

MUMBAI: In November last year, as the ODI world champions Australia returned home, with captain Pat Cummins carrying his own luggage out of the airport, they were greeted by a handful of media personnel and a couple of black-tied officials. The welcome home for the T20 world champions of India, safe to say, had a fair few more. And then some. From the time Team India landed at 6am at Delhi airport, greeted by a huge gathering of supporters carrying placards, to

## Respect for LAC key, India reminds China

NEW DELHI: India and China should redouble efforts for "complete disengagement" of troops and restoring peace and tranquillity on the Line of Actual Control as part of efforts to normalise ties, external affairs minister S Jaishankar told his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi on Thursday. At a meeting with Wang on the margins of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit in the Kazakhstan capital of Astana, Jaishankar laid out India's imperatives for resolving the border issue, including respecting the LAC, and reiterated that "mutual respect, mutual sensitivity and mutual interest" will continue to guide bilateral relations. ## Hathras tragedy: Six held, no sign of Baba

GHAZIABAD: The Uttar Pradesh Police on Thursday arrested six people in connection with the stampede during a religious gathering in Hathras earlier this week, which claimed 121 lives, officials said. The self-styled godman "Bhole Baba", whom hundreds of thousands flocked to see ahead of the deadly tragedy and who remains at large, will be interrogated if required, they added. All those arrested worked as

'sevadars' or volunteers at the event, inspector general of police (Aligarh Range) Shalabh Mathur said and added that a search is underway to nab key accused and 'mukhya sevadar' (head volunteer) Devprakash Madhukar, who also went missing after the stampede, the deadliest in India since 2008. Madhukar was the only named accused in the FIR registered by the police in the connection with the incident, which exposed a raft of administrative failures. →P11

## Assam flood toll at 52 as rain fury continues

## 'I am not leaving': Biden doubles down despite growing discontent

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden continued to resist calls to make way for a younger Democratic candidate, even as two new polls showed him losing voters and more voices, both from within his party and liberal civil society, asked the 81-year-old incumbent to end his campaign after his debate performance last week. Although reports have suggested he is aware that the viability of his candidacy is under strain, Biden told his campaign staff, "Let me say this as clearly as I possibly can and as simply and straightforward as I can: I am running. I am the nominee of the Democratic Party. No one is pushing me out. I am not leaving." Biden's refusal to relent came on a day when a New York Times-Siena poll, conducted after the debate, showed 49% of likely voters supporting the presumptive Republican nominee, former President Donald Trump, while only 43% backed Biden. →P19

**HC again rebukes Guj over game zone blaze**

The Gujarat high court on Thursday again rebuked the state government over the Rajkot game zone fire that killed 27 people in May, asking why a demolition order against the illegal structure was not executed for nearly a year. The court came in response to an affidavit submitted to the division bench of Chief Justice Sunita Agarwal and Justice Pranav Trivedi that has been hearing a suo motu PIL (public interest litigation) it had taken up on May 26, a day after the tragedy. A demolition order was issued by the Rajkot Municipal Corporation (RMC). One year has passed since then (the order). Why was it not executed? Where is the answer? That demolition order proves that officials knew that the structure was illegal," the chief justice said. A welding spark triggered a fire at the TRP Game, which was gutted within minutes with many of the victims charred beyond recognition.

**Onion, potato prices continue to be high**

Prices of onion and potato, two basic grocery items, continue to be stubbornly high due to lower output last year, squeezing households. Tomato rates showed a moderation in June from a year ago, but the vegetable was way costlier compared to the previous month, according to official data. Officials are counting on robust kharif or summer planting to calm food inflation. Expanding summer sowing should have a "salutary effect" on market sentiment, which will bring down prices, one official said on condition of anonymity. Compared to a year ago, as on June 30, average wholesale onion rates rose 106%, from ₹1,260.66 a quintal (100kg) to ₹2,603.55 a quintal. Wholesale potato prices leaped to ₹2,116 a quintal to ₹1,076.14 a quintal, an increase of 96%.

**Sensex closes above 80,000 for first time in a new high**

Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty ticked higher to scale fresh all-time high levels on Thursday, following buying in market heavy-weights ICICI Bank, Infosys and TCS (Tata Consultancy Services) amid a largely positive trend in global equities. The 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 62.87 points or 0.08% to settle at a new closing peak of 80,049.67. During the day, it rallied 405.84 points to hit a fresh all-time high of 80,392.64. The Nifty rose 15.65 points or 0.06% to settle at a record closing peak of 24,302.15. Intra-day, it surged 114.5 points to hit a fresh lifetime high of 24,401. Among the Sensex pack, HCL Technologies, ICICI Bank, Tata Motors, Sun Pharmaceuticals, Tata Consultancy Services, Infosys, Kotak Mahindra Bank and Mahindra and Mahindra were the gainers. In contrast, HDFC Bank, Bajaj Finance, Larsen & Toubro, Tech Mahindra, UltraTech Cement and IndusInd Bank were among the laggards.



**INDIA bloc to get 8 front row seats in LS**

The 236 MP-strong INDIA bloc of opposition parties will get at least eight prized front row seats in the 18th Lok Sabha while the BJP will occupy another eight seats, after division numbers are allotted to the members before the next Parliament session. The seating arrangement reflects the relative strengths of the ruling and the Opposition benches after the Lok Sabha results in which the BJP won 240 seats (down from 303 in the 17th Lok Sabha) even as the Congress improved its tally to 99 (from 52). With Samajwadi Party's 37 MPs and Trinamool's 29, the Opposition has expanded its footprint in the Lok Sabha. The allotment of seats indicates the pecking order and the importance of MPs in their parties. A division number is the seat number of an MP, which is used during voting.

**Revealed: The secret of Delhi's Sabz Burj**

Sabz Burj, the Mathura Road landmark, is actually a tomb built by Mughal emperor Humayun for his mother Maham Begam, architectural historian Ebba Koch has suggested after analysing an embellished ceiling found during conservation work at the monument. Conservation architect Ratish Nanda of Aga Khan Trust for Culture, which executed an ambitious four-year-long conservation project on the monument that was completed in 2021, said the work revealed a painted ceiling that lay hidden under 20th century cement layers. Nanda said Vienna-based Ebba Koch made the startling suggestion last year in her book The Planetary King: Humayun Padshah, Inventor and Visionary on the Mughal Throne. The tomb, however, doesn't have any grave within. Ratish Nanda says that it was most likely stolen by antique hunters in the distant past.

# Challenges loom in India, B'desh talks over Ganga

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**NEW DELHI:** As India and Bangladesh prepare to begin negotiations to renew a nearly three-decade-old treaty for sharing the waters of the Ganga river, the impact of the climate crisis on water flows and the role of West Bengal government are emerging as crucial factors in the deal.

The Ganga is one of 54 rivers shared by India and Bangladesh and long-standing differences over the sharing of its waters were resolved with the signing of the Ganga Waters Treaty in December 1996 by then Indian premier HD Deve Gowda and his Bangladeshi counterpart Sheikh Hasina.

The treaty is up for renewal in 2026, and during Hasina's official visit to New Delhi last month Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced the two sides had decided to start technical negotiations for renewing it.

People familiar with the matter said on condition of anonymity that the effect of the climate crisis on the flow of the Ganga is a crucial issue that has to be factored into the negotiations. This is a factor that has had an impact on the flows of numerous cross-border rivers that traverse India, they said. "Studies on the impact of climate change on the Ganga will have to be a key part of the negotiations to ensure the treaty remains relevant and future-proof, covering all possible scenarios and contingencies," said one of the people cited above.

The people on both sides acknowledged the crucial role that will be played by the West Bengal government headed by chief minister Mamata Banerjee, given that states through which a cross-border river passes have to sign off on a water-sharing treaty or its renewal. In this context, the people pointed to Banerjee's role in holding up a treaty on the Teesta river, even though India and Bangladesh had agreed on the text as far back as 2011. The signing of the pact had to be put off due to opposition from the West Bengal government, which contended the treaty would leave parts of the state dry.

"The role of the West Bengal chief minister will be key to the efforts to renew the treaty, given that we have only about 18 months for negotiations on the renewal," a second person said.

Banerjee recently sent a letter to the PM arguing that the move to renew the Ganga Waters Treaty was "unilateral" and that the West Bengal government was not consulted. However, the people pointed out the Union Jal Shakti ministry set up an internal com-

mittee in July 2023 that included representatives of the Bihar and West Bengal governments.

West Bengal nominated its representative to the internal committee in August 2023, and participated in three of the panel's four meetings. The West Bengal government also sent a communication to the committee on April 5, 2024, that provided its drinking and industrial water requirements for inclusion in the Ganga Waters Treaty beyond 2026, the people said. The internal committee's final report, submitted on June 14, 2024, is being examined by the Jal Shakti ministry, which has also formed a joint technical committee to begin discussions with Bangladesh. HT reached to West Bengal government officials for a response but did not get one immediately.

On the Bangladesh side, there are concerns about any possible move to reduce the quantum of water provided to the country under the provisions of the treaty. "...Any reduction in the quantum of water will be disastrous and make it very difficult to sell the treaty to the public in Bangladesh," a third person said.

Under the terms of the treaty, when the availability of water at the Farakka barrage is 70,000 cusecs or less, India and Bangladesh share the water equally. When the availability is 70,000 cusecs to 75,000 cusecs, Bangladesh gets 35,000 cusecs and India the "balance of the flow". When the availability is 75,000 cusecs or more, India gets 40,000 cusecs and Bangladesh the balance of the flow. This is subject to the condition that India and Bangladesh each will receive guaranteed 35,000 cusecs in three alternate 10-day periods between March 11 and May 10 every year. The quantum for both countries was decided according to the 10-day average availability of water at Farakka between 1949 and 1988.

According to a report released by Kathmandu-based International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) in 2019, the climate crisis will begin altering water levels in the Ganga and the Brahmaputra over the next three decades, and the rivers could record an abrupt decrease in flow after 2050.

Experts stressed the need to "recalibrate" the treaty against the backdrop of climate crisis.

"In the dynamic context of climate change, the Ganges Treaty necessitates recalibration. As river flows shift, adaptive water allocation becomes paramount," said Arun Bhakta Shrestha, climate and environmental risks lead, ICIMOD.

# How polluted is the Yamuna? No data to tell

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**NEW DELHI:** No data has been made available on the water quality of the Yamuna or the major drains that bring sewage and effluents into it since February, which was the last time the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) uploaded a monthly report on its website with parameters such as biological oxygen (BOD), dissolved oxygen (DO) and faecal coliform.

Though mandated by the National Green Tribunal (NGT) to collect water samples from the Yamuna and all major drains emptying into the river, analysing it, and uploading detailed reports on its website, this has not been done for the last four months. Experts said the data is needed to analyse both the short- and long-term quality of the river water.

There was no response to queries sent by HT to the Delhi government, DPCC or the principal secretary (environment & forest) on why the data was no longer

being uploaded, or whether the body had stopped collecting samples altogether. In 2019, NGT gave directions that monthly data be made available on the DPCC website, with a report available for every month since January 2013 for the Yamuna, and since July 2019 for Delhi's drains.

DPCC also uploads reports on Delhi's sewage treatment plants (STPs) and common effluent treatment plants (CETPs), for which the latest reports are available till May this year. Water samples are collected manually from the Yamuna at eight locations - Palla (where the river enters Delhi), Wazirabad, ITO bridge, Okhla barrage, Agra canal, and finally Asgarpur (where the river exits Delhi). This includes parameters such as BOD, DO, chemical oxygen demand (COD), pH and faecal coliform. Similar testing is done for over 25 drains in Delhi.

BOD indicates amount of oxygen required by aquatic life and organisms in the river in order to

survive. The higher the BOD, the more difficult it is for aquatic life to survive. The BOD level in a river should be 3mg/l or less, but the last report from February shows BOD was less than this standard only at Palla (1.3 mg/l), before rising to 6.7 mg/l at Wazi-

rabad and 41 mg/l by the time the river reaches IBSB Kashmere Gate. It touched as high as 54 mg/l at Asgarpur.

The monthly reports also measure faecal coliform - bacteria living in the intestines of warm-blooded mammals, including humans, thus indicating the presence of sewage and human waste in the river. This ranged from 2,000 parts per million (PPM) at Palla to 250,000 PPM when it exits Delhi at Asgarpur in the February report. The acceptable limit for faecal coliform is 2,200 PPM.

In the same month, DPCC released its last monthly report on 28 drains of Delhi, showing that seven of these had "no flow", which means that there was no sewage or stormwater flowing through the drain, at the time of collection of samples. Of the remaining 21, no drain met the 30 mg/l BOD standard for drains.

"The absence of data means it is difficult to tell whether there is an improvement in the Yamuna, or if the situation has worsened," said Bhim Singh Rawat, a Yamuna activist and member of the South Asia Network on Dams,

Rivers and People (SANDRP).

DPCC had in May floated a tender to procure 22 online monitoring stations (OLMS) by the end of this year, to get real-time data on water quality.

**Dead fish in the Yamuna**

Images of dead fish floating in the Yamuna have also surfaced in the last few days - an indicator of low BOD and DO, but with missing data, it is hard to ascertain the exact reason behind the deaths, experts said. Locals said dead fish began showing up along the river floodplain about a fortnight ago, with the situation improving in the last few days, after rains.

"Till a fortnight back, we were getting several kilograms of dead fish washing up on the side of the river. At the time, the Yamuna's water appeared to be much worse than what it is now and the river flow was not as strong. Now, following rains, more water is being released from Haryana and the river is visibly cleaner," said Ram Sahni, a fisherman who looks for his daily catch north of Palla.

Trilochan Singh, a resident of Sabhapur village near Sonia Vihar, said cases of dead fish

showing up on the banks of the Yamuna is a common sight when the water levels are low and a high quantity of effluents are released into the river.

"We last heard about dead fish ending up on the floodplains around 10 days ago. No deaths have been reported since it began raining in Delhi, as the water level has increased. In a lot of cases, we also see tanneries in Haryana release a lot of chemicals directly into the river, which turns a bright shade of red in parts. We often see dead fish when this happens," said Singh.

Faiyaz Khudsar, scientist in-charge of DDA's biodiversity parks programme, said a drop in oxygen in the river generally occurs when the river is receiving a large quantity of sewage and effluents. "For the dissolved oxygen to improve, a lot of water needs to be released from Hathnikund barrage. After rains began last week, it appears the DO has started improving gradually," said Khudsar, saying that he last received images of dead fish along the river on June 30.

But, in the inexplicable absence of data, no one really knows.



## City's cleanest air in 297 days

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**NEW DELHI:** For Delhi residents, the rain over the past few days has brought relief not only from the sweltering heat, but also from the air pollution that incessantly plagues the city.

Delhi on Thursday recorded the cleanest air the city has seen in nearly 300 days, as the 24-hour average air quality index (AQI) reading fell to 61 in the satisfactory category. This is the best air Delhi has seen since September 11, 2023, when it was 53, according to Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) data.

On-and-off spells of rain in the city in the past 24 hours, coupled with strong winds, were the reason for the improvement in air quality, weather scientists said.

The rain also continued to offer relief from the heat. Overcast skies throughout the day meant that the maximum temperature in the city was lodged at 31.7 degrees Celsius (°C), six

degrees below what is considered normal for this time of the year. A day earlier on Wednesday, it was 34.1°C.

Delhi's minimum similarly fell to 24.8°C on Thursday, three notches below normal. It was 29°C on Wednesday.

The AQI reading is taken at 4pm daily, which is the average AQI of the previous 24 hours. On Wednesday, the 4pm reading was 108 (moderate). Prior to Thursday, the lowest AQI this year was 64 (satisfactory) on June 28, after Delhi saw a record-breaking spell of 228.1mm rain.

An AQI reading between 51 to 100 is classified as "satisfactory", between 101 and 200 is classified as "moderate", between 201 and 300 is classified as "poor", between 301 and 400 is classified as "very poor" and over 400 is "severe" by CPCB.

Forecasts by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said that light to moderate showers are likely in the Capital on Friday, with a yellow alert in place.

Over the weekend, only isolated light rain is expected, according to IMD's forecast.

"We saw patchy light rain in parts of Delhi in the early hours of Thursday. A spell was also seen post noon on Wednesday, with wind speeds ranging between 10-25 km/hr," said an IMD official.

### Monsoon trough

Mahesh Palawat, vice president at a private weather forecast company Skymet meteorology, said the monsoon trough was presently north of Delhi, and was likely to move further away from Delhi only on Saturday.

"On Friday, we can expect similar light to moderate showers. Isolated parts of Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh may even record heavy rain. From Saturday, the trough will move further north, closer to the foothills and away from Delhi," he said.

Delhi enjoys its best spell of air in the monsoon period, when a combination of rain and good

wind speed helps settle and disperse pollutants. The period between July and September is also generally the time Delhi has the highest chance of recording a "good" air day, when the AQI drops below 50. The last good air day in Delhi was on September 10, when the AQI was 45.

Delhi recorded moderate to light showers on Thursday, taking the total rainfall in the 24 hours preceding 8.30am to 9.2mm at Safdarjung, 17.4mm at Palam and 40.8mm at Anandgarh. Between 8.30am and 5.30pm on Thursday, Safdarjung recorded 0.6mm, Palam 0.2mm and Anandgarh 2.1mm.

Safdarjung has failed to record any rain in the first three days of the month. Since the monsoon arrived in Delhi on June 28, when 228.1mm was recorded; trace rainfall was recorded on June 29 and 8.9mm on June 30.

The forecast for Friday says that the maximum and minimum on Friday will be 33°C and 26°C respectively.

## Order on ED charges against CM on July 9

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**NEW DELHI:** A Delhi court will pronounce its order on Tuesday on taking cognisance of two supplementary charge sheets, including the one naming Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal, filed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in the money laundering case related to the now-scrapped Delhi excise policy.

Special judge Kaveri Baweja, while listing the matter on July 9, said it will pronounce orders on taking cognisance of the seventh supplementary charge sheet, naming Kejriwal and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) as accused, as well as the eighth supplementary charge sheet naming two other accused, Vinod Chauhan and Ashish Mathur, in the case.

ED, in its charge sheet, relied on chats between the Delhi CM and alleged hawala operators regarding alleged proceeds of crime in the case. The chats were allegedly recovered from the devices of the hawala operators after Kejriwal refused to share the password of his devices.

Close on the heels of naming Kejriwal, the agency named Vinod Chauhan, who it said facilitated transfer of ₹25.5 crores from Delhi to Goa during the Goa assembly elections of 2022 and arranged meetings of some high court judges with Kejriwal.

According to ED, the angadiyas who were involved in hawala transaction for transferring an amount to Goa confirmed to sluthes that the money was received from Ashish Mathur and Tara Singh. Further investigations by ED allegedly revealed both Mathur and Singh were associates of Vinod Chauhan. Mathur has not been arrested so far.

Chauhan's call detail record allegedly revealed that he was in touch with Ashok Kaushik, the

former private secretary of Bharatiya Rashtra Samiti (BRS) leader K Kavitha, linked to the so-called South Group in the excise case.

Kaushik in his statement recorded with ED admitted that, between June 2021 and August 2021, he collected cash-filled bags from businessman-turned-approver Dinesh Arora's office upon the directions of another accused Abhishek Boinpally and had them delivered to Vinod Chauhan.

The agency has also alleged that Chauhan was aware of the fact that the money amounting to ₹25.5 crore was related to the Delhi liquor excise policy scam as he was in deep nexus with the key conspirators of the alleged scam.

During the search conducted by ED, an amount of ₹1.06 crore was seized from Chauhan's residence. ED claimed he knew the amount was from the South Group and was holding it for some AAP leaders.

Kejriwal has denied all charges and the AAP has called it a "political vendetta". Kejriwal has also been arrested in a related case by CBI, and has challenged the action as "illegal".

## Tree-felling: BJP's pressure has silenced officials, claims AAP

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**NEW DELHI:** Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leaders on Thursday targeted the "silence" of bureaucrats and senior officials over the matter of tree-felling in Chhattarpur's ridge area to questions posed by the Delhi government ministers, adding that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) is putting "pressure" on them to not divulge details of the "illegally" hacked 1,100 trees.

AAP leader Jasmine Shah said that the city's forest department and DDA officials were both called by minister Saurabh Bhardwaj on Wednesday with files and reports on felling of

1,100 trees, but nobody turned up for the meeting.

He added that the BJP was turning a blind eye to this "environmental crime", despite its frequent posturing on pollution issues. With the matter now in the Supreme Court and the Delhi government's fact-finding committee demanding answers, the AAP leader alleged that the forest department's files are being withheld and questioned whether political pressure is at play.

The AAP has jumped into the tree-felling issue in the ridge as part of its ongoing tussle with the LG's office and the Delhi bureaucracy, citing emails that allegedly show the chain of vio-

lations.

"It is clear from the emails of DDA officials that the lieutenant governor had visited the Ridge area. Therefore, their role in this crime is clearly visible. In such a situation, the BJP should answer whether it had pressurised LG to get the trees cut?" Shah said.

He alleged that DDA officials were avoiding giving answers to the Supreme Court.

"Whose pressure is on them? When environment minister Gopal Rai asked for a report on the matter from forest department officials, those officials also became silent..." Shah said.

The BJP and the LG's office did not respond to queries on the matter.

## Key road in Sangam Vihar caves in due to DJB work

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**NEW DELHI:** Several portions of a road near Shani Bazar Bandh Road in Sangam Vihar caved in on Wednesday trapping vehicles, including water tankers and tractors. On Thursday, repair work was being carried out on the road, which still was not in a motorable condition.

A senior official of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) said the damaged road was developed by the irrigation and flood control department and pipeline work was being carried out by the Delhi Jal Board, which may have led to the incident. "The civic body has nothing to do with the damaged site," the official said, asking not to be named.

Roads in unauthorised colonies like Sangam Vihar are developed by agencies like the I&FC

department and the Delhi State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation.

HT reached out to the DJB which did not respond to queries seeking comments. "DJB is doing a 20-foot deep sewer line installation. Restoration will be soon done by DJB," said a spokesperson of the Delhi government.

Meanwhile, the Delhi BJP blamed the Delhi government for the poor quality of roads. "Since the onset of the monsoon, roads in unauthorised colonies have turned into a nightmare. Minister Atishi should explain how new roads could deteriorate to such an extent," Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva said.

## Atishi asks chief secy to stop the transfer of govt school teachers

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**NEW DELHI:** Delhi education minister Atishi on Thursday wrote to chief secretary Naresh Kumar, asking him to immediately halt the transfer of thousands of teachers who have completed 10 years at a particular state-run school. The minister also asked Kumar to initiate disciplinary proceedings against officers at the Directorate of Education (DoE), who "wilfully defied" her earlier directions to not transfer these teachers.

The development comes after DoE on June 11 issued a circular, mandating the compulsory transfer of teachers who have been at the same government school for 10 years.

Generally, the directorate invites transfer applications online, and interested candidates are asked to give an order of preference of the schools that they wish to be moved to. Teach-

ers who complete two years at a school are eligible to apply to seek transfers. People aware of the matter said the new DoE circular will affect at least 5,000 government teachers.

Atishi had on July 1 ordered DoE to immediately withdraw the circular, and on Wednesday issued cause notices to its director and secretary, asking them why action should not be initiated against them.

On Thursday, the minister, in her letter to Kumar, said that the DoE transfer order is not only in "blatant defiance" of her directions, but also in complete disregard to provisions of the National Education Policy 2020. She also directed Kumar to submit an action taken report within 48 hours of receiving her letter.

The chief secretary did not comment on the matter.

HT reached out to EoD, but officials there did not respond to queries for comment.

## ACB TO INSPECT 120 PVT HOSPITALS, NURSING HOMES FROM TODAY

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**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi Anti-Corruption Branch (ACB) will on Friday begin conducting inspections of 120 private hospitals and nursing homes across the Capital as part of its drive against medical institutes in the city violating norms, officials said.

The officials said that this is the second phase of the drive—ACB had last month inspected 65 medical institutes in northeast and east Delhi. The inspections were done on orders of lieutenant governor VK Saxena after a massive fire at a Vivek Vihar nursing home on May 25 led to the deaths of six newborn babies.

"Beginning Friday, ACB will start conducting raids at 120 big, medium and small size hospitals in Delhi. Earlier, we had only covered a few hospitals near Shahdara. Now, raids will be conducted in south, southeast, north, and west Delhi, among other areas," ACB chief Madhur Verma said.

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**NEW DELHI:** The fight between Delhi and Haryana over water, played out on several platforms, including the Supreme Court, is set to intensify next year with the end of the 30-year agreement between five Yamuna basin states in 1994 that resulted in the creation of the Upper Yamuna River Board. The agreement will now have to be renegotiated.

