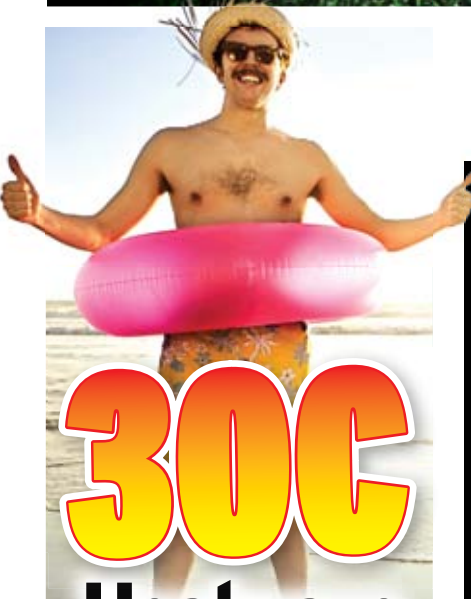

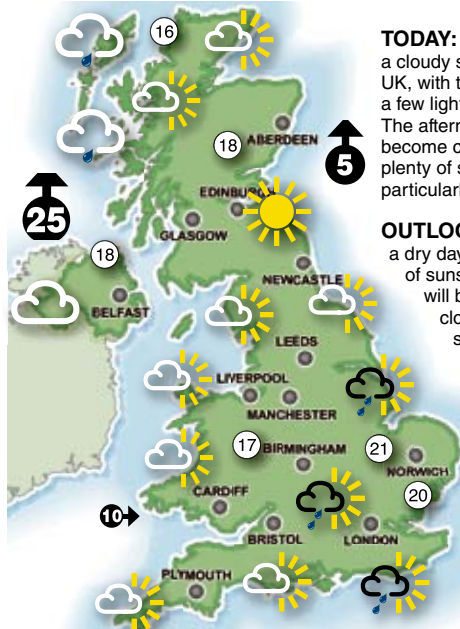

The heat is on: Octopus £3bn

SHIVERING families face bigger summer heating bills after putting the central heating back on in June.

Almost a third switched on the radiators or lit a fire to ward off the unseasonably cold weather, research by AI household money-saving tool Nous.co showed.

Energy analysts at Cornwall Insight confirmed that heating demand has been 22% higher than last June - despite the recent arrival of higher temperatures. Greg Marsh, from Nous, said: "We expect our energy usage to plunge in the summer as we switch off our heating - but not this year."

OCTOPUS Energy will pay the Government nearly £3billion to reimburse the public money it received to take over collapsed energy supplier Bulb.

The repayment will see the next Government get an early windfall, with the payment promised by September, and it means almost all of the costs of temporarily nationalising Bulb in 2021 will have been recovered by the public purse.

Bulb collapsed in 2021 after wholesale prices surged above the price cap set by regulator Ofgem, meaning suppliers were forced to sell energy at a loss.

UK DEBT HITS 60 YEAR HIGH

Leaders pledge to slash spending

UK state debt rose to its highest level for more than 60 years in May, according to official figures.

This is despite lower-than-expected government borrowing. The news emphasises the huge challenge facing the next government, with Labour and the Conservatives pledging to red-

uce debt in their general election campaigns.

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) found public sector net debt as a proportion to UK GDP (gross domestic product) rose to 99.8% for the month.

Prime Minister Rishi "Biggles" Sunak had promised to reduce the country's debt by cutting public spending as one of his five pledges

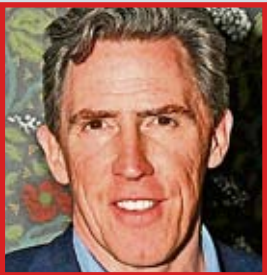
at the start of 2023. The ONS also revealed public sector net borrowing hit £15billion in May.

Initial data found that type of borrowing - the difference between government spending and income - was £0.8bn higher than the same month last year.

It was also the third-highest figure for May since monthly records began in 1993.

A police spokesperson said: "Our thoughts remain with her family at this devastating time."

"The pet dog, registered as a Belgian Malinois, was humanely destroyed."

"The family have asked to be left to grieve in private."

BRITAIN will roast in a five-day sizzler from tomorrow – before a "super heatwave" hits in July.

The overdue hot spell will see temperatures in the high 20Cs from this weekend – just in time for Isle of Wight festival-goers including Ella Norman, seven, inset.

The nation has been shivering for weeks as the miserable summer has felt more like winter. But finally we will be able to dust off the BBQs and swimwear for some much-needed sun.

Exacta forecaster James Madden says we are in for a three-to-five day hot blast at the "absolute bare minimum." And it looks like it'll be getting even hotter as a heatwave will then arrive from July 6.

New map data by Exacta Weather shows thermometers hitting the 30Cs and highs of around 20C at night.

A spokesman said: "The latest Global Forecast System runs are seeing the start of a potential super heatwave just a few days earlier than our July 10th forecast."

"Plus any unsettled weather now looks pretty short-lived for next week."

We pine for fruity burgers

BONKERS Brits love putting pineapple on their burgers.

Some 10% of us get fruity with burger toppings, a study shows.

And one in six even insist pineapple has more right to be in it than a tomato slice.

The research, by Rustlers, found a quarter of us slap a fried egg in there, 12% like adding avocado, 10% have guacamole, and 8% love hummus. What's more, 7% like pesto on their burger and 7% prefer beetroot.

Rebecca Simpkin, at Rustlers UK, said: "We've always known there's been more than one way to boost a burger, but our study has revealed more division – and varieties of popular toppings – than we ever imagined."



TOO COOL: Pink plonk

'Rosé's better warmer'

MILLIONS of wine-lovers are being warned they are drinking their rosé wrong.

Experts say the common practice of swigging the pink plonk straight from the fridge ruins the vino's taste and aromas.

They say it should be removed 15 minutes before pouring and is best served at 7C.

Marks & Spencer wine-maker Belinda Kleinig said: "It's a common misconception that rosé needs to be served ice cold, but serving wine too cold can mute its fruity flavours and hide some of the aromas.

"The optimum temperature for rosé is between 7 and 13C, meaning it's best to take it out of the fridge about 15 minutes to half an hour before drinking."

Tommy Cooper: The legendary comedian revealed: "People say I've only got to walk on stage and they laugh. If only they knew what it takes to walk out on stage in the first place."

Billy Connolly: Going on stage has always "scared the life" out of the funnyman, who added: "I'm riddled with anxiety and self-doubt every time."

Barbra Streisand: Forgetting the lyric to a song in a 1967 performance gave the US singer such "shocking" nerves she didn't sing in public for 27 years and has since used a teleprompter.

Carly Simon: The American singer has such bad stage fright it once caused her to pass out on a table of businessmen eating pasta and has used pain to distract her, like wearing tight boots. She once got orchestra members to spank her.

Salma Hayek: The *From Dusk Til Dawn* actress says: "I don't get nervous in front of the camera...but I can't take the stage with all those people expecting something great of me."

Jennifer Lawrence: The *Hunger Games* movie star has "horrible stage fright" but says: "I find a certain peace

by thinking of 'me in public' as sort of an avatar self."

Lorde: The 27-year-old Kiwi pop starlet suffers so badly she sometimes throws up before shows, saying: "I get nervous, I get freaked out."

Laurence Olivier: The actor often had to be pushed on stage saying the fear was: "A monster which hides in its foul corner without revealing itself

but may come forward at any moment."

Michael Gambon: The star, who played Professor Dumbledore in the *Harry Potter* movies, was once hospitalised with stage terror saying he: "Got so frightened that I collapsed."

Rihanna: A quick pre-show shot diluted with orange juice helps the singer to beat her collywobbles: "I have to have it," she says. "The drink calms my nerves."

Ian Holm: During a 1976 play, the actor, who played Bilbo in *The Lord Of The Rings* movies, fled the stage with fear recalling: "By the time I got back to the dressing

room area I had even lost the ability to walk." He was found curled up in a ball.

Olivia Colman: The actress says stage fright is "an awful feeling" and has turned to hypnotherapy to cope.

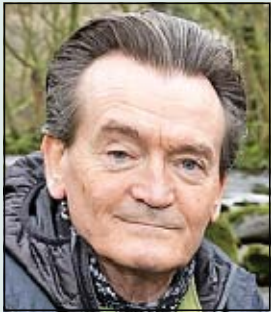
Andrea Bocelli: The opera singer says stage fright makes him feel naked adding: "I don't want to use drugs or medicine. The only thing is to go on stage and to hope."

Ozzy Osbourne: The Prince of Darkness says: "Every night before I go on tour, I get terrible stage fright until I cross that invisible line. Once I'm on, it's s**t or bust!"

Feargal: Sewage is crisis

Count beats Lettuce, 4pts behind Rishi in popularity

VOTERS prefer Count Binface to Lettuce Liz Truss, an exclusive poll for the Daily Star has revealed.

