Modi to visit Russia and Austria from July 8 to 10

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will pay a visit to Russia from July 8 to 9 to hold the 22nd India-Russia annual summit that will review the entire range of multifaceted ties between the two countries.

It will be Mr Modi's first visit to Russia in nearly five years. His last visit to Russia was in 2019 when he attended an economic conclave in the Far East city of Vladivostok.

The annual summit between the Prime Minister of India and the President of Russia is the highest institutional dialogue mechanism in the strategic partnership between the two countries.

So far, 21 annual summits have taken place alternately in India and Russia. The last summit was held on December 6, 2021 in New Delhi. President Vladimir Putin had visited India to attend the summit.

Jharkhand Mukti Morcha executive president Hemant Soren on Thursday took oath as the 13th chief minister of Jharkhand. He was administered the oath of office and secrecy by governor C.P. Radhakrishnan at the Raj Bhavan in Ranchi, an official said.

Mr Soren's father and JMM supremo Shibhu Soren, his mother Rupri Soren, his wife Kalpana Soren and senior leaders of the JMM-led alliance

resigned as the chief minister on Wednesday. Chamapi Soren, who

AICC executive committee member Ajoy Kumar said Mr Soren will be the face of the INDIA bloc in the Assembly poll in Jharkhand, due to be held later this year. For the BJP, Mr Soren's acquittal has hurt its poll plank of corruption and the party's strategists feel that the JMM and the tribal leader has gained sympathy in the tribal dominated state.

MP HC grants ASI till July 15 to file report on Bhojshala

The Indore bench of the Madhya Pradesh high court on Thursday granted a 10-day extension to the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) to complete the scientific survey of the disputed site of Bhojshala temple-Kamal Maula mosque in Dhar district in the state.

In response to an ASI plea seeking an extension by three-four weeks to submit its survey report, the Indore bench of the Madhya Pradesh high court directed the Central agency to complete the scientific survey of the site by July 15 and submit the report.

In the plea, the ASI contended that the Hyderabad-based National Geophysical Research Institute had sought three weeks to study the huge data collected during the survey. This is the second extension of time given to the ASI by the high court to conduct the scientific survey of the 13th century monument and submit a report.

The high court had earlier set an April 29 deadline for the ASI to submit its report. The deadline was later extended till July 2. More on Page 3

UK votes: Starmer says 'new chapter' lies ahead for Britain

London, July 4: The future of Rishi Sunak as Britain's first Prime Minister of Indian origin and the leader of the Conservative Party — fighting anti-incumbency of 14 years — hangs in the balance as millions of voters cast their ballots in a historic general poll on Thursday.

The British Indian leader and the man who wants his job — Labour leader Keir Starmer were among the early voters from an estimated 46 million registered voters as around 40,000 polling booths opened across the country at 7 am local time.

Mr Sunak and his wife Akshata Murty walked to

their local polling booth in his constituency of Richmond and Northolt in Yorkshire.

A little later, Starmer and wife Victoria were at their polling station in Camden, north London. "Today, Britain can begin a new chapter," Mr Starmer told voters in a statement. More on Page 6

"We cannot afford five more years under the Conservatives. But change will only happen if you vote Labour," he said.

Mr Sunak, meanwhile, took to social media to drive home his message: "Polls are open. It's time to stop the Labour supermajority that would mean higher taxes for the rest of your life."

HC judge recuses from Sharjeel hearing

New Delhi: The Delhi high court judge Amit Sharma recused himself on Thursday from hearing a batch of bail pleas in a UAPA case linked to an alleged larger conspiracy behind the 2020 communal riots here, including that of student activist Sharjeel Imam. The matters were listed before a division bench headed by Justice Prathiba M. Singh after a change in the roster of judges dealing with such cases. "Let these matters be listed before another bench of which one of us, Justice Sharma, is not a member, subject to the orders of the acting chief justice, on July 24," Justice Singh ordered. The other accused persons in the case include RJD youth wing leader and Jamia Millia Islamia student Meeran Haider and alumni association of Jamia Millia Islamia president Shifa-ur-Rehman. Imam, United Against Hate founder Khalid Saifi and several others, including former Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) student Umar Khalid, have been booked 2020 riots in Northeast Delhi that left 53 people dead and more than 700 injured.

Man stabbed multiple times by 2 minors

New Delhi: A 23-year-old man was stabbed multiple times allegedly by two teenagers in Southeast Delhi's Nizamuddin, the police said on Thursday. Victim Sahil, who lives with his parents in the Nizamuddin Basti, was sitting alone at a park when he was attacked on Wednesday night, a police officer said. Both the accused fled from the spot leaving Sahil critically injured, the police said. The victim's family members reached the spot and informed the police. Sahil was admitted to Safdarjung Hospital, where his condition is stated to be critical, the officer said. The police said both the accused have been identified and teams have been formed to nab the duo. During investigations, it was found that the victim was attacked two weeks ago also, the officer added.

30-yr-old man shoots self dead in Rohini

New Delhi: A 30-year-old man allegedly shot himself dead in Rohini on Thursday, the police said. The deceased was identified as Sunil Thakur, a resident of Bareilly in Uttar Pradesh, they said. According to the police, they received a PCR call at around 8.40 am at the KN Katju Marg police station regarding a person dying of a gunshot injury in the Sector 17 area. When the police team reached the spot, they found Thakur lying on the staircase of a building. They rushed him to the hospital, where the doctors declared him dead on arrival. The police said that a suicide note was recovered from the place of the incident.

NOW, AYURVEDA TO KEEP ANIMALS AT ZOO HEALTHY

New Delhi: The authorities at the Delhi Zoo are using ayurvedic methods, including neem oil, turmeric and quicklime, to keep the animals healthy and free from bacterial and viral infections during the rainy season. As the monsoon season sets in, Delhi Zoo is taking innovative steps to ensure the health and safety of its animals by incorporating traditional ayurvedic methods. "The monsoon has entered the capital and we have to take all necessary measures to keep the animals healthy and safe during this season. We will use some Indian home remedies like neem oil, which will help protect the animals from common biting insects, including mosquitoes, biting mites and fleas," Delhi Zoo director Sanjeet Kumar said. Neem oil acts as an herbal disinfectant and fly repellent, said Mr Kumar, turmeric, known for its anti-inflammatory and healing properties, will be used to treat itchy skin conditions, infections and wounds. Heavy rains often lead to waterlogging in certain parts of the zoo which create breeding grounds for mosquitoes. To counter this, quicklime (chuna) will be sprinkled in these areas to prevent mosquito proliferation. — PTI

Platform will have arts, crafts, innovation projects by students

Amid Neet mess, NCERT to recreate Pariksha pe Charcha

Amid Neet row, the NCERT is working on a proposal to recreate 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' in a virtual format via a web platform, which will host Prime Minister Narendra Modi's speeches and allow students to "capture selfies" with him and "share on social media."

The proposed virtual exhibition of the 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' will seek to provide an "immersive experience" to the students, who will be offered the opportunity to showcase their projects on the platform that will also host the speeches made by other Union ministers.

The plan is to draw at least 1 crore online visitors annually.

The NCERT move comes against the backdrop of a raging row over alleged irregularities in competi-

tive examinations with the Opposition raising questions on the credibility of the examination processes in the country.

The Opposition has taken swipes at PM Modi, demanding that he should hold one such interaction on the medical entrance exam Neet issue as well.

Launched in 2018, 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' (PPC) is an annual event in which PM Modi interacts with students, teachers, and parents on ways to tackle exam-related stress.

The NCERT released an expression of interest document this week to identify vendors for developing the virtual exhibition for 'Pariksha Pe Charcha.'

"The aim is to recreate 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' in a virtual format, allowing audiences from across the country to experience the event all through the year from the comfort of their homes.

"The virtual platform will showcase the arts, crafts, and innovation projects undertaken by students, providing inspiration and motivation to others," according to an official document.

"The experience will be an immersive 3D/2D experience, similar to the physical exhibition, offering attendees a unique and engaging virtual environment," it added.

The virtual exhibition will feature an exhibition hall, an auditorium, a selfie zone, a quiz zone, and a leaderboard.

The document said, "A dedicated selfie zone could be there to allow attendees to capture selfies with the Honorable Prime Minister, post them on a selfie wall or download them and share them on social media...The auditorium will feature speeches and addresses from the Prime Minister of India and esteemed ministers, as well as essential sessions and discussions necessary for students."

The seventh edition of PPC saw 2.26 crore registrations and took place in January. The only time it was shifted online was in 2021 due to the Covid pandemic.

It is streamed live across television and social media platforms. Students are selected through an online multiple-choice question competition, themes for which are shared with schools across the country.

HC lauds govt for giving textbooks to schoolkids

New Delhi, July 4: The Delhi high court on Thursday appreciated the Delhi governments education department for completing the exercise of distributing textbooks to students in all government schools. The high court, which had earlier questioned the city authorities over the delay in the distribution of books, was informed by Delhi government counsel Santosh Kumar Tripathi that now the work has been done.

"Very good, it shows that when there is a will, there is a way," a bench of acting Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela said.

The bench said, "This court puts on record its appreciation for the work done by the directorate of education."

The high court closed the proceedings in the petition filed by NGO Social Jurist, represented by advocate Ashok Agarwal and Kumar Utkarsh. — PTI

Govt halts transfers of 5,000 teachers over graft charges

Delhi education minister Atishi has instructed the chief secretary to immediately stop the mandatory transfer of 5,000 teachers who have been teaching in Delhi government schools for more than 10 years, following allegations of corruption in the transfer process.

At a press conference here, Ms Atishi highlighted the detrimental impact of the transfer order on the education system.

"This order is absolutely wrong and anti-education. It undermines the hard work of teachers who have transformed Delhi's government schools over the last 10 years," she said.

A circular was issued by the Directorate of Education (DoE) on June 11, titled "Online requests for transfer of teaching staff of the Directorate of Education," wherein, vide Clause 16, it was directed that all teachers who have served for more than 10 years in the same school shall compulsorily apply for transfer, failing which they will be transferred to

any school by the DoE.

Ms Atishi had ordered on July 1 that no teacher should be transferred solely because he has spent more than 10 years in a particular school.

The minister emphasised the crucial role these teachers play in the lives of their students, particularly those from impoverished backgrounds.

"These children are mostly first-generation learners with no academic support at home. For them, their teachers are their sole academic guides," she said.

The minister also referred to the National Education Policy (NEP), which discourages frequent or large-scale transfers of teachers.

Stability in teacher

placement is essential for maintaining the quality of education, especially for vulnerable student populations, she said.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader also raised serious concerns about "corruption" in the transfer process.

"There are worrying reports that bribes have been taken to stop the transfers. This is extremely concerning as corruption within the education department threatens the future of our children," she said.

The minister called for an immediate investigation into these allegations and strict action against any officials found guilty of accepting bribes.

She reaffirmed the Arvind Kejriwal government's commitment to supporting teachers and improving the education system in the capital.

