



Finance recovery

THE economy's recovery from recession was stronger than previously thought, according to updated data.

The Office for National Statistics revealed UK gross domestic product grew by 0.7% between January and March.

In May, it had estimated growth at 0.6% over the quarter.

Mark Preskett, of Morningstar Wealth, said it was "encouraging and further evidence the UK economy is recovering".

Lab: No tax hike

LABOUR has "no plans" to raise any taxes should it win the election, the shadow Treasury minister said.

Darren Jones, who said the party would raise funds by closing tax loopholes, also slammed the Government for being wasteful with public finances during Covid.

He told GB News: "Procurement rules need to be followed even in a pandemic. It would not have happened under Labour."

Election fake out

A HIGH number of young people have seen fake news about the upcoming election.

Three quarters claim to have been fed misinformation.

And 43% of voters think professional reporting is more important than ever before, rising to 65% among 18 to 24-year-olds.

Jo Allan, CEO of Newsworks, which ran the study, said: "These results show the role quality journalism plays at such an important time for the country."

PM staff bet quiz

THE Gambling Commission spoke to the Prime Minister's chief of staff in connection with bets allegedly placed on the date of the General Election.

Liam Booth-Smith was interviewed by the regulator to clarify who may have known that it was on July 4 before it was announced.

And Scotland Yard is looking into offences such as misconduct in public office with seven Met officers also being investigated.

She gave birth to her fourth child - and her first with rocker hubby Travis Barker - last year.


But The reality star, 45, said: "My priority is not bouncing back and getting my body back in shape like it has been in the past."



QUICK FIX: Exercise

'Snack' to beat obesity


SHORT bursts of exercise lasting just one minute or less could benefit people who are overweight, an expert has said.

The "exercise snacks" could be particularly useful for those who spend a lot of time sitting, such as obese people or those with chronic diseases.

Examples used by Bruno Gualano, at the Centre of Lifestyle Medicine at the University of Sao Paulo, Brazil, include stair climbing or cycling.

The NHS and World Health Organisation recommend 150 minutes per week of moderate exercise or 75 of vigorous exercise.

But Mr Gualano said "many struggle to meet these targets" adding: "To mitigate negative impacts of prolonged sitting, 'exercise snacks' are proposed as a practical alternative."



WEIGH TO GO: John

Fat kids donkey danger

THE owner of a seaside donkey-ride business says he has been forced to weigh children before letting them on the animals due to rising obesity.

John Nuttall, 61, says youngsters are required to step on scales to ensure they do not break the 6st weight limit.

He fears heavier kids might harm his animals, who take holidaymakers on trips across Skegness and Cleethorpes beaches, in Lincolnshire.

A sign says children must be under the age of 10, shorter than 4ft 6in and meet the weight limit - if they want a £4 ride.

John said: "The donkeys are better for it and they're not going to knacker them out. I have done it to protect my animals and I'm sorry if I upset anyone, but that's the rules."

Self-Terminator

SUICIDE PLUNGE OF DEPRESSED CYBORG POSTIE



A DEPRESSED slave robot is feared to have killed itself by leaping down a flight of stairs.

The civil service cyborg - which looked like a white bin with a screen on its side - was designed to deliver documents to residents.

But the bored bot ended its "life" by throwing itself down a stairwell in South Korea. It was found "smashed up" after its fatal fall.

An official for Gumi council, in the south-east of South Korea, said a



probe had been launched. They said the pieces "will be analysed".

Staff said the robot had "helped with document deliveries and delivered information to local residents" - with one pen-pusher adding: "It was one of us. It worked diligently."

It was put into action last year and worked from 9am to 6pm, and was designed to be smart enough to call a lift to move between floors by itself.

HIGH FLYING: Heathrow

Airport's demand surges

HEATHROW has increased the number of passengers it expects to travel through the airport this year to 82.8million - 1.4million more than it predicted in December 2023.

This would be above the current record for annual passengers of 80.9million, set in 2019 before the pandemic.

Some 79.2million travelled through Heathrow's terminals last year.

"Over the first five months of the year, we have seen a strong demand in traffic, with 32.4million passengers travelling through the airport," it said in a market update.

The appetite for foreign holidays has jumped since the start of the year, but prices have also remained high as operators seek to cash in on a post-pandemic spike in demand.



SWOOP: A suspect

Arrests over Oil 'fly plot'

DOZENS of Just Stop Oil supporters suspected of planning to disrupt UK airports this summer have been arrested.

The Metropolitan Police said 27 people were taken into custody, including some believed to be "key organisers" for the climate group.

All the arrests were made under a section of the Public Order Act that makes it illegal to conspire to disrupt national infrastructure.

Arrests were made at Gatwick Airport, as well as an east London community centre hosting a Just Stop Oil event "promoting airport disruption", and at homes across England.

Chief Supt Ian Howells, of the Met Police, said the force took "swift and robust action".

NURSE! JOE'S UP ON STAGE AGAIN!

DODDERY Joe Biden was savaged by orange manbaby Donald Trump in a presidential debate.

"Sleepy" Joe, who would be 86 at the end of a second term, lost the debate within minutes.

The mumbling US President's gaffe-laden performance left Democrat officials urging him to step down. Biden, 81, repeatedly appeared to freeze mid-sentence responding to Trump, 78, in the CNN debate in Atlanta, Georgia.

Trump brutally mocked his rival. He said: "I really don't know what he said there... I don't think he knows what he said either."

The pair also had a bizarre golf spat, with Biden insisting he was "happy to have a driving contest" with Trump as long as he carries his own bag after making jibes about his weight.

Trump's allies immediately declared victory, while high-profile Democratic donor Mark Buell said: "Do we have time to put somebody else in there?" One Democratic strategist said: "Biden needs to drop out."



The finalist in the 2015 Miss Slovakia contest has been producing behind-the-scenes team interviews for social media.


She has almost 200,000 Instagram followers and hopes her online army will cheer on the nation's team.

Although there are a lot of frustrations in life, we should all just take a moment and calm down sometimes.





THE Princess Royal has left hospital where she was treated for minor head injuries and concussion after being struck by a horse.