The Ipsos survey found 16% of the public are currently favourable to the “intergalactic space warrior”.

It’s more than twice the 7% favourability rating Lettuce Liz had after she quit during her disastrous PM days in 2022.

In fact, Binface’s favourability is not far off the proportion of voters favourable to Rishi “Biggles” Sunak at 20%.

Binface told the Daily Star: “I am delighted, but not surprised, to be voted more popular than Liz Truss.”

Binface is among 13 candidates contesting Biggles’ seat, the new Richmond and North-allerton constituency, at the July 4 election. Ipsos research director Keiran Pedley said: “On these numbers Liz Truss might be glad Count Binface is running against Rishi Sunak in Richmond rather than against her in South West Norfolk.”

Reports claim the ex-Juventus and AC Milan star was hit over the head with the butt of a gun after confronting a gang of five. His family were locked in a closet as the thieves ransacked the house stealing watches, jewels and cash.

Speaking via his agent, Baggio, 57, who received stitches in hospital said: "All that remains is to overcome the fear."

FORMER Manchester United star Nicky Butt has been banned from the road for 12 months after breaking a biker's leg in a crash.

The ex-England midfielder, 49, was driving his Land Rover Defender when he pulled out in front of Adam Fielding following a "momentary lapse of concentration".

Mr Fielding, 28, suffered a broken leg and other injuries in the crash on October 17, 2022. Butt, of Bowdon, Greater Manchester, told Blackburn magistrates: "I could not be more sorry."

He had admitted causing serious injury by careless driving at a previous hearing, and was ordered to do 100 hours of unpaid work.

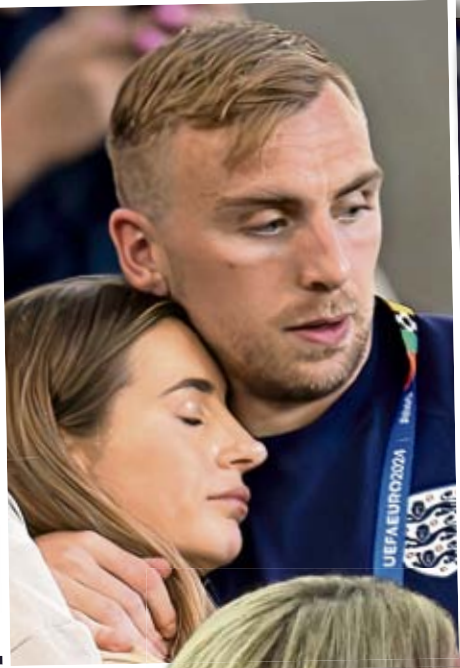
Anthem 'not hit with FA'

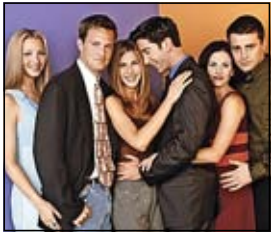

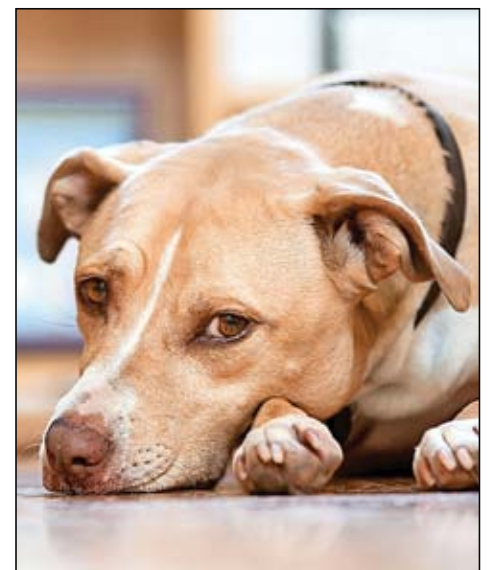

PETS instinctively know the exact time they are going to die, a boffin reckons.

Expert Dr Rupert Sheldrake says evidence shows pets provide a "last rally" for us to comfort them ahead of their death.

He says he has 25 years of tales of animals performing sudden loving gestures for their owners before slinking off to die alone to spare them the pain of witnessing their passing.

He said: "Terminal lucidity is well documented in hospices, but rarely studied. It's a burst of mental and physical energy, often accompanied by unusual clarity, soon before death.

"And it appears equally common in animals.

"My tentative theory is that the last rally has an evolutionary benefit. In the wild, an animal that instinctively knows it is dying can take itself away, to go somewhere its corpse won't spread disease."

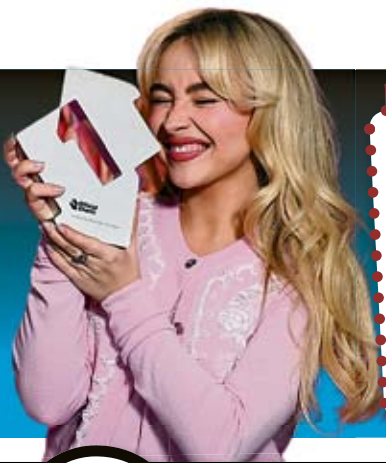

The new songs include *2001: A Space Odyssey*, which Kate wrote about her first date with horticulturist partner Thomas Silverman.

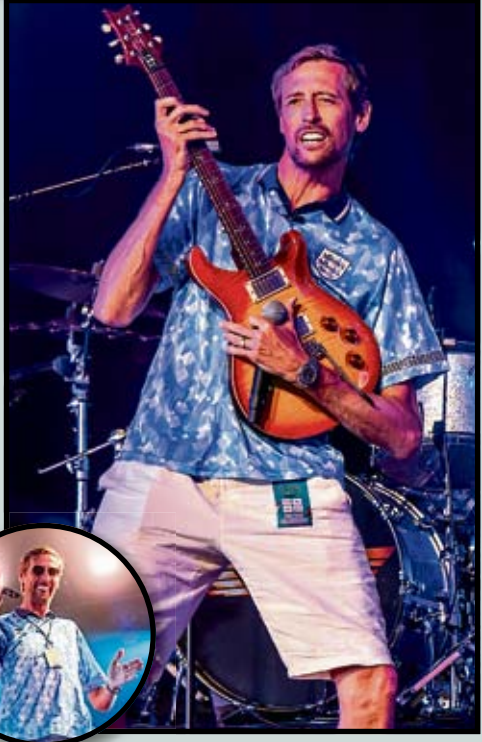
He took her to see the cult sci-fi film of the song's name.

The terrifying invaders from Asia that can eat 40 honey bees a day are spreading across the UK – an absolute menace.

But what many people don't realise is that we actually have a native hornet. A gentle giant who, with the terror sweeping the nation about the rise in their dangerous Asian cousins, are being persecuted and killed by frightened, ill-informed people.

So today I'm going to teach you how to spot the goodies, baddies and the in-betweens.

Hornets are members of the wasp family and, as such, they look rather similar.

The nice, friendly European hornet looks like a giant wasp but with a reddish, terracotta brown body and legs and striped yellow bum.

The legs are important to note here. The nasty hornets are mostly black but only with small yellow stripes and yellow legs ONLY below the knee.

There is one more player who may get confused and that's the giant woodwasp. This completely harmless lookalike is much more stretched out and skinnier, and is mostly black, but has bright yellow legs, bum stripes, antennae and patches on the head. They look like they have a giant stinger but it's just an egg-laying tube.

European hornets have a varied diet of mostly garden pests. Wasps, caterpillars, flies, moths and grasshoppers are all on the menu, they have even been known to cut already trapped prey out of spider webs. They do occasionally eat honey bees but in such small quantities that some bee keepers in

mainland Europe keep hornet colonies with their bees. Losing one or two bees to a hornet is nothing compared to the good the hornets do keeping worse threats away.

Our hornets used to be incredibly rare and only found in central England but now you can see them in many woodlands, gardens and parks.

Unlike regular wasps, they are attracted to light, so be aware if you leave your windows open on a dark evening. They are important pollinators and are very reluctant to sting.

They're pretty much only sting if you step on them, pick them up or disturb their nest. And their sting? Less toxic than that of a honey bee.

So next time you see a giant wasp, take a good look at the legs before getting scared.

Tip of the week

THE evenings are stunning. Yes, make sure you are protected from the other, more bitey night denizens, but also take the opportunity to look out for bats and moths.

Medal lie cop chief is guilty AXE FALLS ON 'FAKER'

A TOP cop who lied about his “military legend” to become a chief constable has been sacked for gross misconduct.

Northamptonshire police chief Nick Adderley wore a “110% fake” South Atlantic Medal suggesting he had served in the Falklands War though he was only 15 when it broke out in 1982.

He claimed on his CV to become chief constable in 2018 he had been in the Royal Navy for 10 years when he had served for only two.

