NEET-UG row: NTA must ‘act fair’, says apex court

The Supreme Court on Tuesday told the Centre and National Testing Agency (NTA) that if there is any negligence in conducting the NEET-UG, 2024 exam, it should be thoroughly dealt with. “If there is 0.001 per cent negligence on the part of anyone, it should be thoroughly dealt with. All these matters ought not to be treated as adversarial litigation,” observed a vacation bench of Justices Vikram Nath and SVN Bharti. The bench told counsels appearing for Centre and NTA that children have prepared for the exams and “we cannot forget their labour” for preparing for these exams. It told the counsel of NTA that as an agency which is conducting the examination, it must “act fair”. “If there is a mistake, say yes, this is a mistake, and this is the action we are going to take. At least that inspires confidence in your perfor-

mance,” the top court told NTA while adding that it expects timely action from them. Aspirants have raised the issue of leakage of the question paper, awarding compensatory marks and anomalies in the question of National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test-Under Graduate (NEET-UG) 2024. The apex court, while hearing fresh petitions relating to alleged paper leaks and malpractices in the NEET-UG, 2024 exam on May 5 this year, issued notices and sought a response from NTA within two weeks. It has tagged these pleas, along with several petitions

pending before it and posted them for hearing on July 8. Several petitions were filed in the apex court seeking direction to recall NEET-UG 2024 results and to conduct the examination afresh, alleging paper leakage and malpractices in the test held on May 5. Last week, the NTA told the Supreme Court that the scorecards of 1,563 NEET-UG 2024 candidates who got “grace marks” to compensate for the loss of time suffered while appearing for the exam will be cancelled and the students will have a chance to reappear for the exam.

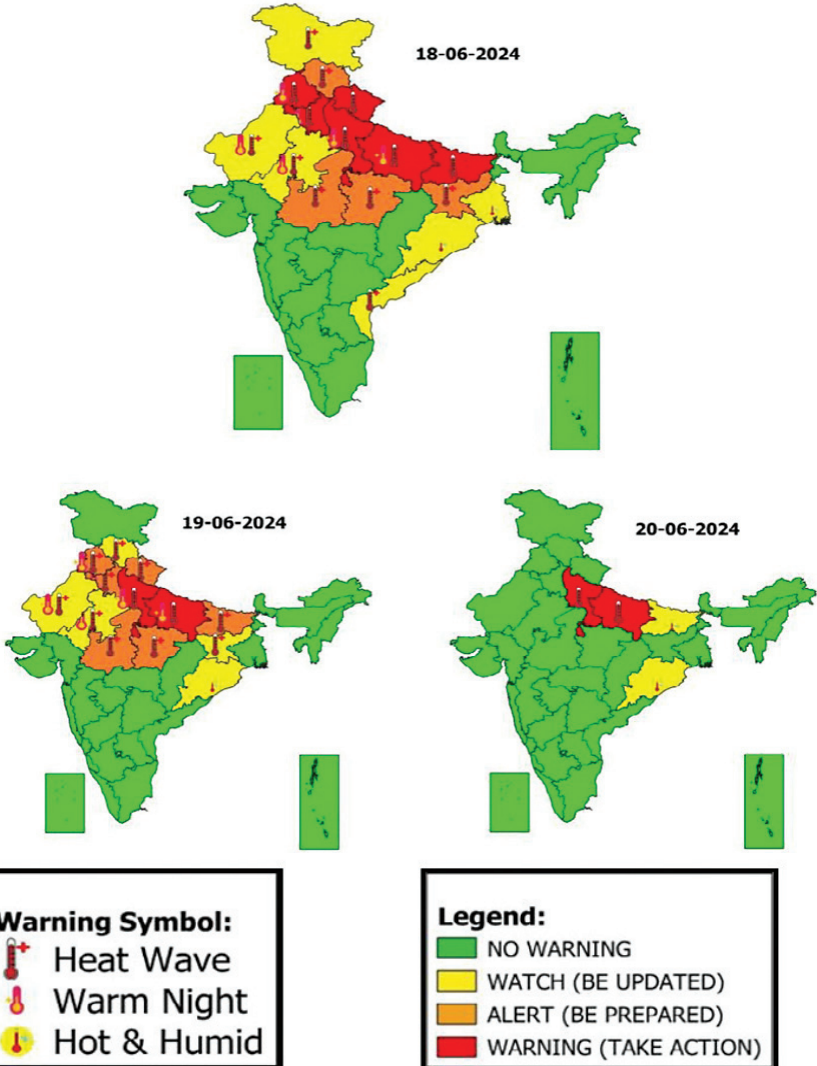
Data shows rail accidents have actually come down in last few years

In wake of the recent train accident at West Bengal’s Darjeeling district involving a passenger and a goods train, the government has stated that safety of passengers was its utmost priority and it has taken a series of step in the last few years to develop railway infrastructure, modernize the system and improve operational efficiency and safety. At least 10 people have died in the accident. This is the second major train accident in the last one year. In June 2023, three trains collided in Balasore district in Odisha leading to the death of 280 people. As per government sources, the railways has observed a steep decline in the number of consequential train accidents. In 2000-01, 473 accidents had taken place which went down to 40 in 2022-23. CONG DEMANDS RAILWAY MINISTER ASHWINI VAISHNAW’S RESIGNATION

Accusing the government of “destroying” Indian Railways, the Congress on Tuesday demanded Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw’s resignation in the wake of the Kanchanjunga Express accident and said that he has no moral right to remain in the position.

The opposition party also took a swipe at Vaishnaw for reaching the accident site riding pillion on a motorcycle, asking whether he is a rail minister or a ‘reel minister’.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said whenever there is a train accident, Modi government’s railway minister reaches the spot under the glare of cameras



and behaves as if everything is fine.

“Narendra Modi ji, tell us who should be held accountable, the Railway Minister or you?” the Congress chief asked.

Kharge posed seven questions to the government and demanded answers.

After a major accident like Balasore, why was not even a single kilometer of the much-hyped ‘Kavach’ anti-train collision system added, he asked.

“Why are nearly 3 lakh posts vacant in the Railways, why were they not filled in the last 10 years? According

to the NCRB (2022) report, 1,00,000 people have died in rail accidents between 2017 and 2021 alone! Who will take responsibility for this?” the Congress chief asked.

The Railway Board itself has admitted that the long working hours of loco pilots due to acute shortage of manpower are the main reason for the increasing number of accidents, he said and asked why were the posts not filled.

“In its 323rd report, the Parliamentary Standing Committee had criticised the Railways for the ‘neglect’ shown by the Railway Board towards the recommendations of the Commission of Railway Safety (CRS). It was underlined that the CRS investigates only 8%-10% of accidents, why was the CRS

not strengthened?” Kharge asked.

According to the CAG, why was 75% funding reduced in the ‘Rashtriya Rail Suraksha Kosh’ (RRSK), while Rs 20,000 crore was to be made available every year, he asked.

Why is this money being used by railway officials on unnecessary expenses and comfort facilities, Kharge further asked.

“Why has travelling by train in the common Sleeper Class become very expensive? Why has the number of Sleeper Coaches been reduced? The Railway Minister recently said to use police force against the people ‘overcrowding’ rail coaches. But does he not know that 2.7 crore people had to cancel their tickets last year due to abysmal shortage of

seats -- a direct result of Modi government’s policy to reduce coaches?” Kharge said.

Did the Modi government merge the railway budget with the general budget in 2017-18 to avoid any kind of accountability, he asked. “Self-glorification will not undo the criminal negligence perpetrated by the Modi government on the Indian Railways! Accountability needs to be fixed at the top,” Kharge said in his post on X. Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters here, Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinate said the Railways is perhaps the most preferred mode of transport as far as the middle class, lower middle class and the poor are concerned simply because it is the most economical means of transportation.

Dubai-bound flight receives bomb threat email before take-off, turns to be hoax

Adding to the series of hoax call incidents hitting the national capital, a Dubai-bound plane that was scheduled to take off from Delhi received a bomb threat via email, police said on Tuesday.

According to the Delhi Police, the bomb threat was received on Monday at 9:35 am.

“On June 17 at 9:35 am, an email was received in the Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL) office, IGI Airport with the threat of a bomb inside a Delhi to Dubai flight,” the police said.

They further informed that, after receiving the threat, necessary legal action was taken and nothing suspicious was found.

Last week, several museums in Delhi received bomb threats, which later turned out to be bogus, the police said.

Officials said that bomb threats were sent to around 10-15 museums including the Railway Museum in Delhi via emails.

The police reached the spots after receiving the information. Upon investigation, the officials found that the mail was a ‘hoax’ and no bomb was found in the museums.

Several institutions; schools, colleges, hospitals, and airports, in the national capital have received hoax bomb threats lately.

Two Delhi University colleges received hoax bomb threats in May.

In the same month, over 100 schools in the Delhi-NCR region received hoax bomb threats.

Earlier, in April, the High Court sought a detailed status report from the Delhi government on the hoax bomb threat email incidents in private schools.

Cong worker washes Patole’s feet

Maharashtra Congress president Nana Patole has come under criticism after a video surfaced on social media showing a party worker washing his muddy feet.

Bharatiya Janata Party has questioned the “culture” of the Congress over the incident.

The incident took place on Monday when Patole was on a tour of Akola district and attended a program in Wade-gaon. Following this he took a ‘darshan’ of the palanquin of Saint Gajanan Maharaj.

Patole apparently had walked through the mud at Nanasaheb Chincholkar Vidyalaya, where people had stopped for a ‘Palkhi Darshan’. On returning to his car, a man was seen washing the dirt away from the Congress leader’s feet.

A purported video of the incident soon surfaced on social media.

Addressing a press conference today, the Maharashtra Congress chief said, “...I am not hiding yesterday’s incident.



The worker was pouring water (on my feet). There was no tap - ‘Har ghar mein nal, har ghar mein jal’, otherwise I would have used water from the tap...”

BJP Mumbai’s official handle on X and wrote in Marathi, “What is unfortunate is that the Congress is repeatedly insulting the workers who fight for their lives. It’s a shame that Maharashtra Congress President Nana Patole made an activist wash his feet because his feet was muddy. Is this the culture of Congress?”

BJP spokesperson Shehzad Poonawalla termed the action as Congress “Nawabi

feudal shehzada” mindset and demanded the party and Patole himself should apologize. “Congress has a Nawabi Feudal Shehzada mindset. Maharashtra Congress President Nana Patole’s gets his leg and feet washed by a party worker in Akola. They treat Janta and workers like Ghulam & themselves like Kings & Queens. Imagine how they treat people without coming to power! What will they do if they by mistake come to power. Nana Patole must apologize & so must Congress,” Poonawalla said on X.

Kanchanjunga Express reaches Sealdah with 850 passengers

The unaffected coaches of the Kanchanjunga Express, which was hit by a goods train near New Jalpaiguri, arrived at Sealdah station here on Tuesday morning with nearly 850 passengers, according to an Eastern Railway official.

“Around 800 to 850 passengers arrived at Sealdah at 3.16 am,” ER spokesperson Kausik Mitra said.

The unaffected coaches began their onward journey from the accident site on Monday afternoon.

The passengers were provided with medical facilities, food, and water at various stations, including Malda Town and Sealdah, he added.

Kolkata Mayor Firhad Hakim, West Bengal Transport Minister Snehasis



Chakraborty, and Divisional Railway Manager of Sealdah Division Deepak Nigam were present at Sealdah station to help passengers reach home safely, Mitra said.

Train 13174 Kanchanjunga Express from Agartala, scheduled to reach Sealdah at 7.20 pm on Monday, arrived eight hours behind schedule.

The transport department provided 16 buses and 60

cars to transport passengers home, he added.

Various railway employee unions have objected to the railway ministry’s initial response to the West Bengal train tragedy when it prima facie blamed the driver of the goods train that hit the Kanchanjunga Express from the rear for the accident.

The employees’ unions said that squarely blaming

the driver, who is not alive to defend himself, amounts to making him a scapegoat of the systematic shortcomings of the Railways.

“It was highly insensitive on the part of the Railway Board to say that the driver overshot the red signal which caused the accident,” Shiva Gopal Mishra, general secretary of All India Railway Men’s Federation (AIRF), said.

“My advice to the Railway Board is that in such cases, instead of blaming any staff, they should wait till the probe concludes. I don’t think that the driver was solely responsible for the accident,” he said.

Mishra referred to various operating norms and questioned why the driver was authorised to cross all red signals in the section when there was a train in between

them.

“The authority to cross the red signals should have been given only when the section (distance between the two stations) was clear and there was no train in between,” he said.

The Railway Board admitted on Monday that there was a signal failure between the Ranipatra Railway Station and Chatter Hat Junction between which the accident took place.

Chief Commissioner of Railway Safety, Northeast Frontier Railway, Janak Kumar Garg, will hold a statutory inquiry in connection with the Kanchenjunga Express tragedy.

The inquiry will be held on Wednesday at the ADRM/ NJP’s chamber from 10 am onwards. The inquiry may also be extended if required, according to a press release.

PM Modi to participate in International Yoga Day event in Srinagar on June 21

BJP attacks Rahul Gandhi for vacating Wayanad constituency

“He (Rahul Gandhi) deceived them and today, after they have in good faith, supported him and given him one more chance to do something for the people, he is washing his hands and saying I am going to Raebareli. It is a betrayal of the people of Wayanad. She (Priyanka Gandhi) is making her political debut in a seat that is going to be extremely easy for her to win because IUML supports her,” he added.

Muraleedharan alleged that Priyanka Gandhi has no connection with Kerala.

“It’s an insult to the entire state of Kerala and especially to the people of Wayanad. Now, instead of Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi is going to contest from Wayanad. It means that the way Amethi and Rae Bareli are family constituencies, the same way Wayanad will be their family constituency. Why Priyanka Gandhi, who has no connection with Kerala, is contesting from Wayanad?” he asked.

Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge announced Priyanka Gandhi’s candidature from Wayanad at a special press conference on Monday, after Rahul Gandhi announced that he would resign as an MP from Wayanad and will keep the Raebareli constituency.

Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday formally informed the Lok Sabha Speaker’s office about retaining the Raebareli Lok Sabha seat and vacating the Wayanad Lok Sabha seat.

BJP fact-finding panel meets post-poll violence victims at South 24 Parganas

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) fact-finding committee that has been formed to investigate post-poll violence in West Bengal met post-poll violence victims in South 24 Parganas district and listened to their grievances.

The members of the fact-finding committee who interacted with the victims include MLA Agnimitra Paul, former Union minister and MP Ravi Shankar Prasad and former Tripura Chief Minister and Rajya Sabha MP Biplab Kumar Deb.

Speaking to the accompanying media crew while visiting the shop of a middle-aged woman whose shop was allegedly vandalised by Trinamool Congress goons, Ravi Shankar Prasad said that her only fault is that her



son supports the BJP.

"She (victim) belongs to the Dalit community....The only fault of hers is that her son supports BJP. Shame on you. Please stop talking about Constitution. This is too much. I condemn this. If you have any shame left, immediately reconstruct the roof of her shop. Your goons destroyed her shop," Prasad said.

Biplab Kumar Deb, a member of the fact-finding committee said, "She (victim) fears that TMC goons might

come to her place and threaten her for giving statement to the media. What is this rule? This cannot go on."

"The results were announced on June 4. The next day goons broke her shop. Her only fault is that her son was a candidate for the BJP in the panchayat elections," he added. When the victim declined to narrate her ordeal to the media out of fear that it might put her son in harm's way, Deb said, "Look at your face, Mamata Banerjee. People

cannot speak in fear. Her shop through which she makes a living has been demolished but she prefers not to speak in fear that her son may be killed."

Deb dared the TMC to send their goons while the BJP fact-finding team are at her place. "Send your goons now. We have come. Why are you hiding like thieves now?...They are depriving poor of their rights," he said.

The former Tripura Chief Minister also hit out at the ruling Trinamool Congress government saying that they have done nothing for the victim and on top of that, they are depriving her of livelihood by destroying her shop. "When asked if she has got any benefit from the Trinamool government, she said she has not been given anything.

Assam CM requests Mamata to hand over IIT Kharagpur student death case to CBI

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Tuesday requested his West Bengal counterpart Mamata Banerjee to hand over the death case of the IIT Kharagpur student to the Central Bureau of Investigation for a transparent and fair investigation.

