**Man attacks ex-wife, children; arrested**

**Gurgaon:** A man was arrested for allegedly attacking his ex-wife and their two children in a village here, the police said on Wednesday. The accused was allegedly upset with his wife for divorcing him and had bought a shroud before the attack, they said. On Monday night, information was received about an attack on a family in Bhingarh Kheri village here. A police team rushed to the spot and found that the woman and her two children were attacked by her ex-husband Chhatarshal Tomar, a resident of Laxman Vihar Phase-2, the police said. According to a complaint filed by the ex-wife of the accused, Tomar barged into her house at around 8:45 pm on Monday and attacked her. "He started shouting that today he had made all arrangements to kill me and both our children. My son caught Chhatarshal from behind while my daughter held his hand... I immediately called the police who saved us," the complaint stated. Tomar was arrested and an FIR was registered against him. A pistol, two magazines, a sharp knife, a plastic bag, a backpack, a screwdriver, a packet of red chilli powder and a shroud were recovered from him, they said. ACP Varun Dahiya said during interrogation, Tomar told police that the victim divorced him in 2019 and had been living separately with their children ever since. — PTI

**CM Mann meets Kejriwal in Tihar**

**New Delhi:** Punjab chief minister Bhagwant Mann on Wednesday met the AAP supreme Arvind Kejriwal in the Tihar jail in Delhi and discussed the party's performance in the just-concluded Lok Sabha elections, party sources said. It was the first meeting between Mr Mann and the Delhi chief minister after the Lok Sabha poll results which came out on June 4. Mr Kejriwal is lodged in the Tihar jail in the excise policy-linked money laundering case. In the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, the Congress dealt a blow to the ruling AAP and the Opposition BJP and SAD, winning seven of the 13 Lok Sabha seats in Punjab even as two independents registered a surprise victory. The AAP could manage to win three seats of Hoshiarpur, Anandpur Sahib and Sangrur as against the target of winning all 13 Lok Sabha constituencies in the just-concluded general elections. The AAP recorded a vote share of 26.02 per cent in the general elections, up from 7.38 per cent in the 2019 parliamentary polls.

**3 held for killing teen in Jahangirpuri**

**New Delhi:** Three youths were on Wednesday arrested for allegedly stabbing a 15-year-old boy to death in Northwest Delhi's Jahangirpuri area. Abhishek (20), Nathu (19) and Dev (18) were arrested from Bhalswa Dairy area, they said. On Tuesday evening, Manish Kumar was stabbed to death in Jahangirpuri's H Block. The accused told the police that about a month ago, Manish had slapped Abhishek's younger brother over a minor issue. So, to take a revenge, Abhishek hatched the plan to kill the teenager, the police said. The trio spotted Manish sitting alone in a park yesterday. They attacked him with a knife and Manish died on the spot, they said. The police said that they have recovered the knife, used in the commission of the crime, and blood soaked cloth from the possession of the accused.

Land Title Act introduced by the previous YSRC government. The third order will be to increase the social security pension from ₹3,000 to ₹4,000.

The fourth signature will be to initiate the process of skill census and the fifth order will be to establish Anna canteens that will supply food at cheap rates. During an informal meeting with the ministers at his residence, Mr Naidu appears to have told them that the portfolios will be allocated by Thursday.

Apart from Mr Naidu, 24 ministers took the oath of office and secrecy. Deputy CM Mr Kalyan, Mr Lokesh, Kinjarapu Atchannaidu, Kollu Ravindra and Nadendla Manohar were

among those who took oath. As per the BJP's stated policy of honouring its grass-root workers, the party nominated Satya Kumar as its representative in the Naidu Cabinet.

The new Cabinet is a mix of social groups under which Mr Naidu offered four ministerial posts to Kammas, three to the Reddy community, three to Kapus, two to BC Yadava, one each to SC Mala, SC Madiga, ST, Muslim minority, Arya Valsya, Balija, fisherman, Telugu Kapu, Koppula Veluma, Gowda, Settibailija and Kuraba communities.

This is the first time that Mr Naidu has inducted 17 new faces into the Cabinet. This is also the first Naidu Cabinet without his aide Yanamala Ramakrishnu.

The current makeup of the Cabinet shows the stamp of Mr Lokesh, who gave preference to the new faces and shunning many senior leaders.

Former vice-president M. Venkaiah Naidu, former CJI N.V. Ramana, Union ministers Amit Shah, J.P. Nadda, Nitin Gadkari, Ram Mohan Naidu, Pemmasani Chandra Sekhar, Chirag Paswan, Kishan Reddy, Ramdas Athawale, Maharashtra chief minister Eknath Shinde and state BJP president D. Purandeswari were among the politicians who attended the swearing-in ceremony.

Celebrities who attended the event include superstars Rajinikanth, Mr Chiranjeevi, popular actor and TD MLA N. Balakrishna.

**■ 'We will ask city police to deal with mafia if you cannot' SC raps govt: Have you taken any action on tanker mafia?**

Lambasting the Delhi government for inaction in curbing the tanker mafia and checking water wastage while people are suffering amid the heat-wave coupled with water scarcity, the Supreme Court on Wednesday asked the city administration what measures it has taken against them.

The apex court expressed its ire and said, "Why were false statements made before this court? Water is coming from Himachal Pradesh then where is the water going in Delhi? There is so much spillage, tanker mafias, etc. What measures have you taken in this regard... People are suffering, we are seeing visuals on every news channel. What measures have you taken to control water wastage if water scarcity is a recurring problem in summers?"

A vacation bench of Justices Prashant Kumar Mishra and Prasanna B. Varale told the Delhi government it will ask the city police to take action against the tanker mafia if it cannot deal with them. "If the same water can be transported using tankers, why can't it be supplied through the pipeline?" the top court said, adding, "If there can be stringent laws to control the theft of electricity, why cannot there be laws to check water wastage."

The apex court said, "There is so much pilferage, transportation loss, and tanker mafia working. Have you taken any action against these....? The same water is coming through tankers but there is no water in the pipeline... We can see from the affidavit that these matters have been coming in 2018, 2019, and 2021."

"Every time this court says we can't do it, let it be done by the Yamuna Water Board (Upper Yamuna River Board). What measures have you taken to control water waste coming through the two barrages if this is a recurring problem? Please show us what action or FIR you have lodged against tanker mafias," it said.

Seeking to assuage the concern of the bench, advocate Shadan Farasat, appearing for the Delhi government, said action has been taken to prevent

**Atishi writes to L-G, alleges collusion of officers, mafia**

As the national capital grapples with a water crisis, Delhi lieutenant-governor V.K. Saxena has directed the Delhi police commissioner to ensure strict vigil and monitoring along the Munak canal to prevent any further theft of water by tanker mafia and to also catch hold of such persons who have been involved in such illegal activities in the past and take necessary legal action against such mafia elements.

He has also asked for a compliance report in this regard within a week.

Earlier in the day, Delhi water minister Atishi wrote to Mr Saxena demanding an inquiry into alleged collusion by senior officers with the tanker mafia and requested him to deploy an ACP-level police officer to patrol the stretch of Munak canal in the city to ensure that no illegal water filling activi-

ty happens there. "There is a need for an enquiry into potential collusion by senior officers in the Delhi government with the tanker mafia because it seems that there has been a deliberate and substantial reduction of the tankers deployed by the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) in the last one year," she claimed in her communication to the L-G.

Citing numbers, Ms Atishi said that in January last year, 1,179 tankers were deployed by the DJB and this number was 1,203 in June the same year. "However, this number was reduced to 888 in January 2024 without any approval from me. I repeatedly kept flagging the issue of grievances regarding water tanker shortage and asking the DJB CEO to increase the number of tankers, but he did not do so," she alleged. The minister said that she directed the chief secretary on March 14, April 3, and April 12 to increase the number of water tankers

advocate Abhishek Singhvi, also representing the Delhi government, said, "However, as against the 1,013 cusecs, the actual water received is varying between 800-900 cusecs."

In an affidavit, the UYRB has told the top court that Himachal Pradesh should prove it has been releasing 137 cusecs of unutilised water for Delhi pursuant to the June 6 directive of the apex court.

Senior advocate Shyam Divan, appearing for the Haryana government, claimed incorrect statements are being made.

**Neet row: NTA to move SC for pleas' transfer from HCs**

The National Testing Agency (NTA) will approach the Supreme Court seeking the transfer of petitions filed by Neet-UG candidates before several high courts over alleged random grant of grace marks, paper leaks, and anomalies in evaluating answers to certain questions, the Delhi high court was informed on Wednesday.

Meanwhile, Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Priyanka Chaturvedi wrote to education minister Dharmendra Pradhan on the issue.

A vacation bench of justice Neena Bansal Krishna, meanwhile, issued notice and asked the NTA to respond to four petitions filed by the national eligibility-cum-entrance test-undergraduate (Neet-UG), 2024, candidates raising these grievances.

Following in the footsteps of the Supreme Court, the high court also

refused to stay the counselling process.

The court granted the NTA counsel's prayer for time to respond to the petitions and listed the matter for further hearing on July 5.

At the outset, solicitor general Tushar Mehta told the bench that several pleas have been filed in seven different high courts relating to alleged irregularities in the conduct of the Neet-UG, 2024, examination and some are pending before the Supreme Court.

He said the NTA will soon file a transfer peti-

tion in the apex court to consolidate all the pleas.

"We are filing transfer petitions in the Supreme Court because there is a likelihood of conflicting views by different high courts. Could your lordship consider waiting for a week or two? We will file a transfer petition," Mr Mehta told the court.

The law officer said these petitions can be broadly categorised as raising the issues of the grant of grace/compensatory marks, alleged paper leaks, and anomalies in answers to certain questions.

**Bibhav moves HC for bail in Maliwal case**

Chief minister Arvind Kejriwal's aide Bibhav Kumar has approached the Delhi high court seeking regular bail in the case of alleged assault on AAP Rajya Sabha MP Swati Maliwal.

The bail plea is likely to be listed for hearing before a vacation bench of the high court on June 14.

Mr Kumar, who was sent to 14 days judicial custody on May 31, has been accused of assaulting Ms Maliwal on May 13 at the chief minister's official residence.

A trial court in Tis Hazari had on June 7 refused to grant him bail, saying he was facing "grave and serious" charges and that there was an apprehension that he could influence witnesses.