He also said he had been a military negotiator in Haiti despite never visiting the country.

And he claimed to have been a “com-mander or a lieutenant” when he was really only an able seaman.

Disciplinary panel chairman Callum Cowx claimed Adderley had lied for many years with “arrogant temerity” and he found his “audacity to be quite staggering”.

He was dismissed without notice and placed on the police barred list as his “sustained brazen dishonesty” and “lack of integrity” will cause “lasting harm” to the force.

In Northampton, Adderley said he “deeply regrets any offence” his medal-wearing may have caused.

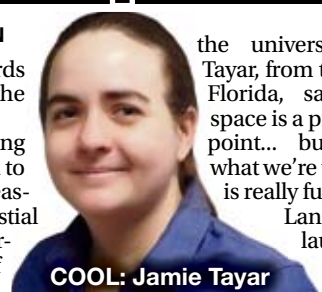

Growing numbers of Jay's family and friends are also flying out to join the search efforts.

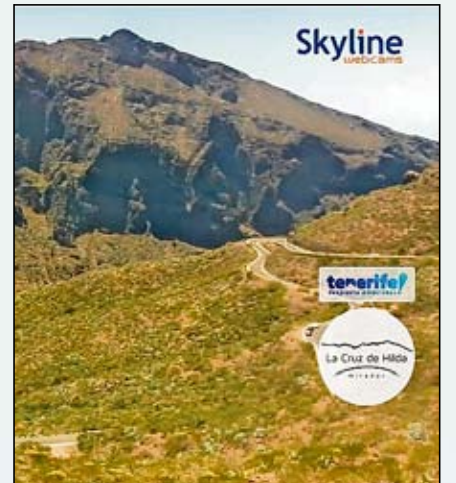
The apprentice bricklayer, from Oswaldtwistle, Lancs, was last heard from on Monday when he called his friend Lucy Law.

4 In the book he also went into space, became a pro wrestler, saved Chairman Mao from drowning and starred in a Raquel Welch movie!

5 Groom, below, wanted actor John Goodman in the role, as in the book Forrest weighs 240lbs and is 6ft 6in tall. Bill Murray and John Travolta were also considered for the part, which Tom Hanks won.

6 Tom, who won a Best Actor Oscar for his performance, copied his strong Southern accent from the real one of Michael Conner Humphreys, who played the young Forrest in the film.

7 Nicole Kidman and Demi Moore were both consid-

ered for the role of Forrest's love interest Jenny, eventually played by Robin Wright, known for her on-off romance with actor Sean Penn.

8 Haley Joel Osment, who would later star in The Sixth Sense, got his first film role as Forrest's son, Forrest Jr. He landed the part after director Robert Zemeckis saw him in a Pizza Hut advert.

9 Sally Field, who played Forrest's mother, is only 10 years older than Hanks, who had played his love interest in 1984's Punchline.

10 Ice Cube turned down the role of Bubba Blue, while fellow rapper Morris Chestnut auditioned for it.

11 Bubba was eventually played by Morris Chestnut, who won an attachment to create the character's look.

12 Gary Sinise played Lieutenant Dan, who loses his legs in action. The actor wore a prosthetic for the part which had been worn by his brother-in-law in real life while serving in the Vietnam War.

13 Illusionist Ricky Jay helped create Sinise's limbless appearance.

14 The famous bench, where Forrest tells the story of his life while waiting for a bus, was actually a fibreglass prop.

15 Tourists still flock to the spot where it stood in Chippewa

24 Jim Hanks, Tom's younger brother, doubled for his sibling in some of the scenes where Forrest jogs across America.

25 They were inspired by Louis Michael Figueroa, who in 1982 aged 16, had run from New Jersey to San Francisco for the American Cancer Society.

26 Tom ad-libbed the line: "My name is Forrest Gump. People call me Forrest Gump."

27 The star's daughter Elizabeth plays a red-headed girl who wouldn't let Forrest sit next to her on a bus in the movie.

28 Guardians Of The Galaxy star Chris Pratt once worked in a Bubba Gump Shrimp Company which had become a real-life, international seafood restaurant chain inspired by the film.

29 The movie made £535million at the box office and the soundtrack sold over 12m copies.

30 A planned sequel never got off the ground... but there was a 2022 Bollywood remake.

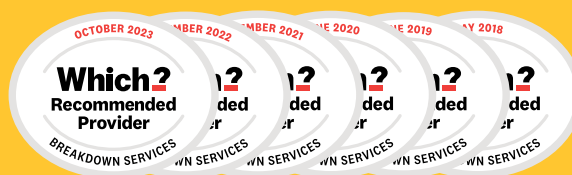

Markets, golf, theatre, gin... Fiona Whitty explores life beyond the university

HEAR the name Oxford and you'd be forgiven for thinking of a city that revolves purely around its famous university. But on a weekend trip there, 18-year-old daughter in tow, I discovered there's so much more to it – namely the perfect bonding pastimes of food and drink, theatre and shopping.

Thanks to its compact nature, Oxford was easy to get around, leaving us more time to indulge – or just chill. It was also simple to get to, with our train from London taking just 52 minutes. Direct services run from Bristol, Birmingham and Manchester too.

Sounds perfect? It was. Rosie and I kicked off our break with some retail therapy. Oxford's pedestrianised high street is packed with brands while its side roads are home to independent stores, cafes and boutiques.

The main shopping centre, called Westgate, is cleverly designed with aerial walkways to give the intimacy of an indoor mall despite it being open-air.

We loved the huge Zara, three-storey John Lewis and the roof terrace that's home to a string of restaurants and offers a beautiful panorama of the city (westgateoxford.co.uk).

For a leisurely lunch we popped into Pho, which focuses on healthy Vietnamese food.

We loved its signature Pho dishes. The Vietnamese national dish, it's a steaming soup of rice noodles with extras such as tofu and button mushrooms, beef brisket or chicken, accompanied by a plate of herbs which you can add to taste. Pure comfort food.

Stir-fried Chinese leaf with fresh chillies and seafood spring rolls made

great sides, while the house cocktails spun clever twists on classics. Our favourites were a spicy lychee margarita with Thai chillies, and a vodka martini with homemade lemonade and Thai basil.

Rosie and I are huge musical lovers so that evening a real treat lay ahead – a show at the city's New Theatre.

There's been a theatre on the site for 188 years, with the newest incarnation – opened in 1934 – designed by architects William and T.R. Milburn and Sir Thomas Bennett to be "England's finest".

It certainly attracted the best – Sir Laurence Olivier and Dame Judi Dench are among the stars who've performed there over the years.

Our amazing show – Everybody's Talking About Jamie – was a touring production of the West End hit and the theatre's lavish interior made the experience feel grander than ever.

It was only on for a limited run – but other mega hits such as Dear Evan Hansen and Grease as well as shows by John Bishop, Sarah

Millican and Paul Weller are in the pipeline this year (atgtickets.com).

Afterwards we were ready to flop at the voco Oxford Spires Hotel. Situated about a mile outside the centre, it's linked to all the action by a relaxing walk along the River Thames past university boat houses – or a £1.40 five-minute bus ride.

We felt like we had the best of both worlds – the city on our doorstep yet plenty of green space and peace and quiet around us.

Our huge room contained two super-king beds and home-from-home touches like a jug of proper milk, coffee bags rather than sachets and fresh biscuits in a jar. The breakfasts were definitely

worth getting up for with lots of fresh fruit, pastries and juices and friendly service accompanying the large hot and cold buffets.

Next morning, after picking up a free tourist map from the hotel reception, we enjoyed a pleasant stroll back along the Thames path and into the centre to discover some of Oxford's most famous sights.

In his work *Thyrsis*, Victorian poet Matthew Arnold dubbed it the "city of dreaming spires" after its incredible architecture, and it's easy to see why as impressive buildings abound.

Its university is the oldest in the English-speaking world and we strolled past several of its esteemed colleges, such as Christ Church, founded in 1546 by King Henry VIII and more recently used as a Harry Potter filmset.

We saw the stunning Bodleian Library, one of the oldest in Europe and the second largest in the UK after the British Library, and

St Aldates police station, which doubled as Inspector Morse's workplace in the TV series.

Then we wandered through the 250-year-old Covered Market with its craft and food stalls, and past Hertford Bridge, better known as the Bridge of Sighs because of its similarity to Venice's version.

For an introduction to how gin, vodka and whisky are made – and a few tastings – we caught a bus to

The Oxford Artisan Distillery in the suburbs.

Sadly it's about to close but its legacy will live on as it will continue to supply gin to the Ashmolean Museum and Oxford Botanic Garden.

We ended our stay with a trip to Junkyard Golf Club, located back in Westgate. Part of a small chain that's spreading up and down the UK, it contained three madcap courses based around a car scrapyard, a jungle and a circus.

