Hasina resigns amid public uprising, flees to India

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 5
After four weeks of violent street protests against her government, Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina resigned on Monday. She was evacuated from Dhaka on board a Bangladesh air force plane that landed at the Hindon airbase in Ghaziabad this evening. Hasina is expected to take a regular commercial flight to London.

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Parallel events 'expose chinks' in Cong; coincidence: Bhan

Even as two parallel programmes held by senior leaders of the Haryana Congress here on Sunday pointed to "chinks" within the party, senior leaders claimed it was part of a well-planned strategy to strengthen the party ahead of the elections.

A poll analyst said, "Factionalism within the party was visible as local leaders had to choose between the two programmes held almost simultaneously." He said while a "Haryana Maange Hisaab" rally under the leadership of Rohtak MP Deepender Singh Hooda was held in Ballabgarh, another event Congress Sandesh Padyatra was led by Sirsa MP Kumari Selja in Faridabad, which created confusion among party leaders and workers.

Claiming that there are no differences within the party, Udai Bhan, HPCC president, said both programmes were part of the campaign aimed at strengthening the party ahead of the elections. He said holding two campaigns simultaneously might be a coincidence, but more events would help strengthen the party.

AK Gaur, a local resident, said, "While several local leaders, including present and former MLAs took part in the 'Haryana Maange Hisaab'

Will reverse anti-people policies of govt if Cong comes to power: Hooda

Former CM and Congress leader Bhupinder Singh Hooda today said the days of the BJP's misrule were over and all anti-people policies of the present government would be reversed as soon the party came to power.

Addressing a meeting of party workers here, he said while the people showed the mirror to the BJP, which harped on slogans and event management, in the Lok Sabha elections, they would oust it from the state in the upcoming Assembly elections.

Claiming that the BJP relied on fake surveys, propaganda and events, he said the delusion of the so-called development and slogans like 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas' stood exposed in the recent elections. He said losing half of the seats in Haryana points towards the anger of the people towards the failure of the BJP rule in the past about 10 years.

Recalling the various development projects launched during the Congress rule, Hooda said all promises of the ruling party had proved hollow as not a single brick had been laid towards the projects like Metro rail link between Faridabad and Gurugram and between Ballabgarh and Palwal. He said while

Haryana had been ignored in the Union Budget this time, he claimed it was a proof of how serious the BJP government was towards any project of public importance. He said while Palwal was carved out as a new district in 2008, it was still one of the most backward parts of the state due to discrimination in allocation of funds.

Charging the BJP rule of putting the state in a web of debt of around Rs 4.5 lakh

crore, he said the state had failed to get new industries or investments, resulting in a sharp rise in unemployment in the state. Reiterating the promises of an old-age pension of Rs 6,000, he said free medical treatment of the cost up to Rs 25 lakh will be given to the poor in the state. He said the Congress would implement the policy of 'Padak Lao-Pad Pao (bring Medal and get job) to encourage sports and sportsmen.

HPCC chief Udai Bhan said people in the state were eager to teach the BJP a lesson as all the policies and programmes had failed in the past 10 years. The Congress party got a shot in its arm as Chaudhary Harsh Kumar a two-time MLA from Hathin, who left the BJP prior to the Lok Sabha polls joined the party along with several others in presence of Hooda today. Former Minister Karan Singh Dalal was among those who addressed the meeting.

Former Deputy Chief Minister and JJP leader Dushyant Singh Chautala acknowledged that partnering with the BJP to fulfill electoral promises for the benefit of all sections of society was a significant political error.

Despite limited influence, JJP managed to fulfil many of its promises. Dushyant was addressing students on the 22nd foundation day of the Indian National Students' Organisation (INSO) at Chaudhary Devi Lal Uni-

versity in Sirsa. Dushyant said Sir Chhotu Ram, who was known as a great supporter of farmers, used to say that participating in politics was essential for the welfare of the poor, women and farmers. That's why he also joined the Congress.

Chautala said if JJP came to power, Agniveers would get free education up to PhD level so that they could serve the country as educated officers. He also vowed to fight for the direct student union elections in the Haryana Assembly.

He also promised college and university students that they would receive bus passes, and transportation within a 30-km radius of educational institutions would be managed by the government using roadways buses. Two-wheeler registration fee for students would be waived, and every student would receive free insurance up to Rs 5 lakh.

Cabinet nod to purchase of 10 more crops at MSP

CHANDIGARH, AUGUST 5

The Haryana Government has decided to procure all crops at minimum support price (MSP). Now, 10 crops, namely ragi, soybean, kalatil, safflower, barley, maize, jowar, jute, khopra and moong will be procured at MSP in the state.

The decision was taken by the Cabinet which met under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini here today. The Cabinet move follows Saini's announcement at a rally in Kurukshetra yesterday. Besides, the Cabinet approved the Haryana Agniveer Policy, 2024, which aims to provide employment and entrepreneurship opportunities to Agniveers after their completion of service in the armed forces.

The policy offers benefits in government recruitment, including a 10 per cent horizontal reservation for Agniveers in direct recruitment for positions such as

constable, mining guard, forest guard, prison warder, and SPOs. Besides, there will be a 5 per cent horizontal reservation for Group C civil posts and a 1 per cent horizontal reservation for Group B posts.

The Cabinet also decided to give the reservation to Backward Classes-Block B in Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) and municipalities based on the recommendations of the Haryana Backward Classes Commission. The Cabinet also approved the amendments to the New Integrated Licensing Policy-2022 by allowing purchasable development rights (PDR) under residential plotted component in parity with

normal residential plotted licensed residences.

The draft of the Haryana Sikh Gurdwaras (Management) Amendment Ordinance, 2024 to amend the Haryana Sikh Gurdwaras (Management) Act, 2014, was also cleared. Now, the Chairman of the Haryana Sikh Gurdwara Judicial Commission shall be a High Court judge, and if an HC judge is not appointed then the district judge, and if the district judge is also not appointed, the one of the three selected members of the commission shall be the Chairman.

The revision of pension/family pension (Pre-2016 and Post-2016) of retired judicial officers

of the Haryana Government as per Second National Judicial Pay Commission was also approved. The Cabinet also passed the proposal regarding the grant of challoaning powers under Haryana Motor Vehicles Rules, 1933. Now, the officers of the Mining Department not below the rank of Mining Officer will also be empowered with challoaning powers for the goods vehicles carrying mining material.

The Cabinet has given ex-post facto approval to criteria for exclusion of persons within the backward classes from creamy layer. The income limit of creamy layer of backward classes in the state has been increased from Rs 6 lakh to Rs 8 lakh.

The Cabinet approved the Haryana Registered Vehicle Scrappage and Recycling Facility Incentive Policy 2024 to help promote state-of-the-art recycling facilities and achieve a recyclability level of 85 per cent. It also passed amendments to the policy of

'Mukhya Mantri Shehri Awaz Yojana' (MMSAY) to address the housing needs of urban families with an annual income up to Rs 1.80 lakh per annum.

The Cabinet approved the Mukhya Mantri Gramin Awaz Yojana-Extension (MMGAY-E) to provide one lakh residential plots of 50 square yards in mahagram panchayats and 100 square yards in regular panchayats to economically weaker sections (EWS).

The Cabinet approved amendments to the Haryana Compulsory Registration of Marriages Rules, 2008. Under the new amendments, additional deputy commissioners (ADC)-cum-district citizen resources information officers will now serve as district registrars for marriage registrations. Now city magistrates, SDMs, joint commissioners, district municipal commissioners, executive officers and BDPOs and gram sachivs have also been granted powers to register marriages.

To regain the lost political strength after its dismal performance in the recently held Lok Sabha elections, the JJP has finalised the names of four candidates for the Assembly elections, which include two members of the Chautala family.

The party leaders have confirmed that party supremo Ajay Chautala has given approval to the names of four candidates — former Deputy CM Dushyant Chautala from Uchana in Jind district, his younger brother Digvijay Chautala from Dabwali in Sirsa district, sitting MLA from Julana (Jind) Amarjit Dhanda and Rajdeep Phogat from Charkhi Dadri.

JJP spokesperson Deepkarn Saharan said there are about 20 names which have been given the go-ahead by the party leadership which include these four names. He said the party has restructured its district-level organisation and is now in the process of reconstituting the Assembly-

level bodies of all districts.

The party, which contested all 10 Lok Sabha seats in Haryana, has suffered severe setback in the Lok Sabha elections and could secure less than one per cent (.88%) votes. The JJP which was founded in December 2018, managed to put up an impressive show when it won 10 seats in the 2019 Assembly elections in Haryana. As the party joined hands with the BJP, which fell short of the majority mark in 2019, Dushyant Chautala served as the Deputy Chief Minister in the Manohar Lal Khattar-led

Haryana Government for about four and a half years.

However, its poor performance reflected that its voter has drifted away from the party, leaving the party leader to rethink on its past decisions and future strategy. With seven out of 10 party MLAs keeping a distance from the campaign in the Lok Sabha elections, the JJP failed to even secure its deposit on any of the 10 seats. Party supremo Ajay Chautala's wife Naina Chautala (mother of Dushyant and Digvijay) too put up a miserable performance in the Hisar Lok Sabha constituency.

No stamp duty on buying land for cow shelters: CM

PANCHKULA, AUGUST 5
 Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini today announced a stamp-duty waiver for purchase of land for cow shelters. He also announced that the state will waive property tax on cow shelters and a four-time increase in grant for fodder to Rs 20 per cow.

The CM was in Panchkula to participate in a 'GauSewa Sammelan'. Animal Husbandry and Dairy Minister Kanwar Pal Gujar, Assembly Speaker Gian Chand Gupta were also present. The CM launched 'Besahara Gauvansh Mukh Abhiyan' — an initiative to render the state free of stray cattle.

Saini also announced that each cowshed will be provided Rs 1.25 lakh for an e-rickshaw for every 1,000 cows it keeps. He said, "There will be no need to apply for change of land use (CLU) for establishing new cowsheds. Those setting up the cow sheds will also not have to pay any external development charges (EDC) or any other fee for the purpose. No permission will be required to install a tubewell in the cowshed."

He said the state has already installed solar power plants on 331 cowsheds out of 675 registered cowsheds. He said the government will also install solar power plants in rest 344 cowsheds.

Property tax on cow shelters also waived

Saini, while launching the Besahara Gauvansh Mukh Abhiyan, said the initiative was aimed at making the state free from stray cattle. He said the cow vigilantes should transport stray cows to cow shelters. He said, "Those transporting stray cattle to cow shelters will be paid Rs 600 per cow and Rs 800 per bull. The state will pay a fodder grant of Rs 20 per day for every calf, Rs 30 for every cow and Rs 40 for every bull." Currently, the state provides Rs 4 per cow per day as grant for fodder.

He said the gram panchayats will now be able to give their

panchayat land for setting up a cow shed for 20 years. This will be done after the approval of Chief Minister's office.

Veterinary surgeon for cows
 The CM said veterinary surgeon will visit cow shelters having more than 3,000 cows once a week. "We have arranged 70 mobile veterinary hospitals as well. These will be available once a week for treatment, tagging, vaccination, counting and other purposes concerning cows," he said.

₹30,000 grant per cow
 Saini also announced that

farmers who keep indigenous cows will be given an annual grant of Rs 30,000 per cow. He said in every city, a committee comprising veterinary doctor, administrator or secretary of Municipal Corporation and representatives of cow shelter will verify the number of cows and will encourage cow shelters to catch stray cows.

Traders suffering will resolve their problems: Cong

 Lakhan Singla, a former MLA from Faridabad and state president of the Haryana Pradesh Congress Vyapar Mandal, said traders' problems would be discussed at a state-level programme, which is scheduled to be held in Arya College here on August 11, and these would be included in the Congress poll manifesto.

Former Chief Minister Bhopinder Singh Hooda would be the chief guest in the programme while party state president Uday Bhan would preside over it.

Singla said after coming to power, the Congress would resolve traders' problems on priority.

Taking a dig at the BJP rule, Singla said the BJP had imposed several types of undue taxes on the traders and made the business very tough. Law and order in the state had deteriorated. The criminals were demanding extortion from businessmen and targeting their establishments in broad daylight, he added.

"The businessmen are not safe at their showroom or shop, on roads and in their houses. The BJP government has failed to provide a secure and peaceful atmosphere to the businessmen in the state," he said.

Policy to regularise illegal banquet halls on the cards

Owners to pay only 50% of existing development charges

CHANDIGARH, AUGUST 5
 Providing a relief to illegal marriage palace and banquet hall owners, the Nayab Singh Saini government has proposed a special one-time policy for their regularisation at 50 per cent of the existing development charges.

Under the policy, which is under active consideration of the Urban Local Bodies Department, a four-month window is proposed to be given to the owners of the illegal marriage palaces and banquet halls in the municipal limits to apply for the regularisation of their unauthorised commercial establishments.

Scores of illegal marriage palace and banquet hall owners could not get their premises regularised under the 2014 policy on account of 'exorbitant' development charges.

Comments and suggestions have been invited from the stakeholders till August 15 before the policy is finalised by the state.

