


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## VIKASPURI IN BRIDGERTON, REPRESENT!


Kartik Aaryan and Triptii Dimri-starrer Bhool Bhulaiyaa 3 (BB3) went on the floors in March this year. However, recently, Aaryan had to take a break from filming to promote his sports biopic Chandu Champion, whereas Dimri went on a break to Italy. Now, the duo is now set to return to the BB3 sets by the end of this month. After completing the shoot in Mumbai and Kolkata, the BB3 team is now heading to Madhya Pradesh for the next leg of the shoot. A source close to the production reveals, "Kartik and Triptii will be going to Orchha, Madhya Pradesh towards the end of June for the next schedule of the film. The location will give a very rooted, aesthetic vibe as per the requirement of the story. The team will be stationed there till July. Post that, another schedule is planned before the film finally wraps up." The film is slated for a Diwali release, and will clash with Singham Again at the box office. Amit Bhadana, who became popular through his YouTube videos, dons many hats. Now, he is set to capture the attention of viewers with his upcoming film, Sipahi, that he has written and directed. Talking about the project that is set to release on his YouTube channel, Bhadana says, "It's a compelling narrative that delves into the life of Sanatan Vijay, a young boy from rural India who

dreams of a brighter future amid overwhelming odds." Bhadana, who plays the protagonist, talks about bringing authenticity and depth to the character, reflecting the struggles and aspirations of many young individuals in a similar situation. "The role was challenging, both mentally and physically. Physically, I had to become lean to look like someone who wanted to join the police force, which was extremely challenging. I achieved this in about 50 days. I used to run for 10-

15km with a dumbbell in my bag," says Bhadana, adding that he also trained in traditional wrestling, mastering the moves and techniques to shed extra kilos. Calling the protagonist "quite opposite" to his own personality, the comedian says, "The character is very serious and isn't funny at all. So it was a challenge to navigate the negative aura of Sanatan. I had to become like him—irritable. Sometimes, it


got under my skin." Another major hurdle was shooting the film in the summer around brick furnaces. "I am capable of shooting in the heat, but I was worried about the crew, and I kept asking them about water," he says. Ask how he zeroed in on the topic, and Bhadana replies, "It was a well-thought-out process; I have spoken about all the things I observed kids from 12th standard do when they prepare for police force entrance exams. Maybe

they'd be able to relate to the film. I understand that they prepare physically in terms of diet and workouts. There's also a written exam, so they go for coaching. It's all so competitive." Speaking about putting his whole soul into the project, Bhadana shares, "I enjoyed directing and acting from the start, as well as the writing stage. Getting to know people's reactions and later sitting with the music director to discuss the possible soundtracks was rewarding."


**KERALA TOPS NON-VEG AND FRUIT EXPENDITURE**

In this dish, whole spices such as black pepper, cardamom, bayleaf, etc. are cooked in oil first, allowing the flavours to develop fully. Then, the meat is added along with yoghurt and other masalas. The result of this technique is a spicy, mouth-watering curry popular in northern India. "Make sure that they (masala pastes and spices) are not so dominant that the mutton loses its own taste and flavour," advises chef Hussain.



**MUTTON BOTI MASALA FROM OLD DELHI**

"The history of this meal can be traced back to the lively bazaars of Old Delhi," says Mohammed Shareef, senior master chef at ITC Grand Central, adding that it's best served with rotis and naan. The boti masala consists of tender, boneless mutton and is flavoured with garlic and a variety of spices. "Its speciality is that it is entirely cooked on the tawa, making the mutton tender and succulent," adds chef Hussain.

**ALOO GOSHT KORMA FROM SOUTHERN INDIA**

Often had with rice or naan, this dish pairs mutton with a luscious tomato gravy and spicy potatoes. A surprise ingredient in this scrumptious dish is cinnamon, which adds a sharp, tart flavour to the curry. "This dish has an unbreakable connection to the royal kitchens of the Nizams of Hyderabad, who were famous for their lavish feasts and selective palate," says chef Shareef. This recipe is reserved strictly for special occasions!

When it comes to Eid-al-Adha, mutton is a delicacy. In fact, it is a luxury," says chef Zulfiqar Hussain while sharing the significance of preparing goat meat

on the day of celebration today. The 4,000-year-old festival emphasises the bonds in community, so one third of the sacrificial meat of the animal is given to those in need, one third is given to friends and family, and the last third is used to prepare various dishes at home. "Many regions have developed specific mutton dishes that

are intricately tied to their cultural and culinary heritage. These dishes are often reserved for special occasions, such as Eid al-Adha," says Abdul Quddus, chef de cuisine JW Marriott, Kolkata

As we gear up for a day of gastronomic affairs, chefs tell us about some dishes where mutton is the hero.