Crazy obstacles involved ramps, skulls, a cannon and a pair of trainers, all accompanied by bright neon lights and pumping tunes to add to the fun.

As a perk you can bring your drinks around with you – all the more reason to take advantage of fun happy-hour cocktails such as Fizz Pop with a bubblegum bottle and popping candy garnish and Snakes on a Plane with a jelly viper on top (from £9.50pp for nine holes, from £14.50pp for 18 holes (junkyardgolfclub.co.uk)).

A weekend in Oxford? We'll drink to that.

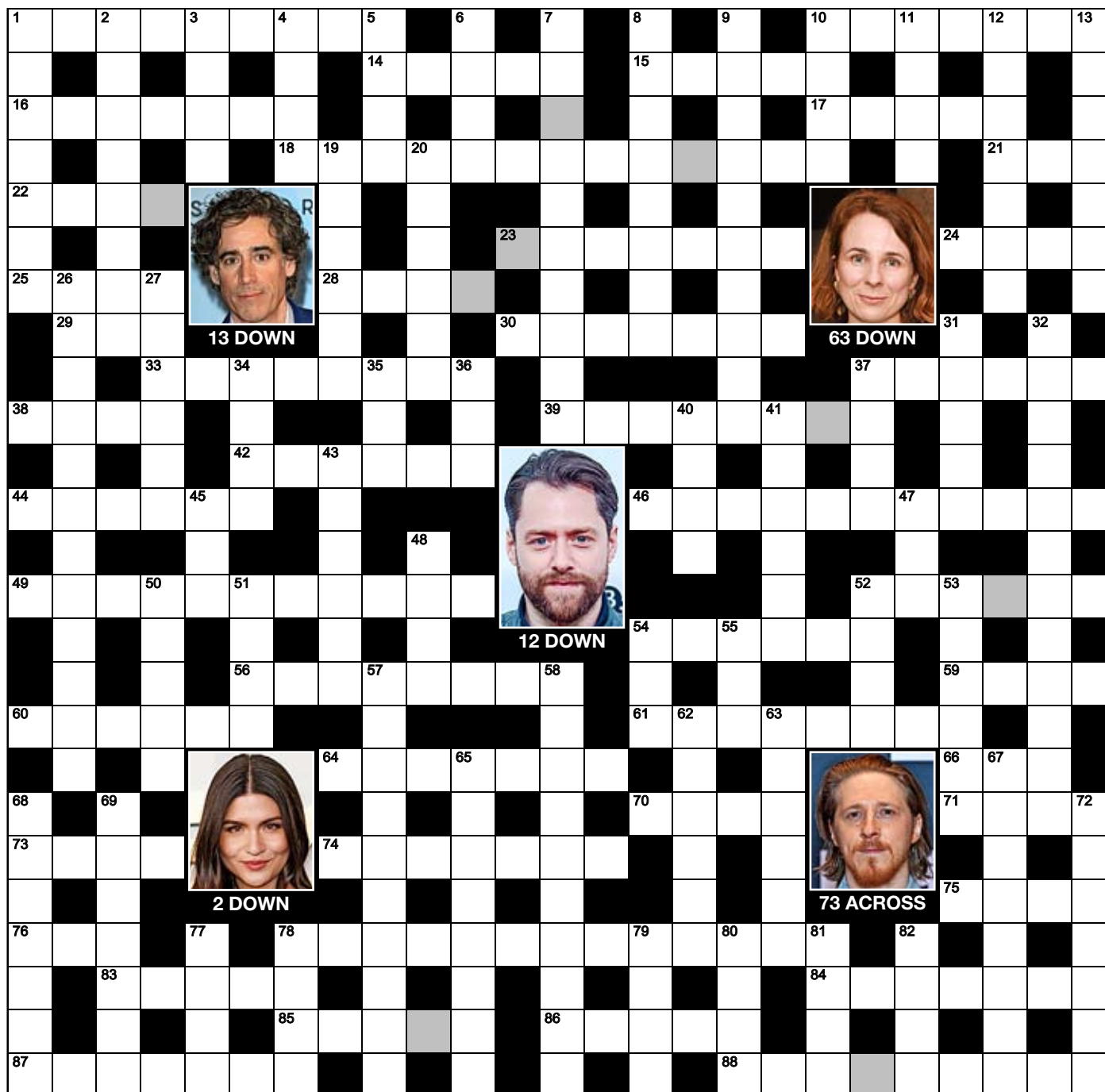

STEVE BORTHWICK has urged aspiring English coaches to pack their bags and work overseas if they want to get to the top of rugby.

The England head coach worked for Japan, under Eddie Jones, from 2012 to 2015, which he said was an eye-opener and travelled extensively before that to pick people's brains as a player.

Attack coach Richard Wigglesworth had a stint assisting Canada at the 2019 World Cup thanks to his friendship with boss Kingsley Jones, who he knew from their Sale days.

Geoff Parling, the former lock, is currently on the Australian coaching staff after staying Down Under following a short playing stint at the Melbourne Rebels.

But Englishmen abroad are few and far between and Borthwick has encouraged more coaching hopefuls to do a Parling and go abroad to broaden their knowledge.

Borthwick said: "During my playing career I tried to travel and see different environments and cultures in South Africa, North America and Australia.

"The opportunity came to travel and coach here in Japan and I feel very fortunate and privileged to have had that opportunity.

"Coaching overseas is something I'd highly recommend to any young and aspiring coach."

Denny has Euro glory on tap

TYLER DENNY admits talk of being a European champion and aiming for world honours would have been a joke even to him only a couple of years ago.

But the former plumber is now hoping to sink Felix Cash to tighten his grip on the European middle-weight crown and then flush out the big names in the division.

Black Country bruiser Denny, 32, is yet again the underdog, despite fighting closer to home at Birmingham's Resorts World tonight.

But he's used to being the less fancied fighter, having suffered defeats when it looked like his career was going nowhere.

After losing to Reece Cartwright and Linus Udofia in English title bouts, Denny got serious in the sport after backing from a local sponsor.

"If you asked me a few years ago would I be here I'd have probably laughed at you," he said.

"I was a plumber back then. I was full-time with that and doing boxing on the side.

"Then S&R Construction got behind me, gave me a month's wage to train and that was before I fought Derrick Osaze.

"To have a month off before that fight was great, I won and he's helped me out ever since.

"That has allowed me to train every day and be on the same level. "When you've got someone

backing you, then it fires you up too. You realise you have to do it because they're putting something behind you."

That Osaze fight was in a temporary boxing arena on a car park in Sheffield as one of the Covid-restricted ideas in boxing.

But it gave Denny the platform to build and it eventually led him to a European title fight with Matteo Signani last year which he won.

"It wasn't even everything I dreamed of, I never even thought I could get to these levels," added Denny.

The West Midlands fighter still keeps in touch with his pals from the building sites.

"A guy rang me last week to send me £200 because he found copper pipes and other stuff we found that we used to collect and sell," he said.

But he will have much bigger pay cheques to come if he can derail the much-fancied Cash, who is backed by tonight's promoters Matchroom, which is run by Eddie Hearn.

He said: "World titles are possible now. Before I'd never have thought it was possible but it shows hard work pays off and never give in."

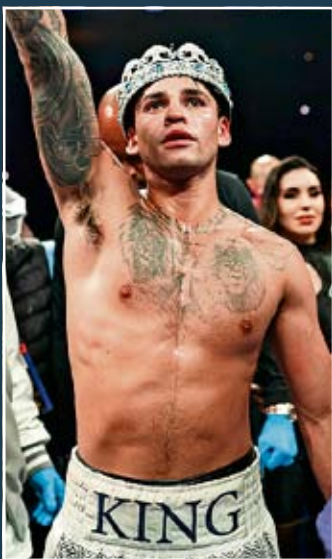

A cracking undercard includes Conor Quinn against Conner Kelsall for the Commonwealth flyweight title.

