



Dozens hurt as police break up lawyers' protest

- Lahore Bar organises rally against LHC's decision to move civil courts to Model Town
- Police round up dozens; law minister urges CM to release lawyers, both favour talks to resolve issues

LAHORE: As scores of lawyers converged on The Mall to lodge their protest against the decision to shift civil courts from Aban-e-Adl on Lower Mall to Model Town, the police used teargas, baton-charges, and water cannons to disperse them, prompting violent clashes outside the Lahore High Court (LHC).

Dozens of people on both sides suffered injuries during the confrontation while several lawyers, including women, were taken into custody.

The police contingent clad in anti-riot gear was on standby when the procession organised by the Lahore Bar Association reached the GPO Chowk on The Mall.

The lawyers had planned to enter the high court to lodge their protest against the LHC chief justice's decision to 'unilaterally' shift the courts from Lower Mall to Model Town.

However, their attempt to enter the LHC premises, which were barricaded by the law enforcers with an 'iron fence' and the main entrance shut, met with batons, as the police used force to disperse them. The lawyers also chanted slogans against the chief justice and the police.

In the ensuing clashes in which media persons were also affected, dozens of protesters, including women lawyers, were rounded up and several received 'minor injuries'. On the other hand, the police claimed that they were pelted with stones which injured over a dozen officials, including two SPs, one DSP, and two SHO's.

The Mall Road from Chairing Cross to Intanah Chowk remained a no-go area for commuters for hours due to the police-lawyers clash.

In a bid to control the situation, Pakistan Bar Council's member Akram Bhatti negotiated with the

police officers and warned them against using force to disperse the lawyers allegedly at the behest of the LHC chief justice. He assured the police that lawyers would remain peaceful if allowed to enter the high court. However, the police did not agree to the demand.

The members of the LBA have been observing protests since December last year when then chief justice

Muhammad Ameer Bharti issued a "unilateral" notification about the shifting of the courts. Due to the protest, the case filing branch at the civil court remained shut for at least 71 days causing problems to litigants and lawyers.

In March, the Punjab Bar Council temporarily called off the protest as a 'goodwill gesture' to Chief Justice Malik Shahzad Ahmad Khan hoping for a positive response from the new head of the Punjab judiciary. However, contrary to the expectation, the bar got a 'cold shoulder' from Chief Justice Khan as well, and the dispute could not inch towards any resolution.

Consequently, a joint action committee (JAC) was formed, comprising elected leaders of different bar associations and councils to chalk out a policy. Wednesday's protest rally was announced by the JAC.

The protesting lawyers also demanded the withdrawal of terrorism cases registered against their colleagues, apparently affiliated with the PTI who were arrested in the wake of the crackdown on the political party. Some of these lawyers are on bail while some others have been

Imran refuses to tender apology over May riots

- Says ready to face inquiry into 2014 dharna • Alvi says those having 'real power' should initiate dialogue

ISLAMABAD: Former prime minister Imran Khan on Wednesday refused to apologise for the May 9 riots and said he is ready to face inquiry into the riots that his PTI staged in 2014.

He was speaking to the media after the court proceedings in the 2150 million corruption case at Adiala jail. When asked whether he would apologise for the May 9 violent protest, Mr Khan replied in the negative, saying he was under detention at the time and was unaware of those protests.

The spokesman mentioned that he became aware of the protests when he appeared before the then chief justice of Pakistan, Umar Ata Bandial.

"I had already condemned those violent protests," he added.

It may be mentioned that a day earlier, the director general of Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) ruled out dialogue with PTI unless the party leadership tendered a public apology over the May 9 protests.

Mr Khan further said that if the establishment is not interested in dialogue,

PTI will not pursue it either.

According to the former premier, he wanted dialogue for the sake of Pakistan, not to strike a deal for personal favours.

However, he clarified that he has no issue with the army as his close relatives are serving in the armed forces and bureaucracy.

inquiry into the 2014 riots and stated that he would gladly appear before the inquiry committee.

He further said that the allegations levelled against him in connection with the 2014 riots had proved to be wrong. Mr Khan stated that the riots were staged to protest the 2013 elections, adding that the 2024 elections are also fraudulent, as the former caretaker prime minister has also disclosed information about Form-47.

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Six terrorists killed, arms seized in KP, says ISPR

PESHAWAR: Six terrorists were killed and weapons recovered from their possession by security forces in operations carried out in two southern districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on Wednesday, the military's media wing said.

A statement issued by the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said that the first operation was carried out following the reported presence of terrorists in Dera Ismail Khan. The security forces planned an intelligence-based operation (IBO) and five terrorists were successfully neutralised during the operation, it added.

The ISPR statement said that another gun battle took place in North Waziristan district during which security forces effectively engaged a terrorist location and killed a terrorist (identified as Ismailullah).

Security forces recovered weapons, ammunition and explosives from the possession of terrorists who, the ISPR added, remained actively involved in numerous militant activities against security forces as well as innocent civilians.

"Sanitisation operation is being carried out to eliminate any other terrorist found in the area as the security forces are determined to wipe out the menace of terrorism from the country," the statement said.

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Electricity tariff for March raised by Rs2.84

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) on Wednesday notified an additional fuel cost adjustment (FCA) of Rs2.84 per unit for electricity consumed in March, to extract about Rs23 billion from consumers of on-Wapda distribution companies (Discos) during the current month.

According to an order issued by the regulator, Nepra "has reviewed and assessed a National Average Uniform Increase of Rs2.8322/kWh in the applicable tariff for NW10000 on account of variations in the fuel charges for the month of March 2024".

The net increase in tariff due to the FCA impact would be about Rs5 per unit because of its partial split over to the quarterly tariff adjustment (QTA) to follow later.

The "adjustment of Rs2.8322/kWh shall be applicable to all consumer categories except electric vehicle charging stations (EVCS) and lifeline consumers. The said adjustment shall be shown separately in the consumers' bills" based on units

Govt dedicates May 9 anniversary to martyrs

ISLAMABAD: As it aims to mark the first anniversary of the May 9 violence which targeted military installations and monuments of martyrs, the government has decided to commemorate the day in solidarity with martyrs and their families.

On the other hand, opposi-

tion Pakistan, Tehreek-e-Insaf, which was at the receiving end after the May 9 riots, has planned to organise gatherings across the country to express solidarity with its incarcerated leader Imran Khan, whose brief arrest on the fateful day triggered countrywide violence.

The government is observing the day with the slogan "May 9, never again".

In order to counter PTI's protests, authorities in

ing of the federal cabinet while the information ministry will organise a special function — to be addressed by the premier — at the Jinnah Convention

In the lead up to the May 9 anniversary, electronic media continue to broadcast advertisements revealing violent protests, mobo clashing with the police, attacking and storming the General Headquarters in Rawalpindi and vandalising

the Lahore corps commander's residence.

Munawwar, President Asif Ali Zardari said in a statement that May 9 will always be remembered as a dark day in Pakistan's history when a "politically instigated mobo ran amok", damaging public property and military installations.

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Proposal to set up medical colleges in five dists reviewed

LAHORE: A proposal to establish medical colleges in Attock, Marwat, Vehari, Bhakkar and Jhelum with the help of public-private partnership was reviewed at a meeting presided over by Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz here on Wednesday.

The chief minister criticised the previous government for not addressing health issues during its tenure.

As the chief minister expressed her indignation over Rs4 billion loss caused to the national exchequer in the Murree hospital project during the previous government's tenure, the meeting decided to take legal action against those responsible for it.

"It is our duty to safeguard people's money and we cannot permit its loss. We want to establish state-of-the-art health facilities for the people in every district. We will provide high-quality treatment facilities to the common man," she said.

A briefing was given to the chief minister on the construction and rehabilitation of hospitals, 'Clinic on Wheels' free medicines and other matters. She also reviewed health sector reforms.

The chief minister ordered early completion of the projects envisaging upgrade of 2,500 basic health units (BHUs) and 300 rural health centres (RHCs).

She directed the officials concerned to take prompt measures for the establishment of a new hospital in Murree and provision of angiography machines in Jhelum, Attock, Marwat, Murree, Bahawal and Sukkot.

SBP promises to rectify Urdu text errors in currency

LAHORE: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has admitted various mistakes in the Urdu text on currency notes and assured the federal ombudsman of correcting those in the upcoming new banknote series.

The mistakes/omissions were pointed out in a complaint filed by a citizen to the ombudsman.

In his complaint, Shabaz Hussain Pasha, a member of Pakistan Writers Guild, pointed out mistakes in the Urdu text (Bank Dastak Pakistan, rupiya, Haseel Haseer to Mustafa per Ada Karyi Ga and Hakeem-e-Pakistan ki Zameenat se Jari Hua) while quoting various redactions and books.

According to the verdict announced

by the ombudsman, the complaint alleging maladministration on the part of SBP stated that the bank was not ready to correct Urdu texts appeared on bank notes. After being disappointed by the SBP, the complainant approached the ombudsman for redressal of his grievance. A copy of complaint was also forwarded to the SBP which, later, submitted that it has initiated the design work for the issuance of new series of banknotes and it would look into the suggestions and observations made by the complainant while finalising the Urdu texts.

Both the parties were heard in detail and record was examined carefully. And during the hearing, the suggestions of the complainant were found valuable.

"During investigation of the instant

case, the representative of the agency (SBP) admitted omission and undertook that the agency would look into the suggestions and observations made by the complainant while finalising the Urdu text on its new banknote series. On the assurance of the agency, the complainant showed satisfaction," reads the verdict.

"The agency is advised to submit compliance report within 60 days," it directs the SBP.

On the other hand, in a letter to the complainant, the SBP through its joint director also pledged to take remedial measures in this regard.

"As discussed, the SBP will look into the suggestions/observations made by your good self while finalising the Urdu text for our new banknote series," the letter states.

Parvez Elahi shifted to Kot Lakhpat jail

LAHORE: The government on Wednesday shifted Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf President Chaudhry Parvez Elahi to Kot Lakhpat Jail, Lahore.

Recently, the IHC directed the interior secretary to decide an application seeking a court decree to declare the residence of former chief minister of Punjab Parvez Elahi as a sub-jail and his subsequent shifting there.

Justice Arshad Mohammad Tahir was hearing a petition filed by Mr Elahi's spouse, who contended that the PFI president could be detained in his residence for health reasons.

A medical board constituted to ascertain his health condition advised that the former chief minister be kept in Rawalpindi prison, and that he should not travel.

Reacting to PFI president's shifting to the jail, his wife Qasim Elahi said in statement on Wednesday, "The interior secretary didn't follow Islamabad High Court's order and shifted Parvez Elahi from Islamabad territory to Lahore's Kot Lakhpat Jail."

"This step of the ministry of interior is clearly against the decision of the Islamabad High Court. Immediate action should be ensured according to the order of IHC," she demanded.

Earlier, in the letters addressed to the interior secretary and Punjab's additional chief secretary home, Mr Elahi's spouse wrote, "In view of his peculiar health condition, injuries, and on humanitarian grounds, my husband, Parvez Elahi, be taken out of jail premises and put under house arrest at Islamabad or Lahore immediately."

The court noted that Mr Elahi is not a convict, and the right to life of an undersheriff prisoner, guaranteed by the Constitution, supersedes the obligation of the state to try him for an alleged offence. The court directed the interior secretary to consider the application of the petitioner and pass appropriate orders if the matter falls within his competency; otherwise, the matter will be referred to the appropriate forum within two days.—Staff Reporter

Man, two robbers killed in gun battle

NAROWAL: Three people, including a citizen and two robbers, were killed and another injured in exchange of firing in Shekhupura on Wednesday.

Reports said during a robbery, a man was killed, and another injured. Two robbers were killed due to retaliatory gunfire from the people.

Waqas Ali and Waqar Abbas were stopped by robbers at Khanpur Canal. During the robbery, gunfire erupted, resulting in serious injuries to both men. Waqas Ali succumbed to his injuries on the spot, while Waqar Abbas was shifted to District Headquarters Hospital by Rescue 1122.

In the meantime, residents from nearby villages surrounded the robbers, leading to a crossfire in which both assailants were killed.

According to Rescue 1122, the suspects have been identified as Afzal Shaukat and Shahbaz.

Rescue 1122 has shifted the three bodies to Shekhupura DHO Hospital. ASI Muhammad Yunus said no FIR was registered so far.

Panel decides to deploy Rangers at two police posts

DERA GHAAZI KHAN: A meeting of the divisional intelligence committee held at the commissioner office on Wednesday decided deployment of Rangers at two inter-provincial police posts, including terrorist hot spots.

Director General of Police Punjab, Khalid bin Waleed (Lahore) and Director General of Police Punjab, Khalid bin Waleed (Lahore) were present at the meeting.

During the meeting, the director general of police Punjab, Khalid bin Waleed, decided to deploy Rangers at two inter-provincial police posts, including terrorist hot spots.

Divisional heads of security agencies, including district police officers and deputy commissioners from all districts of Dera Ghazi Khan division, also participated.

A detailed review of security measures in the tri-border areas, the security of inter-provincial check posts, threat alerts, and challenges was conducted.

It was decided to deploy Rangers at Rana Umar Farooq (Jhang) and Rana Khalid bin Waleed (Lahore) posts to enhance provincial boundary security.

Directives were issued to tighten security further at inter-provincial check posts, facilitate timely information exchange among law-enforcement agencies, and ensure quick responses to emergencies. During the meeting, threats were paid to the Punjab police for regaining the terrorist attack on the Jhang check post.

DGP Sajjad Hasan Khan instructed all DPOs to proactively address threat alerts and challenges, conduct on-ground self-

inspections, and maintain readiness for emergencies. Mock exercises for immediate responses should be conducted, and coordination with other agencies should be prioritised.

The DPOs should complete the ongoing construction work at the check posts as soon as possible, complete surveillance with thermal dome cameras and the jammers posted on duty should be kept alert at all times.

During the meeting, Commissioner Dr. Nasir Mahmood said the government was providing all the resources including modern weapons, bullet proof and armoured vehicles at the inter-provincial check posts.

Roads would be reconstructed as directed by the government to ease traffic in tri-border areas.

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Revisiting Lahore cinema and dismantling language through art

LAHORE: A character, a dishard fan of Sachin Rishi, in the short film and installation, remembers the time when a movie ticket used to cost just Rs5 in Lahore, lamenting that things have changed now.

While the film shows the condition of historical cinemas that are disappearing now, Naseem Begum's song Jidda Di Tu Jary, Jiddi Gai Muk Jary from the 1947 Punjab film *Mera Fero* plays in the background.

These scenes are from the video installation, *Cinematic Catastrophe*, by Naseem Begum, in the group show of artworks and multimedia by six artists, titled *Hein Karamb Karch-Ah Mohabbat Chhap Aghay*, at Tallinn School of the National College of Arts (NCA).

Cinema says his work aims at looking for a sustainable model to bring cinema back to all segments of society, not only multiplexes for the elite. "It would be 'cinema-on-wheels'. We are acquiring a container in which 20 to 25 people would be able to sit and enjoy a movie on screen. We would take this cinema to the suburbs."

Naseem has plans to extend his research based on this project to see whether a new sustainable model for cinema could be created in Punjab once again to attract investors for producing films and to make the films accessible to the poor segments of society. He is documenting the old traditional cinemas of Lahore that are being dismantled or have been abandoned.

Multimedia artist Samul Nasir has displayed her body of work, titled 'Nery for inconvenience. But this is a rebellion,' exploring the relationship between language, power and resistance and a woman's place in it. She has literally deconstructed the legal terms in dictionaries, defining the role of women in the country. By using old pictures from the newspapers and pages

of dictionaries, she has turned them into pieces of art to highlight the women's struggle for their rights, another take on feminism.

"By using the law dictionary in my work, I am literally and visually deconstructing it. By using the printmaking technique I have dismantled the pictures, terms and words to highlight their arbitrary and fluid nature," she says.

Nasir has taken words from a law book and turned them into a piece of art. "That's my rebellion," she declares. She says that she wants to show that there are more words of a language which can be reinterpreted and reinvented to give a new meaning to them according to your will. Even legal terms and words taken as text in law are reinterpreted and changed according to our own whims, she asserts.

Uman Rama has installed his 'visual representation of Sine wave frequencies with salt on aluminium'. He says his installation is about visual representation of Sine frequencies using different materials. "I chose to use aluminium as my surface and table salt as my medium. By doing so, I invite the audience to delve deeper into rulers and beyond the perception of sound," he says. In Rama's installation, salt on the surface creates different patterns as triggered by different frequencies of sound.

"The patterns are different because every frequency creates a separate pattern and energy. Every sound, even the human sound, differs from person to person. So does every note on a musical instrument, eg the sound of a Bansuri or Sarangi makes different patterns as they have different frequencies," he explains.

The other artists whose work are a part of the exhibition are Nadia Zafar, Faris Rashid and Hira Gul. The exhibition was inaugurated by NCA Vice-Chancellor Murtaza Jaffri. It will continue till Friday tomorrow.

Lawyers go on nationwide strike against police today

- Legal fraternity to stage marches and rallies in protest against Punjab 'police brutality'
- Demand immediate action by federal and Punjab govts
- SCBA president says CJP not in favour of interference in high court affairs

ISLAMABAD: Declaring a black day, the Pakistan Bar Council (PBC) and the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) on Wednesday issued a full-day nationwide strike call for all courts, including the Supreme Court, high courts, and subordinate judiciary on Thursday (today).

The strike call has been issued to show solidarity with the legal fraternity after what they called disturbing events of Punjab police brutality against lawyers who were peacefully protesting the "unilateral divisions" of the civil courts in Lahore.

A delegation consisting of SCBA President Shaukat Shaukat and Secretary Syed Ali Imran also called on Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa. Mr Shaukat urged the CJP to take immediate cognisance of the matter by taking suo motu notice for amicable resolution of the issue. However, he told the media later that the CJP believes that the Supreme Court should not interfere in the affairs of the high courts.

In confirmation of the illegal and unlawful acts by the Punjab police, lawyers across the country will stage a complete strike and will abstain from appearing in courts to demonstrate solidarity with the advocates of the Lahore Bar Association. Additionally, they will convene protest meetings, marches, and rallies in their respective bar rooms to express their dissent on this matter.

Mr Shaukat cautioned that they should not be forced to disclose how the Punjab government was installed on a 'take mandate' and said the lawyer's body also unable to understand the alleged agenda of

the chief justice of Lahore High Court (LHC).

Meanwhile, PBC's vice-chairman Riazat Ali Sahar vehemently condemned the reprehensible police brutality inflicted upon lawyers in Lahore on Wednesday. The lawyers were engaged in a peaceful protest against the notification to transfer cases to the "Model Town katchery" and the "unjustified registration of terrorism cases" against their fraternity.

The incident occurred at Mall Road, near LHC, where the police initiated violence and scuffles against the lawyers, subjecting them to brutal treatment and arresting several individuals, he said.

The vice-chairman emphasised that every individual, including lawyers, possesses the fundamental right to engage in peaceful protest.

He underscored that PBC cannot ignore such flagrant acts of police brutality perpetrated against advocates.

He strongly criticised the excessive and unwarranted use of police force against lawyers, denouncing it as a shameful and perpetrated by the police and a grave violation of their dignity and discipline.

The brutal conduct exhibited by the Punjab police has tarnished the dignity and respect of lawyers, who have consistently advocated for the rule of law and the supremacy of the Constitution. Such egregious behaviour demands immediate and severe action against the responsible police officials, he said.

He has, therefore, demanded immediate and decisive action from both the federal and Punjab governments, along with senior police officers, to address the involvement of police officials in this shameful and inhuman act and urged for

exemplary punishment to be meted out to those responsible.

Furthermore, he emphasised the need to prevent any recurrence of such actions in the future, saying failure to do so may lead lawyers across the country to hold the said individuals accountable.

He also expressed disappointment towards chief justice of LHC, stating the failure to resolve the longstanding issue through peaceful negotiation has contributed to the current situation.

Meanwhile, Mr Shaukat and Secretary Syed Ali Imran registered that numerous lawyers have reportedly sustained serious injuries and many have been unjustly detained. They have demanded immediate medical attention for the wounded and the prompt release of the arrested lawyers.

While expressing solidarity with the lawyers' and their just stance against the divisions of civil courts in Lahore, they have also strongly condemned and criticised the inept handling of this very sensitive matter by LHC chief justice who failed to resolve the issue despite repeated appeals from the bar.

Arrests of peaceful lawyers were a clear infringement of the principles of democracy, freedom of expression, and the right to dissent. Being citizens of this country, everyone's rights are protected under Article 4 read with Article 9, Article 10-A, Article 14 and Article 19 of the Constitution, they opined.

In the end, they have warned that for no one be mistaken, if the police brutality continues unchecked and the lawyers' just and fair demands remain unmet, this protest will escalate into a nationwide movement, with SCBA spearheading the call for nationwide action.

Two benches formed to hear judges' complaints

IHC registrar office to notify hearing within a couple of days

ISLAMABAD: Chief Justice of Islamabad High Court (IHC) Justice Asim Farooq on Wednesday constituted two different larger benches to hear complaints of senior justice judge Justice Mohsin Akhtar Kayani and Justice Babar Sattar.

According to a senior official of the court, the bench comprising CJ Farooq, Justice Mansoor Hameed Azeem and Justice Arshad Muhammad Tahir will hear the complaint of Justice Kayani.

Another larger bench comprising Justice Kayani and Justice Tariq Mahmood Jhangrani will hear the complaint of Justice Sattar.

The IHC registrar office would notify the date of hearing in a couple of days.

According to the sources, the senior justice judge in addition to a

recent assigned complaint of so-called affected judges of the district judiciary filed against him also referred a Ylog and a television programme in which lawyer Mohammad Waqas Malik in an interview criticised the judge.

Advocate Malik also filed a reference against Justice Kayani in the Supreme Judicial Council (SJC) a couple of days after six judges wrote a letter to the Supreme Court against meddling of intelligence agencies in the judicial affairs.

Advocate Malik is a former general secretary of Islamabad High Court Bar Association and alleged in the reference that Justice Kayani "waged a war against the forces of Pakistan in a planned manner by inducing and convincing other judges of the high court".

The assigned complaint filed against Justice Kayani last week stated that the judge was biased against the judges who joined the Islamabad's subordinate judiciary from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The complaint also named certain lawyers who were the associates of Justice Kayani while he was a

practising lawyer.

According to the sources, Justice Sattar in the complaint had requested IHC Chief Justice Asim Farooq for initiating contempt proceedings after personal details of his and his family, including their US residence permits, were posted online.

Justice Sattar pointed out that the privacy of his family members was breached, and their identity cards and permanent residency card were uploaded on social media. On April 28, the IHC's public relations office issued a statement in response to the social media campaign, calling it "false, malicious and contemptuous".

The press release stated that the judge was also accused of hiding assets in both Pakistan and the US.

"Justice Babar Sattar has never had any nationality other than that of Pakistan," the IHC clarified, adding that while Justice Sattar worked as a lawyer in New York and was granted a green card, he left his job in the US in 2005 and returned to Pakistan and has lived and worked in Pakistan since then.

Pakistan, Uzbekistan vow early work on rail project

Uzbek FM Bakhtiyor meets PM Shehbaz, FM Dar

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Uzbekistan on Wednesday underscored their commitment to the swift completion of the planned railway link that will traverse Afghanistan, connecting the two countries and promising to enhance regional connectivity and trade opportunities.

Foreign Office, in a media statement after a meeting between visiting Foreign Minister of Uzbekistan Bakhtiyor Salov and Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Naveed Ishaq Dar said, "The two sides reaffirmed commitment to early implementation of the Uzbekistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan Railways project, which would give boost to bilateral and regional trade and become a bridge between South and Central Asia."

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in his meeting with FM Salov also emphasised the importance of the railway project and Pakistan's commitment to its swift completion.

Pakistan, Uzbekistan and Afghanistan had in February 2021 agreed to build a railway line across Afghanistan to connect Central Asia with Pakistani ports at an estimated cost of \$4.8bn. In July last year, the three countries signed a protocol during their meeting in Pakistan that delineated the route of the project run-

ning from Termez, Uzbekistan, Afghanistan's Mazari-Sharif and Leger provinces, and culminating in Pakistan via the Kharakchi border crossing in the Kurram district.

