



Office for National Statistics data last month showed that knife crime has increased 7% in a year and by 81% in the past decade.

Mr Philp told the event, organised by the My Ends programme, that the government planned to invest £25million next year on a programme identifying young people in danger of becoming involved in gang violence. He added: "We are

investing in new technology to scan people walking down the street and if they are carrying a knife it shows up.

THE King and Queen will host the Japanese Emperor and his wife in a state visit at the end of the month.

Buckingham Palace confirmed the event would go ahead in a "slightly adapted" form due to the General Election.

In an unprecedented move, the King and Queen will entertain Emperor Naruhito and Empress Masako on June 25-27. days before the country goes to the polls on July 4.

It will include the traditional pomp and pageantry of a ceremonial welcome on Horse Guards Parade.

There will be a banquet at Buckingham Palace and they will lay a wreath on the tomb of the late Queen at Windsor Castle.

In 2017, a Spanish state visit by King Felipe VI was rescheduled because the date clashed with a snap election in the UK.

The Palace declined to confirm exact details of how the plan had changed.

But a spokesman said: "It has of course been adapted as a result of the current pre-election period of sensitivity."

ROB Burrow left his parting gifts yesterday - his £6.8million centre for motor neurone disease and an inspirational message saying: "Dare to dream."

In a heartwrenching speech recorded before losing his battle with the debilitating condition at just 41, the rugby league legend told of his hope that a cure will be found.

And he said: "By the time that you watch this I will no longer be here?

Earlier in the day, work began on the Rob Burrow Centre for Motor Neurone Disease, due to open next year.

Rob's parents, both 73, attended the

ground-breaking ceremony. Mum Irene said: "He'll be looking down on us and he'll be going 'thumbs up'. We're so proud to be here and it's amazing what you can achieve.

'This is what Rob would want and he'd be proud that we all pulled ourselves together and got the strength to come."

In BBC One's There's Only One Rob Burrow, the MND campaigner spoke using his eye-gaze machine, which allowed him to communicate via

computer by looking at words. Rob said: "My final message to you is whatever your personal battle, be brave and face it.

"I am just a lad from Yorkshire who got to live out his dream of playing rugby league.

"As a father of three young children I would never want any family to have to go through what my family and children have since my diagnosis.

He told how he hoped he had left a mark on the disease, before signing off: "Rob Burrow, over and out."

His dad Geoff wiped away a tear as a minute's silence was held in his son's memory at the ceremony in Leeds.

HAPPINESS

Recalling Rob's sense of humour, he said: "He'll be up there, looking down saying 'shut up mother!'.

"But to have a care centre with his name on it, and not just the centre but having a breakthrough for people with MND so it's not the hell on earth, it's going to be a good future for MND sufferers, we'll make sure of it."

Former Leeds Rhinos star Rob was diagnosed with MND - a rapid progressing neurological condition that attacks the nerves and leads to paralysis - in 2019. His death was announced on Sunday.

Wife Lindsey, 41, mum to their three children, Macy 12, Maya, nine, and Jackson, five, paid tribute yesterday. She, said: "Although we knew this

day would arrive, I am somehow still feeling at a loss for words that our loving, kind and caring husband and father has departed.

"However, we take comfort from how much people's love and continued support meant to Rob through his most vulnerable times."

Calling him "simply the best" and "our hero", she went on: "I was incredibly proud and fortunate to call Rob

my husband. "I am unbelievably proud of the campaigning he's done to raise awareness and the millions of pounds raised in his name for MND charities. "I would like to thank the rugby

league community and everyone for their outpouring of love and support since Rob's diagnosis. I truly appre-

"My priority is to make Rob proud, and to bring our three children up as Rob would want and ensure their happiness and well-being."

Rob's sisters Joanne Hartshorn, 49, and Claire Burnett, 44, said their brother would have wanted them to attend yesterday's ceremony.

Joanne admitted: "Last night we were wondering how on earth we were going to be able to do that, but the outpouring of love and every-body's support has been unbelievable."

outlook on life, he wanted people to have hope, he wanted to find a cure for this disease."

Rob won eight Grand Finals, three World Club Challenges and two Challenge Cups in a glittering career.

And his parents yesterday met players and coaching staff at Leeds' Headingley Stadium, where hundreds of fans gathered to pay their respects.

Flight booze 'a heart risk'

AIRLINES should consider restricting alcohol on long haul flights to protect health, says a study.

It found alcohol at cabin pressure may strain sleepers' hearts.

60 more killed including children as Israel expands Rafah offensive

AT least 60 Palestinians have been killed in Gaza over the weekend and yesterday, including three children and a woman, local authorities said.

Meanwhile fierce cross-border fighting between Hezbollah and Israel sent thousands fleeing to underground shelters. Two shepherds died in the fighting in southern Lebanon.

A strike in Gaza's Bureij refugee camp late on Sunday killed four and a second on the Nuseirat camp killed seven.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office has reacted against a three-phase peace deal suggested by the US, which Hamas had responded to positively.

The US plan includes a six-week ceasefire, withdrawal of Israeli troops from Gaza's populated areas and the release of Israeli female, elderly and sick hostages in return for hundreds of Palestinian prisoners. Phase two would lead to the release of all hostages, and Israel would withdraw its forces from Gaza. A permanent ceasefire would be in place. Phase three would involve major reconstruction beginning in Gaza. Netanyahu's office said it would not agree unless it has destroyed Hamas's military and freed all hostages "before a permanent ceasefire is put in place".

Israel is expanding its offensive in the southern city of Rafah. The invasion has largely cut off the flow of food and medicine to Palestinians, with 37 children dying of malnutrition and 3,500 at risk.

Israel said the body of a hostage, Dolev Yehud, 35, was found at Kibbutz Nir Oz near the Gaza border, which Hamas attacked on October 7.

The military also confirmed the deaths of four more hostages, including three who begged for their release.

Amiram Cooper, Yoram Metzger and Haim Peri were all aged 80 or older. The fourth hostage was identified as Brit-Israeli Nadav Popplewell, 51.

Israel said the four men died in the southern Gaza city of Khan Younis.

Hamas killed around 1,200 in its attack on Israel, and the Israel offensive has killed more than 36,000 Palestinians, according to Gaza's health ministry.

They then attacked the pair outside a hotel in the French Riviera resort of Cannes before fleeing in a Renault Megane.

Local police believe the robbers were part of a well-organised gang".

AN international dog fighting ring led by a violent thug who dubbed himself "Doctor Death" has been jailed.

Vile Phillip Ali, 67, used the sickening moniker as he trained his dogs for blood-thirsty battles inside his co-defendants' home, earning up to £5,000 for a win.