Delhi depends primarily on its neighbours for its water supply (to the tune of 86.5%, actually) and its share of Yamuna water is a function of the 1994 water-sharing agreement signed between the chief ministers of five north Indian riparian states. Three decades later, with water shortages visible across north India, experts say that achieving a fresh consensus will be difficult. There are also demands to reform the Upper Yamuna River Board, which governs the river from its origin till the Okhla barrage in Delhi.

At the peak of the water crisis, standing besides the dry Yamuna river at Wazirabad barrage, Delhi water minister Atishi said that the annual water shortage crisis faced by the Capital can be solved only by higher water allocation under the renegotiation of water-sharing agreement. She argued that the population of Delhi has grown manifold and people have migrated to Delhi seeking better life and employment opportunities. To be sure, Delhi's population in 1994 was 10 million. It is now estimated to be over 21 million, according to National Commission on Population's projections.

But the other signatories have also seen a commensurate rise. For instance, Haryana's Gurugram was a village in the early 1990s. It is now a city with a population of over 2 million.

A senior Haryana government functionary said: "The review of water allocation issue is due next year. Hence, it is too early to comment on this matter. Delhi has every right to seek more share. Similarly, Haryana will also demand more. But the issue is how much water is available at source."

## Tenure of watershed deal nears end: Yamuna sharing talks to start next yr

According to the 1994 agreement, there shall be an interim seasonal allocation of the "annual utilisable flow" of Yamuna. For Delhi, the allocation in July-October is to be 0.580 billion cubic metres (bcm), in November-February it is to be 0.068bcm, and it is 0.076bcm for the March-June period. A bcm translates to around a 1,000 billion litres of water.

The agreement was signed by the chief ministers of Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh (Uttarakhand was not still a separate state) on May 12, 1994. Clause 7(3) of the agreement states that allocation of available flows among the states will be regulated by a board. Accordingly, the central government constituted Upper Yamuna River Board (UYRB) on March 11, 1995 as a subordinate office of Ministry of Water Resources (MoWR) with its headquarters in RK Puram Sector-4.

In its mission statement, UYRB states that it aims at optimal utilisation of waters of Yamuna up to Okhla, maintaining the ecology of the river and supply of water to the basin state. Experts and stakeholders say that the performance of the board on each of these parameters should be examined when the renegotiation happens.

Despite the establishment of UYRB, disputes over water sharing among the member states have persisted. With a rise in population, increasingly frequent

heat waves, haphazard urbanisation, the demand for water continues to rise, exacerbating the situation especially during May-June. Not only Delhi and Haryana, even the states such as Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan have demanded a larger share to support their irrigation needs.

Bhim Singh Rawat, a Yamuna activist, and member of the South Asia Network on Dams, Rivers and People (SANDRP) said that over the years UYRB has become a totally opaque organisation with a non-functional website and inadequate staffing. Worse, minutes of its meetings are no longer made public.

A senior Delhi government official said that the board has not been able to successfully mediate water-sharing allocation disputes between the member states with issues frequently landing in courts. "We have approached the Supreme Court during the summer months thrice in last few years. Ideally, the board should have been empowered enough to resolve these issues but it faces structural issues," the official said.

The board has met 58 times during its existence—less than twice a year over the last three decades and the chief ministers' committee has only met seven times. Hathnikund barrage acts the primary regulation point for release of the Yamuna water for Delhi. Delhi water minister Atishi has demanded that flow meters must be installed at the Hathni-

kund barrage to measure the flow of the water upgrading the archaic system being used now. "We cannot say for sure if the neighbouring state is indeed providing us with as much water as allocated to us. UYRB or Haryana should install flow meters at this critical point," she said.

Rawat from SANDRP said that there has been unscientific allocation of water among the states as well for the river, almost killing the river. "Rajasthan is added as a basin state for Yamuna even though it has no direct connection to the river. Only 10 cumecs (or the flow of 10,000 litres per second) of water has been left for the river as ecological flow and even the National Institute of Hydrology has established that is insufficient and the river should have at least 25 cumecs (flow of 25,000 litres per second) water." The release of water needs an independent monitoring, he added.

The board also faces human resource challenges. In 1999, the ministry of water resources approved creation of 58 permanent posts at UYRB but the ministry later—via two office memorandums on March 19, 2015 and November 3, 2017—abolished 36 posts of board as they were lying vacant. As per another ministry order on October 27, 2020, the sanctioned strength of UYRB was only 22. Of these 22 sanctioned posts, 17 posts have further gone under the deemed abolished category.

Rawat said that the board is only functioning with five officers with a few other on deputation. "UYRB has become a formality and needs major overhaul," he added.

UYRB did not comment despite repeated calls and emails.

Diwan Singh, water expert and environmental activist who organised the Yamuna Satyagrah for rejuvenating the river and other water bodies in the city, says that the board needs to be empowered to take tough decisions.

"Besides the water shortages, the river has suffered the most as the ecological flow is not present in the river channel. Delhi has on multiple occasions used the legal route to get additional water against its original 719 cusecs allocation which was raised to 1049 cusecs in 1996 to meet domestic needs and later for getting water from Punjab. Delhi is growing unsustainably and it should look at demand management rather than being greedy about more and more water," he said.

Delhi's repeated appeals to the Supreme Court for additional water are not new. In 1995, environmentalist Commodore Sureshwar Dhari Sinha filed a PIL the apex court of India under Article 32 of the Constitution seeking directions for maintenance of a consistent flow of water in the Yamuna River amid a drinking water shortage in Delhi.

Singh said that the allocation for Delhi reached 1,049 cusecs (around 30 cumecs) in 1996 after Delhi's petition in Supreme Court. "In 2000, Delhi also got additional 125 cusecs water from Ravi Beas system (Bhakra storage)," he added. However, he cautioned that prioritising Delhi's demand over other states would not be judicious, adding that the renegotiation should also ask the states to use treated wastewater for non-potable uses in larger proportions.


Rawat agreed. "Delhi is increasing its dependence on river. It should think of modern alternatives of treated water, ground water recharge strategies and other ways," he said. "In this tussle between the states, someone will have to also look at the rights of the river Yamuna."

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## Sabz Burj scoop

On an overlooked monument's past

**{ PUBLIC INTEREST }** Looming tall on a traffic circle, outside the Humayun Tomb complex, it is one of Delhi's most overlooked monuments.


The Mathura Road landmark is colloquially known as Neela Gumbad — for neela (blue) tiles adorn the dome. The 16th century building's actual name of Sabz Burj comes from the sabz (Persian for green) tiles on its neck. Among the earliest Mughal monuments in India — older than even Humayun's tomb — it has long been believed to be a tomb. Who built it and for whom has remained a mystery.

We now have answers never reported before in the news media. Conservation architect Ratish Nanda of Aga Khan Trust for Culture, which executed an ambitious four-year-long conservation project on the monument, says: "Our work on Sabz Burj revealed a painted ceiling that lay hidden under 20th century cement layers. It is pure gold and pure lapis, a privilege accorded only to buildings associated with royalty. This rich embellishment, as well as the Timurid architectural style, and the monument's proximity to Hazrat Nizamuddin's sufi shrine, led renowned Mughal architectural historian Professor Ebba Koch to conclude that Sabz Burj was a tomb built by second Mughal emperor Humayun for his mother Maham Begam, wife of Emperor Babar, the first Mughal."

Vienna-based Ebba Koch made the startling suggestion last year in her book *The Planetary King: Humayun Padshah, Inventor and Visionary on the Mughal Throne*. "Its (Sabz Burj) elegant and sophisticated design and the precious building decoration suggest that the building was a royal commission. Who but Humayun would have been able to afford such a fine vault... His mother, Maham Begam, had died in 1533, and after the forty days of mourning, he came to Delhi to found his new city, Dinpanah, near the dargah of Nizamuddin. Could it be that he took Maham Begam's body with him to bury her in a tomb he constructed for her close to the dargah, so that she could benefit from the blessings and spiritual powers associated with the resting place of the great saint of Delhi?"

The tomb, however, doesn't have any grave within. Ratish Nanda says that it was most likely stolen by antique hunters in the distant past, a fate common to many other mausoleums. The grave must have been of marble sculpted with floral patterns and religious calligraphies, he says.

In colonial times, the British turned the tomb into a police station, before the garden around it was razed down to make way for a busy road. Whatever, in the light of new insights, this monument ought to be seen as the cradle of all the Mughal monuments. Being the possible burial place of the first Mughal matriarch from whom came the rest of the Mughals.

## Ggm teen who strangled 9-year-old also booked for sexual assault: Cops

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**GURUGRAM:** The Gurugram Police on Thursday added charges of sexual assault to the case against a 16-year-old juvenile in conflict with the law, who was apprehended for allegedly murdering a nine-year-old girl and trying to burn her body at a residential society on Monday.

Police said they added Section 8 of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (Pocso) Act based on the boy's confession and circumstantial evidence indicated by him. The results of the autopsy of the girl's body were still awaited, investigators said.

"It was a challenge to make him reveal the truth; he tried to mislead us throughout two days. We had to adopt a friendly conversation to ensure he felt comfortable and reveal (details) before his custody ended Thursday. He revealed that the victim was fond of watching magic tricks and he often showed her such tricks, while touching her inappropriately," said assistant commissioner of police (ACP) Naveen Kumar.

As per law, whoever commits sexual assault shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term, which shall

not be less than three years, but which may extend to five years, and shall also be liable to a fine, under the Pocso Act.

Kumar said that during the incident on Monday, the boy told them that upon reaching the victim's house, kissed her and tried to force himself on her.

"The boy revealed that he tried to force himself on the girl. When she raised the alarm and threatened to tell her mother, he panicked. He confessed to forcefully kissing the girl and, under the pretext of showing magic, touching her inappropriately. He sexually harassed the girl in the past too, but she never alerted her parents," he said.

To be sure, earlier police said that he strangled the girl to death when she caught him trying to steal her mother's jewellery, and that he was desperate to repay

debts incurred while gambling. He used naphthalene balls and camphor to try and burn the body, according to police.

The juvenile was produced before the juvenile justice board (JJB) on Thursday after his two-day protective custody ended and was sent to an observation home in Faridabad. He will be produced before JJB on July 17.

ACP Kumar said they recovered the laptop and cellphone of the boy's mother for electronic evidence collection. "We will write to the platforms used by the boy; the reports will take at least 45 days. We will get more clarity on his plan and whether he had planned the murder by watching a Hindi true-crime TV show," he said.

Kumar said the boy revealed the entire sequence of events, starting from the morning till the time he was caught and everything has been brought on record.

Ambika Yadav, a senior legal counsel at the Gurugram court, said that as per Section 15 of the Juvenile Justice Act, the JJB must conduct a preliminary evaluation of the child's mental and physical capacity to commit the heinous offence in order to determine whether the child has to be tried as an adult under the Bhatiya Dand Sanhita.

## Women's 181-helpline begins ops under WCD

**NEW DELHI:** The women and child development (WCD) department of the Delhi government has taken over the management of the women helpline number 181, which was previously handled by the Delhi Commission for Women (DCW), and the services have been resumed, the Delhi government said in a statement on Thursday.

The 181-helpline started receiving calls at the control room from 4.58pm on Wednesday, and received 1,024 calls till 2pm on Thursday, it added.

The 181-helpline had stopped working from July 1 and callers

were being advised to make a call to 112 for assistance. The arrangement was made to ensure the transition of the helpline from DCW to the WCD department.

Delhi WCD minister Kailash Gahlot said: "The women helpline 181 has resumed its operation now under the ambit of WCD. It will act as a robust support system for women in Delhi."

Meanwhile, former DCW chairperson Swati Maliwal criticised men attending to calls on the helpline. She posted on X in Hindi: "This helpline is now being run by men. Girls who call to report heinous crimes like rape and trafficking will hang up the phone as soon as they hear the voice of a boy!"

## 'COURT PRACTICES A CONCERN': LAWYERS CITE CM'S HEARINGS

**NEW DELHI:** Citing the recent hearings in cases concerning Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal, over 150 advocates practising in Delhi on Thursday presented a representation to Chief Justice of India (CJI) Dhananjaya Y Chandrachud, voicing concerns over "unprecedented practices" in the Delhi high court and trial courts. The letter, signed by advocates including Sanjeev Nasaria, head of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) legal cell, alleged procedural irregularities and potential conflicts of interest.

The representation raised questions about the actions of high court judge Sudhir Kumar Jain, complaining that justice Jain allowed the Enforcement Directorate (ED) to challenge an order granting bail to Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal, even before it was uploaded. This action led to the stay of the execution of Kejriwal's bail bonds, issued by special judge Niyay Bindu on June 20, and finally, suspension of Bindu's order.

The advocates argued that justice Jain should have recused himself from the proceedings due to a conflict of interest, claiming that his brother is a counsel for ED, adding that this conflict was not declared by the judge. It also highlighted an alleged internal administrative order issued by the district judge of Rouse Avenue court soon after Kejriwal's bail order, directing all vacation courts to refrain from giving final orders in any matter. Terming this purported order administratively irregular, the letter contended that it contradicted the CJI's call for trial courts to make speedy decisions to avoid overburdening higher courts.

## Can't shame victims of sexual assault: HC

**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi high court has said that shaming a victim of sexual assault or their family cannot be allowed as tools of legal strategy in cases of sexual offences against minors as it deters them from reporting such offences to the authorities.

Upholding the three-year jail term awarded to a house help for secretly recording objectionable videos of the minor daughter of his employer on his phone, justice Swarna Kanta Sharma also discouraged taking a "lenient view" in such cases.

She asserted that judicial pronouncements that recognise the profound impact of voyeurism put a "healing balm" on the wounds of victims of such harassment and assault.

The accused challenged his conviction on several grounds including that the videos were prepared and planted by the father of the victim because he did not want to pay his salary.

Terming the contention "insensitive" and "unthinkable", justice Sharma said the court must uphold the dignity and rights of not only the child victims but also their families.

"The Court must... take a firm stand against any attempts to malign the character of child victims... as tools and pawns in legal strategies... shaming must not be allowed as it will be a deterrent and roadblock in the real victims reporting such offences to the authorities," said the court in its judgement passed on July 1.

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# Mohalla buses likely to begin ops by July-end

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**NEW DELHI:** Delhi transport minister Kailash Gahlot on Thursday said the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government's Mohalla bus service, which will ensure bus connectivity on internal city roads, will likely be launched by the end of the month.

"Mohalla buses are meant for last-mile connectivity and will ply on shorter routes not covered by the current Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) or Cluster service that comprises large 12-metre buses. These will act as neighbourhood or feeder bus networks... We have divided the depots and routes into four zones where these buses will ply. We are now finalising the routes and will hopefully be able to start the service by the month's end," Gahlot said.

"The buses have been coloured green for easy identification. Additionally, 25% of the seats (six seats) are pink, reserved for women. Women can also avail free rides on these buses through pink passes," he added.


The Mohalla buses will have 23 passenger seats. Transport department officials said these have a 196kW battery, providing a range of 120-130km, allowing it to easily complete 10-15 round trips on a single charge.

A total of 2,080 such buses are being procured by the Delhi government from two manufacturers at present, officials said.

Officials said the transport department has identified 16 depots in four zones — north, south, east and west — where the buses will be deployed. They said the service will likely be launched with 50 nine-metre electric buses from the Ghazipur and East Vinod Nagar bus depots, and the number of buses will be gradually scaled up.

## Mohalla buses soon hit the road

Officials added that the areas close to these depots will benefit most from the buses, expected to make multiple trips in loops through the day.

"Kushak Nallah in the south zone is the largest depot, which is spread across 10.5 acres. This will be able to accommodate 350 buses. The south zone will have one more depot at Ambedkar Nagar, that will have 180 buses," an official said, asking not to be named.

The department expects to operate 2,180 such buses by 2025. The buses and the electrification process were inspected at the Dwarka depot by the transport minister on Tuesday.

By the end of 2025, Delhi aims to have a total of 10,480 buses, out of which 80% will be electric. Additionally, efforts are underway to electrify over 60 depots, with 16 depots already fully operational.

In Delhi, over 4,000,000 bus trips are completed by commuters daily, using 7,582 DTC and cluster buses.

Experts said that the Mohalla bus service could be a potential game-changer in the public

transport system, contributing to the overall development.

"By leveraging the flexibility of buses and tailoring services to meet the needs of local communities, this initiative has the potential to revolutionise public transportation in Delhi and beyond," said Amit Bhatt, managing director (India), International Council of Clean Transport (ICCT) that jointly organised an international consultation last year and also presented two pilot route plans from Delhi Secretariat for the Mohalla bus service.

## SANGAM VIHAR ROAD RAGE: MAN WHO STABBED AUTO DRIVER HELD

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**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi Police on Thursday arrested a 19-year-old man in connection with the stabbing of an auto-rickshaw driver in Sangam Vihar on Wednesday evening. Officers said a tanker driver, who ran over a friend of the accused, was arrested and later released, on condition that he appear for questioning upon being summoned.

Deputy commissioner of police (south) Ankit Singh identified the accused as Arif Khan. His friend Shahdab Alam died after being run over by a Delhi Jal Board tanker when they were pelting stones at the vehicle after it splashed water from a puddle on them.

Police said the control room received a call around 4.30pm on Wednesday about the stabbing. They said that the accused stabbed auto driver Bablu Ahmed, when he enquired about the incident and the ruckus.

Tanker driver Sapan Singh, drove the vehicle while trying to save himself and ran over Alam. "He stopped the vehicle and fled the spot," a police officer said.

Alam, a welder by profession, was taken to a private hospital nearby where he was declared dead. A case under sections 106 (I) (rash and negligent driving leading to death) and 281 (rash driving) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita was registered.

## Scrap end-of-life vehicles caught a 2nd time: Govt

**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi transport department has announced that all end-of-life vehicles (ELV) impounded for a second time by the department will directly be sent to scrapping facilities and will not be returned to their owners. The directions came as the department issued an order notifying guidelines to handle such vehicles on Thursday.

The guidelines were notified after the Delhi high court, on August 22 last year, asked the transport department to frame a policy on the issue and clarify the process to the owners of such vehicles.

"These guidelines are required for effective implementation of various directions of NGT and improvement of air quality in Delhi. Further, a large number of junk vehicles are found abandoned at public places which need to be disposed of in an environment-friendly manner," the guidelines said.

No vehicle which is older than 15 years is allowed to operate on Delhi roads, according to orders issued by the National Green Tribunal (2015) and the Supreme Court (2018). For diesel vehicles, this time period is 10 years. These rules are meant to cut down on the number of vehicles on the city's roads with dated emission standards.

The department said that the ELVs can either be transferred to another state or kept in private parking spaces if the owners give an undertaking, specifying details of the private parking space.

"A parking space which has been allotted to the owner inside the residential complex will be considered as a private parking space. Proof of private parking space within the premises of applicant is to be submitted by the applicant, which can be an allotment letter from the RWA or any other authority concerned," the guidelines added.

In any other case apart from these two scenarios, the ELVs found in public places will be

towed away for scrapping and a penalty of ₹10,000 will be imposed along with towing charges on the owner. In the case of two-wheelers, this amount will be ₹5000, along with towing charges.

To be sure, vehicular emissions contribute only around 9% of the PM10 load and around 20% of the PM2.5 load in Delhi, according to a 2016 study by IIT-Kanpur. Particles formed due to smoke from industries and various other sources and burning of garbage were the two main contributors to air pollution in winters, according to preliminary findings of the Delhi government's real-time source apportionment study in January, 2023.

**NEW DELHI:** A man in his late 20s allegedly shot himself dead outside the house of a woman known to him in Sector 17, Rohini, on Thursday, police said, adding that they recovered a suicide note purportedly written by the victim. In the note, the man wrote about "his affair with the woman" due to which he took the extreme step, said an officer.

## Woman assaults auto driver for not giving way to her bike

**NEW DELHI:** A woman riding a bike assaulted an auto driver with a hockey stick in Nihal Vihar on Thursday, police officers aware of the matter said, adding that the incident stemmed from a matter of road rage. The officers said the age of the suspect is yet to be ascertained — she appeared to be in her late teens, and could be a minor.

Locals and bystanders said the incident occurred after an argument broke out between the suspect and the victim over giving way, which led to the assault.

A purported video of the incident, captured by the locals, was circulated widely on social media. In the video, the woman allegedly beat up the driver, who was trying to protect himself. At first, she took a hockey stick and hit him on the head

multiple times. She then threw the stick and assaulted the auto driver with another unidentified weapon, even as onlookers gathered at the spot.

The video also showed a few people questioning the woman and scolding her for assaulting the victim. She then accused the auto driver of being "drunk". The bystanders, however, defended the victim, saying he needed immediate medical help, to which she replied: "I didn't kill him", and then rode away.

A senior officer said police have taken cognisance of the video. "We are talking to the auto driver and will soon apprehend the woman," the officer said.

## Govt reviews plans to roll out ₹1,000 scheme for city women

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**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi government has started formulating a policy and fine-tuning conditions for the Mahila Samman Yojana, a scheme to provide financial assistance of ₹1,000 per month to every woman in the city. The scheme was announced by the government during its annual budget in March this year.

Women and child develop-

ment minister Kailash Gahlot held the first meeting on Wednesday to review the progress of the scheme and asked officials to refer to the policies of states running similar schemes. The only two existing schemes which are similar are the Mukhyamantri Majhi Ladki Bahan Yojana in Maharashtra and the Ladli Behna Yojana of Madhya Pradesh.

"During the meeting, the minister directed officials to work on details like eligibility criteria,

income group and employment status, age group, socio-economic background and other details. We are working on finalising the plan," an official from the minister's office said.

Officials added that factors such as car ownership and loan details may be considered while setting these criteria. The goal is to create a comprehensive framework that ensures the scheme reaches those who need it the most, officials added.

## NBCC seeks Gurugram admin nod to demolish condo declared 'unsafe'

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**GURUGRAM:** The National Buildings Construction Corporation Limited (NBCC) has sought permission from the Gurugram district administration to demolish seven towers at the agency's Green View condominium complex in Sector 37 D — nearly two years after the towers were declared "unsafe for habitation" by the district administration, after a structural audit report submitted by IIT-Roorkee and Central Building Research Institute.

If approved, Green View will be the second residential complex in Gurugram after Chintels Paradiso to be demolished due to structural issues.

deputy commissioner Nishant Yadav, the head of NBCC's real estate division said that according to an order issued by the district magistrate-cum-chairperson of the District Disaster Management

Authority (DDMA) on February 17, 2022, it has been highlighted that there was an imminent danger to the life and property of residents of the society (NBCC Green View) due to structural issues

within the premises. "We kindly request your approval... in facilitating the demolition of towers/buildings to mitigate any further risks posed by the unstable structures," the letter said.

Yadav said the administration will "examine the matter in detail and take a decision accordingly."

The NBCC Green View project was launched in 2010 and the possession was given in 2017. The condominium has 784 apartments in seven towers apart from 139 EWS flats. A homeowner said 255 of the 784 flats had been sold.

The district administration on February 17, 2022, invoked the National Disaster Management Act 2005 and declared the condominium unsafe for residents.

# 16-year-old girl rescued from fire in East of Kailash house

**NEW DELHI:** A 16-year-old girl was rescued from a fire that erupted in a residential building in East of Kailash early Thursday, fire department officials said, adding there was no injury reported in the incident. It took four hours for the fire department to put out the flames and the cause was uncertain, officials said.

Delhi Fire Services director Atul Garg said the fire broke out in F-Block around 5.50am and eight fire tenders were pressed into service. The building comprised a basement, stilt parking, upper-ground, first, second and third floors, he said.

"The entire building caught fire. There were offices and shops on the upper-ground floor and three floors above that were inhabited by families," he said.

Additional divisional officer Yashwant Meena, who responded to the fire call, said: "There is no clarity on where the fire started from but at the spot, people said that fire started from an air conditioner on the first floor and then spread to the upper ground, second and third

floors. There was so much smoke. Most people managed to come out of the building themselves."

Meena said that a clinic and salon on the upper-ground floor were shut at the time of the incident.

While all inhabitants exited the building, the 16-year-old girl was stuck on a balcony of her second-floor house. "She got

scared and didn't come out. A fireman climbed up a ladder and helped bring her down. She was unhurt," Meena said.

Officials said the fire was controlled by 9am and the flames were doused by 9.50am.

Meena said that most possessions in all residences were gutted. "Only a few things may have been saved. Everything was burnt," Meena said.

## TWO INJURED IN ASSAULT BY SIX PEOPLE IN SOUTHEAST DELHI

**NEW DELHI:** Two people were injured after a group of five to six men assaulted them on a busy road in Jaitpur, southeast Delhi, on Wednesday night, police said.

Deputy commissioner of police (southeast) Rajesh Deo said police received a call at 10.12 pm regarding the incident. A team reached the spot and found two men, Akash Kumar and Vishal Kumar, injured. They were taken to a hospital for medical attention, police officers aware of the matter said.