In his plea before the high court, Mr Kumar said the trial court failed to consider the fact that his further custody was not required as all evidence has been collected by the investigating officer and statements of witnesses have also been recorded.

**Now bomb scare at museums, 2 hosps; nothing suspicious found**

The National Museum, Rail Museum, and two mental health institutes were among the institutions that have received bomb threat emails, officials said on Wednesday.

The officials said that nothing suspicious was found in the searches and later the calls were declared a hoax.

The emails were received by the National Museum in Kartavya Path, Rail Museum in Chanakyapuri, Gandhi Museum in Daryaganj, and several others stating that the bomb was planted in their prem-

ises, they said.

Two medical facilities— IHBAS located in Shahdara and Vimhans Hospital in Lajpat Nagar—have also received the threat e-mails containing the same contents, the officials said.

An officer said that after receiving the calls and information about these emails, the installations were checked by the bomb detection team, bomb disposal squad, fire officials, and the local police but nothing suspicious was recovered from any of the places.

Over the past one month, bomb threat emails have been received by many establishments, including

schools and hospitals in the national capital.

Delhi's Chacha Nehru Hospital received a bomb threat on April 30 while more than 150 schools got threats from a Russia-based mailing service company on May 1.

Twenty hospitals, the IGI Airport, and the Northern Railways' CPRO office in Delhi received bomb threats through emails from a Cyprus-based mailing service company on May 12.

Seven Delhi hospitals and the Tihar Jail received bomb threats from the same Cyprus-based mailing service company on May 14.

**2 women 4 others held over honeytrap scheme**

**Noida, June 12:** Six persons, including two women, were arrested in Greater Noida on Wednesday as the police cracked down on a gang extorting money from people after honey trapping them, officials said.

The gang operated a honey trap scheme and used female accomplices to lure victims through phone calls into meeting them in person, the police said. The gang, however, later threatened them with false rape accusations and extorted money through intimidation and violence, they said. Those held have been identified as gang leader Raj Chaudhary, Bhupendra Singh, Faizan Ahmed, Rahul Kumar, Sanjana Yadav and Rifa alias Rustam, the police said.

"The gang members duped gullible people. They would first befriend them over phone calls and then call them to some place on pretext of partying. They would later threaten to implicate them in case of rape, molestation. They also assaulted the victims to illegally extort money from them," said additional deputy commissioner of police (Greater Noida) Ashok Kumar Sharma.

"Six people, including two women members, of the gang have been arrested. They would use fake identities while introducing themselves to their targets. A Mahindra Scorpio car has also been impounded from their possession," he added.

The lid blew off the racket after a Moradabad-based man Sameer (name changed) approached the local Beta 2 police station with a complaint on Tuesday.

"On June 10, 2024, the accused lured Sameer through Rifa and called him to Pi-3 Roundabout for meeting. Sameer along with one of his friends fell into the trap set by the gang. Rifa informed her co-conspirators that the victims had arrived, prompting the mastermind, Raj Chaudhary, to proceed with the plan," said a police spokesperson.

"Raj Chaudhary, accompanied by his associates Sanjana Yadav, Bhupendra Singh, Faizan Ahmed and Rahul Kumar, arrived at the Pi-3 Roundabout in a Scorpio vehicle. They boarded Sameer's car, forcefully taking control and threatening both the friends," he added. — PTI

**9L tulips to be planted across city ahead of flowering season**

Delhi will be adorned with over nine lakh tulips during the flowering season this year. Nine lakh tulips will be planted this year, almost double the number of tulips planted in Delhi in the winters of 2023 (five lakh) and almost six times the number planted in 2022 (1.5 lakh tulips), a Raj Niwas official said on Wednesday.

"The increase in plantation of Tulips and other flowers across the city is in line with Delhi

lieutenant-governor V.K. Saxena's aim and the emphasis given on turning the National Capital into a 'City of Flowers'.

"In a meeting chaired by Saxena yesterday, a blueprint was prepared for sourcing and planting of Tulips in the upcoming flowering season. The meeting was attended by the horticulture departments of various civic and government agencies," the official said.

In the meeting, L-G was informed that the New Delhi Municipal Council

(NDMC) would procure 3.25 lakh Tulips while the DDA (Delhi Development Authority) will procure four lakh tulips this year, he said.

Other civic and green agencies will purchase Tulips from NDMC and DDA, as per their requirements. Nearly 2.5 lakh Tulip bulbs would also be received from the CSIR-Institute of Himalayan Bio-resource Technology in Palampur and other centres where NDMC had sent the harvested tulip bulbs from Delhi for further regeneration, he added.

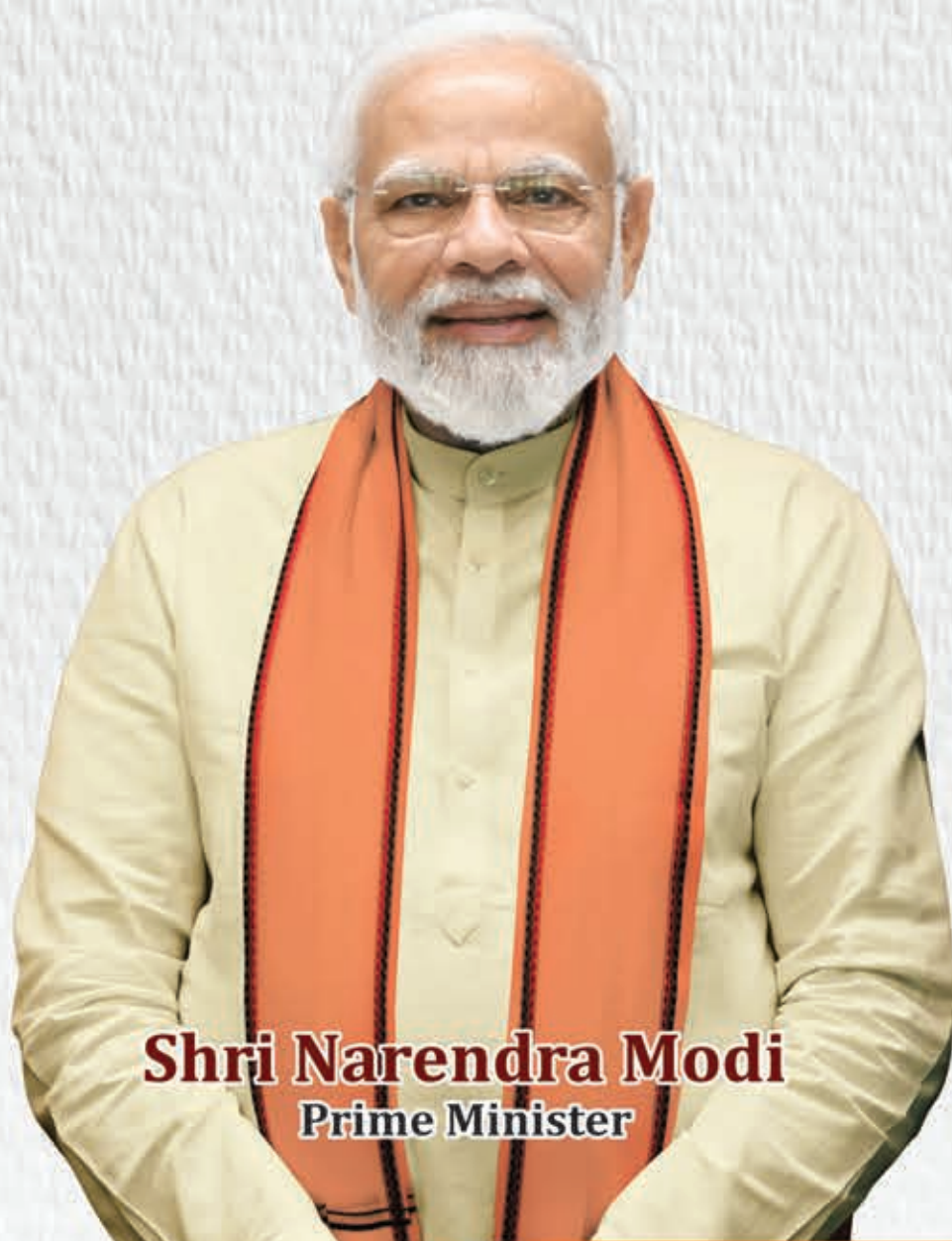

Woman gets death penalty for murder

**Bhopal:** A local court in Madhya Pradesh's Rewa district has sentenced a 24-year-old tribal woman to death after convicting her in the murder of her mom-in-law. Kanchan Kol, a resident of Atraila village under the Mangawa police station limits, was accused of murdering her 50-year-old mother-in-law Saroj Kol by stabbing her more than 95 times with a sickle over a minor tiff two years ago. Local additional sessions court judge Padma Jatav sentenced her to death after convicting her in the case, according to the additional public prosecutor in the case Vikas Dwivedy. Her son informed the police about the incident and then took her to the hospital where she was declared dead, Mr Dwivedy said. According to Mr Dwivedy, the slain woman's husband, Valmik Kol, was also a co-accused in the case, but he was acquitted due to lack of evidence.

Bird flu found in WB; 2nd case after 5 yrs

**Kolkata:** A four-year-old girl from West Bengal was diagnosed with bird flu last month — the second case of human infection with avian influenza A(H9N2) in India, according to the WHO. The first case was reported in 2019 in the country. On Wednesday the WHO said, “On May 22, the International Health Regulations National Focal Point for India reported to WHO a case of human infection with avian influenza A(H9N2) virus detected in a child resident of West Bengal state in India.” It added that the girl had exposure to poultry at home and in the surroundings but no one else had reported her symptoms. On May 1, the girl was discharged from the hospital with oxygen support. She has been stable at home, a state health department official said.