The railway project, spanning 760kms, is scheduled for completion by the end of 2027, with the capability to transport up to 15 million tonnes of goods annually by 2030. This rail link will notably decrease cargo delivery time between Uzbekistan and Pakistan by around five days, while also slashing transportation costs by at least 40 per cent.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, according to PMO, expressed Pakistan's commitment to working with Uzbekistan to speed up and complete all bilateral trade and connectivity projects.

He reaffirmed Pakistan's readiness to provide access to Uzbekistan to Pakistani ports.

At the bilateral meeting, the two sides discussed at length bilateral economic cooperation, trade, investment and connectivity.

They noted that following operationalisation of Transit Trade Agreement, bilateral trade has increased 1.4 times during the previous year and from the potential to reach the targets set during the last Inter-Governmental Commission (IGC) held in Tashkent in February 2023.

Both sides agreed to identify new areas of economic cooperation and emphasised the importance of a liberal visa regime especially for the business community to promote linkages and people-to-people contacts, the PM said.

IHC accepts Bushra Bibi's plea seeking transfer to Adiala jail

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) has accepted the petition filed by former prime minister Imran Khan's wife, Bushra Bibi, seeking her transfer from their Banigala residence, which had been declared a sub-jail.

Justice Mansoor Hameed Azeem pronounced the verdict that had been reserved last week and ordered her transfer to the Adiala jail on Wednesday.

The high court declared the notification issued to declare her Banigala residence as a sub-jail null and void.

The jail authorities had earlier informed the court that Bushra Bibi had to be moved to her Banigala residence, because Adiala jail was already overcrowded, and detaining her in the central prison would pose a security risk.

ISLAMABAD: Days after losing the PTI backing for the post of National Assembly's Public Accounts Committee (PAC), barrister Sher Afzal Khan Marwat on Wednesday lashed out at senior party figures for what he called depriving him of the coveted position.

Mr Marwat was a strong candidate for the post and PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan recently announced that party founder Imran Khan had agreed on his candidature.

However, PTI's political committee met in Islamabad on Friday night to discuss the nomination with majority voting to replace Mr Marwat with MNA Sheikh Waqas Akram.

A party insider said that nine of the 10-member committee, headed by Ghous Ayub, voted for

Sheikh Waqas, seven for Mr Marwat, with Aam Abbas, although present, opting to abstain. Former NA speaker Asad Qaiser and Mr Marwat were not present.

Talking to the media persons, Mr Marwat vented his anger at the senior party leaders and announced the decision not to work with them under protest.

He said the PTI had turned into a dead horse following the arrest of Imran Khan, claiming that he revived the party and took the remaining leaders back to their respective constituencies. However, after the Feb 8 elections, they betrayed him, he regretted.

The PTI lawmaker accused the senior party figures of flouting Imran Khan's directives on one protest and another.

He said he was not being allowed to meet the PTI founding chairman in jail, adding that he was not invited to the political committee's meeting where the voting was held to replace him with Sheikh Waqas as the PAC chairman.

An insider told them that the meeting was convened hushhandedly. According to him, the members were initially informed that the contest was between Mr Marwat and former Federal Council chairman Sahibzada Mansoor Raza. However, most of them were surprised when they learnt that the candidates were Mr Marwat and Sheikh Waqas.

The political committee comprised five MNAs from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa — Asad Qaiser, Aziz Khan, Barrister Gohar, Omar Ayub and Mr Marwat. Besides them, Ali Amin Gandapur, Shah Farman, Aamir Khan Swati and Shafiq Faraz are also from KP.

Likewise, Fakhir Shamim Nagvi and Hafeez Adil Sheikh are from Sindh, Salar Khan Kakar and Qasim Khan Nari from Balochistan and Khalid Khusrheed is from Gilgit-Baltistan.

Hammad Ahsan, Mian Aslam Iqbal, Haffiz Farhat, Aamir Abbas Pappi, Muzamir Hafeez and Zulfikar are the PTI leaders from Punjab but, according to the insider, not a single MNA from the province was asked to the committee.

As per statistics, PTI-backed independent candidates won 59 seats of the National Assembly from Punjab and 14 from KP. — Malik Asad

Opposition leaders slam military involvement in politics

- Omar Ayub questions who has given DG ISPR right to negotiate
- Mahmood Achakzai insists each institution should stay within its limits
- Hamid Khan says rejection of public mandate led to creation of Bangladesh

ISLAMABAD: Prominent opposition leaders collectively called for the full implementation of the Constitution and criticised the military's interference in political affairs.

The leaders were speaking at a seminar titled "Tahafuz-e-Aami Pakistan Kaun aur Kya?", organised by the joint opposition on Wednesday, on the eve of last year's May 9 violent protests erupted after the arrest of PTI founder Imran Khan.

The seminar also came a day after the military said that those involved in the May 9 protests need to regret their acts with sincerity and that the "politics of anarchy and hate" before any talks could be initiated with them.

However, speaking at Wednesday's event, PTI Secretary General Omar Ayub, the leader of the opposition in the National Assembly, openly rejected the press confer-

ence of the director general of Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), questioning the DG's right to negotiate on political matters. He also alleged that the DG was confused and lacked narrative.

"DG ISPR, you are a protector, not the owner of the state," Mr Ayub declared, emphasising that real power resides with the people and their elected representatives.

He also called for public access to several sensitive reports, including those on the Army Public School and the Abbottabad Commission, as well as the investigation into journalist Arshad Sharif's death.

Mahmood Khan Achakzai, who presided over the seminar, said that people have started their struggle for "Haqiqi Aami" (real freedom). He said Pakistan's issues couldn't be addressed unless each institution stayed within its prescribed limits.

He warned that the day anyone tried to enforce martial law or amend the Constitution, the work-

ers of the joint opposition would be on the roads.

PTI leader Asad Qaiser, former speaker of the National Assembly,

spoke about the severe disillusionment prevailing in the country and urged all institutions to adhere strictly to their roles to ensure

peace in the country. He announced plans to conduct similar seminars in other cities to continue advocating for constitutional governance.

Another PTI leader, Advocate Hamid Khan, said the Constitution of 1973 was democratic and if it had not been suspended, East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) would still be part of Pakistan. The country was divided because "we did not accept their (East Pakistan's) mandate", he said.

Advocate Khan noted that the DG ISPR said everything regarding the May 9 incident was clear. "It means that he has made a decision. Who has given him the power to make decisions?" he added.

Liaqat Baloch, the deputy head of Jamaat-i-Islami, suggested that there should be no role of the establishment in politics and democracy.

"No one will accept it even if someone holds a press conference in the Faisal Mosque (saying there is no role of establishment in politics).

We will accept the result of the elections, which will be held without the establishment's interference," he said.

Allama Raja Nasir Abbas Jaffari, the head of Majlis Mahdun-i-Muslimeen, said that steps against the Constitution should be stopped and those who went through "bogus" Form-47 should not sit in the parliament.

Leader of the Opposition in Senate Shibli Faraz said the Constitution should be followed in letter and spirit.

PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Khan said the Constitution was practically suspended and suggested making government with the vote and support of the people.

Advocate Sardar Latif Khosa said that the state consisted of only people and others were employees. "You are employees; you are not even an institution. Everyone must follow the Constitution, even if they are the chief justice or army chief," he added.

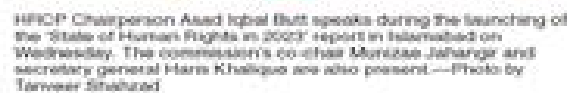

Hub becomes 34th district to report polio detection

ISLAMABAD: While polio virus was limited to 33 districts of Pakistan till last month, wild polio-virus type 1 (WPV1) was found in sewage samples from Hub on Wednesday. The district had hitherto remained free from the virus.

Moreover, three samples taken from already infected districts tested positive, taking the tally for the current year to 116.

A spokesperson for the Pakistan Polio Programme said on Tuesday four samples had tested positive for the virus, meaning that eight samples were detected in two days.

According to the Regional Reference Lab for Polio Eradication at the National Institute of Health (NIH), sewage samples collected from Karachi South, Karachi Central, Jamshoro and Hub contained poliovirus, which was genetically linked to the imported VIRA genetic cluster of WPV1.

"The virus has been found in sewage samples of 34 districts so far this year. All positive samples and two human cases

reported in 2024 contain the VIRA cluster, which had disappeared from Pakistan in 2021, but remained in circulation in Afghanistan and was reintroduced through cross-border transmission last year," an official of the health ministry said.

"The Pakistan Polio Programme conducted four polio vaccination campaigns, including two nationwide drives, with the oral polio vaccine in January and February.

The campaign reached over 45 million children under the age of five years.

"The next campaign is planned for the first week of June, ahead of the high travel season of Eid," the official said.

"Polio is a devastating, incurable disease. The Polio Programme urges all parents and caregivers to ensure that their children are vaccinated at every opportunity and have completed all routine vaccinations to ensure that they are protected from 12 preventable diseases."

Polio is a highly infectious disease that mainly affects children under the age of five years. Vaccination is the most effective way to protect children from it.

Quetta-Chaman highway reopens after negotiations

QUETTA: Traffic between Quetta and Kandahar resumed on Wednesday evening on the Quetta-Chaman National Highway after successful talks between local tribal leaders and government officials.

Tribesmen had blocked the road after violent clashes erupted with security forces during an anti-opioid cultivation drive in Gulistan and other areas of Qila Abdullah district, which borders Afghanistan.

A leader of the tribesmen claimed the confrontation led to the death of two tribesmen and injuries to six security personnel, causing a halt in the Afghan transit trade along with other import and export activities.

Talks were facilitated between the Ghilzai tribe, led by Sena Abdul Shakoor Khan Ghilzai, and government officials, including Frontier Corps commandant Brig Umar and Chaman DC Ashar Abbas.

According to the agreement reached in the talks, an FIR will be registered against the accused persons who were involved in the killing of two tribesmen, compensation will be paid to the families of the deceased, and FC and administration officials will visit the bereaved families to offer condolences. All cases registered against the tribesmen during the incident will also be reviewed.—Saleem Shahid

No plan to hand over Gwadar to China, says Balochistan govt

GWADAR: The Balochistan government has said there is no plan to hand over Gwadar port city to China and refuted all such reports during the rounds on social media in this regard and termed them negative propaganda.

"There are all baseless rumors to misguide the people," Gwadar deputy commissioner Hameed Rehman said about rumors doing the rounds on social media about the handing of the Gwadar city and the port.

He said the provincial government is a guarantor of development of the city, prosperity of the people and protection of their traditional values, which will be ensured at any cost.

He said that Gwadar is being constructed as smart port city of the region

and for this purpose the Balochistan government has approved a safe city project for the port city to ensure complete protection of the people and the city.

"The aim of launching the safe city project is to curb crime, stop smuggling of goods and defeat acts of terrorism," Mr Rehman said, adding that under the project cameras will be installed and latest traffic checking system introduced.

He said those spreading such baseless rumors wanted to put hurdles in the development of the Gwadar city and create law and order situation in the area.

He said that a similar propaganda was hatched when an Industrial Agriculture Park was inaugurated and the Gwadar International Airport was being built.—Bilal Baloch

elections would not be held until Justice Qazi Faez Isa became the chief justice.

During the court proceedings, accountability judge Nasir Javed Karra recorded the statement of a witness, while the counsel for Mr Khan and Bashir Bibi cross-examined another witness.

The court accepted Mr Khan's application for his medical checkup and adjourned the proceedings till May 13.

Impartial inquiry

In Lahore, former president Dr Arif Alvi while speaking to the media outside the Punjab Assembly emphasized the need for an impartial investigation

into the events of May 9 and urged that the perpetrators be brought to justice.

He said, "The oppressor should seek forgiveness. Forgiveness is the only answer to all disputes."

He said those who did not know the meaning of democracy were preaching democracy.

He said the evidence, if any, of the May 9 riots should be presented before courts.

"When I was president, Imran Khan said he was a dialogue," he added.

He mentioned that Mr Khan always voiced for a peaceful protest and resolution of all disputes through dialogue.

In an obvious reference to the establishment, Dr Alvi said those having real power should initiate the dialogue process.

He said the present government was artificial and completion of its tenure was unlikely.

The former president said he visited the assembly to meet the opposition members. He said it was unfortunate how the parliament was filled with those who won the elections with the help of Force 42.

He said that judges should be appointed purely on merit and the freedom of media was critical for the democracy in the country.

"We are Pakistanis and all institutions including the army belong to us," he said.

May 9 fallout

A YEAR since the events of May 9, 2023, very little appears to have changed, at least from the political perspective. In fact, there seems to be even more bad blood between the PTI and the security establishment; both sides appear unwilling to reconsider the combative stance they have taken towards each other. In a press conference on Tuesday, the military's spokesperson made it clear there would be no moving forward without a sincere apology from the PTI and a public disavowal of "the politics of anarchy and hate". In response, the PTI denounced the statement as a "pack of lies" that was "full of contradictions".

It cannot be denied that the violence directed at military symbols and installations in several parts of the country on this day last year, was a direct consequence of the narrative built by the PTI following its ouster. The party had spent months framing the possibility of its chief's arrest as a 'red line', all the while blaming and shaming the security establishment for its ouster from government in April 2022. This combustible mix, triggered by the controversial arrest of Imran Khan by Rangers personnel from the premises of the Islamabad High Court, exploded in the form of unprecedented, widespread violence by PTI supporters. The PTI should acknowledge that it acted in an extremely irresponsible manner by leading its supporters towards such an unacceptable reaction. Thousands were targeted in reprisals by the state, and the events of the day accelerated the expansion of 'unselected forces' influence in the state's legislative and administrative apparatus. However, the state, too, is not without blame. Rather than acting with restraint and demonstrating that it was only interested in getting justice for the wrong that it had been caused, it responded with extreme measures that seemed to have been taken from the playbooks of past dictatorships. For example, in seeking 'justice' for PTI supporters' desecration of various installations, the homes of countless civilian suspects were raided and vandalised and their residents allegedly harassed by personnel representing the state. Even women prisoners, who otherwise enjoy special protections and concessions under Pakistan's legal system, were repeatedly denied their right to bail and kept incarcerated without trial in scores of dubious cases.

The PTI-military stand-off has been the root cause of Pakistan's political instability. Since neither side seems interested in a resolution, perhaps the government should step in. It can offer its best resources to prosecute the May 9 cases in civilian courts, thereby ensuring a transparent judicial process. Done fairly, this will prevent the two sides from engaging directly with each other, which only seems to be perpetuating the tensions between them. It is important that this chapter be closed satisfactorily so that the nation can move forward.

A fresh approach?

SUCCESSIVE governments have tried to address the problems of Balochistan — particularly the province's precarious law and order situation — with very little success. On Tuesday, President Asif Zardari, during a visit to Quetta, made a fresh attempt to tackle the issues of this tortured land. The president, while presiding over a meeting with top federal and provincial officials, reiterated the need for 'dialogue' between all political forces in Balochistan, while also calling for efforts to address its socioeconomic and law and order issues. A similar attempt was made by Mr Zardari and his party the last time he was in the presidency through the 2009 Aghaz-i-Haqooq-Balochistan package which was, at least on paper, a thorough plan designed to deal with many of the issues that have contributed to alienation in Balochistan. But today, nearly 15 years after the package was announced, separatist violence continues in Balochistan, as the underlying discontent has not been addressed. Other elected governments thereafter also announced various packages and schemes for the province, yet Balochistan's problems remain unresolved.

Unless the key factors that fuel violence and alienation in Balochistan are addressed, this vicious trend will continue. The president is right to suggest dialogue as a way out of the quagmire. But this dialogue must be meaningful, and powerful quarters within the state apparatus need to be on board for it to succeed. On the political front, instead of patronising 'influentials' and those seen to be loyal to the official narrative, popular leaders should be given the space and freedom to operate. The detestable practice of enforced disappearances must be ended permanently, and those suspected of breaking the law produced in court so that their fundamental rights are protected. Where socioeconomic issues are concerned, locals have the first right to the province's resources, as well as to jobs and training. Moreover, the province's dismal health and education indicators need to be vastly improved. This would require the state's attention and investment in the social sector. Unfortunately, for decades, the centre has applied colonial methods to 'tame' Balochistan. These have included corridors — such as 'packages' for the province and support for warlords and feudals loyal to the powers that be — as well as sticks — such as frequent security operations. To permanently end the insurgency and bring peace to Balochistan, a democratic approach is required.

Visa fraud

THE FIA has a new task at hand: cracking down on fraudulent work visas. This was prompted by the discovery of a Pakistani human smuggling network in Romania, which arranged for migrants to enter the EU through such means. The smugglers not only facilitated illegal entry into the EU but also the migrants' further clandestine movement towards more affluent European nations, exploiting their hopes for a better life. The criminal network requested 529 work permits, successfully acquiring 102, and generating illicit profits exceeding a million euros. The FIA is broadening its focus from traditional sea and land routes to include air routes through Central Asia. Smugglers now use these air pathways alongside the earlier routes from Quetta through Iran, Turkey, and Greece, charging exorbitant rates to transport individuals into Europe. The agency to address this menace has never been clearer. The government recently organised a conference in Islamabad in collaboration with international bodies to discuss human smuggling. However, this initiative must be part of a broader, more comprehensive strategy to tackle the issue.

The socioeconomic drivers of migration — unemployment, poverty, and lack of security — must be addressed. Traditional pressures and the aspiration to uplift one's familial and social standing also contribute significantly to this risky endeavour. Treating these individuals as criminals rather than victims of exploitation only exacerbates their plight. It is vital to shift this perspective and see them as victims of broader systemic failures. The state's role should be protective and proactive, not merely punitive. Enhanced legal frameworks, increased support for economic development in migration-prone regions, and eradication of corruption in migration processes are crucial. Additionally, enhancing the capacity and integrity of the FIA and related institutions is essential to ensure that these measures are not just temporary fixes but part of a long-term solution. International collaboration should also be harnessed to improve border management and disrupt smuggling networks effectively.

Dubai, Baku and Belém

Pakistan's climate policies must be guided by scientific data and scientific research.

THE federal government has just initiated an important but overly cautious process of streamlining its institutional landscape dealing with climate change. The primary motivation is to strengthen the ability to unlock climate finances. But would establishing the Climate Change Authority, reconstituting the Climate Change Council, or updating the Rules of Business to eliminate redundancies from the climate ministry's mandate alone help turn around the nation's climate vulnerability or access international finance?

It is indeed important to delineate the roles and responsibilities of multiple players and strengthen coordination between national and provincial stakeholders. These changes, however, need to be guided by a clear roadmap of Pakistan's climate journey. Can the process be aligned with domestic economic reforms, inclusion, and climate rights? Concurrently, can it help enhance our eligibility to avail climate finance options, which include concessional lending, trade, and investments? How can the financial flows, even if small, be accessed and made predictable to support Pakistan's drive for resilience, rehabilitation and reconstruction after climate disasters?

Global climate initiatives announced at each Conference of the Parties, particularly since the Paris Agreement in 2015, have provided ample opportunity to interested parties to engage with the presidency of each COP to take advantage of possible opportunities. Britain, Egypt and the UAE, the presidencies of the last three COPs in Glasgow, Sharm el-Sheikh and Dubai, each announced about a dozen initiatives, inviting interested parties to join in. Several of them were backed by ambitious financial mechanisms.

These initiatives, pledges, and side deals are typically voluntary initiatives. They are not always managed or controlled by the secretariat of the climate change convention, and hence not necessarily part of the mandate of climate ministries. Probably half of these initiatives suited Pakistan's development needs in such sectors as energy, agriculture, health, water, industrial production, urban planning, trade, and foreign direct investment. The ministries and departments mandated to deal with these issues are rarely, if at all, present at COPs or aware of the opportunities.

The climate summit in Dubai, for example, made 11 pledges backed by overall commitments

amounting to \$85 billion. These included doubling finances for adaptation, tripling renewable, doubling energy efficiency, halting deforestation, accelerating frameworks for global climate resilience, developing programmes for a just transition, and an agreement to operationalise the Loss and Damage Fund (LDF). Except for the last one, Pakistan did not show much appetite for any of the initiatives, even if Sultan Jafar al-Jaber, the UAE COP chair, visited Pakistan prior to the COP to check Pakistan's pulse for various initiatives and to win support for them.

The initiatives announced in the UAE have set the mood for global climate action that will inform at least the next two climate summits in Baku this November, and Belém, Brazil, in December 2025. The COP in Azerbaijan will prioritise mitigation, regional peace, and water issues. The likely focus in Brazil will be social development, climate justice, and protecting forests and local communities. The agendas of the two COPs are evidently very closely aligned with Pakistan's development needs. These initiatives are typically linked with the country's economic development, structural reforms under discussion with the IMF and multilateral development banks, and the transformation needed to meet SDG targets. A roadmap adopted now can help avoid the annual pang of guilt.

The agenda for Baku will review the implementation of COP28 targets, particularly to advance the Paris Agreement goals. It will strive to finalise the first enhanced transparency framework, establish a new collective quantified goal on finance, scale up targets for climate finance, and finalise the LDF. Baku will also host a series of high-level political convenings to assess barriers to SDG development, regional 'green corridors' for grid-scale storage, and the role of trade in accelerating climate and sustainable development action.

It would be unrealistic, indeed unfair, to expect the climate ministry to engage with and independently assess these processes, let alone lead the country to access finances from such initiatives. The global climate agenda clearly calls for reforms that go beyond amending the Climate Change Act of 2017 or integrating it with the Environmental Protection Act, 1997, in order to remove inconsistencies. We also need to develop

institutional mechanisms and ways to link global climate negotiations with the priorities set for domestic economic development, rather than rapid response every year. This calls for integrating climate considerations in various ministries and departments.

The foregoing can serve as the basis for a four-track climate policy.

First, Pakistan's climate policies must be guided by scientific data and scientific research. The Global Change Impact Study Centre, Zoological Survey, and Pakistan Environment Protection Agency are housed in the climate ministry. They can be mandated to specifically develop baselines and set standards for climate emissions, biodiversity, and ecosystems. Together with the Bureau of Statistics, they can develop Pakistan's natural resource income accounting, because the income generated from natural resources and ecosystems must be quantified. We need to assess the economic value of natural resources and the impact of economic activities on the environment.

Second, Pakistan's climate priorities must be co-created with the provinces. We must avoid the risk of a competitive relationship with sub-national entities. Any differences, as well as the agenda of the Climate Council, must be cleared by the Council of Common Interests. The Climate Council must be a professional organisation and should not take over the functions of the CCI. The climate ministry should build upon its rich experience of dealing with the provinces on environmental and climate issues.

Third, Pakistan's finance minister must spearhead the drive for climate finance. Since he has greater clout than most other cabinet members, he must inform parliament on all climate finance successes and failures with the development partners and the hosts of the annual COP meetings.

Fourth, Pakistan's policy must be embedded in sectoral, national and provincial policies, public-private partnerships, and private sector investment by the Planning Commission. The latter's historically central position must be avoided to embed climate change in a whole-of-government effort to link the global climate discourse with Pakistan's development agenda. ■

The net metering dead end

LET'S start with putting a couple of unlikely misapprehensions to rest. I have had the opportunity of interacting with key decision-makers in the power bureaucracy and they assure me of two things. First, solar panels installed in people's homes are not going to be taxed. Second, the net metering rate at which power utilities buy electricity back from consumers is not going to be revised downward for those who already have their systems up and running. They emphasise that changes are being considered in the net metering regulations of 2015, with a view to reducing the amount people receive for the power their systems pump into the grid, but that those with existing systems will not be impacted.

Let's hope they will keep their word, because breaking promises is becoming far too routine for the government of Pakistan. Assuming that they will keep their word with existing consumers, there is another problem of a more general but critical nature. The government of Pakistan seems to no longer be able to afford the solar revolution sweeping across the world. This is somewhat striking, since the whole idea of the renewable revolution is to make electricity more affordable and cleaner and many countries have set targets for themselves on how much of their power should come from renewable sources like solar.

For example, in 2010, the world's total installed solar power generation capacity was less than 42GW, according to Our World in Data. By 2021, this had risen to 1,053GW. This is one of the fastest rates of growth for a new power source. What is even more striking than these two data points is the slope of the graph along the way, which shows continuous acceleration year after year.