The court heard how animals suffered serious injuries, including broken legs, and endured brutal training regimes.

Sentencing the three men and one woman at Chelmsford crown court, Judge Sawyer said the gang showed "a shocking level of barbarism and callous-

ness" towards the dogs. He said: "They were effectively starved and put through a training regime, like fighters preparing for a boxing match."

Earlier this year the Mirror exposed the mob, who ran fights in the UK, Ireland and France. Several of these were hosted by a married couple who had a fighting pit in their garage.

Billy Leadley, 38, ran and refereed fights while keeping injured dogs caged in filthy conditions at the house he and wife Amy, 39, shared with their young sons in Takeley, Essex.

Although the court heard that Amy did not attend fights, Judge Jamie Sawyer said he found it "impossible" that she would not have known about them.

During the trial, prosecuting solicitor Hazel Stevens told the court that the garage contained a 12ft x 8ft carpeted "pit". She said: "There were what appeared to be blood splatters on the walls. Samples were analysed and found to have come from at least five different dogs."

Ali led the UK arm of the operation from his home in Chigwell, organising fights with his overseas counterparts.

He told his "medicine man" Stephen Brown, 57, also from Chigwell, to pump the animals with steroids, painkillers and chemical stomach liners.

All four continued to deny any wrongdoing yesterday despite being found guilty by a jury in April. Ali was jailed for five years Billy Leadley for four years and Brown for three years and six months. Spared jail because of her sons, Amy Leadley was given a community order with 200 hours unpaid work.

All four were disgualified from keeping dogs for 10° years.

RISHI Sunak's election campaign has been sent into meltdown as a mega-poll showed the Tories heading for wipeout... and that was before Nigel Farage joined the fray.

Brexit cheerleader Mr Farage announced vesterday he was taking over as leader of Reform UK and launching his eighth bid to get into Parliament, threatening to squeeze the Tory vote even further.

Mr Sunak, 44, desperately needs to land a knockout blow on Labour leader Keir Starmer, 61, in tonight's TV debate, but even his own party appears to have given up hope. A Tory source said: "Rishi needs a game

changer. But it won't happen."

A mega-poll of almost 60,000 people last night indicated Mr Starmer is on course for a landslide victory. The YouGov survey suggested the Tories could lose 225 of the seats they won in 2019, leaving them with just 140 MPs.

Twelve Cabinet ministers face the boot, including Jeremy Hunt, Penny Mordaunt, Grant Shapps, Johnny Mercer and Esther McVey. And big-name backbenchers at risk include Jacob Rees-Mogg. The poll predicts Labour would

win a gigantic majority of 194, which would be the second largest in history, behind the 210 majority Stanley Baldwin secured in 1924.

Mr Farage had said he would not stand to be an MP, after his seven previous attempts failed, complaining that the six-week campaign was 'not long enough". But with only days to go until Friday's deadline for candidates, the former UKIP leader threw his hat into the ring.

At an "emergency" press conference in London, Mr Farage, 60, said: "Difficult though it is, I can't let down those millions of people, I to spend every Friday for the

KEIR Starmer yesterday hailed Labour as the party of national security as he joined military veterans standing for him at the General Election.

The decorated heroes, with more than 100 years of service among them, flanked the Labour leader on stage as he vowed to make the country's safety the number one priority if he wins the keys to No10.

In a speech at The Fusilier Museum in Bury, Gtr Manchester, he made clear that his commitment to the Trident nuclear deterrent system was "absolute" and the "foundation of any plan to keep Britain safe".

Ahead of the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings on Thursday he remembered the bravery and courage of soldiers that served.

But he warned the world is perhaps more dangerous and volatile than any time since then" as he said the post-war era is over and a next month. They included ex-Royal

"new age of insecurity" has begun, with conflicts across the globe.

He also insisted the whole of the Shadow Cabinet was behind him despite senior members voting against renewing the Trident weapons system in 2016.

Mr Starmer said: "I lead this party. I have changed this party. "If we are privileged to come in to

serve, I will be the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom and I've made my commitment to this absolutely clear and I've got my whole cabinet, shadow cabinet, behind me."

He appeared with Shadow Defence Secretary John Healey and 10 of the 14 former armed forces personnel who will be wearing the red rosette

Marine, Colonel Alistair Carns, who could become one of the most senior ex-servicemen in the Commons.

His military career - spanning 24 years in conflict zones across the

globe – was recognised with an OBE in 2022 and a Military Cross for "distinguished service" in Afghanistan in 2010 and 2011.

He told the Mirror he was standing out of a "duty to serve", adding: "We'd all agree it's a duty to serve the people of this great nation.

We've got 14 fantastic military candidates - that's over 100 years of experience - coming to support the Labour Party.

His military career ended just last

week as he was selected to run for Labour in safe Birmingham seat Selly Oak. He said there is an "opportunity for Labour to make real

change to this country". Mike Tapp, standing n Dover, left the military 10 years ago and has worked at the National Crime Agency and Ministry of Defence.

He said his "whole life has been service", adding: "It goes for all of us.

That is what's in our blood." "I'm really confident as a veteran that we can deliver for the country." Former Army intelligence officer Louise Jones, who was wearing a campaign medal for the six months she served in Afghanistan, is fighting to win North East Derbyshire - a seat with a 12,000 Tory majority. Ms Jones, who left the military in 2020, told The Mirror: "I was seeing first hand the really damaging cuts under the Conservative government.

"Really short-sighted, all brushed in under the guise of trying to save money but really it's costing more in the long term. We're left with real big gaps in our capability. I'm not the kind of person to sit around. I wanted to get involved."

She also said she was "shocked" that some veterans had been forced nto resorting to foodbanks.

Paul Foster, who served in the Army for 15 years until 2013, including two six-month tours of Kosovo, said he was hopeful of a Labour victory next month.

But the candidate for South Ribble insisted: "We have got to work for every single vote."

FAMILIES of nine babies who died at a hospital trust are calling for a national public inquiry into NHS maternity services.

They also warn a separate inquiry is needed to prevent more "unneces-sary deaths" at the trust, where nine babies died and four mothers barely survived between 2021 and 2023.

Now families have come forward with fresh allegations of failings at two hospitals run by the scandal-hit University Hospitals Sussex NHS Foundation Trust.

They wrote: "All our babies were otherwise healthy and would have grown up if not for the failings in care and the dismissal of our concerns.

"Our children lost an entire life; they never got a chance to grow up, to learn to walk and speak, to make friends, to witness the awe and beauty of our planet.