A CCTV footage of the incident surfaced on social media on Thursday. The video ostensibly showed one of the victims pinned down on the road by the suspects who kicked and punched him. The assault continued for nearly 45 minutes till some locals intervened and stopped the attackers.

"One of the suspects was identified as Nikhil Singh alias Nicky. A case of attempt to commit culpable homicide has been registered under section 110(3/5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). The motive of the fight was a petty dispute. We are investigating the matter," said Deo.

the way, when Rohit and his men were still mid-air, halfway into their flight to Mumbai from Delhi.

When the "Mumbai ka raja" and his triumphant troops finally made their way atop an open-air bus to kick-start their victory parade -- around 2.5 hours later than the original schedule that left many standing on the streets a touch restless -- the multitude assembled by the breezy Queen's Necklace let loose.

Virat Kohli, amid deafening chants of "Kohli, Kohli", began the public party by first holding aloft the World Cup trophy and then kissing it. Hardik Pandya also stood right in front, animating fist-bumping to the masses

as they reciprocated the love. This was the same man who was often heavily booed by fans playing in and for the same city in the Indian Premier League a couple of months ago. Jasprit Bumrah and his gang of match-winning bowlers took turns to step forward and engage with the crowd.

Standing towards the centre of the bus, Rohit and Rahul Dravid, the captain-coach duo, lifted each other's arms and hugged. Rohit would gradually head to the back of the bus and wave along, leading from behind for a change. And Dravid being Dravid, retreated to clicking pictures of his boys having the time of their lives.

"I am going to miss this love," Dravid said at Wankhede Sta-

dium. "What we have seen today is absolutely incredible. What we have seen ever since we landed in India is incredible. I have been told that these scenes were witnessed all over India."

As a player, Dravid never got the feel of this as a World Cup winner. As a country, it had been over a decade since its cricket team was placed on a pedestal and paraded through the streets.

Everyone who flocked the stretch of road in South Mumbai, coming from far and away pockets of the city, wanted a piece of the champions. From the men who'd climbed through branches of trees to those who'd checked into a posh five-star overlooking the street and were clicking pictures through their

room windows. From a wheelchair-bound woman and a budding para badminton player to those free-spirited college kids who were too young to remember the rare times such scenes were witnessed in the history of Indian cricket.

Rahul Shah, one such teen from a nearby college that he bunked for the day, said he would get goosebumps seeing visuals on television of MS Dhoni and his team being similarly paraded through the city's streets the last time India were world T20 champions back in 2007.

This time, through a belated bash that began in Barbados and carried on in Mumbai via a quick stopover in Delhi, he had seen it in person.

# 6 'sevadars' held over Hathras tragedy, preacher still at large

**GHAZIABAD:** The Uttar Pradesh Police on Thursday arrested six people in connection with the stampede at a religious gathering in Hathras that claimed 121 lives earlier this week, officials said, adding that self-styled godman, "Bhole Baba" whom hundreds of thousands flocked to see, remains at large.

While those arrested are 'sevadars' or volunteers of the event, a search is on to nab key accused and 'mukhya sevadar' (head volunteer) Devprakash Madhukar, who went missing after the stampede, the deadliest in India since 2008. A reward of ₹1 lakh will be announced for information on Madhukar and a non-bailable warrant (NBW) will also be issued against him, the officials added.

Officials also said that a process has been initiated to remove Madhukar as supervisor in MGNREGA work across 20 panchayats. "All six people who have been arrested worked as 'sevadars'. They were arrested by officials of Hathras Kotwali and Sikandra Rau police stations. A reward of ₹1 lakh will be announced soon and NBW will also be issued against key accused Madhukar," inspector general of police (Aligarh Range) Shalabh Mathur said. Those arrested were Ram Ladaite (50), Upendra Singh Yadav (62), Megh Singh (61), Mukesh Kumar (38), and women Manju Yadav (30) and Manju Devi (40) — all from Mainpuri, Firozabad and Hathras.

"During the course of interrogation, police learnt that the arrested people are members of the organising committee and work as 'sevadars'. They also followed a dress code while working as 'sevadars'. On the day of the incident, the 'sevadars' tried to stop the crowd from proceeding towards Baba's vehicle (when he was leaving). They later left the crowd to take 'charan dhul' (dust left from feet)," Mathur said.

"These 'sevadars' made sure people did not prepare any videos

and also did not allow police intervention in the internal cordon (at the event venue)," he added.

At least 121 people, most of them women and children, were killed in the stampede on Tuesday afternoon as they attempted to leave the haphazardly organised 'satsang' by "Bhole Baba", a 65-year-old man originally named Suraj Pal, a former cop, who remains at large.

The event was held at a partially covered field in Phulari Mughal Garhi, a village roughly 200km from Delhi, and far from any major centre with medical facilities to handle a mass casualty event. Around 250,000 people attended the event, beyond the allotted permission of 80,000, underlining a string of lapses by the organisers and administration.

On Wednesday, chief minister Yogi Adityanath announced a judicial investigation led by a retired high court judge, even as "Bhole Baba" blamed "anti-social elements" for the stampede. Police filed an FIR against Madhukar and unnamed organisers under various sections of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

## Rahul to visit Hathras today

**LUCKNOW:** Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi will visit Hathras on Friday to meet the families of the victims of the stampede that claimed 121 lives earlier this week. Uttar Pradesh Congress president Ajay Rai told news agency PTI: "Our leader Rahul Gandhi will visit Hathras on Friday.

He will meet the family members of the victims of the incident," said Rai.

Earlier in the day, Rai blamed the state government for the incident.

The stampede occurred at 'satsang' of self-styled godman Narayan Sakar Hari, also known as Bhole Baba, on Tuesday. HTc

Asked about "Bhole Baba's" role, Mathur said the role of any person will be ascertained on the basis of evidence. "The arrests will depend upon the investigating officer and evidence collected. The organisers who had taken permission for the event and not Baba have been named in FIR," he said.

Mathur's remarks came as a team of police entered the ashram premises of "Bhole Baba" in Mainpuri to check security arrangement. "He (Baba) was

neither there yesterday (Wednesday) nor today," circle officer Sunil Kumar Singh said. Asked why police entered the ashram, he said, "We are not here for a probe. We are here to check security."

Meanwhile, Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav hit out at Adityanath for suspecting a "conspiracy". "Look, there can't be a conspiracy in this. The conspiracy could be that the government wants to run away from its responsibility," he said.

## CHAOS CAUSED BY OUTSIDERS, WILL COOPERATE, SAYS BABA VIA LAWYER

**GHAZIABAD:** The lawyer of Suraj Pal, also known as Narayan Sakar Hari and "Bhole Baba", on Thursday visited the people who were injured in the stampede earlier this week and reiterated the self-styled godman's claims that the chaos, which resulted in 121 deaths, was caused by "anti-social elements". Advocate AP Singh, authorised by Pal to represent him and take legal action in the incident, said the stampede was caused by "outside people" who were probably in an "inebriated state".

"All the injured people admitted in Aligarh told me that there was some ruckus created by some outside people and this finally ended up in a stampede. Similar opinion was shared by the injured women admitted at the Hathras district hospital. They told me that these men were outsiders and were possibly in an inebriated state. They also said that these outsiders were never seen attending any satsangs or any religious congregation by Narayan Sakar Hari," he said after he met the victims at Aligarh district hospital and several women at Bagla district hospital in Hathras.

The lawyer also visited the stampede site on Thursday.

"The site is quite huge and wide and it has many entry/exit points. There were no barricades here and there was no obstruction. The Baba left 20-25 minutes before the stampede started. It was due to some anti-social elements. Narayan Sakar Hari is never seen publicly and comes only to attend 'satsangs' and religious events. We will cooperate with the investigation. We have full faith in law and the Constitution and we are law abiding citizens," he said.

# Self-styled Baba owns assets worth ₹100+ cr

**KANPUR/AGRA:** Suraj Pal, known to his followers as "Bhole Baba" or Narayan Hari Sakar, the man behind the large religious gathering at Hathras that ended in a tragic stampede, resulting in the death of 121 people, mostly women and children, has a sprawling network of 24 ashrams, a fleet of luxury cars, and assets worth at least ₹100 crore, according to people familiar with the matter.

"Bhole Baba" (65) has been missing since the stampede, although he released a statement blaming "anti-social elements".

To be sure, the police have not named him in their initial complaint. On Thursday, six people, including some of his key aides, were arrested but police still did not name him.

Pal's, the Shri Narayan Hari Sakar Charitable Trust, oversees his empire, said the people cited above, including some who are closely associated with his operations.

The source of this wealth is unclear because most of Pal's followers are poor people.

When "Bhole Baba" makes his grand entrance before his devotees, he is usually clad in a crisp white three-piece suit, replete with a tie and fashionable eyeglasses. He comes in a convoy; leading it are 16 commandos in black fatigues, astride powerful 350 cc motorcycles, ensuring a clear path for his escort of 15 to 30 vehicles. His Trust's volunteers (sevadars), dressed in light pink attire and carrying batons, are strategically positioned along the route to ensure a smooth passage for their revered leader and to make sure that no one films or takes a photograph. Pal himself rides in a white Toyota Fortuner, its interiors adorned with matching white seat covers, epitomising both luxury and spiritual authority, one person said.

In a statement, the Zehang Lamka Village Authority condemned the attack on the MLA's house and said such incidents will not be tolerated in the future. Meanwhile, the Indigenous Tribal Leaders' Forum (ITLF), an umbrella group of Kuki organisations, alleged that a leader of a local Kuki body was abducted by a group of unidentified people who broke into the house of ITLF secretary Muan Tombing on Wednesday night.

In his first comments in Parliament on the issue, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday asserted that instances of violence that have roiled the northeastern state have begun to decline, and that the resumption of schools, offices and establishments in the state is a sign of normalcy being restored, his first comments in Parliament on the issue. The Supreme Court, on the same day, expressed distrust towards the state and criticised its government for failing to provide adequate medical care to a Kuki interdicted lodged at a jail in Meitei-dominated Imphal and for the state's inability to safely transport him.

"Baba does not trust the police and administration for security, his events and community service," explained Anil Kumar, who has been a devoted follower for 11 years. "Instead, he relies on his thousands of sevadars who manage every aspect of security. Becoming a sevadar involves a formal application process and selection. They receive payment, food, and accommodation within the ashram."

The Hathras event did have permission from authorities, although the crowd is believed to have been twice than what was permitted.

Pal resides in Mainpuri Ashram located in Bichuwa, sprawling across 21 bighas of land and named Hari Nagar. Within this expansive estate, six rooms are exclusively reserved for him and his wife. At the entrance of his Mainpuri Ashram, a board displays names of 200 donors, who have contributed amounts ranging from a minimum of ₹10,000 to a maximum of ₹2.5 lakh.

"To our knowledge, Baba oversees 24 ashrams spread across various parts of the state and the country. This particular ashram, completed three years ago, serves as his residence and operational base," another person said.

In its present form, the Shri Narayan Hari Sakar Charitable Trust was set up only last year. Through other subsidiary trusts, it owns ashrams across the region. Such as one in Kasui village of Kanpur's Bidhnu, where the 'sevadars' reside. Or another that is under construction in Bhupat Sarai, Etawah, and is spread over 15 bighas. There is also one in Patiyali, where Pal hails from, that is constructed on over 29 bighas of land, resembling a fortress with its watch towers, high walls, and a grand entrance gate. Outside the ashram, a board clearly states that video recording and photography are prohibited both inside and outside the premises.

However, it has been years since Pal has visited it, the people said. Nor has he visited in years, the house he owns in Agra's Kedar Nagar. It is not clear how a UP police constable with modest means built a spiritual empire. Given the secrecy around him and his organisation, it is likely this will change.

"He said no goods were being transported out of the firm as was mentioned in the records. He then sought a bribe of ₹2.5 lakh and threatened to cancel the firm's GST number," a CBI release informed.

# Agnipath set to hit combat effectiveness: Ex-navy chief

**NEW DELHI:** The controversy swirling around the Agnipath scheme for the induction of soldiers into the armed forces further deepened on Thursday after former navy chief Admiral KB Singh criticised the recruitment model, saying it will "degrade the combat effectiveness" of the military.

"The only motivation driving the Agnipath is reducing the pension bill. The fact that this scheme will degrade combat effectiveness is known to all who understand national security," Singh wrote on X on Thursday, in response to a post on the subject by another former navy chief, Admiral Arun Prakash.

Singh's comments are significant because he was among the key figures involved in discussions on the Agnipath proposal and retired from the top job in November 2021, months before the National Democratic Alliance government announced the scheme in June 2022.

The development came a day after Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi released a video purportedly of the father of an Agniveer, saying the family had not received any compensation or

help from the Centre after his son was killed in a landmine explosion in Naushera in Jammu & Kashmir in January. The army, however, rebutted this, saying a chunk of the compensation was paid to the next of kin of Agniveer Ajay Kumar and the rest would be disbursed shortly.

The Agnipath scheme was a major departure from the military's decades-old recruitment system, and seeks to recruit soldiers for only four years, with a provision of retaining 25% of them in regular service.

Singh's remarks on X were a response to a post related to national security by Prakash. "Economics take a back seat to national security. The sole litmus test for ANY change or reform in the military must be: 'does it enhance or degrade combat effectiveness,'" Prakash wrote on X on Wednesday, tagging an edit piece written by him in The Indian

**NEW DELHI:** The Indian government has earmarked about ₹5,000 crore to provide over 10,000 Graphics Processing Units (GPUs) as part of its ₹10,000 crore-plus IndiaAI Mission, a senior official announced on Thursday.

Speaking at the Global IndiaAI Summit, Abhishek Singh, additional secretary in the ministry of electronics and information technology (MeitY), said the funds are part of the ₹10,371.92 crore approved by the cabinet in March for the mission. Of this, ₹2,000 crore will be meant to support Indian start-ups in developing indigenous AI-based solutions.

"A lot of investments will come from investors, VCs [venture capitalists] and all, and that will add to the pool of funds available for the AI start-ups," said Singh, who is responsible for IndiaAI.

The government plans to subsidise access to computing power rather than own the infrastructure outright. Singh explained this approach aims to help researchers and startups access compute at lower costs, enabling more experimentation and scaling.

The Indian government, Singh said, felt that Indian start-ups and researchers who are building AI-based solutions,

applications and models to solve problems in healthcare, agriculture, education or social sector should have access to compute at a subsidised cost.

To give access to the compute infrastructure, Singh said that it will largely be trust-based where end users (start-ups, researchers) will choose what kind of infrastructure they want but the government will introduce some checks and balances to prevent misuse. Tenders to procure compute capacity will be floated soon, Singh said. The government wants to focus on the bottlenecks in the AI ecosystem, especially those related to compute, datasets and skilling, Singh said.

Singh said that to catch up with countries like China and the US, India needs to invest in research ecosystem and compute resources. While India is the "tech garage" of the world and has the highest penetration of IT talent, deep tech and AI need research acumen that goes beyond coding skills, he said. "We have the poten-

tial, we have the skillset, and hopefully with the investment that is happening, we will be able to catch up in due course," he said.

Regarding datasets, Singh said that the government wants to augment the synthetic datasets used by start-ups with real datasets in Indian languages so that Indian foundational model can be built.

In a separate panel, Kavita Bhatia, COO of India and group coordinator in the ministry, announced plans to soon release a request for proposals for the IndiaAI Datasets Platform. This platform will provide researchers and startups access to non-personal data from government ministries.

The IDP is one of the seven pillars of the IndiaAI Mission that will give start-ups and researchers access to non-personal data. It will function as a central repository of datasets from government ministries and departments for better decision-making strategies and AI applications.

"They will be able to use this data to train the indigenous models," Bhatia said. The platform will also offer data annotation, labeling, and curation services. On this platform, data annotation, data labelling and data curation services will also be made available, she said, and added that compute functionality will also be integrated.

## HC TO HEAR ON JULY 10 GUV BOSE'S DEFAMATION PLEA AGAINST MAMATA

**KOLKATA:** The Calcutta high court on Thursday said it will hear West Bengal governor CV Ananda Bose's defamation suit against chief minister Mamata Banerjee on July 10.

Bose had filed the case against Banerjee on June 28, a day after the Trinamool Congress chief alleged that several women had told her they were afraid to visit Raj Bhavan.

The governor's counsel, deputy solicitor general Dhiraj Trivedi, mentioned the matter before the court of justice Krishna Rao, who had adjourned the hearing on Wednesday, for an early hearing date.

Noting that the suit was filed on the basis of news reports, Justice Krishna Rao pointed out to Bose's counsel that publications referred to in the suit have not been made party to it. Justice Rao adjourned the case with the liberty to the petitioner to take appropriate steps in this regard. The judge adjourned the hearing till July 10.

## SUBMIT REPORT ON BHOJSHALA SURVEY BY JULY 15, HC DIRECTS ASI

**BHOPAL:** The Indore bench of the Madhya Pradesh high court on Thursday directed the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) to submit its report on the survey of Bhojshala, a protected 11th-century monument in the state's Dhar district, by July 15.

The ASI had sought four-week time to submit the report amid questions over the site's religious character.

While the Hindus consider the Bhojshala to be a temple dedicated to Vagdevi (Goddess Saraswati), the Muslims call it Kamal Maula Mosque.

Petitioner Ashish Goyal said: "The high court gave only 11 days to submit the report. The court will hear the matter on July 22."

The Hindu Front for Justice has on May 2, 2022 filed the petition against offering of namaz at the Bhojshala and ASI's 2003 order that prohibited Hindus from offering daily puja inside the premises.

# New faces in LS front row, INDIA likely to get 8 spots


**NEW DELHI:** The 236 MP-strong INDIA bloc of opposition parties will get at least eight prized front row seats in the 18th Lok Sabha while the BJP will occupy another eight seats, after division numbers are allotted to the members before the next Parliament session.

The seating arrangement reflects the relative strengths of the ruling and the Opposition benches after the Lok Sabha results in which the BJP won 240 seats (down from 303 in the 17th Lok Sabha) even as the Congress improved its tally to 99 (from 52). With Samajwadi Party's 37 MPs and Trinamool's 29, the Opposition has expanded its footprint in the Lok Sabha. The allotment of seats indicates the pecking order and the importance of MPs in their parties.

The first treasury bench — where Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union home minister Amit Shah, defence minister Rajnath Singh and transport minister Nitin Gadkari sit — will not undergo any changes as the NDA's top order remains unaltered.

But key allies such as TDP leader and civil aviation minister K Ram Mohan Naidu and animal husbandry and Panchayati Raj minister Rajiv Ranjan (Lalan) Singh are all set to get a seat in the coveted first row.

A senior Lok Sabha official told HT that parties have been informed about the seats allotted to different parties. "Now, the parties will write back to us to inform which seat should be allotted to a



particular MP. After this exercise is over, the Lok Sabha secretariat will formally notify the division numbers," added this person, who asked not to be named. A division number is the seat number of an MP, which is used during voting.

In the Opposition benches, the Congress party is entitled to three front row seats out of which Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi will occupy one. K Suresh, one of the two most experienced Congress lawmakers in the house and also the chief whip of the party, might get a front row seat. Samajwadi Party leader Akh-

ilesh Yadav and DMK's floor leader K Kanimozhi or senior leader TR Balu are also expected to join Gandhi in the Opposition's first row. The Opposition is also expected to give prime seats to representatives of smaller allies such as Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Arvind Sawant or RJD's Misa Bharati.

PM Modi and defence minister — the latter is the senior-most minister in the government — will occupy seat Nos 1 and 2, respectively. The next two seats — Nos 3 and 4 — will go to home minister and transport minister.

In the new building, the Lok

Sabha is arranged in a semi-circle with eight blocks of seats — up from six blocks in the old building. Each block has 12 rows, and is numbered from front to back. The first block has 57 numbered seats.

The BJP-led NDA will occupy five of the eight blocks.

In the recently concluded session of the Lok Sabha, the lawmakers were not allotted their respective seats. "The seating arrangement for most of the MPs as well as ministers in the first session did not necessarily reflect their division number," said a second Lok Sabha official.



## KIRODI LAL MEENA QUILTS CABINET OVER BJP'S LS PERFORMANCE

**JAIPUR:** Rajasthan cabinet minister Kirodi Lal Meena on Thursday announced that he resigned from his post on June 5, a day after results to the Lok Sabha elections showed Bharatiya Janata Party's poor performance.

While Meena's resignation is yet to be accepted, the BJP leader said he has already vacated the government bungalow and returned the car.

"I sent my resignation letter to chief minister Bhajan Lal Sharma on June 5 and met him again last night to discuss the matter. I do not have any resentment either to the CM or the party. I am only worried about my weakened influence in my own areas. Hence, I have resigned from the post," he told reporters on Thursday.

"Yesterday, the CM said that he would not accept the resignation. But I had to keep the words I said to the public. Therefore, I did not attend the cabinet meeting and left the government car and bungalow," he said.

On June 3, a day before the results were announced, Meena said that he would resign if the party loses in the first Lok Sabha seats under his charge. The BJP lost four seats, including Meena's native Dausa.

# Naidu meets Modi in Delhi; funds for Andhra in focus

Describing the meeting as constructive, the Telugu Desam Party chief said, "Today, I had a constructive meeting with the Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri @narendramodi Ji, in Delhi to address important matters concerning the welfare and development of Andhra Pradesh. I am confident that under his leadership, our state will re-emerge as a powerhouse among states."

According to a person aware of the details, Naidu, who is seeking more financial aid from the Union government for development in the state's capital and other infrastructure projects, was "hopeful" of the state's wish list being met.

The TDP, which has been accommodated in the Union cabinet, has demanded an increase in financial assistance

Naidu visited Krishna Bhawan, which houses the agriculture

ministry, and held a discussion with farm minister Chouhan on speedy rural infrastructure development, a second person said. Civil aviation minister Kinjarapu and minister of state for rural development Pemmasani, both of who belong to the TDP, were also present in the meeting.

"The CM has a number of meetings lined up with several Union ministers to accelerate the process of granting funds and clearing the decks for new projects," the person cited above said.

The 81-year-old Yediyurappa has been charged under Section 8 (punishment for sexual assault) of the Pocso Act and Sections 354A (sexual harassment), 204 (destruction of document or electronic record to prevent its production as evidence) and 214 (offering gift or restoration of property in consideration of screening offender) of the IPC.

Three other accused — Arun Y M, Rudresh M and G Mariswamy who are aides of Yediyurappa — are charged under IPC Sections 204 and 214 in a charge sheet filed by the criminal inves-

tigation department on June 27.

The CID, probing charges against Yediyurappa of sexually assaulting a minor girl, has said in its charge sheet that he and three other accused paid money to the victim and her mother to buy their silence.

The case was registered on March 14 this year based on a complaint by the mother of a 17-year-old girl who alleged that Yediyurappa sexually assaulted her daughter during a meeting on February 2 at his residence.

# After low output last yr, onion, potato prices remain high

**NEW DELHI:** Prices of onion and potato, two basic grocery items, continue to be stubbornly high due to lower output last year, squeezing households. Tomato rates showed a moderation in June from a year ago, but the vegetable was way costlier compared to the previous month, according to official data.

Officials are counting on

robust kharif or summer planting to calm food inflation. Expanding summer sowing should have a "salutary effect" on market sentiment, which will bring down prices, one official said.

A hot, dry summer since April had strained supplies of many commonly consumed vegetables, shifting demand towards potato, onion and tomato and pushing up prices, a second official said.

Compared to a year ago, as on June 30, average wholesale onion

leaped to ₹2,116 a quintal to ₹1,076.14 a quintal, an increase of 96%.

On an annual basis, wholesale tomato prices in June declined 40%, from ₹5,680.75 a quintal to ₹3,368.28 a quintal. However, compared to the previous month, wholesale rates climbed 112.39%, from ₹1,585.84 per 100 kg to ₹3,368.28, indicating volatility.

Vegetables have a weight of 6% in the consumer inflation basket. Retail prices have also edged

up. The countrywide modal rate (a type of average) of onion on July 2 stood at ₹42.21 a kg, up 81% from a year ago, when the price was ₹23.29 a kg.

The retail rate of potatoes has risen 57% from a year ago, from ₹21.91 a kg to ₹34.4 a kg. Consumer prices for tomato on June 2 declined 15%, from ₹64.5 a kg a year ago to ₹54.42. However, compared to a month ago, the vegetable rose a sharp 71%, from ₹31.74 a kg to ₹54.42 a kg.

**SILCHAR** : Six people died in flood-related incidents in Assam on Thursday, taking the toll in the flood-ravaged state to 52 so far this year, with most major rivers including the Brahmaputra and Barak still flowing at severe level.