Chloroform? That's for cleaning fridge



WHAT HOLLY SUSPECT TOLD RAID POLICE

A SECURITY guard accused of plotting to kidnap, rape and murder TV star Holly Willoughby said he bought chloroform to clean a "large stain next to my fridge".

Asked if he planned to use the two bottles of chemicals to "incapacitate anyone", Gavin Plumb replied: "No."

Plumb said he bought a bondage kit, including handcuffs, a blindfold and clamps, hoping to "rekindle" a relationship with an ex-partner.

He said he felt "heartbroken, disgusted and shocked" that his online chats about the alleged plot to snatch telly star Holly, 43, had come out.

Plumb, 37, told Chelmsford Crown Court his "dark" discussions with an undercover cop were "massively regrettable".

But he insisted the alleged plans were "a fantasy" and that his weight had ballooned to 35st, leaving him housebound.

Plumb, from Harlow, Essex, denies soliciting murder and incitement to rape and kidnap. The trial continues.



At war with hunters

RHINOS have been transformed into "walking nuclear weapons" to stop them being hunted into extinction.

Twenty of the beasts on a South African reserve have had radioactive material pumped into their horns, inset, to thwart poachers.



The nuclear horns make them poisonous for human consumption and will set off border detectors at ports and airports to prevent smug-

gling and terrorism. James Larkin, of Johannesburg's Wits University, said: "Every 20 hours in South Africa a rhino dies for its horn. Ultimately, the aim is to try to devalue rhinoceros horn in the eyes of the end users, while at the same time making the horns easier to detect as they are being smuggled across borders."

Dr Natalia Wojcicka, of Imperial College, said the work will help "piece together a timeline of the red planet's geological history and evolution."

'Hiding' denied

A FORMER top Fujitsu engineer denied hiding issues with Horizon during a trial which led to a wrongly convicted pregnant sub-postmaster being jailed.

Gareth Jenkins yesterday told the Post Office inquiry he believes the problems are "down to the way (the) Post Office has behaved".

His evidence was used in prosecutions of many sub-postmasters, including Seema Misra, who was given a 15-month sentence at eight weeks pregnant.

Vets left to suffer

THE majority of veterans are grappling with mental health challenges.

A study of 1,000 former service people found 48% have been diagnosed with a condition such as anxiety, depression or PTSD - and more than half are left without adequate treatment plans.

Dr Simon Erridge, of Curaleaf Clinic, which ran the study, said: "We want to shed light on the mental health struggles within the veteran community."







Life in sights of new scope

WE will find an Earth-like planet that could be home to aliens within our lifetime, a top space boffin claims.

Astrophysicist Jessie Christiansen believes a new Nasa telescope - launching in the 2040s - will finally reveal the truth. Boffins hope the Habitable Worlds Observatory will detect up to 25 Earth-like worlds around sun-like stars.

Dr Christiansen, of California Institute of Technology, US, said: "The bubble of space we've managed to search around our sun is very small compared to the size of the galaxy."

"I believe, in our lifetime, something like HWO will see a signal in the atmos-

phere of a planet in the habitable zone of a star like our sun that we think is life."

But the top boff warns the realisation we aren't alone may rock society, adding: "It might start a revolution in life, religion, philosophy and science."

The Brazilian mystic, 37, claims to have foreseen coronavirus, Elon Musk buying X and the Queen's death.

Salome said a mission by Nasa and the European Space Agency will unveil a discovery "unlike any seen before."

National Highways said the issue started on Sunday and was fixed by Monday lunchtime.





General Sir Roland Walker wants his regiments to be more like the special forces.

The former SAS hero made the pledge in his first public comments since taking up his leadership role this month.

He said: "The only real measurement of an army is

its fighting power - its lethality in the face of very real threats.

"In the near term, my challenge to the British Army is to double that lethality in three years and treble it

by the end of the decade." Sir Roland was an Irish Guards soldier before joining the SAS and fought in Iraq and Afghanistan,

where he survived a Taliban bomb attack. The 54-year-old was awarded the Distinguished Service Order in 2010 for his bravery.

Now he wants to devise new strategies to defeat the enemy without huge investment into expensive hardware, such as extra tanks.

But experts believe the Army would struggle to send a single 6,000-strong brigade to fight overseas for any length of time.







FINDING fame in Sergio Leone's Spaghetti Westerns, the ex-lumberjack played a cigar-chewing anti-hero - The Man with No Name - in films such as The Good, The Bad and The Ugly.

Eastwood keeps the poncho he wore in the Dollars trilogy in a glass case - unwashed!

The star, who later turned down the role of Superman, also played an ageing outlaw in 1992's Unforgiven.

Twice divorced, he has at least eight children by six women. Now 94, he's also been mayor of the Californian town of Carmel - and lobbied for gun control.



JAMES STEWART

A WORLD War Two veteran, who saw combat as a pilot, the star is best known for the Christmas movie It's a Wonderful Life.

But he also appeared in a string of Westerns, often in grittier roles, like a bounty hunter in 1950's Winchester '73.

He also starred in the 1962 epic How the West Was Won.

The star wore the same hat in all his Westerns and said the genre of films "give people a feeling of hope".

Stewart, who died from a heart attack aged 89 in 1997, was big pals with Henry Fonda, himself famous for playing a gunslinging villain in the 1968 movie Once Upon a Time in the West.

PAUL NEWMAN AND ROBERT REDFORD

THE cool 1969 movie Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid saw the pair play the real-life 19th century outlaws. Newman, who also starred as a cowboy in 1963's Hud, played the crafty Butch, while Redford starred as the expert marksman Sundance as they robbed

trains and fled lawmen. While Newman – who died in 2008 aged 83 – did his own cycling stunts, he banned Redford from jumping between train carriages for safety reasons. It didn't stop Redford, now 87, saying the part was his favourite ever role.



JOHN WAYNE

Nicknamed The Duke, after the family dog, he was born Marion Robert Morrison – before Hollywood execs changed it to John Wayne.