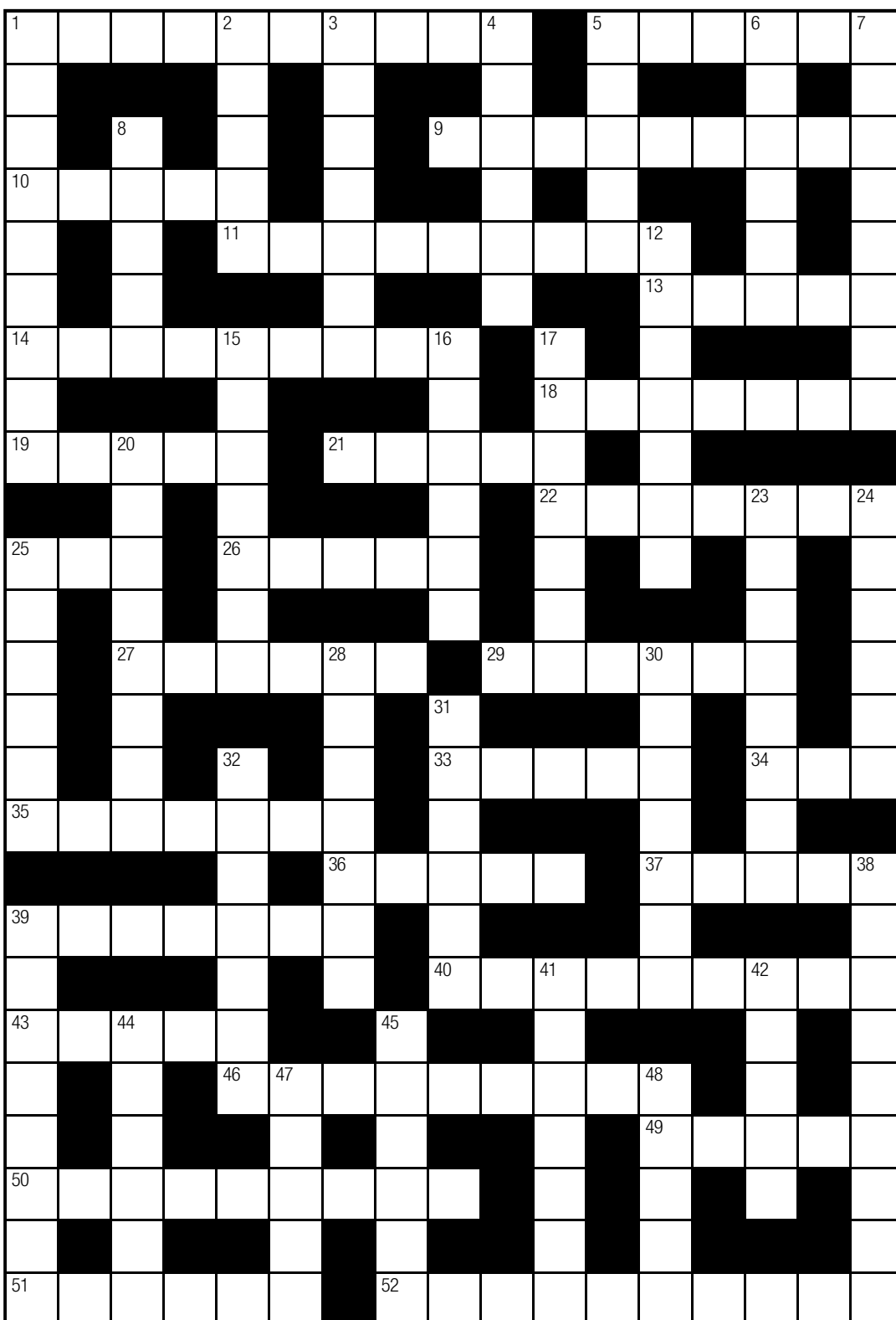

Leeds Rhinos came out in force last night to celebrate the life of the legendary Rob Burrow.

"I said it's possible so let's make it happen. I'm very privileged to make it and be here."

Asked by fellow Rhinos legend Barrie McDermott if he was

claiming an assist for that brilliant Burrow try at Old Trafford, Buderus laughed and said: "No. Not at all. It was a tired pass!"

"I had the best seat in the house for that one. He made it his field of dreams and it was so special. He was a special man."

Eight years ago, after a couple of technical failures for Hamilton while team-mate Nico Rosberg flew, fans wearing tin foil hats cried foul play.

This season, George Russell (*inset*) is smashing Hamilton in qualifying on a weekly basis and is 14 points ahead in the championship. And an anonymous email, claiming to be from a Mercedes employee, alleges "systematic sabotage" of the Ferrari-bound Briton.

It's all complete rubbish. No doubt there

will be favouritism in Russell's favour this year - it's only natural when a driver is leaving for a rival.

Hamilton will be frozen out of meetings and won't be prioritised for upgrades. Mercedes won't want the seven-time champion taking knowledge of their future plans to Ferrari.

What isn't reasonable, is to think for one second that the Silver Arrows would deliberately make one of their cars slower, or more prone to break down.

They need as many points as they can get and have no reason to want Hamilton to fail in their final season together.

Anyone who believes otherwise needs to take off their Hamilton-tinted glasses.

The matter didn't distract Hamilton, who yesterday finished at the top of the timesheets in practice for tomorrow's Spanish Grand Prix in Barcelona.

He pipped home hero Carlos Sainz, while fellow Briton Lando Norris, who was quickest in the first session of the day, was less than one-tenth of a second behind in third.

Many expect Red Bull to be back to their fearsome best at the Circuit de Catalunya but the championship leaders were keeping their cards close to their chest.

Max Verstappen was second quickest in the first session and fifth fastest later in the afternoon.

IT ALL GOES SOUTH

England up against it to retain their title

IT'S not just England's footballers who are putting their supporters through the mill.

On the island where Freddie Flintoff's maritime misadventure on a pedalo made waves 17 years ago, England were sunk again to leave their Twenty20 World Cup hopes back in the balance.

Chasing a modest 164 to beat South Africa in St Lucia, they fell just seven runs short in a dramatic finish.

Now the holders must beat the United States convincingly in their final Super 8s game in Barbados tomorrow to reach the semi-finals.

After scraping through the rain-affected group stage, they seem determined to take the scenic route to glory.

Despite a swaggering 78-run stand in seven overs between Harry Brook (53 off 37 balls) and Liam Livingstone (33 off 17), the Proteas maintained their unbeaten record.

Defiant England skipper Jos Buttler said: "We are still in this tournament if we can get over the line with a decent net run rate against the USA.

"I'm proud of how we responded with the ball after South Africa's strong powerplay and Brook and Livingstone's partnership took us so close.

"At one stage we were favourites but T20 cricket is never that simple and credit to South Africa for closing it out."

After slipping to 61-4 in the 11th over of their chase, England's cause looked irretrievable and with 77 required off the last six overs, the odds were stacked against them. But

Livingstone cleared the ropes twice and, with 14 required off the final over, Brook looked poised to steal the spoils for England.

But from the first ball of pace bowler Anrich Nortje's death-or-glory over, Proteas skipper Aiden Markram took a magnificent running catch, moving back towards the long-off boundary to remove Brook and effectively sealing a tight contest.

Markram said of his acrobatic effort: "I'll take it. I'm just grateful it stuck. Happy to hold on and it made a big difference."

South Africa's innings was dominated by Quinton de Kock's 22-ball half-century, but with the exception of David Miller (43 off 28 deliveries), nobody was able to follow his lead.

De Kock was fortunate to survive a reprieve on 58, holing out to Mark Wood off Adil Rashid but standing his ground after the 95mph paceman appeared to misjudge the flight and take the catch desperately low.

England were aggrieved when TV umpire Joel Wilson gave De Kock the benefit of the doubt but he only lasted another seven runs before Buttler's flying catch to dismiss him.

Buttler then excelled with a direct hit at the non-striker's end to send the dangerous Heinrich Klaasen packing.

And when Jofra Archer's two wickets in as many balls, aided by Brook and Sam Curran's sprawling catches in the deep, restricted the Proteas to 163-6, England looked favourites after shipping just 100 runs in 14 overs after the powerplay.

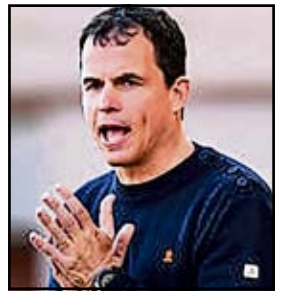

Rice wants united squad to find their will to win

DECLAN RICE has told England to deal with the pressure of wanting to win Euro 2024.

Gareth Southgate's Three Lions have been left licking their wounds in the wake of their shambolic draw with Denmark in Group C on Thursday.

England starred in their own fright night in Frankfurt, producing a clueless performance that has left them facing fierce criticism.

Southgate's men started Euro 2024 as favourites to win it but some of them have failed to deal with the expectation on their shoulders.

And Rice believes it is time for England to stand up and be counted.

He said: "I think we are all so desperate to do the country proud. We are all so desperate to win, to be leaders, to go out there and give people memories for lifetimes.

"Sometimes I maybe feel like we put too much pressure on ourselves.

"There is probably more pressure now from the outside, just because of the seasons some of our players have had."

"If you look at the goals that our front four have scored this year, it's over a hundred between them.

"Of course there is expectation because they are the best players in the world. That goes for everyone throughout the team. There's going to be that pressure. This is England at a major

tournament. But this is our job and what we have to deal with.

"We've played in high-pressure games and high-pressure environments.

"It's all about us on the pitch, to be able to get it done. We know we can be collectively better. We'll be ready for the next one."

