Reir Starmer finally greenlighted her candidacy on Friday after days of pressure from other senior party figures, including his deputy Angela Rayner.
Responding to reports she was still weighing up options, Ms Abbott wrote on X: "This is factually incorrect.
"I have never been offered a seat in the Lords, and would not accept one if offered.
"I am the adopted Labour candidate for Hackney North and Stoke Newington — I

intend to run and to win as Labour's candidate."

Ms Abbott was suspended last year for suggesting Jews, like redheads, do not experience racism in the same way as black people.

She had the Labour whip restored last week but briefings swirled that she would be barred from standing in the General Election amid a cull of left-wingers in the candidate selection.

Shadow Home Secretary Yvette Cooper yesterday had to deny reports that hard-left MPs, including Ms Abbott,

were offered peerages so that allies of Starmer could take

weie offered peerages so that allies of Starmer could take their seats.

She told Sky News: "No party can do that. It's not the way the system works."

A close friend of Ms Abbott, Labour peer Baroness Chakrabarti, accused the party of "trying to bully" her.

And Health Secretary Victoria Atkins waded into the row, accusing Labour of having an "identity crisis" by welcoming hard-right souch as Natalie Elphicke, while turfing out left-wingers.



Real Madrid star Jude took Denise, dad Mark and younger brother Jobe from the crowd and later fought back tears as he thanked his family for their support.

He said: "This is the best night of my life. I was all right until I saw my mum and dad's faces.

"The amount of nights where they could be at home by seven o'clock

"The amount of nights where they could be at home by seven o'clock and they're doing trips at 11 and 12 at night to take me to football.

"And my little brother there who I'm trying to be a role model for. Yeah, it's the best night of my life." England fans were now urging Jude to save his strength for the upcoming Euros in Germany, after playing 42 games for Real in a debut season which saw him La Liga Player of the Year.

Chelsea fan Richard Wilson, 36, from Sunbury-on-Thames, Surrey, said: "Jude has played twice as much football as most top professionals at his age — he must be knackered."

"But he has the ability to become a true England great."

On Saturday night Jude celebrated the 2-0 win over former club Borussia Dortmund by taking Denise to the sidelines to meet former Madrid manager and TV pundit Jose Mourinho, dubbed The Special One.

Jude snapped the pair together, telling smiling Mourinho: "Sorry about that, my mum's fancied you for years!"

Mourinho later told TNT Sports: "Special player, special family. To see that family, the way they are there, they are not looking for cameras, they are not looking for the VIP seats, they are just there

not looking for the VIP seats, they are just there to support their kid in the most humble way. "For me, it's really beautiful. Family, we play for them, especially in these moments, we play for them."

Mum Denise, 54, had accompanied former Birmingham City player Jude when he was sold to Dortmund in 2020 for £2lmillion—then stayed by his side as he moved to Madrid last year for an initial £38million.

Retired cop Mark, 48, remained at home with 18-year-old Jobe, currently playing for Sunderland.

Denise made sure to celebrate her birthday, in December, back in the UK. Jude wrote online: "Happy Birthday to my Queen! Love you more than life." He has admitted:

## Final chaos engineered by Russian

A RUSSIAN rabble-rouser was behind shocking Wembley security lapses which marred Saturday's Champions League final.

Gatecrashers attempted to charge through the VIP Club Wembley entrance and pitch invaders halted play by dashing up to players to pose for selfies.

One fan even managed to take a snap with Real Madrid superstar Vinicius Jr, making a mockery of the pledges to throw a £5million "fring of steel" around the soccer showpiece.

Troublemakers were seen wearing T-shirts promoting "Mell-stroy", a Moscow-based vlogger called Andrey Burim who had offered huge sums to anyone who disrupted the game.

The tlug — who was once convicted of abusing a model on a YouTube livestream — posted the taunt: "If you run on to the field in the final of the Champions League with the Mellstroy logo on your body, you will receive 30,000,000 rubles (£260,000)."

Police had pledged to beef up security after a Euros final shambles in 2021 in which 3,000 yobs stormed the stadium for the England vs Italy clash.

Chiefs yesterday insisted a "robust policing operation" had been in place while revealing 53 arrests were made at the final – five for pitch invasion and many more for security breaches.

Trouble flared despite Wembley beefing up its security measures with more than 2,500 stewards.

UK's top military units have failed to reach their recruitment targets under the Tories, stats show.