Roof-top solar has dominated this growth, although some estimates are suggesting that utility-scale solar may start to overtake rooftop in a few years in some critical regions like the European Union. But these trends apart, rooftop solar has dominated the rise, and for most countries, it has been the main driving force in their solar expansion and plans to meet net zero targets.

Here in Pakistan, something has happened that others have experienced too, but they found

innovative solutions rather than trying to suppress the growth of rooftop solar. Pakistan had targeted 1,920MW of rooftop solar capacity by the year 2025, according to its latest Indicative Generation Capacity Expansion Plan. In reality, we crossed that threshold in 2023, if not sooner. Now they want to apply the brakes, because, according to the power bureaucracy, this rapid growth in rooftop solar is creating costs that have to be passed on to poorer segments of the population, who don't have the luxury (yet) to go the rooftop solar route because they have single-phase meters and the technology does not yet work with that. Additionally, they have very limited rooftop space they can use for the purpose.

The big problem in Pakistan's power bureaucracy now is that the state insists on setting the price of electricity manually, using outmoded formulas. In large-scale thermal power plants, for example, they still use what is called 'cost-plus' pricing, where the regulator actually looks at each cost item in the prospective power plant and decides what their total costs are and how much margin they should be allowed. This is partly because nobody is willing to invest in Pakistan on a large scale if their returns are not guaranteed. And the big reason for that is the government of Pakistan has a lousy reputation when it comes to delivering on its commitments.

Meanwhile, the way in which electricity is produced has evolved and changed rapidly from the time this 'cost-plus' pricing formula was developed. Back then, we had a few large-scale power plants supply electricity to a single buyer — the government — which transmitted this power to various distribution companies, all state-owned, who then sold it on to a list of

interested customers.

The solar revolution has changed all that. Now we have what is called 'distributed generation' or 'point of sale consumption', where electricity is produced in a large and growing number of locations, and often consumed there and there. Along with this shift has come a new category of consumers and producers of electricity, called 'prosumers' — people who produce and consume electricity themselves. The old pricing formulas are not going to work in a world of prosumers.

Here is what seems to be going wrong in the power bureaucracy with this move to bring down net metering rates, and perhaps switch to what they call 'gross metering' for all categories, although it seems the details are still being worked out. What's wrong with all this is that it aims to protect the bureaucracy from the disruptive impact of a new technology that is spreading rapidly around the world, and changing how power sectors are organised.

Imagine, in the early 2000s, if the bureaucracy had moved to protect the Pakistan Telecommunication Corporation from the disruptive impact of mobile phones. Imagine if they made the argument that this new technology was being used by elites, who were opting out of the PTC system, leaving the rest to carry the costs of the state-owned telecom infrastructure. Imagine if the state gave in to their arguments, and moved to heavily tax handsets and talk time and priced the new technology out of the market. Where would we be today?

Something similar, perhaps not identical, is happening today with solar and other renewable power generation technology. Power bureaucracies need to adapt to, facilitate and spur on this revolution and increase the speed of its adoption. The key change begins with pricing and then the 'single buyer model', allowing power generators to sell to their customers directly instead of through the state. Instead, they seem more concerned with protecting the financial health of their bureaucracy in the face of this revolution. ■

Unwelcome returns

WITH the precience that philosophers share with out-of-office politicians, a hundred years ago, a leading Indian scholar analysed the combustible demography of India. In 1923, Dr Radhakrishnan wrote in his two-volume survey of Indian Philosophy: "India even today is nearly Hindu." [Describing the Epic Period, which spanned roughly 600 BC to 200 AD, he wrote: "The fortunes of the Hindus [however] became more and more linked with those of the non-Hindus." Amongst these, he included Buddhists, Jains, Sauristas and Vaishnavites — the sons of India's soil. Muslims, of course, had yet to come.]

It is a lengthy tome to read, and even more difficult to digest. I closed on it as a student in the 1960s, but gave up before reaching the end of the second volume. I returned to it recently to seek answers to the Hindu-Muslim experiments at religious coexistence since the arrival of Muslims in the subcontinent, and especially since PM Narendra Modi's determination to expel them.

India's traditional hospitality is proven, but it does not extend to religious strangers. Over the centuries, Buddhists have quit India for gentler climes. Today, Buddhists have over 520 million followers, of whom only 80 are left in India (Lord Buddha's birthplace) to follow in his footsteps.

Almost contemporary to Buddhism in Jainism, also founded in India and perfected by the 24th tirthankara, Lord Mahavira (circa 600 BC). Equally pacifist and non-conflictual, unlike Buddhists, Jainism has survived in India. There are between 4m to 5m still living there. A growing number are to be found today in Canada, Europe, and the US, where the practice of pious self-abnegation would appear to be at odds with crass materialism.

In PM Modi's eyes, the problem in India is not a majority of Hindus, but a fertile mix of 200m Muslims (over 15 per cent of its population). Modi's predicament is not a question of putting a genie back into the bottle. His conservatism is to remove the green genie from the oil from both.

Under PM Nehru, Muslims in India rarely felt that they had to choose between their country and their religion. Under his daughter, PM Indira Gandhi, a test of sorts for Indian Muslims came in 1971, when, after her victory in East Pakistan, she said to have commented: "A thousand years of subjugation have been avenged."

Incidentally, all of the rulers of the Moghul dynasty (whom PM Modi regards with antipathy) — except for its founder Babur and his son Humayun — from Akbar to Shah Jahan, were born in India. They saw themselves as Indians by birth. Today, they are tarred as Muslim foreigners.

During the recent elections in Bangladesh, which brought Sheikh Hasina Wajed back to power, India did not figure as a material issue. Neither in Pakistan, where Nawaz Sharif's earlier bonhomie with PM Modi did not affect the return of his PML-N to power.

In India, though, PM Modi's recent speeches during his election campaign could have been dismissed as hatings hype, were it not for their implications for Muslims within India, and for Pakistan and, by extension, other neighbouring countries.

On buses bound for Gujarat, Mr Modi addressed the Congress party as harbouring a "disgusting mentality", its motto being the "Language of the Muslim League". In 2017, he had accused former PM Manmohan Singh of "holding a secret meeting with Pakistani diplomats to conspire against India".

Now his theme is that Pakistan's political leaders "are praying for a Congress victory. Pakistan is now eager to make the prime of the Congress the prime minister of India".

In Modi's eyes, India's problem is a surfeit of 200m Muslims.

They may give away the Kutch desert claiming no one lives there."

On June 4, everyone in the subcontinent will know who will rule India for the next five years. Mr Modi knows it will be him. The Sharifs in Pakistan hope so too. They should anticipate, however, that Mr Modi is an emboldened three-time prime minister may tempt Pakistan by testing the fragile frontier between occupied Kashmir (India's new 'union state') and Pakistan's founding conspiracy. And Jammu & Kashmir.

He may also decide to withdraw from the Indian Waters Treaty, which covers the rivers flowing from the upper riparian, to leave Pakistan thirsting at the mouth, knowing that an emboldened World Bank would prefer not to arbitrate.

Over the next five years, PM Modi could pressure Indian Muslims to crowd Pakistan's eastern borders in Punjab and Sindh as refugees. It happened in 1971, when upon PM refugees from East Pakistan crossed into India. PM Modi may be tempted to return the compliment. ■

Grapes of wrath

HOW I would like to live in the dream world of the neoliberal economist, in which markets are left to determine the exchange rate, where prices of wheat are left to market forces, where consumers are indifferent to eating imported or domestically produced wheat, and inputs like fertilisers are freely available at market prices, free of the monopolies and hoarding that artificially raise prices.

The thoughts of a small farmer? But the harsh world that confronts us in the Punjab countryside today is very different. For the poor small farmers, who form the vast majority of the province's nearly 5.5 million rural households with holdings of 12 acres or less, or for small-scale farmers, it is becoming clearer by the day that the government has no intention of purchasing wheat at the announced support price of Rs3,900 per 40 kilograms.

For the poor farmer, hope is all but lost as inclement weather brings rain and thunderstorms, and his wife curses him for not having sold his harvest (which now lies in the open) at Rs2,700 — the going market price, which is even less than the current world price. But at this rate, he would make a big loss, he pleads. Yet no one is there to listen.

Unbeknownst to the farmer, who was banking in the hope that his bumper crop would finally yield good returns and a livable income, plans were made to undercut the price announced by the government before the harvest. Knowing full well that a bumper crop was expected, the interim government still allowed the import of nearly 3m tonnes of wheat, costing the country over a billion dollars in precious foreign exchange at world prices that were one-third lower than the announced price. Rather than face the problem, the new government then took office in late February decided to ignore it. The ECX produced a half-baked plan in which the Punjab government deliberately played no part.

In contrast to the simple, idealistic world of the neoliberal, there is a large body of literature tracing the history of how wheat prices should be determined by the government. The resulting system had serious mismanagement and corruption flaws as well as an unaffordable government subsidy. But on one point it was very clear: the farmer cannot be left to the mercy of the market and middlemen, who will fleece him in the process. If we let wheat prices be dictated by global market prices, as postulated by neoliberals, such a policy would need to be carefully thought through, especially keeping in mind the wide price fluctuations, the control of both food security and protecting small farmers from

steep price declines.

This is the crux of the matter. Last year, the world price of wheat, given the market-determined exchange rate, was higher than that announced by the government. In the 1980s, at a highly overvalued exchange rate, the world wheat price was lower. So, before we postulate that domestic wheat prices should follow world prices, we must establish if the exchange rate at which this is determined reflects its real price.

Indeed, even since the 1950s, the Pakistani farmer has paid a huge tribute to finance growth of the economy, especially industry, because agricultural prices have been kept low through overvalued exchange rates and high protection to industry to foster its growth, which changed the terms of trade against agriculture and in favour of an inefficient, uncompetitive industrial sector. And we want to continue this practice?

Now, having acted thoughtlessly to allow prices to be determined by market forces and allowing large imports at world prices, what options does the government have to overcome the current wheat crisis?

First and foremost, to provide some relief to farmers who are still holding on to their harvested wheat, the government should start procuring, on a war footing, at least 3.5m tonnes of wheat at Rs3,900 — the price to which it has committed — and quickly move space to store the crop.

Second, the State Bank must urgently come up with a plan for financial support from commercial banks to advance loans to small farmers at lower-than-market interest rates, so that they can purchase the necessary inputs to prepare and plant their next crop.

Third and most importantly, the government must set in motion a well-thought-out plan for ensuring a better and more efficient system of wheat procurement. Such a plan should ensure food security and a fair return to farmers, while gradually reducing the role of and cost to the government in fixing minimum support prices, replacing this with a role it can afford to maintain.

For now, let the government make amends for its procrastination and bring some relief to anxious farmers. ■

Cement industry should wake up



PAKISTAN'S cement industry, supported by abundant indigenous raw material, comprises 26 plants with a collective annual installed capacity of 83.18 million tonnes. However, despite this capacity, actual cement sales across the country witnessed consistent month-on-month decline throughout the 2022-23 fiscal, mainly due to reduced domestic demand.

Further more, total cement sales for 2022-23 amounted to 44.58 million tonnes, marking a 15.71 per cent year-on-year decline. This trend has persisted, with only a brief respite in the first nine months of the current fiscal year, up to March 2024, during which total cement sales reached 34.5 million tonnes compared to 31.6 million tonnes in the same period of the preceding year, representing a nominal 2.7pc growth. Besides, total sales saw a 3.9pc decrease in domestic sales during the said period, while exports surged by 68pc, nearly doubling compared to the corresponding period in 2022-23.

With continuing sluggish domestic sales, the industry has shifted focus towards boosting exports and exploring new markets. Despite global challenges, Pakistani cement exports surged from 2.152 million tonnes in 2021-22 to 4.566 million tonnes in 2022-23, making it approximately 10pc of the total sales. Pakistan earned \$323 million in 2022-23 from cement exports compared to \$165.7 million in 2021-22, leveraging the devaluation of the Pakistani rupee against the dollar.

While Japan, Vietnam and China lead globally in cement as well as clinker exports, Pakistan has historically been an inconsistent exporter due to various factors. On the flip side, cement exports represent a nominal share of Pakistan's total commodity exports, accounting for 0.538pc in 2023-22 and 0.939pc in 2022-23. Major export destinations in 2022-23 included Sri Lanka (\$104 million), Afghanistan (\$87 million),

Bangladesh (\$56 million), Madagascar (\$36 million), and other countries, such as Qatar, South Africa, Mozambique, Togo, and Cameroon (cumulative exports \$56 million).

In the past, Pakistan has exported rather significant volumes of cement, with exports exceeding \$570 million in 2012, \$536 million in 2013, and \$517 million in 2014. However, exports declined to \$345 million in 2015 and went down to \$270 million in 2021. Gradually, Pakistan lost some markets to cheaper sources of supply from Iran, India and China. Bangladesh revitalised its cement industry, and has recently entered the export market.

It is imperative for the industry to regain momentum in international markets. Recent developments include receiving orders for the first-ever Pakistani cement shipment to the United Kingdom, securing a substantial order from the United States, and exploring markets in Mexico, France and Germany, indicating promising prospects.

Over the last more than a decade, the total installed capacity of the industry has surged from 47 million tonnes in 2010 to the current 83 million tonnes per year. This capacity has to be optimised.

The inside rot

THE Water and Power Development Authority (Wapda) has been increasing the cost of electricity almost on a monthly basis now, citing increased line losses and generation cost as the main reasons. The latest bogeyman trotted by Wapda is the



use of solar panels by end users. However, Wapda has consistently ignored the highest contributor of losses in the system: the procurement department of all distribution companies (Discoms).

The whole procurement process actually is nothing but a never-with-a-number of manufacturers, suppliers and agents,

which is hemorrhaging state resources at an alarming rate.

The losses incurred by the corruption and collusion of Discoms far outweigh the losses incurred due to theft. Yes, you have read this right. To shield those losses from the public and those in power, a mechanism and chain of command is in place to keep all prying eyes out and away.

Consider the case of electrical cable and wire rope manufacturers. Wapda has implemented a rule stipulating that these items must be exclusively sourced from local 'approved' manufacturers, effectively granting a green light to a cartel that gouges orders from Discoms, and fixes prices with 'mutual consent'.

The costs of these cables, as procured by Discoms, surpass those of equivalent imports from China, and in some cases even in comparison with imports from Germany. The cable manufacturers, on the other hand, keep officials of Discoms happy to keep the racket going.

Procurement losses attributed to these cable manufacturers dwarf line losses by a conservative factor of 1:8. A cursory examination of procurements by Discoms over the last five, perhaps even 10 years, comparing the costs from 'approved' local suppliers against those available in the open market or from international manufacturers would unveil the staggering scope of corruption.

Wapda officials should stop conjuring up a new bogeyman every now and then. Instead, they need to focus towards

Money transfers

USING online banking channels has become necessary, if not inevitable, for various payments and money transfers. However, most people take into account the hidden charges or bank fees related to it. The cost and challenges associated with traditional banking channels and mobile wallets are often dispiriting. Besides, people have also faced a variety of problems in their interbank transfers. All such elements work as impediments to the growth of online banking in the country.

I had never used the Raast platform that was introduced by the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) a while ago. It was only recently that I had the occasion to use it, and found it to be an efficient mode of online transfers. It was instant, reliable and absolutely free of any charges. As I later came to know, the platform is available for mobilephone applications, internet banking and over-the-counter services.

Impressed by the facility, I find it crucial to raise awareness about Raast so that the people may take due benefit. All commercial banks allow customers to create a Raast identity (ID) by linking their preferred International Bank Account

Number (IBAN) with their registered cellphone number. Once that has been created, it allows others to make money transfers by only using the cellphone number, taking away the need to remember account details and codes. Transfers can also be made even if the sender does not have a Raast ID.

On the basis of my own journey from ignorance to experience, I believe it is the general lack of awareness that is keeping the general public away from this facility. SBP should be proactive in this regard.

Two brothers killed over land dispute in Swabi

SWABI: Two brothers were killed over a land dispute in a Topi village here on Wednesday, Rescue 1122 and police officials said.

A rescue official said a team provided first aid to two men seriously injured and shifted them to the Tehsil Headquarters Hospital, Topi, where they succumbed to injuries.

The deceased were identified as Taysab Khan, 40, and Jahanzeb Khan, 35.

Sultan Zeb registered an FIR with the police, stating his brothers were trying to stop some labourers from harvesting wheat crop on a disputed land when Sherazada, Golanda and Goharwala, who were also present there, opened fire at his brothers, injuring them critically. Later, they died in hospital.

Meanwhile, the police arrested a man, who had allegedly killed his wife in Jalali village of Chota Lohor, according to a press release issued by the police.

Mohammad Nafi had gone into hiding after the incident, but the police traced him.

DSP Chota Lohor Usaid Sher Khan said a team traced the accused in a far-flung area and arrested him during a raid. Also in the day, a Peshawar Electric Supply Company official was injured when owner of a house attacked him for removing illegal connection in Yar Hussain village on Wednesday, Peco officials said.

They said the injured, Khizar Hayat, was shifted to Sacha Khan Medical Complex, Shalimarwala.

The Yar Hussain police registered an FIR against the accused, Shabid Khan.

Rickshaws banned from GT Road in Peshawar

Admin also decides to seize old buses, wagons plying along BRT corridor

PESHAWAR: The district administration has banned rickshaws from the Pir Zakaria Bridge-Bareilly Pal stretch of the Grand Trunk Road here from today (Thursday), initiating the move to ease traffic congestion on the major main thoroughfare in the capital city.

The decision about the ban was made in a meeting chaired by the commissioner of Peshawar division, Riaz Khan Mehmood, according to an official statement.

The meeting called to discuss traffic issues in the provincial capital was attended by deputy commissioner Afzal Wazir, SSP (traffic) Nasir Khan, officials of the Regional Transport Authority and excise department, and representatives of transporter unions.

It also decided that the old buses and wagons plying the roads along the Peshawar Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) corridor would be impounded and scrapped, while their drivers would be arrested.

The participants also agreed about the seizure of rickshaws that are reg-

istered in other districts but operate in the provincial capital.

They also directed authorities to crack down on the rickshaws whose drivers have photographic permits and registration papers, while the sealing of rickshaw factories was also ordered.

The meeting decided to ban rickshaw supply from Punjab and order the arrest of suppliers and confiscation of those tri-wheeleders.

It said the district administration would launch a 20-day crackdown on illegal rickshaws, buses, and wagons from Thursday (today).

Under the plans, pressure horns, flashlights, tinted glasses, illegal registration plates, and musical instruments will be removed from vehicles before being destroyed, while legal action will be taken against drivers under the age of 21.

The meeting also decided to impound and scrap the buses, wagons, and rickshaws illegally operating in the provincial capital.

It chalked out a strategy to do away with illegal transport vehicles from the provincial capital and took the representatives of transporter unions into confidence about it.

Officials said as the crackdown would continue until May 25, special teams of the police, district administration, and transport and excise departments were formed

for its success.

Peshawar SSP (traffic) Saad Khan told Dawn that the traffic police had presented the traffic management plan for Peshawar to the district administration for approval and implementation.

He said the traffic police were impounding illegal rickshaws and buses and registering FIRs against their drivers.

"Last month, we [traffic police] registered FIRs against 205 rickshaw drivers and impounded 205 illegal buses and rickshaws," he said.

The SSP said that over 300,000 rickshaws and loaders operated in the provincial capital, but in the case of their seizure, the traffic police lacked space to keep such a large number of vehicles.

An official told Dawn, requesting anonymity, that the Peshawar BRT project envisioned the scrapping of old buses plying the provincial capital's roads.

He said that under the bus project, authorities scrapped around 600 old and rickety buses after making due payments to their owners in two phases.

The official, however, said that transporters later brought in buses from the Punjab province and demanded a phase-out of old buses, but the demand was turned down by authorities.

Wheat procurement from local farmers to save govt Rs12bn, claims Gandapur

DERA ISMAIL KHAN: Khush Pakh-rudhira Chief Minister Ali Amin Khan Gandapur on Wednesday said his government would save Rs12 billion by purchasing wheat from local farmers and the money would be utilised for construction and renovation of wheat warehouses.

He stated this during a visit to the provincial reserve centre of the food department, where he formally inaugurated the process of wheat procurement for the current season.

Provincial minister for food Zahid Shah Tera and high-ups of food department and district administration were also present. Addressing a ceremony on the occasion, Mr Gandapur said 300,000 metric tonnes of wheat would be procured from farmers of the province, out of which 80,000 metric tonnes was being purchased from Dera farmers.

He said total procurement at the rate of Rs3,500 per 40kg would cost Rs29 billion.

"It will be ensured that farmers are provided with their due rights without any hindrance," he said, adding necessary steps had been taken to make the procurement process

transparent. He said committees had also been formed at the district level in addition to establishing a control room and introducing an app for the purpose.

Gandapur said: "Not buying wheat from Pakistan Agricultural Storage & Services Corporation Limited, would result in a benefit of Rs12 billion, which would be utilised for construction and maintenance of warehouses."

The chief minister made it clear that wheat procurement would be carried out on the basis of first come, first served basis.

He asked the farmers' community to come forward and play their proactive role in implementing the provincial government's policy aimed at ensuring wheat procurement in an efficient and transparent manner.

He made it clear that the provincial government had decided to have zero tolerance policy against corruption and bribery in all the departments, adding all possible steps would be taken to ensure transparency in all government matters, including postings and transfers. — Correspondent

PHC asks Afghan artists' counsel to examine deportation pleas pending with SC

Bureau Report

PESHAWAR: The Peshawar High Court on Wednesday adjourned the hearing into the petitions of several Afghan artists and transgender persons for stopping the federal government from deporting them, insisting they'll be persecuted in the Taliban-ruled Afghanistan.

A bench consisting of Justice Syed Mohammed Atiqur Shah and Justice Syed Arshad Ali directed the counsel for petitioners to examine the pleas filed with the Supreme Court on the matter.

The bench observed that it would be appropriate for the petitioners to file applications with the apex court for checking if the prayers in the pleas before the Supreme Court and the high court were identical.

It was hearing two petitions, including the one filed on behalf of 147 musicians and singers by Hashmatullah Ghosel, Raft Hamid and Hamid Shabdan, and the other by Ahmad Anwar alias Hossain and 18 other transgender persons.

Advocate Munir Ahmad appeared for the petitioners and said his clients had challenged the decision of the federal government to forcibly repatriate all unregistered Afghans, including the petitioners.

He said that the high court earlier issued an order stopping the federal government and its law-enforcement agencies from harassing his clients and acting against them until further orders.

The lawyer added that the high court also ordered the clubbing of the two petitions.

The counsel claimed that the takeover of Afghanistan by the Taliban rendered the lives of the local artists and transgender people "very dangerous and miserable," as the government had announced that it wouldn't allow Afghan artists to perform in the country.

He added that like thousands of other Afghans, his clients fled their country along with their families and took shelter in Pakistan.

The lawyer said that the petitioners and their families were registered by the UN refugee agency, which gave them a token number, and their cases were under process.

A deputy attorney general said that identical petitions had already been filed with the Supreme Court.

When the bench asked Mr Munir whether the same petitioners were parties in the case pending with the apex court, the counsel said that petition was filed by the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan for relief for all unregistered Afghan nationals, whereas the two petitions pending with the high court sought relief for artists and transgender persons only.

The bench wondered whether it wouldn't be appropriate for the petitioners to withdraw their pleas and approach the apex court to become parties to the matter pending with it.

The counsel said that he was not sure whether the prayers made in that plea were identical to those in the two petitions. He said that if his clients withdrew the two petitions, then the continuing order of the high court would become ineffective and that there were fears that the petitioners would face harassment and forced repatriation.

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Economic crisis deepens amid political instability

Industrialists, analysts lament govt yet to develop long-term growth strategy

KARACHI: Industrialists and analysts express growing concern over political protests and when farmer demonstrations escalate, casting shadows over business activities and economic stability.

The business community, already beset by high inflation and interest rates, feels that political issues overshadow economic priorities.

"A rising tide of unrest and protests against the government has concerned the economy, making it difficult for businesses to operate effectively," one businessman stated anonymously, reflecting the prevalent fear of backlash for speaking out.

Some traders and industrialists note that persistent political disturbances have dashed hopes for stability after visible economic improvements compared to last year.