"Though our babies left their mark on this world in many meaningful ways, they had so much more to give. This is a loss to us as parents, to our families and to society as a whole."

They continued: "With the volume and repetition of errors in maternity care by the trust, we believe that babies and potentially mothers will continue to unnecessarily die under the trust's care unless there is additional intervention."

The group includes the parents of five babies who died at the Royal Sussex County Hospital and four who died at Worthing Hospital between 2021 and 2023.

EMERGENCY

Abigail Fowler Miller died in January 2022, two days after she was born by an emergency C-section in a foyer at the Royal Sussex.


Her mother, Katie Fowler, had gone into cardiac arrest in a taxi on the way into hospital, after midwives relying on over-the-phone assessments allegedly missed warning signs of massive internal bleeding.

An inquest found Abigail would likely have survived if her mother had received medical care earlier. Another baby, Orlando Davis, died

at Worthing in September 2021 after maternity staff failed to his realise mother, Robyn, had a rare fluid imbalance called hyponatremia.

An inquest found his death was "contributed to by neglect".

And Esme Vowels Lovett died in February

dismissed mum Chloe's concerns about stabbing pains, reduced movements and bleeding during the late stages of her pregnancy.

Chloe and her husband, Toby, had been trying to conceive for seven years and had experienced several miscarriages. An investigation found staff missed six opportunities to intervene before Esme's death.

2022 after staff at Worthing Hospital baby girl who was stillborn at almost 40 weeks after her mother twice attended hospital concerned about reduced movements but no appropriate action was taken.

Two more boys died after failures to carry out appropriate monitoring. The worst maternity scandal in NHS history was uncovered at Shrewsbury and Telford NHS Trust, where a report blamed poor care for

the deaths of more than 200 babies. Donna Ockenden, the independent midwife who investigated Shrewsbury and Telford, is now carrying out an inquiry into Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust. More than 700 families have contacted the review team. The Maternity Safety Alliance, a

group of relatives of newborns who have died due to lapses in NHS childbirth, said scandals will continue unless a national inquiry is held.

Maternity services at the Royal Sussex, in Brighton, were downgraded to the lowest safety rating of "inadequate" by the Care Quality Commission in 2021.

At the time, it warned of issues including a lack of trained staff, poor patient assessment and response to risk, and poor governance.

Although the CQC has noted some improvements have been made since, maternity services at the Royal Sussex remain "inadequate", while services at Worthing are

classed as "requires improvement". Dr Maggie Davies, chief nurse at University Hospitals Sussex NHS Foundation Trust, said: "We offer our deepest condolences and sincere apologies to each of the

bereaved families for their devastating loss. Whilst we recognise that no words can ease their pain, our dedicated teams are committed to listening, learning and improving the service, so mothers-to-be, mothers and their babies are as safe as they possibly can be whilst in our care.

We have recruited more midwives, changed how we listen to and support families, and we have a nationally recommended triage process to help react quickly if there are any reasons for concern.

"Our outcomes for mothers and babies are now better than most other trusts in the country, but we know we must continue to listen and improve, and would always want to meet any families who have concerns to understand their experiences and make changes where possible."

BLACK Lace star Colin Gibb, who enticed the nation to "push pine-apple, shake the tree" in 1984 hit Agadoo, has died aged 70, just days before he was due to retire.

His devastated wife Sue Kelly said it was "heartbreaking" to tell fans her "dearest husband" had passed away.

She added: "I love you Colin, we spent 22 years living your Agadoo dream, we were due to retire to Spain on Thursday, you were so happy, so looking forward to our new life, now you're gone. As we used to say, always love you for ever."

Wedding reception staple Agadoo was the pop duo's biggest hit, shifting a million copies to reach No2. The song stayed in the top 75 for 30 weeks.

But the band enjoyed a run of other novelty hits in the 1980s, often centred round cheesy dance routines, including Do the Conga, Superman, Hokey Cokey and Wig-Wam Bam.

And earlier, as a four-piece, they represented the UK at the Eurovision Song Contest in 1979, coming seventh with Mary Ann.

Colin's death on Sunday was confirmed by his former bandmate Dene Michael, who wrote: "So sad to hear the passing of my singing partner with Black Lace. RIP my friend Colin Gibb. God bless. We had some great times together touring the world."

Sue urged mourners to honour her husband's colourful legacy by dressing up in bright outfits similar to the ones Black Lace wore as they led us through their famous dance routines.

SIR Keir Starmer has one of Labour's most loyal voting blocs slipping away.

It won't stop him winning next month's election. This country cannot rid itself of its chiselling Tory chancers soon enough.

But on July 4, family ties and tradition will go AWOL as Black and Brown Labour voters look elsewhere.

Don't kid yourselves it is all about Diane Abbott. Yes, the Hackney North and Stoke Newington MP, 70, has been treated disgracefully by the party over the past 18 months.

It is also about Faiza Shaheen, the Labour candidate with Fijian and Pakistani heritage, who was de-selected last week for the Chingford and Woodford Green seat in East London.

It has long been about Gaza and Starmer's unwillingness to call for a ceasefire early on when, quite rightly, he'd previously been unequivocal about October 7. It is also about the lack of new Black male Labour candidates to represent the raft of issues facing young men in this country.

So now a diverse young voting bloc and a disgusted middle-aged generation are set to provide their own response.

Mine is a family commitment to a party that fought for Black Britain in the 1970s and 80s

Yes, after a backlash, she had the whip restored to her last week.

And yes, the whole thing looked to have taken such a toll on her that she might just prioritise her health, despite insisting she'll stand again. The point is, for Black people sidelined and maligned at work on a daily basis, the whole thing matters.

More broadly, what do you do after Starmer goes from this in 2020: "We need to make the wider case on immigration. We welcome migrants, we don't scapegoat them. Low wages, poor housing, poor public services

are not the fault of the people who come here - they are political failure."

To this in 2024?: "Read my lips - I will bring immigration numbers down. I will control our borders and make sure British businesses are helped to hire Brits first."

A reminder, net migration has fallen by 10%. Just a fraction of

those numbers were illegals. To use the language of the right when immigrants have paid their taxes, boosted the economy and done the jobs that few people have wanted to do over decades, is quite something.

Especially when research revealed last year that Brexit had led to a shortfall of 330,000 people in the UK labour force, mostly in the low-skilled economy.

Again, Starmer is right. This country does need change. But an empowered, diverse electorate also needs politicians to earn our trust. Not take it for granted. DM1ST

STORMY Daniels finds it hard to believe crooked Donald Trump can still run for president even if he is jailed, and begs Americans not to vote for him.