"We respect our teachers and will not allow any compromise with their rights or the education of our children. It is because of these dedicated teachers that our government schools are now outperforming private schools," she added.

Heavy rains bring deficit down to 3%

Heavy rainfall in Northwest and Northeast India over the past few days has brought down the overall monsoon precipitation deficit in the country from 11 per cent on June 30 to just 3 per cent on Thursday, according to India meteorological department (IMD) data.

The IMD reported that the rainfall deficit in Northwest India has reduced from 33 per cent on June 30 to 14 per cent on Thursday, from 14 per cent to 8 per cent in Central India, and from 13 per cent to 2 per cent in East and Northeast India. South India has recorded surplus rains (13 per cent) in the monsoon season so far.

The Met office stated that 24 per cent of the sub-divisional area of the

country experienced excess to large excess rainfall, 45 per cent received normal rainfall, and 31 per cent experienced deficient rainfall.

The country has gauged 190.6 mm of rainfall against a normal of 196.9 mm since the start of the four-month monsoon season on June 1.

June 26-27," IMD chief Mrutyunjay Mohapatra had said earlier.

The weather department on Thursday said heavy rainfall will continue over Northwest and East India in the next 4-5 days. Extremely heavy rainfall is predicted in Northeast India during this period.

The northeastern states are already grappling with severe floods. Assam's flood situation remains critical with over 16.5 lakh people affected in 29 districts in the second wave of flooding this year.

Experts from the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD), a Nepal-based intergovernmental organisation, have also warned about a difficult monsoon season for the countries in the Hindukush Himalayan region including Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, and Pakistan.

RSS outfit for overhaul of competitive exam system

Expresses concern over Neet-UG paper leak

56 Neet-UG students move SC against any bid to cancel exam

New Delhi, July 4: Amid the backdrop of the Neet-UG paper leak row, the RSS-linked Vidya Bharti on Thursday pitched for changes in the current "pattern" of competitive examinations to prevent the recurrence of such incidents and also put to an end to candidates' dependency on coaching institutes.

Replying to questions at a press conference here, Vidya Bharti Akhil Bhartiya Shiksha Sansthan chairperson D. Ramakrishna Rao expressed "concern" over the alleged Neet-UG paper leak and said the current examination system should be changed to assess the "competence, aptitude, attitude, and intelligence quotient," not just memory of the candidates appearing for various competitive exams.

"There should be reforms in conducting these kinds of exams. Our examination pattern should be summarily transformed along the lines of institutions such as the Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs). The examination system of IITs is fool proof," he told reporters.

The national eligibility cum entrance test-undergraduate (Neet-UG) is conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) for admissions to MBBS, BDS, AYUSH, and other related courses in government and private institutions.

Mr Rao suggested changes should also be brought in the evaluation

A group of 56 successful Gujarat-based Neet-UG candidates have moved the Supreme Court seeking a direction to restrain the Centre and the National Testing Agency from cancelling the controversy-hit entrance test results.

The petitioners have sought a direction from the apex court to the Union education ministry to probe, identify and take strict action against students and others who indulged in unfair practices like paper leak and impersonation in the Neet-UG exam conducted on May 5.

The fresh plea moved by Sidhharth Komal Singla and 55 other students said: "The Hon'ble court

may further direct the respondents (Centre and the NTA) not to re-conduct Neet-UG ... As that would not only be unreasonable and harsh for the honest and hardworking students but also would lead to the infringement of the Right to Education and therefore violative of Article 14 (right to equality) of the Constitution."

The plea also sought a direction to the Centre and the NTA to take appropriate action where any "compromise to the established guidelines for Neet-UG 2024 examinations has been done."

The fresh plea has been filed days before a top court bench headed by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud is slated to hear on July 8 as many as 26 petitions seeking reliefs like re-test.

Over 25% OTs in govt hosps non-functional: Cong's Yadav

New Delhi, July 4: Delhi Congress chief Devender Yadav on Thursday

alleged that out of the 235 operation theatres (OT) in the 28 city government hospitals, 62 are non-functional.

According to a statement, Mr Yadav said that OTs in many Delhi government hospitals are not functioning due to a shortage of staff, such as OT assistants, anaesthetists, technicians etc.

He said this was a matter of grave concern as it puts the lives of patients, who have already waited for several months to get an appointment, at risk because many scheduled operations are either cancelled or postponed.

It was shocking that six out of the 13 existing OTs at Delhi's premier government hospital, Lok Nayak Hospital, were shut down following the hospital management sacking 51 paramedical staff and 170 nurses, Mr Yadav alleged in the statement.

He said that these staff members had rendered selfless service during the Covid-19 pandemic, saving many lives with their dedication and commitment.

No immediate reaction was received from the Delhi government over Mr Yadav's allegations.

'Not much scope for Cong-AAP to ally for Delhi, Haryana polls'

New Delhi, July 4: There does not appear to be much scope for an alliance between the Congress and the AAP for the Assembly polls in Haryana and Delhi but the INDIA bloc will fight elections together in Maharashtra and Jharkhand, AICC general secretary Jairam Ramesh said on Thursday.

Mr Ramesh said there is no one formula the INDIA bloc will follow for state elections. The grouping will fight together in states where Congress leaders and other alliance partners agree to such an understanding, he said.

Asked whether the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) will fight the Assembly polls together going forward, Mr Ramesh said the alliance will do so in Jharkhand and Maharashtra.

"There is no INDIA 'janbandhan' in Punjab. In Haryana, we had given one seat to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in the Lok Sabha polls but I don't think that INDIA janbandhan will be there for Assembly polls. In Delhi, the AAP itself has said that INDIA janbandhan will not be there for Assembly polls," Mr Ramesh said.

The Congress and the AAP had fought the Lok Sabha polls together in Delhi, while they contested separately in Punjab.

Mr Ramesh said, "In the context of West Bengal also, I had said that the

INDIA bloc is for Lok Sabha polls but in states where the circumstances are such that our leaders of the state and leaders of our alliance partners want, the alliance will remain. In Maharashtra, the alliance will be there with Shiv Sena (UBT) and NCP (SCP). In Jharkhand, we have an alliance with the Jharkhand Mukti Morch."

Where the state Congress leaders and the respective alliance parties agree, there will be an alliance, he said, adding there is no one formula on which the alliance will be done for Assembly polls.

Asked specifically as to whether there would be an alliance in Haryana and Delhi, Mr Ramesh said, "There does not appear to be much scope (for alliance) in Delhi and Haryana."

Last month, AAP's Delhi state convener Gopal Rai had said his party's alliance with the Congress was only for the Lok Sabha elections and hinted that the ruling party in the city will go solo in next year's Assembly polls here.

HC: Why SC rejects names for judgeship can't be made public

New Delhi, July 4: The reasons for rejection of recommendations for appointment of high court judges by the Supreme Court collegiums cannot be made public as it will be detrimental to the interests of people concerned and will stifle the appointment process, the Delhi high court has held. The high court made the observation while dismissing an appeal challenging an order which had rejected a petition seeking a direction to the Supreme Court collegiums to provide detailed reasons while refusing to accept recommendations for appointment of high court judges.

The appointment of a judge to the high court or Supreme Court is an integrated, consultative and non-adversarial process which cannot be challenged in a court of law except on the ground of want of consultation with the named constitutional functionaries or lack of any condition of eligibility in case of an appointment or a transfer being made without the recommendation of the Chief Justice of India, it said.

The division bench said the single judge has correctly noted that this court cannot sit in appeal over the subjective satisfaction of the Supreme Court collegiums. — PTI

Infant continues to struggle for life mnth after hosp fire

New Delhi, July 4: Over a month after a fire in the East Delhi children hospital killed seven newborns and injured five, an infant continues to fight for her life with breathing complications and burn injuries. The parents — Rakesh and Karishma — recalled the horrific night and said that they remembered when they were standing outside the hospital balcony to know if their first child was alive.

PARENTS SAID that they are worried about future of their baby and have decided never to tell her about her scars

seven newborns and left five babies injured.

"My daughter is still having breathing issues after the fire incident. However, her burn marks are healing with every passing day. She is still undergoing treatment in Chacha Nehra Bal Chikitsalaya," Rakesh told a news agency.

He said that they are worried about the future

of their baby and have decided never to tell her about her burn scars. But they also want justice for the parents who lost their children in the fire.

"Currently I, along with my wife are giving our entire time in hospital. We both have taken leaves from our work and are focusing on her betterment," he added.

The police had said that during the investigation, they found that the hospital was operating despite the expiry of its license. It did not have qualified doctors nor did they have clearance from the fire department. — PTI

Appear on July 15: B'uru court to BSY

Bengaluru: A Bengaluru court on Thursday issued a summons to former chief minister B S Yediyurappa to appear before it on July 15 in connection with a Pocco Act case filed against him. The criminal investigation department had filed a chargesheet against the BJP leader at a fast-track court for Pocco Act cases on June 27. A day later, the Karnataka high court extended its interim order restraining the CID from arresting Mr Yediyurappa after allowing the prosecution to file objections to the petition filed by him seeking quashing of the FIR against him, and then adjourned a further hearing by two weeks. The CID, probing charges against Mr Yediyurappa of sexually assaulting a minor girl, has alleged in the chargesheet that he and three other accused paid money to the alleged victim and her mother to buy their silence. — PTI

2 kanwariyas from Delhi washed away

Uttarkashi: Two kanwariyas (Shiv devotees) from Delhi were washed away on Thursday when the flooding of a stream along the Gangotri-Gomukh trek damaged the temporary wooden bridge over it. The kanwariyas, named Suraj and Monu, both residents of Delhi, were washed away by the raging waves of the Chirbasa stream as the bridge collapsed when they were crossing it. The spot where the incident happened is about nine km from Gangotri, forest department officials said. The water level of the stream rose suddenly due to the melting of a glacier, they said. Uttarkashi district magistrate Meharban Singh Bisht has asked the deputy director of Gangotri National Park to search for the kanwariyas swept away in the stream. — PTI

Hottest July day in Srinagar in 25 yrs

Srinagar: Heatwave conditions persisted in Kashmir on Thursday with Srinagar recording a maximum temperature of 35.7°C, six notches above normal and the highest in July in 25 years, officials said. The city had recorded a high of 37°C in July 1999. Srinagar was hotter than Delhi (31.7°C). Other parts of the Valley also witnessed scorching temperatures with Qazigund recording a high of 32.8°C and Kupwara 35.2°C, officials said. The Valley has been experiencing rising temperatures and scorching heat over the past few weeks, leading to water shortage in many areas. The health department has issued advisories to deal with the heatwave conditions. The school education department has already announced a 10-day summer vacation for all schools in the Valley from July 8. — PTI

Amritpal can meet family, not allowed to leave Delhi

Being brought to Delhi on parole to take oath as MP

Jailed radical preacher Amritpal Singh, who is being brought to Delhi on parole to take oath as a Lok Sabha member, will be allowed to meet his family but will not be permitted to leave the "territorial jurisdiction" of New Delhi.