Urban Local Bodies Minister Subhash Sudha said the policy would be finalised after incorporating suggestions from the stakeholders till August 15.

Besides 50 per cent development charges, the owners will have to shell out scrutiny fee at the rate of Rs 10 per sq mt and applicable labour cess. An extra 25 per cent development charges are proposed to be levied for the regularisation of the unauthorised commercial component in the marriage palaces and the banquet halls.

Saying that the size of the marriage palace should not be less than 1,500 sq mt, the

policy said only those marriage palaces and banquets halls which had been constructed till December 2023 would be considered for the regularisation. These palaces should be situated at least 100 metres away from a school, college and hospital.

The policy lays down strict parameters for the regularisation such as maximum permissible ground coverage of up to 40 per cent, floor area ratio (FAR) of 0.70 and commercial component of 10 per cent of the total FAR. Besides, the minimum parking area shall not be less than 25 per cent of the site area. The basement shall be used for parking, services (public health, electricity) and storage purposes.

"If the covered area of the marriage palace/banquet hall is covered by temporary ceiling or tenting, travel distance from any point of the building/temporary structure to the exit shall be as per the National

Building Code (NBC)," the policy said.

Under the existing policy, an amount of Rs 3,000 per sq mt is charged for the regularisation of marriage palaces situated on the roads with a width up to 30 metres in Gurugram. The charges for such marriage palaces situated on roads with a width of more than 30 metres are Rs 3,500 per sq mt.

The current charges for marriage palaces situated on roads with a width up to 30 metres in Panchkula and Faridabad are Rs 1,500 while for the road beyond 30 metres the charges are Rs 2,000 per sq mt.

The charges for Sonepat, Sohna, Karnal, Kurukshetra, Ambala, Yamunanagar, Bahadurgarh, Hisar, Rohtak, Rewari, Ganaur, Pahal, Hodal and Rewari are Rs 1,000 and Rs 1,200 for these two categories. For other areas, the charges range from Rs 600 to Rs 800 per sq mt.

Jagmalwali dera row deepens as villagers declare new chief

SIRSA, AUGUST 5
 The controversy over the leadership of Mastana Shah Balochistana Dera in Jagmalwali, valued between Rs 1,200 and Rs 1,500 crore, is intensifying.

Recently, villagers declared Gurpreet, the nephew of former dera chief Manager Sahib, as the new head. However, Bahadur Chand Vakil Sahib's son Omprakash, nephew Sanjay Singh, and another nephew, Vishnu, countered this by stating that according to Vakil Sahib's will, Virendra is the rightful heir. They also refuted claims that Vakil Sahib passed away on July 21.

On Sunday, about 200 followers from villages Jagmalwali, Assir, Pipli, and Makha gathered at the dera. Pawan, a follower from Dabwali, said Manager Sahib had promised to repay the villagers for their service to the dera. Following this, the followers declared Gurpreet Singh as the new chief, despite his absence.

Omprakash and Vishnu emphasised that they met Vakil Sahib on July 31 when he was still alive and that politics over the dera's throne is tarnishing its reputation. They insisted that the final decision should be left to the followers and trustees.

Omprakash criticised the spread of false information and called for trustees to come forward under police protection. He stressed that their family has no interest in the throne but wants the truth to emerge.

Vishnu mentioned that Vakil Sahib had shown him a diary years ago, indicating that Virendra Singh had donated Rs 1 lakh to the dera and served it for 25 years. He urged Virendra Singh to

Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann will directly interact with farmers protesting against the acquisition of land for the Delhi-Amritsar-Katra expressway. The delay in acquisition of pockets of land in Ludhiana, Tam Taran, Gurdaspur and Amritsar districts has affected the pace of the completion of the expressway.

After being pulled up by the Centre for the delay, the CM has decided to meet farmers in small groups so that an early solution can be worked out, said sources in the government.

Recently, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari taking note of the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) projects getting stalled due to farmer protests in Punjab was highlighted in these columns.

A senior functionary in the Public Works Department (PWD) said though a majority of the land for the expressway had been acquired, pockets of land measuring near 100 acres in four districts were yet to be acquired and that was hampering the progress of the expressway.

Stubble mgmt plans may go awry as farmers oppose biogas plants

Throwing a spanner in the ex-situ crop residue management plan, farmers in Punjab are opposing the setting up of three new compressed biogas plants and stalling another one from resuming operations.

Information gathered by The Tribune reveals that three projects have been stalled at Bhundri, Akhara and Mushkabad villages, while the operation of biogas plant at Ghungrali Rajputan village has been forcibly stopped by members of farmer unions, allegedly because of the foul smell emanating due to the use of pressmud at the plant. Though the plant management has reportedly given an undertaking to the Punjab Pollution Control Board that they have stopped using pressmud, the protesting farmers have refused to relent.

BS Aulakh, a drug scientist, who is spearheading the protest by farmers against the plants, said the chemicals released during the making of biogas penetrate the earth and these are carcinogenic. "The effects will start coming after two decades, but many studies have proven that these chemicals enter the

food chain and lead to breast cancer in women and liver cancer in males and animals, besides leading to endocrine disorders,” he said.

His claim, however, was brushed aside by officers of the Punjab Energy Development Agency (PEDA), investors and state government. Sanjeev Nagpal, managing director of Sampurn Agri Ventures, a bio-

mass-based power producer, reiterated that this waste-to-wealth project was the best remedy to manage the 19.52 million tonnes of paddy straw expected to be generated this year in Punjab.

The sites of all these four plants are located in Ludhiana. According to the crop residue management plan of the state government, it had

been proposed to ensure that work on 24 biogas plants started soon. As many as 38 plants have been allocated to Punjab, but only three are operational (excluding the one at Ghungrali Rajputana), which together produce 80 tonnes of biogas per day.

This delay has caught the attention of the Union Government, which has asked the Pun-

jab Government to intervene and ensure that these plants begin operations. “The Government of India is promoting waste-to-wealth projects, and Punjab is a natural choice for investors. This is an opportunity that could take the state to prosperity,” said Vini Mahajan, Secretary, Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Government of India.

HC quashes removal of Jagraon MC chief

The Punjab and Haryana High Court quashed an order issued in December last year removing Jatinder Pal from the post of the Jagraon municipal council president after ruling that his action did not amount to abuse of power under the Punjab Municipal Act.

The Bench of Justice Sudhir Singh and Justice Karamjit Singh asserted the issue before the court was whether his act of facilitating issuance of appointment letters to the selected contractual safai sewaks and sewer men amounted to an abuse of power.

After hearing senior advocate ML Saggar with counsel Sunny Saggar and Armaan Saggar for the petitioner (president), the Bench asserted it was not the case of the state and other official respondents that the persons issued appointment letters were not eligible or entitled. But the same were to be distributed in a programme yet to be fixed. At best, the petitioner tried to take credit for issuing appointment letters to the selected contractual employees at an earlier date.

The Bench asserted: “The act of the petitioner may be a decision taken in haste and under excitement to win the praise and fame in order to earn credit. But it cannot be

said to be abuse of power, especially when there is no allegation by the official respondents that the same was done dishonestly or for any extraneous consideration or by using the corrupt practices.”

The Bench observed the appointment letters were not withdrawn, indicating that the selected employees were working pursuant to the issuance of appointment letters. The single act might amount to misuse of power, but not abuse.

The Bench added: “Even if the act is considered to be a misuse of power, the same does not have the gravity of causing any loss to the municipal council or the public exchequer, as it is an undisputed position that the safai sewaks and sewer men had been duly selected and they were to join their service after issuance of the appointment letters. Thus, in any manner, the petitioner’s act cannot be termed to be an abuse of power, so as to warrant his removal from the office.”

In its detailed order, the Bench observed an action must involve willful misuse or intentional wrongdoing to be considered an abuse of power. Quoting Black’s Law Dictionary, the Bench clarified that abuse of power meant “to depart from legal or reasonable use in dealing with (a person or thing)” and involves “a willful abuse or intentional wrong.”

In a first, WHO centre for stroke opens in Ludhiana

In a first, the World Health Organisation (WHO) has designated Christian Medical College and Hospital (CMCH) in Ludhiana as the WHO Collaborating Centre (WHO CC) for stroke.

The advanced stroke centre of the CMCH has become the first in the world to be recognised as a WHO CC. Dr Jeyaraj D Pandian, principal and professor of Neurology, who heads the centre, told The Tribune.

Dr Pandian, who is also the president elect of World Stroke Organisation (WSO), said it was a long-standing collaboration with the WHO Southeast Asian Region (WHO SEAR) and WHO Headquarters, Geneva, which started in 2015, that led to the collaboration aimed at enhancing stroke care globally. Health Minister Dr Balbir

Singh formally inaugurated the centre recently. Headed by Dr Pandian, the WHO team of doctors at the CMCH comprises Dorcas Gandhi, Ivy Sebastian, Ranjit Injety, Christy, Nistara Chawla, Pranay Pawar and Rineta Mascarenhas.

The major collaborative efforts started in 2020 when the WHO SEAR requested the hospital to prepare a manual titled, ‘Integrating stroke services in healthcare systems: A practical approach’ for stroke care services at all levels of healthcare.

The CMCH has also prepared a plan to develop stroke care services in Bhutan, Maldives, Myanmar and Timor-Leste. “The collaborative journey began from Bhutan, where hospitals previously lacked a standardised stroke care system, leading to significant delays in the identification and treatment of stroke

cases,” Dr Pandian said.

In response to the growing burden of stroke and uncoordinated system, the WHO SEAR project launched its first phase in August 2020. The initiative empowered over 70 participants across medical, surgical, and rehabilitation disciplines to revolutionise stroke care.

Beyond infrastructure, the initiatives raised awareness about stroke and emphasised the importance of evidence-based care among healthcare professionals, policymakers, and the public, collectively enhancing the quality of stroke care in Bhutan.

“In 2023, we were invited by Queen Mother Ashi Sangay Choden Wangchuk to visit their hospitals, medical university and health minister. During the visit, a roadmap for further development of stroke care was laid out for Bhutan,” he said.

He said that 42 medicines would be provided free of cost to cancer patients in government hospitals. These medicines had been included in the state's essential medicines list, he added.

Sukhu said, "Himachal Pradesh has been placed second in the country in cancer cases after the northeast, which is a matter of grave concern. In view of this, a decision has been taken to provide free treatment to cancer patients in various government hospitals."

tinuously working to provide assistance to people in the disaster-affected areas.

He urged all four MPs

from the state to raise the issue of the rain disaster with the Central Government. He said that the state was yet to receive any financial assistance from the Central Government.

The minister said that he would meet Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on August 7 to discuss some projects related to the state Public Works Department, including many road projects in Simaur district and Chopal in Shimla district.

87 roads blocked, yellow alert till Aug 8

SHIMLA, AUGUST 5 Flashfloods and landslides triggered by days of heavy rains led to the closure of 87 roads in different parts of Himachal, the state emergency operation centre said on Monday.

The meteorological centre here has issued a 'yellow' alert for heavy rain at isolated places in the state till Thursday.

Thirty roads were closed in Kullu, 25 in Mandi, 14 in Lahaul and Spiti, nine in Shimla, seven in Kangra and two in Kinnaur on Sunday evening, the state emergency response centre said. The Sansari-Killar-Thiro-

Tandi (SKTT) road in Udaipur subdivision of Lahaul and Spiti was blocked after a flash flood at Dhandhal nullah, police said. With the Chandrabhaga river in spate, the deputy head of Tadang village in Lahaul and Spiti was notified and residents were asked to move to Junda village, they said.

Hamirpur has received the highest rainfall of 67 mm since Sunday evening, followed by Aghar (44 mm), Jogindernagar (42 mm), Nadaun (38 mm), Dehra Gopipur (32.3 mm), Palampur (28 mm) and Dhaula Kuan and Nahan (27.5 mm each). — PTI

Plan afoot to set up 45 weather stations

SHIMLA, AUGUST 5 Several precious lives can be saved during weather-related disasters like flash-floods if more weather observatory systems are set up in the state.

"We need to have a dense network of automatic weather stations (AWS) in the mountains. If the network is dense enough, the forecast and alerts for extreme weather conditions can be more specific," said Surender Paul, a former Director of the Meteorological Centre, Shimla. In fact, the plan to set up around 45 AWS was in process. "The project is at the MoU stage at present,"

DATA GATHERED TO HELP IN PREVENTIVE STEPS

Additional observatory systems will also offer other benefits in the longer run. The data gathered from these stations over the years will tell us which area is vulnerable to which hazard. Once we know it, preventive measures can be taken. Kuldeep Srivastava, DIRECTOR, MET CENTRE, SHIMLA

said Kuldeep Srivastava, new Director of the Meteorological Centre, Shimla.

At present, there are around 27 or 28 AWS stations in the state, besides some manual facilities for collecting weather-related data. For more specific forecast and alerts — both in terms of time and place — the weather observatory systems need to be ramped up. "In plains, one AWS is sufficient for around 200 sq km. In hills, due to the topogra-

phy and higher weather variations, there should be one AWS for 50 sq km. Ideally, there should be one AWS at the tehsil or block level. Such a network will help us gather more data, which will make the forecast more precise," said Paul.