He said that the second autopsy report of the deceased student showed a gunshot and stabbing wound on his neck.

The case pertains to the death of IIT Kharagpur student Faizan Ahmed who was found dead in his hostel in October last year.

"Late Faizan Ahmed was found dead in his hostel room on October 14, 2022. Although his death was claimed by the college authority to be a case of suicide, his bereaved parents



had observed injury marks on his body which indicated that it was a case of homicide. I had, therefore, requested you for a thorough investigation into the unnatural death of the bright young student," CM Sarma stated in the letter.

"It is now reported that, as directed by the Calcutta High Court, a second autopsy was carried out by exhuming Late Faizan

Ahmed's body. According to the second forensic report, there was a gunshot wound on the upper left side of Faizan Ahmed's neck and a stab wound on the right side of his neck," he added.

The Assam Chief Minister further said that given the "shocking findings" of the latest forensic report, the perpetrators of the crime must be brought to justice.

Cyber gang that cheated AKT varsity of Rs 120 cr arrested

Uttar Pradesh's Lucknow police has busted a cyber gang that cheated Rs 120 crore from Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam Technical University's (AKTU) account by creating fake mail IDs on behalf of AKTU and opening bank account in Union Bank of India.

By creating fake mail IDs of AKTU, the fraudsters had got Rs 120 crore transferred from AKTU's State Bank of India account. The mastermind of the gang disguised himself as the Chief Account Officer of AKTU and started doing transactions by opening a savings account at Union Bank of India in the name of AKTU. Informing about the matter, Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) East, Prabal Pratap Singh said

that out of Rs 120 crore, the police team has managed to recover Rs 119 crore. He said, "An amount of Rs 120 crore from AKTU's account was transferred to Shree Shradha Education and Charitable Trust of Ahmedabad, out of which Rs 119 crore has been recovered and the remaining money is also being recovered." All the accused in the case are being taken into custody and presented before the court. Meanwhile, the Lucknow Police also took to its official X handle and posted about the cyber fraud incident and said, "The police station cyber crime police team arrested seven cyber criminals who had cheated Rs 120 crores by sending emails using fake mail ID of AKTU and posing as official operators by giving fake authority letter and KYC form and opening an account in Union Bank."

Ex-Andhra CM Jagan Reddy calls for ballot papers instead of EVMs

Former Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, asserted on Tuesday that in "upholding the true spirit of our democracy," ballot papers must be used in place of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs).

In a post on X, YS Jagan said, "Just as justice should not only be served but should also appear to have been served, so should democracy not only prevail but must appear to be prevalent undoubtedly. In electoral practices across the world, in almost every advanced democracy, paper ballots are used, not EVMs. We too must move towards the same in upholding the true spirit of our democracy."

Several opposition leaders are raising questions about the EVMs and pressing



about using ballot papers instead in the electoral process. Maharashtra Congress President Nana Patole on Monday said that ballot papers must replace EVMs and emphasized that the Congress party has been constantly raising the demand for ballot papers but the centre has shown reluctance.

"Voting is our fundamental right. There is a question in front of people if their vote gets delivered in favour of the candidate whom they

cast their vote for. Why doesn't the central government use ballot paper for voting?" Patole pointed out.

"The developed countries including the US and Japan have been practicing voting on a ballot paper. Then why not in India? Congress has been asking the same question repeatedly," Patole said. Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Priyanka Chaturvedi on Monday said that it is the responsibility of the Election Commission to clear the doubt of voters in this country adding that the "constitutional methods" of the country should not be affected and the election process should be "free and fair."

CPI General Secretary D Raja said that the credibility of EVMs has become an issue and people are questioning it.

Karnataka HC grants interim bail to Bhavani Revanna in kidnapping case

The Karnataka High Court has granted anticipatory bail to Janata Dal (Secular) suspended MP Prajwal Revanna's mother, Bhavani Revanna in a kidnapping case related to the obscene video case. The bail exempts her from arrest.

Krishna Dixit, a single judge bench of the special representative court, granted bail to Bhavani Revanna.

While granting bail, the court also said the petitioner must not visit Mysore and Hassan.

Earlier on June 15, the court extended anticipatory bail granted to Bhavani, in a kidnapping case related to the obscene video case.

The bench, headed by Dixit, completed the arguments and reserved the verdict.

The court ordered the extension of interim anticipa-



tory bail granted earlier until the next order.

Earlier on June 7, the Karnataka High Court granted anticipatory bail to Bhavani in the case.

The petitioner attended the hearing for three days, as ordered by the court.

The petitioner said, "Bhavani is not cooperating with the investigation. Everything is false information. No correct answer is given to any question. Bhavani

Revanna is the main accused in the whole case. She played an important role in the abduction of the victim. In case of non-cooperation, she should be detained and interrogated. Therefore, already granted anticipatory bail should be cancelled."

In this case, the bench asked the investigation authority to explain the reason for which the detention should be conducted.

While the BJP has nominated Sheetal Angural from Jalandhar West (SC) assembly constituency, in West Bengal, Manas Kumar Ghosh has been nominated from Raiganj, Manoj Kumar Biswas from Ranaghat Dakshin (SC), Binay Kumar Biswas from Bagda (SC) and Kalyan Chaubey Bhattacharya from Manikpala.

Earlier in the month, the Election Commission announced the dates to hold bye-elections to fill vacancies in 13 assembly constituencies of seven states.

'Probe stock market manipulation ahead of LS poll results declaration'

A delegation of Trinamool Congress (TMC) Shiv Sena (UBT) and Nationalist Congress Party (SCP) leaders met with officials of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) on Tuesday and demanded a probe into the alleged stock market manipulation ahead of the declaration of Lok Sabha election results.

The leaders protested and raised slogans outside SEBI



over the alleged stock market manipulation.

Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Arvind Sawant said, "The agencies because of which Rs

13 lakh crore has been lost of the common man, the same agencies are working for FII and exit polls. That linkage with them is a serious thing

to be investigated..."

TMC leader Kalyan Banerjee said, "...We will take the matter in the monsoon session. PM Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah and Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman should resign..."

Earlier in the day, the TMC delegation met NCP (SP) President Sharad Pawar who supported their demand for an investigation into the alleged stock market manipulation following the exit polls.

NCP (SCP) leader Nirmala Samant Prabhavalkar said "...SEBI is a regulating authority which controls the stock exchange. If there is any complaint about anything unethical or illegal, there is only one institution that can intervene is the stock exchange..."

Ahead of their meeting with SEBI officials the leaders of Trinamool Congress, Shiv Sena (UBT) met with Nationalist Congress Party chief Sharad Pawar.

Earlier, TMC Rajya Sabha

member Saket Gokhale wrote to financial markets regulator SEBI, alleging "manipulation" in trading activities, a day after private exit polls were announced.

In a letter to the Securities and Exchange of India Chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch dated June 11, the Trinamool parliamentarian registered his complaint with the regulator, what he termed "stock market manipulation".

Gokhale has specifically demanded an investigation

into statements made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah during the poll campaign, where they apparently "advised" people to invest in stocks hinting at positive election results for BJP.

During TV interviews, both Modi and Shah had asserted that the Indian stock markets will trade firm soon after election results, which was inferred by many in the Opposition, including TMC and Congress, as stock ad-

vices.

"PM Modi and BJP do not run a brute-majority government anymore. Along with SEBI action, this matter will also be taken up in Parliament if required," Gokhale wrote on his X timeline, attaching the letter he wrote to the SEBI. "There was something very rotten about stock market fluctuations on 3rd and 4th Jun after rigged exit polls. The statements by Modi and Shah also contributed to losses of investors," said Gokhale.

Blistering heat makes life miserable across North India

Large parts of northern and eastern India remained in the grip of a sweltering heat wave on Tuesday, driving power demands to record highs with warmer-than-usual nights further exacerbating people's distress.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) said heat wave to severe heat wave conditions prevailed in parts of Uttar Pradesh, south Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Punjab and pockets

of north Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar and the Jammu division.

Maximum temperatures ranged from 44 to 46 degrees Celsius in many parts of Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, and some parts of north Madhya Pradesh, south Bihar and north Rajasthan.

The blistering heat has left a large number of people scrambling for water, with storage levels in reservoirs and rivers hitting record lows. The shortage of water for irrigation is impacting agriculture in some areas.

The power grids are under immense pressure and there has been an increase in incidents of short circuits and fires.

Delhi, which is facing a severe water crisis, recorded a maximum temperature of 44 degrees Celsius over five notches above the normal. The minimum temperature in the city was 33.8 degrees Celsius, at least six notches above what is normal for this time of the year.

The national capital's peak power demand on Tuesday afternoon reached 8,647 MW, the highest ever for

the city. According to officials, cooling load due to the increased use of air conditioners and other cooling appliances amid the relentless heat wave has led to the record rise in power demand.

Hospitals in Delhi-NCR have been seeing an influx of patients with complaints of heat stroke and heat exhaustion as the mercury continued to soar, with doctors advising the elderly and immuno-compromised patients to avoid stepping outdoors.

IMD officials said high

minimum temperatures or warm nights are exacerbating the impact of the deadly heat.

High night temperatures are considered dangerous because the body does not get a chance to cool down. Increasing nighttime temperature is more common in cities because of the urban heat island effect, in which metro areas are significantly hotter than their surroundings. At least 10 places in Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Punjab and Haryana reached or surpassed 45 degrees Celsius on Tuesday, with Orai in Uttar

Pradesh being the warmest place in the country at 46.4 degrees Celsius.

India is experiencing one of its hottest summers this time. Multiple heat waves have pushed millions in the country to their limits and many states have reported heat-related deaths.

According to IMD, around 40 per cent of the country has recorded double the number of heat wave days than it usually does.

In Rajasthan, Sangaria was the hottest place in the state with a maximum temperature of 44.9 degrees Celsius.

PM wants Indian products on every dining table in world

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said he hopes to see Indian food products on dining tables across the world.

Addressing a PM Kisan Samman Sammelan here, Modi said, "We have to think about the global market. We have to become self-reliant in pulses and oilseeds and a leader in agricultural exports. Look, 'Langda' mango of Banaras, Jaunpur's radish, Ghazipur's lady finger, and many such products are reaching the foreign market today."

He said that with the 'one district one product' initiative and the formation of hubs at the district level, exports are increasing.

"Now, we have to take the country to new heights in the global market of packaged food. My dream is that there should be some food products from India on every dining table in the

world," he said.

He also said production of 'zero defect' food items should be encouraged.

Noting the presence of women in large numbers, Modi underlined their importance and support in agriculture and said, "Without mothers and sisters, it is impossible to imagine farming."

"Therefore, now the role of mothers and sisters is being expanded in giving a new direction to agriculture. Like Namo Drone Didi, the Krishi Sakhi programme is one such effort. We have seen the work of sisters as ASHA workers. We have seen the role of sisters as bank sakhis. Now we will see agriculture getting new strength in the form of Krishi Sakhi," he said.

At the event, Modi released the Rs 20,000-crore 17th installment of the PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KSN) for more than 9.26 crore farmers.

He discussed in detail the

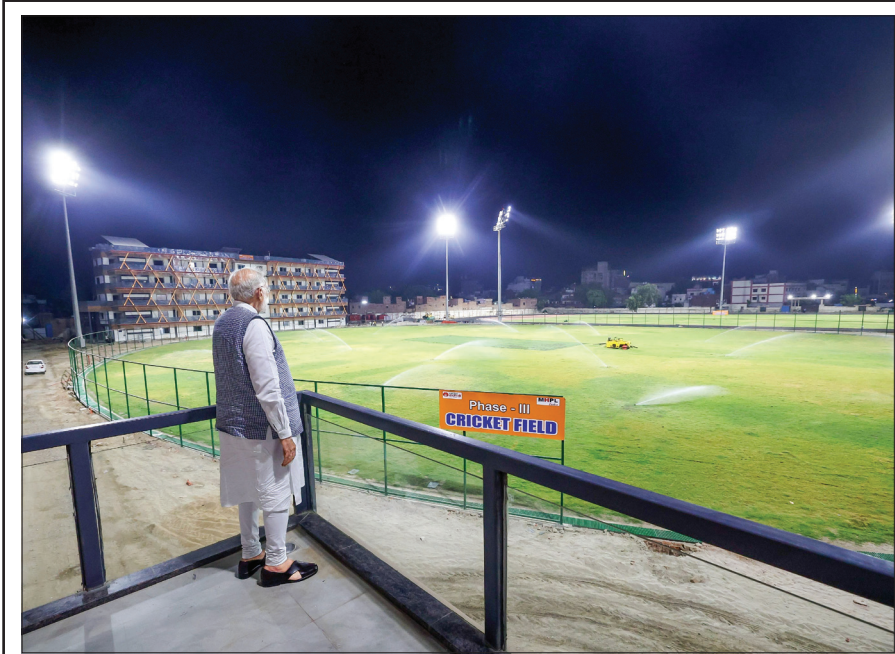
benefits of agricultural work and the schemes being run by the Centre and the state government for farmers in Varanasi.

The Prime Minister also said that "Banas Dairy is going to add 16,000 more cattle farmers of Kashi in the next one and a half years. Last year, a bonus of more than Rs 100 crore went into the accounts of cattle farmers".

"The government is continuously working to increase the income of fish farmers in Banaras. It is enriching them through the PM Matsya Sampada Yojana. A modern fish market is being constructed in Chandauli at a cost of Rs 70 crore," he said.

Modi expressed happiness that PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojna is in demand in Varanasi.

Around 40,000 people have registered for the scheme and 2,500 houses have already got solar panels and work is ongoing for 3,000 houses, he said.



After the day's programmes in Kashi, which included the programme to hand over Kisan Samman Nidhi, Ganga Aarti and prayers at the Kashi Vishwanath Temple, PM Modi undertook a surprise visit to review the work underway to build the stadium and sports complex in Varanasi. Data shows rail accidents have actually come down

2014, the average number of consequential train accidents was 171 per annum, which significantly declined to 68 per annum during the period from 2014 to 2024.

Officials pointed out the establishment of the the Rashtriya Rail Sanraksha Kosh (RRSK) in 2017-18 with a substantial corpus of Rs. 1 lakh crore over five years. This fund was dedicated to the replacement, renewal, and upgradation of critical safety assets.

Similarly, in the realm of technology, the KAVACH system has been introduced for enhanced safety. Adopted as the National Automatic Train Protection (ATP) system, KAVACH ensured safer operations by automatically applying brakes when necessary, even in adverse weather conditions. By 2024, KAVACH had been implemented on 1,465

kilometers of track and 121 locomotives, safeguarding countless journeys.

Sources said due to the government's vision to make railway train accidents free, by January 2019, all unmanned level crossings on Broad Gauge routes were eliminated.

To further enhance safety, 6586 stations had been provided with Electronic Interlocking (EI) by May 31, 2024. Additionally, Automatic Block Signalling (ABS) was implemented on 4111 Rkm of High-Density Routes by Oct 2023. Safety at level crossing gates was addressed by interlocking 11137 gates with signals during the same time period.

Official records show that all locomotives are now equipped with Vigilance Control Devices (VCD) to ensure the alertness of loco pilots, and GPS-based Fog Safety Devices (FSD) have

been installed in fog-affected areas.

In the field of track safety, advanced Track Recording Cars have been introduced which are faster and more reliable. Complete track circuiting has already been provided at 6609 stations by the end of May 2023. To verify track safety, ultrasonic testing of rails is being conducted to detect flaws.

In the field of bridge safety, a Bridge Management System (BMS), a web-based IT application, has been developed to provide 24x7 access to bridge information which helps in bridge inspection. Other measures, such as continuous water level monitoring, drone inspections, and 3D scanning of riverbeds, have been introduced.

To improve the safety of rolling stock, advanced technologies like the On-line Monitoring of Rolling Stock System (OMRS) and

Wheel Impact Load Detector (WILD) have been adopted for predictive maintenance. Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) tags are being fitted to rolling stock for automatic tracking.

The replacement of conventional ICF design coaches with LHB design coaches is ongoing at frantic pace, sources said.

The railway ministry is also investing significantly in installation of fire detection systems in AC coaches and fire extinguishers in non-AC coaches.