**HYDERABADI MUTTON BIRYANI**

A classic Bakrid dish, the origins of which can be traced back to Mughal chefs. The biryani comprises juicy mutton pieces and fragrant rice. Before cooking, the goat meat is marinated for 30 minutes in a blend of yoghurt, turmeric and salt and then combined with a spicy gravy. The dish is topped with fried onions.



**ROGAN JOSH FROM JAMMU AND KASHMIR**

"Mutton Rogan Josh is a dish deeply rooted in cultural traditions. It encapsulates the spirit of Eid al-Adha, bringing together rich flavours, communal sharing, and a sense of heritage," says chef Amjad from JW Marriott, Kolkata. Renowned for its deep aroma, achieved through a combination of spices such as cardamom, cloves, cinnamon and Kashmiri red chillies, Rogan Josh's slow-cooking process enhances the tenderness of the mutton, making it a centrepiece dish for the festive meal.



Seen at the Met Gala, movie premieres and on social media, 3D floral nails are making a bold statement on the red carpet. The theme of this year's Met Gala, held at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, was The Garden of Time, inspiring celebrities to showcase intricate floral designs on their nails. Model Gigi Hadid, singer Lizzo, and actors Teyana Taylor and Ayo Edebiri all sported stunning floral nails.

Taking the trend to the next level, actor Sydney Sweeney flaunted three-dimensional nails at the premiere of her film *Immaculate*. She wore a Balmain top featuring a pair of hands holding a bouquet of flowers, and her nails complemented this with tiny white flowers on a light pink

base. "3D floral nails are tiny works of art," says Shweta Ghadge, a nail artist at Mary Cohr Salon, adding, "They add texture and depth, elevating the creativity of a manicure."

Lizzo's glass 3D nails were particularly striking, featuring beige stiletto nails adorned with delicate glass-like petals, creating a flower reminiscent of the pink flower emoji. Celebrity nail artist Eri Ishizu designed this stunning look.

Annie Gonsalves, a nail artist at Apple Unisex Salon, notes, "3D floral nails are popular because they are unique and stylish, perfect for special events and making a fashion statement." Singer Dove Cameron has embraced this trend, incorporating 3D floral nails into her personal style for events like her birthday and the Met Gala. Experts recommend matching your nails to the seasons, for instance, bright mango colours for summer and delicate blossoms for winter. 3D nails are also a big hit for weddings, turning nails into stunning accessories.

"If you want to flaunt these nails daily, match them to your clothes and style. Choose colours and designs that complement most of your outfits," advises Gonsalves. Ghadge adds, "For long-lasting 3D floral nails, get the nail extensions removed or refilled every two to three weeks. Regular maintenance is key to keeping them looking great."

**Tips on nail care**

- **Keep nails clean:** Wash your nails with a soft brush and soap to remove dirt. Always dry your hands thoroughly after washing.
- **Moisturise regularly:** Apply moisturiser to your nails and cuticles to prevent cracking and dryness, stimulate nail growth, and stop gel or acrylic from lifting off the nail bed.
- **Handle with care:** Be gentle with your nails, when opening or lifting heavy objects. Avoid using your nails as tools, such as for opening cans or packages, to prevent breakage.
- **Maintain 3D floral nails:** These intricate designs require significant upkeep. Fix any broken pieces with professional help to keep them looking pretty.
- **Consider your routine:** Before getting 3D nails, think about your daily activities. If you're very active, choose simpler designs that won't break easily.
- **Start simple:** If you are new to nail art, start with simpler designs or limit them to one or two nails.

- **Stir-Fried Rind:** Treat the rind as any other vegetable. Stir-fry it to add crunch and nutritional value to your dish.
- **Juiced Rind:** Juice the rind along with the rest of the fruit or add it to smoothies.

Sushma Paul Berlia, Chairman, Apeejay Stya and Svrán Group, provided deep







Come Eid-al-Adha and the talks of kebabs and biryani fill the bylanes of some popular spots in Delhi. Beyond these famous shops are the new-age home chefs who have gained popularity for whipping up magic for the festival. Keeping in mind the ever-changing culinary demands of the city's foodies, some home chefs share what's cooking on their stoves today.

Due to the rising temperature in the Capital, this time we've noticed an increase in the demand for cold beverages hence offering Phalse ka Sharbat, Aam Panna and Thandai, too."

From our Rampuri cuisine, Gulaththi — rice kheer with smoky taste that's topped with dry fruits — is in demand.