The Khalistani sympathiser, who won the Khadoor Sahib Lok Sabha seat in Punjab in the recent parliamentary elections while being lodged in a jail in Assam's Dibrugarh district, is scheduled to take oath on Friday.

Singh will be flown in from Assam to Delhi to take oath and his parole period of four days starts from July 5, sources said on Wednesday.

During his stay in the national capital, neither Singh nor his relatives or family members can make a statement in any form of media, the conditions laid down in his parole order issued by the district mag-

istrate of Punjab's Amritsar from where he was arrested on April 23 last year. The parole order, which mentions 10 conditions, stated that the period of temporary release would include the time taken for the journey from the Central jail in Dibrugarh to New Delhi and back. He will "not enter the territorial jurisdiction of any place other than New Delhi during the period of temporary release", it stated.

"Any of his relatives shall not be permitted to videograph any statement of Singh or circulate any such statement in any electronic form," accord-

ing to the order. He will also "refrain from taking any action or making any statement that is prejudicial to national security", it stated.

On the deployment of security personnel for Singh, the order stated that he will be accompanied by such a number of police personnel as is deemed appropriate by the senior superintendent of police, Amritsar (rural). These personnel will be there with him from the date and time of his temporary release from the jail, and till the time he returns to the prison for the continuation of his period of detention, it stated.

Rajnath & Oz minister talk, Indo-Pacific is main focus

In a post on X, the CM said he has given a petition to the PM covering 12 issues which include setting up of an IIM in

Hyderabad and 24 new Navodaya schools. Mr Reddy also urged Mr Modi to include Telangana in the India semiconductor mission given the interest of several companies in setting up semiconductor fabs in Hyderabad.

Emphasising the need to boost IT infrastructure, Mr Reddy sought the revival of ITIR in Hyderabad to encourage the growth of new IT companies and developers.

The project, initially approved in 2010, has been stalled since 2014. "He requested the immediate sanction of an Indian Institute of Management (IIM) in Hyderabad and said land for the campus is available within the Hyderabad Central University campus," sources said.

State government officials said a request was made to the Union government for the allocation of 2,450 acres of defence land

to the state for infrastructure projects, including elevated corridors on the Hyderabad-Karimnagar and Hyderabad-Nagpur highways (NH-44). The chief minister offered alternative land in Raviryal in exchange.

Highlighting the lower allocation in the initial phase, the chief minister requested the Centre to sanction 2.5 million houses for Telangana in the upcoming phase of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY). He said the state is prepared to align its guidelines with those of PMAY.

During his meeting, the chief minister reiterated the need to fulfil promises made during the state reorganisation and asked for the establishment of a steel plant in Bayyaram in Khammam district and a railway coach factory in Kazipet.

A request was also made for the release of ₹1,800 crores under the Backward Regions Grant Fund for the years 2019-2024.

Andhra CM meets PM in Delhi, seeks financial help

'State grappling with repercussions of unfair bifurcation'

Andhra Pradesh chief minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Thursday met Prime Minister Narendra Modi and sought the Centre's support in overcoming the financial deficit in the state. It is learnt the CM has sought enhanced assistance for Andhra in case the special category status cannot be granted to the state. The Andhra Pradesh chief minister's Delhi visit is seen as crucial for securing the Centre's support for the state's development following its bifurcation in 2014.

"Today, I had a constructive meeting with the Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi Ji, in Delhi to address important matters concerning the welfare and development of Andhra Pradesh. I am confident that under his leadership, our State will re-emerge as a powerhouse among states," he wrote on X.

Mr Naidu, who is on a two-day visit to Delhi, also held talks with Union home minister Amit Shah, minister of road-way transport and high-

way Nitin Gadkari, commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal and agriculture minister Shivraj Singh Chauhan.

While urging for "handholding" of state finances in the short term, the CM sought the Centre's support in the commissioning of the Polavaram National Irrigation Project and for the development of the Duggirajapatnam port. He also asked for comprehensive financial support for the completion of the government complex and trunk infrastructure of the capital city of Amaravati and incentives for industrial development.

In addition, Mr Naidu asked for an additional allocation under the scheme for special assistance to states for capital investment, target-

ing essential sectors such as roads, bridges, irrigation and drinking water projects. He has also sought support for the backward regions of Andhra Pradesh along lines of the Bundelkhand package.

During their meeting, the CM highlighted that Andhra Pradesh continues to grapple with the repercussions of the unscientific, unfair and unjust bifurcation of 2014, a statement from the Andhra government said. He added that the miserable governance of the previous administration, marked by malice, corruption and misgovernance, has dealt a more deleterious blow to the state than bifurcation itself.

Sources said the CM drew the attention of the PM to the current fiscal situation in Andhra Pradesh, saying it has significantly deteriorated due to the previous government's misadventures and the absence of a strategic long-term development plan.

Mr Naidu said that the state exchequer remains severely constrained by lack of financial resources.

Pawar jr hits out at Opp in video msg, lauds Budget

Maharashtra deputy chief minister Ajit Pawar on Thursday released a video message for people claiming that the Opposition is criticising him unfairly. HC directs ASI to submit Bhojshala report by July 15

The Indore bench of the Madhya Pradesh high court on Thursday granted an extension by around two weeks to the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) to complete the scientific survey of the disputed site of Bhojshala temple-Kamal Maula Mosque in Dhar district in the state.

In response to the plea by the ASI seeking an extension by three-four weeks to submit its survey report, the high court directed the Central agency to complete the scientific survey of the site by July 15 and submit the report.

This was the second extension of time given to the ASI by the high court to conduct the scientific survey of the 13th-century monument and submit a report.

The high court had earlier set an April 29 deadline for the ASI to submit its report. The deadline was later extended until July 2.

"The ASI's plea for an extension of time to submit the report on the Bhojshala temple-Kamal Maula Mosque complex came up for hearing on

Thursday. The high court granted an extension to the ASI to submit its report by July 15. "The next date of hearing of the case has been fixed to July 22," the counsel for the Central agency Himansu Joshi told this newspaper.

In its directive to the ASI on March 11 this year, the high court had sought a scientific survey of the Bhojshala temple-Kamal Maula Mosque complex, observing that the nature and character of the mediaeval-era monument needed to be "demystified and freed from the shackles of confusion".

The high court's directive was in response to a petition filed by the Hindu front for justice seeking intervention by the court to hand over the site to Hindus, claiming that it was originally a temple.

The ASI, which was to submit its report on July 2, sought an extension of time by "three-four weeks" to produce the survey report.

Jagannath rath yatra in Ahmedabad July 7

Ahmedabad: The 147th edition of the annual Rath Yatra of Lord Jagannath will take place on July 7 in Ahmedabad where more than 22,000 security personnel will guard the event which draws lakhs of devotees, an official said on Thursday. Extra care will be taken to manage the crowd in view of the recent stampede in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras where more than 100 persons were killed, Ahmedabad commissioner of police G.S. Malik said at a press conference here after holding a review meeting with nearly 600 police officers. This time, police will use face detection cameras to identify criminals by matching people's faces in crowds with the database, he said. The Ahmedabad police will also deploy 20 drones and some balloon-mounted cameras to keep a watch on the people's movement, the official said. — PTI

Chinese military build-up in the Ladakh sector four years ago at the LAC, the de-facto border between the two sides, in violation of Sino-Indian pacts that led to the deadly clash between troops of both sides in the Galwan valley in mid-June of 2020. The Chinese troops have yet to withdraw from some of the friction points in the Ladakh sector, despite numerous rounds of talks at the diplomatic and military levels between the two Asian giants. New Delhi has already made it clear to Beijing that ties between India and China cannot be normal until the Chinese troops pull back and the status quo that existed in the spring of 2020 is restored. In a statement, the ministry of external affairs said, "The two ministers had an in-depth exchange of views on finding an early resolution of the remaining issues along the LAC in eastern Ladakh to stabilise and rebuild bilateral relations... Mr Jaishankar highlighted the need to redouble efforts to achieve complete disengagement from the remaining areas in eastern Ladakh and restore border peace and tranquillity in order to remove obstacles towards the return of normalcy in bilateral relations..." The foreign ministry added: "Both ministers agreed that the working mechanism on consultation and coordination on India-China border affairs should hold an early meeting. Mr Jaishankar reiterated that India-China relationship is best served by observing the three mutuals — mutual respect, mutual sensitivity and mutual interests. The two ministers also exchanged views on the global situation. Mr Jaishankar extended to Mr Wang India's support for China's presidency of SCO next year."

No end to student suicides in Kota, 13th incident this year
JEE aspirant hangs self in Kota

Kota, July 4: A 16-year-old engineering aspirant allegedly committed suicide by hanging himself from a ceiling fan inside his PG room here, police said on Thursday. This is the thirteenth case of suspected suicide by a coaching student in Kota since January. The number of student suicides in Kota stood at 26 in 2023. Sandeep Kumar Kurmi, a native of Bihar's Nalanda district, was taking coaching for the Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) in Kota for the last two years and lived in a paying guest (PG) room in Mahaveer Nagar-III, the police said.

At around 7 am on Thursday, the teen's classmate went to his room. When he did not get any response, he peeped through the window and found Kurmi hanging from the ceiling fan, Mahaveer Nagar SHO Mahendra Maru said. Kurmi's classmate informed the PG caretaker who then informed the police, he said. According to the SHO, the student committed suicide on the intervening night of Wednesday and Thursday. No suicide note was recovered from the room, the police said. Kurmi's brother, Sanjeet, is taking coaching for the

THE PG room where the student lived did not have any anti-suicide device installed on the ceiling fan. No suicide note was recovered from the room, the police said. medical entrance exam NEET in Kota and lives in a separate PG room in Dadabari area, Head Constable Mahaveer Prasad said. The two brothers reportedly lost their parents four years ago and their uncle was funding for their education, he added. During a preliminary probe it was found that Kurmi was an average student and would often miss

his coaching classes, the SHO said. According to the police, the PG room where Kurmi lived did not have any anti-suicide device installed on the ceiling fan. The district administration has made it mandatory for all hostels and PGs in the coaching hub to install anti-suicide devices in their rooms to prevent such cases. An anti-suicide device is a spring-like structure which is attached to the ceiling fans. When an object weighing more than 20 kilos is hung from the fan, the spring attached to it expands and a siren goes off. — PTI

Speaker calls spl session of WB Assembly amid oath row

Kolkata, July 4: Amid the ongoing impasse over the swearing-in of two newly elected TMC MLAs, Speaker Biman Banerjee on Thursday summoned a special session of the West Bengal Assembly and asserted that the functioning of the House is not solely dependent on the governor. While talking to reporters, Mr Banerjee said the business advisory committee meeting has been scheduled for noon on Friday and the tenure of the session will be decided in the meeting. "The special session will begin at 2 pm tomorrow," he said. "If someone thinks that we are helpless, then he or she is wrong. The Assembly is not helpless, and everything is not in the hands of the Governor. You can't just force everything down our throats; there are rules, regulations, and constitutional norms. All of us have to abide by them," Mr Banerjee said. Two newly elected Trinamul Congress MLAs staged a sit-in protest on the West Bengal Assembly premises for the sixth day on Thursday, demanding that they be administered the oath of office in the House rather than at Raj Bhavan, following an invitation from governor C.V. Ananda Bose. Baranagar MLA Sayantika Bandyopadhyay and Bhagabangola legislator Rayat Hossain Sarkar began their sit-in protest on June 27 and continued on June 28, July 1, 2, 3, and 4. Despite being declared winners in the assembly bypolls, they have yet to assume their roles as elected representatives due to the pending swearing-in process. — PTI