Besides having more weather observatory systems, several other steps need to be taken to mitigate losses from natural disasters that were occurring frequently in the

state. "We should make an inventory of natural drainage and ensure construction is discouraged close to it," said Paul.

Incidentally, the government had banned construction within 10 metres of rivers and nullahs following massive damage caused by heavy rains last year. According to Public Works Department (PWD) Minister Vikramaditya Singh, the decision hadn't been implemented strictly on the ground. "We need to implement the decision firmly, especially at places that are vulnerable to natural hazards. We will need to take some harsh steps to avoid such losses," he added.

Govt releases ₹50 cr for Haroli drug park

SHIMLA, AUGUST 5 Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today said that the government had released Rs 50 crore for infrastructure development at the bulk drug park to be built at Haroli in Una district. He presided over a meeting of the Industries Department here. Sukhu said that his govern-

ment was committed to ensuring the timely construction of the bulk drug park. He added, "Approach roads, discharge treatment plant, steam generation, ducting, etc should be done on priority. "The action plan should be moved forward firmly by keeping in mind the quality and future needs at various levels." — TNS

To identify bodies, DNA samples of 36 missing Samej villagers' kin taken

SHIMLA, AUGUST 5 The DNA samples of the relatives of 36 missing persons of cloudburst-hit Samej village near Rampur in Shimla district have been taken to identify bodies being found during the ongoing search operations. The DNA samples of 37 persons have been taken so far.

According to a government spokesperson, five bodies expected to be of Samej flashflood victims have been recovered so far. The post-mortems on all bodies have been done and DNA samples sent to the forensic lab at Junga, near Shimla.

Today, two bodies were recovered from near a dam in Sunni. While one body was of a girl aged 14 to 17 years, the other found in a disfigured condition was of a man. On Sunday evening, two bodies were recovered from near Rampur from the Sutlej.

"Bodies are being found in a mutilated condition, making identification difficult. That's why we have decided to go for DNA matching," said Anupam Kashyap, Deputy Commissioner, Shimla. Meanwhile, eight LNT machines were deployed in the search operation that con-

tinued for the fifth consecutive day. The help of sniffer dogs, life detector devices and local people was also being taken in the operation.

In Samej, a temporary bridge was constructed by connecting electric poles to initiate the search operation on the other side of the nullah. Kashyap appealed to people not to provide any financial help through messages on social media in the name of the Samej tragedy. "Willing donors can contribute to the CM's Disaster Relief Fund or through the office of the SDM, Rampur," he said. — TNS

Tourists stuck in Kullu village since July 31 rescued

Chamba to get state's first green hydrogen-based mobility station

SHIMLA, AUGUST 5 Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today said that Chamba was all set to become the first district in Himachal to have a green hydrogen-based mobility station.

The Chief Minister, who could not travel to Chamba due to inclement weather conditions, virtually presided over the closing ceremony of the international Minjar fair from the state capital. He

inaugurated and laid the foundation stones of various projects totalling Rs 120.44 crore. Vidhan Sabha Speaker Kuldeep Singh Pathania was also present on the occasion. "The National Hydro Power Corporation (NHPC) will construct this significant green initiative, led by the state government, and complete it by August 2025," he said after virtually laying the foundation stone of the Green

Hydrogen Mobility Station pilot project at Chamba. The project would cost Rs 14 crore. He said, "The project will be located near the NHPC's Chamera-III power station and will include a 300-kw grid-connected solar power plant to meet its energy needs. The plant will produce 20 kg of green hydrogen per day, which will be stored at pressures of 450 bar or higher to fuel a green hydrogen bus." Additionally, a

hydrogen dispenser unit would be set up to facilitate bus refueling, he added. Sukhu said that the NHPC had started the tender process to procure a green hydrogen bus for Chamba, ensuring its availability once the pilot project becomes operational. "This project in Chamba district is expected to generate revenue and create employment opportunities," he added. — TNS

Films, tourists, jobs, social inclusion: Centre lists gains on Article 370 anniversary

On the fifth anniversary of the abrogation of Article 370, the Centre on Monday listed progress across 11 sectors in the union territory — from constitutional-social inclusion, local governance, jobs and industry to tourism, education and J&K heritage's global reach — to cite its post-August 5, 2019 legacy.

Among the outcomes it counted were the extension of key national legislations to J&K — Right to Education Act 2009, Forest Rights Act 2013, Juvenile Justice Act 2015, among others — and passage of laws in Parliament that enabled social inclusion.

included the term 'Valmiki' in the list of Scheduled Castes in J&K; The Constitution (Jammu and Kashmir) Scheduled Tribes Order (Amendment) Bill 2024 included the communities of Gadda Brahmin, Koli, Paddari tribe and Pahadi Ethnic Group among STs in J&K. All progressive laws of the country are now applicable in J&K,” top government sources said today.

Earlier in an X post, Prime Minister Narendra Modi hailed the fifth anniversary of the abrogation. “Today we mark 5 years since the Parliament of India decided to abrogate

Articles 370 and 35(A), a watershed moment in our nation's history. It was the start of a new era of progress and prosperity in Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh. It meant that the Constitution of India was implemented in these places in letter and spirit, in line with the vision of the great men and women who made the Constitution.”

“With abrogation came security, dignity and opportunity for women, youth, backward, tribal and marginalised communities who were deprived of the fruits of development. At the same time, it has ensured that corruption, which

plagued J&K for decades, has been kept at bay,” he said, assuring fulfilment of the aspirations of the people of J&K and Ladakh in the coming times.

Government sources flagged J&K's transformation post-2019 listing the empowerment of Kashmiri migrants who bagged 2,720 among the 3,000 new government jobs created; approvals to shoot 300 films with 120 completed and a considerable rise in tourist influx — from 1.88 cr in 2022 to 2.11 cr in 2023.

Data show Kashmiri Pandits have reclaimed over 3000 kanals of land by way of property dis-

pute redressal mechanisms in J&K. Nearly 10,000 complaints were registered on the related portal and 8000 resolved.

Silent on the recent terror attacks in Jammu region, the sources spoke of deepening democratic roots in the region with 34,260 representatives handling local governance issues.

On J&K's rising soft power, government sources mentioned the world's first QR code-based mechanism for GI authentication of Kashmir carpets; GI tagging of ten includes pashmina, carpet, sozni, walnut wood carving, Kashmir paper mache, Kani shawl, Khatamband, Basholi painting, Basholi Pashmina and Rajouri Chikri Wood and GI tagging also of Doda's famed Gucci mushrooms.

Going forward, the government said ambitious infrastructure targets had been set for the UT with an aim to reach 5000 MW power generation capacity in five years and expected the early completion of the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla rail link.

Valley leaders placed under house arrest, claims Oppn

Several mainstream politicians in the Valley including two former chief ministers on Monday were placed under house arrest, on the fifth anniversary of the abrogation of special status to Jammu and Kashmir in 2019. However, till late Monday evening, there was no statement from the Jammu and Kashmir Police about the detention of political leaders.

Since morning, leaders mostly from the National Conference and the People's Democratic Party said they had been detained by the police and were not allowed to leave their homes.

National Conference's chief spokesperson Tanvir Sadiq took to X and posted a picture stating that he has not been allowed to leave his house.

“I have been detained at home, which was completely unnecessary...this is unwarranted and illegal,” he wrote on X.

Tanvir, later told *The Tribune* that several party leaders had been put under house arrest, including party chief and former chief minister Farooq Abdullah.

A statement by the National Conference said this “blatant suppression of mainstream democratic activities only serves to showcase the administration's underlying fear and exposes the hollowness of their claims of progress over the past five years.”

Former chief minister and PDP chief, Mehbooba Mufti, who was also placed under house arrest said August 5, 2019 “will go down in history not just as a dark day for J&K but a blot on Indian democracy.”

While several leaders were put under house arrest, the BJP unit in Kashmir celebrated the abrogation in Srinagar. Local BJP leaders claimed the situation had improved in Jammu and Kashmir post-2019, and they wanted to thank Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah, for “taking the historic step” in 2019. The leaders chanted the slogan “Kashmir got freedom on August 5.”

Former chief minister and National Conference vice-president Omar Abdullah, referring to the celebrations by BJP, said “a handful of BJP leaders” were encouraged to celebrate today while those “who would have registered their protest against what was done to J&K are locked up in homes across the valley.”

has been the PM since. The nation had been under military rule from 1975 to 1990. Hasina's father, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, considered the “father of the nation”, was assassinated in 1975 and Lt Gen Ziaur Rehman took over.

Today, protesters climbed atop a statue of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in Dhaka and began chiselling away at the “head”, almost akin to the way statues of Vladimir Lenin were removed in Moscow in the 1990s.

In Dhaka, General Zaman said he had “fruitful” talks with leaders of all major political parties he had invited and would soon meet President Mohammed Shahabuddin to discuss the way ahead.

Hasina's party, which won an electoral mandate in January this year, was not invited by the army.

“The country is going through a revolutionary period,” said General Zaman, who took over as the army chief on June 23.

In his address, General Zaman said, “I promise you all, we will bring justice to all murders and injustice. We request you to have faith in the army of the country. I take full responsibility; do

not get disheartened,” he said, indicating that the army was in control.

“I request you all to be a little patient, give us some time and together we will be able to solve all the problems,” General Zaman said. “Please don't go back to the path of violence and please return to non-violent and peaceful ways.”

Television visuals showed thousands of people pouring into the streets of the capital Dhaka in jubilation and raising slogans. Thousands also stormed Hasina's official residence “Ganabhaban”, raising slogans, pumping

fists and showing the victory sign and rampaging through her house.

Crowds could be seen carrying away televisions, chairs and tables from what was one of the most protected buildings in the country.

Bangladesh has been engulfed by protests and violence after student protests last month against quota in government jobs escalated into a campaign for the ouster of Hasina.

About 250 people have been killed and thousands injured in the violence. Student activists had called for a march to Dhaka today in

defiance of a nationwide curfew to press for Hasina's resignation after deadly clashes across the country on Sunday killed nearly 100 people.

The role of the country's army in tackling violence had come into focus with a group of retired military officers urging Hasina to withdraw troops from the streets and undertake “political initiatives” to resolve the crisis.

Critics of Hasina, along with human rights groups, have accused her government of using excessive force against the protesters, a charge she and her ministers deny.

Hasina had said “those who are carrying out violence are not students but terrorists who are out to destabilise the nation.”

In India, Director General of the BSF Daljit Singh Chawdhary said troops were aware and alert about the recent development and the situation across the Indo-Bangladesh border was being closely monitored to deal with any unforeseen situation.

In Parliament, Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi met External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar in the Lok Sabha and spoke regarding Bangladesh developments.

Abrogation BJP's kala karnama: MP

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 5

Jammu and Kashmir National Conference MP Aga Syed Ruhullah Mehdi on Monday said the abrogation of Article 370 five years ago was good neither for the country nor democracy. Participating in a debate on the demands for grants for the Union Ministry of Fishing, Animal Husbandry and Dairy in the Lok Sabha, the Srinagar MP termed the abrogation as “kala karnama (black act)”.

“What happened five years ago was not good for the country, was not good for the democracy. It didn't go well for us,” Mehdi said. His remarks evoked a sharp reaction from the treasury benches.

Intervening in the discussion, Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Nityanand Rai said the decision was taken for the integrity and unity of the country. Jagdambika Pal, who was in the chair at the time, urged Mehdi to speak only on the budget.

The Narendra Modi-led government had on this day in 2019 annulled Article 370 and Article 35(A) that gave special rights to the then Jammu and Kashmir state, which was also divided into two Union territories. — PTI

Army opens fire on suspected infiltrators

JAMMU, AUGUST 5

Army troops opened fire after noticing the movement of two groups of infiltrators along the Line of Control (LoC) in Akhnor and Sunderbani sectors in the early hours of Monday, officials said.

Though there was no exchange of fire, a massive search operation is underway in both areas to ensure that there is no infiltration from across the border, they said. Alert Army troops fired after picking up suspicious movement of three to four infiltrators in a forward area in the Battal sector of Akhnor on the outskirts of Jammu around 1.30 am, the officials said.

The area was illuminated

2 groups of men spotted along LoC in Akhnor, Sunderbani

with flares and put under surveillance through drones with reinforcements mobilised to lay a tight cordon. A search operation was launched at first light, they said.

The Army troops also fired a few rounds on noticing suspicious movement in a forward area in the Sunderbani-Nowshera sector in Rajouri district around 12.30 am. A search of the area along the LoC is also underway, they added. — PTI

Amarnath Yatra suspended for a day in Jammu

JAMMU, AUGUST 5

No fresh batch of Amarnath Yatra pilgrims was allowed to leave the Bhagwati Nagar base camp here for Kashmir as a precautionary measure in view of the fifth anniversary of the abrogation of Article 370 on Monday, officials said.

An official informed that the pilgrimage has been stopped for a day from Jammu towards Kashmir as a precautionary measure by the security forces as inimical forces might try to disrupt the peace in the region by targeting the pilgrims.