The Royal Marines, the Paras and the Intelligence Corps have all endured plummeting applications.
This is despite being feeders

for the UK Special Forces. The Marines have failed to hit recruitment targets since 2016 and are expected to miss it again this year.

Last year saw a 28 per cent nosedive for the green berets.

The trend is mirrored in the Paras and Intelligence Corps, where applications are reported

to be down by 50 per cent and 69 per cent respectively over the past five years.

The Paras supply half of the Special Air Service, while the Royal Marines are the backbone of the Special Boat Service.

Labour, who compiled the data, last night accused the Tories of having failed to "fix their crisis in Armed Forces recruitment".

#### £3m on 'cells' for migrants

THE Government is spending almost £3million on jail-like cells at its processing centre for small boat migrants. Planned expansion for "confinement units" at Manston in Kent is set to be completed next month. A Ministry of Justice contract says they will provide "suitable accommodation and facilities to deal with potential incidents of disorder". Salford-based company Kier Construction Ltd is completing the work at the Home Office site. Manston, which opened in February 2022, made headlines that year when overcrowding led to thousands sleeping in tents. Diphtheria spread through the camp. The Home Office said previously that "significant improvements" had since been made at the site, which at its peak housed around 4,000.

Avanti West Coast said: "We would welcome further discussion with RMT to resolve this dispute and we're sorry for any inconvenience this industrial action will cause to our customers."


#### Birth halt gel 'fast'

SCIENTISTS have created a contraceptive gel that acts faster than similar male birth control methods, say researchers Combining the hormones testosterone and segesterone acetate, it suppressed sperm production in eight weeks on average, a study found. Injected hormonal contraceptives did so in nine to 15 weeks, previous studies showed.

The National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, US, said a safe, effective, reliably reversible contraceptive method for men was "an unmet need".

WOMEN'S sport would be allowed to ban transgender athletes under landmark legal changes pledged today by Equalities Minister Kemi Badenoch.

The Tories are opening the second full week of election campaigning with a vow to enshrine the rights of biological

ensimme the rights of biological sex over gender.

It would let providers of single-sex services and spaces exclude trans women without fear of being taken to court for discrimination.

And it would allow firms to stop biological men entering sensitive places such as toilets, changing rooms and domestic violence hostels. This will be done by strengthening the Equalities Act to make clear that the protected characteristic of sex refers specifically to biology.

Rishi Sunak has said this needs clarifying because of the surge in trans people since the last Labour government introduced the Act.

The PM has also committed to wresting control of gender issues back to Westminster so the SNP cannot have another crack at their controversial reforms.

He said: "The Conservatives believe that making this change in law will enhance protections in a way that respects the privacy and dignity of everyone in society.

"We are taking an evidence-led approach to this issue so we can continue to build a secure future for everyone across the whole country." Tory strategists believe Labour is weak on the trans issue and want to put Sir Keir Starmer on the back foot ahead of the first election TV debate.

Both leaders spent the weekend prepping for tomorrow's head-to-head on ITV, with Mr Sunak hoping to claw back ground in the polls.

The gender crackdown also brings Tory big beast Ms Badenoch into the election battle for the first time.

She has won plaudits for railing against trans millitants and putting in safeguards against transitioning.

Today's pledge comes after Ms Badenoch wrote to the Equality and Human Rights Commission last year warning of "the increasing contestation of how the term sex is understood in law and in practice".

The Commission agreed defining sex as a biological issue would "bring greater clarity" in issues like single-sex spaces and clubs.

Trans athletes competing in sport has especially sparked fierce debate.

There was international controversy in 2022 when US male-born swomen's US College Championshi

has said Labour has "an issue with women".
Following the recent Cass review — that found children were being pushed down a medical transition route with little supporting evidence — senior Labour MPs rowed back on previous hardline positions.
The trans crackdown is the latest in a line of "common-sense" Tory pledges designed to open up dividing lines with Labour. It is also seen as a bid to blunt the Reform Party threat.



A young child sat on a bench as his caricature was drawn. Another in an AC-DC T-shirt laughed with a pal. Nearby, a lad drove a toy car. Beautician Kseniya, 39, said: "We've tried to lead as normal a life as possible since the start of the war. People are only afraid of the things they've not experienced.

"This is the third year of the war. We are used to this now. It's still a nightmare and those who are not OK with it have already left. We will stay here no matter what."

