- ♦ **All India Survey of Higher Education (AISHE) under MHRD:** To portray the status of higher education in the country, Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) has endeavoured to conduct an annual web-based All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) since 2010-11 through the College Nodal Officer Dr Ajoy Mitra. The College has been continuously getting itself assessed by the MHRD under the banner of All India Survey of Higher Education from 2010-11 to 2019-20. (<http://aishe.gov.in/aishe/home>)
- ♦ **Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) under MHRD:** RUSA aims to build a self-sustaining momentum that will push for greater accountability and autonomy of state institutions and impress upon them the need to improve the quality of education and infrastructure. The College is maintaining all the formalities regarding institutional development under RUSA. Works of three storied RCC Building for Library and Toilet Block under RUSA was completed in 2020-21.

- ♦ **Cash less Transaction:** The Digital India programme is a flagship programme of the Government of India with a vision to transform India into a digitally empowered society and knowledge economy. Dispur College also followed all Government Notification time to time.

- ❖ The College has redesigned College website i.e. www.dispurcollege.ac.in and made it user friendly with up-to-date information as required by different stakeholders.
- ❖ Digital Classroom has been introduced and phase wise more and more classrooms will be made interactive.

- 1) The Online Admission portal at <http://www.dispurcollege.ac.in/> will be live from **13th August, 2021**
- 2) One can directly visit at <http://dispurcollege.ac.in/online/> and read carefully all instructions before new registration.
- 3) Admissions to HS 1st Year (Arts & Commerce) and B.A. /B.Com./ BBA/BCA 1st Semester will be strictly on the merit basis and as per the Govt. Reservation Rules. **75% of seats in Degree Course shall be reserved for AHSEC.**
- 4) **For HS first year Admission** one can register through **Darpan**, the common portal for online HS admission (for all AHSEC and CBSE), available on AHSEC's official website <http://www.darpan.ahseconline.in>
- 5) The interested students must register and apply before **25th August (HS) & 30th August 2021 (UG)**
- 6) **All students should generate Unique ID from the Web Portal of Director of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam**
- 7) Fee Waiver Scheme, all other Admission Rules will be applicable as per the Govt. Notification
- 8) College only offer CBCS Honours Course as per GU Syllabus for TDC Arts & Commerce.
- 9) Merit lists for admission into B.A. 1st Semester Honours will be prepared on the basis of honours applied (subject wise like Assamese, English, Education, Economics, Political Science, Philosophy and History)
- 10) As per CBCS GU, B.Com Honours syllabus specialisation allowed only in 3rd Year (Subject like Accountancy, Management & Finance)
- 11) B.A. 1st Semester - Merit list for Honours selection will be made Honours subject wise in accordance to the candidate's first choice (indicated as 1st preference*)
- 12) Students seeking admission in to the Self-financing Course (BCA and BBA) have to pay processing and admission fee as per the college fee structure.
- 13) **The date of admission will be notified later in the college website along with the Merit List for HS and BA/BCOM/BBA/BCA. .**
- 14) The students and parents are requested to visit the college website **REGULARLY** www.dispurcollege.ac.in for subsequent notifications.
- 15) The decision of the admission committee will be final and binding to all.
- 16) After provisional admission STUDENTS AND PARENTS/GUARDIANS have to fill up **Online Anti Ragging Undertaking** as per UGC guidelines.

Admission Rules :

Admission into the college is made **STRICTLY ON THE BASIS OF MERIT** as per provision of Govt rules and is governed by the college admission rules. The Admission Committee shall regulate and supervise the whole process of admission. In case of any dispute, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding. However, the G.B. shall be the appellate authority. The Application Form for admission available online after registration and must be submitted online with all documents online on or before the specified date.

N.B. : Students must submit copy of Age Proof Certificate, Mark sheet, Caste Certificate, Domicile Certificate, Income Certificate/BPL Card etc. along with the Form as per Govt.

For the Session 2021-2022

1. Candidate seeking admission to the college in first year Higher Secondary class (Other Board) BA/B.COM first semester classes must apply online as per instructions in college website as per the prescribed norms. No application will be received after the last date.
2. Candidates must submit documents as per Govt. notification and norms.
3. A candidate found to have submitted false information will be liable to face penal proceedings; and his/her fees already paid will be forfeited.
4. Selected candidates must take admission on the date prescribed by fulfilling necessary norms.
5. Eligibility for Admission
 - (i) Students who have completed 10th standard (SEBA or other equivalent Board) can apply for Higher Secondary 1st year admission either in Arts or in Commerce or in both.
 - (ii) Students who have completed Higher Secondary (AHSEC or other equivalent Board) can apply for TDC 1st Semester Course either in Arts or in Commerce.
 - (iii) Separate forms to be used for Arts & Commerce and HS & TDC online.
 - (iv) Seat Allocation will be on **Merit Basis** and Choice of Section will be decided by the college authority depending on merit.
 - (v) Some seats are reserved for the candidates with International/National/ State level proficiency in Extracurricular activities.
 - (vi) Seats of the students will be forfeited who are continuously absent in the class for 15 days and those seats will be filled up by new students.
 - (vii) Admitted students must register their names uploading all relevant documents in the G.U. website just after their admission for G.U. registration paying necessary fees directly.