Famous for his swagger and slurred dialogue, he appeared in more than 80 Westerns including Stagecoach, True Grit, The Searchers and The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance. Fiery Wayne drove director John Ford to say he “acted like a poached egg and walked like a hippo”.

The three-times-married actor was superstitious about people leaving hats on beds, and never allowed anyone to pass him the salt directly. Smoking five packs of fags a day, he coined the term “The Big C”, dying from lung cancer aged 72, in 1979.



GARY COOPER

RAISED on a ranch in Montana the star rode horses as a kid and was surely destined to play a cowboy.

A car accident as a teenager left him with a trademark limp, but it didn't stop him becoming a stunt man and later an actor in roles like the brave sheriff in Oscar-winning 1952 hit High Noon.

He loved to star in Westerns saying: “You feel real when you make them.”

Off screen the married star had a string of high-profile lovers including Ingrid Bergman, Marlene Dietrich and Carole Lombard. He died aged 60, from cancer, in 1961.




YUL BRYNNER

AS leader of a gang of gunfighters in 1960's The Magnificent Seven, the Russian-born actor starred alongside James Coburn, Charles Bronson and Steve McQueen – who he feuded with over scene-stealing.

The bald ex-acrobat studied how to quick-draw a gun and not blink when firing for the role.

He also wore silver-metallic contact lenses for his steely glare as a crazed cowboy robot in 1973's Westworld.



I don't think our kids will ever forget the bizarre Bastille Day celebrations they got to be a part of last summer in the tiny village of Berny-Rivière in the Hauts-de-France region in northern France.

HE struggled to hold down a Hull KR spot last year yet stunned Sam Wood is now preparing for his England debut.

"That's probably where it comes from that I never expected a call - I've never been in the England system.

"But now I want to do my family proud for the sacrifices they've made and my friends and family back home. I'll enjoy it and hopefully round off a good week."

Wood's former Robins team-mate Elliot Minchella and ex-Huddersfield colleague Oliver Wilson also set to debut along with Wigan hooker Brad O'Neill.



SINFIELD OPENS UP ON TRAGIC PAL BURROW

It was just brilliant to see Rob's big grin one last time

KEVIN SINFIELD revealed the last time he saw his old teammate Rob Burrow he was welcomed with a wide grin just days before his best friend passed away this month.

The England assistant coach, who will make a flying visit to the UK to attend Burrow's funeral next Sunday, admitted he had struggled following his old Leeds Rhinos colleague's death from motor neurone disease.

In a frank interview in Auckland, Sinfield revealed he has missed several tributes to Burrow at sporting occasions but the day after his death, he was at a site in Leeds where an MND hospital in Burrow's name is being built.

Sinfield went straight into camp, before heading to Japan and then down to New Zealand where the England party, led by head coach Steve Borthwick,

wrapped their arms around him. "That weekend was tough," said Sinfield. "I got to see him on the Thursday before he passed.

"We had broken from camp and I knew he was poorly but I walked in to see him and I got a big smile off him, which was brilliant."

"Rob passed on a Sunday afternoon and on Monday we were in camp before we came out to Japan. At that point you want to be with family and friends."

"On Monday morning, before I travelled down to Pennyhill, I was at the site where the Rob Burrow MND Centre is going to be. They put the first spade in

the ground, and his mum and dad were there and his sisters.

"There are a lot of things I have missed over the last few weeks. We were at the Premiership final, where they did a wonderful job with the tribute to Rob, and the FA did a wonderful job earlier that week."

"Then the Challenge Cup final goes ahead and there was a big tribute. Again the response and love and respect from everyone across the UK for Rob has been wonderful and great to see."

"There was a big tribute last week at the Rhinos game, there was an MND round in Super League. There are some bits I would like to have been there to witness." Sinfield will fly home next

Friday for the July 7 service in Pontefract and will miss the first Test against the All Blacks in Dunedin.

After two days in the UK, he will then jet back to New Zealand ahead of the second international in Auckland.

Borthwick has given his blessing to him missing a part of the tour ahead of the crunch game.

Sinfield said: "I'll be back out here getting ready for the second Test. Steve has been wonderfully supportive of that. He completely understands and I couldn't have asked for any more."

"Apart from being at home with family this is probably the best place for me to be. Rob would want me to be here and be part of this."

STOKES: NO IFS ABOUT BUTTS

JOS BUTTLER has been backed by Ben Stokes to stay on as England's white-ball captain.

England suffered a 68-run defeat by India in Thursday's World T20 semi-final to lose their grip on the crown. It was a second disappointment coming on the back of England's failure to reach the last four of the 50-over World Cup in November.

But England Test captain Stokes told the BBC: "Jos is the man to lead that white-ball team forward."

"He is a great leader. He's got

the respect of all the team members in the dressing room."

Stokes is convinced the nation's white ball teams are heading in the right direction under head coach Matthew Mott and Buttler (pictured with Stokes, inset).

He said: "That's what it's all about. Being part of sport is about growing and progressing your sides."

"That's just like what we're trying to do in the Test team."

"It's all about progressing

and trying to become better and better. It's not shabby to say that you got through to a World Cup semi-final.

Cav on his Merckx to be greatest stage winner

SIR MARK CAVENDISH will take aim at immortality on his Tour de France encore in Florence today – on a mission to prove you're never too old for fairytales.

At 39, the Manx missile has high hopes of crossing the line first for the 35th time, which would take him clear of Belgian legend Eddy Merckx (inset) as the Tour's greatest-ever stage winner.

And if the first-ever knight of the peloton tastes glory in the 111th edition of the world's greatest bike race, he will be untouchable as Britain's greatest cyclist.

Cavendish was inches away in Le Tour's record books last year until he was caught on the line in Bordeaux – cursing a cruel gear malfunction and slipping chain – by Jasper Philipsen.

Just 24 hours later his pursuit of greatness was over as he crashed out with a broken collarbone and feared his last chance of overhauling Merckx had disappeared.

But with at least five sprint finishes on this year's route, which ends in Nice on July 21 as Paris will be heavily-fortified ahead of the Olympics, he only needs one lead-out to go like clockwork for the credits to roll. Yes, it

■ by MIKE WALTERS would take a near-miracle for a sprinter to win a stage just 10 months shy of his 40th birthday.