Southgate claims some of his stars are too tired from a long season to produce the high-pressing game he wants.

Rice has revealed players will never admit to being tired and reckons the balance of the team has to change.

Ahead of the final group game against Slovenia in Cologne on Tuesday, the Arsenal midfielder added: "Lads are never going to admit if they're tired or not.

"It's about getting that balance. I watched France the other night, Portugal changed to a back five. They're not going out and pressing full throttle.

"So it's about getting that balance of when we can press and when we can't.

"The further it goes on, we're going to play against better opposition, more world-class players.

"And if you don't get your press right, which is probably the most important thing on the pitch, you're going to get picked off."

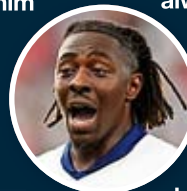

He said: "The way we are playing isn't about an individual player. We've got to play better as a group."

"We have got some strong leaders in the dressing room here who have been in situations like this and will play their part in lifting people."

"And, of course, all of the staff have to do that as well. That is our job."

"I'm not going to hide from the realities of that. I have to find the solutions. We can draw on what we like, but we have to deliver."

Southgate can use past experiences of having reached the latter stages of major tournaments.

However, he wants his players to deal with the burden of being expected to end England's long wait for a

trophy. He said: "I am seeing every day that they are loving working together."

"I don't think it is a lack of spark. At the moment, they ironically care too much and they need firm leadership at this time."

"We are trying to do something that has never been done before. So that is going to be a bit of a roller coaster."

"It's not going to go smoothly when you are trying to achieve extraordinary things. They (major tournaments) are bloody difficult."

"We have to accept the level of expectations, we have to accept the arena we are in. And we have to find a better way of playing to how we have so far."

"There can be no suggestion that they are not trying."

"They are running, they are giving everything, but at the moment the emotion and the way we are playing isn't calm in the moments we need it to be."

"To go to the stages of the competition that we want to end up in, that has to be better. We know that."

Southgate wants to embrace the TCUP concept (Thinking Clearly Under Pressure) that Sir Clive Woodward used to help his England rugby team win the World Cup in 2003.

He added: "We're in an intense arena and have to find a way of embracing that."

"Walking towards the challenge and understanding what it is and playing in a more composed manner than we have so far."

"I have to guide the fellas through that."

5 BIG ENGLAND QUESTIONS

Should Gareth Southgate consider dropping Harry Kane?

The prospect has been unthinkable, considering his status in the team.

He's the captain and main goalscorer but the reality is Kane (inset, top) is also not involved in games enough.

Current tactics do him few favours and he's dropping too deep. Which defeats the whole object,

considering what a lethal marksman he is. A rest would do him good.

Does the midfield need to change?

Yes. It's the area of the pitch that will decide England's ultimate fate at Euro 2024.

The Trent Alexander-Arnold experiment has not worked, because his discipline and defending is nowhere near good enough.

Jude Bellingham should slot in alongside Declan Rice with a licence to go forward, while Phil Foden

should operate in the No.10 role. He's at his best in tight spaces.

Southgate said England are missing Calvin Phillips? Are they really?

He's had pelters for saying this, not least because Phillips (inset) has seen his career go off the edge of a cliff.

He couldn't even get a game on loan at West Ham towards the end of last season. But Southgate is referring to the Phillips who anchored the midfield so



brilliantly during Euro 2020. That man is now Kobbie Mainoo. He's taken him, so why not pick him?

Why can't England build on a lead?

It must all go back to the instructions Southgate has given them.

Go ahead and then sit tight, play deeper and protect what you've got.

Which is absolute madness, considering the attacking talents England have at their disposal.

The handbrake shouldn't be left on. All the great sides have that killer instinct but England seem to like making life difficult for themselves.

Are we panicking too much?

It's part of the English DNA to do so when performances don't go to plan.

The circus around England has always been bonkers, but the levels of paranoia

have reached unprecedented levels in recent times due to the Three Lions threatening to actually win a tournament.

England are good enough because the talent is there. The question is, is Southgate good enough to get the most out of that talent?

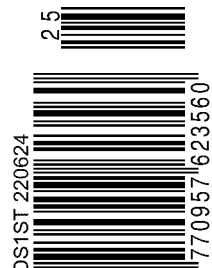

DROP KANE? IT'S WHAT WE NEED RIGHT NOW

HARRY KANE should be dropped for England's Euros group decider with Slovenia.

That's the verdict of Wes Brown, speaking on today's (SAT) episode of our podcast Euro Thrash, which you can find on Apple, Spotify and YouTube from 9am.

Despite scoring, Kane was one of a number of England players who failed to fire in a laboured 1-1 draw with Denmark.

But with four points in the bag and qualification for the knockout stages in touching distance, former Manchester United defender Brown reckons it's time to mix up the front line by starting Aston Villa forward Ollie Watkins (above) instead.

"I honestly believe Watkins will start the next game," Brown said. "I know Harry Kane is the captain, and when we get

through he gets back into the team, but it's good to give the team something else with a player that can run in behind.

"Unfortunately, Harry came short too many times.

When we have such great ability in that midfield, he doesn't necessarily have to.

"We need someone to keep the centre-backs pushed back which creates space."

Brown also believes Trent Alexander-Arnold would be more impactful from off the bench.

"Some times he's not sure what to do," he said. "We've got so many good players in midfield that we could play.

"I think we should bring Trent on in the 60th minute when everyone's tired. He is a brilliant passer of the ball, he can be brilliant coming on as a sub, when it's a bit open."

Ayoze Perez says Spain's greatness was there for all to see in the win over Italy

AS he watched Spain dismantle Italy from the sidelines, Ayoze Perez realised he was in the presence of greatness

Riccardo Calafiori's own goal (below) was all that separated the sides but Spain were far better than the defending champions.

"It was actually the case that from the bench, from the stands, you could feel that this was world class," said Perez, the former Leicester and Newcastle star now with Real Betis, who joined the action in the 78th minute.

"You could see the quality on the pitch and this was a very good game. This is the sport we love, and I believe that this was a great show for everyone."

Hype is building around Luis de la Fuente's side after their two statement victories to kick off Euro 2024. The win over Italy followed a 3-0 thrashing of Croatia in Berlin, with six points already guaranteeing Spain a ticket to the knockout stages.

Lamine Yamal, 16, was

exceptional on Spain's right flank against the Azzurri but Nico Williams was even better on the left.

Williams' man-of-the-match display earned him a rapturous reception after the final whistle and a message of encouragement from older brother and Athletic Bilbao team-mate Inaki.

"My team-mates applauded me in the dressing room and I'd like to thank them for helping me out with their ability," said Williams. "I'm delighted to help them. I got a text from my brother straight away and I hope

my family are enjoying this as much as I am."

De la Fuente has shown no interest in protecting his players from the weight of expectation, as he openly claimed there is no team better than his at this summer's tournament.

His opposite number, Italy boss Luciano Spalletti, seemingly agrees.

"I think everyone would love to copy Spain in terms of the way they play," said Spalletti. "They've been playing the best football for the longest time now."

"There was too much of a gulf

(between us) in terms of sharpness. You can't necessarily talk about anything else, that's right at the basis of everything."

While a draw could be enough, Italy will need to win their final Group B game against Croatia on Monday to guarantee their spot in the last 16.

Having had only one shot on target against Spain, Spalletti's side will need to create more against a Croatia team who are also fighting for their tournament lives.

Goalkeeper Gianluigi Donnarumma claims he and his Italy team-mates are furious with their performance in Gelsenkirchen and hopes they can channel that to win their group-stage finale.

"Honestly, I don't care about my saves – I was hoping for a different result and a different performance," Donnarumma admitted. "We missed too many easy passes and put in too little quality and, if you miss that much, they punish you."

"We are angry, but let's use this for the last match in the group."

THIS was not the coach who moped glumly around Old Trafford for six months in one of Manchester United's more unusual managerial phases.

Skipping along the touchline, punching the air, losing his glasses, leading a lap of honour inside Berlin's Olympic Stadium, Ralf Rangnick was in the form of his life. And make no mistake, with the tune Rangnick is getting out of this Austrian side, he has a tournament dark horse on his hands.

This was, arguably, as impressive a performance as Euro 2024 has seen so far and Rangnick had every right to be pleased.

And if confirmation was needed that he has energised and organised this Austrian team, it came from the outstanding Christoph Baumgartner, the official man of the match and scorer of Austria's second goal (top).

Baumgartner said: "The coach believed in me. He made it clear that I can make the difference in big matches. He has faith in me."

"I wanted to show him that I am extremely grateful. I am extremely happy that he is still here with us."

Rangnick (circled, above) was typically understated after the statement victory, saying: "Since I was coach

with Austria, that was the most important match and that is why I am so happy, not just with the result but with the performance. We played well and controlled the second half."