“There were apprehensions that ultras might try to target the pilgrims on the Art 370 abrogation anniversary out of frustration,” a police official said. — OC

‘End of Hasina era’ concern for...

the security establishment told *The Tribune* on condition of anonymity. Hasina had visited India twice since PM Narendra Modi took over on June 8.

New Delhi fears that as a result Bangladesh can turn into a hostile territory. This could have fearsome repercussions for India's fragile North-East, prone to insurgencies, as is taking place in Manipur at present. The last time the BNP was in power in Bangladesh from 2001-2006, several rebel groups from Assam, which shares a large border with Bangladesh, had taken refuge there.

In the past four weeks, Islamists in Bangladesh have attacked Hindu temples. Today, the Indira Gandhi Cultural Centre, inaugurated in March 2010, was attacked in Dhaka. In the past 10 years, India has pumped in Rs 25,000 crore in infrastructure projects in Bangladesh.

According to former Foreign Secretary and former High

Commissioner to Bangladesh Harsh Shringla, the possible involvement of “foreign powers” inimical to Bangladesh's interests as well as to India's, could not be ruled out.

A second former Foreign Secretary, Nirupama Menon Rao, posted on X, “We must weigh our reactions and policy moves with caution and (with) a capacity to think on our feet with agility, a clear focus and foresight. We cannot afford any misstep. There are strategic dilemmas involved here.”

Security officials say a possible encirclement of India is likely, pointing out that the student protests had started when Hasina was on a visit to China. Beijing has for long been wooing Dhaka to edge out India. “There is Chinese influence on student bodies and the military while its ally Pakistan has influence among the Islamists,” security agencies here said.

But Deb Mukharji, a former

High Commissioner to Bangladesh, advised caution, “It is very difficult to guess what will happen. We don't know what will be the new government's focus. We will have to observe before taking any step.”

In retrospect, the crisis has been brewing for months. As elections approached in January in Bangladesh, Washington imposed sanctions on members of Hasina's party, hoping that a coalition government with the BNP and the radical Jamaat would be formed.

Hasina accused the US of attempting to create a “Christian state” from regions of Bangladesh, India and Myanmar. Additionally, the US seeks port access to establish a foothold in the area. Though the US had denied it, reports from Bangladesh suggest the most powerful military sought an island near Chittagong to set up a base, possibly to counter China.

to comply with the fire and safety norms under the Master Plan of Delhi, 2021, read with the Unified Building Bylaws of Delhi, 2016. Monday's development came three days after the Delhi High Court ordered a CBI probe into the death of three civil services aspirants.

“Having regard to the nature of the incident and to ensure that the public has no doubt with regard to the investigation, this court

transfers the probe to the CBI,” a Bench led by Delhi High Court Acting Chief Justice Manmohan had said on Friday, transferring the probe into the case from the Delhi Police to the CBI.

The high court had asked the Central Vigilance Commission to appoint a senior officer to oversee the CBI probe and had pulled up the Delhi Police and the Municipal Corporation of Delhi over the drowning incident, saying it was unable to fathom how the students could not come out and sought to know if the doors were blocked or staircases were narrow.

Kerala Congress and Left parties MPs staged a walkout during his speech in the Lok Sabha, protesting against the poor allocation of funds in the Union Budget for healthcare for their state. Nadda, who was replying in the Lower House to a debate on the demand for grants for the Health Ministry, also dismissed the allegations of the opposition that allotment of funds under the Ayushman Scheme had been reduced. The Health Minister during Trinamool Congress members, who were protesting during his speech, to tell the House why the West Bengal Government did not share the dengue registry with the Centre. On opposition claims on reduction of funds for the health infrastructure mission, the Health Minister said states were able to spend just ₹1,806 crore out of the budgetary allocation of ₹4,200 crore in last year's budget. "We are giving money, but it is not spent. You spend the money, we will allocate more funds, if the existing funds are spent," Nadda said. — TNS

Govt urged to slash GST on health insurance

New Delhi: TMC MP Derek O'Brien on Monday urged the government to reduce 18 per cent GST on medical and health insurance, saying the high tax rate is burdening the middle class. During the Zero Hour in Rajya Sabha, he referred to a letter written to Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman by Union Minister Nitin Gadkari making similar demands. "We should reduce the GST because this is burdening people, especially the middle class. Insurance penetration in India is below 4 per cent as compared to over 7 per cent globally. There is an imbalance in the insurance sector where 75 per cent is life insurance policies and 25 per cent medical insurance," Derek said. He said the TMC had raised the issue in the Parliament on July 29 and West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee also wrote to the Finance Minister in this regard. Sitharaman had earlier faced similar demands to reassess the GST rate on health insurance premiums. — TNS

Digi Yatra 'purely voluntary': Minister

New Delhi: Stating that Digi Yatra is "purely voluntary" for air passengers, Civil Aviation Minister K Ram Mohan Naidu has claimed that wide publicity had been given to inform people that Digi Yatra was one of the options for passengers and they need not necessarily go for it. Naidu stated this in the Rajya Sabha on Monday in response to a question by Trinamool Congress (TMC) member Jawahar Sircar. Sircar asked while Digi Yatra mode was said to be "optional", why air passengers were not informed about it well in advance by sending them text messages? Sircar also wanted to know about the owner of the Digi Yatra Foundation (DYF), which uses the facial recognition technology (FRT) for verification of flyers. The TMC MP also asked about the agency that controlled the facial recognition data collected through Digi Yatra. — TNS

'Demand of poor Muslims': Govt on Waqf Act changes; Akhilesh says move divisive

Close on the heels of the Union Cabinet's approval to nearly 40 amendments to the 1995 Waqf Act, the government on Monday said poorer Muslims had long demanded changes to the law even as the Samajwadi Party-led opposition said they would oppose the amendments if pushed in Parliament. "For a long time demands have come from poor and common Muslims, including women, to make Waqf properties more transparent and efficient," Union Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said. The Bill to amend the Wakf Act seeks to mandate 30 Waqf boards in India to register their properties with district collectors and ensure actual valuation. Government sources say revenues from Waqf properties could be understated and are currently estimated at Rs 200 crore a year — a mismatch from the quantum of properties and their market values. Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav in Lucknow said his party would oppose the amendments and accused the BJP of working solely to divide Hindus and Muslims. IUML's ET Mohammed Basheer called the move ill-intentioned. AIMIM president Asaduddin Owaisi said the government wanted to rob Waqf boards of all autonomy. The amendments also mandate inclusion of women in Waqf boards with the government saying these are essential for transparency and inclusion of the lesser represented Muslims.

INCLUSION OF NEW CASTES IN OBC LIST
SC seeks quantifiable data on backwardness from WB

The Supreme Court on Monday asked the West Bengal Government to furnish quantifiable data on social, economic backwardness and inadequacy of representation in public employment of the castes included by it in the OBC list for extending reservation benefits.

A Bench led by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud issued notices to those who had challenged before the Calcutta High Court the inclusion of 77 castes, mostly Muslims, in the Other Backward Classes (OBC) list. It also issued notice on the West Bengal Government's application seeking to stay the High Court's verdict.

The Bench — which also included Justice JB Pardi-

wala and Justice Manoj Misra — directed the West Bengal Government to file an affidavit explaining the process followed for classification of 77 castes as OBCs. The top court also sought to know the nature of the survey; if there was a lack of consultation with the Commission (state backward commission) in respect of any of the 77 communities designated as OBCs; and if any consultation was done by the state for the sub-classification of the OBCs.

The Calcutta High Court had on May 22 quashed the OBC status of several castes in West Bengal granted since 2010, declaring the reservation given to them in services and posts in the state as illegal. The High Court struck down several classes for reservation as Other Backward Classes (OBC) given under The West Bengal Backward Classes (Other than Scheduled Castes and Sched-

uled Tribes) (Reservation of Vacancies in Services and Posts) Act, 2012.

"Religion indeed appears to have been the sole criterion" for declaring these communities as OBCs, the High Court had said.

However, the High Court had clarified that the services of citizens of the struck-down classes, who were already in service or had availed the benefit of reservation or had succeeded in any selection process of the state would not be affected by the order.

The HC had directed that the state's executive orders classifying several other classes as OBCs from March 5, 2010, to May 11, 2012, were also quashed, in view of the illegality of the reports recommending such classification. The directions will be given prospective effect, it clarified.

Nine kanwariyas electrocuted to death, two injured in Bihar

SC raps UP Govt for delay in considering remission pleas

Focus on 'gai' but where is fodder, asks Trinamool MP

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 5
Launching a scathing attack on the BJP, first-time Trinamool Congress MP from Jadavpur Sayoni Ghosh on Monday said despite making tall claims of protecting the cow, it had failed to provide fodder for them, leading to their deaths in states ruled by the saffron party. He further commented that the Central government's journey had begun from "chai" (alluding to PM Narendra Modi's tea-selling family background) but had ended with "gai".

"They talk about 'gau-raksha', people should know that there is a fodder crisis in India," she said, adding that the (fisheries) minister, in a written reply, had admitted that there was a fodder shortage. It means cows are dying without food in government-owned gaushalas, especially in the BJP-ruled states," she said, while participating in a discussion on the demands for grants for the Ministry of Fishing, Dairy and Animal Husbandry.

"About 70 per cent of India's rural poor depend on livestock and farm animals. But does this sector get what it deserves? If you seek a reply from our farmers, they will only say that 'Chaise shumhui sarkar and gai par atak gayi aur vikas ki mauasi 10 saal mein ruste mein bhatak gayi,'" she quipped amid thumping of desks by opposition benches.

On animal husbandry, she said 70 per cent of India's rural poor depended on livestock, but the sector hardly received its just share. She raised concerns over the rising price of cattle and poultry feed.

"What are the farmers going to eat and feed their families and the cattle? This forces farmers to sell their cattle, and pushes them eventually to suicide," she said. — TNS

Chouhan outlines govt's vision for agriculture amid Oppn protest

Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Monday talked about the Union Government's "vision" for the farm sector amid a bitter clash between him and the Opposition in the Rajya Sabha. While delivering the concluding part of his address on the discussion on the working of this ministry, Chouhan slammed the Congress and said agriculture was never its priority. "The Congress has always talked about helping farmers, but it has never done that. It was PM Narendra Modi who launched the cash transfer scheme (PM-Kisan scheme) for farmers," Chouhan said. his reply. Congress member Digvijaya Singh, a former CM of MP, said six protesting farmers were killed in police firing in Mandasaur during Chouhan's tenure as Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh. A furious Chouhan retorted saying, "I have warned if you provoke me, I'll not spare you." Chouhan then reeled out instances of farmer killings during the Congress' tenures. "Digvijaya Singh has blood on his hands... 24 farmers were killed. In 1986, 23 farmers were killed by police during Congress rule in Bihar. In 1988 in Delhi, on the occasion of the death anniversary of Indira Gandhi, two farmers fell to police bullets. In 1988, they killed five farmers in Meerut. In August 1995, six farmers in Haryana were killed in police shooting," Chouhan said. This attracted strong protest from the Opposition and the entire Opposition led by Congress' Sonia Gandhi walked out of the House and boycotted the rest of Chouhan's speech. The Congress also pressed its demand for a right to reply, which Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar rejected. "There is no right of reply under rule 238(2). If any grievance is raised according to correct provisions, I will consider." Chouhan said he had read all speeches of former PMs given from the ramparts of the Red Fort on Independence Day. "In as many as 15 speeches made by Jawaharlal Nehru, the country's first PM, there was no mention of the word 'farmer'," Chouhan said. Without naming Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi, Chouhan said that one Congress leader, who went to Sonapat during his yatra to meet farmers, was found having more camera persons with him than the farmers present

at the site. Chouhan presented a video recording of the Sonapat visit, which the Chairman asked the minister to authenticate and submit during the course of the day.

Chouhan said the Modi government was moving towards climate-friendly agriculture. "Nearly 1,500 climate smart biofortified crop varieties will be developed. The PM will launch 109 such varieties this year," he said. Chouhan said PM Modi's vision is to take a holistic view of health — of humans, of soil, of animals and plants — and said the central government planned to set up 100 horticulture clusters and amend the Pesticides Act for better use of chemicals for agriculture. The Agriculture Minister also informed that the government had launched an oilseeds mission worth Rs 68,000 crore.

Hasina's ouster

Authoritarian govt gets its comeuppance

MASSIVE anti-government protests have forced Sheikh Hasina to step down as the Prime Minister of Bangladesh and flee the country in the wake of widespread violence that claimed over 300 lives in just three weeks. A democrat who turned into a dictator, Hasina had it coming. She chose to ride roughshod over the people's aspirations and took them for granted. The dramatic turn of events has happened barely seven months after a controversial general election that was boycotted by the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) and other Opposition parties. Hasina had stormed to power for the fourth time in a row, but the allegations of rigging and strong-arm tactics tainted her victory. Desperate to drum up support for herself and her government, she visited India and China in recent months, even as trouble was brewing at home.

