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Tree Expert Committee too quick to say yes to chopping of trees for railways projects, but doesn't follow up on compensatory plantation

ased on orders by Bengaluru's Tree Expert Committee (TEC), thousands of trees in the city are yet again in the line of fire.

The order copies with Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) show that while permission to remove 187 trees has been grant-

ed by the committee for a South Western Railway Project, over 2,000 trees have been permitted to be cut for Bengaluru's Suburban Rail Project (BSRP).

According to the public notice put up by SWR, permission was asked to remove 176 trees to accommodate extra tracks along the existing tracks and construction of a new rail line in connection with quadrupling work between KR Puram railway station and Whitefield.

Freedom Park's new hi-tech parking complex is ready

Space for 445 two-wheelers and 556 cars, offers structured fees with free pickup and drop-off services for visitors

he long-delayed multilevel parking complex near Freedom Park is finally set to be inaugurated on June 20. For Rs 79.81 crore, BBMP constructed the country's first facility utilising advanced parking technology. However, the complex remained unused for three years until relaxed conditions attracted contractor interest, leading to the tender being awarded after seven failed attempts.

The parking complex accommodates 445 two-wheelers on the first floor and 556 cars across three floors: 118 on the first, 219 on the second, and 219 on the third. Fees are structured as follows: Rs 15 for bikes and Rs 25 for cars for the first hour, increasing with duration up to Rs 100 for bikes and Rs 165 for cars for 10-12 hours. Monthly passes are available at Rs 2,500 for bikes and Rs 3,500 for cars.

An official said, "The multilevel parking complex will offer free pickup and drop-off services for those who park their vehicles

there, benefiting visitors to Vidhana Soudha, the High Court, Majestic, and surrounding areas. They can park their vehicles and easily travel to their destinations. This facility incorporates advanced parking technology, including an automatic parking guidance system, smart parking management, and digital signage, ensuring safe and efficient vehicle parking. The complex is equipped with 24/7 CCTV surveillance, fire safety equipment, and an emergency response system." The opening of this multi-level parking complex is poised to greatly ease parking challenges in the city centre. Following multiple tender calls, the contract has been awarded to two contractors for a decade, committing an annual payment of Rs 1.50 crore to BBMP.

Located near key destinations such as Vidhana Soudha, Vikasa Soudha, the Lokayukta, the High Court, City Civil Court, Bangalore University, Mysore Bank Circle, Income Tax Department, Chickpet, and Cubbon Park, this parking facility will be a major convenience for visitors to Gandhi Nagar, Majestic, and surrounding areas. "The area around Freedom Park houses

many government offices and colleges, and this complex will be a boon for visitors. Additionally, it will be beneficial for those attending protests and demonstrations in the vicinity," said an official.

Earlier, there were plans to ban parking around Freedom

Park due to a lack of interest from contractors in managing the multistory parking facility nearby. The availability of free parking in the area was a major deterrent. This new parking facility aims to serve both commuters heading to the Central Business District (CBD) and the significant number of protestors who frequent the area. Protests near Freedom Park and Kalidasa Road lead to vehicles parked on nearby streets, causing traffic congestion and inconvenience to locals. BBMP aimed to ease this by planning a 1,000-vehicle capacity parking complex, yet free parking in the vicinity initially deterred interest.

NEET 2024 fallout: IAP pushes for re-evaluation & CBI probe

midst the recent NEET results controversy, The Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP), the second-largest organisation of paediatricians globally, committed to children's holistic well-being, has raised additional inquiries regarding concerns following the release of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) by the National Testing Agency (NTA). These FAQs aim to address various queries and issues surrounding alleged discrepancies in the conduct of NEET 2024.

The IAP, representing over 45,000 paediatricians across India, boasts a strong network, including 32 state branches, 337 district and city branches, one foreign branch, and 30 subspecialty chapters and interest groups across five zones of the country.

