Mayor's pledge to youth

SADIQ Khan began his third term as London mayor with a pledge to make it the best city in the world to grow up in. At a declaration of office ceremony in the Tate Modern, he said: "I want London to be a byword for opportunity, the best place in the world for people to grow up in, and that means supporting young people." He said he wants to make free school meals permanent in state primary schools, fund more youth clubs and mental health support and invest in mentoring. The Labour incumbent beat Tory Susan Hall by more than 275,000 votes last week.

War on net porn rogues

TECH firms will face fines unless they protect children from porn and suicide online. Ofcom set out dozens of rules for sites, apps and search engines. They include stricter age-checks and "taming aggressive algorithms". Watchdog boss Dame Melanie Dawes said the Children's Safety Codes of Practice "firmly place the responsibility for keeping children safer on tech firms". She added: "We want children to enjoy life online. But for too long, their experiences have been blighted by seriously harmful content which they can't avoid or control."

Surge in Channel migrants

MORE than 2,000 migrants have arrived in the UK across the Channel since the controversial Rwanda Act became law. Since April 25, Government officials have recorded 2,007 people making the journey in 40 boats. That takes the total to 8,674 so far this year. It includes 396 who arrived in eight boats over the bank holiday. And children were among those pictured being brought ashore in Dover, Kent, yesterday. The Home Office said it showed "exactly why we must get flights to Rwanda off the ground as soon as possible".

The supermodel icon, 53, launched her range with Pretty Little Thing with a huge catwalk show in New York last autumn.


But six months on most of it has been reduced - some as much as 80%.

NO! I KILLED HULL NOT YOU GYLES

THE former Countess of Bradford is the latest person to claim the comic Rod Hull's death was down to her.

Rod, famed for his emu and its attacks on celebrities, died after falling from his roof while fixing an aerial in 1999.

Last week This Morning star Gyles Brandreth, 76, said he blamed himself for Rod's death aged 63.

He said he told Rod to adjust his aerial after complaining about his TV reception while at the theatre. But now

family friend Joanne Miller, 68, claims Gyles "pinched" her story.

Ms Miller said she and her ex-husband had spent the night with Rod watching the musical Animal Crackers.

Joanne said: "Gyles seems to have pinched my story. I don't recall Gyles being with us at all that night."

She said perhaps her ex had "told him later how we urged Rod to fix his TV problem".

Mr Brandreth said he was "relieved" the former Countess was happy to take the blame.

Drivers' strike a rail pain

COMMUTERS were hit by more travel headaches as train drivers went on strike.

The action, by members of the Aslef union, saw limited Southeastern, Southern, Thameslink and Gatwick Express services running yesterday.

Aslef said drivers will continue to strike for an improved pay offer, with some members going five years without a rise.

The Department for Transport said a pay rise which would take train drivers' average salaries up to £65,000 - almost twice the UK average salary - had been offered.

Strikes were also due to be held today and tomorrow affecting different operators, while drivers are also refusing to work overtime until Saturday, causing more disruption.

Polls rival wants Commander shot after 24 attacks

A POLITICAL opponent of president Joe Biden has said his dog should be put down.

Kristi Noem, Republican governor of South Dakota and a contender as Donald Trump's running-mate, suggested his unruly pet Commander should be shot dead.

Kristi, who made the comments in new book No Going Back, previously admitted killing her puppy Cricket, describing it as "worthless" because it was "dangerous" and "untrainable".

In February we told how Biden's German shepherd bit Secret Service agents at least 24 times in less than a year. Victims had "severe" wounds needing stitches.

She said: "What would I do if I was president on the first day in office in 2025? I happen to have a list.

"The first thing I'd do is make sure Joe Biden's dog was nowhere on the grounds ('Commander, say hello to Cricket for me')."

She defended her com-

"How many people is enough to be attacked and dangerously hurt before you make a decision on what to do with a dog?"

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DRUG DEALER IS TRUMP-ED

A DRUG dealer who lived a "lavish lifestyle" making ecstasy tablets shaped like former US president Donald Trump has been jailed for 14 years.

Jay Roberts, 31, was snared when police hacked into encrypted criminal messenger site EncroChat.