According to data collated by the Assam state disaster management authority (ASDMA), over 1.62 million people across 29 districts have been affected by the deluge, and 361,000 of them have been displaced. Over 25,000 people have taken shelter in 515 relief camps set up across 24 districts, the ASDMA data showed.

The disaster body's bulletin at 6pm said that four deaths occurred in Golaghat district, and one each in Charaideo and Dibrugarh.

The Central Water Commission, which is sharing regular updates, said in a post on X: "River Brahmaputra at Dhubri district of Assam continues to flow in severe situation it was flowing at a level of 29.94m with rising trend which is 1.32m above its danger level of 28.62m."

A total of 40 embankments have been breached during the flood across Assam while 60 oth-

ers were damaged by heavy flow of water. Roads in nearly 1,000 areas have been damaged which includes 52 bridges, according to state government reports.

The commission has predicted further rise in water level of rivers including Aie, Manas, Beki, Kalanadi, Puthimari, Suklai, Jiabharali, Kamang, Dikrong, and Ranganadi, and other tributaries in districts Kokrajhar, Dhubri, Chirang, Baksa, Bongai-gaon, Barpeta, Nalbari, Udalguri and Darrang over the next two days.

Due to the overflow of the Brahmaputra River, almost 80% of the Kaziranga National Park and Tiger Reserve has been affected this year, prompting authorities to move a large number of animals to higher areas. Till Thursday, deaths of 31 wild animals were reported from the national park. At least 23 of these, the park director said, were drowning cases.

Assam chief minister Himanta Biswa Sarma is expected to visit the flood-hit areas soon. "The situation is under control but everything depends on the weather. If there is no further rain in Arunachal Pradesh and South Tibet, the situation will improve, but it might worsen if there is more rainfall", Sarma told reporters after reviewing the flood situa-

tion in the severely affected river island district Majuli.

The situation is unlikely to abate soon, with the India Meteorological Department issuing a warning for heavy rainfall in isolated places in Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and surrounding areas till July 5. Heavy rainfall is likely to continue over northeastern states till July 8, the weather department has forecast.

Across the northeast, rains have wreaked havoc, triggering landslides, inundating areas, and disrupting normal life. Landslides triggered by rain have snapped surface communication in at least seven districts of Arunachal Pradesh on Thursday, officials said. The landslide-affected districts are Siang, East Siang, Upper Siang, West Siang, Shi Yomi, Leparada and Upper Subansiri. A major landslide on Thursday morning blocked a large portion of the National Highway-13 along the Pasighat-Pangin-Aalo. In Manipur, the Assam Rifles have launched "Operation Jal Raahat" in Imphal to prevent flooding. A Flood Control Room has been activated, the Assam Rifles said in a statement. Reports of severe waterlogging and rivers reaching high flood levels were received from Imphal West, Imphal East, and Thoubal.

## Amid heavy rains, alert sounded for Himachal, U'khand

**SHIMLA/DEHRADUN/NEW DELHI**: Heavy rains continued to lash parts of Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand on Thursday, triggering multiple landslides, leading to the closure of 115 roads in Himachal, and causing at least three deaths in Uttarakhand.

The monsoon rains so far are less intense in north-western Himalaya as compared to 2023 when over 527 people died in Himachal and over 150 in Uttarakhand in extreme rainfall events, and there has been no major disruption to life so far.

The India Meteorological Department, however, has forecast heavy to very heavy rainfall over northwest and east India, and very heavy to extremely heavy rainfall over northeast India in next four to five days.

Due to heavy rains in upper reaches in Garhwal region of Uttarakhand, the water level in Ganga reached close to warning level of 293 meters in Haridwar.

"Flood relief posts are being inspected to ensure all requirements are in place. As soon as the water level rises or there is incessant rain, personnel at these flood relief posts are put on alert mode," said sub divisional magistrate Laksar Gopal Singh Chauhan.

The state disaster response force (SDRF) recovered three bodies in three separate incidents in Pauri, Rishikesh and Chamoli districts.

Due to landslides, 120 roads have been blocked including 14 in Nainital district, which has announced closure of schools in the district on July 5 amid the warning of heavy rainfall.

In neighbouring Himachal, 115 roads in Mandi, Chamba, Solan, and Kangra districts were closed for vehicular traffic following rains.

Several trees were uprooted in the state capital Shimla which has received 84mm of rain since Wednesday evening.

The weather department has predicted isolated heavy rainfall very likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad on July 5 and 6; Himachal Pradesh on July 6 and 7; Uttarakhand on July 6 and 7; Punjab on July 6 and 7; Haryana, Chandigarh till July 6; Uttar Pradesh till July 8, East Rajasthan on July 5 and 6. "The monsoon trough is oscillating. It's now near its normal position but we expect that it will shift to the north of Delhi again. So, Delhi may see patchy rain," said Mahesh Palawat, vice president, climate and meteorology at Skymet Weather.

## India again stresses on respect for sovereignty

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**NEW DELHI**: The Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) should address issues such as respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity and non-discriminatory trade rights in the context of connectivity projects, India said on Thursday in a thinly veiled swipe at China.

Delivering a speech on behalf of Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the SCO Summit in the Kazakhstan capital of Astana, external affairs minister S Jaishankar pointed to mutual respect for territorial integrity, non-interference in internal affairs and non-use of force being the basis for the foreign policies of the nine members of the bloc.

The remarks came against the backdrop of India's opposition to the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) since a key part of it passes through Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), and its concerns about China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI). Indian officials have pointed in the past to the lack of a level playing field in projects under BRI.

The text of Modi's remarks to the SCO Summit noted that economic development requires robust connectivity, which can facilitate trust between societies. "Respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity is essential for connectivity and infrastructure

projects. So too are non-discriminatory trade rights and transit regimes. The SCO needs to deliberate seriously on these aspects," the text said.

The SCO is a principle-based organisation and consensus drives the approach of its member states, and it is "particularly noteworthy that we are reiterating mutual respect for sovereignty, independence, territorial integrity, equality, mutual benefit, non-interference in internal affairs, non-use of force or threat of use of force as a basis for our foreign policies", the text added.

The speech also highlighted the issue of combating terrorism, which was one of the "original goals" of the SCO. "Many of us have had our experiences, often originating beyond our borders. Let us be clear that if left unchecked, it can become a major threat to regional and global peace," the text said, in an apparent reference to India's

concerns about cross-border terrorism from Pakistan.

The world community must isolate and expose countries that harbour terrorists, provide safe havens and condone terrorism, and cross-border terror requires a "decisive response" and terror financing and recruitment must be resolutely countered, it added.

The speech also referred to challenges such as climate change and proper use of emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence. India is working towards a committed reduction in emissions, transition to alternate fuels, adoption of electric vehicles and building climate-resilient infrastructure. It is also among countries to formulate a national strategy on AI and is working within the SCO framework on a roadmap for AI cooperation. The Indian side expressed its condolences at the recent death of Iranian president Ebrahim Raisi in a helicopter crash while congratulating Iran on attending the SCO Summit as a member of the bloc. It also congratulated President Aleksandr Lukashenko on Belarus becoming a new member of the SCO.

The SCO, which was established in June 2001 comprises Belarus, China, India, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. India was represented at the summit in Astana by Jaishankar.

## 16-yr-old JEE aspirant dies by suicide in Kota

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**JAIPUR**: A 16-year-old student, who was preparing for the Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) for admission to undergraduate engineering courses, died by suicide in the Kota district of Rajasthan on Thursday, making it the 13th such incident in the coaching hub this year.

Last year, 27 students preparing for various competitive examinations died by suicide in the district.

Mahaveer Nagar station house officer, Mahendra Maroo, said the student was a resident of the Nalanda district of Bihar and was preparing for JEE in Kota for a year. He added that the student died by hanging at his paying guest (PG) accommodation.

"The incident came to light when the victim's friends knocked on his door several times, but he did not respond. They then informed the police and the boy's younger brother, who was also staying in Kota and preparing for NEET," said Maroo.

The police broke open the door to his room and found his body, he added.

"No suicide note was recovered from his room. The body was sent for an autopsy, and his parents were also informed," the SHO said.

The Kota district administration also seized the PG for violating the guidelines while a case was lodged in the district court against the hostel owner based on the police investigation report revealing that the anti-hanging device was absent in all the fans in the PG.

Amid a surge in suicides among students last year, the district administration ordered all hostels and PG accommodations on August 18 to install spring-loaded fans in rooms "to provide students mental support and security".

Kota is the centre of India's test-prep business, estimated to be worth ₹10,000 crore annually. Students from around the country arrive here in huge numbers after completing Class 10, and register in residential test-prep institutes. They also enrol in schools, most of which are largely for purposes of certification.

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## 3 more bridges collapse across Bihar in 24 hrs; 12 in a fortnight

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**PATNA**: Three bridges collapsed at three different locations in Saran district of Bihar in the last 24 hours, officials said on Thursday, taking the number of such incidents over a fortnight to 12. No casualties were reported in any of the three collapses, the officials said.

The first collapse was reported around noon on Wednesday, when a British era bridge near Baba Dhodha Nath temple in Lahladpur block of Janata Bazar police station in Chhapra collapsed.

Soon after, at around afternoon, the bridge on Gandaki River collapsed in Saran village of Dandaspur Panchayat in the same block. This bridge is said to be nearly a century old.

The third incident was reported on Thursday from the Baniyapur block when the bridge on the Gandaki river connecting Saraiya and Satua Panchayat collapsed.

Saran district magistrate Aman Samir, however, said the structure was built 15 years ago.

"The small bridge was constructed 15 years ago... The exact cause of the bridge collapse is yet to be ascertained but desilting work was recently undertaken," the district magistrate told reporters.

Attacking the Rashtriya Janata Dal over the collapses, rural works department minister Ashok Choudhary said: "The

department was earlier with RJD. JD(U) got this department in new rule. So tell us who is responsible for this?"

In a post on X, RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav wrote, "Twelve bridges have collapsed in Bihar. Both Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar are silent over these incidents in Bihar. What happened to the claims of good governance and corruption-free government?"

## Autopsy report of five kids confirms cholera outbreak at MP shelter

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**BHOPAL**: Five specially-abled children died of cholera infection at an orphanage in Indore a post-mortem examination has confirmed, days after over 50 children were admitted to the Chacha Nehru Government Hospital for treatment.

A stool test of the six children, who died between Sunday and Tuesday, confirmed the presence of the infection in five children, while the sixth child was suffering from epilepsy, said Dr Preeti Malpani, head of the pediatric department.

"We have conducted multiple tests of children and stool test confirmed the presence of vibrio cholerae bacteria that caused cholera," said Malpani.

Fifty-two children are undergoing treatment at the hospital, and six of them are in a serious condition, she said. These six are being treated in the intensive

care unit (ICU), she said.

Despite repeated attempt Ashram principal Anita Sharma couldn't be contacted for the comment.

The orphanage, which is the only centre in the state for specially-abled children, has been served a show cause notice by district collector Ashesh Singh after a probe committee found several lapses in the functioning of the orphanage and care of the children.

"The children complained of diarrhoea and dehydration on June 27 to an Ashram doctor but the administration didn't pay any attention. The ashram administration didn't inform the district officials on time and tried to treat children at the ashram only," said an officer of district administration, who was part of probe committee, said on condition of anonymity. "After four deaths, the children were rushed to the hospital," the officer said.

## Godhra school owner took ₹5-10L to fill answer sheets: FIR

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**AHMEDABAD**: On June 30, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) arrested Dixit Patel, the chairman of Jay Jalaram Trust, which runs Jay Jalaram School located at Paravadi near Godhra of Gujarat, in connection with the irregularities in this year's National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test-Undergraduate (NEET-UG) conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA).

Prior to CBI taking over investigation of the case on June 23, Gujarat police had arrested five individuals: Tushar Bhatt, a physics teacher; Purushottam Sharma, principal of Jay Jalaram School; Parshuram Roy of Roy Overseas, an education consultancy firm; Vibhor Anand, who introduced students to Roy; and Arif Vora, a local resident implicated as Bhatt's accomplice.

According to an FIR filed at

the Godhra Taluka Police Station on May 8, 2024, three days after the NEET-UG exam on May 5, the accused instructed students to leave blank answers for questions they did not know on the sheet. The accused, who were paid between ₹5 lakh to ₹10 lakh per candidate, would later fill in these answers after the exams. In all 30 students at the Godhra centre are suspected to have been part of the fraud.

According to the plan which could not be executed because of prompt action, the accused intended to exploit the 30-45 minute gap before the courier arrived to collect the papers in a sealed cover. Answers for NEET would be available a few minutes after the exam ended, posted by many coaching centres on their websites. The accused, including Bhatt, were to then mark the correct answers for students who had paid them. Patel runs two schools, one in

Godhra district and Jay Jalaram International School at Thermal village in Kheda district. He also ran a school in Anand district but shut it down.

Parimal Pathak, advocate for Patel, stated that his client "is not an employee but is part of the management and was not present at the school premises when the exam was being conducted." He explained that the NTA chose Jay Jalaram school as its centre for NEET-UG due to its

unique infrastructure in the area. The advocate also clarified that Bhatt, one of the main accused, "is not an employee of Jay Jalaram School and was selected by NTA." He acknowledged an attempt to cheat but emphasised that "Bhatt was caught before the exam could begin."

Pathak said, "There is no link between the cheating attempt at Jay Jalaram school and the NEET irregularities reported elsewhere in the country. CBI has found no material evidence after conducting searches at my client's premises."

"In the past, the school was given permission to have one classroom for Class 11 students with a maximum capacity of 66 students, but they admitted 450 students. Jay Jalaram School has also been charged with taking excessive fees from students. Why did the NTA choose such an institution for holding NEET? It

seems the school owner has connections with some powerful people," said senior Congress leader Shaktisinh Gohil.

**Dixit Patel and his political ambitions**

Dr. Sujaat Vali, a gynecologist who runs a hospital in Godhra and is also a social activist said the school "has good infrastructure and is centrally air-conditioned. However, it seems that for the last two years, Patel has been trying to attract students by getting involved in paper leaks."

Patel, from Kantadi village in Godhra taluka, serves as the deputy sarpanch of the village. His father was active in local politics, and Patel often met with politicians, showcasing these connections on social media. He aspired to secure a ticket for the 2022 Gujarat assembly polls from the Shehra constituency but did not pursue it due to the popularity and influence of the sitting MLA,

Jetha Bharwad, said people familiar with the matter.

During their investigation, the Gujarat police found eight blank cheques and another set of cheques worth ₹2.30 crore from the residence of Parsuram Roy of Roy Overseas. These cheques belonged to parents whose children had appeared for NEET-UG exams at Jalaram School.

"Some of these parents from Vadodara said they knew Bhatt from his time running a coaching class in the city. Others mentioned being in contact with Roy, who operated an overseas education consultancy firm. They had paid Roy in 2023 to secure their children's admission in medical colleges abroad, but when this didn't happen, they protested. Roy then assured them he would secure admissions in Indian medical colleges and help them get the required NEET-UG scores," said a Gujarat police official.

## 50 students move SC to not cancel NEET-UG

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**NEW DELHI**: Over 50 successful Gujarat-based NEET-UG candidates, including several who have been ranked first, have moved the Supreme Court seeking a direction to restrain the Centre and the National Testing Agency from cancelling the controversy-ridden exam.

They have sought a direction from the top court to the Union education ministry to probe, identify and take strict action against students and others who indulged in unfair practices like paper leak and impersonation in the NEET-UG exam conducted on May 5 this year.

The fresh plea by 56 students has been filed days before a top court bench headed by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud is scheduled to hear as many as 26 petitions seeking reliefs like re-test and probe

into the conduct of the examination plagued by allegations of malpractices.

The pleas seeking cancellation of the exam, re-test and high-level probe are listed for hearing on July 8 in the SC.

**CBI granted remand of man held from Dhanbad**

Rabindra alias Aman Singh (26), one of the alleged co-conspirators in the NEET-UG paper leak case, who was arrested from Dhanbad on Wednesday, was sent to four-day CBI remand by a special judicial magistrate court of CBI, Patna, officials said on Thursday. Aman, is the sixth accused to have been arrested by the federal agency in connection with the alleged irregularities in the NEET-UG 2024.

"A CBI team raided Bindu Apartment in Dhanbad and arrested Aman," an official said.

# Effective rule of law key for economic growth: CJI

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**NEW DELHI:** The idea of "rule of law" is not only about social and political justice but is also intrinsically linked to better economic outcomes and financial advancement, Chief Justice of India Dhananjaya Y Chandrachud emphasised on Thursday, adding that a legal system with adequate procedural safeguards and fairness builds investor confidence and is crucial for economic growth.

Inaugurating the new office premises of the Securities Appellate Tribunal (SAT) at Mittal Court, Mumbai, the CJI underscored the critical role of SAT in fostering improved economic outcomes and financial growth, which in turn create a stable and predictable investment environment.

Justice Chandrachud noted that SAT, as a pivotal appellate forum for securities markets, ensures that all stakeholders adhere to regulations, thereby maintaining market integrity and investor confidence.

"A legal system that has adequate procedural safeguards, fairness, and forums that dispense justice without arbitrariness, is integral to building investor confidence in a country's markets and business landscape. Therefore, regulators like SEBI (Securities and Exchange Board of India, the market regulator) and appellate

forums like SAT assume immense national importance in fostering a stable and predictable investment environment," said the CJI, citing the World Bank's theory from 2005 that protecting the rule of law is intrinsically linked to better economic outcomes.

When investors feel assured that their investments are protected by law and that there are effective mechanisms for dispute resolution, the judge added, they are more likely to invest in the country's markets. "This influx of investment can lead to better economic outcomes, such as increased capital formation, job creation, and overall economic growth."

According to the CJI, SAT is like a referee, ensuring that in the "dog-eat-dog" world of finance, all stakeholders play by the rules. "Just like any good referee, SAT has successfully kept pace with the

evolving game. As our markets and businesses become more complex and new regulations flood in, the tribunal must consistently rise to the challenge. To effectively adjudicate the appeals before the tribunal, members require not only a deep understanding of intricate financial matters but most importantly, a strong commitment to fair adjudication and procedural safeguards. This is crucial in maintaining market integrity and investor confidence."

Commending the tribunal for moving its office to new, modern premises equipped with state-of-the-art infrastructure and technology, the CJI stressed the importance of digital infrastructure, stating that the concept of "access to justice" needs to be re-imagined because modernising infrastructure must not limit to physical infrastructure. He said that technology is at the heart of the func-

tioning of the Indian judicial system and that it has been a mission for him as the CJI to promote it.

"In *Sarvesh Mathur Vs The Registrar General, High Court of Punjab and Haryana (2023 and 2024)*, the Supreme Court issued several directions to ensure the continued use of video conferencing facilities across High Courts and Tribunals. It is commendable that SAT has been at the forefront in adopting technology including virtual hearings and e-filing, both during the Covid-19 pandemic and after it subsided," he said.

With SAT having a bench only in Mumbai, Justice Chandrachud underscored the importance of virtual hearings as a matter of right rather than a concession. "A tribunal with jurisdiction across the country must have digital resources to allow lawyers from different regions to appear before the tribunal easily and effectively," he stated. The judge also praised the decision to revamp SAT's website, making it more user-friendly and enhancing accessibility in accessing legal services.

The CJI added: "The rapid growth in the number of market participants and the increase in the volume of financial transactions brings with it the likelihood of an increased number of disputes. The vacancies in SAT must be filled at the earliest to allow the tribunal to work effectively and at full capacity."

## INDIA, UK AGREE TO DEEPEN TIES TO BUILD ROBUST CYBERSPACE

**NEW DELHI:** India and UK have agreed to deepen cooperation between their cyber agencies in order to build a "safe and robust cyberspace", the external affairs ministry said on Thursday.

The sixth cyber dialogue between the two countries, which was held in New Delhi on Wednesday, focused on cyber threat assessment, internet governance, data protection and protection of critical infrastructure. The discussions also covered capacity building and cooperation in multilateral forums, the ministry said.

"Both sides agreed to deepen cooperation between their respective cyber agencies in order to build a safe and robust cyberspace," it added.

The dialogue was co-chaired by Amit Shukla, joint secretary in the cyber diplomacy division of the external affairs ministry and Kat Jones, head of strategy in the cyber policy department of Britain's Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office.

The Indian delegation included officials from external affairs, home and electronics and information technology ministries, Indian Cybercrime Coordination Centre, Defence Research and Development Organisation, CERT-In and the National Critical Information Infrastructure Protection Centre.

The delegation from UK comprised officials from National Cyber Security Centre, cyber policy department of the FCDO. HT

## PM to hold talks with Putin next week, visit Austria in second leg

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**NEW DELHI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi will embark on a visit to Russia and Austria next week, with the highlight being a bilateral summit with Russian President Vladimir Putin that will allow the two sides to chart a course for future cooperation.

The first leg of the three-day official visit will take Modi to Moscow during July 8-9 at the invitation of Putin to hold the 22nd India-Russia Annual Summit. "The leaders will review the entire range of multifaceted relations between the two countries and exchange views on contemporary regional and global issues of mutual interest," the external affairs ministry said in a statement on Thursday.

An announcement from the Kremlin said Modi will meet Putin to discuss the "further development of the traditionally amicable relations between Russia and India, as well as pressing international and regional issues".

This will be Modi's first bilateral visit in his third term following a trip to Italy last month to participate in the outreach session of the G7 Summit. It is also

his first visit to Russia since 2019, and also the first since the start of the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2022.

Besides discussing ways to balance bilateral trade, which is currently skewed in Russia's favour following India's increased purchase of Russian crude, the two sides are expected to review cooperation in defence, space and nuclear energy, people familiar with the matter said on condition of anonymity. They will also explore new avenues for cooperation, including connectivity initiatives, the people said.

The safe and speedy return of Indian nationals serving in the Russian military, an issue that figured in talks between external affairs minister S Jaishankar and Russian counterpart Sergey Lavrov in Astana on Wednesday, is

expected to be raised during the prime minister's visit, the people added.

India has sought a "verified stop" to the recruitment of Indian nationals in the Russian Army following the death of four Indians on the frontlines of the conflict with Ukraine.

India has not publicly criticised Russia's invasion of Ukraine though it has called on both sides to cease hostilities and return to the path of dialogue and diplomacy. Modi's visit to Russia will also reflect India's strategic autonomy in foreign relations, the people said. The trip has, however, raised eyebrows in diplomatic circles as Indian prime ministers have traditionally chosen a neighbouring country as the destination for their first foreign visit.

From Russia, Modi will travel to Austria during July 9-10. This will be the first visit to Austria by an Indian premier in 41 years.

Modi will meet President Alexander Van der Bellen and hold talks with Chancellor Karl Nehammer. Modi and Nehammer will also address business leaders from both countries.

He will also interact with members of the Indian community in Moscow and Vienna.

## HC rebukes Guj for not abiding by '23 civic body order to raze gaming zone

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**AHMEDABAD:** The Gujarat high court on Thursday censured the state government for not abiding by a 2023 order to demolish the TRP Game Zone in Rajkot, where a massive blaze left 27 dead in May this year.

The HC's rebuke came in response to an affidavit filed by the state government that accused the Rajkot Municipal Corporation (RMC) officials of not acting on a June 2023 order to demolish the illegal gaming zone.

Advocate General (AG) Kamal Trivedi, who was representing the state government, informed the court that the RMC issued a notice to demolish the illegal structure in the gaming zone after a fire earlier in 2023. But, neither the structure of the TRP Game Zone was demol-

ished nor was it regularised by the owners.

Chief Justice Sunita Agarwal then pointed out: "More than one year passed and this incident happened. Why was it not executed. This is not a case where authorities were not aware of this illegal construction."

When Trivedi pointed out that the present Municipal Commissioner has already suspended RMC's Town Planning Officer (TPO) and an Assistant TPO for negligence, Chief Justice Agarwal said it was not enough. "Taking action against a few people will not help you. The working (style) has to be revisited. There are loopholes and lapses which need to be taken care of. You cannot put this state in this situation. It is very serious that such incidents are happening," noted the chief justice.

The Gujarat government also submitted its "fact-finding inquiry" report in a sealed cover to the HC on the blaze. The bench last month had expressed displeasure over the investigation into the fire and ordered a "fact-finding inquiry" to uncover how the illegal game zone had come up and what roles officials played in it.

## Centre clears collegium recommendation after 6 mths

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**NEW DELHI:** More than six months after the Supreme Court collegium's recommendation, the central government on Thursday notified the appointment of justice Sheel Nagu as the chief justice of the Punjab & Haryana high court — a development that highlights ongoing concerns over judicial appointments and administrative hold-ups.

Union law minister Arjun Ram Meghwal announced justice Nagu's appointment in a post on X on Thursday evening.