"There is no sign of stability in the government, which reflects rising vulnerability in the economy," said Asim Aziz, an exporter.

"Daily remarks from the Supreme Court and high courts on political and corruption issues leave us in limbo, particularly concerning our future strategies," Mr. Aziz said. He emphasised the need for a well-defined economic and political roadmap to attract investment.

A Karachi-based head of research noted that trade and industry were not

clear about the economy's future, and the present government has yet to develop a long-term growth strategy.

He lamented that economic growth, which must be the government's priority, has been put under the shadow of inflation and interest rates. He said the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has also failed to spur growth or bring down inflation and appears to be overwhelmed by the challenges.

The private sector is working with least participation, which will bring down the growth rate to even lower than two per cent this year. "Despite sovereign default, Sri Lanka recovered with two to three years and the current inflation is 7.5 per cent. This is not a miracle but management," he said.

Some bankers believe that the SBP is managing the exchange rate, and this stability may vary in one go.

Amid these economic challenges, analysts also noted some positives, such as Saudi investors' interest in major Pakistani assets, which could temporarily bolster the country's external accounts. However, the looming need for \$25 billion for debt servicing next fiscal year and a persistent trade deficit threaten to offset these gains.

"The stable exchange rate is not the benchmark for the economy's growth. It is only a sign that the country can pay back the debt and be able to trade with any country," said Asif Ahmed, a currency dealer in the interbank market.

He noted that the current account deficit has significantly decreased, yet the NRP's foreign exchange reserves are largely borrowed, showing no clear policy on managing external and domestic debts.

Six-month deadline extension for upgrade agreements irks refineries

Excessive delays cause about \$4bn loss in last four years

ISLAMABAD: The Petroleum Division has requested the Cabinet Committee on Energy (CCCE) to extend the deadline for signing upgrade agreements with five domestic refineries for six months until October this year, but most refineries small a cut for the delay.

"The government seems to be more focused on attracting foreign investment, which is no doubt important, but it needs to realise that foreign investment flows in only when existing foreign and local investors are satisfied," said Asif Khattak, who is chairman of Oil Companies Advisory Council (OCAC) and chief executive officer of Attock Refinery Ltd.

He said the deadline for signing upgrade agreements with the Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) was April 22, 2024. Three refineries — Attock Refinery Ltd, National Refinery Ltd and

Pakistan Refinery Ltd — gave consent to sign the agreements before the deadline, while two other refineries — Parco and Chongoria — needed more time.

However, the "Petroleum Division didn't arrange signing with the willing refineries, nor extended the deadline date in time to accommodate Parco's request", he said, adding that ARL, NRL and PRL plan to invest \$3bn on their upgrade projects. The total investment will increase to \$4bn when Parco and Chongoria join in.

It may be noted that the refining policy had already taken more than four years to develop, causing the country to lose about \$4bn due to these delays.

Interestingly, the Petroleum Division has now moved a summary to the CCCE days after the deadline expires, seeking a six-month extension even for those ready to start working immediately on an upgrade to Euro-5 fuels.

The Petroleum Division said the Pakistan Oil Refining Policy for Upgradation of Existing/Brownfield Refineries 2021 was approved by the Federal Cabinet in February to upgrade the existing refineries to produce environ-

ment-friendly Euro-V fuels and decrease the production of furnace oil.

The policy provided an incremental incentive of 2.5pc on HSD (in addition to the current 7.5pc) and 10pc on petrol in the form of deemed duty for seven years to achieve this objective. The incremental incentive has been deposited in an escrow account maintained by OGRA with the respective refinery for meeting up to 27.5pc of the upgrade projects' cost. OGRA is to allow withdrawal of funds from the escrow account by the respective refinery, post financial close of the Upgrade Projects, and against expenditure made for each milestone or the deliverables.

To avail the said incremental incentive, the refineries were required to execute Upgrade Agreements, open an Escrow Account with OGRA and provide Refineries bank guarantee to OGRA within 60 days of notification of the Policy i.e. by April 22, 2024. The policy required the deemed duty to be cut from 7.5 to 5pc for refineries that do not sign the upgrade agreement by the said deadline.

The petroleum division confirmed that "ARL, NRL and PRL

have conveyed their readiness to sign the Upgrade Agreement" and requested the Petroleum Division to coordinate the signing ceremony. "However, Parco and Chongoria Pakistan Limited (CPL), jointly contributing more than 20pc of the country's refining output, have yet to finalise the Upgrade Agreements," the Petroleum Division said.

Interestingly, the Petroleum Division also confirmed in the summary that Parco was in the process of updating its feasibility study, after which its board of directors will decide on the planned upgrade. "The said activities may take 5-6 months."

On the other hand, the Petroleum Division also confirmed that "a settlement agreement between Chongoria and the Government of Pakistan for payment of about Rs500m outstanding petroleum levy (payable by Chongoria) was also being negotiated", which also could not be concluded before April 22 deadline.

"In case of non-signing by the due date, the deemed duty on HSD shall be reduced from 7.5pc to 5pc for Parco and Chongoria, making the operation of these refineries extremely challenging."

WB reaffirms help for development

ISLAMABAD: World Bank Vice-President for South Asia Martin Raiser concluded his three-day visit to Pakistan on Wednesday and reaffirmed the bank's readiness to collaborate with Pakistan in its journey of economic transformation aimed at sustainable development.

During his stay, Mr. Raiser met with Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, members of his government, and key counterparts to discuss Pakistan's development priorities.

The discussions focused on economic and fiscal reforms, human capital development, adaptation to climate change, energy sector reforms, and digitalisation as a foundational enabler and accelerator of development.

"I am pleased to learn about Pakistan's reform plans to boost growth and attract more private investment, leverage digital transformation to improve governance, strengthen climate resilience, and invest in human capital to tackle daunting challenges such as child stunting and learning poverty," said Raiser in a statement issued by World Bank Islamabad office.

On Wednesday, PM Shehbaz witnessed the signing of a joint communiqué signed by World Bank Country Representative Nargis Bano and Secretary of Economic Affairs Dr. Kamran Niaz.

PM Shehbaz lauded the World Bank's contribution to Pakistan's development and appreciated the bank's support for building climate-resilient infrastructure in the wake of the 2022 floods in Pakistan.

Appreciating Pakistan's aggressive reform agenda, Mr. Raiser said the World Bank is ready to collaborate with Pakistan in its journey of economic transformation aimed at sustainable development.

Both sides agreed to engage in a long-term, focused partnership under a new Country Partnership Framework with an annual review mechanism to assess progress and ensure results are achieved.

CDWP clears three projects worth Rs126bn

ISLAMABAD: The Central Development Working Party (CDWP) recommended on Wednesday three projects worth Rs126 billion to the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (NEC) for approval.

The CDWP meeting was chaired by Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission Muhammad Jehanzeb Khan, said a press release.

Two projects related to transport and communication sector were presented in the meeting.

The first project pertained to upgradation and widening of Jagan Skardu Road 164km (second revised) worth Rs12.27 billion referred to NEC for further consideration.

The second project was rehabilitation and reconstruction of N-5 from Moro to Ransipur (NRC/SRC) and 32km damaged bridges under ADB Flood Emergency Loan (revised) worth Rs27.24bn, referred to NEC for further consideration.

A project, namely the Prime Minister's Programme for Elimination of Hepatitis C Infection, worth Rs25.41bn, was referred to NEC. —APP

Kharif crop production prospects improve

ISLAMABAD: The extended and massive rainy spell in April, higher than usual temperatures and anticipated monsoon rainfall have improved kharif crop output prospects.

Taking into consideration the "very promising water situation", the India River System Authority (IRSA) on Wednesday decided "to curtail the shortages for the early kharif period till June 10, from the initial 30pc to 21pc for Punjab and Sindh", said a statement issued by the water regulator.

After a meeting presided over by less Chairman Abdul Hamid Mengal and attended by all four members, the regulator said it would "continue with full informed supplies for Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa".

An official told Dawn that the temperatures in Skardu — the major catchment area of Tarbela dam — had already risen to 27 degrees centigrade on Wednesday against 17 on the same day last year which meant snow melting to improve river flows earlier than normal. Also, the Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has indicated that monsoon rains are expected to be normal this year,

although a final forecast will be made by mid-June.

Moreover, better storage in dams than anticipated earlier had also significantly addressed the operational constraints arising out of Tunnel-5 construction activities at Tarbela dam. At present, the water conservation level at Tarbela stands at 1,467 feet, while operational constraints for T5 could emerge at 1426 feet.

While reviewing the water situation from April 1 to 30, 2024, IRSA noted that the actual inflows of 10.35 million acre-feet (MAF) far surpassed the forecasted inflows of 7.03MAF, showing a 47pc increase. The increased river inflows — more concentrated in the Kabul and Swat basins — were due to the exceptionally early snowmelt stretched into April 2024, making the rainfall total for the month 144pc above normal.

The recent rains added about 3.6MAF in storages. Accordingly, the storages in Tarbela, Marla and Chashma reservoirs stood at 4.358MAF on May 8 (Wednesday), i.e. 48pc above the 10-year average.

Therefore, Punjab's approved share of 8.252MAF has now been increased to 9.266MAF. Likewise, Sindh's approved share of 4.934MAF was also increased to 5.548MAF.

Axe falls on another senior taxman

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has agreed in principle to suspend another senior taxman, who sought adjournment in a case involving Rs56 million in tax payments, for allegedly demonstrating lack of commitment to resolving tax concerns, Dawn has learnt through reliable sources.

They said FBR Chairman Zubair Tiwana forwarded the name of Sahibzada Abdul Mateen, chief commissioner of Medium Taxpayers Office (MTO), Karachi, to Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif for suspension or removal from his current position.

Mr. Mateen will become Inland Revenue Service's (IRS) second senior officer after Yousaf Hyder Sheikh, chief commissioner-IR, Large Taxpayers Office, Islamabad, who was suspended with immediate effect for 120 days on April 23 on the same charges of seeking adjournment in a case in the Islamabad High Court.

A senior tax official told Dawn that the competent authority in such cases is the prime minister. "As of today, I can confirm that no notification has been issued [about suspension of the officer]," the official said; however, the notification is expected to be issued on Thursday (today).

According to the source in MTO Karachi, the issue relates to a request for an adjournment in a tax case pending before the Sindh High Court. The adjournment did not indicate that the tax was waived or that any commitment was made not to pursue it.

The source said the FBR would issue a notification suspending the officer for 120 days.

The FBR chairman has transferred more than 20 senior tax officers based on an intelligence report that they fervently challenged their removal from posts. He also removed the IRS tax policy member, who was also an official spokesman for the FBR.

The FBR chairman has yet to appoint a spokesman, and avoided responding to numerous messages sent to him as well as his IRS member operation for comment on the matter. Mr. Tiwana, the IRS member operation and Customs member policy enjoy their current assignments, whereas all other top tax officers have been placed on special duty (OSD).

Based on intelligence in formation, a drive has been launched to remove senior tax officers from the IRS and Customs departments and make them OSDs. However, many officers suspected that a pick-and-choose approach was used throughout the process, as many officers with tainted reputations continue to hold high-level positions in the field because of their connections with those at the helm.

Shell posts Rs314m profit

KARACHI: Shell Pakistan Ltd (SPL) posted a profit after tax (PAT) of Rs314 million during first quarter of 2024 against a loss of Rs4.762 billion in the same period last year.

The mobility business grew its network with five newly commissioned sites and refreshed 13 sites. The business added 13 new fuel retail facilities across the network.

ARL's key unit

Attock Refinery Ltd (ARL) said that it has started its main crude distillation unit after some improvement in upshift of highspeed diesel (HSD).

In a stock filing on Wednesday, ARL said it is closely monitoring the situation with respect to product demand.

Pak-Qatar Takaful's turnover

Pak-Qatar Family Takaful Ltd achieved a turnover of Rs16.30 billion in 2023.

Shareholders Fund posted a net profit after tax of Rs156.30 million (earnings per share at Rs1.20), while the Participants' Takaful Fund (Waqf Fund) generated a surplus before distribution of Rs17.5m. —Staff Reporter

KARACHI: The stock market was on a losing streak for the third consecutive day as investors indulged in profit-taking on pre-budget uncertainty.

Abbas Mehmood of Arif Habib Corporation said the market extended overnight losses on pre-budget uncertainty and reports of falling fertilizer and cement sales. Urea sales plunged 49 per cent month-on-month to 125,000 tonnes in April, hitting a three-year low. DAP sales also declined 12pc to 92,000 tonnes month-on-month.

Topline Securities Ltd said the index's decline was mainly propelled by Darood Hercules, Engro Fertilisers, MCB Bank, Lucky Cement, and United Bank Ltd, collectively causing a drop of 210 points. On the other hand, Service Industries Ltd, Fajr

Combating terrorism is a 'shared interest' with Pakistan: US

WASHINGTON: The United States on Wednesday emphasized its 'shared interest' with Pakistan in addressing the critical threat that terrorism poses to the entire region.

At the State Department's daily news briefing, spokesperson Matthew Miller also focused on the treatment of Afghan refugees in Pakistan and urged Islamabad not to repatriate them due to the dire situation in Afghanistan.

"We remain committed to working with Pakistan to address the shared threat posed by terrorist groups throughout the region," said Miller, commenting on a recent ISPR statement about the involvement of Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) in a series of terrorist attacks in the country.

Pakistan has suffered greatly at the hands of terrorists, and "we regret the loss of life and injuries sustained and offer our heart-felt condolences to those affected by these attacks," he added.

Underlining the need to protect Afghans forced to seek refuge in neighbouring states, he emphasised: "We will continue to encourage Afghanistan's neighbours, including Pakistan, to respect the humanitarian advisory, given the dire situation in Afghanistan."

Miller refrained from taking a stance on speculations that former prime minister Imran Khan could be released soon, stating: "We do not take position on those matters. Those matters are for the government of Pakistan to decide."

In his briefing on Tuesday, the spokesperson welcomed diplomatic engagement between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia, applauding Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman's expected visit to Islamabad later this month.

Asked to comment on the Saudi prince's visit, Matthew Miller said: "Certainly, we always support diplomatic engagement between our partners," adding that he did not have further details about the visit.

BJP deletes X post accused of targeting Muslims

NEW DELHI: Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's party on Wednesday deleted a cartoon video posted on social media platform X that was criticised for targeting Muslims during an ongoing national election.

India's election rule bans campaigning based on "communal" incitement like the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has frequently invoked the country's main religious divide in the campaign trail.

The video, posted by an official BJP account, featured cartoonists of opposition politicians scheming to abolish special affirmative action programmes for marginalised Hindu groups and instead distribute them to Muslims.

The election commission wrote to the platform's Indian office on Tuesday saying the "objectionable" post violated Indian law. On Wednesday the original post had disappeared from the platform, with a notice saying it had been deleted.

A police complaint filed by the opposition Congress party accused the video of promoting "enmity between different religions". Modi, who is widely expected to win a third term in office when the six-week general election concludes next month, has made similar claims to the video in campaign appearances since last month. —AFP

Germany sees spate of attacks on politicians; minister struck on head

BERLIN: German police on Wednesday arrested a 74-year-old man suspected of hitting a former mayor of Berlin in the head, the latest in a rash of assaults against politicians in Germany.

Chancellor Olaf Scholz blasted the attacks against politicians as "outrageous and cowardly", stressing that violence did not belong in a democratic debate.

Franka Giffey was at a library on Tuesday afternoon when the suspect came up from behind her to hit her in the head and neck with a bag containing hard objects, police said.

Giffey, who is now Berlin state's economy minister and a member of Scholz's Social Democratic Party (SPD), was treated in hospital for light injuries. The detained suspect was previously known to investigators over "state security and hate crimes", said police, adding that they were investigating the motive of the attack.

Prosecutors were also considering if the man should be sent to psychiatric care because of indications that he might be mentally ill.

According to provisional police figures, 2,790 crimes were committed against politicians in Germany

in 2023, up from 1,806 the previous year. Nevertheless, that was down from the 2,840 recorded in 2021, when the last general elections were held. Giffey said she was feeling well after the initial scare, but she was "concerned and shaken about a growing 'free wild culture' in which people who are engaging politically in our country are increasingly exposed to attacks that are supposedly justified and acceptable."

"We live in a free and democratic country, in which everyone can be free to express his or her opinions," she wrote on X, formerly Twitter. "But there is a clear line — and that is violence against people," she added.

Berlin's current mayor Kai Wegner said anyone who attacked politicians was "attacking our democracy", as he vowed to examine "tougher sentences for attacks against politicians".

Next victims

Politicians, particularly from Scholz's SPD or coalition partner the Greens, have found themselves under increasing attacks in recent months. Vice Chancellor Robert

Habeck of the Greens was stopped from disembarking from a ferry by a group of protesters earlier this year.

Another prominent Green politician Katrin Göring-Eckardt was blocked from leaving an event in the state of Brandenburg last week by demonstrators who surrounded her car and started hitting it.

Giffey's assault also came just days after a European member of parliament, likewise from the SPD, had to be hospitalised last week after four people attacked him as he put up EU election posters in the eastern city of Dresden. Matthias Eckel, 48, needed an operation for serious injuries suffered in the attack, which Scholz denounced as a threat to democracy. Four suspects, aged between 17 and 18, were being investigated over the incident.

All four were believed to have links to the far-right group known as "Erfassungsliste", according to German media. Dresden has been a hotspot for assaults against politicians, with another case reported on Tuesday. A politician, identified by police only as a 47-year-old from the Green party, was threatened and spat on. —AFP

EU to use profits from frozen Russian assets to arm Ukraine

BRUSSELS: EU member states reached agreement on Wednesday on a plan to use billions of euros in profits from frozen Russian central bank assets to arm Ukraine and fund its post-war reconstruction.

Moscow has made a string of battlefield gains in recent months, proving its manpower and weapons advantage as Kyiv awaited critical new Western aid more than two years into the conflict.

With Washington finally set to deliver on a long-stalled aid package, Kyiv's other major backer the European Union has also been pushing for months to find more funds. Leaders of the 27-nation bloc agreed in March to move ahead with the assets proposal, expected to unlock some three billion euros (\$3.3 billion) a year, leaving diplomats to hammer out the details.

Posting on X, the bloc's Belgian presidency said EU ambassadors had "agreed in principle on measures concerning extraordinary revenues stemming from Russia's immobilised assets".

It said the funds would "serve to support Ukraine's recovery and military defence in the context of the Russian aggression," with a first tranche expected to be freed up in July.

"There could be no stronger symbol and no greater use for that money than to make Ukraine and all of Europe a safer place to live," added EU Commission chief Ursula von der Leyen.

The EU froze around 200 billion euros of Russian central bank assets held in the bloc as part of punishing sanctions imposed on Moscow for sending troops into its neighbour in February 2022. —AFP

World's record-breaking temperature streak extends through April

BRUSSELS: The world witnessed the hottest April on record, adding to an 11-month streak in which every month set a (fresh) temperature record, the European Union's climate change monitoring service stated on Wednesday.

Every single month since June of 2023, has ranked as the planet's hottest on record, as compared to the corresponding month in previous years, the Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S) said in its monthly bulletin.

Including the month of April, the world's mean temperature was the highest on record for a period of 12 months (1.61 degrees Celsius above the average), in the 1850-1980 pre-industrial period.

Some of the extremes which include months of record breaking sea surface temperatures, have led scientists to investigate whether human activity has now triggered a tipping point in the climate system.

"I think many scientists have asked the question whether there could be a shift in the climate system," said Julian Nicolas, C3S Senior Climate Scientist.

Greenhouse gas emissions from burning fossil fuels in the central component of climate change. In recent months, the natural El Niño phenomenon, which warms surface waters in the eastern Pacific Ocean, has also contributed to a rise in temperatures. —Reuters

UN sets sights on clinching 'biopiracy' accord at conference

GENEVA: After talks which spanned over a period of over 20 years, the United Nations is adamant on finalising an international agreement, in order to combat so-called 'biopiracy' later this month. Their solution is to enforce transparency with regards to the patenting of 'traditional knowledge' surrounding genetic resources.

The World Intellectual Property Organisation (a UN agency that deals with IP and innovation) is hopeful of ensuring that such knowledge will be protected from exploitation.

WIPO is comprised of 193 member states and will begin negotiations for an agreement from the 13 to 24 of May, at the agency's headquarters in Geneva. Below is a

summary of the issues at stake, relevant fault lines and an explanation as to why exactly countries have waited till now, to move towards an agreement.

What is biopiracy?

Biopiracy is the use of genetic resources, and associated traditional knowledge, without any agreement on the part of those who hold them, and without the holders receiving any tangible benefit. Genetic resources are contained in a variety of organisms, such as medicinal plants, agricultural crops and animal breeds.

These resources are increasingly being utilised in everything ranging from cosmetics to foods, medicines, biotechnology

and food supplements. Given it is not obligatory to publish the origin of innovation, numerous developing countries are concerned that patents are being granted that either circumvent the rights of indigenous people or are issued for already existing inventions. Such cases often end up in prolonged legal battles.

"This is referred to colloquially as 'biopiracy' according to World Wetland, the director of WIPO's traditional knowledge division. While natural genetic resources themselves cannot be directly protected as intellectual property (as they are not creations of the human mind), inventions developed using them can be, most often through a patent, says WIPO.

Inventions based on genetic resources, and the related traditional knowledge used and conserved by indigenous people over generations, may be eligible for protection through the patent system.

What does the draft agreement say?

Patent applicants will be required to disclose the country from which the genetic resources involved in the invention originated, as well as the indigenous people that provided the traditional knowledge.

The goal is to increase the "efficiency, transparency and quality" of the patent system, says the WIPO. This will ensure that the invention is indeed new and that the countries and communities concerned

have consented to the fact. An excess of 10 countries have such disclosure requirements incorporated into their national legislation. The majority of these are developing countries, including China, Brazil, India and South Africa. However, there are European states, too, such as France, Germany and Switzerland. It is paramount to mention that these procedures may vary and not all are always mandatory.

Transparency stands to boost the implementation of the Nagoya Protocol, which stipulates parties providing genetic resources and/or traditional knowledge "should benefit from the advantages (financial or otherwise), arising from their use." —AFP

What a feat: viral Dutch artist paints 10 pictures at once

VLAARDINGEN: Two portraits of the artist, two in her hands, and fierce concentration etched on her face, Dutch artist Rajacornia van Dam is crafting 10 paintings at the same time.

An astronaut, a self-portrait, a bespectacled panda and seven other pictures burst into life from her hands, painted on 10 canvases laid out on a table, upside down on the floor, and two easels.

It started as a party trick for the curly-haired Rajacornia — her artist name — who wanted a challenge to relieve her boredom. But it has since become a profession that has shot her to viral fame, with every paint stroke marked out in advance in her head before setting to work with hands — and feet.

"I work a bit on one canvas, then move to another one, so I'm always dividing my

attention between them," said Rajacornia, who is technically left-handed. "Five years ago, I started painting with both hands, as a bit of a challenge and to go quicker. I discovered I was ambidextrous," the 33-year-old artist said.

Starting out "for fun" and after a few mishaps with sticky tape between her toes, she tried using plasticine to keep the brush between her toes. It was a success and she posted a video of her exploits online, quickly becoming a viral hit. Orders flooded in. She is so skilled that only she can tell the difference between paintings crafted with her hands and those with her feet.

"I can really see a big difference. It's a bit less precise," she said, performing her skills at a museum in Vlaardingen, her home town in the south of the Netherlands. —AFP

to incite violence would never be tolerated.

"We have never seen such vandalism in responsible democracies, with violent mobs wreaking havoc on state properties for political gains," he added.

Earlier, addressing a press conference, Federal Minister for Information and Broadcasting Attaullah Tarar said the May 9 tragic incidents were the "biggest conspiracy" orchestrated to disrupt the country's development and harm its defence and integrity. "Such a tragedy has never ever been witnessed that was aimed to weaken the country," he added.

"The May 9 events were systematically planned to undermine the country's defence," the minister claimed. The minister claimed that in the viral videos, it could be seen how the leadership of the PTI "provoked people" to attack the government and defence installations.

Interestingly, soon after the riots, civil and military leaders last year decided to observe May 9 as "black day" at the national level.