The early Austrian pressing was ferocious and Poland were so rattled that the ninth minute opener for Rangnick's side was overdue.

Wing-back Phillip Mwene's smart cross was converted by an equally smart header from Gernot Trauner. Sadly for Trauner, it was his deflection that gave

Krzysztof Piatek a routine chance to equalise. A chance he took expertly. Robert

And the games will continue to come thick and fast if Ronaldo guides his nation to the knockout stages of Euro 2024.

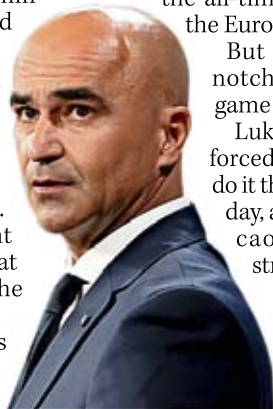

"If you want to analyse his stats over the past 12 months... Cristiano is in the Portuguese national team because he deserves to be.

Having appeared in every edition of the tournament since 2004, Ronaldo is by far and away the all-time leading scorer at the Euros with 14 goals.

But he was unable to notch in Portugal's first game against the Czechs.

Lukas Provod's opener forced Martinez's men to do it the hard way on Tuesday, as Francisco Conceicao's stoppage-time strike sealed a 2-1 win.

Portugal's upcoming opponents, Turkey, are also fresh from a victory

after putting three past Georgia earlier this week. Real Madrid teenager Arda Guler's stunning strike in that game is already a candidate for goal of the tournament.

Turkey will have thousands more fans cheering them on in Dortmund than their opponents will, but Portugal's Rafael Leao refuses to be intimidated.

In fact, the AC Milan forward expects to get more joy against Turkey than he did against the well-drilled Czechs.

"It is a very important match against a very good team," he said.

"They have great quality. We can't allow them a lot of space. They're very skilled individually.

"We've been studying what the gaffer wants us to do. We know what we want to do and it's going to be an entirely different game.

"There will be more space for us - for Joao Felix, for Cristiano, for Goncalo Ramos.

"I think we may show how strong our attacking players are - this is what the gaffer has been telling us. This game will be a bit more our style."

AS the ball drifted over his right shoulder, who could not have imagined what would happen next.

"I'm proud to be here and play for my country. Today is a special day for me. In these competitions, you can't rely on 11 players – you need all 26 who can go on the pitch and change the game, who can do something special.

"Everyone has to be ready. Everyone has to be sharp. Then you have a chance to do something special."

After losing their opening match 3-0 to Romania, Ukraine looked in danger again as Ivan Schranz put Slovakia ahead after 17 minutes.

He scored with a looping header into the back post not far from the spot where Yaremchuk would have his glory.

Shaparenko drove home a well-taken equaliser in the 54th minute following a fine counter attack as he swept home a cross from Arsenal defender Oleksandr Zinchenko.

And when Yaremchuk replaced Artem Dovbyk 13 minutes later, the path was set for the unforgettable finale.

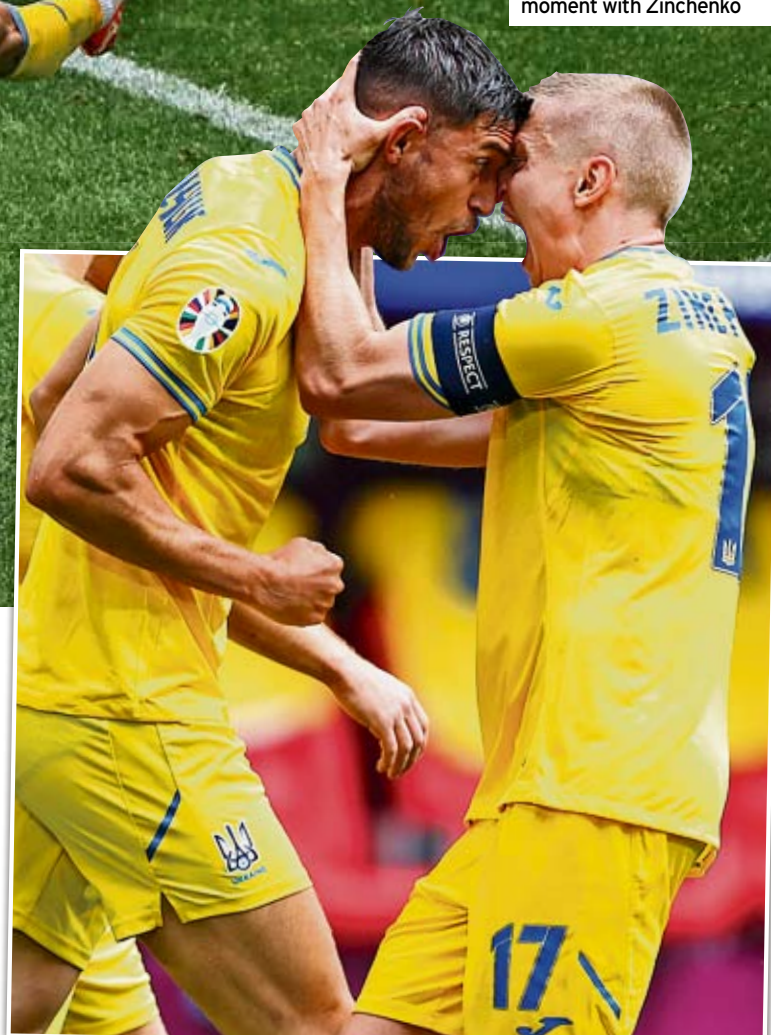

Czech gives his name to outrageous penalty kick

THERE must be something about the third week of June that drives some footballers to shape their legacy.

Three days ago, June 19, marked the 50th anniversary of the birth of the Cruyff Turn, the Dutch master's masterpiece in Hamburg during the 1974 World Cup.

The following day, June 20, was 48 years since another player tried something even more audacious, in Belgrade, after which it would always be labelled with his name.

What made Antonin Panenka's cheeky penalty kick so breathtaking was that not only

was it in a European Championship but it was in the final. In the penalty shoot-out.

And it was the kick that would decide whether or not Czechoslovakia were crowned kings of Europe.

Having never seen it performed, even legendary West Germany goalkeeper Sepp Maier fell for it and was on his backside near the right-hand post by the time Panenka's dink floated down the middle and into the net.

The Czech No.7 was so impressed with his effort that he followed it into the net, taking a couple of steps inside the goal before turning away to celebrate. Maybe he just wanted to be sure it was in as nobody watching could quite believe what he had done.

And, even though some colleagues knew he had it in his box of tricks, none of them was sure he would try it at such an important moment.

Panenka said: "I practised it for two years before Euro '76. I just figured out that every

keeper always jumps to one side, so it could be good to kick in the middle.

"After every practice, I competed with our goalkeeper, Hruska, in penalties. He was really good, so I was losing a lot of money, chocolates etc, in side bets.

"Then I started to use my little trick and suddenly I was winning more often. The only problem was that I got fat because of all the chocolates I won!"

West Germany went into the 1976 tournament as the reigning champions of Europe and the world, but the Czechs seemed unfazed and were 2-0 up after 25 minutes thanks to goals from Jan Svehlik and Karol Dobias.

Dieter Muller got one back, but it still looked as though it would not be enough until a late

Bernd Holzenbein equaliser sent the contest into extra-time and eventually penalties.

The first seven kicks of the shoot-out were scored but, when Uli Hoeness missed, it was Panenka's turn to step up.

The rest is history and, though many of the world's greats such as Zinedine Zidane, Lionel Messi and Diego Maradona have done it since, there is only one man whose name it carries.

HAVING shelled out 400,000 grand at the London Goffs Sale on Monday night, the new owners of **PENTLE BAY (2.30)** can get a swift return when he lands the Chesham Stakes run over seven furlongs at Royal Ascot.

George Boughey's son of New Bay overcame a very tardy start to make a successful start to his career over six furlongs at Leicester 18 days ago. As he is out of a Galileo mare, he is sure to appreciate the step up in real estate and Tom Marquand is a great jockey booking.

Before he won over today's distance at last year's meeting, **DESERT HERO (3.05)** ran a shocker on his previous start at Newbury in May, and the King's horse did the same thing this season. I'm prepared to give him a pass for that tame effort and expect him to bounce back in the Hardwicke Stakes run over a mile and a half.

William Haggas has his string in good heart, so snare the 8-1 with a layer paying four places and back him each-way.

MILL STREAM (3.45) showed a great attitude to get up in the dying strides under an inspired ride from Will Buick to land the Duke Of York Stakes over this afternoon's journey in May by a nose.

It's no surprise to see Jane Chapple-Hyam snap up the champion jockey again for her improving four-year-old in the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes run over six furlongs.