Labelled a "key player", he was caught with 3kg of MDMA, cocaine, ketamine, cannabis, lists of dealers, a cash-counting machine and a pill press.

Roberts, of Ellesmere Port, Cheshire, was jailed at Chester Crown Court after admitting conspiracy to supply drugs and possessing criminal property.

BRITISH kebab fans want a price cap on their favourite fast-food after politicians called for one in Germany.


Calls have been made to the Bundestag after doners almost doubled in price to around £8.



Norse power




HORNS AXED: Vikings wore leather helmets. Below, the invaders land



★ **FEISTY** ginger tom cats came over to Britain with the battling Vikings, helping to explain why they are so fearless, according to boffins, as we revealed yesterday.

But how much do you know about history's most frightening folk?

★ Here **JAMES MOORE** has pillaged some little-known facts about the notorious Norse clans and their wild ways...



HORNY TRUTH: It's a myth that the Vikings, from Scandinavia, wore horned helmets. This was invented by the Victorians. In fact, a lot of the infamous raiders only wore leather helmets. The term Vikings itself, for Danes or Norsemen, wasn't used until the 1800s.

BONKERS IN BATTLE: Our word berserk comes from their Berserker warrior cult. Hyped up on psychedelic mushrooms and booze, they sometimes bit chunks out of their shields with rage.

WORD UP: Other words Vikings gave us include anger, slaughter, hell, skull, scrawny, snort, cake, freckles, husband and wife.

HEADS UP: Veisalgia, the medical term for a hangover, comes from combining the Greek word for pain with the Norse word "kveis" meaning uneasiness after debauchery.

DAILY DEITIES: Tuesday is named after the one-handed Norse god Tyr. Wednesday after Woden or Odin who ruled over Valhalla, the Viking heaven, Thursday after Thor, god of thunder and Friday is from Frigga, the goddess of marriage.

FOUNDING FATHERS: Vikings founded the Irish capital Dublin, as "Dubh Linn", meaning "black pool" and gave us English

place names ending in "-by" or "-thorpe".

GROOMING MARVEL: They had good personal hygiene, bathing once a week - a lot for the time - and archaeologists have found they used lots of grooming tools like combs.

HAIR-RAISING: Brown-haired Viking men used to dye their locks blond and, more weirdly, filed their teeth and sometimes dyed their gnashers red too.

SNOW JOKE: They used to ski on wooden poles, for getting around and for fun. They even worshipped a god of skiing, Ullr. They also trained horses to fight to the death for sport.

HAVING IT LARGE: Vikings believed the first man and woman were created from the sweat of a giant's armpit and clouds were giants' brains.

FOOD AND BOOZE: They


were known to eat polar bear meat, seagull and moose and drank beer or mead out of horned cups which had to be finished in one go - as you couldn't put them down.

AMAZING MYTHS: Cheeky god Loki once changed into a horse to mate with a stallion.

Werewolf Fenrir Greyback, from the Harry Potter tales, was named after a monster wolf from Norse mythology.

NUTTY NUP-TIALS: Viking men could divorce if they caught their wives wearing their trousers and wives could divorce her hubby if he showed too much chest in public.

SHIP SHAPE: They travelled thousands of miles in pioneering longships and were the first Europeans to visit North America in the 10th century under explorer Leif Erikson.

A statement read: "In response to the many inquiries, it unfortunately will not be possible due to His Majesty's full programme.



PUBS will be allowed to stay open an extra two hours if England or Scotland reach the Euro 2024 semis and final, the Government announced.

Licensing hours will be extended to 1am in England so fans can toast either team's success in a boost to the hospitality sector.

Home Secretary James Cleverly said: "Over the coming weeks we will all be getting ready to support our home nations in what will be a busy summer of sport.

"We have listened to the public through our consultation. This boost to the hospitality sector will allow friends, families and communities to come together for longer to watch their nation hopefully bring it home."

The legislation will be laid in Parliament today to give time for it to be debated and passed before Euro 24 begins next month.

It is hoped Scotland, which sets its own rules on pub hours, will follow suit.

Jaws in Brit sun isle alert

HOLIDAYMAKERS at a resort popular with Brits fled from the sea when a deadly shark was spotted lurking off the beach.