8 of family die in UP after truck overturns

**Hardoi, Uttar Pradesh:** A sand-laden truck overturned on people sleeping outside their house here early Wednesday, leaving eight members of a family dead, the police said. Superintendent of police Keshav Chandra Goswami said the victims were buried alive under the sand. Locals tried to remove the sand to rescue the family but in vain. A bulldozer was subsequently called to remove the sand and the bodies recovered. “Another five-year-old girl was injured in the incident and has been admitted to a hospital,” the officer said, adding the truck driver has been arrested. Chief minister Yogi Adityanath condoled the loss of lives in the incident. District magistrate Mangla Prasad Singh said the police has seized the truck and an investigation is being conducted. — PTI

Ganesh Ram Singkhuntia, Suryabanshi Suraj, Pradeep Bala Samanta, Gokulananda Mallik and Sampad Chandra Swain were administered oaths as ministers of state. Five-time Odisha chief minister and BJD president Naveen Patnaik graced the swearing-in ceremony. Sources said senior BJP leader and Ranpur MLA Surama Padhy is likely to be elected as the new Speaker of the Odisha Assembly. Dressed in his characteristic white robes with a royal blue half jacket, Mr Majhi walked over to and sought the blessings of Mr Modi, Union home minister Amit Shah, BJP president J.P. Nadda and a few other top leaders of the party. Before taking the oath as the new CM, Mr Majhi paid respect to the Odia leaders, who in the past played a crucial role in the formation of Odisha as a separate state on the basis of its language. As many as nine chief ministers, including Yogi Adityanath of Uttar Pradesh and Himanta Biswa Sarma of Assam, of BJP-ruled states, joined the oath-taking ceremony. The CM will hold his first Cabinet meeting later in the evening, where he is expected to announce some crucial decisions. Soon after the swearing-in ceremony, the new CM announced the reopening of the state secretariat's doors for journalists after a period of four years. The previous Naveen Patnaik government had banned the entry of journalists to the state secretariat in 2020 on the pretext of the Covid-19 crisis.

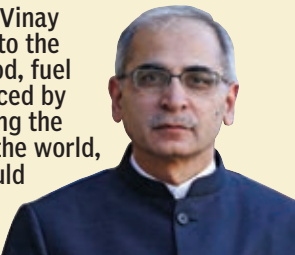
■ Modi set to attend G-7 summit, hold talks with Meloni Dialogue, diplomacy best option to resolve Ukraine conflict: India

Prime Minister Modi will on Thursday embark on his first foreign visit after assuming charge for the third term to Italy to attend the G-7 summit as a special invitee that will be held there from June 13 to 15 at Borgo Egnazia in Apulia.

Mr Modi will participate in the outreach session at the summit on June 14, foreign secretary Vinay Mohan Kwatra said at a special MEA briefing on Wednesday. At the outreach session, the PM is expected to raise issues about developing nations that are collectively referred to as the Global South. The Russia-Ukraine conflict and the Israel-Gaza conflict are expected to be discussed

FOREIGN SECRETARY Vinay Mohan Kwatra referred to the challenges regarding food, fuel and fertiliser security faced by the Global South following the outbreak of conflicts in the world, indicating that India would focus on such issues at the G-7 meeting



prominently at the summit. The foreign secretary also confirmed that India would attend “at an appropriate level” the peace summit (June 15-16) for the resolution of the Russia-Ukraine conflict that will be hosted by Switzerland, but added that the level of representation is currently being worked out.

India is not a member of the G-7 grouping, but Mr Modi has been regularly attending the G-7 summits

in the past few years following special invitations extended to India by the host nations. The G-7 grouping comprises seven of the “largest” advanced economies in the world — Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the United Kingdom, and the United States apart from the European Union (EU). On the sidelines of the summit, the PM will hold a bilateral meeting with Italian Prime Minister and the summit host

Georgia Meloni during which both leaders will review the entire gamut of bilateral ties and strategic partnership in areas, including trade and defence.

Asked about the Russia-Ukraine conflict and the position that will be taken by India at the summit, the foreign secretary said India has always been of the view that the issue can only be resolved through dialogue and diplomacy. He also referred to Mr Modi's earlier remark that “today is not an era of war”. Mr Kwatra also referred to the challenges regarding food, fuel and fertiliser security faced by the Global South following the outbreak of conflicts in the world, indicating that India would focus on such issues at the G-7 meeting.

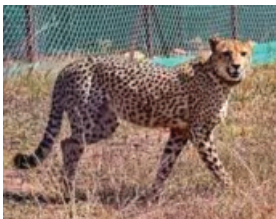

■ Move to help increase prey base for cheetahs 1,500 chitals to be relocated from 3 sanctuaries to MP's Kuno park

To improve the prey base in Kuno National Park (KNP) in Sheopur district in Madhya Pradesh to prevent cheetahs from straying into the nearby human habitations “in search of food”, the state forest department has decided to translocate around 1,500 chitals or spotted deer to KNP from other wildlife sanctuaries. The proposal to relocate chitals from three wildlife sanctuaries in the state to Kuno was cleared by the wildlife wing of the state forest department on Wednesday, sources said. Around 500 chitals each from Pench Tiger Reserve (PTR), Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve (BTR) and



Madhav National Park (MNP) will be relocated to KNP to improve the prey base for cheetahs.

KNP field director Uttam Sharma on Wednesday confirmed that chitals from other wildlife sanctuaries are being shifted to Kuno.

The move to improve the prey base in KNP comes in the wake of cheetahs found to be straying into the human habitations in the periphery of the park and the neighbouring state of Rajasthan, frequently.

The felines have also killed prey such as cattle and goats in these areas.

Mr Sharma, however, dismissed the contention that cheetahs moved out of the core area of KNP because of a declining prey base.

“The prey base in Kuno National Park is sufficient. The main prey of cheetahs in KNP is chital. Cheetah is the fastest animal in the world and moves in vast areas,” he said.

A few months ago, around 1,000 chitals were translocated to KNP from other wildlife sanctuaries.

In the first-ever inter-continental translocation of carnivores, eight cheetahs from Namibia were shifted to KNP in September 2019 under the cheetah introduction project.

Monthly stipend by Assam govt to curb early marriage

Scheme for all students from Class 11 to graduation

Assam chief minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Wednesday said that his government has designed a scheme to delay the early marriage of girl students by providing monthly stipends to all unmarried girl students from Class 11 to graduation. The scheme will be applicable for married as well as unmarried girl students in post-graduation over the next five years.

Mr Sarma said the scheme, “Nijut Moina”, was approved by the Cabinet, which has estimated that ₹1,500 crores would be required in five years to give the incentives to around 10 lakh girls.

“A married girl will not get the benefit. The only exception will be those married girls who are

The chief minister said that one of the prime objectives of this scheme is to delay the marriage of a girl so that she can be financially independent and start earning for herself and her family.

Asserting that the scheme will increase the gross enrollment ratio of girls substantially, he informed that all girls studying in Classes 11 and 12 will get ₹1,000 every month, it will be ₹1,250 for degree students and ₹2,500 for girls doing PG.

“Except for daughters of ministers, MLAs and MPs,

and those students studying in private colleges, all girls irrespective of their financial background will be included in the scheme. In June and July, during summer vacation, no money will be given. The stipend will be deposited to the bank accounts of the students for 10 months in a year,” he said.

Mr Sarma reiterated, “Those girls who were not able to continue their education due to various reasons, including financial hardships, will now be able to do so. We expect around 2,00,000 more girl students to enroll in educational institutions this year.”

The CM said the students who are involved in ragging, indiscipline, low attendance or perform poorly in their examinations will stop getting the stipend.

Monsoon sluggish as heat still grips North

**New Delhi, June 12:** A sluggish southwest monsoon on Wednesday covered large parts of Maharashtra, awaiting a fresh pulse to march across central and northern India, which continued to reel under intense heat conditions.

The IMD said monsoon could cover Odisha, coastal Andhra Pradesh and north-west Bay of Bengal during the next three to four days.

“The Bay of Bengal arm of the monsoon is weak and is awaiting a fresh pulse to take it forward,” an official said.

Heatwave conditions were observed on Wednesday in most parts of Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, UP, Jharkhand; in many parts of north Rajasthan; in some parts of Himachal, south Bihar, north Odisha and

in isolated pockets of Gangetic West Bengal.

Severe heatwave conditions were also observed in isolated pockets of Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Jharkhand and Gangetic West Bengal.

The maximum temperatures were in the range of 45-47°C over some parts of west Jharkhand, south UP, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, north Rajasthan.

The highest maximum temperature of 47.5°C was reported at Kanpur IAF in eastern UP.

Former earth sciences secretary Madhavan Rajeevan said after a normal progress, monsoon is going into a hiatus mode.

“Not much progress is expected in the next 8-10 days, thus delaying onset over north India,” he wrote on X. — PTI

65 ill in MP village after drinking polluted water

At least 65 people fell ill after allegedly drinking polluted water in a village in Madhya Pradesh's Bhind district, officials said on Wednesday.

The local people alleged that two people died after drinking polluted water.

However, officials denied the allegations that the two people, Brajraj Choudhury (80) and Asharam Visvas (75), died after drinking polluted water, saying that they succumbed to prolonged illness.

The incident took place

in the village of Fuph, around 20 km from district headquarters of Bhind.

The local block medical officer Siddharth Chouhan said that a number of people were admitted to the community health centre in Fuph over the last few days following complaints of vomiting.

Later, it was found that the polluted piped water, supplied in the three wards in the village, caused illness among the people.

Dr Chouhan said that he held discussions with the authorities of the local civic body on the matter.

In 1st Cabinet meet, Majhi reopens gates of Puri temple

In a significant development, Odisha's new BJP government on Wednesday announced that the four gates of the Jagannath temple will be reopened for devotees on Thursday.

The gates were mysteriously closed for over a year now for unspecified reasons. Despite repeated demands by the Opposition parties, the Naveen Patnaik government was sitting silent on the issue. Devotees had harrowing times to visit the temple and stand in the queue to have a darshan of Lord Jagannath and His siblings — elder brother Lord Balabhadra and Devi Subhadra.

This decision to open the temple was taken at the first Cabinet meeting, chaired by new chief minister Mohan Charan Mishra. The Cabinet met soon after Mr Majhi was administered the oath of office as the CM of Odisha.

The Cabinet also cleared a proposal to create a corpus fund of ₹500 crores for Srimandir.

The Cabinet also approved a proposal for the setting up of a Samrudha Krushi Committee for the holistic development of farmers.

The committee, among others, will suggest the execution of the BJP's poll promise to provide ₹3,100 minimum support price (MSP) per quintal of paddy to farmers.