A government notification issued later said: "In exercise of

the powers conferred by clause (1) of Article 217 of the Constitution of India, the President is pleased to appoint Shri Justice Sheel Nagu, Judge of the High Court of Madhya Pradesh, to be the Chief Justice of the High Court of Punjab and Haryana with effect from the date he assumes charge of his office."

The decision came a day after HT spotlighted how justice Nagu was the only judge left out from a set of five names recommended by the Supreme Court collegium in December 2023.

The government's notification of justice Nagu's appointment arrived more than six months after the collegium, led by Chief

Justice of India Dhananjaya Y Chandrachud, recommended his elevation alongside four other judges. The other members of the collegium were justices Sanjiv

Khanna and BR Gavai.

The delay in justice Nagu's appointment meant that he was the only one from the group still awaiting confirmation, even as the other three judges — Justices Arun Bhansali, Manindra Mohan Shrivastava, and Vijay Bishnoi — were appointed as chief justices of the high courts of Allahabad, Rajasthan and Gauhati, respectively, in February. The fifth judge, justice BR Sarangi, was appointed as the chief justice of the Jharkhand high court on Wednesday, though justice Sarangi will have one of the shortest tenures at the helm owing to his impending retirement on July 20.

The delay in justice Nagu's appointment underscores a pattern of selective processing by the Centre, which has resulted in prolonged vacancies in high courts.

The Punjab & Haryana high court has been without a full-time chief justice since October 2023, while the Jharkhand high court remained without a full-time chief justice since December 29 — two days after the collegium's recommendation to appoint justice Sarangi. Some other high courts such as Delhi, Madhya Pradesh and Madras are also functioning with acting chiefs as the collegium is yet to recommend names to fill these posts.

## No India-China thaw at SCO meet

New Delhi did well to continue to push for de-escalation at LAC. This will need more than talks at the diplomatic and military levels

With the India-China standoff on the Line of Actual Control (LAC) into its fifth year, it would be unrealistic to expect a meeting between the foreign ministers of the two sides to lead to an immediate breakthrough, especially in the absence of any meaningful engagement of the top leadership of both countries in several years. The meeting in Astana (where the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation summit is on) saw external affairs minister S Jaishankar emphasising to his Chinese counterpart, Wang Yi, the need for complete disengagement of troops at the remaining "friction points" in Ladakh and restoring peace at the border to facilitate the restoration of normalcy in bilateral ties. There was also agreement on stepping up the diplomatic and military talks that began in 2020 to resolve the face-off that has heightened tensions between the Asian giants. All of these points are in line with India's stated position that it cannot be business as usual with China as long as tens of thousands remain deployed on LAC, often in close proximity to other, and Beijing continues to flout agreements that had ensured a fragile peace at the disputed border. The meeting of the foreign ministers, however, is significant as this is the first time Jaishankar and Yi sat across a table in almost a year to discuss a situation that is not in the interest of either side.

The fraught nature of the bilateral relationship and China's numerous actions — whether it is forays into the Indian Ocean by its surveillance vessels or meddling in countries in India's backyard — don't augur well for regional stability. There have been subtle shifts by India on issues of importance to China — such as more open support for the Philippines' position in the South China Sea, allowing a US Congressional delegation to visit the Dalai Lama in Dharamshala, and the Indian premier's references to Taiwan in public comments — that show New Delhi is less willing to countenance coercion or use of force.

However, it has also become amply clear that the diplomatic and military tracks are no longer adequate to fully resolve the standoff on LAC. Some on the Indian side even believe this is an effort by China to prolong the issue and hold up its resolution, while Beijing continues to insist that the border standoff be put in its "appropriate place". Therefore, the diplomatic and military talks should proceed in parallel with some form of supervision by the political leadership of both sides to ensure results, without the process dragging on interminably.

## Macro factors back sharp Sensex rise

BSE Sensex, India's benchmark equity market index, crossed yet another psychological threshold of 80,000 on Wednesday. The Sensex has taken only 139 trading sessions to complete its journey from 70,000 to 80,000 points, the quickest ever 10,000-point addition to its value. What is one to make of this achievement? Three points need to be made to answer this question.

The first is a need for a sense of proportion. Each new 10,000 points mean a smaller growth of the value of the Sensex. For example, the journey from 10,000 to 20,000 meant a 100% growth while the one from 70,000 to 80,000 means just a 14.3% growth.

The second is a more substantive question. Is the Indian equity market being driven by exuberance? An international comparison of the PE multiples — it compares share prices with earnings per share — suggests that it is. But a historical comparison shows that the PE multiple of the Sensex is lower than what it has been in the near and distant past. Read together, they suggest that the ongoing bull run could be driven by India's relative advantage vis-à-vis other global economies rather than unhealthy exuberance.

The third and most important is the question of the larger macroeconomy. Much of India's relative advantage has come because of its macroeconomic stability. Fiscal restraint shown by the Centre since the pandemic has played a role here. While this has been music to the ears of investors, it has also contributed to the ongoing growth trajectory not being broad-based. This must change if private capex, and, therefore, profits, have to increase on a sustained basis. This is what will justify the forward premium driving the equity markets. Rejuvenating broad-based growth without hurting investor sentiment is the most important economic policy challenge at the moment.

# Health alert! Indians need to exercise more

As the scope for adequate physical activity through work diminishes, the focus has to be on making it easy for people to exercise

A study published in *The Lancet* recently concluded that the prevalence of insufficient physical activity (PA) among adults has been increasing globally since 2000. The report says it has increased from an estimated 23.4% in 2000 to 31.3% in 2022. Of concern to readers here is that it has increased from 22.3% to 49.4% in the same period for India. It is important to note that insufficient PA means less than 150 minutes of moderate or vigorous physical activity in a week. For PA to protect the heart, it must make the heart work more than usual, indicated by an increase in heart rate or breathing harder, and must be done for at least 10 minutes at a stretch. PA has been shown to prevent many cardiometabolic diseases as well as cancers. And no, yoga is not counted as PA.

The key data sources are large population-based studies funded by the ministry of health and family welfare that use standard global tools and protocols. Having been personally

involved in many of these surveys, I can vouch that measuring PA at the population level is incredibly difficult. We ask a series of questions about time spent usually or in the last week in moderate and vigorous activity at work (at home for the non-working), travel, and leisure time, or discretionary (self-driven). Assessing the intensity of the activity as moderate/vigorous and the time spent can be quite challenging. The activity per se is not enough. For example, one could swim or play badminton vigorously (competitive) or moderately or even with very little activity (float/laze in water). Similarly, walking could be brisk (about 5 km per hour) or slower or faster. People often overestimate both the intensity and the time taken for such activities. The use of wearable devices to measure PA is rising for such surveys, though this still has several operational challenges.

Acknowledging the difficulty in measurement does not subtract from the key finding that PA is declining in India. In general, our studies show that the rural population has higher PA, men are more active than women, older people have lower PA and most of our PA occurs in the work domain, especially in rural areas, and is much lower during leisure time or in the discretionary domain. In other words, we do not make efforts to do PA but do it only if it becomes necessary. Is brisk walking (or similar PA) for

30 minutes daily difficult for most Indians? Women often do low-intensity housework for long periods and get tired without necessarily doing any cardio-protective PA. They seem unable to fit these 30 minutes into their daily schedule or consider this unnecessary. People do not even walk to the bus or metro station and use two-/three-wheelers instead. Inclement weather conditions and pollution further compound the problem. Most of us do desk jobs with little scope for any PA at the workplace. Long commutes leave us with little time and energy to do PA, even if one is interested. Rising screen times at all ages also hinder PA.

India is in transition as far as PA is concerned. As a chunk of the population ages and with rapid urbanisation, we are moving from work-based to discretionary as our predominant domain of PA. We need to create systems to facilitate it. The way out for women would be the partial automation of many chores; the saved time can be used for discretionary PA. As rural people move away from agriculture to factories and service industries, work-based PA will come down. With an increase in the purchase of motorised vehicles (explosion in the two-wheeler segment and budget cars), commutation-related PA is also coming down. Increased PA in the discretionary domain will have to compensate for these declines. The challenge is to

make this transition smooth by making PA a habit.

People of all ages and genders exercising in parks in the morning and evenings are a common sight in the bigger cities. Public gyms have also made this more attractive. This shows that given the right nudge, people take up PA when an appropriate environment is created. Only education and fitness events will not cut it. Though they serve a certain group, more indoor gyms are also not a solution. We need to make our lives more physically active. For example, to promote cycle use, make it a safer and easier option. Promote stairs over lifts by making stairs easy to find in buildings and hotels. Build these habits at schools and promote PA in the workplace. We need more neighbourhood parks and spaces for children to play safely. While bigger and planned cities make provisions for parks, these are often missing in the unplanned growth of our peri-urban and suburban spaces. Our pavements are so

haphazardly made that it is difficult to walk on them, even for the most agile. Why do our smart cities not promote health and PA as a core focus? Promoting PA has to become a central tenet of urban planning and design. Finally, while it is good to see two large surveys funded by the health ministry contributing data for this estimate, these information sources are old (2017-18), and we need to have the next round of surveys to get a more updated picture and to do this regularly, the Union, state, and local governments need to promote PA at the population level; a goal of achieving a 10% reduction in insufficient PA by 2025 has already been set for the country. However, at the individual level, nothing stops one from taking the first step. It is, after all, for one's own benefit.

## Courts need to uphold procedural safeguards

The Indian Constitution mandates, under Article 22(2), that a person arrested has to be produced in front of a magistrate within 24 hours of arrest, providing an opportunity for a judicial magistrate to inquire into the life, liberty, safety and dignity of the accused. This first step in the criminal justice system, termed first production, has life and death consequences for the accused. The magistrate also authorises further detention in police custody or judicial custody (jail) and oversees police investigation through remand hearings. Yet first production and remand in the magistrate courts have been understudied, given the inordinate focus on the higher judiciary, particularly the Supreme Court.

A recent report by Project 39A, National Law University, Delhi, authored by us, brings attention to the significant role of the magistrate at this stage, drawing from observations in Delhi courts over a period of three months. In a striking incident before a duty magistrate's court, a young Muslim man accused of theft was brought in for first production with visible injuries. The accompanying case file had the two most important documents, linked to the protection of liberty and safety of the accused that the magistrate examines at this stage — the arrest memo and the medico-legal certificate (MLC). The arrest memo has details of the time and place of the arrest and the proof of intimation to the family. The MLC is a document created after a medical exam and is placed before the magistrate at first production and during subsequent productions from police custody. The accused's lawyer raised the issue of the police beating the accused. When the magistrate asked the accused about it, the policeman standing next to the accused intervened and stated that the accused was beaten up by the public. When the magistrate asked the accused directly, he said *public ne bhi maara* (the public also beat me). While clearly, the magistrate examined the documents and even interacted with the accused, it is unclear whether this was adequate probing of the possibility of police violence, which is necessary to ensure the safety and dignity of the accused.

This first of its kind study, titled Magistrates and Constitutional Protections: An Ethnographic Study of First Production and Remand in Delhi Courts, was conducted across all six district court complexes of Delhi — Dwarka, Karkardooma, Rohini, Saket, Tis Hazari and Patiala House. Researchers focused on the role of multiple court actors —

magistrate, court staff, lawyers, police, the accused and their families — and observed the manner in which courtroom dynamics and social hierarchies mediated the experience of the accused during first production and remand. These are aspects that do not necessarily make their way into the written record or case documents. Besides checking the paperwork, these proceedings are an opportunity for the magistrate to publicly verify its contents through interaction with the accused, lawyers, police and even the family of the accused. This oversight is meant to ensure accountability in police functioning during investigation.


We found that magistrates rarely interacted with the accused to ascertain their well-being beyond a brief query. The MLC produced before the magistrate court notes the physical condition of the accused. The examination of the MLC, however, was rarely taken as an opportunity to probe the origin of the visible injuries and confirm whether they were caused by the police or the public, accidentally or intentionally. Magistrates also did not necessarily ensure the continued well-being and treatment of the accused in custody. In fact, while the accused brought for first production always had the MLC, those coming from judicial custody did not seem to have any such requirement of an MLC to ensure their continued safety. The researchers did not observe any mention of an inspection memo or a record of injuries/condition of the accused on arrest.

Perhaps the most surprising limitation observed in this context, unmentioned in the jurisprudence, statute and remand hearings, is that the accused are produced from police custody by officers from the same police station investigating their case. In the case mentioned here, for instance, the magistrate asked him whether he was beaten up by the police while the officer investigating his case was standing right next to him. The accused, at that point, is not sure whether he might be sent back to police custody for further detention. There is thus no separation between the investigating officers and the accused at this stage to create an environment where the accused feels safe to raise their concerns about possible police violence. There appears to be a lack of recognition of the vulnerability of the accused in custody at this stage.

Undoubtedly, there is variation in the behaviour of magistrates across different courts, but a lot currently depends on their discretion, and whether first production and remand are adequately accounted for in the magistrates' work day. The onus is currently on the accused and their lawyers to point to the illegalities of arrest and the need to protect the dignity and safety of the accused in custody entitled under Article 21 (on life and liberty).

By drawing attention to the experience of the accused during remand, we hope that institutional barriers to the protection of constitutional rights are addressed and procedural safeguards such as the MLC are used fully to ensure the safety of the accused.

## How cities can beat the heat with passive design

The monsoon has brought much-needed relief from a scorching summer, in which the national Capital saw temperatures pushing 50 degrees Celsius. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) had issued red alerts for heatwaves in several states, and cities were panting for cooling solutions. While the clamour for air conditioning units grows louder, an impactful approach to combating such heat exists, rooted in scientific understanding and sustainable principles — passive design.

Marketed as an easy fix, air conditioning systems mask deeper issues like power cuts and global warming. Rising temperatures and reliance on air conditioners (ACs) strain the grid, leading to breakdowns, higher peak loads, and increased fossil fuel demand. This heightens heat exposure risks when passive alternatives aren't used. Additionally, ACs exacerbate the urban heat island effect by transferring indoor heat outdoors, making concrete areas hotter than green spaces and compromising thermal comfort for those without them. Integrating passive features into buildings decreases reliance on energy-intensive cooling systems, lowers carbon footprints, reduces electricity bills, and addresses climate change by minimising peak loads on air conditioning systems.

Incorporating passive design principles starts right from the beginning of house design, with close attention to factors like massing (the architectural structure of a building) and orientation (a building's position in relation to the Sun's path and direction of wind). Creating shading through strategic massing and incorporating courtyards are integral aspects. Professional guidance ensures optimal building orientation to maximise airflow and minimise heat gain. Utilising indigenous materials with natural cooling properties enhances sustainability. Retrofitting existing constructions to incorporate these strategies improves thermal comfort and reduces electricity costs.

The insulation forms the foundation for cooler homes. With options from building air pockets to advanced thermal materials available in the market, insulation offers a versatile toolkit for protection. Reflective coatings and lighter hues on exterior surfaces deflect heat while traditional mosaic roof-floors minimise heat absorption. Yet, insulation alone isn't sufficient. Walls made of high thermal mass materials like clay bricks or autoclaved aerated concrete (AAC) blocks impede heat transfer, enhancing thermal comfort. Modern catalogues of such materials often feature hollow

configurations, which allow for the addition of air pockets or extra insulation materials to further optimise performance.

Efficient window design is crucial for balancing daylight and minimising harsh sunlight, promoting natural ventilation, and reducing reliance on mechanical cooling. Historically, courtyard-based layouts offered shaded areas and central vents for airflow, with windows positioned to reduce heat gain. Modern residences often overlook these features, but homeowners can still use shading techniques ranging from traditional *chajjas* to modern louvers to reduce heat penetration. Additionally, dampened bamboo or reed curtains, or *chik blinds*, provide effective shading during dry summers. Modern adaptations like modular clay brick louvers offer both functionality and aesthetic appeal.

Planting local, drought-resistant trees significantly lowers ambient temperatures, reducing reliance on ACs and providing essential shade. In urban areas, vertical gardens and green roofs offer compact alternatives to trees. While maintenance is a consideration, automatic watering systems and innovative gardening techniques help address this challenge.

While deceptively simple, these measures are crucial for maintaining thermal comfort and reducing bills. Passive design effectiveness varies by climate, making it essential to prioritise the right strategies. Engaging architects and sustainability consultants becomes imperative for effective implementation.

Residents can enhance self-reliance and reduce their carbon footprint by transitioning to net-zero housing and leveraging government subsidy schemes for photovoltaic (PV) electricity generation and rainwater harvesting. Programmes like the Indian Housing Technology Mela under the PM Awas Yojana and the ministry of housing and urban affairs provide access to innovative building materials and technologies. Additionally, homeowners can enrol in green rating programs such as SVAGRIHA by Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment (GRIHA) to receive feedback on their sustainability efforts.

Investing in insulation, optimising thermal mass, and fostering natural ventilation may lack the glamour of a brand-new AC unit, yet its enduring benefits for both your finances and the environment are undeniable.

mutual interest – will guide our bilateral ties,” he added.

This was the first meeting between Jaishankar and Wang in almost a year, though they had a brief encounter on the sidelines of the Munich Security Conference in Germany in February.

A readout from the external affairs ministry noted the two ministers agreed that prolonging the current situation in the border areas is not in the interest of either side, and said that Jaishankar had “highlighted the need to redouble efforts to achieve complete disengagement from the remaining areas in Eastern Ladakh and restore border peace and tranquillity in order to remove obstacles towards return of normalcy in bilateral relations”.

The two ministers “agreed to continue and step up” meetings of diplomatic and military officials to take forward discussions to resolve the remaining issues at the earliest, the readout said.

In this context, Jaishankar and Wang agreed that the Working Mechanism on Consultation and Coordination on India-China Border Affairs (WMCC) should hold an early meeting. Jaishankar reiterated that the bilateral relationship is “best served by observing the three mutuals – mutual respect, mutual sensitivity and mutual interests”, the readout said.

Jaishankar also emphasised the “importance of fully abiding by relevant bilateral agreements, protocols, and understandings” reached by the two sides in the past, and that the LAC “must be respected and peace and tranquillity in the border areas always ensured”, the readout added.

The readout further noted that the meeting had focused on finding an early resolution of the remaining issues along the LAC to “stabilise and rebuild bilateral relations”.

The ministers also discussed the global situation and Jaishankar extended to Wang India’s support for China’s presidency of the SCO in 2025.

There was no immediate word from the Chinese side on the meeting, which was held against the backdrop of continuing tensions between India and China over the military standoff on the LAC, which is into its fifth year and has taken bilateral ties to a six-decade low.

Jaishankar and Wang last held a bilateral meeting on the margins of various Asean-related meetings in Jakarta on July 14, 2023 and Thursday’s meeting was an opportunity for the two sides to take stock of the situation along the LAC and continuing efforts to address remaining “friction points” such as Depsang and Demchok.

Jaishankar has maintained that the overall relationship with China can’t be normalised without peace and tranquillity on the border. He has also blamed China for the current situation, saying on numerous occasions that it violated border management agreements and massed troops along the LAC.

However, even at his meeting with Jaishankar last July, Wang had said the two countries should “not define overall relations with specific issues” – a reference to China’s position that the LAC standoff should be put in its “appropriate place” in the overall relationship.

China has lobbied in recent weeks for the resumption of direct flights to India and the easing of restrictions on issuing visas to Chinese nationals, especially technical personnel deputed to work with manufacturing units in India. The Indian side has given no indication it intends to address these matters, with officials saying all such issues are linked to the situation in Ladakh sector, where both sides have arrayed about 50,000 troops each.

Despite dozens of rounds of diplomatic and military talks, India and China have been unable to resolve “friction points” such as Depsang and Demchok.

A deadly clash in Galwan Valley in June 2020, which killed 20 Indian soldiers and at least four Chinese troops, sent ties plummeting and the Indian side also has concerns about China’s adversarial activities across the region, such as the deployment of surveillance vessels and efforts to gain access to ports and key facilities in neighbouring countries.

party MLA Kalpana Soren, Champai, and senior leaders of the JMM-led alliance were present at the swearing-in ceremony held at the Raj Bhavan.

“The INDIA front government had started various development projects (after the 2019 state polls). Then I was forced to quit after being framed as part of a conspiracy. Champai Soren ji continued the work amid political turbulence. Now, I have returned and will take things forward,” Hemant Soren said after the swearing-in.

Soren resigned from the chief minister’s post on January 31 and

was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) hours later on money laundering charges in connection with an alleged land racket in the state capital. Champai, a sitting minister at the time, was elected as the ruling coalition’s leader on the same day and took oath as chief minister on February 2. Soren, who has denied all charges, was released from jail last Friday after the Jharkhand high court granted him bail.

“I had given a message to you about how the Opposition hatched a conspiracy against me and how they succeeded in their evil designs. They attempted to keep me in jail for a long time, but I chose to resort to a legal battle. You supported me on the streets. Finally, justice was delivered, and I was released clean,” CM Soren said in a video message to the people. He said that he was given an opportunity to serve the people but “the conspirators could not digest that a tribal youth could reach such heights, and finally on January 31, I was removed on false charges”.

“We got Jharkhand after a long struggle. The adivasis, Dalits, and the poor have had to fight for their rights. I took the government to your doorstep. Now I am back... The thrust of our government would be to strengthen the work that was being done earlier. Jharkhand jhukega nahin, Jharkhand rukega nahin (Jharkhand won’t bow down, Jharkhand won’t stop),” he added.

The case against Soren originated with the arrest of Bhanu Pratap Prasad, a land revenue sub-inspector of Bargain circle area in the state capital, in 2023. Prasad was allegedly part of a land-grab syndicate that falsified original land records. Several original land records were recovered from Prasad, along with an image on his phone showing an 8.86-acre land parcel allegedly in Soren’s illegal possession.

Soon after being sworn in, Soren visited Sidhu Kanhu Park and Birsra Chowk where he garlanded the statues of tribal icons Sidhu Kanhu and Birsra Munda before heading to the state secretariat, where he took charge of office.

Champai lauded Soren and said: “I congratulate Hemant Babu for the formation of the new government. I congratulate all our alliance members.”

Soren’s return to the state’s helm is likely to provide impetus to the ruling alliance of JMM, Congress, Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) and Communist Party of India (Marxist–Leninist) Liberation ahead of this year’s state elections, members of the coalition said.

“The change of guard in Jharkhand will not hamper the prospects of the INDIA bloc at all in the assembly election. In fact, we will do much better than the 2019 polls,” AICC executive committee member Ajoy Kumar said.

The ruling alliance won 47 of the total 81 seats in the state in the 2019 assembly polls and the BJP managed to bag 25. The coalition swept the tribal seats in the elections, winning 26 of the 28 ST-reserved constituencies, while the BJP won the remaining two seats, down from the 11 it won in 2014. In the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the BJP won eight of the state’s 14 parliamentary seats, the JMM three, and the Congress two.

Kalpana Soren, who won the bypoll from the Gandey assembly constituency last month, said Soren will “continue to work for the people”.

“It is a blessing from people and our party workers. Following the high court’s decision, he [Soren] is once again the Jharkhand CM. Now, he will work even more for the people of Jharkhand...,” she said.

Speaking on condition of anonymity, coalition leaders said that the cabinet under Soren was likely to take shape on July 7. They added that while most of the ministers from the “JMM quota will be repeated in the cabinet, the Congress could bring in one or two new faces”. RJD MLA Satyanand Bhokta is likely to remain a part of the cabinet, they added.

The JMM held six berths, including that of the chief minister, in the state cabinet under Champai and also under Soren before his arrest. The Congress had four members, while RJD had one member in the cabinet. The 12th berth remained vacant, but those aware of the matter said it could be filled this time.

“The 12th berth is likely to be filled by JMM MLA Baidynath Ram, while Congress MLA Irfan Ansari is set to replace the position vacated by (Congress leader) Alamgir Alam, who is in jail. The Congress is also likely to change at least one of the three ministerial faces,” an alliance leader said on condition of anonymity.

The BJP launched an attack on Soren after he took charge, with the party’s state president Babul Marandi accusing him of making false promises.

“Last year, Hemant Soren had given assurance of regularizing (contracts of assistant policemen)... But Hemant, who has mastered the art of lying, cheating, fraud and deceit, has betrayed even the assistant policemen,” he posted on X.

**LK Advani discharged, condition stable: Official**

Advani was brought to the facility around 9pm on Wednesday.

He was accompanied by his daughter Pratibha Advani.

**CONG SEEKS ACTION OVER STATEMENTS BY MODI, THAKUR**

**NEW DELHI:** Congress MP Manickam Tagore has written to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, alleging that Prime Minister Narendra Modi and BJP MP Anurag Thakur made “factually incorrect, inaccurate and misleading statements” in the House, and sought appropriate action in the matter, officials familiar with the matter said.

Tagore has written to Speaker Birla, requesting that provisions of direction 115(1) be invoked over the statements made by Modi and Thakur.