PTI plans protests

As the Islamabad police announced a ban on gatherings in the capital in light of Section 144, PTI spokesperson Raza Hasan claimed that there were a crackdown on PTI supporters across the country, with dozens arrested in different cities to avert their planned protest.

Talking to Dawn, Mr Hasan said police were arresting the workers to stop them from holding rallies and protests. "Section 144 has been already imposed in a number of cities, including Islamabad. We will hold peaceful rallies and there is no plan to hold sit-ins. The state is so much afraid of Imran Khan that it has again changed the prisoner number of Imran Khan," he said.

According to a circular, signed by PTI Secretary General Omar Ayub Khan, as per the instructions of Imran Khan, the party will hold rallies at every provincial assembly constituency level in the country to mark the day.

Former prime minister Imran Khan's photo on placards with "Prisoner Number 864" written on them would be prominently displayed during the rallies and prayers for PTI's "martyrs" would also be organised.

According to the PTI, over 10,000 of its workers were arrested, but the government claimed it arrested only a few thousand people.

The PTI not only challenged the military court cases in the Supreme Court but also alleged that the riots were a false-flag operation designed and carried out by the establishment to dismantle the former ruling party.

Separately, the Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam led by Maulana Fazlur Rahman decided to mark the day by staging protest rallies and public meetings at various places in the country. JUI-F chief Maulana Faruk Rabbani has announced a public meeting on May 9 in Dera Ismail Khan and said it has nothing to do with the May 9 anniversary. The JUI-F chief said "One Million March and Awami Assembly have nothing to do with the May 9 incidents."

Police, demonstrators clash at Amsterdam's Gaza demo

86 detained in Paris after police removed students who had set up a pro-Palestinian camp at the Sorbonne university

THE HAGUE/PARIS/WASHINGTON: Dutch riot police clashed with pro-Palestinian demonstrators on Wednesday after moving in to 'clear' barricades at Amsterdam's main university. Images from local television outlets showed dozens of police officers (wearing riot gear) 'chasing' back demonstrators with a group of protesters, when officers started clearing out an area in front of the Renaissance building, within Amsterdam's city centre.

"The operation has been authorised by the mayor," they stated. The UvA alleged charges including 'disturbing the peace and destruction of property'. Images on the local AT5 channel portrayed police arresting demonstrators, numbering a few hundred.

They went so far as 'roughly pulling' one individual off a front-end loader. Another protester attempted to stop a loader before jumping into a canal, to evade police attempts at making an arrest.

Images further showed police surrounding and dragging away a small yet vocal group of protesters who remained on campus, while a front-end loader was 'pushing material used to put up the barricades into a canal'. Protesters here too, were warning placards which read "Free Palestine" and shouted "Shame on you" at police officers.

Police alleged protesters were not 'just' students, but contained elements "who were not affiliated to the university and were deliberately seeking conflict with the police."

The Amsterdam city council is due to host an emergency debate regarding the ongoing demonstrations on Friday. Campus protests have also sprung up across the United States in weeks gone by, with students calling upon universities to cut direct or indirect financial ties with US weapons manufacturers and Israeli institutions. The rallies have rocked colleges campuses and slowly but surely, have

begun spreading across the globe. Pro-Israel counter-protesters at the University of California, Los Angeles, physically attacked demonstrators at an encampment.

86 detained in France

French police on Wednesday detained 86 individuals following an operation to remove students staging a pro-Palestinian occupation at the Sorbonne university in Paris, according to prosecutors. Those arrested in the police operation on Tuesday night were being held for a variety of public order offences, the statement read.

They include wilful damage, 'sedition', violence against a person holding public authority, 'intrusion into an education establishment' and holding a 'meeting designed to disrupt order'. A handful of students are also being held for participation in a group with a view to seeking to promote violence or damage to property.

They may only be held for an initial 24 hours, which can then be extended to another 24 hours.

George Washington University protest

Police used force in order to 'clear' an encampment of pro-Palestinian protesters at George Washington University in the US capital on Wednesday. In similar fashion to the events that unfolded in Paris, dozens were arrested in the latest clash with students demonstrating over the Israeli onslaught on the Gaza Strip.

Members of Congress allied with the Republican Party had 'pressured local authorities' to act on the

encampment, even going so far as summoning Washington's mayor and police chief to testify in the House of Representatives on Wednesday.

Just after dawn (0800 GMT) hundreds of officers moved in on a university quad, making numerous arrests and using pepper spray on demonstrators.

Police representatives stated that 33 people were arrested for "unlawful entry" and "assault on a police officer". Officers remained on the scene till around 10:00 am, as tents were being dragged towards a garbage truck and a student held a poster reading "Free Palestine." For context, police had declined a request from the university to disband the encampment last month, the Washington Post had reported. At the time, they cited apprehensions about moving in against peaceful protesters.

Free speech versus intimidation

President Biden and universities have tried to walk a fine line between the rights of free speech and concerns about so-called intimidation. On Tuesday, Biden condemned a "terrifying surge" in "anti-Semitism" in a speech at the Capitol, stating "There's no place on any campus in America, no place in America, for anti-Semitism or hate speech or threats of violence of any kind."

Demonstrators, including Jewish student organisers, have clarified that they denounce acts of anti-Semitism. On the other hand, they accuse their detractors of conflating criticism of Israel with prejudice against Jews.—Agencies

hilled in March 2024, and it will reflect in the billing month of May 2024, Nepra's notification stated.

In its determination, the regulator also lauded a myth advanced by certain vested groups about the negative impact of solar net metering on overall national consumer tariffs. Nepra said that the Central Power Purchasing Agency (CPPA) reported about 7.5pc reduction in consumption during the first nine months of the current fiscal year. The CPPA also conceded that only 54.7 gigawatt hour (GWh) of energy came from the solar net metering, accounting for just 0.7pc of total grid pool of 7,756 GWh delivered to Discoms.

This also suggests that the narrative against homeownes with solar net metering was being pushed to conceal certain other efficiency-related matters in the power network. Upon inquiry by Nepra, the chief executive of CPPA reported that on an accumulative basis, the actual generation remained lower by 7.4pc for FY 2023-24, up to March 2024.

On further inquiry by Nepra about the reason for running RLNG plants, the CPPA responded that "the reason was due to the orders which were already placed for RLNG due to the expected increase in demand and to ensure system stability". Upon more questions by the regulator, CPPA admitted that overall consumption reduced by 7.5pc, including a reduction in residential consumption by 11.3pc, commercial by 2.8pc, industrial by 4.5pc, and bulk by 14.5pc. Regarding the reduction in part-load charges, CPPA-G submitted that a proper study needs to be carried out in this regard.

On the issue of low utilisation of Thar coal power plants, CPPA conceded that the overall utilisation of these plants remained around 48pc during March 2024, considering system stability and demand patterns. Regarding the curtailment of Thar-based plants during the month, NEDC responded that this was due to a lack of demand and load management.

It was further revealed that the limitation of the HVDC (Mataro-Lahore) corridor, coupled with system stability issues, led to lower dispatch of certain plants. Regarding the financial impact of operating Guddu 747 on open cycle, CPPA-G stated that the rate difference between open cycle and combined cycle fuel cost component was around Rs3.6/kWh, resulting in an additional cost of Rs450 million.

Upon inquiry regarding the non-utilisation of the Lucky coal power plant despite being higher on the economic merit order, and the operation of the Sahiwal coal power plant which is substantially under-performing, CPPA explained that the grid code also mandates the system operator to maintain system stability and reliability while dispatching power plants.

EU staff members protest Israel's bombing on Gaza

BRUSSELS: More than 100 staff members of European Union institutions gathered in Brussels on Wednesday in a protest against Israel's war in Gaza.

Protesters laid three rolling white sheets with red stains on them on the square outside the European Commission's head office in the Belgian capital. On the three 'ladies' the words International Law, EU Treaties and Genocide Convention were written, in a protest of the way Israel has responded to the Gazans.

"We're coming together in a peaceful assembly, to stand up for these rights, principles and values that the European institutions are built on," EU Commission staff member Maria Carlisle said.

"The reason why we work here and love to work here. These values of human rights, human dignity and freedom especially."

Yellow protester Simona Baloghova, who works for the European Commission of the Regions, added the protest should not be seen as a political statement.—Reuters

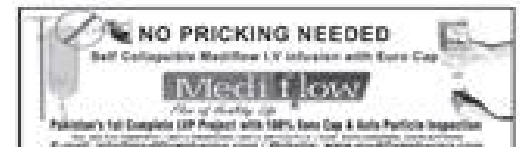

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PM vows to get 26m out-of-school children enrolled

• Declares education emergency in country • Unicef official says 70pc kids can't read, understand text

ISLAMABAD: Declaring an education emergency in the country, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Wednesday vowed to get around 26 million out-of-school children enrolled and promote literacy so that the motherland could regain its lost space and transform it as one of the most educated societies in the world.

"Today, with our conviction, and the support of provinces, we will handle this challenge of 26m out-of-school children. We will bring them back to school...I declare from this moment an Emergency in Education all over Pakistan...The way we did it in Punjab, we will do it in Pakistan," the prime minister said addressing the National Conference on Education Emergency.

"I will personally supervise the programme and meet all the chief ministers, irrespective of their political affiliations, with a vision to march in unison, expressing the hope that the provinces too would extend their support," the PM said.

The event was attended by federal ministers, parliamentarians, vice-chancellors, diplomats and development partners.

"This is about our children and our future... This is a very challenging task, no doubt. But nations which had faced difficulties and defeat in the past arose from the ashes of defeat. Germany and Japan are the examples. Why can't Pakistan be? I guarantee, if we move in unison to find our space, Pakistan will emerge as one of the most educated societies one day," he added.

The premier said the enrolment of 26m out-of-school children and arrested growth were major challenges facing Pakistan which required huge financial resources. "But the real challenge is the will to do," he said, recalling Pakistan's manifestation of the commitment to becoming a nuclear power despite international pressures, and eliminating terrorism by sacrificing around 80,000 lives to establish peace in the country.

In his address, Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training Dr Khalid Maqsood Siddiqui said the education sector needed immediate action and urgent response as Pakistan stood at the crossroads of destinations with no option to lose.

"The statistics of education in Pakistan are disturbing, alarming and disheartening. More than 26m children are out of school. This number is greater than the population of 150 countries in the world," he added.

Unicef representative in Pakistan Abdullah A. Fadil said over 70 per cent of children aged 10 in Pakistan could not read or understand text. Despite constitutional guarantee, education in Pakistan was neither yet compulsory nor free, he regretted.

He said through enhanced investment in education and young people, Pakistan could regain its lost stature as the first Nobel laureate in physics belonged to Pakistan and that the country also recently sent a space mission to moon.

British High Commissioner in Islamabad Jane Marriott said Pakistan with 60pc population under 30 years of age was at a crossroads to make tough choices.

She said the conference called for urgent actions like enhanced funding, inclusivity, multiple shifts schools and retaining the children, and assured her country's utmost cooperation to make Pakistan achieve the goal.

World Food Programme Country Director Guss Lishyama, in her video message, said food security and education went hand in hand and school meal was one of the best programmes to invest in the country's future.

World Bank Vice President Martin Raiser said Pakistan was faced with 40pc children having stunted growth and the ratio was around 60pc in poor districts.

Mr Raiser said as Pakistan's education system was vulnerable to climate change, it was a must to invest in climate resilience.

Pakistan's fastest mountaineer Nadea Kiani, in her video message from Makalu Mountain, said she had been able to achieve her dreams just because of self-belief and education. She requested the prime minister and chief ministers to allocate more resources for girls' education to help them materialise their dreams.

Meanwhile, chairing a separate meeting on Wednesday, PM Shehbaz directed the authorities concerned to immediately initiate the process of establishing the Pakistan Skill Development and Pakistan Skill Development Fund to unify the technical and vocational education countryside and provide better employment to Pakistani workers abroad.

Pakistan's first moon satellite enters its orbit

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's inaugural lunar satellite, RUBE-Q, has achieved a significant milestone by successfully entering the moon's orbit on Wednesday afternoon, as confirmed by Institute of Space Technology.

RUBE-Qamar was successfully deployed in lunar orbit on May 8, at 1:14pm.

According to the Institute of Space Technology, the pivotal development highlights its importance in potentially unlocking larger-scale space missions for Pakistan in the future.

"Satellite after deployment is performing as per design specifications. All sub-systems' health data is excellent. The imaging payload is fully functional," IST said, adding, "The next two days will be spent conducting thorough in-orbit testing. Images will be shared after in-orbit testing."

Last Friday, Pakistan became the sixth country to launch its first-ever moon satellite.

Riding on the Chinese rocket Chang'e 4 lunar probe, the RUBE-Q satellite marked a historic collaboration between Pakistan and China in lunar exploration. The Chinese mission aimed to land on the moon's far side, perpetually hidden from Earth, and subsequently collect and return samples.

The Chinese embassy expressed its enthusiasm for the mission, highlighting that this marked the first-ever China-Pakistan cooperation in lunar exploration.

According to Dr Khuram Khurshid, head of the department of electrical and computer science at the institute, the satellite would play a critical role in deep space missions.

Operating in extreme temperatures as low as minus 100 degrees Celsius, the satellite features a 7kg one-megapixel camera tailored for missions with power constraints. "Its surface-level analysis capabilities, transmitting images at a modest 1-kbps, will provide crucial data on crater locations, water, and traces of ice on the moon's surface. These findings, obtained through various techniques, hold promise for global utilisation," he said.

As the Chinese lander collects rock and soil samples, RUBE-Q will spend three to six months orbiting the moon, capturing and transmitting images of the moon back to Earth. By May 15, according to the institute, Pakistan anticipates sharing images captured by the satellite.

Seventh mass grave found at Gaza as Israel strikes Rafah

• Negotiations resume in Cairo with Hamas calling latest round 'decisive' • US pauses shipment of 3,500 heavy-duty bombs amid Israeli incursion

GAZA STRIP: Medical teams found a third mass grave inside Al-Shifa hospital and a seventh mass grave across Gaza hospitals, with the recovery of 49 bodies from the premises, as Israel bombarded Rafah on Wednesday amid the ongoing negotiations in Cairo and Doha for ceasefire and prisoner swap.

Israel has defied international objections and sent tanks into Rafah, which is crowded with Palestinian civilians sheltering near the Egyptian border, seizing on Tuesday a crossing that is the main conduit for aid into the besieged territory.

The White House condemned the incursion to humanitarian deliveries, with a senior US official later revealing Washington had paused a shipment of bombs last week after Israel failed to address concerns over its long-threatened Rafah operation.

However, the Israeli military claimed on Wednesday it was reopening a major aid crossing into Gaza, Kerem Shalom, as well as the Erez crossing. But the UN agency for Palestinian refugees, UNRWA, said the Kerem Shalom crossing remained closed.

The Israeli military did not immediately comment on the third mass grave, as footage from Al-Shifa hospital showed at least a dozen bodies wrapped in black plastic body bags.

Standing in front of the ruins of the hospital, Mohammed Salah, head of the emergency department at Al-Shifa, said several of the bodies had decomposed.

Last month, around 30 bodies were

reported found buried in two other graves in the hospital courtyard.

After the Israeli assault in March, the World Health Organisation said Al-Shifa had been reduced to ashes, leaving behind an "empty shell" with many bodies.

On Wednesday, Gaza authorities said health workers continued to uncover bodies from the complex. So far, 520 bodies have been recovered from "seven mass graves" found at three different hospitals across Gaza in recent weeks, the media office said.

Since the escalation of attacks by Israeli forces in Gaza in October 2023, at least 34,844 Palestinians, mostly women and children, have been killed, according to the Hamas-run territory's health ministry.

Cairo talks resume

On the other hand, talks aimed at agreeing a ceasefire resumed in Cairo on Wednesday "in the presence of all parties", Egyptian state-linked media reported.

A senior Hamas official said the latest round of negotiations would be "decisive".

Hamas "stands on the rightful demands of its people and will not give up any of our people's rights," the official told AFP on condition of anonymity because he was not authorised to speak publicly on the negotiations.

He had previously warned it would be Israel's "last chance" to free the scores of prisoners.

However, the Israeli forces continued to conduct air and ground assaults in Gaza and Rafah, after

capturing Rafah crossing.

Incursion condemned

Meanwhile, Qatar, which hosts a Hamas leadership and has been mediating between the two sides, appealed "for urgent international action to prevent Rafah from being invaded and a crime of genocide being committed".

A Palestinian analyst said Israel's seizure of the Rafah crossing could be an attempt to create new facts on the ground, or a bid to "sabotage the truce talks".

Israel's seizure of the Palestinian side of the Rafah crossing came after Hamas said it had accepted a truce proposal — one Israel said was "far" from what its own negotiators had previously agreed to.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu described the Rafah operation as "a very important step" in denying Hamas a passage that was essential for establishing its influence.

Bombs shipment stopped

Hours later, a senior US administration official speaking on condition of anonymity said Washington had "paused one shipment of weapons last week" after Israel failed to address its concerns over the Rafah incursion, which the United States has vocally opposed. The shipment consisted of over 3,500 heavy-duty bombs, the official said.

It was the first time President Joe Biden, whose government is Israel's top provider of military assistance, had acted on a warning he gave to Netanyahu in April.—Agencies

Karachi, Lahore passport offices start working 24/7

ISLAMABAD: The Zonal passport offices in Karachi and Lahore have started to operate 24/7 in line with orders of Interior Minister Mohsin Raza Naqvi.

Passport offices at Awan Market in Karachi and Garden Town in Lahore will now be open around the clock to facilitate the public.

Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi on Sunday announced that at least one passport office in both Lahore and Karachi will stay open 24/7 to better serve the public and improve accessibility of the people in passport services.

In a post on X, Mr Naqvi said the move will make it easier for everyone to access passport services anytime.

"To give some to the public and to facilitate them, at least one passport office will be open 24/7 in both Lahore and Karachi. This will make it easier for everyone to access passport services anytime," he said.

The move is expected to significantly alleviate the burden on existing passport offices and reduce waiting times for applicants.

The development has come at a time when the number of people applying for passports appears to be growing.

Informed sources said the passport and immigration currently had a capacity to print 20 to 25 thousand passports per day while it was receiving around 40 thousand applications each day, leading to a backlog of passports which stands at around 0.8 million.

They said the interior minister has also taken notice of the huge backlog and under his directions steps were under way to enhance the printing capacity. They said that tenders had already been invited for printing of e-passports and machine readable passport machines.

The sources said the delay in release of funds for procurement of laminating paper and other essential materials was one of the reasons for the delay in issuance of passports.

They said a law will soon be brought to the parliament to give passport and immigration department the status of Authority, so that the organisation earning billions of rupees each year is not handicapped by delays in the release of funds.

Three Afghan cops killed in bomb blast

Taliban-run defence ministry refutes Pakistan military's claim about Bisham attack

PAIZABAD: After days of protests against the ongoing operation for clearance of poppy cultivation in Badakhshan, three policemen were killed and five others wounded in a bomb attack on a security convoy on Wednesday.

"The bomb exploded while the convoy of police forces was on its way to destroy poppy cultivation," Taliban Interior Ministry spokesman Abdul Mannan Qazi posted on X, formerly Twitter.

The ministry officials said a stickie improvised explosive device (IED) was attached to a motorcycle that targeted a convoy of police vehicles in Fozabad, the capital of mountainous Badakhshan province, around 11am.

There was no immediate claim of responsibility for the attack.

An AFP journalist saw Taliban authorities searching homes and detaining dozens of people near the scene. Images posted on social media but not immediately verified by AFP showed a charred motorcycle and a police truck riddled with bullets.

Eyewitness Amirullah, who did not want to give his full name, said he heard a huge explosion and saw that a convoy of Taliban authorities had been hit. "Immediately the security forces cleared the area of people," he said.

The explosion comes days after Taliban security officials and residents clashed over the violent clearance of poppy crops in two Badakhshan districts, leaving two dead and sparking rare protests.

Afghanistan was the largest producer of opium before poppy cultivation was banned by the Taliban in a decree in 2022. Farmers have been encouraged to plant different crops, but none compete with the financial draw of the poppy, leading some to continue to discreetly cul-

tivate small plots.

The number of bombings and suicide attacks in Afghanistan has fallen since the Taliban ended their insurgency after ousting the US-backed government and returning to power in August 2021.

However, a number of armed groups, including the Islamic State group, remain a threat, with regular reports of explosions that go unconfirmed by authorities.

Taliban reject Afghan's role in Bisham attack

Separately, the Taliban defence ministry rejected Pakistan military's claim that Afghans were involved in an attack on Chinese engineers. "Afghans are not involved in such matters," said Mufti Emayyullah Khawarizmi, the spokesperson for Afghanistan's Taliban-run ministry of national defence.

"Blaming Afghanistan for such incidents is a failed attempt to divert attention from the truth of the matter and we strongly reject it," he added.—Agencies

China, Serbia agree to chart 'shared future'

In a bid to boost ties with eastern Europe, Xi to reach Hungary after touring Serbia

BELGRADE: China and Serbia on Wednesday agreed to follow a "shared future" as President Xi Jinping visited the Balkan country as part of his bid to forge stronger relations with allies at the edge of the European Union.

Xi is on his first European tour in five years, and the trip was seen as an effort to strengthen ties with eastern European countries that are pro-Russia and large recipients of Chinese investment. He will fly to Hungary later in the day.

"We are writing history today," Serbian President Aleksandar Vucic told a large crowd that had gathered in front of the Serbian presidential palace to welcome Xi, applauding and chanting "China,

China". The two countries signed 29 treaty and economic cooperation agreements promoting legal, reg-

Serbia will also become the first European country in years to enter into a free trade agreement with China when a deal signed last year comes into effect on July 1.

Vucic said that since 2020 China had been the single-largest investor in Serbia, and that its investment was up 10-fold over the past decade. The free trade deal will guarantee tariff-free exports for 95 per cent of Serbian products to China over the next five to 10 years, he said.

Xi said that China was ready to import more high-quality agricultural products from Serbia and would welcome more direct flights between Belgrade and Chinese cities.

Both leaders boast of an ironclad partnership. Along with Hungary, Serbia is Europe's firmest supporter of China's huge Belt and Road infrastructure project across parts of Asia and Europe.

"Serbia became China's first strategic partner in central and

eastern Europe eight years ago, and it becomes the first European country with which we shall build a community with shared future," Xi said.

The two leaders said they would support each other's sovereignty and territorial integrity, meaning that Serbia considers Taiwan, viewed by Beijing as a breakaway province, to be part of China, just as China considers Kosovo, which declared independence in 2008, as part of Serbia.

"We shall jointly confront hegemony and the politics of power," Xi said.

Xi's visit comes on the anniversary of the 1999 Nato bombing of the Chinese Embassy in Belgrade during a campaign against the former Yugoslav to force late Serbian strongman Slobodan Milosevic to end a crackdown on ethnic Albanians in Kosovo.

Nato said the bombing, which killed three Chinese journalists and wounded 29 Chinese nation-

als, was accidental. It prompted outrage in China and an apology from then US President Bill Clinton.

"The Chinese people appreciate the peace but will never allow that a historic tragedy repeats itself," Xi said in an opinion article in the daily Politika on Tuesday.

Vucic said the two countries had agreed to establish an inter-governmental technology committee that would enable Serbia to get access to the latest technologies and use of artificial intelligence.

China owns mines and factories across Serbia and has lent billions for roads, bridges and new facilities, becoming Serbia's key partner in much-needed infrastructure development.

Xi left France on Tuesday after a two-day trip during which he offered no major concessions on trade or foreign policy, even as President Emmanuel Macron pressed him on market access and Ukraine.—Reuters

Olympic champion Hafnaoui to miss Paris Games

TUNIS: Olympic 400-metre freestyle champion Ahmed Hafnaoui will miss the Paris Games, Africa Aquatics (AA) said on Tuesday.

The continental governing body said on its website the 21-year-old Tunisian had confirmed local media reports that he would not swim at the July 26-Aug 11 Games.

AA's report said Hafnaoui had declined to resume training in the US where he was previously based but did not provide details.

However, Tunisian Olympic Committee president Mohamed Bouayadi told Reuters Hafnaoui's participation in Paris has not been fully decided yet, adding that he has suffered an injury that requires him to rest for 45 days.

Bouayadi also said Hafnaoui has many other international obligations ahead of him, calling on sports fans to "change their vision of champions and treat them humanely."