2 terrorists killed in encounter in J&K

■ **Continued from Page 1** a deep ravine after the driver, who was reportedly hit by a bullet fired by the assailants, lost balance of the vehicle.

The sneak attack on the bus at Kanda near the Teryath village of Reasi's Poni area was carried out by two militants on June 9, the day when Narendra Modi was sworn in for the third term as PM at a grand ceremony in Delhi.

Additional director-general of J&K police Anand Jain told reporters that a newly infiltrating group of militants descended on Saida Sukhal village, close to the International Border (IB) with Pakistan, in the Kathua district at around 7.45 pm on Tuesday.

The terrorists entered a private house and asked a father-son duo who was present there for drinking water, which they refused. As they started fleeing, the gunmen opened fire over their heads and then forcibly entered another house, by which time the other villagers had informed the police about their presence in the area.

A resident Surinder Kumar said that he saw two strangers dressed in black and carrying assault rifles entering the village. “I was returning

home on a motorcycle

when a boy ran towards me to inform me that there were two gunmen around. I also saw them and heard them asking for water, but suspecting they were terrorists, I alerted the villagers. Sensing trouble, the terrorists opened fire, injuring one villager in the shoulder. This was followed by a blast,” he said.

Mr Jain said: “The villagers grew suspicious and slammed their doors on terrorists while a few raised alarm. The terrorists panicked, fired their rifles into the air and also aimed at a couple of villagers. A police party was already on the spot. One of the terrorists hurled a hand grenade towards them but was killed in the retaliatory fire.”

A second terrorist was killed in the gunfight with the security forces on Wednesday. The ADGP said that CRPF jawan Kabir Das, who was injured in the initial stage of the encounter, died in Hiranagar's sub-district hospital early Wednesday. He added that the civilian who was injured in the terrorist firing is “stable.”

The security forces have recovered grenades, IEDs, a US-made M4 carbine and other war-like

weapons from the slain terrorists.

While the efforts were on to neutralise the second militant at Saida, a group of three to four militants targeted a joint checkpoint of the J&K police and the Army in the Chattergalla area of eastern Doda district, injuring five soldiers and a special police officer, the officials said.

After the attack and exchange of fire with the security forces, the militants fled into nearby woods, the police sources said, adding that the J&K police, along with the Army and Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs), have launched a massive search operation in the higher reaches of Doda to “neutralise” them.

A senior police official said that the J&K police and the Army had stepped up their vigil in the area by setting up additional checkpoints and laying drop-gates after receiving reports about the movement of militants in the area.

“Over the past few days, we were getting information about the movement of terrorists through the intelligence branch of the district police and accordingly, temporary posts jointly manned by the Army and the police were

set up in the higher reaches along with check points on the (inter-state) road,” deputy inspector-general of police, Doda-Kishtwar-Ramban range, Shridhar Patil, told the media.

Asked about these back-to-back terror attacks, Mr Jain said, “It is our hostile neighbour who always tries to damage the peaceful environment in our country.”

Union minister Jitendra Singh said: “The terrorists are desperate and, as a result of the mounting pressure of the security forces in the Kashmir Valley, they are on the run and are trying to shift the focus of their activities to the Jammu region, but their design will not succeed.”

Lieutenant-governor Manoj Sinha said that his administration and the security forces “will not rest till terrorism and its supporters are eliminated from the J&K soil”.

While addressing a folk festival here, Mr Sinha said, “The anger among people (over the Reasi incident) is genuine. People should have faith in the great valour, courage and intelligence of the police and security forces. We will not rest till we root out terrorism and its supporters from the J&K soil.

Cong revival: Gogoi

**New Delhi:** Crediting Rahul Gandhi with the revival of the Congress, party MP Gaurav Gogoi says he not only provided "moral and philosophical" leadership to the party but also set the narrative for the Lok Sabha polls which was reflected in the results. Vidhan Sabha secretary Pradeep Kumar Dubey said, "Akhilesh Yadav as well as the newly elected party member from Faizabad Lok Sabha seat, Awadesh Prasad, have quit the membership of the UP Vidhan Sabha." Mr Prasad was elected to the UP Assembly from Milkipur constituency on a Samajwadi Party (SP) ticket. He sprang a surprise by defeating BJP's Lallu Singh in Faizabad, which includes the temple town of Ayodhya. Mr Yadav was the leader of Opposition in the UP assembly. The SP will now have to look for a new name in his place for the post of leader of Opposition in the Assembly. PTI

**Bengaluru:** The Criminal Investigation Department (CID) has issued a notice to senior BJP leader and former Karnataka chief minister B.S. Yediyurappa to appear before its probe team for an inquiry in connection with a POCO case registered against him, police sources said on Wednesday. Mr Yediyurappa is presently in Delhi, and he is likely to join the probe after he returns, sources close to him said. According to police, Mr Yediyurappa has been booked under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offence (Pocco) Act and Section 354 A (Sexual harassment) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) based on a complaint by the mother of a 17-year-old girl who alleged that he sexually assaulted her daughter during a meeting on February two this year. — PTI

**New Delhi, June 12:** The CPI(M) is not happy with its performance in the Lok Sabha polls despite a marginal increase in the number of seats, and it will do a serious introspection on how to close the gap between its ability to launch struggles on the ground and its power to win seats, party leader Sitaram Yechury has said. In an interview with PTI, the Communist Party of India (Marxist) general secretary said there is some disappointment in the party, as despite the Left organisations leading several mass struggles, its impact was not reflected in its electoral performance. Asked about the Bharatiya Janata Party's entry in Kerala, the only state ruled by Left parties at present, Mr Yechury said the Left's vote share is intact, but some of the votes of the Congress-led United Democratic Front (UDF) shifted towards the BJP. In the recently concluded LS polls, the Left parties increased their numbers in House to eight, from five in the 17th Lok Sabha. The CPI(M) won four seats, while the Communist Party of India (ML) Liberation won two each. — PTI

## J&K terror attacks: Intel grid at grassroots level to be tightened

Following back-to-back three terror attacks in Jammu and Kashmir in the last 72 hours, the sources in the security set up said that the intelligence grid at the grassroots needs to be strengthened further as well as the gaps in the border security need to be plugged in at earliest.

Security experts believe that human intelligence gathering in Jammu and Kashmir needed to be upgraded and gaps in the security architecture required to be plugged as much as possible.

In last three days, the terror attacks took place in Reasi, Kathua and Doda. It may be recalled that both Prime Minister

Narendra Modi and home minister Amit Shah took stock of the situation immediately after the Reasi attack on a bus carrying pilgrims on June 9. Soon after the terror

attack on Sunday, Mr Shah spoke to the lieutenant-governor and DGP of Jammu and Kashmir and warned that the culprits behind this dastardly attack will not be spared

and they will face the wrath of the law.

Noting that the local residents, especially in the border areas, are major assets for the intelligence collection, the sources further said that apart from the other intelligence inputs, the civilians' inputs needed to be scaled up to keep eyes on the infiltrators from the hostile neighbouring country.

The security experts have recently highlighted that the "lack of human intelligence" as one of the key factors that cripples the Central force's anti-terror operations in the in the J&K to hunt down the ultras, therefore, a well coordinated efforts are required to build the robust intelligence network and to fill the gaps in the security grid.

# 'If Modi can't stop terrorism, he has no right to be PM'

Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray on Wednesday hit out at Prime minister Narendra Modi over the terror attacks in Jammu and Kashmir saying if the latter cannot handle terror attacks, he has no right to be the Prime Minister again.

He claimed that nothing had changed in the northern state after the abrogation of Article 370. "Kashmir is burning, attacks are being carried out. Lives are being lost. Who is responsible for the terror attacks in Jammu and Kashmir? Where are those who have been speaking about Kashmir during the elections?" asked Mr Thackeray.

The former Maharashtra chief minister said the abrogation of Article 370, which provided special status to J&K, has made no difference in the territory. The legislation was revoked on August 5, 2019 — less than two months after PM

On June 9, when Modi took oath for the third time, terrorists opened fire at a bus carrying pilgrims to the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine in Katra. Ten people lost their lives while at least 41 people were injured.

# Pema Khandu re-elected Arunachal CM; oath today

Shah, Nadda will attend swearing-in ceremony

The BJP legislators on Wednesday re-elected Pema Khandu as the leader of BJP Legislature Party. The meeting of the BJP Legislature Party (BLP) was held in the presence of the party's two central observers - Ravi Shankar Prasad and Tarun Chugh.

the new Cabinet.

The swearing-in ceremony of the new government will be held at the Darbar Hall of Raj Bhavan in Itanagar.

The new government will take oath in presence of BJP national president J.P. Nadda, senior leader and Union home minister Amit Shah and party's national general secretary (organisation) B.L. Santosh, a BJP leader said on Wednesday.

Mr Nadda, Mr Shah, and Mr Santosh are expected to arrive in Itanagar on Wednesday evening.

Serving initially as the tourism minister in Nabam Tuki's Congress government, Mr Khandu's leadership trajectory soared following a constitutional crisis in January 2016 that led to the imposition of president's rule.

# SKM protests against Shivraj being picked as agri minister

**New Delhi, June 12:** The Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM) on Wednesday protested against the NDA government's decision to allocate the ministry of agriculture and farmers welfare to Shivraj Singh Chouhan and held him responsible for the killing of six farmers in Madhya Pradesh's Mandsaur in June 2017.

attacks and that the only way to prevent such incidents was for the Centre to reach out and engage in talks with Pakistan. "We

The terrorists are coming from across borders, and they will continue coming. Whichever government will be there tomorrow, will have to face the same thing."

Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut on Wednesday criticised

Union home minister Amit Shah over the terror attack in J&K, alleging that the BJP leader "was busy wiping out the Opposition". Mr Raut also claimed that during Mr Shah's tenure, the highest number of security forces and civilians were killed in J&K.

Earlier, the Trinamul Congress chief Mamata Banerjee had demanded a probe into the attacks in the Union territory.

# Govt at Centre formed with help of others, says NCP (SP) prez

## Pawar: Gone are days of one-man rule

**Pune, June 12:** NCP (SP) chief Sharad Pawar on Wednesday said gone are the days of one-person rule as the new government at the Centre could not have been formed by the BJP without the help of other parties.