Details shared by officials comparing the safety performance parameters vis-à-vis 2004-14 and 2014-24 shows that the expenditure in safety related work has increased 2.5 times, from Rs. 70273 crore in 2004-14, to Rs. 1.78 lakh crore during 2014-24.

Similarly, track Renewal Expenditure increased 2.33 times, from Rs. 47018 crore

in 2004-14 to Rs. 109659 crore during 2014-24. Expenditure on Level Crossing (LC) Elimination has increased 6.4 times, from Rs. 5726 crore 2004-14, to Rs. 36699 crore during 2014-24.

Construction of Road Over Bridges has increased 2.9 times, from 4148 during 2004-14 to 11945 during 2014-24. Also, the expenditure on Bridge Rehabilitation has increased 2 times, from Rs. 3919 crore during 2004-14 to Rs. 8008 crore during 2014-24.

Also, Electronic Interlocking (Stations) have increased 3.5 times, from 837 during 2004-14 to 2964 during 2014-24. Automatic Block Signalling has increased 1.67 times from 1486 km during 2004-14 to 2497 km during 2014-24.

Similarly, fog Pass Safety Devices have increased 219 times, from 90 as on March 14 to 19742 as on March 2024.

Regarding the TDP, there

are two potential scenarios. If there is a consensus on D Purandeswari, the TDP might offer the Deputy Speaker post to another BJP ally. If no agreement is reached on Purandeswari, the BJP will propose other candidates, and the TDP could be offered the Deputy Speaker position.

Om Birla is making significant efforts from the BJP's side. After Union Home Minister Amit Shah and BJP President JP Nadda visited Birla's official residence on Monday, speculation grew that Birla might get another chance.

WATER REMAINS SCARCE COMMODITY

Long lines of people were seen queuing up on Tuesday to fetch water from tankers across parts of the national capital, as the city sizzled in the summer heat.

Morning visuals showed people from Kusumpur Pahadi in Vasant Vihar, Geeta Colony, and Okhla area seen standing in queues, holding onto cans and buckets and crowding around water tankers.

Amid soaring temperatures, these scenes have become a daily occurrence in the national capital in many areas since the start of the summer season this year

A local resident from Okhla described her plight and said that their whole day goes into fetching water for the family.

“The situation is much worse here. Only two to three tankers come here in a day. The whole day goes into fetching water, when will we do the rest of the work?” she said.

Chanakypuri’s Sanjay Camp, Geeta Colony in East Delhi, Patel Nagar, Mehrauli, and Chhatarpur are some of the areas in the national capital that have been affected by severe water crisis.



Delhi Jal Board providing less water for NDMC area, says NDMC

New Delhi: Kuljeet Singh Chahal, a member of the New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) on Tuesday targeted the Delhi Jal Board and said that the council is facing an acute water problem due to a shortage of water supply being provided by the Board during the past few days.

Out of three Water Treatment Plants, the Delhi Jal Board has not provided a single drop of water in the Wazirabad Plant, due to which hospitals like Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia (RML) Hospital, Lady Harding Hospital are facing problems, the press release by NDMC said.

Chahal said that the minimum committed quantity of water supposed to be provided by the Delhi Jal Board to the NDMC is 125 million of litres per day (MLD). Water is being provided to NDMC by the Delhi Jal Board from mainly three Water Treatment Plants–Wazirabad, Chandrawal and Sonia Vihar.

Meanwhile, the water crisis has also incited a political storm in the national capital, with both BJP and AAP at loggerheads.

The Aam Aadmi Party has accused the Bharatiya Janata Party of “orchestrating” the shortage in the national capital by trying to block the flow of water into the national capital.

The BJP has been blaming the AAP government for the water crisis saying that it did not take effective action against the tanker mafia who pilfer water. It even held protests in different parts of Delhi against the water crisis. Congress, which had

fought the recent Lok Sabha elections in alliance with the AAP in the national capital, has also held protests in the national capital.

Earlier on Monday, Delhi Water Minister Atishi appealed Haryana government to release the water and solve the problems of the people of Delhi amid the escalating water crisis and sweltering heat. Addressing the media persons, Atishi said, “Today we are here at Wazirabad barrack. Water from here is sent to various water treatment plants including Wazirabad, Chandrawal, and Okhla. Currently, no water is being released into the Wazirabad barrage. The

water level has stepped so low that now the river bed is visible. Again, we are appealing to the Haryana government to release the water and solve the problems of the people of Delhi.”

“Till the time Haryana doesn’t release water into the Yamuna, water shortage will continue in Delhi.

Munak Canal receives very little water and on the other hand, Wazirabad Barrage receives no water. The water from Yamuna goes to water treatment and is then resent to Delhi’s public after re-treatment. But there is no water in Yamuna, the reason why the supply is halted. I can just stand before the Haryana government with folded hands and appeal to save the lives of Delhi’s public,” she added.

On the other hand, Haryana Chief Minister took a potshot at Delhi’s government for “neglecting” and “mismanaging” the issue of water supply .

Feels-like temp exceeds 50°C

A severe heat wave engulfed Delhi, with temperatures peaking at 45.2 degrees Celsius on Monday, according to the India Meteorological Department’s Safdarjung observatory centre. The weather office, however, has forecast some relief from June 19 onwards. Delhi remains under a ‘red’ alert through Tuesday, with temperatures expected to reach 45 degrees Celsius again. The Safdarjung observatory, the main weather station in Delhi, recorded a high of 45.2 degrees Celsius, which is 6.4 degrees above the seasonal average.

The heat index, or the feels-like temperature, in Delhi surged to 50 degrees Celsius on Monday and could remain in the range of 49-51 on Tuesday, according to IMD. Thereafter, on Wednesday, the heat index could drop to 47-49 range.

These extreme temperatures pose a significant risk of heat illness for individuals exposed to the sun for prolonged periods or those engaging in strenuous activities.

Amid heatwave, 7 people found dead with no injury marks

Seven people were found dead in different parts of Noida in the last 24 hours without any visible signs of injury amid heat wave, with police on Tuesday saying the cause of deaths is yet to be ascertained.

According to police, an unidentified person, believed to be a ragpicker, was found dead near Gate No. 5 of Amity University in the Sector 126 area, while a 60-year-old man, appearing to be a nomad, was found dead in Sector 1, Noida.

“In Sector 58, two bodies were recovered in the Green Belt park near Khoda T-point. No visible injuries were observed on the bodies. The local police inspected the scene and sent

the bodies for postmortem,” police said in a statement. “Yesterday (Monday), another unidentified person was found unconscious in Sector 61. The individual was rushed to a hospital, where he died during treatment,” it said. In the Expressway area, Brahmanand, 51, a security guard, “suddenly” fell ill and

was admitted to a hospital, where he was declared dead by doctors. In another case, Shyamlal Bashak, a 45-year-old labourer from West Bengal currently residing in Greater Noida, also fell ill and was declared dead upon arrival at the Community Health Centre in Bhan-gel, the statement said.

Vulnerable populations, such as infants, the elderly, and people with chronic diseases, are particularly at risk.

Heatwave to severe heat wave conditions are likely over many parts of Uttar Pradesh and some parts of Haryana-

Chandigarh-Delhi as people in various parts of the country continue to grapple with severe heat conditions.

Heatwaves drive power demand to record high of 8,647 mw

New Delhi: The extreme heatwave continues to push Delhi’s power demand northwards. According to the State Load Dispatch Centre data, at 3:22 PM on Tuesday, Delhi’s peak power demand clocked 8,647 MW. It is the highest ever in the history of the national capital. Delhi’s peak power demand clocked 8000 MW for the first time on May 22, 2024. Since then, Delhi’s peak power demand has crossed the 8000 MW mark on 8 occasions.

Before the records of 2024, Delhi’s previous high of 7695 MW was recorded on June 29, 2022. Last year, Delhi’s peak power demand was 7438 MW. Tuesday marks the 30th day in a row when Delhi’s peak power demand has crossed the 7000 MW mark. Delhi’s peak power demand never crossed 7000 MW during the month of May 2023 and crossed the 7000 MW mark in May only once in 2022. It is also important to remember that barring last year, when Delhi’s demand peaked in August, it usually peaks during late June and early July. But the trend has changed this year. The surge in power demand can be attributed to weather conditions that led residents to use more air conditioning and coolers, leading to an increase in electricity consumption.

Influx of heat stroke patients in hospitals

New Delhi: Hospitals in Delhi-NCR are seeing an influx of patients with complaints of heat stroke and heat exhaustion as the mercury continues to soar in the national capital, with doctors advising the elderly and immunocompromised patients to avoid stepping outdoors. Last month, Delhi Health Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj had announced that the Delhi government-run hospitals will reserve two beds each for heatstroke patients while five beds will be reserved at the LNJP Hospital. Dr Ritu Saxena, deputy medical superintendent, LNJP Hospital, said, “We are getting eight to 10 patients every day. There are serious patients also who require ICU admission. Yesterday, we got two patients who were hospitalised and prior to that we had four ICU admissions. “The patients who are developing severe illness are those who are elderly or have co-morbidities like hypertension, diabetes and Coronary Artery Disease (CAD). We are also getting few patients from other hospitals like Babu Jagjivan Ram Hospital and Satyawadi Raja Harish Chandra Hospital,” she said. The senior doctor said the rise has been in proportion with the intensifying of heatwave conditions.

NEET exam row: AAP protests, demands SC-monitored probe

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leaders staged a protest at the Jantar Mantar here on Tuesday against the alleged irregularities in the NEET exam. The AAP leaders demanded the cancellation of the exam and a Supreme Court monitored probe over the alleged irregularities in the conduct of the test. The protesters burnt copies of the NEET paper and raised slogans against the Central government.

AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh lashed out at the Centre and alleged the NEET exam shows its corruption.

“The Ministry of Education and the NTA under it, along



with its leaders in BJP-ruled states, have messed up with the future of lakhs of children of the country. Therefore, our demand is that this NEET exam should be cancelled and the exam should be held again,” he said.

Singh claimed that the NEET results were to come on June 14, but were released 10 days earlier on June 4.

“So that the media remains busy with the election results and there is no discussion

about the BJP’s paper leak. There should be an investigation as to why the NEET results were released on June 4 instead of June 14,” he said. The AAP leader exhorted the youth and students of this country to come forward and raise their voice.

“Today we have raised your voice on the road. The Parliament session is going to start from June 24 and the session of the Rajya Sabha will start from June 27.

Massive fire breaks out at 3-storey factory in Shahdara

Man killed in Burari area, accused held

A 32-year-old man was killed and robbed of Rs 5,500 by one of his friend in Burari area of north Delhi, police on Tuesday said. The accused has been identified as Love (21), they said.

“On June 11, at 7:18 pm, a PCR call was received at the Burari police station regarding a man lying in an injured condition. The injured was shifted to the BJRM Hospital by the staff wherein he was declared brought dead by the doctors,” said Deputy Commissioner of Police (north) Manoj Kumar Meena.

The police initially suspected the case as an accidental death and registered an FIR, he added.

Subsequently, the spot was examined forensically.

“On June 14, the deceased was identified as Neeraj of Sant Nagar area in Burari...A case of 302 (murder) of the IPC was registered. During the course of investigation, the family members revealed that the deceased was unmarried and had left the house alone at about 12.30 am on June 10 under the influence of alcohol carrying his mobile phone and some cash with him,” the DCP said. The police checked 100 CCTVs during the investigation. The deceased was seen going with two persons on a motorcycle, police said.

“We traced the motorcycle and apprehended Love and Rajan Kumar (22). Both Love and Rajan were roaming in

the town under the influence of alcohol on the intervening night of June 10 and 11. As the deceased and they were known to each other, they convinced him to come along and have some more drinks. All three went near Ashok Vihar,” said the DCP.

They purchased liquor and returned near Mukundpur Flyover and drank again. Rajan left the spot, leaving Neeraj and Love.

The accused Love was having knowledge that Neeraj is carrying cash with him, said the DCP. The accused Love with the intention to rob murdered Neeraj by hitting his head multiple times with a cemented beam lying on the roadside “We recovered Rs 2,500 and robbed mobile phone from the accused.

Airport launches ‘Quick Drop Solution’ to reduce luggage waiting time

It is a one-step process where the need for the board-

ing pass or biometric validation is removed since these details are already available on the baggage tag. This reduces the processing time from about a minute to 30 seconds.

2 ‘Thak-Thak’ gang members held; theft case solved, claims police

The male accused has been identified as Kunal (23), a resident of Madangir in Delhi. However, police have not revealed the name of the 38-year-old woman accused

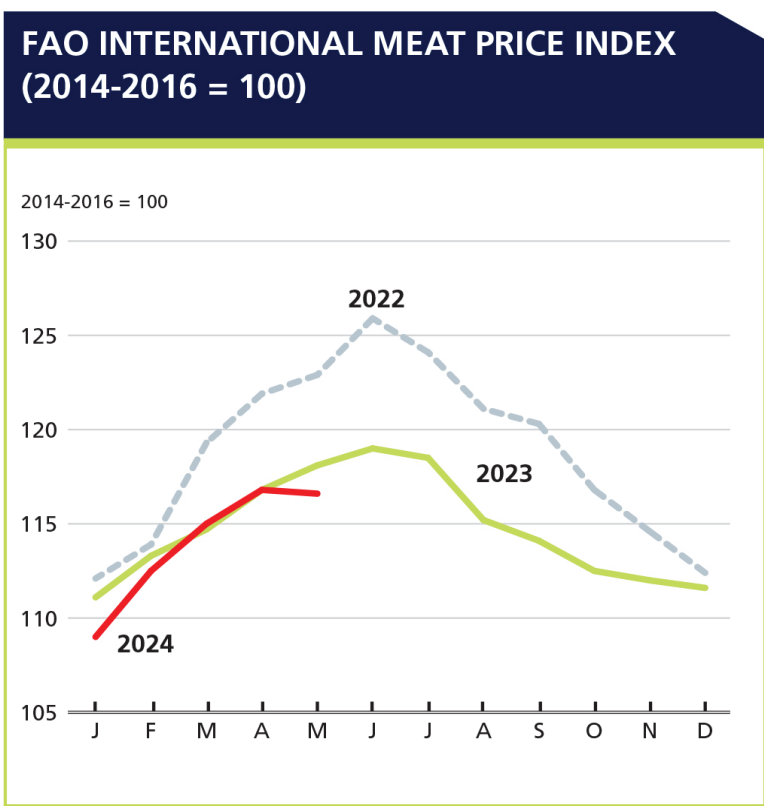
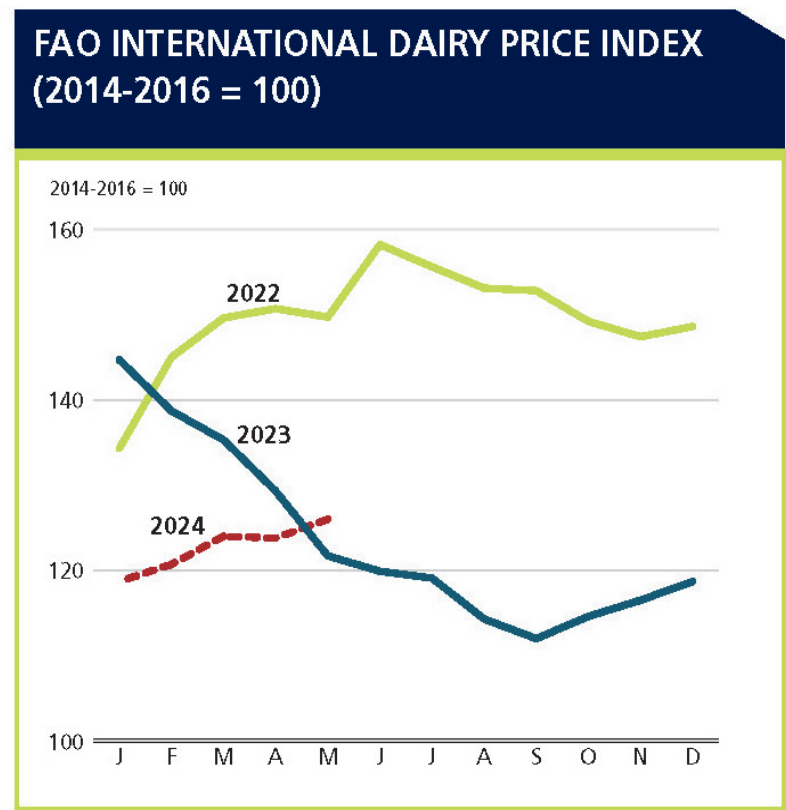

POWER UTILITIES ASKED TO BE ON HIGH ALERT AS DEMAND RISES

The power ministry on Tuesday said it has asked all utilities “to maintain a high state of alert and minimise forced outages of equipment” amid heatwave pushing electricity demand, especially in the northern region where Monsoon is yet to arrive. The country’s northern region has been experiencing high electricity demand due to a prevailing heatwave since May 17, 2024, the ministry said in a statement.