3 more Bihar bridges fall in 24 hrs; 10th in 16 days

Patna, July 4: Another bridge collapsed in Bihar's Saran district on Thursday, the 10th such incident in the state in just over a fortnight. District magistrate Aman Samir said it was the third bridge collapse in Saran in the last 24 hours. "A high-level probe has been ordered to determine the causes of these small bridge collapses in the district," he said. The small bridge over Gandaki river was located in Baneyapur block and connected several villages in Saran with the neighboring Siwan district. In all, ten bridges have collapsed in Siwan, Saran, Madhubani, Araria, East Champaran, and Kishanganj districts over the past 16 days. "It was constructed 15 years ago. The exact cause of the collapse is yet to be ascertained, but desilting work was recently undertaken," the district magistrate told PTI. On Wednesday, four small

OFFICIALS HAVE been asked to conduct a survey of all small bridges across the state that are more than 30 years old and require maintenance. bridges collapsed in Saran and Siwan districts. Speaking to reporters on Thursday, Chaitanya Prasad, additional chief secretary of the water resources department said, "Siwan and Saran districts witnessed the collapse of numerous small bridges/causeways in the last 24 hours. A probe has been ordered to determine the exact cause of the incidents, and departmental action will be initiated against erring officials after the report is handed over by the fact-finding team on Friday." "Preliminary reports from Siwan and Saran suggest that the standard operation procedure (SOP) for maintenance of the small bridges and desilting work of the

canal were not followed by the government engineers in both districts. The recent desilting drives conducted in canals in Siwan and Saran by contractors also weakened the foundation of the structures that collapsed," he said. Mr Prasad added, "All small bridges/causeways that collapsed in these two districts will be repaired at the earliest, and the government will charge the money from the contractors who recently did the desilting work carelessly." Officials have been asked to conduct a survey of all small bridges across the state that are more than 30 years old and require maintenance. Commenting on it, deputy CM Samrat Chaudhary told reporters, "The CM, after a review meeting on Wednesday, has instructed officials to conduct a survey of all old bridges and identify those that require repairs." — PTI

stated: "Priority must naturally be given to combating terrorism, one of the original goals of the SCO. Many of us have had our experiences, often originating beyond our borders. Let us be clear that if left unchecked, it can become a major threat to regional and global peace. Terrorism in any form or manifestation cannot be justified or condoned. International community must isolate and expose those countries that harbour terrorists, provide safe havens and condone terrorism. Cross-border terrorism requires a decisive response and terrorism financing and recruitment must be resolutely countered. We should also take proactive steps to prevent the spread of radicalisation among our youth. The joint statement issued during India's presidency last year on this subject underlines our shared commitment." Mr Modi further said: "At this time, it is particularly noteworthy that we are reiterating mutual respect for sovereignty, independence, territorial integrity, equality, mutual benefit, non-interference in internal affairs, non-use of force or threat of use of force as a basis for our foreign policies. We have also agreed not to take any measures contrary to the principles of state sovereignty and territorial integrity." He added: "We gather today in the backdrop of the pandemic impact, ongoing conflicts, rising tensions, trust deficits

and increasing number of hotspots around the world. These events have put significant strain on international relations and global economic growth. They have aggravated some of the problems that have emanated from globalisation. Our gathering is aimed at finding common ground to mitigate the consequences of these developments. The SCO occupies a prominent place in our foreign policy... The SCO is a principle-based organisation, whose consensus drives the approach of its member states." The PM also said: "Another prominent concern before us today is of climate change. We are working towards achieving committed reduction in emissions, including transition to alternate fuels, adoption of electric vehicles, and building climate-resilient infrastructure. In this context, during India's SCO presidency, a joint statement on emerging fuels, and a concept paper on de-carbonisation in the transportation sector were approved." Later, Mr Jaishankar delivered Prime Minister Modi's remarks at the extended format of the meeting of the SCO Council of Heads of State where he spoke about challenges, saying terrorism would surely rank foremost for many of us. "The truth is that it continues to be used by nations as a tool of destabilisation. We have had our own experiences with cross-border ter-

rorism. Let us be clear that terrorism in any form or manifestation cannot be justified or condoned. Harboring terrorists must be strongly condemned," he said. On connectivity, Mr Modi highlighted the connectivity initiative by India and other countries through the Iranian port of Chabahar. "For the SCO extended family, we flag the progress made on Chabahar port recently through a long-term agreement between India and Iran. This not only holds great value to landlocked Central Asian states but also de-risks commerce between India and Eurasia," Mr Modi stated. "As more countries seek association with SCO as observers or dialogue partners, we must strive to communicate better and deepen our consensus. Granting English the status of a third official language will be crucial," Mr Modi added. He also spoke on Afghanistan, saying "We have a historical relationship between our peoples that is the bedrock of our ties." India remains sensitive to the needs and aspirations of the Afghan people, he added. On the issue of UN reforms he stated, "The SCO extended family shares a commitment to reform the current international order. This is only possible when those efforts extend to the United Nations and its Security Council. We hope that in the near future, we can develop a strong consensus on the way ahead."

scam. He had resigned as the CM shortly before his arrest on January 31 by the Enforcement Directorate. The ED is directing to challenge Mr Soren's acquittal in the Supreme Court. After taking the oath, Mr Soren said former CM Champai Soren discharged his duties well. "The court order is in the public domain for all to see," the JMM executive president said, adding that he will discharge his duties with commitment. In a video message to people, Mr Soren said that a conspiracy was hatched against him by the BJP-led Opposition, because of which he had to spend about five months behind bars. "I was arrested on January 31... I had given a message to you about how the Opposition hatched a conspiracy against me and how they succeeded in their evil designs. They attempted to keep me in jail for a long time, but I chose to fight a legal battle. You supported me on the streets. Finally, justice was delivered and I was released clean," Mr Soren said in the video clip. The JMM leader said he was given an opportunity to serve the people in 2019, but "the conspirators could not digest that a tribal youth could reach

such heights, and finally, on January 31, I was removed on false charges. There could be delay in God's plans but ultimately truth prevails." Mr Soren said he was ready to serve the people of Jharkhand with dedication. Former Jharkhand CM Champai Soren extended good wishes to Mr Soren. The decision on Mr Soren's new Cabinet is yet to be taken. Asked about the council of ministers, Jharkhand Congress in-charge Ghulam Ahmad Mir said that the high command will decide about the party faces in the Soren Cabinet. Mr Mir said the Congress is yet to decide who will join the Cabinet from the party. Taking a jibe at the political developments in Jharkhand, BJP MP Nishkant Dubey, in a post on X on Wednesday, said, "The Champai Soren era is over in Jharkhand. In the family-oriented party, people outside the family have no political future. I wish the chief minister drew inspiration from Bhagwan Birsa Munda and stood up against the corrupt Hemant Soren ji." Jharkhand BJP president Babul Marandi also hit out at the JMM, claiming that the "tribals outside Shibu Soren's family are only temporary faces in JMM".

5 Reds killed in C'garh, carried bounty of ₹40L

Total 136 Maoists killed in encounters in 2024 so far

Five Maoists, slain in encounters with security forces in Abujhmad area of Bastar in Chhattisgarh on July 2, have been identified as members the Central Committee (CC) protection team of CPI (Maoist), the police said on Thursday. The five deceased Maoists, who together carried bounty of ₹40 lakhs, have been identified as Rakesh (35), Konda Togda (30-35), Edma Wadde (40), Kamlu Wadde (40), and Farsa Tumda (30). They were all CC protection team members each carrying a bounty of ₹8 lakhs, police said. "The killing of five CC protection team members indicates the likely presence of CC members of the outlawed CPI (Maoist) in the area," Bastar range inspector general of police P. Sunderraj told this newspaper. They may have fled the

spot during the encounter, he added. The 72-hour counter-insurgency operation was launched in Hikulnar-Ghamandi under Kohakmat in Narayanpur district, falling under Abujhmad, in Bastar on June 30 following inputs on the presence of Maoists' CC members Sonu and Kosa, and divisional committee members Arun, Ranita alias Jaymati, Radhika, Arab, Sukhlal in the forested area. An encounter took place between the Maoists and security forces in the area on July 2 leading to killing of five Naxals and seizure of a huge cache of weapons, which included .303 and 315 bore rifles and

AN ENCOUNTER took place in Abujhmad area on July 2 leading to killing of 5 Naxals and seizure of a huge cache of weapons, which included .303 and 315 bore rifles and barrel grenade launcher and its shells. This was the fifth major counter-insurgency operation undertaken by the security forces in Abujhmad area in Narayanpur district in the last two months. The security forces have of late achieved major successes in counter-insurgency measures in Bastar, particularly the Abujhmad area, said to be used as a safe haven by the CC members of CPI (Maoist), police said. In the current year so far, a total of 136 Maoists were killed in encounters in different parts of Left Wing extremism-hit Bastar, according to Mr Sunderraj.

Dead snake found in mid-day meal packet in Maha's Sangli

Sangli, July 4: A tiny dead snake was allegedly found in a packet distributed under the mid-day meal scheme meant for children aged between six months and three years at an "Anganwadi" or a government-run nursery school in western Maharashtra's Sangli district, prompting the authorities to launch a probe. The incident was reported by the parents of a child in Palus on Monday, said Anandi Bhosale, Vice-President of the State Anganwadi Workers' Union. Calling it a "serious" incident, Congress

leader and Palus-Kadegaon MLA Vishwajeet Kadam raised the issue in the state Legislative Assembly in the ongoing monsoon session. He demanded a detailed probe into the incident and action against those responsible for it. District officials said the child's parents disposed of the dead snake after photographing it and sent the image to the local anganwadi sevika (worker). But despite this, the food sample from the packet has been collected and sent to a laboratory for testing, they said. — PTI

ED arrests 2 bizmen in C'garh liquor scam

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Thursday said it has arrested two liquor businessmen named Arvind Singh and Trilok Singh Dhillon in connection with its money laundering probe into an alleged excise scam of Chhattisgarh that is estimated to have generated over ₹2,100 crores of slush funds. Both Singh and Dhillon were arrested on July 1 at the Central Jail in Raipur and later a special PMLA court sent them to ED custody till July 6, the federal probe agency said in a statement. The two were lodged in jail after the Chhattisgarh police's economic offences wing arrested them in the case sometime back. The alleged scam, where the ED has estimated the proceeds of crime at ₹2,161 crores, purportedly took place between 2019-2022 when the Congress was in power in the state. In an ongoing probe in this case, the central financial probe agency has arrested former IAS officer Anil Tuteja as well as some other bureaucrats and politicians.