"With the coalition government in place at the Centre, the Modi guarantee is now over, a change made possible by the power of the voters," Mr Pawar said, while speaking during a meeting in Pune's Purandara tehsil, a part of Baramati Lok Sabha constituency, where

he had come to review the water scarcity situation.

"Elections are over and a government has been formed (at the Centre). For the last 10 years, the government had been of one person, but now it has been freed from it (that system). This time, the government has been formed with the help of others," Mr Pawar said, adding that the situation was such that the government would not have been formed without the help of the chief ministers of Bihar (Nitish Kumar) and Andhra Pradesh (N

Chandrababu Naidu).

"The government has been formed with their help, which means gone are the days of one person running the government. It also means that Modi's guarantee, about which we used to hear, is over and power to end it (this guarantee) lies with you," the former Union minister said.

Mr Pawar asserted that the Lok Sabha election outcome showed that a similar result will be seen in the Maharashtra Assembly polls. "After the Lok Sabha poll results are

replicated in the state Assembly polls, I will give the reins of the state in your hands. The power in the state will come in the hands of our people and this power will be used to address critical issues and for that I need your cooperation," Mr Pawar said.

In the LS polls, the BJP won 240 seats, falling short of the 272 majority mark and needing the support of allies in the party-led NDA for government formation, a far cry from the 303 and 282 seats it had won in 2019 and 2014 Lok Sabha elections. — PTI

# MNS demands 20 seats from BJP in Maha polls

After giving "unconditional support" to Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Lok Sabha elections, Raj Thackeray-led Maharashtra Navnirman Sena has demanded 20 Assembly seats from the BJP for the upcoming state elections.

According to sources, one of the major seats demanded by Mr Thackeray is the Worli Assembly seat, which is currently represented by his nephew Aditya Thackeray, the son of Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray. Raj Thackeray's trusted lieutenant Sandeep Deshpande is the likely MNS candidate from Worli.

Majority of the seats demanded by the MNS are from Mumbai and Mumbai Metropolitan region (MMR).

In 2009, when it fought the Assembly polls for the first time, the MNS had won 13 seats in the Maharashtra

Vidhan Sabha. However, they now have only one MLA in the Assembly. In the Lok Sabha polls, Raj Thackeray had announced unconditional support for Mr Modi and also campaigned for the National Democratic Alliance's candidates. He even shared the stage with the PM at an election rally at Shivaji Park in Mumbai last month.

However, the MNS functionaries were upset over Raj Thackeray being not invited for the swearing-in ceremony of the Modi government. The party leaders accused the BJP of neglecting him.

# Sunetra Pawar likely to get RS nomination from Ajit camp

Sunetra Pawar, wife of Maharashtra deputy chief minister Ajit Pawar, is likely to be nominated to Rajya Sabha. A formal announcement will be made on Thursday. She will file her nomination on Thursday.

Ajit Pawar's son Parth Pawar is also being considered by the NCP. Other NCP aspirants are Chhagan Bhujbal, Baba Siddique and Anand Paranjape. Rajya Sabha by-election was necessitated after NCP Working president Praful Patel resigned, following his re-election to the Upper House of Parliament in February 2024.

NCP national president Ajit Pawar on Wednesday evening held a meeting with top leaders including state president Sunil Tatkar, Chhagan Bhujbal and Dhnanjay Munde.

An NCP insider said that Ms Pawar and her son Parth Pawar are the front-runners for the Rajya Sabha seat. "After taking into confidence all senior leaders, the party is likely to finalise the name Sunetra Pawar in the meeting," the NCP insider said.

Ms Pawar was defeated by her sister-in-law and Sharad Pawar's daughter Supriya Sule from the Baramati Lok Sabha seat in the recently held Lok Sabha election. Ms Sule won by a massive margin of 1,58,333 votes. Ms Sule had secured 7,32,312 votes, while Sunetra had received 573,979 votes.

Retail inflation eases to 12-mth low of 4.7%

CPI inflation under 5% for 3 consecutive months from March

MADHUSUDAN SAHOO NEW DELHI, JUNE 12

With the decline of food prices and kitchen items, India's headline retail inflation eased to a 12-month low of 4.75 per cent in May on an annual basis. According to national statistical office (NSO) data, rural and urban inflation rates are 5.28 per cent and 4.15 per cent respectively. "Inflation in the food basket was 8.69 per cent in May, marginally down from 8.70 per cent in April," the NSO data showed. The consumer price index or CPI inflation has now been under the 5 per cent-mark for three consecutive months starting this March. It has remained within the RBI's target range of 2-6 per cent since September 2023. "The spices category has seen a considerable



decline in year-on-year inflation. Inflation for clothing and footwear, housing, and miscellaneous groups has also decreased since last month," the data said. Meanwhile, India's

industrial production growth slipped to 3-month low of 5 per cent in April this year due to poor show by the manufacturing sector, though mining and power segments performed well. Factory out-

put growth, measured in terms of the Index of Industrial Production or IIP, was 5.4 per cent in March and 5.6 per cent in February 2024, according to data released by ministry of statistics and programme implementation. The previous low of IIP was recorded at 4.2 per cent in January 2024. For the fiscal 2023-24, the IIP growth was 5.9 per cent against 5.2 per cent in the preceding financial year. India's index of industrial production grew by 4.6 per cent in April 2023. As per the data, the mining output growth accelerated to 6.7 per cent in April. "The manufacturing sector's growth decelerated to 3.9 per cent in April. Power generation increased 10.2 per cent in April against a contraction of 1.1 per cent same month last year," the data showed.

India to remain fastest growing GDP, finds WB

India will remain the fastest-growing of world's largest economies, although its pace of expansion is expected to moderate, finds the World Bank. India will clock a steady growth of 6.7 percent per year, on average between FY2 and FY26. While retaining the GDP growth forecast for FY24 and FY25 at 6.6 per cent and 6.7 per cent respectively, the World Bank estimated the country to clock 6.8 per cent growth in FY26. This is slower than 7 per cent and 8.2 per cent growth achieved in FY22 and FY23 respectively.

This moderation is mainly due to a slowdown in investment from a high base. However, investment growth is still expected to be stronger than previously envisaged and remain robust over the forecast period, with strong public investment accompanied by private investment. Private consumption growth is expected to benefit from a recovery of agricultural production and declining inflation. Growth in industrial activity, including manufacturing and construction, was stronger than expected, alongside resilient services activity, which helped offset a slowdown in agricultural production partly caused by monsoons. Growth of domestic demand remained robust, with a surge in investment, including infra, offsetting a moderation of consumption growth as post-pandemic

pent-up demand eased. However, government consumption is projected to grow only slowly, in line with the government's aim of reducing current expenditure relative to GDP. In India, the fiscal deficit is projected to shrink relative to GDP, partly because of increased revenues generated by the authorities' efforts to broaden the tax base. The South Asian region's fiscal imbalances will slowly improve, although, apart from India, a reduction of fiscal deficits is expected to be smaller. According to the World Bank, inflation in the South Asian region has gradually declined from the peaks reached in mid-2022 as inflation in India has kept within the Reserve Bank's target range of 2 to 6 per cent since September 2023.

Better rain prospects to support wage growth

A drop in inflation and better monsoon rainfall is expected to support 6.5 per cent growth in real wages in FY25. The real wage growth in FY24 should have been around 3.5 per cent, according to India Ratings (Ind Ra). The support to real wage growth is expected to emanate from a drop in inflation and improved employment conditions

given an above-normal southwest monsoon rainfall for 2024, finds Ind Ra. It estimates that private final consumption expenditure (PFCE) demand is expected to grow 7 per cent in FY25. The average real wage growth during FY20-FY21 was negative 0.7 per cent. PFCE in the same period moved in tandem. Due to the negative base, the real wage growth in FY23 stood at 8.9 per cent and 12.6 per cent in FY22.

The wage growth of the non-financial private corporations moderated to 3.6 per cent in 3QFY24 after clocking over 6 per cent growth for 10 quarters, and stood at about 6 per cent in 4QFY24.

U.S. CURBS: EURO, DOLLAR TRADE HALTED BY RUSSIA

Moscow, Washington, Budapest, June 12: New US sanctions against Russia have forced an immediate suspension of trading in dollars and euros on its leading financial marketplace, the Moscow Exchange. The exchange and the central bank rushed out statements on Wednesday — a public holiday in Russia — within an hour of Washington announcing a new round of sanctions aimed at cutting the flow of money and goods to sustain Russia's war in Ukraine. "Due to the introduction of restrictive measures by the US against the Moscow Exchange Group, exchange trading and settlements of deliverable instruments in US dollars and euros are suspended," the central bank said. Earlier, the United States announced a raft of sanctions on Wednesday aimed at constraining Moscow's war in Ukraine while raising the stakes for foreign banks that still deal with Russia, ahead of G7 leaders' talks this week. "Hungary will not block Nato decisions on providing support for Ukraine but has agreed that it will not be involved," Prime Minister Viktor Orban said on Wednesday during a visit to Budapest by the Nato alliance's secretary general Jens Stoltenberg. Hungary has been at odds with other Nato countries over Orban's continued cultivation of close ties to Russia and refusal to send arms to Ukraine, with Budapest's foreign minister last month labelling plans to help the war-torn nation a "crazy mission". "Hungary made clear today that it will not block decisions by Nato which, although they differ from our rational assessment of the situation, are shared and advocated by the rest of the alliance," Orban said. The treasury department and state department's sanctions hit more than 300 targets, including entities in Russia and in countries like China, Turkey and the United Arab Emirates. Those designated include the Moscow Exchange and subsidiaries, a move set to complicate billions of dollars in transactions.