The adult-film actress has attacked the businessman's ability to continue his battle for the White House in the November election. calling it a "disgraceful loophole".

Despite Trump being found guilty last week of 34 criminal charges, nothing in the US Constitution forbids him from running.

Now Stormy, whose hush-money payment to stop her revealing details of their alleged affair led to Trump's conviction, has urged Americans to vote for his rival, Joe Biden.

She says: "If Trump is jailed, he cannot vote, but he can still be president. That's a disgraceful loophole.

"It is as crazy as the law that prevents you from walking your alligator on a sidewalk on Sundays that still exists in some states.

Asked about who she will be casting her ballot for on November 5, Stormy, who is a Republican, said she would find it hard to vote for Democrat Mr Biden but would definitely not be backing Trump.

She says: "I would like to encourage everyone to vote.

"I understand not liking either of the candidates... but remember, NOT voting for Biden is the same as

voting FOR Trump. "That's why that is important. How is it that this amazing country that we live in is full of all these amazing people, and yet Trump and Biden are all we have? Like that's it? I just don't understand."

Stormy is unambiguous about who she holds responsible for the political unrest in the States and its lack of civility". "It's Trump," she says.

"People have either one extreme view or another.

Jim Fuller has now uncovered new information about his brother and the last minutes of Fyfe's life.

It is contained in a letter to the War $% \mathcal{A}^{(n)}$ Office from an Army captain who

quizzed Geoff about the crash in 1945. It is believed they were sitting next to

each other on the glider.

This week at Geoff's grave Floss, 98, and Jim, 86, paid their respects and told his incredible story.

Jim said: "My brother and the Daily Mirror's Ian Fyfe were heroes. I was honoured to find out more information about their heroism on D-Day.

"Finding that letter from an Army captain was really quite special.

From my inquiries it's almost certain that the Daily Mirror reporter and my brother were sitting next to each other on the glider when it crashed on the night of 5th June 1944."

The letter, dated 8th March 1945, is marked "Missing Personnel" and was sent to The War Office, Blue Coat School, Wavertree, Liverpool 15 by Captain EJ Wellman.

Military chiefs had asked him to speak to Geoff to find information on Sergeant Ockwell of the Glider Regiment No1 wing who was still missing.

e wrote: "Fuller does not know Staff Sergeant Ockwell. I have, however, obtained information.

"Fuller says on the night of fifth of June 1944, he was in a glider, which was number one of five towed by Albermarles.

The other occupants were two pilots, names not known, an Army lieutenant and a war correspondent named Fyfe.

"In landing, the glider crashed into a tree.

"Fuller was badly injured and rendered unconscious. "

'When he came to, he noticed that the war correspondent was pinned by a jeep and died 10 minutes later. He's positive both the pilots and the lieutenant were dead.

"Fuller crawled into a 🗌 ditch and at daybreak the enemy machine gunned the glider and later arrived and took the bodies away.

"Fuller says he saw all this happen from the ditch and he was picked up by our troops later."

Floss said Geoff, a respected Transport and General Workers Union shop steward who died in 1977, never spoke about that night.

Speaking at her husband's grave in Bishop's Stortford, Herts, she said: "I knew he was a Prisoner of War and he was in a glider that crashed, that's all. He never spoke about what actually



happened. I had no idea that he was in a glider with a Daily Mirror war

correspondent. I can't thank Jim enough for all his research." The glider, one of the first to land, carried weapons and a jeep.

Veterans gather at op's H

D-DAY veterans swapped war stories at the headquarters where the operation was planned ahead of its 80th anniversary on Thursday.

Around 40 veterans met at Southwick House in Southwick, Hants, vesterday, the headquarters of Supreme Allied Commander General Dwight Eisenhower.

George Chandler, from Burgess Hill, West Sussex, served aboard the British motor torpedo boat MTB 710.

The 99-year-old said: "Let me assure you, what you read in those silly books that have been written about D-Day are absolute crap.

"It's a very sad memory because I watched young American Rangers not shot, slaughtered. I was 19 at the time, these kids were younger than me."

Marie Scott, 97, served with the Women's Royal Naval Service at Fort Southwick. Her job was to pass messages from troops on the beaches to the leaders of Operation Overlord, Eisenhower and Field Marshal Bernard Montgomery. Ms Scott, who was



awarded France's highest order of merit, the Legion d'Honneur, described hearing the battle rage.

She said: "I was a little bemused when I first heard it, then I thought to myself, 'Oh, you know, this is war'.

You could hear everything, machine gun fire, cannon fire, bombs, men shouting, the general chaos."

Most of the veterans at Southwick House, now housing the Defence School of Policing and Guarding, were brought by the Royal British Legion, the Spirit of Normandy Trust and the Taxi Charity for Military Veterans.



Zara's family 'tortured' by street killing on way home

THE family of a woman killed by a sexual predator told an inquest they are "tortured" by the thought her death was preventable.

Jordan McSweeney, then 29, had been released from prison on licence when he attacked Zara Aleena, 35, as she walked home from a night out in June 2022.

He admitted her sexual assault and murder, in llford, East London, at the Old Bailey and got life with a minimum 38 years.

CRUMBLING

Zara's aunt Farah Naz said the murder highlighted "the crumbling justice system [which is] meant to protect us".

She told a jury at East London coroner's court in Walthamstow: "She believed that a woman should be allowed to walk home, and her dreams, her future was brutally taken."

McSweeney received his first custodial sentence at the age of 13 and had spent much of his life in jail.

Coroner Nadia Persaud said the inquest will look at "whether any actions or omissions of state bodies contributed to her death". The inquest continues.

Pair arrested over Channel death of girl

TWO men have been arrested over the death of a young girl who drowned attempting to cross the Channel in a small boat.

She was among five to die when a dinghy carrying more than 100 people got into difficulty after leaving Wimereux, northern France, on April 23.

National Crime Agency officers arrested Al Tahir Abdullah Adam, 24, and Musaab Bashir Altijani, 19, from Sudan, in Hillingdon, West London.

They appeared at Westminster magistrates court on Saturday and were held in custody until Friday. The NCA's Craig Turner said: "We will do all we can to identify those responsible."

A 91-YEAR-OLD man has become the first patient in the country to receive an artificial cornea.

Cecil Farley faced a year-long wait for sight-saving surgery after a human cornea transplant failed, but his surgeon offered him the chance to skip the queue by using an artificial one.

Mr Farley, married to Elizabeth, 83, said: "I can still see my wife after 63 years' marriage. It makes your life fuller when your eyes work properly. "You don't realise how debilitating it is until it happens to you."

