

A new Emerson poll has Donald Trump up by one to four points in Arizona, Georgia, Wisconsin, Nevada, Pennsylvania and Michigan. But he's also tied, 45%-45% in Minnesota, which has backed Democrats for decades. And he's within eight points of Joe Biden in deep blue New York, a Siena poll finds.

Blast-ard off to jail

His drug-smuggling scheme really blew up in his face.

A South Carolina drug dealer was sentenced to 18 years in prison this week after he was caught trying to move meth and fentanyl inside hollowed-out grenades last spring.

Cory Gerald Bell, 36, was stopped in May 2023 by a Greenwood County Sheriff's deputy who noticed Bell had a broken tail light, according to WYFF 4.

The deputy searched the car after catching a whiff of marijuana, which is still illegal in the Palmetto State, and found a bag containing 166 grams of meth — as well as fentanyl pills — packed inside hollowed-out hand grenades, 8th Circuit Solicitor David M. Stumbo said.

Bell pleaded guilty this week to trafficking methamphetamine and possession with intent to distribute fentanyl. On Monday, a circuit judge sentenced him to 18 years in prison.

"We will continue to make it clear to the local peddlers of these deadly substances that they will pay a high price for choosing to make a living off the misery of addicts," Stumbo said. Steve Janoski

Hard-boiled New Yorkers threw cold water on the hoopla surrounding the supposedly "extreme" heat dome that hit the city Thursday — as forecasters warned it really is going to get worse.

"It's hot, but I thought it was going to be hotter. It's not that humid," said Melanie Gedney, 28, who works in accounting and was eating lunch outside in Midtown. "Anytime we have the first weather event of any season it gets hyped up."

Brian, a 37-year-old construction worker doing a project nearby, said he had sweat through far hotter days

"It's regular heat to me. Could be worse," he said, adding he doesn't believe the heat dome is really a thing. "They hype up too many things sometimes."

Everyone from Mayor Adams to National Weather Service meteorologists have warned that an op-

pressive heat wave would roast the city this week, bringing realfeel temperatures into the high 90s.

But some Big Apple residents said officials may be overreacting.

"It's hotter than normal this time of year, but then again, I have seen it hotter in New York City," said Irene Borutta, 75, who works at a law firm and was smoking a cigarette outside.

"It's hot, it's not dangerous," added Greg Gullo, 59, who works in construction in Manhattan. "It's summertime. You drink a lot of water. I would be surprised if we had this weather in the winter."

Jennifer James, a 32-year-old student from Manhattan, said she's endured higher temperatures: "It has been worse."

Still, forecasters told The Post Thursday — the first day of summer — that the most sweltering weather is yet to come.

"It hasn't been too terrible the last couple days — but it is going to get worse as we get into the weekend," said FOX Weather meteorologist Samantha Thomas.

<u>'Close to record'</u>

The mercury is expected to climb to a high of 92 on Friday, followed by 93 on Saturday, she said. Sunday will hit a high of 95 with real-feel temps reaching 101.

"We're close to record heat on Sunday," Thomas said.

The record for hottest ever June 23 in New York City was set in 1888 at 96 degrees.

On Thursday, New Yorkers spent time tanning in parks, cooling off at the beach and doing outdoor yoga in Times Square to celebrate the summer solstice.

Gilly's re-elex support

Democratic New York Sen. Kirsten Gillibrand appears vulnerable as she seeks a fourth term, a surreleased Thursday claims.

Only 42% of voters support Gillibrand's re-election in the deep-blue Empire State, while 42% prefer someone else and 16% were undecided, the Siena College poll found.

While 62% of Democratic voters backed Gillibrand's re-election, only 32% of registered independents supported another term for the junior senator, while 46% preferred someone else.

Just 40% of voters view her favorably while a combined 60% either view her unfavorably or have no opinion.

Her Republican opponent, retired NYPD Detective Michael Sapraicone, said the findings show he has a shot to topple Gillibrand, who's been a senator since 2009.

Sapraicone claimed Gillibrand is in trouble because she's been "missing in action."

"As I travel the state, I hear valid concerns about crime, illegal migrants, and the economy — and every New Yorker, no matter their party, says Gillibrand is missing in action," Sapraicone said in a statement.

But history shows toppling Gillibrand isn't easy. better-financed Gillibrand handily won re-election with 67% of the vote in 2018 and 68% of the vote in 2012. Carl Campanile

phoned the mother of Rachel Morin, who was ruthlessly raped and murdered allegedly by an illegal migrant from El Salvador — with

the grieving mom saying she was "deeply touched" by Trump's "honest compassion."

The condolences from the presumptive GOP nominee came after Patty Morin slammed President Biden's Department of Homeland Security chief for referring to her daughter as an "individual" killed by a suspected gang mem-

Trump talked at length with Patty (lower inset) about Rachel (upper inset), a 37-year-old mother of five who was senselessly

slaughtered last August while on a hiking trail in Harford County, Md. "I am deeply touched by Presi-

dent Trump's kindness and con-

cern," Patty said in a statement. "He was genuine and truly wanted to know how our family was coping," she added. "He asked about Rachel and showed honest compassion for her untimely me during this very difficult time."

Officers with the Harford County Sheriff's Office, the FBI and other law-enforcement agen-

cies arrested Victor Antonio Martinez-Hernandez, 23, last Friday for Rachel's murder.

Martinez-Hernandez is an undocumented immigrant who illegally crossed the border four times last year and had been wanted for assaulting a mom and young girl during an LA home break-in.

His arrest reignited debates over the besieged southern border.

On Tuesday, Department of Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro

Mayorkas appeared on CNN and was asked about Rachel's murder and his response to critics blaming the administration's policies for violent crimes committed by migrants.

During his response, Mayorkas referred to Rachel as "the individual," with Patty appearing on Fox News the following day to condemn the DHS chief's choice of Ronny Reyes

Ex-President Donald Trump is running the table against President Biden in six battleground states, fresh polling shows.

The surveys from Emerson College and The Hill show the 45th president edging out Biden in Ar-(47%-43%), izona Georgia (45%-41%), Michigan (46%-45%), Nevada (46%-43%), Pennsylvania (47%-45%) and Wisconsin (47%-44%).

In all six states, Trump's lead has either remained the same or grown from the outlet's polls taken last month, before he was convicted by a Manhattan jury on 34 business fraud charges.

"In our first polling in several key swing states since Trump's conviction last month, there has been little movement, with support for both Trump and Biden staying largely consistent since November," Emerson College Polling executive director Spencer Kimball explained.

"Notably, results fall within the

poll's margin of error."

The poll also showed Trump and Biden dead even at 45% each in Minnesota, which has backed a Republican for president just three times since the onset of the Great Depression.

However, the Trump campaign has insisted that the Land of 10,000 Lakes is in play this time.

"Independent voters break for Trump in all seven states — however, there has been some movement among these voters since April," Kimball said.

"In Arizona, Trump's support among independents dropped 5 points, from 48% to 43%. In Michigan, Trump's support dropped three, from 44% to 41%, and in Pennsylvania, Trump dropped 8 points, from 49% to 41%. Biden lost support among independents in Georgia, by 6 points, 42% to 36% and Nevada, by 5, 37% to 32%.

The RealClearPolitics polling average also shows Trump leading Biden in the six battlegrounds, by margins ranging from 0.2 percentage points in Michigan to 5.7 percentage points in Nevada.

Dems favored in Senate

Similar to other polls, Emerson College and The Hill's survey shows Democrats in most contested Senate races running ahead of Biden.

In Pennsylvania, incumbent Democratic Sen. Bob Casey is topping Republican David McCormick, 47% to 41%.

In Michigan, Democratic Rep. Elissa Slotkin is running ahead of former GOP Rep. Mike Rogers, 43% to 39%.

In Nevada, Democratic Sen. Jacky Rosen is well up on Republican Sam Brown, 50% to 38%.

And in Wisconsin, Democratic Sen. Tammy Baldwin is narrowly ahead of Republican Eric Hovde, 46% to 44%.

A clear majority of voters in Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Minnesota. Nevada and Pennsylvania said they disapproved of Biden's performance in office — with the incumbent scoring approval ratings ranging between 35% in Georgia and 39% in Michigan and Pennsylvania.

The most important issue in all seven surveyed states was the economy, with 27% of Arizonaregistered voters deeming it their top concern, along with 45% of registered voters in Georgia, 41% in Michigan, 34% in Minnesota, 42% of in Wisconsin, 35% in Nevada and 44% in Pennsylvania.

Final say in first debate

President Donald Trump will close next week's debate with President Biden after he lost a coin toss, CNN announced Thursday.

Biden's campaign correctly called "tails" and got the option of either choosing which podium the incumbent

would stand behind at the CNN-hosted debate on June 27, or the order of the candidates' closing statements.


Democratic The camp opted for the right podium spot, where Biden stood in both of his 2020 election debates vs. Trump.

The Trump cam-

paign then said he would give the second and final closing statement of the 90-minute showdown. The June debate,

The second-most important issue varied by state. Michigan (13%), Minnesota (15%), Pennsylvania (12%) and Wisconsin (12%) voters said "threats to democracy" ranked high on their list of concerns.

In Arizona, immigration narrowly trailed the economy as the top issue, with 26% of registered voters saying it was their main concern. A majority of voters (55%) in the Grand Canyon State also said they would vote to approve a ballot measure that would allow state and local police to arrest illegal immigrants while giving state judges the power to order deportations.

The Emerson College Polling/ The Hill survey sampled 1,000 registered voters in each state June 13-18, with a margin of error of 3 percentage points.

Biden and Trump are slated to square off in their first 2024 debate next Thursday in Atlanta.

Ex-prez's red tide rising in blue NY

Donald Trump is within could be even closer. "We are going to win New York!" the prestriking distance of President Biden in a new poll of New York voters — with the former president claimed boosted by big May 23 gains among black and Jewish Empire Staters.

If the election were held today, Biden would receive 47% of the vote to 39% for Trump, Siena College found in a survey of 805 registered voters.

The poll's margin of error -4.1% — means the race

Hochul's slappshot Gongest brake OK

Gov. Hochul signed landmark legislation Thursday barring socialmedia companies from bombarding New York children with "addictive" feeds - something she said was the first step in a new push to restrict

schoolkids' smartphone usage. The first-in-the nation "SAFE for Kids Act" cracks down on apps such as TikTok and Instagram - that use algorithms to keep children glued to their phones and then profit off that data.

"We will save lives with this, my friends," Hochul told a crowd gathered at United Federation of Teachers union headquarters in Manhattan for the bill signing.

"Our kids will not be commoditized," she stressed. "We will not let them make money off our kids, our babies, anymore. That is not happening here, so here we are, the first in the nation."

The governor also doubled down on previous statements that she'd be looking at banning smartphones in schools next.

"The next frontier is the phones," Hochul told reporters after the announcement. "This is something that individual school districts right now can adopt. There is no prohibition on them, but to those who need the courage to be able to say that the governor made me do it, I'm happy to take that on, but we need some time to develop and get this done properly."

Stop scrolling

It's the latest in a campaign against technology Hochul and local politicians and advocates feel is harming New York's children. But the milestone law, passed by state lawmakers in Albany earlier this month, is almost certain to face a legal challenge from Big Tech companies.

That bill, and another signed by Hochul on Thursday, will:

- ■Prevent social-media platforms from feeding users under 18 content using algorithms that are tailored to keep them scrolling.
 - ■Give parents the ability to

- Prevent social media platforms from feeding users under the age of 18 content using algorithms that are tailored to keep them scrolling.
- Give parents the ability to pause notifications on their kids' social media accounts between 12 a.m. and 6 a.m.
- Bar social media companies from selling data generated by users under the age of 18.

The legislation charges Attorney General Letitia James with crafting many of the details on how it will be enforced, including how apps will verify the ages of users.

James, who was heavily involved in crafting the language to withstand a legal challenge, will also be the one to defend it in court.

"As most of you know, Tish James loves litigation and Tish James is not afraid to stand up to any bully," James said to applause, referring to herself in the third-person.

Google and Meta had already spearheaded a \$1 million lobbying effort to tank the Empire State legislation, public disclosures showed.

The legislation will go into effect six months after James finalizes the specific rules and regulations for the social-media platforms.

Julie Samuels, president and CEO of Tech:NYC, a group that advocates for tech companies, claimed the "unresolved issues" of how the laws will work could throw a wrench in the plan. Carl Szabo, vice president of NetChoice, blasted the legislation as "unconstitutional."

A spokesperson for Meta — the parent company of Instagram and Facebook — only said the company supports federal legislation that would put the onus on app stores to give parents more control over the apps their kids download.

New York City Schools Chancellor David Banks backed the socialmedia laws Thursday, saying the impact of the apps on kids has been "incredibly harmful." Asked about a potential phone ban, he said the DOE was still evaluating the idea.

Hochul said last month she was opposed to kids keeping phones in class, later clarifying she would be OK with students having "dumb" devices like a flip phone so parents can reach them if necessary.

in 'burbs

The majority of voters living in New York City's suburbs approve of Gov. Hochul's surprise last-minute decision to indefinitely pause the congestion pricing toll, according to a new poll.

Of the statewide respondents, 45% said they supported Hochul's decision to pause the \$15 daily toll on drivers entering Manhattan below 60th Street.

Suburban voters continued to voice the most fierce opposition to the toll, with 56% supporting Hochul's pause. Those voters encompass Long Island as well as Westchester, Putnam and Rockland Counties.

The poll was conducted last week, just days after lawmakers ended their yearly session in Albany after bucking Hochul's lastminute attempt to raise taxes to make up for revenue the MTA had expected to generate from congestion pricing.

Gov. Hochul's approval rating is at its lowest ever.

Only 38% of Empire State voters gave Hochul a thumbs-up, with 49% saying they disapprove of her job performance, in a Siena College poll released Thursday.

A whopping 81% of Republicans said they disapproved of the governor.

She also isn't winning over a huge number of fellow Democrats, with only 56% saying they view her Vaughn Golden favorably.


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
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Hollywood legend Donald Sutherland has died at 88.

"With a heavy heart, I tell you that my father, Donald Sutherland, has passed away," Kiefer Sutherland announced on X on Thursday.

"I personally think one of the most important actors in the history of film. Never daunted by a role, good, bad or ugly. He loved what he did and did what he loved, and one can never ask for more than that. A life well lived."

The award-winning actor starred in a slew of hit movies such as "The Hunger Games," "The Dirty Dozen," "Invasion of the Body Snatchers," "Ordinary People," "M*A*S*H" "Don't Look Now," "Klute" and "Animal House."

According to Deadline, he died on Thursday in Miami after a long illness.

Sutherland was never nominated for an Oscar, but he got an Honorary Oscar in 2017. During his acceptance speech, he said, "I wish I could say thank you to all the characters I've played. Thank them for using their lives to inform my

lives." A father of five, he was married to Lois Hardwick from 1959-1966, Shirley Douglas from 1966-1970 — with whom he had Kiefer and Rachel — and actress Francine Racette from 1972 until his death, with whom he had sons Rossif, Angus Redford and Roeg.



Born on July 17, 1935, in Saint John, New Brunswick, Canada, Donald Sutherland had a career spanning over 60 years, with more than 200 film and TV credits.

He rose to stardom with 1970's "M*A*S*H," playing the martini-drinking Hawkeye.

In a 1970 interview for the Canadian program "Telescope," he said about that

movie, "When you are in a field station like we were, it is insane to watch human bodies come flying into a camp that are wrecked for no reason at all. That kind of insanity created an environment, a kind of mini-society, that was in chaos. To a lot of people, that represents a kind of society that we have today."

Sutherland was ill as a child. In a 2011 interview with Esquire, Sutherland said, "The first word I said was neck. My mother turned around and said, 'What did he say?' My sister said, 'He said, "Neck."' My neck was killing me. That was a sign of polio. One leg's a little shorter, but I survived."

In a 2018 interview on "60 Minutes," Sutherland opened up about his childhood insecu-

rities. "I went to her and I said: "Mother, am I good looking?" And my mother looked at me and went. 'Your face has character, Donald.' And I went and hid in my room for at least a day," he recalled.

When Anderson Cooper asked if his mother's words stayed with him, Sutherland quipped, "Not really. Just- just for- 65, 66 years."

'Animal House'

In the 1978 comedy classic "Animal House," Sutherland played professor Dave Jennings, who smoked pot and had an affair with a student.

He was reportedly given a choice between taking a fee of either 2% of the film's gross or \$35,000, and opted for the latter — costing him many millions when the film went on to become one of the most successful comedies ever, grossing over \$500 million to date.

About filming that movie, he told Esquire, "My ass was in

'Animal House.' John Landis said he filmed it only for the rushes. He promised my wife that he wouldn't put it in the film. But he did put it in the film — and my wife never spoke to him again."

Sutherland won a Golden Globe for the TV movie "Path to War," and he won an Emmy and a Golden Globe for his performance in the miniseries "Citizen X."

His extensive television credits also include "Trust," "Dirty Sexy Money" and "The Pillars of the Earth."