'New laws will bring speedy justice to victims'

Former CBI chief and Mumbai police former commissioner Subodh Kumar Jaiswal said the new laws represent a tectonic shift towards a people centric approach over to implementing agencies and courts," he said. Former Maharashtra police DGP A.N. Roy also said that new laws take a victim-centric approach compared to the British era penal code. "The provisions in the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita aim to provide timely justice to women and children with increased punishment under these cases. It introduces digital electronic evidence reviews along with more focus on national security," Mr Roy said. Former CBI chief and Mumbai police former commissioner Subodh Kumar Jaiswal said the new laws represent a tectonic shift towards a people centric approach to justice. "This will ensure justice is served rightly, timely and swiftly. Indian criminal justice system is now more victim friendly and justice oriented, a transformation achieved through extensive deliberation," he said.

CBI registers its 1st FIR under new laws
New Delhi: The CBI has registered its first FIR under newly enforced Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) against two Delhi police officers for allegedly demanding ₹10 lakhs bribe to help the release of a person lodged in Tihar Jail. The BNS has replaced the British era penal code. The FIR registered on Wednesday evening booking head constables Ravindra Dhaka and Parveen Saini both posted in narcotics cell. — PTI

Spirit of cooperation will help govt in Parliament

The discussion on the motion thanking the President for her address to the joint session of Parliament showcased before the people the portraits of a government side which remains in denial mode on critical issues of national importance and an Opposition that has regained its strength, voice and relevance.

The BJP and Prime Minister Narendra Modi can be justifiably proud of their third successive electoral win, albeit with lesser numbers, but they might do well to remember that those who elected them do not have the luxury to celebrate with them forever. Far too many issues need urgent attention of the government. However, the Prime Minister, while replying to the motion, appeared not to be in a mood to address what has shaken the people's trust in the nation's institutions but played it safe by expatiating on platitudes and mouthing stale rhetoric.

Manipur has been on a boil for over a year. More than 200 people have died; thousands are still living in relief camps. Armed rebels engage each other in battle on a regular basis. In fact, the strife has of late spread to border villages with more than 2,000 having taken refuge in neighboring Assam last month fearing violence in the border district of Jiribam. While the President did not

bring it up in her address, the Prime Minister, who has skirted Manipur in his speeches and electoral campaign, would now claim in the Rajya Sabha that the state is returning to normal, citing the reopening of schools and data on arrests and FIRs. He would even reprimand the Opposition for raising it. It is highly regrettable that the government refuses to acknowledge ground realities.

The government also appears to be in a state of denial when it comes to the mess related to the conduct of the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test for medical education and other national competitive examinations and it looks to be unmindful of the death blow it has dealt to the foundations of institutional integrity. The President mentioned it in her address and the Prime Minister assured the nation in his reply that the government has been working on a war footing to fix the problem. However, it has not yet considered scrapping the tainted examination and ordering a retest despite the investigating agencies, including CBI, making several arrests across the country. No resolute action means allowing the cheats to get their way.

The Prime Minister was only stating the obvious when he tells the Congress Party that it was the NDA which won the election, and not the INDIA bloc. But Mr Modi and the BJP must keep in mind that it sought a mandate that will give it sufficient numbers to amend the Constitution but it got a number which won't even allow it to pass a law without requiring the help of its allies. It must realise that the people have elected a Lower House unlike in the past two elections and ensured that it has an Opposition in substantial numbers and a Leader of Opposition who can lay legitimate claim to the post. It should perish the thought of sweeping contentious issues under the carpet or expelling Opposition MPs. Instead of painting their suggestions as imbecile, it should open its eyes to the reflection in them of popular demands. Picking out the actionable points, it should then proceed to frame policy and notify redress. A spirit of accommodation and cooperation is all that the people are asking for.

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Team India can still do it!

Team India may have taken an eternity to get home. In fact, so many days did Hurricane Beryl take to move west beyond the southeastern island of Barbados that the T20World Cup organisers could have held a best-of-three finals at the Kensington Oval in Bridgetown so that any lingering doubts about Team India being a worthy winner could have been made to disappear.

Having found a former national carrier willing to send a huge aircraft out to evacuate the victorious Indians, the team were jetted directly to New Delhi to meet the Prime Minister. But, before the Opposition, given today's polarised world of Indian politics, can raise any objections, let it be said that the triumph in the 1983 World Cup, a revolutionary event that turned the cricket world upside down, felt more complete when the then PM Mrs Indira Gandhi said to the team, famously, "India can do it."

Having driven India's enthusiastic cricket fans numbering way over one billion to the point of vexation in a decade of non-performance in the most crucial of knockout games, Team India proved they could play to capacity and win something as major as the T20 World Cup once again. Which is why whatever was laid out for Rohit Sharma's team of achievers by way of a grand welcome as they brought home the cup was something that they so thoroughly deserved.

A ticker tape welcome was once given to the first achievers in international cricket of Ajit Wadekar's team who won Test series both in the Caribbean and in England in 1971 and lit up the expectations of an Indian public who progressively became crazy over the game. When Kapil's Devils beat the champions in '83, it became an explosive moment that changed Indian cricket forever.

As MS Dhoni's men won the inaugural T20 World Cup in 2007 they helped transform the sport so much that it soon became an Indian game that is spreading around the globe much more now. And what Rohit Sharma and Rahul Dravid's men have achieved now is to prove that "India can still do it", win Cup finals to justify the talent, the money, the attention and the adulation that Indian cricketers receive from their adoring fans.

It appears now that the sky's the limit for Team India, currently ranked No. 1 in all three formats, because Rohit's men broke the shackles of the inhibitions, the anxieties and the fears that may have seen them stumble at the last hurdle for too long. They are truly champions of cricket now.



Why New Delhi needs to take fresh look at Beijing

With the Narendra Modi government having begun a fresh term last month, it is time for it to undertake a full-scale review of its policy towards the People's Republic of China. One only has to see the sordid happenings during its 2019-2024 second term. This included the Dragon's unilateral push to Delhi to the precipice, to show who's the real boss of Asia, especially South Asia.

The unilateralism shown by the post-1949 Communist Party of China and its overlord, Chairman Mao Zedong, has now rubbed off on his successors. Little wonder then that what Mao did to India in 1950s and 1962, Xi Jinping did to India in 2019-2024 with vengeance. History repeated itself in its ugliest form to hit the 21st century successors of India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru (1947-1964).

Nehru, a liberal, had idealism and a vision, which regrettably led to his monumental China failure. It will be wrong, however, to look at Nehru's broad vision and policies only through the China prism, for he also had mega-successes which far outweigh the negativity. Just as non-violence was Mahatma Gandhi's path-breaking means to end British rule, "non-alignment" and "Panchsheel" were Nehru's enduring contributions to the world of diplomacy. India still follows this path with great elan, as seen by the world in the 28-month ongoing Russia-Ukraine war. So far, India has done very well; thanks to inherited wisdom of the professional mandarins of South Block, who have kept the ship of state steady, even in a rocky ambience of deceptive Chinese hostility and Western diplomatic irritants and pressure.

In dealing with China, one has to be prepared for more

deception. Remember Mao's formula of "one step backward and two steps forward" when the situation so demands? Remember Deng Xiaoping's prescription once China started interacting with the world of foreign "barbarians" from its claustrophobic Forbidden City: "Hide your intent and bide your time"? Secretiveness is in the DNA of Chinese diplomacy. That is what needs to be effectively countered by India today.

The inflexibly bellicose Han dictator must be tackled upfront. As China now faces a robust pushback from the West and East on trade, import, export and military hotspots, out of sheer exasperation Xi Jinping was forced to quote Nehru's 1954 "Panchsheel" (Five Principles of Peaceful Co-existence) to influence the world, without of course giving Nehru due credit for coining those memorable words.

In India, two Chinese diplomats (the ambassador in Delhi and the consul-general in Kolkata) arrived in midst of the parliamentary election and straightaway began a verbal charm-offensive to impress Indians and create a pro-China lobby. The idea was to put pressure on Indians - to humble the enemy without a fight, through internal sabotage. The Chinese take their cue from India's history, where battles were lost to foreigners, with internal lobbyists ensuring victory for external foes.

One need not go into the myriad ways in which China has inflicted damage on India. The question is how India should re-orient its entire policy spectrum in order to counter-balance Han aggression. The Hans' psyche solely revolves around the Opium War (1839-1842) and subsequent events like the burning of Royal Summer Palace (1860), Boxer Revolt (1898), and suppression by the

"barbarians" (foreigners) of the "Son of Heaven" (Emperor) living in the opulent Forbidden City of Beijing. This "revenge factor" is deeply embedded in the psyche of 1.5 billion Chinese people. Let India not be bullied or get carried away by false hopes from outside and internal pressures mounted by China's lobbyists for their own private agenda, which may not necessarily benefit the 1.4 billion Indians.

Therefore, first insist on going back to India's territorial status quo ante of April-May 2020. This is absolutely non-negotiable. Inviolability and sovereignty of territory comes first and foremost for any nation-state. It's good that India's external affairs minister, at least, has been publicly harping on this for quite some time. Despite the parrot-like utterances of some of China's "wolf-warrior" diplomats, there can be no "business as usual" without a proper territorial resolution. Beijing is circulating a false narrative that "India and China have more convergence than divergence". This is nothing more than a backdoor device to open the gates for hordes of Chinese people to enter India for "business", which will only benefit Beijing. New Delhi must not fall into this trap, otherwise the leaders of today will face the harsh judgment of history, even worse than Nehru in 1962.

India-China bilateral trade is in shambles. The \$100 billion-plus deficit can't be wished away with a magic wand. The options are limited, and some hard decisions are needed. It's time to take action to prohibit through the commerce ministry the import of all non-essential goods from

the Chinese, on which India's traders are making humongous profits by selling in the domestic market at steep markups. Second, impose stiff tariffs on all Chinese imports. Then, impose non-tariff barriers as well.

The WTO today is hardly in a position to deal with disputes between the "big boys". The United States imposed 100 per cent tariffs on Chinese-made electric vehicles. The European Union followed, with a maximum 38.4 per cent import duty. The entire West is trying to protect their domestic industry from brutal Chinese assault through cheap products. Let India recognise the harsh reality that the days of rampant globalization may be past. The monopoly-like Chinese juggernaut has taken on the entire West, and India is bound to be Dragon's next target.

The global pushback Beijing is facing is bad news for its economy. India must keep watch on the fast-unfolding scenario. Unfortunately, it has let itself become excessively dependent on cheap Chinese products and raw material. It's now heard that some Indian companies may "collapse" without "imported Chinese managers" running them. Truly bizarre! Have some people, in their over-enthusiasm to make money through any means, lost their mind? Can India be (mis)-guided by them?

It's time for South Block to crack the whip and ensure that the tentacles of the Chinese Dragon don't spread any further in this country. Just consider some facts. In a reply to a Parliament question in December 2022, the government had acknowledged that "nearly 3,560 companies in India have Chinese directors" and that "174 Chinese companies are registered in India". These need to be kept under close watch and acted upon, to ensure that India's self-interest is not compromised in any way.