Despite these challenging conditions, the ministry said, the highest ever peak demand of 89 GW in the northern region was successfully met on June 17, 2024.

It was made possible by importing 25-30 per cent of the region’s power requirement from neighbouring



regions, it said. “All utilities have been advised to maintain a high state of alert and minimise forced outages of equipment,” the statement said.

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD) forecast, heatwave conditions in North-West India are expected to abate from June 20.

In response to the increased electricity demand and to ensure adequate power availability across the country, the Ministry of Power has implemented a series of measures to meet the highest ever peak demand of 250 GW during the ongoing summer season.

The ministry has estimated that peak demand can touch a level of 260 GW during this season.

These measures include directions issued under Section 11 of the Electricity Act, 2003, for ICB (imported coal based) plants to continue the generation support during the high demand period.

The ministry has instructed power generating units to have minimum planned maintenance during this period.

Efforts are being made to minimise partial and forced outages to maximise the availability of generation capacity, it stated, adding that plants under long-term outage have been sensitised to revive their units to ensure maximum power generation.

All generating companies (GENCOs) have been advised to keep their plants in healthy condition to ensure full capacity availability for optimal operation of various generation sources, it stated. About the coal stock maintenance, it stated that adequate coal stocks are being maintained at coal-based thermal stations.

The hydro stations have been advised to conserve water during solar hours and dispatch maximum generation during non-solar hours to ensure power adequacy at all times, it stated.

India, US agree to step up cooperation on semiconductors, critical minerals

India and the US have agreed to closer engagement and co-operation on supply chain, semiconductors and critical minerals during the meeting of the India-US initiative on Critical and Emerging Technology (iCET), led by Indian National Security Adviser Ajit Doval and his US counterpart Jake Sullivan in New Delhi.

India and the US Monday launched a new strategic semiconductors partnership to co-develop semiconductor design and manufacturing processes for precision-guided ammunition.

“Launching a new strategic semiconductor partnership through a partnership between the US Semiconductor Industry Association and the India Electronics Semiconductor Association, which identifies near-term industry opportunities and facilitates longer-term strategic development of complementary



US and India.

Semiconductors (essential for defence, automobiles and telecommunications sectors) have grown into a key geopolitical battleground, with the US, Japan and China investing heavily in developing domestic capabilities.

“Celebrating the conclusion of a joint Semiconductor Readiness Assessment through a partnership between the US Semiconductor Industry Association and the India Electronics Semiconductor Association, which identifies near-term industry opportunities and facilitates longer-term strategic development of complementary

semiconductor ecosystems,” the factsheet added. This engagement with Indian and US investors in the semiconductor industry in India aims to continue building India’s robust semiconductor and information communication technology ecosystem.

Notably, India in March approved three semiconductor plant proposals, aiming to bolster India’s semiconductor manufacturing ecosystem. The projects entail an estimated investment of Rs 1.26 lakh crore and are expected to significantly contribute to India’s electronics manufacturing sector.

Tata Electronics and Tai-

wan’s Powerchip Semiconductor Manufacturing Corp. (PSMC) will establish India’s first semiconductor fabrication plant (fab) in Dholera, Gujarat. Tata Semiconductor Assembly and Test Pvt Ltd (TSAT) will set up a semiconductor unit in Morigaon, Assam. CG Power, in partnership with Renesas Electronics Corp., Japan, and Stars Microelectronics, Thailand, will establish a semiconductor unit in Sanand, Gujarat. US and India also aimed to work together to ensure a reliable supply of critical minerals, which are essential for clean energy technologies and other important industries. “Promoting India’s vital role in the Mineral Security Partnership, including through co-investing in a lithium resource project in South America and a rare earths deposit in Africa, to responsibly and sustainably diversify critical mineral supply chains,” read the fact sheet.

NIA seizes over Rs 1 crore used for funding studies of Maoist leaders

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Tuesday seized more than Rs 1 crore, extorted from contractors and others in Bihar and Jharkhand, which was being used to finance medical studies of a relative of a senior Maoist leader. The seizure came as part of the agency’s probe into a 2021 case pertaining to a conspiracy hatched by members of the banned outfit CPI (Maoist) for its revival in Magadh zone and to raise funds for the organisation.

“In a major seizure linked with the CPI (Maoist) Magadh zone attempted revival case, the NIA on Tuesday seized, as proceeds of terrorism, funds extorted from contractors and others in Bihar and Jharkhand which were used to finance the medical studies of a relative of some of the accused,” the probe agency said in a statement.

Magadh division in Bihar largely covers areas falling under Gaya, Nawada, Aurangabad, Jehanabad and Arwal districts.



The money, amounting to Rs 1,13,70,500, has been seized in the case registered suo motu by the NIA on December 30, 2021, the statement said.

“NIA investigations revealed that the said amount had been directly transferred to the bank account of a medical college in Chennai, Tamil Nadu for the medical education of a relative of a senior Maoist leader,” it said.

The transfer was done through bank accounts of close relatives of the accused persons, under the garb of a loan amount, it added.

“The beneficiary of the funds extorted by CPI (Maoist) is the niece of the FIR named charge sheeted accused and Special Area Committee member of

CPI (Maoist) Pradyuman Sharma. She is also sister of arrested charge sheeted accused Tarun Kumar, and cousin of arrested charge sheeted accused Abhinav alias Gaurav alias Bittu,” the NIA said.

The NIA had, on January 20 last year, filed a charge sheet before its special court in Ranchi, Jharkhand against two accused persons under various sections of Indian Penal Code and the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act.

In June last year, the agency had filed its first supplementary charge sheet in the case against one more accused, followed by a second supplementary charge sheet against two others in December 2023, the statement said.

India to grow at 7.2% in FY25 on consumer spending, investment

Fitch Ratings on Tuesday upgraded India’s growth forecast for the current fiscal, FY2024-25 to 7.2 per cent, a revision from 7 per cent projected in March 2024, on recovery in consumer spending with elevated consumer confidence even as investment continues to rise but more slowly than in recent quarters.

In an update to its global economic outlook report, Fitch said it expects inflation to decline to 4.5 per cent by end of this year and RBI to cut policy interest rates by 25 basis points to 6.25 per cent.

The rating agency expects growth in later years to slow and approach its medium-term trend estimate, forecasting real GDP growth of 6.5 per cent in FY26 (unchanged from March), and 6.2 per cent in FY27, driven by consumer spending and investment.

Reflecting back on the final quarter of the financial year ending March 2024, Fitch Ratings notes that In-

dia’s real GDP increased by 7.8 per cent yoy, terming it higher than its expectation in March, although slower than previous quarters of the financial year.

For FY23-24, real GDP expanded 8.2 per cent with domestic demand driving growth, and investment rising by 9.0 per cent and consumer spending by 4.0 per cent.

Falling indirect taxes net of subsidies have boosted GDP growth relative to gross value-added at basic prices. The latter is currently a better guide to underlying momentum and has been growing at just over 7 per cent.

The rating agency cites purchasing managers survey data pointing to continued growth at the start of the current financial year and expects that signs of the coming monsoon season being more normal, should support growth and make inflation less volatile, though a recent heatwave poses a risk.

Fitch notes that consumer price inflation has only edged down since the start of the calendar year.

1.52 lakh safety category posts vacant, says Railways in RTI reply

Out of around 10 lakh sanctioned posts under the safety category in the Indian Railways, more than 1.5 lakh are vacant, the Railway Ministry has said in response to an application under the Right to Information Act in March. Officials, however, have said the safety of trains is of top-most priority and the railways has made significant investments in this matter in the past 10 years while also taking up many structural and systemic improvements that have had a positive impact on safe operations.

Safety category posts include train drivers, inspectors, crew controllers, loco instructors, train controllers, track maintainers, station masters, pointsmen, electric signal maintainers and signalling supervisors among others.

Being directly involved in the running of trains, personnel in these posts are crucial to safe train operations.

“The total number of sanctioned, on roll (working) and vacant posts in safety category of Indian Railways,



as available in this office, as on 01.03.2024 (provisional) are: 10,00,941, 8,48,207 and 1,52,734 respectively,” the ministry said in response to the RTI application.

Responding to a question in the RTI application about vacant posts of loco pilots (mail/express/passenger/goods/shunting), the Railway Ministry said out of a total sanctioned post of 70,093, as many as 14,429 are vacant.

Chandra Shekhar Gaur, the RTI applicant based in Madhya Pradesh, said, “The response shows the Railways also suffers due to the vacancy in post of the assistant drivers. Out of the total sanctioned posts of 57,551 for assistant drivers, 4,337 are vacant.”

In the RTI application, Gaur also sought to know how many new posts were

created and how many posts were surrendered in the Indian Railways in the past four years.

To this, the Railways replied, “It is stated that this information is not centrally maintained in this office. It is scattered. It pertains to more than one Public Authority i.e. All Zonal Railways and Production Units etc.”

“The ministry advised me that such information can be obtained from the public authorities concerned by submitting separate applications to them under the RTI Act. I think such crucial information should be centrally maintained,” Gaur said.

Railway trade unions have raised the issue of rising stress on officials and workers in the safety category due to a shortage of personnel.

Brahmaputra River rises due to torrential rain

The water level of the Brahmaputra River has risen following incessant rainfall in parts of Assam and neighbouring states.

The water level of the Kopili River, a tributary of the Brahmaputra River, is flowing above the danger level mark at Kampur in Nagaon district, according to the Assam State Disaster Management Authority.

“Right now the water level is going up and down. There is a statue in the middle of the river and when the water reaches its neck, we realize that the water level has risen,” a local said.

Notably, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Monday, issued a week-long forecast predicting continuous rainfall in Guwahati.

Alerts have been issued for various parts of the country, including Assam and Meghalaya, where heavy to very heavy rainfall is expected until June 20.

IMD has specifically warned of exceptionally heavy rainfall on June 18, ie,



Tuesday.

“Assam and Meghalaya is very likely to get isolated heavy (64.5-115.5 mm) to very heavy rainfall (115.5-204.4 mm) on 16th & 17th June and exceptionally heavy rainfall on 18th June whereas likely to get heavy (64.5-115.5 mm) to very heavy rainfall (115.5-204.4 mm) on 19 and 20th June,” IMD said on its official Twitter account on Sunday.

The streets of Anil Nagar and Chandmari areas in Guwahati were severely waterlogged on Monday, disrupting normal life, following heavy rainfall in the region.

A resident of Anil Nagar urged the administration for a solution.

“Water fell during the night

and there is so much water that it has filled up. How will we come and go here? I want to tell the administration that we need a diversion here because, without diversion, there is no solution,” the resident said.

Meanwhile, Cyclone Remal has brought about intense rainfall in Assam, leading to widespread flooding.

14 districts and 309 villages have been affected due to the floods with Karimganj being the worst affected, as per the Assam State Disaster Management Authority.

According to the latest bulletin, 1,05,786 people in rural Assam have been impacted and 1005.7 hectares of crop area is also affected due to the floods.

Bypolls to 5 legislative council vacancies in 4 states on July 12

Bypolls to fill five legislative council vacancies in four states will be held on July 12, the Election Commission said on Tuesday. Elections to three of the five seats were necessitated due to the resignation of members of legislative council (MLCs) and to the remaining two due to disqualification.

In Karnataka, former chief minister Jagadish Shettar had resigned as an MLC in January. He had quit the BJP and joined the Congress after being denied a ticket to contest the election from the Dharwad Central Assembly seat which he represented.

Shettar had later rejoined the BJP ahead of the Lok Sabha polls and won the parliamentary election.

A vacancy was created in the Uttar Pradesh legislative council when Swami Prasad Maurya quit the Samajwadi Party and resigned from the House in February.

One seat each in Bihar and Andhra Pradesh fell vacant due to the disqualification of sitting members.

Prime Minister Modi’s monthly ‘Mann Ki Baat’ broadcast was last aired on February 25, after which it was stopped considering the Lok Sabha elections.

“Mann ki Baat will not be broadcast for the next three months in view of upcoming Lok Sabha polls,” PM Modi had said in his 110th edition of the programme.

Jungle Safari in Raipur all set to welcome new animals

Nandanvan Jungle Safari in Chhattisgarh’s capital is all set to welcome new guests like chimpanzee, zebra, Assam’s monkey, ring-tailed lemur and other animals.

The authority of the jungle safari is planning to develop new enclosures for the new animals.

“Presently, the Jungle Safari is housing 28 animals

in 36 enclosures and in the future eight more enclosures will be developed here. The authority here is planning to bring different animals like chimpanzees, zebra, Assam monkey and ring-tailed lemur,” Director of Jungle Safari Ganveer Dhammshil, elaborating that process in this direction is underway.

According to the requirements of different animals and parameters of Central

Zoo Authority, the enclosure will be developed, said the officer.

He elaborated that the enclosure for zebra will be sprawling in an area of around 10000 square meters while 700 meters will be for monkeys. Enclosures of different sizes will be developed for separate animals.

The jungle safari will have a special animal keeper to take care of the new ani-

mals, informed Dhammshil and further added that the animals will be provided with separate diets, sitting arrangements, trees and spaces for movement.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the massive man-made jungle safari, spread around 800 acres of land, in Naya Raipur on November 1, 2016. The Jungle Safari includes four safaris: herbivore, Lion, Tiger, and bear.

MODI 3.0 — OPPORTUNITIES OF CHALLENGES

The first session of the 18th Lok Sabha will begin from June 24. With the beginning of the session, the challenges of Modi Government 3.0 will also begin. If the challenges are handled properly, challenges can be converted into opportunities. This time the opposition is in a strong position. The opposition was limited to 91 seats in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, this time in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the opposition i.e. INDI Alliance is in a strong position with 234 seats. The first challenge before the NDA is regarding the selection & election of the Speaker and Deputy Speaker. In the past, the post of Speaker has been given to the largest party of the ruling coalition. In this regard, it is almost certain that BJP will get this post. However, there have been exceptions to this tradition. Due to the compulsions of the coalition government, the post of Speaker has also been with other allies of the alliance. This time, the two biggest allies of the NDA, JDU and TDP, have not indicated any such condition and are also not in a position to indicate any such condition. Out of 293 seats of NDA, 240 seats belong to BJP, hence it is expected that BJP will easily get the post of Speaker. There is a problem regarding the post of Deputy Speaker. It is more likely that the post of Deputy Speaker can be given to NDA. Modi 3.0 faces many challenges, out of which some important challenges, can be turned into opportunities are as follows-

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR DEVELOPED INDIA
It is very challenging to manage the expenditure of

lakhs of crores of rupees in economic development, welfare schemes and subsidies simultaneously. The question is of priority. For inclusive and holistic development, the government will have to be very sensitive towards the poor, at the same time it will have the responsibility to accelerate the pace of economic development. A glimpse of this will be reflected in the full budget of the coming July month. The government has expressed its commitment to see India as a developed country in the coming 23 years, till 2047, which seems to be coming true. Despite the challenges, if the country continues to move forward on the path of progress in this way, India can join group of developed countries before 2047. For the last three years, the GDP growth rate has been between 7 to 8.5 percent, which is a record in itself. In the financial year 2023-24, the GDP growth rate was 8.2 percent. The Government of India has a target of \$2 trillion exports by the year 2030. In a few years, India will become the third largest economy in the world, leaving behind Japan and Germany. It is estimated that India can have an economy of \$5 trillion by the year 2026 and \$10 trillion by 2030.

UNIFORM CIVIL CODE
Uniform Civil Code has been on the BJP's agenda since 1950. In this Lok Sabha election too, Uniform Civil Code was one of the major resolutions of the BJP's manifesto. Governments of many states have started to work on it. This resolution can be fulfilled only when there is harmony various fractions of NDA as well as mutual consensus among the opposition parties. The role of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, Defense Minister Rajnath Singh and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju will be important in this regard. It may take months to build a consensus. If the Uniform Civil Code is implemented in the country, it will be a great achievement for the government, BJP and NDA.