Later in life, he had a career resurgence playing the tyrannical President Snow in the "Hunger Games" movies between 2012-2015.

Sutherland told GQ in 2014 that he sought out the role.

"Nobody asked me to do it. I wasn't offered it. I like to read scripts, and it captured my passion. I wrote them a letter . . . I thought it was an incredibly important film, and I wanted to be a part of it," he said.



'Kid slayers' from Venez. **Dumped girl's body**

Police in Houston have arrested two migrants from Venezuela in the murder of 12-vearold Jocelyn Nungaray, who was lured away from home, then strangled and dumped in a bayou.

One of the suspects crossed the border illegally less than a month before the shocking murder, and was released into the US after claiming he feared for his life if he was sent back to his home country, sources told The Post.

Johan Jose Rangel Martinez, 21, and Franklin Jose Pena Ramos, 26, were charged Thursday with capital murder.

Department of Homeland Se-

curity sources said Pena Ramos crossed into El Paso, Texas, on May 28. He was released soon after his interaction with border agents.

He told authorities he planned to live with his cousin in Houston until his court appearance in July, sources said.

Agents put a GPS tracker on Pena Ramos, which was set to monitor his location for only 21 days, sources said.

It's unclear whether he was wearing the tracker when Jocelyn was murdered.

Investigators identified the suspects from surveillance footage after they were seen following Jocelyn as she walked into a convenience store.

Her body was found in a swampy creek Monday by a Houston resident who happened to be driving by. The Houstonian told KTRK-TV she thought at first the body was a floating mannequin.

"I did a U-turn and I stopped on the bridge, put my flashers on, looked down, and realized it was someone. I parked right here and called 911 immediately," she said.

Homeland Security has opened an investigation into the suspects' immigration his-

Nungaray, said her daughter sneaked out of their apartment late Sunday.

She told KHOU-TV the girl was taken "advantage of" by the killers.

"I'm like angry that they took advantage of her. She was so young. She was 12, you took my baby away, you took her away. Now, I get to let her little brother know his older sister is never coming home," she said.

"She turned into a beautiful, beautiful young lady," Alexis said. "I was really looking forward to seeing how she was gonna be and they took every opportunity away from me and my family.

Houston Mayor John Whitmire said Thursday the murder affected him personally.

"As a grandfather and a father, it doesn't get any worse," the mayor said.

"If there is any circumstance where you deny bail, this is it."

The number of migrants flocking to the US-Mexico border from a country known as a hotbed of ISIS recruitment has skyrocketed under President Biden.

More than 1,500 migrants from Tajikistan are known to have crossed the border between October 2020 and May 2024, according to leaked border data obtained by The Post.

At least 500 Tajiks have been caught so far this year.

Over the previous 14 years, there were just 26 Tajik nationals crossing the border.

It's unknown how many of the Tajik migrants were released into the US, but the vast majority of migrants caught at the border claim asylum and are allowed to stay while awaiting a court hearing.

The small Central Asian country, which borders China and Afghanistan, has become a major source of terrorists for ISIS and Islamic State Khorasan Province (ISIS-K), an extreme offshoot of the Islamic State militant group.

Planting the seeds

Javed Ali, a former counterterrorism official who now teaches at the University of Michigan, said the surge of Tajik nationals could include ISIS "seeding people into the United States" to

prepare for a possible attack.

The Post recently reported on ICE arresting eight Tajik migrants with suspected ties to ISIS who crossed the southern border and then settled in New York, LA and Philadelphia.

ISIS-K in March was responsible for a massive attack on a concert hall in Moscow - carried out by citizens of Tajikistan that killed 145 people and wounded hundreds.

AN AWFUL STATE



Experts say ISIS and its affiliates have been preying upon Tajiks to carry out attacks abroad.

"Tajiks have been recruited to and played a key role in terrorist organizations like Islamic State to a greater degree than many neighboring countries in recent years. They have become key to [ISIS-K]'s externally-focused campaign as it seeks to gain attention and more recruits," said Texas A&M University professor Edward Lemon.

"Heavy-handed counter-extremism policies" by the government of Muslim-majority Tajikistan may be radicalizing some of the country's 10 million people and "causing the very terrorism they seek to address." Lemon said.

Lemon, whose research has focused on Tajikistan and Central Asia, said large populations of Tajiks live outside their native land. When they choose to come to the US, they are utilizing "networks of traffickers" who "actively advertise the opportunity to come to America in Tajikistan."

"Tajikistan is one of the most migration-dependent countries in the world, with over a million of the country's 10 million people living in Russia. As life in Russia has become more difficult since the invasion of Ukraine, they have sought other destinations such as Europe, the Gulf and US," Lemon said.

"Most come here, like so many others, to seek a better life."

Heightened threats

FBI Director Chris Wray has recently warned that the US is in a heightened threat environment for terrorism, citing both the Oct. 7 terrorist attack on Israel carried out by Hamas and the attack in Moscow.

Last Friday, the Biden administration sanctioned four people based in Central Asia and Turkey who are allegedly involved in an ISIS-tied smuggling operation helping migrants reach the US.

One of the sanctioned men is commander of the ISIS-Georgia Province, Adam Khamirzaev, who "provided guidance to this network on a range of activities supporting ISIS and was aware of its efforts to facilitate travelers to the United States."

ISIS and its affiliates are keen on recruiting and inspiring attacks globally, with their sights set on Tajiks.

"One of the things that they've actively and deliberately done is try to expand their recruits geographically. So not only Afghans and Pakistanis, but they want to bring in a big central Asian component," said Colin Clarke, Soufan Group director of research.

"Moreover, they want to reach out to the diaspora ... central Asians living in Europe, living in North America, in the attempt to radicalize them, because for ISIS-K, it's low-hanging fruit."

New York poll cites migrant influx, crime

The overwhelming majority of New Yorkers believe the ongoing migrant crisis is a serious concern — and more than half fear the Empire State is heading in the "wrong direction," according to a poll released Thursday.

The sobering statewide survey, conducted by Siena College, found that 83% of registered voters said they believe the influx of migrants was a "serious" issue for the state. Of those surveyed, 57% deemed the crisis — which has seen more than 203,900 migrants come through New York City since spring 2022 — "very serious," while 26% said it was "somewhat serious."

Split by political party, 77% of Democrats answered the problem was "serious," while 95% of Republicans agreed.

And 37% said they believe the Empire State is on the "right track" while 52% said it was "headed in the wrong direction." The remaining 11% didn't know or had no opinion. A little over half, 51%, said they did not believe the state Legislature had succeeded in "passing laws that improve the quality of life in New York" during the 2024 legislative session.

The poll comes as the stream of new arrivals has overwhelmed Big Apple shelters, with over 119,700 people in city care, including over 65,300 migrants, as of June 16, according to City Hall.

The Adams administration says it has been forking up over \$387 a day to put up a single migrant household in taxpayer-funded shelters, and City Hall has claimed the costs to combat the migrant crisis could hit \$10 billion through the next fiscal year.

The poll, which included a pool

of 800 registered voters and was conducted June 12-13 and 16-17, was released just days after an Ecuadorian migrant was busted for allegedly raping a 13-year-old girl in a Queens park in a horrific broad-daylight attack last week.

On the subject of crime, 49% of respondents said the problem has gotten worse across the state over the last year, while only 17% believed it had improved and 31% said it had stayed the same, with 2% who said they didn't know or refused to answer.

Mayor responds

Among respondents, 34% of Democrats and 76% of Republicans said they were concerned about heightened crime.

Mayor Adams has previously blamed the cumbersome bureaucratic process of getting into the US for pushing some asylumseekers to crime in the wake of the shooting of two NYPD officers, allegedly by a migrant.

cers, allegedly by a migrant.

"He can't work. He can't go to school. So what happens? You have to really think about what I'm going to say, what's being created in this amazing city," Adams said of Bernardo Castro Mata's immigration case being closed in Chicago months earlier.

Just 2,000 of the 27,000 migrants who are of working age have been connected with a job under the Adams administration's ongoing push, officials said during a City Council meeting last week.

City officials have called on President Biden to expand a program that grants temporary protected status to asylum-seekers from countries facing political turmoil or violence, which would fast-track working authorizations.

The poll has a 4.1% margin of error.

The dismissals quickly drew fury from rank-and-file NYPD officers, higher-education officials and Jewish leaders who spoke with

'Green light for chaos'

"This is turnstile justice," said Michael Nussbaum, a 25-year member of the Jewish Community Relations Council of New York. "This is a green light for chaos, a green light for destroying propertv."

Israel uses an expert committee of medical experts that reviews classified intelligence in order to determine the hostages' status, the Journal reported.

The estimated number of dead hostages is growing due to the conditions of their captivity combined with the injuries they suffered on Oct. 7, and possible preexisting health condi-

Eight of the remaining hostages are US citizens - including three who were declared dead several months ago.


"As soon as I got the additional information from the UN, we condemned the sexual violence, we voted to condemn it, and we're continuing to do the work."

Coke heir pressed on assault \$\$

The heir to a Coca-Cola bottling fortune was ordered yet again Monday to shell out millions in damages to a former employee who accused him of sexual assault.

A Los Angeles jury unanimously ruled that Greek billionaire Alki David will have to pay the woman, identified as Jane Doe in her lawsuit, a whopping \$900 million for allegedly harassing and raping her over a three-year period, her lawyer said.

"It's so despicable, the facts of this case. He raped my client while on trial in another case," attorney Gary Dordick told the Los Angeles Times. David has lost multiple other sexual-misconduct cases.

The alleged abuse began in February 2016 while the victim worked as a model for David's companies — including Hologram USA, which creates holograms of dead celebrities. That office was "alarmingly hostile," her lawyers said, with one room referred to as "The Rape Room." Katherine Donlevy

"I feel like you need less Botox for more emotion, and I don't have it," she joked in the latest episode of "The Kardashians."

"How am I gonna be scared? How am I gonna cry?"

To prove her point, Kardashian jokingly tried to raise her eyebrows, which did little to her forehead.

Also standing in the way of serious acting parts: "I'm not gonna be gaining 500 pounds for a role or losing ... that's not where I need to be," she noted.

<u>'10-year plan'</u>

Nevertheless, Kardashian, 43, has taken on a thin, non-emotive role in a comedy film, "The Fifth Wheel," which she described as a mix of "The Hangover," "Bridesmaids" and "The First Wives Club."

In addition to producing, the Skims founder will star in the film, which she acknowledged will be quite the commitment.

With so much on her plate, Kardashian joked

she will "have to give up" something in her life — and immediately chose "sleep" as the thing to go.

Despite having only a few small movie roles in the past, Kardashian made headlines in 2023 when she landed a larger part in "American Horror Story: Delicate."

She said she hired an acting coach to prepare.

During a recent — and controversial — "Actors on Actors" interview with Chloë Sevigny, Kardashian revealed she has four projects currently in the works.

"It's been fascinating, learning the business in such a short period," the reality star said.

One of those projects is a Ryan Murphy-produced scripted series in which she will play "a high-powered divorce attorney"

"I will be channeling Laura Wasser, if that resonates with anybody," Kardashian teased.

DWI rap trashes Timberlake image SECRET'S OUT ON BAD REPUTATION

The sheen has worn off America's onetime golden boy.

The latest kick to Justin Timberlake's ego? When, as Page Six reported, the young cop who arrested him for DWI in Sag Harbor early Tuesday didn't recognize his face or name.

"Justin said under his breath, 'This is going to ruin the tour,' " a source told Page Six. "The cop replied, 'What tour?' Justin said, The world tour.' "

Indeed, the 43-year-old singer is due to perform in Chicago on Friday and will be at Madison Square Garden next week, sources confirmed. But he may not have his old swagger — especially after his latest album, "Everything I Thought It Was," dropped off the Billboard 200 after just four weeks.

Sources told The Post that the singer and actor's career is not where he thought it would be at this point.

"The album didn't do too well,

and I don't see Justin getting big acting roles right now," said a well-placed Hollywood insider. "I just think Justin has a bad reputation in Hollywood as a bit of a jerk and a pain in the ass."

"He's got a bit of an ego," said an industry insider.

Midlife-crisis issues

The past few days, complete with Timberlake's glass-eyed mug shot, are a clear indication that the former *NSYNC heartthrob has some very real midlifecrisis issues.

Not least of them is the fact that his wife, actress Jessica Biel, is said to be "extremely upset" with her husband's antics, according to Us Weekly.

While Timberlake has traded on his dimpled good looks and sunny charm for decades, he's not been having a great year.

"Everything I Thought It Was" became his first solo release to miss the No. 1 spot since "Justified" in 2002.



The record was met with criticism and weaker than usual sales upon its release in March.

Ticket sales for The Forget Tomorrow World Tour have been similarly lackluster. "His golden-boy image is definitely depleted," the Hollywood source said.

"Reptile," last year's Netflix thriller, saw Timberlake deemed by critics as making "his best impression of Ben Affleck in 'Gone

His biggest success in recent years has come from voicing a character in the "Trolls" movies. The latest, "Band Together," saw him reunited with *NSYNC and releasing "Better Place," the boy band's first single in more than 20 years.

It's surely not the career he imagined when, as The Post reported in 2010, he had his eyes on an Academy Award nomination for his role in "The Social Network." Back then, Page Six reported that he was "doing things his own way, including attending academy screenings on his own and privately reaching out to award winners and academy darlings Tom Hanks and Kevin Spacey for campaigning advice."

In the end, only co-star Jesse Eisenberg received a nod, although Timberlake did get to open the Oscars in 2017 with a rambunctious performance of his nominated, self-penned song, "Can't Stop The Feeling." (From, yes, a "Trolls" movie.")

The early solo stuff

It was seen as a feat when Timberlake managed to leapfrog from boy-band success to solo fame with edgy, grown-up songs like "Senorita" and "SexyBack."

One of his biggest hits, "Cry Me a River," is widely believed to be about cheating by his ex-girlfriend and former "Mickey Mouse Club" co-star Britney Spears.

Timberlake was seen as having come out of 2004's Super Bowl "Nipplegate" — when he exposed Janet Jackson's breast in a wardrobe malfunction during the halftime show — largely unscathed.

But defenders of Jackson and Spears took to social media this week to claim karma has finally caught up with Timberlake, posting memes of the female singers laughing and casting side-eye, and of Timberlake singing his 2006 hit "What Goes Around . . . Comes Around."

Last year, Spears revealed in her memoir, "The Woman in Me," that she had an abortion at age 19 after becoming pregnant with Timberlake's baby.

Justin definitely wasn't happy about the pregnancy. He said we weren't ready to have a baby in and humbles the golden boy

our lives, that we were way too young," she wrote. "If it had been left up to me alone, I never would have done it. And yet Justin was so sure that he didn't want to be a father.

"To this day, it's one of the most agonizing things I have ever experienced in my life."

Sources at the time told Page Six that Timberlake was extremely hurt by Spears' words, saying they were just teens.

During a concert in February, Timberlake told the crowd, "I'd like to take this opportunity to apologize to absolutely f--king nobody."

On the same day as Timberlake's arrest, Spears, who is currently on vacation in Las Vegas, posted a snapshot of what appears to be a cocktail. She also included an image of her legs floating in a pool and simply captioned her post, "It's the little things you know!!!"

'Bubble about to burst'

Another industry insider said, "There have been rumors around Justin's behavior for a long time. Maybe the bubble was about to burst, and this was the pin that pricked the bubble."

Timberlake had previously apologized to Biel for a "strong lapse in judgment" in 2019, when he was photographed holding hands with actress Alisha Wainwright while off-duty from filming the drama film "Palmer" in New Orleans.

Timberlake blamed being drunk in his public apology for his behavior.

"Nothing happened between me and my co-star. I drank way too much that night, and I regret my behavior. I should have known better," Timberlake wrote in an open letter at the time.

Said the industry insider, "He's got a few blemishes, for sure."


The 10-time Grammy winner was released without bond Tuesday after being arraigned in Sag Harbor, LI.

He was charged with a DWI misdemeanor, and his next court date was scheduled for July 26, the Suffolk County district attorney's office said.

Timberlake said he only had one martini — an extra-boozy Vesper martini, according to sources — while onlookers reported him drinking from another guest's glass.

Page Six is told he and Biel have rented a house in Sag Harbor for the summer, as they did last year.

"In today's world you have to be really dumb to drink and drive," the industry insider said. "Justin is showing off a side that I don't think a lot of people knew about."

Baby born 24 wks. early goes home

A premature baby who was delivered 24 weeks early and weighed less than two pounds was finally sent home Wednesday after spending nearly five months in a neonatal intensive care unit on Long Island.

Little Shyne Graham "defied all odds" when she was born via emergency C-section at NYU Langone Hospital on Jan. 24, weighing just one pound and 11 ounces, according to a nurse and her mother.

"I feel completely relieved having her home," proud mama Phaebe Turner told The Post on Thursday. "I didn't sleep last night — I was just looking at her, thinking, 'Is it really real that she's finally here?"

Shyne's touching saga began when Turner suddenly began bleeding and having contractions for unclear reasons in January.

