

Tippers fix plan

LABOUR will force fly-tippers who blight the countryside to join "clean-up squads". Shadow environment

secretary Steve Reed promised the party would fix issues including the housing crisis and what he said was a rural crime epidemic.

He pledged Labour would increase police patrols in towns and villages, adding: "We'll force offenders who dump rubbish to join clean-up squads."

'Get real on debt'

LABOUR and the Tories are "avoiding the reality" that their plans lock them into "sharp" spending cuts post-election, a think tank warned.

The Institute for Fiscal Studies said neither appeared "serious about the underlying principle of getting debt falling".

It said forecasts suggest whoever is chancellor in the autumn will be "fortunate" to meet the fiscal rule of getting debt on a downward path between 2028 and 30.

The move is part of Government efforts to counter threats during the General Election campaign.

An estimated 6,000 candidates are expected be registered by Friday's deadline for the election on July 4.



STIs on the rise

SEXUALLY transmitted infections are on the rise.

There were 401,800 diagnoses of STIs in England last year – up 4.7% from 2022, UK Health Security Agency data showed. Gonorrhoea diagnosis

rose 7.5% in the same period and infectious syphilis diagnoses surged 9.4%.

Chlamydia diagnoses remained stable but local government chiefs say the rise in all STIs shows the need for a 10-year strategy to tackle the cases.


JAMES Bond has been voted the best-dressed character in TV and movie history.

Chinese support to Russia, the war will last longer. "Russia, using Čhinese influence in the region,

does everything to disrupt the peace summit. "Regrettably this is un-

fortunate that such a big independent powerful country as China is an instrument in the hands of Putin."

<u>Sperm `swimming</u> <u>slower' is blamed</u> <u>on sluggish fellas</u>

SPERM may have become as lazy as the men who produce them, boffins have found.

Academics had believed counts were dropping across the planet resulting in a slow down in the birth rate.

But new research shows levels may not have dropped. Instead – like many of the blokes who produce them – sperm just cannot be bothered to move.

Experts blame "changes in working patterns, diet and levels of physical activity" since lockdown for sperm stopping swimming. That means they are **by JERRY LAWTON**

That means they are simply not trying as hard to fertilise eggs.

fertilise eggs. Researchers analysed data from 6,758 Danish men applying to be donors at the world's largest sperm bank Cryos International.

The study by the universities of Manchester and Queen's in Kingston, Canada, published in the journal Human Reproduction, showed the average sperm concentration has not significantly changed in the past six years. But their ability to swim,

or motility, has unexpect-

edly dropped. Professor Robert Montgomerie said: "This decline roughly corresponds to the onset of the worldwide Covid-19 pandemic.

"While there's no evidence to suggest the virus is directly affecting sperm, we speculate whether the widespread lockdowns may have led to changes in working patterns, diet and levels of physical activity which we already know can impact sperm motility."

BOOZING on a plane could be deadly, boffins have warned.

Researchers found drinking alcohol before falling asleep can put "considerable" strain on the heart and risks "fatal" consequences.

The common cocktail of booze mixed with low air pressure and oxygen levels can raise passengers heart rates while lowering the amount of oxygen in their blood – even if they're fit and healthy.

Boffins have now urged travellers to refrain from downing booze during their flight and opt for non-alcoholic beverages instead, especially if they're travelling long-haul.

£130 worth of coins. She said: "We just want to save our fish because we love them, and our customers love them."





AS top footballer Megan Tinsley watched the drama of Christian Eriksen's pitch col-lapse on live TV during Euro 2020, she thought: "That could happen to me!'

The Danish midfielder suffered a cardiac arrest during the game against Finland – but thanks to fast medical attention, he went on to make a complete recovery.

Already playing as a defender for Derby County Women, Megan knew she was also at a higher risk of having a hear attack on the pitch.

The star was diagnosed with atrial septal defect – a condition in which there is a hole between the two collecting chambers of the heart - at the age of three.

She had successful surgery two



years later, which doctors were confi-dent had fixed the issue, though she was left with an irregular heartbeat. Megan says: "I had a lot of check-

ups but when I was 15, they signed me off as being fit." In the meantime, she had become a

talented footballer, at first having no problems with her ticker.

But soccer legends like Erikson having heart issues did make Megan won-der if she could be affected too.

She says: "It made me think, 'I'm in a more vulnerable position' because of my heart history. "I'm at a higher percentage for peo-

ple to have a heart attack on the pitch." Then during the 2021/2022 season the left-back started having chest pains while playing.

She explains: "They'd come on ran-domly. At first, I brushed it off and thought it's a stitch or indigestion.

heart beat eight times in two seconds. "It's not clear what might be causing my pain, but there might be an issue in one of the chambers of my heart."