Coastguards raised the red flag after they spied the 7ft beast off the coast of Menorca.

People were stopped from swimming following the sighting of the predator - thought to be a blue shark - at Arenal d'en Castell on the Spanish island.

The ban was lifted later. Another shark was sighted at the same location in June 2018.

Blue sharks are among the most common species in the seas around Spain.

They are less aggressive than more infamous species such as great whites and bull sharks, but are still believed to have killed four people.

PEOPLE in a town known for floral displays have been ordered to do a £165 safety course if they want to attach hanging baskets to street lamps.

Cambridgeshire County Council has introduced the health and safety rules.

But people in Chatteris, which has an impressive record of Britain in Bloom gold medals, are furious.

The council says the course is needed to "ensure everyone's safety" as the street lights are connected to the power grid.

A SURGE in "100-day cough" cases is claiming the lives of babies.

Cases of whooping cough - or pertussis - have rocketed since January.

In that time there have been 2,041 lab-confirmed cases, up from 207 cases and 30 confirmed in the lab last year.

Some tots too young to receive the pertussis vaccine are understood to have already passed away from the highly contagious bacterial infection.

Dr Liz Whittaker, of Imperial College London, explained: "We are seeing massive numbers of cases of pertussis at the moment".

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A heavy strain on fire staff

BRITAIN'S obesity crisis is taking its toll on firefighters who are having to take sick days due to the strain of lifting "plus-sized patients".

Dorset and Wiltshire Fire Service revealed six members of staff needed time off to recover after gruelling call-outs last year.

They assisted NHS colleagues 97 times with moving people who reportedly often weighed over 30st.

DWFRS area manager Darren Langdown said: "We attend this type of incident to support our NHS colleagues when there is a risk to life."

The Health Survey for England 2021 estimates 26% of UK adults are obese.

It's stop gear in 5 years

MANUAL gearboxes are set to reach the end of the road in five years.

The number of new models that are manuals has more than halved in six years, research reveals.

Out of 300 models currently available to UK buyers, only 89 are manuals - 18% fewer than last year.

At its current rate of decline, experts say that by 2029 the manual gearbox could be all but extinct.

The demise is being fuelled by electric vehicles, which all have automatic gearboxes. Chris Knapman, at CarGurus UK, said: "We could be approaching the end of the road for the manual gearbox."

Chimps lifelong learners

CHIMPANZEES, like humans, may be lifelong learners.


Boffins found the great apes continue to learn and hone their tool-using skills into adulthood.

Chimps were seen getting better at using their fingers to grip and manipulate their stick tools as they got older.

Another posted: "Border control E-gates not working at Stansted due to computer problem. Another warm welcome to the UK at a broken airport."

A Heathrow spokesperson said: "Border Force is currently experiencing a nationwide issue which is impacting passengers being processed through the border."

"Our teams are supporting Border Force with their contingency plans to help resolve the problem as quickly as possible and are on hand to provide passenger welfare. We apologise for any impact to passenger journeys."

Representatives of Manchester Airport and Gatwick both confirmed they were aware of the issue.

Over 270 E-gates were introduced at 15 air and rail ports in the UK to speed up entry.

Mother money worries

MOST new mums suffer financial stress in pregnancy and maternity leave.

Maternity Action said three out of five managed by using credit cards, while a similar number went back to work early – or planned to.

The charity, which has launched its manifesto to End Pregnancy Poverty, said only 13% of women on maternity leave benefit from employers' occupational maternity pay schemes, down from 44% in 2008.

It highlighted those unable to claim statutory maternity pay because of the nature of work contracts or self-employment.

Ros Bragg, at Maternity Action, said: "The low levels of maternity pay and benefits come as a huge shock to many trying to start families."

The Swiss Army Knife was created by Mr Elsener's great-grandfather, who landed a contract to supply knives to their military in 1891.

A WOMAN has admitted killing an 11-year-old neighbour while trying to eliminate bedbugs in her home.

Jesmin Akter, 33, scattered aluminium phosphide around her flat in November 2021.

The chemical was activated by moisture to create the gas phosphine, which can cause death within 12 to 24 hours.