"I remember waking up from surgery in a fog, and people were saying, 'Congratulations.' I said, 'For what?'" Turner recalled. "I was shell shocked."

She soon learned she'd given birth, but that she wouldn't be able to hold her teeny bundle of joy for months.

"She was so small. Her hand was the size of my thumb," Turner

But the pint-sized fighter eventually cleared the illnesses and has now grown to 10 pounds, the size of a "a chubby 1-month-old," she said.

On Wednesday, NICU nurse manager LaShon Pitter helped set up a heartwarming graduation for the miracle baby and her family.

"I can't begin to express how I feel right now," Turner said. "I'm just happy. Today's a great day."

No high court tax ax

The Supreme Court ruled Thursday a foreign-investment tax nestled into Donald Trump's 2017 tax-cut law can remain in place, turning aside a challenge backed by business groups.

In a 7-2 decision, the high court ruled Congress was within its authority to enact a one-time levy on investors' share of profits that have not been passed along to them, which some critics had speculated could lay the groundwork for a future wealth tax.

Writing for the majority, Justice Brett Kavanaugh said the anti-tax argument, brought by a Washington state couple, "taken to its logical conclusion, could render vast swaths of the Internal Revenue Code un-constitutional."

"And those tax provisions, if suddenly eliminated, would deprive the US Government and the American people of trillions in lost tax revenue," he wrote.

The case brought by

Charles and Kathleen Moore had challenged a nearly \$15,000 tax bill based on Charles' investment in an India-based company. Charles said he never received any money from the company, KisanKraft Machine Tools Private Ltd.

Public documents show that Moore's involvement with the company, including serving as a director for five years, is far more extensive than court filings indicated.

Justices Clarence Thomas and Neil Gorsuch dissented, with Thomas writing that the provision violated the 16th Amendment establishing an income tax.

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Space, the final front for nukes

WASHINGTON — The US is on the brink of a new Cuban missile crisis — this time in space — as Russia develops nuclear anti-satellite armaments while the Biden administration twiddles its thumbs, House Intelligence Committee Chairman Mike Turner said Thursday.

Turner (R-Ohio) called on President Biden to crank up the pressure to prevent Moscow from launching the weapon which could wipe out everything from GPS to cell service and the Internet, eliminating many of the conveniences of modern life — during an event at the Center for Strategic and International Studies in the nation's capital.

"The Space Age began when Russia launched Sputnik in 1957," he said. "The Space Age will end when Russia launches its anti-satellite weapon into orbit."

'Day Zero'

Space Force Chief of Staff Gen. B. Chance Saltzman has referred to the feared launch date as "Day Zero" due to the massive impact it would have on military and civilian life, Turner added.

"From that day forward ... trillions and trillions of dollars and time

we don't have will be required to build duplicative and redundant systems just to preserve what we accomplished in the Space Age," Turner said

The Biden administration reluctantly admitted in February that the Intelligence Committee had confirmed that Russia has been working for years to send nukes into space, which Turner said only happened after "overbipartisan" whelming, pressure from Congress to make public the emerging threat.'

"The fact that it took the House Intelligence Committee to do so, I think, shows you some of the waste of time that the administration has had — the fact that they don't have a response to this," he said.

But Turner argued the reveal did not go far enough, leaving Americans in the dark about the progress and viability of Russia's capability.

"The administration says that [Russia's] developing this," he said. "Does that mean that this is a drawing on a drafting board? Does this mean this is a research project in a lab? ... Does it mean that there's nuclear warheads that have been created? Is there a satellite?

"All of these are the natural resulting questions for the administration and they're avoiding this discussion ... because they don't want to admit that they're not doing anything, and we are sleepwalking into what will be an irreversible 'Day Zero' effect," Turner said.

Deterrents

In addition to public warnings, Turner said the White House must pursue key deterrents to prevent Moscow from launching such a weapon, including tighter sanctions. And he said the US should invest more in modernizing its nuclear stockpile, bringing advancements to weapons that, in some cases, have been in storage for decades.

"The Biden administration is incredibly reluctant to take any action that would appear to be escalatory. However, Russia is the escalatory aggressor. Escalation has already occurred," he said. "Now, the United States must stand with our allies to stop 'Day Zero' and preserve space.'

For its part, the White House has encouraged the improvement of its nuclear stockpile, with Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin repeatedly calling for new investment. The Pentagon, in its 2022 Nuclear Posture Review, called on the US to update the aging supply as the nation prepares to contend with two major nuclear-armed adversaries Russia and China — for the first time ever.

Bumped onto tracks – & hi

Forget the Hamptons or St. Barts – all the cool girls are going to camp this summer.

Shira Blumenthal, 35, can't wait to arrive at Camp Social - a women-only adult summer camp in the Poconos costing \$600 for a two-day, three-night stay — later in August.

"I'm super excited about it. Everyone in my family knows," she told The Post with a laugh.

The self-proclaimed city girl hasn't been to a summer camp since she was a middle schooler and is a little nervous about being outdoors but can't wait to relive her childhood, disconnect and make new friends.

At adult summer camps, unlimited wine replaces juice boxes, French châteaus sub in for old wooden cabins in the middle of nowhere, and community swaps in for competition — although the hair-braiding and friendship bracelet-making remain.

And these excursions have wait lists longer than the pool at Dumbo House.

Lengthy wait lists

Camp Social has a roster of about 40,000 wannabe campers, and Camp Château - a womenonly adult adventure in the South of France costing \$2,300 for a sixday, five-night stay - has over

Adult sleepaway events aren't a new concept, but demand even at Camp No Counselors — a co-ed adult gathering that started in 2013 and now has several locations has never been higher, a representative told The Post.

It comes as both the loneliness epidemic and interest in travel continue to spike.

They're sold out for the next two years already.

Sue Jacobs, 59, of Huntington, can't wait to return to Château next month.

"It's magic, absolute magic, from the first second until the last, when you're just sobbing that you have to leave," she told The Post.

She attended the French outpost in Béduer, France, last summer with her daughter Shelby, 30, and relished every moment, whether it be horseback riding, picking plums off the fruit trees to eat by the pool or playing games with strangers.

"It's whatever you want it to be. It can be everything. It can be nothing. The whole point of camp is the exploration of not just things you've never done before, but you just have time with yourself. And how often do you get that?" she said.

"Women and minorities spend most of their working life putting on masks and trying to behave in a way in which they can be heard and respected and they can advance," Girling told The Post. "[It] is frankly exhausting.'

Friendships made

Camp Social skews a bit younger and offers a bit more of a classic summer camp experience — like wooden cabins and tug-of-war games — but with the intention of creating a fun, freeing space for women.

Founder Liv Schreiber, 27, said she started Camp Social last summer to let women "connect to their childhood selves again" and spend a weekend enjoying themselves however they please.

"No two girls' experience is the same. Some girls are going to have a high-intensity, high-energy, wild, do everything, play pickle ball, play tennis, climb the rock wall kind of weekend, and some girls are going to choose to do yoga, meditation or acupuncture,' Schreiber said.

She explained that the weekendlong experience allows women to make deep connections quickly.

"Of course, we have s'mores and all the good camp things," Schreiber said. "But what makes it special are those moments that are unplanned in between these activities. It's those moments of connection."

Maddie Martino, 27, and the women she met at Camp Social have traveled the country visiting each other and rented a lake house in Alabama together this summer.

"Everyone was there to make friends, so we had the same goal,"

FEMALE DRAFT JEER Senate conscript plan ripped

Senate Democrats are mulling a proposal that would force women to sign up for the military draft for the first time.

But the proposed policy — introduced by Democrats as part of the 2025 National Defense Authorization Act that last week cleared a key Senate committee has raised hackles among members of the far-right, even though the action has a slim chance of becoming law.

Sen. Josh Hawley, a Missouri Republican, derided the measure to put women on equal footing as another "woke" decision being made on behalf of the nation's military.

"We need to get reality back in check here," Hawley told Fox

News. "There shouldn't be women in the draft. They shouldn't be forced to serve if they don't want to."

But Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell, along with more moderate Republicans such as Maine Sen. Susan Collins and Sen. Lisa Murkowski of Alaska — have backed the bill, with Collins noting that the change "seems logical," according to The New York Times.

Currently, the law says that nearly all men ages 18 to 25 must register with Selective Service, the agency that maintains the draft databases.

Most states automatically register those eligible when they get their driver's license or apply to college — a move that has buoyed the program's compliance rate and put more than 15 million men on the rosters.

Of those, just under 85% are actually eligible to serve.

'In the national interest'

Refusing to register for the draft comes with significant consequences — including a felony charge that could lead to a hefty fine and a five-year prison sentence, according to the Selective Service System website.

"Unless a man provides proof that he is exempt from the registration requirement, his failure to

register will result in referral to the Department of Justice for possible investigation and prosecution," the site said.

Despite the number of registered men, the rate at which they actually volunteer for the military has fallen ever further, according to the Defense Department, as less than 1% of American adults serve in active duty combat roles.

Women have been allowed to serve in every part of the military, including combat roles, since 2016. That change essentially made moot a 1981 Supreme Court decision that found that banning women from forced service was OK, as the draft was meant to help the military fill combat roles — something women would not be able to do for another 35 years.

Since the introduction of women in combat roles, there has been a steady debate in Congress on the issue. Military experts have repeatedly testified that registering women for the draft would be "in the national security interest of the United States."

But lawmakers have abandoned such plans each and every time.

Sen. Roger Wicker (R-Miss.) said he'll try to nix the proposal.

"I don't think this is the time to get into a debate on the floor of either house about that," he said. "We're not anywhere near implementing a draft, and to me, it's a distraction when we need to be talking about real issues that are immediate."





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Bribery raps on jail staff

A crew of Westchester County jail employees, including current and former correction officers, were arraigned on bribery charges in long-running smuggling scams, prosecutors said Thursday.

Two jail guards, a former correction officer and two jailhouse commissary workers are charged with pocketing thousands of dollars in recent years to sneak marijuana and other contraband to inmates, Westchester County District Attornev Mimi Rocah said in a press release.

"These defendants put their own interests above the safety of incarcerated individuals, employees, civilians and other corrections officers," Rocah said.

The Post first reported on the bribery scheme earlier this month.

According to new details released by prosecutors, the scam dated to late 2021, with inmates' pals greasing the jail workers' palms with hefty payoffs to sneak banned items to prisoners.

Investigators reviewed hours of visiting-room surveillance footage and examined dozens of texts and phone conversations between the workers and the prisoners' associates, the DA's Office said.

First airports, now retail, medical, concerts

But the technology company is now betting on far wider applications at retail stores, online and even in the health-care world.

"It never made sense to me that you are pulling cards out of your wallet to show who you are and what you have access to, when biometrics can do that more easily,"

LYDIA

CEO Clear Caryn Seidman Becker told The Post.

The Manhattan-based company operates

kiosks at 57 airports globally — in Germany, Italy, England and Canada, as well as the US — where customers bypass the usual driver's license or passport check and opt in to having their iris or fingerprint scanned.

Membership costs \$189 annually and is offered as a perk with several credit cards.

It also has a presence at 15 stadiums and arenas across the country, including Yankee Stadium, Barclays Center and Madison Square Garden.

At SoFi Stadium in Los Angeles County, for instance, members can quickly gain entry next month to see the Rolling Stones without having to show their physical tickets.

Clear began in 2003 as a digital identity start-up but filed for bankruptcy after its co-founders left six years later. Seidman Becker and Ken Connick, now president and CFO, bought and relaunched it as a biometrics company in 2012.

Receptive customers

Seidman Becker (inset below) said it was easiest to introduce the technology in a setting like airports, where travelers already expect security screening.

"Travel was the obvious place to start, especially in a post 9/11 environment ... it's where customer

experience, security and identity collide," the CEÓ

The expedited security program has already bro-

kered partnerships with companies like LinkedIn, so customers can snap a selfie to verify their identity instantly — a process that typically takes closer to a week with other social media platforms.

Similar partnerships exist with the retail brokerage Public and online health portal Well Star.

In the future, Clear's technology will be used at the doctor's office: A camera can scan your face and retrieve saved medical data. The

company has already created the technology, a source said, and is now focused on applying it in as many ways as it can.

"Think about the clipboard in health care . . . you're filling out the same information every time to prove who you are in your electronic medical record," Seidman Becker said.

The company is also working on bringing the technology to retail stores as a way to prevent fraud and make the shopping experience faster.

"At drugstores you could use your face which generates a QR code to unlock a glass door where you could get Tylenol as opposed to calling for an associate," Seidman Becker said, adding that they plan to announce a retail partner later this year.

Even as the CEO envisions a future in which biometric technology will be ubiquitous, the company has faced challenges in its core business.

Seidman Becker acknowledged that Clear's customer satisfaction at airports dipped in 2023 as more

17 million people signed up for the service, overwhelming the existing agents and processes.

At its best, Clear ambassadors greet you as you approach airport security, help scan your retina or fingerprint at one of the company's kiosks, and escort you directly to a TSA agent, skipping all other lines and the need show ID.

But customers have complained about frequently having to show identification.

Seidman Becker said those issues have been resolved to make the customer experience frictionless moving forward. Up next: technology that will scan clients' faces as they step onto the security line, removing the need to stop for a fingerprint or retina

Improving verification

"We are moving to face-first technology so you won't break stride when going through," Seidman Becker said. "IDs are staying in pockets and our systems our faster."

And the company believes that expansion beyond airports and entertainment venues will also make it relevant as airlines such as Delta introduce digital IDs that allow customers to zip through security.

Said Seidman Becker: "There will be a million more



'Hail Mary'

Donald Trump's lawyers have called embattled Fulton County District Attorney Fani Willis' attempt to dismiss Trump's appeal seeking to boot her from his Georgia election fraud case a "Hail Mary" and a "desperate bid to avoid disqualification.'

The presumptive Republican presidential nominee and eight other co-defendants are asking Georgia's Court of Appeals to boot Willis for alleged misconduct after she admitted to having an affair with since-ousted special prosecutor Nathan Ŵade.

Last week, Willis' office asked for the appeal to be tossed out, arguing the issue of her and Wade's former romance is now moot since he was forced to resign on March 15.

But Trump's lawyer Steve Sadow fired back in court papers Thursday, calling Willis a "deeply conflicted District Attorney."

Fulton County Judge Scott McAfee - who allowed Willis to remain on the case on the condition that Wade step down and the appeals court both granted Trump the right to appeal before the start of trial because they "have already determined these issues are critical," Sadow wrote.

A famed subway performer who has been playing the musical saw underground for more than two decades says she's been feeling bad vibrations about her safety — even before a hooligan brazenly stole cash from her tip bucket in the Union Square station this week.

Bystander video shows Natalia "Saw Lady" Paruz wield her bow - normally used to coax otherworldly sounds from her instrument - against a shoeless man as he shamelessly grabbed a handful of her hard-earned tips Tuesday.

The tattooed brigand then ran off toward the station's turnstiles. It's the latest threatening incident Paruz has experienced in recent months, she exclusively told The Post — despite a surge of National Guard and cops in the subways.

"When that actually happened, that was fantastic," she said. "But that didn't last. It was a great initiative, but it doesn't replace the need for local police officers to actually man the police stations. 'I've never felt menaced before. This is a new thing."

For 25 years, the self-styled Saw Lady has been delighting straphangers as one of 350 sanctioned performers in the MTA's Music Under New York program. She has also performed in orchestras and for films and provided the chilling music to Robert Durst's murder confession in HBO's "The Jinx."

But Paruz said the subways have

felt increasingly unsafe since performers returned in 2021, after a COVID-driven 14-month hiatus.

Run-ins with menacing weirdos - including a bucket drummer who threatened to beat her up and destroy her equipment — recently forced her to stop playing at the Times Square station altogether.

'What is the point?'

"It's a concern because I don't want the Union Square subway station to deteriorate like Times Square," she said.

Paruz said she brushed it off when a man stole a CD from her this week in Union Square but that Tuesday's robbery shook her.

She fears that even if the thief is

caught, he'll be cut loose without bail like the woman who whacked subway cellist Iain Forrest, a friend of hers, over the head with a metal water bottle in February.

"What is the point in police catching criminals if there's no deterrent?" Paruz said.

The NYPD confirmed that Paruz made a complaint about the theft, which police sources said was for \$2. Paruz said that's the amount of cash she puts in her tip bucket before performing and she doesn't know how much the thief grabbed.

Transit crime citywide is down 5.5% so far this year compared with last year, NYPD data shows. This week, it's up nearly 18% from the same week last year.

Outraged over Apple gun carnage

New Yorkers whose lives have been shattered by gun violence are speaking out about the recent jump in shootings - and wondering how many more moms will have to mourn.

"Mothers should not have to be burying their young ones, especially

when you are sending your children out to play in the park, you are sending them to places where they should be enjoying life," said Melissa Alexander, whose 9-year-old daughter was wounded by a stray bullet in a park across from her home.

"Unfortunately kids are being injured and losing their lives at a young age," said Alexander, 36. "They didn't ask for that."