"One of our duties as officials is to protect and care for athletes," he said.

Hafnaoui's mother Amina said her son's main focus right now is his recovery. "Ahmed's absence from the Paris Olympics has not yet been confirmed. Even if he is absent, Ahmed is an Olympic champion and has achieved international recognition despite his young age, and there is still a long way to go before him to achieve the best."

"The priority currently is his physical and mental health," she added.

Hafnaoui had trained in California late last year under former US swim coach Mark Schubert, who runs an elite distance swimming programme in Orange County.

However, he told reporters at the World Championships in Doha in February that he had returned home to Tunisia, citing a visa issue.

In 2021 at the age of 18, Hafnaoui stunned the world by winning the 400m freestyle gold from lane eight at the pandemic-delayed Tokyo Olympics after being the slowest qualifier in the final.

He claimed the 800m and 1,500m freestyle titles at last year's World Championships in Fukuoka and was runner-up in the 400m both at Australia's Swim Short.

However, he failed to reach the final in all three events at the last World Championships in Doha in February.—Reuters

Pakistan junior tennis team named

PESHAWAR: A three-member Pakistan team was announced on Wednesday for the forthcoming South Asian Tennis Championship being staged in Kathmandu later this month.

The players selected for the May 20-29 event include Rashid Ali Bachani (Kashmir), Muhammad Shayan Afridi and Muhammad Javed Khan (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa).—APP

Flying under the radar, Dortmund stun Europe with CL final spot

PARIS: Eleven years after losing 2-1 to German rivals Bayern Munich in the 2013 Champions League final, Borussia Dortmund have overcome the odds and are heading back to Wembley.

Dortmund's 1-0 win over Paris St Germain in the French capital thanks to a header from Mats Hummels on Tuesday saw the Germans complete a 2-0 aggregate win, becoming the most unlikely Champions League finalists since Tottenham Hotspur in 2019.

In the June 1 final in London, they will face either Bayern again or 14-time champions Real Madrid.

Dortmund came into the season on the back of a bitter Bundesliga title loss on the final matchday of the previous campaign.

And while their league results quickly confirmed Edin Terzic's team did not have the consistency to be a serious title contender this season, it was a different story in Europe.

Dortmund, who won the tournament in 1997, cruised through their group with only one loss in six matches against PSG, AC Milan and Newcastle United.

"There is always a team that no one has on their radar that reaches the quarter-finals or the semi-finals. We wanted to be the team that will not necessarily be on anyone's radar," Terzic said. "That road has been unbelievable."

"Last season, we lost the championship at home on the last matchday. I'm happy that we can now give something back to the fans," Terzic added, remembering how Bayern Munich snatched the Bundesliga title from Dortmund on goal difference.

"[Going to the final] was a very emotional moment, a beautiful moment. We wished a last season's last matchday. But today we could give something back, keep them dreaming and now we'll do everything to bring the trophy back home."

Dortmund did not play the kind of spectacular football that instantly attracts attention but scored key wins at Newcastle and Milan. After losing on the first matchday Dortmund won five group games without defeat to top the section.

"After the second matchday [following a loss at PSG and a home draw against Milan] almost no one believed in us any more," said captain Eric Can. "We only had one point after two matches but we kept believing in us and that was the most important thing. Keeping two clean sheets in two matches against PSG is no mean feat."

Borussia Dortmund veteran Marco Reus, who announced on Friday he would leave the

club at the end of the season, said "nobody expected us to make it".

"Tomorrow nobody will ask how we did it. They will just see the name Borussia Dortmund in the final at Wembley," Reus said to Amazon Prime. "Today it was clear that we needed to suffer and that we needed some luck, but what the fans did was crazy, crazy."

Prior to their two 1-0 wins over PSG in the last four, Dortmund had dispatched PSV Eindhoven in the round of 16 and Atletico Madrid in the quarter-finals. A rematch with Bayern remains on the cards.

"We will come up against a very tough opponent, no matter who it is," said Hummels. "Since that second matchday we have kept believing we can hold our own in the Champions League. There is absolutely no reason whatsoever not to believe that we can also win the final."

Dortmund have played a roller-coaster Bundesliga season and are currently in fifth place with two games left.

"That plays a role," Terzic said. "In 2013 when Dortmund were in the Champions League final they were 25 points behind in the league and in 1997 when they won it they were also not doing well. The season had highs and lows but our season is still not finished."

Dortmund rode their luck in both semi-finals, with PSG hitting the woodwork six times — including four times on Tuesday.

Despite needing assistance from the goal frame, Dortmund's central defensive pairing of Hummels and Nico Schlotterbeck kept PSG's ace attacker Kylian Mbappe under check.

PSG began the second half well but their fluency was cut short when Hummels headed in from a corner on the 50-minute mark.

Hummels' headers have a history of breaking French hearts. At the 2014 World Cup in Brazil, Hummels nodded in the only goal in Germany's 1-0 quarter-final win over France on their way to a fourth crown.

Hummels' contract expires at the end of the season and he has said he will not decide until the summer when he plays next season — or whether he plays at all.

But while the veteran may join Reus in walking off into the Westfalenstadion sunset, his whereabouts on the first Saturday in June remain clear.

MBAPPE DENIED DREAM PSG FAREWELL

MBAPPE, however, will not get his dream

farewell from PSG after their shock exit deprived him of playing his last game for the club at Wembley.

The 2018 World Cup winner will leave PSG after seven years when his contract expires at the end of this season, with Real Madrid his likely next destination.

He had hoped to sign off by leading the Qatar-based club to Champions League glory for the first time in their history, but missed two good chances at the Parc des Princes.

"I tried to help my team as best as I could but I didn't do enough," Mbappe said. "I'm the guy who should score goals and be decisive. When things are good, I take all the time I want and when they are not, you have to take the shadows. That's not a problem. The first one who should have scored tonight was me. That's life and we have to move on, me and the team."

It will be hard for PSG to do that, given how close they were to reaching the final for the second time, four years on from their defeat against Bayern Munich in Lisbon.

That will forever remain as close as Mbappe came to lifting the European Cup with his hometown team, for whom he is their all-time top scorer with 255 goals.

Being knocked out by the team who sit fifth in the Bundesliga looks like a disaster for a club who have invested as much as PSG over the years since the Qatar takeover of 2011.

However, the truth is also that this PSG side was not seriously expected to get this far, despite the presence of Mbappe.

A massive overhaul of the squad was undertaken ahead of this season following the departures of Lionel Messi and Neymar, and Luis Enrique was brought in to oversee the new project.

"The objective I set out when I arrived was to compete as well as we could for every trophy," the Spanish coach said on Tuesday. "Tonight I'm proud of my team, of all the players."

PSG won the Ligue 1 title and have the French Cup final to come later this month.

"We weren't efficient, they were efficient, they scored two goals and won both matches. There's a lot to take back from this competition," captain Marquinhos told reporters.

"At the start of the season, nobody believed we'd get this far. We've overcome a lot of obstacles, but we can't throw everything away now just because we've been eliminated. We have to remember that this is a new project, with a new coach. There are positive things to take into the next season."—Agencies

Karachi face Lahore in national women's one-day final

FAISALABAD: Karachi and Lahore won their respective matches here on Wednesday to qualify for the final of the National Women's One-Day Tournament.

Karachi and Lahore, having finished at the top two sides with nine wins each in the double round-robin stage, will lock horns in the final at the Iqbal Stadium in Faisalabad on Saturday.

On Wednesday, Karachi defeated Rawalpindi by 22 runs in their tenth-round match at Bohrauwali Ground in Faisalabad.

Battering first, Osama Sohail's 86-ball 67 featuring seven fours cleared Karachi to 167 all out in 41 overs. Karachi spinners led by Osama (4-34) played a vital role in restricting Rawalpindi to 145 all out in 49.4 overs. Maham Manzoor and Syeda Aroob Shah shared five wickets between them.

In a low-scoring thriller at the Iqbal Stadium, Peshawar successfully defended a scanty 110 to edge out Multan by four runs.

Peshawar's Aleema Shah helped her team cross the 100-mark with a disguised 40 as Multan's Noor-ul-Iman grabbed five wickets for 15 runs.

In reply, Multan looked comfortable at 76-2 before losing the next eight wickets for just 30 runs with six balls to spare.

In another match, Lahore outclassed Quetta by nine wickets at the Javed Sports Complex.

After electing to bat first, Quetta managed to post a poor total of 105 all out in 49.1 overs. Khadija Chishti and Arijah Hameed top-scored with 28 runs each. Lahore's Noorun Yaqoob and Ayeesha Bilal picked up three wickets apiece while Qureshaim claimed two.

Murray to return for Geneva Open

LONDON: Briton Andy Murray will make his comeback from injury at this month's Geneva Open after the former world number one was handed a wildcard by the organisers of the French Open tennis event on Wednesday.

Murray, who turns 37 later this month, rolled his ankle in the final set of his defeat by Czech Tomáš Macho in the Miami Open in March and withdrew from the Monte Carlo Masters and Munich Open last month.

The Scot opted not to undergo surgery and will now return in the May 18-25 tournament in Switzerland.

The three-time Grand Slam winner, who had hip reconstructive surgery in 2019, previously said he did not plan to "play much past this summer" but hoped to compete at another Olympics.

Murray had also said he hoped to play at the French Open, which starts at Roland Garros on May 26. Murray has not played in the tournament since 2020.—Reuters

Nasir, Wong advance as CNS International Squash begins

KARACHI: Hong Kong's Wong Chi Him and local hope Nasir Iqbal advanced to the second round of the Chief of Naval Staff International Squash Championship with straight-forward victories on Wednesday while Japan's Etsuko Tomotaka prevailed in a five-game thriller.

In the opening match at the Rashid Khan and Jahangir Khan Squash Complex, Wong justified his higher seeding as he dominated the court against Sebastian Hoffmann of the Netherlands, winning six straight games 11-4, 11-2, 11-5.

Wong's clinical drop shots were too hot to handle for the underdog Hoffmann. The

Dutchman, struggling to find his rhythm, mistimed his shots and failed to counter Wong's precise play.

"As I was the higher seeded player I expected to play better than him," Wong told Dawn. "Still I need to be more consistent as Hoffmann dominated me in some rallies but I was able to catch up. I would analyse my game-play a bit more and try to improve on some areas."

Wong's compatriot Ka, however, didn't have an easy ride as Tomotaka edged him in a nail-biter 12-10, 11-8, 5-11, 10-12, 11-3.

Etsuko prevailed in a closely-contested first set, utilising his reach advantage to edge out Ka.

The second set was equally intense, with Etsuko taking it

despite the ninth-seeded Ka's valiant efforts.

He upped the ante and served the riddle of Etsuko as he clinched a well-deserved game to halve the deficit, capitalising on Japanese international brief lapses in focus.

The match was tied at 2-2, with Ka leading 5-3 in the fourth set before Etsuko staged a remarkable comeback to level the score at 5-5. Ka's resilience was evident as he claimed three consecutive points to level the match at 2-2.

But Etsuko regained his composure in the decisive game as he raced to a 5-1 lead before wrapping up a hard-fought victory.

"I know Ka is a very competitive individual as he beat me in our last three fixtures, so it's

great to register a victory against him," the 29-year-old Etsuko told Dawn. "He picked up on most of my drop shots and I struggled on counter-drops so I guess that is something I can improve on."

Nasir, meanwhile, downed a "frustrated" Darren Pragsam 11-5, 11-5, 12-10.

Nasir was cruising towards victory when he led 10-5 in the first game but Pragsam bounced back in style to cut the deficit to 10-9. Nasir was relieved when referee gave Nasir a point for obstruction — a decision against which the Malaysian protested vehemently — which sealed the game.

The second set was more comfortable for Nasir, as he showcased his superior move-

ment and shot selection.

Although Pragsam pushed Nasir in the third set, the Pakistani emerged victorious, displaying great sportsmanship by declining a point awarded due to obstruction again.

"The last point in the first game could've easily been a let," Pragsam told Dawn. "But at the end of the day these decisions can be subjective, maybe my perception was different the referee."

But Pragsam admitted that the decision affected him.

"In the second game I was still stuck on that decision and really hindered my performance which was frustrating," he said.

Pragsam's fellow countryman Mohammed Syafiq Kamal (though had a fine outing as he

staged a brilliant comeback to defeat Egypt's Hossam Hosam 5-11, 12-11, 12-10, 11-9, 11-8.

Hossam won the first set with some great shot selection, building an 8-1 lead. Kamal struck back with four consecutive points, but Hossam regained control to close the set.

The second set was a thriller, with Kamal leading 8-10 before Hossam equalised and took the lead. Kamal's clever shot towards the corner forced Hossam to retreat, levelling the score. Kamal capitalised on Hossam's errors to take the game.

The Egyptian regained control in the third game, despite Kamal's efforts to level the score. The fourth set saw Kamal break the pattern, taking the lead and eventu-

ally winning to level the match at 2-2.

The decisive fifth set was packed with action, as Hossam went 7-4 up before Kamal levelled the score. Hossam's shot out of his range gave Kamal a 9-8 lead, and the Malaysian secured the victory in 69 minutes.

Meanwhile, Malaysia's Bryan Teo Kong Lim and Ong Nai Hang, Hong Kong's Leo Cheng along with England's Will Schar also won their first-round matches.

The top-seeded players were given a first-round bye.

In the women's section, Anam Mumtaz Aziz, Naima Shoaib, Rubana Mithboob, Kamal Khan, Melvish Ali and Sara Rahbar emerged victorious in their first-round clashes.

Enacted years ago, witness protection law fails to see the light of day

- Passing the buck, govt departments inform SHC that response on draft rules awaited for eight years
- Bench expresses serious resentment against inordinate delay

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court was on Wednesday informed that the provincial home department had been waiting for a response from stakeholders on the draft Sindh Witness Protection Rules for the past eight years.

The home department submitted in its comments filed before a two-judge bench headed by Chief Justice Asim Ahmed Khan that in 2016 it had circulated the

proposed draft rules to various officials and departments but despite the lapse of around eight years their response was still awaited.

The SHC has been expressing serious resentment against the authorities concerned over an inordinate delay to take necessary steps for proper implementation of the witness protection law enacted over a decade ago.

The law and home departments have filed their comments and attempted to shift the blame on others over an excessive hold-up to enforce the law.

The law department asserted that it had verified the drafted rules in September 2014 and thereafter had no information whether such rules were approved and notified by the home department or otherwise while the home department maintained that proposed rules were circulated to the finance and law departments as well as various other offices in 2016, but their response was still awaited.

A petition was filed last year seeking proper implementation of the Sindh Witness Protection Act, 2013 and at the previous hearing the SHC had ordered

the authorities to take necessary steps for proper implementation of the law and warned that the secretaries of the home and law departments would be summoned if the compliance was not made.

When the two-judge bench took up the matter for hearing on Wednesday, the law and home departments filed their comments.

The reply filed on behalf of the law secretary asserted that the law was enacted and notified in June 2013 and being custodian of law, the home department drafted rules and the same were verified/checked by the law department in September 2014.

After such progress, the law department had no information whether these rules were approved and notified by the home department or otherwise and the administrative department would be in better position to explain the court about further progress, it added.

The home department in its comments contended that witness protection advisory board under the chairmanship of home secretary and witness protection unit had already been notified while an

additional inspector general of police (AIGP) had been requested in 2016 to nominate officers for constitution of the committee, but the response had not been received yet.

It also maintained that comments were also called from AIGP of counter terrorism department and secretary member advisory board about procedure to appoint witness protection officers in 2016, however their response was still awaited.

A copy of the draft proposed Sindh Protection Rules, 2016 under Witness Protection Act, 2013 was circulated to the various offices via a vice prosecutor general Sindh, AIGP CTD Sindh, law department, finance department and inspector general of police Sindh vide home department No. 84/LC/10134/78/2023 dated 20-09-2016. However, the replies are yet not received, it concluded.

After taking the comments on record, the bench adjourned the hearing till May 30.

PTI claims police crackdown ahead of May 9 protests

KARACHI: On the eve of first anniversary of May 9 incidents, the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) on Wednesday accused the Pakistan Peoples Party-led Sindh government of launching a crackdown on the party across the city.

The party said raids were being carried out on workers' homes, their families were being "harassed" and activists had been detained, but expressed the resolve that the party would not stop from taking to streets on Thursday (today) to exercise its constitutional and democratic right of peaceful protest and demonstration.

In an early-morning video statement, social media updates and messages to its workers, the Karachi leadership of the party came up with claims about pre-dawn raids on workers' homes by police and detention of a number of activists and

their family members.

The party alleged that the "harassment" was carried out on the behalf of the PPP government.

In the video statement shared by the party on different social media platforms, PTI Karachi president Raja Ashraf said that the police had raided the homes of PTI leaders Sajid Soomro, Saad Afridi, Fahim Khan and Shahzad Jadoon.

"The police harassed their families when they weren't found at home. Even they [the police] misbehaved with the women and children of the leaders. In one case, the police detained younger brother of Shahzad Jadoon and took him away. Our Soomro Town president was also arrested. It's not policing but fascism on direct orders of PPP government and their leaders Bilawal Bhatti and CM Murad Ali Shah."

He said the government had "labelled PTI workers as terrorists" and treating them as "anti-state elements" which was a sheer injustice as the workers and supporters of the party were the most patriotic citizens of Pakistan.

The party spokesperson, Fawzia Siddiqi, later in the evening said the police though released the Soomro Town president a few hours after the detentions. Law-enforcement agency kept raiding the homes of party workers even later in the day.

"We were seeing this coming [police raids on eve of May 9]," she told Dawn. "So the party has advised workers to adopt all precautionary measures."

Dawn tried to contact senior police officials for their version, but there was no response.

Symbolic 'Adhala Jai'

Six booked for harassing student on KU campus

KARACHI: Police on Wednesday booked six "students" of the University of Karachi in a case pertaining to harassing a female student on the campus on Tuesday night.

The case was registered with the Mobara Town police station under Sections 147 (roving), 148 (plotting, armed with deadly weapon), 149 (every member of unlawful assembly guilty of offence committed in prosecution of common object), 504 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of the peace), 337-H (punishment for hurt by rash or negligent act), 304 (assault or criminal force to woman with intent to outrage her modesty) and 509-B (criminal intimidation).

Area SHO Mohammed Nawaz said that complainant Amir Hussain stated in the FIR that he was a student of the Sindh department in the KU and on Tuesday night he was sitting with a female student at "Sufi Canten", located in the staff town, at around 9pm on the campus when six students — Haroon, Sharif Inam, Mohammed Umar, Muneeb, Asad and Kamran — and some others arrived there, asked his name and department.

The complainant said that they became angry when he asked as to why they were inquiring that. They started beating him with fists and sticks and also attempted to harass the girl.

On Wednesday morning, several students of the KU staged a protest sit-in and blocked the main Abdul Hasan Jaffer Road for vehicular traffic. They demanded the police to incorporate relevant sections of the Anti-Terrorism Act of 1997 in the FIR against six students. However, the police convinced them that it was not a terrorism case. Later, they ended their protest and dispersed peacefully.

16 PSF workers granted pre-arrest bail

A session court has granted interim pre-arrest bail to 16 activists of the Peoples Students Federation (PSF) on Wednesday in a case pertaining to a clash between two groups of the Jinnah Postgraduate Medical Centre (JPWC).

Last week, eight students sustained injuries in a clash between PSF and Islamic Jamaat Talaba (IJT).

After hearing the arguments, the court granted interim pre-arrest bail until May 13 to the 16 applicants against a surety bond of Rs20,000 each.

Sindh PA meets today

KARACHI: Sindh Governor Kamran Tessori on Wednesday summoned the session of the provincial assembly on Thursday (today).

The session was called as the ruling Pakistan Peoples Party is set to table a resolution in the house to recognise May 9 as a 'dark day in the country's history'.

The resolution, submitted by PPP's Sadiq Javed on Wednesday and to be taken by the house on Thursday, condemned the violent incidents on May 9, 2023 after the arrest of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf founder Imran Khan and urged the federal government to hold accountable "the architects and all individuals involved in the mayhem".

It said that the arrest of the PTI leader was exported to unleash widespread destruction and chaos in whole country. "Pakistan's critical defence installations were attacked, national memorial heritage sites were vandalised, and innocent civilians were killed and robbed," the resolution added.

No order issued by SC for removal of hawkers: registrar

KARACHI: Terming a report published in Dawn about its recent order "factually inaccurate and misleading", the Supreme Court of Pakistan has said its April 25 order "does not direct the removal of street hawkers".

A detailed rejoinder sent by the registrar of the apex court was in reference to a 'common' piece, 'The CJF and Karachi hawkers', published in the newspaper in its edition of May 6.

While pointing at certain factual inaccuracies in the article, the letter states that what is fundamentally wrong and contrary to the record is to categorise the order of April 25, 2024 as 'not dissimilar from the order issued by then-CJP Justice Gulzar Ahmed', which had directed buildings to be demolished. "The order dated 25 April 2024

does not do this," says the SC letter.

In the letter sent to Dawn, the SC registrar also highlighted certain portions of the April 25 order about "encroachments", "settlements" and "trees".

Regarding the issue of "encroachments", the SC order states: "While encroachments by citizens are demolished, it is undesirable to demolish encroachments on public roads and pavements are made by those paid out of the public exchequer. Occupants of properties also assume that the pavement running in front of their property is theirs, to do with it as they please. Generators are also installed thereon. Pavements are for the use of the public; access thereto and use thereof cannot be prevented or restricted."

The order further says: "Everyone, including the provincial and federal governments, and all those under them must abide by the law and cannot encroach upon

public roads and pavements nor can block them which may stop or restrict public use thereof."

According to the order, citizens must not be incentivised as "those paid out of the public exchequer serve the people, and not vice versa".

While referring to observations of the additional attorney general for Pakistan and the advocate general for Sindh regarding the placement of certain barriers for protection against terrorist attacks, the SC order states: "We are mindful of the security concerns and the same can be met by placing the barriers within the premises."

Regarding its implementation, the SC order directs all the provincial governments, as well as the federal government, to clear public roads and pavements of all encroachments from all over the country within three days, "failing which the same

should be demolished/removed by the relevant authority and the cost incurred thereon shall be recovered from those who encroached thereon."

In regard to the buildings in official use, the SC order states: "The amount shall be recovered from the pay of the senior most official in occupation of the property/building in front of which runs the pavement on which barriers or other restrictions preventing public use thereof are placed."

The SC order also instructs the government to place advertisements in newspapers informing the public of this order, and to ask the Pakistan Electronic Media Regulatory Authority (Pera) to direct their licensees to broadcast it as a free public service message.

The SC registrar's letter also mentions certain excerpts from the SC order regarding the shipping containers that used by the authorities from time to time for security

purposes, but are left on the roadside or on pavements, and instructed that this practice needs to be stopped.

It also observed that there was a need to line the roads with trees in order to control pollution and counter effects of climate change.

While referring to the detailed excerpts on the issue of encroachments, the registrar's letter states that the SC order "does not direct the removal of street hawkers", describing the headline of the newspaper article as "wholly inaccurate and misleading".

At the same time, the SC registrar's letter points out that in the newspaper article there were certain factual inaccuracies like the CJF Quai Fiaz bar's name was misspelled, and that the period when Justice Gulzar Ahmed was the CJP, and the year in which he passed order about Karachi, were incorrect.

Islamabad police's all-inclusive licence policy rife with complications

Experts say move to issue licences to 'outsiders' violates law; police say otherwise

ISLAMABAD: The decision of the Islamabad Traffic Police (ITP) to dole out driving licences to every citizen irrespective of their residential address stands in stark contrast to relevant laws, as these documents can be only issued to the citizens by the respective licensing authority — separate for each district.

According to law experts, there is a traffic police department in each district headed by the SSP, which is the competent authority to issue licences under Section 7 (Grant of Licences) of the Motor Vehicles Ordinance, 1965.

According to Section 7 of this law, "Any person who is not disqualified under Section 4 for driving a motor vehicle and who is not for the time being disqualified for holding or obtaining a licence, may apply to the licensing authority having jurisdiction in the area in which he ordinarily resides or carries on business or, if the application is for a licence to drive as a paid employee, in which the employer resides or carries on business for the issue to him of a licence."