Highlighting disparities observed in the NEET UG 2024 examination, the IAP expressed concerns following a recent press release by the NTA. The IAP cited the following statistics from the NTA's press release. The examination took place in 13 languages across approximately 571 cities, including 14 cities outside India, with 4,750 centres and oversight from 210,105 invigilators. A total of 24,06,079 candidates registered for the NEET UG 2024 examination, of which 23,33,297 appeared, and 13,16,268 qualified. This marks a notable difference from previous years, with around 11,45,976 qualifying in 2023 and approximately 9,93,069 qualifying in 2022. Interestingly, over 67 students achieved the 1st rank with a perfect score of 720, followed closely by scores of 718 and 719 for subsequent ranks. In comparison, in 2023, 2 students secured the 1st rank with a total score of 720, followed by scores of 716



and 715 for other top ranks. In 2022, 1 student clinched the 1st rank with a total score of 715, followed by 3 students also scoring 715.

However, the IAP pointed out that they have requested comprehensive clarification on several points. The NEET UG result press release lacks the marks obtained by the top 100 rankers, providing only their percentiles. This contrasts with previous years, where scorecards included both marks and percentiles for the top 50 ranks. The surge in the number of students qualifying for the NEET UG 2024 examination is strikingly higher

compared to previous years. Questionably, 67 candidates secured the 1st rank with a perfect score of 720 in NEET UG 2024. Traditionally, first rankers achieved a perfect score of 720, followed by subsequent ranks scoring 716 or 715. However, this year, subsequent ranks had scores of 718 and 719, deviating from the usual scoring pattern, and raising concerns about the testing and evaluation process. NTA awarded compensatory marks for time loss, though not specified in exam guidelines, causing a sudden rise in the cutoff. Such rules should have been disclosed earlier. Additionally, addressing unfair practices like cheating and paper leaks requires immediate attention.

IAP further stated, "We request a CBI inquiry into the discrepancies as mentioned above and a re-examination to ensure a fair evaluation process. These candidates represent the hope for our future."

Don't botch it up, forest dept to start training snake handlers in city

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n the wake of multiple botched snake rescue operations by unskilled snake rescuers in the past, the Karnataka Forest Department (KFD) has finally started its programme to train snake handlers in the city.

Under this initiative, the department has decided to conduct a two-day training programme for rescuers in Bengaluru. The training will be held on June 19 and 20 at Bannerghatta Biological Park.

"Keeping in mind the instances of humansnake conflict, snake rescuers in Bengaluru and surrounding areas are key to peaceful and safe coexistence. Training will be given by experts on various aspects of snake rescue such as situations that warrant a rescue, protocols for the safe handling of snakes, strategies for community engagement, knowledge of the latest developments in taxonomy, herpetological science, snakebite management, etc," said a statement released from the department.

The programme will train participants to help the department in record keeping. After the programme, successful participants will be certified as trained rescuers by the department.

"We are mulling over uploading a detailed list of certified rescuers on our website so citizens can reach out to them when in need. The programme will also help us understand the level of human-snake conflict.

It will help us understand conflict-prone areas and this information can then be used to plan mitigation measures. The department will also play a role in the safe and scientific release of snakes," said Kumar Pushkar, additional principal chief conservator of forests (wildlife), KFD.



In October 2022, the department came up with a draft operational manual to effectively mitigate human-snake conflict. The idea was to institutionalise the process and make it compulsory for the handlers to seek a certificate from the department.

As per the manual, anyone interested in snake rescue will have to undergo a periodic certification programme at institutes notified by the department. The department had then mentioned that the handlers will have to undergo the certification and assessment program every two years. According to the department, the idea is to provide standard operating procedures to guide a rescuer in managing a conflict situation and build a system of accountability to regulate snake rescue across the state.

Later, in February this year, an instruction was issued by the department's Wildlife Division to all CCFs to conduct training programs for snake handlers as per the operational manual.



UGC secretary Manish Joshi said, "The NEP emphasises the importance of public selfdisclosure as a fundamental principle. NEP contemplates that HEIs shall be responsible and accountable to the stakeholders through transparent self-disclosure of all relevant records. The availability of information in the public domain is an important source of accountability. Stakeholders in the higher education system, such as students, parents, research scholars, prospective students, regulatory bodies, accreditation agencies, alumni, and the public, desire to seek information from the websites of HEIs."