Althea Lawson, 34, who was sitting in her walker near her Brooklyn home when she was hit by a stray bullet earlier this month, said she's now afraid to leave home.

"I'm scared to walk in the area," Lawson said Thursday. "You have to look over your shoulders to see what's happening."

The Post previously reported that shootings in the city spiked by a whopping 50% last week compared to the same period last year — with the number of victims jumping by an even wider number. And that's just an uptick in what has already been a violent month. Zoe Hussain,

Spy threat as Beijing gains ground

China has been buying up strategically placed farmland next to military installations across the US, raising national security fears over potential espionage or even sabotage.

The Post has identified 19 bases across the US from Florida to Hawaii that are in close proximity to land bought up by Chinese enti-ties and could be exploited by spies working for the communist nation.

They include some of the military's most strategically important bases: Fort Liberty (formerly Fort Bragg) in Fayetteville, NC; Fort Cavazos (formerly Fort Hood) in Killeen, Texas; Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton in San Diego; and MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa,

"It is concerning due to the proximity to strategic locations," Robert S. Spalding III, a retired Air Force brigadier general whose work focuses on US-China relations, told The Post.

"These locations can be used to set up intelligence collection sites

and the owners can be influential in local politics as we have seen in the past," he added.

"It is alarming we do not have laws on the books that would prevent the Chinese from buying property in the US."

'Drone' on the range

Under the guise of farming, the Chinese landowners could set up reconnaissance sights, install tracking technology, use radar and infrared scanning to view bases or attempt to fly surveillance drones over the military sites, sources told The Post.

A report in The Wall Street Journal from September found Chinese intruders attempted to breach military facilities more than 100 times in recent years, including by sneaking onto a missile range in New Mexico and by using scuba divers spotted near a rocket-launch site in Florida.

The threat the Chinese government poses to America is huge, with the FBI labeling it a "grave threat" and Director Christopher Wray saying in April that hackers have made their way into US critical infrastructure and are waiting "for just the right moment to deal a devastating blow" and "physically wreak havoc."

The Department of Homeland Security has also warned of the threat of Chinese spies slipping over the southern US border, among the more than 30,000 Chinese nationals who have already been admitted since October.

Those spies will likely "employ economic espionage" and "seek to illicitly acquire our technologies and intellectual property," according to DHS' Homeland Threat Assessment 2024.

Morgan Lerette, a former contractor for private military contractor Blackwater, is sounding the alarm.

"The Chinese are, or will, use this farmland to learn more about US military capabilities, movements, and technology," Lerette told The Post.

"This will allow them to better understand how to transition their military from a defensive strategy to an expeditionary one," he said. adding they'll figure out "how to


move forces quickly for conflicts such as taking Taiwan and how and when US forces would respond to their incursions based on troop movement at these bases."

He believes China will be watching troop movements into and out of bases in an attempt to form an idea of the patterns of behavior and movements.

"It would allow the Chinese to research what is moving and how to combat it. It's easy to identify mobilization if you know what to look for," Lerette said.

He cited specific examples: "Listening to GIs at a bar talking.... Local storage units being rented out near a base is an indicator troops are leaving.

"A train carrying tanks, Strykers [armored fighting vehicles], and [Mine-Resistant Ambush Protected vehicles], followed by an increased number of cargo planes landing and leaving a joint base like Lewis-McChord in Washington state, would indicate when US forces are moving," all of which is invaluable military knowledge.

Battle field

According to the latest analysis from the Farm Service Agency of the USDA, Chinese investors owned 349,442 acres of US farmland as of December 31, 2022.

One of the biggest investors in Texas is secretive billionaire Sun Guangxin, who has deep ties to the Chinese Communist Party and spent an estimated \$110 million buying up land next to Laughlin Air Force Base in Val Verde County, a training ground for military pilots.

Álthough no overt evidence of spying by Guangxin's companies, which use the land as a wind farm, has emerged, the state's Republicans have been raising the alarm.

Sen. Ted Cruz told Forbes in 2021: "The Chinese Communist Party has demonstrated time and again they're willing to invest billions of dollars to expand their espionage capabilities and their global reach, including through land purchase schemes near military bases."

Fufeng Group, a Shandong, China-based company that specializes in flavor enhancers and sugar substitutes, purchased 300 acres of farmland 40 miles from Grand Forks Air Force Base, ND, in 2022.

Billionaire and CCP member Chen Tianqiao is the second-largest foreign owner of farmland in the US. He bought nearly 200,000 acres of farmland in Oregon in 2015 at about \$430 an acre, according to The Land Report.

However, his purchase of the acreage did not appear in government records of land ownership by foreign investors when it was first revealed in January, according to The Daily Caller.

Chinese holdings total under 1% of foreign-owned agricultural land in the US, reports NBC, but it's the proximity to critical military in-

stallations that raises concerns, critics have charged.

Fort Liberty in North Carolina, for example, is surrounded by Chinese-owned farmland within a 30-mile radius.

'Gate-crashers'

In a move acknowledging these security risks, a Chinese-backed cryptocurrency mining firm was barred from owning land in Wyoming in May by the Biden administration.

MineOne Partners, a firm partly backed by Chinese nationals, was told to move equipment from less than one mile from F.E. Warren Air Force Base in Cheyenne, saying it was a "national security risk," according to the Air Force Times.

Potential espionage attempts by Chinese operatives have prompted the Defense Department, FBI and other agencies to heighten their investigations on "gate-crashers" attempting to breach US military installations.

According to the September Wall Street Journal report, the in-

cidents largely appear designed to test security practices, officials explained.

US-China tensions also spiked early last year after a Chinese surveillance balloon flew over the mainland.

The FBI has previously warned: "The Chinese government is engaged in a broad, diverse campaign of theft and malign influence without regard to laws or international norms that the FBI will not tolerate."

At Fort Wainwright, Alaska, home to the Army's 1lth Airborne Division, a group of Chinese nationals attempted to push past guards, claiming they had hotel reservations on base.

In New Mexico, officials reported repeated cases of Chinese nationals taking pictures at a US Army range after straying from nearby White Sands National Park, according to the Journal.

Chinese nationals have also used drones to enhance their surveillance efforts.

Key West, Fla., has seen repeated incidents at an intelligence center, where Chinese "tourists"

were found swimming near the military facility and snapping photos. In 2020, three Chinese citizens were sentenced to prison after illegally entering the naval air station there, either walking around the fence or driving in and ignoring orders to turn back, the Journal reported.

Southern exposure

Meanwhile, the border has proven an even greater threat to America's security.

By the end of the 2023 fiscal year on Sept. 30, Customs and Border Protection officials apprehended 24,048 Chinese citizens at the border with Mexico, the agency revealed. That number is more than 12 times the 1,970 arrests in the previous fiscal year.

"They are a communist dictatorship no different from the [Soviet Union], except they have been integrated into the global economic system," said Spalding, the retired brigadier general.

Argentina's new prez laps the Latin socialists

OUTH America is doing the world a favor at the moment, but you have to tune in to reap the benefits. Just as South and North Korea and West and East Germany became perfect Cold War laboratory experiments contrasting the blessings of democracy and capitalism with the destructive drudgery of communism, the reformist government in Argentina and the Marxist-led ones in Colombia and Brazil are inviting us to compare and contrast.

Hint: You won't have to do much research to see which system is still the best.

Argentina's new free-market President Javier Milei is lapping Colombia's Gustavo Petro and Brazil's Inacio Lula da Silva in terms of economic achievement and the ability of people to live in freedom. Milei is also an ardent supporter of Israel's right to exist and defend itself - while the Marxists have sided with the Hamas terrorists who massacred 1,200 Jews on Oct. 7 and now hide behind Gaza's civilian population.

Of course, Argentines, Colombians and Brazilians are not

quite the same people, unlike the Germans and the Koreans. Yet the results so far among these close neighbors with Iberian roots show that free markets and freedom will beat central planning every day of the week.

So far Milei has achieved, well, the unachievable. Argentina yes, the country that was until recently South America's economic basket case — now has a primary fiscal surplus, the first in more than a decade and a half.

March was the fourth straight month with more government revenues than non-interest spending: In other words Milei, who was inaugurated in December, has produced a government budget surplus every month since taking over.

This surplus is partly because Milei has also delivered on another of his promises: paring back Argentina's gargantuan state. He has halved the number of federal agencies, from 18 to nine, slashing public spending by up to 30%.

Best of all, Milei is also making

inroads against Argentina's biggest bugbear for decades, inflation. Monthly inflation in May cooled for the fifth straight month — again, marking the entire Milei presidency so far and now sits at 4.2%, compared to over 25% in December when Milei's term began.

Economists know that budget deficits lead to higher inflation. When the government pumps more and more money into an economy that is producing the same amount of goods and services, prices will rise.

Just don't tell Joe Biden that, as he doggedly denies that his spendthrift policies are the reason inflation re-ignited here during his term in office.

So Milei's results compare well even to North America, but how does Argentina today stack up against his South American neighbors? Colombia this year expects to have its largest fiscal deficit since the Marxist Gustavo Petro took office in August 2022. Petro is also pursuing former conservative president Alvaro Uribe in court — what self-respecting country does that? and now seeks to scrap the national Constitution in order to write one that will make his radical agenda easier to implement.

In Brazil, meanwhile, the Lula government that took over in January 2023 produced the second-highest primary deficit in

the country's history last year, reversing the surplus produced in 2022 by conservative president Jair Bolsonaro. Just as in Colombia, Brazilian authorities are also criminally investigating Bolsonaro.

All of this explains, of course, why Petro and Lula have done all they can to undermine the Milei government. The Brazilian and Argentine leaders didn't even speak to each other while both were in Rome last week during the G-7 meeting, and Petro frequently shares anti-Milei posts on social media.

Polling shows that the new president remains popular with Argentines, especially among the young — in spite of a string of anti-Milei protests and riots, some organized with help from Brazilian sources.

Just as it was with the two Germanies and remains the case with the Koreas, the South American contrast between the two economic models couldn't be starker. As the Venezuelanborn Manhattan Institute fellow Daniel Di Martino posted on X recently. Milei is the greatest threat to left-wing tyrants in the region. "Milei's success will be the end [of] socialism in Latin America," wrote Di Martino.

A Building City Housing Disaster

ew York City's housing stock is set to grow more distressed after the Rent Guidelines Board just voted again to limit increases for a million rent-stabilized apartments to less than the inflation rate.

Lefties will still attack Mayor Adams because his RGB has OK'd nominal rent hikes for a third year in a row (this time, 2.75% for one-year leases and 5.25% for two-year ones).

But that's not remotely as much as landlords' costs have risen, and many (especially those whose buildings' units are mostly rent-controlled) have no fat left to cut.

Over the past decade, inflation has run 23% (by the board's own figures), while the RGB has only allowed rents to rise 14%.

In the short run, this seems great for tenants, but even in the medium term it means at least reduced maintenance and building services. Longer term, it forces honorable

landlords (which is still most of them) to sell to less-savory characters — or to let the whole building deteriorate, putting their non-regulated units at risk, too.

Presumably, City Hall is afraid of the short-term political heat as the mayor eyes his re-election bid next year.

The city's not as foolish about its own rising costs: It just OK'd a 9% hike in water rates — another hit on landlords, along with fast-rising property taxes, insurance costs and costly Local Law 97 climate mandates.

The rent laws have long squeezed Gotham's housing market, but this last decade amounts to an all-out war on private-sector affordable housing — when the city's publichousing agency is tens of billions in the hole.

As with every progressive crusade, the victims in the end are the very people the progs claim to be helping.



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You Owe \$100,000

It's your share of Uncle Sam's \$35 trillion debt

HE federal government is now almost \$35 trillion in debt. That means every American owes \$100,000.

Biden administration officials don't care. They want to spend more. Already they are spending so much that they're increasing our debt by a trillion dollars every 100 days. President Donald Trump was no better: His administration increased our debt by almost \$8 trillion. This will not end well.

Last year, we hit a new ugly milestone: Americans must pay \$1 trillion per year just for interest on our debt. That's more than we spend on defense - on infrastructure, education, poverty programs. . . everything, but Social Security and Medicare. If we didn't waste these trillion dollars on interest. we could give \$3,000 tax cuts to every man, woman and child to use as they please.

Worse, America's spending growth is unsustainable. You can stretch a rubber band farther and farther, but eventually, it will

This column has reported on the politicians' irresponsibility for a long time. In 2019, I complained that our debt increased by a trillion dollars every year. Now, it's three trillion!

In 2023, the ratings agency Fitch was criticized for downgrading US government debt. But a few months later, Moody's Investor Service lowered its outlook from "stable" to "negative," saying America's "fiscal deficits will remain very large, significantly weakening debt affordability.'

No one knows which straw will break the camel's back.

In the past, politicians at least talked about our debt problem. President Bill Clinton said, "We've got to deal with this big long-term debt problem, or it will deal with us." President Barack Obama said not dealing with it is "irresponsible." Trump said, "We've got to get rid of the \$19 trillion in debt."

But not one of them did anything about it.

Now they lie about it. President Joe Biden says, "We literally cut the federal debt in half." This is absurd. When he took office, our



debt was \$26.9 trillion. Now it's \$34.8 trillion.

Part of the problem is that Biden staffers listen to advocates of "Modern Monetary Theory" the ridiculous idea that the United States, because it prints its own currency, can spend even more. "There's nothing to prevent the federal government," says Stephanie Kelter, Sen. Bernie Sanders' economic adviser, "from creating as much money as it wants to and paying it to someone.'

This is crazy. Look what's happened to countries that tried it. After World War I, the German government couldn't afford its reparation payments, so it printed more money. That led to 300% inflation and created anger that set

the stage for Hitler.

Similar hyperinflation wrecked lives in Argentina, Zimbabwe and, most recently, Venezuela. People work their whole lives to build savings; politicians steal it through in-

Today, silly people like Biden and Sen. Elizabeth Warren say we can "fix" our deficit by taxing the rich. Since the stock market's risen almost 30,000 points in 15 years, there are a lot of absurdly rich people around. "Pay your fair share," shouts Warren.

But rich people already pay a bigger share, and raising taxes on the rich wouldn't even get us out of the mess we're in. First, many wouldn't pay: They'd move abroad or invest abroad or spend even more on tax lawyers to slime around the rules.

Even if they didn't, there aren't enough rich people to tax to compensate for what our politicians spend. If Warren were able to grab all billionaires' wealth, that would only cover about one-seventh of

The only solution is to address what causes the debt in the first place: excessive government spending. It shouldn't be so hard. Politicians don't even need to stop spending more. They don't need to balance the budget.

They just need to limit spending increases to just below America's average yearly economic growth. Then we could grow our way out of our debt burden.

But our politicians won't do that. They don't even talk about debt.

They are irresponsible cowards.

Use Mayoral Control — Or You'll Lose It

HERE is no viable alternative to "mayoral control" of the city's school system, but that didn't save Mayor Adams from getting fleeced in Albany for a paltry two-year extension of that law.

The limited grant of power means state legislators will continue to hold the mayor's agenda to their whims and spending priorities; buck them, and Adams risks further obstruction of his education goals.

He's not faring any better in negotiations with the City Council, having agreed to extend its underutilized pre-kindergarten program for 3-yearolds. While some neighborhoods have a shortage of 3K seats, others have a wasteful surplus.

As parents increasingly seek options outside the Department of Education's schools, Adams has not forcefully argued for new charter schools, the best way to increase educational opportunity in lower-income communi-

ties. Parents in some districts are still dealing with the reduction of merit admissions to middle schools, while access to Gifted and Talented programs has not increased.

And parents across the city have been shocked by the antisemitic actions occurring in individual schools. At no point has the DOE appeared to take action ahead of these outrages — it has merely reacted after the incidents came to light.

Meanwhile, in the Legislature and Council, money talks - and the loudest voices include the schoolsystem employees and contractors who want payouts from various programs. With one-party dominance in both the city and state, legislators no longer need even pretend that they stand for the children.

Any mayor in Adams' position would be holding a weak hand. So he might wonder where the cavalry

serve. That's the opposite of mayoral control's intent, in which the mayor and chancellor - not unaccountable superintendents — set policy.

To gain the trust of the city's families, the mayor and chancellor must demonstrate that they understand and are willing to use the power of mayoral control. They could start by taking a stand on some key issues.

- Accountability: Bloomberg's approach of assigning annual letter grades to schools, and closing those that didn't meet the mark, worked. De Blasio's approach of throwing \$400 million to fix low-performing schools failed. How will Adams correct low-performing schools?
- Reorganization: Due to enroll-

is: Where are the parents and grandparents of the city's schoolchildren, standing up for students?

He needs to look in the mirror and ask what he has done to gain their support, to prove that he's using the power of mayoral control to make tangible improvements.

In fairness, Adams inherited a mess. The previous administration retreated from reforms that were improving educational opportunity.

Adams' schools chancellor, David Banks, knows those reforms well, having used opportunities created by the Bloomberg administration to launch his own network of responsive and innovative schools. But where is that action now?