Under this law, the relevant authority can only issue licences to those who either reside or have business in its jurisdiction, experts said, adding that the authority can also issue licences to applicants, whom employer either resides or has business in its jurisdiction.

One of the complications which will arise due to the recent decision of the ITP is the postal address supposed to go on the licence. It is also unclear which address will be mentioned on the licence — permanent or temporary — for applicants residing outside the federal capital. The police spokesperson, however, said that for the time being, the permanent address from the CNIC would be mentioned on the licence.

Similarly, there is no centralised authority for the issuance of licences, which means people can obtain multiple licences from different district traffic police offices and the law asking applicants to get the licence from their district aims to curb this practice.

The issuance of licences to people who do not live in Islamabad will also result in complications in the enforcement of traffic penalties because of potential problems with their residential addresses. In 2014, the ITP in its collaboration with Pakistan Post started delivering licences to applicants' homes to ensure the implementation of the law, and only the residents of the capital were issued driving licences by the authority. However, the majority of the licences were returned to the ITP headquarters as most of the addressees were "fake".

Police officials said that people from other districts, especially Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and northern Punjab, are interested in ITP licences as these are certified by the International Organisation for Standardisation and recognised in 80 countries. Moreover, Pakistani citizens registered with the ITP can drive abroad without the need for an international driving licence for one year.

Proposal to IGP

Police officials told Dawn that the ITP

SSP had sent a proposal to the Inspector General of Police to legalise the interior minister's order, as without the amendment in Section 7 of the Motor Vehicle Ordinance, the traffic police cannot issue licences to outsiders.

Legal experts said that in response to the proposal, the SSP could issue standing orders under Section 12 (power to make rules) of the Police Rules. However, the approval of the "provincial government" was still mandatory.

Lawyer Raja Inam Amin Mirhas told Dawn that the Motor Vehicle Ordinance was a "proper law" which could not be amended "on the wish and will". Proper legislation is required for the amendment to the law, he added.

According to Section 22 and 43 of the ordinance, the government "shall make rules", said Advocate Mirhas, adding that the PM and the cabinet were the government, not the IGP or the interior minister. As per the rules, the IGP cannot issue a standing order amending the rules, he added.

The lawyer said the issuing authority in each district could issue licences to citizens in its limits in light of their details, such as domicile and relevant records, available with them.

Islamabad police spokesperson Tariq Jawad said the interior minister's instructions to the ITP did not violate any law. The spokesperson said such people will get licences issued by the ITP after the approval of SSP under Section 7 of MVCO.

The PMO also confirmed that the SSP ITP sent a proposal to the IGP to "legalise the instructions" of the minister regarding the issuance of licences to every citizen.

Naqvi asks CDA to focus on development of stalled sectors

ISLAMABAD: The chronic issue of stalled sectors got the attention of Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi on Tuesday, as he directed the Capital Development Authority (CDA) to start development work in these sectors as well as digitise land record within six months.

At present, the CDA has 13 acquired residential sectors and nine of them are stalled with no signs of development.

In addition to these 13 sectors, there are nine other sectors that have not been acquired yet but will be acquired sooner or later as per the civic body's plans.

The CDA, which is supposed to develop sectors in the capital, has badly failed in this area as it could not develop any new sector after D-12, which was completed in 2008. E-12 is the highlight of the stalled sectors. Plans in this sector were ready by the CDA in 1999 and it has not been developed even now, with many who purchased the land having passed away.

In 2005, the CDA launched E-15 sector and sold plots, but people are still waiting to get possession in this sector. However work in this sector along with E-12 is near completion.

In 2008, the CDA through a land-sharing formula acquired several other sectors — D-13, E-13, F-13, H-16, C-13, C-14, C-15 and C-16. Out of them, development work is in progress only in C-14 and C-15 and no signs of development in other sectors.

As per the city's master plan, sectors H-13, H-15, H-16, H-14, H-17, D-14, D-15, and D-16 are also supposed to be developed by the civic agency.

Officials, however, told Dawn that there was a need to complete development work in sectors that had already been acquired instead of launching new sectors.

In the meeting with the interior minister, the issue of illegal housing societies, shams, and right of way of Islamabad Expressway was discussed.

Sources said during the meeting it was discussed that illegal governments were being set up on the right of way of this road. The PTI government in 2020 had proposed to lease out a portion of the right of way of this road only to abandon the decision after coming under criticism.

"The interior minister ordered [the CDA] to start development work in these sectors which were lying undeveloped for decades. It is grave injustice to the people if they were not given possession despite paying all charges," he said, adding that a comprehensive strategy in this regard would be finalised soon.

According to an official hand-out, Minister Naqvi said that an efficient one-window system would be established in the CDA to facilitate the people. He also asked the CDA to activate its smart mobile application within three

Rubina Khalid appointed BISP chairperson

ISLAMABAD: President Asif Ali Zardari Wednesday approved the appointment of a senior leader of Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Rubina Khalid as Chairperson Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP).

He also accepted the resignation of Dr Arshad Saigbi from his position as BISP chairperson, a press release issued by the President House said.

Dr Saigbi was appointed by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif after the post had fallen vacant after the departure of Dr Sarra Noshair.

The president approved the appointment under Section 5(3) of the Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP) Act 2010.

In the last Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) government the position was retained by the PPP as its legislator Shazia Mari was made its chairperson.

After one year of assassination of former prime minister Benazir Bhutto, the social safety net programme was launched after her name in 2008. BISP is considered as the largest and most systematic social protection initiative to be launched in Pakistan. Under the programme poor and needy people are given monetary support.

According to the BISP, the BISP board has approved record Rs471 billion budget for 2023-24 which included Rs361.5 billion for Benazir Kafalat Programme, covering a total of 9.3 million families, Rs32.27 billion for Benazir Nashonuma Programme covering 1.5 million individuals, Rs55.4 billion for Benazir Taleemi Wazaf which would benefit 9.2 million children.

In addition, Rs6 billion have been earmarked for Benazir Scholarships for Undergraduates.

Senator Rubina Khalid hails from a noted and widely respected political family of Peshawar. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Her father late Syed Zafar Ali Shah had served as the Member of the National Assembly (MNA) in 1985-88 and 1993-96.

A close confidant of former prime ministers Zulfikar Ali Bhutto and Benazir Bhutto, her legacy was carried out by his son Syed Zahir Shah who served in the provincial assemblies of 2002-2007 and 2008-2013 and also as Provincial Minister for Health from 2008 to 2013.

Rubina's late husband Rauf Khalid is fervently remembered an ardent per excellence and a noted writer. His services as a film maker, actor, writer and a cultural icon were recognised by the government of Pakistan by conferring upon him the highest civil award of Sitara-i-Imtiaz.

After Rauf Khalid's tragic death in 2010, Rubina ventured into practical and political field. She was awarded senate ticket from KP in 2012 and again in 2018. She has served in the parliament for 12 long years where she has rendered services as the chairperson of the standing committee on maritime affairs, besides being member of standing committees on information, information technology, national heritage, delegated legislation besides others. — Syed Irfan Raza

DC summoned over FIRs filed against tandoor owners

ISLAMABAD: Justice Tariq Mahmood Jahangir of Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Wednesday summoned the deputy commissioner de a petition filed by the Naanbani Association against registration of FIRs against tandoor owners for overcharging the price of Roti.

Barrister Umar Ijaz Gillani, counsel for the petitioner, challenged the notification dated April 26 issued by the district magistrate whereby the price of Roti (100 grams) had been fixed at Rs16 and that of Naan (120 grams) at Rs20 under Section 3 of the Price Control and Prevention of Profiteering and Hoarding Act, 1977.

Mr Gillani contended before the court that Section 3 of the Price Control and Prevention of Profiteering and Hoarding Act, 1977, provided that the federal government was empowered to issue notification in this regard and fix a "fair price". Another mandatory requirement was that the notification shall be given publicity in the official gazette, but the impugned notification was not published in it, he added.

The counsel further contended that there was no justification for fixing the rate of Roti having a weight of 100 grams at Rs16 and the rate of Naan weighing 120 grams at Rs20.

He pointed out that in Punjab and remote areas of the province like Chakwal and Talagang, the same rate of Roti had been fixed. It is not possible that in a city like Islamabad, the Naanbani Association could sell Roti at the same rate as fixed by the Punjab government.

The court issued notices to all the relevant authorities and directed the "deputy commissioner... to appear in person on the next date of hearing." Further hearing has been adjourned until May 10. — Malik Azeed

HRCP concerned over 'restrictions' on civil, political rights

Calls for upholding democratic principles, rule of law

ISLAMABAD: Expressing concerns over increasing political polarisation in the country resulting in greater restrictions on civil and political rights, the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan (HRCP) has called for economic justice and protection of civil rights and emphasised on the importance of upholding democratic principles and the rule of law.

In its annual report "State of Human Rights 2023", released here on Wednesday, the HRCP noted with deep concern that irreparable political divisions spilled over into public acts of arson and violence on May 9, 2023, following the arrest of former prime minister Imran Khan.

"What followed was flagrant disregard for the Constitution as unselected forces tightened their grip on the country's democratic structures and civic spaces shrank to an all-time low," says the report. The

report says the state's response to the May 9 riots was to quell dissent — to the extent of resurrecting military courts to try civilians, perpetrating enforced disappearances, ordering mass arrests and allegedly orchestrating public discrimination from the PTI among many senior party leaders.

According to the report, the right to freedom of expression and assembly took a particular hit during the year.

The general elections were also delayed well beyond the 90-day constitutional limit on various grounds, including the need for new delimitations on the basis of the recent census.

The rule of law, it says, was markedly poor, with a record six-year high in fatalities related to terrorist attacks and counter-terrorism operations and two militant attacks in Bajaur and Mardan, that collectively left at least 117 dead. The practice of extrajudicial killings continued, while street crime and the incidence of mob lynchings surged, says the report.

The report says that as in previous years, journalists, activists and political workers were subjected to enforced disappearances across the

country. In an admirable show of strength, however, young Baloch women mobilised a long march from Turbat to Islamabad to protest against alleged extrajudicial killings and enforced disappearances.

Among vulnerable groups, religious minorities reported an increasing climate of fear, especially in the aftermath of an attack in Jaranwala, in which scores of churches and homes were torched and looted by mobs, following allegations

of blasphemy against a Christian man.

In the wake of the federal government's decision to expel undocumented foreigners, it says, Afghan nationals in particular were rounded up in police raids and sent to deportation centres with little to no legal recourse.

Speaking at the launch of the report, HRCP secretary-general Haris Khattak said the 2023 economic crisis had "pushed tens of millions of ordinary citizens to the brink

of desperation."

Commenting on the high incidence of enforced disappearances, he also deplored the role and performance of the Commission of Inquiry of Enforced Disappearances as "disgraceful."

HRCP chairperson Asad Iqbal Butt said it was critical for the state to fulfil people's right to education, livelihood and health.

Expressing concern over the low rate of trade unionisation, he said attempts to unionise workers were routinely met with harassment and intimidation.

"Vice-chair HRCP Islamabad Nusrat Anwar said religion continued to be "weaponised for political purposes".

Concluding the press conference, co-chair, Munir Zahangir said the state must protect the right to peaceful protest for all political parties and groups. She pointed out that repressive laws passed in one government's tenure would return to haunt them when in opposition.

It called upon the government to take immediate steps to address the grievances outlined in the report and uphold the principles of democracy, justice, and human rights.

Man abducted from Pindi found dead in Kashmir

RAWALPINDI: A man who was abducted for Rs20 million ransom in March by unidentified kidnappers after he left for his home in Sukkur was found dead in Kashmiri Katcha area on Wednesday, police said.

After the recovery of Agha Sohail Ali Khan's body, the police concerned from Kashmir-Sindh contacted the R.A. Bazaar police as from his pocket a driver's license bearing the name of Agha Sohail Ali Khan a resident of Tench Bhutta Rawalpindi was found, police said.

After reviewing the police station record, the R.A. Bazaar police have found that the deceased was the same person who had been kidnapped for ransom in March, 2024. Later, a police team was dispatched to Kashmir to bring the body of the victim back.

According to police sources, the kidnappers were in contact with the family of the abducted person and initially they demanded Rs20 million for his release from his family and later reduced it to Rs10 million.

Agha Sohail Ali, a resident of Tench Bhutta, lodged an FIR with the R.A. Bazaar after his father Agha Sohail Ali Khan, 70, left his house for Sukkur on March 5, 2024 and were missing till his body was found by the police in Kashmir on Wednesday.

Babar Ali said in the FIR that his father left his house for Sukkur on March 5 as his brother Agha Masoom Maqsood Khan accompanied him father to the Rawalpindi Railway Station to see him off.

He said the next day his father informed his friend Anjad that he had reached Sukkur safely. He further said that after he found his father's mobile phone switched off, his brother asked Anjad if his father had any conversation with him, he replied that his mobile phone was found switched off.

He further told the police that his father was possessing ATM cards of different banks, CNIC and a driving license with him when he left his house.

His father was wearing a Shalwar Kameez, gray waistcoat and brown shoes when he left for Sukkur. Following his complaint, the R.A. Bazaar has registered an FIR under section of kidnapping (365 FP) and launched an investigation.

Meanwhile, SSP Investigation Zunsira Aftab directed the police investigating officer to ensure timely completion of cases charter.

She was presiding over a meeting at Police Lines Headquarters.

The officers assigned to follow up cases and enforcement staff participated in the meeting.

SSP Investigation gave instructions to the officers regarding the compliance of summons and warrants.

The SSP further directed that all legal requirements must be met for the punishment of the accused.

Proposal to tax pension rejected

ISLAMABAD: All Pakistan Railways Pensioners' Association has rejected the proposal to tax the pensions of retired government employees and said that for the first time in the history of Pakistan, government plans to bring pensioners into tax net.

In a meeting the members of the association observed that the proposal has been floated by bureaucrats to please the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and warned that if this decision was enforced, the government will be responsible for the reactions of the general public.

The meeting held under the chairperson of the association Muhammad Aslam Butt, also observed that the bureaucrats and technical experts negotiating with the IMF were making pensioners scapegoats of their own incompetence and financial mismanagement.

Mr Butt added that the association demands of the government to curtail wasteful expenditures to increase income instead of creating hardships for the retired persons.

"The government should ban unauthorised foreign visits, free fuel and vehicle facilities for senior government officials," he added.

He said that all wasteful expenditures should be done away with immediately and more money has to be spent on the welfare of people.

The association's general secretary, Aurangzeb Tanoli and other officials announced that the retired government employees should not be at the mercy of ministers and advisers, to afford daily needs.

The only source of income for the retired person was pension and if the government imposed taxes on pensioners only to please the IMF, their lives would be pushed further into financial difficulties.

Think-tank sees national reconciliation key to restoring stability

ISLAMABAD: An Islamabad-based think-tank on Wednesday warned that political instability in Pakistan significantly heightens the risk of arrest, undermining the need for a national reconciliation to restore stability.

Islamabad Policy Institute (IPI) in its report titled 'Mapping the Policy Agenda 2024 - 2025' identified political instability as the foremost challenge facing the country and addressing this critical issue will ultimately pave the way for the much needed economic reforms and attracting foreign investments.

The think-tank stressed that the process should be all inclusive and more than just political maneuvering within the assemblies or the streets.

Faisal Ahmed, head of research at IPI, stated that such a process should recognise and address the concerns of all involved parties so that a common ground that facilitates constructive engagement and dialogue could be found.

Although various political stakeholders have recently suggested dialogue and reconciliation, divergent views on the process—particularly PFI's insistence on negotiating directly with the military and the military's refusal to engage in talks with the main opposition party—have stalled any progress.

In this backdrop, the report suggests that while the dialogue should be largely between the political parties, it should be owned and backed by the military. This it argued would legitimise the process, ensuring broader acceptance among the public and political entities, and foster trust among political factions, encouraging essential dialogue and compromise.

"The military, as a significant external stakeholder, has historically played a critical role in the country's politics, and its position and reactions could significantly influence the feasibility and success of any reconciliation efforts," it stressed.

For tackling the economic crisis, it was proposed that the government should push for a comprehensive debt restructuring plan that would relieve financial pressure and spare scarce resources for critical sectors.

"Without decisive action, the risk of falling into the footsteps of countries that have suffered under the weight of unsustainable debt is all too real. Restructuring offers a viable alternative, one that requires courage, strategic foresight, and a steadfast commitment to the nation's long-term economic health and sovereignty," the report maintained.

The report proposed that institutions like the IMF should be engaged not just as alternatives to restructuring but as supportive partners in this endeavor.

The report further recommended reforming the subsidy programmes by eliminating regressive subsidies that benefit the affluent and focusing on targeted cash transfers for the vulnerable. Additionally, it suggested recalibration of government spending, strategic privatisations, and an expansion of the tax base.

Women leadership in climate action recognised

FIA probes alleged corruption, illegal appointments in APP

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) has opened investigations into the alleged illegal appointments and payment of salaries to ghost employees at the state-owned news agency Associated Press of Pakistan (APP).

The APP management had also filed a complaint against some of the employees, alleging that they were involved in releasing payments to 'ghost' employees.

Applications were filed against senior APP officials, with hearing regarding inquiry into 95 illegal appointments held at the anti-corruption circle of FIA on Wednesday.

A complaint was filed by Muzammil Khokhar, special assistant in the APP, against Managing Director Asim Khichi, accusing him of illegally appointing around 100 people.

Apart from the FIA, Mr Khokhar also forwarded the complaint to the chairman PM's Inspection Commission as well as information secretary, who is also the APP Board chairman.

The complainant highlighted that not only were the appointments made in the APP during the ban period, but the laid-down procedure such as open advertisements was also not adopted.

He further alleged that most of the persons appointed were either relatives of the MD or belonged to his native area.

The complainant has attached some appointment letters and demanded the reversal of Mr Khichi alleging that his actions had resulted in significant financial loss to the state agency.

On the other hand, responding to a query, Mr Khichi acknowledged that he had made around 42 appointments on contractual basis, claiming that all the personnel appointed were already working in the project initiated to establish the agency's social media wing.

"The project was set to expire in June 2023 and these working in the social media wing of APP were told in March 2023 to accept a new appointment letter with reduced salary as their services under the project would expire in the coming months," Mr Khichi said.

He presented documents, which included the APP Board's approval that empowered the MD to hire personnel on contractual basis.

"The complaint against me will only show 35 to 40 appoint-

ment letters because the list of 100 as claimed by them was fake, they had not even provided the list of 100 persons employed by me to the FIA or any other forum," he said.

Meanwhile, sources in the FIA acknowledged that the complaint lodged by the APP management included the name of Muzammil Khokhar as well as 19 employees and officers accused of illegally hiring 20 people who although were

getting salaries from APP, did not have appointment letters or personal files with the state agency.

The complaint made to the FIA by the APP management in October 2023 was based on the report of a fact-finding committee on illegal appointments, and it pointed out that Asim Khichi, managing director APP, Islamabad distributed salaries to these ghost employees through open

cheques.

The inquiry report highlighted that among these ghost employees was the son of Asim Khichi and the FIA had been requested to help recover the illegal amount paid to these persons.

Responding to the query, a senior FIA official said that after completion of the inquiry, FIA would be lodged against those involved in misuse of power and malpractices.

Wheat crisis
starts hitting
cotton sowing

LAHORE: The persisting wheat crisis has begun affecting cotton cultivation in the country, raising alarm bells in the textile sector.

Cotton sowing has already been delayed due to unexpected drop in temperatures during the months of February and March, postponing wheat ripening and subsequent harvesting, which opens fields for the next crop.

As wheat has not been sold at the official rates of Rs3,900 per 40kg, this has shrunk the farmers' power to procure seeds, pesticides, fertilisers and other farm inputs for the next crop.

Due to this factor, most of the farmers have not yet started cotton sowing, causing concern in the textile and spinning sectors.

Cotton acreage has already dropped in the coastal cities of Sindh and Punjab's Bahawalpur, Sahiwal and Vehari districts etc. Apparently, the growers in these areas did not sow the crop because of low temperatures earlier in the year. This means that cotton cultivation may remain lower than the official target of harvesting over 10 million bales of white lint.

Cotton Growers' Forum chairman Ihsanul Haq urges both the federal and provincial authorities to introduce per acre subsidy for wheat growers to enable them to grow cotton by improving their income. Otherwise, he warns, the country will have to import cotton as well as edible oil worth billions of dollars to meet the local shortfall.

SBP promises to rectify Urdu
text errors in currency

LAHORE: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has admitted various mistakes in the Urdu text on currency notes and assured the federal ombudsman of correcting these in the upcoming new banknote series.

The mistakes/omissions were pointed out in a complaint filed by a citizen to the ombudsman. In his complaint, Shafiqul Hameed Malik, a member of Pakistan Writers Guild, pointed out mistakes in the Urdu text (Bank Dastak Pakistan, rupya).

Hamid Haq to Ministry per Ahsan Karay Ga and Hameed-ul-Pakistan ki Zameen se Jari Hain while quoting various references and books.

According to the verdict announced by the ombudsman, the complaint alleging maladministration on the part of SBP stated that the bank was not ready to correct Urdu texts appeared on banknotes. After being disappointed by the SBP, the complainant approached the ombudsman for redressal of his grievance. A copy of complaint was also forwarded to the SBP which, later, submitted that it has

initiated the design work for the issuance of new series of banknotes and it would look into the suggestions and observations made by the complainant while finalising the Urdu texts.

Both the parties were heard in detail and record was examined carefully. And during the hearing, the suggestions of the complainant were found valuable.

"During investigation of the instant case, the representative of the agency (SBP) admitted mistake and undertook that the agency would look into the suggestions and observations made by the complainant while pre-

paring the Urdu text on its new banknote series. On the assurance of the agency, the complainant showed satisfaction," reads the verdict.

"The agency is advised to submit compliance report within 60 days," it directs the SBP.

On the other hand, in a letter to the complainant, the SBP through its joint director also pledged to take remedial measures in this regard. "As disclosed, the SBP will look into the suggestions/observations made by your good self while finalising the Urdu text for our new banknote series," the letter states.

EU approves
Rs4bn for
Wasa reforms

LAHORE: European Union (EU) has approved over Rs4 billion grant for introducing institutional reforms in the Water & Sanitation Agency (Wasa) of Lahore and Faisalabad.

Meanwhile, AFD, the French government's funding agency, has also pledged to fund the establishment of a water treatment plant at Babu Sabes to treat sewage before its discharge into the river Ravi.

"The Rs4 billion grant would be utilised to strengthen Wasa in Lahore and Faisalabad under institutional strengthening and reform programme of the EU," Lahore Wasa Managing Director Ghaffar Ahmad told Dawn on Wednesday.

"Besides this, AFD would fund the water treatment plant at Babu Sabes. A sum of 300,000 Euros has already been provided by AFD for establishing the project management unit (PMU) in this regard," he added. To a question, the MD said the PMU has also started working.

Panel decides to deploy
Rangers at two police posts

DHRA GHAZI KHAN: A meeting of the divisional intelligence committee held at the commissioner's office on Wednesday decided deployment of Rangers at two inter-provincial police posts, including terrorist hit Jhang check post established at Punjab-Khyber Pakhtunkhwa boundary.

Dera Ghazi Khan Regional Police Officer retired Capt Sajjad Hassan Khan and Commissioner Dr. Nasir Mahmood presided over the meeting.

Divisional heads of security agencies, including district police officers and deputy commissioners from all districts of Dera Ghazi Khan division, also participated.

A detailed review of secu-

rity measures in the tribal border areas, the security of inter-provincial check posts, threat alerts, and challenges was conducted.

It was decided to deploy Rangers at Harnai Umar Farooq (Jhang) and Harnai Khalid bin Walid (Lahore) posts to enhance provincial boundary security.

Directives were issued to tighten security further at inter-provincial check posts, facilitate timely information exchange among law-enforcement agencies, and ensure quick responses to emergencies. During the meeting, tributes were paid to the Punjab police for repelling the terrorist attack on the Jhang check post.

RPO Sajjad Hassan Khan instructed all DPOs to proactively address threat alerts and challenges, conduct on-

ground self-inspections, and maintain readiness for emergencies. Mock exercises for immediate responses should be conducted, and coordination with other agencies should be prioritised.

The DPOs should complete the ongoing construction work at the check posts as soon as possible, complete surveillance with thermal dome cameras and the javans posted on duty should be kept alert at all times.