The operation he had replaced the inner part of his cornea with an artificial lens attached to the eye by a single stitch.

There is a worldwide shortage of

91-year-old can see wife due to artificial cornea

Poole said of the artificial cornea, developed by British scientists: "One of the beauties is that it is not human tissue so the body does not try to reject it."

Mr Poole, who performed the surgery at Frimley Park Hospital in Surrey, added: "I think this may end up replacing human corneas for certain types of corneal graft patients. In maybe 10 or 20 years' time, this may become the norm where we don't need a human cornea, we just take one out of the box."

Mr Farley, of Chobham, known to friends as John, had been suffering

problems with his right eye for around 15 years. When a cornea is damaged, it can become clouded and change shape. Mr Farley's vision is improving after February's operation, and is expected to get better over the pert year

to get better over the next year. He added: "It has made a great difference to my sight. It was very blurred and I couldn't distinguish a face. Now I can see better with it, the brighter the light the better. It's coming along."

With some donors opting out of giving eye tissue, NHS Blood and Transplant's Kyle Bennett made a public plea.

plant's Kyle Bennett made a public plea. He said: "We understand that people often attribute more emotion and symbolism to the eyes.

"However, agreeing to this form of donation, even when solid organ donation may not be possible, means there can be light after darkness for thousands of people."





A BABY heart charity says a simple test could save hundreds of newborns' lives each year if it were carried out universally.

Pulse oximetry testing - a check of blood oxygen levels – is not currently compulsory and 20% of UK hospitals do not perform it. But it can spot congenital heart disease, which kills more than 300 UK babies a year.

Charity Tiny Tickers wants testing to be mandatory for newborns on the NHS, and for better training and equipment to spot CHD in pregnancy. A spokeswoman said: "Sadly, 1,000

heart babies leave hospitals every year with no one knowing they have a lifethreatening heart condition, putting them in danger of heart failure.

"Some of those babies won't make it back to hospital in time to receive the treatment that could save them"

Campaigning to make testing mandatory, Tiny Tickers has put 600 pulse oximetry machines in maternity wards, at a cost of £242 to £725 each.

The test involves wrapping a soft sensor around a baby's hand and foot

It takes five minutes for a monitor to detect blood oxygen level and heart rate. Tiny Tickers says if it is performed in the first 24 hours after birth, certain types of CHD can be detected and treated before they become critical.

The spokeswoman added: "Surgery survival rates are very high and 80% of babies born with a congenital heart defect survive past 16 years of age."

DIAGNOSED

She added of detecting CHD during pregnancy: "When a sonographer detects a problem at a 20-week scan, the mother will then be referred for a specialist scan, where the heart condition can be diagnosed.

"A care plan will then be put in place for the baby's arrival, usually at a specialist heart centre.

'This means, as soon as the baby arrives, they will receive the care they need. Early diagnosis also means parents can prepare for the journey ahead." Dr Joyce

Lim. consultant cardiologist at Alder Hey Children's Hospital in Liverpool, said: "We need to increase the antenatal pick-up rate of congenital heart disease, which means better diagnosis during pregnancy.

"In some serious heart conditions, only 50% are picked up in pregnancy." Health visitor Zoe

Beresford, based in Newcastle, could not agree more.



already shown that sleeping less than the recommended seven to eight hours a night can have an adverse effect on heart health.

But findings from a new US study suggest that, for women going through the menopause, it's not just short sleep duration that can be an issue disturbed, restless sleep can also affect their risk for heart disease and stroke.

The study, led by Columbia University Medical Center in New York City found that women who reported poor sleep quality during menopause were three times more likely to have poor overall cardiovascular health scores.

That means dealing with interrupted sleep should be a priority for women in middle age.

"Studies indicate around 40 to 60 per cent of women experience sleep problems during menopause - most commonly disturbed sleep with lots of interruptions," says Dr Zoe Schaedel, menopause specialist and co-director at Myla Health (mylahealth.co.uk).

"And for some women, who might have been good sleepers before menopause, it's something that can come out of the blue. Typical issues that disturb sleep include night sweats, anxiety and sleep apnoea."

Luckily, there is plenty you can do to improve slumber.

NO TO NIGHT SWEATS

Every evening, our core body temperature needs to drop to help us fall asleep, and it needs to stay low through the night to keep us asleep.

'The hormone changes of the menopause make it harder for your brain to regulate your body temperature and can result in hot flushes and night sweats, which can really impact sleep," Dr Zoe says.

"HRT (hormone replacement therapy) can cure the night sweats and can help your sleep in other ways, too. You could also try breathable, cool cotton or moisture wicking nightwear, sheets and cooling gel mattress toppers. Keep a change of clothing by the bed so you don't wake yourself even more by having to rummage for fresh nightwear.

CHECK FOR SYMPTOMS **OF SLEEP APNOEA**

Sleep apnoea is a condition where the airways of the throat relax and narrow, interrupting normal breathing and disturbing sleep.

"Rates of sleep apnoea double after the menopause, possibly linked to the fact that a drop in hormones, particularly oestrogen, reduces the airway's muscle tone," says Dr Zoe. The menopause transition may also lead to weight gain, which can increase the risk of developing the condition.

"Sleep apnoea is associated with an increased risk of heart disease and stroke," adds Dr Zoe. "But lots of cases in women go undiagnosed, because they can present with more subtle symptoms than men, like loud snoring. Instead things such as morning headaches, nightmares and depression can be





happen if you don't get enough sleep is enough to increase your hyperarousal – your fight/flight/freeze response – which then becomes the problem.

"It is virtually impossible to go to sleep when your heart rate is elevated, your breathing has quickened, your muscles are tense and your core body temperature has increased.

"There are lots of strategies to try to calm yourself, such as slow, diaphragmatic breathing, cognitive defusion – a process whereby you try to separate from your thoughts to allow you to gain



perspective and not get caught up in unhelpful negative thought cycles.

"Another relaxation strategy which is very helpful is Progressive Muscle Relaxation where you systematically tense and relax the muscles in your body from head to toe."

DON'T CANCEL PLANS It's tempting, after a bad night, to duck out of social events, forgo exercise and stay at home to try and catch up on sleep, but that can be counter productive.

"Generally speaking I usually suggest continuing with your daily activities regardless of how well you have slept," says Dr Maja. "By getting on with life we're taking

"By getting on with life we're taking back control and saying that poor sleep doesn't have the power to hijack our

lives. That enables us to reduce the power of insomnia and thereby make it easier to sleep going forwards.