He has won only two races this year – in Hungary and Colombia – among 164 career wins. But with Cav, knighted in the King's Birthday Honours this month, you never say never.

He cherishes his place as the most revered sprinter in the race's pantheon, telling Eurosport: "Everything about the Tour is amazing. It's been my life, my career."

"I'm so lucky to be in this exclusive club of Tour de France stage winners, but for every day I've raced in it, I've won one in every six of them."

"I've always said that winning one stage of the Tour makes a rider's career, and I'm fortunate enough to have felt that emotion 34 times. It's just different to everything else."

After his near-miss with glory on the Champs-Elysees three years ago, when Wout van Aert denied him in the finale, and Philipsen's heist in Bordeaux 12 months ago, Cavendish will be fortified by a huge groundswell of goodwill.

And knowing Sir Cav, he won't settle for just a knighthood.

LEWIS IS BACK OF THE PACK

Hamilton needs sprint finish after quali blow

LEWIS HAMILTON bemoaned a "disastrous" session which saw him qualify two places behind team-mate George Russell for today's Sprint.

Mercedes are on the up and had a driver on the podium at each of the last two events. They want to make it a hat-trick of top-three finishes in Spielberg tomorrow but have a Sprint race to negotiate first.

Hamilton will start that from sixth place and cut a frustrated figure as he reflected on a messy qualifying.

He said: "I wasn't in the mix at all, our whole session was pretty disastrous from our side."

"What can I say? Practice was good and the car generally felt good, but I don't think we had the pace to get pole. But, yeah, very bad laps, every single one of them."

The seven-time F1 champion wrote off his chances of a significant points haul from the Sprint and is instead eyeing a better starting slot for the main event.

He added: "I don't think overtaking is mega here, but we'll do our best."

"It's usually not such an eventful race, so I think the focus will be mostly on getting a better qualifying."

Russell (*inset*) was much happier with his day and is more confident he can make progress, having gone slower only than pole-sitter Max Verstappen and the two McLaren drivers.

And the Brit thinks his result is yet more evidence Mercedes are capable of competing with the top teams again.

Russell said: "P4 is still a great place

to be for tomorrow. We're definitely fighting for the podium in the Sprint.

"Obviously, eyes are on the main race, but it's validation again that we're in this mix now, probably ahead of Ferrari at the moment."

"McLaren still seem to be a smidge ahead, but it's nice to be at the front end."

Boss Toto Wolff was slightly disappointed with the team's results and admitted: "We thought we could play for pole but Verstappen was much too quick."

McLaren have been the main rivals to Red Bull in recent weeks and will have both their cars in Verstappen's rear view mirrors at the start of the Sprint.

Lando Norris will join the Dutchman on the front row and, though slightly disappointed, declared himself in a "good position" to fight for victory.

Team-mate Oscar Piastri thinks he too is in the fight for the Sprint win after a disappointing race in Spain a week ago. The Aussie said: "After a bit of a rough one last weekend, it feels we're on the pace."

"The gap to Max is not massive. We're in the mix."

Charles Leclerc had to settle for 10th on the Sprint grid after an issue in the pit lane meant he did not reach the start line in time to record a lap in SQ3.

Surely he realises that the questions will keep coming until he says he's definitely going nowhere?

The Frenchman (*right*) is a very good driver but he has had problems with most of his F1 team-mates so far.

Raducanu ready for GRINbledon

HAPPY Emma Raducanu wants to show the world she is in a "good place" when she makes her return to Wimbledon.

And the 2021 US Open winner revealed she is finally able to see her teenage triumph in New York as just "insane", instead of looking at it in a negative light.

Raducanu, now 21, has been drawn against Russian No.22 seed Ekaterina Alexandrova in the first round at SW19.

The world No.168 missed last year's Championships after undergoing wrist and ankle surgeries.

That was just a part of her struggles during her introduction to life on the WTA Tour, which has been dogged by injuries, loss of form and splits with coaches.

And she attracted further controversy by deciding not to enter qualifying for the French Open or play at the Olympics. At times over the last three years, she has looked a tortured soul. Not any more.

After three years in the public spotlight - since reaching the fourth round here - she has found herself in a good place in recent weeks.

And she admitted she can't wait to return to Wimbledon.

She said: "I'm just happy to play because I feel like before I would look at the US Open in more of a negative light whereas now I'm like, 'Okay, that was insane.'

"I just maybe lost a little sense of who I was playing for, what I was doing. I'd say I'm just owning it more like, 'I did that. I did the US Open.'

"It shouldn't be a bad or negative thing. I think now it's just like, 'Okay, I'm that girl who did that so I should just own it' and that's what I'm doing."

Before playing in Eastbourne this week, Raducanu said she had "rekindled" her love

for tennis. Now she will bring her new, upbeat outlook to the All England Club and wants to share the feel-good factor with her fans.

"I just really want them to see that I'm putting my personality on the court, my character, being bubbly, happy, energetic," she said.

"You can really tell the difference, especially with me, when I'm in a good place compared to when I'm struggling with confidence or something. Now I want them to see I'm happy."

Her on-court positivity comes from off-court stability. She is working with childhood coach Nick Cavaday, while mentor Jane O'Donoghue was in Nottingham and Eastbourne.

"I'm really happy with my team, my coach," she said. "It's nice to have someone who I've known since I was a kid."



But they also need to remember it's the British Broadcasting Corporation. Along with ITV, it's a service that's beamed into living rooms across the United Kingdom and not just England.

There will be plenty of Scots, Welsh and Northern Irish tuning in to enjoy England struggling. They don't



GORDON KEEN FOR START CALL

ANTHONY GORDON was not at the back of the queue when they were handing out confidence pills.

In fact, there is no-one in the Three Lions camp more bullish than the Newcastle United attacker when it comes to talking up his own strengths.

And in the countdown to the clash with Slovakia, Gordon set out - in no uncertain terms - his case for a starting spot in Gareth Southgate's line-up.

He said: "I am very direct, I'm quick. I know I am a nightmare for anyone that I play against."