During the meeting, Commissioner Dr. Nasir Mahmood said the government was providing all the resources including modern weapons, bullet proof and armoured vehicles at the inter-provincial check posts. Roads would be reconstructed as directed by the government to ease traffic in tribal border areas.

Proposal to
set up medical
colleges in five
dists reviewed

LAHORE: A proposal to establish medical colleges in Attock, Marwal, Vehari, Bhakkar and Jhelum with the help of public-private partnership was reviewed at a meeting presided over by Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz here on Wednesday.

The chief minister criticised the previous government for not addressing health issues during its tenure.

As the chief minister expressed her indignation over Rs4 billion loss caused to the national exchequer in the Murree hospital project during the previous government's tenure, the meeting decided to take legal action against those responsible for it.

"It is our duty to safeguard people's money and we cannot permit its loss. We want to establish state-of-the-art health facilities for the people in every district. We will provide high-quality treatment facilities to the common man," she said.

A briefing was given to the chief minister on the construction and rehabilitation of hospitals, 'Clinic on Wheel' free medicines and other matters.

She directed the officials concerned to take prompt measures for the establishment of a new hospital in Murree and provision of angiography machines in Jhelum, Attock, Marwal, Murree, Sahiwal and Sialkot.

Parvez shifted to
Kot Lakhpat jail

LAHORE: The government on Wednesday shifted Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf President Chaudhary Parvez Elahi to Kot Lakhpat Jail, Lahore.

Recently, the IHC directed the interior secretary to decide an application seeking a court decree to declare the residence of former chief minister of Punjab Parvez Elahi as a sub-jail and his subsequent shifting there.

Justice Arbab Muhammad Tahir was hearing a petition filed by Mr Elahi's spouse, who contended that the PTI president could be detained in his residence for health reasons.

A medical board constituted to ascertain his health condition advised that the former CM be kept in Rawalpindi prison, and that he should not travel.

Reacting to PTI president's shifting to the jail, his wife Geesara Elahi said in statement on Wednesday, "The interior secretary didn't follow Islamabad High Court's order and shifted Parvez Elahi from Islamabad territory to Lahore's Kot Lakhpat Jail."

"This step of the ministry of interior is against the decision of the IHC. Immediate action should be ensured according to the IHC order," she said.

Earlier, in the letters addressed to the interior secretary and Punjab's additional chief secretary home, Mr Elahi's spouse wrote, "In view of his peculiar health condition, injuries, and on humanitarian grounds, my husband, Parvez Elahi, be taken out of jail premises and put under house arrest at Islamabad or Lahore."

The court noted that Mr Elahi is not a convict, and the right to life of an under-trial prisoner, guaranteed by the Constitution, supersedes the obligation of the state to try him for an alleged offence. The court directed the interior secretary to consider the application of the petitioner and pass appropriate orders if the matter falls within his competence; otherwise, the matter will be referred to the appropriate forum within two days. — Staff Reporter

Revisiting Lahore cinema and dismantling language through art

LAHORE: A character, a discarded fan of Sultan Rabi, in the short film and installation, remembers the time when a movie ticket used to cost just Rs5 in Lahore, lamenting that things have changed now. While the film shows the condition of historical cinemas that are disappearing now, Nasreen Begum's song 'Jidda Di Tin Jari, Jidda Di Moka Jari' from the 1967 Punjabi film Mere Neeh plays in the background.

These scenes are from the video installation, Cinematic Catastrophe, by Nasreen Chaudhry, in the group show of artworks and multimedia by six artists, called Arts Karamahat Karachi—Art Mohabat Chhaya Ahlewar, at Tollymore Black of the National College of Arts (NCA).

Cinema, says his work aims at looking for a sustainable model to bring cinema back to all segments of society, not only multiplexes for the elite. "It would be cinema-on-wheels. We are acquiring a container in which 20 to 25 people would be able to sit and enjoy a movie on screens. We would take

this cinema to the suburbs."

Nasreen has plans to extend his research based on this project to see whether a new sustainable model for cinema could be created in Punjab once again to attract investors for producing films and to make the films accessible to the poor segments of society. He is documenting the old traditional cinemas of Lahore that are being dismantled or have been abandoned.

Multimedia artist Samudra Nadeem has displayed her body of work, titled 'Sorry for Inconvenience, But this is a rebellion,' exploring the relationship between language, power and resistance and a woman's place in it. She has literally deconstructed the legal terms in dictionaries, defining the role of women in the country. By using old pictures from the newspapers and pages of dictionaries, she has turned them into pieces of art to highlight the women's struggle for their rights, another take on feminism.

"By using the law dictionary in my work, I am literally and visually deconstructing it. By using the printmaking technique I have



dismantled the pictures, terms and words to highlight their arbitrary and fluid nature," she says.

Samudra has taken words from a law book and burnt them to make a piece of art. "That's my rebellion," she declares. She

says that she wants to show that there are more words of a language which can be reinterpreted and recontextualised to give a new meaning to them according to your will. Even legal terms and words taken as text in law are reinterpreted and changed

according to our own whims, she asserts.

Shamim Rana has installed his "visual representation of Sine wave frequencies with salt on aluminium". He says his installation is about "visual representation of Sine frequencies using different materials. "I chose to use aluminium as my surface and table salt as my medium. By doing so, I invite the audience to delve deeper into reality and beyond the perception of sound," he says. In Rana's installations, salt on the surface creates different patterns as triggered by different frequencies of sound.

"The patterns are different because every frequency creates a separate pattern and energy. Every sound, even the human sound, differs from person to person. So does every note on a musical instrument, as the sound of a Bansuri or Sarangi makes different patterns as they have different frequencies," he explains.

The other artists whose work are a part of the exhibition are Nadia Zafar, Fariba Rashid and Ibra Ghel. The exhibition was inaugurated by NCA Vice Chancellor Mariam Jafri. It will continue till Friday (tomorrow).

Rickshaws banned from
GT Road in Peshawar

Admin also decides
to seize old buses,
wagons plying
along BRT corridor

PESHAWAR: The district administration has banned rickshaws from the Pir Zakari Bridge/Burey Pul stretch of the Grand Trunk Road here from today (Thursday), insisting the move will ease traffic congestion on the major main thoroughfare in the capital city.

The decision about the ban was made in a meeting chaired by the commissioner of Peshawar division, Riaz Khan Mehsud, according to an official statement.

The meeting called to discuss traffic issues in the provincial capital was attended by deputy commissioner Afqar Wazir, SSP (traffic) Saad Khan, officials of the Regional Transport Authority and excise department, and representatives of transporter unions.

It also decided that the old buses and wagons plying the route along the Peshawar BRT Rapid Transit (BRT) corridor would be impounded and scrapped, while their drivers would be arrested.

The participants also agreed

about the seizure of rickshaws that are registered in other districts but operate in the provincial capital.

They also directed authorities to crack down on the rickshaws whose drivers have photocopied permits and registration papers, while the sealing of rickshaw factories was also ordered.

The meeting decided to ban rickshaw supply from Punjab and order the arrest of suppliers and confiscation of these tri-wheeled.

It said the district administration would launch a 20-day crackdown on illegal rickshaws, buses, and wagons from Thursday (today).

Under the plans, pressure horns, flashlights, tinted glasses, illegal registration plates, and musical instruments will be removed from vehicles before being destroyed, while legal action will be taken against drivers under the age of 21.

The meeting also decided to impound and scrap the buses, wagons, and rickshaws (illegally operating in the provincial capital).

It chalked out a strategy to do away with illegal transport vehicles from the provincial capital and took the representatives of transporter unions into confidence about it.

Officials said as the crackdown would continue until May 29, special teams of the police, district administration, and

transport and excise departments were formed for its success.

Peshawar SSP (traffic) Saad Khan told Dawn that the traffic police had presented the traffic management plan for Peshawar to the district administration for approval and implementation.

He said the traffic police were impounding illegal rickshaws and buses and registering PTNs against their drivers.

"Last month, we [traffic police] registered PTNs against 200 rickshaw drivers and impounded 200 illegal buses and rickshaws," he said.

The SSP said that over 300,000 rickshaws and leaders operated in the provincial capital, but in the case of their seizure, the traffic police lacked spaces to keep such a large number of vehicles.

An official told Dawn, requesting anonymity, that the Peshawar BRT project envisioned the scrapping of old buses plying the provincial capital's roads.

He said that under the bus project, authorities scrapped around 600 old and rickety buses after making due payments to their owners in two phases.

The official, however, said that transporters later brought in buses from the Punjab province and demanded a phantasm of old buses, but the demand was turned down by authorities.

Wheat procurement
from local farmers to
save govt Rs12bn,
claims Gandapur

DERA ISMAIL KHAN: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Khan Gandapur on Wednesday said his government would save Rs12 billion by purchasing wheat from local farmers and the money would be utilised for construction and renovation of wheat warehouses.

He stated said this during a visit to the provincial reserve centre of the food department, where he formally inaugurated the process of wheat procurement for the current season.

Provincial minister for food Zahir Shah Toro and high-ups of food department and district administration were also present. Addressing a ceremony on the occasion, Mr Gandapur said 300,000 metric tonnes of wheat would be procured from farmers of the province, out of which 40,000 metric tonnes was being purchased from Dera farmers.

He said total procurement at the rate of Rs3,500 per 40kg would cost Rs29 billion.

"It will be ensured that farmers are provided with their due rights without any hindrance," he said, adding

necessary steps had been taken to make the procurement process transparent. He said committees had also been formed at the district level in addition to establishing a control room and introducing an app for the purpose.

Gandapur said: "Not buying wheat from Pakistan Agricultural Storage & Services Corporation Limited would result in a benefit of Rs2 billion, which would be utilised for construction and maintenance of warehouses."

The chief minister made it clear that wheat procurement would be carried out on the basis of first come, first served basis.

He asked the farmers' community to come forward and play their proactive role in implementing the provincial government's policy aimed at ensuring wheat procurement in an efficient and transparent manner.

He made it clear that the provincial government had decided to have zero tolerance policy against corruption and bribery in all the departments, adding all possible steps would be taken to ensure transparency in all government matters, including postings and transfers.

Two brothers
killed over land
dispute in Swabi

SWABI: Two brothers were killed over a land dispute in a Topi village here on Wednesday. Rescue 1122 and police officials said.

A rescue official said a team provided first aid to two men seriously injured and shifted them to the Tehsil Headquarters Hospital, Topi, where they succumbed to injuries.

The deceased were identified as Tayyab Khan, 40, and Jahanzeb Khan, 35.

Sultan Zeb registered an FIR with the police, stating his brothers were trying to stop some labourers from harvesting wheat crop on a disputed land when Ghemzada, Gutzada and Goharzada, who were also present there, opened fire at his brothers, injuring them critically. Later, they died in hospital.

Meanwhile, the police arrested a man, who had allegedly killed his wife in Jabal village of Chota Lahor, according to a press release issued by the police.

Mohammad Nabi had gone into hiding after the incident, but the police traced him. DSP Chota Lahor Fazal Sher Khan said a team traced the accused in a far-flung area and arrested him during a raid.

Also in the day, a Peshawar Electric Supply Company official was injured when owner of a house attacked him for removing illegal connection in Yar Hussain village on Wednesday. Police officials said.

They said the injured, Khazir Hayat, was shifted to Bacha Khan Medical Complex, Shahransoor.

The Yar Hussain police registered an FIR against the accused, Shahid Khan.

PTI to hold rallies on
first anniversary of
May 9 violent protests

PESHAWAR: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf will hold public gatherings and processions for the release of the party's founding chairman Imran Khan and other incarcerated leaders and workers on the first anniversary of the May 9, 2023 violent protests.

PTI's additional general secretary, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa chapter Irfan Saleem told Dawn that public gatherings and rallies would be staged in each district and constituency of provincial assembly. "MNAs, MPAs and office bearers of the party will lead the gatherings and rallies."

Mr Saleem said a public gathering would be staged at Chowk Yodgar in the provincial capital on Thursday evening to be attended by the ministers, MPAs and PTI leaders from Peshawar.

He said MPAs from Peshawar would take out processions from their respective constituencies and would march on different roads before reaching Chowk Yodgar.

He said flags of Pakistan and PTI would be hoisted on the buildings.

Meanwhile, MPA Fazal Isha staged a hunger strike camp outside the Peshawar Press Club demanding the release of Imran and other leaders and workers.

PTI activists chanted slogans in favour of their leader on the occasion.

Plastic surgeons to launch programme for
rehabilitation of burn victims

Raising awareness to
reduce burn incidents
also part of initiative

PESHAWAR: Pakistan Association of Plastic Surgeons will launch provincial burns prevention programme to put brakes on incidents of burns through public awareness, ensure rehabilitation of victims and help in legislation to protect buildings from fire.

Prof Tahmasebullah, the president of Pakistan Association of Plastic Surgeons (PAPS), said that burn incidents had record 15 per cent increase as compared to last year but the silver lining was that 90 per cent of cases were preventable provided public awareness was scaled up and legal measures were put in place to reduce such incidents.

He said that an estimated 1.5 million people suffered burn injuries country-wide annually with 10 per cent of them happened to be life-threatening requiring hospitalisation.

Prof Tahmasebullah, who is also direc-

tor of the 120-bed Burns and Plastic Surgery Centre, Peshawar, said that the programme was aimed at legislation making installation of smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, safe electrical wiring and gas fitting in building mandatory to cut down risk of deaths from fire by 61 per cent.

He said that Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Burns and Accidents Prevention Authority would be established to ensure architectural design of buildings with fire exit plan, safety of homes, educational institutes and road safety.

"Legislation will also cover prevention of industrial burns, safety of Wapda employees along with training sessions to protect the workers, safe handling of toxic and explosive chemicals with availability of personal protective equipment, like industrial gloves and masks etc," said Prof Tahmasebullah.

He said that about 15 to 20 per cent victims got crippled and underwent multiple surgeries and prolonged rehabilitation. "Of these, 70 per cent are in most productive age group of 15 to 40 years while 80 per cent belong to poor socio-economic strata, mainly due to illiteracy, poverty and low level safety consciousness," he added.

The director said that non-existence of

burn care services at primary and secondary healthcare levels further complicated the situation. "As per plan, we want to set up a central registry to ascertain data, assess burn-related facilities, injuries and disabilities to identify high-risk areas and populations and then initiate steps," he added.

Prof Tahmasebullah said that they would enlist support of plastic surgeons, experts in physical medicine and rehabilitation, health education and health promotion to guide, oversee, supervise and evaluate the programme. "We need more trained surgeons and nurses to improve the quality of treatment," he added.

He said that prevention was better than cure for which awareness campaigns at the community level, schools and workplaces would be held in addition to utilising television, radio, social media and community gatherings to disseminate information on burn prevention, first aid and safety measures.

"Integrate burn prevention education into the school curriculum from primary to secondary levels. Encourage schools to organise awareness events and competitions on burn prevention," he said.

The PAPS chief said that imparting specialised training to healthcare pro-

fessionals including doctors, nurses and paramedics on burn management and prevention were included in the programme. "Establishment of burn care training programmes in collaboration with medical institutions and international organisations is also part of the strategy," he added.

He said that the comprehensive programme also included steps to improve infrastructure, upgrade healthcare facilities for better burn care by imparting training to health professionals and procurement of modern equipment.

"Enhancement of emergency response systems to promptly transport burn victims to specialised facilities, enforcement of regulations related to fire safety at public places, industries and residential buildings along with penalties for violators are needed," he said.

Prof Tahmasebullah said that collaboration with postgraduate medical institute and Khyber Medical University for state-of-the-art training to healthcare providers, provision of incentives to businesses and organisations that prioritised fire safety measures and holding work shops, seminars and interactive sessions to raise awareness about burn prevention and safety were necessary to cope with burns.

FPCCI chief pledges to resolve issues of industrialists

HARIPUR: Federation of Pakistan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI) will establish a special desk at its central office to promote business activities and encourage industrialists to play their role in strengthening national economy.

This was said by FPCCI president Sheikh Ali Ikram during his visit to Haripur Chamber of Commerce and Industry here the other day. He said that FPCCI cabinet was cognisant of the problems being faced by industrialists.

He said that FPCCI had decided to facilitate investors by addressing their problems related to government departments. Young man foils college girl's suicide attempt

CHITRAL: A young man saved a college girl from drowning when she jumped into Chitral River from Chawal Bridge in Jaghoor village to end her life here on Wednesday morning.

City police station SHO Muzamil Malik told Dawn that the deceased girl from Jaghoor village jumped into the river to commit suicide. He said that Mashtar, a young man from her village, also jumped into the river and saved her life.

He said that the girl was rushed to hospital for first aid. She had sustained injuries and was discharged after initial treatment.

Regarding the immediate reason of her suicide attempt, the police officer said that no per initial inquiry, the girl was

dejected over the decision of her parents about her marriage against her will. He said that no case was

instituted against the girl for her suicide attempt as the relevant section (325) was deleted from Pakistan Penal Code.

Three months earlier, another college girl had jumped into the river from the same point on the bridge but she could not be saved. Reason of her suicide was also stated to be marriage against her will.

The district police officer, Fikhar Shah, said that the arrested men were identified as Muhammad Ishaq, of Lachigram, Damsel and Sheikh Zahid and Khan Tahseen of Zareen Bagh Damsel.

He said that the proclaimed offenders had fled to Khyber province of Afghanistan after committing crimes.

Pre-marriage blood test can help prevent thalassaemia in children

Functions, awareness walks mark World Thalassaemia Day

SWAT: Functions and awareness walks were held to mark the World Thalassaemia Day on Wednesday.

Speaking at a function organised in Rakinalad area of Swat to mark the World Thalassaemia Day, children with thalassaemia expressed gratitude for the new lease of life they received through the generosity of voluntary blood donors.

The SPS College management had invited thalassaemia children to mingle with students.

"The disease could be prevented if both partners undergo a simple thalassaemia test since it is inherited from both parents. We urge couples to prioritise this test before marriage," said Waqar Ali, a thalassaemia fighter.

Another thalassaemia patient, Aiman, said they were indebted to those who regularly donated blood to them. "Our hopes and role models extend beyond just blood donors to include those leading the Al-Fajar Foundation, which cares for the

thalassaemia patients in Swat, and blood activists," she said.

The thalassaemia children were greeted with gifts.

Wajahan Ali, a blood activist, said individuals with thalassaemia endured significant hardships, particularly when their blood levels dropped. "They experience severe discomfort as their blood depletes. When fresh blood is transfused, they encounter another challenge of iron chelating," he explained. "Doctors administer medications to alleviate their pain and discomfort."

Wajahan emphasised that a simple blood test could prevent its transmission if couples underwent the screening.

He urged students to familiarise themselves with the disease and to disseminate information among their friends and parents.

In Lower Dir, speakers at a function held on Wednesday urged people to donate blood and let the patients suffering from thalassaemia.

The Al-Khidmat Foundation organised the function and an awareness walk on the premises of the District Headquarters Hospital, Timargara, to mark the World Thalassaemia Day.

Doctors, paramedics, thalassaemia patients, relatives, social and political activists were in attendance.

The hospital's medical

superintendent Dr Ali Agha, AKF district vice-president Hagi Majidullah, its blood society in-charge Mohammad Zeb and others spoke at the function.

The speakers said thalassaemia was a genetic disorder causing decrease in haemoglobin production in the body.

They said thalassaemia was a fatal disease and awareness was needed to prevent it. They said there were 500 registered thalassaemia patients in Lower Dir. They said cousin marriages should be avoided.

The speakers said spouses

should be tested for blood screening before entering into a marriage. They said bone marrow transplant was the only way to get rid of the disease.

Gifts were distributed among thalassaemia patients.

In Kohat, speakers at a function urged parents to carry out blood tests of their children before their marriages to save future generations from blood diseases.

An awareness walk was also held under the auspices of Frontier Blood Bank Foundation and a transfusion centre run by an individual, Imad Khan.

The walk was led by MPA Shafiqullah Jan, SP Usman Farooq, leaders of political parties and social organisations, SDO Jangladesh police station Riaz Hussain and SDO city Saifullah Khan. Khattak also participated in the walk.

Speaking on the occasion, Imad Khan said cancer patients, particularly children aged between 16 and 18 years required fresh blood transfusion weekly and sometimes twice a week depending on their condition. He appealed to people to donate blood generously.

Anti-polio drive in three tehsils of Bajaur from 13th

BAJAUR: The local authorities on Wednesday said an anti-polio campaign would be launched in three tehsils of the Bajaur tribal district from May 13. Polio campaign in Warh Mamund, Lowi Mamund and Nawagai tehsils was postponed after the murder of a policeman escorting the vaccinators in Mamund tehsil on April 30.

A decision to this effect was taken at a meeting attended by officials of the district administration, the police and health department. Deputy commissioner Muhammad Arwaraal Haq chaired the meeting, according to a statement.

The meeting expressed satisfaction over the law and order for conducting the campaign. However, it was decided that footpath security would be provided to the police teams to conduct the five-day activity in a peaceful manner.

Speaking on the occasion, Arwaraal Haq asked the district police officer to make strict arrangements for the safety and security of vaccinators.

District immunisation officer Dr Fida Muhammad briefed the meeting about the health department's arrangements for the campaign. He said over 130,000

children would be administered anti-polio drops in three tehsils.

The meeting was informed that over 700 policemen would be deployed for security of police teams in the areas.

JIUF PROTEST: Jamiat Ulema-i-Islam-Farooq local chapter on Wednesday said scores of workers would participate in the party's public gathering in Peshawar on Thursday (today).

Talking to reporters, JIUF district chief Maslana Akbar Rashid said besides large number of workers, scores of people from different areas of the district would participate in the Peshawar gathering.

He said the workers would leave for Peshawar in the morning on Thursday. He said party chief Maslana Faruk Rehman, party's central and provincial leaders would address the gathering.

21 more illegal filling stations sealed in Khyber

KHYBER: The district administration continued its crackdown on illegally established filling stations on Wednesday and sealed 21 more such stations and arrested six persons.

Officials in Bura and Landi Kotal said that they found at least 21 filling stations operating in different localities without registration and selling substandard fuel.

The official raiding parties also checked fuel gauge, rates and quality of fuel being sold at these filling stations and arrested six managers for violating Ciga regulations.

Meanwhile, Fata Qasmi Jirga held its protest meeting in Jamrud on Wednesday in support of their demand for repeal of 25th Amendment and restoration of the previous status of erstwhile tribal areas.

FQJ leaders termed the merger of former Fata with Khyber Pakhtunkhwa unconstitutional and insisted that it was done in haste and against the genuine aspirations of tribal people.

They said that majority of the tribesmen were not happy with the 'forced' merger as it further compounded their misery and multiplied local disputes.

They said that people of merged districts had never demanded extension of Police Act to their region while revenue system was also forcefully imposed on them.

FQJ leaders demanded of the federal government to reverse the merger plan and let the people of tribal areas live their lives in accordance with their time-tested customs and traditions. — Correspondent

Govt asked to compensate rain victims in Shangla

SHANGLA: Chakkar tehsil chairman Bakht Alam Khan on Wednesday alleged that provincial government ignored Shangla despite the fact that it was affected by recent rains that caused massive landslides, collapse of houses and casualties in different areas of the district.

Flanked by members of the tehsil council, he held a meeting with deputy commissioner and informed him about their grievances, especially about the distribution of food packages among the people affected by rains.

He said that revenue officials claimed that they distributed 250 food packages among deserving families but he did not see anything on the ground. He said that affected

people were ignored in distribution of food packages.

"Our people have been badly affected by rains but despite lapse of two weeks they are still waiting for rehabilitation and compensation," said the tehsil chairman.

He said that provincial government only focused on southern districts and ignored northern districts including Shangla. He said that Shangla was among the most affected districts where emergency was also imposed but government was yet to start rehabilitation work there.

Mr Khan, who is also district general secretary of Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz, said that government should immediately provide funds for rehabilitation and compensation of the people affected by rains.

He said that federal government

assisted the affected people through PML-N provincial president Amir Majeed.

RECOVERED: Shangla police handed over to its owner a stolen jeep, they recovered during checking by their vehicle verification system team the other day.

A report was lodged at Nasirabad police station in Rawalpindi about the theft of the vehicle.