Adams and Banks would be wise to return to some of the strategies that worked under Bloomberg, modified to meet current needs. If that's not to their liking, they must articulate their own plan, and give parents a clear vision of school improvement to rally around.

In Adams' first two years, it was unclear where the educational buck stopped. Some issues of great importance to parents, such as merit admissions to middle schools, were delegated to local superintendents appointed by the chancellor, unanswerable to the communities they ment declines, at least 150 schools in grades pre-K through eight enroll fewer than 200 students. Will the mayor consolidate lower-performing schools into successful ones? Where schools close, will he make space available to charter schools?

• Gifted students: Will Adams build on his first-year initiative to create more seats in gifted programs in communities where they are lacking?

• Workforce preparation: The state is changing high-school graduation requirements. Will the mayor expand programs which prepare students for direct entry into the workforce, rather than perpetuating the myth that college preparation is the only legitimate goal?

Adams will need the support of the city's parents if he hopes to be re-elected in 2025, and to win permanent extension of mayoral control thereafter. He and Chancellor Banks must act to win that support with measurable plans to make the system more effective and efficient.

If they remain on their current path, parents will answer with indifference in the voting booth — or they'll keep voting with their feet.

Instagram's algorithm routinely serves up sexually charged videos featuring scantily-clad sex content creators to teens as young as 13, according to the alarming results of a seven-month analysis published Thursday.

The Wall Street Journal and a Northeastern University researcher probed the Mark Zuckerberg-led app's filters by creating accounts posing as fictional 13-year-olds and scrolling Instagram's Reels video feed — which reportedly began showcasing suggestive content almost immediately.

At first, the racy videos included women dancing suggestively or showcasing their breasts, the report said. As the accounts watched those videos while skipping others, the content became more graphic with videos featuring online sex workers promising nude images to viewers appearing in "less than 20 minutes," according to the Journal.

Anal sex videos

In one set of tests conducted in June, the Journal said, Instagram began showing "video after video about anal sex" to a fictional 13year-old who previously watched videos of women on the Reels feed.

In other cases, the recommended algorithm served up videos of women caressing their bodies, mimicking sex acts or even flashing their genitalia to the camera, the Journal said.

The racy videos occasionally appeared along ads for major corporate brands, the report said.

Meta pushed back on the report's findings, with spokesman Andy Stone asserting it "was an artificial experiment that doesn't match the reality of how teens use Instagram."

"As part of our long-running work on youth issues, we established an effort to further reduce the volume of sensitive content teens might see on Instagram, and have meaningfully reduced these numbers in the past few months," Stone added.

The analysis was conducted by the Journal between January and June. Northeastern University computer science professor Laura Edelson also replicated the test results.

The test accounts did not follow any other accounts or like any posts. To test how quickly Instagram ramped up illicit recommen-

dations, the testers scrolled through Reels watching the sexually-charged videos, skipping others.

Other apps different

The Journal said it conducted similar tests on Snapchat and Tik-Tok and neither recommended sexually graphic content to the test accounts under similar conditions.

Meanwhile, current and former Meta employees told the outlet that internal tests uncovered problems with inappropriate content for underage users as far back as 2021.

In one internal report from 2022, Meta reportedly found that teen users viewed three times as many posts featuring nudity as adults.

Meta has repeatedly said it is taking steps to ensure teens get "age-appropriate experiences" on its apps.

The Journal uncovered the illicit content even as Meta rolled out stricter content controls in January.

As part of those new restrictions, users under 16 are supposed to be blocked from seeing sexually explicit content in their feeds.

The damning report comes as Meta faces criticism and a sweeping federal lawsuit from dozens of states alleging its apps have fueled a youth mental health crisis.

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TikTok challenges law banning app

TikTok and Chinese parent ByteDance on Thursday urged a US court to strike down a law they say will ban the popular short app on Jan. 19, saying the US government refused to engage in any serious settlement talks after 2022.

Legislation signed in April by President Biden gives ByteDance until Jan. 19 of next year to divest TikTok's US assets or face a ban on the app used by 170 million Americans.

ByteDance says a divestiture is "not possible technologically, commercially, or

The US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia will hold oral arguments on lawsuits filed by TikTok and ByteDance along with TikTok users on Sept. 16.

"This law is a radical de-

parture from this country's tradition of championing an open Internet, and sets a dangerous precedent allowing the political branches to target a disfavored speech platform and force it to sell or be shut down," Byte-Dance and TikTok argued

The Justice Department said last month that the law "addresses critical national security concerns in a manner that is consistent with the First Amendment and other constitutional limitations."



Amazon drops plastic filler

Amazon is shifting from the plastic air pillows used for packaging in North America to recycled paper because it's more environmentally sound, and it says paper just works better.

The company said Thursday that it's already replaced 95% of the plastic air pillows with paper filler in North America and is working toward complete removal by year's end.
"We want to ensure that custom-

ers receive their items undamaged, while using as little packaging as possible to avoid waste, and prioritizing recyclable materials," Amazon said.

It is the company's largest plastic packaging reduction effort in North America to date and will remove almost 15 billion plastic air pillows from use annually.

Almost all customer deliveries for Prime Day this year, which happens next month, will contain no plastic air pillows, according to Amazon.

The e-commerce giant has faced years of criticism about its use of plastic from environmental groups, including a nonprofit called Oceana, which has been releasing its own reports on Amazon's use of plastic packaging.

There has also been broad support among Amazon investors who have urged the company to outline how it will reduce waste.



Pits for Olive Garden

Chain to raise prices despite slowing traffic

Olive Garden said it plans to keep raising its menu prices — even as top executives admitted that sales dropped in the latest quarter as inflation-hammered customers pulled back on

Olive Garden's same-store sales - or sales at stores open at least a year, a closely watched industry metric fell 1.5% in the quarter ended May 26 — missing Wall Street's expectations for flat sales, the chain's parent company, Darden, revealed.

In a Thursday earnings call with analysts, Darden executives blamed the sales shortfall on financial stress among its less-wealthy clientele, who continue to grapple with rampant food

"Consumers are generally concerned about inflation and they are becoming more concerned about the



job market," CEO Rick Cardenas said on the call.

According to financial chief Raj Vennam, "The pullback is mostly at the below-median household income," adding, "our other [customer] groups are stable or growing."

But that isn't stopping Orlando, Fla.-based Darden from increasing prices this year. The company is reluctant to discount its food to attract customers, Cardenas said on the call.

Companywide, Darden which also operates the LongHorn, Ruth's Chris and Capital Grille steakhouse chains, says it will raise prices companywide on average by 2% to 3% over the next 12 months.

Menu prices at Olive Garden rose by 1% late last year. They will rise again this month, executives said, without giving specifics.

"We're not going to do things to buy sales even with the increasing dis-counting our competitors are doing," Cardenas said. "Our focus is on profitable sales growth."

Darden estimates that its same-store sales growth in fiscal 2025 will increase by 1% to 2% and that customer traffic will improve this year as inflation comes down, Vennam said.

"Last year we had a little too high profit margin," Vennam said. "It was industry leading and we had talked about not pricing as much" this year.

It's the second consecutive quarter in which samestore sales fell at Olive Garden - following a 1.8% decline in the previous quarter.

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US bars Russian software

The Biden administration announced plans Thursday to bar the sale of antivirus software made by Russia's Kaspersky Lab in the US, citing the firm's large US customers, including critical infrastructure providers and state and local governments.

Moscow's influence over the company was found to pose a significant risk, Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo said on a briefing call with reporters. The software's privileged access to a computer's systems could allow it to steal sensitive information from American computers or install malware and withhold critical updates, enhancing the threat, a source added.

"Russia has shown it has the capacity and . . . the intent to exploit Russian companies like Kaspersky to collect and weaponize the personal information of Americans and that is why we are compelled to take the action that we are taking today," Raimondo said on the call.

Kaspersky Lab and the Russian Embassy did not respond to requests for comment. Previously, Kaspersky has said that it is a privately managed company with no ties to the Russian government.

Home starts at 4-year low

Construction of new US homes fell 5.2% in May, the lowest level in four years, as builders pulled back on new projects.

The pace of construction hit a speed bump as builders grappled with higherfinancing than-normal costs, as well as elevated mortgage rates.

Housing starts fell to a 1.28 million annual pace from 1.35 million in April, the government said Thurs-

Toyota halt over airbags

Toyota Motor said Thursday it suspended production and delivery of the Grand Highlander and Lexus TX sport utility vehicles until it can address an airbag issue.

The automaker said earlier that it was recalling 145,000 2024 model year Toyota Grand Highlander and Lexus TX vehicles in the US because the curtain shield airbag on the driver's side may not deploy as intended during certain crashes if the driver's window is rolled down.

The automaker said production and deliveries of the three-row SUVs are being halted "until a remedy can be determined. An improvement for mass-produced vehicles is currently under study."

The automaker said customers will be notified about the issue by mid-August but it is not clear when the recall remedy will be announced. Reuters

Nvidia slips behind M'soft

Shares of chipmaker Nvidia dropped 3.5% on Thursday, handing the title of the world's most valuable company back to Microsoft.

Nvidia, whose market capitalization surpassed that of Microsoft on Tuesday, lost around \$91 billion, resulting in a market value of \$3.22 trillion. Microsoft's market value also slipped, to \$3.31 trillion, as its shares were down 0.1%.

Nvidia, Microsoft and Apple are

in a three-horse race to become the world's most valuable company. The Tim Cook-led iPhone maker's market capitalization was at \$3.215 trillion, with its shares down 2.2%.

Nvidia shares hit a record high of \$140.76 Thursday before closing at \$130.78. The stock is up 164% this year. Mizuho Securities' Jordan Klein

said investors have aired concerns that valuations of AI semiconductor stocks have gotten frothy.



Gates ex backing **Biden**

Philanthropist Melinda French Gates gave Democratic incumbent Joe Biden her first-ever presidential endorsement, citing his support for reproductive rights among other issues.

Gates this year left the charitable foundation she co-founded with her former husband, Microsoft founder Bill Gates, with \$12.5 billion for her own charity work.

She said the contrast between Biden and Donald Trump, the presumptive Republican rival in the Nov. 5 election, "couldn't be greater, and the stakes couldn't be higher."



'Pharma Bro' & Don Son' team?

Disgraced "Pharma Bro" Martin Shkreli claims he and Barron Trump — the 18-year-old son of Donald Trump — are behind a mysterious Trumpbranded cryptocurrency whose value has been surging this week.

Shkreli, who was convicted of securities fraud in 2017 after he hiked the price of a lifesaving drug, said he was initially approached by an acquaintance of Barron about making the coin, which has been branded DJT Trump-Coin.

Rumors of possible links with the 45th president sent DJT TrumpCoin's value skyrocketing by 385% within 24 hours on Tuesday, and amassing a trading volume of \$363 mil-

"About three months ago I started working with two

was a Trump family member, to create Trump Coin," he claimed in an X livestream.

"I was surprised. It was the president's son, [which] seems like a good idea," he said during the X Spaces event. "He wants to make money."

The existence of the token "Trump Coin" was first reported by Fox Business Monday after it was registered on the Solana blockchain platform.

Shkreli said repeatedly in the X exchange he had evidence of Barron Trump's involvement in the project that had eventually as many as 50 people working on it.

Shkreli had first told online crypto investigator ZachXBT of how he worked with Donald Trump's youngest son to launch the coin.

"I have over 1,000 pieces

other guys, one of whom of evidence I created it with Barron," Shkreli wrote in that exchange.

Nevertheless, Shkreli has not yet made public any of the proof linking Barron Trump to the coin that he purportedly has in his possession.

Online sleuths had tried to unmask the creator of the DIT token after blockchain company Arkham Intelligence offered \$150,000 to anyone who could successfully identify them.

Donald Trump, the presumptive GOP nominee for the White House this year, has not confirmed whether he or his Truth Social platform is connected to the coin.

The DJT coin's rally comes as investors continued to dump stock in parent company Trump Media, which fell by 15% on the Nasdaq on Thursday to close at \$26.75.

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IN FLA Insurer's rate hike

government-Florida's backed home insurance company is planning to hike rates by 14% — another blow for more than a million residents of the hurricanebattered state, which is saddled with some of the highest premiums in the country.

The board of governors of the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation voted unanimously on Wednesday to boost rates for next year this despite the fact that nine private insurers in the state have filed to cut their rates while 10 others have made it known they intend to keep their rates flat for

The rate hike is pending approval from state regulators.

"Paying because you're paying for the paradise ... of course. I agree. We have to pay a little more . . . but how much more? Too much. It's too much," Sofia Bereza, a Tampa area resident, told WFTS-TV on Wednesday.

Bereza said she considered a Citizens policy but that regardless of which company offered home insurance, the prices were steep.

A combination of more intense storms and hurricanes as well as soaring inflation have sent insurance premiums skyrocketing.

"You know it's unfortunate, but I also understand that inflation has caused a whole mess of trouble, and then on top of that, the climate is not what it used to be as well, so we are hit with a lot of storms that were unexpected," Frances Druding, another Tampa area resident, told WFTS-TV.

'Sound rates'

In a statement to The Post, Citizens said: "The rates recommended by the board today seek to continue the move towards actuarially sound rates while reflecting the benefits gained from recent legislative reforms."

The company said that premiums "remain well below the filed and approved rates of most private insurance companies writing in the state."

"The 2025 proposed rates will help reduce the risk of assessments on non-Citizens policyholders, many of whom are already paying higher premiums," the company rep told The Post.

Primary home owners will have to pay 14% more while those with secondary homes defined as residences that are occupied nine months or less each year will be required to pay 50% more.



Or, book with Lander's River Trips, another beloved local outfitter (tubing from \$15 per person; overnight trips with camping from \$82 per person), where guests can bring their dogs in all river crafts.

Make your home base in Monticello at the Kartrite (from \$250 per night), which has New York's biggest indoor water park, plus an

outdoor area open during the summer. The all-suite hotel has eight food outposts, six miles of hiking trails, a daily activities schedule, a full arcade and a ropes course.

If you're traveling with teens, we'd point you toward Antrim Streamside, a sprinkling of six luxe cottages on the banks of Willowemoc Creek in Livingston Manor. New for this summer is the midweek "Go Streamside"

package, which includes two nights' accommodations, a guided nature hike to Beaver Lake Farm, an on-site yoga class and more (from \$700 for two people).

Lake Hopatcong, NJ

Welcome to New Jersey's largest freshwater lake, just shy of 50 miles northwest from Manhattan. There's quite a lot to do on the 2,700-acre body of water, which stretches 9.5 miles in length and boasts over 38 miles of shoreline.

The beach at Hopatcong State Park offers picnicking and swimming (fair warning — it often fills up soon after its 8 a.m. opening

time on summer weekends). When kids are tired from swimming, sailing and waterskiing, set up shop at one of two playgrounds, or the field when they want to toss Frisbees, play soccer, fly kites or, heaven forbid, relax for a precious few.

LivetheLakeNJ.com has interactive maps of the area, but lakefront nosh standouts include Alice's, Stone Water and Lola's Tex-Mex though a personal favor-

ite is the Windlass, which hosts events like music under the stars and also runs the Miss Lotta boat, offering seafarers brunch, lunch, dinner, themed and historical cruises around "the Hop."

For landlubbers, the mini golf next door is based on the history of the lake, including the Wildcat





roller coaster from the Bertrand Island amusement park that used to be on the lot.

Nearby, there's RV and tent camping — you can do it! — on Mahlon Dickerson Reservation. At these verdant campgrounds (\$25 daily for tent sites; \$37 for RV sites), families

with kiddos will find no shortage of biking and hiking trails to pummel upon under the summer sun.

For the camping-averse, try the delightfully quaint bed-and-breakfast, the Whistling Swan Inn, from \$135 per night, about an 8-minute drive to the lake, in Stanhope.

Hudson Valley, NY

In Port Jervis, the gateway to the Upper Delaware River, you and yours can slip right into the lakefront embrace of a 1930s-era summer camp at Cedar Lakes Estate (from \$225 per night). Spend your vacation swimming near the sandy beach, paddleboarding in the middle of the lake or taking out a rowboat and casting a line for largemouth bass, perch, sunfish or crappies. There's also an infinity-style pool with bucolic views of the lake's tranquil waters. For your digs, choose from luxury cottages, camp-y cabins or suites.

Whatever you book, if you can time your visit, grab tickets for the Sunday Supper Series (\$125 per adult; \$95 per child), an alfresco dining experience with heirloom produce from the chef's garden and ingredients sourced primarily from neighboring farms.

Hamburg, NJ

Roughly 90 minutes northwest from Manhattan, Crystal Springs Resort comprises two properties six miles apart, and has a dizzying amount of H2O-infused fun.

You'll want to make sure everyone in your posse packs multiple bathing suits since there are eight indoor and outdoor resort pools within three pool complexes, including water slides, an infinity pool with Appalachian Mountain views and more.

