THE INCEPTION:

With the shift of the capital of Assam from Shillong to Dispur, there emerged a huge demand for higher education in the adjacent areas of the new capital which led to the establishment of Dispur College in the year 1978, with Sri Ghana Kanta Chetia Phukan as its founder Principal. The classes were started with the Arts Stream at Gopal Boro Govt. Higher Secondary School in the evening shift only. In 1987, during the tenure of Principal Dr.Reba Kanta Hazarika, the college shifted to its present premises in the periphery of Narakasur Hills at Ganeshguri-Dispur, in the heart of Guwahati City. The evening shift was gradually discontinued and the classes were transposed to day shifts. The Arts Stream was provincialized from 1st April, 1992. The College was recognized by the UGC U/S 2F and 12B in 1995-96. From the academic session 1991-92, the Commerce Stream (HS) was introduced and in the year 1994-95, an undergraduate course (B. Com) was introduced in morning shifts. The Commerce Stream was provincialized from 1st January, 2013. Due to increasing demand from the students, an additional evening shift was started from the session 2022-23 in the Commerce stream. The college introduced BBA and BCA from the session 2007-08 to meet the growing demand for professional education in the region. The College also provides a platform for open and distance learning via the K.K. Handiqui State Open University.



From the Academic Session, 2023-24, Dispur College is going to implement the FYUGP (Four Years Under Graduate Programme) in Arts and Commerce under Gauhati University which is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme- (i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline. The word Stream here refers to Arts, Science, Commerce and Management. In case of a degree in a stream, the student studies a multitude of different subjects, usually mixing different disciplines, which leads to a truly multidisciplinary degree. While in case of a degree in a discipline, the student is confined to a certain set of disciplines.

The FYUGP is designed to cater to the diverse academic needs of the students and seeks to offer multiple entries/exits and obtain Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with or without Major or a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

ADMISSION:

ADMISSION TO THE FYUGP SHALL BE DONE AS BELOW:

1. Eligibility

- a. A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.
- b. Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any Major, she/he will be admitted on the basis of preferences of the subject combinations.
- c. Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a college/department.
- d. No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP UNLESS she/he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

2. Progression and exits

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) After 1 Year

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirements is 44 (and 4 credit extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).

(b) After 2 Years

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirements is 84 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).

(c) After 3 Years

If a student completes 3 years, s/he can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a Bachelor's Degree. The minimum total credit requirements is 120.

(d) After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research. The minimum total credit requirements is 160.

It should be noted that any certificate / diploma / degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e. passes) all the required courses (papers) till that point of time.

However, a student can complete his FYUGP within a maximum period of 7 years.

3. ABC (Academic Bank of Credits)

The GU-FYUGP is directly connected to the ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earn at the end of an examination in GU-FYUGP, will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such it is mandatory that a student under GU-FYUGP register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

*Aadhaar Card is mandatory for all the admitted students as it will be required for all purposes like creation of ABC, Registration with University, etc. Those who do not have Aadhaar Card, they must avail it within two/three weeks from date of admission.

4. Multiple exits and entries

The FYUGP allows students to have multiple exits and entries. That is a student can exit the programme, say after one year and then again can enter the institution as per the policy of Inter-institutional mobility (shown in point no. 5) Programme at a later time and can continue the programme from where s/he left. This process can be executed multiple times.

However, the entry into the programme is subject to availability of positions at that point of time and in that institute / college. Besides, the following should apply

- (a) A student will get a certificate / diploma / degree on exit from the GU-FYUGP (depending on in which year the student exits), only when the student passes in all the minimum compulsory courses at that point of time.
- (b) After an exit, either after Year 1 or 2, the student can seek an entry only into the same programme to which the student was admitted.
- (c) When a student exits the GU-FYUGP after 3 years with a Bachelor's Degree, s/he can not seek reentry into the programme at the fourth year, rather s/he will need to take admission into the Master's programme at the first year.
- (d) As the contents (syllabi) of all the courses are subject to modification from time time, when a student enters into the programme after an earlier exit, the contents of all courses will be what is as per the syllabi at the current point of time.