The Virudhunagar MP called on Birla to initiate requisite proceedings and take appropriate action over “factually incorrect, inaccurate and misleading statements” made by the PM and Thakur in the House. Tagore also pointed out alleged inaccuracies in Thakur’s July 1 speech in the Lok Sabha.

**Navy chief 1st foreign head to review Bangladesh Naval Academy parade**

**NEW DELHI:** Indian Navy chief Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi on Thursday reviewed the passing out parade at the Bangladesh Naval Academy in Chittagong as chief guest, becoming the first foreign head of service to do so, the navy said in a statement.

He was on a four-day visit from July 1-4 to Bangladesh to bolster bilateral defence relations and explore new avenues for naval cooperation.

In his address at BNA, Tripathi recalled Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman’s vision of “Sonar Bangla” and the valour of the brave fighters of Mukti Bahini during the Liberation War of 1971 to motivate the 68 passing out officers to dedicate their lives to nation-building and

national security, the statement said. Naval cooperation between India and Bangladesh cuts across bilateral exercises, interactions through port calls and training initiatives.

During the visit, Tripathi held

talks with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and several top government and military officials. A 122-member contingent of the Bangladesh armed forces took part in the 2021 Republic Day parade in New Delhi.

# Amid growing calls to quit, Biden says he will stay in the prez fight

In public, Democratic representatives have categorically begun asking Biden to either quit or reassure American citizens about his health

**WASHINGTON:** President Joe Biden continued to resist calls to make way for a younger Democratic candidate, even as two new polls showed Biden losing voters and more voices, both from within his party and liberal civil society, asked the 81-year-old incumbent to end his campaign after his debate performance last week.

In response to the increasing speculation about his candidacy, Biden joined a call with his campaign staff, reached out to Congressional leadership and met with Democratic governors on Wednesday, a day before America closed down for a long holiday weekend.

Although while reports have suggested he is aware that the viability of his candidacy is under strain, Biden told his campaign staff, "Let me say this as clearly as I possibly can and as simply and straightforward as I can: I am running. I am the nominee of the Democratic Party. No one is pushing me out. I am not leaving."

## US president trailing in two opinion polls

Biden's refusal to relent came on a day when a New York Times-Siena poll, conducted after the debate, showed 49% of likely voters supporting the presumptive Republican nominee, former President Donald Trump, while only 43% backed Biden, the largest lead Trump has enjoyed in the poll. An overwhelming 74% found Biden too old for the job.

A Wall Street Journal poll found 48% of voters backing Trump and 42% backing Biden, with 80% of voters saying Biden was too old to run. Trump also enjoys a comfortable lead over Biden in key swing states that will determine the outcome.

The polls confirm what an increasing number of Demo-

crats have felt since last Thursday's debate, when Biden's age-related vulnerabilities, including the inability to complete thoughts, construct sentences, defend his record, or attack his opponent, were apparent.

In private, fearful of a second Trump administration, convinced that Biden can no longer beat him, and terrified that Biden's unpopularity will drag down all other Democrats on the ballot in Congressional and state races this year, party leaders have begun pushing the party to think of an alternative to Biden.

A Democratic state office bearer from a swing state told HT, "If Biden is our candidate, this election is over. There is no coming back from that debate. It has confirmed the worst fears of voters about his health. We may not win with a new candidate, but we definitely won't win with Biden as the candidate."

There is also a view within the party that the crisis can be

turned into opportunity. A new and younger panel of candidates can bring energy to the campaign and base, get rid of Biden's baggage with younger progressives and minorities on issues such as the war in Gaza, and force Trump to change his current narrative that relies on attacking Biden's age and record.

In public too, increasingly, Democratic representatives have categorically begun asking Biden to either quit or reassure American citizens about his health even though the senior most governors and party leaders have rallied behind the President.

Biden's campaign has struggled to respond to the criticism. In the hours after the debate, they framed it as "one bad night" that cannot offset three and a half years of his record. The day after the debate, Biden acknowledged that he wasn't young anymore and he couldn't speak and walk as well, but contrasted what he framed as his

truthfulness with Trump's lies.

This week, Biden blamed the performance on fatigue. But news reports have also suggested that Biden's performance wasn't an aberration and there have been many moments in recent months where he has been incoherent. His staff has put in several measures to protect him from public exposure, and other world leaders have been startled at his decline.

The challenge for Democrats is that never before has a candidate dropped out of the race this late in the electoral process. To start afresh, Biden will have to announce he was quitting and free up his delegates who will congregate at the party convention in mid-August in Chicago to pick a new candidate.

Strikingly, in perhaps the closest analogy to the current moment, it was in Chicago in 1968 when Democrats picked a candidate in turbulent circumstances at a convention after the incumbent, President Lyndon Johnson, chose not to contest

and the party faced the wrath of young voters who were then protesting against the Vietnam war.

## If Biden quits, Harris top contender to replace him

If Biden does choose to quit, as the vice-president, Kamala Harris — the first woman, the first Black, and the first person of Indian-origin to hold the office — will be a top contender to replace him. Harris has stoutly defended Biden in recent days, including on Wednesday when she told the campaign staff that she was "all in" and will follow the President's lead.

She also will have access to the campaign's funds, and her presence has the potential to energise people of colour as well as younger liberals. But many Democrats are concerned about her winnability. For most part, Harris's favourability ratings have been lower than that of Biden though after the debate, she polled better than the president in a direct face-off

with Trump.

There are also questions on whether she can draw in White voters in swing states. And given that Harris was in charge of border and immigration issues — which is Trump's key campaign critique of the Biden administration — the Republicans will have a clear line of attack against her. The fact that no woman has ever become president, and Trump defeated Hillary Clinton in 2016, also remains embedded in the minds of Democratic operatives.

Washington DC is abuzz with speculation about other contenders. Among those who may seek the nomination are California governor Gavin Newsom (who is seen as a charismatic leader with the ability to raise funds in quick time), Michigan governor Gretchen Whitmer (under whom Democrats won the governor, state Senate and state House race in the crucial swing state), Maryland governor Wes Moore (a Rhodes scholar, a combat veteran and only the third Black governor in US history), and Illinois governor JB Pritzker (who belongs to one of America's wealthiest business families and will have a fundraising advantage).

But all of this will eventually boil down to Biden and his wife, First Lady Jill Biden, both of whom have expressed their determination to continue in the fight. Over the next few days, whether Biden, his family and advisers prevail, or whether the mood among the Democratic rank and file and voters in general prevails, will determine the contours of the 2024 race.

# Absolute majority still possible, says far-right leader

**PARIS:** The French far right National Rally (RN) is still capable of winning an absolute majority in parliament, three-time presidential candidate Marine Le Pen said on Thursday, despite denouncing electoral pacts between the centre and the left aimed at thwarting its rise to power.

With just days left until the second round of the most critical legislative elections in France's recent history, a poll projected that the RN would fall short of an absolute majority despite its success in the June 30 first round.

The outcome of the election will see if postwar France elects its first far-right government or enters into an era of potentially paralysing coalition politics.

The centrist forces of President Emmanuel Macron and a broad-left wing coalition have withdrawn over 200 candidates from the run-off on Sunday in a joint effort to ensure the far right is defeated.

"I think there is still the capacity to have an absolute majority with the electorate turning out in a final effort to get what they want," Le Pen told BFMTV in an interview.

"I say turn out to vote as it's a really important moment to get a change in politics in all the areas that are making you suffer right now," she said.

If the RN wins an absolute majority of 289 seats in the 577-member National Assembly, it will be able to form a government with Le Pen's 28-year-old protegee Jordan Bardella as prime minister.

But she acknowledged that the "operation" by Macron's centrists and the New Popular Front (NFP) coalition to withdraw candidates "had the aim of preventing the RN from having an absolute majority."

The moves have sparked speculation a possible right-centre-left coalition could emerge after the election to prevent the RN taking power.

# Fourth human case of bird flu reported in US

**WASHINGTON/SYDNEY:** US officials on Wednesday reported the country's fourth human case of bird flu linked to the current outbreak of the virus in dairy cattle.

As with previous cases, the person worked on a farm and was exposed to infected cows, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) said in a statement, adding that the risk to the general population remained "low".

The infection occurred in Colorado and the affected person only had eye symptoms, was given antiviral medication, and has since recovered, it said.

A first US infection in the southern state of Texas was announced on April 1. Two

other cases were subsequently reported in Michigan.

Numerous herds of cows are infected across several American states, an epidemic which was first detected in March.

## Bird flu curbs McDonald's in Australia

McDonald's fast-food outlets in Australia have cut breakfast service hours as bird flu outbreaks around the country hit egg supplies.

Australian authorities say H7 avian influenza has emerged at nearly a dozen poultry farms across Victoria, New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory. Scientists say the bird flu strain is genetically related to viruses detected in Australia's wild bird population and is not the H5 strain spreading elsewhere in the world.

## UKRAINE'S FORCES 'RETREAT' FROM A DISTRICT IN STRATEGIC TOWN

**KYIV:** Ukraine said on Thursday its forces had withdrawn from a district in the key eastern town of Chasiv Yar, where Russian forces have recently claimed several advances. The fall of the small hilltop town is a worrying prospect for Ukraine because it would likely accelerate Russian advances towards large civilian hubs in the wider eastern Donetsk region.

"It became impractical to hold the Kanal district, which the enemy had entered, because it threatened the lives and well-being of our soldiers," a Ukrainian military spokesman said on state-run television.

"Our defenders' positions had been destroyed. The command decided to retreat to better protected and prepared positions," Nazar Voloshyn added.

Russia had said this week that its forces had advanced around Chasiv Yar but it was unclear if it was claiming its forces had crossed a canal which runs through the eastern part of the town. AFP

# Israel to send delegation to negotiate hostage release deal: Netanyahu

**JERUSALEM:** Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu announced on Thursday he has agreed to send a delegation for talks on securing the release of hostages seized in the October 7 attacks.

In a statement after telephone talks with US President Joe Biden, Netanyahu's office said: "The prime minister updated President Biden about his decision to send a delegation that would continue negotiations for freeing the hostages."

There was no indication where the delegation would go or when it would leave.

Netanyahu called a meeting of his security cabinet for late Thursday to discuss proposals sent by Hamas through Qatari mediators to end the Gaza conflict, media reports said.

Hamas has demanded an end to fighting and an Israeli withdrawal as a prelude to any hostage deal.

Prior efforts to end the nearly

nine-month conflict were mediated by Egypt and Qatar, with talks held in both locations.

Meanwhile, the Lebanese Hezbollah group said it launched over 200 rockets on Thursday at several military bases in Israel in retaliation for a strike that killed one of its senior commanders. AGENCIES

## Philippines says its forces will retaliate if attacked again

**MANILA:** Philippine forces will defend themselves with "the same level of force" if they come under assault again from China's coast guard in the disputed South China Sea, where Chinese personnel armed with machetes and spears injured Filipino navy personnel and damaged two of their boats in a chaotic face-off last month, the Philippine military chief said on Thursday. AP

## 26,000 evacuate as California wildfire spreads

**CALIFORNIA:** Firefighters lined roads to keep flames from reaching homes as helicopters dropped water on a growing wildfire on Wednesday in Northern California that has forced at least 26,000 people to evacuate. The Thompson fire broke out on Tuesday about 110km north of Sacramento, near the city of Oroville in Butte County. AP

# To save its spotted owls, US to shoot down thousands of another species

**WASHINGTON:** To save the imperiled spotted owl from potential extinction, US wildlife officials are embracing a contentious plan to deploy trained shooters into dense West Coast forests to kill almost a half-million barred owls that are crowding out their cousins.

The US Fish and Wildlife Service strategy released on Wednesday is meant to prop up declining spotted owl populations in Oregon, Washington state and California.

Documents released by the agency show up to about 450,000 barred owls would be shot over three decades after the birds from the eastern US encroached into the West Coast territory of two owls: northern spotted owls and California spotted owls. The smaller spotted owls have been unable to compete with the invaders, which have large broods and need less room to survive than spotted owls. Past efforts to save spotted

owls focused on protecting the forests where they live, sparking bitter fights over logging but also helping slow the birds' decline. The proliferation of barred owls in recent years is undermining that earlier work, officials said. "Without actively managing barred owls, northern spotted owls will likely go extinct in all or the majority of their range, despite decades of collaborative conservation efforts," said Fish and Wildlife Service Oregon state supervisor Kessina Lee. AP

## Euros big boys ready for showdown

The clash between the tournament's two most impressive teams will be the marquee matchup for the final in Berlin

**HERZOGENAURACH:** Host nation Germany face Spain in Friday's Euro 2024 quarter-final in Stuttgart riding a wave of belief not seen in the proud football nation for almost a decade. After a series of poor performances at major tournaments, the most decorated nation in European football history are again confident of a deep run.

Germany veteran and 2014 World Cup winner Toni Kroos said Wednesday "the goal is to win the tournament. We want to go a lot further and in the dressing room we are very convinced we will achieve that."

The bold stance is a far cry from nine months ago, when Hansi Flick became the first coach sacked in Germany's history after a 4-1 demolition by Japan in Wolfsburg. His replacement Julian Nagelsmann only won one of his first four games in charge, but in March laid the groundwork for a successful Euro run.

Nagelsmann made 11 changes to the squad, bringing in players from eventual Bundesliga champions Bayer Leverkusen and surprise runners-up Stuttgart, while axing several big names.

But Nagelsmann's most crucial step was bringing back Kroos, who had stepped down from international football in 2021. The midfielder has excelled in what will be his final tournament before retiring from football completely.

The clash between the tournament's two most impressive teams — and the only sides to have won three Euros titles — would be a marquee matchup for the final in Berlin.

But with other pre-tournament favourites like France, England and Portugal stuttering, whoever emerges victorious on Friday will be favoured to go all the way to the German capital.

With four wins in four, Spain are the only side to have tasted victory in each of their matches at Euro 2024 and have scored nine goals while conceding just one. Germany have won three and drawn one but have faced challenges along the way.

A player with an unblemished record of success, six-time Champions League winner Kroos believes the will to win comes "only through experience. You can have a winning mentality or belief, you can live it, but it's hard to convey it in conversations. You have to go through experiences and that's how your belief grows."

Kroos pointed to the "difficult situations" which have honed Germany's tenacity. "Against Hungary we had difficult moments, against Switzerland we were behind. Versus Denmark things did not go so smoothly," Kroos said, explaining "something like that helps you get through tough phases, stay calm and believe in yourself. We now have a different belief. We are now winning games or at least not losing games that we were clearly losing in the past."

Kroos will do battle against Spain, the country he has lived in for the past decade. He said his knowledge of the Spanish players from his time at Real was no clear advantage, saying "they're all pretty well known. I don't think we're expecting any big surprises."

The 34-year-old felt underappreciated in Germany, which motivated his decision to leave Bayern for Madrid in 2014.

Bayern powerbroker Uli Hoeness was particularly critical of Kroos, calling him "sideways pass Toni" and saying in 2021 "Toni Kroos has no place in modern football anymore".

Hoeness, the man who built Bayern into a global powerhouse, clearly understands football, which made the criticism even more bizarre. Asked on Wednesday if the Spanish were quicker to see his value faster than the Germans, the midfielder said coolly "I'll say it like this, some of them understand quickly, and some others need a bit more time."

"But eventually, they all understand."



"Germany are a fantastic team, they have some of the best players in the world and they are very organised and disciplined. But they will come up against a team very similar to themselves: very dedicated, very well organised, hard to beat and hungry for success."

## Will Mbappe finally fire for France against Portugal?

**HAMBURG:** Kylian Mbappe leads France into Friday's Euro 2024 quarter-final against Portugal having yet to find his best form at the tournament after months of speculation about his club future and then the broken nose which overshadowed his team's opening game.

The 25-year-old will again sport a protective face mask on Friday in Hamburg, a necessity following the injury he suffered in the 1-0 win against Austria on June 17.

Mbappe admitted prior to Monday's last-16 victory against Belgium that he hates having to wear the mask and that it makes him feel like he is watching the tournament with virtual reality goggles on, rather than being an

active participant. Yet he is the leader of a France team that has reached the quarter-finals despite scoring only three goals in four matches, one his penalty in a 1-1 draw with Poland and the other two coming from own goals. He and his team have had chances, but have not been taking them.

France have an Expected Goals (xG; a metric used to measure the quality of a chance created) of almost seven, bettered only by Spain, Portugal and Germany.

Mbappe's own xG is 2.54, with only Cristiano Ronaldo and Germany's Kai Havertz having a higher number.

It is a source of frustration for Mbappe that he has lit up the last two World Cups but has not enjoyed the same success at the Euros. He starred as France became world champions in Russia in 2018 and again in Qatar in

2022, when he netted a hat-trick in their final defeat against Argentina. The new Real Madrid signing has 12 World Cup goals, but his penalty against Poland is his only goal in seven appearances at the Euros.

Three years ago he failed to find the net before missing the crucial penalty in the shoot-out defeat by Switzerland in the last 16. "My Euros didn't start like I wanted but I am here to help the

team and I really want to have success with this team." Mbappe said just before the 1-0 victory against Belgium. "The Euros is the only thing I have not won with the national team so I really want to win it."

France assistant coach Guy Stephan said on Wednesday that Mbappe had been "traumatised" by the collision with Austria's Kevin Danso which left him with the broken nose.

The fact that his final season at Paris Saint-Germain was often difficult may not have helped either. He scored 44 goals, but Mbappe was also frozen out of the squad at the start of the campaign after telling the club he did not plan to extend his contract beyond this year.

His playing time was again reduced in the final three months of the season, once he had con-

firmed to PSG that he would be leaving. Sources recently told AFP that Mbappe is still trying to get PSG to pay significant sums of money owed to him in wages.

Yet France will hope Mbappe finds extra motivation against Portugal as he comes up against his boyhood hero.

The recent completion of Mbappe's move to Madrid put an end to years of speculation about when he would sign for the Spanish giants, and his long-held desire to one day join them was in part down to Ronaldo.

He idolised Ronaldo growing up, and decorated his bedroom with posters of the Portuguese superstar. Real attempted to sign Mbappe for the first time in December 2012, when he was approaching his 14th birthday.

He was invited to Madrid for a week, taken to a game and to the

club's Valdebebas training ground where he met Zinedine Zidane and Ronaldo.

There is a famous picture of Ronaldo with his arm around the youngster, who only comes up to his hero's shoulder.

"He is a hero from my childhood and it was amazing to meet him when I visited Valdebebas," he once told Spanish sports daily Marca.

Now Mbappe is about to become the star in Madrid, where five-time Ballon d'Or winner Ronaldo was the main man for almost a decade. But first he knows that in order to keep alive his own dream of winning the European Championship with France he will need to knock out Portugal, and in the process potentially bring an end to Ronaldo's remarkable international career.

## OLYMPIC-BOUND ATHLETES WILL MAKE COUNTRY PROUD: PM MODI

**NEW DELHI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed confidence that India's Olympic-bound contingent will make the country proud and live up to the aspirations of 140 crore people.

India will be sending close to 120 athletes to Paris with the hope that they will better the Tokyo Games tally of seven medals, which included Neeraj Chopra's gold in javelin throw. "Interacted with our contingent heading to Paris for the Olympics. I am confident our athletes will give their best and make India proud. Their life journeys and success give hope to 140 crore Indians," the Prime Minister posted on X after meeting Paris-bound athletes that included shooters, archers, track and field athletes and support staff. The contingent was accompanied by Sports Minister Mansukh Mandaviya, Minister of State for Sports Raksha Khadse and Indian Olympic Association President PT Usha.

The PM also posted images of him with the athletes and support staff.

The PM also interacted virtually with Neeraj Chopra, who will aim to defend his crown in Paris, boxer Nikhat Zareen and two-time Olympic medallist shuttler PV Sindhu.

## From record 'A' cuts to universality spots

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**BENGALURU:** Three years ago around this time, Sajan Prakash was riding a wave. He had made history by becoming the first Indian swimmer to achieve the Olympic Qualifying Time ('A' cut) and was headed to Tokyo. Another Olympics is round the corner, but Sajan features nowhere in the pre-Games landscape. He's checked himself in at an ayurvedic facility in Thodupuzha, Kerala, to tend to his sore muscles from stubborn injuries. Sajan couldn't qualify for the Paris Olympics.

No Indian swimmer made the 'A' or 'B' qualifying mark this time. It left India to fall back on Universality Places — which are handed to underrepresented National Olympic Committees. Through it, one male and one female swimmer — Srihari Nataraj (100m backstroke), who also made the 'A' cut last time, and Dhinidhi Desinghu (200m freestyle) will represent India at the Paris Olympics in a couple of weeks' time. To go from history-making direct qualification to universality quotas, isn't a great look for Indian swimming. If anything, it's a step back.

"It's definitely disappointing," Sajan told HT. "We had a breakthrough last time with both Hari and I making the 'A' cut." Sajan has no delusions about what may have gone wrong in

his case. "I swam a lot this time but my planning and periodisation weren't great. My shoulder wasn't feeling good either and I couldn't cope with the intense workouts."

In April this year, World Aquatics modified the criteria for Universality places. It stipulated that athletes can only compete in up to two Olympics and shouldn't be older than 30 years as of December 2024. Sajan already has two Olympic appearances on his CV and will turn 31 this September. "It was almost as if the rules were changed for me," he joked.

"I knew I wouldn't be eligible for Universality and making an 'A' cut was the only option. The qualifying times were a lot faster this time which didn't make it any easier. There was barely any difference this time between 'A' and 'B' timings. I was hoping to go below 1:56, but I was stuck at 1:59."

The 'A' mark for men's 200m butterfly was 1:55.78. For Paris, the average gap between 'A' and 'B' marks or OQT and Olympic Consideration Timing (OCT) is just 0.5%, as opposed to 3%, for Tokyo.

Asian Games medallist, who's now transitioned to coaching wondered how things had come to such a pass. "After two 'A' timings for Tokyo, I was pretty certain we'd double the number this time. Being down to zero is puzzling."

Srihari called it "disappointing" to not make direct qualification. "I've been training really well this past season. I had a few shots at it and I kept getting better each time I swam the race, but it just wasn't enough." Srihari clocked 54.68 (100m backstroke) to win the Mare Nostrium meet in May. The Paris 'A'

cut was set at 53.74 and he holds the national record at 53.77.

Dronacharya awardee Nihar Ameen who coaches both Srihari and 14-year-old Dhinidhi believes all is not lost but there's still work to be done. "For Srihari, we did everything we possibly could, but it just didn't happen. Maybe he needs to drop a bit of weight to get faster. All said, an 'A' mark is mighty tough and it's not easy for an athlete to deliver across two Olympic cycles. We were kind of between a rock and a hard place for the Universality and the 'B' and 'A' cut."

But he's home and dry now headed to Paris and all is not yet lost. What we don't have is depth in Indian swimming. So, it's just down to a couple of them to crack the 'A' timing."

Indian swim coaches concur that the lack of numbers coming through is partly due to early burnout. "We have a high burnout and dropout rate before 17," Ameen pointed out. "If a coach can't deliver in the first national meet with a 13-14-year-old kid, parents often pull them out of the program and take them elsewhere. So, coaches are obliged to train kids in a way that they peak early which ends up in early burnout and injuries. The key is to raise the level of coaches with a robust coaches' education program. It could take a while."

## Djokovic survives test versus rookie

**LONDON:** Novak Djokovic came through a testing Wimbledon workout to stay on course for a record-equaling eighth men's title on Thursday as Andy Murray prepared to launch his emotional farewell.

Jessica Pegula became the highest-ranked player to exit the tournament so far, dumped out by China's Wang Xinyu in the second round.

Seven-time champion Djokovic did not have it all his own way against British wild card Jacob Fearnley but came through 6-3, 6-4, 5-7, 7-5 in a second-round match lasting three hours.

It appeared to be business as usual for the Serbian as he coasted into a two-set lead on Centre Court but the 27th-ranked Fearnley broke his illustrious opponent twice in the third set to reduce the deficit.

Fearnley, playing in his first Grand Slam, carved out two break points in the sixth game of the fourth set but missed his chance and Djokovic broke in the 11th game before serving out for the win. "I didn't have a chance to see him play," said Djokovic, 37. "Actually two days ago, I saw him for the first time.

Obviously there's always an element of surprise and with him having nothing to lose. Most of the British players grow up being exposed to grass courts, quick surfaces, so they know exactly how to play. It's a very windy day, very challenging conditions and I thought he served very well."

Djokovic, who is playing with protection after a recent knee operation, is seeking to equal Roger Federer's record of eight Wimbledon men's titles and is aiming for a record 25th Grand Slam title.

Fifth-ranked Pegula went down 6-4, 6-7 (7/9), 6-1 to China's Wang Xinyu, who celebrated her first win against a top-10 player.

The American battled back after losing the first set, saving a match point in the second-set tie-break, before levelling the match.