After the fiasco over Neet leaks & NET row, what's the way forward?

The government must prioritise student welfare by allowing this discussion. Rhetoric alone is insufficient. Although President Droupadi Murmu did mention the issue in her address to the joint sitting of both Houses, and emphasise the government's commitment to a fair investigation, a debate in both Houses of

Parliament would be a good starting point. Also, it is important not to dismiss the government's actions, such as replacing officials and postponing exams, as mere "cover-up". However, to restore faith in the system, it must engage in a thorough discussion. The nation deserves to know the truth.

On the legal front, aggrieved students are seeking a fair resolution, but the path is fraught with challenges. Opinions are divided: Some students advocate for a re-examination, while others are firmly opposed, and both sides have some valid points. Cancelling the exam and ordering a retake would impose extra stress on students who genuinely prepared and performed well, subjecting them to further hardship. But, given the malpractices that compromised the exam's integrity, the results cannot be deemed valid for selecting candidates. This situation presents a classic Hegelian dilemma, where the courts must choose between two justifiable yet conflicting options. Deciding without causing harm to one party will be a difficult task for the judiciary.

Meanwhile, student organisations like NSUI, AISF and AISA are intensifying their protests. Their anger is natural and spontaneous. Interestingly, even the ABVP has raised concerns. Some organisations demand scrapping the National Testing Agency (NTA), while others have called for the Union education minister's resignation. While the minister's resignation might be seen as a political move, it is up to him to decide on moral grounds. The call to disband the NTA is more significant

due to its ongoing controversies. As investigations continue, doubts about the exam's reliability and the NTA's role are only mounting. For instance, the retest results for 813 out of 1,563 candidates, where no one achieved full marks, highlight systemic corruption. This casts doubt on the NTA's practices since its inception in 2017 and questions past candidate selection. Public faith in the NTA is waning. An opinion poll showed only 18 per cent of 857 respondents have confidence in the NTA, while 77 per cent believe it should no longer conduct exams.

One of the major problems contributing to the NTA's predicament is the overwhelming volume of work it has been assigned. A brand-new organisation with inadequate and underqualified staff to meet millions of aspirants' needs to compete in top-notch exams was a sure recipe for disaster. Lord Acton's words ring true: "Power corrupts, and absolute power corrupts absolutely." Such an outcome was inevitable. Compounding the issue, several officials responsible for maintaining the integrity of the exam process have also fallen prey to greed. The arrest of a school principal and district coordinator of Neet exams in Hazariabagh, Jharkhand, has eroded public confidence.

The silver lining in these troubling events is the government's acknowledgment that not all is well with Neet and the NTA, prompting the initiation of reforms. A seven-member expert committee, led by K. Radhakrishnan, former chairman of the Indian Space Research Organisation (Isro), is expected to

submit its recommendations in two months. While it is unlikely that the committee will recommend abolishing the NTA - indicating the government's continued commitment to its "one nation, one exam" approach - the focus will be on reforms in the examination process and improvements in data security protocols.

However, importantly, the committee should consider regional realities and the perspectives of state governments, many of which advocate for education to be returned to the State List from the Concurrent List. The committee has invited feedback from stakeholders; it would be worthwhile to include opinions from state representatives as well.

In this regard, closely examining the A.K. Rajan committee report on Neet could provide valuable insights. The solutions proposed by the committee need to be enduring. Understanding the negative impacts of a centralised approach, its effects on different sections of society and how a "one-size-fits-all" method undermines social justice is essential. Any proposed solutions will likely be cosmetic without sincerely addressing these concerns in the recommendations. The committee's work must ensure that the reforms lead to substantial, long-lasting improvements in the examination system while simultaneously avoiding discrimination.

TEN POLITICAL PRISONERS SET FREE BY BELARUS

Minsk, July 4: Belarusian leader Alexander Lukashenko has freed at least 10 political prisoners, rights campaigners said on Thursday, including a veteran opposition figure suffering from cancer.

But the rare pardon still leaves some 1,400 people behind bars for political activity, most of them arrested after peaceful mass protests in 2020 and convicted on a range of charges related to alleged extremism.

Human rights group Viasna said it knew of three women and seven men who had been freed.

THIRD JAPANESE CLIMBER DIES ON PAK MOUNTAIN

Peshwar, July 4: A Japanese climber has died while descending one of the highest mountains in northern Pakistan, the third death of a Japanese on the mountain in less than a month, officials said on Thursday.

Rescuers have located the body of Hiroshi Onishi, 64, who fell into a crevasse earlier this week on 7,027-metre (23,054-foot) Spantik Peak, also known as Golden Peak.

Arrangements are being made to airlift the body by helicopter to the base camp, local officials and the Alpine Club of Pakistan said.

25 SUDANESE DROWN AS THEY FLEE FIGHTING

Port Sudan, July 4: Around 25 people have drowned in Sudan's southeast while trying to flee fighting between the Sudanese Army and paramilitary forces, a pro-democracy activists' panel said on Thursday.

"Around 25 citizens, most of them women and children, have died in a boat sinking" while crossing the Blue Nile River in the southeastern state of Sennar.

The committee is one of hundreds across Sudan that used to organise pro-democracy protests and have coordinated front-line aid since the war began last year.

U.N.: GENOCIDAL VIOLENCE LOOMS IN MYANMAR

Geneva, July 4: Myanmar's Rakhine State is facing a terrifying situation similar to the "genocidal violence" eight years ago against the persecuted Rohingya minority, a UN expert warned on Thursday.

Speaking at the United Nations Human Rights Council, Thomas Andrews, the special rapporteur on the situation in Myanmar, voiced deep alarm at recent events in the western region.

"The situation in Rakhine State, where the junta is rapidly losing territory to the Arakan Army, is terrifying," Andrews said.

KUALA LUMPUR AIRPORT GAS LEAK: 39 FALL ILL

Kuala Lumpur, July 4: A gas leak on Thursday at an engineering section of Kuala Lumpur's international airport saw 39 people fall ill, an emergency services official said.

"A total of 39 victims suffered from dizziness and nausea," local rescue officer Muhammad Nur Khairi Samsumin said.

He added that 24 victims were discharged, 14 others were at the Air Disaster Unit receiving care and one was hospitalised.

All of those affected work for three companies at the facility. However, the incident did not disrupt air travel at the country's top airport.

COURT CONVICTS SAUDI NETFLIX SHOW CREATOR

Riyadh, July 4: Saudi TV creator Abdulaziz Almuzaini, whose animated Netflix show has made waves for breaking social taboos, said he was convicted by an anti-terrorism court.

The kingdom's Specialised Criminal Court "issued against me (a sentence of) 13 years, followed by a 13-year travel ban", Almuzaini said in a video that was subsequently deleted.

In a second video posted this week, still available on X, Almuzaini filmed himself inside a car, saying: "I am banned from travelling" out of Saudi Arabia.

Labour tipped for historic win as UK voters cast votes

Taking nothing for granted, Labour's Starmer asks voters not to stay at home

London, July 4: Britain voted on Thursday in a general election widely expected to hand the opposition Labour party a landslide win and end nearly a decade-and-a-half of Conservative rule.

The first national ballot since Boris Johnson won the Tories a decisive victory in 2019 follows Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's surprise call to hold it six months earlier than required. His gamble looks set to backfire spectacularly with polls throughout the six-week campaign — and for the last two years — pointing to a heavy defeat for his right-wing party.

That would almost certainly put Labour leader Keir Starmer, 61, in Downing Street, as leader of the largest party in Parliament. Centre-left Labour is projected to win its first general election since 2005 by historic proportions, with a flurry of election eve polls all forecasting its biggest-ever victory.

But Starmer was taking nothing for granted as he urged voters not to stay at home. "Britain's future is on the ballot," he said. "But change will only happen if you vote for it."

Voting began at 7.00 am (0600 GMT) in more than 40,000 polling stations across the country, from church halls, community centres and schools to more unusual venues such as pubs and even a ship.

Sunak was among the early birds, casting his ballot at his Richmond and Northallerton constituency in Yorkshire, northern England. Starmer voted around two hours later in his north London seat.

"I just moved back from Australia and I've got the feeling that everything has turned wrong in this country and a lot of people are not satisfied," said Ianthe Jacob, a 32-year-old writer, after voting in Hackney, east London.

In Saint Albans, north of London, 22-year-old student Judith told AFP. "I don't really trust any of them but will vote. A lot of my friends feel the same." Voting closes at 10.00 pm (2100 GMT). Broadcasters

Results from the UK's 650 constituencies trickle in overnight, with the winni-

string of government ministers, with talk that even Sunak himself might not be safe.

That would make him the first sitting PM not to retain his seat in a general election. — AFP

Xi, Putin bat for Eurasian security

Astana, July 4: China's President Xi Jinping and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin pressed their case on Thursday for closer security, political and economic cooperation between countries of the vast Eurasian region as a counterweight to Western alliances.

They were speaking on the second and final day of a summit in the Kazakh capital Astana of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), a club launched in 2001 by Russia, China and Central Asian states and now including India, Iran and Pakistan.

"SCO members should consolidate unity and jointly oppose external interference in the face of the real challenges of interference and division," Xinhua quoted Xi as saying, warning against the West's "Cold War mentality".

President Putin, in his address to the SCO, reiterated Russia's call for "a new architecture of coop-

eration, indivisible security and development in Eurasia, designed to replace the outdated Eurocentric and Euro-Atlantic models, which gave unilateral advantages only to certain states".

He blamed the West for the war in Ukraine and said Russia was ready to freeze the conflict if Kyiv and its backers accepted Moscow's terms for talks.

Putin said last month the proposed new Eurasian security pact should be open to all countries in the region, including current Nato members. But the aim, he said, should be to gradually remove all external military presence, a clear reference to the United States. — Reuters

6 Chinese, soldiers killed in Congo militant attack

Beni, Beijing, July 4: Militia fighters have attacked a Chinese-linked mining site in northeastern Democratic Republic of Congo, killing six Chinese nationals and at least two Congolese soldiers, local officials said on Thursday.

China condemned the attack, which took place on Wednesday in Djugu territory in the gold-rich Ituri province.

Djugu administrator Ruphin Mapela said it was carried out by the CODECO (Cooperative for the Development of the Congo) militia.

It is mainly made up of fighters from the Lendu ethnic group, which they claim to defend. Six Chinese nationals and two Congolese soldiers guarding the site were killed, Mapela said.

The Red Cross representative for Djugu, Dhekana Ernest, said the CODECO fighters came across the Chinese digging for gold. "They entered their

camp, killed six Chinese nationals and three soldiers," he said, adding that the corpses were taken to the city of Bunia. A spokesman for the Army in the region confirmed the toll and added that a Congolese national and six militia fighters were killed.

In Beijing, the Chinese foreign ministry said an attack on a Chinese-funded private enterprise led to the death and disappearance of several Chinese citizens.

