

Five years ago, when Nir-mala Sitharaman took over as finance minister, she appeared uncertain amid criticism of waning growth, resulting in a series of post-Budget announce-

ments, including a massive cut in corporate tax. As she presents a record seventh straight budget, the Modi's govt's report card presented an economy which is on a strong footing - projecting 6.5-7% growth this year - with robust public finances, high tax collections and improved quality of spending.

Woman dead, 23 injured as bus hits Metro pillar

An electric DTC bus crashed into a Metro pillar in west Delhi's Punjabi Bagh Monday, killing a 45-year-old woman passenger and injuring 23 others, including one being treated for critical injuries in a hospital ICU.

The driver said he lost control of the bus after a two-wheeler shot ahead in a dangerous manner. As it veered and braked suddenly, an auto smashed into the bus from behind, causing injuries to three occupants. **P 2**

New Delhi: A 45-year-old woman was killed and 23 people injured when a DTC electric bus collided with a metro pillar in west Delhi's Punjabi Bagh on Monday. The sudden braking of the bus also caused an autorickshaw to collide with it from behind.

While the driver claimed that a motorcycle trying to overtake the bus caused him to lose control, police said experts would conduct an inspection to see if mechanical issues such as brake failure contributed to the accident.

The electric bus, operating on route 939 between Mangolpuri and Anand Vihar, had collided with Metro Pillar 146. Police received news about this at 7.42am. This collision also caused an autorickshaw at the rear to crash into the bus.

Eyewitnesses claimed that the bus was being driven at a high speed.

Savita of Sultanpuri, an MCD sanitation worker who was on her way to work in Naraina, was killed, while 23 others, including the driver and conductor, were injured. Savita had suffered severe head injuries. Fourteen passengers were taken to Maharaja Agrasen Hospital and 10 to Acharya Bhikshu Hospital in Moti Nagar. A 55-year-old passenger had to be admitted to the ICU in critical condition.

Auto driver Usman Khan was taking his wife, Shahjahan, to RML Hospital and their daughter, Neha, was also in the three wheeler. Rahman, Khan's son-in-law, said, "They were behind the bus when the DTC bus driver took a sharp right turn, forcing them to brake abruptly. They

collided and the people at the scene pulled him out with much effort. He fractured his hands and suffered facial injuries. My mother-in-law also sustained fractures and Neha injured her knee."

Eyewitnesses reported hearing a loud noise and rushing to see what had happened. Krishan Kumar, 34, a local resident, recalled seeing the electric bus driving on the road with minimal morning

traffic. "Suddenly, I heard a loud boom, as if a heavy object had fallen," he said. "Some people and I rushed to the scene and found the bus had crashed into a pillar. The driver was trapped inside."

The people began rescuing passengers from the bus and police arrived shortly thereafter. Many of the bus passengers had suffered injuries to their heads and faces. "Five or six ambulances arrived and to

ok the injured people to the hospital," said Kumar. Jagram, a 65-year-old tea seller, said that an unconscious woman was removed from the bus.

At the scene, a broken windshield and pieces of glass lay scattered later in the day. Trees that had fallen due to the crash were also lying around. The bus was towed away to the Madipur police post. The driver of the DTC vehicle told the cops that a bike trying to over-

take the bus forced him to take a sharp right turn, resulting in the accident.

Vichitra Veer, DCP (West), said that the cause of the accident would be determined after a mechanical inspection of the electric bus. An FIR has been registered at the Punjabi Bagh police station. The incident led to major traffic snarls on Rohtak Road with vehicles forced to move at a snail's pace.

Car on wrong side of DME rams scooter; woman, son die

After 'down payment', rogue cops took bribes in EMIs, frisked targets for wires

Ghaziabad: A 20-year-old college student and his mother died after the scooter they were riding on their way back from Haridwar was hit by an Alto that was being driven on the wrong side of Delhi-Meerut Expressway near Mehrauli underpass on Sunday evening.

Devdutt Singh (50) of Vijay Nagar, an ayurvedic practitioner who was driving the Alto, was arrested. He had driven the car on the wrong side for almost 300 metres after missing an exit to NH-9 when the accident occurred around 7.45pm.

The accident, once again, raised questions on patrolling on speedways. Not only did the car move on the wrong side without being stopped, the scooter also had a free run on the expressway despite a ban on two and three-wheelers.

Yash Gautam (20), a BA third-year student, and his mother Manju (40), a

ward inspector at the Central Research Institute of Homeopathy in Noida, were returning home to Vinod Nagar in Delhi from Haridwar. The two would often go to the Uttarakhand city on scooter, police said.

CCTV footage showed the Alto coming from the wrong side along the divider and crashing into the scooter head on. Manju was flung in the air and fell on the road ahead while Yash landed on the car's roof.

Ankit Chauhan, the SHO of Wave City police station, said a passerby called up to inform them about the accident. The mother and son were rushed to Manipal Hospital and wheeled into the emergency ward.

"They succumbed to injuries after a few hours. The bodies were sent for autopsy and the woman's brother was informed," the SHO said. "We arrested the car driver, Devdutt Singh. He was accompanied by his wife on their way back after visiting a relative in Bhojpur," he added.

New Delhi: Are Delhi cops accepting bribes in EMIs after taking a lump sum down payment? Amid unprecedented CBI raids on the department, an analysis of FIRs filed by the probe agency in recent cases indicates that the accused personnel were predominantly apprehended allegedly accepting a portion of the bribes in multiple instalments. The victims in all these cases were apparently instructed to make a down payment and remit the rest at their convenience.

It has also come to light in a few cases that before beginning the negotiations, police personnel meticulously frisked the targets in order to ensure that they were not wearing a wire. Central Bureau of Investigation is aware of these trends and will

formulate strategies accordingly, sources divulged.

In the latest raid conducted at Patparganj police station in east Delhi, CBI apprehended two head constables while accepting a bribe of Rs10,000. The accused, according to CBI, had demanded Rs 50,000 from a woman trader after accusing her of selling stolen phones. After negotiations, they agreed to accept Rs 11,000 as a "part payment" and the rest in equated monthly instalments.

Another recent case of a cop accepting a bribe in instalments surfaced during a CBI raid conducted at a police station on June 21. The accused, a sub-inspector, had demanded a bribe of Rs 3 lakh from a complainant but finally reduced it to Rs 2 lakh. The bribe was demanded for not arresting the complainant in a particular

case being investigated by the accused cop. CBI laid a trap and apprehended the policeman while accepting the first instalment of Rs 1 lakh from the complainant.

Similarly, in another case reported a few months ago, a policeman had demanded a bribe of Rs 25 lakh from a complainant in exchange of extending favours in a case. The accused sub-inspector agreed to accept Rs 5 lakh as a down payment and take the rest later in easy instalments over the next few months. The other party, however, approached CBI, which conducted a raid and arrested the policeman while accepting the "EMI" of Rs 4.5 lakh.

The case of frisking and looking for a listening device on a complainant was noticed during a raid on cops from the narcotics cell of North district. The

first information report lodged by CBI stated that the complainant was sent to the policemen with a recording device and the cops frisked him to ensure that he was not wired up, but couldn't detect it. Later on, they grew suspicious and abducted the complainant. He was taken around the city for a few hours before being threatened and dumped on the road. The accused cops are still at large, and police commissioner Sanjay Arora has demanded their swift arrest.

In the past two years, there has been a sharp escalation in the instances of corruption in Delhi Police, prompting the investigating agency to conduct massive raids at the city's police stations and on police personnel. More than two dozen police personnel have been arrested.

DU to raise funds by allowing donors to name capital assets

New Delhi: Philanthropists may now be able to apply for naming and re-naming of any infrastructure of Delhi University through donations for a specified time period, according to a policy proposal.

The donors will be allowed to decide the names of any new building, part of the new building, or additions in the existing structures of Delhi University, such as hostels, laboratory, teaching block, library, and auditorium, it states.

According to the recommendation, donors contributing Rs 5 crore and above will be able to name or rename the structure for a period of 33 years. Those contributing Rs 2 crore and above but not exceeding Rs 5 crore can get them named for a period up to 20 years. Donations of Rs 1 crore and above, not exceeding Rs 2 crore, will allow the donors to name the structure for a period up to 10 years.

The matter is placed before the executive council, the highest decision-making body of the university for consideration.

A four-member panel recommended guidelines

for naming and renaming DU's capital asset structures on April 16.

The committee also recommended the norms for accepting donations to institute fresh scholarships and awards for the students. It observed "that fresh scholarships and awards haven't been instituted for quite some years. Furthermore, the existing guidelines provide for scholarships/awards in perpetuity which is not sustainable in the long run. Keeping these in view, the recommendations are suggested."

In case of naming the floor, room or building, at least 60 per cent of the construction cost will have to be given as contribution.

Establishment of the new scholarship and awards by government entities, NGOs, trusts, corporate houses, PSUs, and other organisations - both national and international, as well as by individuals, will be permitted.

The minimum amount required for the establishment of any scholarship or award will be Rs 5 lakh for a duration of 10 years and Rs 10 lakh for a duration of 20 years. PTI

ACB Files Case Against 3 Firms Providing Security To Govt Hosps For 'Irregularities'

Under-Deployment Of Staff, Bribery Among Complaints Bharadwaj flagged 'corruption' several times, officials 'reluctant' to act: AAP

New Delhi: Anti-Corruption Branch (ACB) has registered a case against three companies that were supplying security personnel to various Delhi government hospitals. The action was taken after it received several complaints alleging under-deployment of staff, recruitment of ineligible candidates, fraudulent claims for ESI and provident funds, bribery by employers and embezzlement of govt funds.

ACB chief Madhur Verma said that these companies provide security personnel at GTB Hospital in Shahdara, Rajiv Gandhi Super Speciality Hospital in Tahirpur, BR Ambedkar Hospital in Rohini, SDN Hospital in Shahdara, Hindu Rao Hospital, and other Delhi govt hospitals. "During verification, it was found that these private players, in collusion with govt officials, were

actively involved in various malpractices and violations of the tender conditions as well as the laid-down procedures in providing security personnel at different Delhi govt hospitals," he added.

Two of the complainants were working as security supervisors in these manpower and security provider companies.

An officer highlighted the major allegations made by the complainants. "These included the under-de-

ployment of security personnel at the govt hospitals compared to the agreed deployment in the award of the tender. The agencies received payment for the agreed number of security personnel without their actual deployment. There was also an issue with the simultaneous deployment of an individual at more than one hospital, with the agencies claiming bills for the single individual at more than one hospital," the officer said.

After examining some of the complaints and the complainants, a case under Section 7(A) of the POC Act was registered by ACB against the three security service provider companies and some govt and private persons involved in the matter. "A comprehensive investigation has been launched to unearth the whole conspiracy and fix the role and culpability of govt and private persons involved in the embezzlement of the govt exchequer," the officer added.

New Delhi: Delhi govt on Monday said health minister Saurabh Bharadwaj flagged "blatant corruption" in the hiring of contractual manpower at hospitals and other facilities several times since his induction into the cabinet, but officials were "reluctant" to take decisive action.

The govt, in a statement, mentioned that Bharadwaj took the oath of office on March 9, 2023, and highlighted the corruption issue on March 30 of the same year. "A thorough inquiry should find out why officials had shut their eyes despite repeated reminders by the health minister. The strictest punishment should be given to those responsible for continuing this corrupt practice," the statement read.

Govt said the matter had been discussed "dozens of times" with the officers of the health department, including its se-

cretary. It was also thoroughly deliberated upon when Bharadwaj was the chairman of the Delhi Assembly's Petitions Committee, yet no action was taken.

"Even in the case of hiring contractual data entry operators, the minister has written on dozens of files about corruption. The file was moved to stop this practice of taking manpower through private contractors and suggested they are hired through a central govt's undertaking such as ICSIL. The policy was even passed by the Cabinet. For reasons best known to LG, even that decision has not been implemented," the govt claimed, adding that the minister sent a detailed note yet again on the issue a few days ago.

"In the note, the minister recalled several instances of complaints made by contractual manpower. Despite repeated directions on file, things have not changed on the ground," the govt stated.

185 camps with high-quality waterproof tents being set up for kanwariyas: Atishi

New Delhi: To ensure that kanwariyas don't face any inconvenience, Delhi revenue minister Atishi said on Monday that 185 camps were being set up across the city and each of them would be equipped with high-quality waterproof tents, medical facilities, clean water, toilets and furniture.

Addressing a press conference, the minister stated that AAP govt was "committed" to providing the best facilities for the Shiva devotees during the holy month of Sawan. She also called upon the people of Delhi to join in this religious endeavour and support kanwariyas in every way possible.

While the movement of kanwariyas started from Mon-

day, it is likely to peak by the end of July and culminate on August 2, with people bringing Ganga water from Rishikesh and Haridwar on foot and offering it to the deity.

Atishi, in her press conference, said that kanwariyas would start arriving in Delhi from July 25 onwards, and all camps would be fully ready in the next 2-3 days. Since East

and Northeast Delhi and Shahdara districts are the entry and exit points for kanwariyas, most camps are being set up in these areas.

"Maximum 38 camps are being set up in Shahdara district, while North East will have 29, Central will have 22, and East district will have 19. Kanwar camps are being set up in various other parts of Delhi too," said the minister, adding that about 15-20 lakh pilgrims pass through Delhi during this period.

Atishi said the revenue department had started preparing for kanwar camps from June itself and regular inspections were being conducted by her and senior Delhi govt officials.

"All preparations for setting up kanwar camps in Delhi are almost complete," she added.

BJP says Kejriwal govt must go; allegations 'frivolous', says AAP

New Delhi: Delhi BJP on Monday demanded the resignation of Arvind Kejriwal govt, alleging that it was preoccupied with press conferences while development work in the capital was stalled.

In response, AAP said BJP had brought "frivolous" allegations against it and should instead reflect on how many promises its central govt had fulfilled.

At a press conference, Delhi BJP chief Virendra Sachdeva alleged that several AAP ministers, MLAs and councillors were accused of corruption, and many, including chief minister Arvind Kejriwal, had been arrested and jailed.

He added that Delhi govt was "trapped in a game of bail from jail", which had resulted in the stalling of development work in the city. "In Arvind Kejriwal's rule, only one development has taken place in Delhi, which is corruption," Sachdeva said.

He said AAP recently made "guarantees" to the people of Haryana, where elections were due later this year, but failed to fulfil the promises of opening 100 schools per year, 1,000 mohalla clinics and for providing free electricity and water.

"The academic level of Delhi's students has dropped so much that thousands fail in class each year. Free electricity is only a dre-

am. Due to the power purchase adjustment cost and pension surcharges, electricity rates are the highest in Delhi. People are forced to buy water at Rs 30 a bottle either due to shortage or contaminated water," Sachdeva said.

"Delhi is labelled as the most polluted capital in the world. In the winter of 2023-24, the AQI was over 400," he added.

South Delhi BJP MP Ramvir Singh Bidhuri said that "incompetence, deceit and corruption have become the hallmarks" of the AAP govt in Delhi and Punjab.

"BJP will not let Kejriwal deceive the people of Haryana and will run an awareness campaign," he said.

AAP countered the charges by saying that Kejriwal was "staunchly honest" and had provided "transparent" governance, resulting in Delhi having a revenue-surplus budget although it offered several free schemes. It said BJP should

stop indulging in "frivolous allegations". "It's been more than 11 years since BJP MPs were given a chance by Delhiites. Can BJP name a single significant achievement during this period? Can BJP name one state under its governance that has a revenue surplus or provides free electricity?" AAP asked.

AAP charged that the people of India had seen through the "false promises" of BJP, such as the unfulfilled 'jumla' of depositing Rs 15 lakh in every citizen's account.

"Delhi has the lowest inflation rate and the highest per capita income," it said.

Camps 'found wanting' in northeast Delhi, govt says work in progress

New Delhi: The incomplete arrangements at kanwar camps in northeast Delhi and Shahdara have left the Shiva devotees on the annual march in disarray. The camps, intended to offer rest and convenience to 15-20 lakh devotees passing through Delhi, are grappling with teething problems.

When asked about the inadequate arrangements, Delhi govt explained that a significant number of kanwariyas was expected to arrive in the city from July 25 and that more than 95% of the kanwar camps were, therefore, only now being put up by the state govt and hadn't yet been inaugurated. These stoppers for the devotees will not become fully operational before July 25.

Speaking to TOI, the camp coordinators said there was a big footfall on the first day of the yatra on Monday. However, the lack of essential facilities, including tents, washrooms and medical help, indicated that there might be more inconveniences once the number of devotees started increasing in a couple of days.

The camps that are already running are still waiting for some amenities. Ratanlal, coordinator at Kanwar Mandir in Yamuna Vihar, told TOI, "Having organised these camps for three decades, I can see we are still lacking a lot of facilities. The tent, which serves as the main sanctuary for the weary pilgrims, is absent despite our temple being the only one dedicated specifically to the

kanwar yatra. We can't ask the exhausted devotees to sit in the rain. We are, therefore,

only resulted in disorder."

TOI's visit to several camps also showed that team of medical professionals had yet to be deployed. Some camps have reported receiving over 2,000 devotees, who often suffer from bruises and injuries while marching for long distances with heavy pots of Ganga water back to their localities. Jwala Sharma, coordinator of the Seelampur Kanwar camp, complained, "The govt has assured us of medical facilities at the camps but they are yet to be set up. The severity of the devotees' injuries forced us to get a private doctor to disinfect their sores."

The camps in northeast Delhi's Yamuna Vihar did not have toilets and sanitation facilities. The exhausted devotees rested on the littered concrete roads. In Dilshad Garden, the open sewers within the camps were a significant safety hazard. An organiser expressed worry saying, "The designated spot for our camp is fraught with danger, but we have no alternative but to make do with what we have. The safety of women and children in the camp is a matter of concern because when the crowd increases, anyone can stumble and fall into these open sewers."

There was accumulated garbage near some camps in Dilshad Garden, Seelampur and other areas. Despite assurances of Delhi Police about posting of security personnel in these areas, the absence of CCTV cameras at the camps and the lack of barricading on busy roads like Maujpur to Seelampur have also left the organisers worried about the safety and security of the kanwar yatrias.

ART centre staff allege misbehaviour by AIIMS security

New Delhi: The staff and doctors at AIIMS expressed outrage on Monday after the "in charge" and staff members of ART centre, dedicated to treating HIV patients, were allegedly mis-treated by hospital's security personnel.

They claimed that the security officer of the institute behaved like "goons" when they arrived at the centre, "wielding lathis and throwing around items lying there". The incident was strongly condemned by doctors and staff members.

The ART centre, managed by department of medicine, plays a crucial role in providing care and support to individuals living with HIV. The medical community at AIIMS demanded swift action to

address the situation and ensure that such incidents didn't recur.

A video of the incident that surfaced on social media showed Neeraj Nischal, a senior doctor from department of medicine, expressing his distress over the phone. He voiced his complaint regarding the "inappropriate conduct" of security personnel towards the female staff members at the centre. Nischal alleged that the security guards were "abusive" and "even resorted to throwing objects".

He claimed that attempts to reach the chief security officer were unsuccessful.

The video also showed security guards stationed at ART centre. They were dressed in blue uniforms and carrying sticks, and one security officer was in a khaki uniform.

According to insiders, a free generic pharmacy has been granted a one-year extension and instructed to move to a new location, which is integrated with registration counters set up at ART centre. However, doctors claimed that this space had been allocated without prior consultation or official communication with medicine department.

The situation was eventually brought under control after almost three hours. The chaos affected the single-window counter that fulfils the basic needs of patients, including distribution of medicines. As a result, patients were forced to wait for an extended period.

A senior hospital official, who requested anonymity, acknowledged "the regrettable nature" of the incident and stated that the matter was being looked into.

Records Avg PM2.5 Of 102µg/m3 From Jan To June

New Delhi: A new analysis by Centre for Research on Energy and Clean Air (CREA) has revealed that Delhi was the third most polluted city in the country from Jan to June this year, with average PM2.5 levels of 102 micrograms per cubic metre. Bijnor in Meghalaya was the most polluted among the 256 cities, followed by Faridabad. The average half-yearly PM2.5 levels for Bijnor were 140 micrograms per cubic metre. Faridabad recorded 103 micrograms per cubic metre on average in that period. According to the analysis, 140 cities were featured in the daily most polluted cities list from Jan to June. Of these, 51 cities appeared at least 10 times over the six-month period. Bijnor topped the list, featuring on 118 days, followed by Gurgaon (63 days), Faridabad (62 days), Ballabgarh (58 days), Mu-

zaffarnagar (55 days), Delhi (54 days), Sri Ganganagar (51 days), and Mandi Gobindgarh (51 days). Among India's top 10 polluted cities, three were located in Haryana, two each in Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh, while Delhi, Assam, and Bihar each had one. The PM2.5 data was analysed for only those cities that had the figures for over 80% of the days from Jan 1 to June 30. During this period, Delhi did not meet WHO guidelines of 15 micrograms per cubic metre for even a single day. Out of 182 days, the city met the national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS) of 60 micrograms per cubic metre for 18 days. The half-yearly analysis by CREA said Delhi's average PM2.5 levels at

120 micrograms per cubic metre exceeded the NAAQS and was 20 times higher than the WHO annual levels. Sunil Dahiya, South Asia analyst at CREA, said: "Almost all cities except Palwal and Mandikhera across Delhi-NCR reported higher pollution levels than the prescribed annual NAAQS, raising two important issues. First, that the data quality and sighting of ambient air quality monitors for these two cities should be investigated as it is strange for some cities to show usually lower values in the larger polluted air-shed." He added that "as all the other remaining 25 of the 27 Delhi-NCR cities... recorded higher PM2.5 levels than NAAQS, it is important to formulate a larger air-shed level clean air action plan. This plan should also enforce systematic and comprehensive pollution strategies for these cities and sources beyond the municipal corporation boundaries."