Since then, she has been cleared to play in the 2023/2024 season, but Megan has been fitted with an implantable loop recorder under the skin in her chest to monitor her heart that

means I now feel safer playing". Now, with other football icons affected by heart problems, she's backing the Every Minute Matters campaign with Sky Bet and the British Heart Foundation to recruit 270,000 people to learn life-saving CPR over the next 12 months.

There are more than 30,000 out-ofhospital cardiac arrests in the UK each year.

She says: "If you don't understand how to do CPR, you might lose some-body you love."

Megan has been back playing with Derby and says: "I'm really thankful my heart problems have not forced me to retire from the sport I love.





Preston rose to Challenge

HE WAS the flying winger nicknamed Bond who had a licence to thrill for Wigan yet still can't believe his Wembley feat.

Mark Preston scored twice in their famous 1990 Challenge Cup final win over Warrington.

But he admits feeling like an imposter in a side littered with some of rugby league's greatest-ever stars.

However, the prolific wideman with pace to burn was undoubtedly the real deal, as the club chalked up the third of eight successive Cup final victories

England B rugby union international Preston amassed 57 tries in just 77 games for Wigan after crossing codes from Fylde in 1988 *(below)*.

And, as they prepare to meet Warrington at Wembley again for only the second time on Saturday, none is more cherished than that brace 34 years ago.

Preston, 57, recalled: "It was a pinch yourself moment. I was a season-ticket holder at Wigan as a kid going along to Central Park week in, week out with my dad.

"The next thing I'm signing for the club I love and playing with players I used to worship from the terraces. At times I thought how the hell am I in this team?' It was full of superstars. And me!

Shaun Edwards, Andy Gregory, Ellery Hanley, Denis Betts. Andy Goodway - incredible. "And Ďean Bell. The best centre I ever played with. "He took all the big hits and made all the big hits. As a winger, I was well looked after by him. But Wembley was

just a great memory." Preston, sold to Halifax for £50,000 in 1991, was dubbed Bond by the legendary Joe Lvdon.

He explained: "When I signed, a few players, like Ellery and Shaun, were full-time but not many.

So we trained in the evening and I'd come straight from working as an insurance underwriter. I always had a suit on and it was Joe [Lydon] who

said: "F***** hell, it's Bond again!" "I'm on the Wigan past players group with Shaun Wane and all the lads and they all still call me Bond. It's just stuck."

After racing 75 metres for a stun-ning first-half try against Warrington, Preston finished off one of Wembley's all-time great scores when adding his second in a 36-14 triumph.

He admitted: "It was an amazing try. Shaun Edwards, who had a broken cheekbone for most of the game, picked up a loose pass in our 20, Andy Goodway sent on to Steve Hampson who broke, then Ellery took it on and Shaun again.

"Mike Gregory came up with an unbelievable cover tackle after he'd run about 70 metres. But Shaun must have known I was there, flipped it inside and fell over the line. When I watched it afterwards I realised how

good a team try it was. "It won Eddie Waring's Try of the Year. I've still got the little trophy. And I

didn't really do anything!" Preston added: "The one disappointment when I really reflected on Wembley was the fact John Monie took me off and put Bobbie Goulding on.

No one had ever scored three tries at Wembley. I'm not saying I would have.

"But I might have had a shout and you'd have almost been guaranteed the Lance Todd Trophy, regardless of how well you'd played. It didn't matter – we'd won the cup." Former All Black

Frano Botica ar-rived ahead of the following season, though, ousting Preston off his left flank and into the reserves.

A few months later, he moved onto Halifax, and not long after that another electric union convert by the name of Martin Offiah joined the Wigan machine.

IF Novak Diokovic had converted a set point in the second-set tiebreak in last year's Wimbledon final, he would have completed a calendar Grand Slam.

And the Serbian superstar would already have set a new record of 25 Major singles titles.

But from a memorable 2023, the soon-to-be deposed world No.1 has suffered a 2024 to forget. He could be facing the beginning of the end of

his amazing career. Even his famed powers of recovery will be tested by the torn medial meniscus he suffered in his right knee while beating Argentina's

Francisco Cerundolo. Now, with the next generation winning Majors, there is a real possibility he will never break the record of 24 Grand Slam singles titles he has shared with Margaret Court since winning the US Open last year.

Last September it only seemed a matter of time before he became statistically and indisputably the

greatest player of all time. Yet there have since been big changes on and off the court for ne controversial star.

In November, he split with his

long-time Italian agent Edoardo Artaldi, then with his coach Goran Ivanisevic in March and his fitness trainer Marco Panichi in April.