It travelled to the apartment

Deadly phosphine gas caused cardiac arrest

above Akter's flat, poisoning Fatiha Sabrin.

Fatiha went into cardiac arrest and she died two weeks later in hospital - a day after her 11th

birthday. Akter admitted manslaughter when she appeared at the Old Bailey.

She denied a further charge of importing a regulated substance,

namely aluminium phosphide, from Italy without a licence. The chemical is used in the farming industry but in the UK requires a licence to keep and use.

Judge Alexia Durran told Akter: "Prosecution lawyers will tell your lawyers by Thursday, 16 May, if there needs to be a trial or not."

She bailed Akter, of Shadwell, east London, ahead of a further hearing on May 20.

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

A Wessex Water spokesman said: "The sensors use AI to correlate with public health measures that normally take 36 hours to test in a laboratory."


BOEING was forced to call off its first astronaut launch because of a valve problem on the rocket.

READING TEA LEAVES

TASSEOMANCY – using tea leaves for divination – is an old tradition. Any herbal tea will work, but you could use herbs that are thought to aid intuition and strengthen your powers of “second sight”. Valerian root can be particularly good because it helps to access hidden knowledge and other realms. The images you see in the tea leaves can help you divine messages and gain inspiration.

Source herbal teas from a reputable and ethical company or create your own blends using bought or home-dried herbs. If you don't have loose tea, tear open a tea bag.

- YOU WILL NEED:**
- One teaspoon black tea
 - A teapot, teacup and saucer

- One teaspoon valerian root
- One teaspoon camomile

READING THE LEAVES: Make your tea with loose leaves in a pot then pour into a cup without using a strainer. Allow the leaves to sink to the bottom. Enjoy your tea, while you relax and open your mind.



When there's only a little liquid left in the bottom of the cup, swirl it and turn upside down onto the saucer, letting the liquid drain away.

Turn the cup the right way up then look at the patterns and images formed by the tea leaves.

Use your intuition to interpret the images. You could look up traditional symbols and their meanings but above all else, trust your instincts.

Herb-leaf in magic?



ATTRACTING WEALTH



DRESSING a candle with herbs adds potency and infuses their energy into a spell. Each element here is chosen for its links with prosperity and abundance. Cinnamon is for success and power, while nutmeg is for good fortune and wealth. After casting the spell, don't be surprised if money becomes attracted to you. This might be in the form of a new work opportunity, promotion, gift or windfall.

YOU WILL NEED:

- A candle – green or gold are good money-attracting colours, as green is associated with luck and gold represents wealth
- One tbsp sunflower oil – sunflowers link to prosperity
- Six drops of essential oil – citrus fruits are symbols of abundance and good fortune, so drops of orange, lemon or bergamot will boost money attraction
- Six dried allspice berries (the number six is thought to be a money attracting number)
- Six small pieces broken from a cinnamon stick
- Six gratings of nutmeg
- A pestle and mortar

CASTING THE SPELL:

Grind the allspice, cinnamon and nutmeg with the pestle and mortar. Using the pin, scratch the surface of the candle with money symbols or words, for example £ or wealth. Dip your fingers into the oil and spread the oil along the length of the candle. Sprinkle the ground herbs onto a surface and roll the candle through it six times, pressing the candle into the powder to make it stick.

Burn your candle, while visualising money coming to you. Say: "Wealth and money flow to me, fortunate and prosperous I will be." You can also try grinding the herbs together in a clockwise motion (or "deosil", the direction used for attraction and drawing in).

Place the candle in the centre of the plate. Sprinkle the herbs around the candle. Light the candle and gaze into its flame, visualising strength, vitality and passion. Let the candle burn down and, while the puddle of wax is still soft, press some of the ground herbs into it. Put the wax and remaining herbs into the bag and tie tightly. Carry it with you, to draw upon the spell's energy.



NG IF you feel like you've had a run of bad luck, break it with the aid of nettles, which are valued for their curse-breaking qualities. Nettles grow in the wild from early spring then all summer. Forage in an area away from farmland, roads or paths frequented by dog walkers, so they won't have pesticides, roadside toxins or wee on them.

Pick the top of the stem with a few leaves from young plants around a foot tall, before they flower. Wear gloves to protect your hands from the stings.