Tomb raiders: Silt and debris on roadside lay waste to beautification on key stretch


New Delhi: The capital is currently hosting international guests for the World Heritage Committee events and various areas in and around central Delhi have been spruced up. In sharp contrast, just a short distance from the World Heritage Site of Humayun's Tomb, there are massive piles of garbage on Lala Lajpat Rai Marg, which connects with the cultural district of Lodhi Colony and the historic locality of Nizamuddin. Silt excavated from the Barapullah drain, construction and demolition debris and municipal waste lie in unkempt mounds on the roadside, obstructing both a lane of the road and the footpath. Under civic rules, the silt and sludge have to be removed to an authorised dumping ground within 36 hours of intimation by the engineer in charge of the road using mechanical transport. The muck and silt from the 10-foot-high mounds are washed into the drains when it rains, defeating the purpose of unclogging the drains and potentially increasing the possibility of waterlogging. Usually, the silt drawn out from the drains used to be dumped in Singhla, a designated site, but that facility has run out of space. Some agencies now dispose of the silt at landfills after paying dumping charges to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi. The road, however, is managed by the Public Works Department. But MCD is the agency primarily responsible for sanitation in the city. While the municipal corporation did not

Cop comes in contact with high-tension wire, dies

New Delhi: A Delhi Police constable died after coming in contact with a high-tension wire while investigating a theft case in Dwarka. On July 13, constable Hemant, who was posted with anti-burglary cell in Dwarka district, along with head constable Anil Kumar, went to inspect a crime scene related to a theft case. They arrived at a plot in Prem Vihar in Nangli Dairy at 10.30am. The complainant said that when he was sleeping on the ground floor, the thief went to the first floor from the roof of the house. The cops then went to the roof to investigate the claim. "A high-tension wire of 66 KV was running over the roof of the house. While Hemant was trying to trace the potential path taken by the thief, he tried to see the neighbouring house from the roof, resulting in a sudden blast. Hemant was electrocuted and his clothes caught fire," an officer said. Anil extinguished the fire and rushed Hemant to a hospital. He was later transferred to AIIMS Trauma Centre. He succumbed on July 20. Hemant had joined the service as a constable in 2018. DCP (Dwarka) Ankit Singh said a "final advice to the bereaved brave heart", was given at his native village in Rewari, with all due respect, where all from the police staff were present. According to BSES, the constable came in contact with a high tension electricity wire above the roof of an unauthorised house. Incidentally, these wires were installed over 50 years ago and in complete violation of the Central Electricity Authority (CEA) guidelines; the building was later constructed underneath high tension wires. "CEA guidelines specify minimum distances to be maintained from electricity installations and wires. Despite being served a notice by the discom, the owner failed to rectify the violation," a BSES official said.

Yellow alert in place, rain respite from heat may last till tomorrow

New Delhi: Delhi got light to moderate rainfall on Monday with the highest precipitation between 11.30am and 2.30pm. The maximum temperature did not drop by a lot. However, the city did get a cool breeze. Favourable weather conditions are likely to keep Delhi cool over the next few days. The weather department expects a two to three-degree drop in the daytime temperature too. On Monday, the city's weather base station at Safdarjung recorded 31.4mm rainfall till 5.30pm. A day earlier, Safdarjung had seen 7mm rainfall. The Palam area recorded 8.9mm on Monday, Lodhi Road 26.6mm, the Ridge 27.8mm, Delhi University 39.5mm, Pusa 48.5mm, Najafgarh 19.5mm, Pitampura 48.5mm, and Ayanagar recorded 13.6mm rainfall. The forecast is for light to moderate showers till Wednesday. "There is an active western disturbance which fed additional moisture to

the city. Besides, the monsoon line of trough has shifted closer to the city and is currently south of Delhi. All these factors together will bring the city moderate showers. The rain is expected to continue towards

Tuesday and Wednesday as well," an official of India Meteorological Department (IMD) said. On Monday, Safdarjung recorded a maximum temperature of 36.4 degrees Celsius, a notch above normal and against 36.6 degrees a day earlier. The minimum temperature was 29.2 degrees Celsius, two notches above normal and against 26.4 a day earlier. The humidity oscillated between 65% and 100%. So far in July, the city had recorded 118.2mm rainfall net. Since the arrival of the monsoon on June 28, Delhi has seen 355.2 mm of rainfall. The weather department has issued a yellow alert for the moderate to light rainfall expected on Tuesday and expects the maximum and minimum temperatures to hover around 35 degrees Celsius and 27 degrees Celsius, respectively. The maximum temperature may drop further to 34 by Wednesday. The air quality has improved to satisfactory from moderate, recorded a day earlier. The air quality index was 85 on Monday.

BJP targets MCD & PWD after roads waterlogged

New Delhi: After Monday's rain, waterlogging was reported in various parts of the city, including underpasses, intersections and internal colony roads. BJP and Congress raised questions about the claims of Delhi govt and MCD, both being run by AAP, regarding the "complete desilting" of drains. Delhi govt and MCD didn't respond to the allegations. According to a report of MCD, waterlogging was reported at Laxmi Nagar, Shakti Vihar in Utam Nagar, Kalyan Vihar and Naraina Industrial Area. Falling of trees or branches was reported from three places in Mehrauli, Trinagar and Naraina Industrial Area. Among PWD areas, traffic was affected on both carriageways of New Rohtak Road, from Azadpur towards Mukarba Chowk, and on Najafgarh Phirni Road due to heavy waterlogging. Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva claimed that just an hour of rain had led to waterlogging in unauthorised colonies in the areas from Najafgarh to Chhatrapur and Narela to Badarpur. "Even residents of well-established colonies faced issues in internal streets. Many underpasses, including the one at Kishanganj, were submerged and major intersections, including ITO, were also waterlogged, causing traffic jams," he said. Leader of opposition at MCD, BJP's Raja Iqbal Singh, claimed neither PWD nor MCD drains were cleaned properly. Delhi Congress president Dender Yadav said the "assurances and preparedness" claimed by the authorities to prevent waterlogging had fallen flat once again.

'Greys will rule the world': Striving to break stereotypes for better quality of life for elders

New Delhi: Clad in a churidar kurta, spectacles perched on her 65-year-old nose, she moved fluidly on the stage, leaving her audience in awe. Classical dancer Ravi Bala Sharma, a retired govt schoolteacher, performed on Monday at the 10th edition of The Times of India's Right to Excellence, a summit on the well-being of senior citizens. Dubbed Dancer Dadi, Sharma and other panellists talked about their "Golden Years, Golden Gains" at Eros Hotel on Monday. The discussions and fireside chats touched upon key topics such as health technology, innovations and opportunities in the senior living sector, rise of older influencers and secrets to thriving in the golden years of life. Dancer Dadi, who reignited her passion for dancing during the Covid lockdown, said that it was unfortunate that society pigeonholed the elderly into categories based on what they could do or what they couldn't, but that had to

change. "At the age of 62, I started dancing again and posted a reel on Instagram. It went viral and changed the course of my life," she said. Sharing the stage with Sharma was model Dinesh Mohan, 66, who proclaimed to a big applause, "Greys soon will rule the world." Mohan, who began his modelling career only at the age of 56, said, "At that age, I had given up on my dreams and become a prisoner of my thoughts. But wishing to break out of this jail, I made an effort to change, first mentally and then physically." Actor Adil Hussain similarly spoke about personal growth and lifelong learning. Given India's burgeoning population of the elderly, the summit was a timely effort to bring together experts and policymakers to discuss issues critical to senior living. Dr Anoop Misra, chairman, Fortis C-DOC Hospital for Diabetes and Allied Sciences, put things in perspective when he said in his opening address that longevity was determined only 25% by the ge-

netic. "75% of longevity is non-genetic. So the environment, diet and nutrition and exercise and fitness determine how long one lives," Misra said. Dr Harsh Mahajan, foun-

der and MD, Mahajan Imaging, pointed out that 7.4% of Indians over the age of 60, or 8.8 million individuals, currently lived with dementia, but that this could be fought. Early detection through imaging, genome sequencing and new blood tests can check the risk of dementia and Alzheimer's disease among the seniors, emphasised Mahajan. Antara Senior Living, Association of Senior Living India, Samarth Eldercare and Epoch Elder Care were the sponsors of the event. Ashesh Gupta, founder, Samarth Eldercare, said that studies had determined that the elderly "need people to talk to, places to go and the feeling that they are still needed". He added that financial independence and security were also key for worry-free living. Neha Sinha, co-founder, Epoch Elder Care, rued that India, unlike other countries, lacked in trained caregivers. "Technology can assist us to care for the seniors, but we also need to skill the caregivers," she said.

14 Pending Proposals On MCD House Meet Agenda

Awaiting Nod For 10 Months; Meeting Slated For July 29

New Delhi: The upcoming Municipal Corporation of Delhi's (MCD) House meeting is slated to take place on July 29. During this meeting, at least 14 proposals, which have been pending approval for 10 months or more, are likely to be discussed. These proposals include the allocation of additional funds for the completion of parking lots partly constructed over a decade ago, the construction of a medical college, and the reconstruction of Minto Road flats.

Due to the non-formation of a standing committee, several development works in Delhi have been badly affected. Delay in receiving a nod from the House for important projects has also affected the overall pace of the

corporation's work. The mayor did not respond to queries in this regard.

Leader of opposition Raja Iqbal Singh said that every time due to uproar in MCD's House, except for a few proposals, others remain undecided. "Generally, when a proposal comes before the House, it is postponed for one or two meetings because the public representatives or councillors ask for some clarification from the department concerned. After understanding the proposal, a decision is taken. Due to non-formation of the standing commit-

tee, the House cannot give financial approvals, which is leading to several projects getting delayed," he added.

Some of the major proposals that have not seen the light of day include the project for building multi-storey underground parking in Kalkaji and Jangpura. Initially, an amount of Rs 104.2 crore was sanctioned for the project. However, the amount was later proposed to increase to Rs 107.4 crore. A proposal in this regard came to the House in Oct 2023, wherein it was postponed. Since then, there has been no progress.

In front of the MCD headquarters, there are residential flats for officers and employees of the corporation. A plan was conceived in 2016-17 to reconstruct these single-storey flats into multistoried structures to provide accommodation to more employees during the tenure of the erstwhile north corporation. The last time, the proposal related to this came in the House meeting in March 2024, wherein it was postponed. If the project is implemented, MCD will also earn revenue as the housing allowance of the corporation employees will come to the corporation only.

Further, in May 2024, MCD came out with a proposal to construct a medical college building complex for MBBS and postgraduate students at the campus of Rajan Babu Institute of Pulmonary Medicine and Tuberculosis Hospital in Mukherjee Nagar. The project will cost Rs 380 crore to MCD. The facility is needed because the medical college is currently running from temporary arrangements (porta cabins) at Hindu Rao Hospital.

The new proposal included constructing a proper medical college building with provisions for laboratories, hostels, staff quarters, a library, an auditorium and hostel blocks.

UAE-Delhi flight diverted to Muscat after technical snag

New Delhi: IndiGo's Abu Dhabi-Delhi flight was on early Monday morning safely diverted to Oman following a technical snag that, according to passengers, saw the aircraft "vibrate" right from the moment it took off. Passengers were put up in a hotel and said on Monday afternoon that they were waiting to be flown to Delhi. The crew told flyers the aircraft had suffered a technical snag. "The aircraft had encountered turbulent weather en route," said people in the know.

Comments were sought from IndiGo and were awaited till the time of going to press.

The flight, 6E 1406, was to take off from the UAE at 12.20 am. A passenger who was on this flight said: "We took off with a delay of 40 minutes with 129 passengers and six crew members. Even at take-off time, the aircraft was vibrating a lot. Some passengers seated in the emergency exit row heard noise as if a door was getting open and shut. For the next one hour, the seat belt sign was not switched off and everyone remained seated. Subsequently, the pilot announced there's some technical problem and that we're diverting to Muscat."

Once the aircraft landed safely in Muscat, passengers claimed that they remained on board for an hour with technical teams trying to rectify the snag. "Some passeng-

ers now started asking for refreshments. The air hostess (the lead one) pointed out there were limited food items on the aircraft as IndiGo is not a full service airline (that has meals & beverages for all). She requested to save the limited meals for the old and very young passengers apart from those with medical conditions just in case the waiting inside the aircraft was going to be a long one. Some food items were given to other passengers," said some on board the aircraft, while praising the lead cabin attendant for the way she handled the situation. Later, passengers were as-

ked to alight from the plane. "We did not have an Oman visa and were waiting inside the terminal when the crew of our flight came. They told us the aircraft had suffered a hydraulic snag and that's why they decided to divert to Oman," some passengers, who did not wish to be named, said.

In about 2.5 hours, IndiGo managed to take the non-Oman visa holders to a transit hotel at the airport. "Now we are waiting to be flown to Delhi. Our baggage is inside the aircraft and we have only our handbags with us," said a passenger at 3.30 pm Monday (India time).

Roof collapse at IGI: HC closes plea for probe

New Delhi: Delhi High Court on Monday closed proceedings on a PIL seeking an investigation into the recent canopy collapse at IGI airport amid heavy rain that caused the death of a taxi driver.

The court recorded the Centre's stand that a high-level expert committee had been formed to examine the incident. Separately, an FIR has been lodged.

Govt told the bench of acting Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Tushar Rao Gode that the authorities had taken several steps, such as the registration of an FIR for alleged "death by negligence" and "hurt by an act endangering life or personal safety of others" under the Indian Penal Code. Additionally, the committee comprising engineers from IIT will submit its report.

The petitioner, Civil Safety Council of India, had sought a probe by a "multidisciplinary special investigation team," headed by expert engineers or an agency such as CBI. The aim was to assess the quality of building construction, its project approval and clearances from civil agencies.

The petitioner highlighted that within a short span of time, there were three instances of structures collapsing at three airports — in Delhi, Rajkot, and Jabalpur — raising serious concerns regarding the safety of the public and the state of structural integrity of the airports. The plea urged the court to direct that the report of the inquiry be made public.

Turning down the request, the court said: "IIT-Delhi is there. That is good enough."

The counsel appearing for the civil aviation ministry told the court that, besides the formation of the committee, the ministry has directed all airport operators to get a third-party audit done. This audit would be on the structural stability of the airports by reputed institutions, such as IITs and National Institutes of Technology. Airports Authority of India said 88 airports have already completed their structural audits and started working on the required remedies, while the process is ongoing in 13 of them.

The counsel also mentioned that the airport operators have been asked to carry out an evaluation of the civil, technical and electrical aspects of their respective airports before the onset of monsoon every year.

The court was further told that all airport buildings are built in accordance with standards laid down in the National Building Code or by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), leading the court to end the proceedings.

'Correct mistakes': HC to Bharti on Swaraj plea

New Delhi: Pointing out several mistakes in a plea that challenged BJP MP Bansuri Swaraj's election, Delhi High Court on Monday adjourned the petition filed by AAP functionary Somnath Bharti to next month.

Justice Manmeet PS Arora, at the very outset of the hearing, flagged numerous typographical errors that made it difficult to understand the contents of the petition. The court also highlighted that the reference to parties arrayed in the petition did not correlate with the respondents mentioned in the memo of parties and synopsis.

The court gave Bharti 10 days to file a corrected petition, which will be heard on Aug 14.

When Bharti's counsel urged the court to issue notice to the respondents on the petition, the judge responded, "There are too many mistakes. Correct the petition first. I can't issue notice like this. I will simply adjourn it. Please file a corrected petition."

The petition, filed under sections 80 and 81 of the Representation of the People Act, alleges corrupt practices by Swaraj, her election agent, and other individuals. It also claims that former AAP minister Raaj Kumar Anand contested the election on a Bahujan Samaj Party ticket to aid Swaraj by splitting the vote share. The plea further notes that Anand joined BJP on July 10.

It contends that Anand, a minister in AAP govt in Delhi, was actively campaigning for Bharti until April 9, when he suddenly resigned from the party on April 10. On election day, the petitioner was shocked to see that Swaraj's booth agents had pamphlets displaying her ballot number, photo, election symbol, and a photograph of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

In response to what transpired in court, Delhi BJP spokesperson Praveen Shankar Kapoor stated the "adverse observations of Delhi High Court on the election petition filed by MLA Somnath Bharti have shown he is neither a good public representative nor a competent advocate."

Bharti, in his statement, said, "Being a lawyer, I am also an officer of the court, I can't comment on observations of the Honourable Court, outside the court. Inside the court, I am being represented by advocate KC Mittal."

Aaftab's plea for twice a month hearing rejected

New Delhi: A Delhi court has dismissed a plea by Aaftab Poonawala, accused of murdering and chopping his live-in partner Shraddha Walkar into 35 pieces, seeking only two dates per month in the ongoing trial so that his counsel gets suitable time to prepare his defence.

The court of additional sessions judge (fast track court) Manisha Khurana Kakkur, in its order dated July 6, stated that Aaftab was trying to deliberately delay the trial. "The number of prosecution witnesses is excessive and considerable time is required to record the lengthy testimonies of prosecution witnesses, especially police witnesses," it stated. The court further noted that out of the 212 prosecution witnesses, 134 had been examined, and consecutive hearings were necessary for the examination of several outstation witnesses.

The court also refused to immediately release the bones of the victim for her cremation on her father's request, saying they were required for identification by police witnesses. "However, keeping in view the fact that the father of the victim has a right to cremate the bones of his deceased

daughter, the matter shall be taken up expeditiously on consecutive dates of hearing each month in order to conclude the prosecution evidence, after which at least some part of the bones may be released to him for cremation, at an appropriate stage of proceedings," it stated.

"Moreover, the right of the accused to a fair trial cannot be allowed to completely trump the right of the victim to a dignified cremation as well as the right of the surviving heir of the deceased to cremate the body of the deceased with dignity and respect," it added.

The court further said that these rights could not be completely thwarted by slackening the pace of the trial at the whims and fancy of the accused, who had been adequately accommodated on each date of hearing to give him ample opportunity to prepare his defence as well as to cross-examine

the witnesses. Special public prosecutor Amit Prasad earlier submitted before the court that fixing two dates of hearing in a month would "severely prejudice and protract the trial" and significantly delay the trial. Recording the testimony of one police witness, constable Deepak, took seven dates, he recalled.

Shraddha was allegedly strangled by Aaftab on May 18, 2022. The 6,629-page chargesheet filed by Delhi Police in Jan 2023 says that Aaftab, after chopping her body into pieces, kept those in a fridge and disposed of the pieces in desolate places across the city over several days, which were discovered later. In May last year, the court had framed charges against Aaftab for the offences under sections 302 (murder) and 201 (causing the disappearance of evidence of offence) of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

Amid Internet Shutdown & Curbs, Nuh Yatra Peaceful

Police Picket Every 3km, Armed Cops At Key Junctions

Nuh: Police pickets on approach roads, vehicle checks after every 3km or so and armed security personnel at key junctions - Nuh resembled a fortress on Monday as hundreds of devotees brought out the annual Brajmandal Jalabhishek Yatra amid a mobile internet and bulk SMS shutdown.



The yatra started from the Shiv temple in Nalhar, went past the Jreshwar mandir in Firozpur Jhrika and concluded at the Radha Krishna temple in Punahana in the evening

On July 31 last year, participants in the yatra were pelted with stones, leading to riots and communal clashes that spread through several districts of south Haryana over the next few days. Six persons died and 88 were injured in these clashes.

So, this year, when Hindu outfits announced they would bring out the rally as usual, it sparked concerns over law and order. Security arrangements were in anticipation of that.

On the way to Nuh from Gurgaon, the first checkpoint was at Sohna - one of the areas that was witness to the clashes last year.

Over the next 18km - till Tauru junction - there were five more checkpoints. At each of them, cops stopped

vehicles to check for papers and questioned the occupants about their destinations. At some places, bags were scanned as well.

"Our job is to ensure no unruly element enters Nuh today. So far, we have not come across any suspicious persons. No weapon was found in any of the vehicles either," a policeman at one of the checkpoints told TOI.

Inside Nuh town too, there were cops at almost every corner. At Tauru Chowrasta - the epicentre of last year's violence - RAF (Rapid Action Force) personnel were on their toes along with local

personnel were on guard since Monday morning.

"After the yatra was announced this year, we prepared a list of areas where clashes had broken out last time. We decided to deploy the maximum number of security personnel at these spots. There were teams of RAF and IRB, along with local cops to stop any untoward incident," he added.

The yatra was brought out in the afternoon. It started from the Shiv temple in Nalhar, went past the Jreshwar mandir in Firozpur Jhrika and concluded at the Radha Krishna temple in Punahana in the evening.

Varun Gaur, the VHP general secretary in the state, said devotees had come from different districts and neighbouring states. "The yatra was a huge success. We had participants from Gurgaon, Faridabad, Kurukshetra, Karnal and Kaithal too. Security arrangements were up to the mark. There were volunteers to provide the devotees with food and water" he added.

Krishan Kumar, a spokesperson for Nuh police, said, "The yatra was peaceful. There was no untoward incident by the end of the day"

The anti-riot paramilitary force, along with personnel of the Indian Reserve Battalion (IRB), also kept watch at different locations, including the areas around Nalhar temple, where the yatra participants had gathered.

Along the 1km stretch between Nalhar Medical College and Mahadev temple - where several vehicles were torched and devotees attacked on July 31, 2023 - there were cops outside every house, every building, every place of worship.

Dhirendra Khadgata, the Nuh deputy commissioner, said more than 2,000 security

Shops closed, roads empty: 'No one wants a repeat of last year'

Nuh: Most shop-owners had downed shutters for the day and the otherwise bustling market area in Nuh town was deserted as hundreds of pilgrims participated in the Brij Mandal Jalabhishek Yatra on Monday, almost a year after riots erupted in the district during the procession.

Though there was no restriction on shutting down businesses and markets, locals said they decided to avoid any trouble as pilgrims crossed Nuh.

"No one forced us to shut

the shops. It was voluntary," said Mohammad Arif, a vegetable vendor who remained off the roads.

Pharmacies, grocery stores and tea vendors were among the few shops still open. Their owners told TOI that hundreds of cops and paramilitary forces were deployed in Nuh to shore up security arrangements, and someone needed to cater to them too.

"What happened last year was a mistake. No one wants to repeat it. Most of the shops were shut voluntarily for this purpose, and some of us opened our businesses to cater

to the needs of those who have to be on the roads," said a man who was keeping his small eatery near Tauru Chowk open.