But China's 42nd-ranked Wang raced into a 5-0 lead in the decider.

Wang, 22, said: "Couple of days ago I was asking my coach, 'When will this happen?' "Jessica was really tough to play on grass. Her ball was super low and I'm just really happy I won in the end."

Wang will face Britain's Harriet Dart, who defeated Nottingham champion Katie Boulter, for a spot in the last 16.



"When the pressure is there, those catches need to be taken and all the moments of training come into your mind. And at that moment it was a brilliant effort from him to take the catch!" said Rohit. "I am blessed to have this team, who at any given time have stood up to the challenges."

Batting legend and coach Rahul Dravid said the reception that his team has received shows how India makes cricket brilliant while adding how it was the perfect way

to end his innings.

Virat Kohli's arrival had the crowd cheering him by his nickname, "Cheeku, Cheeku". Like Rohit, it also took him some time to be heard as the crowd showed him their appreciation.

"Since we came back what has happened is phenomenal! I remember when I won that World Cup as well. I couldn't connect with the emotions of the senior players back then. I was 22, 23. But now, it's a different feeling. Now, to be in this position. We both (Rohit) have been trying for so long. The only aim was to carry the team for so long," said Kohli.

Everyone bowed in respect when player of the tournament, Jasprit Bumrah, stepped on to the stage. "It feels amazing. This ground is really special in my life. As a kid, I came here to play cricket and what I saw today, I will never forget that," the Mumbai Indians and India star said about his connection with the ground.

The evening came to a close with the team taking a lap of honour while throwing signed tennis balls into the crowd. The lucky few got their hands of a precious moment. The others just soaked in the moment.

If you ever wanted to truly understand what makes Indian cricket tick, you just had to be there on a wet, humid evening at the Wankhede. It was the stuff that dreams are made of; dreams that someday in the future may turn into trophies themselves.

## Breakfast at Modi's: PM greets world champions

**NEW DELHI:** The T20 World Cup-winning Indian team met Prime Minister Narendra Modi at his official residence on Thursday, shortly after landing in the national capital after a non-stop 16-hour flight from Barbados. The players reached 7, Lok Kalyan Marg at around 11 am on the wet morning where they were hosted by the PM for breakfast.

Aboard Air India's Boeing 777-200LR with a special call sign AIC24WC, the Rohit Sharma-led side emerged from the IGI Airport at around 6 am to a huge gathering of fans and a heavy security arrangement.

Having broken India's 11-year jinx for an ICC trophy, there were no signs of jet-leg on Rohit's face when he cut the day's first cake with BCCI president Roger Binny and secretary Jay Shah at the airport.

The team then checked into ITC Maurya where another cake — one in the shape of the winning trophy — was cut by Rohit and Virat Kohli. The two stalwarts of India's white-ball cricket announced their retirement from the shortest format moments after India's thrilling win over South Africa in the final. All-rounder Ravindra Jadeja called time on his T20 career a day later.

From the hotel, the team along with BCCI President Roger Binny and Secretary Jay Shah were escorted to the Prime Minister's

residence. They donned a special jersey with 'Champions' emblazoned across it in bold letters.

In a 57-second clip posted on Modi's YouTube channel, the players, led by Rohit with the trophy, can be seen gleefully entering the PM's house. Modi, flanked by Rohit on his right and outgoing coach Rahul Dravid to his left, posed for a picture with the entire squad.

Yuzvendra Chahal, Bumrah, Kohli, Rohit, Dravid, Jadeja, Kuldeep Yadav, Axar Patel, and Rishabh Pant stood in the front row while Shivam Dube, Mohammed Siraj, Hardik Pandya, Jay Shah, Roger Binny, Suryakumar Yadav, Yashasvi Jaiswal, Arshdeep Singh, and Sanju Samson stood in the back.

The players then sat with Modi for a seemingly light-hearted conversation where Rohit, Dravid, Pandya, Kohli, and Player of the Tournament Bumrah took turns to speak to the PM.



## 'Would've been funny to stop at 9'

Anand won his 10th Leon Masters title, defeating opponents who were much younger than him

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**BENGALURU:** Age can seem a curious construct in chess. Last weekend, Argentinian Faustino Oro — all of 10 years & eight months (yes, Argentina and No 10!) became the world's youngest International Master in Barcelona. While in the northwestern Spanish province of Leon, Viswanathan Anand rang in own Number 10 — a 10th Leon Masters title, at age 54.

Anand's tenth Leon Masters title comes eight years after his previous win. "It would've been funny to stop at nine," Anand told Hindustan Times, laughing. "Ten is a nice number. I'm happy I can maintain this level."

Anand, who serves as Fide deputy president and is shepherding India's current crop of top young names, has been playing tournaments sparingly in recent years and believes the switch from following chess to suddenly sitting across another player at a competition can need some getting used to.

Before the Leon event, Anand got together with his Jordanian Club Cup teammate Jordan Van Foreest for a short training camp in Romania.

"My general way of following chess during the long breaks has to be readjusted a little bit right before an event because instead of thinking in very abstract terms that these things are possible and these aren't, I suddenly have to decide what am I going to play today. It's a very different thought."

At the Leon event, Anand found himself straddling generations — a former World Championship rival, one born the year he won his first Leon

Masters title, and a third, a fellow Indian younger to him by over three decades. "With (Veselin) Topalov, our rivalry goes back to 1993 thereabouts. Then there was Jaime (Santos) who was born in 1996 and Arjun (Erigaisi) who was born in 2003. So, you kind of don't know which era you want to belong to."

Anand and Topalov played each other in the 2010 World Championship in Sofia, Bulgaria. The Indian went on to

win the match, which had its fair share of misgivings, apart from Icelandic volcanic ash and a 40-hour road journey to get to Sofia. "I don't think Topalov and I thought too much (of the past). I had this feeling also with (Anatoly) Karpov long back. I played him after a couple of years and you realise, well, too much water has passed under the bridge and you don't even remember what it was all about."

Each match consisted of four

rapid games. Anand and Topalov played out two edgy draws to start the semi-final, and it was followed by the five-time world champion launching a full-blooded king side attack in the third game to walk away with a full point. It left Topalov staring at a must-win situation in the final game but Anand had little trouble finding a draw.

Defending champion Santos snuffed out the prospect of an all-Indian, inter-generational

final between Anand and Arjun with a come-from-behind win in the other semifinal.

"When I was paired with Topalov, I found that I got into trouble quite easily in the first two games, quite serious trouble in the second game. And finally, the same thing happened to me again with Jaime in the final. It seemed that I needed some time to get into these matches. But once I got in, my level in games three and four was much higher, also the confidence of saving difficult positions."

There's a reason why Anand is considered among the finest to have played the game and you could see it in the touch of class and the wealth of understanding he brought to the games. Like the stunning 3Lb4 move in the fourth game which perhaps rattled Santos and led him to make fateful captures.

Anand was delighted for his fellow newsmaker of the weekend — 10 year old Oro. "John Nunn (English GM) always used to say that you have to beat the young before they get very strong. Instead, I can say I've given him an autograph before he got very strong," Anand said after his win. "That's an achievement!"

## GM Gukesh holds Caruana; Pragg draws with Nepo

**BUCHAREST:** World Championship challenger Grandmaster D Gukesh played out a draw with tournament leader and top seed Fabiano Caruana of United States in the seventh round of the Superbet classic chess tournament here.

On another all-draws day, R Pragganandhaa signed peace with Ian Nepomniachtchi of Russia leaving the lead positions intact like the previous round.

Caruana on 4.5 points remains in front with two victories and five draws, he is followed by Gukesh, Pragganandhaa and Alireza Firouzja of France, who are all half a point behind the American. Nepomniachtchi shares the fifth spot with Maxime Vachier-Lagrave of France with a fifty percent score, a half point ahead of the trio of American Wesley So, Dutch Anish Giri and Uzbekistan's first son in chess Nodirbek Abdusattorov. Just two rounds remain in the \$350,000 prize money tournament.

Gukesh's choice of Italian opening gave him an optical advantage against Caruana. After the initial tussle, the players reached a middle game wherein the Indian had an edge thanks to better placed forces but Caruana was up to the task in finding the defense to maintain the balance.

The pieces got traded at regular intervals in this encounter and the players arrived at a Queen and rook endgame where neither side had a real chance. The game was drawn after 62 moves.

Pragganandhaa had a relatively easy day against Nepomniachtchi despite playing black. Years of working with World number one Magnus Carlsen and his own expertise as the two-time world championship challenger has made Nepomniachtchi a leading theoretician but in the seventh round the Indian surprised him with what looked like a sensational preparation. The next round would mostly decide the final outcome of the tournament as Caruana is facing Pragganandhaa and Gukesh has a tough nut to crack in his final white game in Anish. Firouzja might also fancy his chances for a maiden victory in the Grand chess tour if he can conquer the machine-like precision of Nepomniachtchi.

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# Govt plans duty reforms, tax tweaks to boost mfg

Changes are expected for items related to consumer electronics and medical devices

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**NEW DELHI:** The finance ministry is mulling several moves to ease business for domestic manufacturers—including easing procedural hurdles, rectifying tax anomalies, and recalibrating customs duties—in the upcoming Union Budget, according to two people familiar with the matter. The larger plan is to reduce import dependence and boost local manufacturing and value addition, the people added.

Among the moves being planned are removal of irritants for merchants claiming tax refunds, tweaking tariffs to make investments in critical sectors more viable, and correcting inverted duty structures in textiles, apparels, and engineering goods, the first person cited above said, requesting not to be named. Further, a periodic review of import duty exemptions is underway, with only items that benefit the domestic economy likely to be retained, the person added.

The second person, who also

requested anonymity, said that customs duty changes are expected for items related to two key sectors—consumer electronic goods and medical devices—to boost component production in these sectors.

"For these sectors, the know-how is not under patent protection, and all it may require to attract fresh investments is a little tariff support," said the second person. "A price arbitrage of 5% between imports and local production on account of import duty, ocean freight and insurance can be a big incentive for local production."

The plan is to encourage more value addition in segments where local production is pre-

dominantly in the nature of assembling imported components, the person added.

The government may also expand the authorised economic operator (AEO) scheme, granting accredited merchants and logistics players privileges at ports, including quicker clearance and deferred duty payments, the second person added.

An email sent to the spokesperson for the finance ministry and to Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) on Tuesday seeking comments on the story remained unanswered at the time of publishing.

Even as the government prioritises improving ease of doing business and cutting red tape in

claiming tax refunds, experts said that an amnesty scheme under customs is the need of the hour. "This would go a long way in resolving legacy litigation and in fostering certainty in doing business," said Abhishek Jain, indirect tax head and partner at KPMG. "Separately, rate rationalization for certain products is also being looked forward to, specifically where the rate of duty on import of raw material is more than that on import of finished goods."

In the Union budget for FY24, the government simplified the customs duty structure by reducing the number of applicable rates from 21 to 13.

Further, the Centre is exploring free trade agreements (FTAs) with various countries and blocs to boost exports and facilitate trade. These pacts reduce tariffs and some non-tariff barriers, allowing trade partners to get easier access to one another's markets.

India's FTAs are now pivoting towards markets in the West, including the UK, the EU, the UAE, Eurasia, and Australia. These recent agreements reflect an emphasis on specific goods and services, with promising prospects for sectors such as gems and jewellery, plastics, engineering goods, agro-processed foods, textiles, technology services, and financial services.

# Markets hit fresh highs; Sensex closes above 80K

**MUMBAI:** Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty ticked higher to close at fresh all-time high levels on Thursday, following buying in market heavyweights ICICI Bank, Infosys and TCS amid a largely positive trend in global equities.

The 30-share BSE Sensex scaled an intraday record high of 80,392.64 in early trade. The index pared most of the gains later due to volatility and profit-taking by investors at record levels. Sensex closed 62.87 points or 0.08% higher at 80,049.67, its all-time closing high. The broader Nifty also hit an intraday record high of 24,401 in early trade before closing almost flat. The 50-issue index rose by 15.65 points or 0.06% to settle at a record 24,302.15 with 23 of its shares closing higher and 27 with losses.

"The defensive bet on large caps like IT and pharma gained momentum due to the diminishing US inflationary pressure, improvement in QoQ earnings outlook and a resultant sharp fall in the US 10-year bond yield."

"The buoyancy in government spending and the green shoots in corporate earnings are now supporting the premium valuation. Return of FII to the domestic market and expectation of a rate cut in September are supporting market sentiment," Vinod Nair, head of

research at Geojit Financial Services, said.

Among Sensex shares, HCL Technologies, ICICI Bank, Tata Motors, Sun Pharmaceuticals, Tata Consultancy Services, Infosys, Kotak Mahindra Bank and Mahindra and Mahindra were the gainers. In contrast, HDFC Bank, Bajaj Finance, Larsen & Toubro, Tech Mahindra, UltraTech Cement and IndusInd Bank were among the laggards.

Analysts said that stock markets traded within a narrow range and ended nearly unchanged. "The Nifty has approached its immediate target of 24,500 and appears slightly overextended. It would be prudent to take some profits and wait for a potential dip before considering new long positions in the index." Ajit Mishra—SVP, research, Religare Broking Ltd said.

In the broader market, the BSE Smallcap gauge jumped 0.62% and the midcap index

climbed 0.60%. Among the indices, healthcare soared by 1.17%, IT jumped by 1.12%, tech by 0.98%, auto by 0.88% and telecommunication rose by 0.73%. However, consumer durables fell by 0.22%, FMCG (0.15%), financial services (0.13%), and Oil & Gas (0.02%). A total of 2,185 stocks advanced while 1,742 declined and 94 remained unchanged on the BSE. As many as 23 Nifty shares advanced, 27 declined on the exchange.

In Asian markets, Tokyo, Hong Kong and Seoul ended in the positive territory, while Shanghai closed in the red. European markets were trading in the green territory in mid-session deals.

US markets ended higher on Wednesday during the shortened trading session. Stock exchanges will remain closed on Thursday on account of Independence Day. Global oil benchmark Brent crude fell 0.52% to \$86.89 a barrel.

## FPI BUYING HITS 6-MONTH HIGH IN JUNE: NSDL DATA

**BENGALURU:** Foreigner portfolio investors (FPI) snapped a two-month selling streak in the markets and turned net buyers in June, hitting a six-month high. The heaviest-weighted sector, financials, garnered FPI inflows worth ₹9,170 crore during the month, the highest since December 2023, according to data from the National Securities Depository (NSDL).

The FPI buying in the sector came after two months of outflows worth ₹18,200 crore, boosting the markets index, private banks and banking stocks 6.9%-8% higher in June.

"Once the concerns on the national elections-related uncertainty were over, the government was formed and ministries were allocated, the FPIs were assured of policy continuity," said Ajit Banerjee, chief investment officer at Shriram Life Insurance.


FPI outflows from domestic equities hit a record high on June 4, the election results day that showed a surprise weaker mandate for the ruling National Democratic Alliance (NDA).

"It appears the FPIs have realised that selling in the most-performing market would be a wrong strategy," Banerjee said. Helped by the return of foreign inflows and sustained domestic buying, the blue-chips Nifty 50 and S&P BSE Sensex rose about 7% each in June, the best monthly performance in 2024.

"Once the interest rate cut starts in the US, which is expected by the end of the year, it could trigger bigger FPI inflows into emerging markets like India as the arbitrage will open up between the two countries," said Viraj Gandhi, chief executive of SAMCO Mutual Fund.

Information technology companies led Indian shares higher on Thursday, in line with Asian peers, after softer US labour data boosted hopes for a rate cut in September.

Telecommunication, consumer services, capital goods and healthcare sectors saw FPI inflows worth between ₹2,700 crore and ₹8,000 crore in June.

Currently serving as co-convenor of the G20's High Level Expert Group for multi-lateral development bank reforms and president of the Institute of Economic Growth, Singh has played a crucial role in India's economic policymaking for decades.

LSE president Larry Kramer praised Singh's long-standing relationship with the university, saying, "NK's life and

career have exemplified LSE's mission to apply the social sciences in service of humanity."

## Aviation ministry looking to boost air cargo volumes

**NEW DELHI:** The Centre has begun talking to industry stakeholders such as Indian airlines, scheduled and charter cargo operators to find ways to liberalise norms governing air cargo, in an attempt to boost the volume of exports by air from the country, two officials involved in the ongoing discussions said.

Among the steps being deliberated are allowing foreign freighters to pick and deliver cargo from multiple cities in one run, and easing of paperwork and procedures for exporters and shippers, among other things.

"We are looking at ways to increase participation of freighters, assessing cargo throughput of the top 20 Indian airports, and other ways to improve efficiency and create a competitive mar-

ket," the first official cited above said, adding that the government hopes to make concrete progress on these proposals within a year.

The second official said the government is working on ways to ease the KYC (know your customer) process for exporters as well as standardising the e-invoice format for shippers for greater efficiencies. Both officials spoke on condition of anonymity. The development comes on the back of the government

setting a target in 2022 of handling 10 million tonnes of air cargo per year by 2030.

That's a big jump from the 3.4 million tonnes of freight handled last fiscal (FY24) by all of India's operational airports combined, which included 2 million tonnes of international freight, per data from Airports Authority of India.

Queries sent to the civil aviation ministry were unanswered till press time. As part of the discussions with stakeholders,

the civil aviation ministry is working on creating a smoother process for foreign freight operators to carry cargo to and from multiple points in India, the first official said.

Under the current framework, Indian freighter operators are allowed double dipping—when cargo is carried to and from more than one city—but international freight operators are approved double-dipping only on a case-by-case basis.

## IT services hiring picks up

**BENGALURU/MUMBAI:** Emerging from a long spell of declining revenue growth and high attrition, Indian information technology services companies have embarked on a hiring spree, particularly in search of engineers with AI chops.

The previous fiscal, 2023-24, marked a bleak phase in domestic IT services hiring, with headcount and job offers declining amid muted global demand for software services and advances in artificial intelligence.

But the tide appears to be turning in terms of both business and recruitments for India's \$245-billion IT services industry, according to industry analysts and recruitment firms. IT services companies, however, have not provided a clear indication of their hiring plans for this financial year, 2024-25.

"Some of our IT clients have inked a few large deals, which in turn has led to a demand for more employees skilled in Generative AI," said Vijay Sivaram, chief executive of Quesst IT Staffing, adding that he expects hiring in the IT sector to increase by

25% in the three months ended March.

Tata Consultancy Services Ltd, India's largest software exporter, in May said it had doubled its pipeline of generative artificial intelligence projects to \$900 million in the March quarter. Infosys Ltd, India's second-largest IT services company, has said it is working on 225 GenAI projects.

"There has been a 20% uptick in mandates in the IT sector in the March-end quarter when compared sequentially," said Sunil Chemankotil, country manager at recruitment firm Adecco India. "The bench utili-

sation is high and, therefore, IT firms are now hiring candidates with experience in larger numbers than in earlier quarters," Sivaram added.

Utilisation rate refers to the proportion of staff actively involved in projects while 'bench' refers to employees yet to be assigned a project. Infosys and Wipro Ltd reported a utilisation rate of 83.5% and 86.9%, respectively, as for March.

Industry experts estimate the worst may be over for India's IT sector although elections in key markets such as the US and the UK could see changes in outsourcing policies, and the Israel-Palestine and Ukraine-Russia war could still impact the deal pipeline.

"Our estimates indicate that hiring has grown by 5-7% in Q1 (April-June quarter) compared to the previous quarter. This increase is mainly driven by higher IT spending and investments in AI capabilities," said Krishna Vij, vice-president and business head of IT staffing at TeamLease Digital, a Bengaluru-based staffing firm. Despite volatile economic conditions and budgetary constraints, "we estimate further acceleration in hiring," Vij added.

## GenAI may be hurting BPOs as clients seek to automate

**BENGALURU:** The rise of generative artificial intelligence (GenAI) led to the weakest revenue growth at the business process outsourcing (BPO) units of Infosys Ltd and Tech Mahindra Ltd in at least six years in FY24, analysts said.

The advent of ChatGPT in November 2022 propelled GenAI to boardroom discussions in companies globally. Across industries, companies are now looking at the technology disruptor, which can create content in written, audio and visual forms, to replace routine human work.

"We are seeing in general an overall slowdown in BPO. Contracts are being renegotiated and companies are looking to automate BPO operations," said Ray Wang, chief executive officer and founder

of Constellation Research.

Two months ago, K. Krithivasan, chief executive officer of Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), India's largest information technology services company, said in an interview with the *Financial Times* that GenAI could almost finish the BPO business.

Pune-based Tech Mahindra's BPO division generated ₹7,712 crore (\$930 million) in revenue in FY24, which was about 15% of its overall revenue of \$6.28 billion. Revenue growth at 7.12% was the slowest since FY18 and came after two consecutive years of growth exceeding 30%.

"As this successful business has gained scale it becomes harder to grow fast on a larger base," said Peter Bendor-Samuel, chief executive of Everest

Group, a US consultancy that advises clients on outsourcing. "The customer experience market where TechM has most of its work is facing significant uncertainty, driven by the possibilities offered by GenAI. As these issues get sorted out, we expect that this area will regain momentum. However, at this time, the uncertainty is creating a drag on growth."

In the case of Tech Mahindra, another analyst said the BPO arm's slowdown was due to slowing demand in its mainstay telecom business.

"I would attribute slower growth in BPO due to the softening demand in Tech M's major vertical of telecom. Last year's protracted transition of leadership from C.P. Gurnani to Mohit Joshi didn't help matters," said Phil Fersht, chief executive officer of HfS Research, an outsourcing-research firm in the US.




Khan added in the video that she is making a wig out of the shorn hair to use during this phase of her treatment.

## SOL students vandalise SBSC to 'avenge' punishment for cheating: Peers regret, principals debate

One of the topmost reasons behind recent cancellation of NEET and UGC-NET exams has been cheating. Now, in a recent incident, a student from Delhi University's (DU) School of Open Learning (SOL), who was asked to leave the exam hall in Shaheed Bhagat Singh College (SBSC) for using his mobile phone during the test, came back to avenge his punishment. The student, along with four of his peers, caused damage worth ₹2.5 lakh to the property (including an interactive

smart classroom panel), as per footage collected from the CCTV. Narrating the incident, SBSC principal Arun Kumar Attree tells us, "The first-year student of BA (Prog) appeared for an exam on June 26 at the college, during which he was caught cheating with the help of his mobile phone. But, on June 30, he and his friends entered the restricted section of the college used for Faculty Development Programs (FDP) sessions only and wreaked havoc. We filed a complaint at the Malviya Nagar Police Station."

Payal Mago, director SOL, says, "A disciplinary committee has been established to hear out the student

and for the college to make an informed decision, which will be submitted within the next 15 days."

### SOL STUDENTS FEEL LET DOWN

"If someone is going to cheat like this and violate academic integrity, then what is the point of us slaving away, trying to score high marks," rues Anshu Mishra, a final-year student of BA (Hons) English. Concurring with Mishra is Shashank Verma, a second-year MBA student, chimes in, "Incidents like this sully the reputation of all SOL students. Strict action must be taken against this person."

### PRINCIPALS SAY...

Bijayalaxmi Nanda, principal, Miranda House, says, "We can't demonise all SOL students for the action of one. The solution is a two-pronged approach—prevention (of such acts) through behavioural change, and campaigns and legal action to hold the wrongful accountable." Meanwhile, Swati Pal, principal of Janki Devi Memorial College (JDMC), opines, "The difference between regular college students and others is the process of socialisation. The university could create centralised spaces to accommodate students during exams for an added sense of belonging and accountability."

If SOL students behave like this, it will be difficult for any college authorities to conduct examinations for them because of all the extra effort needed.



### Air pollution exposure are deadly even at levels much lower than Indian norms: Study

**NEW DELHI:** Air pollution exposure can cause deaths even at levels much lower than what is considered the Indian national standard, according to a new study published in Lancet Planetary Health.

The report found that across 10 major cities in India — Delhi, Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Chennai, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Mumbai, Pune, Shimla, and Varanasi — around 33,000 deaths every year are attributable to PM 2.5 pollution levels that breach the WHO guideline of only 15 micrograms per cubic metres. The national standard for fine, particulate matter or PM 2.5 (24 hours) is 60 micrograms per cubic metres.

In terms of proportion, Delhi recorded the highest deaths attributable to air pollution across all cities studied — 11.5% of all deaths — amount-

ing to 12,000 each year. Varanasi is estimated to have recorded 10.2% of all deaths (830 each year) during the study period, which were attributable to short-term PM2.5 exposure higher than the WHO guideline value of 15 micrograms per cubic metres.