Her friend Kayeryna, 39, added: "We've been here in Kharkiv the whole time. People are out and

about. They're refusing to give in to the terror and we won't be stopped. "The sign saying Kharkiv Unbreakable isn't just a slogan. It has true meaning behind it because of what we've experienced together. "We're aware of the scary things that can happen but we still walk in the park because it is ours to enjoy. "We will never fall." Albina, 28, said: "It's hard not to think of the possibility that you might be hit by a missile. It's like playing Russian Roulette every time you go out. We go out and understand the risks that exist. "We don't want to die but it's impossible to sit all day and all the time inside the house." Her boyfriend Anatolii added: "The people of Kharkiv are strong. We love it here and we're staying in the city until the end."

Outside the National Opera House, Artem, 14, skateboarded with his pals, Danya and Nikita, both 21. He

said: "I am scared but not so scared that I can't carry on with life. The scariest thing that can happen is losing my parents and my friends."

The Sun has witnessed first-hand the recent horrors being inflicted on Kharkiv, including a rocket attack on a printing press which killed seven and another on a DIY megastore in which 19 people died.

We were also at the scene of a missile strike on an apartment block which claimed another nine lives.

And still the ballistic missiles, glider bombs and Iranian-made kamikaze drones rain in.

Kharkiv's mayor, Ihor Terekhov, praised the city's indomitable spirit and said it would not be crushed.

Young children are being evacuated but the rest are staying put amid hopes Ukraine will soon strike military targets deep within Russia. It comes after the US performed a U-turn on the use of its weapons to wipe out the launch sites beyond enemy lines that are responsible for so much carnage in Kharkiv.

Meanwhile Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky has accused China and Russia of trying to undermine his upcoming global peace summit in Switzerland.

# Auction prize bidders end up empty-handed ids hospice left without its £30k donation

VIP charity auction firm has suddenly shut leaving down, leaving good causes owed tens of thousands of pounds.

Attempts to contact boss Alan Lambert — snapped with celebs including Geri Horner, Harry Kane, Anthony Joshua and Vernon Kay — are met with an automated response, simply saying Good 2 Auction has "ceased trading".

One charity chief told The Sun: "We're owed tens of thousands. We just don't know where to turn."

Those hit include Noah's Ark Children's Hospice, which cares for 350 kids every year at a site in Barnet, North London. It confirmed it was owed "at least £30,000".

Garden House Hospice Care in Letchworth, Herts, said it was trying to recover at least £31,000 in donations and promised funds. The Seashell Trust, a national charity providing support to children and young adults with complex disabilities, told The Sun it was owed £22,000.

Donors who bid for prizes at gala dinners have also been left out of pocket.

Businesswoman Sally Alington, 45, stumped up £11,000, including £3,000 on a VIP trip to watch the Monaco Grand Prix from a yacht. She forked out £2,000 on flights and a hotel only to find when she got to Monte Carlo the prize had not been paid for.

Good 2 Auction has run silent auctions with sealed

Good 2 Auction has run silent auctions with sealed bids since 2019. Lambert, 50 has registered nine firms at Companies House since 2018, with seven struck off without filing accounts.

with seven struck off without filing accounts.

Accounts from March 31 last year showed Good 2 Auction owed £655,414 with total assets of just £545,045. In January it was taken to court for unpaid bills, while Lambert set up a "personal services" company which is still trading.

The Sun left a written request for comment at Lambert's home — a £1.2million North London mansion. We also left phone and WhatsApp messages, without reply.

CANCER cases are rising faster in the under-50s than any other age group, a study has found.

Experts warn that unhealthy Experts warn that unheating living by young adults is play-ing a part in the increase. Rates rose 24 per cent in 25 to 49-year-olds between 1995 and 2019. It was nearly double the 13 per

cent increase for the UK population and greater than the 16 per cent rise in under-25s, or 14 per cent in those aged 50 to 74.

Analysis by Cancer Research UK found that among the over-75s, at highest risk, it was up ten per cent.

Prof Charles Swanton said: "Changes to lifestyles and diets over time, and rising obesity, may all contribute to the uptick in early-

cancer." Obesity, which has onset cancer." Obesity, which has doubled to around 30 per cent over the same time period, has been associated with cancer risks.

It comes as US research linked foods high in sugar and low in fibre to bad gut bacteria.