Tauru Chowk was one of the epicentres of violence that tore through the south Haryana district last year. Incendiary comments made on social media had escalated tensions in the run up to the VHP-organised annual yatra, and it culminated in rioting on July 31 last year. Clashes spread to parts of Gurgaon, Faridabad and Palwal in the days after.

On Monday, there was an uneasy calm apart from the

rush of pilgrims who stopped at two temples in the district between 12.45pm and early evening hours.

Mobile internet services and bulk SMS remained suspended till 6pm as a precautionary measure, and traffic diversions were in place. Notices were put up at petrol pumps, advising customers to pay in cash as UPI payments were not available.

"We kept a watch on social media posts and recently, an FIR was also registered against an offender for posting an objectionable message," Nuh deputy commissioner Dhirendra Khadgata said.

₹24 crore due, GDA cancels allotment of 410 EWS units

Ghaziabad: The development authority on Monday cancelled the allotment of 410 economically weaker sections (EWS) units in Wave City township after beneficiaries of the affordable housing scheme failed to clear dues worth Rs 24 crore cumulatively.

GDA officials said the EWS units were allotted through a lottery in 2020. For the 410 units, with an estimated cost of around Rs 4 lakh each, beneficiaries only cleared the first couple of instalments. Subsequently, defaulters were issued several notices, a final one on June 22 asking them to clear dues within 15 days.

"We cancelled the allotments through a public notice as the 410 beneficiaries failed to respond within the stipulated time. The units will soon be re-allotted," GDA secretary Rajesh Kumar Singh said.

A Wave City representative told TOI that after notifying GDA, they reached out to each beneficiary, asking them to clear the dues. "Following our report, the GDA, through a public notice, cancelled the allotments. Beneficiaries who have made partial payment can obtain a refund after necessary deductions," the spokesperson said.

Real estate agent Ashish Kumar said while it was difficult to ascertain why so many allottees defaulted on payment, one plausible explanation could be that the Wave City township's project was stuck after a 2017 CAG audit flagged the developer owed Rs 401 crore as land conversion charges.

As per a 2012 govt order, developers must allocate 10% of the total flats in group housing societies, coming up on 3,000 sqm or above, to EWS and 10% to low-income group (LIG) categories. EWS units should be in the range from 24 sqm to 36sqm, while LIG units between 40sqm and 60sqm. The GDA approves project maps only when developers commit to constructing these flats within a specified timeframe. Earlier this year, GDA had warned several group housing developers for failing to adhere to their commitments.

Judge recusal delays Khalid bail plea hearing to July 24

New Delhi: Former Jawaharal Nehru University student Umar Khalid's bail plea was renounced for July 24 after one of the judges recused himself from the matter.

Justice Amit Sharma recused himself from hearing Khalid's bail plea in a UAPA case related to the alleged larger conspiracy behind the Feb 2020 riots. The matter was listed for hearing before a bench of Justices Prathiba M Singh and Sharma. "This has to go before another bench," Justice Singh said.

"List before another bench, of which Justice Amit Sharma is not a member, on July 24," the court ordered.

Earlier, Justice Sharma had recused himself from hearing a batch of petitions on the 2019 Jamia Millia Islamia violence, as well as the NIAs appeal seeking the death sentence against terrorist Yasin Malik.

in the national capital, which left 53 people dead and over 700 injured.

The violence erupted during the protests against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) and the National Register of Citizens (NRC).

On May 28, the trial court rejected Khalid's plea seeking regular bail for the second time, stating its previous order dismissing his first bail application had attained finality. "When Delhi High Court has already dismissed the criminal appeal of the applicant (Khalid) vide order dated Oct 18, 2022, and thereafter, the applicant approached the Supreme Court and withdrew his petition, the order of this court as passed on March 24, 2022 (on the first bail plea), has attained finality, and now, in no stretch of imagination, this court can make an analysis of the facts of the case as desired by the applicant and consider the relief as prayed by him," the trial court had said.

MCD places pipes to cut landfill methane and fires

MOUNTAIN OF WOES

New Delhi: To reduce the impact of the release of methane from fresh garbage at landfills and curtail fire incidents, Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) is inserting perforated pipes into the fresh dumps at designated locations.

After trying the method at Bhalswa landfill, the plan has now been successfully executed at Ghazipur by inserting 10-12 pipes measuring 18-20 feet long. Eight to nine feet of each pipe is installed inside the waste while the rest is above surface.

When fresh garbage is dumped at a particular site for a long time, methane is generated during the decomposition of wet waste. "When methane becomes trapped inside fresh waste at landfills, it can lead to ac-

cidents such as fires as it is easily ignited when exposed to air due to increased temperatures. Dumps can also collapse like what happened in 2017 at Ghazipur when at least 50 tonnes of garbage came crashing down after several days of heavy rains," an official said.

MCD currently dumps approximately 1,800 tonnes of waste daily at a designated site spanning 8,000-10,000 square metre at Ghazipur, where a fire incident

was reported in April. The method has been recommended by the National Green Tribunal-appointed joint committee headed by Justice SP Garg, a former judge of Delhi HC, the official said. The civic body had carried out a similar exercise at the Bhalswa landfill in 2022, following a major fire incident that was triggered by methane and took five days to be extinguished. No pipe has been inserted at the Okhla landfill as no fresh waste is dumped there, said officials.

MCD dumps around 3,200-3,400 metric tonnes of fresh and unprocessed waste daily at the Ghazipur and Bhalswa landfills. Earlier this year, MCD also took additional measures to reduce fire incidents at the landfills, including requesting the fire department to use sand or foam instead of water to control such incidents.

Court takes note of CBI chargesheet against Kavitha

New Delhi: CBI has labelled Bharat Rashtra Samithi's (BRS) K Kavitha as a "key conspirator" in an alleged scam regarding the formulation and implementation of the now-scrapped Delhi Excise Policy 2021-22. In its third supplementary chargesheet, Central Bureau of Investigation has alleged that she played a significant role in the manipulation and tweaking of the policy.

Kavitha "demanded, collected and provided upfront money of Rs 100 crore to Aam Aadmi Party for manipulating and tweaking Delhi Excise Policy 2021-22 in favour of the liquor businessmen of south India", CBI has claimed.

The court of special judge Kaveri Bajewaj took cognizance of the chargesheet against Kavitha on Monday, directing her production through videoconferencing on July 26. In June, CBI filed the supplementary chargesheet, claiming there is enough material to prosecute Kavitha.

Special public prosecutor DP Singh, appearing for CBI, told the court that the agency would file the final chargesheet in the corruption case by the end of the week. Chief minister Arvind Kejriwal may be named in it as CBI earlier said its investigation against all other accused was complete.

Meanwhile, the same court on Monday extended the judicial custody of Kavitha and former Delhi deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia till July 26.

CBI has claimed that Kavitha was involved in incorporating favourable provisions, through co-accused Abhishek Boinpally, Arun R Pillai and Butchibabu Gorantla, who had stayed with her at a five-

star hotel in Delhi during March 14-17, 2021, the peak period of Covid-19.

It has alleged that the call detail records of many accused during the same period show that accused Vijay Nair visited the hotel, and on March 16, he went to CM's residence in Civil Lines, where Sisodia was also present. On March 19, Nair visited Hyderabad to discuss the policy further.

Referring to WhatsApp chats of the relevant period, retrieved from the mobile phones of Gorantla, Kavitha's CA, the agency said they were "very clinching". One of them, as per CBI, read, "We have appointed a consultant who will give us the policy tweaking and the ins and outs of the policy required and presentable business opportunity... From that view, we are required to make 2/3 Delhi visits, detailed discussions, freezing the policy etc., then we know the final business opportunity (sic)."



U'khand to split its aid for deceased soldiers between wife & parents

Dehradun: The Uttarakhand govt is planning to divide the compensation amount offered by the state to the family of fallen soldiers between the wife and parents. The development has come following a recent row between the wife and mother of Kirti Chakra awardee Captain Anshuman Singh in which his parents alleged that their daughter-in-law took the entire compensation amount provided by govt and left the house without giving them any share. If the initiative is implemented, Uttarakhand would become the first state to adopt such a move.

Currently, the state govt adheres to the "next of kin" rule of the armed forces, which stipulates that the compensation is given entirely to the spouse if the fallen soldier was married. If unmarried, the compen-

sation is given to his parents or other dependents.

Ganesh Joshi, minister of soldier welfare in Uttarakhand, said, "A meeting on the issue has been held with a few retired officers and the matter has been discussed in detail."

"At present, the state govt offers Rs 25 lakh to the next of kin (wife, if the soldier is married) as per the norms of the armed forces. We are, however, planning to divide that amount among the wife and parents to prevent any monetary issues in future," Joshi said, adding that a final decision would soon be taken after holding another meeting.

An official of the department mentioned that there have been cases in the past where the soldier's widow left his parents to fend for themselves after receiving the compensation. "This initiative would prevent such incidents," the official said.

Kallesh B, additional director of the department, stated in his complaint that ED had summoned him over the phone on July 16 for investigation into the Karnataka Maharshi Valmiki Scheduled Tribes Development Corporation.

Wilson Garden police registered a case under BNS for criminal intimidation, intentional insult, and criminal liability when two or more individuals act with common intention. They mentioned an official identified only by his surname Mittal as accused No. 1 and one Murali Kannan as accused No. 2 in the FIR.

Kallesh said, "I appeared before ED assistant director Murali Kannan, who asked me 17 questions. I answered

all the questions except three, for which I sought time as I had to source documents and check with my subordinates. Kannan agreed and asked me to appear before him for questioning at 2pm on July 18."

Kallesh alleged the ED official did not give any endorsement for his statements. "However, he started to ask questions orally. He told me that transferring the corporation fund to the MG Road branch was wrong. So I clar-

ified that I had transferred the money according to a govt order on March 25, and the illegal transfer of the fund was done on March 5. I did not commit any mistake. After my clarification, he threatened he would arrest me and I would not get bail for two years," Kallesh stated.

He claimed Kannan had assured him that ED would help him if he confessed that there was an instruction from former minister Nagendra and the finance department. Kallesh added that Kannan sent him to Mittal, an IRS officer in the ED office.

"Mittal abused and pressured me (to make statements against CM and Nagendra)," Kallesh said, requesting police to take action against the ED officials.

Terror hit on Shaurya Chakra winner's home, J&K security post leaves 2 hurt

Jammu: A soldier and a civilian were wounded when terrorists simultaneously attacked the house of a civilian Shaurya Chakra awardee and an adjacent security post in Gundah village of Budhal in J&K's Rajouri around 3.10am Monday, barely 24 hours after Army chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi's stocktaking visit to flashpoint Jammu. Instant retaliation by the Army forced the terrorists to retreat, official sources said.

The attack was the second pre-duty terrorist strike on a security camp in Jammu division in less than a week. Two soldiers were wounded

Monday's attack on the house of Parshotam Kumar, the Rajouri Village Defence Guard member who received a gallantry medal this year for taking on terrorists, was carried out by a large group of terrorists. "An Army column deployed in the vicinity of the village rushed to the spot and foiled the attack... A cordon-and-search was then launched to track down the terrorists, triggering a gunfight," an Army source said. Civilian Vijay Kumar, a relative of the Shaurya Chakra awardee, was wounded in the shootout along with a soldier whose identity wasn't disclosed. Both are in hospital but out of danger, sources said.

J&K bans JeM's video misusing Saif's picture

Jammu: J&K Police issued Monday an advisory cautioning citizens against sharing a "propaganda video" created by Pakistan-based terrorist outfit Jaish-e-Muhammed (JeM), misusing a picture of actor Saif Ali Khan and a poster of his new film Phantom, reports Sanjay Khajuria.

The 5:55-minute video was released around 2pm, a police spokesperson said.

"J&K Police have outlined strict instructions for the public to not forward the video to anyone. Anybody who receives the video is required to report. The report should include the sender's telephone number, along with the date and time of receipt," the advisory states.

Assam cash-for-job scam: APSC ex-chief among 32 convicted

Guwahati: A former chairperson of Assam Public Service Commission (APSC) and 29 agricultural development officers appointed during his stint were among 32 people convicted Monday by a special court in a 2014 jobs-for-cash scam that was under probe for eight years. Special judge Dipak Thakuria acquitted 11 people, seven of them officers whose appointments were under a cloud.

The court held ex-APSC chief Rakesh Kumar Paul, two former members of the commission Samedur Rahman and Basanta Kumar Doley and the 29 officers who bribed their way to govt jobs guilty of cheating, criminal conspiracy and forgery under sections of IPC and Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988.

Special judge Thakuria said Paul violated the Assam Agriculture Service Rules, 1980, by injudiciously awarding marks to the beneficiary candidates for "additional qualification and experience". "The convicted APSC trio

also did not allow principal controller of examinations to perform his duty. In the name of selecting right candidates, they (commission) selected their favoured candidates."

The judge said that some deserving candidates were disqualified in the bargain by unfairly reducing their marks while publishing the merit list. "The entire interview process was a mockery of procedure."

The court ordered the convicts be taken into judicial custody till their sentencing. It said the onus was now on the state govt to build public confidence in the recruitment process.

Ex-Union min's son gets regular bail in Kheri violence case

New Delhi: Supreme Court on Monday granted bail to Ashish Mishra, who had been out on interim bail in the Lakhimpur Kheri (Uttar Pradesh) violence case related to the mowing down of five persons in Oct 2021.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan modified the earlier order of the court and made the interim bail order absolute. Mishra, son of former Union minister Ajay Mishra, was granted interim bail last year in Jan.

SC, which had barred Ashish Mishra from visiting the state, allowed him to stay in Lucknow after his lawyer told the court that his father was no longer a minister or member of Parliament and he could not influence the trial proceedings in the case.

Noting that only seven out of the 117 witnesses have been examined so far, the bench directed trial court to expedite the proceedings and fix a time frame to wrap up the hearing and deliver the verdict. TNN

HC cites human error, recalls child porn judgment

Bengaluru: Stating that "fallibility is not alien to the functions" of judges and "to immortalize an error is no heroism", Karnataka high court has recalled its own order in a child-porn case, paving the way for continuation of investigation against an accused person caught watching child porn on a website, reports Vasantha Kumar.

After recalling the order, Justice M Nagaprasanna held a fresh hearing of the petition on Friday and passed an order, observing that in-



vestigation against petitioner, M Inayathulla, should continue as Section 67B (b) of IT Act clearly opens a prosecution against a person who browses child pornographic material. Police had registered an FIR against Inayathulla for viewing a child pornographic site on his phone in March 2023. He had challenged the action, claiming Section 67B wasn't applicable in the case as he wasn't publishing or transmitting child-porn content, but was only browsing a site. On July 10 this year, Justice Nagaprasanna had quashed the proceedings, holding Section 67B punishes only those who publish or transmit material containing child pornography and the allegation against Inayathulla was that he had viewed a website.

However, the state govt submitted an application seeking recall of the order, pointing out that under Section 67B(b) of the Act, even browsing and downloading child pornography were punishable. About the earlier order, the judge said, "Errors do happen; to err is human. We judges are also humans, infallibility is not known to humanity and, therefore at times, we are fallible. To rectify the error is the compulsion of the judicial conscience."

Man gets 70-yr term for triple murder

Patiala: A district and sessions court in Ropar, Punjab, has sentenced a man from Morinda town to 70 years in jail for the murder of his wife, sister-in-law and wife's nephew, besides injuring another nephew.

District and sessions judge Ramesh Kumari agreed with the additional public prosecutor that the convict, Alam, was guilty of both murder and attempt to murder. He was awarded three life sentences of 20 years each for the triple murder and a 10-year jail term for the attempt to murder. The order, pronounced Saturday, made it clear that the sentences will run consecutively.

On the night of June 3, 2020, Alam had hacked to death his wife Kajal, sister-in-law Jaspreet Kaur and Jaspreet's son Sahil, with an axe, while they were asleep at his wife's parental house. He also attacked and tried to kill Jaspreet's second son, Bobby, but he survived.

In Feb 2021, police framed charges against Alam, and the trial concluded on July 20, 2024. TNN

PM to Oppn: Welcome to fight in '29 but respect '24 mandate

'Don't Let Work Of House Suffer For Partisan Purposes'

New Delhi: An aggressive PM Narendra Modi on Monday said while opposition parties are welcome to fight the 2029 elections with full vigour, they should respect the mandate of the last polls and not let the functioning of Parliament suffer because of partisan purposes.

"Go to the battlefields of election in Jan 2029. Till then, the only priority should be the country, its poor, farmers, women and the youth," PM said in his address to media ahead of Parliament session.

Modi said the "negative" tactics of many Parliamentarians in the last session deprived many MPs of valuable opportunity to raise the concerns of their constituents.



We have fought a full-throttle battle since last Jan. But now that phase is over, the countrymen have given their verdict, PM said

"I urge all the MPs, no matter which party they belong to...I want to say emphatically that we have fought a full throttle battle since last Jan. We have told whatever we had to tell the public. Some tried to show the way, some tried to mislead. But now that phase is over, the countrymen have given their verdict," PM said.

"It is the duty of all elected MPs, it is the special responsibility of all political parties that we have fought all the battles we had to fight for the party, now for the coming five years we have to fight for the

country and we have to fight by being noble. Let us use this dignified platform of Parliament for the coming four and a half years by rising above the party lines and dedicating ourselves only to the country," he further added.

Modi referred to heckling by Congress during his reply to debate on motion of thanks to President. "Nation witnessed how an undemocratic effort was made to muzzle a democratically elected govt. For over two-and-a-half hours, an effort was made to suffocate PM of the country and

suppress his voice. This has no place in democratic traditions," the PM asserted, referring to the opposition's slogan shouting when he delivered his speech on vote of thanks on the President's speech during the recent LS session.

The PM reminded the Parliamentarians that people of the country have given their mandate to serve the country and not the agendas of political parties.

"This House is not meant for political parties, this House is meant for the country. It is not meant to serve the Parliamentarians but 140 crore citizens of India," Modi further added.

He highlighted that India is the fastest growing country among the major economies with about 8% growth in the last three consecutive years. Today, opportunities are at the peak due to positive outlook, investment and performance, he said.

Concluding the address, the PM expressed the belief that all Members of Parliament will contribute towards fruitful discussions.

FM to present Budget today; LS, RS to have 20-hr debates

New Delhi: Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha are each likely to have a 20-hour discussion on the Union Budget, which finance minister Nirmala



Sitharaman will present on Tuesday, with the Lower House expected to have separate debates covering ministries of railways, education, health, MSME and food processing.

The business advisory committees (BAC), which have representatives from different parties, of the two Houses met on Monday to finalise the agenda for the session. Govt, however, is entitled to introduce any new item, depending upon exigencies, with the permission of the Chair.

In Rajya Sabha, sources said, a discussion for eight hours is likely to be scheduled on the appropriation and finance bills, and a four-hour debate each on four ministries, which are yet to be identified.

A Congress MP said his party highlighted its demand for short-duration discussions on issues like Agnipath scheme and NEET room during Lok Sabha BAC meeting. However, it was decided that the discussion related to different ministries would allow all parties to raise their issues.

A govt source said a 20-hour time slot for the general discussion on Budget will also provide different parties an opportunity to raise a range of issues to which Sitharaman will reply. Issues like paper leaks can be covered when the debate related to demand for grant to the education ministry comes, a source said. TNN

Centre cites 14th fin panel, rules out spl status for Bihar

New Delhi: Centre has ruled out special category status for Bihar, turning down the demand of BJP's ally JDU, a decision which will also have implications for a similar insistence by another coalition partner, TDP, for Andhra Pradesh.

Though the decision is significant because of the cruciality of Lok Sabha numbers of TDP and JDU for Modi govt, it is a reiteration of Centre's known stance, was expected, and is unlikely to cause political risks; at least not in the near run.

Centre's stand, conveyed by junior finance minister Pankaj Chaudhary in a written reply to JDU member Rampreet Mandal, is based on recommendation of the 14th Finance Commission, which had cited the increase in devolution of central funds to states—from 32% to 42%—to call for doing away with the scheme for special category status, a measure devised to support backward states with incentives like tax concessions to industries willing to make investments in their jurisdictions.

Both TDP and JDU appear to have factored this in their political calculus. During his interactions with BJP, Andhra CM and TDP chief, N Chandrababu Naidu has appeared to be more focused on central assistance for projects such as de-

velopment of Amaravati as the new capital to substitute for Hyderabad and Polavaram dam project. At the all-party meeting on Sunday, TDP representative Lavu Sri Krishna Devarayalu did not raise the issue, much to the apparent annoyance of Congress, which has appeared to be egging on the party not to lower the ante on the issue.

The same meeting saw JDU working president and Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Kumar reiterating Bihar CM Nitish Kumar's demand for special category, while also showing empathy for Centre's stand and indicating his party could settle down for central assistance for fighting floods.

Predictably, Lalu Prasad's RJD seized upon Centre's stand to taunt JDU. "Nitish Kumar has assured special status for Bihar. Since Centre has refused, he should resign

immediately," said Lalu. However, Union minister Giriraj Singh retaliated by pointing out that Lalu kept mum when UPA denied special category status to Bihar. "When RJD is raising this issue, it makes me laugh. When Lalu bhैया used to be called a 'kingmaker' and he was playing in the lap of Congress, he could have got the special category status to Bihar," Singh said.

In a written reply, Pankaj Chaudhary said special category status was granted in the past by NDC to some states which were characterised by a number of features necessitating special consideration which included—hilly and difficult terrain, low population density or sizeable share of tribal population, strategic location along borders with neighbouring countries, economic and infrastructural backwardness and non-viable nature of state finances.

The decision was taken based on a consideration of all the factors listed above and the peculiar situation of a state, the minister said.

IJP (RV) MP Shambhavi Choudhary said, "Special status was a term that existed until the Planning Commission. After formation of Niti Aayog, nobody was provided anything under special category status but states have definitely received special package that would speed up development..."

UK foreign secy visiting India this week, FTA tops agenda

New Delhi: UK Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs David Lammy will visit India this week for what is the first high-level engagement between India and the new Labour govt in the UK. The visit is expected to see both sides reaffirming commitment to a mutually beneficial FTA, while also discussing other bilateral issues including the Indian govt's case for action against separatists who continue to target Indian interests in Britain.