Grooming & Discipline:

- Major students will get one additional library card and all borrowers of library books will be responsible for the loss or damage of book/s borrowed from library and he/ she will have to pay the cost of the book/s
- No student will be allowed inside the college campus without uniform.
- Every student must appear for all the internal tests conducted by the concerned departments.
- Students should follow all the notices displayed in the Notice Board for their own benefit.
- Any application for obtaining certificates, railway concession, scholarship etc. must be submitted in advance to enable the office to deliver in time.
- Payment of scholarship will be made only by Crossed Cheque.
- Payment Receipt should be obtained for all amounts paid in the college office.
- College property to be used with utmost care and electric, water and other fixtures should not be tampered with.
- Students must attend all the functions of the college.

Regulation of BA/BCOM for Semester System and Grading System as per G.U. Guideline:

1. BA/BCOM course consists of six semesters covering three calendar years. The schedule for Semester system shall be as shown below :
 - (a) First, Third and Fifth Semester : August 1 –Dec-31 (including examinations)
 - (b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester : January 1 –June-30 (including examinations)
 - (c) Semester Break : July 1 –July-31.

The Academic Calendar, Course Structure and Schedule for Semester System is as per GU guidelines and for details students can log on to www.gauhati.ac.in

2. Student's performance will be monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the student's performance in each of the theory and practice paper will be based on as per GU and AHSEC guidelines.
3. Internal evaluation will be based on one sessional examination, home assignments, seminars, and library work in each semester. The schedule for internal evaluation is given in Annexure-I. The procedure for internal evaluation is given in Annexure-III.
4. External evaluation will be done through a final examination at the end of each semester.
5. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and that in each practical paper is 40%.
6. In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal (sessional) as well as the external evaluation separately.
7. A student who could not appear or failed in any Semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows :
 - (a) First semester with the regular third semester examination.
 - (b) Second semester with the regular fourth semester examination.
 - (c) Third semester with regular fifth semester examination.
 - (d) Fourth semester with regular sixth semester examination.
8. A student may be allowed to "repeat" anyone of the theory papers in the first, second, third and fourth semester, and may be allowed for "betterment" of marks in one paper in the fifth semester, provided the student secures less than 45% marks in that paper.
9. No "repeat"/ "betterment" shall be allowed in the practical examinations in any semester.
10. A student must pass all his semester examinations, including "repeat" and "betterment" chances within five years from the date of admission to the first semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular semester.
11. In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen event, the matter maybe placed in the committee of courses and studies (U.G.) for amicable settlement.
12. Since the semesters involve continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.
13. For any matter not covered under this regulation for semester system, the existing university rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) would be applicable.

Internal Assessment & Student Feedback:

Each and every student will be required to attend sessional, unit test, etc. whenever conducted by the Departments for the purpose of internal assessment as per G.U. regulations. All students from 1st to 6th Semester (Arts & Commerce) are required to provide student feedback regarding overall assessment of courses, performance of faculties etc. IQAC also introduced online feedback facilities from 2020-21.

Dispur College Library-A Learning Resource Centre:

The college library is a learning resource centre for the users (students, teachers, staff). Users can access the wide range of resources comprising textbooks, reference books, periodicals etc of Indian and international authors. The library has a total collection of 18,533 (textbooks and reference books) till date covering different subjects. The library has a total 13(thirteen) periodicals comprising different subjects, journals, general Magazines and 8 (eight) newspapers.

H.S. Students are given 2(two) reader's tickets (library cards) and B.A., B.Com semester students are given 2(two) (for pass course) and 3(three) (for major course) reader's ticket for borrowing the books from the library. Some of the general library rules which the students must follow in the library are:

Students cannot use the mobile phone within the library.

Students should maintain silence within the library and should try to keep it clean.

Students cannot chew any kind of intoxicants within the library.

Students are to return the books within the due date after which a fine of Rs.1(per day) will be charged.

If borrowed books are mutilated, damaged or lost, will have to be replaced or the price of the book must be paid by the borrower.

For loss of reader's ticket, a fine of Rs.20(per card) will be charged.

Students cannot borrow the books using other students cards as it is not transferrable. The library has SOUL 2.0; a library management software, for the automation of the housekeeping activities of the library. Till now, 12,000 data of the books have been entered. Recently, for accessing the e-resources through N-LIST (National Library and Information service, Infrastructure of Scholarly Content) program under INFLIBNET Centre, Gujarat, has been installed in the library. N-LIST is a college component of the UGC-INFONET Digital Library Consortium, mainly provided to the colleges, for accessing the e-resources (comprising e-books and e-journals) by the users.

Conduct of Election of College Union

Instructions issued in compliance with the verdict of the Hon'ble Supreme Court

Ref: Order passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP No.24295/2004.