ONE NATION, ONE ELECTION

Under One Nation One Election, elections to the Lok Sabha and all the Legislative Assemblies are held simultaneously. This tradition continued in the country till 1951-52, 1957, 1962, and 1967. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been in favor of One Nation One Election for years. He had also raised this issue while being the Chief Minister of Gujarat. The concept of One Nation One Election was also quoted in the BJP's manifesto for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. Home Minister Amit Shah had repeatedly reiterated the resolution of One Nation One Election in election speeches and made it clear that the government would work on One Nation One Election if the BJP government is formed. One Nation One Election can be ensured only through constitutional amendment, for which consensus among all parties is necessary. There are many benefits of One Nation One Election. According to an estimate, about Rs 10 lakh crore is spent from local elections to Lok Sabha elections, if all the assembly elections are held along with the Lok Sabha, about Rs 5 lakh crore of the country can be saved. Wastage of election machinery will stop. Economic development will be promoted. Elections keep happening somewhere or the other throughout the year. Due to the implementation of the code of conduct, there is a delay in taking decisions in the interest of the public, which has an adverse effect on the public and development of country.

BALANCED, DEVELOPMENT-ORIENTED BUDGET
The development of the country is linked with the development of 140 crore people. At this time, an inclusive, balanced and development-oriented budget is the imperative of the country. Increasing the income of the country is necessary, at the same time, it is imperative to curb expenses. Nirmala Sitharaman's work as Finance Minister in Modi Government 2.0 was commendable. It is expected that Nirmala Sitharaman's

work as Finance Minister in Modi Government 3.0 will be excellent. The interim budget for 2024-25 was of Rs 47.66 lakh crore. For the coming year, the total income was estimated to be Rs 31 lakh crore and the total expenditure was estimated to be Rs 48 lakh crore, in which the income from tax was estimated to be around Rs 26 lakh crore. The full budget will come next month in July, which may be more than Rs 50 lakh crore. Necessary amendments should be made in the farm laws and must be implemented as soon as possible so that the income of the farmers increases as expected.

INFLATION AND UNEMPLOYMENT
Inflation was a major issue in the 2024 general elections, continuously raised by the opposition. After studying inflation data of the last 10 years, except for a few years, the inflation rate has mostly remained under control. Inflation is a continuous process. Inflation rate of 3 to 5 percent is beneficial in any economy. Inflation rate was 4.75 percent in May 2024, which is completely controlled. The government will have to ensure that there is no disruption in the supply of essential commodities and there is no black marketing of it.

Unemployment is a major problem in India. The main reason for this is the desire for a government job and the lack of necessary skills. After the implementation of the new education policy, we will see a significant reduction in the unemployment rate. We should also not forget that we are the most populous country in the world.

GLOBAL TRADE AND IMPROVEMENT OF INFRASTRUCTURE
During the last 10 years, exports have increased as expected. This year the total exports are \$778 billion, which is likely to be \$900 billion next year. The Government of India has set a target of \$2 trillion exports by the year 2030, which looks quite possible. In the last 10 years, defense exports have increased by 2300 percent, which is a record in itself. The government has increased the capital expenditure on infrastructure by 540 percent in the last 10 years. In the last 10 years, the Modi government has spent about 45 lakh crore rupees on infrastructure, as a result of which there has been a lot of improvement in infrastructure. This improvement needs to be taken forward so that the country's infrastructure system can become of world-class.

Most Indian students are lacking required knowledge and skills despite having degrees. Education should be based on the Indian education system in which special attention should be given to Indian languages, especially Hindi, regional languages and Sanskrit as medium of instruction. Whether it is engineering or management, technology or science, if their curriculum and medium of instruction is Hindi instead of English, students will learn comprehensively. By including ancient Indian knowledge in higher education,

students will not only be aware of values and ethics but their knowledge and skills will also increase. Attention has been given to these matters in the NEP and it's implementation.

ANTI-CONVERSION LAWS AND CULTURAL SECURITY
There is nothing like conversion in Indian tradition and philosophy. Indian culture is based on correction and conversation, not conversion. In this culture, emphasis is laid on transformation, not transfer. There are constant reports of conversions in the country, which is unacceptable in a democracy. No one can be forced to convert by luring or through pressure. This is a disregard for humanity and the Constitution. The central government should bring a strict anti-conversion law so that the country and the countrymen can get cultural and religious security. Cultural development is very important for the economic and social development of any country. Indian culture is linked to the Sanskrit language, so the Government of India should pay special attention to the promotion of Sanskrit language. The influence of foreign culture is constantly increasing, having negative impact on the youth. Cultural and religious security is possible only with a strict anti-conversion law.

FOREIGN POLICY
There is a relationship between foreign policy and international trade. Whether the country's relations with other countries will be good or bad depends on the foreign policy. India's foreign policy has been very effective in the last 10 years. India's strategic and trade relations are good with almost all the countries of the world except few countries. As a result, foreign trade is increasing continuously. One of the main reasons for the strengthening of the Indian economy is its successful foreign policy. And each compliments the other. The talk of sibling rivalry is restricted to the groups that surround each rather than emanating from the top. At the family level, all three seem to be in sync, with Rahul taking the lead. And Priyanka is happy to play her part. She certainly knows how to counter the BJP, both with flair and emotion. If Rahul is a schooled politician, his sister is an instinctive one. It is certainly going to be an exciting Parliament session ahead, with Priyanka Gandhi Vadra in the House.

foeticide, infanticide and neglect. India has improved its position marginally in the Gender Inequality Index in 2021{0.490} from 2020 {0.493}. The GII measures inequality in achievement between women and men across three dimensions - reproductive health, empowerment and the labour market. Despite the country lowering gender inequality over the years, the achievement is not outstanding even compared to immediate neighbours

Yet patriarchy curfew hasn't saved Indian women from physical and mental scars. So, to be a woman in this age is both a privilege and a challenge. Still society sets boundaries for women. There is a lack of awareness and empathy on part of society on certain aspects of a woman's life that is known to all of us. It is widely believed that a woman who is 'too independent' is considered having volatile ambition while we try to perpetuate the myth of gender equality but we all know how true it

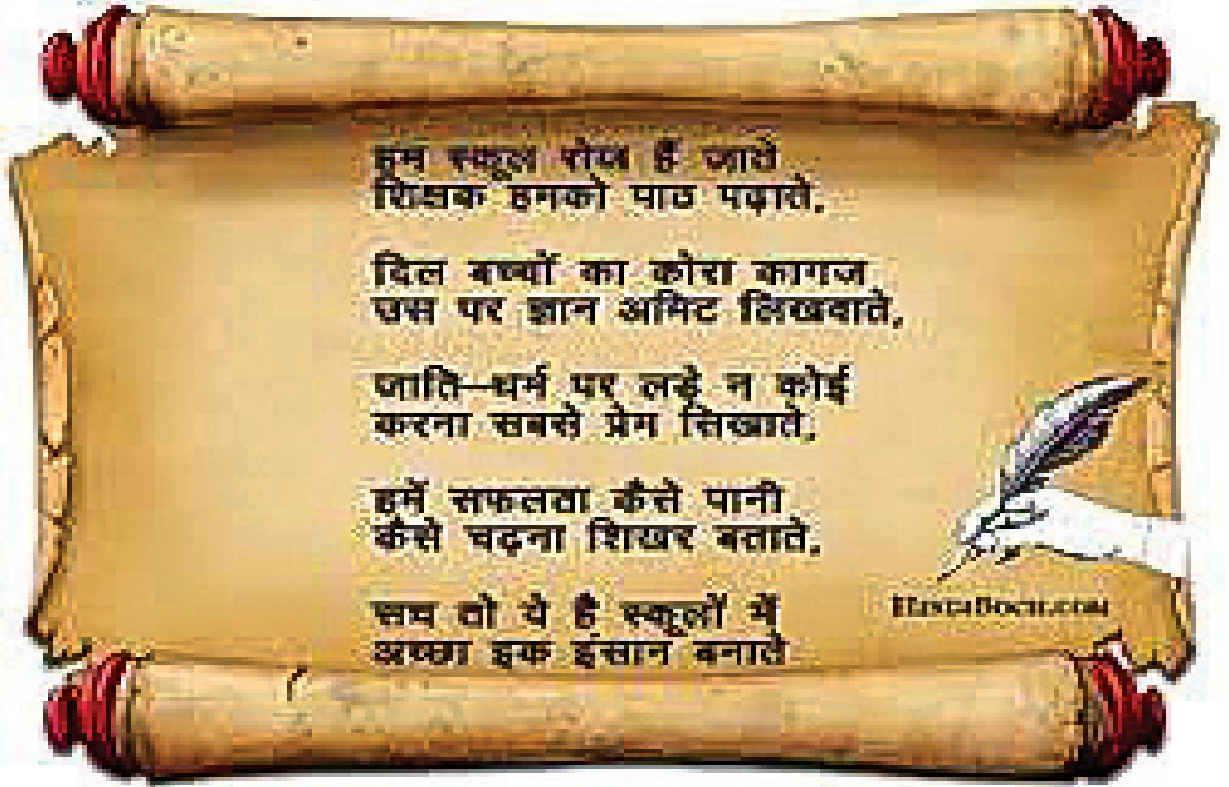
is in our patriarchal society. The reality is that we always endeavour to inculcate a spirit of sacrifice, submissiveness and sagacious sensitivity on our girls. According to National Family Health Survey data only 42.3% and 31.7% females said they own a house and land alone or jointly, respectively. While 51.2% of women respondents agreed to have autonomy in financial matters. While education and basic health indicators have improved, financial and personal autonomy eludes most

women. Within the private realm rigid gender roles are practised and promoted and woman's socio-economic autonomy is discouraged and seen with suspicion. Isn't there an urgent need to break the mould and stand up for what a woman wishes to raise her hand in protest because being a man is still considered a wee better in this part of the world than being a woman of her own will. The times are obviously better. Yet it has not reached crescendo for a lot of women. In an equal world there is some unequal music. MYSTIC POET KABIR

As Kabir Jayanti approaches on 22 June this year, it is an opportune time to remember Sant Kabir, a mystic poet who defies classification. Hindus and Muslim both claim him. It is said that upon his death the two communities both fought for custody of his body, one for burial and the other for burning, but when eventually the shroud was lifted only flowers could be found. Such is the power of Kabir's words, and the wisdom they radiate that his verses also find pride of place in the Guru Granth Sahib the sacred scripture of the Sikhs. Evelyn Underhill who helped translate Kabir's poetry writes how 'it is impossible to say of their author that he is Brahman, or Sufi, Vedantist or Vaishnavite.' According to Kabir himself, she writes, he was 'at once the child of Allah and of Ram.'

Many contradictory legends have surfaced concerning the life of Kabir. It appears probable that he was born to Muslim parents, based on the Arabic origins of his name. Despite being born or raised in a Muslim family he was deeply influenced by a Hindu saint named Ramananda. It is said that he waited for Ramananda to finish his bath at the Ganges and when by mistake the learned man's foot fell on Kabir and he uttered the words 'Ram! Ram!' Kabir seized the opportunity to at once declare himself

Kabir's poems were borrowed from various dialects including Khadi boli, Braj, Bhojpuri, and Awadhi. They cover various aspects of life and call for a loving devotion for God. Kabir composed his verses with simple words. Most of his work was concerned with devotion, mysticism, spiritualism and discipline.

Ramananda's disciple. He pays tribute to his guru in several of his famous couplets. Perhaps the most famous of his couplets on the importance of the guru is: 'The Guru is akin to a potter; and in his hands a disciple is like clay. The Guru's actions may appear harsh from the outside yet it is all for the goodness of the one seeking guidance. Kabir invoked the Divine repeatedly in his writings but the metaphors he used were often very earthy and even rustic. He did not fear

offending the Hindu priests or the Muslim mullahs and wrote his poems fearlessly. For instance, he wrote 'The Purana and the Koran are mere words: Lifting up the curtain, I have seen.' Kabir was also a musician and a weaver. It is said that a disciple sought to make him give up his weaving, considering it to be no more than a craftsman's skill but Kabir would not leave the practice considering it to be something that gave him joy and was part and parcel of

his creative expression, not something separate from his spiritual yearnings. It is such a touching and beautiful attitude given the times we live in, in which many so-called spiritual leaders love to pontificate and live in the lap of luxury, but do not have their own separate creative pursuits. Anyone wishing to read the great mystic in English could do no better than to read 'One Hundred Poems of Kabir,' that has his poems translated by the great Rabindranath Tagore.

LEGACY

Kabir literature legacy was promoted by two of his disciples, Bhgods and Dharamdas. Songs of Kabir were collected by Kshitimohan Sen from mendicants across India, these were then translated to English by Rabindranath Tagore. Kabir's legacy continues to be carried forward by the Kabir panth ("Path of Kabir"), a religious community that recognises him as its founder and is one of the Sant Mat sects. This community was founded centuries after Kabir died, in various parts of India, over the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. Its members, known as Kabir panthis, are estimated to be around 9.6 million. They are spread over north and central India, as well as dispersed with the Indian diaspora across the world, up from 843,171 in the 1901 census. There are two temples dedicated to Kabir located in Benares. One of them is maintained by Hindus, while the other by Muslims. Both the temples practise similar forms of worship where his songs are sung daily. Other rituals of aarti and distributing prasad are similar to other Hindu temples. The followers of Kabir are vegetarians and abstain from alcohol.

BHAKTI MOVEMENT

The philosophy of Kabir and other saints of the Bhakti movement is the seeking of the Absolute. The notion of this Absolute is nirguna which, writes Vaudeville, is same as "the Upanishadic concept of the Brahman-Atman and the monistic Advaita interpretation of the Vedantic tradition, which denies any distinction between the soul [within a human being] and God, and urges man to recognize within himself his true divine nature". [49] Vaudeville notes that this philosophy of Kabir and other Bhakti saints is self-contradictory, because if God is within, then that would be a call to abolish all external bhakti. This inconsistency in Kabir's teaching may have been differentiating "union with God" from the concept of "merging into God, or Oneness in all beings". Alternatively, states Vaudeville, the saguna prema-bhakti (tender devotion) may have been prepositioned as the journey towards self-realization of the nirguna Brahman, a universality beyond monotheism. David N. Lorenzen and Adrián Muñoz trace these ideas of God in Kabir's philosophy as nirguna Brahman to those in Adi Shankara's theories on Advaita Vedanta school of Hinduism, albeit with some differences. The first poem that appears in Tagore's wonderful collection is on the subject of the Divine not being found in temples or mosques, neither at the Kaaba nor in Kailash, but within each one of us. It

reads as follows: I am neither in temple nor in mosque: I am neither in Kaaba nor in Kailash: Neither am I in rites and ceremonies, nor in Yoga and renunciation. If thou are a true seeker, thou

shalt at once see Me: thou shall meet Me in a moment of time.

Kabir says, 'O Sadhu! God is the breath of all breath.'

Despite the clear sightedness and wisdom in his writings Kabir infuriated orthodox elements across the religious spectrum when he penned controversial verse such as the above.

Legend has it that Kabir was produced before Sikander Lodi as a poser who claimed divine powers. Something about the man must have impressed the ruler for he imposed the lesser punishment of banishment from Banaras, letting him escape with his life.

All those hundreds of years ago this mystic railed against the caste system.

Do not ask the Sadhu's caste, O Friend

Ask him what he knows! Value the sword; and Set aside the scabbard.

Kabir is at once ancient and at the same time extremely contemporary. No modern-day poet, motivation speaker or management expert could have spoken on the value of time as profoundly as he did.

In one of his most popular dohas he writes as follows

What you have to do tomorrow; do today instead.

What you have to do today; do it right away.

Within a second all can be destroyed

What will you do then?

We live in an age with short attention spans, where tweets are limited by the number of characters they use. This may pose a problem for spiritual gu-

rus given to issuing long sermons, but Kabir was a master of communicating in short rhyming couplets also known as dohas. This begs a further question. Had Kabir been alive today, would he have published his dohas as tweets or on Insta as Rupee Kaur the Indo-Canadian poet did, and would they have similarly gone viral? According to marketing experts those aspiring to be social influencers should tweet or make Instagram posts at least once a day, but for Kabir's dohas a discerning audience would have waited for as long as was needed, weeks, months even, for it would be a special kind of nectar that a reader would eventually get to savour. Such profound verse would have also immeasurably raised the standard of what is these days referred to humorously as WhatsApp University.