The crème de la crème is the Biosphere, a 10,000-square-foot pool area with a retractable roof at the

resort's Grand Cascades Lodge (from \$569 per night). The space is the first in the US to feature advanced German Foiltec roofing, allowing for nearly 100% light transmission for year-round tanning, and is designed with lush tropical foliage, connected indoor and outdoor pools, an underground aquarium and a water slide.

Over at Minerals Hotel (from \$439 per night), kids go wild for the cliff jump at its outdoor pool.

Round out your trip with archery, glow golf, pony rides, pickleball, goat yoga, scaling a rock climbing wall and mom-and-dad decompress time at one of two spas, any of the six golf courses, or touring one of the world's top wine cellars with more than 45,000 bottles.

If you can swing it, tack on diner pour deux at Restaurant Latour, the finest of the resort's 10 seasonal dining venues, where the seven-course chef's tasting menu is otherworldly in both taste and presentation.


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
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
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MINUTES AWAY. A MOUNTAIN OF FUN.

These vintage coasters are still thrilling after all these years

By ARTHUR LEVINE

O stay relevant and attract visitors, amusement parks introduce new rides that promise the latest, greatest thrills and technology. On the flip side, many parks, especially those in the Northeast, offer rides that have been fixtures on their midways for decades.

Here's some of the oldest coasters in New York and Connecticut that still do what they've been doing for, in some cases, upward of 100 years: generating screams and smiles.

Jack Rabbit

The oldest continuously operating roller coaster in the US (and the third oldest in the world), Jack Rabbit opened in 1920 at Seabreeze Amusement Park in Rochester. It enthralls guests as much today as it did when it debuted.

As with most of the rides on this list, it's wooden. (Tubular steel coasters didn't come on the scene until Disneyland debuted Matterhorn Bobsleds in 1959.)

Known as a terrain coaster, it hugs the park's topography and dives 75 feet into a ravine. For its finale, it sends passengers careening in the dark through an enclosed tunnel.

"It's the oldest attraction here, and it's our No. 1 most popular ride," said Rob Norris, Seabreeze president and a fifth-generation member of the family that owns and operates the park, which dates back to 1879.

Jack Rabbit is a rite of passage for kids in the Rochester area who can't wait to reach the required 48-inch height to board the coaster. "It's such a great ride, and the way it was initially engineered, it's very manageable to keep in great shape," Norris notes. "The Jack Rabbit is running as well now as it ever has."

That's saying something for a 104-year-old coaster.

Cvclone

This is one of the most famous coasters in the

world. It opened in 1927 in Coney Island and is registered as a National Historical Landmark.

Climbing 75 feet and dropping at a hairy 59-degree angle, the ride reaches a perky 60 mph, eliciting screams that reverberate down the boardwalk.

The Brooklyn amusement area was once the home of one of the world's first roller coasters, the Gravity Pleasure Switch Back Railway, which opened in 1884.

Wildcat

Lake Compounce, in Bristol, Conn., welcomed its first visitors in 1846, and lays claim as the country's

oldest still-operating amusement park. Its Wildcat coaster opened in 1927 and greets guests near the main entrance, where it descends 78 feet and accelerates to 48 mph.

Wooden coasters can be difficult to maintain, and the aged Connecticut coaster had become excessively rough in recent years. The park closed Wildcat in 2023 to perform extensive retracking work and reopened it this season with a smoother, more pleasant ride experience.

"We need to preserve the history of the park, and it's important to us to maintain the integrity of this wooden

hill, Lake Compounce's general manager. "There is a sentimental value to it. Folks tell me that their grandparents rode Wildcat. It's great that we are able to be a part of their lives and keep the coaster relevant and alive."



coaster," said Doug Hemp-

While many older coasters have been updated with computer controls and other modern niceties, at Playland in Rye, ride operators still use a large manual brake to control the Dragon Coaster's trains.

The ride, which opened in 1929, climbs 80 feet and offers a great first drop that is followed by a potent pop of airtime, the giddy negative-G sensation coaster passengers feel when they rise out of their seats.

About halfway through the ride, the train enters a darkened tunnel that is designed to look like the namesake, mythical beast.

Fun fact: A scene from the film "Fatal Attraction," was shot aboard the Dragon Coaster.

Comet

This has been one of the highlights at the Six Flags Great Escape in Queensbury, NY, since it opened there in 1949.

But the coaster first debuted a year earlier in 1948 at Crystal Beach, a now-defunct park in Ontario, Canada, and was transported, piece by piece, to the Lake George-area Six Flags.

It climbs 95 feet and hits 55 mph and, for its age, is surprisingly nimble, delivering plenty of airtime.

UN for all ages awaits in this famed Alpine enclave upstate. Here, the latest and greatest hits in the mountains of yore.

Ulster County

Roughly a 2 ½-hour drive from Manhattan lies Ulster County. After "are we there yet?," the first thing kids clamor in the car is "we're hungry." And palates will be more than pleased at Mill & Main, a family affair helmed by a husband and wife team and their son.

Located in Kerhonkson, there's a kids' menu to keep little ones happy and shareable plates that will blow grown-ups' minds, from loaded yucca fries with Colombian queso to grandma's lemon-and-rosemary fried chicken. Grab a seat in the banquettes or, on a clear day, head out to the cozy patio. (Mill & Main Provisions is next door, a deligrocer with heavenly pastries and iced coffee.)

Properly fueled, we'd steer families toward the Ulster County Nature Bus. Run by the county's tourism office, the free shuttle service with mountain, ridge and river routes originates in Kingston and Ellenville with a handful of stops for hiking

nd biking

If you don't do the "ridge route," definitely still pay a visit to Minnewaska State Park Preserve in Kerhonkson. The two-mile Carriage Road Loop around the lake dazzles with kaleidoscopic panoramas of lake, cliffs, mountains and blue sky.

Speaking of such views, you can also visit the world's largest kaleidoscope at Emerson Resort & Spa in

Mount Tremper, or make your own multicolored candles at Candlestock's Wax Imagination Studio in Saugerties. Post-action, adults and mini yogis alike will adore a unique yoga flow with Nixa De Bellis. Have her come to your group for a private yoga experience enhanced by essential oils, or try her weekly class at Whole Sky

Yoga in Stone Ridge.
Stay at Rocking Horse
Ranch Resort (all-inclusive from \$1,000 for four
people), a kid-friendly
resort in Highland with an
indoor water park, mountain tubing, horseback riding and much more.

Other top votes: U-pick fun and the petting zoo at Kelder's Farm in Kerhonkson (My dad and I recently picked strawberries here, and I assure you, we will never take the effort behind pre-packaged pints for granted again.); hop on the Delaware & Ulster Railroad tracks for a pedal-powered ride with Rail Explorers; and catch a Saugerties Stallions game, the summer col-legiate baseball team regularly has events for kids where they bring them out to the field for races and games, offer face-painting activities, etc.

Don't close your Ulster County sojourn without a visit to Belleayre Beach for swimming and boating, followed by a huge sundae at Santa Fe Burger Bar in Rosendale.

For lodging, check into your very own treehouse. Three of them were unveiled earlier this year at the bucolic Chatwal Lodge (lodges from \$900 per night; treehouses from \$1,800 inclusive of food, nonalcoholic beverages and most activities).

The fun factor of dwelling in the canopy is there for the kiddos, and adults will be grateful for the chic factor complete with a living room

O you want an epic farmers market haul, while disguising it as an afternoon activity that will leave kids delighted? There's a farmers market for that. Ahead, local produce meccas to enjoy with little ones.

GrowNYC

Since 1976, environmental nonprofit GrowNYC has given New Yorkers the chance to sink their teeth into farm-fresh foods. All produce, animal products and baked goods are grown, raised, caught or baked by the on-site producers themselves, no more than 250 miles north, 120 miles south, and 170 miles east and west of New York City.

Along with just-picked fresh fruits and vegetables, you can also purchase heritage meats, award-winning farmstead cheeses, breads and baguettes, jams, pickles, cut flowers and plants, wine, ciders, maple syrup and more. On any given trip, you may unearth produce running the gamut from watermelon radishes and Chioggia beets to Pinka-boo apples and Mexican specialty produce. Kids will also be amazed to see unfamiliar types of common fruits and veggies like, say, purple potatoes, red carrots, white cucumbers and yellow

tomatoes. Expect a convivial atmosphere where thousands of shoppers load up their reusable totes with fresh fare and chat with farmers, students tour the grounds

to learn about seasonality, and kids entreat their caretakers to stop, watch and taste at one of the daily cooking demos. GrowNYC's Greenmar-

ket program comprises more than 45 Greenmarket locations across the five boroughs at the height of the season (June through November). While you can't go wrong with veggie ventures at any of GrowNYC's outposts, Union Square Greenmarket at Union Square Park in Manhattan, Jackson Heights

Greenmarket at 34th Avenue at 79th Street in Queens and Grand Army Plaza Greenmarket in Brooklyn reign supreme.

At the Union Square market (and Grand Army Plaza location, although the

lineup isn't finalized) you can also look forward to special guest visitors, arts and crafts for kids and cookbook signings. While not until fall, the annual Cider Village takeover at Union Square is an autumnal

The TaSH (Tarrytown & Sleepy Hollow) **Farmers Market**

Whether you made the move to Westchester or are simply looking for an easy day trip to keep kids entertained, it's hard to outshine the TaSH for your next farmers market haul outside the five boroughs.

Celebrating its 10th anniversary season, this farmers market has all-day live music every weekend and a rotating series of activities. (Especially noteworthy: The TaSH will be partnering with the Sleepy Hollow Arts Collective to run arts workshops for the community.)

Families regularly camp out here for the whole day, picnicking on the Village Green, playing with on-leash pups and letting little ones burn off energy on the playground. Located about 90 miles northeast of NYC, local vendors include farms, creameries, florists, artisans and two food trucks, accompanied by live music. Kids can have a ball playing lawn games like cornhole, while parents sip vino on the winery's bucolic lawn.

FYI: Dogs are welcome, as are mortgage applications when you realize there are some upsides to this whole "country" thing.



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



PUMP THE BRAKES: The Cubs' Shota Imanaga has been impressive, but the Mets are a worthwhile underdog in the eyes of Action Network's Nicholas Martin.

The Grimace magic took a momentary pause on Wednesday but the Mets still enter their three-game series at Wrigley Field having won seven of eight and are just one game back of a wildcard berth.

Meanwhile, the Yankees face another tough test from the Braves this weekend. Let's take a look at Friday's matchups involving the Mets and Yankees.

Mets at Cubs

The Mets get their second look at Japanese sensation Shota Imanaga in Friday's matinee, and are hoping to fare better than they did the first time they faced him. Imanaga was dominant on May 1, allowing zero runs and just three hits over six innings at Citi Field.

His 1.90 ERA is the third-best mark among qualified pitchers in the NL this season. He holds an expected fielding independent (xFIP) of 3.47 and an expected ERA (xERA) of 3.07, which suggest some regression is on the horizon. Imanaga's underlying results have also tailed off to a greater extent recently; over his last five starts, he has been hard-hit 36 percent while striking out 25.8 percent of batters faced.

Hitters have chased 126 of Imanaga's 300 (42 percent) off-speed pitches out of the zone for the third-highest rate in the league. Getting hitters to chase pitches has been a key to his 81 percent strand rate.

Laying off Imanaga's secondary stuff out of the zone is a key for opposing lineups, and it should benefit the Mets to have seen him already.

The Mets have been dominant versus left-handed pitching of late. Over the last 30 days, they own a league-leading weighted Runs Created plus (wRC+) of 161 with an OPS of .912. In the same span, the Cubs have hit to a wRC+ of only 74 versus lefties and own a leaguehigh 19.1 percent soft-contact rate.

So while Jose Quintana is obviously a lesser pitcher than Imanaga at this point in his career, he is facing a Cubs lineup on Friday that has been out of form.

Despite Imanaga's brilliance, the Mets still look to be worthy of an underdog shot in Game 1 considering their other edges in this matchup.

Recommendation: Mets moneyline (+128, FanDuel)

Braves at Yankees

At 35, Chris Sale is authoring another excellent season, with an ERA of 2.98. He owns a superb underlying profile, including an xERA of 2.72 and an xFIP of 2.48.

Over the last 121 plate appearances against Sale, the pitcher has struck out 30 percent of batters faced, walked only 4 percent and allowed an expected batting average (xBA) of .229. He owns a Stuff+ rating of 107, and a Location+ rating of 102. His slider remains elite and has helped him generate a 35.9 percent chase rate.

The Yankees own lesser splits versus lefties than righties but will still offer a tough test for Sale. They have hit to a wRC+ of 119 versus lefties over the last 30 days, with an OPS of .752.

The Braves' offense has been far less effective over the last month. They have hit to a wRC+ of 98 against lefties, with an OPS of .703. They have struck out 22.8 percent of the time.

Carlos Rodon has enjoyed a nice bounce-back campaign, with a 4.17 xERA and a 4.30 xFIP.

A matchup at Yankee Stadium is scary for any pitcher right now, but Sale has the stuff to stifle even the best offenses. Rodon should continue to be a strong starting option the rest of the way, and the Braves' offense isn't in top form right now.

This total looks high given the starting pitching matchup, and there is value backing the Under.

Recommendation: Under 8 runs (-115, FanDuel)

Redick 59 to helm Kink **Lakers**

The Lakers are taking a big swing with their new head coach.

After a dramatic coaching search, the Lakers struck a four-year deal with JJ Redick on Thursday, according to ESPN's Adrian Wojnarowski.

The 39-year-old will earn roughly \$8 million per season, according to The Athletic.

Redick, who has no coaching experience, cohosts the "Mind the Game" podcast with Lakers star LeBron James, who can become a free agent this summer. He most recently was an analyst for ESPN and called the NBA Finals games with Mike Breen and Doris Burke.

Lakers general manager Rob Pelinka offered Redick the job Thursday morning after being sold on his "ability to connect with players and his basketball IQ," according to ESPN.

The Lakers offered UConn coach Dan Hurley a six-year, \$70 million contract, but Hurley opted to remain in Storrs to chase an NCAA championship threepeat.

Redick retired from playing three years ago after 15 NBA seasons and was known as a sharpshooter, finishing with a career 41.5 shooting percentage from 3-point range.

The former Duke star, who the Magic selected 11th in the 2006 NBA Draft, played parts of seven seasons in Orlando and later played for the Bucks, Clippers, 76ers, Pelicans and Mavericks, averaging 12.8 points over his career.

Redick was linked to the Lakers job since the team fired Darvin Ham on May 3 after a first-round playoff loss to the Nuggets and first spoke to Pelinka at the NBA draft combine last month.

James, 39, holds a player option for the 2024-25 season and has yet to officially make a decision on his future, though pal Redick becoming the Lakers' coach ostensibly increases the likelihood he'll stay.

Olivier Rioux makes Zach Edey look like Muggsy Bogues. An incoming Florida basketball

freshman, Rioux has gone viral in recent days after internet sleuths discovered his bio page on the school's athletic website lists him at a staggering 7-foot-9.

That height would make the Montreal native the tallest college basketball player of all time, passing former 7-8 Florida Tech and Mountain State center Paul Sturgess, according to Fox Sports. Rioux previously entered the Guinness World Book of Records in 2022 as the tallest living male

"As a child, Olivier spent hours looking through his Guinness World Records books, studying the tallest people, and comparing himself to every record holder," Guinness wrote in September

Time will tell if Rioux can leave his mark on college basketball the way his fellow Canadian, the 7-4, two-time National Player of the Year Edey did, but Rioux is going to turn some heads this

You can't teach height, as they say, and it's not every day you see a 7-9 player. Edey brought plenty of eyes for his height and prowess, just like other giants before him, but he still falls 5 inches short of Rioux.







Perhaps the most-recognized skyscraper is the late Manute Bol, who was frequently listed at 7-7 and sometimes 7-6 — while playing for Division II Bridgeport in the 1980s before the Washington Bullets drafted him in 1985.

Sturgess played collegiately from 2007-11, although he did not reach the Power Five level as Rioux will this upcoming season. Sturgess eventually played for the Harlem Globetrotters.

The 7-6 Tacko Fall also became a viral sensation for UCF during the late 2010s before heading to the NBA in 2019 for a brief career with the Celtics and Cavaliers

Rioux, who played for IMG

Academy in Florida, actually lists himself at 7-7 on his Instagram page, while noting that he's 7-9 with his size-20 shoes on.

The Ballislife.com X account reported that the 18-year-old stood at 7-5 two years ago before growing an inch last year and then adding another inch this

Rioux measured at 6-1 as an 8-year-old, 6-11 in sixth grade and joined the 7-foot club before entering seventh grade, according to Florida.

The 290-pound center went viral last year for posting a 2018 photo of him towering over Nuggets guard Jamaal Murray, who is listed at 6-4.

"Congrats to Jamal Murray for winning the Nba Championship with Denver! @jmglitxh27," Rioux wrote. "Do you remember 5 years ago you were the one asking for the picture."

Rioux is listed as a three-star prospect by 247sports.com, ranking 305th nationally and 56th among centers. Edey, too, was considered a marginal Canadian prospect coming out of IMG Academy before blossoming into one of the most dominant college players ever and a likely firstround pick in next week's NBA draft.