5. Inter-institution mobility

The GU-FYUGP allows a student for inter-institutional mobility, both for incoming and outgoing students. For this, GU will take into account the credits a student has in his / her ABC.

For an incoming student, the following should be observed:

- (a) The entry is subject to availability of seats in the concerned discipline.
- (b) The student need to fulfil all the academic prerequisites of the concerned discipline.
- (c) Gauhati University will award a degree to a student, only when the student will have completed 60% of the credits for core courses from GU.

6. Choice of courses

6.1 Prerequisites

Prerequisites are conditions which need to be fulfilled prior to admission into the FYUGP. Each subject and its course (paper) has their own prerequisites, which need to be fulfilled by a student prior to enrolment. For details one can visit university website https://gauhati.ac.in / https://nep.gauhati.ac.in

Here, having a prerequisite necessarily means that the student needs to have passed in the subject. The details of these prerequisites are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

6.2 Requirements

As opposed to prerequisites, the requirements are conditions which need to be fulfilled when a student chooses a certain subject or course. For example, when a student wants to study Botany as a subject, Chemistry as another subject must be studied.

The details of the requirements are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

6.3 Course options

Subject to fulfillment of prerequisites and requirements, a student can choose any subject as core subjects. The nomenclature of the degree awarded (whether Bachelor of Arts or Science) will be decided by the group to which at least two subjects belong.

7. Examination & grading

7.1 Examination

The examination modalities of GU-FYUGP will be as per GU's Examination Ordinance.

7.2 Grading

After successful completion of the programme, a student will be awarded grade. In GUFYUGP, there will not be any percentage of marks, but all students will provided SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) as per UGC's Curricular Framework.

8. Fourth year of the GU-FYUGP

The fourth year of the GU-FYUGP consists of one compulsory course on Research Methodology of credit 4, to be studies in Semester VII. The rest of the course consist of Advance Core Courses and a Dissertation. The details of the the fourth year will be available later.

9. Curricular components

The entire FYUGP curriculum is divided into two parts – (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

9.1. Core courses

The core courses constitute of Majors and Minors. Usually, a student will choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. Altogether, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses (papers) with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3-year programme.

Major Course: The minimum credit requirements for a Major Course over a 3-year period is 60 which translates to 15 courses (papers).

Minor Course: The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period is 12 which translates to 3 courses (papers).

Second Major Course Provided a student has a Major Course with 60 credits, s/he can convert one of her Minor Courses to a Second Major only with a credit allocation of 48. In that case, s/he gets a degree with Double Major and Minor.

9.2. Common courses

As the name suggests, these courses will have to be studies by all students of FYUGP. Together the common courses have a credit allocation of 36 divided over five subdivisions.

They are:

- (a) Value Added Courses (VAC): Total Credits 6
- (b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): Total Credits 8
- (c) Multidisciplinary Courses: Total Credits 9
- (d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): Total Credits 9
- (e) Internship: Credit 4

A brief description of these courses is given below.

Multi-disciplinary Courses

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects — (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses are of Class XII.

Each student need to take at any three courses, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is a 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication).

Each student need to complete two courses of 4-credits each – one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be taken during Semesters 1-2.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

There are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have four skill courses starting from Semester 1 and in Semesters 4-6.

• Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups — (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.

Each student will have to take any two courses, each of 3-credits, from any three groups during Semesters 2 & 3. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

• Internship

All student are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.