"I'm positive. Every time I get the ball, I always try to make something happen. I'm not a very safe player, I am always going for it. I am always trying to put people on the back foot."

Gordon says that with the likes of Harry Kane (right) often capable of dropping deep, he adds a differ-

ent element to the team. "I know how hard I am to play against, I can feel it," he said. "I know people don't like playing against me."

"It's worked for me how I'm doing it. I have zero doubts when it comes to playing football."

Come on Anthony, don't be so hard on yourself.

But seriously, Gordon's infectious self-belief suggests he might just be the sort of fearless player that could swing a crucial phase of a game England's way.

"A lot of people have used 'frustration' about my minutes but that's the wrong word," Gordon went on. "It's more of a want, a want to play, a want to perform on the biggest stage."

"That just comes from my self-belief. I feel like I can impact any game in a positive way."

Even though there is a growing number of pundits and fans who believe Gordon should start the last-16 match in Gelsenkirchen tomorrow, the 23-year-old is likely to have to make that impact from the bench.

But whatever his role, Gordon has reminded his team-mates that there are no more

excuses. He said: "We're into the knockout stages so there is no more 'next game, next game'."

"Now we really have to step it up and be the team we can be. That's on us, we're the ones on the pitch."

"We're the ones who can make an impact and change things. As players you've got to take responsibility and accountability."

That Gordon came out and gave chapter and verse about his calamitous cycling incident to the media gives an indication of his self-confidence and he is delighted that there are calls for him to be playing tomorrow.

He added: "Six months ago it would have been crazy because the opinion of me then compared to now is very different. I've worked hard to be in this position so I want people to be calling for me."

When Gordon is not crashing his bike at the England camp, he is immersing himself in 'The Art of Winning' by All Blacks legend Dan Carter.

Gordon said: "There is a quote he uses in the book. Pressure is a privilege."

"It is... it means people expect things from you, which, in turn, means they think you're good at what you do."

His first memories of watching the Three Lions in a major tournament were of the infamous defeat to Germany in the 2010 World Cup.

When Frank Lampard's shot hit the underside of the bar and crossed the line – but was somehow disallowed as England lost 4-1 and crashed out.

But if Palmer thought that was bad, even worse was to come.

Four years later he travelled to Brazil to spend time with his grandad and watch some of the 2014 World Cup.

But England had gone out of the tournament before he got off the plane in Rio.

He said: "The one when Lampard hit the bar. That's the only thing I remember about that tournament.

"Then I went to Brazil for the World Cup. My grandad Gary lives in Brazil.

"By the time I got there, England had already been knocked out! But it was great. I went to watch Belgium versus Russia.

"It was in the Maracana. My grandad lived in Rio. He's got an apartment out there."

Thankfully, Palmer's status as a jinxed England supporter doesn't extend to him being the same now he's an actual Three Lions player.

Having turned his back on the great Pep Guardiola to join Chelsea from Manchester City, the wing wonder has established himself as one of the greatest young talents in English football.

His sensational form towards the end of last season made him an automatic choice for Gareth Southgate's Euro 2024 squad.

And following three games of huge disappointment, the clamour for

Palmer to start against Slovakia in the knockout stages tomorrow is now huge.

The midfielder is aware of it but admits that with players like Bukayo Saka, Phil Foden and Jude Bellingham available in his position, it's understandable that Southgate has left him warming the bench.

He said: "Ask any player who's sat on the bench and they think 'get me on'. It's just normal to want to go on the pitch.

"But it's not up to me. You can see on social media what fans think. There's loads of different teams people want to play, so it's normal."

Palmer, 22, impressed so much in his early years that City boss Guardiola spent two years trying to persuade him not to leave the Etihad.

But the Spaniard's loss has been Chelsea and England's gain, although Palmer said it was the toughest decision he's ever had to make.

He added: "I didn't know what to do, to be honest. I was thinking for a good week if I should leave or not but I just didn't want to be in the same position as I was the past two years. Being a bit-part player.

"He did speak to me and he did say that players were leaving and 'you will get your opportunity'.

"But I felt like I was at a stage where I needed to play.

"I would come on for 20 minutes and then not play for five games. And then come on for five minutes.

"I couldn't get any rhythm, so that's why I left."



TIME TO OPEN UP AND GOAL FOR IT, GARETH

WES BROWN has urged Gareth Southgate to take the shackles off in a bid to guide England to glory.

The Three Lions have scored just twice so far at Euro 2024 despite their group not posing too many major hurdles.

A front four of Jude Bellingham, Phil Foden, Harry Kane (inset) and Bukayo Saka has failed to gel properly and there are calls for attacking changes to be made against Slovakia tomorrow.

If England are to reach a second successive European Championship final, former defender Brown believes Southgate has to be less pragmatic.

Speaking on the latest episode of our podcast Euro Thrash, which you can find on Apple, Spotify and YouTube, Brown said: "With the team we've got, we've not scored many goals.

"Looking at the group, I

went into this tournament thinking about who's going to be top goalscorer in our team.

"We had a strategy coming into the tournament to get us where we are. In the next few games, you might see changes or a bit more positive play.

"It's been a bit side to side and let's keep the ball, let's not panic, let's not get counter-attacked. It's been a bit calculated."

Brown feels Foden (right) should have a different role after struggling out on the left.

"Phil for me is still one of our outstanding players who we need," he added.

"It worked a little bit better what him and Jude were doing in the last game where they were swapping sides, Jude going out to the left. But I still think Phil's our best player in that hole.

"We've got changes there who have made an impact that have come on."

GERMANY have been going to great lengths to deal with a mosquito invasion at their Bavarian base, but Julian Nagelsmann is confident Denmark won't clip their wings tonight.

The German boss and several of his players have been quizzed all week on the outbreak at their Adidas-built Home Ground camp, with Nagelsmann even calling it "an abnormal plague" as players and staff were bitten.

Cocoa fumes have now been used to deal with the problem, but some players have complained about the smell.

Nagelsmann insists his men remain laser focused on delivering a victory at their home tournament though, with excitement growing in Germany over the squad's potential.

