


I'm trying to reinvent and redeem myself with my film with Siddharth: Sri Ganesh

The restored version of veteran filmmaker Shyam Benegal's 1976 film *Manthan* was screened at the Bunuel Theatre at Cannes on Friday as part of Cannes Classics 2024. While Benegal missed the screening due to health reasons, Naseeruddin Shah, the Film Heritage Foundation (FHF) team, along with FHF director Shivendra Singh Dangarpur, Nirmala Kurien (daughter of Dr Verghese Kurien, whose groundbreaking milk cooperative movement inspired the film), Ratna Pathak Shah and Prateik Patil Babbar attended the red carpet event and screening of the film.

Dedicating the standing ovation for *Manthan* to Shyam Benegal and Dr Verghese Kurien, Naseeruddin shared that in his 50-year career, it was his first Cannes film festival. He said, "The screening is also an occasion to invoke memories of all those people who were indispensable in the making of the film. This was my second film as an actor and when it was time to be released, I was extremely nervous. I wondered how it would fare at the box office since it did not contain any of the 'essential' elements of an Indian film - the very colourful songs, dances, and action sequences. It turned out to be one of the sleeper hits of 1977 and generated more work not only for myself but for many of the other actors as well."

Court rejects bid to return Mona Lisa



The Mona Lisa has been in France since 1516 when Leonardo da Vinci came under the protection of Francis I

France's top administrative court recently rejected a claim for the famous Mona Lisa masterpiece from an unknown association that says it represents the heirs of the painter Leonardo da Vinci.

The claim by International Restitutions - who claims to be acting "on behalf of the painter's heirs" - said that the former French king Francis I appropriated the world-famous

painting in 1519. The organisation, whose head office and directors are unknown, said the painting should be removed from the Louvre museum in Paris and returned to its "rightful owners". The Mona Lisa has been in the Louvre since 1797. The high court called the claim unlawful and ordered the association to pay 3,000 euros (€2.71 lakh) fine for "abusive" proceedings.

HOW TO PLAY
Fill in the grid so that every horizontal row, every vertical column, and every 3x3 box contains the digits 1-9, without repeating the numbers in the same row, column or box. You can't change the digits already given in the grid. Every puzzle has one solution.

HOW TO PLAY
1. A number may appear just once in each row or column. Eliminate repeat numbers by darkening cells. (see example)
2. Darkened cells must never be adjacent in a row or column.
3. Unmarked cells must create a single continuous area, undivided by darkened cells.
4. Every time you darken a cell, you can automatically circle its vertical and horizontal neighbours, which means they cannot be eliminated.
5. Any cell "sandwiched" between neighbours of the same value can be circled. (e.g. 6 4 6)
6. A "triple" is a special case of sandwich. Circle the centre cells, and darken the ends. (e.g. 6 6 6)

LOOP THE LOOP

RULES

- Connect adjacent dots with vertical or horizontal lines, creating a single loop (Fig A).
- Crossovers or branches are not allowed (As shown by dotted lines in Fig B).
- Numbers in the puzzle indicate the number of lines that should surround it, while empty cells may be surrounded by any number of lines.
- You can't draw lines around zeroes.
- Each puzzle has just one unique solution.

HOW TO BEGIN:
Example (Fig A) - Begin with the zero next to 3. Since no lines can be drawn around zero, mark crosses around it, as shown. Now there is a cross in one space around 3. So we know the three lines of 3 can only be drawn in the remaining three spaces. Next, these lines can only be extended in one direction each. Continue, using the same logic.

Hints: Keep eliminating possibilities by marking crosses in spaces between dots where a line isn't possible, i.e., if you have already completed required lines or where a line extension may create a branch or cause a deadend (Fig B).