He said that every Higher Education Institution shall maintain a functional website for making relevant self-disclosure to the stakeholders. The disclosure made on the website shall have unrestricted access without any requirement of login/registration and shall have a 'Search' facility for easy access. HEIs are required to provide information related to various aspects such as the institution's overview, legal framework, accreditation status, financial reports, governing bodies, academic programs, admissions, research activities, student life, alumni associa-

Rain turns Thubarahalli Road into risky slush

Citizens of area plead for asphalting of road, but no action has been taken by authorities

pproximately 2,000 citizens of Thubarahalli Extension face significant challenges commuting on the road connecting Thubarahalli with other areas, including several private schools. Due to the neglect and apathy of the authorities, travelling on this road has become an arduous task. When it rains, the road transforms into a mini-pond filled with slush, making it especially difficult for two-wheeler riders to navigate.

The citizens have been appealing to the authorities to address the issue, but their requests have gone unanswered, and the road remains unpaved. With more residential apartment complexes under construction, the situation is set to worsen. "I have been living here for the past 10 years, hoping the BBMP authorities would finally pave the road, but my hopes have been in vain. Commuting on this muddy, uneven road during the monsoon is a constant struggle. I appeal to the BBMP authorities to asphalt the road as soon as possible," said Jayakumar R, a person with disabilities.

Sunder Raman, an occupant of Thubarahalli Extension, is appealing to the BBMP authorities to assist the citizens. "We have been requesting and reminding the BBMP engineers of the need of asphalting the road but nothing has been done till date. The BBMP engineers are not even bothered to reply to our messages. The condition of the road between Thirumalaraya Swamy Temple and

Vibgyor School Junction is pathetic," said Sunder Raman.

A citizen speaking anonymously, mentioned that it has become customary for elected representatives and politicians to give assurances when approached by citizens seeking permanent solutions to infrastructure problems. "One of the politicians has assured us to look into the matter but never bothered to fix the problem," the citizen said.

A BBMP assistant engineer stated that the incomplete stormwater drain is causing waterlogging on Thubarahalli Extension Road. However, BBMP Stormwater Drain Assistant Executive Engineer Malati mentioned that the construction of the stormwater drain-cum-road has already begun. "We have already completed a 100-metre stormwater drain-cum-road and we have to complete the remaining 400-metre. Locals are causing issues for the workers involved in the construction. We had to pause the work for two months because the traffic police diverted traffic to this road due to pipeline work by the Bangalore Water Supply and Sewerage Board (BWSSB) on the alternate road. We will complete the construction shortly," said BBMP Assistant Engineer.

IT sector fumes as Karnataka extends exemption unilaterally

KITU leads a major labour office march, with IT employees submitting a memorandum to the labour commissioner, strongly advocating for change

arnataka State IT/ITeS Employees Union (KITU) has decided to protest against the Karnataka government's unilateral decision to extend the exemption given to the IT/ITeS sector from the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act.

As per a circular dated June 10, the state government has extended the exemption of IT/ITES/Startups/Animation/Gaming/Computer Graphics/Telecom/BPO/other knowledge-based industries from the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946 for an additional five years.

Despite concerns raised by KITU regarding companies' failure to meet conditions during the previous exemption, the government proceeded with extending the exemption for the IT/ITES sector from the Standing Orders Act. On March 16, KITU organised a labour office march involving hundreds of IT sector employees. They submitted

a memorandum to the labour commissioner, urging against extending the exemption due to companies' non-compliance with conditions.

Despite the labour commissioner's assurance of a decision only after hearing both parties, the government unilaterally extended the exemption for another five years without holding the tripartite meeting as promised. "This is a blatant attempt by the government to appease its corporate bosses, completely disregarding the concerns of the 20 lakh employees in this sector," the KITU said in a statement.

Industries exempted must adhere to several conditions, including establishing an internal committee as per the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act, setting up a grievance redressal committee with equal employer-employee representation, and notifying labour authorities about disciplinary actions like suspension, termination, or demotion. Additionally, they must furnish employee service details upon government request.

It is important to note that the Karnataka State IT/ITeS Employees Union filed a writ petition in the Karnataka High Court challenging the exemption, and this petition is currently under adjudication.