Lammy will hold talks with his counterpart S Jaishankar on Thursday and also meet commerce minister Piyush Goyal to discuss progress in efforts to conclude negotiations for the FTA. UK PM Keir Starmer told his counterpart Narendra Modi in their conversation earlier this month he stood ready to conclude a deal that worked for both sides.

In the talks, both agreed there was a wide range of areas across defence and security, critical and emerging technology, and climate change, for the two countries to deepen cooperation on. Just before the elections in UK, Lammy had criticised the then ruling Conservative govt for failing to close the trade deal and said he intended to get it done as soon as possible.

"My message to Sitharaman and Goyal is that Labour is ready to go. Let's finally get our free trade deal done and move on," he said. According to an agency report from London, a source in Delhi said the Indian side would seek clarity on whether the Labour govt intends to pick things up from where they were left off or start afresh in some way. TNN

In first lot, 4 mantris from BJP allies get bungalows

New Delhi: In the first lot of official accommodation for ministers in the Lutyens' Delhi, four cabinet ministers from BJP allies have been allotted bungalows falling under the biggest category of type-VIII.

While civil aviation minister Kinjarapu Ram Mohan Naidu from TDP had been allotted 22, Akbar Road, heavy industries minister H D Kumaraswamy from JD(S) has been allotted 6, Kushak Road, sources said.

Similarly, food processing minister from LJP (Ram Vilas) Chirag Paswan and HAM leader and MSME minister Jitan Ram Manjhi have got 1, Sunehri Bagh and 7B, Janpath respectively. Former Haryana chief minister and housing minister Manohar Lal has been allotted 3, Krishna Meon Marg, which used to be the official residence of former agriculture minister Narendra Singh Tomar.

All cabinet ministers are eligible for the top category of bungalows. The housing and urban affairs ministry, which manages accommodations under 'general pool' category, allocates accommodation to all ministers in the Lutyens' Bungalow Zone (LBZ). TNN

No info to prove exit polls used to manipulate markets: Minister

New Delhi: Minister of state for finance Pankaj Chaudhary on Monday said that those who alleged that exit polls were used to manipulate markets have failed to back their charge with specific information.

"Though SEBI has received representations on stock market movements, no specific information on any unfair trading has been provided," said Chaudhary, in a written reply in Lok Sabha in response to questions by members.

The minister was asked whether it is a fact that there was an unprecedented fall of stock prices amounting to a loss of Rs 30 lakh crore to investors immediately on June 4.

Indian stocks witnessed a bloodbath on the day LS poll results were announced, where incumbent BJP performed below par and seemed set to fall well short of exit poll predictions and the majority mark on its own.

Trinamool Congress' Rajya Sabha member Saket Gokhale had written a letter to financial market regulator Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), seeking a probe into the stock market activity ahead

of the declaration of Lok Sabha election results.

He had alleged "manipulation" in trading activities, a day after exit polls were announced. Earlier, Congress' Rahul Gandhi had alleged a Rs 30 lakh crore stock market scam due to "fake" exit polls and sought an investigation into the role of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union home minister Amit Shah and Union finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman alleging they gave investment advice to people ahead of poll results. Sensex had declined by 4,389.73 points and Nifty by 1,379.40 points on June 4 when results of the 2024 Lok Sabha elections were announced.

Minister Chaudhary in his written reply asserted that stock market movements are a function of investor perceptions along with other factors—global economic scenarios affecting foreign capital flows, domestic macroeconomic parameters, and overall corporate performance.

"The indices recovered within three days and have reached record levels since 4th June 2024, registering an increase of 12.9 per cent and 13.3 per cent respectively as on 18th July, 2024," the minister said.

The decrease of around Rs 30 lakh crore in market capitalisation of companies listed on NSE and BSE on June 4, 2024 was recovered within a period of five days and it has increased by around Rs 59 lakh crore since then as on July 18, 2024, the minister added.

"Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), as the statutory regulator of securities markets, is mandated to put in place regulatory and surveillance frameworks for effecting stable operations and development of the securities markets. It conducts regular surveillance of trends in the securities markets to enhance market integrity and safeguard interest of investors," the minister said.

During the course of the discussion, Congress' Deepender Hooda raked up the issue of alleged sexual harassment by ex-BJP MP Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh. Though he did not name Singh, Hooda said a situation should not come when players have to fight their own govt and the system.

Kiren Rijiju, who had earlier held charge of sports ministry, intervened to say that members should avoid raising "federation fights" in the House. He said there is bound to be politics in sports federations and such issues should not be raised in Parliament. Rijiju said no other govt has done what PM Narendra Modi has done for sports. The short duration discussion on 'India's preparedness for Olympic games' was included through a supplementary agenda.

When Speaker Om Birla asked the House to take up the discussion, RSP's N K Premchandran questioned the timing and asked what suggestions could the House offer when the Indian team has already left for the Olympics beginning July 26. He accused govt of taking the House for granted, noting that supplementary agenda is issued to bring important legislative items.

BJP's Sanjay Jaiswal hit back and said opposition finds discussion on sports irrelevant. He said govt has invested over Rs 400 crore for 16 disciplines and is making all-out efforts to ensure athletes get the best training and facilities. TNN

RS chairman rejects oppn notices on UP kanwar yatra order

New Delhi: On the first day of the Budget session, the Upper House opened with opposition demanding suspension of business to discuss UP govt's order asking eateries along the along kanwar yatra route to display names of their owners and employees.

Rajya Sabha chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar on Monday rejected notices from opposition MPs on grounds that the notices were neither in conformity to requirements of rule 267 nor to directions given by the Chair and so the same are not accepted.

Opposition MPs including Congress and Aam Aadmi Party had given notices under rule 267 seeking suspension of the business of the day to take up discussion on the issue. Dhankhar said he had received notices under rule 267 from seven MPs across different opposition parties.

Earlier, the Rajya Sabha chairman while making

his opening remarks at the 265th Session of Rajya Sabha drew attention of the members to what he described as "an important and concerning aspect".

"Many a time, members' communications to the chairman find way to public domain and sometimes even before the same reach the addressee. This inappropriate practice of garnering public attention is at best avoided."

He urged all members to uphold the principles of 'dialogue, discussion, deliberation, and debate', fostering an environment conducive to robust parliamentary discourse and set an example before the nation.

BJD pushes for special status for Odisha

New Delhi: All-party meeting on Sunday set the ground, and the Upper House on the first day of the Budget session got a glimpse of what lies ahead, as BJD made an intensified demand during zero hour for special status for Odisha, citing the state's vulnerabilities in the face of cyclones and other concerns.

BJD's Muzibulla Khan said during his tenure as Odisha CM Naveen Patnaik wrote repeatedly to Centre but govt did not address the issue. Even BJD MPs have been raising this issue in Parliament but no one has paid heed, he added.

Khan said the party is aware that there are certain criteria for granting the status but for the welfare of people the laws can be amended and demanded that changes should be made taking into view of the vulnerabilities faced by the state. BJD's Sammit Patra backed the demand.

"Odisha has been deprived of special category for more than two decades," Patra said. He added that BJD has joined its counterparts from other states who feel that there is a need for special status. TNN

HC to Swamy, Gandhis: File notes on submissions in Herald case

New Delhi: The Delhi high court on Monday asked BJP MP Subramanian Swamy and Congress' Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi to file short notes on submissions in the National Herald case.

Justice Neena Bansal Krishna gave them four weeks to file the notes but said if they were filed later, they would be accepted only with costs of Rs 15,000. The HC then listed the matter for Oct 29.

HC is dealing with a plea by Swamy against a trial court's refusal in Feb 2021 to allow him to lead evidence to

prosecute the Gandhis and others in the case.

In 2021, it had issued a notice to Gandhis and others, including late AICC general secretary Oscar Fernandes, Suman Dubey, Sam Pitroda and the entity Young India (YI), to spell out their stand on Swamy's plea and stayed proceedings in the case.

On Monday, HC extended its stay until the next hearing. Congress members were represented in court through senior advocate RS Cheema and Tarannum Cheema.

Swamy has sought summoning of some witnesses with directions to prove cer-

tain documents. They include secretary general (registry officer) of SC, a deputy land and development officer, & a deputy commissioner of income-tax department. In a private criminal complaint in the trial court, Swamy accused the Gandhis and the others of conspiring to misappropriate funds of the entity that ran the National Herald.

Swamy said they paid only Rs 50 lakh, through which Young India obtained right to recover Rs 90.25 crore that Associate Journals Ltd, owner of National Herald, owed Congress. All accused had denied the allegations.

NTA has put off 16 exams since its establishment

New Delhi: National Testing Agency (NTA) has postponed at least 16 exams, mostly because of Covid since its establishment, said minister of state for education, Sukanta Majumdar.

Detailing reasons for postponement, Majumdar told DMK's Kanimozhi Karunanidhi: "Since most of the examinations conducted by NTA are held in multiple subjects, multiple shifts and span over a number of days, there have been instances due to unforeseen circumstances like Covid-19 pandemic, logistical and technical issues, administrative issues, legal orders, etc, when examination dates initially notified in respect of specific subjects or shifts could not be adhered to," the minister explained.

Majority of the exams conduct-

ed over to NTA and had successfully delivered five editions including twice during the pandemic.

The data provided by the minister revealed that four exams—JEE-Main (2020), NEET-UG (2020), JEE-Mains (2021), and NEET-UG (2021)—were postponed due to Covid. Additionally, four other exams, including CSIR UGC-NET (2020), UGC-NET (Dec 2020), UGC-NET (May 2021), and Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) AIEEA (2020), were postponed due to a combination of the pandemic and logistical challenges.

Delhi University Entrance Test (DUET) 2020, which was meant for admission to UG, PG, MPhil, and PhD courses, was postponed due to the registration process was put on hold by DU due to Covid. Common Management Admission Test (CMAT)-2021 was

postponed due to the revision of the examination pattern by AICTE. All India Ayush Post Graduate Entrance Test (AIAPGET), 2021, and Joint Integrated Programme in Management Admission Test (JIPMAT), 2021, were also postponed due to the pandemic.

In 2022, IGNOU PhD Entrance was postponed due to administrative reasons, while in 2023, Graduate Aptitude Test Biotechnology (GAT-B) was postponed after consultation with regional centres for biotechnology. In 2024, National Common Entrance Test (NCET) was postponed due to technical issues, and CSIR-NET was postponed due to logistical issues.

"Since its inception in 2018, NTA has successfully conducted over 240 examinations involving over 5.4 crore students," the ministry informed the House.



Reversing Export Bans, More Pvt Investment Among Proposals

New Delhi: The Economic Survey on Monday emphasised on the pressing need for comprehensive reforms in India's agricultural sector and recommended five policy points to ensure that the markets function in the interest of the farmer. It also pitched for striking a delicate balance between incentivising farmers to increase production and keeping food prices within acceptable limits, and suggested addressing the issue of land fragmentation.

Elaborating on five policy recommendations, the survey, tabled by finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman in Parliament, suggested not opting to ban 'futures or options' at the first sign of price spikes. Other

four suggestions include invoking export bans only under exceptional circumstances, re-examining the inflation-targeting framework, increasing

the total net irrigated area, and making farming consistent with climate considerations. It said the agri sector requires structural transforma-

tion due to challenges of water scarcity and climate change. The survey called for enhancing private sector investment in agriculture saying it is vital for impetus. It said investments in production methods, marketing infrastructure, technology and reduction in post-harvest losses need to be scaled up. Chief economic adviser V Anantha Nageswaran in the preface to the survey highlighted the need for policy re-orientation despite existing subsidies and support measures. The survey noted that the sector provides livelihood support to 42.3% of the population and has a share of 18.2% in GDP at current prices. The sector has seen average annual growth rate of 4.1% at constant prices over last five years.

New Delhi: With land acquisition issues delaying infrastructure projects, particularly highways, airports and power, the Economic Survey has called for faster onboarding of digital land records and obtaining clearances.

The report highlights that despite the large build-up of connectivity infrastructure and energy-related assets, both sectors are hit by delays in land acquisition. The govt is tackling it by focusing on developing access-controlled NHs and upgrading existing ones. "Implementing single-window clearances is crucial for enhancing roadway services' efficiency and effectiveness in India's transportation network," it said.

The report also said that India needs more private participation in building infrastructure, along with more data about investments and assets in the sector, instead of relying on public expenditure. Private sector participation is not forthcoming to the extent desired, it says.

"For India to continue building quality infrastructure, a higher level of private sector financing and resource mobilisation from new sources will be crucial. Facilitating this would not only require policy and institutional support from the Centre, but state and local govts would have to play an equally important role," the survey said.


Richer states like TN, Kerala
corner more NREGS funds

New Delhi: The Economic Survey has questioned the conclusions that higher work generation and fund use under the job scheme implies rural distress, arguing that if it was so, then poorer states with higher unemployment should be leading the performance in MGNREGA as against the fact that richer states have a better record of tapping the scheme. The survey raised the possibility that there may be a correlation between MGNREGA fund usage and reduced unemployment, in what appears to argue that the job scheme is mitigating joblessness.

The survey stated that in 2023-24, Tamil Nadu, which

has less than 1% of country's poor population, accounted for 15% of MGNREGS funds released, while Kerala with

just 0.1% of poor population used 4% of MGNREGS funds. TN and Kerala together generated 51 crore persondays of work.

In contrast, Bihar and UP with 45% of poor population accounted for only 17% of the scheme's funds and generated 53 crore persondays of work. "The survey further added that "states with highest rural unemployment rates did not necessarily use the most MGNREGS funds."

The survey also noted that irregularities and leakages also result in higher fund usage, and the funds do not reach the intended beneficiaries, which makes "demand an unreliable distress indicator". It said Rs 935 crore over four years was found to have been misappropriated, as per social audit units.

Climate
change fight
smart tactic
in geopolitics

New Delhi: An active role in fighting climate change also makes for good geopolitics.

This is what the Economic Survey says, pointing out that by helping small island nations, most vulnerable to climate change, building disaster resilient infrastructure is helping India build a network of allies in the Indo Pacific region, where China has increasingly been aggressive and expanding.

India's contributions through its International Solar Alliance (ISA), Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI), creation of LeadIT, Infrastructure for Resilient Island States (IRIS), and Big Cat Alliance are significant, the survey said.

The India-headquartered International Solar Alliance (ISA), an inter-governmental body of 110 countries, has the potential of unlocking \$1 trillion of investments by 2030, creating a market system to tap the benefits of solar power. The ISA is an Indian initiative, launched in 2017.

India's quest for global leadership roles also saw the launch of New Delhi-based CDRI, which works for sharing of expertise to build disaster resilient infrastructure across the globe. CDRI was launched by PM Narendra Modi in 2019 at the UN climate summit in New York and has 33 countries, multilateral banks, UN agencies and many international financial institutions as its members.

Recently, CDRI invited proposals for funding of \$8 million to develop resilient infrastructure as part of its Infrastructure for Resilient Island States Programme (IRIS), which has financial commitments of \$40 million from Australia, the European Union, India and the UK.

Obesity, fatty foods threat to
healthy & wealthy India

New Delhi: Excessive use of social media, screen time, sedentary habits, and unhealthy food don't just raise the risk of non-communicable diseases such as diabetes, heart diseases and certain types of cancer. The Economic Survey 2023-24 has warned that the lethal mix of these lifestyle-related factors that is highly prevalent among India's working-age population also poses a threat to the country's economic potential.

"For India's working-age population to be gainfully employed, they need skills and good health," the survey says, adding that the private sector has made substantial contributions to this toxic mix of habits.



LIFESTYLE REBOOT

The survey recommends Indian businesses embrace traditional lifestyle and recipes. "India's traditional lifestyle, food and recipes have shown how to live healthily and in harmony with nature and the environment...it makes commercial sense for Indian businesses to...embrace them," the survey says.

Nearly 56% of the disease

burden in India is due to unhealthy diets, according to the latest dietary guidelines for Indians published by the Indian Council for Medical Research. The survey cites this data and says a surge in the consumption of highly processed foods laden with sugars and fat, coupled with reduced physical activity and limited access to diverse foods, may add to the crisis as it would exacerbate micronutrient deficiencies and overweight/obesity problems.

Excess weight and obesity, two common lifestyle problems that plague nearly 17% of India's population, are costing the country 1.02% of its GDP, the World Obesity Federation and the RTI International had said in a report published in BMJ Global Health in 2022.

Just skill it: Incentivise job
creation to meet global needs

New Delhi: The Economic Survey 2023-24 highlighted the need to equip India's workforce with employable skills and knowledge to meet the demands of the global labour market.

With only 4.4% of the young workforce formally skilled, the survey suggested linking skill development initiatives with Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) and employment-linked incentive schemes in high-growth potential sectors such as toys, apparels, tourism, logistics, and textiles. This approach would facilitate the upgrading of skills as production moves up the value chain.

Currently, the Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme is available for 14 sectors. Industry bodies have

been demanding introduction of an employment-linked incentive scheme to promote job creation in the economy, in the face of a growing young population amidst concerns about joblessness growth.

The survey emphasised the importance of maximising the outcomes from skilling initiatives by promoting convergence and utilising synergies with other employ-

ment-centric programmes. The govt is actively partnering with the industry to enhance skilling and employability, ensuring that job and entrepreneurial opportunities align with the aspirations and abilities of youth.

"Measures are being taken by govt to translate India's demographic dividend into a productivity dividend by enabling job and entrepreneurial opportunities that are in sync with the aspirations and abilities of India's youth. It is partnering with the industry to enhance skilling with employability," said the Survey.

By linking skill development with PLI schemes and employment-linked incentive schemes in high-growth sectors, the govt aims to support the upgrading of skills as production advances along the value chain.

Rubbing the wrong way: Toilet
paper doesn't wash with planners

New Delhi: The Economic Survey focuses on the excessive use of toilet paper by the West and the need for a behavioural change.

"The entire developed world uses toilet paper made of 'virgin wood' for the most regular body activity, every single day, multiple times over. Making one single roll of toilet paper uses 1.5 pounds of wood, 37 gallons of water and 1.3kwh of electricity," the survey quotes a report.

It suggests that advanced countries learn from some of the poor and developing nations in Asia where they have adopted a more nature friend-

ly lifestyle when it comes to maintaining basic hygiene. "Many Asian countries provide valuable lessons around these, yet their non-capitalist strategies often re-

main excluded from mainstream discussions because behavioural and lifestyle change seems to be more difficult than climate change," the published report said.

It also points out how the developed world is reluctant to focus on the impact of their 'consumption-oriented lifestyle'. Growing red meat for consumption in these countries, which has a large impact on climate change, is one example. The OECD Environmental Policies and Individual Behaviour Change survey of 2022 said that 43% of respondents reported regular consumption of red meat and showed resistance to change this lifestyle.

No more red cards for 'motherhood penalty'

New Delhi: The Economic Survey calls for strategic reforms to create a robust care economy in India to not only address the expected rise in demand for such services but also address the challenge of 'motherhood penalty'.

Childbearing and childcare is found to have a significant financial impact on women's careers. "Motherhood penalty" shows up as a drop in 'female labour force participation rate' during child-bearing years and resultant loss of income.

"The economic value of developing a care sector is two-fold—increasing female labour force participation rate and promoting a promising sector for output and job

creation," the survey said. According to the Indian Labour Organisation (ILO), the care sector is one of the fastest-growing sectors globally, and investments in care

services sector are estimated to generate 475 million jobs globally by 2030.

In India, direct public investment equivalent to 2% of GDP has the potential to gen-

erate around 11 million jobs, nearly 70% of which will go to women.

According to the ILO, care work consists of activities involved in meeting the physical, psychological, and emotional needs of adults and children, old and young, frail and able-bodied.

"India's care needs are slated to expand significantly in the next 25 years, as an ageing population follows demographic transition while the population of children stays relatively sizeable. Thus compared to 50.7 crore persons in 2022, the country would need to care for 64.7 crore persons in 2050," the survey said.

The report asserted that the additional requirements for care would be further up-scaled as more women partici-

pate in paid work with prevalence of nuclear families increasing.

In a section on social and economic empowerment of women, the survey calls for measures to enhance asset ownership among women and normalising female property rights. "For development to be led by women, it will also have to be 'owned' by them," the report said.

On financial inclusion, it has pointed out that the PM Jan Dhan Yojana has facilitated the opening of 52.3 crore bank accounts, of which around 56% of account holders are women, as of May 2024. This is accompanied by a rise in average deposits by nearly four times, from Rs 1,065 in March 2015 to Rs 4,398 in May 2024.

Ignoring gov, swearer to swear-in 4 TMC MLAs today

Kolkata: Amid the stand-off with Bengal governor CV Ananda Bose over swearing-in of newly elected TMC MLAs, the state assembly's business advisory committee Monday decided that four MLAs, who won bypolls held on July 10, would be administered oath by speaker Biman Banerjee Tuesday, report Debasish Konar & Krishnendu Bandyopadhyay.

The four MLAs to be sworn-in on Tuesday include Supti Pandey, Mukutmani Adhikari, Krishna Kalyani and Madhuparna Thakur. Earlier, two MLAs — Sayantika Banerjee and Reyat Hossain Sarkar — were administered oath by the speaker on July 5.

The decision came hours after Bose wrote to Banerjee and Sarkar, reminding them of Article 193, which penalises MLAs who have not been administered oath by governor or his representatives. Bose's letter also inquired whether the MLAs were sworn in by his authorised representative, deputy speaker Ashish Banerjee.

Bengal parliamentary affairs minister Sobhan Chatterjee had written to the governor seeking time for swearing-in but was not given any. Raj Bhavan shot back queries. Chatterjee said the speaker was well within his rights to administer oaths to MLAs at start of a session.

Rule 5 of Chapter II of 'rules of business' of assembly, which was cited to administer oaths to Banerjee and Sarkar, would be applied on the other four MLAs on Tuesday as well, sources said. Bose sent a report to Prez Droupadi Murmu on the matter.

Cops can't usurp authorities' powers sans legal basis: SC

The court prima facie agreed with arguments put forth by senior advocates Abhishek Manu Singhvi, C U Singh and Huzefa Ahmad, who submitted that kanwar yatra had been going on since pre-Independence but no such directive was ever issued which is against constitutional provisions and secularism and it was meant for social and economic boycott of a community.