While in these cases, the numbers may not be as surprising due to the generally high air pollution, the study also surprisingly revealed that cities such as Chennai, Bengaluru and Shimla, which largely meet the nation standard, are estimated to have recorded 4.8% of all deaths (2,100 each year); 4.9% of all deaths (2,900 each year) and 3.7% of all deaths (59 per year). The deaths are higher in Delhi, Varanasi, Kolkata etc because of higher average exposure, possibly the nature of sources and population according to authors who said the purpose of the study was not to compare the number of deaths but to stress that cities that are understood to have relatively low pollution are also seeing high impact on health.

"7.2% of all deaths were attributable to PM2.5 concentrations higher than the WHO recommended 15 µg/m<sup>3</sup>, corresponding to 33627 annual deaths across our ten cities (table). Delhi had the largest attributable fraction and highest attributable yearly deaths," the paper said.

### Floods badly affect animals in Assam's Kaziranga Park

**GUWAHATI:** Seventeen animals have died so far due to drowning while 72 others rescued from flood waters inside the famed Kaziranga National Park, an official said on Thursday. The animal mortality includes 11 hog deer due to drowning in the park and five during treatment.

The forest officials rescued 63 hog deer, two each of otter, sambar and a scop owl and one each of a rhino calf, Indian hare and a jungle cat.

Currently, 26 animals are under treatment while 29 others have been released after treatment, the official said. Eleven animals had died due to drowning while 65 others had been rescued from flood waters in the Kaziranga National Park till Wednesday. Out of the total 233 camps in the Eastern Assam Wildlife Division, 141 are still inundated so far as against the 173 on Wednesday.

### Ahom era Moidams recommended for Unesco heritage list

**GUWAHATI:** Ahom era Moidams, resting place of royal families, in Assam's Charaideo district have been recommended for inclusion in the Unesco World Heritage List by its international advisory body ICOMOS.

The International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS) has prepared a report, Evaluations of Nominations of Cultural and Mixed Properties, for the 46th ordinary session of the World Heritage Committee, to be held in New Delhi on July 21-31.

The report, evaluated a total of 36 nominations, including 19 new ones, received from across the globe and the Ahom Moidam was the only applicant from India. "ICOMOS recommends that Moidams — the Mound-Burial System of the Ahom Dynasty, India, be inscribed on the World Heritage List on the basis of criteria (iii) and (iv)," it said.

### Rains cause traffic disruptions galore in Delhi

**NEW DELHI:** Rains in the national capital, first a spell in the morning and another around midday, led to significant traffic disruptions in several areas.

The weather department, in their 12 pm notification, said light intensity rain and drizzle will occur at a few places in South Delhi and South-East Delhi (Akshardham, Lodi Road, Nehru Stadium, Defence Colony, Lajpat Nagar, Malviya Nagar, Kalkaji, Tughlakabad, East of Kailash, Chhattarpur, IGNOU, Ayanagar, and Deramandi) in the next two hours.

According to India Meteorological Department (IMD), 9.2 mm of rainfall was recorded at Safdarjung, the city's primary weather station, 7.4 mm at Lodhi Road, 5.6 mm at Ridge, 17.4 mm at Palam, and 40.8 mm at Ayanagar in the last 24 hours at 8.30 am on July 4.

In the wake of the rains, long lines of vehicles were witnessed on the roads. Delhi's minimum temperature settled at 24.8 degrees Celsius, three notches below the season's aver-

### US Prez Biden rejects growing pressure to abandon his drive

**WASHINGTON:** US President Joe Biden vowed to stay in the 2024 presidential race during calls with Democratic lawmakers and governors on Wednesday, as he sought to shake off calls for him to drop out after his shaky debate performance last week.

Biden dialed in to a call with worried members of his campaign team and told them he wasn't going anywhere, according to two sources familiar with the call. "No one is pushing me out. I'm not leaving. I'm in this race to the end," Biden said in a separate email blast by his campaign, urging supporters to "pitch in a few bucks" to help defeat his Republican rival Donald Trump in the Nov. 5 presidential poll.

**ASTANA:** Chinese President Xi Jinping urged members of a regional security club on Thursday to resist external meddling, while President Vladimir Putin was due to speak about creating a new Eurasian security system at the group's annual meeting. Putin and Xi have expanded the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), a club founded in 2001 with Russia, China and Central Asian nations, to include India, Iran and Pakistan as a counterweight to the West.

### Beryl heads towards Mexico after hammering Jamaica

**KINGSTON, JAMAICA:** Hurricane Beryl powered towards Mexico and the Cayman Islands early Thursday, threatening strong winds and a storm surge after battering Jamaica's southern coast. Beryl weakened to a Category 3 storm overnight, sustaining winds of 200 km an hour, but is forecast to be "at or near major hurricane intensity" while it passes by the Caymans, according to the US National Hurricane Center (NHC). "Strong winds, dangerous storm surge and damaging winds" were expected across the Cayman Islands overnight, the NHC said early on Thursday.

# Labour tipped for historic win as UK voters go to the polls

LONDON: Britain voted Thursday in a general election widely expected to hand the opposition Labour party a landslide win and end nearly a decade-and-a-half of Conservative rule.

The first national ballot since Boris Johnson won the Tories a decisive victory in 2019 follows Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's surprise call to hold it six months earlier than required.

His gamble looks set to backfire spectacularly, with polls throughout the six-week campaign pointing to a heavy defeat for his right-wing party.

That would almost certainly put Labour leader Keir Starmer, 61, in Downing Street, as leader of the largest party in parliament.

Centre-left Labour is projected to win its first general election since 2005 by historic proportions, with a flurry of election-eve polls all forecasting its biggest-ever victory.

**'People are not satisfied'**

Voting began at 7:00 a.m. (0600 GMT) in more than 40,000 polling stations across the country, from church halls, community centres and schools to more unusual venues such as pubs and even a ship.

Sunak was among the early birds, casting his ballot at his Richmond and Northallerton constituency in Yorkshire, northern England. Starmer voted around two hours later in his north London seat. Voting closes at 10:00 p.m. (2100 GMT). Broadcasters then announce exit polls.

Results from the UK's 650 constituencies trickle in overnight, with the winning party expected to hit 326 seats — the threshold for a parliamentary majority — as dawn breaks Friday.

Polls suggest voters will punish the Tories after 14 years of often chaotic

rule and could oust a string of government ministers, with talk that even Sunak himself might not be safe.

That would make him the first sitting Prime Minister not to retain his seat in a general election.

"I appreciate people have frustrations with our party," he conceded on Wednesday. "But tomorrow's vote... is a vote about the future."

**Endorsements**

Sunak, 44, is seen as having run a dismal campaign, with anger over his decision to leave D-Day commemorations in France early the stand-out moment.

In new blows Wednesday, The Sun newspaper switched allegiance to Labour — a key endorsement given the tabloid has backed the winner at every election for several decades.

It follows the Financial Times, the Economist and The Sunday Times as well as traditionally left-leaning papers The Guardian and The Daily Mirror, also endorsing the party.

Meanwhile, three large-scale surveys indicated Labour was on the

brink of a record victory, with the Tories set for their worst-ever result and the centrist Liberal Democrats resurgent in third.

YouGov, Focaldata and More in Common all projected Labour would secure at least 430 seats, topping the 418 under Tony Blair in 1997.

The Conservatives could plunge to a record low of less than 127, the trio predicted. The Lib Dems were tipped to scoop dozens of seats — up from their current tally of 15 — while Nigel Farage's anti-immigrant Reform UK party was set to win a handful.

YouGov and More in Common both forecast the Brexit figurehead would finally become an MP at the eighth time of asking.

**'Decade of national renewal'**

If the predictions are accurate, Sunak will on Friday visit head of state King Charles III to tender his resignation as prime minister.

Starmer will meet the monarch shortly after to take up his invitation to head the next government — and become prime minister.

# World's oldest artwork discovered in Indonesian cave, it shows humans and pig

PARIS: It may not look like much — just a flaking image of three people around a big red pig. But the humble cave painting discovered in Indonesia is the oldest known narrative artwork ever made by human hands, dating back more than 51,000 years, new research said on Wednesday.

"This is the oldest evidence of storytelling," Maxime Aubert, an archaeologist at Australia's Griffith University, told AFP.

Aubert was part of the team that identified the previous record holder in 2019, a hunting scene found in a nearby Indonesian cave then estimated to be nearly 44,000 years old.

The latest discovery, which was dated using a new laser technique, marks "the first time we've passed the 50,000-year barrier," said Aubert, a co-author of a new study in Nature describing the find.

That early humans were able to tell such a "sophisticated" story through art could rewrite our understanding of human cognitive evolution, he added. "Our discovery suggests that storytelling was a much older part of human history... than previously thought," study co-author archaeologist Adam Brumm said.


**New laser dating**

For the discovery, the researchers used a new method that uses lasers and computer software to create a "map" of rock samples.

This laser ablation technique is more precise, easier, quicker, cheaper, and requires much smaller rock samples than the previous uranium series method, Aubert said.

The team first tested the new technique on the previous record holder.

It determined that the hunting scene was actually at least 48,000 years old — 4,000 years older than the

uranium series method determined in 2019. The team then tried the laser method out on a previously undated painting first spotted in a cave on Indonesia's Sulawesi island in 2017.

It was found to be at least 51,200 years old, smashing the previous record. The painting shows three people around a wild pig.

"We don't know exactly what they're doing," Aubert admitted.

He speculated that the paintings were likely made by the first group of humans who moved through Southeast Asia before arriving in Australia around 65,000 years ago. "It's probably just a matter of time before we find samples that are older," Aubert added.

**Art gap mystery**

Humans first evolved in Africa more than 300,000 years ago.

The first images known to have been made by humans are simple lines and patterns made in ochre found in South Africa dating back

100,000 years. But then there is a "huge gap" in human art until the Indonesian cave paintings 50,000 years later, Aubert said.

"The question is, why is it not everywhere?" One theory is that artwork elsewhere did not survive all those millennia. Another is that ancient art could still be out there waiting to be discovered.

Previously the first narrative art was thought to have emerged in Europe.

A "lion man" statue found in Germany has been dated to around 40,000 years ago. The date given for the Indonesian cave art is "quite provocative" because it is so much older than what has been found elsewhere, including in Europe, said anthropologist Chris Stringer.

"In my view this find reinforces the idea that representational art was first produced in Africa, before 50,000 years ago, and the concept spread as our species spread," he told AFP.

## India pip South Africa to lift T20 World Cup

India outwitted South Africa by seven runs to lift the T20 World Cup in a see-saw final in Bridgetown, Barbados, on Saturday (June 29). It was India's second T20 World Cup title and the first ICC trophy since 2013.

Rohit Sharma won the toss and opted to bat. Kohli (76), Axar Patel (47), and Shivam Dube (27), were the chief contributors in India's 176 for seven. In South Africa's run chase, India's pacers

picked two early wickets before a 58-run stand between opener Quinton de Kock (39) and Tristan Stubbs (52) put their team back in the game. Heinrich Klaasen's aggressive 52 almost upset India's plans.

South Africa needed 20 runs off the last 12 balls with David Miller and Keshav Maharaj in the centre. Jasprit Bumrah picked up a wicket and conceded only six runs off his last two overs. Hardik Pandya defended 16 runs in the last over and Suryakumar Yadav took a sensational catch at the long-off boundary. South Africa mustered just 169 for eight. Kohli and Bumrah were adjudged the Player of the Match and of the Championship, respectively. Kohli and Sharma announced their retirement from T20 internationals at the venue. The result was a fitting farewell to coach Rahul Dravid.



## New Army chief

Gen Upendra Dwivedi on Sunday (June 30) became the 30th Chief of the Army Staff, taking over from Gen Manoj Pande who retired from the post. Before this, Gen Dwivedi was the Vice Chief of the Army. Prior to taking charge as the Vice Chief of the Army Staff on Feb 19, Gen Dwivedi was the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief of Northern Command from 2022-2024. With a distinguished career spanning nearly 40 years, Gen Dwivedi has been honoured with the Param Vishisht Seva Medal, Ati Vishisht Seva Medal and three GOC-in-C Commendation Cards.



## France elections

The far-right National Rally (RN) of Marine Le Pen dominated the June 30 first round of snap legislative polls called by French president Emmanuel Macron after his camp was trounced in European elections last month. France votes on July 7 in the final round of polls to choose representatives in the 577-seat National Assembly, the lower and more prominent house of Parliament. In the first round, voters handed the RN about 33% of the vote, bringing it to the brink of power. The New Popular Front (NPF) leftist alliance was second with about 28% while Macron's group was third with about 20%.




## Biden-Trump debate

## New criminal laws

New criminal laws came into effect in India on Monday, bringing major changes in its criminal justice system. The new laws replace the British-era Indian Penal Code, Code of Criminal Procedure and the Indian Evidence Act, respectively. From now on, all fresh FIRs will be registered under the BNS. Cases filed earlier will continue to be tried under the old laws.



Erik ten Hag to stay at Man United till 2026

**MANCHESTER:** Manchester United manager Erik ten Hag has signed a contract extension through to 2026, the Premier League club said Thursday.

The Dutchman has won back-to-back trophies in his first two years at Old Trafford, but faced uncertainty over his position after leading it to its worst league finish in 34 years last season. United decided to stick with Ten Hag and he has now agreed a new deal, which is a one-year extension on his previous contract, which was due to expire at the end of the upcoming season.

"Looking back at the past two years, we can reflect with pride on two trophies and many examples of progression from where we were when I joined," Ten Hag said. "How-

ever, we must also be clear that there is still lots of hard work ahead to reach the levels expected of Manchester United, which means challenging for English and European titles. In my discussions with the club, we have found complete unity in our vision for reaching those goals, and we are all strongly committed to making that journey together."

Ten Hag joined United from Ajax in 2022 and won the English League Cup. He followed that up last season with the FA Cup win.

He stays on in the face of a major overhaul of United's football operations by new co-owner Jim Ratcliffe. British billionaire Ratcliffe bought a 27.7% stake in the club in February and has hired a new CEO, sporting director and technical director.

All sacrifices were worth it, says Dhinidhi

**BENGALURU:** At times, she misses the carefree pleasures her peers enjoy and occasionally experiences a sense of solitude, but all of that has been worth it for 14-year-old swimmer Dhinidhi Desinghu, who is gearing up to fulfil her dream of competing at the Olympics later this month.

The Bengaluru swimmer, who studies in class ninth, is set to be the youngest member of the Indian contingent at the Paris Olympics.

"Sometimes I miss the fun generally kids of my age have. I do not go out much with friends and feel lonely. But then I wanted to swim and I wanted to go to the Olympics," Dhinidhi said. "I am the one who chose this path for me. With that comes a lot of sacrifices but I do feel different, extraordinary and proud. At 14, I am

going to the Olympics, so all the sacrifices are worth it," she added.

The Olympic cycle has been an underwhelming one for Indian swimming as none of the swimmers were able to breach either the 'A' or 'B' qualification time. But Dhinidhi has been on a roll, winning medals at the National Games and the senior National championships last year.

Her performances this season made her the top-ranked Indian female swimmer with the Swimming Federation of India handing her one of the two Universality places and an opportunity of a lifetime.

"I knew that I had a chance (of making the Olympics) because I have been working really very hard but it was surprising that I got this chance so early in my career."

Neeraj to lead 28-member squad in Paris

**NEW DELHI:** Defending champion Neeraj Chopra will headline a 28-member Indian athletics contingent at the Paris Olympics starting July 26.

The 26-year-old Tokyo Games gold medalist and reigning world champion in javelin throw has decided to skip the last Diamond League this weekend in Paris in order to prepare for the quadrennial extravaganza as almost all the selected names are on expected lines. The squad comprises 17 men and 11 women athletes with

some of the other prominent names being Asian Games champions Avinash Sable, Tejinderpal Singh Toor along with sprint hurdler Jyothi Yarraji, to name a few.

The 4x400m men's relay team, featuring Muhammed Anas, Muhammed Ajmal, Amoj Jacob and Rajesh Ramesh, will also be followed with keen interest.

The track and field competitions will be conducted at the Stade de France in Paris between August 1 to August 11.

# India's T20 world champions return to roaring welcome

**NEW DELHI:** Exuberant fans followed them despite monsoon showers and heavy security deployment before Prime Minister Narendra Modi rolled out the red carpet for a breakfast meet as the T20 World Cup-winning Indian cricketers returned home to a euphoric reception, here on Thursday.

Hundreds of supporters, holding placards congratulating their favourites and waving the national flag, braved the inclement weather to wait outside the airport for the victorious side, which defeated South Africa by seven runs in the final in Bridgetown on Saturday last week.

There was dancing, there were multiple cakes, and there were fans on streets showing just why cricket is the most passionately followed sport in the country. The weary players joined in the fun after arriving at the

hotel from airport to complete the party atmosphere. "We have waited for this moment for the past 13 years. The team has made us proud by winning the World Cup," a fan, who claimed to have been waiting since 4:30am in the morning said, referring to India's last World Cup triumph which came back in 2011.

The side was unable to head back home immediately after the title win due to a shutdown forced by hurricane Beryl in Barbados. They were cocooned in their hotel before the BCCI secretary Jay Shah made arrangements for a special charter flight. The Air India special charter flight AIC24WC — Air India Champions 24 World Cup — which left Barbados around 4:50am local time on Wednesday arrived in Delhi at 6am (IST) on Thursday after a 16-hour non-stop journey.

Heavy security was deployed to keep the crowd in check at the Indira Gandhi International airport but that

did little to dampen the spirits as fans cheered enthusiastically holding up posters of star batter Virat Kohli, skipper Rohit Sharma and outgoing head coach Rahul Dravid.

Two buses were stationed outside the T3 Terminal to ferry the players to ITC Maurya, where they were greeted by dhol and traditional Bhangra dancers. Most of them, including skipper Rohit Sharma, all-rounder Hardik Pandya, Suryakumar Yadav and Rishabh Pant, shook a leg with the assembled dancers, giving them a memory that would last a lifetime.

Even the on-duty security personnel had smiles on their faces as the players let their hair down after the long journey, shook hands with everyone who wanted to and moved into their rooms after cutting yet another cake that was kept ready for them. All of this unfolded amid expected media frenzy. A brief while later, they left to meet Modi at his official residence, continuing a hectic

schedule that awaits them through the day. They spent close to two hours at the 7, Lok Kalyan Marg residence of the Prime Minister before heading back to the hotel. Earlier, at the airport, the players trickled out in ones and twos after completing immigration formalities.

Tired but excited, they acknowledged the waiting fans by waving at them and flashing warm smiles.

Suryakumar, who took the sensational match-winning catch of David Miller in the final, was the most animated in responding to the cheering.

Pant, who returned to international cricket at the just-concluded event after a life-threatening car accident, saluted the gathered crowd, while pacer Mohammed Siraj blew flying kisses in their direction.

Rohit and Player of the Final Kohli, both of whom retired from T20Is at the end of India's campaign, were among the last to come out of the VIP exit.

# Ronaldo vs Mbappe: Clash of generations adds spice to QF

**HAMBURG (GERMANY):** Cristiano Ronaldo vs. Kylian Mbappe. A clash of football icons. A clash of generations.

They'll go head to head when Portugal plays France in the Euro 2024 quarter-finals on Friday, and this heavyweight meeting might have got just that little bit bigger.

"It is, without doubt, my last European Championship," the 39-year-old Ronaldo said after his tearful, emotionally charged performance in Portugal's penalty-shootout victory over Slovenia in the last 16.

That may have just confirmed what many were presuming anyway. Still, there's now a definitive specter of finality to Ronaldo's long, headline-grabbing Euros adventure that could be brought to an end by Mbappé, the heir apparent to Ronaldo and Lionel Messi after their long-time dominance of the sport.

Mbappé grew up with pictures of Ronaldo on his bedroom wall.

A photo is inevitably doing the rounds on social media of what is apparently their first ever meeting, at Real Madrid's training ground at Valdebebas in 2012 when a 13-year-old Mbappé stood beside Ronaldo after a visit to the Spanish club where his sporting hero was the star player.

In 2020, Mbappé posted on Twitter, now X, that Ronaldo was his "idol." And only a few months ago, Ronaldo reacted to Mbappé clinching a highly anticipated move to Madrid by writing on Instagram: "Excited to

see you light up the Bernabeu." That Mbappé can now end Ronaldo's European Championship career — who knows, it might even be his last ever major tournament — adds an intriguing subplot to a match that will be watched around the world.

"Let's go, let's go to war," Ronaldo said of the match against France, whom he considers as the top contender at Euro 2024 along with Spain. He said he was driven to tears against Slovenia not at the prospect of elimination but because his main motivation these days is "making people happy" and he had a penalty saved in extra time.

"I'm moved by all that football means — by the enthusiasm I have for the game, the enthusiasm for see-

ing my supporters, my family, the affection people have for me.

"It's not about leaving the world of football. What else is there for me to do or win?" Ronaldo heads into Friday's game having failed to score in eight straight matches at major tournaments — Portugal's last four at the 2022 World Cup and its four games at Euro 2024 — and with growing concerns about whether he deserves what appears to be a guaranteed spot in the team under Roberto Martinez.

Things haven't been straightforward for Mbappé, either, at Euro 2024. He sustained a broken nose in France's group opener against Austria and has since been wearing a vision-limiting protective facemask during games.

# BABAR'S FUTURE TO BE DECIDED AFTER CONSULTATION WITH KIRSTEN, SAYS PCB

**LAHORE:** Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chairman Mohsin Naqvi on Thursday said no decision has been made on Babar Azam's future as captain yet, and the future course of action will be taken after consultation with former players and head coach Gary Kirsten.

Naqvi said he will meet head coach Kirsten and his assistant Azhar Mahmood here soon to discuss the national team's T20 World Cup debacle, but refrained from taking any decision in haste.

Naqvi's had earlier criticised Pakistan team and suggested an overhaul of the side, saying it needs a "major surgery" following its ouster in the Super 8 stage of the recently-concluded T20 World Cup, after humiliating losses against India and the United States.

"I have asked them (Kirsten and Mahmood) to come here as I want to talk to them in person and in detail based on Kirsten's report on the World Cup," he told media here.

"Kirsten has given a very detailed report on the team and it will help us a lot to chalk out our future course of action."

"No decision taken so far related to Babar Azam. One former player has submitted a very comprehensive report on what needs to be done to improve cricket. But I will take no decisions out of anger or based on what is being said on social media. "Decisions taken out of haste and anger generally lead to more complications and I don't want that in our cricket," he added.



## PAPER PLATE CHICK PURSE

### SUPPLIES

- One paper plate
- Ribbon, string or wool for hanging
- Paint (if you want to change the colour)
- Felt or cardboard (for the beak)
- Feathers (optional - you can also draw some on, cut out patterned feathers from pretty paper or plain paper)
- Glue
- Stapler (optional)



### INSTRUCTIONS

First paint the back of the paper plate yellow (or any fun chick colour!).

It needs to be painted on the back as that is where the plate curves outwards. If you do the front, you can't bring the two sides together to create the pocket.

Once fully dry, cut your paper plate in half.

Take one half and decorate as a chick - we added feathers, a beak and a little black eye.

However, you can use whatever you have: felt, cardboard or draw on some feathers or leave your chick plain.

Take some ribbon or yarn - measure the length and cut a strip.

Now either glue or staple your paper plates halves together - with your ribbon positioned in place.

We prefer to staple as it is instant and feels more secure. If gluing - use some clothes pegs to hold it in place whilst it dries.

Your paper plate chick purse is ready!

## TOOTHPICK CACTI

### SUPPLIES

- Styrofoam balls
- Mini terracotta pots
- Paint
- Mod Podge
- Toothpicks
- Tissue Paper
- Foam brush



### INSTRUCTIONS

Put a layer of Mod Podge on the Styrofoam ball with a foam brush.

Next, cover the ball with tissue paper and add more Mod Podge on top.

Once it's dry, repeat the process a few times.

Paint the toothpicks. Let them dry. Then cut the toothpicks in half.

Finally, poke in the painted toothpicks in the dried Styrofoam ball.

You may also paint the terracotta pots. The toothpick cacti is ready.

## MANGO SMOOTHIE BOWL

### Ingredients

- 2 mangoes, 1 cup hung curd, 1 tablespoon chia seeds, 1/2 cup ice cubes, 1 cup oats, 2 tablespoon honey, 7 slices banana, 1 handful canned blueberries, 1 tablespoon coconut flake


### METHOD

- Wash and peel the mangoes. Chop them into small pieces.

and top it with fruit slices, blueberries, chia seeds and coconut flakes.

## SWEET POTATO HALWA



**Ingredients**  
2 large sweet potatoes, 1 cup milk, 1/4 cup of ghee, 1/4 teaspoon cardamom, a handful of chopped nuts

### METHOD

- Boil the potatoes in a pressure cooker after washing them well.
- When they cool down, peel and mash.
- Heat ghee in a pan on medium heat, add the mashed potato and cook while stirring continuously.
- Add milk and cook for another few minutes.
- Add chopped nuts in the end.