The Hasina regime grossly mishandled the agitation launched by students in protest against 30 per cent reservation in government jobs for relatives of freedom fighters who won independence for Bangladesh in 1971. The Supreme Court slashed the quota to 5 per cent, but the government's reluctance to release the arrested student leaders enraged the protesters, who upped the ante against Hasina. The public anger was exemplified by a mob vandalising a statue of her father, 'Bangabandhu' Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, who spearheaded the country's liberation movement.

The developments are reminiscent of the 2022 protests in Sri Lanka that led to the ouster of the Rajapaksa brothers. The next government in Bangladesh will have to address the burning issues of high youth unemployment, economic stagnation and inflation. New Delhi, which enjoyed good ties with Hasina-ruled Dhaka, will have to recalibrate its strategy in view of the colossal chum in the neighbouring country. With the return of Pakistan-aligned BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami imminent, India needs to be wary of adverse headwinds in the subcontinent.

Protect the voiceless

Wildlife crime cases surge in northern India

THE alarming increase in wildlife crime in northern India is a stark reminder of the ongoing battle between conservation efforts and illegal activities. Over the past five years, a staggering 683 wildlife crime cases have been reported across Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chandigarh. This data, obtained from the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau (WCCB), reveals the grim reality facing our nation's biodiversity. Uttar Pradesh, with 425 cases, and Uttarakhand, with 152, are the epicentres of these crimes, highlighting the severe threats to local wildlife. These cases include poaching, forest fires, encroachments and the smuggling of animal body parts. Notably, Himachal reported cases involving the trafficking of snow leopard skins and bear gall bladders, underscoring the diverse and valuable wildlife targeted by poachers.

While the WCCB's efforts, including cyber-patrolling and training enforcement officers, are commendable, they are not enough. The decline in cases in UP from 158 in 2019 to 19 in 2023 may suggest some progress, but it is also an indicator of the work that remains. The data points to the fact that while some states have seen a reduction, others continue to struggle, and emerging trends like the trafficking of exotic species at airports show that poachers are adapting and finding new ways to circumvent the law.

The urgency to address wildlife crime cannot be overstated. Protecting our wildlife is not just about preserving individual species; it's about maintaining the ecological balance and ensuring a sustainable future for all. This fight requires a multifaceted approach, including stricter enforcement, public awareness campaigns and robust international cooperation. If investigative and enforcement methods do not evolve and stay ahead of poaching syndicates, India's richly diverse ecosystems will suffer the consequences. We must safeguard the natural heritage for future generations.

Lord Chelmsford's speech

WE have said that it was unfortunate that it should have been left to such a man as Lord Chelmsford to befriend the cause of India in the recent debate in the House of Lords, in which so many ex-Indian views and sympathies took part, and in which sentiments of a most pernicious character were expressed. Even a cursory examination of the ex-Viceroy's speech will suffice to show how ill-fitted he was for the task thus entrusted to him. There was not in the whole speech a word of rebuke to either Lord Inchcape or Lord Harris or Lord Amthill for the views expressed by them on the question of Indian self-government, views which, Lord Chelmsford could not but be aware, would, if left unchallenged, do great mischief in India. Nor was Lord Curzon's equally provocative reference to Lord Olivier's recent speech in which he had asked the House to take a common sense view of Mr Das' attitude in the matter of the Saha resolution handled with anything like the strength and earnestness which were imperatively demanded. If anything, Lord Chelmsford was clearly apologetic. "I wished it was sufficiently realised," he said, "how difficult it is at this distance from India to form a sound judgment on some problems like those raised by the utterances of Mr Das which had been so often quoted in that House. Lord Peel might form one inference from the facts before him and Lord Olivier form another from what was before him." This was not facing but fighting shy of the real issue. Distance had nothing to do with the matter; nor was the question merely of different persons drawing different inferences from the facts before them.

Lured into a life-killing rat race

Civil services aspirants should stop mythologising the jobs of IAS/IPS officers

ENOUGH has already been said and discussed about the tragic death of three IAS aspirants in New Delhi. It is like realising the implications of the all-pervading civil services myth, the agony of the perplexed/exploited generation, the crude business of India's black education system — the demonic coaching industry — and above all, the unholy alliance of the merchants of education and corrupt government functionaries. Imagine the callousness and corruption — a fancy and well-advertised IAS coaching centre running a library in the basement of the building, and feeling quite at ease with this illegal act. Think of the way these aspirants bargain with the gang of brokers/property dealers for finding an accommodation in tiny/dark cells that characterise the lanes and bylanes of Old Rajinder Nagar in Delhi — supposedly the 'sacred' sites for aspiring civil servants. Think of the monsoon malady and the pathetic drainage system in the area. And think of the intense flow of rainwater entering the basement library, and three youngsters dying a terrible death. Everything, it seems, is possible in this soon-to-be Viksit Bharat!

Even though I understand the agony of these IAS aspirants, I feel like urging them to go deeper, question the myth that seems to have completely hypnotised them, rethink the meaning of 'success' and their life projects, and reflect on the price they

pay — financial, mental and existential — for pursuing a goal that has often been imposed on them. To begin with, they need to understand the shallowness in the arguments they often make: "We want to become civil servants in order to serve the country." Well, IAS/IPS officers do not monopolise patriotism. One who collects the garbage from our houses and keeps the 'gated societies' clean is no less a patriot. Moreover, only a naïve person would say that our bureaucrats are saints and altogether free from the influence of the hugely problematic politics-business nexus.

The IAS myth has such an overwhelming impact on this generation because it promises officially 'legitimised' power and privilege. Anyone who has lived in a small town or village in India knows how the power/aura of the district collector, the superintendent of police, or even the block development officer tempts the aspiring class. For many, it is a path towards upward social mobility. Yes, accept it — it is not essentially the unconditional love for the country, but the

'will to power' and associated privileges that fascinate these youngsters — from engineers and doctors to PhD holders, or from history/anthropology graduates to even political activists. The result is the life-killing rat race. Imagine more than 10 lakh aspirants appearing in the UPSC prelims exam, and eventually 1,000 or a little more getting selected for IAS/IPS and allied services! Yet, the power of the myth is so strong that most of these aspirants try repeatedly, spend a

huge amount of money (say, Rs 1.75 lakh only for general studies), end up wasting five or six years of their youthful lives, and eventually carry the stigma of 'failure'.

Is it time for these youngsters to come to their senses, and debunk this myth? Think of the intensity of the damage it causes to them. For five/six years, what do they do? They shop around the overpriced coaching centres, and get attracted by the 'star strategists' (I do not regard them as teachers because meaningful teaching has a higher purpose) who instruct them how to prepare for general studies, history, psychology or Hindi literature, or 'motivate' them through their carefully crafted discourses. And from early morning to late night, they keep consuming the 'notes' or 'success manuals' through which the coaching centres colonise their lifeworld. Accept it, dear aspirants: In this highly mechanised and dehumanised process, there is no light, there is no joyful learning, and there is no serious engagement with even the 'skills' a future civil servant needs to cultivate. Possibly, after this tedious journey and endless

drilling, most of these aspirants realise the utter meaninglessness of this process. If, for five years, you study history, literature or physics with creative joy, and under the guidance of great professors, you grow as a thinker/researcher. Or, possibly, you evolve as a mature and intellectually awakened human. But this rat race for some sort of mythical success kills one's soul and causes severe mental fatigue. This harsh reality cannot be escaped simply because you and I love to see only the much-advertised smiling faces of the UPSC exam 'toppers' — the brand ambassadors of the gigantic coaching industry.

Is it, therefore, possible for these aspirants to widen their political and intellectual horizons, and raise their voice against the way schools/colleges/universities across the country have been allowed to decay, and the political/economic establishment has promoted and encouraged the mushrooming growth of coaching centres for almost everything — from the Mathematics Olympiad to board exams, or from standardised tests like JEE, NEET and CUET to the civil services exams? Have they ever thought why their college/university education should not be sufficient to do well in the UPSC exam? Have they reflected on the systematic decay of government schools and public universities and raised their voice against this onslaught on education? As loud as it gets on the roads

THE car windows were vibrating as if they would break. And my eardrums felt as if they would be punctured. The 'sonic boom' was not because of a Su-30 taking off from Palam airport but from a *Dak Kanwar* on the highway. Though I had been stuck in the traffic jam for over an hour, it was now that I was right next to one of these.

For years, the *kanwar* was carried by the devout from the Ganga to their villages on foot. The pilgrimage, as all pilgrimages, was a physically testing one. The idea presumably being that the religious merit gained is directly proportional to the physical hardship faced by the pilgrim. I recall as a child seeing a lone *kanwar yatri* hobbling along the road, evoking a mixture of awe, pity and reverence.

Dak Kanwar, for the uninitiated, is a recent invention. The idea behind this is not to punish oneself, but instead make the pilgrimage a celebration. It starts typically with a bunch of youngsters seeking donations from the neighbourhood for bringing the *kanwar*. Next, a truck is ornately decorated to look like a *jhanki*, like the one usually taken out on Dasehra day. On the sides of the truck are huge banners displaying photos of the destination and the prominent donors. A sound system with gargantuan speakers is placed at the top and back of the truck to ensure that all and sundry can gain some residual religious merit. Interestingly, recent years have seen a new class of professionals oddly called 'DJ Sound'. No birthday party, wedding or even a *satsang* is complete without hiring one.

The truck serves as a resting place for the youngsters who are carrying the *kanwar*. The idea is that the *kanwar* is carried in a relay with each person running with it for a short distance before passing it to the next one and then hopping on to the accompanying motorbike to take the 'baton' after some time. A couple of people would be on another motorcycle, clearing the way. This they do by blowing a whistle and, if need be, by not so gently using a baseball bat or a hockey stick.

It is estimated that about 30-40 lakh people undertake this pilgrimage every year. As an Internet meme puts it, 'Our girls (from Haryana) are bringing medals while all that our boys can do is bring *kanwar*'!

This enthusiastic religiosity causes mayhem on the roads. The month of *Sawan* is traditionally a cause for celebration since it is when the earth rejuvenates. Not for hapless commuters like me, though. For us, it brings hours of sitting in the traffic with devotional songs (set to tunes of popular film songs) blaring from a *Dak Kanwar*.

But as with everything, this too has a silver lining. A friend of mine, whose brother is in the police, told me that the cops are normally relieved at this time. The reason is simple — the rate of petty crime comes down, presumably because some of the offenders are busy getting the *kanwar*'s!

How Hasina joined the ranks of dictators

THE image of a Bangladeshi protester climbing on the shoulders of the enormous statue of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and trying to crack his concrete skull with a hammer sent a collective shiver down the spine of all those watching the revolution unfold in Bangladesh on Monday afternoon.

This could not — cannot — be the work of a student protester, we thought, however angry he was with Bangabandhu's daughter. Even if she, Sheikh Hasina, kept quiet when more than 300 people were killed by her armed forces in recent weeks via the shoot-at-sight orders given by none other than her Awami League party general secretary Obaidul Quader, should Bangabandhu have become the target of an ideological pervert who understood little or nothing about the incredible 1971 Liberation War?

Hasina, democracy's child,

the daughter of the Father of Bangladesh who could do no wrong; who escaped the midnight massacre on that awful night of August 15, 1975 — when the rest of her family was cruelly obliterated — only because she and her sister, Rehana, were simply not present in the family house in Dhanmondi; today, Hasina has joined the ranks of dictators who think little of shedding the blood of others because they have to, first, protect themselves.

How could this come to pass? How could Hasina allow Obaidul Quader to issue orders to kill those who dared to protest? Clearly, the 1971 revolution was turning upon itself. It was eating its own children.

It is said, in Dhaka, that Quader said at that fateful press conference two weeks ago that if the students didn't shut down their protests and go home, he would order the Awami League cadres to "sort them out". Did that mean that Hasina's own party cadres shot innocent students on the streets of Dhaka and Chittagong? The jury is out on that assessment. But UNICEF has since said that at least 32 children were killed in the July protests.

How could Hasina — who lived in Delhi's Pandara Road area with her sister in the wake of the massacre of her entire family, including

her teenage brother Russel and watched pro-Pakistani forces come to power in her beloved Bangladesh — allow herself to turn into a brittle, copycat version of her hated opponents?

As she sleeps in an Indian safe house at or close to the Hindon airbase near Delhi — not even allowed to drive to the Capital less than an hour away at the house of her daughter Saima Wazed, who works with the WHO — Hasina should, perhaps, spend a few minutes looking within, of how and why she allowed this dire situation to unfold.

In January, when the Opposition Bangladesh National-

ist Party (BNP) boycotted the polls for the second time, Hasina haughtily threw the decision back into its face, ordering the arrest of the party's key leaders and metaphorically spitting in their face. Even if the two women, Hasina and BNP leader Khaleda Zia, ailing for many years, are believed to hate each other's guts, the first rule of democracy is to allow the person whose guts you hate the space to say what she wants to say.

But Hasina put out — and Delhi, increasingly without choice bought the argument — that if she wasn't supported in her democratic return

to power via authoritarian means, then the Bay of Bengal would turn into a nest of crocodiles that had been trained and fed by the Pakistani military establishment. The irony is that that assessment was also definitely true.