Estimates suggest that Karnataka is home to over 18 lakh professionals currently working in 8,785 IT/BT firms. Initially, on January 25, 2014, the state government exempted IT, ITeS, business process outsourcing, and knowledge process outsourcing firms from the Industrial Employment (Standing Order) Act 1946. This exemption was further extended for an additional five years from May 25, 2019.

'I will ask engineers to ensure quality of work'

New BBMP administrator plans to make sure that infra fixes for city are sustainable and long-standing


enior IAS officer SR Umashankar has assumed the role of administrator for BBMP. With BBMP elections pending, senior IAS officers are being appointed as administrators. The former administrator, Rakesh Singh, retired on June 30, and now Umashankar has stepped into the position. We spoke to him to understand the plans for Bengaluru, Excerpts:

What assistance does Bengaluru need from the Central Government specifically for BBMP's operations?

Bengaluru, as a major economic hub, plays a crucial role in contributing to the national revenue through various taxes. The city's substantial contributions to the Central kitty underscore the need for adequate support and resources from the Central Government to address the diverse challenges and development needs within BBMP's jurisdiction.

How crucial is collaboration and consensus among

Various agencies such as BDA, BMRCL, BWSSB, and BMRDA are actively engaged in enhancing the city's infrastructure and ser-



equipment, being used to patch a Umashankar intends to focus on durable solutions

but also to ensure that our roads remain durable and resilient in the long run.

How do you address waterlogging challenges?

There are numerous historical factors contributing to this issue in our city. Now, our focus needs to shift towards finding effective solutions. One of the primary issues is the incomplete coverage of stormwater drains across the city. Approximately 300 km of Rajakaluves need to be constructed, which will provide a longterm solution to the waterlogging problem. However, this extensive infrastructure development project will take several years to complete. In the meantime, we must implement temporary measures to mitigate the immediate impacts of waterlogging.

Given BBMP's typical shortage of funds for new projects, what strategies do you

propose to increase revenue streams?

The financial situation of BBMP has improved significantly compared to the previous year. This positive trend is expected to continue into the future. The Deputy Chief Minister has announced that the one-time payment scheme will conclude by July 31. I encourage all defaulters to settle their dues promptly. Doing so will not only contribute to boosting our tax revenues but also facilitate the ongoing improvement.

As this is your first assignment in BBMP, how do you plan to manage this mammoth body?

Though this is my first stint in BBMP in any capacity, I bring a wealth of experience with my previous experiences in various departments. I have worked as Deputy Commissioner in three districts and held administrative roles in three municipal bodies. Throughout my career, I have consistently engaged with people, understanding their needs and concerns. In this new role, my fundamental approach will be to listen attentively to the pleas and feedback of the residents. By carefully understanding their problems, we can then devise effective and sustainable solutions.

There are plans to create five new corporations out of BBMP. Could you provide further updates on this?

There have been ongoing discussions regarding the potential division of BBMP, although no final decision has been reached. These deliberations are taking place at the highest levels of leadership, and any decisions made will be officially communicated to the public in due course.

Darshan in custody: More details emerge in murder plot

olice have intensified their investigation into the murder of Renuka Swamy, leading to significant developments. Kannada actor Darshan's phone, along with the phones of 12 other suspects, have been seized.

Additionally, a red jeep allegedly used by Darshan and his associates to dispose of Renuka Swamy's body on June 8, has been confiscated. Authorities are also investigating the involvement of four vehicles in the crime, having already seized two of them.

Darshan's arrest took place in Mysuru, after which he was transported to Bengaluru and placed in police custody for six days. Swamy's body

was discovered at Sumanahalli Bridge in Bengaluru on June 8. He was reportedly an employee at pharmacy branch in Chitradurga. The murder weapon is believed to be a wooden log, and the initial plan was to dispose of his body in the Vrushabhavati valley, but the body was found by dogs.

According to police reports, Swamy allegedly sent inappropriate messages to Kannada actress Pavithra Gowda, a friend of Darshan. This purportedly led to Swamy's murder. Eight suspects have implicated Darshan, claiming he was present during the assault on Swamy.