Experts at Ohio State University found it could trigger inflammation that raises the risk of bowel cancer.

They said under-50s with cancer had cells that looked 15 years older

than they are, potentially due to swelling damage.

Illness in younger adults is projected to keep rising into the 2040s, Cancer Research added.

Prof Swanton said: "Around four in ten cancer cases are preventable."

Prof Swanton said: Around Jourin ten cancer cases are preventable and not smoking, keeping a healthy weight, being safe in the sun and cutting down on alcohol all make a big difference."

#### Three in 4 of jail's lags high or drunk

THREE in four of a jail's lags were "drunk or high" on home-made hooch or drugs, a report found.
Sniffer dogs led staff to 136 five-litre bottles of the booze, some as strong as spirits, over a year at HMP Guys Marsh.

Lags made it with £200 "toxic" starter kits available in the Category C nick — storing it in old disinfectant containers.

It was sold for between £50 and £100 a litre depending on the "market" at the Dorset jail, the Independent Monitoring Board report added.

It said the containers had holes punched in them "to foil further use". Inspectors said the jail's governor should get "all support necessary" to target the "lucrative trade in illicit items", including drugs and mobile phones. The Prison Service said: "We're finding and stopping more contraband behind bars."

Daf James is the Welsh creator of the three-parter, which starts tonight, and like the central characters he went through the intrusive, gruelling but rewarding process – and is now a happy father of three.

But Lost Boys And Fairies is not an autobiography, it is a drama in its own right and one he hopes might have a unique outcome.

Daf said: "My job as a storyteller and a writer of a performance is to entertain and not to bore an audience. I take that role very seriously

"All the rest of the stuff is additional. If I can make them think or laugh or cry as part of that entertainment, that would be

that entertainment, that woul an amazing thing.
"But if this influences somebody to go away and adopt, it's a win because there are hundreds of kids in the UK who need loving homes. That would be an absolute triumph.
"I would love it if that happens."
Daf knows how difficult the journey to becoming

the journey to becoming an adoptive parent



can be after he and his husband worked with social services to form

worked with social services to form a family eight years ago. One of the things he wanted to focus on was his positive experience of social workers, particularly given how negatively they can often be portrayed.

Daf said: "I can only talk from the adoption perspective, but their job is to protect these children. "We go through a very, very rigorous process and everybody always asks us, 'It's intrusive isn't it?' and I'm like, 'Well, it is in a sense but that's because they need to make sure that where that child, who has already lived with significant trauma, is coming to is a safe place'.

significant trauma, is coming to is a safe place.

"We've had many social workers who've been involved in our lives with our children and they've been like angels to us."

Lost Boys And Fairies is a reflection of all these experiences, with some artistic licence.

Daf said: "When we went through that it was the most incredible life-changing.

life-changing, challenging ever been and it lifeaffirming, challed thing I'd ever through and

changed me as a human and as an artist as well.

"I needed to write about it almost as a cathartic thing. I always borrow from my life in terms of writing but the show is a work of fiction because I've found a way of translating my lived experience and putting it into a story.

"My characters are not actually based on my family."

The show revolves around Andy, played by Fra Fee, and his performing artist boyfriend Gabriel, played by Sion Young.

#### 'It was electric'

They both live in Wales and have reached a stage in their relationship where they want to start a family, except one of them has a rather

Gabriel endured a troubled childhood and when he reached adulthood he slipped into a hedonistic whirlpool he struggled to get out of.

Far more difficult is the emotional journey they go on as they try to be parents to seven-year-old Jake, played by Leo Harris.

For Daf, the story isn't about gay adoption, it is simply about family and everything that comes with it.


The officer was on patrol in a marked police car when he spotted the vehicle parked in a field at 11.30pm on Saturday.

A NEW artificial intelligence tool can rule out heart attacks in A&E.
Rapid-RO identified that over a third of patients had not had attacks at four hospitals. It is hoped it will help cut thousands of hospital stays a year.
Prof James Leiper, of the British Heart Foundation, which funded a study of the tool, said: "This demonstrates the important role AI could play in treatment for heart patients."
Rapid-RO was developed at Imperial College London using data from 60,000 patients and then tested on 35,000 people. It analyses data from a protein blood test and other info. The AI ruled out attacks in 36 per cent of patients, compared to 27 per cent by blood tests.

# RUGBY SUPERSTAR TURNED MOTO

#### ROB BURROW once said: "There's something beautiful about being cared for by the only girl you've

tul about being cared for by the only girl you've ever loved."