Join election pact against far right: Macron to rivals

Paris, June 12: French President Emmanuel Macron on Wednesday urged rival parties to join his electoral alliance against Marine Le Pen's far-right National Rally, while the conservative Republicans ditched their party chief for eyeing a far-right pact. The fast-moving political developments come after Macron's shock decision to call a snap parliamentary election in a few weeks' time. The vote could hand real power to Le Pen's party after years on the sidelines. In what amounted to a campaign speech, Macron on Wednesday defended his decision to call the snap vote, and urged parties on both sides of the political centre to join him in the battle against the hard right in the June 30 and July 7 elections. Macron, who ruled out quitting if his ruling alliance loses, called on "our compatriots and political leaders who do not recognise themselves in the extremist fever" to "build a new project ... a coalition to govern." In a sign of the political chaos that Macron's decision has unleashed, the Republicans party leadership on Wednesday decided to kick out their party

chief Eric Ciotti after he appealed for a poll alliance between his party's candidates and the RN. Macron described such an accord as a "deal with the devil". It would have ended the decades-long mainstream political consensus to block the far-right from power. Writing on X, Ciotti said the Republicans meeting had not followed protocol: "I am and remain the president of our political party, elected by the members!" he said. Macron called the election on Sunday after the anti-immigration, euro-sceptic RN came out on top in a vote for the European Parliament. The RN is expected to win 31% of votes in the first round national vote on June 30, while a left-wing alliance would get 28%, an Elabe poll on Wednesday showed. Macron's ticket is seen clinching 18%. Political commentators say the battle between the far right and left will determine who comes out on top in the legislative election, which will be decided in the second round on July 7. If the RN were to win a parliamentary majority, Macron would remain President for three more years. — Reuters

Chinese EVs face EU tariffs of 38%

Brussels, June 12: The European Commission notified car makers on Wednesday that it would apply additional duties of up to 38.1% on imported Chinese electric vehicles from next month, a move likely to draw possible retaliation from China. Less than a month after Washington quadrupled duties for Chinese EVs to 100%, Brussels said it would set tariffs of 17.4% for

BYD, 20% for Geely and 38.1% for SAIC over what it said were excessive subsidies. China's commerce ministry said it would monitor the development and resolutely take all necessary measures to safeguard the legitimate rights of Chinese companies. The EU provisional duties are set to apply by July 4, with the anti-subsidy probe set to continue until Nov. 2. — Reuters

Israel, Hamas guilty of sexual violence, finds UN's HR probe

Hamas official denies group presented new ideas for Gaza truce deal

Geneva, Doha, Cairo, Jerusalem, Beirut, Dubai, June 12: UN-backed human rights experts say in a report issued on Wednesday that Israeli forces and Palestinian militants engaged in sexual and gender-based violence during the first months of the Israel-Hamas war. Senior Hamas official Osama Hamdan denied on Wednesday that the Palestinian Islamist group had put forward new ideas for the US-backed proposal for a Gaza ceasefire, after US secretary of state Antony Blinken said it had suggested numerous changes. Hamdan, speaking to pan-Arab Al-Araby TV, also said Blinken was "part of the problem, not the solution" in the Gaza war. Lebanon's Hezbollah fired big barrages of rockets at Israel on Wednesday in retaliation for an Israeli strike which killed a senior Hezbollah field commander, escalating the conflict across the Lebanese-Israeli border. The Israeli strike in South Lebanon village of Souaiyya last on Tuesday killed three Hezbollah fighters alongside the senior field commander identified by Hezbollah as Taleb Abdallah, also known as Abu Taleb. A merchant ship issued a distress call after being struck in the Red Sea off Yemen, a security firm said on Wednesday, in what appeared to be the latest attack by Iran-backed Houthis rebels. The proposal outlined by US President Joe Biden envisages a truce and a phased release of Israeli hostages in Gaza in exchange for Palestinians jailed in Israel, ultimately leading to a permanent end to the war. The independent experts, in a detailed chronicle of events that have mostly been reported in the media, said Israeli forces and Palestinian militants committed war crimes, while Israel was also said to have committed crimes against humanity. Israel, which has refused to cooperate with the body and accused it of bias, rejected the allegations. The report, which covered the time between the Oct. 7 rampage and the end of last year, laid out a wide array of alleged rights violations and crimes by both sides. It said Israeli forces had committed forced starvation, murder or willful killing, collective punishment and intentional attacks on civilians, and that the military wings of Hamas and other Palestinian groups had performed killings and mistreatment of civilians and hostage-takings. It said that frequency, prevalence and severity of sexual and gender-based crimes by Israeli forces amounted to signs that some forms of such violence "are part of ISF operating procedures". Despite noting denials by Hamas' military wing of sexual violence against Israeli women, it said the experts had documented "cases indicative of sexual violence" against women and men. The expert panel was commissioned in 2021 by the UN-backed Human Rights Council to look into rights violations and abuses in Israel and the Palestinian areas it controls. Led by Navi Pillay a former United Nations human rights chief, they are independent experts and do not speak for the world body itself. Israel has refused to cooperate with the experts. Israel's diplomatic mission in Geneva responded that the report "outrageously and repugnantly attempts to draw a false equivalence between IDF soldiers and Hamas terrorists with regard to acts of sexual violence" and reiterating claims of anti-Israel discrimination. — Agencies

ISRAEL WITHHELD MEDICAL CARE, SAY PALESTINIANS

Gaza, June 12: Palestinians held in Israeli detention since the start of the war in Gaza said they faced systematic ill-treatment by prison authorities whom they accused of deliberately withholding vital medical treatment. Human rights groups and international organisations have alleged widespread abuse of inmates. They described abusive and humiliating treatment, including holding blindfolded, handcuffed detainees in cramped cages, beatings, intimidation and harassment. — Reuters

Imran nod for talks with govt

Islamabad, June 12: Pakistan's jailed former prime minister Imran Khan in an apparent U-turn has given a green signal for talks with the government to ease the ongoing political tension, days after refusing to have a dialogue with the toothless ruling coalition.

The change of heart came after the Supreme Court during a hearing of a case on changes to the country's graft laws observed that Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party should initiate talks with the government and resolve its issues in Parliament through dialogue.

Speaking to journalists outside the Adiala Jail where Khan is incarcerated, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf leader Gohar Ali Khan on Tuesday said that Khan has given the go-ahead for the talks with the government. He said the party would initially take its allies into

confidence but could also take a solo flight on the issue. "We told the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf founder that dialogue is necessary, as the distance is widening. He agreed with us (on this)," Gohar told the media outside the Adiala jail in Rawalpindi. — PTI

Andhra hopes high as Naidu starts record 4th term as CM

After one of the biggest electoral triumphs of his life, Nara Chandrababu Naidu, chief of the Telugu Desam Party, is set to begin a record fourth term as chief minister of Andhra Pradesh. And with his return to power, hopes are sky high in the beleaguered state, marked with little to no development, investment, job creation or infrastructure upgrade for the last five years or more.

After taking oath on Wednesday in the presence of political and cultural bigwigs, including his NDA partners, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, home minister Amit Shah, Union ministers Nitin Gadkari and J.P. Nadda, and former vice-president of India, M. Venkaiah Naidu, besides a galaxy of film stars including Tamil superstar Rajinikanth, and Telugu megastar K. Chiranjeevi, whose younger brother and Tollywood power star K. Pawan Kalyan is the boss of the Jana Sena Party, a crucial NDA ally, and a minister in the new Andhra Pradesh Cabinet, chief minister Chandrababu Naidu is all set to hit the ground running.

He is also the all-time longest serving Telugu CM, with the intense pressure of high expectations of over five crore people of Andhra Pradesh upon him. They would expect miracles from the former CEO of Andhra Pradesh, Inc., as he was called during his first two terms as CM of united AP, with a fair claim of having re-imagined and recreated Brand Cyberabad.

Mr Chandrababu Naidu, whose business friendly policies, proactive push to build Hyderabad into a global destination for software and pharma investments and rapid push for infrastructure-building during his first stint of nine years over two terms as CM of united AP between 1995 and 2004, was the first state CM and regional party leader to create a space in the post-liberalisation phase of Indian democracy to pursue economic reforms and investments-to-jobs creation as good politics. But he also suffered politically for his work.

Accused of ignoring rural and agrarian distress through the largely drought-prone stint, even as he brought Microsoft and Bill Gates to invest in their first-ever development centre outside the United States, as well as a plethora of other major software corporations, Mr Naidu was sent into a decade outside power, leaving the NDA. He remained in hibernation, between 2004 and 2014, during which time, his state was bifurcated into Telangana and AP, and the residual Andhra state had to lose Hyderabad.

Promising a more balanced tenure when he came to power as an NDA partner, backed by the electoral charisma of the then prime ministerial candidate, Narendra Modi, and Jana Sena chief Pawan Kalyan, Mr Naidu wished to put all his eggs in the basket of a new, greenfield capital of Amaravati, and yet again, lost power badly in 2019 to YSRC chief Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy.

A tenacious fighter with a never give-up attitude, Mr Chandrababu Naidu, suffering charges of insider trading and corruption, was then sent to prison by the Jagan Mohan Reddy government, but he came back, yet again, into the NDA fold and tasted exceptional electoral success.

In his fourth term, he will face several challenges, including rebuilding the infrastructure and financial health of his state, now tottering without its own capital for a decade, and having suffered a huge partisan divide as its new social reality. But the people of Andhra Pradesh have faith, reflected in the mandate they gave, that if anyone can turn things around, it is Nara Chandrababu Naidu who is equal to the task.

Neet: Key questions unanswered

There must be something seriously wrong with the conduct and granting of marks in the medical entrance test Neet-UG examination of 2024. Several irregularities were noted in its conduct, including the possible leaking of the question paper, wrong issue of different question papers to different sections of students in parts of India and many more questions hanging over the results. No wonder the Supreme Court decided to issue notice to the Centre as well as the National Testing Agency vested with the task of conducting the exam and correction of papers that lakhs of students take all over the country. It is the integrity of the testing system that is being doubted now after several egregious actions by the NTA.

With their whole career depending on their performance in the test to qualify for a medical education in dentistry and general medicine at the undergraduate level, student anxiety skyrocketed with the release of results.

The court has said that it might take extreme action like a retest if the anomalies are not properly explained. It is not often that students stand with placards decrying the exam system, but they are so alarmed by the glaring discrepancies in the test this year that they have been quite demonstrative about their grievances.

An unusual number of toppers — as high as 67 this time — as compared to just two last year and three on average in the last five years, grace marks awarded to 1,586 candidates on the grounds that there was “loss of time” in an offline test and 44 toppers getting grace marks despite getting an answer wrong because a Class 12 NCERT textbook had carried an inaccuracy were some of the glaring anomalies pointed out.