We need a Kabir for our times that will fearlessly speak out against fanaticism and bigotry. On human negativity, of which there is so much around these days, as translated by Tagore, the poet wrote

Empty the Cup! O be drunken

Drink the divine nectar of His Name

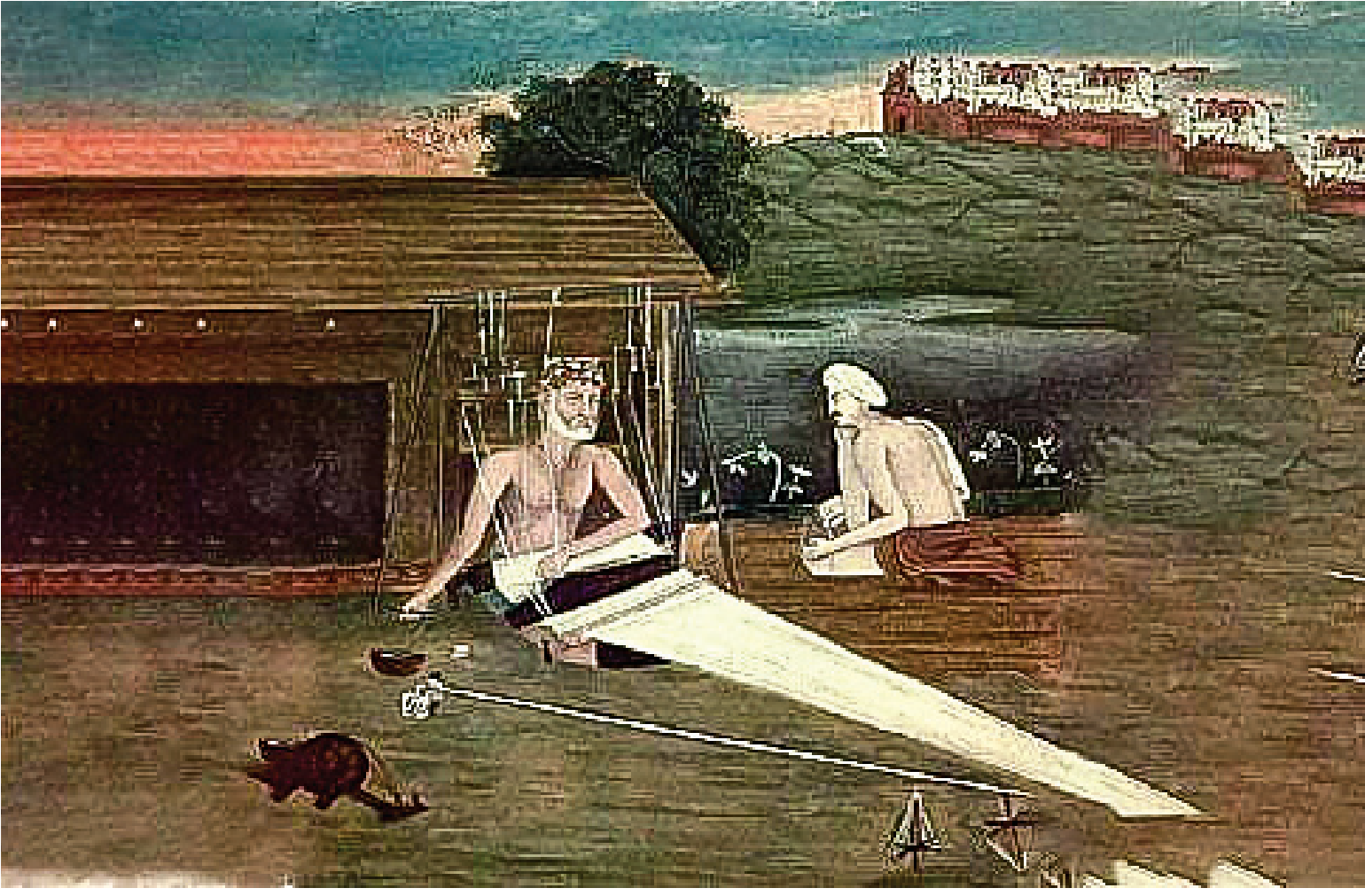
Kabir says, 'Listen to me, dear Sadhu!'

'From the soul of the foot to the crown of the head, this mind is filled with poison.'

KARNATAKA HIGH COURT: CONSENSUAL RELATIONSHIP IS NO LICENCE TO ASSAULT A WOMAN

The Karnataka High Court in the case ABC AND State of Karnataka & Anr. observed and has refused to quash charges of assault levelled by a woman against a man with whom she was in a consensual relationship for years.

The single judge bench of Justice M Nagaprasanna in the case observed and has stated that, 'Any amount of consensus or a consensual relationship between the accused and the complainant will not become a licence to the accused to assault a woman.'

The court in the case observed and has partly allowed the petition filed by the accused. The court also quashed the charges of rape on the pretext of marriage and cheating levelled against the accused.

In the present case, the complainant and the accused were



in a consensual relationship for more than 5 years.

It has been alleged by the complainant that petitioner is indulged in sexual activities with her on false promise of marriage and therefore, he has committed offences punishable as stated under section 376, section 417, section 504 and section 506 of the Indian Penal code, IPC. It has also been alleged by her that petitioner beat her leading to injuries depicted in the wound certificate.

The petitioner in the plea argued that complainant is ha-

bitual in registering repeated crimes on different men and thus the impugned proceedings needs to be quashed.

The bench observed that the narration in the complaint is the relationship was and all acts during the said period were consensual. The bench also took note of the fact that during the same time, petitioner had alleged identical offences against another accused. The bench stated that if the allegation in the complaint made against Kamalash Choudhary is juxtaposed to the subject complaint, it be-

comes unmistakably clear that it is verbatim similar and the manner of narration is identical. Thus, another factor that would become clear is that the complainant was sailing in two boats at the same time. The offence alleged is the one punishable as stated under Section 376 of the Indian Penal Code, IPC, on such consensual acts on the specious petition that it was on promise of marriage and later, the promise of marriage has been breached, are all on the face of it false.

Adding to it, the court stated that section 417 of the Indian Penal code, IPC is also loosely laid as it is an offshoot of the allegation that it is on false promise of marriage or the sexual relationship on account of promise of marriage and its later breach. Such acts would not amount to cheating as obtaining under Section 417 of the IPC, is by now a well settled principle of law. Therefore, laying of the said

offence against the petitioner is also unsustainable.

The court held that in regards to the offences pertaining to Section 323 (Voluntarily Causing Hurt) and Section 504 (Intentional insult) of the IPC, the court said the complainant's version is backed by a wound certificate which indicate that there have been multiple bruises on her body.

Further, the court held that the bruises are on account of assault by the accused, the petitioner. While the offence as stated under Section 376 of the IPC or section 417 of the IPC cannot be made out, the offence under Sections 323 and 504 of the IPC are prima facie met.

Accordingly, the court allowed the petition in part. The counsel, Advocate Venkatesh P Dalwai for

Calcutta High Court Directed Bengal Govt To Ensure 1% Reservation For Transgender Persons I

The Calcutta High Court in the case Mrinal Barik -Versus- The State of West Bengal & Ors observed and has directed the West Bengal government to ensure 1% reservation for all transgender persons in public employment in the State, in accordance with the Supreme Court's NALSA guidelines.

The single bench of Justice Rajasekhar Mantha in the case observed and has held that in terms of paragraph 135 (3) in the National Legal Service Authority Vs. Union of India & Ors, the reservation has not yet been made in the State for transgender persons. The court in such circumstances directed the Chief Secretary of the Government of West Bengal to ensure 1% reservation for the category of persons men-



tioned in the NALSA case in all public employment in the State.

In the present case, the court was hearing the petition filed by a transgender person who passed the Teachers' Eligibility Test, TET in 2014 and in 2022 but was not called for the counselling process or interview.

The bench headed by Justice Mantha referred to the Supreme Court's judgement in the case NALSA v Union of India, which carved out reservations for transgen-

der persons to protect their rights under Part III of the Constitution.

The court observed that in the NALSA judgement, the court had directed the state and union governments to treat transgender persons as 'socially and educationally backward' and extend all kinds of benefits to them including reservations in public employment.

Further, the court noted that while the State had devised its own policy for reservations for transgender persons, it had not been made in accordance with the order of the Supreme Court.

The court directed for 1% reservations to be maintained for transgender persons in all public employment in the state and directed the Secretary of the West Bengal Board of Primary Education to arrange for an interview and counselling of the petitioner.

KARNATAKA HIGH COURT: VICTIM OF PROSECUTED UNDER SECTION 5 IMMORAL TRAFFIC PREVENTION ACT

The Karnataka High Court in the case Mrs X and State of Karnataka & Anr observed and has held that a woman who is a victim of prostitution cannot be punished for offences punishable as stated under Section 5 of the Immoral Traffic Prevention Act.

The single judge bench of Justice M Nagaprasanna in the case observed and has allowed the petition filed by a woman who had been charged under the provision and said, the provisions, the purpose or the object of the Act is not to abolish prostitution or the prostitute and there being no such provision under the law, which penalises a victim who indulges in prostitution. What is punishable is sexual exploitation for commercial purposes and to earn or make a living upon it against such person/s.

As per the prosecution

case, the Police received information that some girls are being illegally transported from Udupi to Goa for the purpose of putting them in the business of prostitution.

Therefore, the vehicle was intercepted and accused No.1 along with accused No.9 were found taking the petitioner or accused No.8 and others for engaging them in the business of prostitution.

The petitioner in the plea argued that she is the victim and therefore she should not be permitted to be prosecuted.

The prosecution opposed the petition filed wherein it is stated that the case is now 10 years old and she should come out clean in a trial.

The bench referred to Section 5 of the Act which pertains to procuring, inducing, or taking person for the sake of prostitution. It said, thus, nowhere the section 5 of the Act would indicate that a woman who

is a victim of prostitution should be punished for offences punishable under Section 5 of the Act.

It has clearly been stated under section 5 of the Act that any person who procures or attempts to procure a woman or a girl for the purpose of prostitution would become liable for such prosecution.

The court also referred to the Bombay High Court judgement in the case Kajal Mukesh Singh v. The State Of Maharashtra, wherein the court held that in the light of the admitted fact that the petitioner or accused No.8 is a victim and notwithstanding the fact that she is a victim of prostitution, if further trial is permitted to continue it would become an abuse of the process of law and result in patent injustice.

The counsel, Advocate Kumara appeared for the Petitioner.

The counsel, Additional SPP B.N Jagadeesh represented for RI.

The Meghalaya High Court in the case Smti. Uttora G. Sangma vs. The State of Meghalaya & Ors. observed and has considered the resignation tendered by a teacher as voluntary retirement wherein enabling the teacher to benefit from pension and other entitlements, which is based on the circumstances of her resignation from the service.

The bench headed by Justice H.S. Thangkhiew in the case observed wherein it is stated that the claim of the petitioner that she cannot be deprived of her pensionary and other terminal benefits after having served for 33 years.

In the present case, the petitioner was appointed as an Assistant Teacher in 1989 and through an order dated September 01, 1998, the Inspector of Schools had regularised her services with effect from October 29,



1996.

The petitioner in the plea sought voluntary retirement from service in 2022 under Meghalaya Civil Services, Pension Rules 1983, it was rejected by the respondents which being on ground voluntary retirement scheme, VRS would only be applicable post-regularisation and that her regularisation through the order dated September 01, 1998 was invalid as it was done by an incompetent authority.

Therefore, the petitioner resigned from her services on February 01, 2023 con-

test elections.

However, on April 25, 2023, the respondents regularised the service of the petitioner with effect from September 01, 1998.

The petitioner in the plea argued that in view of these circumstances, her resignation should be treated as voluntary retirement wherein she is entitled to pensionary benefits, whereas, the respondents maintained that petitioner has relinquished her entitlements through her resignation.

The High Court in the case stated that petitioner was under the bona fide impression that her services were regularised by the order dated September 01, 1998 and that she was she in the case was eligible for voluntary retirement under the Meghalaya Civil Services (Pension), Rules 1998.

Further, the court noted that the resignation from service would normally result in forfeiture of past

service

The court in the case remarked that had the petitioner continued in service after the rejection of her VRS application, she would have been entitled to all the benefits as her service was regularised by the order dated April 25, 2023.

The court observed that the petitioner's regularisation stood at the mercy of the respondents despite long years of service. Thus, it has been expressed that 'the writ petitioner in the instant case was faced with a situation, wherein her VRS application stood rejected, her regularization at the mercy of the respondents inspite of her long years of service, and with the impending elections, which she was keen to contest in, in jeopardy, culminated in her tendering her resignation. The High Court also referred to the case Shashikala Devi vs. Central Bank of India & Ors., wherein the Supreme Court held that in case

of claim of relinquishment of retiral and other benefits, there should be compelling circumstance to suggest that an employee consciously gave up the benefits despite long years of service.

The High Court held that the resignation of the petitioner's should be considered as voluntary retirement by the respondents.

Further, the High Court held that the petitioner in the case is entitled to pensionary and other benefits as per the Meghalaya Civil Services (Pension) Rules 1983.

The court while considering the facts and circumstances of the case observed and has stated that where the petitioner cannot be said to be totally at fault, the resignation of the petitioner shall be considered by the respondents to be in effect and in continuation of the application for voluntary retirement, and the petitioner consequently be afforded all the retiral benefits, as entitled and permissible.

Relief For Forging Pattas:Nature And Gravity Of Offence Taken Into Account While Considering Anticipatory Bail

Rajasthan High Court Denies

The Rajasthan High Court in the case Dilip Sharma v State of Rajasthan observed and has denied anticipatory bail to the person charged under five different FIRs for forging 'pattas' that were never actually being issued by the Ajmer Development Authority and taking lakhs of rupees from complainants for distributing these fabricated pattas and documents.

The bench headed by Justice Anoop Kumar Dhand in the case was hearing an application filed for grant of anticipatory bail.

The bench observed that the personal liberty of the accused as a relevant factor and at the same time it being the duty of the Court to take into account the nature of the offences involved and the charges levelled against the persons alleged.

The counsel appearing for the applicant argued before



the court that for the grant of anticipatory bail which being on the ground that during his period of incarceration entire investigation was done by the police.

The counsel appearing before the court also stated that filing of repeated FIRs for same allegations amounted to abuse of the process of law.

On the other hand, the application filed was countered by the counsel for the complainant who contended that it had been concluded in the chargesheet that after fabricating the documents, thus, the applicant also destroyed the evidences as well as threatened the material witnesses as

well as complainants.

It has also been pointed out by the counsel appearing during investigation, statements of two witnesses indicated applicant's involvement in the crime.

Furthermore, the court in the case stated that the reference was also made to the fifth First Information Report, FIR that was launched recently against the petitioner for same nature of allegations.

It has also been argued by the counsel that looking at the gravity of the matter, the applicant should not be granted bail.

The court referred to the case Prasanta Kumar Sarkar

v Ashis Chatterjee & Anr., wherein the court laid down certain factors to be kept in mind while considering applications for anticipatory bail. Some of the factors included, whether there was any prima facie or reasonable ground to believe that the accused had committed the offence; nature and gravity of the accusation; severity of punishment for the alleged offence.

The court also referred to the case Nimmagadda Prasad v CBI, wherein the court held that the Court should keep in mind the nature of evidence and accusation while deciding an application for anticipatory bail. The court also observed that many Supreme Court cases have settled that while deciding an anticipatory bail, the court should not make a detailed analysis of evidence but focus on some reasonable grounds that would reveal if the accused had committed the offence or would reflect the seriousness of the offence.

The court stated that the ob-

servations made in the case Nimmagadda Prasad v CBI, wherein the court has kept in mind that for the purpose of granting bail, the Legislature has used the words 'reasonable grounds for believing' instead of 'the evidence' which means the Court was dealing with the grant of bail can only satisfy it as to whether there is a genuine case against the accused and that the prosecution will be able to produce prima facie evidence in support of the charge. At this stage, it is not expected to have the evidence establishing the guilt of the accused beyond reasonable doubt.