Key points to be Taken into Account

- 1) Entire process of submission of admission forms will be conducted in online mode through the admission portal of Dispur College.
- 2) Admissions will be open from the 2nd week of June, 2023.
- 3) One can directly visit http://dispurcollege.ac.in/online/ and read all instructions carefully during admission and before new registration.
- 4)For HS first year Admission, one can register through Darpan, the common portal for online HS admission (for all AHSEC and CBSE), available on AHSEC's official website http://www.darpan.ahseconline.in as well as through college website.
- 5)Students applying for FYUGP shall have to register in SAMARTH-e-gov suite for admission.
- 6) Existing Govt. rules and notifications will be applicable for fee waiver scheme and other fee structure.
- 7) Merit lists for admissions into H.S. 1st year and 1st semester B.A./B.Com/ BBA/BCA (FYUGP) will be prepared strictly on merit basis following Govt. reservation policy.
- 8) Students seeking admission into the Self-financing Course (BCA and BBA) have to pay processing and admission fee as per the college fee structure.
- 9) The date of admission will be publicly advertised through newspapers as well as in the college website.
- 10) The students and parents are requested to visit the college website REGULARLY www.dispurcollege.ac.in for subsequent notifications.
- 11) The decision of the admission committee shall be final and binding on all.
- 12) During the admission process, the candidate may have to fill up some other relevant form/forms in connection with his/her admission into the college.
- 13) A candidate found to have submitted false information will be liable to face penal proceedings; and his/her fees already paid will be forfeited.
- 14) Fees once paid shall not be refunded.
- 14) Students have to select at least two of the following activities (enrollment is free of charge):

- 16) Seat of a student who remains absent in classes consecutively for the first 10 days will be forfeited and that seat will be filled up by new admission.
- 17)Admitted Students shall have to pay registration, enrollment, and examination fees of boards and universities separately and upload relevant documents as per instruction.

*Separate forms will be issued online for H.S. (Arts and Commerce) and B.A., B. Com., BBA, BCA. Admission Rules:

The Admission Committee shall regulate and supervise the whole process of admission. In case of any dispute, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding. Submission of applications will be accepted only after payment of Rs.300/-(Rupees three hundred) online. The admission process shall be in offline mode in the college campus on the specified dates and time to be announced through college website.

N.B.: Students must submit copies of Age Proof Certificate, Mark sheet, Caste Certificate, Domicile Certificate, Income Certificate/BPL Card etc. along with the form as per Govt. Notification. The original copies must be brought at the time of admission for verification.

Reservation of Seats:

Reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC/MOBC/Divyangjan will be according to existing government rules. A few seats will be reserved for deserving candidates in each class having state/national/international level proficiency in sports, NCC and cultural activities. Supporting certificates will have to be produced at the time of admission.

The students who shall seek admission under this category will have to give a self-declaration about his/her gender and also submit a Certificate about the same from a reputed organization representing such community.

Discipline:

Dispur College has a set of defined Codes of Conduct which can be found in the College Website.

All the students are required to go through the same and comply with them.

- All the students are expected to follow "Students' Charter" and "Code of Conduct" that are displayed in the college campus/website.
- Use of Mobile Phones in the College Campus is restricted to only Academic Purposes.
- Students must attend 75% of the total classes held in each subject, otherwise they will be debarred from appearing in the sessional examinations. As a result, their internal assessment marks cannot be forwarded to Gauhati University for their semester-end exams and consequently, they will be declared as fail (Back) for that particular semester.
- No student shall move out of the college campus during the college hours, roaming around market and nearby places, creating nuisance and engaging themselves in any anti-social activities, violation of which shall lead to stringent disciplinary action including expulsion from the institution, rustication and initiation of legal action. Loitering in front of the classrooms and corridors are prohibited.
- Every student must carry their Library Card (which is non-transferable)
- Major students will get one additional library card and all borrowers of library books will be responsible for the loss or damage of book/s borrowed from library and he/ she will have to pay the cost of the books.
- No student will be allowed inside the college campus without uniform.
- Every student must appear compulsorily for all the internal tests/sessional exams/home assignments conducted by the concerned departments.
- Students should follow all the notices displayed in the Notice Board for their own benefit.
- Any application for obtaining certificates, railway concession, scholarship etc. must be submitted in advance to enable the office to deliver on time.
- Payment of scholarship will be made directly to benifisary account through online mode.
- Payment Receipt should be obtained for all amounts paid in the college office.
- College property to be used with utmost care and electric, water and other fixtures should not be tampered with.
- Students must attend all the functions of the college.
- Single use plastic items are strictly prohibited inside the college campus, violation of which will lead to a fine of Rs. 200 in the first instance.