It was typical of the way the rugby league legend tackled motor neurone disease, which turned him from one of the fiercest rugby league players in Britain to being confined to a wheelchair barely able to move. Rob, who has died aged 41, leaves behind wife Lindsey – his teenage sweetheart – and their children Macy, II, Maya, eight, and four-year-old Jackson.

The sportsman had a stellar 17-season career at Leeds Rhinos as well as being capped 15 times for England and five for Great Britain.

In 2019, two years after retiring, he was diagnosed with MND and told he only had two years to live.

He selflessly threw himself into raising awareness of the disease and fundraising for MND charities – helping to raise around £20million with his best pal and former teammate Kevin Sinfield, 43.

Lindsey said: "This is so people no longer have to explain. And it is about giving hope to families who have little. You are given bleak statistics, we want to bring change."

Images of Rob being carried across the finishing line of the Leeds Marathon by his mate Kevin went all around the world in May 2023 and became an enduring symbol of hope.

The friends met at a Rhinos squad session when Kevin was 14 and Rob was 12.

Kevin pushed Rob's specially adapted chair around the 26.2-mile course before picking him up so they

Was 12. pushed Rob's specially adapted chair around the 26.2-mile course before picking him up so they could finish together.

Rob later told The Sun: "Kevin whispered, 'You're not going to beat me Rob, we are finishing together. He then kissed me on the cheek.
"It was a day in a million. It felt like scoring in a Grand Final again."

Rob was awarded an MBE in 2022 and he and Kevin received CBEs from Prince William this year for their efforts in raising funds and awareness of the disease.

At 5ft 5in, Rob, often called "the smallest player in Super League" worried about his size when he began playing rugby but soon realised it was his advantage.

He said: "I was wondering how I could cope with being small but it was my size which would be my greatest adversary.

"I quickly learnt that I had to do it my way and differently to others. I knew that to be the strongest pound for pound I would need to be the quickest in the team."

Mum Irene, 73, told The Sun last year: "He might have been small but nobody could catch him."

After an old rugby injury flared up, Rob was diagnosed with the cruel condition that leaves sufferers trapped in their bodies while their minds are as sharp as ever and their movement and speech fails.


He told the BBC: "My speech was slurred, with family telling me it had got worse. I had an old injury and went for a (painkiller) jab in my shoulder. I mentioned about the speech to the doctor and was very quickly diagnosed.

"I didn't know much about MND at all. I'd read up on the internet about the symptoms... but I didn't believe (I had) it. When I found out it was a massive shock."

His first instinct on being told he would die was to check that Lindsey was OK. "Most husbands would feel that," he said. "It was tough on her. I thought, 'I'm glad I have this disease and not her'.

"MND is not the worst thing in the worst thing.

"I'm not trying to portray myself as a hero because any man would gladly take any pain from their wife and kids and give it to himself." His fam-







ily refused to give up hope, with his dad Geoff managing to get his son on a trial drug to slow down the progression of the disease.

It kept Rob alive longer than the couple of years he had been told he could expect in 2019.

Geoff said: "Sufferers have waited over 25 years for a breakthrough." "With all the support we've had we've been able to get Rob on trial treatments.

"That's the reason why Rob and the family are raising awareness— it's for all the people sat quietly at home, going through what we're all going through."

Of the difficult task the couple faced of telling their three children about his disease, Rob said: "It's not easy. How do you tell them you've got something when there's no cure?

Lindsey was a great help. We wanted to tell them before Christmas because we thought that would be a distraction

we thought that would be a distraction."

Lindsey later spoke of the children's acceptance, saying: "We told them that the doctors and nurses were doing everything they could for Daddy but that he had MND and it was life-limiting.

"Maya said, 'Why are you telling us this? It's boring'. We all started laughing."

Lindsey told The Sun last year how the family had a "no tears" approach to the disease, and explained how Rob had been inspired to live by another MND sufferer, rugby union player Doddie Weir who died aged 52 in 2022, six years after his diagnosis.

Lindsey said: "Within the first couple of weeks of diagnosis, Kev Sin-

field took Rob to meet Doddie, and that was the turning point. Doddie instilled hope into Rob, telling him, 'Despite what they tell you, fight this and carry on with life'.

"Rob came home and told me, 'Right, there's a no-tears policy, we deal with this.