The testing agency and the government that has appointed it for the task of setting the question papers in confidential mode and putting them out to lakhs of candidates have much to answer and do it satisfactorily to convince the top court that injustice has not occurred because of the errors committed by the system. The problems are cropping up at a time when there is intense resentment against the national test in many states, especially in Tamil Nadu where a retired judge listed how Neet has altered the medical entrance landscape, favouring students from affluent families because 99 per cent of students passing the test needed to train at special tuition academies and putting the CBSE stream of education at an advantage over others. As the court said, NTA and the Centre have a lot to answer for.

It's time for New Gen to consolidate on ground

Now that the anti-BJP Opposition is back in strength in the 18th Lok Sabha after the Indian National Democratic Inclusive Alliance parties won 232 of the 543 seats and the conglomerate of regional and smaller parties have earned bragging rights, it's time for leaders of these parties to return to the battlefield. Narendra Modi may have been reduced to leading a minority government but the BJP still remains a formidable political machine.

The time to engage in the byzantine workings in New Delhi's rarified environment has not arrived for Rahul Gandhi or Akhilesh Yadav, not even Supriya Sule and Abhishek Banerjee, who are still underestudies even though they packed a punch in this election. With others like Uddhav and Aadiya Thackeray, M.K. Stalin and Udhaynidhi, and Tejashwi Yadav, these torchbearers of the political aristocracy must go back to fortifying the trenches, connecting with the popular sovereign, managing the organisational networks and strengthening the bases they have retaken from the BJP.

The representative of Indian politics' middle ground, bookended by the extreme-right BJP-RSS and the Left, the Congress as the largest national party, Samajwadi Party, Nationalist Congress Party, DMK, Trinamul Congress and the RJD have to work on the ground to foil the recapture of the median voter and the space they compelled the BJP to vacate.

This election is certainly historic, but not because Mr Modi became PM for the third time, matching Jawaharlal Nehru's record. It is historic because a new generation of leaders have emerged in the old parties and rebuilt the bases that were almost razed by the

BJP juggernaut between 2014 and 2024.

Each of these leaders were handed hay as they entered the firepit that is the Lok Sabha election. Instead of setting themselves on fire, they lit a fire that sent the BJP scampering. In UP, the SP won 37 seats, against the BJP's 33, down from 62. In Maharashtra, the Congress won 13 seats, while the BJP won a mere nine seats, down from 23 in 2019. In Tamil Nadu, the BJP was nil out of 39 seats. The Mamata-Abhishek Banerjee duo, sneeringly referred to as "Pishi-Bhaipo" by Mr Modi and his party, regained ground and won 29 seats out of the state's 42.

The transition in leadership from the founding to successor generation that is this new league of younger leaders was invariably marked by blood feuds, defections, bad-mouthing and backstabbing by veterans within and outside the immediate families. Through the process of taking control, stabilising the often-vandalised parties, establishing their identities by coming out of the shadow of their predecessors, these new leaders have a history with many commonalities and the wisdom of hindsight, that if some things were done differently, it would have been less politically destructive.

The decade of Mr Modi's first two terms seems to have worked like a baptism of fire for the new generation. Instead of the visceral animosity their predecessors had towards the Congress, a leader like Akhilesh Yadav, or Uddhav and Aadiya Thackeray, can and do get along with Rahul Gandhi. The SP-Congress alliance in UP is proof that such partnerships do indeed work well. The new league of leaders turned out to be challengers of 73-year-old Mr Modi's popularity among voters, a hefty 25 per cent-plus of whom are under 30 and, more signifi-

cantly, either grew up and became first-time voters or were job-seekers in the past 10 years, sitting recruitment examinations that either didn't take place as scheduled, or were cancelled because of paper leaks or were waitlisted as the government hadn't notified the filling of vacancies.

Without a formal common minimum programme, a centralised seat-sharing mechanism, this new generation has an extraordinary ability to identify and speak on issues and problems by pinpointing the BJP as the common enemy and their target. Jobs, unemployment, contractual recruitment into the Army through the "Agnipath" scheme, recruitment exams and unfilled vacancies, bad environment for trade and small businesses, the cost-of-living crisis, hate speeches and divisive politics are shared and separate concerns. In a remarkable campaign, each of these parties addressed each of these issues, contextualising them within the overarching anxiety about Mr Modi's authoritarian, extreme right-wing politics, crony capitalism and bad governance. Each of these leaders used the lived experiences of their constituents to locate these problems within the specific territories which they worked to recover from the BJP's stranglehold and build support for the common agenda that India's democracy, Constitution, diversity, social harmony and political pluralism were in danger from the hegemonic and homogenising design of the Narendra Modi-led BJP.

In Maharashtra, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh, the INDIA bloc parties have dislodged the BJP from its number one position in the Lok Sabha election. The

INDIA parties have to retake these states in the coming Assembly elections. In Tamil Nadu, the BJP hasn't made a breakthrough despite the best efforts of Mr Modi. In West Bengal, the BJP is a distant number two, way behind the Trinamul Congress. In Karnataka, Gujarat, Rajasthan and Bihar the BJP haemorrhaged; it yielded seats to the Congress, the Rashtriya Janata Dal and even the CPI(M).

The new generation of leaders rebuilt political capital from the bottom up. They fought the BJP and its reputation as an outstandingly efficient, cohesively organised and strongly-led party that had mastered strategy, especially manipulating caste and sub-caste fractions, making them serve as vote-multipliers to enable the party to punch above its weight in Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Bihar, West Bengal, Karnataka and dream of making a dent in Tamil Nadu.

The responsibility of the new league of leaders is clear: to increase the efficiency of their parties in defeating the BJP by getting better at working in coordination with allies at the ground level, where hostility between workers of different parties can upset the momentum that the Lok Sabha poll performance created by becoming the Leader of the Opposition with ministerial rank, endless office work and a big bungalow, it would please the BJP. A peripatetic Rahul Gandhi is a different kettle of fish than one who is tied down in New Delhi. The Congress has other younger, successful and hungry leaders, like Sachin Pilot or Gaurav Gogoi, who can take on the BJP.

As leaders of regional parties, even Chirag Paswan and Nara Lokesh seem to have figured out that their future lies in defending their territories against, principally, the BJP.

If Labour wins in UK, as expected, Starmer govt may be good for India

The general election in Britain is due to be held just three weeks from now, on July 4. The Conservative Party had won a majority in the House of Commons in 2010, 2015, 2017 and 2019, albeit with different Prime Ministers — starting with David Cameron, Theresa May, Boris Johnson, Liz Truss to the incumbent, Rishi Sunak. However, this is poised for a change, given the seemingly irreversible lead of the Labour Party under Sir Keir Starmer over the Rishi Sunak-led Conservatives. Almost all pollsters validate the writing on the wall. It is time to bid farewell to the Tories and await the pragmatist, reformist and constantly evolving Labour Party leader Keir Starmer as the next PM of Great Britain.

Why should this concern India? Because Britons of Indian origin constitute the UK's largest ethnic minority, at about 2.5 per cent of the population, or two million. The fact that Rishi Sunak too is of Indian origin and has often worn his religio-cultural identity on his brown sleeves, the subliminal after-effects can be imagined in the erstwhile empire where it was once imperiously claimed that "the sun never set". Beyond the patent political correctness that defines most Britons, to assume that there would be no subliminal racist concerns with a PM named "Rishi" (sage in Sanskrit), that too within the ranks of the Tories, is to live under a rock! As could be normally expected, would attempts by Rishi Sunak's successor, Keir Starmer, to "un-do" Rishi and

his legacy, lead to changed equations which are fundamentally detrimental to India? The short answer is "no".

For starters, Labour has been the "natural" party of choice for most Britons of Indian origin, given the support afforded towards India's Independence, as opposed to the Conservatives. Yet, it is equally true that the Conservatives had swung a significant voter base towards itself during the Jeremy Corbyn-led Labour era (2015-2020), which was marked by Mr Corbyn's hard-left stances that militated against Indian positions, especially on Kashmir. A 2019 Labour motion noted that Kashmir was a "disputed territory" and that "the people of Kashmir should be given the right of self-determination in accordance with UN resolutions". Many Britons of Indian origin were horrified with the obviously "anti-India" stance, always predicated on the hyphenated corollary to be viewed as "pro-Pakistan". Second, the unprecedented possibility of an Indian-origin incumbent at 10 Downing Street (Rishi Sunak) accelerated the mass exodus of many desis towards Tory ranks.

But the ambiguous and relatively un-decoded Keir Starmer is outrightly anti-Jeremy Corbyn, as are his policies. Sir Keir Starmer has completely enervated the headline Labour-Left and steered the Labour anchorage to its revised centrist moorings. About four years ago, he retracted sharply from Mr Corbyn's position on Kashmir by brazenly counterpoising: "Any constitutional issues in India are a

matter for India's Parliament, and Kashmir is a bilateral issue for India and Pakistan to resolve peacefully. Labour is an internationalist party and stands for the defence of human rights everywhere." The telling usage and deep import of insisting on "bilateral issue" (read, pro-India position), whilst nuancing the same with perfunctory Labour verbiage of "internationalist" and "human rights", was a marked course correction. Keir Starmer did so, calculating the possible repercussions on the extreme-left section of his Labour party and even on the still-sizeable vote bank of Britons of Pakistani origin. The lawyer in him punted to be clearly "pro-India".

Since then, Sir Keir has solidified his "pro-India" spiel and last year spoke at the India Global Forum, acknowledging: "This is a changed Labour Party... the opportunity is there for this to be an Indian century ... The challenge, as I see it now, is for Britain to step out of the shadows in its mind, to cast aside the entitlement of history and deepen our relationship with the real India, the modern India, the future India." Tellingly, Keir Starmer had suspended Mr Corbyn for his anti-Semitism (another strong retraction in Labour stand) and today Mr Corbyn is standing as an Independent!

Clearly, the PM-in waiting is seeing the practical picture as opposed to that of a puritanical ideologue when he acknowledges the "win-win" possibilities with the growing Indian economy that just dislodged the UK from the Global Top 5. India, as the second

largest source of foreign direct investment into the UK, will be critical to Keir Starmer's plans to fix the UK's pressing economic woes.

Also, unlike Rishi, who would be extra-cautious to avoid showing any overt India bias (beyond cultural issues) due to his inherent Indianness, Keir Starmer could freely demonstrate positive India biases, as they would make eminent sense, economically, and even from partisan lens.

