Chargesheet filed in Salman Khan's home firing case

The Mumbai police filed a chargesheet on Monday against nine individuals, including the incarcerated gangster Lawrence Bishnoi, for firing outside actor Salman Khan's home. The 1,735-page chargesheet, presented by the crime branch in a special MCOCA court, comprises three volumes of investigative documents, including statements from 46 witnesses, section 164 CrPC recorded statements, and confessions under MCOCA. It also contains 22 panchanamas and technical evidence. The incident involved two

assailants on motorcycles firing five rounds outside Salman's Galaxy Apartment in Mumbai's Bandra area early on April 14. Police confirmed that audio recovered from a suspect's phone matched the voice of Lawrence Bishnoi's brother, Anmol Bishnoi. Anmol, residing in Canada, claimed responsibility for the incident, reportedly playing a significant role in motivating the shooters. HTC

Amid speculation that *Hanu-Man* director Prasanth Varma took a veiled dig at actor Ranveer Singh via a cryptic post on his X account, stating "One day you realise every rejection was a blessing in disguise", the director tells us that the post was "not targeted at anyone". Varma and Singh were slated to work together on a film called *Rakshas* some time ago, but it fell through due to creative differences. Clearing the air, Varma says, "It (what he wrote on X) was a generic feeling I had in the

morning and I thought of posting it. I was thinking about the overall journey I've had. Had people not rejected me in my initial years, I wouldn't have ended up making *Hanu-Man*. I was feeling grateful

because had I done any of the films that I had previously pitched to other actors, *Hanu-Man* would have never happened."

Shedding light on why he and Singh couldn't work together, the 35-year-old notes, "There were different points of view with regards to the film. I really respect him for the actor he is. And I believe that even he respects my work."

Ask if there's any bad blood between the two, since Singh pulled out of a project that was officially announced, and Varma says they share a cordial bond: "We still talk to each other. It (the movie) just couldn't happen, but our relationship has stayed."

From accompanying actor Zaheer Iqbal on his bachelor party to holding phoolon ki chadar for actor Sonakshi Sinha during her bridal entry, actor Saqib Saleem was a part of his best friends' wedding festivities from the word go. "Sona and Zaheer have been a part of my life for almost seven years. When you spend the most important years of your life with people like them, andar se ek awaaz aati hai. It doesn't feel like you're doing something [special for them]. It just felt like ghar ki shaadi ho rahi thi," Saleem tells us. The 36-year-old adds that since he shares many common friends with the newlyweds, there was no thought being put into who will be doing what during the wedding. "We've all grown together, travelled, had meals, watched films and partied together. So, you don't think so much about who'd do what [during a wedding]. We were all there for Sona and Zaheer, because it's a beautiful love story for the ages, and we wanted to be a part of it," says the actor, who stars in the upcoming film, *Kakuda*, where he

plays Sinha's on-screen husband. On a lighter note, Saleem adds that he often found himself in a spot when he had to choose between the bride's or the groom's side. "If I'd take Sona's side, I'd get a message from Zaheer. 'Theek hai bhai, you be on her side'. If I was on his side, I'd get a message from her. So, we were all walking on eggshells, trying to please both the lovely people. So, we decided, 'Hum dono ki taraf hain,'" the actor tells us. While all these years, Sinha and Iqbal never announced their relationship publicly, Saleem says there was nothing awkward about it. "Nobody was hiding anything. People were just being in their space and as friends, we are protective about Sona and Zaheer. Woh khush the apne jeevan mein and nobody likes to interfere in other people's lives. Maybe social media gives a different impression," he ends.



YEH BAAT KAALPANIK NAHIN HAI!

With a surge in the popularity of films and web shows based on Indian folklore, makers and actors share why such projects resonate with the audience and do well

In the last decade, there has been a notable rise in films and web series drawing inspiration from Indian folklore, with titles such as *Bhoothnath Returns* (2014), *Puli* (2015), *Nagarahavu* (2016), *Pari*, *Tumbbad*, *Stree* (all 2018), *Bhediya* (2022) and *Munjya*, and OTT shows such as *Kaali*, *Betaal* and *Asur* to name a few. "India is vast, and wherever you go, you will hear countless tales. These stories, passed down through generations, are deeply embedded in the cultural consciousness of the country. When audiences see their own untold stories on the big screen, they feel a sense of attachment and nostalgia," says *Stree* and *Bhediya* director Amar Kaushik. *Munjya* director Aditya Sarpotdar feels the audience prefers "this cinema (stories that are rooted in our culture) over films that aspire to be foreign in terms of the appeal and subject matter". He adds, "The audience doesn't relate to anything that is not Indian in its storytelling. They want to know more about our roots and culture. The folklore

genre provides all that. The stories are our own, the characters are very interesting and they have a local flavour."