"It is what it is and we keep things as normal and possible for the children and make happy memories.

"Rob said he would accept the diagnosis but fight the prognosis."

Two months later Rob started recording his voice so his children could still hear him through a computer when it disappeared.

By October 2020 his Yorkshire tones could only be heard through technology controlled by Rob's eyes.

As his condition worsened the player had to permanently use a

including a new research and treatment centre, the Rob Burrow Centre for MND, which hopes to open next year in Leeds. It will be the first to have its design led by the holistic needs of the patient and their family. The chief executive of Leeds Hospitals Charity, of which Rob was a supporter, said he was "an inspiration, not only to the people of Yorkshire, but the entire nation".

Esther Wakeman added: "Rob, and his family, bravely shared his personal story with us all and showed us how to live life to the fullest in the face of adversity.

"Even when his own voice failed him, he gave a voice to the entire MND community, giving people hope and spreading joy with his infectious smile and unwavering sense of humour. Thanks to Rob's dedica-

tion and support, we have now raised £5.8million to help bring Rob's dream to life, a specialist centre for people living with MND and their families."
Rob, of Pontefract, West Yorks, who grew up with sisters Jo, 49, and Claire, 44, was named in the super league dream team three times.

Prime Minister Rishi Sunak summed up Britain's affection for Rob in March 2023, when he was given a special 2000 Points of Light award for his work.

Rishi said: "The legacy of everything you are doing for the fight against this disease will change what it means to be diagnosed with MND. "As you have said, 'In a world of adversity, we must dare to dream'.

"Inspired by you, many will dare to dream and fulfil those dreams, in spite of whatever adversity they may

face." Last night Prince William posted on X/Twitter that Rob was a "legend of Rugby League" and "had a

huge heart". His forme

His former rugby club said: "He never allowed others to define what he could achieve and believed in his own ability to do more.

"For those who knew Rob... his determination and spirit in the face of MND over the last four and a half years came as no surprise.

"Rob never accepted that he couldn't do something. He just found his way of doing it better than anyone else. He will continue to inspire us all every day."

Rob lived his final months unable to move or talk unless through his machine.

Yet his positivity always shone

Yet his positivity always shone through. He once said about his

attitude: "I don't know how I became so positive and smiling all the time. "I definitely think it is something I have dealt with in my life previously. "I have a wonderful family who can't do enough for me, especially my wife and kids. "My mum still pampers me when I go up and my dad is the most positive person I have met. "I use positive imagery a lot, like walking my girls down the aisle. I often see me and Lindsey going to the villa for 90 days when she retires from her job. The brain is really powerful and I believe I can get to that stage."

Rob may have not fulfilled his dream but his legacy lives on through the incredible fundraising he and Kevin achieved — and the love of everyone who knew him.

#### WHEN I got married I vowed to stay faithful — even though I'd cheated on previous girlfriends.

But within five years I'd broken my promise by having my first affair when I was 39. After we'd had our two children my wife lost interest in sex and I felt like I was going mad.







EDDIE HEARN needs to ditch the tuxedo and rip June 1 out of his diary if he is ever to wrestle back bragging rights from bitter rival Frank Warren. Five years ago, on the first day of the month in New York, Matchroom promoter Hearn went full black-tie for Anthony Joshua's US debut against Andy Ruiz Jr — and ended up looking more like the Joker than the Penguin.

And on Saturday night in Riyadh, he was humiliated again in his black tux for the Matchroom v Queensberry 5v5 tournament which pitted a handful of his best fighters against Warren's.

Team Queensberry secured a 10-0 whitewash after winning all five bouts — four of them convincingly—and finishing with a new featherweight world champ in Merseyside mauler Nick Ball.

The sad thing for boxing fans who have grown up with this bitter, spiteful and snarling rivalry—sparked almost 40 years ago by 72-year-old Warren and Eddie's dad Barry, 75 — is the pair are now having to fake a friendship to play nice with the Saudis bankrolling such stunning events.

Instead of Warren gloating with talk of silver spoons and the Hearn family being better off sticking to their old accountancy trade, he has been magnanimous and generous in victory.

And Hearn — who vowed to emulate Sir Alex Enguson with his better

victory.

And Hearn – who vowed to emu-And Hearn — who vowed to emulate Sir Alex Ferguson with his team talks and mind games but ended up about as handy in the dugout as Duchess of York Sarah Ferguson—has had to grin and bear it and congratulate his new chum through gritted and polished teeth.