YOU WILL NEED:

- One leek, chopped
- Three cloves of garlic, minced or finely chopped
- A knob of butter or a

tbsp of olive oil

- 450g nettle tops
- One litre of vegetable stock
- 100ml cream (dairy or plant-based)
- 400g potatoes, chopped

CASTING THE SPELL: Gently fry the leek and garlic in the butter or oil for 10 minutes. Add the potatoes and nettles

then fry for 2 minutes. Add the stock, cover and simmer for 15 minutes.

When cool, purée with a blender. Stir in the cream then season and reheat.

As you serve, say: "Power of nettle, as I swallow, break the curse, good luck to follow." *Herbal Magic is out now, published by Summersdale.*

Any idea who won Eurovision in 1973?
 OK, how about 1975?
 It's not a quiz question, there's no prize, I'm just curious.
 My guess, no disrespect, is you'd have to look it up. Which is fair enough.
 And yet the bunch who won in 1974 are always remembered and celebrated whenever the latest contest comes around.
 Year in, year out, Eurovision week always features some kind

of flashback to Abba's triumph in Brighton that year with Waterloo. Partly, I guess, because they went on to become pretty huge.
 But as we learn in **ABBA: AGAINST THE ODDS** (10.40pm, BBC One; 11.10pm in Wales, 11.40 in Northern Ireland), there was no guarantee this would happen. You may think: "Come on, it was Abba. They had catchy tunes and cheesy clobber. People loved that stuff in the Seventies."
 But actually lots of people didn't.
 Winning the contest proved both a blessing and a curse. There was a lot of snobbery. "If you're part of Eurovision, you're

dead afterwards," suggests the band's Benny Andersson. And their kitsch image? "We really suffered for that," recalls bandmate Bjorn Ulvaeus. Also, po-faced types reckoned Abba's frothy pop was insensitive. These, bear in mind, were troubled times. In Britain that year there was even talk of a military coup. I kid you not.
 One political campaigner talks of how distressing the world had become – then adds: "We were upset that Abba weren't upset."
 "There was a kind of progressive movement," suggests Bjorn, "that looked upon Abba as the Antichrist."


I look back and cringe because he was an incredible and eager lover. He was young and highly sexed and never let me down.

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Family's fight to tackle dementia

AT 39 years old, teacher John Jennings looks the picture of health.

But he is living with the knowledge that he has a 50:50 risk of developing dementia – in as little as 10 years from now.

His family was the first in the world to be diagnosed with hereditary early-onset Alzheimer's disease caused by a mutant gene – a story told in new BBC TV documentary, *The Jennings vs Alzheimer's*.

Now John is facing the scary prospect of having a test that would confirm if he is carrying the gene.

The threat hanging over his family has had a big impact on their lives.

John says: "I think about death a lot more than other people of my age."

"It's totally changed who I am as a person having this, and that's true for all of us."

"It's always been there, affecting our thoughts about mortality and the future."

It was John's campaigning mum Carol who helped identify a familial link in the disease.

She lobbied doctors back in the 1980s to investigate the issue, after her dad and four of his siblings all developed Alzheimer's at an early age.

Symptoms

Research eventually proved she was right and helped scientists understand the causes of the wider disease better.

At that time Carol, from Coventry, decided not to have a test for the gene, but tragically began developing symptoms of the disease in her early 50s.

She was formally diagnosed in 2012 and died in March this year at the age of 70.

Sadly, now John and his sister Emily, 42, have a 50% risk of getting early Alzheimer's, a progressive neurological condition causing symptoms like memory problems.

John first realized his extreme Alzheimer's risk as a teen.

He says: "It wasn't until mum started getting ill that it became very immediate."

"It was quite overwhelming to begin with."

"I don't think I'd really worked out what it would mean, slowly losing yourself."

"Seeing that happen with mum, I hated the idea that I wouldn't be able to read or express myself clearly."

John said the first sign that the usually outgoing Carol, married to Stuart, was falling victim to the disease was when

she started becoming more withdrawn socially.

He says: "The fear for me of being isolated like that is horrible, I hate it."

"For about six months, when she was still able to know what the diagnosis meant, she was really upset."