At the outset of the hearing, the bench asked whether some formal order had been passed by gov or it was just voluntary for shopowners to display the names. Senior advocate Singh, who along with lawyer Fauzia Shakil appeared for the Association for Protection of Civil Rights, told SC that coercion was in the nature of the order as a fine was being imposed by state police on shopkeepers. He claimed that a bulldozer was being deployed for its compliance and it was compulsory and not voluntary.

Singhvi, appearing for TMC MP Mahua Moitra, submitted that the purpose behind the directive was exclusion by identity, which is not envisaged by the Constitution. He said people of all religions, including Muslims, help kanwaris on their way, and added that it was a double whammy for shopkeepers — if they disclose they are damned, if they don't then also they are damned. In both cases there is exclusion and hundreds from the Muslim community are losing jobs, he told the bench.

Hope & relief as traders on 'kanwar highway' begin removing 'nameplates'

Following the Supreme Court's order on names being displayed outside business establishments, a wave of hope and jubilation spread across owners and employees of Muslim-run fruit carts, tea stalls, tiny dhabas and restaurants dotted along highways and roads that are part of the kanwar yatra route that leads from UP to Uttarakhand, report Sandeep Rai, Mohd Dilshad & Deepak Lavania. "Once again, the court has come to our rescue. We can heave a sigh of relief, at least for now," said Mohammed Nisar as he took down a poster that read 'Nisar Phal (fruits)'.

While the SC order is interim, aggrieved dhaba (eatery) owners are confident that the final verdict will also "uphold the tenets of our Constitution."

Examining the issue, the bench also raised questions on the need and expectation of yatrias who take vegetarian food during the pilgrimage. It asked whether it was needed that food be cooked and served by a member of a particular community and whether the farming of the foodgrain was also to be done by a member of the

same community.

Emphasising that cleanliness and hygiene is more important than who cooks or serves food, Justice Bhatti shared his experience when he was in Kerala. He said that there were two vegetarian restaurants by side — one run by a Hindu and other by a Muslim and he went to the latter because of its hygiene standards and the owner, who was a Dubai returnee, had displayed everything about cleanliness, safety and standard of food on a board.

Ahmedi, appearing for Apoorvanand Jha and activist Aakar Patel of Association for Protection of Civil Rights, said the directives were discriminatory and would further the cause of untouchability and violation of Article 14, 15(1), 17 and 19(1)(g) of the Constitution. He said that requiring vendors to display the names of the owners and staff cannot by itself be read as a measure to ensure vegetarian food for the yatrias.

Prima facie not agreeing with the directives passed by state authority, the bench said, "It is permissible for the authorities to ensure that the kanwaris are served vegetarian food conforming to the preferences and also ensure hygienic standards. In furtherance to this, the competent authority may perhaps issue orders under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006 and the Street Vendors Act, 2014. However, the legal powers vested on the competent authority cannot be usurped by police without legal foundation."

Survey flags need to create 78.5L non-farm jobs annually till 2030

The Economic Survey, meant to be a comprehensive official account of the financial year gone by, said on inflation, India had handled the price situation better than peers and the short-term outlook was benign.

Of course, employment has been identified as a challenge, with the document underlining the need to create 78.5 lakh non-farm jobs annually until 2030, while suggesting that the Centre alone cannot deal with the issue. "It is worth reiterating that job creation happens mainly in the private sector. Second, many (not all) of the issues that influence economic growth, job creation and productivity and the actions to be taken therein are in the domain of the state govts."

Chief economic adviser V Anantha Nageswaran, also waded into the debate on inequality by citing data to argue that as India's GDP expanded 12 times since 1983, per capita income also increased sevenfold between FY1990 and FY2024: a pointed rebuttal to Thomas Piketty and his acolytes. Nageswaran is confident about the trend continuing as he projected a healthy growth rate up to 2047.

However, he also signalled his sensitivity to the rich-poor gap, flagging the role of tax policies as a possi-

ble solution, and AI as a disruptor which could add to the challenge. "Tax policies on the treatment of capital and labour incomes will likely play a more important role in the coming years, especially since the deployment of technology like AI may have a more deleterious impact on employment and income."

The Survey stood out from its predecessors in its candid acknowledgement of several bumps that the gov needs to navigate to ensure sustained growth over a quarter century. It highlighted how compliance burden and approvals were hobbling economic activity.

"The Indian state can free up its capacity and enhance its capability to focus on areas where it has to be letting go of its grip in areas where it does not have to. The licensing, inspection and compliance requirements that all levels of the government continue to impose on businesses is an onerous burden. Relative to history, the burden has lightened. Relative to where it ought to be, it is still a lot heavier. The burden is felt more acutely by those least equipped to bear it — small and medium enterprises. It holds them back, leashes their aspirations, and, in the process, holds the country back," Nageswaran said in the preface of the sedate economic analysis. The compliance burden on SMEs is seen to be particularly heavy.

Apart from jobs, inequality and deregulation, the nine-point policy thrust for the short- and medium-term — some of which may be addressed by Sitharaman in the budget on Tuesday — included a focus on skilling as just around half the youth is deemed employable.

It also called for tapping the full potential of the farm sector by targeting higher yields and land consolidation, crop diversification and better price discovery.

Besides, it sought to draw attention to the policy on China, where gov has imposed restrictions, arguing that boosting FDI from the neighboring nation with which India is engaged in a border dispute, could help bridge the mounting trade deficit and also integrate domestic companies into the global value chain. The observation came in the backdrop of slowing FDI inflows.

On the critical issue of energy transition, the Survey recommended an India-specific approach and also cautioned about protectionism in climate change policies in the developed world.

"Over the last 10 years, the visionary policies of Modi Ji have placed Bharat at the pinnacle of economic growth. The survey documents Bharat's rise to the pedestal of the fastest-growing major economy while prominently outlining its future trajectory to emerge as a developed nation," home minister Amit Shah tweeted.

Petitioners claim entire NEET exam process flawed. Where's the proof, asks top court

Pointing to an ambiguity in this year's NEET-UG exam, a petitioner said in SC that one of four options in the multiple-choice question was correct as per the new NCERT physics syllabus and another would be held correct as per books prescribed prior to 2019. Advocate Suriti Chowdhury said, since the options were ambiguous, her client, who secured 715 marks, didn't attempt the question. She said the question and four marks allotted to it should be either "completely erased" or "four marks given to those who chose the correct answer".

SG Tushar Mehta said NTA would leave it to the court's discretion to engage any expert to determine which of the two statements is correct. He said over nine lakh students chose the correct option as per the new syllabus, while around 4.2 lakh students chose the answer deemed correct as per the courses studies prior to 2019. However, he said only one of the answers could be correct.

A bench of CJI D Y Chandrachud and Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra chose to take help of three experts from among the biggest academic brains of the country in physics to get the correct option for the elementary atomic theory question. "In order to resolve the issue as regards the correct answer to the above question, we are of the view that an expert opinion should be sought from IIT-Delhi. We request the director at IIT-Delhi to constitute a team of three experts on the subject. The team is requested to formulate its opinion on the correct option and to re-submit its opinion to the secretary general of this court, preferably by July 23," it said.

Prior to this, during the day-long inconclusive hearing, senior advocate Narendar Hooda, lead counsel for the petitioners seeking retest of NEET-UG, pointed to the paper leak at Hazaribag and Patna in Bihar, the anomalies in conducting examination at Jhajjar, and the abnormal results in 38 centres at Sikar in Rajasthan and Godhra to argue that the entire exam process was compromised. He also questioned the manner in which the custody of the question papers was entrusted to private school teachers, who are centre superintendents, prior to conducting the test.

However, SC said the petitioners have so far pointed to paper leak at a few places in Bihar and anomalies in other centres but haven't been able to provide evidence as to whether entire process was compromised, affecting sanctity of NEET-UG. The proceedings will resume Tuesday.

After TN, K'taka cabinet moves to demand NEET scrapping

Bengaluru: Congress-led Karnataka cabinet on Monday passed a resolution asking the Centre to scrap NEET for state-specific assessments for admissions to medical colleges. The resolution will be introduced in the assembly on Tuesday or Wednesday. If cleared, Karnataka will become the second state after Tamil Nadu to pass such a resolution.

Following a nationwide outrage over NEET-UG paper leak, Karnataka has alleged that the national entrance test is detrimental to the interests of the poor and rural students.

The state govt has planned to reintroduce the previous system where admissions to both engineering and medical colleges were conducted through a common entrance test.

The cabinet also decided to oppose the Union govt's proposal to synchronise assembly and Lok Sabha elections under the 'One Nation, One Election' initiative. "The govt may move a resolution in this regard in both Houses of the legislature," a minister said.

NTA doesn't outsource setting of question papers, edu min clarifies

New Delhi: All 170 employees of the National Testing Agency are either contractual or outsourced staff, the ministry of education told Parliament on Monday. It also clarified that "all core activities, including setting up of question papers" for exams conducted by the agency are not outsourced. This information was shared by junior education minister Sukanta Majumdar in response to a question raised in the LS by DMK MP Kanimozhi Karumanidhi.

The director general of NTA is appointed by the Centre under the Central Staffing Scheme, the minister said. Additionally, 22 employees are currently working on deputation in NTA, while 39 are contractual employees and 132 are outsourced staff, he added. One employee has been absorbed in NTA from the parent dept, he further said.

Regarding the tasks outsourced by NTA, Majumdar explained that, considering the sensitivity involved in competitive exams, a range of operational and security measures are undertaken to ensure their smooth and fair conduct. "Such measures involve engagement of specialised or experienced agencies for providing services like capturing of biometric (data), frisking, CCTV surveillance and AI analytics, with a view to identify any potential impersonation, exam delivery etc."

- (iv) 1 and 2 are both incorrect

Students who moved court argued there could be two correct answers—option ii based on the old NCERT book (pre-2019) and option iv according to the new book. As a result, NTA had awarded 4 grace marks to those who went for option ii

The exchanges during Question Hour in Lok Sabha saw INDIA bloc members joining forces with Samajwadi Party boss Akhilesh Yadav in attacking the Centre. "The issue is there are millions of students in this country who are extremely concerned about what is going on and who are convinced that the Indian exam system is a fraud. If you are rich and have money, you can buy the Indian examination system," a leader of opposition Rahul Gandhi alleged. "As this is a systemic issue, what exactly are you doing to fix this issue at the systemic level?" he asked.

Education minister Dharmendra Pradhan hit back by reminding opposition that NEET was conceptualised under UPA but was never implemented because of pressure from the private medical colleges which charge hefty capitation fees from students — his refer-

ence to "remote-controlled govt" being seen as a suggestion that Rahul, having been the all-powerful figure in the Congress-led coalition, cannot wash his hands off the policy volte face.

"For the first time, students from ST/SC/OBC categories and from rural areas have performed well... Students from Kerala have done well, should we now say that there is some wrongdoing there also?" Pradhan asked.

"There is no evidence of paper leaks in the last seven years in any numbers..." Pradhan said in response to Congress MP Manickam Thagore mentioning that there have been 70 paper leaks in seven years. He also rejected Thagore's demand that he quit, saying he enjoys PM's confidence. "I am here at the mercy of my leader, the PM," Pradhan said, adding his govt is "collectively answerable".

"Questioning the entire examination process of the country is very sad and calling it rubbish and fraud is condemnable," Pradhan said and also informed the House that the list of successful students, as directed by Supreme Court, has been uploaded on the website.

Akhilesh Yadav also raised questions about the examination paper leaks and claimed the govt will make a record on the issue. Congress MP Hibi Eden called NEET issue "the biggest scam". RSP MP N K Premachan-

dran demanded a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) probe into the NEET issue.

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla intervened as he said it is not right to raise questions about all examinations and members should discuss the need of developing a better examination system.

Rahul said it is obvious to the whole country that there is a very serious problem in the examination system, not just in NEET but in all major examinations. A visibly peeved Pradhan said it was unfortunate that the member described the examination system as rubbish. "Since setting up NTA, more than 240 examinations have been conducted, more than five crore students applied and more than 4.5 crore students participated," the minister said.

Rahul and almost the entire opposition, including from Trinamool Congress and Dravida Munnetra Kazhaga, walked out of the House. Congress deputy leader in the House Gaurav Gogoi raised slogans demanding the resignation of Pradhan.

K'taka freezes Bill on techies' workhours

Bengaluru: Congress cabinet in Karnataka Monday put in cold storage its contentious proposal to increase work timings in IT sector from a maximum permissible 10 hours to 14 hours a day. The cabinet also formally decided to postpone indefinitely an earlier proposal to move a Bill seeking to introduce job reservation for local candidates in the private sector amid a backlash from captains and associations of industry.

Nasscom, which represents the IT industry, said Saturday that it supported the 48-hour workweek followed across the country and had never asked for a 14-hour workday or a 70-hour workweek.

Sources linked minister Santosh Lad's opposition to the proposal to his unhappiness at not receiving support on the proposed reservation for locals in private sector. TNM

Jr sailor went missing likely during attempt to jump off listing warship

After Navy chief Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi briefed defence minister Rajnath Singh on Monday about the mishap on INS Brahmaputra, an official said, "The minister prayed for safety of the missing sailor. He directed the Navy chief to take appropriate action." A board of inquiry has been ordered to ascertain the sequence of events and reasons for the mishap.

INS Brahmaputra, which was commissioned in April 2000 after being built by defence shipyard Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Ltd at Kolkata, was undergoing a refit at the naval dockyard when the fire broke out on board on Sunday. Packed with weapons and sensors, it had a crew of around 450 including 40-odd officers.

The fire was brought under control by the warship's crew with the assistance of firefighters from the naval dockyard, which was followed by "sanitisation checks" for any residual risks. On Monday, however, the frigate began "listing" (when a ship takes in water and tilts to one side) to the port side from water pumped into the vessel during firefighting operations.

"Despite all efforts, the warship could not be brought to upright position. The ship continued to list further alongside her berth and is resting on one side at present," an officer said. The junior sailor still to be accounted for probably went missing during the

attempt to jump off the listing ship.

Another Brahmaputra-class frigate, INS Betwa, had slipped from her dock blocks, tilted and then crashed flat on her port side while being undocked during a maintenance refit in the Mumbai naval dockyard on Dec 5, 2016. It had taken a Herculean effort to make INS Betwa operational again with the help of international salvage experts at a cost of around Rs 20 crore.

The Navy had been hit by a string of accidents, almost 40 of them, between 2007 and 2016. In Feb 2014, then Navy chief Admiral D K Joshi had owned "moral responsibility" and resigned after two serious accidents on board two submarines — INS Sindurakshak and INS Sindhuratna — killed five officers and 15 sailors.

Reports by the CAG, incidentally, have punched several holes into the management of refits of warships that take place in the two naval dockyards at Mumbai and Visakhapatnam and three naval ship repair yards at Port Blair, Kochi and Karwar.

Razed 503 illegal religious structures in 1 mth: Guj to HC

Ahmedabad: State govt on Monday informed the Gujarat high court that 503 religious structures, illegally constructed on public places, were removed across state in the last one month.

The HC and Supreme Court have ordered the removal of all religious constructions, illegally put up on public places.

This was in response to a photograph of a temple in Ahmedabad published by TOI in 2006 after riots broke out in Vadodra, when three mazzars were razed by the civic body. The govt submitted that out of 503 religious structures that were demolished, 263 structures were in district areas and 267 in municipal corporation areas. TNN

4 injured in Mumbai as drunk driver rams Audi into 2 autos

Mumbai: A speeding Audi car, driven by a man allegedly in an inebriated state, ramed into two stationary autorickshaws in Mumbai's Mulund area on Monday, leaving four people injured, police said.

Police have arrested the accused, Dattatray Gore, 43, a resident of Kanjurmarg, from his sister's house after he fled the

Police arrested the accused, 43-year-old Dattatray Gore, from his sister's house after he fled the scene, leaving the vehicle behind, an official said.

The incident occurred at around 6.15am on Dumping

Road, and police later impounded the high-end car, he said. The car had ramed into two stationary autorickshaws, injuring two drivers and as many passengers. Their condition is said to be stable, the official said.

Police have collected the accused's blood sample and sent it to Kalina Forensic Science Laboratory. It was found that he

was under the influence of alcohol at the time of the accident. A case has been registered under relevant provisions of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and Motor Vehicle Act (MVA), the official said.

This incident follows a recent accident in Worli, where a BMW fatally struck a woman riding pillion on a two-wheeler. PTI

Musk and Khosla argue over Trump's GOP candidature

New York: Tech billionaire Elon Musk and Indian-American venture capitalist Vinod Khosla were engaged in a war of words on Monday over Republican Donald Trump's candidature for the US presidency.

In a post on X, Khosla said it is hard for him to support someone like Trump, who has "no values, lies, cheats, rapes, demeans women", and "hates immigrants" like him.

Replying to his post, Musk said Trump "doesn't hate you. In fact, I think he likes you. Meet him and find out for yourself".

Khosla in his reply said he agreed with that, "but abandon climate and drill baby drill! Be MAGA (Make America Great Again) and abandon Nato and American leadership and moral authority?"

In support of Trump, Musk said civilisation will continue to need oil and gas. "I don't think we should demonise an industry that is essential for humanity... Sustainable energy production and consumption is growing very rapidly and is tracking to exceed the use of hydrocarbon fuels. That will happen no matter what Trump does."

B'desh protests halted, govt gets 48 hrs to meet demands, including apology from PM







More registered voters expect Kamala Harris to win against Donald Trump than thought so of Joe Biden




Support for Harris among elected Democrats as the party's nominee



US Secret Service boss says attack on Trump major failure, but rejects calls to resign

Washington: Secret Service director Kimberly Cheatle said Monday that her agency failed in its mission to protect ex-prez Donald Trump during a highly contentious congressional hearing with lawmakers of both major political parties demanding she resign over security failures that allowed a gunman to scale a roof and open fire at a campaign rally.

In her first hearing over the July 13 assassination attempt, Cheatle repeatedly angered lawmakers by evading questions, citing ongoing investigations.

Cheatle acknowledged that the Secret Service was told about a suspicious person "between two and five times" before the shooting. She also revealed that the roof from which the shooter fired had been identified as a potential vulnerability days before the rally.

te the failures, Cheatle, who has spent nearly three decades at the Secret Service, remained defiant that she was the "right person" to lead the agency.

Cheatle acknowledged that the shooter, Thomas Matthew Crooks, had been seen by local law enforcement before the shooting with a rangefinder, a small all device resembling binoculars.

Asked about why there were no agents on the roof, Cheatle said she is still waiting for the investigation to play out, prompting outbursts. The Secret Service has acknowledged it denied some requests by Trump's campaign for increased security at his events in the years before the assassination bid.

Biden/Caesar

How an American president has played out a classical tragedy, palace coup included

Every tragedy falls into two parts, a complication is followed by an unraveling or a denouement. Aristotle said this 23 centuries ago. The 46th American president is living this now. The Biden-Trump debate was watched by 51mn Americans on TV alone. In Biden's telling, he just had a bad night. For too many others, it meant that he would for sure have a super bad election day. And it isn't just Americans who have been weighing in on the matter. First, because of how consequential this election is for the world. Second, because its theatricality is riveting. Global interest has only intensified after the failed assassination of Trump. So, when Biden stepped down from his re-election bid this weekend, the denouement of the political crisis triggered by his debate performance, it sure vibed like classical tragedy: Beware the Ides of July.

The classical tragic hero, "highly renowned and prosperous", is not downed by vice or depravity, but by some error or frailty. This, too, describes Biden's situation well - he was brought down by nothing but "biological dynamics". A sitting American president dropping out of the race so late in the election cycle, is historic. It's really an unprecedented offering for "party and the country".



Republicans, of course, have a darker spin on his fate. That it is something like a palace coup. But talk of Biden being Julius Caesared is actually bipartisan. There are Democratic voices that are uncomfortable with the way in which long-time supporters and donors stepped away from Biden in recent weeks. When Shakespeare's Caesar went down with, "Et tu, Brute?", Antony called it "the most unkindest cut of all". This is echoed by some Democrats, who accuse Obama and Pelosi, who did not stage their disaffection publicly, of brutal betrayal. The theatre was all the more riveting because Biden didn't move towards denouement meekly. He resisted for days. So did his loyalists. There was no better demonstration of this than his continuing to claim until hours before he quit the race that, Hollywoodised American style, "I'm the guy."

So, yes, Biden has walked into what he and his cohort see as early, unwanted and unwarranted retirement. His critics in America's liberal establishment, in and outside the Democratic party, reckon he left it too late. But even if those critics are right, in this epic political drama, Biden is a bit of a tragic hero.

LOTUS FIGHTS TO BE POTUS

The battle for America's soul will be fought between Kamala Harris, who represents a changing country, and Donald Trump, who pushes a quasi-isolationist agenda

A week is a long time in politics, a British politician once said, but he was speaking well before the arrival of the internet and the age of social media, when even 24 hours is now an eternity. How things have changed in the hours after Biden bowed out - or was hustled out - of the US presidential election race, endorsing his VP Kamala Harris as the Democratic nominee.

Suddenly, she is poised to fight the oldest nominee for president in US history. It's not Biden's senility or infirmity in question now. It's Trump's age (78), fitness, and mental acuity. The tables have turned.


Trump and his MAGA constituency's immediate response to the development has been to resume and ramp up attacks on a person they see as an interloper. The crazies are crawling out of the woodwork, over-running moderate Republicans legitimately opposing Kamala on political and ideological grounds.

Birther conspiracies have taken on new life. Far-right maggots festering with resentment at a black-brown woman taking on white supremacy among other issues are questioning her eligibility to run for White House because she is an "anchor baby" - born to parents when they were foreign students in US. Typical of their ignorance, they're unaware that parental status is irrelevant; she was born in America and that's what matters.

Expect more such attacks and vilification in the coming days in a deeply polarised country, including edited mishmash of her word salads (still not a patch on Trump's actual blather) and sexist denigration of the way she dresses, moves and laughs. Patriarchy and misogyny still rule in conservative America, illustrated by the continuing

efforts by old white men to regulate the uterus of women, but who resist regulation of deadly assault weapons.