Contrarily, Renuka Swamy's wife has refuted allegations that her husband sent any offensive messages. She

expressed disbelief over the need to kill him, stating that a warning would have sufficed if the claims were true. She called for justice regardless of Darshan's celebrity status.

Furthermore, on Tuesday, Karnataka police recovered CCTV footage showing a car, allegedly belonging to Darshan, near the disposal site of Swamy's body. The footage from the early hours of June 9, also captured a car, believed to contain Swamy's body and Darshan's close aides. It remains unclear if Darshan himself was in the vehicle at the time.

Details emerge

According to police sources, Swamy drew the wrath of Darshan for making lewd comments against Gowda on her social media posts. "It was Pavithra who instigated Darshan to punish

Renukaswamy. Accordingly, the plan was hatched," they claimed. "Darshan engaged the Chitradurga unit of Darshan Fan Club Convenor Raghavendra alias Raghu, who obtained all information about Renukaswamy."

Swamy's wife Sahana alleged that Raghavendra picked up her husband on Friday night from near their house in Chitradurga."Darshan beat up Renukaswamy with a belt. After he fell unconscious, his accomplices thrashed him with sticks. Further, they threw him against a wall, which proved fatal, as he suffered multiple bone fractures" they said, adding, after the killing, his body was dumped in a storm-water - PTI & BMB drain.

Committee must analyse need to cut each tree, say experts

Similarly, Karnataka Rail Infrastructure Development Company Limited (K-RIDE), through multiple applications requested the removal of over 4,000 trees. Out of these, while 1,227 trees were required to be removed for the design and construction of the elevated viaduct of corridor 2 of BSRP, 661 trees along the roadside were proposed to be felled and 2,495 trees standing in the project area between Benniganahalli Railway Station and Chikkabanavara Railway Station required felling.

TEC has granted permission to remove 2,797 trees.

City-based tree activists and envi-

ronmentalists have objected to TEC's order stating permissions to hack the city green cover is being granted for BSRP, while a public consultation meeting is due on June 14.

"What is the point of issuing these orders, when K-RIDE has called for a public consultation about the overall environmental impact of the project? It appears that the public consultation is a farce," said a city-based activist.

No compensatory plantation

Concerned citizens and experts also raise the issue of a lack of information about compensatory plantations in the orders passed by TEC.

"While the green cover is being hacked at a rate never before, ghost compensatory plantation activities are becoming the order of the day. TEC's order copy on permission for felling over 2,000 trees does not have any details about the compensatory plantation," said a citizen.

Experts also highlight concerns around K-RIDE's Environment Impact Assessment document, which states that compensatory plantation for BSRP will be taken up by BBMP.

"BBMP lacks resources to carry out its day-to-day activities. Even if K-RIDE will extend financial help, this arrangement is unlikely to work. A good case in point is that of the Bengaluru-Mysuru expressway. While the agency responsible for carrying out compensatory plantation for the project on behalf of NHAI, it never saw the light of the day," said the environmentalist.

Experts say TEC must analyse each tree separately instead of performing a shoddy job such as in the case of the order allowing K-RIDE to remove thousands of trees.

Plea filed in HC seeking BSY arrest

writ petition was filed in the Karnataka High Court on Wednesday, seeking the arrest of former Chief Minister and BJP Parliamentary Board member BS Yediyurappa. The petition, submitted by the victim's brother, claims

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FELL IN HIS PRIME: JUMBO DEATH LEAVES ALL SHOCKED

Ashwathama is the latest to fall victim to what conservationists are calling sheer carelessness on part of authorities

he death of 38-year-old Ashwathama, a Dasara elephant, on Tuesday, has once again sparked concerns over jumbos dving due to electrocution in Karnataka.

According to the elephant mortality report of Karnataka Forest Department (KFD), four elephants in the state have died due to electrocution in just last one month.

Apart from Ashwathama, who died in Mysuru, one elephant death was recorded from Chikkamagaluru, and two deaths due to electrocution were recorded in Madikeri.

Between January 2021 and now (June 12, 2024), Karnataka has lost 35 elephants to electrocution. Out of these, 12 cases were recorded in 2021, nine in 2022 and 2023 each, and five deaths have been registered this year.