John feels he will probably have the test to find out if he will develop it too.

He is currently weighing up the pros and cons with his sister, admitting: "I'm getting more certain I will take it fairly soon."

His main motivation is that it could eventually make him eligible to be put on pioneering new drugs.

These zap amyloid plaques – now known to build up in the brain of those affected – slowing the progression of Alzheimer's. He explains: "I'm totally convinced that if I was on them now, I would never get ill."

John suspects that he does have the mutant gene and naturally worries about any potential symptoms.

He says: "It's not so much forgetting things... there are times when I'm just



not switched on and I feel like that's what it feels like in the early stages."

To keep his brain healthy, John takes a host of supplements and learns different languages.

So, what if the test is positive?

John, who lives in Edinburgh with husband Matt, 38, says he might consider assisted dying in the future, but won't change his lifestyle.

He says: "Our life is great; we travel and have loads of friends."

Meanwhile, he's proud of the breakthroughs his mum Carol helped achieve and has an annual MRI himself to help

scientists with further research.

John is also hopeful that new drugs will help develop a "cure" for Alzheimer's in the future and his niece Eleanor, now eight, will be spared the trauma that has affected the rest of the family.

He adds: "I'm optimistic for the future."



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

'The Warrior', 32, clinched his maiden world crown with a fine 18-14 victory over surprise package Jak Jones on Monday night.

All of his family's sacrifices paid off as he lifted the treasured trophy aloft with tears in his eyes.

His parents bought a derelict house, which had not been lived in for 40 years, because it had the potential to build a snooker room in.

And they had to remortgage multiple times to fund Wilson's development in the early days.

"It's like a Rocky Balboa story," said Wilson, who came close to walking away from snooker in 2013.

"I've had to dig in and go back to the gritty gym and find myself again.

"I remember two years I couldn't get

through Q School. Sophie (his wife) looked at me and said, 'If you don't do it this year we'll have to look at alternatives. You have to live.

"The setbacks have made me stronger. I said a while ago that I'd be disappointed if I only landed one.

"I believe I can become a multiple world champion.

"This first one must be the hardest one to win, surely?"

"I hope it's the hardest to get off your back. Now I've done that no one can take that away from me.

"I can build a legacy in this sport and that's something I would like to have a good crack at now I've got this one out of the way.

"You sort of hunt for your first Triple Crown event and there's

no better Triple Crown event to land as your first one than the World Championship."

Wilson has time on his side to rack up the game's grandest gongs.

Rivals Ronnie O'Sullivan, John Higgins and Mark Williams are all nearing 50, while Mark Selby, Neil Robertson and Shaun Murphy are in their early 40s.

Judd Trump, 34, and Mark Allen, 38, look set to be his biggest challengers.

"I'll relish every single opportunity of being world champion," added Wilson after his maiden major title banked him £500,000.

"Being world No.1 is something that's high on the agenda. It's something I want to tick off the list.

"If you can be remembered as a world champion and world No.1,


you've conquered it for me." After fueling his title tilt with salmon and deep sleep, alongside the help of a hypnotherapist, Wilson partied into the early hours - until an impromptu fire alarm drew proceedings to a premature 5am close in Sheffield.

Arm in arm with brother Taylor, his manager who has been by his side on the tour for many years, renditions of "We are the champions" rang out at the annual Champion's Reception.

And after putting in blood, sweat and tears from the age of six to scale the Crucible mountain, Wilson tightly gripped the iconic trophy for most of the night.

"Sophie knows her place," said Wilson. "There's only one lady that's coming to bed with me - and that's the silver lady on top of the trophy!"

MAX VERSTAPPEN can use his relationship with Red Bull super advisor Helmut Marko to walk away from the team whenever he wants.

The Dutchman has been linked with an exit for months, ever since Red Bull's internal conflict became public.

In the media, he has consistently said he has no immediate plans to leave the Formula One championships with whom he has a contract until 2028.

But he has been unsettled ever since civil war broke out between his ally Marko and team principal Christian Horner.

Verstappen, 26, is also said to have concerns about how competitive Red Bull's 2026 engines will be.