"It doesn't matter if you're the hosts or not, the expectation of our fans is always the same," he said. "They always want to see a successful team.

"It's a big support and really good feeling when we see all the pictures out in the streets, with our fans supporting us and celebrating the games.


"And we want to help produce more pictures for them. It's an additional push for our team."

The hot topic among those fans has been Nagelsmann's preference for Kai Havertz as his No.9 over Niclas Fullkrug.

Late bloomer Fullkrug, 31, has a remarkable international record of 13 goals from his 19 caps with many of those – including his strikes against Scotland and Switzerland at this tournament – coming from the bench.

A fan poll run by German publication Bild showed 90 per cent of 138,000 responders wanted to see the popular Fullkrug start over Havertz, but Nagelsmann gave short shrift to questions over his preference to face Denmark.

"I've not followed the discussion," he said. "We decided who will play, no one



else. There are always discussions about everyone. I don't read anything, I have enough things to do. We have enough expertise on our staff so we don't need to follow the discussions."

One player who does seem certain to

feature is Antonio Rudiger, with the Real Madrid defender returning to training yesterday after picking up a hamstring issue.

"He's very important," said Nagelsmann. "Our medical staff have been trying everything this week to get him fit again, and in training he looked good. We'll see what happens overnight in terms of muscle issues. We have to wait and see what will happen, but at the moment he looks like being fit again so we're happy to have him back."

"If nothing special happens (overnight) he could play."

Nagelsmann also feels Germany's

tests becoming harder throughout the tournament is a good thing.

His side started their group stage with a 5-1 win over Scotland before beating Hungary and drawing with Switzerland.

"We started with an easier game than we expected, then a more complicated game against Hungary, who were brilliant, then a third game against the Swiss, which was difficult, but we got a late equaliser," he said.

"So in the end we had to deal with different things in the group stage so we are well prepared for the knockout stage."



ERIKSEN HAS STOMACH FOR FIGHT

 AN unwell Christian Eriksen faced a lonely drive to Dortmund but Denmark boss Kasper Hjulmand is confident his star man will have recovered from illness in time to face Germany.

The Manchester United midfielder was quarantined from his team-mates at Denmark's training base after complaining of stomach issues, with midfielder Thomas Delaney also under the weather.

Denmark kept Eriksen (above) away from the rest of the team as they prepared for tonight's clash, but Hjulmand says he should be fit to feature.

"Christian had some stomach issues, and it was the same thing we had with Thomas Delaney," said the Danish boss on Friday.

"So to make sure that it doesn't develop we told him not to join the training session.

Thankfully he feels better, so it's going better than it did with Delaney. We hope he'll be ready for the game, but we always have a Plan B for every player.

"We think he's ready. He's in his own car on the way here because we didn't want to mix him with the other players but we expect him to be ready."

Hjulmand (inset) said he expected Eriksen to come out of isolation and link up with the rest of the squad last night, adding that he wasn't concerned that both he and Delaney had fallen ill at the same time.

Denmark will be huge underdogs against the tournament hosts, who will be backed by the vast number of fans in Dortmund at an estimated ratio of 10 to 1, something which has irked some in the Danish media. "Of course the atmosphere will be like an away game," admitted Hjulmand.

"But we are ready, and we're so glad for the people who are coming. They will do their very best to be loud and support us, and we'll be ready."

"We know we have to honour comparisons with our predecessors in 2006 when we brought home the trophy.

"That was a special moment in Italian history and we hope to show our best."

Italy celebrated World Cup glory in Berlin as they beat France 5-3 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in the final.

As defending champions here, they would have been eliminated if it had not been for Mattia Zaccagni's fire-cracker in the 98th

minute that broke Croatian hearts. Now Spalletti believes his troops can brush their Group B struggles to one side and kick on in their ambitious quest to retain the trophy.

He said: "We were really keen to get out of the group. The players probably struggled with that, but we've done it.

"Now I expect them to be more relaxed because you don't have to think about permutations, everything is in your hands completely."

The match is being billed as the battle of the goalkeepers as Gianluigi Donnarumma battles to outwit Yann Sommer

between the Swiss sticks. The Italian keeper, who saved Luka Modric's penalty in the 1-1 draw with Croatia in Leipzig, said of his opposite number: "I know

Sommer well, he had a wonderful season. I'm in touch with Gianluca Spinelli, his Inter goalkeeping coach, I'd like to congratulate him on winning the Scudetto.

"We need to make sure we do a great job against him because it won't be easy at all. I really admire what he has achieved so far but I hope he does a lot less tomorrow."


Paris Saint-Germain No.1 Donnarumma wants his team to learn from their mistakes against Croatia after they were let off the hook. Now there is no longer any margin for error.

He said: "A lot of people wrote us off and said it was the group of death. It wasn't easy and we were well aware of that.

Record-breaking group stages proved if you're good enough you're old (or young) enough

IT started with a thrashing in Munich and climaxed with a fairy tale in Gelsenkirchen.

Thirteen straight group-stage days served up 36 matches and 81 goals, spawned a new Spanish superstar and even proved VAR can deliver offside decisions that do not require long stoppages.

From the hosts battering Scotland in the opener to Georgia's enthralling conquering of Portugal three days ago, Euro 2024 has already given us plenty to enjoy.

It has also produced a slew of records to be digested as we head into the business end of the show, where 15 games over 16 days will see the 17th crowning of the European champions in Berlin on July 14.

Some records were staggering. Portugal fielded two old-stagers whose combined age was 80, while neighbours Spain loosened the restraints on one player so young that there are not many countries in Europe where drinking or driving are an option for him.

Pepe still anchors Portugal's defence and, when he stepped on the pitch against the Czech Republic,

he became the oldest Euros combatant at 41 years and 113 days.

He then beat his own record against Turkey four days later.

Team-mate Cristiano Ronaldo, 39, is a young pup by comparison but he has also been on the record trail, even though he has yet to score in this tournament, becoming the only player to play in half-a-dozen Euros.

"I'm proud to be the first player to play in six," he said. "I'm thrilled about it as it shows the longevity of my career."