Whereas, like all right-wing politicians, Rishi is harping to the past by desperately proposing long-abandoned schemes like National Service to drum up a "renewed sense of pride". This on top of the Brexit fiasco (which Keir Starmer hopes to moderate and normalise with EU) points to the agenda-less spiel of the Tories, which promises even more conservatism, exclusivism and revisionism. In contrast, Sir Keir Starmer is relatively fresh (he became an MP in 2015), flexible and unstrapped to the dogmas of the past. His politics are completely practical, relentlessly ends-focused, and not caught up in identities, "camps" or ideologies (some even call it transactional and unrooted), and that may just be the reason why New Delhi ought to welcome Sir Keir Starmer as the next PM of Britain, once the vacuously nativist fuss around Rishi Sunak is over.

Nepal, SL stare at exit; SA in Super 8

Heavy rain washed out Sri Lanka and Nepal's crucial Group 'D' fixture in the T20 World Cup that ended up assuring a Super 8 spot for South Africa. The match was abandoned without a ball being bowled as both teams settled for a point each and are now staring at an early exit from the tournament.

South Africa secured the Super 8 berth by topping Group 'D' with three wins from three matches.

Second placed Bangladesh, who are ahead of the Netherlands on net run-rate, are also vying for the second spot.

Nepal next face South Africa (Saturday), and Bangladesh (Monday) in Kingstown, St. Vincent.

Sri Lanka's chances of qualifying are the slimmest as they have only one match left in the group — against the Netherlands in St. Lucia on Monday.

Josh questions T20 WC format

Australian pacer Josh Hazlewood finds it a bit strange that their superior net run-rate after three comprehensive wins will count for nothing in the Super 8 stage of the T20 World Cup. Considering it is the biggest-ever T20 showpiece with the involvement of 20 teams, the ICC created four groups of five teams, out of which two from each pool make the Super 8 stage of the tournament.

The format is different from the previous edition, when all the top teams began their competition in the Super 12 stage where two groups of six teams were created and top two from each pool made the semifinals.

“Yeah, it’s a little bit strange that it doesn’t really, it doesn’t go through the tournament. This is probably the first T20 World Cup I’ve played that’s set up this way, or first World Cup in general that’s set up this way, so it’s a little bit different,” said Hazlewood.

“Yeah, the work that you do in the round games and if you go through undefeated and have a good net run rate, doesn’t really account for much once you’re in the Super Eights. So, yeah, it’s a strange run, but that’s how it is.”

Last respect paid to MCA prez Kale

India and Mumbai players Iajinkya Rahane and Dhawal Kulkarni and several others from the cricketing fraternity on Wednesday paid their last respects to Mumbai Cricket Association (MCA) president Amol Kale, who passed away in New York.

Kale's mortal remains were brought back to India on Wednesday afternoon after he died on the intervening night between June 9 and 10 due to a cardiac arrest.

The 47-year-old was in New York to watch India's match against Pakistan in the ongoing T20 World Cup. “Deeply saddened to hear about the sudden demise of MCA President Amol Kale. His dedication to Mumbai cricket was exemplary. Deepest condolences to his family and friends during this difficult time,” BCCI secretary Jay Shah wrote on his X account.

Sublime Arshdeep silences USA as India cruise into Super 8

Team India beat down a spirited challenge from hosts USA, defeating them by seven wickets to keep a clean slate in Group 'A' and sail into the Super Eight stage of the T20 World Cup on Wednesday.

Chasing a Nelson (111) for victory, the Blues overcame initial setbacks to finish the task in 18.2 overs at the Nassau County International Cricket Stadium.

Suryakumar Yadav (50 not out — 49 balls, 2x4, 2x6) and Shivam Dube (31 not out — 35b, 1x4, 1x6) were the architects of the chase with a solid 67-run stand for the unbroken fourth wicket. Earlier, pacer Arshdeep Singh had drilled USA earlier with fantastic figures of 4 for 9.

Virat Kohli's wretched run at the World Cup continued. The IPL top-scorer was out for a golden duck as he edged left-arm seamer Saurabh Netravalkar to wicketkeeper Andries Gous behind the stumps on the second ball of the innings to stun Indian supporters into silence.

Captain Rohit Sharma too departed quickly, falling to the same bowler as India slipped to 10 for 2 in the third over.

Pant (18) and Surya then stitched a 29-run stand to repair the damage before the former lost his stumps to an Ali Khan delivery that kept low.

That brought IPL stars SKY and Dube together. They made sure there were no further hiccups for the Blues.

Earlier, USA got to 10 over the three-figure mark after being put in to bat.

India were off the blocks in a flash. They began with a bang. Arshdeep Singh struck on the first and last balls of the first over, rapping Shayan Jahangir on the pads and then Gous's big shot climbed vertically before landing in the safe hands of Hardik Pandya behind the straight umpire.

It was not until the fourth over that the hosts got the first six of the match. Captain Aaron Jones hooked fast bowler Mohammed Siraj out of the ground. That was the

only shining spot during the Powerplay, at the end of which USA were a lowly 18 for 2. Siraj got back at Jones though, catching him on the fine leg fence as he tried to play a similar shot off Pandya.

Shivam was out of sorts bowling his first over, ninth of the innings. He conceded 11 runs includ-

ing a six and a four to opener Steven Taylor.

It was a case of 6 and out for Taylor. The left-hander sent Axar Patel out of the ground in the 12th over and then played the next ball from the left-arm spinner on to his stumps to end his knock of 24 that came off 30 deliveries and contained two sixes.

The Americans were pretty slow, getting to the team 50 in the 12th over. The 13th over fetched 12 runs for USA as Nitish Kumar targeted Pandya, hitting him for a ramrod straight boundary and a soaring six.

Nitish kept going for his shots, and perished as he tried to get another maxi-

**North Sound (Antigua), June 12:** Leg-spinner Adam Zampa starred again in the middle overs as Australia annihilated Namibia by nine wickets to qualify for the Super 8 stage of the T20 World Cup here.

Australia put up a complete bowling performance to dismiss Namibia for a meagre 72 before gunning down the target in just 34 balls with Travis Head and skipper Mitchell Marsh remaining not out on 34 and 18 respectively.

With three wins in a row, Australia thus stormed into the Super Eight from Group with a match in hand. They take on Scotland at Gros Islet in their concluding Group 'B' fixture on Saturday.

For Namibia, it was their second loss in three games, eliminating them from the Super 8 race.

Scotland and England are fighting for the second Super spot from Group B. Josh Hazlewood (2/18) removed the Namibian openers Michael Van Lingen and Niko Davin before Zampa (4/12) got into the act to run through Namibia, who ended with their lowest total in T20Is.

Zampa reached a major landmark in the game as he became the first Australian bowler to take 100 wickets in T20 Internationals.

Opening the bowling alongside Hazlewood, Marcus Stoinis (2/9) also took a couple of wickets while skipper Pat Cummins and Nathan Ellis chipped in with a wicket each.

Australian opening duo of David Warner (20 off 8) and Head (34 off 17) were in a hurry to get the job done, giving the team a flying start.

Nagal wins thriller to reach quarterfinals

**Perugia (Italy), June 12:** Indian tennis star Sumit Nagal continued his fine form as he entered the quarterfinal of the ongoing ATP Perugia Challenger here.

On Wednesday, the sixth-seeded Indian toppled unseeded local Alessandro Giannessi in a three-set thriller 0-6, 7-5, 7-6 (7-5).

Last week, India's top singles player had won the Heilbronn Challenger in Germany.

In the opening set, Nagal received heavy thrashing after the Italian blanked him 6-0.

However, the 77th-ranked Indian did not back down from

a fightback and kept things close in the following set before earning a lone break and winning the set 7-5 to take things to the decider.

As for the final set, it was 'game on' for both the competitors, who eventually took to the tie-breaker, where Nagal survived to take the set 7-6 (7-5).

In the quarterfinal, the Indian will face off against the winner of the pre-quarterfinal clash between Maks Kasnikowski of Poland and third seed Borna Coric of Croatia.

AIFF seeks probe into Qatar's goal

**New Delhi, June 12:** The All India Football Federation (AIFF) has lodged a complaint with the match commissioner, seeking a probe into the controversial goal awarded to Qatar in their crucial World Cup qualifying match in Doha. Sources in the AIFF said they have asked for a "thorough investigation into the goal" that was allowed by South Korean referee Kim Woo-Sung despite the ball clearly going out of play during the must-win match that India lost 1-2 at Jassim Bin Hamad Stadium on Tuesday.

The goal sparked widespread outrage as it deprived the Indians of what would have been



their maiden entry into the third round of the FIFA World Cup Qualifiers for the 2026 edition.

“We have lodged a complaint with the match commissioner and are seeking a thorough investigation into the whole thing,” said an AIFF official.

In the 73rd minute, Abdullah Alahrak's free-kick saw Yousef Ayem attempt a header, which

was saved by India skipper and goalkeeper Gurpreet Singh Sandhu.

But as the custodian lay on the ground seeing the ball roll over the line, Hashmi Hussein kicked it into play with Aymen slotting it into the net.

Since the ball had visibly rolled out of play, the game should have stopped and then resumed with a corner-kick in this case as Sandhu was the last player to come in contact with the ball before it went out.

But, to the frustration of the Indian players, the referee awarded the goal to Qatar and despite the visiting team protesting vehemently, the on-field official upheld his decision.

**Doha, June 12:** India football coach Igor Stimac said “injustice” was done and his team's “dream was killed” by the blatantly “irregular” goal that allowed Qatar to claw back and clinch the must-win World Cup qualifying match here. “Qatar were lucky tonight, especially because they came back from 0-1 with an irregular goal. I can confirm that now because I have seen the replay. The whole ball was out of play and the goal was given,” Stimac didn't mince words as he spoke about what went wrong in the game.

“It shouldn't be happening in today's football because that goal changed everything in this game. It could've happened to Qatar today and I would say the same. I'm not looking for an excuse.

“I feel sad that when you have 23 boys working really hard and living the dream, to achieve something, and that dream is killed because we didn't stop such things from happening,” the Croat added.

The loss, however, cannot hide the fact that India have been consistently poor in their campaign, the lowest point being a home loss to Afghanistan.

Stimac said his players gave their everything and he had no complaints.