Rival F1 teams would fall over themselves to secure his signature if he became available and Verstappen has a clause in his contract which allows him to leave in the event that Marko, 80, heads through the exit door.

It is understood the Austrian used his position as a director of the racing team to insert that clause into Verstappen's deal late last year.

It was supposedly done without the knowledge of anyone working for either the race team or the parent company, including Horner, who insists he does not anticipate an exodus of top staff in the coming months.

"We came here for redemption, really," he said. "I think we had a point to prove in this game after recent weeks and we did that definitely. We came here with a plan

and we had to come here to turn things around, especially at Anfield.

"The home crowd were behind us from the first minute and the boys showed that."

Saka's loving thrill of the title chase

BUKAYO SAKA says the pain of Arsenal's title blow-out last season has driven their "beautiful challenge" of going one step further this year.

But the Gunners may need to blank the crushing disappointment of another near-miss on the last day of term if Manchester City take it to the wire again.

England winger Saka has contributed the most goals (16), assists (nine) and touches in the opposition box (280) in Arsenal's latest climb to the Premier League summit.

And they know the title race will go to the final day if they beat crisis-torn Manchester United at Old Trafford on Sunday.

However, Saka insists they are relishing the white-knuckle ride, instead of bottling it or being frustrated by the outcome being out of their hands.

The England star said: "You can see it in two ways. You can either view it as frustrating or as a beautiful challenge."

"Everybody knows they (City) are one of the best teams in the world and they have been on top for five years, challenging for everything, so for ourselves to be up there competing with them is good.

"We're pushing them the whole way, and let's see what happens.

"But we are not getting frustrated - we see it as a challenge that we want to fight until the end. They have set a standard and it's up to the rest of us to try and be better than them.

"The pain of last year has brought us together and we are so hungry to go one step further this year, but also in future years, too.

"We are young, we are hungry, we've got quality and we have many more years ahead of us and we'll have lots of experiences together.

"The end of last season has made us stronger, made us hungrier and the squad is a lot stronger, too.

"The new signings have had a big impact. We have been so consistent this year, not conceded many goals, only lost once in the league, so we want to continue that."

Saka, still only 22, has hit 20 goals at home and in Europe for the first time in his career, despite being the Premier League's most-fouled player, which has led to Arsenal making an official complaint to referees' union PGMOL to demand more protection.

Gunners legend Bob Wilson (inset) even warned Saka could be forced to retire early if he is repeatedly kicked by defenders ill-equipped to stop him by legitimate means. But Saka said: "I try

to avoid the big tackles, so I think I'm much smarter now, as well as being more physical.

"It's just the hunger to win that keeps me going.

"I feel like I'm physically much stronger than I was four or five years ago. I've got more experience now, in terms of knowing which tackles to go through and which ones to jump.

"If I stay on the floor, then it can disrupt the momentum we have built up, so I just try to get on with it."

This is the fourth season in a row Saka has played more than 50 games for club and country. After 14 years at Arsenal as man and boy, in Saturday's match-day programme he defined the club in three words: "Family, hunger, quality."

But City are old hands at holding their nerve. They denied Manchester United at the death in 2012, while Liverpool's 97 points was not enough in 2019 and 92 two years ago.

Then, last season, Arsenal finished empty-handed despite spending 248 days at the top. And unless Pep Guardiola's men stumble, the Gunners' season will be defined by three more cruel words: Another near miss.

Rosenior a thorny issue still

The 38-year-old, who was in charge of Cambridge for three and a half years before losing his job in November, has signed a two-year deal at Priestfield.


Bonner succeeds Stephen Clemence, whose six-month stint at the helm ended last month after the Gills finished the season in 12th place in League Two.

Ten Hag vibe all wrong... he just doesn't fit club

ERIK TEN HAG was branded "delusional" as the beleaguered Manchester United boss slipped closer to the sack.

United's 4-0 mauling at Crystal Palace on Monday was their 13th league defeat of the season - the most they have suffered in the Premier League era.

It left United down in eighth place, with a Champions League place already gone and now the very real danger of missing out on a European position altogether next season.

Against that backdrop, former United striker Teddy Sheringham, one of the heroes of their 1999 Treble triumph, accused Ten Hag of losing the plot and claimed his old club is "broken".