Kamala may or may not be the right answer to America's problems, but she has every right to have a fair shot at White House.



They will make it hard for her. A country that hasn't elected a woman to Oval Office in 248 years, and whose old white guard denied the presidency to a white woman (Hillary Clinton) through electoral college caprice (even though she won 3mn more popular votes than the winner in 2016) is hardly likely to entertain the prospect of a black-brown woman in White House. Her getting within a heartbeat of the presidency was enough to trigger them.

How does all this matter to the world and specifically to India? For all its flaws, US still remains the shining city on the hill, a political, social, and economic trendsetter. The fallout of what happens in America will affect not just the global order, but domestic politics everywhere. Any diminution of democracy and move

towards authoritarianism will delight demagogues and dictators all over the world.

Indians tend to see Kamala, or any other foreign leader of Indian origin for that matter, mainly through diasporic lens, expecting their ethnicity to supersede their nationality. By now it's reasonably established that any "desi-ness" in such leaders - be it Rishi Sunak or Kamala - is secondary and subservient to their national loyalty, as it should be.

Simply put, or oversimplified, Trump may be an existential threat to US and its democracy, but he is, in one sense, good for India because he is transactional, and lately, New Delhi is good at this *dhandu* (business). He is easily won over by flattery. There will be no pious lectures on human rights and his anti-minority majoritarianism sits well with the current dominant mood in India.

In his first term, someone suggested that all New Delhi had to do to appease him was buy for its police forces plenty of Harley-Davidson motorcycles, of which he was a big votary. India did better; it hosted a public rally that massaged his ego. His jettisoning of an Atlanticist outlook, his prospective diminution of Nato, and his more agreeable engagement with Russia (at the risk of being branded Putin's puppet) while seeking to counter China, will also be pleasing to New Delhi. Trump sees India in favourable terms, much more than Kamala. Small wonder he has growing support in India.

In any case, even an improbable Kamala victory will be questioned, challenged, and possibly overturned. A preview of the methods was demonstrated on

Jan 6, 2021 when the loser tried to usurp power through violence and intimidation trending to insurrection. The stage has already been set and the acoustics tested for a repeat performance. Trump has, in effect, said only a result that shows him winning will be valid. An outcome where he loses can only be because there was cheating and the election was stolen.

So, domestically, the battle for the soul of America that Biden often spoke about has now truly been joined. On the one side stands an old white misogynist speaking in racist undertones who promises to "Make America Great Once Again" with a quasi-isolationist agenda, while making it grate in the four years he was in office. On the other side will likely be a candidate, far from perfect, but more representative of a socially and demographically changing America that will want to remain agreeably engaged with the world. It will be a compelling, tense, and possibly brutal few weeks ahead.

So strap on your seat belts. It's going to be a wild ride till Election Day on Nov 5 and perhaps even after. The pilot in the cockpit has passed out, and the co-pilot and a pilot who was cashiered in 2020 will be making a grab for the controls. There's no telling who will land the plane, how, and in what condition.



Cooking It Just Right

SC order banning display of names at eateries along Kanwar route removes a govt-created blot

The Supreme Court's interim order putting a pause on UP, Uttarakhand and MP govt directives - for food stalls, shacks and eateries along the route of Shiv bhakts' annual trek, 'kanwar yatra', to display their names and their staff's - is a relief for both proprietor and pilgrim. States were wrong to enforce, with gusto and precision, such a measure. As SC said, food laws require that menus be displayed, and food be correctly labelled. People, petitioners argued, visit restaurants basis the menu, not who's serving or cooking - which directly feeds into politics of "untouchability". Thus, the case stood on the trinity of, SC said, "safety, standard and secularism".



Livelihood hit | The measure had a chilling effect with restaurants forced to ask Muslim employees to stand down during the yatra. The workers, largely pasmanda, would thus lose wages, and proprietors, their workers. The kanwar yatra has been the busiest season for decades for these eateries, fruit sellers and food stalls on the 240km odd route with multiple paths, catering to hungry, thirsty, exhausted walkers. The non-compliant would have had to cough up fines. The choice then was between a fine and the possibility of economic boycott. It was unconscionable for states to roll out such a targeted measure that hits livelihoods of certain sections during a certain festival along a certain route - Muslims along UP's districts, and OBC/Dalit-concentrated pockets in districts from UP into Uttarakhand.

Introducing a fault | Any rationale was missing from the word go. Unsurprisingly, directives drew new fault lines. Several kanwars too criticised the directive. There's, after all, also the matter of choice. Peer pressure is big in community activity such as this. If a kanwar were to patronise a restaurant against his group's choice, it might destroy camaraderie within kanwar groups. SC's order rightly brings pause. But these govt directives should be altogether nixed. They speak to poor governance, and poorer politics.

Why La Roja Shines, In White, Black & Brown

That Spain's a major sporting power goes back to 1992 Barcelona Olympics. But immigration is changing the country. Its stars are not all white, whether the far-right likes it or not

July 14, 2024 will be a date to remember in Spain. Carlos Alcaraz's victory in Wimbledon and the unexpected success of the Spanish squad at the Euros were something more than a breath of fresh air. They also had a message for the world and to Spain itself as a nation.

"I'm Spanish, what do you want me to win?", a successful catchphrase of the early 2010s, got back into circulation on social media. The two victories have also shown Spain as a changing country finding its way to be, while the far-right rises in the Western world.

The two wins' accurate comparison is neither with the 2010 Fifa World Cup, nor Nadal's long run in tennis. Instead, we have to go back 32 years to the 1992 Barcelona Olympics. That was not only a sports success. It was a public demonstration that Spain isn't only about bulls and paella, and that Spaniards aren't short, big-bellied, lazy people, but modern, free, arty and talented citizens of a likeable country.

How did that happen? Was there a sudden explosion of talent? If anything, there was a sudden explosion of method.

Before 1992, sports success in Spain was the result of individual effort. But in 1987, after Barcelona was nominated to host the Olympics, a plan was put in place. Program ADO, a non-profit govt-based institution, gave young sports talents the opportunity to worry about nothing but their careers. Funded with public and private resources, it gave amateur athletes the tools for success: from scholarships that, de facto, equalised their economic situation to that of professional athletes, to medical, psychological and structural aides like CARs (high performance centres). Alcaraz

was trained in former tennis player Juan Carlos Ferrero's academy shaped as a CAR.

Plus, the end of Cold War also brought unexpected assets. Coaches and trainers of the former red bloc could move to Spain to add a key element: technique and expertise.

Those were the facts behind Spain's 1992 success. Not just effort, but method; not just talent, but hard work; not just individuals, but a national goal birthed



by public-private joint ventures. Since 1992 until the 2022 Beijing Winter Games, Spanish sportsmen and sportswomen have won 144 summer and winter Olympic medals. From 1896 to 1988, they had won just 27 medals, a number that was almost equalled during the Barcelona Games alone, with 22 medals.

While sports grew in Spain, the country was growing too. During the 1990s and early 2000s, its economy and quality of life saw unprecedented growth. Just before the 2010 debt crisis, it had the 3rd highest GDP

per capita in the Eurozone. But the debt crisis broke some basic rules of the welfare state: public expenses for those in need had to be cut. A suddenly impoverished country became the breeding ground for a new kind of far-right, not based in Franco's fascist dictatorship nostalgia, but in a nationalistic, racist endeavour that has seduced thousands of youngsters.

The far-right rise clashed with an undeniable fact - that Spaniards were moving to other countries, fertility (1.16 child per woman) and birth (6.7%) rates were falling, and immigration had become a need. For Spain, and much of Europe, rise of nationalism is based on the vote of a frightened middle class that fears impoverishment without being poor. This comes with the usual fake news that sets crimes as a consequence of immigrants and illegal aliens, a lie that's been repeatedly debunked by official data.

Although the sports method remains unchanged, immigration is changing the skin of Spain. Success has made Spanish sportsmen and sportswomen a valuable - though not always affordable - good for Spanish professional teams. Only three of the 23 players (13%) that won the World Cup in 2010 played for foreign teams. In 2024, this percentage has risen to 26.9%. And some of them, such as Rodri, Fabian and Dani Olmo, have short or no experience in Spanish domestic tournaments; they're migrants themselves.

As it happened in 1992, the response to the existential debate of what we Spaniards are comes from the pitch. Young footballers Lamine Yamal (17) and Nico Williams (22) set the bar; a 17-year-old minor son of migrants and the son of an illegal alien now represent the possibility of a future against racism and warped nostalgia. Spanish society has to choose now. Between its past and its future. Between its angels and its demons.

contingency of our lot can inspire a certain humility, enabling us to accept that, "There, but for the grace of God, or the accident of birth, or the mystery of fate, go I". The wisdom of this understanding humbles us and changes our attitude to life for the better.

Far from advocating inaction, an absence of doership promotes non-action, a positive trait that focuses on being in the moment. Ramana Maharshi explains this by distinguishing freedom from free will and ego from egoism. Freedom, as Ramana says, is our birthright. We are ever free, more so as we persevere to associate with our true nature or Self. Our sense of illusory free will provokes disharmony, more so when outcomes and expectations are not met. Ramana also distinguishes ego and egoism. A




Sensex Up 21,000 Pts Or 31%, Market Cap Surges By \$2Tn

Mumbai: Since finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman's fifth Budget on Feb 1, 2023, Indian investors have become richer by a staggering Rs 174 lakh crore — translating to about \$2.1 trillion at the current rupee-dollar rate. In the same time, the Sensex has risen 31% (nearly 21k points) while Nifty has outperformed its more popular peer with a return of 39%, stock exchange data showed.

Gains in the Sensex and Nifty, however, fade when compared to the returns in mid and small-caps. While BSE's Midcap index rose 92% — nearly doubling investors' money — the small-cap index was slightly behind at a 90% gain. The rise in these indices during the last 18-plus months came on the back of strong buying by both foreign and domestic investors. Mutual funds had net invested Rs 3.4 lakh crore in the equity market,

while FPIs net bought stocks worth Rs 2.1 lakh crore, official data showed. The turnaround in the fortunes of the Indian market since Feb 2023 is remarkable if we look at how the global economy and markets have traded during the same period. Despite fears of rising inflation in the US and the EU, govt and RBI

worked in tandem to keep the impacts of a global inflationary pressure from affecting the Indian economy in any major way. While RBI managed liquidity well and its monetary policies contained inflation, govt kept its market borrowings under check. As a result, the Indian economy didn't face a runaway inflation and interest rates also didn't rise much. Among the highlights of the Indian market was the crash in Adani group shares just around last Budget. After US-based short-seller Hindenburg Research published a damning report on the group on Jan 24, 2023, in about five weeks, the group's total market value crashed by nearly 65% — from Rs 19.2 lakh crore to about Rs 6.5 lakh crore. Since then, the group has recouped most losses and Sebi didn't find any proof backing Hindenburg's allegations of corporate malfeasance by the Indian conglomerate.

The market also discounted the Lok Sabha poll results that saw the BJP's total seats fall from their number five years ago. Even as markets took a tumble as a knee-jerk reaction, they soon recovered to take the Sensex over the 80K mark — which is seen as a major psychological milestone for Dalal Street.

RBI cites Windows outage to flag single vendor risks

Dependence On Third-Parties For Critical Services Can Create Vendor Lock-In Situations: Dy Guv Rao

Mumbai: RBI's deputy governor M Rajeshwar Rao cited last week's global Windows outage to highlight the risks of outsourcing and relying on a single vendor for critical services. He also pulled up lenders for partnering digital platforms that do not provide redressal mechanism.

"Last Friday's (incident) essentially reflects the kind of risks which I'm talking about. Third-party dependencies and digital outsourcing have become integral to the operations of financial service entities consequent to the rapidly evolving technology," the deputy governor said in a speech at a BFSI summit organised by ratings agency CareEdge on Monday.

Rao said that dependence on third parties can create vendor lock-in situations where regulated entities become reliant or captured by

a single vendor of critical services. "This lack of vendor diversification can increase dependency risks and limit the flexibility of the entities to adapt to changing market conditions," he added. Rao said that despite regulatory efforts, some entities fall

Baba Kalyani's niece & nephew look to settle family assets matter

Mumbai: Bharat Forge chairman Baba Kalyani's nephew Sameer Hiremath and niece Pallavi Swadi are looking to settle a dispute over a multi-billion dollar estate with their uncle through a court-monitored mediation process.

Sameer and Pallavi — grandchildren of forging industry pioneer Neelkanth Kalyani — had moved Pune civil court against their uncle Baba Kalyani in March, seeking division of family assets. They had demanded one-ninth of the family estate including stakes in Bharat Forge and Kalyani Steel as their share. Sameer and Pallavi are children of Baba's sister Sugandha Hiremath, who is also the co-promoter of Hikal, a pharmaceuticals and chemicals company. Separately, Sugandha is in an ownership dispute with Baba over Hikal. The court on Monday asked the two parties to look at settling their dispute through mediation after Sameer and Pallavi tabled the mediation option before the judicial forum. The siblings told the court that they were willing to mediate with their uncle as they were deeply anguished by mudslinging in court.

If Baba agrees to the mediation, then from such date for a period of 60 days the matter will stand adjourned, people familiar with the case said. If mediation fails, the mediator will file a failure report and the dispute will continue at the Pune court.

A Kalyani Group spokesperson said: Having filed a frivolous suit before the Pune local court seeking partition of alleged properties of Kalyani family HUF, both Sameer Hiremath and Pallavi Swadi have now sought permission of the court to permit mediation of the dispute. The proposal to mediate in the pending dispute itself demonstrates that both have no cause of action in filing the partition suit. Both petitioners

have been indulging in making malicious attempts to defame certain named family members, the spokesperson said.

Baba had earlier denied the existence of any such HUF and had said that Sameer and Pallavi had no right in the wealth of any Kalyani family HUF since they and Kalyani do not have any common "male" ancestor. The siblings, however, argued that they became coparceners in their own right in the Kalyani family HUF upon the introduction of the amended Section 6 of the Hindu Succession Act 1956, in the year 2005.

In their rejoinder filed on Monday, the siblings said that the wealth was created by their great grandfather, ANK, which led to the growth of the Kalyani family. "Since all these businesses commenced and the investments were made from the said nucleus, all these businesses and investments constituted the properties of the joint family," the duo said in their rejoinder.

Under pressure from IT cos to allow 14hr work days: K'taka min

Bengaluru: Karnataka labour minister Santosh Lad on Monday said that the state govt is under pressure from the IT industry to introduce legislation allowing software professionals to work up to 14 hours a day. He, however, clarified that no final decision has been made as govt is still evaluating the proposal and seeking a thorough debate on the issue.

"The Bill has come to us because of pressure from the IT industry. It is not the IT minister (Priyank Kharge) himself who has come up with this idea but all stakeholders. That's why it has come to us (labour department). I want all major stakeholders to debate this and share their opinions. Based on the feedback, we, as a department, will look into the issue and take it forward," Lad said.

HCLTech's policy linking 'work from office' with leaves 'draconian': IT union

Bengaluru: IT Employees' union Nascent Information Technology Employees Senate (NITES) has criticised HCLTech's policy that links work from home with employee leaves, calling it 'draconian'.

According to the union, the policy requiring employees to work from office for 12 days a month to be eligible for leaves is contrary to the work-life balance concept. Reports suggested that HCLTech has started informing certain teams about this policy. TNN

Regarding concerns about the potential impact on IT employees' personal and social lives, Lad said, "Let IT companies, owners, and directors come forward and discuss whether it is necessary or not. Later, we will take a call."

The state BJP has also slammed the Congress govt, arguing that it should focus on underperforming sectors rather than imposing new policies on the thriving IT industry. "Siddaramaiah's govt itself is in sleeping mode but he plans to propose a bill that will force the IT sector to work for 14 work hours a day, 70 hours a week," Karnataka BJP president BY Vijayendra wrote on X.

Govt sources declined to provide details of the Bill being proposed. However, IT industry association Nasscom said categorically that they fully support the 48-hour workweek across the country.

CCI sends queries to Reliance, Disney on \$8.5bn merger deal

New Delhi: Antitrust body CCI has asked Reliance Industries and Walt Disney around 100 questions linked to their \$8.5 billion India media assets merger, including details on sports rights as it heightens its scrutiny of the deal, two sources told Reuters.

Antitrust experts had warned that the Reliance and Disney deal, which was announced in Feb, could face intense scrutiny as it will create India's biggest entertainment player with 120 TV channels and two streaming services. The companies will also together own lucrative rights for cricket — India's most popular sport. In a confidential submission to CCI in May, the companies said their merger would not hurt the competition, and argued that cricket rights will expire in 2027 and 2028 and allow bidding by rivals, and advertisers can target cricket-watching consumers on many rival platforms including YouTube, Reuters reported in May. REUTERS

Doting Gen Z 'parents' drive pet care market

Chennai: Powered by millennial and Gen Z pet owners' search for out-of-the-box products and services for their pets, India's pet care market is all set to jump from \$1 billion in 2022 to \$2.5 billion by 2025 — a CAGR of more than 15%. Pet care marketers say the focus is moving away from the conventional pet food segment to a more varied bouquet of offerings. Shashank Sinha, CEO, Drools Pet Food said, "While pet food is still 65% of the market, the categories of supplements, treats, toys, accessories and bowls are increasing which aligns with the trend observed in mature pet care markets like the US and Europe."

What has changed over time is the profile of pet owners in India. Today's 'pet parents' — many of whom adopted their furry friend during the pandemic — are younger, tech-savvier, and far more invested in looking for specialised solutions and services for their pet care needs. Rashi Narang, founder & CEO of Heads Up For Tails, said, "If we've learnt anything from

the pandemic, it's the power of the pet which also supercharged growth of the pet care e-commerce market." She added that the growth curve is thanks to "digitally savvy millennials and Gen Zs who will account for one in three pet parents by 2025". According to Sinha, India is expected to

see its e-commerce share reach 35% within the next few years.

For the pet care market, that has meant a sudden spurt in investor interest. Between 2021-22, the industry attracted investments totalling \$77 million, as reported by Venture Intelligence. Already, several pet care startups are offering everything from pet cosmetics to tech-enabled smart collars and pet tracking devices. Take the IIT-Madras incubated Vetinstan Healthcare, which offers devices to track pets' vital statistics. Its founder Vani Aiyar said, "Pet parents today have seen technology deliver across multiple segments like food, banking, travel and health, so they are keen to look at new ideas and new methods of pet care too."

Bangalore-based veterinarian Archith Sridhar specialises in regenerative medicine through

his company Animalia Biogenesis. "We focus on treating severe injuries, arthritis, and kidney issues using stem cells and platelets without side effects of conventional treatments," he said.

However, this growing trend of paw-parenting is largely a metro phenomenon. According to Sinha of Drools, "Cities such as Bengaluru and Hyderabad have emerged as prominent markets... Monthly expenses of Rs 5,000 or more on pets are becoming increasingly common, with the average expenditure in Bengaluru estimated at Rs 3,000 per month."

Pet parents are also networking using social media and frequently shares tips and complaints. Heads Up For Tails, Narang added, collaborates with these communities along with NGOs, influencers and pet activists to "encourage conversations".

Cash reserves relief can help tackle deposit woes: SBI MD






Corporate Sector (Non financial+financial)

AI casts huge uncertainty on jobs

India Inc Should Plan To Augment Labour Rather Than Displace Workers

The advent of Artificial Intelligence (AI) casts a "huge pall of uncertainty" when it comes to jobs, considering its impact on workers across all skill levels — low, semi and high, said the Economic Survey. "The biggest disruption for the future of work is the accelerated growth in AI, which is poised to revolutionise the global economy. India would not remain immune to this transformation."

Taking a note of the growing concerns around impact of AI on employment, the survey said technological leap has potential to disrupt growth and thus it requires a concerted effort among Centre, states and even corporates to minimise disruptions.

"These will create barriers and hurdles to sustained high growth rates for India in the coming years and decades."

To protect jobs, there is a need to quickly adapt to advancements. "With AI taking roots in several spheres of economic activity, job market must adapt, while steering the

technological choices towards collective welfare is key."

It said while AI has a considerable potential for boosting productivity, it can also "disrupt employment" in certain sectors. "As AI systems continue to get smarter and adoption increases, the future of work will be reshaped... Rout-

time tasks, including customer service, will likely witness a high degree of automation, creative sectors will see extensive usage of AI tools for image and video creation, personalised AI tutors can reshape education and sectors like healthcare can witness accelerated drug discovery."

The survey also said India's services exports, primarily the BPO sector, could be badly hit due to the advent of AI, and thus companies should devise strategies to tackle the reversal. "Next wave of technological evolution might bring the curtains down on boom in telecom and rise of internet facilitated BPOs. In this milieu, the corporate sector has a responsibility, as much to itself as it is to society, to think harder about ways AI will augment

labour rather than displace workers." On impact of AI in the services sector, the survey said studies suggest it is likely to "restrain the growth opportunities for business services progressively" and, therefore, poses a challenge to long-term sustainability and job creation.

The survey, however, noted that even while posing challenges to jobs, AI will emerge as an opportunity to create employment. "... India is an attractive destination for AI investment due to its relatively low operating costs and world's second-largest pool of highly skilled AI, machine learning, and big data workers." India — with its vast demographic dividend and a very young population — is "uniquely situated" as AI poses both risks and opportunity.



Discourage Chinese goods but encourage Chinese capital. This is the twin track approach laid out by the Economic Survey to deal with what it calls the China Conundrum. In a policy prescription aimed at taking advantage of China Plus One strategy, the document suggested a policy rethink, arguing that FDI from India's neighbour will help domestic companies integrate with the global value chain besides checking the widening trade deficit.

"...to boost Indian manufacturing and plug India into the global supply chain, it is inevitable that India plugs itself into China's supply chain. Whether we do so by relying solely on imports or partially through Chinese investments is a choice that India has to make," it said.

Pointing to a recent research note, which cautioned against the risk of coercion due to Chinese dominance in certain segments, the Survey advocated "striking a right balance between importing goods and importing capital" from China. The report had cited how Brazil, Turkey and some European nations had

raised import duty on electric vehicles, but courted investment from China.