China is in close communication with DRC authorities in the search for those missing, ministry spokesman Mao Ning told a press briefing.

"We urge the DRC to pursue and punish the perpetrators in accordance with the law as soon as possible," Mao said.

The official called for measures to beef up security and protection for Chinese citizens and enterprises there. — Reuters

CONGO SOLDIERS GET DEATH FOR FLEEING BATTLE

Beni, July 4: Twenty-five soldiers have been sentenced to death by a military tribunal in the Democratic Republic of Congo for fleeing battles against M23 rebels and theft, their lawyer and an Army spokesman said on Thursday.

Congo's Army has been fighting the Rwanda-backed M23 insurgency for more than two years, as well as facing other militia violence, with around 2.7 million people displaced within the North Kivu province.

The rebels advanced into strategically important territory last week.

On Tuesday, the Army detained 27 soldiers after they abandoned their positions in the villages of Keseghe and Matembe in the province. — Reuters

Biden: I am party nominee, no one pushing me out

Washington, July 4: US President Joe Biden on Wednesday asserted that he is the nominee of the Democratic Party for the November 5 presidential elections and there is no pressure on him to quit the race.

Donald Trump's campaign and some of his allies have launched a pre-emptive political strike on Vice President Kamala Harris, moving swiftly to try to discredit her amid talk among some of her fellow Democrats that she might replace President Joe Biden atop the party's 2024 presidential ticket after his debate debacle.

Biden's statement is quite contrary to the reports appearing in the media and the internal party murmurs that he should leave the election race amid his dismal performance in the presidential debate against his Republican rival Donald Trump.

"I'm the Democratic Party's nominee. No one is pushing me out. I'm not leaving, I'm in this race to the end, and WE are going to win this election. If that's all you need to hear, pitch in a few bucks to help [Vice President Harris] and me defeat Donald Trump in November," Biden said in his fundraising email on Wednesday.

After his terrible performance in the presidential debate in Atlanta last Thursday, Biden's approval ratings have dipped, and his own party leaders are calling him to quit the race. "Look, this campaign is bigger than me or you. Everything we believe in, everything we stand for, and everyone we are fighting for are at risk in this election," Biden said in the email.

"Let me say this as clearly and simply as I can: I'm running," he said in his mass email to his supporters. — Agencies

Tel Aviv sends team to broker hostage release

Cairo, Gaza, Jerusalem, July 4: Israel has dispatched a delegation to negotiate a hostage release deal with Hamas, a government official said on Thursday, as Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu prepared to convene his security Cabinet to discuss new Hamas positions on an accord.

Before the Cabinet meets on Thursday evening, Netanyahu will have consultations with his ceasefire negotiations team, a source in his office said. US President Joe Biden, who has sought for months to broker a truce, will also speak with Netanyahu on Thursday, a source said. "Prime Minister Netanyahu reiterated that the war will end only after all its objectives have been achieved and not a moment before," said the official, who did not specify where the delegation had been sent.

Prior efforts to end the nearly nine-month conflict were mediated by Egypt and Qatar, with talks held in both locations.

Israel received Hamas' response on Wednesday to a proposal made public at the end of May by Biden that would include the release of about 120

ISRAEL FACES ROCKETS, DRONES FROM HEZBOLLAH

Beirut, Jerusalem, July 4: Lebanon's Hezbollah launched a big rocket and drone attack at Israel on Thursday and threatened to hit new targets in retaliation for the killing of a top commander, in the latest surge of violence in the steadily worsening conflict across the border.

Sparked by the Gaza war, the conflict between Hezbollah and Israel has been gradually intensifying for months, raising fears of a full-scale war, which both sides have indicated they want to avoid and diplomats are working to prevent. As the latest violence played out in areas at or near the frontier, the sound of sonic booms rattled nerves for the second successive day in Beirut. — Reuters

EU SLAPS CHINESE ELECTRIC CARS WITH EXTRA TARIFFS OF UP TO 38%

Brussels, July 4: The European Union on Thursday slapped extra provisional duties of up to 38 percent on Chinese electric car imports because of "unfair" state subsidies, despite Beijing's warnings the move would unleash a trade war.

A European Commission probe launched last year concluded that state subsidies for Chinese EV manufacturers were unfairly undercutting European rivals — which Brussels wants to shield as they make the transition from thermal to electric power.

The Chinese Chamber of Commerce to the EU slammed the tariffs, coming on top of import duties of 10 per cent, as "politically-motivated" and "protectionist", while voicing hope the dispute could be resolved. — AFP

Hurricane Beryl heads for Cayman Islands, Mexico

Kingston, July 4: Hurricane Beryl rumbled towards the Cayman Islands and Mexico on Thursday, after pummeling Jamaica with winds and rain that caused floods and widespread power outages and leaving a deadly trail of destruction in several smaller Caribbean islands.

Beryl has so far left at least 10 people dead but that number was widely expected to rise as communications are restored on islands devastated by flooding and powerful winds. Beryl's eyewall skirted

"It's terrible. Everything's gone. I'm in my house and scared," said Amy Wellington, a 51-year-old cashier who lives in Top Hill, a rural farming community in southern St. Elizabeth parish. "It's a disaster." Beryl moved away from Jamaica early on Thursday.

At around 1200 GMT, the Category 3 hurricane was 50 miles (80 km) from Grand Cayman and about 385 miles (620 km) off Tulum, Mexico, the United States National Hurricane Centre said. — Reuters

Heat to persist, says China weather body

Beijing, July 4: China's weather agency expects extreme heat to persist across the country this summer as climate change pushes global temperatures higher, state media reported on Thursday.

The Asian nation is the world's biggest emitter of greenhouse gases that scientists say cause global

warming. They added that it is the reason why extreme weather is more frequent and intense.

Swathes of northern China have already been baked by heat waves this summer, while unseasonably torrential rains have triggered deadly floods and landslides across much of the south. — AFP

THOUSANDS TOLD TO FLEE CALIF. WILDFIRE

Oroville, July 4: Thousands of people have been ordered to evacuate as a wildfire rages out of control in northern California, with a swathe of the US in the grip of a "record-breaking and dangerous" heatwave that was complicating firefighting efforts.

More than 3,500 acres of grass and woodland have been consumed since Tuesday. — AFP

Zydus gets nod to market blood pressure drug

The tentative approval by the US food and drug administration is for Azilsartan Medoxomil tablets of strengths 40 mg and 80 mg, it said. The drug will be manufactured at the group's formulation facility in Ahmedabad SEZ - II, it added.

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Cargo traffic at 12 major ports rises by 6.8% to 69 MT

Mumbai, July 4: Cargo traffic across 12 major Indian ports rose 6.8 per cent to 69.08 million tonnes (MT) in June from 64.69 MT in the year-ago month, with ten ports showing positive growth while the remaining two witnessed a decline.

Jawaharlal Nehru Port in Maharashtra recorded the highest growth in cargo handling at 15.12 per cent during the reporting month, followed by Cochin Port with 15.12 per cent, Kamarajar Port (10.70 per cent), Deendayal Port (8.57 per cent) and New Mangalore Port (8.53 per cent), according to the data released by the major ports' apex body Indian Ports Association (IPA).

According to the IPA, VO Chidambaram Port's cargo traffic grew 7.73 per cent and Paradip Port 7.41 per cent growth, respectively, during the previous month. SMP Kolkata Port registered a 6.66 per cent growth in traffic handling, followed by Chennai Port (6.09 per cent) and Mormugao Port (3.75 per cent).

On other hand, Mumbai Port witnessed a 6.59 per cent decline in cargo traffic, and Visakhapatnam Port saw a 0.27 per cent year-on-year drop in June this year, as per the IPA.

Meanwhile, a government official said the focus should be on further improving processes as well as ensuring faster turnaround time to tap the potential of the country's air cargo sector.

Piyush Srivastava, senior economic advisor at the ministry of civil aviation, said the air cargo sector has a bright future and the number of freighters in the country is expected to rise.



JAWAHARLAL NEHRU Port in Maharashtra recorded the highest growth in cargo handling at 15.12% during the reporting month, followed by Cochin Port with 15.12%.

Currently, Indian carriers have around 18 freighters.

There will be a focus on further improving the ease of doing business and faster turnaround time in the air cargo sector, he said while speaking at the conference organised by the air cargo forum India (ACFI) in the national capital.

Air cargo is yet to fully recover to the pre-Covid levels. In 2023-24, the air cargo handled in the country was a little over 3.36 million tonnes.

Surendra Kumar Ahirwar, joint secretary at DPIIT, a lot of movement is happening on the logistics side, including the skilling of people.

He said there is sub-optimal utilisation of existing air cargo facilities and emphasised the need for developing hubs as part of logistics infra. —PTI

RBI DIVIDEND TO GOVT WILL LOWER NEED FOR BIG DIVESTMENT: CARE

Mumbai, July 4: The record ₹2.1 lakh crore dividend payout by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will limit the need for big-ticket divestment, a domestic rating agency said.

Care Ratings said the new government will retain the interim budget's ₹50,000 crore target on receipts from divestments. "With a bumper dividend from the RBI, the central government's fiscal position remains comfortable, which may limit the urgency to push ahead with big-ticket divestments," it said.

If there is a shortfall in the resource accretion, the government will prefer asset monetisation, it added.

Shipping Corporation of India (SCI) sales expected to be completed during the year will make it easy sailing for the government on the FY25 target, the agency said. "If the government offloads its entire stake in SCI, it could generate ₹12,500-22,500 crore as divestment proceeds," according to the report.

The other plausible candidates include Concor and Pawan Hans, Care Ratings said.

In the last ten years, the government has raised ₹5.2 lakh crore from the divestment initiatives. The government can raise ₹11.5 lakh crore by selling stakes in state-owned companies without getting the stake below 51 per cent, according to the report. —PTI

The Sensex closed above 80,000 mark for the first time at 80,049.65 gaining 62.87 points or 0.08 per cent while the Nifty-50 closed at new high of 24,302.15 gaining 16 points or 0.06 per cent.

The broader market outperformed with BSE midcap index up 0.60 per cent and BSE small-cap index up 0.62 per cent.

BSE's market capitalisation touched a new high of over ₹447.30 lakh crore or \$5.36 trillion.

Foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) were net buyers of equities worth ₹2,575.85 cr while domestic institutions were net sellers by ₹2,375.18 crore.

indices opened higher on Thursday, driven by positive global cues. As a result, the Nifty-50 registered a new record high of 24,401 and finally settled the day on a flat note at 24,302. However, the broader market outperformed the benchmarks, with the midcap and smallcap indices registering fresh highs," said Hrishikesh Yedve, technical analyst, Asit C. Mehta Investment.

The pharma sector gained more than 1 per cent to be the top performer followed by IT,

auto and realty while bank, FMCG, oil and gas, were the laggards.

"Sector-wise it was a mixed bag with buying seen in IT, pharma, and auto. Defence witnessed a smart rally today on the expectation of continued focus on the upcoming budget and strong order inflows," said Siddhartha Khemka, head - Retail Research, Motilal Oswal Financial Services.