Regulation of FYUGP for Semester System and Grading System as per G.U. Guidelines:

1.For details students can log on to www.gauhati.ac.in

- 2. Students' performance will be monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the student's performance in each of the theory and practice papers will be done as per GU and AHSEC guidelines.
- 3. Internal evaluation will be based on class attendance, library attendance, unit tests, home assignments, projects and sessional examinations.
- 4. External evaluation will be done through a final examination at the end of each semester.
- 5. A student must pass all his semester examinations within seven years from the date of admission to the first semester course.
- 6. In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen event, the matter maybe placed in the committee of courses and studies (U.G.) for amicable settlement.
- 7. For any matter not covered under this regulation for the semester system, the existing university rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) would be applicable.

Internal Assessment and Student Feedback

Each and every student will be required to attend sessional, unit test, etc. whenever conducted by the Departments for the purpose of internal assessment as per G.U. regulations. All students from 1st to 8th Semester (Arts and Commerce) are required to provide online feedback on completion of courses, performance of faculties/department, administration, support staff etc. as and when required by IQAC.

Facilities and initiatives available in the Campus:

Dispur College, situated in the heart of the city of Guwahati is well accessible from all the directions of the state of Assam as well as the other states of the Northeast Region. The College since its inception has been providing quality education to the students from entire Northeast India. The College has an academic ambience, having adequate need-based physical infrastructure and accessibility as well as a designed administrative block, various rooms and facilities for the students such as girls' common room and boys' common room, waiting room etc.

- **6) Multi Gym:** -Gym facilities are also provided to all the students of the college. It operates with the motto that "A healthy mind resides in a healthy body".
- 7) Seminars and Workshops: -The College organises seminars and workshops on a regular basis to upgrade the skills among students. Such programmes also help the students in the escalation of their professional lives.
- 8) Inter-Disciplinary Lectures: -Such lectures engage students and help them to develop knowledge and insight about various problems of the society. It also develops problem solving skills in them, thus enhancing their self-confidence.

10) Library Facilities: -The institution provides an open library to each and every student. Students can read books, journals, magazines and newspapers in the library as well as borrow books from it.

Semester-end Recreational Tour

Dispur College Library- A learning resource center: -

Established in the year 1978, the Dispur College Library is one of the pioneer centres to provide knowledge not only to its stake holders, but also to its society. The college library is a learning resource centre for the users (students, teachers, staff and other social stakeholders). Users can access the wide range of resources comprising of textbooks, reference books, periodicals etc. of Indian and international authors. As one of the pioneer institution of the Greater Guwahati, the Library is catering to the needs of its users providing every possible services to its users with its resources.

The Library building has been renovated in 2021 with RUSA 1.0 Grant. The Library has a sitting capacity of 50 both in new and old building. The Library has textbook section and reading room in Old building and in New building it has sections like Property Counter, different reference books, Teacher's Reading Room, Librarian's Room, Library Assistant Room and reading room.

In the initial stage, Library collection was very less (2000 approx.). Gradually, the collection increased over the time along with the newspapers, journals, magazines etc. Presently, the Central Library has a collection of 21,140 (text and reference books), covering different subjects. The library also has a collection of 12(twelve) Journals, 5(five) Magazines and 10(ten) Newspapers. The Library has N-LIST (National Library and Information Service Infrastructure of Scholarly Content), to access e-resources (e-journals and e-books) by the users.

The Central Library has been automated through KOHA Software and in house automation process is going on. The Central Library has an E-Resource Centre for the users to access the internet, strictly only for the academic purpose.