"Cancelling plans to see friends or to exercise or do something which would otherwise be good for our health and wellbeing may also impact negatively on

our mood, which can affect our sleep. "There are limits of course. If somebody has had very little sleep for several days and they're struggling with their cognitive functioning then it might not be helpful to continue with their everyday activities."

SCHEDULE WORRY TIME Menopausal changes in

hormone levels may influence neurotransmitters in the brain responsible for regulating mood, which could explain why women are more susceptible to anxiety at this time.

Feeling anxious can disrupt our sleep and lead to restless nights filled with worry. "To combat this, we need to 'retrain' our bodies and brains to know that nighttime is for rest and daytime is for thinking," says Dr Maja.

"The best way to do it is to put an alarm on your phone for a time during the evening which suits you. It's best to do it not just before you go to bed, perhaps 7pm or 8pm. Then set aside 15 to 20 minutes to write down all concerns and worries that come into your mind. Invite them in.

"Then give yourself time to make any necessary plans or action points you need, but after that, shut your book, put it away and tell yourself, 'Your worry time is over'.

"Then when any worries show up late at night you can tell yourself, 'I have already spent enough time worrying about this today, nighttime is for resting."

any of us will be familiar with the pain that comes from tight muscles and joints. A good stretch or massage can often help alleviate the discomfort. But while your back and legs might be the obvious sore points on your body, it's also worth checking in on your jaw.

In today's busy, high-stress world, it's common to carry tension in the jaw, which can lead to further pains and problems.

Charlotte Mernier, registered osteopath and director of My Osteo London, blames our sedentary lifestyles as well as increased stress and anxiety.

"The majority of people clench or grind their teeth, holding tension in their jaw without even realising it," says Charlotte. "Orthodontic treatments like braces and aligners can also trigger jaw tensions."

You might not be concerned about the health of your jaw, but holding tension there can cause Temporomandibular Joint Disorders (TMD), affecting the two joints that connect your lower jaw to your skull. "TMD affects one in three, but less than 7 per cent of the population seek treatment," says Charlotte.

"The most common symptoms are jaw pains, tension headaches, neck and shoulder tensions and pains, limited mouth opening (less than three fingers width), clicking noise

when opening the mouth, eating or yawning, earaches, tinnitus or a sensation of water in the ear."

These can seriously impact daily life, quality of sleep and even generate more stress.

"You may notice symptoms in the morning after clenching your jaw or

grinding your teeth during sleep." Often, dentists will prescribe a mouthguard to be worn overnight, to avoid this grinding and clenching. Relaxing your jaw is key and there are simple ways to let go of tension. "First, reduce clenching during the day. Use daily reminders to retrain your brain like an alarm or visual cues," suggests Charlotte.

Practising stress-reducing techniques is also important. Regular exercise, time away from technology and even regular breathing exercises will also help. "Avoid bad oral habits like chewing gum, biting your nails or biting the

"When eating, chew slowly on both sides or alternate sides, cut your food into small pieces, avoid hard and crunchy food and prolonged mouth opening, such as when you eat a burger or apple."

If you smoke, Charlotte says it's

best to quit as it can stimulate muscle activity.

Sat at a desk all day? "Check your sitting position too and avoid having your head forward." She also advises against sleeping on your front.

Your at-home massage

"Practise self-massage three to four times a week to limit the tensions in your jaw and face," advises Charlotte.

First up, place your index or thumb inside "the mandible angle". This is the corner of the jaw bone, found at the back of the jaw.

"Gently massage the area while gliding your jaw forward. Massage here until you feel a release of the muscles," says Charlotte.

Reduce tension in the jaw and cheeks by placing your fingertips under the cheekbones (on the soft part of your cheeks).

"Clench your teeth to make sure you feel the muscular contraction. Then, in circular movements, gently massage while gradually increasing the pressure.

You should do this for five minutes, says Charlotte.

To reduce tension headaches caused by a tight jaw, place your fingertips on your temples.

"Clench your teeth to make sure you feel the muscular contraction then, again, gently massage the temples with circular movements while increasing the pressure gradually. Do this for five minutes."

HEALTH Having an artificial pancreas has totally changed my life

hen Britain's Got Talent star Tom Ball was offered an artificial pancreas, he initially said no. The singer, who has Type-1 diabetes, had strong reservations. But Tom, who has been using the system for a year and a half, now says it has revolutionised his life.

When I was first offered it, I was worried about the algorithms, about losing control," says singer Tom, 25. "But it absolutely changed my life. For the first time ever I was able to go to bed and not wake up in the middle of the night worrying about my readings, because it was looking out for me.

"From someone who has used basically every form of treatment, there is no better treatment out there at the moment that I'm aware of."

An artificial pancreas – also known as a hybrid closed loop system – continually monitors blood glucose, then adjusts the amount of insulin given to them through a pump. For Tom, it has meant he no longer has to inject himself.

Tom was an early user of the system and one of the first in his home county of West Sussex trialling it. In April it was announced that thousands of children and adults living with Type-1 diabetes across England will now receive it on the NHS.

"Your CGM [continuous glucose monitoring] tells the pump exactly what your blood glucose readings are and it knows where you should be," says Tom. "It automatically injects you. If your readings go up, the pump delivers more insulin. If my readings go low, it reduces the insulin delivery to allow my body to naturally rise back up.

"It's constantly making adjustments to try and keep me within that sweet spot, whereas beforehand I had to give manual injections."

Type-1 diabetes is a lifelong condition that causes a person's blood sugar level to become too high. If not

treated, it can cause life-threatening hypoglycaemic and hyperglycaemic attacks, which can lead to seizures and even death.

Tom was first diagnosed when he was eight years old. "When I was in hospital those first few days, I didn't realise the gravity of the condition. It wasn't until I started having to do injections myself when I went back



into school that I realised this was never going to change.

"No-one else from my school was Type-1 diabetic. It felt a bit isolating. The music rooms became my happy place. In my lunch breaks I would go in there to do my injections and then play the piano or pick up a guitar. It was my safe place, where I developed most of my love for music."

Tom finished third in BGT in June 2022 and reveals that just two days before the live final he ended up in hospital due to high levels of ketones (made when glucose is in short supply), but he didn't tell the show bosses

"At the time I didn't think it was useful knowledge because it's part of my life. I

just thought that's another day in the diary done, move on," he says. "That was before my closed loop system." Tom says having a hypo for him

means getting very dizzy. "My legs feel like jelly. I get very confused and sweaty. It could be for 20 or 30 minutes, depending on how severe it is."