"India has a similar decision to make, given its large bilateral trade deficit with China. It makes India vulnerable to potential abrupt supply disruptions. Replacing some well-chosen imports with investments from China raises the prospect of creating domestic know-how down the road. It may have other risks, but as with many other matters, we don't live in a first-best world. We have to choose between second and third-best choices," it said. Following Covid outbreak, India too

had imposed checks on FDI from neighbouring countries, a move meant to target Chinese companies. It followed it up with import and public procurement curbs, while banning several apps, including Tik Tok, after tension escalated in Ladakh.

Survey argued imports from China are so cheap that "no amount of tariff can reduce their price competitiveness". It cautioned against Chinese goods slipping in through third countries, without getting noticed. Beijing too has responded by blocking India's access to solar parts after gov't launched an anti-dumping probe.

India must labour to generate 78.5L non-farm jobs every year



The Indian economy needs to generate an average of nearly 78.5 lakh jobs annually until 2030 in the non-farm sector to cater to the rising workforce, the survey has estimated.

It said that to meet the demand of 78.5 lakh jobs in the non-farm sector per year, there is scope to supplement the existing schemes of production linked incentive (60 lakh employment generation over 5 years), MITRA textile scheme (20 lakh employment generation), MUDRA, and others while boosting their implementation.

The survey said that state govts can grease the wheels of hiring by businesses by easing the compliance burden and reforming laws on land, etc. to suit the priorit-

es of development. It said the jobs are created in the private sector and India's corporate sector has never had it so good as now, with profitability at a 15-year high in FY24. Profits had quadrupled bet-

ween FY20 and FY23.

"Businesses have an obligation to themselves to strike the right balance between deployment of capital and deployment of labour. As important, capital and labour

shares of income have to be fair," said the survey.

"In their fascination for AI and fear of erosion of competitiveness, businesses have to bear in mind their responsibility for employment generation and the consequent impact on social stability," it added.

Calling for a rebalancing of labour regulations for generating employment, the survey said current labour regulations have unintended adverse repercussions for the general workforce, and women specifically.

The report showed that a comparison with other countries reveals that India's stricter overtime wage regulations are potentially hindering the growth of the manufacturing sector by driving production to nations with lower overtime costs.

Social security should keep pace with gig eco growth

India's gig workforce is expected to expand to 23.5 million by 2029-30, forming an estimated 6.7% of the non-agricultural workforce or 4.1% of total livelihood in the country, which calls for creation of effective social security initiatives for the segment. The gig economy covers online platform workers, freelancers, on-call workers and creative tech talent. Growing consumer adoption of digital services in India has fuelled the growth of the gig economy

3.5% of GDP may come from GCCs

India's global capability centres (GCCs) have become new growth engine, accelerating the country's economic growth and job creation. The rapid expansion of GCCs has bolstered India's IT services exports, providing a significant boost to the industry.

By 2030, GCCs are projected to contribute a total revenue of \$121 billion, which is approximately 3.5% of India's GDP. Out of this, \$102 billion will represent export earnings. Revenue from GCCs has more than doubled to \$46 billion in 2022-23 from \$19.4 billion in the 2014-15, growing at a compound annual growth rate of 11.4%.

with internet companies deploying a wider delivery fleet on the ground to cater to the rising demand.

"The new Labour Codes now provide social security benefits to gig and platform workers via a social security fund, financed by contributions from the central and state govts, aggregators, CSR etc. Additionally, definition of inter-state migrant labour has been simplified," the survey said.

Gap between 2 NPA cycles should rise

The banking industry has been urged to lengthen the gap between two cycles of NPAs. Govt's economic report card has also said that corporate shift to capital market for funding is a positive development in this regard.

These observations come at a time when the asset quality of scheduled commercial banks has improved, with gross NPAs ratio decreasing to 2.8% in March 2024, which is a 12-year low. "Indian financial sector is at a turnpike moment. The dominance of banking support to credit is being reduced and role of capital markets is rising. For a country that aspires to be a developed nation by 2047, this is a long-awaited and welcome development.

No longer an aberration, mis-selling 'too rampant'

The Economic Survey has highlighted the malaise of mis-selling in banks and financial services and has said that it is "too rampant" to be dismissed as an aberration of a few over-enthusiastic sales personnel. "Acknowledgement of mis-selling and misrepresentation and compensating for consequential losses is a good business practice enjoined upon stockbroking, fund management, banking and insurance firms," it said.

This is the first time a govt agency is acknowledging mis-selling as a systemic problem. Previously, regulators viewed mis-selling as isolated instances of mi-

sconduct. The reason why financial institutions get away with mis-selling is that there is no punitive penalties for consequential loss and at best the victims get their money back after they approach the ombudsman, say consumer activists.

"Identifying and correcting mis-selling and misrepresentation and compensating for losses are non-negotiable practices for sectors like banking, insurance and fund management. Stakeholders need to unite in efforts to bring the consumer and the industry on same page to build better trust and transpa-

rency between them," said Sarbvir Singh, joint group CEO, PB Fintech. He added that with tech advancement and rise of AI and ML, it has become a lot easier for the industry to detect and prevent fraud in early stages. Addressing mis-selling, the survey also raises the issue of regulatory turf. While the insurance regulator recognises banks as corporate agents, banks are regulated by RBI. Similarly, insurance companies offer unit-linked insurance plans (Ulips), promising market returns. Stock markets are regulated by Sebi. In the past, Sebi's attempt to clamp down on returns promised by Ulips had resulted in a turf war, where finance ministry had to intervene.

SYSTEMIC PROBLEM

Fear of losing control helps debt recovery

Introduction of insolvency code has changed behaviour of borrowers, with over Rs 10 lakh crore worth of defaults being resolved in pre-admission stage of insolvency proceedings. Borrowers' fear of losing control of their businesses after admission to insolvency prompts them to work towards resolving debt.

"A notable fact is Rs 10.2 lakh crore of underlying defaults were addressed at pre-admission stage. This change in debtor behaviour has been a big boon for banks and other lending institutions. The code has created an optimal incentive-disincentive mix to facilitate above-board and transparent dealings in creditor-debtor relations."


Speculation alert on high retail trade

The Eco Survey sounded a cautionary note about huge surge in number of retail investors, who may be coming to the market in search of higher returns and possibility of heightened speculation. It also warned against a runaway stock market with India's market capital-to-GDP ratio at 124% in Dec 2023, the fifth highest in the world. It was 77% in Dec 2019. This indicator says if market cap of a country is growing faster than its economy, it's time to be cautious.

The survey also warned about excessive retail participating in derivatives trading. It said financialisation of economies is a welcome move but in several developed nations, this move has not ended well, with the most recent example being the glo-

Timely, quality data must to improve policy actions

Govt's economic report card has called for strengthening the statistical system and said the statistics ministry needs to be equipped fully to produce and integrate all required data with desired quality, regularity and timeliness.

It also said quality and timeliness of administrative and transactional data of the ministries must be brought to levels that facilitate timely course corrections against the backdrop of target of making India a developed nation by 2047.

The need to shore up the statistical system with good data producing capability is also required for formulating policies and timely decision-making to address societal challenges and promoting inclusive growth. In recent years, the quality of

govt data has triggered a debate and there have been calls for an overhaul of data collection and dissemination systems in the country.

The report has highlighted the need to update the base year of important indicators, such as GDP, CPI and IIP to the most recent feasible year at the earliest. It said ministry has undertaken an exercise to change base year of CPI from 2012 to 2024 and has set up an advisory committee on National Accounts Statistics to decide on base year for GDP.

It also flagged the need for high-frequency collection of price monitoring data for essential food items and link them in a way that build-up of prices at each stage from farm gate to the consumer is quantifiable and monitorable. The suggestion comes against the backdrop of stubborn food inflation and the impact of weather related events on vegetab-

les and other products and price spikes, which have confronted policymakers.

The survey has also suggested that if the granular GST data of over 1.3 crore entries is made available, it has potential to analyse the health of businesses, screen applications, provide support for cash flow-based lending and understand the economics of different geographies deeply. It has also called for a regular mechanism to aggregate financial flows to infrastructure and physical progress — sectorally and geographically differentiated — achieved in different infrastructure sectors, at least on an annual basis.

On the infrastructure sector, the report has mentioned that existing databases fall short on assessing the demand for infrastructure and tracking the utilisation of facilities built in the sub-sectors.

SREEJESH'S LAST HURRAH

India's Top Hockey Custodian
To Retire After Paris Games

Bengaluru: In 2002, a gawky youngster in a netted sleeveless vest and *vesthi* joined the country's junior hockey team probables. He seemed out of place among the boisterous group, his troubles compounded by his language skills, or the lack of them.

He couldn't speak in any language other than Malayalam, his mother tongue. The lanky youngster was mocked by his peers for his appearance — his primitive goalkeeping pads were secured by a rope — and lack of social skills. Although the youngster was close to realising his dream of making it to the Indian team, he yearned for the comfort of his home in Pallikkara, Ernakulam district, Kerala. Every time he decided to pack his bags, he would be reminded of his family's sacrifices. His father, PV Raveendran, a man of modest means but big dreams for his two sons, sold a cow to buy him his first goalkeeping kit.

The youngster would block out the bullying and humiliation and focus on his dreams. On Monday, wearing his first-ever jersey at the Olympic Village in Paris, Parattu Raveendran Sreejesh announced to the world that Paris would be his last dance.

While the announcement was in the offing for a while, when it did materialise, it marked the beginning of the end of one of the most stirring careers in modern Indian hockey. The 36-year-old has been the wall of Indian hockey for over a decade-and-a-half.

Sreejesh is among the very special players to have taken the field for India. His agility and game awareness are his primary strengths and being an ever-dependable team man with the ability to soak up pressure only enhanced his reputation. The call-ups from the Indian junior to the senior team was delayed, but since his international debut in 2006, he has made the opportunities count and has been a crucial cog in many landmark Indian victories, including the bronze medal at the Tokyo Games.

On Monday, overcome by emotions, Sreejesh, eloquent on and off the field, was lost for words. "It was a tough call. I don't

know how to put my feelings in words," he said. "Playing hockey is all that I have done in the past 24 years. Post Paris, not going back to playing hockey will be like searching for a path in the dark," he told TOI.

Sreejesh, the FIH best goalkeeper of 2021-22, wanted to set an example to others on the right time to announce retirement. "It was about deciding when the right time was. I believe I've played a crucial role in Indian hockey, and I wanted to finish before I was asked to leave. In Indian hockey, rarely has there been a perfect retire-

ment. I wanted to show youngsters how to say goodbye. There could not have been a better platform than the Olympics." Before making it known to the world, Sreejesh discussed his plans with his family and spoke about it to teammates during their training camp in the Netherlands.

"I've been telling my family for the past eight years that I plan to retire. This time, when they realised I was serious, they agreed it was the right time. In the Netherlands, during a meeting, I told the team about my plans. I also told them I need their help to make my last outing a memorable

one. As I gave it my best one last time, I want them to do the same," said the former India skipper. Coming from a state which doesn't have a hockey culture, Sreejesh, who refers to himself as a '*ottayan*' — a lonely tusker — thrived on self-belief. "People thought a player from Kerala wanting to make it big in the Indian team was a lofty dream. Even my parents thought so, but it didn't hamper me." Among Sreejesh's biggest career regrets is not winning the World Cup despite four appearances in the quadrennial showpiece. He now wants nothing more than a medal in Paris.

Participating in the Olympics is the ultimate pinnacle of achievement for any sports person. I have been lucky enough to represent India in four editions. I am 36. There are youngsters waiting in the wings, and I reckon it's time they take the mantle from me. And there is no better stage to end your career than the Olympics.

It was in 2004 that my name was tagged with an Indian squad for the first time when I was included in the junior team to tour Australia. After my selection, I was handed the Indian goalkeeper's jersey. I didn't have a mirror in my room and quickly rushed to the washroom. I wore the jersey and looked at myself in the mirror. Time stood still as I saw my name printed on the back of an Indian jersey for the first time. When I came back, I gifted that jersey to my dad, who received it with tears in his eyes."

Our goal is to do better than last time. We have the team to do that. I don't know what to say. All this while, I knew Paris would be my last tournament in Indian colours. It's just been 10 minutes since I announced my retirement decision. Suddenly, I have gone blank. Let me give myself some time and focus on the job ahead."

The Olympic Order is the highest award of the IOC, given for distinguished contributions to the Olympic Movement. It is awarded to recognize an individual who has illustrated the Olympic ideal, has achieved remarkable merit in the sporting world or has rendered outstanding services to the Olympic cause. PTI



NADAL UNCOMFORTABLE AHEAD OF GAMES BID

Bastad (Sweden): Rafael Nadal will head to the Paris Olympics chasing a third gold medal but admitted his "level was so far from what it should be" after losing in the Bastad clay-court final on Sunday. The 38-year-old Spanish great went down to a straight-set defeat to Portuguese journeyman Nuno Borges in his first final since capturing a 14th French Open in 2022.

"The level was so far from what it should be. Probably the energy too," said Nadal. "It has been a long week with long matches. Even if my body, I don't have damage, that's important. But mentally and physically, I am not used to playing four days in a row and playing long matches."

Nadal was playing his first tournament since an opening round exit at the French Open in May. He skipped Wimbledon to focus on his clay-court bag of tricks ahead of the Olympics which are being played at Roland Garros, the site of 14 of his 22 Grand Slam triumphs. AFP

Israeli contingent to get round-the-clock security

Paris: Israeli athletes will receive 24-hour protection during the Paris Olympics. France's interior minister said, after a far-left lawmaker said Israel's delegation was not welcome and called for protests against their participation. The Games begin on Friday amid pronounced security concerns at a time of heightened geopolitical tensions over the wars in Ukraine and Gaza. Israel's war against Hamas has become a lightning rod among France's far left, with some critics accusing pro-Palestinian members of antisemitism.

French interior minister Stéphane Sejourne said in Brussels, "I want to say on behalf of France, to the Israeli delegation, we welcome you to France for these Games."

FRANCE IS READY, SAYS MACRON

Paris: President Emmanuel Macron said on Monday that France was ready to host the Paris Olympics as he visited the athletes' Village four days before the Games begin.

"We are ready and we will be ready throughout the Games," Macron said. "We have been working on these Games for years now and we are at the start of a decisive week which on Friday will see the opening ceremony and then the Olympic which will be held in Paris, 100 years since the last one." He added: "This is the fruit

of an immense amount of work which has profoundly changed the country, in particular the area" of Seine-Saint-Denis, where the Athletes' Village is situated.

International Olympic Committee (IOC) president Thomas Bach also visited the Village to the north of the French capital, where thousands of athletes and officials are arriving, with up to 14,500 expected there at the peak of the Games. Macron promised the area would not be forgotten after the Olympics. "I will come back after the Games to see the legacy with you and to see how life has changed." AGENCIES

Manu determined to leave Tokyo woes behind

Pune: In his autobiography, Abhinav Bindra mentioned the importance of detaching oneself from the result, his gold at Beijing being a strong validation. Much younger in age and experience, but maybe not in determination, Manu Bhaker too has started thinking along the same lines as Bindra did before the 2008 Olympics.

The pistol shooter had a forgettable outing in her first Olympics in Tokyo. Yet, it was difficult for her to forget what unfolded at the Asaka Shooting ranges three years ago. Nonetheless, the Haryana girl gathered her thoughts and corrected mistakes made in Tokyo, including getting

back to her former coach, Jaspal Rana, with whom she had a fallout just weeks before the 2021 Games. Manu, 22, insists she has grown wiser as a person and stronger as a shooter.

"I have very bitter memories of Tokyo. Two years ago, when I used to think about it, I used to wonder why it happened to me and what I did wrong. But as 2023 began, I started connecting the dots. I started understanding how everything turned out the way it did. Also, what I could have done to make the results better. After all those thoughts, I am just not willing to make those mistakes again, no matter what the results

are," Manu told TOI after the Olympic trials in Bhopal in May. "We all must make our peace with situations which are not in our hands. We cannot change the past and can't have control over the future. It took me a long time to make peace with my situation. Once I started doing it, things started falling in place," she said.

Talking about her fallout with Jaspal at a crucial juncture of her preparation for the Tokyo Games, Manu agreed that her performance could have been better with her trusted coach by her side.

Going to Paris, Manu doesn't want to sulk over the past. "When someone close to you dies, you cry

for some days and go about your routine after some time. You realize crying won't bring the person back, but remembering good things about the person would make you cherish the time you had together. I think I had a similar feeling about my Tokyo experience. I was sad for some time but now I think of the good things that happened to me then," she said.

She asserted that she has come to a stage where she now only thinks of giving her best and not about the results. The process of detachment has started, and Bindra would approve. "An athlete's life is kind of a rollercoaster as we face a lot in a short span of our short careers. I have been shooting for over eight years now and now I feel I am prepared for everything."

German sports campus boosts Paris hopes & dreams

The Sprawling Facility In Saarland, The Most 'French' State In These Parts, Gives Athletes A Taste Of What To Expect At The Games

Saarbrücken: It is wrapping up time here at the SportCampus Saar. The sandbags are being unhooked and towed away, weights dismantled from bars and stowed one atop the other, creating a few hundred little pyramids of their own. The heating of the sauna is being brought down a few notches, the hoops and rings being pulled down in the performance halls, hurdles stacked away, badminton nets rolled away. In the cafeteria, there are unspoken instructions to prepare less quantities of food from now on.

Elsewhere, in the residential quarters, athletes are doing their final last-minute packing, looking around their rooms — which they called "home" for the past so many weeks — to see if nothing has been left behind. Maybe they will spot a sweaty, old tee, a broken shoe, or a note from family or one to self tell-

ing the person not to give up, not give in and to go forth and conquer. A sure favourite of Indian athletes — Neeraj Chopra has an apartment reserved for him — the sprawling nine-hectare facility will bear a vacant look from this week on as the festooning moves eastward to Paris. It's a good time for the folk that run the facility at Saarbrücken — 100 heads employed — to sit and look back at what they may have helped shape, even if sometimes recollecting the unusual.

"There was a request once for a saloon from one of the members of a training team here," remembers Johannes Kopkow, chuckling at the strangest request they encountered over the past months.

utes away by high-speed train. Or, as Kopkow says, "Just 50 minutes by car and you are in France." "Saarland is the most French state of Germany," he says, explaining how that proximity is the chief benefit the athletes sought this time. "The weather, the altitude, the cuisine here is so similar to what they will find in France." Returning to barbershop talk,

Kopkow continues, "We found him one in the city, of course, but he would insist that we should accompany him. Strange, but we agreed. But when he met us, he was already clean-shaven! We still cannot understand why he was insisting on a haircut when he had no hair?" At 41, Kopkow, chief of the SportsCampus, happily reaffirms the old German stereotype of al-



ways needing a mission, to organize and help function like fine machinery. The go-to man, he knows the ins and outs, remembers the little details, even knows those little secrets that visiting athletes know are safe with him. He tells you about that one-hour-long phone call Neeraj received from a higher-up at home, when the time came to take a decision on India's flagbearer for the opening ceremony.

The lockdown and the pandemic forced a reinvention of the facility, and Kopkow too. Looking for a new 'mission' after having run one of the biggest sports clubs in the east near Nuremberg, he travelled west here. "We wanted a more local feel to it, so we rechristened it, adding 'Saar' to the title."

Expecting a windfall with the Olympics nearing, Team SportCampus got to work, pumping in nearly two million euros over two years to reach this level of expertise. SportCampus banks on a unique funding concept to keep it running. The trust has 42.5% stake in SaarToto, a regional lottery company based

in Saarland, and one-eighth of the revenue from it (nearly 14 million euros annually) goes for the running of SportCampus.

It doesn't come cheap for the visiting athlete. Depending on the facilities and services they avail, an athlete per head could cost their respective countries anything from between euros 100 to 130 per day. Thereafter, it's an all-access facility with minimal or zero presence of policing. "Everything is free to use, in that sense. That is our philosophy," says Kopkow.

But sometimes, they overreach. Nearly two years ago, they found an army of IOC lawyers at their door. Reason? "We had bought a website domain. 'Paris2020.saarland' for training registration purposes. It cost us just 24 euros, but the Paris organisers would not have any of it. We didn't have the legal means to fight so it was changed to 'trainingcamp.saarland'."

The tiny tweak has worked. "The IOC still doesn't recognize us as an official training facility, but see the results," says a satisfied Kopkow, pointing to the bustling activity in the boxing hall, where over a dozen national teams are training. "We are the busiest training facility closest to Paris. We can already see nearly 40 medals floating here in SportCampus."

'Captain should be on the park more often than not'

Fitness, Not Form, The Reason Behind Surya's Elevation
As T20I Skipper Over Hardik, Says Chief Selector Agarkar

Mumbai: One of the contentious issues after the team for the T20I series against Sri Lanka was announced was the appointment of Suryakumar Yadav as skipper, with rising young batting star Shubman Gill named as his deputy. Hardik Pandya was vice-captain to Rohit Sharma in India's victorious campaign in the T20 World Cup and had a great tournament with bat and ball (144 runs at a strike-rate of 151.57 and 11 wickets at an average of 17.36) and was the hero of the final too against South Africa.

It was expected that Pandya will be the natural successor to Rohit. On Monday, prior to the team's departure to Sri Lanka from Mumbai, Agarkar revealed that Pandya's battles with fitness was the prime reason why the selectors took that call. "The captain should be on the park more often than not," was Agarkar's blunt take on Pandya's demotion.

"Why Surya as captain? Because he is one of the deserving candidates," Agarkar stated.

Growing dressing room respect for the dashing Mumbai batter was also another reason revealed by Agarkar. "He's been around the group over the last year, we get feedback from the dressing room a lot. He has a good cricket brain and is one of the best T20 batters in the world. One of the main issues we discussed was that you want a captain who is likely to play all the games. We think he is a deserving candidate and hopefully we'll see how he develops into the role," Agarkar explained.

Agarkar though was full of praise for Pandya's skillsets and utility he offered to the team.

Why was Rahul overlooked?