Luka Modric appeared in his fifth tournament and, before Croatia were eliminated, he managed to slip into the record books by becoming the oldest goalscorer at 38 years and 289 days.

Doubtless Ronaldo will be busting a gut to seize that record during the knockout phase.

At the other end of the scale came the future of Spanish football in the shape of the lively Lamine Yamal, the youngest debutant in Euros history at 16 years and 338 days. And, boy, did he make an impact.

The Barcelona winger delighted fans around the world with his boundless enthusiasm and desire to take on defenders. He has been a joy to watch and impressed his manager

Luis de la Fuente, who said: "He just keeps breaking records. He needs to keep growing and I'm sure one day he'll be one of the best."

Yamal's 17th birthday is the day before the final and Spain are in the mix. What a celebration he could have that weekend.

The tournament has also seen the youngest coach of all time in Germany's Julian Nagelsmann, 36, and youngest captain in Dominik Szoboszlai, 23, of Hungary.

Jude Bellingham, who will hope to show his Real Madrid form to guide England to glory, got in on the act as he became the youngest player to have played in two Euros.

One record that might stand for a while is the fastest goal, by Albania's Nedim Bajrami (left) after he pounced on Federico Dimarco's poor throw to hit an unstoppable shot past Italy goalkeeper Gianluigi Donnarumma after 23 seconds.

By the time we reach the final there may be other records, and Germany will be hoping to have set landmarks on the first and last days.

The hosts became the first team since 1960 to score five in the opener and also produced the biggest margin in that fixture (5-1).

If they go on to triumph in Berlin, they will become the first nation to win four titles at the Euros.

TURKEY were nicknamed the Terminators at Euro 2008. Why? Because they just kept coming back.

They arrived at the semi-final stage to take on Germany having been ahead in all of their previous games for a total of just two minutes.

Yet here they were with a chance of downing the three-time winners.

But they were in pieces – four suspensions and a load of injuries meant their hopes were low of another upset.

The Crescent Stars scraped out of their group and beat Croatia on penalties after forcing the shoot-out with a last-gasp goal.

But surely this was a step too far? "Nothing is impossible," said Turkey coach Fatih Terim. "It only takes time."

But this time it was not on their side. Turkey got off to a flying start, hitting the crossbar early on through Londoner Colin Kazim-Richards.

Then Ugur Boral fired them in front. They led for four minutes – the longest they had been in front in the tournament.

But Bastian Schweinsteiger equalised for the favourites before Miroslav Klose looked to have won it for Germany with 11 minutes remaining. The problem was that nobody told Turkey and they refused to down tools.

They levelled in the 86th minute through Semih Senturk. Surely not another comeback?

There was time for one more goal, but Philipp Lahm got it, the full-back firing home for Joachim Low's side in the 90th minute.

It was an heroic effort from Turkey, who may have deserved to sneak through in a classic encounter in Basel.

Defender Gokhan Zan summed it up, saying: "We didn't deserve to lose. We had more possession and more shots on goal, but it wasn't much help.

"On one hand we're happy and, on the other, sad; happy because for the first time we made the semi-final, sad because we lost when we played so well."

Even German chancellor Angela Merkel was gasping for air after the game. She said: "I really must say I often had to catch my breath. I heartily congratulate our team."

Germany progressed to the final where they met Spain but they would come up short in Vienna as Fernando Torres's goal denied Low's side.

BOASTING a record of 2-2 on the sand dunes, it's a cute move by William Haggas to run **WILTSHIRE (1.35)** in the Jenningsbet Handicap over six furlongs at Newcastle.

A winner off a perch of 93 at Newbury in April, he can take this off a higher ledge of 95. Snap up the 11-2 with William Hill who are paying four places.

Karl Burke runs two in the Group Three Jenningsbet Chipchase Stakes run over six furlongs at Newcastle, so the fact Clifford Lee has chosen **SPYCATCHER (2.04)** is good enough for me to back the beast.

The six-year-old was successful in this grade at Deauville in July and was third at Ascot in Group One company in October, so he has the best form on offer.

In the Listed Maureen Brittain Memorial Empress Fillies' Stakes run over six furlongs at Newmarket, I'm going to steam into **ARABIAN DUSK (2.15)** at 4-1 each-way.

Simon Crisford's youngster was as green as a Kent cabbage on her racecourse bow when second at Doncaster 28 days ago, where the form has been franked by the fourth, Alice Fairfax, who obliged at Thirsk next time out. Highly regarded by her trainer, she has come on the proverbial ton for the experience.

Cathy O'Leary - who is the sister to banned trainer Tony Martin - sends two horses from County Meath to contest the Jenningsbet Northumberland Vase run over two miles at Newcastle.

ALPHONSE LE GRANDE (2.35) bolted up at Chester in May and a 8lb hike in the weights may not be enough to stop him following up under the excellent Hollie Doyle.

Charlie Appleby has snared the last two runnings of the JCB Fred Archer Stakes - the

great jockey was alive when England last won a football tournament - run over a mile and a half at Newmarket, and he can complete his hat-trick with **KING OF CONQUEST (2.50)**.

This creature obliged at Goodwood 20 days ago over today's trip and, rated 113, he has 4lb and upwards in hand of his five rivals according to the handicapper - 13-8 looks a gift.

Earlier this week Ian Williams sent out two winners from three runners, so I'm backing **ZEALANDIA (3.10)** each-way six places with William Hill at 20-1 in the Jenningsbet Northumberland Plate over two miles at Newcastle.

A course and distance winner off a perch of 88 on New Year's Day in a race which has thrown up three subsequent winners, the seven-year-old looks primed to go very close off a rating of 91.

Although he must carry a 3lb penalty for a success at Haydock Park three weeks ago, **TIBER RIVER (3.25)** will take all the beating in the Group Three Plantation Stud Criterion Stakes run over seven furlongs at Newmarket.

Tom Marquand has decided to stay at HQ and ride this improving steed for his boss William Haggas, rather than go to Newcastle.