Overall, 47 cases of unnatural deaths in jumbos have been recorded in the given period, which include deaths by gunshots, electrocution, road and train accidents, and snaring.

"Ashwathama's death is a case of sheer carelessness. According to media reports, KFD officials have claimed that the elephant died after touching a solar fence, which is bizarre. How can an elephant die of a 12volt timer-based solar fence when it cannot even kill a pig ? Another claim by officials that Ashwathama died of a weak pancreas is also outlandish. It is a case of illegal power tapping. The department should work towards eradicating incidents of illegal power tapping to reduce elephant deaths due to electrocution," said Ramesh Belagere, wildlife researcher, Foundation of Ecology and Education Development.

Last year, the forest department convened a meeting with power-supplying companies to discuss the issue of illegal tapping of power lines. Officials then met BESCOM (Bangalore Electricity Sup-

Initially, Lakshmi was fond of Dhruvanth, but she was eventually won over by Ashwathama's charm and began spending time with him. Their love story became a highlight of that year's Dasara celebrations," said an official. Their love story was a sensation, the official said. "Their strong bond created a dedicated fan base for Ashwathama, earning him the nickname 'Romeo'. Standing 9.3 feet tall, 11.3 feet long, and weighing over 3,700 kg, Ashwathama was a majestic elephant. He possessed all the qualities of an ideal elephant, including a strong back and curved tusks, making him a perfect candidate to carry the golden howdah (Ambari) during the Dasara festivities. Abhimanyu, the elephant carrying the Ambari, is 58 years old and expected to retire in two years. Forest officials had high hopes that Ashwathama would take over this

ply Company Limited), HESCOM (Hubballi Electricity Supply Company), and other electricity supply companies in the state to understand the issue and ensure illegal tapping is stopped.

However, conservationists and experts working on the ground say not much has changed.

"Electricity companies are not taking precautionary measures and we are hearing more and more cases of sagging power lines and illegal tapping every day. However, there is a High Court order on the issue, but rules are not being implemented by various line agencies. While very few cases of such offence are being registered, the majority never reach logical conclusions. There is not much of a deterrent," said a wildlife conservationist.

Trouble in corridors

Recently, the Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change (MOEF&CC), in association with the Wildlife Institute of India (WII), identified nine elephant corridors in Karnataka. Out of the identified corridors, one was found to be impaired and thus required immediate restoration to facilitate the movement of elephants.

The Ministry had also recommended that the state forest department notify seven of the nine corridors so that they are legally protected to prevent encroachment and development activities, which can be detrimental to animal movement. For the remaining two corridors, the Ministry has suggested eviction of encroached areas and habitat improvements, including removing invasive alien species, creating waterholes, and establishing fodder plots.

"Elephants are long-ranging mammals and are accustomed to using traditional corridors. However, these corridors also have highways, agricultural land, railway lines, and encroachment issues, leading to an increase in cases of unnatural deaths. It is time that these corridors are notified. Just identifying them is not sufficient," added the conservationist.

Yet another fishkill at Panathur Lake

esidents around Panathur Lake in East Bengaluru have reported yet another fish kill incident in the waterbody on Wednesday morning.

According to residents and lake walkers, over a 100 fish were found floating on water surface. They said Panathur is receiving raw sewage, which has led to this incident.

"Sewage is directly flowing into the lake. We are already witnessing fish kill incidents in other lakes in the area such as Vasantpura and Seegehalli. This is the situation despite crores of rupees spent on rejuvenation of these



water bodies," said Balaji Raghotham Bali, a lake activist in the area.

Residents say the issue has already been flagged.

"We spoke to BBMP officials and they informed us that sewage is entering as the inlet wall was destroyed by some miscreants. The civic agency should take action immediately," said another resident of the area.


'Policy on hazardous medical waste'

arnataka Forest Minister Eshwar Khandre has instructed officials of the Karnataka Pollution Control Board (KSPCB) to prepare a draft policy for scientific transportation and disposal of hazardous medical waste. The Minister gave the order in KSPCB's progress review meeting on Wednesday.