PM Modi, just like several prime ministers before him, including Indira Gandhi and Atal Bihari Vajpayee, realised that New Delhi had no option but to support Hasina. When the BNP had been in power between 2001 and 2006, not just had India's North-East been pushed into deeper turmoil, but pro-Pakistani elements had sought to push a vast consignment of sophisticated weaponry into Bangladesh via the Chittagong port.

It is perfectly true that Sheikh Hasina's return to Dhaka was a big boon for India. It's not just about the 1971 connection — although that stirring beginning is where the special relationship was forged, not just between the Mukti Bahini and India's armed forces, but also between the peoples of both countries — but about the last 15 years since Hasina returned as the PM.

A brand new partnership across the political and economic spectrum between India and Hasina's Bangladesh has become a role model for the rest of South Asia. Roads, railways,

transit rights, civilian travel, defence assistance, you name it, and India-Bangladesh pop up like two blushing peas in a pod.

So what happens now? It is clear that the Bangladeshi protester hammering at Mujib's concrete skull in Dhaka on Monday, as well as the attacks against Hindu families across the country, is being orchestrated by a dark force. The pro-Pakistani Jamaat-e-Islami is the likely contender for that ticket. They are back. The past is never fully past in Bangladesh. For the Pakistani military establishment to play once again in the Bay of Bengal is a heaven-sent opportunity.

It is equally true that there is no one — except Hasina — who has had the raw courage to take on the Jamaat as well as its political face, the BNP. But now, Hasina has fled. At the Hindon airbase, she is likely waiting for the UK Foreign Office to accept her request for asylum. It probably wasn't safe for her to stay on in Dhaka while she waited for London to say yes. She would have requested India for temporary shelter. It was the right thing for the Modi government to let her come. It's what friends are for — even when they are in the wrong.

How could Hasina let Obaidul Quader issue orders to kill those who dared to protest?

Greater localisation is the key to equitable economic growth

INDIA does not have a growth problem: its GDP is growing faster than other countries. The problems of the Indian economy are its inequitable growth and the harm caused to the natural environment. India's policymakers must adopt new theories of growth.

In the prevalent theory of economic development, labour must move from agriculture into manufacturing, and then to services. Therefore, the productivity of agriculture must be improved with inputs provided by the industry (fertilisers, pesticides, machinery), and surplus labour moved into manufacturing. India's manufacturing sector is not able to provide enough employment to workers displaced from agriculture. This is the structural reason for large numbers in India remaining in agriculture.

Economists measure the productivity of all sectors — agriculture, manufacturing, and services — by the amount of labour required to produce its output. The productivity of agriculture is improved by reducing the amount of human labour required to produce food from the soil,

and substituting it with other technological inputs — machines, chemicals, etc. The productivity of manufacturing is improved by reducing human labour input, substituting it with technology; similarly for services.

It is not the size of its GDP that determines whether a nation is more advanced than others: it is the per capita GDP that counts. Technology, including AI, can improve productivity in all sectors by increasing the output of human effort or eliminating it altogether. Economically advanced nations that have more financial capital can afford to use more technology than labour. The measure of productivity of Indian economic enterprises must be changed. More labour and less capital must be used for growth and improvement of the Indian economy's performance.

Scale is a concept beloved by managers. Large-scale factories and farms, each specialising in the production of a single item or crop, enable the use of standardised machinery and inputs (chemicals, components, etc), also produced in large-scale factories, thereby reducing overall costs. However, large-scale production requires larger markets for every factory and farm. Underutilised large factories and farms can be a waste of capital.

International trade expands markets for specialist producers, each producing what it does best. In trade theorist David Ricar-

do's example, the Portuguese should produce port wine and the British textiles, and trade with each other; rather than the British trying to grow grapes in their climate and the Portuguese learning to run mechanised textile mills. Global GDP is higher when each country produces only what it does best and imports the rest of its needs. Increased global trade with reductions in costs of transportation (containerised supply chains, giant ships and large cargo planes), along with a decline in trade barriers, has enabled faster globalisation and increased the global GDP in the last 30 years.

'Free market' economists say that a market is the most efficient way for fixing prices by matching supply with demand. A change in price also provides a signal

to investors to adjust production capacities. This simplistic view of a market is blind to inequities in markets caused by unequal power between capital owners and the providers of perishable resources. Workers who have only their time and work to sell must be employed regularly, and paid on time, or their lives are wasted. Workers and farmers with perishable produce cannot withhold the sale to induce price rises, whereas their buyers can delay purchases and payments, compelling them to sell at a loss.

With the expansion of global trade, the power of consumers over producers (workers and farmers) has increased. Buyers threaten to find lower cost sources in other countries if they cannot obtain lower prices from the current suppliers. Inequality

in incomes and wealth have been increasing between those who earn their incomes and wealth from financial investments and workers and small farmers, even in advanced countries (unless farmers are heavily subsidised).

Environmental scientist Vaclav Smil analyses the use of fossil fuels in the modern economy in *How the World Really Works: A Scientist's Guide to Our Past, Present and Future*. They are used in the production and distribution of four foundational materials for modern civilisation: steel, concrete, plastics and food. He evaluates the 'total system' requirements of fossil energy in the production of these.

Food is the most fundamental of these for human survival: more fundamental than steel, concrete and plastics. Food systems are also the largest users of fossil fuel-based inputs. Fertilisers are produced from fossil-fuel feedstock. Farm machinery is made of steel and runs on fossil fuels. Plastics are used for hygienic transportation of food in global supply chains. Fossil fuel-based solutions became integral for increasing the scale of food production and distribution for meeting the needs of the human population, which increased in the last 100 years from two billion to eight billion (1.4 billion in India). The world does not have a problem with the overall quantity of food produced any more. The problem is the inequitable distribution and


wastage of food.

Smil calculates the benefits of locally circular, organic multi-cropping systems. He says they could be the solution for the world. He wonders though: "Could we return to purely organic cropping, relying on recycled organic wastes and natural pest controls, and could we do without engine-powered irrigation and without field machinery by bringing back draft animals? We could, but purely organic farming would require most of us to abandon cities, resettle villages, dismantle central animal feeding operations, and bring all animals back to farms to use them for labour and as sources of manure. Are we prepared to do this?"

The solution for the twin problems of environmental degradation and inequitable economic growth is less globalisation and more localisation. About 64 per cent of the people in India live in rural areas (36 per cent in China, 17 per cent in the US). They mostly work on farms and in small industries in rural areas, not in large factories that use automated equipment. Rather than trying to catch up with rich countries on their historical development paths, India should take advantage of its present realities. Local, systemic, small-scale agricultural solutions, and small industries, cooperatively managed by communities in their own villages and towns, is the way to solve global problems of climate change and inequitable growth.

Note: (A) In case, the candidate applied on the basis of equivalent qualification(s) for the post(s) where 'equivalent' word is mentioned in essential qualification(s), the consideration of the said equivalent qualification(s) of the candidate at the level of Commission will be only provisional subject to its acceptance by the indenting Department after due verification.

(B) Further, if a candidate claims eligibility on account of possessing higher qualifications in same line as prescribed in minimum qualifications for that particular post, in view of Haryana Government instruction No. 10/4/2015-3G/Sl, dated 25.03.2016, in that case, the consideration of said higher qualification in the same line at the level of Commission will only be provisional subject to its acceptance by the indenting Department after due verification.

3. Details of syllabus for different categories in the group are attached at Appendix-C (available on the website of HSSC).

4. Groupwise schedule of dates and time shall be uploaded/notified after closing date of application form.

5. Criteria for Selection, Examination & Syllabus.

(i). In view of Hon'ble High Court judgement dated 31.05.2024 in LPA No. 1037/2023, the weightage of socio-economic marks of 2.5% in the scheme of marks has been done away with. Accordingly, the pattern of exam shall be as follows:

Pattern of Examination:- All questions shall be compulsory. Question paper shall be Bilingual (English & Hindi). An Offline (OMR base) written examination will be held for recruitment of Group-C posts. There shall be no negative marking for wrong answer. The total no. of questions will be 100 with weightage of 0.975 marks for each question. A candidate has to fill one option compulsorily out of five options given. In case a candidate doesn't mark any of the five options for a question then 0.975 marks for each un-attempted question shall be deducted.

Extra five minutes shall be given to mark fifth option, if candidate does not know the answer. Total time allowed for the paper will be (100+5)=105 minutes including the five minutes.

Note: Syllabus and pattern for written examination/skill test (97.5%) is attached at Appendix-C and the details is available on website i.e. www.hssc.gov.in.

6. Process of recruitment for Group C Posts

(i) After receipt of application, the Commission shall hold offline written examination/or skill test from the eligible candidates based on the merit list of CET marks.

Provided that the maximum number of eligible candidates for the skill and/or written examination who shall be eligible to appear in such examination based on number of posts advertised by the Commission as under:-

(a) Candidates equal to five times the number of posts advertised if the number is less than 30;

(b) 150 candidates if the number is between 30 and 40;

(c) Candidates equal to four times the number of posts advertised if the number is greater than 40;

(ii) If the CET marks of the last candidate who has applied for the post in terms of sub-clause (i) above is achieved by more than one candidate, then all the candidates at the cut off CET marks who have applied for the post shall be entitled to be considered for appearing in the skill and/or written examination for the post(s) advertised by the Commission.

(iii) Only those candidates, who fulfill the minimum educational qualifications and other eligibility conditions for a post advertised by the Commission on the last date specified in the advertisement issued by the Commission under sub-clause (i) above and who applied for the post for consideration shall be issued an Admit Card and be eligible to appear in the skill and/or written examination to be conducted by the Commission.

(iv) On receipt of requisitions of the posts of different nomenclature but of similar educational qualifications, the Commission shall be competent to hold one common skill and/or written examination with the condition that the distribution/allocation shall be on merit-based option given by the successful candidates.

(v) When the number of candidates applying under sub-clause (i) who are eligible is less than the number limit specified in the above said clause then the Commission may extend the date by publication on the website for enabling further eligible candidates to apply.

(vi) For consideration of a candidate against a post of general category, such candidate has to secure minimum 50% marks in the skill and/or written examination to be considered for selection/recruitment. In case of consideration against the reserved category post (whether vertical or horizontal) the candidate shall receive a concession @ 10% for the purpose of eligibility for the purpose of skill and/or written examination, i.e. the minimum cut off for such candidates shall be 40% because they have been given 10% concession in minimum marks.

(vii) The Commission shall on the basis of marks obtained in the written/skill examination shortlist the candidates for selection, recommendation or waiting list in the respective categories and publish on the website.

Note:-Save as otherwise provided in any instructions of Government, in case of non-availability of eligible candidate(s) of respective category after the skill and/or written examination for the post which remain unfilled shall be re-advertised as per reservation policy.

For consideration against a Group C post of General category, a candidate (including a candidate of reserved category who has not availed any kind of concession/relaxation of age, fee, qualification etc.) has to obtain minimum 48.75 marks (i.e. 50% of 97.5) of skill and/or written examination. However, for consideration against the same post of reserved category, a candidate of respective reserved category has to obtain minimum 39 marks (i.e. 40% of 97.5).

7. Reservation:

7.1. Implementation of reservation policy, maintaining reservation roster and earmarking of vacancies for different categories comes under the domain of the concerned departments and Commission has nothing to do with the number of posts requisitioned under different categories. Benefit of reservation to the persons of reserved category will be as per Haryana Government instructions contained in letter No. 22/10/2013-1GS-III, dated 15.07.2014 and thereafter issued from time to time up to the date of advertisement shall be applicable. With regard to the PwD category posts, in case a particular category of suitable PwD candidate as per advertisement is not available, then the other suitable PwD category candidate may be accommodated, if permitted by the concerned department as per the instructions applicable.

7.2. The shortlisting of candidates shall be done on the basis of particulars filled in online application form for which supporting documents shall be uploaded. As candidates can update their particulars till closing date, therefore, no change of particular at any stage shall be entertained. In absence of documentary evidence or mismatch in claimed category and uploaded documents, candidature of candidate shall be considered under General category/Parent category, subject to his/her fulfilling eligibility in General category/Parent category.

7.3. The benefit of reservation will be given only to those SC/BCA/BCB/EWS/PwD and ESM candidates who are bonafide resident of Haryana State and submit the application against reserved category posts. As per letter No. 22/8/96-3GS III dated 25.06.1997, if any member/member belonging to Scheduled Castes / Backward classes is/are selected in the open competition for direct recruitment on the basis of their own merit, they will not be counted against the quota reserved for Scheduled Castes / Backward classes, they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates should fulfill conditions of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates.

7.4. EWS certificate (issued for State of Haryana) on prescribed proforma should be valid for the year in which the candidates have applied for the posts as per govt. instructions issued vide no. 22/12/2019-1GS-III, dated 25.02.2019. EWS certificate issued for jobs in Central Govt. will not be considered irrespective of income mentioned in certificate.