The library has some general rules and regulations which the users have to be abide by. They are:

- 1. No students are allowed to enter the Library without uniform.
- 2. Students cannot use mobile phones within the Library. They have to take permission of the Librarian to use mobile phones strictly for academic purpose only.
- 3. Students should maintain silence within the Library and should try to keep it clean.
- 4. Students cannot chew any kind of intoxicants within the Library.
- 5. Students cannot borrow the books using other student's reader's ticket as it is not transferable.
- 6. For loss of reader's ticket, fine of Rs.50/- will be charged.
- 7. Students have to return the books within due date after which a fine of Re.1/- will be charged per day.
- 8. Degree Students are given 3(three) books and H.S Students are given 2(two) books for issue.
- 9. Students can issue the books for 15 days, Teachers for 1 month and Office Staffs for 15 days.
- 10. Only textbooks can be issued. Reference books, journals, magazines, dictionaries, encyclopedias etc. will have to be consulted/read in the Library only as they cannot be issued.
- 11. Borrowed books mutilated, damaged or lost, will have to be replaced or pay the double price by the borrower.
- 12. Desktops and fans have to be switched off after use.
- 13. Any kind of query related to the Library should be consulted with the Librarian or Library Staffs.

NCC Unit of Dispur College:

The College is under the 48 Assam Naval Unit where any student can join for their personality development, development of leadership skills and can attend various national level camps and competitions including Republic Day Camp at New Delhi. Three to four cadets are selected for the Republic Day Camp every year from our unit. Cadets can apply for Bir Chilarai Award which includes a cash reward of Rs.10,000 and certificate. There is also provision for a cash award of Rs.50,000 under Cadet Welfare Society (CWS). In addition to that, there is another prestigious award known as Lt. Col. M. Chowdhary award of Rs.25,000. In the first year, cadets are eligible to attend 'B' certificate and in the second year after attending two national camps, cadets are eligible for 'C' certificate exam. 'C' certificate holders can get appointment in reserve category in army, navy, air force and other paramilitary forces without written examination of UPSC. Our cadets have already earned accolades in national level camps. There is no admission fee for joining NCC.

Code of Conduct for College Union Elections:

Instructions issued in compliance with the verdict of the Hon'ble Supreme Court Ref: Order passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP No.24295/2004.

The Honourable Supreme Court of India has pursued the Report of the Committee, headed by Mr. J. M. Lyngdoh, former Chief Election Commissioner, constituted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India for making recommendations and suggestions related to the Students' Union Elections in terms of the order of the Supreme Court dated 12.12. 2005. The Supreme Court has accepted the an interim measure and directed to implement Recommendations as recommendations subject to such modifications indicated therein. The recommendations have been incorporated as a part of the order. The Supreme Court has also made it clear that the recommendations made, which the court has accepted to be adopted as an interim measure, shall be followed in all college/University Elections, to be held herein after, until further orders. In light of the above order, the College has decided to conduct the elections of the Students' Unions in accordance with the system of direct elections as envisaged in clause 6.2.2 of the recommendations submitted by the committee headed by Mr. J. M. Lyngdoh and accepted by the Honourable Supreme Court. The directives of the Supreme Court shall be supplementary to the clauses contained in the Constitution for College Unions/Constitution for University Departments' Unions and the rules for the conduct of elections to College Unions/Departments' students Unions contained herein and the same shall supersede any of the clauses that are inconsistent with the directives.

In this regard, the rules and regulations for DCSU Elections are incorporated in the amended 2022 version of the constitution of DCSU which is available in the college website. Interested students may visit the same.







Assignment

Assignments are administered as part of the practice and evaluation schemes. These are important components in internal evaluation schemes.

Seminars

Seminars are conducted on current IT and Management topics of importance. These seminars help students to interact with different professional industries.

Workshop/IT Training/ Projects

Information technology skills are essential for engineers to be successful in today's information technology intensive environment. Projects attempt to bridge the gap between the professional world and academic institutions. They help the students to develop practical work skills. Likewise, IT Workshops, held at regular frequency, are crucial in helping students attain hands-on training in latest technologies.

Interview Training:

Placement meets and personality development workshops are organized as parts of the placement program. All the students are guided on career planning as they progress to higher levels of the program. The entire placement exercise is a joint effort between the institute and the students. The students have the responsibility to put in the maximum possible efforts to obtain suitable placements under the guidance of the department.





Recruitment:

On completion of the courses, so far about forty percent students have got jobs in MNCs like Cognizant, Wipro etc. through campus interviews. Students have also been employed in some other organizations directly.


