

I am very mindful of where I draw the line. I will not go overboard or ever talk about say, Farah (Khan, choreographer) ji's kids or husband, or make a remark on how she is earning money. That may be a bit below the belt. So, making fun of all that or someone's sexual orientation... Things like that, we have to be mindful of.

**Shaan on Kya Maine Socha: 20 years on, it is still one of my big hits**

The iconic British boy band Blue's 2002 hit, *One Love*, is trending again. Social media users have been posting Reels with the song, forming the letters L or O in a dramatic flair. The four-member band, which was formed in 2000 and comprises vocalists Simon Webbe, Duncan James, Antony Costa and Lee Ryan, too, jumped on the bandwagon recently, sharing a Reel on the trend. "We are very grateful that this song is trending now," says Webbe. The band, who is currently touring the UK and has a new single, *In My City*, coming up, collaborated with singer Shaan back in 2004 for the Hindi version of the song, titled *Kya Maine Socha*. It was also featured in the movie *Rakht* starring Abhishek Bachchan

and Bipasha Basu. "We got to hear and see the song years ago. It was amazing, even the dance routine was amazing," says Costa, adding that a visit to India in December is on the cards. "We are working on our tour dates for India and so, for us, it's great because we're going to get to come back to India and get to perform *One Love* ourselves," he adds. Is there an Indian musician they would want to collaborate with? "Arijit Singh. We have heard his songs. He seems really cool. He does a lot of romantic songs. So, we would love to come back to India and work with other Bollywood singers, or even an actor. It would be fun," says James. The band plans to set some time aside on their India visit to go and explore the country. "It is such an amazingly spiritual and lovely place," adds Ryan.

Actors Abhishek Bachchan and Bipasha Basu grooving to the smooth tunes of Shaan's *Kya Maine Socha*, featuring *One Love* by the British band Blue, is perhaps a core memory for every Y2K kid. While many believe the rendition was a recreation of the boy band's popular track, the singer clarifies: "It was a collaboration. We made a Hindi version of the song around the same time as the original released." As the song clocks 20 years, Shaan recalls how he landed the opportunity. "Blue was touring in Asia for their single *One Love*. Musicians from all over Asia, including me from India, recorded a cover of the song," shares the 51-year-old. On the way to the studio, he thought of adding a few more lines. The Hindi lyrics, Shaan explains,

The singer, who's known for hits such as *Chaand Sifarish* (Fanaa, 2006), says *Kya Maine Socha* is still a part of his gigs. "It is one of my most popular songs. Even Simon Webbe of Blue heard it and said that I should go ahead and add it to my album, *Aksar*, that I'd been working on," he ends.



**Rakul's mum reveals why she quit her job to be a homemaker**

Actor Rakul Preet Singh has seen the image of strength and sacrifice in her mother, Rini Singh. In our run-up to Mother's Day on May 12, our special series reflects on the bond celeb kids share with their mums. Born and brought up in Ambala (Punjab), Rini did her master's degree in economics, followed by BEd. She also taught professionally in school before deciding to take up the role of a homemaker. "Being a homemaker is the toughest job. I don't think this generation, including me, has an iota of skills compared to our mums," says Rakul.

The actor's father, Col Kulvinder Singh, is a retired army officer, and Rakul insists that it is "the toughest job to be an army officer's wife". "At times, dad was posted at border areas. We didn't have phones back then, but my mum was fearlessly raising me and my brother. We never felt that our father wasn't around, or our mother was scared," she shares. Rini adds, "I never gave myself time to think about the negative. I kept myself busy and used that time to make my kids learn everything out there."

Rakul goes on to recall the time when they were in the Northeast for four years. She says, "Dad was posted at the Manipur border. At that time, if we didn't have anything to do at home, mum would ask us to dance or sing, and she'd record us. Often on weekends, we would travel in convoys to meet dad. Many wouldn't do it due to the risk involved, but my mum was fearless." Ask Rini where she got the courage from, and she says, "Sometimes, ignorance is bliss."

**RAKUL IS SO MATURE: RINI**

"Rakul was so confident during Miss India! I never thought she would be comfortable in a bikini, but she did it well. She was just 18, but her thinking was so mature. I feel proud to have given birth to such a strong woman. So many people tell us, 'Bachcha ho toh Rakul jaisa!'"

**MY MUM IDENTIFIED MY TALENT: RAKUL**

"My mum was the one to identify my talent and say I should act and go for Miss India. I would watch the pageant diligently every year, and one day she told me I should apply. I was tomboyish and said I wouldn't be able to do it, but she was confident. She went with me for my bikini shopping. While dad also never had any reservations, my mum was the one to tell him, 'It's her dream and if she wants to do it, we should let her.'"

**When my husband was posted in the ministry, I chose to quit my job and become a homemaker. After my children took up golf, I began taking them to the training sessions every day for four to five hours.**