Quarterly business updates by large corporates have triggered fresh buying in some sectors.

"The defensive bet on large caps like IT and pharma gained momentum due to the diminishing US inflationary pressure, improvement in QoQ earnings outlook and a resultant sharp fall in the US 10 year bond yield," said Vinod Nair, head-Research, Geojit Financial Services.

The buoyancy in government spending and the green shoots in corporate earnings are now supporting the premium valuation. Return of FIIs to the domestic market and expectation of a rate cut in September are supporting market sentiment, Nair added.

Coal output increases in May

New Delhi, July 4: The coal sector has registered a growth of 10.2 per cent among all eight core industries of the economy in May, the government said on Thursday.

The index of coal industry has reached 184.7 points during May as compared to 167.6 points during the same month last year.

This increase in production underscores the sector's capacity to meet

growing demand of energy and manufacturing industries.

"The coal sector has demonstrated highest growth of 10.2 per cent (provisional), following the electricity industry among the eight core industries for the month of May, 2024 as per the index of eight core industries (ICI) released by ministry of commerce and industries," the coal ministry said in a state-

ment.

The driving force behind growth can be attributed to a considerable rise in coal production during May. The latest data released on June 28

showed the eight key infrastructure sectors' growth rose by 6.3 per cent in May. The production of the eight sectors grew 6.7 per cent in April.

The production growth of coal, natural gas and electricity rose by 10.2 per cent, 7.5 per cent and 12.8 per cent, respectively, against 7.2 per cent, (-) 0.3 per cent and 0.8 per cent in May 2023, according to the data released by the commerce ministry. —PTI

Govt brings new funding guidelines

New Delhi, July 4: The ministry of new and renewable energy (MNRE) on Thursday said it has issued scheme guidelines for funding testing facilities, infrastructure, and institutional support under the national green hydrogen mission.

The scheme will have a total budget of ₹200 crore and will be implemented till the FY2025-26, said MNRE in a statement.

The scheme includes the

development of robust quality and performance testing facilities to ensure the quality, sustainability, and safety of green hydrogen (GH₂) production and trade, according to the statement.

It will support the identification of the gaps in the existing testing facilities for components, technologies, and processes in the value chain of Green Hydrogen and its derivatives, it said.

SCHEME INCLUDES the development of robust quality and performance testing facilities to ensure the quality, sustainability, and safety of green hydrogen production and trade.

The scheme will support the creation of new testing facilities and the upgradation of existing testing facilities to ensure

safe and secure operations.

The national institute of solar energy (NISE) will be the scheme implementation agency (SIA).

The national green hydrogen mission, launched in Jan 2023, has an outlay of ₹19,744 crore up to FY 2029-30.

It will contribute to India's goal to become Aatma Nirbhar (self-reliant) through clean energy. —PTI

Sebi asks brokers to hone fraud detection

New Delhi, July 4: Sebi on Thursday issued a circular requiring stock brokers to establish an institutional mechanism for prevention and detection of fraud or market abuse in a bid to protect the interest of investors in the securities market.

The circular mandates the implementation of systems for the surveillance of trading activities and internal controls, introduction of a whistleblower policy, among other obligations.

The standards for implementation of the same, including operational modalities will be formulated by the broker's industry standards forum (ISF), in consultation with the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi), the regulator said.

The implementation will be based on the size of the stock brokers. Brokers with more than 50,000 active unique client codes (UCCs) are required to comply by Jan. 1, 2025.

Those with 2,001 to 50,000 active UCCs have to comply by April 1, 2025, and brokers with up to 2,000 active UCCs must comply by April 1, 2026. Qualified stock brokers must comply with these requirements by Aug. 1, 2024. —PTI

Moreover, the premiumisation trend and growth in volume will expand the operating margin of FMCG companies "by 50-75 basis points to 20-21 per cent", it said.

"The margin expansion would have been higher but for rising selling and marketing expenses amid heightened competition among organised and unorganised players alike," the report added.

The product realisations in FY25 are "expected to grow in low single digits with a marginal rise in prices of key raw materials for the food and beverages (F&B) segment", however, key raw material prices for personal care (PC) and home care (HC) segments are seen to be stable, it added.

Over the revenue growth, the report added the FMCG sector will also be supported by modest realisation growth of 1 to 2 per cent "primarily due to marginal rise in prices" of some key F&B raw materials.

Crisil Ratings associate director Rabindra Verma said revenue growth will vary across product segments and firms.

It estimated the FMCG growth for the fiscal 2024 to be around 5 to 7 per cent. —PTI



FMCG REVENUES TO GROW 7-9% THIS FISCAL, SAYS CRISIL

New Delhi, July 4: The fast-moving consumer goods (FMCG) sector is expected to see a revenue growth of 7 to 9 per cent this fiscal, helped by higher sales volume and a revival of rural markets, Crisil Ratings said in a report.

Volume growth from urban consumers will also remain steady at 7 to 8 per cent supported by rising disposable incomes and continued focus on premium offerings by the industry players, especially in the personal care and home care segments, it said.

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Firms woo staff with swanky offices

Mumbai, July 4: To retain employees and bring them back to office, many companies are resorting to "Office Peacocking", which involves creating a swanky or fancy work space, and spending huge amounts of their budget on attractive design, says industry experts.

The "Office Peacocking" concept gained significant traction in India post-Covid, as companies sought to entice employees back to the office following the remote work shift induced by the pandemic in order to compete with the comfort of home offices, human resource service provider TeamLease Services chief executive officer-Staffing Kartik Narayan said.

Peacocking involves



redesigning office spaces with stylish decor, trendy furniture, cosy corners, natural light, and well-stocked pantries to create an inviting and vibrant work environment.

"Companies are allocating a substantial portion of their budgets for office redesigns. Although specific figures vary, investments in office aesthetics are seen as strategic moves to improve employee productivity," he said.

Technology, finance, and

consulting sectors are particularly keen on office peacocking as these sectors face higher competition for talent and a greater need to entice employees back to physical workspaces, he said.

Echoing the view, staffing firm CIEL HR director and CEO Aditya Narayan Mishra said over the past 2-3 years, "Office Peacocking" has seen remarkable growth, with an estimated 25-30 per cent surge in investment in office aesthetics and interior design.

Major metropolitan cities like Bengaluru, Mumbai, Delhi NCR, and Hyderabad are leading in "Office Peacocking" as these cities host many multinational corporations and start-ups. —PTI

Calgary, Canada: Promising Indian shuttler Priyanshu Rajawat stunned higher-ranked Rasmus Gemke of Denmark in a hard-fought three game contest to advance to the second round of men's singles event at the Canada Open here. World No.39 Rajawat had to dig deep to get the better of eighth seed Gemke of Denmark 17-21, 21-16, 21-14 in his opening round match that lasted one hour and 10 minutes on Wednesday night. Rajawat, thus, remained the only Indian surviving player in the men's singles competition and will take on Takuma Obayashi of Japan in the next round.

The two other Indians in the fray, Ayush Shetty lost 14-21, 11-21 to sixth seed Koki Watanabe of Japan, while S Sankar Muthusamy Subramanian was shown the door by France's Alex Lanier 16-21, 17-21. In the women's singles, Tanya Hemant and Anupama Upadhyay also progressed to the second round. While Tanya beat Jackie Dent of Canada 21-13, 20-22 21-14, Anupama defeated Rachael Darragh of Ireland 21-11, 21-11. — PTI

Deepanshi does not train at National camp. — PTI

In 2007, Rohit Sharma was the youngest member of the Mahendra Singh Dhoni's epoch-making squad and now at 37, for him to lead his T20 World Champion Indian cricket team on a victory parade must have given him a sense of deja vu. He is now the oldest member of this current team, 'been there and done that' and even as the faces around him changed in more than one-and-a-half decades, the now-retired Indian T20 skipper remained a constant for all these years. As the bus passed through the sea of human, his mind must have travelled back to that September morning in 2007 when Mumbai was as drenched as it was on Thursday evening. Chants of "Mumbaicha Raja Kaun? Rohit Sharma" (Who's the King of Mumbai? Rohit Sharma) reverberated through the roads. "This (crowd) tells that the desperation we had to win was similar to the desperation which the fans had. The win has brought smiles on faces of crores of people. This is a special team and this trophy belongs to the nation," Rohit said while addressing the fans inside the stadium. — PTI

India women look to continue spree

The T20 series, the final phase of South Africa women's India tour, holds significant importance for both teams as they prepare for the upcoming T20 World Cup in Bangladesh this October. While India are set to participate in the Asia Cup later this month, it's the final opportunity for the Proteas to fine-tune and finalise their team composition ahead of the ICC event. India's recent T20 form

has been impressive, having won six out of eight matches since January, including a commanding 5-0 sweep against Bangladesh in May. The likes of Smriti Mandhana and D. Hemalatha were in scintillating form with the bat against Bangladesh, while left-arm spinner Radha Yadav's 10-wicket haul earned her the Player of the Series award. All eyes will be on Smriti who has scored three centuries in her last four — three ODIs and one Test — international innings. South Africa, on the other hand, has faced challenges in the shortest format. They were white-washed by Sri Lanka in their last T20 series in April. However, their valiant performance on a challenging Chepauk track in the one-off Test should instill a sense of belief.

Djokovic survives rookie test

London, July 4: Novak Djokovic came through a testing Wimbledon workout to stay on course for a record-equaling eighth men's title on Thursday as Andy Murray prepared to launch his emotional farewell. Jessica Pegula became the highest-ranked player to exit the tournament so far, dumped out by China's Wang Xinyu in the second round. Seven-time champion Djokovic did not have it all his own way against British wild card Jacob Fearnley but came through 6-3, 6-4, 5-7, 7-5 in a second-round match lasting three hours. It appeared to be business as usual for the Serbian as he coasted into a two-set lead on Centre Court but the 27th-ranked Fearnley broke his illustrious opponent twice in the third set to reduce the deficit. Fearnley, playing in his first Grand Slam, carved out two break points in the sixth game of the fourth

Sriram Balaji made an exit from the Wimbledon Championships along with Luke Johnson. Bhambri and Olivetti downed Kazakhstan duo of Alexander Bublik and Alexander Shevchenko 6-4, 6-4 in 58 minutes at court nine. — Agencies

CHOPRA SETS TO LEAD 28-MEMBER SQUAD IN PARIS

New Delhi, July 4: Defending champion Neeraj Chopra will headline a 28-member Indian athletics contingent at the Paris Olympics starting July 26. The squad comprises 17 men and 11 women athletes with some of the other prominent names being Asian Games champions Avinash Sable, Tejinderpal Singh Toor along with sprint hurdler Jyothi Yarraji, to name a few. The 4x400m men's relay team, featuring Muhammed Anas, Muhammed Ajmal, Amoj Jacob and Rajesh Ramesh, which had created quite a stir by leaving behind the USA team in one of the heats at the last World Championships. The track and field competition will be conducted at the Stade de France between August 1 to August 11. — PTI

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