Hunt down a benevolent bookmaker paying four places and back Mill Stream at 5-1 as this stiffer track will suit him better than the Knavesmire.

All of Aidan O'Brien's horses have come on a bundle for their first run this

campaign, so **RIVER TIBER (4.25)** will be hard to beat in the Jersey Stakes run over seven furlongs.

This creature was third in the Irish 2,000 Guineas behind St James's Palace hero Rosallion over a mile on his seasonal bow, where the trip seemed to stretch his stamina.

River Tiber showed his liking for this course when taking the Coventry Stakes over six furlongs at last year's royal jamboree, and this distance may turn out to be his optimum.

The 30-runner Wokingham Handicap run over six furlongs looks harder to work

out than my wife's psyche but French cheval **DARK TROOPER (5.05)** looks worth an each-way nibble.

HAND OF GOD (5.40) landed a gamble when rated 88 over a mile at Sandown Park in April, and Harry Charlton has not run his inmate since so he could protect a mark of 91 for the Golden Gates Handicap run over a mile and a quarter.

The son of Churchill was never going to be defeated in the battle up the Esher hill, and as he is out of a Daylami mare, the three-year-old will be seen in a much-better light over this extra expanse of real estate. Will Buick gave

Belloccio – thank the good lord – one of the rides of the decade when winning the lucky last here on Tuesday, so having him on board is a Brucie bonus.

Joseph O'Brien captured the Queen Alexandra Stakes run over two miles and six furlongs with Dawn Rising last year, but that horse has a 3lb penalty this time so I'm going to back stablemate **UXMAL (6.15)** each-way around the 10-1 perch.

The son of Galileo bolted up at Killarney over a mile and six furlongs in May and this progressive four-year-old has been aimed at this race all season.

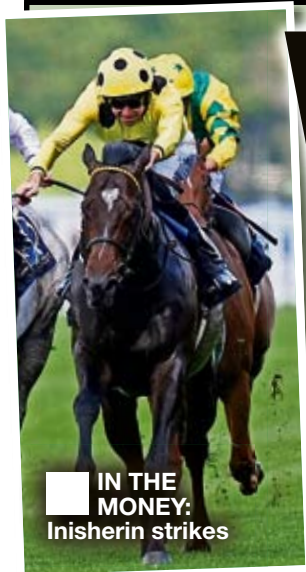

This test is tailor-made for him – expect him to be thundering home late off a strong pace.

In the Hardwicke Stakes it may pay to shoot for the moon with an each-way poke at 50-1 outsider **ELEGANT MAN (3.05)**. Group races were

always going to be his bag but the cash at all-weather finals day lured him to Newcastle, where he gave 10lb and a beating to sand star Penzance.

He was no match for White Birch and Auguste Rodin in a Group One next time but the Amo team blamed the easy ground.

They've always thought a lot of him and, down in grade and with a faster surface to bounce off, he may not be out of this.

POSTILEO (6.15) was smart over middle distances when with Roger Varian but shapes like a marathon test may be what he now needs.

Shrewd trainer Emmet Mullins certainly thinks so and tests the theory in the Queen Alexandra Stakes.

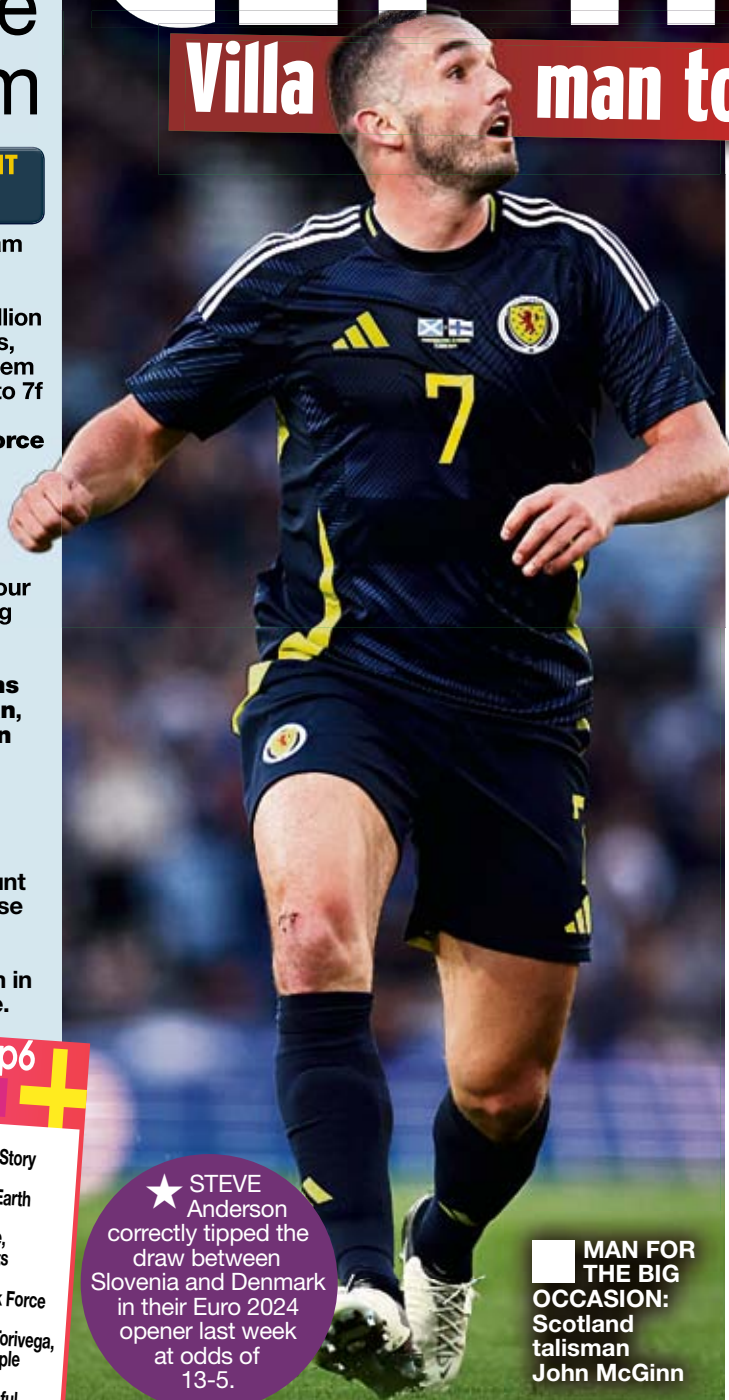

McGINN CAN GET THE WIN

Villa man to help Scots make history



SCOTLAND can make history by beating Hungary tomorrow and reaching the knockout stages of a major tournament for the first time.

But it certainly won't be easy and promises to be another tense, nervy night for the Tartan Army.

However, Steve Clarke's men have their tails up again after a battling draw against a decent Switzerland side, while the Magyars must recover from two opening defeats in Euro 2024.

The bookmakers can't separate the sides in the betting, with each country priced around 6-4 for the victory and the draw at 3-1.

Scots boss Clarke will take heart from the fact that Hungary have conceded in each of their last seven competitive matches - including five at this tournament already.

But it's in defence that he has the biggest worries. With Aaron Hickey, Nathan Patterson, Ryan Porteous and Kieran Tierney all out through injuries and suspension, it will be almost a second-string defence facing a dangerous Hungarian front line.

I just can't see goalkeeper Angus Gunn surviving another 90 minutes without conceding here, so I'd expect both teams to score, which is just 8-15 with Sky Bet.

Take Scotland to edge home 2-1, a scoreline that pays 9-1 with bet365.

I'd expect Clarke's men to come out firing as they did against the Swiss and try to get their noses in front early, so it could pay to take the Scots to be ahead at the interval and at full-time, which is 7-2 with Sky Bet in the half-time/full-time market.

At least the Tartan Army don't have to pin their hopes on goals

coming from their strikers, with Che Adams getting few chances up front so far.

But midfielders John McGinn and Scott McTominay have regularly come up with the goods for the Scots and you have to fancy one of them to hit the net here.

Aston Villa ace McGinn, who has hit 16 of his 18 international goals in competitive fixtures, is a big 11-2 to score in a Scots win, while he is 11-4 to net at any time.

I'd fancy him at 8-1 to grab the first goal, with the scorecast of McGinn netting first and Scotland winning 2-1 paying a huge 50-1 with Betfred.

Southampton forward Adams has worked tirelessly up front so perhaps tomorrow he'll get the reward he deserves. He's just 15-8 to score at any time but could be worth backing at 6-1 to score the last goal of the game.

Gareth Southgate's men are 2-5 to beat Slovenia, with their opponents 17-2 with bet365 and the draw 19-5 with BetMGM.

England will still be keen to finish top of Group C, so I'd expect them to win in Cologne. Take them to triumph 2-0 with bet365 and Bukayo Saka to find the net at 6-4.

Lukaku to lead the way for bruised Belgians