KL Rahul, a player who has led India across formats, was another cricketer who could be entrusted with the responsibility of captaincy. But judging by the selectors' calls, one feels that Gill is the chosen one for the future. "KL hasn't been part of T20Is now for a while. We've got

a chance to hit the reset button. When Hardik got injured, captaincy became a challenge as Rohit wasn't playing T20Is. Because he was still around, it made our life easier, and he could come and lead. We don't want that situation where suddenly we have to look around for a captain in case there are injuries or loss of form. Shubman has shown decent leadership qualities, and we want him to get experiences."

Why the snubs to Abhishek, Sanju and Ruturaj

Agarkar was asked if the calls to drop players like Sanju Samson (dropped for ODIs despite getting a hundred in his last outing vs SA in a series-decider), Abhishek Sharma (dropped from T20Is despite getting a hundred in Zimbabwe) and Ruturaj Gaikwad (dropped despite impressing in both ODIs and T20Is) were justified. "Every player who is left out feels hard-done by. Our challenge is to pick only 15. To try and get the best balance possible, someone is likely to miss out. You've got to see who is picked ahead of them (KL Rahul, Shreyas Iyer). Are those guys not deserving?" Agarkar asked.

Jadeja not dropped from ODIs

"We know what Jaddu has done. He's had a terrific 50-over World Cup. He hasn't been dropped. We had Axar Patel in the squad and either of them wouldn't have played all three games if we'd taken both. A big Test season is coming up, where he's likely to feature in a lot of the Tests," said Agarkar.

Relationship With Virat Not For Public Consumption, Says New Head Coach Gambhir
Ahead Of Team's Departure To SL, Adds Rohit, Kohli Have Plenty Of Cricket Left In Them

Mumbai: The rumour industry had been working overtime ever since it was announced that former opener Gautam Gambhir will be the head coach for India. His firebrand altercations with batting talisman Virat Kohli in the IPL (2013 KKR vs RCB) and 2023 (LSG vs RCB) were probably the reasons for that.

There was more history. Gambhir was dropped from the side in 2016 after the Rajkot Test against England and KL Rahul, who was reportedly still unfit, made a curious return as opener. Incidentally, Kohli was the captain then. However, on a rainy Monday in Mumbai, it seemed like plenty of water had flown under the bridge. Ahead of the team's departure to Sri Lanka for a six-match white-ball series (three T20Is and three ODIs), the gritty former left-handed opener put theories that suggested it will be a difficult dressing room with him and Virat in it, to rest.

"What kind of relationship I share with Virat Kohli, I think it is between two mature individuals. It may be good for TRP, but it's not public," Gambhir said and justified the run-ins with the superstar batter by adding, "On the field, everyone has got the right to fight for their own team, their own jersey, and want to come back in a winning dressing room."

Putting his India hat on, Gambhir further stressed, "But you are represent-

ing India and 140 crore Indians now, and I am sure we are going to be on the same page and try and make India proud."

That their relationship was not in cold storage was evident during the 2024 IPL when both met cordially and Kohli, targeting headline seekers, had famously said, "logon ka masala khatam" during an event.

Gambhir was asked if he and Kohli had chatted or exchanged texts after he was named coach and he stressed, "How many chats have I had with him, after my announcement or before my announcement, during the games, after the games... sometimes just because we want headlines... it is not important."

But he reiterated the respect he has for the man who he gave away his man of the match award for after Kohli's first international hundred in 2009 in Kolkata. "He is a thorough professional, a world-class athlete, a world-

class player. I have huge respect for him as a player and it is going to continue. And hopefully we can work together really well."

Another player, Gambhir will have to work closely with is Rohit Sharma, who has retired from T20Is, like Kohli, but will continue to lead India in Tests and ODIs. And he hoped that Rohit and Kohli still have a lot of cricket left in them.

"They have both shown they can deliver on the big stage, be it the T20 World Cup or 50-over World Cup. One thing I can be clear of is that both have a lot of cricket left in them. More importantly, with the Champions Trophy and a big tour of Australia coming up, they would be motivated. If they can keep their fitness, the 2027 ODI World Cup as well."

For the record, Kohli will be 39 in 2027, and Rohit will be 40.


Workload management for someone like Jasprit Bumrah is important. For a batter, if they can play consistently, if they're in good form, might as well just play all the games. Rohit and Virat are not playing T20 cricket. We only have two formats to look after. I'm sure they're going to be available for most of the games."

"A happy dressing room is a winning dressing room."

"It is important to give players freedom and not have a relationship of a head coach and a player. The best relationship is one built on trust."

"Sometimes international cricket can be tough. It can be insecure as well because only 15 can be picked. It is the job of support staff to keep them happy."

Dravid to return to RR as head coach?

Colombo: Team India's former head coach Rahul Dravid is likely to return to the Rajasthan Royals as the IPL franchise's head coach, TOI has learnt. "Talks are going on between RR and Dravid, and an announcement in this regard is round the corner. He is likely to return to RR," a reliable source told this paper. The 51-year-old Dravid, a legendary India batsman, has had a long relationship with the Royals, having been their captain who led them to the Champions League T20 final and IPL playoffs in 2013, before taking on the mentor's role with the Jaipur-based franchise in 2014 & 2015, when they finished third in the IPL. It was in his stint with RR that players like Sanju Samson and Stuart Binny blossomed and eventually went on to play for India.

From 2015, Dravid was associated with the BCCI as the head coach of the India Under-19 and India A teams, then the chairman at the National Cricket Academy, before finally taking over the head coach of the Indian men's team from Oct 2021. It's not clear if the franchise would retain Sri Lankan great Kumar Sangakkara, who has been the Royals' director of cricket since 2021 or relieve him after Dravid comes on board.

Meanwhile, Sri Lanka are taking the help of an Indian

hand to prepare for a six-match white-ball series (three ODIs and three T20Is) against India, which will commence in Pallekele from July 27.

Zubin Bharucha, the high-performance director of the Rajasthan Royals, is currently taking a nearly week-long 'batting master class' for Sri Lanka's players here in Colombo. A former Mumbai batsman, Bharucha is known for his rigorous training methods for the batsmen, which have played a key role in the rapid development of India's talented young batsmen, opener Yashvir Jaiswal and wicketkeeper-batsman Dhruv Jurel.

"I'm assisting Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) coaches in how they are setting up practice for all their age groups, from the academy to the international players, as well as reviewing the technical aspects of their players across all formats," Bharucha told TOI on Monday.

As the director of cricket at RR, Sangakkara has seen the impressive work put in by Bharucha. "It was Sangakkara who recommended his name," a source informed.

Randhir set to become first Indian to head OCA

New Delhi: Former international shooter and veteran sports administrator Randhir Singh is set to become the first Indian president of the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) after emerging as the sole candidate for the top post for the September 8 elections. The 77-year-old Singh, a former member of the International Olympic Council and ex-secretary general of Indian Olympic Association, is currently serving as the acting chief of the OCA.

Zheng defends Palermo clay-court title: China's Zheng Qinwen successfully defended her Palermo clay-court title with a three-set win over Karolina Muchova in a major confidence boost ahead of the Olympics. Top seed Zheng, runner-up at the Australian Open earlier this year, defeated second seeded Muchova of the Czech Republic 6-4, 4-6, 6-2. It is world number seven Zheng's third career title, having also won in Zhengzhou last year.

Indian boys and girls lose in quarters: India's boys and girls lost narrowly in the quarterfinals of the team competition at the World Junior Squash Championships in Houston, USA. The sixth-seeded boys went down 1-2 to fourth seed South Korea, while the girls lost by an identical margin to third seed Malaysia.

In a first, women's hockey team trains at Indian Naval Academy: Unarmed combat training, endurance runs and boat pulling were some of the elements of a first-ever "transformative training camp" that the national women's hockey team underwent at Indian Naval Academy (INA), aimed at making the side mentally stronger, and more disciplined. The unique camp was held at the INA in Kannur, Kerala, from July 15 to 21.

Sri Lanka, Bangladesh win: Sri Lanka and Bangladesh produced superlative performances to secure victories over Malaysia and Thailand in Group B to inch closer to semifinals at the Women's Asia Cup T20 tournament on Monday. While hosts Sri Lanka thrashed Malaysia by 114 runs, Bangladesh defeated Thailand by seven wickets. AGENCIES

ICC forms 3-member committee to review conduct of T20 WC

Colombo: As was widely expected, the International Cricket Council (ICC), soon after the conclusion of its four-day annual conference here on Monday, announced that it had formed a three-member committee to "review the delivery" of the T20 World Cup which was co-hosted by the USA and the West Indies last month.

The committee includes three directors: former New Zealand batsman Roger Twose, Lawson Naidoo and Imran Khwaja -- the deputy chair of ICC.

"The ICC board confirmed that there will be a review into the delivery of the ICC T20 World Cup. This will be overseen by three directors, Roger Twose, Lawson Naidoo and Imran Khwaja, who will report back to the board later in the year," the ICC stated in a release soon after the conclusion of its Annual General Meeting (AGM).

Reportedly, the ICC has incurred losses over \$20 million for conducting matches in New York, Florida and Dallas. Apparently, the tournament's expenses for the US leg overshoot the allocated budget by a long margin, something that was pointed out by Pankaj Khimji of Oman. It was reported that the resignation of two ICC officials was related to the conduct of the World Cup, although a reliable source in the ICC maintained that both Claire Furlong and Chris Tetley had made up their mind to quit last year itself but were asked to stay back

for the Women's T20 World Cup (Furlong), and the Champions Trophy next year (Tetley).

NO DISCUSSION ON INDIA'S CT PARTICIPATION

Meanwhile, TOI understands that there was no discussion on the ICC Champions Trophy -- to be held in Pakistan in 2025 -- or India's participation in the tournament.

USA, CHILE PUT ON NOTICE

In what is certainly a big setback for cricket in the United States, just a few days after their national team stunned everyone by beating Pakistan and making it to the T20 World Cup Super 8s, USA Cricket along with Cricket Chile, have been formally put on notice and given 12 months to comply with ICC's associate membership criteria.

Apparently, the USAC has been in breach of associate members protocols on two counts -- not having a full-time CEO and not having recognition of the US Olympic and Paralympic Committee.

WOMEN'S T20 WORLD CUP EXPANDED TO 16 TEAMS IN 2030

The ICC board approved an expansion of the ICC Women's T20 World Cup to 16 teams in 2030, aligning with its ongoing commitment to equity between the men's and women's games.

The CEC approved the appointment of ex-Australian pacer Paul Reiffel to the Cricket Committee as the Elite Panel representative.

ECB open to IPL money in Hundred

Nottingham: English cricket chiefs confirmed on Monday that they have held talks with Indian Premier League (IPL) owners about acquiring a stake in their domestic 'The Hundred' competition.

The fourth edition of the controversial 100-balls per side tournament, which features eight specially created teams -- each with a men's and women's side -- rather than the traditional 18 first-class English counties, starts on Tuesday.

Its future remains uncertain, with the England

and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) looking to secure private investment in a bid to cement its position in the global calendar and boost the finances of the domestic game.

The ECB are trying to balance a desire for a cash injection while retaining control of the Hundred by selling off a 49 percent stake in each team to private investors, with host teams retaining the remaining 51 percent of shares. But the hosts could sell part or all of their shares. "Control comes at different levels, it comes at team level and it comes at competition level -- that's not something we are ceding control of," ECB chief execu-

'Bashir has shown the world what he can do'

Nottingham: England captain Ben Stokes heaped praise on young spinner Shoaib Bashir after his series-clinching figures of 5-41 in second innings that handed the hosts 241-run victory against West Indies at Trent Bridge on Sunday. England have taken an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series. Bashir played a huge role in setting up mammoth victory as he became the youngest English bowler to take a five-fer in a home Test and also the first spinner to take five wickets in a Test innings at the Nottingham venue since 2006.

"He has got so much talent and he's got an unbelievable desire to get better," Stokes said of Bashir. "His intent is to always take wickets and never just to hold an end up. It's really good for a young guy to put in a performance that wins England a Test. He was pretty emotional at the end. It's a pretty cool day for him. He has shown the world what he can do."

Bashir's rise from relative obscurity has been well known. He was spotted and selected for the India trip ear-

lier this year after England captain Stokes watched recordings of him bowling to Alastair Cook on X (previously Twitter). Despite not being a regular for Somerset, the youthful offspinner's 2.35-metre release point and length control were thought critical for a hard trip of the subcontinent.

Bashir confirmed his inspired selection pick with 17 wickets in three Tests in India, including five-fer in Ranchi and Dharamsala.

"The decisions we make are all based around not only how far we think talent can take a player, but if we think they're good enough for international cricket straight away," Stokes said. "Bashir showed what he could do in India with conditions in his favour, but the pitch this week didn't really offer much for spin and he has taken seven wickets in the match. The ability he had to be able to change his pace, change his line, and manipulate how he wanted the ball to react out of the surface was top-class. I don't want to sound like it's an 'I told you so' kind of thing, but it sort of is." AGENCIES

Villa seal sloop for Everton midfielder Onana

London: Aston Villa signed Belgium midfielder Amadou Onana from Everton in a deal worth a reported £50 million (\$64 million) on Monday. Onana agreed a five-year contract with Villa, who had been searching for a replacement for Douglas Luiz after the Brazilian's move to Juventus. The 22-year-old failed to make an impact at Everton after arriving from Lille two years ago. But, after featuring for Belgium at Euro 2024, Onana has been given the chance to revive his Premier League career by Villa boss Unai Emery.

"Aston Villa is delighted to announce the signing of Amadou Onana from Everton," the club said on their website.

Capped 11 times by Belgium,

Onana made 72 appearances for Everton, scoring four goals.

He joins Villa with the club looking forward to their first Champions League campaign since 1983 after last season's fourth-place finish in the Premier League.

Spurs star Son's dad accused of verbal abuse: Tottenham Hotspur star Son Heung-min's father has been accused of verbally abusing a young player at his football academy in South Korea, according to a police interview transcript given to AFP by a lawyer on Monday.

Former footballer Son Woong-jung is a public figure in South Korea and authored a best-selling memoir detailing how he helped his son become one of the best strikers in the English Premier League. But the family of a 12-year-old, identified only as Kim, told police he was the target of foul language just weeks after his enrolment at Son senior's academy in November.

Fishcake fury cancels match in Norway after VAR protest: The match in the Norwegian top-flight between Rosenborg BK and Lillestrom was suspended after fans showed their displeasure with the Video Assistant Referee (VAR) by throwing fishcakes on the field. The protests started from kickoff and after a two-minute bombardment of fishcakes, the referee stopped the match and sent the players to dressing room. The match was restarted, but protests intensified with tennis balls and smoke bombs thrown onto the field. The referee abandoned the match around the half-hour mark with the score 0-0. VAR has stirred several controversies in the Norwegian league. AGENCIES

Dunlap first in PGA Tour history to win as amateur and pro in same year

Truckee, USA: Nick Dunlap became the first player in PGA Tour history to win as an amateur and a professional in the same year, rallying for a two-point victory in the Baracuda Championship. In January at The American Express in La Quinta, the 20-year-old Dunlap -- then a sophomore at the University of Alabama -- became the eighth amateur to win a tour event and the first in 33 years. He turned professional days later.

"I never thought that I would have my name next to that, but it's definitely an honour," Dunlap said about the amateur-pro double. "It's been a little tough after

AmEx. You kind of lose a little bit of confidence and wonder if you can do it again."

At Tahoe Mountain Club, in the only PGA Tour event that uses the modified Stableford scoring system, Dunlap took the lead with a 55-foot eagle putt on the par-5 15th. "I hadn't made an eagle yet this week, so that was kind of the goal, and just play aggressive, not reckless," Dunlap said. "This course, it allows you to make a lot of birdies if you're in position." It's official: 44-year-old ban on govt staffers joining RSS lifted

Imposed In '66, It Was First Lifted In '77, Then Reimposed In '80

New Delhi: The Centre confirmed Monday that govt employees would no longer be penalised for associating themselves with RSS, ending a prohibition that has been in force since 1966 and which had not been done away with even by previous BJP govts.

As was reported by **TOI** in its July 22 edition, a notification to this effect was issued on July 9, sources said.

The order, which was flagged by Congress to attack govt, may appear to give only a de jure status to the reality of RSS activists occupying senior positions in govt as members of Union cabinet. But its significance is its timing, coming amid a perception in some quarters about Sangh-govt differences. More importantly, it marks another step towards "mainstreaming" of Sangh, which has long faced curbs because of its alleged

Hindu majoritarian agenda. The order issued by DoPT, which comes directly under the charge of PM Narendra Modi, for once delinks RSS from Jamaat-e-Islami.

The first order, issued by the then Congress govt in 1966, had tagged RSS with Jamaat-e-Islami, stating that "govt have (sic) always held the activities of these two organisations to be of such

a nature that participation in them by govt servants would attract the provisions of sub Rule 1 of Rule 5 of Central Civil Services Conduct Rules, 1964". The rule states that no govt servant shall be a member of or be associated with any political party or any organisation which takes part in politics, or shall take part in, subscribe in aid of or assist any politi-

cal movement or activity. Following a ban on RSS after the Emergency clamped by Indira Gandhi govt in 1975, DoPT issued another order on Nov 25 banning RSS, Jamaat-e-Islami, Anand Marg and CPI(M). The ban meant that any person who associates with such organisations could invite up to seven years in jail and/or fine.

Relief for RSS and other organisations, however, came after the Indira govt was dislodged in 1977 by the Janata alliance. A DoPT clarification dated April 23, 1977, stated that consequent upon lifting of the ban on RSS, Jamaat-e-Islami, Anand Marg and CPI(M) etc, the Nov, 1975 OM referred to above relating to the aforesaid organizations may be treated as deleted.

In 1980, however, the Indira regime was back in office and the restrictions on participation of govt employees in RSS and Jamaat-e-Islami activities were back in force.

BJP, RSS & Union ministers hail govt move, say ban was politically driven

Rahul Refuses Comment, Says, 'I'm Focusing On NEET Right Now'

New Delhi: Govt and BJP Monday put up a strong defence of the decision lifting the ban on govt employees' participation in RSS activities, while the saffron fountainhead welcomed the move saying the previous ban was imposed for political reasons. The opposition, however, suggested that the decision was motivated to appease Sangh.

The govt decision is appropriate and strengthens the democratic system of India, said RSS media head Sunil Ambekar in a post on X. "Due to its political interests, the then govt had baselessly banned govt employees from participating in the activities of a constructive organisation like Sangh," he said.

The govt move came against the backdrop of a perception of Sangh-govt differences and a few media reports about incoherence

Surprisingly, leader of opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi refused to react on the issue unlike his party functionaries Jairam Ra-

mesh and Pawan Khera, who have adopted an aggressive stance. "No no, right now I am focusing on NEET," Rahul said when reporters asked him about the order. Congress's deputy leader in Lok Sabha, Gaurav Gogoi, however, said, "I feel this is a jugal-bandi of RSS-BJP. Govt is taking such a decision to end the resentment of Mohan Bhagwat... Today UPSC, NTA are in such a bad state because RSS people are infiltrating every section of the govt."

ADMIM chief and LS MP Asaduddin Owaisi termed the govt decision totally wrong. "The oath of RSS states that it doesn't believe in pluralism, it talks of Hindu nationalism. Do the NDA allies believe in this decision?" he said.

Minister of social justice and empowerment Ramdas Athawales said, "I think it's not right to discuss such things. All parties have employees who support them, and they do their work within limits."

Migrant worker found living in kennel, Kerala orders probe

Thiruvananthapuram: Kerala may be 'God's own country', but for guest workers, it's a dog's life out there. At least, for Shyam Sundar, the expression has been true, quite literally. The 37-year-old migrant worker from Bengal was found living in a kennel, and even paying Rs 500 as monthly rent.

A daily wage, Sundar sought shelter in a kennel on a house compound in Piravom South in Ernakulam district due to financial constraints. As news spread, police visited the spot and took Sundar for a medical checkup. However, cops said no case had been filed against the landowner as the worker said that he preferred to stay in the kennel on his own. Sundar opted for the tiny space as he could not afford the Rs 3,000 monthly rent he was earlier paying for a house nearby.

However, taking note of media reports, state's labour minister Vasudevan Sivan-kutty has sought a report from the labour commissioner.

BULLDOZERS KEEP ROLLING IN UP & RAJ

5 houses flattened, 35 held days after Muharram clash

Bareilly: The administration in Bareilly started razing 11 houses of people belonging to minority community Monday following the death of a man injured in stone pelting during Muharram procession last week when members of two communities targeted each other, reports Kanwardeep Singh.

Bulldozers were brought in hours after Tej Ram, 23, succumbed to injuries sustained during the July 18 fracas. Five houses had already been brought down at the time of filing the report, with the action set to continue Tuesday, confirmed police.

This came even as 35 individuals, all Muslims, were sent to jail following the clash. Violence began when antisocial elements disrupted the Muharram procession as it passed by a temple. It sparked a confrontation that escalated into stone-pelting. Videos of the incident circulated on social media added to the tensions, prompting administrative response. Next day, the groups clashed again, resulting in injuries to several. Police filed an FIR for rioting against several members of the minority community.

The wife of one of the jailed accused told **TOI**, "Police have taken one-sided action. No one is interested in our side of the story."

House of kingpin in police exam paper leak razed

Jaipur: Rajasthan authorities demolished illegal structures in Churu town built at the house of Pankaj Bhambhua alias Unique, the alleged kingpin of a 2021 SI exam paper leak on the run since this Feb after joining as forest ranger. The demolition came amid a continuing wider crackdown on cheating rackets in the desert state. The structures pulled down were allegedly constructed by Bhambhua on two plots in Churu's Poonia Colony.

Investigations indicated that Bhambhua hid inside a school in Jaipur's Hasanpura area where he "discreetly priced open envelopes containing the sub inspector test papers with a cutter and stole them before sealing the envelopes with tape", said sources in Rajasthan Police's special operations group that is handling the leak probes. A hunt is on for Bhambhua, also under the scanner in other paper leaks through which he accumulated significant wealth, sources said.

Bhambhua later passed the forest ranger exam and was undergoing training in Alwar. Sources said he would arrive at the training centre in luxury SUVs, raising eyebrows. On Feb 17, just days after he had arrived, he abruptly applied for leave and left.