Having an artificial pancreas has helped immensely with touring. "Before going on stage I can tell the pump that I want to run just a little bit higher, because I'm going to be doing some exercise on stage. I know I can go on stage and not worry about a hypo

mid-song." It also helps with his voice. "If I've got high readings, I really struggle to hit the high notes and I love hitting those. Keeping my readings under control

"

before I'm about to sing helps." There's just no better treatment out there at the moment that

Tom's debut album Curtain Call, which came out last month, features a self-penned song about his diabetes, Let Me Live.

"It's about the control diabetes has over me, about combat-ing it a little bit – Tm in control of you, you do what I say"."

Feeling isolated as a child made Tom determined to be more vocal about diabetes. It's one of the reasons he's an honorary patron of the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF).

"When I was growing up, they were one of the main charities that I looked to for support. I suddenly realised I wasn't alone," Tom says.

He has to look out for his mental health too. "It's constant and relentless," he says. "I've been in therapy because I was really struggling with my diabetes.

"It's something that the community has coined diabetic burnout, where you get to a point where you can't be bothered to look after it anymore. Therapy helped massively.

Grabbing opportunities like the closed loop is all part of that and he would encourage people to give it a try. NHS England has provided local health systems with £2.5million so they are ready to start identifying patients that can benefit.

"It's amazing that everyone can have access to this technology and great that the NHS is going to fund it for everyone who wants it," says Tom.

"Going on BGT changed my life overnight. What I've learnt and what I'm still trying to learn, is to not let moments pass you by.





Dr Brian Dickie, director of research, Motor Neurone Disease Association says: "It often takes a year from the first onset of symptoms to receiving a diagnosis of MND. This innovative research into the early cellular changes potential for the development of new tests to help reduce diagnostic delay.

The early detection of these accumulating proteins in people with MND remains a major challenge to successful treatments, slowing down Horrocks of Edinburgh University believes this research could speed things up. "This is the first time that this approach has been used in human tissue and we're excited by its ability to detect a pathological form of the

protein that has so far been difficult to characterise.

"Unlike antibodies used in current testing for MND, aptamers are synthesised in the laboratory, offering a more cost-effective and

reliable alternative." "This could be a game-changer for MND research, diagnostics and treatment. This tool 'targets' the disease protein and allows us to see where toxic clumps are building up in the body. It can do this for much lower amounts of disease proteins, and with greater accuracy than ever before."

Without international collaboration between scientists from the University of Edinburgh; Instituto Italiano di Tecnologia, Genova; King's College London; and the Centre for Genomic Regulation in Spain, this revolutionary MND research could never have happened.

DDLE AGE CANCER RISE But more survive the illness

The bad news is more people are getting cancer in middle age - but the good news is fewer of them are dying from it. Researchers looked at cancer incidence and mortality among people

aged 35 to 69 between 1993 and 2018. Overall, they found mortality rates

had dropped 37% in men and 33% in women, but there were some far



greater drops for particular cancers. So the mortality rate for cervical cancer is down 54%, owing to the combined impact of the HPV iab and cervical screening. The researchers, however, warned that there were worrving increases in cases

of melanoma, liver, oral and kidney cancers - which are linked to lifestyle risk factors including alcohol consumption and obesity.

they have carried on in secret or would things have become physical? Emotional affairs often lead to sexual affairs, although not always.


If you want to repair your marriage, my advice would be to accept the friendship with



D-DAY: THE UNHEARD TAPES

Marking the 80th anniversary of the invasion, this unique series is the story of D-Day, told by those who actually experienced it.

It relives one of the most extraordinary days in the history of modern warfare using powerful eyewitness accounts, many of which have never been heard.

The series features rare audio interviews recorded with D-Day survivors, including Royal Navy Marines James Kelly and Warwick Nield-Siddall, sourced from archives around the world. Young actors, cast to resemble the interviewees at the time of the war, lip-sync the original testimony to recall moments of bravery, fear, chaos and confusion.

These memories are interwoven with fragmented documentary-style dramatic recreation and expert narration.

Together, they tell the story of the fateful Normandy invasion and the bloody battle that followed, in which more than 100,000 people lost their lives.

Once you get used to the style, with young actors fronting the real words, it's a compelling insight into that deadly day.

QUEENIE Channel 4, 10pm

BASED on the bestselling novel by Candice Carty-Williams, this is a razor-sharp comedy drama with a lot of heart.

Dionne Brown plays Queenie Jenkins, a 25-year-old Jamaican-British woman who straddles two cultures but feels that she doesn't neatly slot into either.

A South London stalwart, journalist, friend, girlfriend, daughter and granddaughter, she's also a bit of a mess when dealing with the constant trials and tribulations of life.

It starts with a hospital scene, packed at once with malady and mirth, which sets the tone for the series. Watch out for Laura Whitmore as a puzzled nurse.

There's an immediate sense of chaos. Queenie is late for work and she's had a big argument with her boyfriend. Again.

At work, where she's trying – and failing – to get ahead, her boss (Sally Phillips) isn't interested in her latest pitch.

And something was definitely wrong at her doctor's appointment. All she has to look forward to is an

All she has to look forward to is an awkward dinner for boyfriend Tom's mum's birthday.

The meal, complete with racist gran, lurches from one catastrophe to another. Eventually, Queenie is left shell-shocked when Tom (Jon Pointing) tells her they need a break.

"I can't always be angry. I can't take the drama. You're too much," he tells her.

In the second episode of a double bill, Queenie puts on a brave face as she moves into her new house share, but when she realises Tom isn't coming back any time soon, she takes steps to numb her loneliness.

EXTRAORDINARY ITV2, 10.05pm

This fun and fresh sitcom is set in a world where everyone over the age of 18 develops a superpower. Everyone that is, except for Jen.

Breathing new life into the over-done superhero genre, this follows 25-year-old Jen (Máiréad Tyers) as she struggles to be the only adult she knows who is a completely ordinary human.

Her best friend Carrie (Sofia Oxenham) can channel spirits of the dead, while Carrie's boyfriend Kash (Bilal Hasna) can rewind time, like a slightly clunky superman. And watch out for Siobhan McSweeney as Mary, Jen's mother who can control technology.

What makes Jen special? Absolutely nothing. Yet.

With a tongue-in-cheek sense of humour, this has a fantastical element, but also a relatable mundanity.

It begins as Jen hopes to make an impression at a job interview. But the interviewer's superpower is making everyone tell the truth. Needless to say, it doesn't go well.

Without a power of her own, Jen is feeling very left behind.



Reports say the company plans to potentially file paper-MEETING work in the coming days, laying the groundwork for a blockbuster flotation. The move by the firm, which was founded in China and is now headquartered in Singapore, would be one of the largest deals for the London Stock Exchange in a decade.