His domination of the Australian Open ended with a semi-final defeat to Jannik Sinner, he lost to world No.123 Luka Nardi at Indian Wells and pulled out of the Miami Open claiming he needed to balance his 'private and professional schedule". Getting injured by a water bottle falling out of a fan's backpack, before losing in Rome, summed up

his strange season. Djokovic entered the French Open without a tournament win to nis name for only the second time in 18 years and in his pre-tournament press conference here, he admitted: I don't want to open Pandora's Box and talk about things. What has happened, happened, and it's in the past."

Now his future is about getting fit. Taylor Fritz left court in a wheelchair at the French Open in 2021 after suffering the same injury, underwent surgery and recovered in time for Wimbledon. He was 23.

Djokovic is now 37. His former coach Niki Pilic said: "Wimbledon and the Olympics are coming up, and he wants gold in Paris. Why would he risk hurting his knee even more?'

The Serb's withdrawal in Paris guaranteed the world No.1 spot for Italian star Sinner, during his 6-2 6-47-6 win over Grigor Dimitrov.

Sinner now faces Carlos Alcaraz in the semi-finals after the Spaniard secured a 6-3 7-6 6-4 win over Stefanos Tsitsipas.

Iga Swiatek thrashed Wimbledon champion Marketa Vondrousova 6-0 6-2 yesterday to set up a last-four clash with Coco Gauff, who beat Ons Jabeur 4-6 6-2 6-3.

And whatever happens over the next month or so, Trippier has already made special memories, having led out the Three Lions on his home turf. He said: "It was a very special night,

"He's walked out with me with Newcastle before, but never with England. It was a great experience for him, and I managed to sneak him into the dressing room after the game." And while he was in Newcastle,

Southgate joy as Trent finally fits bill for Lions

GARETH SOUTHGATE knows more than most how Trent **Alexander-Arnold** remains one of England's most unfulfilled talents of modern times.

Alexander-Arnold might have enjoyed huge success at club level in re-cent seasons, after helping Liverpool win their first league title in 30 years as well as the Champions League.

But the 25-year-old has experienced nothing but frustration when it comes to the Three Lions.

Alexander-Arnold made his England debut against Costa Rica at Elland Road in 2018 ahead of the World Cup - and was presented his shirt by Prince William.

But since then he has gone on to win just 23 more caps, despite being hailed as one of the best talents in English football

Alexander-Arnold made just one appearance as England reached the semi-finals in Russia, then missed the entire Euro 2020 tournament due to a thigh injury suffered in the build up.

He was included in the squad for the last World Cup in Qatar in 2022, but once again made just one appearance, as a substitute against Wales in the group stage.

Alexander-Arnold has resembled a spare part at times when it comes to England.

To make matters worse, critics have questioned his defending at right-back at the highest level, leaving him behind Kyle Walker and Kieran Trippier in the pecking order.

But since moving into a midfield role with Liverpool, he has taken his game to a new level, something he continued to

do in Monday's 3-0 warm-up win over Bosnia and Herzegovina at St James' Park.

Alexander-Arnold capped an impressive display with a stunning goal - and Southgate reckons the Scouser is learning to love being in England colours again.

He said: "Firstly, he is enjoying play-ing in an England shirt. "He has had a difficult

international career in that, because of the strength in depth in the area, we haven't always been able to give him the amount of football that his talent deserves.

"But we have always been trying to find a way to do that, and he knows that and he appreciates that, so it is lovely to see him score, have that moment and play with that confidence for England."

Älexander-Arnold finished the game at right-back. and Southgate knows he will need such versatility to stand a chance of leading England to this Euros glory

(with Alexander-Arnold in midfield). It is a role he is discovering. "He is hungry to learn, and has been

since I talked to him about playing it a year or so ago. "And equally, what we saw in the

last half-an-hour is an important option for us as well.

"We are going to have different chal-lenges in this tournament, and we are going to have to have different ways of solving problems that teams pose us.

Alexander-Arnold will be named in Southgate's final squad of 26 for the Euros, but has been warned he faces a battle to make it into the starting XI. Declan Rice is guaranteed to be on the

summer. He said: "We were very pleased team sheet, and Southgate admits he has to find the right balance.

He added: "That is the unknown, because obviously with (Conor) Gallagher and (Kobbie) Mainoo, you know exactly what they can and what they can't do.

None of these players can do everything, so you are trying to work out what is the right balance.

"Declan is going to be in there, so what is the balance with him? That could be different for different games.

"I think we will play against a back five at certain times and we have got some good options, both what we start with, but also what we can adapt the team to during matches.