7.5. The candidates belonging to BC-A/BC-B categories should attach the fresh/latest BC-A or BC-B certificate as the case may be as per Haryana Government instruction issued vide no. 22/132/2013-1GS-III, dated 22.03.2022. Government notification No. 40/13/2024-1SW dated 16.07.2024 and as amended from time to time, as applicable. OBC certificate issued for jobs in Central Govt. will not be considered irrespective of income mentioned in certificate.

7.6. The reserved category candidates belonging to other States will be allowed to compete against the posts meant for general category only and will be considered as general category candidates.

7.7. Ex-serviceman
Benefit of reservation to Ex-Serviceman & their family members will be as per Government Instructions bearing No. 12/15/2019-4GS-II dated 09.03.2022 and 13.04.2022 or as amended from time to time up to the date of advertisement, viz:-

(A) An ex-serviceman who himself/herself or his/her family member has already secured employment in civil service on regular basis in any Department/ Board/Corporation/University etc. under the State Government with availing the benefit of reservation-

(i) he/she himself/herself shall not be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation in civil service for any subsequent appointment in any Department/ Board/ Corporation/University etc. under the State Government. However, the benefit of age relaxation for securing another employment in a higher pay scale or post shall remain continue; and

(ii) his/her family member shall also not be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation against the posts reserved for ex-servicemen.

(B) (i) An ex-serviceman who himself/herself has already secured employment in civil service on regular basis in any Department/ Board/ Corporation/ University etc. under the State Government without availing the benefit of reservation in such case he/she himself/herself or one of his/her family members (son, daughter or spouse) will be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation;

- (D) The family members of martyr military personnel shall be entitled to exercise an option either-
 - (i) to avail the benefit of reservation up to two family members; or
 - (ii) to avail the benefit of compassionate appointment to one of the family members under the Ex-gratia Policy namely Compassionate Appointment to family member of Martyr Armed Forces Personnel Policy notified by Government from time to time.
- (E) The priority list for recruiting agency for preparation of final list of selection/appointment of ex-servicemen or their family members against the posts reserved for ex-servicemen shall be as under:-
 - (i) disabled ex-servicemen, the post(s) for which they are physically fit;
 - (ii) failing (i), family member of disabled ex-servicemen;
 - (iii) failing (ii), other ex-servicemen who are eligible to get the benefit of reservation under these instructions;
 - (iv) failing (iii), family member of other ex-servicemen who are eligible to get the benefit of reservation under these instructions.
- (F) Disabled ex-serviceman means a person who has been released from military service due to disability attributable or aggravated due to military service. An ex-serviceman shall not be treated as disabled one who has been released from military service not on account of his/her disability but has been released in the normal course after the completion of his/her term or retired from military service voluntarily.
- (G) Both the reservations are horizontal, therefore, a disabled ex-serviceman who is selected against the post reserved for ex-servicemen will not be counted against the post reserved for PwD.
- (H) In all circumstances the benefit of reservation against the posts reserved for Ex-servicemen shall be admissible at the time of final selection list only and not at the time of preliminary test, main test or interview.
- (i) An ex-serviceman who has been discharged from military service by way of dismissal, misconduct or inefficiency neither he/she himself/herself nor his/her family members shall be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation in civil service.

7.8. ESM candidates shall attach attested photocopy of Identity Card issued by concerned Zila Sainik Board and Discharge certificate/ Discharge Book. Disabled ESM/Dependent of Disabled ESM shall attach disability certificate & proof that he/his/her father or husband has not been released in the normal course after the completion of his/her term or retired from military service voluntarily and family member of Martyr shall produce relevant certificate/Battle Casualty certificate which proves the Martyr status issued by competent authority.

7.9. Benefit of reservation to the children/grandchildren of Freedom Fighters will be as per Government Instruction No. 22/49/2021-IGS-III dated 27.10.2021 and 26.04.2022. Children/Grand Children of Freedom Fighter shall be required to produce the Certificate duly issued by the respective competent authority.

7.10. Commission can direct the ESM candidates to provide relevant information along with the affidavit to avail the benefits.

7.11. If for any post, there is no vacancy in reserved category, then the candidate of reserved category can apply under general category. However, such candidate will be considered as general category candidate and will be shortlisted as per merit of general category.

8. Provision of Compensatory Time and assistance of Scribe to Persons with Benchmark Disabilities:-
Following facilities will be made available to Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (Divyangjan):

8.1. In case of persons with benchmark disabilities in the category of blindness, locomotor disability (both arm affected-BA) and cerebral palsy, the scribe will be allowed, if so desired by the candidate.

8.2. In case of remaining categories of persons with benchmark disabilities, the scribe will be allowed on production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitation to write, and scribe is essential to write examination on his/her behalf, from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Physical Superintendent of a Government Health Care Institution as per proforma at Annexure-I. Candidates will be allowed the scribe only if they apply for availing the scribe facility in online application form and produce the certificate at the time of written examination as well as subsequent stages of examination as per proforma at Annexure-II.

8.3. The qualification of the scribe should be matriculation in case the minimum qualification prescribed for the post is 10+2 and if minimum qualification prescribed for the post is graduation or above then the scribe shall be matriculate or 10+2. The candidates with benchmark disabilities opting for scribe shall be required to submit details of the scribe at the time of examination as per proforma at Annexure-I. In addition, the scribe has to produce a valid ID proof in original at the time of examination. A photocopy of the ID proof of the scribe signed by the candidate as well as the scribe will be submitted at the time of written examination as well as subsequent stages of examination as per proforma at Annexure-II.

8.4. Scribe should not be a candidate of the same examination. If a candidate is detected as assisting another PwD candidate as scribe in this examination, then the candidature of both the candidates will be cancelled.

8.5. A compensatory time of 20 minutes per hour of examination will be provided to the candidates who are allowed to use of scribe as per Para 8.1 and 8.2 above.

8.6. The candidates referred at Para 8.1 and 8.2 above, who are allowed to use of scribe but not availing the facility of scribes will also be given compensatory time of 20 minutes per hour of examination.

8.7. No attendant other than the scribe for eligible candidates will be allowed inside the examination hall.

8.8. The PwD candidates who have availed the facility of Scribes and/or compensatory time shall be deemed to have availed benefit of relaxation and must produce relevant documents for the eligibility of scribe/compensatory time when called upon to do so by Commission.

9. Relaxation in Age:

(A) In accordance with public notice dated 11.05.2022, age shall be relaxed for those posts only which were withdrawn by the Commission on 13.01.2022 and only for those candidates who had applied against the said cancelled posts and who have now qualified CET-2022 for Group-C (withdrawal notice dated 13.01.2022 and public notice dated 11.05.2022 are attached at Appendix-E&F). The maximum age limit shall be considered on the last day of submission of online application form, however, the candidates who were eligible to apply and applied under Advertisement No. 03/2023 and have now become overage, are also eligible for this advertisement.

(B) As per Haryana Govt. Instructions No. 22/06/2021-IGS-III, Dated 25th March, 2022, benefit of relaxation in upper age limit, applicable to various categories, is as follows:

(i) Where the upper age limit is 42 years without any relaxation in age the same shall not exceed 52 years for the applicants who are entitled to get the benefit of relaxation in age of one or more categories under various circumstances mentioned below :-

However, relaxation to Ex-servicemen as per rules of Police or Prisons Department, Haryana.

Note 1.- For appointment of an ex-serviceman to a post of Group A, B, C or D, his age will be calculated keeping in view the actual age minus (actual period of military service plus upto three years of break, if any, between military and civil service). If the resultant age does not exceed the maximum age limit, including the number of years of any other relaxation in age admissible to him, prescribed for the post for which he is seeking appointment he shall be deemed to satisfy the condition regarding age limit.

Note 2.- The upper age limit of an applicant of any category (except Ex-servicemen) shall not exceed 52 years who is entitled to avail the benefit of relaxation in age of one or more of the categories mentioned above.

Note 3.- The experience certificate(s) of equivalent post issued by the Appointing Authority of respective Department/Board/ Corporation/Government aided Institutions only shall be valid. Before grant of benefit of relaxation in age, the experience certificate(s) shall be got verified by the HPSC/HSSC from the concerned Appointing Authority (ies).

- (ii). Age relaxation is not admissible to sons, daughters and dependents of Ex-servicemen.
- (iii) Claim of reservation etc., if any, shall be admissible to those candidates only, who upload the requisite valid original certificate along with their application in support of their claim.
- (iv) The benefit of reservation will be given only to those SC/BCA/BCB/EWS and ESM candidates who are domicile of Haryana State.
- (v) The reserved category candidates belonging to other States will compete against the posts meant for general category and will be considered as general category candidates as there is no reservation available for them.

10. How to apply:

10.1. Please read the advertisement, instructions and procedure carefully before you start filling the online application form and check all the particulars filled up in application form after getting the printout to ensure the correctness of information and upload all documents before finally submitting the application.

10.2. Apply online well in advance without waiting for last date of submission of online application form. Before submission of the online application, candidates must check that they have filled correct details in each field of the form. A candidate may edit his/her application form till the last date of submission of application forms i.e. closing date. After closing date of application, no change/correction/modification will be allowed under any circumstances. Requests received in this regard in any form like Post, Fax, Email, by hand etc. shall not be entertained and shall be deemed to be rejected.

10.3. After successful submission of application, candidates are advised to take final print out of application form for record alongwith uploaded documents.

10.4. The hard copy of application form along with all uploaded documents must be brought at the time when called upon to do so by Haryana Staff Selection Commission. Documents which have not been uploaded shall not be entertained. However, HSSC may ask an additional paper in support of already submitted document for more clarity, if required.

10.5. No request for change of any particular on the application form shall be entertained by the Haryana Staff Selection Commission after final submission.

10.6. No offline application form or copy of downloaded application form will be accepted by the Haryana Staff Selection Commission.

10.7. Candidates who do not fulfill the qualifications/eligibility conditions on cutoff date, their application shall be liable to be rejected. All the Certificates/Documents relating to educational qualification/eligibility conditions & experience etc. will be determined with regard to last date fixed to apply online applications.

10.8. The Commission does not carry out the scrutiny of the physical documents at the time of submission of online application and the same are checked only at the time of Scrutiny of documents (offline/online).

11. Experience:
For the purpose of age relaxation and essential qualification, the experience will be considered only after acquiring the essential qualification and the experience certificate should be issued by competent authority of the concerned Department/ Board/ Corporation/ Company/Statutory Body/Commission/Authority Co-operative banks etc. under Haryana Government. The details of salary, designation, date of joining, period of service and date of issuance of the certificate of the concerned post should be clearly mentioned in the experience

For essential qualifications, where there is requirement of experience, the experience from private organizations/institutions may be considered if the service rules so provides. The required experience certificate should be issued by the competent authority of the private organization/institution concerned. The details of salary, designation, date of joining, period of service and date of issuance of the certificate of the concerned post should be clearly mentioned in the experience certificate. **The copy of proforma is placed at Annexure-IV.**

12. Post Preferences:
As skill and/or written examination is being held for multiple posts/Departments in groups, therefore, detailed options for various said posts/Departments need to be filled by the candidates through online mode. A candidate will not be considered for a post/Department, if such a candidate has not given his/ her preference for the same. Options confirmed at the time of submission will be treated as final and will not be changed subsequently under any circumstances. Therefore, candidates are advised to be careful while exercising such options.

13. Scrutiny of Documents
Only those documents which are uploaded by the candidates while filling up the application form shall be considered for the purpose of scrutiny. In case of any variation in the document uploaded and produced at any subsequent stage, the candidature of such candidate shall be cancelled/rejected. If any application is found without uploading requisite supporting documents and other relevant information, the candidate himself/herself shall be responsible for the same and his/her candidature would liable to be cancelled/rejected.

Note:- The Commission does not verify that the genuineness of documents uploaded by the selected and recommended candidates with their application forms, which shall be done by the indenting department at the time of giving appointment.

14. Resolution of tie cases for final result

14.1. In case there are more than one candidate having equal aggregate marks (written examination/skill test marks the candidate who is older in age will get precedence over the younger one.

14.2. In case two or more candidates have the same aggregate marks and same date of birth. The candidates having higher marks in CET Phase -I written examination shall be considered.

15. Likely causes of rejection of application/candidature

1. More than one application form for a particular post.
2. Application is incomplete and not online.
3. No qualification of Hindi/Sanskrit as prescribed in advertisement.
4. Applicant does not possess the requisite academic qualification on cutoff date.
5. Candidate is underage/overage on the cutoff date/closing date.
6. Variation in data of online application form and in original documents if detected at any stage.
7. Lack of essential qualification as prescribed in advertisement.

Note: Candidates beyond the limit mentioned in the CET notification No. 42/119/2019-5GS-I dated 5th May, 2022 & 31st May, 2022 shall not be called for written examination.