Craig Richards, the only real homegrown Matchroom talent on Hearn's cherry-picked team, was supposed to bank early points against Scotland's Willy Hutchinson.

But the 35-year-old Londoner was

painfully tentative over all 12 rounds

painfully tentative over all 12 rounds and, even when Hutchinson tired, he did nothing to salvage even a close contest.

Ball came next and he bullied American sensation Ray Ford over the distance and grabbed the WBA title, just two months after being harshly denied the WBC version in the Saudi Arabian capital.

Queensberry were out of sight when Capitain Fantastic Hamzah Sheeraz battered Yank Ammo Williams and stopped him in the 11th round to make it 6-0 after three bouts.

Olympic super-heavyweight

three bouts.

Olympic super-heavyweight bronze-medal winner Filip Hrgovic was a Hearn banker going in against twice-beaten Daniel Dubois.

But the Rio 2016 star has been a flop as a pro and lasted eight rounds before being stopped due to cuts over both eyes.

Deontay Wilder — the Alabama heavyweight who was nemesis for years after repeated failed attempts to make an Anthony Joshua fight — was the last man who could save face for his new boss. But the 38-year-old American

had pleaded with Saudi boxing boss Turki Alalshikh to let him box for WARREN against Hearn, so his heart was clearly not in his clash with Zhilei Zhang.

And neither were the Bronze Bomber's fists, legs or chin as he was brutally knocked out in the fifth round — his fourth defeat in five fights — and should now retire. It was a dismal night for Hearn, whose snooker and darts mogul dad left a jokey note on the dressing-room door demanding to see his boy in his office at 9am this morning.

The serious implications are he has been obliterated in a battle to be Britain's best boxing promoter. Hearn blew his chance with a stable of three Americans and a Croatian, so his boasts of being a dominate force around the globe for his broadcast backers DAZN are now up in smoke, too.

The 5v5 format will be revisited, with talk of a UK vs USA version. For the sake of king and country, let us hope Warren is given the playing cards to deal as his flashy young foe is a busted flush, in any suit, for now.





Stokes may have been cleared of affray, claiming he was defending a gay couple from homophobic abuse, but he was still charged by the ECB for bringing the game into disrepute. He pleaded guilty and was fined £30,000 in December 2018 and banned for eight matches. The big-hitter has

been open about his psychological battles, seeking therapy and taking anti-anxiety medication.

He took an indefinite break from cricket in June 2021 to focus on his mental wellbeing, explaining it was due to a combination of feeling let down by the ECB over the Bristol incident, the impact of Covid and the cancer death of his dad Ged in 2020.

Football boss Southgate hailed the session Durham star Stokes, 32, put on as "brilliant".

The 53-year-old said: "He's one of the few English sportsmen that I felt could impact them, make them think. "He's authentic, he talked brilliantly about getting the right balance of fearlessness but recognising that any-body's going to have nerves.

"It's making good decisions under pressure. He was able to talk to them about some leadership aspects, the culture he'd tried to create.

that next step now. I fully believe we can go all the way."

Harry Maguire showed Bellingham around Old Trafford and United icon Eric Cantona was flown over from France to meet the 16-year-old.

Yet the Bellinghams decided on a move to Dortmund — and what a wise decision that proved to be. And the midfielder also got his timing spot on by moving to Madrid to link up with manager Carlo Ancelotti last summer. Pushed up as a No10 by the Italian manager, he scored 23 goals and delivered 13 assists in 42 games.

In recent weeks, Bellingham found himself in a different position, wide on the left, which also came with more defensive duties.

After the Dortmund game, in an interview with US network CBS, pundit



Thierry Henry asked whether some fans might not have noticed he is having to work harder off the ball. Bellingham replied: "I couldn't really give a s\*\*t what people think about me!"

Bellingham spoke to TNT Sports pundit Jose Mourinho on the pitch and asked him whether he would pose for a picture with his mum as she had always fancied the Portuguese coach.

The Wembley celebrations continued yesterday in Madrid. And Bellingham's role is likely to change next season as Kylian Mbappe will join Real's attack. But it seems that anywhere he plays, he will be a success.

After a few days' rest, he will link up with his England team-mates at the end of the week.

And then it will be up to Gareth Southgate to continue to get the best out of Bellingham at the Euros.