Shein's huge selection of cheap clothes - backed by campaigns with social media influencers - has turned it into one of the world's biggest fashion retailers.

However, it has faced criticism over its supply chain, including allegations around the use of forced labour. Sky News



BRITAIN'S fastest man Zharnel Hughes has suffered an Olympics injury scare after pulling out of this weekend's European Championships.

Hughes (above), who was among the favourites to win the 100m in Rome, hurt a hamstring racing in Jamaica on Saturday night.

And last year's world bronze medalist has less than four weeks to be fighting fit for the British Olympic trials, which are being held in Manchester on June 28-29. Matthew Hudson-Smith has also

withdrawn from the Euros less than a week on from breaking his own 400m European record but is not injured, while Imani-Lara Lansiquot and Nethaneel Mitchell-Blake are no longer set to compete over the 100m and 200m respectively.

Britain have named a team of almost 70 for the event. Keely Hodgkinson and Katarina Johnson-Thompson (below) are among the gold medal hopefuls

Meanwhile the athletics calendar is set to receive a major shake up from 2026 after the sport's governing body announced a new biennial competition featuring a prize fund worth a record £7.9million.



The inaugural Ultimate Championship will be held in Budapest from September 11-13, 2026 and will see eight to 16 of the highest-ranked athletes per event battle for a winning prize of £118,000.

It follows World Athletics' divisive decision to become the first sport that offers prize money to Olympic champions.

Gold medallists in Paris will receive £39,000, a move that has been criticised behind the scenes by the IOC and heads of other governing bodies.

Beyond World Athletics' drive to improve financial rewards for its biggest stars, the Ultimate Championship, which will run in alternate years to the World Championships, is their latest attempt to engage younger audiences.

"With only the best of the best on show and cutting straight to semi-finals and finals, we will create an immediate pressure to perform for athletes," said president Seb Coe.

'The World Athletics Ultimate Championship will be high on action and excitement for fans, setting a new standard for track and field events.

'Featuring athletics' biggest stars, it will be a must-watch global sports event and means track and field will host a major global championship in every single year, ensuring for the first time that athletics will enjoy a moment of maximum audience reach on an annual basis."

Teen Mirra reflects on last-8 spot

Novak wins another epic but is doubt for quarters

NOVAK DJOKOVIC claimed he is a doubt to play in the French Open quarter-finals after needing a "maximum dose" of painkillers for a knee injury during his latest five-set win.

And the world No.1 slammed the slippery condition of the main court after fighting back to beat Francisco Cerundolo.

Djokovic only finished his five-set victory over Lorenzo Musetti at 3.08am in the early hours of Sunday morning.

And back on Court Philippe-Chatrier yesterday, the defending champion appeared to be limping to a shock defeat against the No.23 seed Cerundolo (circle) when he needed treatment for a right knee injury in the second set.

He pulled up in agony chasing a drop shot in the fourth set and he fell heavily behind the baseline in the final set to prompt another rant at officials – and boos from the

the fourth set – and had a break point to serve for the match at 5-5. But after being only five points from defeat, the Serbian superstar shook off his latest injury to win 6-1 5-7 3-6 7-5 6-3 in four hours and 39 minutes.

It was the longest match of Djokovic's Roland Garros career -

and followed the four hours and 29 minutes he needed to beat Musetti. Djokovic, who triumphed just before 9pm local time, won two five-set thrillers in under 42 hours.

But the Serb, 37, revealed: "For the last couple weeks I have had slight discomfort in the right knee. It is wear and tear. Then, in the third game of the second set, I slipped and fell. That affected the knee.

"I didn't know whether I should continue or not. I got the medications.

"After the third set was done, I asked for a doctor to come and give me something extra. That was the maximum dose that kicked in. I





'I look forward to working with a very talented group of players and staff to develop a team that continues the club's tradition of success and makes our fans proud."

Chelsea put out a joint statement from Laurence Stewart and Paul Winstanley, their co-sporting directors, who said: "He has proven himself to be an excellent coach capable of delivering impressive results with an exciting and identifiable style. Enzo has deeply impressed us in our discussions leading up to his appointment.

"His ambitions and work ethic

he will be expected to deliver align with those of the club." Maresca beat the likes of Kieran McKenna and Thomas Frank to the Chelsea job and is regarded as someone from the Pep Guardiola coaching model.

Chelsea also wanted Maresca because of his ability to work and develop young players, including Cole Palmer, 22, and Romeo Lavia, 20.

The Londoners expect another busy summer of ins and outs, but Maresca will work within the club structure while having a say on transfers.



Trent divides opinion... but he's too good to be a bit-part player

IT is almost six years to the day since Trent Alexander-Arnold made his England debut, being handed his first Three Lions jersey by Prince William the day before a friendly against Costa Rica at Elland Road.

Since then, on the international stage, it has been far from regal progress for one of the most talented players of his generation.

Åt club level, he has collected winners' medals in the Champions League, the Premier League, the FA Cup, the EFL Cup, the FIFA Club World Cup and the UEFA Super Cup.

The extent of his influence on the Liverpool team of Jurgen Klopp's era cannot be overstated. But four months shy of his 26th birthday, Alexander-Arnold has only 24 England caps.

He has appeared in only two tournament games, both numbingly dull contest to

Salmon Good Food daily recipe to collect

Creamy salmon, leek & potato traybake

Nestle leeks, potato and capers around salmon fillets to make this easy traybake for two. It's great as a midweek meal, or for a more romantic occasion

DM1ST

Ingredients

- 250g baby potatoes, thickly sliced
- 2 tbsp olive oil 1 leek, halved, washed and sliced
- 1 garlic clove, crushed 70ml double cream
- 1 tbsp capers, plus extra to serve 1 tbsp chives, plus extra to serve 2 skinless salmon fillets mixed rocket salad, to serve
- (optional)

Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/ gas 6. Bring a medium pan of water to the boil. Add the potatoes and cook for 8 mins. Drain and leave to steam-dry in a colander for a few minutes. Toss the potatoes with 1/2 of the oil and plenty of seasoning in a baking tray. Put in the oven for 20 mins, tossing halfway through the cookina time.

> Meanwhile, heat the remaining oil in a frying pan over a medium heat. Add the leek and fry for 5 mins, or until beginning to soften. Stir through the garlic for 1 min, then add the cream, capers and 75ml hot water, then bring to the boil. Stir through the chives.

Q Heat the grill to high. Pour the Creamy leek mixture over the potatoes, then sit the salmon fillets on top. Grill for 7-8 mins, or until just cooked through. Serve topped with extra chives and capers and the optional salad on the side.