Further, the court held that the allegations raised of forging pattas and distributing these for lakhs of rupees, made in five different FIRs, were serious allegations that required investigation by the investigating agency.

The court while considering the facts and circumstances of the case observed and has rejected the bail application.

MADRAS HIGH COURT ISSUED WARRANT AGAINST PRODUCER OF ARVIND SWAMI STARRER 'BHASKAR ORU RASCAL' OVER UNPAID DUES

The Madras High Court in the case Arvind Swami v K Murugan Kumar observed and has issued an arrest warrant against K Murugan Kumar, proprietor of Harshini Movies and producer of Arvind Swami starrer Tamil movie 'Bhaskar oru Rascal' in a case of non-payment of dues to the actor.

The bench of Justice P Velmurugan in the case observed and has noted that the producer had not disclosed his assets despite a court order to do so in 2020. Though the counsel appearing for Murugan's informed the court that he had disclosed his assets, the court issued an arrest warrant and adjourned the case to July 8.

In the present case, Arvind Swami had approached the court in 2019 after Murugan failed to pay the remuneration dues and repay a loan taken from Arvind Swami. He also informed the court that as per an agreement between the two, Murugan was to pay Rs 3 Crore to Arvind for acting in the movie



as the lead. Of this, Murugan had paid and amount of Rs. 2,70,00,000 and was liable to pay the balance of Rs. 30,00,000 along with other charges as applicable. Additionally, Murugan had also taken a short term loan of Rs. 35,00,000 from Arvind to help with the release of the film on time.

It has also been informed by the actor to the court that after deducting TDS he had received a sum of Rs. 2,43,00,000 and it was the producer's duty to remit the amount deducted as TDS. Since Murugan had not re-

mitted any amount, Arvind sent the legal notice. The actor had alleged that Murugan was making a deliberate attempt to refuse the legal notices.

The bench of single judge in 2019, directed Murugan to pay Rs. 30,00,000 as professional charges, Rs. 35,00,000 towards settlement of loan amount, deposit Rs. 27,00,000 for TDS deducted and to pay a sum of Rs. 2,00,000 as compensatory cost.

Following this, Arvind had also moved an execution petition.

PROTEST RALLY HELD IN TURBAT ON EID TO DEMAND RECOVERY OF MISSING PERSONS

The families of forcibly disappeared individuals held a protest rally on the first day of Eid in the central city of Kech, Turbat. The demonstration saw a large turnout, with participants demanding the recovery of their missing loved ones.

The families, joined by supporters, have also established a sit-in at Shaheed Fida Chowk, determined to draw attention to their plight.

This ongoing protest has gained notable support from the community and various human rights organizations.

The Baloch Yakjehti Committee, a prominent advocacy group, has been vocal about the issue on social media.

Citing a United Nations report, the committee empha-



sised the broader impact of enforced disappearances. "Enforced disappearance has frequently been used as a strategy to spread terror within society. The feeling of insecurity generated by this practice is not limited to the close relatives of the disappeared but also affects their communities and society as a whole. It is a crime against humanity," the committee stated in a post on X.

The committee further criticized the state of Pakistan, accusing it of dehumanizing the Baloch people through systematic enforced disappearances and alleged genocide.

"However, the State of Pakistan constantly reminds us-by committing this crime and our genocide--that Baloch doesn't qualify to be human. The international community and human

rights advocates, proud of their humanity, seem to agree with the state by keeping their silence on crimes against the Baloch people," the statement added.

The protest on Eid highlighted the emotional toll on the families of the disappeared.

"On every Eid, Baloch mothers and fathers, sisters and brothers, wives and children, friends and relatives; torn by the pain of their disappeared loved ones, look to the world and ask: when did they lose their humanity to deserve this tyranny?" the Baloch Yakjehti Committee expressed.

They implored the global community to break their silence and advocate for the release of those held in captivity.

"We are humans, free our loved ones from dark dungeons and give us back our humanity," the BYC said.

Thousands of protesters seek early polls, Gaza hostages' release

Tens of thousands of protesters gathered in front of the Knesset (Israeli Parliament) demanding early elections and the release of hostages in Gaza, The Times of Israel reported.

The anti-government protesters gathered in front of the Knesset and later marched towards Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's home, where violent clashes broke out with police, with at least three people requiring hospitalization.

Authorities stated that they had permitted the protest to continue until a few of the attendees attempted to scale the crowd control barriers erected around Netanyahu's home.

Police said at least nine people were taken into cus-



today.

Outside Netanyahu's house, demonstrators were again met with the threat of a water cannon by police, who they claimed were using excessive force, The Times of Israel reported. The demonstrations were part of the second day of what has been branded a "week of disruption" by various protest groups.

There were also chants

calling for fresh elections and accusing Netanyahu of being "guilty" of the October 7 failures during the protests.

Netanyahu has stated time and time again that elections shouldn't take place while the conflict in Gaza is still going on. The next general elections in Israel are formally scheduled to be in October 2026, according to The Times of Israel.

Former Thai PM Shinawatra released on bail

Former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra has been released on bail amounting to 500,000 baht following his arraignment on charges of lese-majeste and computer crimes related to remarks made during a 2015 interview, Bangkok Post reported.

The Criminal Court granted bail after Thaksin reported to public prosecutors on Tuesday morning and appeared for his arraignment, as confirmed by the Office of the Attorney-General's spokesman.

Prayut Petcharakhun, speaking on behalf of the OAG, stated that the court formally accepted the case at 8:56 am, marking Thaksin as an official defendant. Conditions of his release include surrendering his passport

EU raises human rights concerns with China in 39th Dialogue session

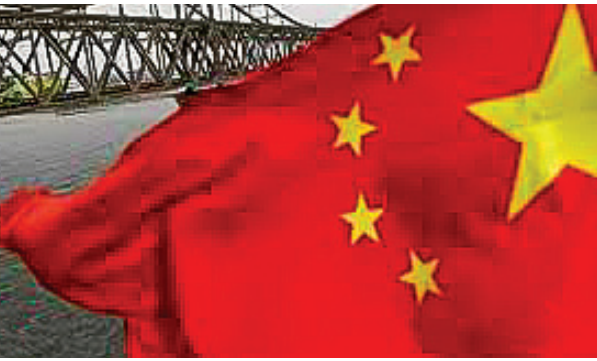

The European Union reiterated its persistent concerns regarding fundamental freedoms, labour rights, judicial independence, and cases of forced labour in China, during the 39th session of the joint Human Rights Dialogue held in Chongqing.

The session, which took place on June 16, followed a side visit to Tibet from June 13-15.

In a press statement, the EU voiced concerns over restrictions on freedoms of expression, assembly, and religion in Tibet. It also highlighted the issues of rights to equality and freedom from discrimination, including the rights of women and LGBT.

The EU also reiterated its unequivocal opposition to the death penalty, urging China to implement a moratorium and provide transparent data on its use.



It emphasized that religious leaders should be selected without government interference, respecting religious norms, particularly in the case of the Dalai Lama's succession.

The EU highlighted the vulnerability of religious, ethnic, and linguistic minorities, including Uyghurs and Tibetans, the negative impact of Hong Kong's new national security legislation on rights and freedoms, and the erosion of the region's autonomy.

Expressing deep concerns over the human rights situation in Xinjiang, Tibetan ar-

eas, and Hong Kong, the EU cited reports of crackdowns on human rights defenders, lawyers, and journalists.

It further urged Beijing to stop human rights violations and investigate the cases of unlawful detention, enforced disappearance, torture, and ill-treatment.

Specific cases raised included EU citizen Gui Minhai, Uyghur academic Ilham Tohti, and Tibetan Activists Go Sherab Gyatso and Tashi Dorje.

The EU also addressed the detention of individuals for exercising freedoms of religion, belief, expression, and

peaceful assembly, highlighting the cases of Xu Na, Pastor Wang Yi, Zhang Chunlei, Ding Yuande, Yu Wensheng, Xu Yan, Zhang Zhan, Li Qiaochu, Peng Lifa, and Kamile Wayit.

The European Union also called for a reassessment of China's national security framework to ensure compliance with international human rights law.

It encouraged Beijing to invite UN Special Procedures and monitoring bodies to assess and improve its human rights record.

China, in response, discussed the situation of refugees, migrants, and manifestations of racism in the EU, and focused on economic, social, and cultural rights there.

The EU also updated China on incoming European legislation requiring human rights due diligence for companies and prohibiting products made with forced labour on the EU market.

South Korea fires warning shots as North Korean soldiers cross border

South Korea's military said that a group of 20 to 30 North Korean soldiers crossed the border early Tuesday morning, prompting South Korean forces to respond with warning shots. The incident occurred around 8:30 am local time in the central part of the Demilitarised Zone (DMZ), according to Yonhap news agency citing the Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS).

The JCS clarified that the North Korean soldiers swiftly retreated after South Korean forces fired the warnings shots, indicating that the crossing was likely unintentional. A similar event occurred just over a week ago in the same DMZ sector.

Additionally, South Korean military officials said that several North Korean



soldiers had been injured or killed in recent landmine explosions near the border, though the exact timing of these incidents was not specified. The DMZ and its surroundings are notorious for being heavily fortified and mined, making it one of the world's most heavily militarised borders, according to Yonhap News agency. "Numerous casualties have resulted from multiple landmine explosions in the

frontline area," stated the JCS during a briefing.

Last November, North Korea announced its decision to nullify a 2018 military agreement with South Korea and escalated its troop presence along the border. This action followed South Korea's suspension of parts of the agreement in response to North Korea's launch of its first military reconnaissance satellite, as reported by Al Jazeera.

Taiwan warns China for influencing political party recruitment

The Ministry of the Interior (MOI) of Taiwan issued a stern warning, cautioning against the formation of political entities under foreign influences. This advisory follows allegations that a Chinese entity attempted to recruit Taiwanese celebrities to establish a political party, Focus Taiwan reported.

Taiwanese have the right to form political parties but cannot accept instructions or funding from foreign forces to develop parties, as this would violate the National Security Act and the Anti-Infiltration Act, the MOI said in a statement.

The statement was prompted by social media posts made by Taiwanese singer



R-chord on June 14 and actress Alexis Ho on June 15. These posts detailed efforts by Beijing Ciguang Film and Television Media Co, Ltd, a Chinese company, to recruit them via email for pro-China activities. Screenshots of the emails revealed that the artists were invited to release a statement titled "Establish a new type of cross-strait relations" on their Facebook

pages, after which they would be appointed as vice chairpersons of a purported "Taiwan Pro-Peace Party." The correspondence also promised lucrative employment opportunities with an annual income exceeding NTD10 million (USD308,950), projecting recruitment of at least 1,000 founding members for the party, as reported by Focus Taiwan.

Taiwan to receive 1,700 TOW 2B anti-tank missiles from US by year-end

Taiwan's Defence Minister Wellington Koo announced on Monday that the island nation is set to receive all 1,700 TOW 2B anti-tank missiles and 100 launchers purchased from the United States by the end of this year, following a two-year delay, Focus Taiwan reported.

The timeline update came during a legislative session in response to queries from ruling Democratic Progressive Party lawmaker Wang Ting-yu about the delivery schedule.

Originally allocated NTD11.81 billion (USD364 million) over the fiscal years 2018-2025 for the procurement, Taiwan had expected delivery to commence in



2022 but faced setbacks. According to Wang, Taiwan has yet to receive any missiles as per the original schedule due to failed US Army tests.

Minister Koo acknowledged the delays were indeed caused by the weapons' failure to meet required US Army standards initially. However, he assured that all necessary tests have now

been successfully passed, ensuring delivery before year-end, as reported by Focus Taiwan.

Highlighting the significance of the acquisition, Koo mentioned the TOW 2B anti-tank missiles and launchers are part of three major arms packages purchased from the US, all of which have encountered significant delays.

‘G7 political tool to perpetuate US, Western supremacy’: China

China has criticised the G7 Leaders' Communique, accusing the group of using China-related issues as a pretext to vilify and attack the nation.

In response to a media query on China's comment to G7 Leaders' Communique, Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Lin Jian denounced the G7's statements as baseless and biased, reflecting what Beijing views as a continued



effort to perpetuate US and Western dominance in global affairs.

"The G7 Leaders' Communique again used China-related issues to vilify and

attack China, resorting to the same old false accusations that have no factual, legal or moral basis and are filled with arrogance, bias and falsehood," Lin Jian said, addressing the media.

China further criticised the G7's composition and relevance in today's global context. "The G7 does not represent the world. The seven countries only account for 10 per cent of the world's population; even combined, they contribute less than China to global economic growth,"

Lin Jian asserted, highlighting what Beijing perceives as a declining influence of the group.

According to the Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson, the G7 has "long strayed from its original purpose of coordinating for stability in the global economic environment, and has increasingly become a political tool to perpetuate US and Western supremacy".

"It puts its own rules and decisions above the purposes and principles of the

UN Charter and the international law, and has lost its ability to represent the world and credibility among the international community," he remarked.

Regarding the G7's stance on global peace and security, Lin Jian accused the group of exacerbating tensions through military maneuvers and regional interventions. "While claiming to safeguard world peace, the G7 keeps drawing lines along differences in ideology and values, forming

exclusive groupings and inciting bloc confrontation," Jian criticised, asserting that such actions undermine international order.

China also condemned the G7's allegations of "Chinese overcapacity" as unjustified and motivated by protectionism. "The G7's 'Chinese overcapacity' allegation is unsupported by facts or the laws of economy. It is just an excuse for protectionism," he emphasised, pointing out the detrimental impact on global economic coopera-

tion and climate initiatives.

The G7 Summit leaders have reaffirmed their dedication to a free and open Indo-Pacific governed by international law.

"We reiterate our commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific, based on the rule of law, which is inclusive, prosperous, and secure, grounded on sovereignty, territorial integrity, peaceful resolution of disputes, fundamental freedoms, and human rights," the White House said in a statement on Friday.

New 'opportunity' to engage with new Indian govt post G7 Summit: Trudeau

Days after his first interaction with Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Italy amidst the chill in bilateral ties, Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has said that there is an "alignment" on several "big issues" with India and he sees an "opportunity" to engage with the new Indian government including on economic ties and "around national security".

Prime Minister Modi posted an image on social media of the two leaders shaking hands on Friday, with a one-liner saying "met Canadian PM Justin Trudeau at the G7 Summit".

The meeting which took place on the sidelines of the G7 Summit in Apulia, south-



ern Italy, was the first amid strained diplomatic relations over pro-Khalistani extremism after Trudeau alleged in September last year of "potential" involvement of Indian agents in the killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, a designated Sikh terrorist.

Back in Ottawa, Trudeau told CBC News that one of the really good things about the Summit is that "you get an opportunity to engage

directly with a huge range of different leaders with whom there are various issues and certainly with India, there are massive people to people ties, they're really important economic ties."

"There's alignment on a number of big issues that we need to work on as, as democracies as a global community. But now that he (Modi) is through his election, I think there is an op-

portunity for us to engage, including on some very serious issues around national security and keeping Canadians safe and the rule of law that we will be engaging."

When asked if he has seen improvement in cooperation from India on the Canadian probe into the murder of Nijjar in Surrey in British Columbia, Trudeau said, "There is work ongoing very much."

Trudeau's allegations from last year were strongly rejected by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) as "absurd and motivated". India has been maintaining that the main issue between the two countries is that of Canada giving space to pro-Khalistan elements operating from Canadian soil with impunity.

Mediterranean migration accident: 51 evacuated, over 10 dead

More than ten suspected migrants died and 51 were evacuated on Monday during a failed travel attempt in Mediterranean waters on the southern Italian island near North Africa, Euro News reported citing the German aid group RESQSHIP statement.

German aid group RESQSHIP, which operates the Nadir rescue ship, said it picked up 51 people from a sinking wooden boat, including two who were unconscious, and found 10 bodies in the vessel.

In a post on X, RESQSHIP said that their crew were "caring" for 51 people evacuated off the boat. "The rescue



came too late for 10 people."

"Two of whom were unconscious - they had to be cut free with an axe," the post on X added.

According to Euro News, the southern Italian island near North Africa is a famous target destination for human smuggling, with 127,000 migrants arriving last year.