The Honourable Supreme Court of India has perused the Report of the Committee, headed by Mr. J. M. Lyngdoh, former Chief Election Commissioner, constituted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India for making recommendations and suggestions relating to the Students' Union Elections in terms of the order of the Supreme Court dated 12.12.2005. The Supreme Court has accepted the

recommendations as an interim measure and directed to implement the recommendations subject to such

modifications indicated therein. The recommendations have been incorporated as a part of the order. The Supreme Court has also made it clear that the recommendations made, which the court has accepted to be adopted as an interim measure, shall be followed in all college/ University Elections, to be held hereinafter, until further orders. In the light of the above order, the College has decided to conduct the elections of the Students' Unions in accordance with the system of direct elections as envisaged in clause 6.2.2 of the recommendations submitted by the committee headed by Mr. J.M. Lyngdoh and accepted by the Honourable Supreme Court. The directives of the Supreme Court shall be supplementary to the clauses contained in the Constitution for College Unions/ Constitution for University Departments' Unions and the rules for the conduct of elections to College Unions/ Departments' students Unions contained therein and the same shall supersede any of the clauses that are inconsistent with the directives.

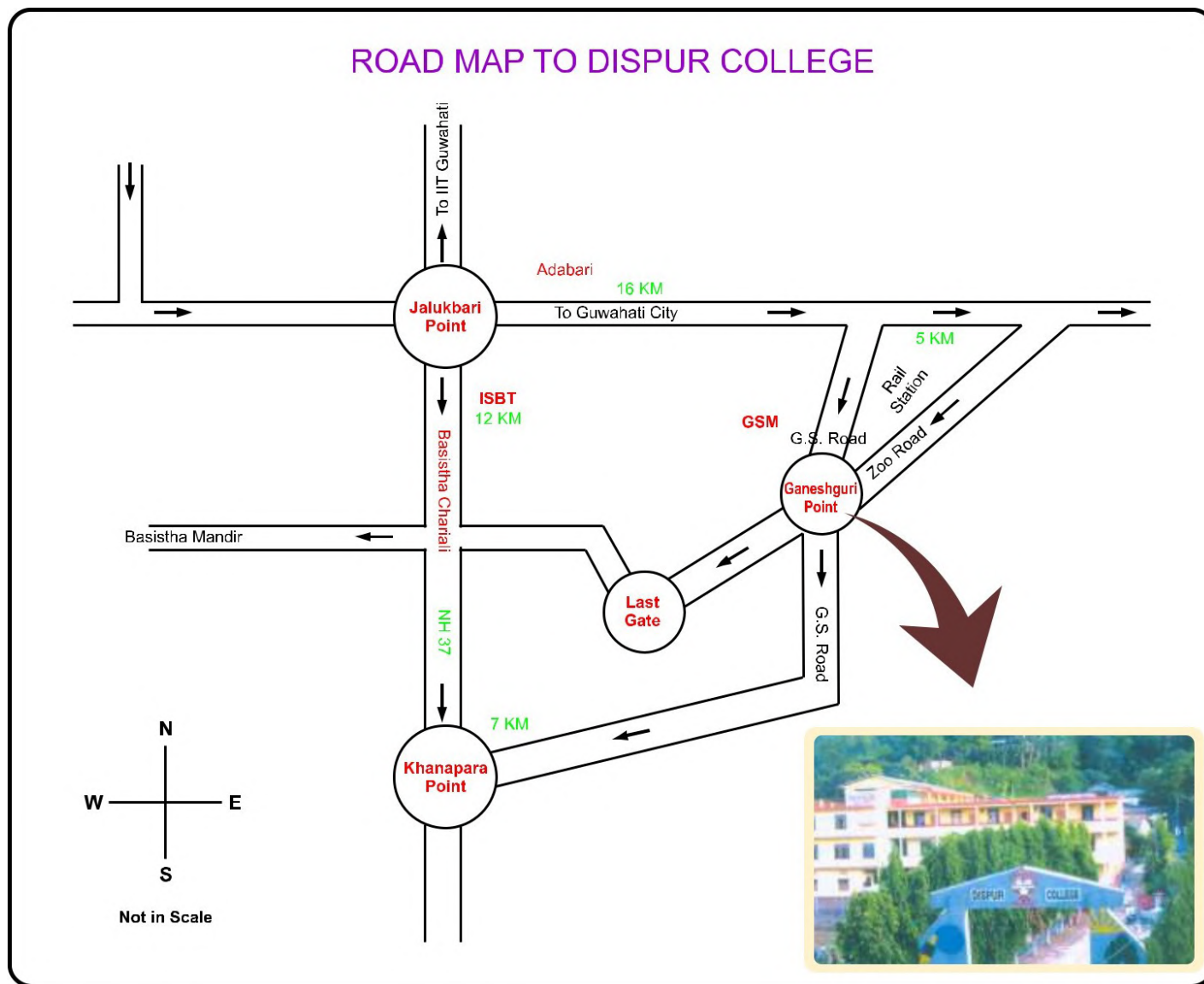