Mark Knopfler is one of the best things ever to come out of Newcastle - second only to the wonderful Cheryl Cole - so let's hope we are not in Dire Straits after **LOCAL HERO (3.40)** obliges in the Pertemps Network Handicap run over seven furlongs at the Geordie venue.


The progressive three-year-old gets 9lb from his older opponents and looked a horse on an upward curve when scoring off a mark of 85 at Kempton Park 24 days ago.

She showed an impressive turn of foot on her debut and looks ready for this rise in class.

Charlie Appleby has won the last two runnings of the JCB Fred Archer Stakes and can bring up the hat-trick with **KING OF CONQUEST (2.50)**, while old boy **POGO (3.25)** loves Newmarket and is tipped to repeat his 2022 win in the Plantation Stud Criterion Stakes.

FANSHAWE KEEPS IT FRIENDLY

will try to land a €100,000 Irish Derby punt by his owners at the Curragh tomorrow.





ZIP (3.40) is a horse that tends to be well supported at Newcastle, having won here three times before, and in the 7f handicap he has shortened into 7-1 from 10-1.

Away from Newcastle, there's some quality action at the Curragh this weekend. Aidan O'Brien's (inset) JAN BRUEGHEL (2.55) has been smashed into 6-5 from 13-8 in the International Stakes and interestingly there's also been interest in him for the St Leger at 16-1. In tomorrow's Irish Derby, AMBIENTE FRIENDLY (4.05) has been the most popular selection at 6-5 to confirm Epsom form with Los Angeles, who's 7-4 for Coolmore.

Arsenal ace can see off Slovaks



ENGLAND can claim a place in the quarter-finals of Euro 2024 tomorrow but fans could be watching through their fingers - again.

Winning their group has earned them a tie against Slovakia, one of the third-placed teams, but if this tournament has shown us anything it's that there are no easy games.

Just ask Portugal, beaten by a Georgia side that finished a huge nine points behind Scotland in the qualification process.

Surprisingly, England remain favourites at 7-2 with Betfred to lift the trophy - presumably on the strength of their squad rather than the strength of their performances so far. Spain are next up on 9-2 with France third in the betting at 11-2.

In Gelsenkirchen, Gareth Southgate's men will start 11-25 favourites with Coral to beat the Slovaks, who are 9-1 with Betfred to spring a surprise. The draw is 7-2.

But after failing to set the tournament alight in their group games, I can see this being another uphill battle for the Three Lions.

It's certainly unlikely to be a goalfest - only one of the six games so far involving these sides featured more than two goals - Slovakia's 2-1 defeat by Ukraine.

I reckon it could be the same scoreline tomorrow - in favour of England. That would earn punters a payout at odds of 9-1 with bet365.

England desperately need to find their shooting boots after only scoring twice in their opening three games, but facing them in goal will be Newcastle's Martin Dubravka, who will want to make a point against the country where he makes his living.

He could have a busy night, so I'd

take Sky Bet's 5-2 that he makes five or more saves in the match.

Arsenal's Bukayo Saka was unfortunate not to get on the scoresheet against Slovenia, with one strike ruled out for offside.

But he got four goals and three assists in qualification and if he can rediscover that form, he could well be the man to make the breakthrough for England, so back him at 6-1 to get the opening goal or 5-2 to net at any time.

Slovakia have scored all their goals so far in the first half of matches, so I'd take the 3-1 from BetVictor that it's draw/England in the half-time/full-time market.

Finally, the 4-1 offered in Sky Bet's Requestabet markets for Slovakia to score and also earn four or more corners in normal time could well pay dividends.

In the other last-16 matches, I fancy a draw treble in the games between Switzerland and Italy, France and Belgium and Romania's tie with the Netherlands. If all three end level after normal time, it would pay around 40-1.

As for the remaining ties, Spain are no value at 1-6 to beat Georgia so back Austria (5-6) to beat Turkey, 2-5 shots Portugal to sink Slovenia and 4-7 Germany to edge out Denmark. The treble would pay 3-1.

As an outside shot for the tournament winners, it could be worth taking a chance on Austria at a huge 16-1 each-way, with half those odds if they lose the final.

Unfancied teams like Denmark and Greece have triumphed in previous editions and, with neighbours Germany the hosts, Austria are sure to be well supported throughout.

Romania and Austria offer great outsider value

EURO 2024 has reached the last 16 and, while England's struggles and Gareth Southgate's strange selections continue to dominate the headlines, there's plenty of value to be had elsewhere.

For the best of that look no further than Romania (125-1 on the outright) who face the Netherlands in Munich on Tuesday.

Holland are strong

Forty years after the original film hit our screens, *Beverly Hills Cop* is back for a long-awaited fourth instalment – with Eddie Murphy returning as wise-cracking detective Axel Foley.

The Netflix film reunites the original cast in this action comedy romp, with Judge Reinhold playing Billy Rosewood and John Ashton reprising his role as John Taggart.

“It felt like a family reunion,” says John, 76. “It was like we never left.”

Judge adds, “The young crew were excited seeing the three of us together. It was like we’d walked out of their collective childhoods.”

In the film, Axel calls on his former police partners Taggart, who’s now a chief, and Billy, who’s been promoted to lieutenant, to help keep his daughter out of harm’s way. “Eddie wanted to use the first film as a template for the fourth one – he wanted that grittiness again,” Judge says.



John admits that he hadn’t kept in touch with Eddie since the first films. “Our lifestyles are a little different – I live in Colorado and Eddie lives in Beverly Hills. I work and play golf, and he works and then does more work at a

nightclub,” he says. “But when we get on stage, we work together.”


He adds, “Believe it or not, Eddie is pretty quiet off-camera but once they turn that camera on, he lights it up.”

During her visit, she uncovers why, 300 years ago, accusations of witchcraft spread so widely around the town, and why they resulted in such tragic consequences – from 200 accused, 30 people were found

guilty, 19 of whom were executed by hanging (14 women and five men).

Suranne then examines how the same mass hysteria hit US society during efforts to stamp out communism in the 1950s; and how even today, the impact is still being felt, with the phrase “witch hunt” being used by powerful men, such as Donald Trump, to paint themselves as victims.