Yanks add vet arm to bullpen

The Yankees added a veteran lefty to their beat-up bullpen on Thursday, though he did not receive the warmest of welcomes.

The club signed sidearm reliever Tim Hill to a major league contract and immediately threw him into the mix in an ugly 17-5 loss to the Orioles. Hill pitched an inning and gave up a three-run home run on which all of the runs were unearned because of an error behind him.

YANKEES NOTES

Hill, 34, was designated for assignment by the White Sox last week and then released Tuesday. He had posted a 5.87 ERA with 13 strikeouts in 23 innings this season.

But Aaron Boone said before Thursday's game that the Yankees believed Hill was better than his surface numbers would suggest.

"Hopefully getting here, getting in our environment, he can become an important part of this," Boone said. "We think he gives us a different look down there that can be valua-

Clayton Andrews was designated for assignment to make room on the 40-man roster.

Across parts of seven seasons in the majors — also spending time with the Royals and Padres — Hill has a career 4.30 ERA in 347 appearances, known as a pitcher that can generate a high rate of ground balls.

Boone said Hill had been on their board "for a few weeks" and that in a few of his rough outings with the White Sox he had just been "dinked and dunked to death."

The Yankees were in need of a fresh arm after the bullpen was forced to cover six innings in Wednesday's 10-inning, 7-6 loss to the Orioles, plus Ian Hamilton landing on the IL. And after using six relievers Thursday — plus Jose Trevino for the ninth — the Yankees optioned Ron Marinaccio to Triple-A, clearing the way for another arm (perhaps Cody Morris) to be recalled on Friday.

Oilers need more McDavid magic

EDMONTON, Alberta — Connor McDavid was surrounded by

His hair still wet from practice, he sat in Studio 99, the restaurant in the Oilers' home arena named for Wayne Gretzky and full of memorabilia commemorating the legendary career of the "Great One." To his right was a jersey Gretzky wore during his first NHL season and on the wall to his left quotes from No. 99, who captained Edmonton to the Stanley Cup four

If McDavid keeps this up, the Oilers are going to have to make room for a Studio 97.

The heir apparent to Gretzky, Mario Lemieux and Sidney Crosby as the best hockey player in the world, McDavid has carried his team from the brink of elimination in the Stanley Cup Final against the Panthers to a Game 6 on home ice Friday night. The only player in league history to record back-to-back four-point games in the Final, the Oilers captain gets his next chance to add to his legacy and push the series to a deciding Game 7 back across the continent.

"You spend your life working to get into a position like this," McDavid said Thursday. "You think that when you're here it's going to be some magic feeling, magic, I don't know. You don't know what to expect. To be honest, it's all been pretty normal. This has always been part of the plan for our group, to be in a position like this, playing big games at home in big moments. Just another one [Friday] night."

Just another one in front of another sellout crowd of 18,000-plus, with many more in the city of nearly a million people packing downtown in hopes of witnessing something that has not

been done in nearly eight decades. Detroit in 1945 was the last team to trail 3-0 in the Final and get to a Game 7, and Toronto three years before that was the only one to

Gretzky's record set in 1985. He has emerged as the front-runner to win the Conn Smythe Trophy as playoff MVP, even if the Oilers fall short and the Panthers win the Cup for the first time in franchise history.


"He's a reckless skilled player, which a very unique quality," Hall of Famer Ken Hitchcock, who coached McDavid in 2018-19, told the Associated Press by phone. "He's not afraid to put his body in dangerous areas to score, and it's really hard to defend against. He's going to the net and taking a hit to make a play. There's no fear in his game - none."

Panthers coach Paul Maurice warned anyone who would listen to him coming into the series that the greatness of McDavid tends to get taken for granted because it's such a constant. McDavid hasn't had a ton of goals in these playoffs, or in this title series, but his impact has been off every chart.

"Here's what happens: You get really good players, like Connor McDavid, and they get a block of time where they don't score and there seems to be something wrong," Maurice said. "There isn't. Nobody, even Connor McDavid, scores at the rate in the last three games over 82 or over every playoff game or he'd have 700 points a year. That's the way this works."

McDavid might be reinventing how this works, putting up 11 points in Games 2-5 of the final on three goals and eight assists, despite getting the toughest defensive matchup possi-Connor ble opposite Aleksander Barkov, McDavid Florida's cap-

Rangers' prospects received plenty of chances last season, which could pay off next season

All the one-year deals worth \$875,000 and below that Rangers president and general manager Chris Drury signed veteran free agents to last offseason were a necessity, considering the organization's position under the cap and desire to create opportunity for upward mobility in the lineup among its young core.

It may have served its purpose a little too well, however, with the Rangers having to call up and give ice time to nine skaters (not including goalie Louis Domingue's onegame cameo) who began the season in Hartford with the club's AHL affiliate, the Wolf Pack.

But after the Rangers shed Barclay Goodrow's contract by getting the Sharks to claim the veteran forward off the waiver wire on Wednesday, Drury looks to be freeing up cap space and taking a different course of action this summer.

Still, last offseason's approach allowed for the Rangers to get a better understanding of what their prospect cupboard looks like. Prospects such Matt Rempe and Adam Edstrom received lengthy opportunities, with Rempe appearing in 17 regular-season games and 11 playoff games in comparison to Edstrom's 11 regular-season contests.

The two Bash Brother-like forwards, who respectively stand at 6-foot-8 1/2 and 6-7, will surely be in the mix come training camp, but Rempe, in particular, will look to prove he can be an NHL regular and that he wasn't just a product of the sideshow he helped create.

This all while the Rangers' 2021 first-round pick, Brennan Othmann, attempts to better showcase himself after a nondescript first three NHL games this past season and Brett Berard, the club's 134th-overall pick in 2020, tries to join the conversation.

Part of the Rangers' need to utilize their depth this season was happenstance.

Blake Wheeler (one year at \$875,000) suffered a season-ending injury in mid-February which, when paired with Filip Chytil's suspected concussion 10 games into the season, left the Rangers without two top-nine skaters. There were also significant injury stints for Adam Fox and Jacob Trouba, which created temporary holes that needed to be filled on the back end.

The defense in Hartford always seemed to be ailing in some way, too, which limited the Rangers' options for blueliners to recall. Ben Harpur missed a majority of the season after undergoing pectoral surgery and Connor Mackey was week-to-week with an upper-body injury at one point, as well.

This didn't happen at all last year. Not when Sabrina Ionescu missed time with a hamstring injury. Not when Courtney Vandersloot sat out the second game of a back-to-back in late July, either. Through 15 games in 2024, even amid Vandersloot's sixgame absence due to personal reasons, the Liberty — and their current nucleus - had also avoided another injury and the need to navigate without

That changed Thursday, when Betnijah Laney-Hamilton was a late addition to the availability report with a right knee injury and went from full **LIBERTY** to questionable to out in a matter of hours. Rookie Leonie SPARKS

Laney-Hamilton, who'd started every game this season and usually faced the task of guarding an opponent's top player, dealt with knee swelling that dated back to their last road trip. That didn't solve their short-term conundrum, though.

Brondello turned to Fiebich, a productive spark off the bench. Ionescu and Jones helped pace the offense in the first half with 15 and 11 points, respectively, while the Liberty prevented anyone on the Sparks from hitting double digits across the opening 20 minutes. Los Angeles was also navigating without rookie — and No. 2 overall pick — Cameron Brink after she tore her ACL earlier in the week.

For most of the opening 20 minutes, though, Los Angeles kept within striking distance — and really just two or three points away — after an early sixpoint advantage was erased. Fiebich's crosscourt pass was picked off, and Rae Burrell drew a foul in transition. Then, after another Liberty possession with good ball movement fizzled out with a miss, Dearica Hamby tied the game with a basket.

Behind Jones and Ionescu, the Liberty still took a seven-point lead into halftime. Jones, while double-teamed on the left block, threaded a nifty pass to an open Ivana Dojkic for a 3 and one of her eight assists. She and Ionescu connected for a layup off a screen, too.

And when posed with the frequency of how often Ionescu has assisted on the star forward's baskets this season, she joked Jones that she's "gotta buy me lunch."

"Any time we come together, I think it just shows why we play and what's really important in life," Sabrina Ionescu said. "Obviously, just wrapping our arms around her and her family in this time is important."

Cam Thomas is convinced he should've been in the Most Improved Player Award conversation this past season. But his biggest improvements — passing and defense — weren't just unheralded; they were unseen.

"I should definitely be top three [for Most Improved], going from barely playing in the rotation and having little spurts in the season to going all the way up an 11-point jump to 22 points per game," the Nets guard said. "Any other year, that goes noticed, but this year it's gone unnoticed.

"Obviously, I feel like when you have a jump like that in all aspects, if you watch the games you see how I'm guarded and all the other stuff. I should definitely be in the top three of that conversation. ... [But] we probably didn't win enough games."

Therein lies the rub. The Nets' sad 32-50 season saw Thomas relegated to just seventh for the award. The 76ers' Tyrese Maxey won the award. Coby White of the Bulls was second and the Rockets' Alperen Sengun was third.

The young guard emerged with 22.5 points per game, his quantum leap from just 10.6 points the year prior the biggest in the NBA and largest in franchise history.

Thomas' 8.5 turnover percentage was surprisingly clean considering the offensive burden he carried. The only guards in league history with lower percentages and a similar 30 percent usage rate: Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (2023-24), Tracy McGrady (2002-03), George Gervin (1981-82) and Michael Jordan (four times).

Thomas' offense has never been in doubt. The steps he's needed to take — and will have to keep taking next season - were in his defense and playmaking. If

a chain is only as strong as its weakest link, then a player is only as good as his flaws — and those have clearly been his.

"Look, Cam had a heck of a year. I'm not saying anything that anybody didn't see for themselves," Nets general manager

Sean Marks said. "I really was intrigued about the responsibility Cam took in his own development, in terms of we all knew he could go get a bucket, we all knew the confidence that he plays with, which some of that to be quite honest can't be taught. So it's innately who he is and how he's built.

"But it's him being a facilitator out there, him playing with others, him making other people look good. And we saw that over the course of the year, taking a little bit more emphasis on the defensive side of the ball, too, scrapping for loose balls, getting in there for defensive rebounds. So I've got to give Cam a lot of credit, because his game has developed over the course of last year."

While Thomas is under contract next season for \$4 million. the Nets can give him an extension this summer that would kick in for 2025-26. But just like the 76ers did with Tyrese Maxey, there are salary-cap advantages to waiting and re-upping Thomas as a restricted free agent in a year when analyst Yossi Gozlan estimated he could get between \$20 million and \$25 million annually.

For perspective, Thomas allowed a troublesome 1.727 points per possession against the roll man in pick-and-rolls in 2022-23, labeled as "poor" by Synergy. His improvement to 1.158 last season bumped him up to "average."

Similarly, Thomas' playmaking has improved. After averaging fewer than 1.4 assists through his first two campaigns, Thomas averaged 2.6 assists this season including 3.6 after the All-Star break when interim coach Kevin Ollie replaced Jacque Vaughn.

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Randle 'good' for season's start

While explaining his tortured decision to undergo shoulder surgery before the playoffs, Julius Randle said his recovery is "ahead of schedule" and he'll be available for the start of next season.

"I'm good, bro. ... I'm good, I'm healthy," Randle said on "7PM in Brooklyn" with hosts Carmelo Anthony and Kid Mero. "I'm getting there. It's a process. It's something that's going to take a long time. I knew that going into it. But I'm ahead of schedule, I'm feeling good. I'm healthy, I'll be ready when the season starts."

Randle's surgery was April 9 in Los Angeles, less than two weeks prior to the Knicks first-round playoff series against the 76ers and more than two months after the power forward suffered a dislocated shoulder. There's been no

official timeline for his recovery, but six months is common for that type of procedure – placing Randle back into action in October, a couple weeks into training camp.

The long recovery and the potential for it to impact next season son he abandoned his

attempt to return without surgery. The bigger reason was Randle's shoulder wasn't getting better.

The 29-year-old previously said he suffered a setback during a full contact practice.

"I'm rehabbing for 2 ½ months knowing my shoulder ain't good," Randle said. "So it's a situation where it's like, 'Do I play and know that I'm going to miss six or seven months after we're done



playing?' So I'm probably not playing into the next year. And I'm not good. So can I help the team? I can't get a rebound. I can't fall. I feel like if I fall my shoulder is going to come out. So I'm dealing with that."

Randle said he felt — was part of the rea- **JULIUS RANDLE** like a failure as the Knicks were preparing

for a playoff run.

"I'm also dealing with the part like I feel selfish, like I'm letting the guvs down," Randle said. "Then it came to the point where I don't even want to be around because I'm trying to work to come back but I feel like I'm a distraction. I feel like an outcast. I'm like, let me just stay away, they're doing great, let me just be around and support when I can.

So I had to get out of my own way of my own ego and be like, all right, once I made that decision, deal with it, and keep moving and support the best way we can. But that s--t was tough."

The Knicks earned the second seed but fell in the second round to the Pacers, largely because of an avalanche of injuries. Randle was one of five Knicks to undergo surgery during or after the season, joining Jalen Brunson (hand), OG Anunoby (elbow), Mitchell Robinson (ankle, twice) and Bojan Bogdanovic (ankle,

Randle is eligible for a contract extension this summer and recently expressed his desire to remain long term in New York, where he joined Melo as the second Knick with three All-Star appearances since Patrick Ewing.



Mendoza said before the Mets traveled to Chicago for a series with the Cubs that starts Friday.

The 22-year-old catcher caught all 27 innings against the Rangers, and went 7-for-13 with a double and four RBIs, continuing to impress offensively and defensively.

Luis Torrens has done well behind him, but Alvarez is arguably the most important player on the team — which makes his growing presence in the lineup all the more significant.

Since returning from thumb surgery on June 11, Alvarez had been absent from the starting lineup every third game. That changed Wednesday because of the schedule and because Mendoza was comfortable with Alvarez's left thumb. He continues to wear a splint on it while he catches.

"I keep checking with him after every game, before he comes to the ballpark," Mendoza said. "He's been fine."

The upcoming series at Wrigley Field is an oddly timed one, with matinees on Friday and Saturday before a late start for "Sunday Night Baseball."

Such an arrangement — along with an off day Monday might ensure Alvarez catches a second entire series.

"He cares, and that's what we're seeing," Mendoza said of Alvarez, whose return has helped the Mets play better baseball. "They're feeding off of each other, and Alvy's right there in the thick of it."

For about two months, Jeff McNeil did not produce as the everyday second baseman.

For about three weeks, McNeil has not produced as essentially the platoon second baseman.

The Mets second baseman has fallen deeper into this funk and will bring a .219 batting average more than 100 points below his .326 mark that led the National League in 2022 — into a threegame set at Wrigley Field beginning Friday.

It is likely that the lefty swinger will be out of the lineup when the series begins and Cubs lefthander Shota Imanaga gets the ball. The question will become how long the Mets will continue to rely upon McNeil even against righties.

"Jeff McNeil is our second baseman, and he's going to continue to get playing time," manager Carlos Mendoza said last week, and McNeil indeed has continued to get playing time. He has not run with the continued opportunities,

After never quite getting going in a down and injury-filled 2023 season, McNeil again has not approached the type of hole-finding savant that made him such a valuable hitter. McNeil is still putting his bat on the ball — his 11.7 percent strikeout rate entered play Thursday as the fifth-best among qualified hitters — but the hits have disappeared.


McNeil, who does not bring much power, was hitting just .224 with a .618 OPS through May 30, which prompted the call-up of slick-glove and righty-hitter Jose Iglesias to play second base against opposing lefties.

Iglesias' defense has been as advertised — he partnered with Francisco Lindor to turn an impressive double play that helped clinch Tuesday's win in Texas — and his bat has been excellent (a .370/.433/ .444 slash line), while his high-energy presence has coincided with a spike in the team's play.

Iglesias has just 10 plate appearances against righty pitchers, but his hot streak eventually could lead to the Mets wanting to see more.

"His defense, the energy and how much he's talking to players," Mendoza said about what has stood out about Iglesias. "But we need Jeff McNeil."

Upon Iglesias's call-up and emergence. McNeil was benched for an entire week as the Mets saw

a slew of opposing southpaw starters. He returned to the lineup on June 9 in London and has played in 10 games since the hiatus, which does not seem to have worked: McNeil has gone 5-for-30 (.167) with one extra-base hit (a double), his OPS all the way down to .591. Just four qualified hitters in the majors entered Wednesday with a worse mark.

The advanced metrics do not contain a ton of optimism. McNeil's expected batting average is .234. The 32-year-old statistically has lost a step, ranked as the 205th fastest runner as a rookie in 2018 and 376th this season.

The David Stearns-Mendoza re-

gime has proven it will move off players who are not performing. Brett Baty was not hitting, so he was exchanged for Mark Vientos. Omar Narvaez and Joey Wendle were owed money for the rest of the season, but their play on the field dictated that they would receive that money away from the team. Adrian Houser was not helping out the rotation, so the Mets found a new home for him in the bullpen.