"If your leader, the manager, is not leading in the right way, other people follow that standard," said Sheringham. "Ten Hag isn't leading from the front.

"I know he's had some difficult decisions to make with certain players, but for some reason he just doesn't come across with the personality required to take United forward.

"It's all a little bit dreary. He's trying to pull the wool over the eyes of the journalists when he says the club are doing well and controlled the game - what game is he watching? It's delusional.



TEDDY SHERINGHAM'S BRUTAL VERDICT

He's giving out the wrong vibes as the leader of United.

"I just don't see any improvement in any area under Erik ten Hag.

"When you look at the likes of Arsenal and Manchester City, even Liverpool to a lesser extent, their players are playing with full confidence.

"They understand what the manager wants and they deliver that. Those are well-oiled teams.

"When you look at United, it looks broken. The team is fractured. One person is closing down, the other one is sitting off. It just doesn't look right. That's down to the manager."

Sheringham's blunt views on Ten Hag were echoed by another two former United players, Michael Owen and Paul Scholes, both of whom feel he is on his way - maybe before the season ends.

"I've been saying for a while that Ten Hag is not the right man for this job," said Owen. "He cannot, simply cannot, manage the team next season. They've got an

FA Cup final and a few important games that could mean European football next season or not.

"At some point you've got to make a decision. They're going to get absolutely hammered by Manchester City. They're going to get annihilated.

"In fact, Arsenal will smash them to bits at Old Trafford, Newcastle will probably beat them and I wouldn't even fancy them at Brighton either.

"They might not get anything out of the rest of the season.

"I just wonder, with so much at stake, even though it's only for four games, if the board might just try to do something here and now, and be quite radical about it?"

Scholes felt United's emphatic defeat at Palace had echoes of Ole Gunnar Solskjaer's last game in charge, a 4-1 hammering at Watford in 2021.

"It almost felt like a final nail in the coffin," said Scholes.

"I felt for a while he might get another year and work for a club that has calmed down a little by the new owners, but it doesn't feel like that. It's quite plain he's on borrowed time.

"I remember Ole at Watford, it felt very similar to me - it felt like the end."

THE most Manchester United player on the pitch at Selhurst Park on Monday night was wearing a Crystal Palace shirt.

Michael Olise not only scored two goals in the 4-0 thrashing, he caused a buzz of excitement every time he touched the ball.

One passage of play in the first half summed up the one-sided match.

Olise shrugged off Antony by the touchline and ghosted past Christian Eriksen with an audacious stepover before launching another attack. The cameo caused an instant

standing ovation. He has the kind of class and confidence to follow in the footsteps of United superstars like George Best and Cristiano Ronaldo.

Along with Eberechi Eze, he has formed a deadly attacking duo behind Jean-Philippe Mateta which ran the United rearguard ragged.

Sky Sports pundit Jamie Carragher said: "In Eze and Olise, Crystal Palace have got two players that would walk into Manchester United's team. Under Oliver Glasner, they have been brilliant."

Palace's Tyrick Mitchell added: "Michael's a quality player. You can see that he's a talent, a gifted footballer."

Sir Jim Ratcliffe's INEOS – the new co-owners at Old Trafford – will be basing future transfers on stats. And Olise's numbers are impressive.

In his last 13 Premier League starts, he has been involved in 14 goals (nine goals, five assists). And he netted in each of his last six home league games. Eze, who scored the winner

at Liverpool last month, said: "He brings a lot. You want to play with players like this and the quality he has is incredible. We enjoy playing together."

The Hammersmith-born star, who has opted to play for France, does not seek the limelight and his rare interviews are usually alongside his friend Eze.

On the pitch, when the pair start together, the Eagles score an average of 0.5 more goals per game.

"When we do play together, we enjoy it a lot," Olise told Sky Sports in their joint post-match interview.

He turned down a £35m move last summer, when Chelsea activated his buyout clause, to sign a new deal.

Olise will now cost more than £60m. That is a bargain compared to the £82m spent on Antony and the £72m on Jadon Sancho by United.

New Eagles boss Glasner said: "It's the job of the club to keep all the players. I know they'll try everything possible. They're amazing players, this is an amazing group."