Shah explains the appeal of folklore-inspired content among audiences: "Folklore can be adapted across genres, from the supernatural horror of *Tumbbad* to the fantastical adventure of *Baahubali*. This versatility allows creators to explore various cinematic styles and themes."

Indian folklore also serves as a powerful tool for exploring and reaffirming cultural identity, feels *Hanu-Man* director Prasanth Varma: "Folklore-based films encourage all generations to come together and enjoy those stories. Embracing our own culture has become the new cool. Even other countries are embracing Indian culture."

Travellers are increasingly letting their passion drive their trips. Think music lovers attending popstar Taylor Swift's Eras Tour in Singapore, cricket fans flying to the US for the recently concluded T20 World Cup, or sports lovers booking tickets for the Paris Olympics 2024.

'A STRONG SHIFT' IN INDIAN TRAVELLERS' PREFERENCES

"When Taylor Swift and

Coldplay announced their concert dates in June 2023, Singapore witnessed a 10x rise in year-on-year searches by travellers from around the world. In May this year, our search data showed a 30% spike in year-on-year searches by Indian travellers for Paris during the 2024 Olympics," says Santosh Kumar, country manager for India, Sri Lanka, the Maldives and Indonesia, at Booking.com.

"We've seen a strong shift in Indian travellers' preferences and will spend on experiences," says Daniel D'Souza, president and country head, Holidays, SOTC Travel,

adding, "Occasion or event-based travel for events such as Coachella and Tomorrowland, cultural festivals such as La Tomatina, and experiences such as chasing the Northern Lights in Norway, or African safaris, have seen a growing demand."

Kumar says, "This year, 25% of Indian travellers plan to visit a place to experience a cultural event, 21% intend to travel for a music festival or concert and 17% for a sporting event."

DOMESTIC PASSION PROJECTS RULE, TOO

"The trend is not confined to just international events. There is also a high demand to

explore domestic, state-specific events such as Nagaland's Hornbill Festival, Ziro Festival in Arunachal Pradesh and Magnetic Fields Festival in Rajasthan, among others," says Rajeev Kale, president & country head (Holidays, MICE, Visa), Thomas Cook (India) Limited. "During Rann Utsav (Gujarat), there was a 19% spike in booking searches. At the time of the Hornbill Festival, there was a 13% rise in passengers flying to Nagaland," says Karthick Prabhu, head of strategy, Cleartrip.




SUHASINI'S SECRET INGREDIENT FOR SUCCESS: DISCIPLINE

Many of us often dream of starting a side hustle, crafting elaborate plans with friends or siblings to give wings to passion projects. But Suhāsini Sampath, co-founder of Yoga Bar, didn't just dream, she made it happen, along with her sister Anindita. They launched Yoga Bar (Sprout Life Foods) in 2015 by selling clean, healthy snack bars in Bengaluru. Soon, the sisters transformed this into a thriving business. Now, the nutrition-led food company, which makes breakfast cereal, energy bars, protein bars, etc., is valued at ₹500 crore and was acquired by ITC Ltd in 2023.

In a chat with Fever FM's RJ Sharat, Sampath opens up about how she managed to turn her side hustle into a mainstream business. "You need to be disciplined," she says, adding, "Give yourself two hours in the morning, two hours when you come back from work, and weekends. Invest time and energy in your business; quantifying and tracking will help you."

Sampath started the brand with a clear mission: to create healthier, better-tasting packaged foods that address the needs of modern consumers with busy lifestyles. Soon enough they were rewarded with their first bulk order from Indigo Airlines.

When one puts their soul into their business, selling it can never be an easy decision. But Sampath didn't hesitate before making the audacious move because she "didn't want it to be dependent on the next round of funding". "Handing over the business to a strategic partner would mean that my brand would live for a hundred years."

Moreover, the arrangement is such that we still make the products ourselves," she says. Now, Sampath wants to live a simple, disciplined life and plans to contribute in some way to society in her next venture. Akshay Kumar's upcoming film Sarfira, based on the life of Captain GR Gopinath, founder of India's first low-cost airline, set to release on July 12, promises to showcase a similarly passionate journey.


