**■** by JERRY LAWTON HEROIC Rob Burrow has left a heartbreaking final message, declaring: "Every day is pre-cious. Don't waste a moment."

The rugby star, who died aged 41 on Sunday after battling motor neurone disease, recorded the touching words using a special voice machine.

He said: "I hope one day we find a cure and live in a world free of MND.

"By the time that you watch this I will no longer be here. I am just a lad from Yorkshire who got to live out his dream of playing Rugby League.
"As a father of three young children I

would never want any family to have to go through what my family have since

my diagnosis.
"I hope I have left a mark on the disease. I hope it shows to live in the moment. I hope you find inspiration from the whole story.

'My final message to you is whatever your personal battle be brave and face it. Every single day is precious. Don't waste a moment. In a world full of adversity we must still dare to dream.

"Rob Burrow, over and out." The former Leeds Rhinos and Great Britain ace recorded the message for a 30-minute BBC documentary. It is understood his wife Lindsey was by his side as it was made.

The film was shot by BBC Breakfast and shown on BBC One last night and a longer version will be on BBC iPlayer.





Britain basked in temperatures of up to 24C at the weekend, raising hopes sunshine was here to stay.

But forecasters warned it was only "a taste" as wet, windy and cooler weather is on the way over the coming weeks.

Brits will have to wait until the last week of June just before polling day - for a prolonged period of settled sun.

But when it arrives it


# 'Waste' of Savile inquiry

# BRIT BIRDS GROW LONGER PECKERS

BRITAIN'S great tits are ■ by NADEEM BADSHAH getting bigger - from gorging on gardeners'

Our birds are outgrowing their continental cousins due to their diet, say boffs.

The UK species have longer beaks because of bird feeders. The average Brit great tit has a 0.3mm longer pecker, Oxford University

experts found.
Prof Robin May, of Gresham College, said: "The British put out more wild bird feed in their gardens than the rest of Europe put together and Europe is a big place.

"This is driving evolution.

In hundreds of years we may end up with two distinct populations in Britain and Europe."

Brits spend twice as much on bird feeders as folk in mainland Europe.

Uni researchers have been measuring the beak sizes of great tits in Wytham Woods, Oxon, for 0 years.

And they found those with longer ones were more successful at re-

producing in the UK.



# jerman football race row

# **CALL FOR MORE** HITE PLAYERS'

GERMAN football has ■ by JERRY LAWTON been plunged into a race row days before Euro 2024 kicks off.

The tournament hosts are reeling after a survey by a broadcaster found 21% of people want more white players in the national team.

In the poll, 17% thought it a "shame" that ex-Manchester City star Ilkay Gundogan, 33, is Germany's captain - due to his Turkish roots.

The poll threatened to cast a shadow over a major tournament being staged in Germany for the first time in 18 years.

Germany manager Julian Nagelsmann, 36, was stunned by the survey, which he blasted as "crap" and "racist". He

said it was "madness" by the public broadcaster.

Nagelsmann added: thought about it briefly and I have the feeling that we need to wake up a bit. There are people in Europe who've had to flee because of war, economic factors, environmental disasters, people who simply want to be taken in."
Bayern Munich star Joshua

Kimmich, 29, inset, said: "Football unites people of different skin colours and religions and that's what it's all about."

TV chiefs said 65% either disagreed or strongly disagreed with wanting more white players in the team.

THE vast majority of Brits will watch Euro 2024 from the comfort of their sofas rather than in a pricey boozer.

A solid 66% said they would be staying at home, with

just 26% watching games at the pub, a study found.

# ND ROB BURROW LEAVES HUGE LEGACY

SAM BURGESS paid tribute to Rob Burrow by hailing the rugby league great's "heart of a thousand lions".

Leeds Rhinos legend Burrow died aged just 41 on Sunday after a four-and-a-half-year battle with motor neurone disease.

Warrington boss Burgess (*inset*), speaking ahead of Saturday's Challenge Cup final with Wigan at Wembley, played alongside the brilliant scrum-half for England and Great Britain.

The Wolves head coach also faced Burrow numerous times in Super League, while Burgess'

own father Mark died from MND in 2007. Burgess, 35, said: "I'd obviously known Rob for a long time. It is a horrible disease.

"It's a really sad day. It's tragic news but we all knew it was coming at some stage – it's the reality of MND.

"And he's left such a remarkable legacy in the MND community and sport in general, not just in England but across the globe.

"For that, many people will be forever in debt to him. That legacy will no doubt continue

to grow.

"He had the heart of a lion on the field and a heart of a thousand lions off it. I'm proud to call him a friend and wish all his family and friends the best."

Burrow was scrum-half when Burgess made his Great Britain debut in 2007, announcing himself on the biggest stage with a famous hit on New Zealand's Fuifui Moimoi.

And the pair were also in tandem when Burgess first appeared for England against France the following year plus Burgess' only previous Wembley appearance – a last-minute 2013 World Cup semi-final loss to New Zealand.

He said: "I also made my Super League debut for Bradford Bulls against Rob. He kicked the

Asked what Burrow was like, he said: "A cheeky little bugger. He was great fun to be around, a great character and great competitor.

"He defied the laws of physics on the field half everyone else's size and weight but still caused everyone problems. "To be able to do that you have to have a level

of cheekiness and personality. That was Rob."

Burrow won the Challenge Cup twice with Leeds in 2014 and 2015. There will be a minute's silence on Saturday ahead of the men's and women's finals.

Burgess said: "Everyone will try and represent Rob in a great fash-ion, not just us. Let's get a sold-out crowd, get it full and make it a spe



# Pass master rent wort central role

# KOP ACE CAN PROVIDE SPARK

IT is almost six years to the day since Trent Alexander-Arnold his **England** made debut, being handed his first Three Lions jersey by Prince William the day before a friendly against Costa Rica at Elland Road.

the Since then, on international stage, it has been far from regal progress for one of the most talented players of his generation.

At club level, he has swept all before him, collecting winners' medals in

Champions League, the Premier League, the the FA Cup, the EFL Cup, the FIFA Club World Cup and the UEFA Super Cup.

The extent of his influence on the Liverpool team of Jurgen Klopp's era cannot be overstated.

But four months shy of his 26th birthday, Alexander-Arnold has only 24 England

But in truth, it was all a bit pedestrian and Alexander-Arnold was far from faultless.

And it would have been more encouraging to see him make his own occasional forays forward rather than staying in a quarter-backing role as he did in the first half.

For the first 15 minutes of the second half, he was more advanced - and a little more effective.

He was certainly not overadventurous but you would guess Southgate is not a great fan of over-adventure.