Simultaneously, the Italian

Coast Guard is searching for approximately 50 people missing after a vessel shipwrecked off the southern Calabrian coast. According to a statement from the Italian Coast Guard, the search and rescue operation began following a Mayday call from a French boat, which was sailing about 120 miles (193 kilometres) from Italian shores, as per Euro News.

King Charles honours India-born brain trauma expert

An India-born brain trauma expert and Professor of Anaesthesia at the University of Cambridge has been conferred with one of the high honours by Britain's King Charles III for "services to neurocritical care".

Prof. David Krishna Menon, Head of Division of Anaesthesia at the University of Cambridge, was conferred with a Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE) by the 75-year-old monarch in his annual Birthday Honours list over the weekend.

Menon, who trained in Medicine, Anaesthesia and Intensive Care at the Jawaharlal Institute of Post-graduate Medical Educa-



tion & Research (JIPMER) in Pondicherry, founded the Neurosciences Critical Care Unit (NCCU) at Addenbrooke's National Health Service (NHS) teaching hospital in Cambridge and is renowned for his global clinical and research leadership in traumatic brain injury.

Far-right violence a threat to German democracy: Minister

A surge in far-right violence, Islamist extremism and cyber-attacks from Russia and China are putting German democracy under "significant" threat, the interior minister, Nancy Faeser, said as she presented a government report on domestic and foreign adversaries.

The wars in Ukraine and

Gaza are having strong ripple effects on German security, driving radicalism and attacks, the study by the office for the protection of the constitution (BfV) found.

"Our democracy is strong but it is under significant pressure," Faeser said. "We have got to stand up to domestic threats from extremism as decisively as to external threats, above all from the Russian regime."



Tories expected to target voters with letters signed by Boris

The Conservatives will turn to Boris Johnson in an attempt to boost their faltering election campaign, according to reports.

Tens of thousands of letters signed by the former prime minister are expected to be delivered later this week in the closest campaign engagement yet by Johnson, whose involvement so far has been limited to endorsing individual Tory MPs.

Voters who backed the Conservatives in the 2019 general election but who are now tempted to switch to Nigel Farage's resurgent



Reform UK are among those who are to be targeted in the direct mail push, the Telegraph reported.

Johnson has been recording personal endorsements in the form of video messag-

es that have been shared on social media by Conservative candidates, including some of those who were supporters when he faced a leadership heave.

The former prime minister said in one of them that he was "passionate" about the re-election of Simon Clarke, who tried to spark a rebellion against Sunak earlier this year. Alice Hopkin, a former special adviser to the home secretary, James Cleverly, shared one of the latest video endorsements from Johnson on Monday night when she said voters "must decide if they want a Labour super majority or be represented by true Conservative MPs".

FLORIDA RESTRICTS CHINESE NATIONALS FROM PURCHASING PROPERTY

Florida signed a law restricting Chinese nationals without US green cards from purchasing property in the state leaving them fuming over the law, CNN reported.

The law underscores the heightened tensions between the two biggest economies in the world in a US presidential election year, the rules have fostered uneasiness and confusion among ethnic Chinese people living in the state. Some say the law has damaged their businesses, while others say they are considering abandoning Florida altogether.

Bian, a 31-year-old soft-



ware engineer who has lived in the US for 12 years, is a recipient of an H-1B visa, which allows companies to employ foreign workers was told that this decision might get him prison time.

"That was really shocking to me. It's just purchasing property," Bian, who is originally from Nanjing, China, said. "Once I learned that, I didn't even bother to look anymore."

Ever since Florida Senate Bill 264 went into effect on July 1, 2023, Chinese citizens without green cards face a felony charge and possible prison time if they purchase property in the state. Sellers and real estate agents can also be found liable under the law, reported CNN.

Bian said he has recently started reconsidering his life in Florida, and he isn't alone. The law specifically bans the

"purchase or acquisition of real property" by "any person who is domiciled in the People's Republic of China and who is not a citizen or lawful permanent resident of the United States." But the term "domiciled" isn't fully defined in the law's language.

"We feel like we're different from everyone else because of this type of law," said Echo King, a US citizen who was born in China and is president of the Florida Asian American Justice Alliance. "We feel like we're not welcome." Susan Li, a 47-year-old small business owner in Orlando, Florida, who holds a green card, said she "really felt the discrimination" when she learned about the bill.

Russia, N Korea to work together to counter Western sanctions: Putin

Ahead of his two-day visit to North Korea beginning Tuesday, Russian President Vladimir Putin has said that the two countries will together build the security architecture in Eurasia, counter Western sanctions, and establish independent transaction systems.

Putin said this in his article for North Korea's Rodong Sinmun, published on the Kremlin website, state news agency TASS reported.

"We are ready to closely work together to bring more democracy and stability to international relations. To do this, we will develop alternative trade and mutual settlements mechanisms not controlled



by the West, jointly oppose illegitimate unilateral restrictions, and shape the architecture of equal and indivisible security in Eurasia," Putin wrote.

Putin will be on a state visit, his first visit to North Korea in 24 years, on the invitation by North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, the country's state news agency KNCA said.

During his visit, the Russian President is expected to hold talks with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un and discuss military and other cooperation.

The visit follows Kim's travel to Russia's Far East in September 2023 for a summit with Putin. Putin's visit to North Korea will show Moscow's desire to conduct equal dialogue and coop-

eration with all countries, a Kremlin aide Yuri Ushakov was cited as telling reporters by the TASS news agency.

"On June 18-19, our President will pay a state visit to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. This will be the second visit of the Russian head of state to Pyongyang in the entire history of our relations. The program is very intensive," Ushakov said.

On June 19, both bilateral negotiations and a meeting with leader Kim Jong Un are planned, he said.

"This includes various areas of the economy, energy, transport, agriculture, inter-regional relations, security issues, issues of cooperation in the international arena, and so on," the Kremlin aide said.

US refrains from commenting on pro-Khalistani terrorist Pannun

The White House on Monday (local time) refrained from commenting on the question of the plot to kill pro-Khalistani terrorist, Gurbatwant Singh Pannun came up in National Security Adviser (NSA) Jake Sullivan's meetings in India and if it will be part of the discussions. In a White House press briefing, National Security Spokesperson John Kirby said, "I don't have more to add on the conversations that Jake Sullivan is having. He is still over there having these conversations"

that they would file a bail application at a later date, meaning Gupta will continue to be detained for now.

During the 20-minute hearing, Chabrowe stressed the conditions of Gupta's detention that he had not been provided with a vegetarian meal since he arrived at a Brooklyn detention facility on Friday.

Get ready for a blast of nostalgia as Hrithik Roshan-starrer 'Lakshya' is scheduled to be re-released in theatres.

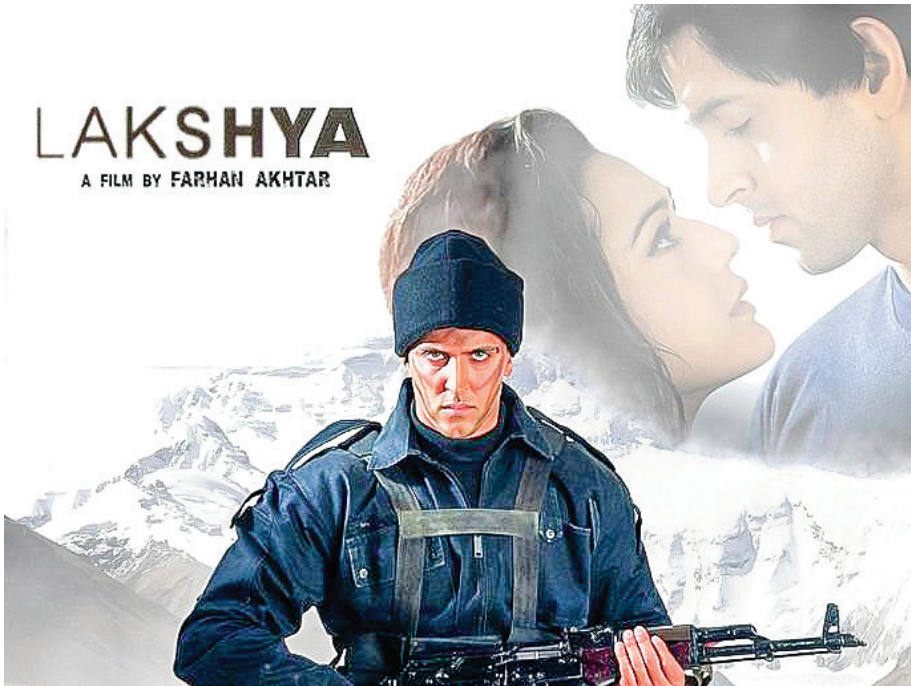
Marking 20 years of the film, the makers have decided to release the film in cinema halls once again on June 21.

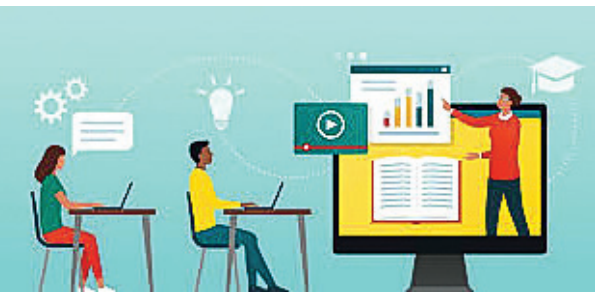

T20 WORLD CUP: WEST INDIES THRASH AFGHANISTAN IN FINAL GROUP GAME

Nicholas Pooran was run out agonisingly short of a maiden T20 World Cup hundred as a rampant West Indies humbled Afghanistan by 104 runs in a clash of unbeaten teams on Monday.

With both sides already into the Super Eights, Pooran smashed 98 off 53 balls in the final group match at the Daren Sammy Stadium in St Lucia to propel the hosts to 218-5 after being put in to bat.

A rattled Afghanistan never recovered from the loss of Rahmanullah Gurbaz in the first over of the reply and were bundled out for 114 off 16.2 overs, seamer Obed McCoy marking his first match of the tournament with best figures of 3-14.

The next phase of the competition, the Super Eights, starts on Wednesday.

“When you get the good



wickets you have to capitalise as batters. When it's your day you have to take it and make the most of it,” said Pooran, who thumped six fours and eight sixes in a spectacular innings took him past 2,000 T20I runs.

Coming to the middle in the second over after the demise of Brandon King, Pooran and hometown hero Johnson Charles (43 off 27 balls) accel-

erated at supersonic speed in lifting the total to 92-1 by the sixth over.

It was the highest total ever in the Powerplay overs of a T20 World Cup since the first of the eight editions was played in South Africa in 2007.

That period of relentless carnage included 36 off an over from seamer Azmatullah Omarzai, whose way-

ward bowling in that fourth over of the innings reflected the confused state of the Afghan attack.

But it was Omarzai who ended Pooran's pursuit of the century in the final over of the innings, his direct hit to the striker's end from deep cover leaving the left-hander just short of his ground as he dived to the crease. With all the frontline Afghan bowlers

taking a hammering it was left to Gulbadin Naib to help pull things back with 2-14 off two overs.

“To concede more than 90 runs in the Powerplay, it's pretty hard to come back from that,” Afghanistan captain Rashid Khan said.

“I thought we fought hard in the middle overs though to restrict them below 220.

“It's good that this happened at this stage of the tournament because you understand now what has to be the mindset and strategy in a similar situation.” West Indies skipper Rovman Powell said their run of four consecutive wins in the group -- extending their overall winning streak to an unprecedented eight matches -- was no fluke.

“It goes to show all the hard work that the boys have put in over the past 12 months is paying off and it's important for us to keep on playing good cricket and keep on improving,” he said.

Gautam Gambhir set to be named India coach soon

Former India opener Gautam Gambhir was on Tuesday interviewed by the BCCI's Cricket Advisory Committee (CAC) for the national team's head coach position.

The 42-year-old Gambhir recently guided Kolkata Knight Riders to the IPL trophy as the team's mentor.

Current India coach Rahul Dravid will be stepping down at the end of the team's T20 World Cup campaign in the Americas.

The side is currently in Barbados for the Super 8 matches after remaining unbeaten in the group league stage.

GM Arjun wins Stepan Avagyan Memorial, jumps to career-high 4th spot in live rating

Indian Grandmaster Arjun Erigaisi delivered yet another domineering performance to clinch the Stepan Avagyan Memorial 2024 crown in Jermuk, Armenia with a round to spare.

The 20-year-old, India's highest-rated chess player, defeated Russian GM Volodar Murzin in 63 moves in the eighth and penultimate round to move to six points with four wins and as many draws.

He now has an unassailable lead of 1.5 points over three players tied for second spot in a strong 10-player field.

The victory also helped Arjun jump to a career-high live rating of No. 4 as he has so far added 9 points from the eight rounds to reach a total of 2779.9 ELO points.

He trails Norway's Magnus Carlsen and Hikaru Nakamura and Fabiano Caruana of USA in live ratings.

“This has been a fantastic tournament for me as I have been able to make the most

of my opportunities. These tournaments are never easy as the level of competition

is very high but I am happy with the way I played and clinched my second title of the year,” said Arjun.

Arjun, who has been challenging himself to play more open tournaments so as to play a variety of opposition, has been in fine form this year.

He bagged the Menorca Open crown in April, finished second in TePe Sigeman Chess Tournament in May and also finished joint-fifth in the Sharjah Masters Open tournament.

France edge Austria in Euro 2024 opener

Maximilian Woeber's own goal was enough to give France a winning start to their Euro 2024 campaign on Monday as they edged Austria 1-0 in their opening game but Kylian Mbappe came off late on with a broken nose.

Woeber diverted Mbappe's cutback into his own net seven minutes before half-time in Dusseldorf to allow the French, one of the leading contenders to win the tournament, to come through a stiff test.

Austria have been much-improved under Ralf Rangnick and they often made life uncomfortable for the 2022 World Cup runners-up, who saw Mbappe leave the field near the end after being hurt in a collision.

He had earlier failed to convert a glorious chance that would have allowed France to win by a wider margin, and sources close to the player confirmed he had broken his nose in the accidental clash with Kevin Danso.

“We had the chance to put the game to bed and it is true that we could have been more precise in attack, but it's very good to start with a victory,” said France



coach Didier Deschamps.

“It is a good habit to have and we need to try to keep it.”

France will be relieved to have emerged victorious after a build-up overshadowed by talk of politics rather than football.

Mbappe and other French players had spent much of their time before the media in recent days answering questions about upcoming elections in the country which could see the far-right National Rally become the biggest party.

Any slip-up here would have led to suggestions their minds had not been fully focused on the competition.

Instead, the result leaves France level on three points in Group D with the Netherlands, who defeated Poland 2-1 in Hamburg on Sunday.

France and the Netherlands meet next in Leipzig on Friday, while Austria

face Poland earlier the same day in Berlin.

“We are obviously disappointed with the result. No France player scored against us in 100 minutes, just a very unfortunate own goal,” said Rangnick. “I think Didier Deschamps was really happy when the final whistle came which shows how well my team played.”

Austria had enjoyed some impressive results coming into the tournament on a seven-game unbeaten run and their team is on familiar ground during these Euros -- Rangnick is from Germany and eight of their starting line-up played in the German Bundesliga last season.

The French, however, are arguably the most talented team at the tournament, led by their captain Mbappe.

He endured a miserable time at his only previous Euros three years ago, fail-

ing to score and missing the decisive penalty in a shoot-out defeat by Switzerland in the last 16.

The new Real Madrid signing will wonder how he did not score in this game, with his first big opportunity arriving inside eight minutes.

Antoine Griezmann and Theo Hernandez combined to release Mbappe, who cut in from the left as he loves to do and shaped to curl a shot into the far corner before instead aiming for the near post.

However, Austria goalkeeper Patrick Pentz was able to make the save.

The Austrians settled into the contest and passed up a wonderful chance of their own to go ahead on 36 minutes.

Skipper Marcel Sabitzer touched down a Michael Gregoritsch cross from the left for Christoph Baumgartner, but he was foiled by goalkeeper Mike Maignan. That proved crucial as France took the lead two minutes later.

Ousmane Dembele gave the ball to Mbappe on the right, and he produced a stepover to get to the byline before his cutback was nodded into the far corner of his own net by the unfortunate Woeber.