Those decisions, though, were cleaner than it would be to find a new role for McNeil. He is due \$31.5 million over 2025 and 2026. He has been a significant contributor since debuting in 2018 and a

Mets suddenly find themselves playing games with high stakes

FUNNY thing happened Wednesday night in Arlington, Texas. For the first time in 619 days the New York Mets played what could be termed an "important" game.

What's even funnier is that nobody really noticed that before it

happened, or while it was happening. And even when they surrendered a 5-3 game to the Texas Rangers, snapping a sevengame winning streak, there

Except, just as the Mets seized a 3-l lead in the top of the sixth inning, SNY showed a graphic of the wild-card stand-

ings in the National
League. And two
things struck right
away: They didn't
just show five or
six teams, the way
wild-card standings are
supposed to look. They
showed 10. Ten!

Also, even before Gary Cohen and Keith Hernandez did the obvious math, if you took a look at that graphic one became thing apparent: If the Mets could have gotten the final 12 outs of this game, they would have woken up Thursday

morning — and this is almost impossible to believe, if you recall what the Mets looked like for much of April and May — tied for playoff position.

They never did get those outs. Sean Manaea lost his no-hitter, then lost the lead, and then Drew Smith

offered up a meatball to Leady Taveras, and that was that.

"After what we have been through, especially in the month of May, and for us to play good baseball shows that we have got a good team," Mets manager Carlos Mendoza said afterward. "We have got

guys that are going to continue to compete."

And look, the Mets playing better (seven straight before Wednesday, 11 out of 13, 11-4 in June) was the biggest

reason for there to be any reason at all to even glance at the standings. The Mets fell a season-worst Il games under .500 when they blew a ninth-inning lead to Arizona on June 2, and they were a ghastly mess.

The season could have spun completely out of control at that point and it would have been understandable, because at that point the Mets did nothing well, and nothing right. They also fell a season-high 6 ½ games behind the final wild-card spot that day, a significant number even for early June, since there were eight teams between them and the wild card.

We can have good fun at the expense of the three wild-card system (and will in a paragraph or two), but when you're a terrible team not even the promise of three consolation prizes mean very much. There hasn't been one second of false hope this year for White Sox or Rockies fans, for instance, and on June 2 Mets fans were easily shuffled into that crew.

Now? Look, not long ago we wrote about the 35-game stretch that was going to take the Mets a few days past the All-Star break that featured 33 games against teams at or below .500. Now the caveat, of course, is that all of those losing teams were hungrily eyeing their games with the Mets every bit as much.

But now, nine games in, the Mets are 7-2 as they head to Wrigley Field

and the Cubs, who are one percentage point higher than the 35-38 Mets at 36-39. There's a lot of work to do, and a lot of season left, and the delicate balance of a season always offers silent warning that a six-game losing streak might be awaiting you.

Now ... a few words about the wild card.

And look, there are still a lot of baseball fans who pine for the days when only first-place teams made the postseason. And that was, for the longest time, a calling card that baseball held all to itself. Then they added a wild card in each league. Then another. And another.

It's still rare when a whole season plays itself out with a team qualifying for the playoffs when it spent the first 158 or so games wondering if it would even finish above .500. All these years later, the '73 Mets — who finished 82-79, who as late as the final week were dealing with the possibility of a five-way playoff in the NL East — are still tied for the playoff team with the fewest regular-season wins ever (with the 82-80 '05 Padres).

It's interesting to note that those teams — along with the '06 Cardinals, at 83-79 — were all division winners, all first-place teams. The worst-ever wild-card teams were last year's 84-78 Diamondbacks and Marlins.


Right now, there's the Braves with a comfortable 5 ½-game lead in the wild card. Then there are those nine teams — Cards, Nats, Padres, D'backs, Pirates, Cubs, Giants, Mets and Reds — separated by 1½ games, vying for the last two slots.

Now, is this absurd? Probably. It's also likely that one of those teams will have a coming stretch where they go 20-5 and probably sneak securely into the second wild card. But those teams are all awfully similar to each other, too, and not just the records. This *could* be a crazy inching to the finish line, if not eight teams then surely five.

Is that absurd? Maybe. But if you happen to root for the team that does squeeze in at, say, 81-81, will you think it's so absurd?

Unlikely.

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Wait for Dominguez will be 8 more weeks

Jasson Dominguez will not be available to the Yankees for at least two months.

The top outfield prospect is expected to miss "up to eight weeks" with an oblique strain, manager Aaron Boone said Thursday.

"It's a pretty significant strain, so probably up to eight weeks until he's playing in games," Boone said before finishing a series against the Orioles in The Bronx with a 17-5 loss.

Dominguez suffered the injury on a check-swing Saturday at Tri-ple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

The 21-year-old switch hitter had been sidelined to start the year as he recovered from Tommy John surgery to repair the torn UCL that he suffered last September after an impressive eight-game cameo with the Yankees.

Dominguez had played 23 games in the minor leagues this season — 20 of them as part of a rehab assignment before the Yankees reinstated him from the 60-day IL and optioned him to Triple-A last Wednesday. He was batting .356 with a 1.014 OPS, six home runs and three steals.

Though there was no spot for him in the big leagues to get everyday at-bats once he finished his rehab from elbow surgery, Dominguez was set to serve as insurance in case the Yankees had an injury in their outfield or to DH Giancarlo Stanton. Now, Dominguez will be out until August as he recovers from the oblique strain.

Dominguez made the most of

his late-season call-up last year before getting hurt, batting .258 with a .980 OPS and four home runs in eight games.

His latest injury further weakens the Yankees' outfield depth at Triple-A after Everson Pereira recently underwent season-ending internal brace surgery to repair a torn UCL. He and Dominguez are the only two outfielders on the 40-man roster not currently in the big leagues.

Judge returns, homers in loss to 0's

Aaron Judge made it back into the Yankees' lineup Thursday, and his bruised left hand appears to be OK.

Two days after being drilled on the left hand by a 94 mph fastball from Baltimore's Albert Suarez, Judge was in center and batting third for the Yankees in an otherwise ugly 17-5 loss to the Orioles in The Bronx.

Judge said there was still some swelling and soreness "especially on foul balls. When I square it up, it feels good." He looked just fine and was one of the few bright spots on a sultry Thursday afternoon, with a two-run homer and an RBI single, both hit hard.

Those were pretty much the only highlights against Baltimore, who won another series from the Yankees. This one was so bad that Judge, along with Juan Soto, was replaced in the field in the top of the eighth.

With the Yankees trailing by seven runs thanks to the unexpected implosion by Luis Gil, knocked out in the second inning, Judge hit his 27th homer of the season in the bottom of the third, a two-run blast that made it 8-3. The 110 mph shot was a bullet to right-center.

He added a two-out laser RBI single to left that just got under the glove of a diving Austin Hays to drive in Anthony Volpe. That hit went 114 mph.

Prior to the game, Aaron Boone said gave the manager a "thumbs-up" after he underwent treatment and hit in the cage.

Judge left Tuesday's game in the fourth inning, but the Yankees avoided a worst-case scenario when imaging came back negative. He was unavailable for Wednesday's loss in The Bronx, when the Yankees let Jahmai Jones strike out looking to end the game with the tying run on base.

Judge made sure he was on the field Thursday, calling it "a must-win game" against "a division rival."

The Yankees and Judge aren't necessarily out of the woods with this injury just yet, as Boone said he would "probably" keep a close eye on Judge, but also noted, "I watch him pretty closely, anyway. I think we should be in a good spot [with the injury]."

Boone was pleased to be able to put Judge and his MVP-worthy numbers back in the lineup Thursday.

"It's definitely a good feeling," Boone said. "Obviously, the caliber of player he is [and] he's the captain in that room, too. Guys rally around him. And not only him back in the lineup adding length to the lineup so guys are in different spots."

BURNES NO

O's hurler has perfect mentality for big market

RIOLES star Corbin Burnes is from the smallish Central Valley California city of Bakersfield, and he's pitched in two of the smaller markets in baseball — Milwaukee and Baltimore. But he's about to be the biggest pitching free agent (just ahead of Max Fried, another major star), and a big market may just fit his big personality.

One rival says Burnes is known as a "bulldog" and a "great guy."

"bulldog" and a "great guy."

"It doesn't scare me," Burnes told The Post of a big market. "Fan bases in general want to see a guy come in and play hard, and do everything they can to help the team and the city. Whether it's a small market, midsized market or big market, you need to come in and compete every day."

When he was traded to Baltimore, everyone assumed it was a one-and-done situation. However, new owner David Rubenstein was approved only weeks after Burnes was acquired, signaling the end of the Angelos-era penny-pinching.

Nothing's going to happen in summer, though. Burnes doesn't close the door entirely, but he told me "he'd "prefer not to talk" in season.

"I think at this point I would be doing these guys a disservice by taking my focus away from this year and our ultimate goal of winning the World Series," he said.

The Orioles get that, and sources

say they have little intention of trying to sign him while they're still playing. And though Rubenstein puts the sudden powerhouse in better long-term position, they'd surely also like to lock up homegrown superstars Gunnar Henderson, Adley Rutschman and others on their excellent young team.

"I think these guys knew coming in they were going to get one of the better arms in the game, and so I'm going to do everything I can for them this year," Burnes said. "And if it's a one-year thing, then hopefully we win it all. And if it turns into something more, that's great. [But] my focus is coming in every day and doing what I can to help myself and the team."

Burnes shot down rumors of a California preference (he lives in Arizona now) and professed only one preference: "I want to go to a team that's going to compete for the entirety of my contract."

Ultimately, Burnes may actually belong in a big market. His confidence is warranted, and given a chance, it surfaces. He's been typically brilliant this year (8-2, 2.14 ERA), but by design, he's striking out fewer than previously, which was a record pace for a starter. But he says, "If I need to get a strikeout I know I can get it."

Though the Orioles can't be discounted, if he isn't made for New York (or Los Angeles or Chicago), I'm not sure who is.



The Orioles ambushed Gil for seven runs on eight hits, knocking him out of the game before he could record a fifth out and setting the tone for a brutal 17-5 drubbing of the Yankees.

When the bloodbath was finally over, the Yankees (51-26) still led the Orioles (49-25) by a half-game atop the AL East,

but Baltimore has now taken both series between the top two teams in the American League this season.

"It's gonna be back and forth all the way to September, that's for sure," said Aaron Judge, who returned to the lineup after getting hit by a pitch on Tuesday and clubbed his 27th home run of the year. "I think we're looking forward to having those battles back and forth. But what it really ultimately comes down to is us just taking care of ourselves. We go out there and play baseball the way

<u>Birds, not</u>

HE ORIOLES are in second place and yet the Yankees are chasing them.

The standings tell one story, with Baltimore trailing the Yankees by one-half game.

Their head-to-head matchups are more revealing. The Orioles have won five of the seven while clearly looking like the superior team.



They took three of four at Camden Yards seven weeks ago. And without using either of their two best remaining healthy starters — notably ace Corbin Burnes — the Orioles just took two of three in The Bronx. The defending AL East champs have now gone 22 straight series against division foes without losing one — the longest such streak since division play began in 1969. The Yankees are 10-12 within the AL East this year.

Like in Camden, the more athletic Orioles made the Yankees

we're supposed to, clean it up on defense a little bit ... we'll take care of it and be where we want to be."

The Orioles did what no other team has done this year by clobbering Gil, raising his ERA from 2.03 to 2.77 over the course of his 47-pitch outing. The runs and hits surrendered were both careerhighs, while Gil also walked a pair and hit a batter on a day when he simply did not have it. The seven runs Gil allowed were the same amount he gave up across his previous nine starts combined.

"I felt like I let the team down today," Gil, who tossed 6 1/3 scoreless innings against the Orioles on May 1, said through an interpreter. "But we definitely have more games ahead of us and I'm sure we're going to be able to turn the page on this one and improve. I believe in myself and I definitely believe in my teammates.'

By the time Aaron Boone finally put Gil out of his misery with one out in the second inning, the Orioles led 7-0 and still had the bases loaded. Michael Tonkin spared Gil's line from getting any worse, but the Orioles went on to rack up 19 hits overall.

The Yankees' day also included three errors, Gleyber Torres exiting early with groin tightness and the bullpen continuing to show some more cracks. Before catcher Jose Trevino had to pitch the

ninth, five of their six relievers gave up at least one run as the Orioles continued to pile on.

The only bit of good news for the Yankees was Judge returning to the lineup for the first time since Tuesday. His left hand looked just fine when he crushed a two-run shot in the third inning that pulled the Yankees within 8-3. But that was as close as they

would get. In the Yankees' 77th game of the year, it was the first time their starter did not complete at least four innings, snapping the longest

single-season streak in franchise history.

Gil came into Thursday having made nine straight starts in which he threw at least five innings and allowed three or fewer runs, but he did not come anywhere close to that against the Orioles. His first pitch of the day was roped for a double by Gunnar Henderson over the head of Juan Soto, and it only got worse from there.

After limiting the damage to one run in the first inning, he could not stop the bleeding in the second, when the big blow was Ryan Mountcastle's three-run double down the left-field line.

"Not his day," Boone said. "They came out really aggressive to the fastball in that first inning and took it away, got him out of the zone a little bit and then he made some mistakes in the heart of the plate with everything.

In the process, the Orioles improved to 5-2 against the Yankees this season with two more headto-head series to go.

"The first couple series, they've had their way with us," Boone said. "They've had the upper hand. But there is a long way to go in all this. You never like losing, especially in your division and up against a team you're battling neck and neck with. It's also an opportunity to hopefully grow for us."

look plodding and unsettled in winning this rubber match 17-5 the most runs the Yankees have permitted since surrendering 19 to Cleveland on Aug. 15, 2019.

The Yankees have not won any of their last five series against Baltimore dating to last year. And this was their worst defensive series of 2024 (Anthony Volpe excluded), with the continuing freeway when Jose Trevino catches only growing more troubling.

Trevino actually ended up pitching the ninth Thursday for a bullpen that is both a midseason tryout camp and worsening calamity. Tim Hill was signed Thursday morning and gave up a three-run homer to Anthony Santander a few hours later as part of what was a 16-run barrage against Yankee relievers in these three games.

But nothing was quite as disturbing during these three games as Luis Gil's start. Was this a bad outing or the slipper falling off of Cinderella? Gil could not have honored his responsibility better to the Yankees; filling in for the injured Gerrit Cole and for 14 starts pitching like Gerrit Cole — literally until the ace returned Wednesday night. Start No. 15 was a disaster, making

the Summer Solstice longest day in the Northern Hemisphere all the longer for the Yankees. Aaron Boone called this merely a "bump in the road" for Gil after seven runs against four outs. But he conceded that the Yanks are constantly monitoring whether the righty, who basically didn't pitch the past two seasons following Tommy John surgery, is hitting reality or a steel wall.

Gil said like he "felt like he let the team down," but also that he feels stronger than at any time this

Gil had thrown 6 1/3 shutout innings on May 1 to help the Yankees win their lone game at

Camden. But Baltimore fastballs hunted Thursday, early with 11 of 15 hitters swinging at the first strike they saw on a day when Gil had his velocity, but nothing close to command.

Baltimore broke the game

season.

open with a six-run second. Jordan Westburg went down 0-2 to lead off and lashed a single - previously batters had been 1-for-30 on 0-2 counts against Gil.

In all, Baltimore was 4-for-6 with runners in scoring position against Gil, who had held hitters to 5-for-48 in that situation all year. The Orioles scored seven runs against four outs, matching the number of earned runs Gil had allowed in his first seven home starts (and 40 innings) this season. And for the first

time this season, after a franchise record 76 straight games, a Yankee starter failed to go at least four innings, exposing a bullpen that has been generally protected by a rotation covering lots of innings. Aaron Judge, who missed Wednesday's game after being struck by a pitch on his left hand in Tuesday's series opener, hit the two hardest balls

Thursday — a 110.6 mph two-run homer and a 114.2 mph RBI single. Thus, ended the good news for the Yankees. Gleyber Torres homered as well, but also committed his 11th error (second most in the majors) and left the game with what the Yankees termed right groin tightness.

Suddenly — even with Cole back - the Yankees are more battered and bruised, having lost Anthony Rizzo, maybe Torres, two more pitchers to the IL and five of seven games. Don't expect the Orioles to light a candle. They announced during this series that Kyle Bradish was their third starter this year to need elbow surgery and be lost for the season — as is closer Felix Bautista.

The Yankees (51-26), Orioles (49-25) and Phillies (49-25) are tied for the majors' best winning percentage at .662. But Baltimore arrived in The Bronx having taken two of three from Philadelphia. And its mastery of the Yankees persisted. The Orioles have outplayed the Yankees in every way when sharing a field in 2024.

"They are as formidable as there is and the first couple of series they've had with us, they've had the upper hand," Boone said. 'There's a long way to go.'

The race is on, with it feeling like the Yankees are chasing a team that has been behind them all year in the standings.




