

### NHS bill for drug mistakes

NHS hospital patients have been compensated after they were caused extra suffering by drugs mix-ups.

The mistakes, settled by the health service in the past five years and affecting almost 1,000 patients, totalled £86million in costs and compensation.

In 101 cases the patient died.

The details revealed in a Freedom of Information Act response from NHS Resolution.

It has responsibility for settling all clinical negligence brought against NHS hospitals.


### Koreans in border crossing



BP has banned workers from having relationships with members of their team.


Under new rules, the oil giant's staff must also declare if they are intimately involved with anyone at the firm or risk disciplinary action.



The majority of dust in our atmosphere comes from the Desert's Depression. It's an ancient lake bed in Africa from which around 5billion tonnes a year is blown away. It can affect weather patterns and air temperature.

That dust can cause chaos to

holiday makers as sandstorms ground flights, such as in 2020 when the Canary Islands were blanketed, below. Along with affecting pilots being able to see where they are going, the dust can damage plane engines.



But it's good news for our oceans. Boffins from the journal Science revealed in 2011 that dust helps boost phytoplankton

growth - and the tiny plants suck up the greenhouse gas carbon dioxide and release oxygen.

In other splashing news, teeny weeny dust particles can be found in raindrops because they attach themselves to gassy water in the air.

1901 - which was so heavy it was horse drawn and needed gas to power it to work at buildings inclu Westminster including Abbey.

Enjoy looking at a beautiful sunrise? You've got dust to thank for that too. While it sucks up green and blue light around the sun it doesn't work the same for orange, yellow and red light, which are the glowing colours we then see when the sun is low in the sky.

People who suffer from

asthma and bronchitis can find dust makes their symptoms worse but it's dust mites' poo and dead bodies which most people are allergic to. A gram of dust can contain around 500 mites. Yuk!

Colourful explosions in the sky on Bonfire Night are given a boost by dust because fireworks contain tiny metal particles.

9 Around 40,000 tons of cosmic dust a year fall down on us on Earth from space in micrometeorites.

10 If you need an excuse to stop dusting your home, then the residues could prove helpful if you experience a break-in. Prints left in dust have been helping crime investigators since

the early 1900s and are used in shows like Line Of Duty starring Vicky McClure, where forensic teams are the first on site.

In 1999 Nasa sent a mission called Stardust to collect particles while they were in motion to study them, collecting the dust in a silicon-based material known as aerogel, which is 99.8% empty space. În 2014 boffins revealed they found seven particles which they believed were interstellar

But Tunnock's has said it will never compromise on the quality or size of its world-famous range, which

includes teacakes, snow-

The family firm is led by Sir Boyd Tunnock, 91, who was knighted by the Queen at Buckingham Palace in 2019 for services to business and charity.

His grandfather Thomas founded the business in 1890 as a bakery shop in Uddingston, Lanarks. It now employs more than 600 people in the

town and exports to more than 30 countries.

Tunnock's sales chief Fergus Loudon told Scottish Grocer magazine: "If your mother or grand-

mother bought Tunnock's Caramel Wafers 50 years ago, they were the same size they are today."

He added: "In a changing world, it is reassuring Tunnock's still holds the line, and does not compromise on quality or value for money."

Last year Which? reported research which found two-thirds of shoppers had noticed "shrinkflation" on products, including Lurpak butter and Whiskas cat food.


Fashion fans said the team looked like a "recruitment company at a teambonding weekend".

**BOFFINS** want to intercept signals from aliens - after eavesdropping on Earth from the Moon.

They used the first ever private lunar lander. Odysseus, to listen to frequencies from our planet. It's hoped it will help them know what to look for when hunting little green men.

Dr Jack Burns, from the University of Colorado Boulder, US said: "We viewed Earth as an exoplanet. That enables us to ask, 'What would our radio emissions look like if they came from an extraterrestrial civilisation?"

The "sort of space radio selfie" will now be used as a blueprint to scan for ETs.



"I'm going to get in crazy shape and then start practising. I want to