16. Commission's Decision Final
The decision of the Commission in all matters relating to eligibility, acceptance or rejection of the applications, penalty for false information, mode of selection, short-listing for examination(s), conduct of examination(s), allotment of examination centres and preparation of merit list and allocation, debarment for indulging in malpractices will be final and binding on the candidates and no enquiry/correspondence will be entertained in this regard. Commission can anytime call candidates to capture their biometric data. In case of biometric thumb or facial mismatch of data taken at the time of examination, at time of scrutiny, before making recommendation, at the time of joining or at any other stage, candidature of candidate will be cancelled on grounds of impersonation and he/she will be debarred from the future examinations. Criminal proceedings shall also be initiated against such candidates/impersonators.

If a candidate bypass the biometric arrangements and does not provide his/her biometric/facial data or uses any other unfair means during written exam, scrutiny, physical test, joining or at any other stage, his/her candidature will be cancelled on attempt of cheating and impersonation and he/she will be debarred from the future examinations.

17.3. Scanned Photograph.

17.4. Scanned signatures of the Candidate.

17.5. Scanned copy of all documents showing higher qualification, experience etc. as per criteria if applicable

17.6. Haryana Bonafide Resident certificate if applicable.

17.7. Equivalence certificate, if applicable.

17.8. EWS certificate as per Annexure-V.

17.9. Discharge Certificate/Book, if discharged from the Armed Forces For (ESM)

17.10. Eligibility certificate for family members of ESM.

18. Important Instructions:

- (a) If the CET marks of the last candidate who has applied for the post in terms of sub-clause (i) above is achieved by more than one candidate, then all the candidates at the cut off CET marks who have applied for the post shall be entitled to be considered for appearing in the skill and/or written examination for the post(s) advertised by the Commission.
- (ii) Only those candidates, who fulfill the minimum educational qualifications and other eligibility conditions for a post advertised by the Commission on the last date specified in the advertisement issued by the Commission under sub-clause (i) above and who applied for the post for consideration shall be issued an Admit Card and be eligible to appear in the skill and/or written examination to be conducted by the Commission.
- (iv) On receipt of requisitions of the posts of different nomenclature but of similar educational qualifications, the Commission shall be competent to hold one common skill and/or written examination with the condition that the distribution/allocation shall be on merit-based option given by the successful candidates.
- (v) When the number of candidates applying under sub-clause (i) who are eligible is less than the number limit specified in the above said clause then the Commission may extend the date by publication on the website for enabling further eligible candidates to apply.
- (vi) For consideration of a candidate against a post of general category, such candidate has to secure minimum 50% marks in the skill and/or written examination to be considered for selection/recruitment. In case of consideration against the reserved category post (whether vertical or horizontal) the candidate shall receive a concession @ 10% for the purpose of eligibility for the purpose of skill and/or written examination, i.e. the minimum cut off for such candidates shall be 40% because they have been given 10% concession in minimum marks.
- (vii) The Commission shall on the basis of marks obtained in the written/skill examination shortlist the candidates for selection, recommendation or waiting list in the respective categories and publish on the website.

Note:- Save as otherwise provided in any instructions of Government, in case of non-availability of eligible candidate(s) of respective category after the skill and/or written examination for the post which remain unfilled shall be re-advertised as per reservation policy.

For consideration against a Group C post of General category, a candidate (including a candidate of reserved category who has not availed any kind of concession/relaxation of age, fee, qualification etc.) has to obtain minimum 48.75 marks (i.e. 50% of 97.5) of skill and/or written examination. However, for consideration against the same post of reserved category, a candidate of respective reserved category has to obtain minimum 39 marks (i.e. 40% of 97.5).

7. Reservation:

7.1. Implementation of reservation policy, maintaining reservation roster and earmarking of vacancies for different categories comes under the domain of the concerned departments and Commission has nothing to do with the number of posts requisitioned under different categories. 7.2. The short-listing of candidates shall be done on the basis of particulars filled in online application form for which supporting documents shall be uploaded. As candidates can update their particulars till closing date, thereafter, no change of particular at any stage shall be entertained. In absence of documentary evidence or mismatch in claimed category and uploaded documents, candidature of candidate shall be considered under General category/Parent category, subject to his/her fulfilling eligibility in General category/Parent category.

7.3. The benefit of reservation will be given only to those SC/BCA/BCB/EWS/PwD and ESM candidates who are bonafide resident of Haryana State and submit the application against reserved category posts. As per letter No. 22/88/96-3GS III dated 25.06.1997, if any member/members belonging to Scheduled Castes / Backward classes is/are selected in the open competition for direct recruitment on the basis of their own merit, they will not be counted against the quota reserved for Scheduled Castes / Backward classes, they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates should fulfill conditions of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates.

7.4. EWS certificate (valid for State of Haryana) on prescribed proforma should be valid for the year in which the candidates have applied for the posts as per govt. instructions issued vide No. 22/12/2019-1GS-II, dated 25.02.2019. **EWS certificate issued for jobs in Central Govt. will not be considered irrespective of income mentioned in certificate.**

7.5. The candidates belonging to BC-A/BC-B categories should attach the fresh/latest BC-A or BC-B certificate as the case may be as per Haryana Government instruction issued vide No. 22/132/2013-1GS-II, dated 22.03.2022. Government notification No. 40/13/2024-1SW dated 16.07.2024 and as amended from time to time, as applicable. **OBC certificate issued for jobs in Central Govt. will not be considered irrespective of income mentioned in certificate.**

7.6. The reserved category candidates belonging to other States will be allowed to compete against the posts meant for general category only and will be considered as general category candidates.

7.7. Ex-serviceman

Benefit of reservation to Ex-Serviceman & their family members will be as per Government Instructions bearing No. 12/15/2019-4GS-II dated 09.03.2022 and 13.04.2022 or as amended from time to time up to the date of advertisement, viz.-

(A) An ex-serviceman who himself/herself or his/her family member has already secured employment in civil service on regular basis in any Department/ Board/ Corporation/ University etc. under the State Government with availing the benefit of reservation-

(i) he/she himself/herself shall not be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation in civil service for any subsequent appointment in any Department/ Board/ Corporation/ University etc. under the State Government. However, the benefit of age relaxation for securing another employment in a higher pay scale or post shall remain continue; and

(ii) his/her family member shall also not be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation against the posts reserved for ex-servicemen.

(B) (i) An ex-serviceman who himself/herself has already secured employment in civil service on regular basis in any Department/ Board/ Corporation/ University etc. under the State Government without availing the benefit of reservation in such case

he/she himself/herself or one of his/her family members (son, daughter or spouse) will be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation;

(ii) where an ex-serviceman who himself/herself is eligible to avail the benefit of reservation under the instructions but he/she does not want re-employment in civil service in such case one of his/her family members (son, daughter or spouse) will be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation.

(C) If an ex-serviceman applies for various vacancies before joining any civil employment, he/she can avail the benefit of reservation as ex-serviceman for any one of the subsequent employments. However, to avail this benefit, an ex-serviceman as soon as he/she joins any civil employment should give self-declaration/undertaking to the concerned employer about the date-wise details of applications for various vacancies for which he/she had applied for before joining the initial civil employment. Further, this benefit would be admissible only in respect of vacancies which are filled by direct recruitment and wherever reservation is applicable to the ex-serviceman.

(D) The family members of martyr military personnel shall be entitled to exercise an option either-

(i) to avail the benefit of reservation up to two family members; or

(ii) to avail the benefit of compassionate appointment to one of the family members under the Ex-gratia Policy namely Compassionate Appointment to family member of Martyr Armed Forces Personnel Policy notified by Government from time to time.

(E) The priority list for recruiting agency for preparation of final list of selection/appointment of ex-servicemen or their family members against the posts reserved for ex-servicemen shall be as under:-

(i) disabled ex-servicemen, the post(s) for which they are physically fit;

(ii) failing (i), family member of disabled ex-servicemen;

(iii) failing (ii), other ex-servicemen who are eligible to get the benefit of reservation under these instructions;

(iv) failing (iii), family member of other ex-servicemen who are eligible to get the benefit of reservation under these instructions.

(F) Disabled ex-serviceman means a person who has been released from military service due to disability attributable or aggravated due to military service. An ex-serviceman shall not be treated disabled one who has been released from military service on account of his/her disability but has been released in the normal course after the completion of his/her term or retired from military service voluntarily.

(G) Both the reservations are horizontal, therefore, a disabled ex-serviceman who is selected against the post reserved for ex-serviceman will not be counted against the post reserved for PwD.

(H) In all circumstances the benefit of reservation against the posts reserved for Ex-servicemen shall be admissible at the time of final selection list only and not at the time of preliminary test, main test or interview.

(i) An ex-serviceman who have been discharged from military service by way of dismissal, misconduct or inefficiency neither he/she himself/herself nor his/her family members shall be entitled to avail the benefit of reservation in civil service.

7.8. ESM candidates shall attach attested photocopy of Identity Card issued by concerned Zila Sainik Board and Discharge certificate/Discharge Book. Disabled ESM/Dependent of Disabled ESM shall attach disability certificate & proof that he/his/his father or husband has not been released in the normal course after the completion of his/her term or retired from military service voluntarily and family member of Martyr shall produce relevant certificate/Battle Casualty certificate which proves the Martyr status issued by competent authority.

7.9. Benefit of reservation to the children/grandchildren of Freedom Fighters will be as per Government Instruction No. 22/49/2021-1GS-III dated 27.10.2021 and 26.04.2022. Children/Grand Children of Freedom Fighter shall be required to produce the Certificate duly issued by the respective competent authority.

7.10. Commission can direct the ESM candidates to provide relevant information along with the affidavit to avail the benefits.

7.11. If for any post, there is no vacancy in reserved category, then the candidate of reserved category can apply under general category. However, such candidate will be considered as general category candidate and will be shortlisted as per merit of general category.

8. Provision of Compensatory Time and assistance of Scribe to Persons with Benchmark Disabilities:-

Following facilities will be made available to Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (Divyangjan):

8.1. In case of persons with benchmark disabilities in the category of blindness, locomotor disability (both arm affected-BA) and cerebral palsy, the scribe will be allowed, if so desired by the candidate.

8.2. In case of remaining categories of persons with benchmark disabilities, the scribe will be allowed on production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitation to write, and scribe is essential to write examination on his/her behalf, from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care Institution as per proforma at Annexure-I. Candidates will be allowed the scribe only if they apply for availing the scribe facility in online application form and produce the certificate at the time of written examination as well as subsequent stages of examination as per proforma at Annexure-II.

8.3. The qualification of the scribe should be matriculation in case the minimum qualification prescribed for the post is 10+2 and if minimum qualification prescribed for the post is graduation or above then the scribe shall be matriculate or 10+2. The candidates with benchmark disabilities opting for scribe shall be required to submit details of the scribe at the time of examination as per proforma at Annexure-I. In addition, the scribe has to produce a valid ID proof in original at the time of examination. 8.7. No attendant other than the scribe for eligible candidates will be allowed inside the examination hall.

8.8. The PwD candidates who have availed the facility of Scribes and/or compensatory time shall be deemed to have availed benefit of relaxation and must produce relevant documents for the eligibility of scribe/compensatory time when called upon to do so by Commission.

(v) The reserved category candidates belonging to other States will compete against the posts meant for general category and will be considered as general category candidates as there is no reservation available for them.

10. How to apply:

10.1. Please read the advertisement, instructions and procedure carefully before you start filling the online application form and check all the particulars filled up in application form after getting the printout to ensure the correctness of information and upload all documents before finally submitting the application.

10.2. Apply online well in advance without waiting for last date of submission of online application form. Before submission of the online application, candidates must check that they have filled correct details in each field of the form. A candidate may edit his/her application form till the last date of submission of application forms i.e. closing date. After closing date of application, no change/correction/modification will be allowed under any circumstances. Requests received in this regard in any form like Post, Fax, Email, by hand etc. shall not be entertained and shall be deemed to be rejected.

10.3. After successful submission of application, candidates are advised to take final print out of application form for record alongwith uploaded documents.

10.4. The hard copy of application form along with all uploaded documents must be brought at the time when called upon to do so by Haryana Staff Selection Commission. For essential qualifications, where there is requirement of experience, the experience from private organizations/institutions may be considered if the service rules so provides. The required experience certificate should be issued by the competent authority of the private organization/institution concerned. The details of salary, designation, date of joining, period of service and date of issuance of the certificate of the concerned post should be clearly mentioned in the experience certificate. The copy of proforma is placed at Annexure-IV.

12. Post Preferences:

As skill and/or written examination is being held for multiple posts/Departments in groups, therefore, detailed options for various said posts/Departments need to be filled by the candidates through online mode. A candidate will not be considered for a post/Department, if such a candidate has not given his/ her preference for the same. Options confirmed at the time of submission will be treated as final and will not be changed subsequently under any circumstances. 13. Scrutiny of Documents

If any application is found without uploading requisite supporting documents and other relevant information, the candidate himself/herself shall be responsible for the same and his/her candidature would liable to be cancelled/rejected.

Note:- The Commission does not verify that the genuineness of documents uploaded by the selected and recommended candidates with their application forms, which shall be done by the indenting department at the time of giving appointment.

14. Resolution of the cases for final result

14.1. In case there are more than one candidate having equal aggregate marks (written examination/skill test marks the candidate who is older in age will get precedence over the younger one.

14.2. In case two or more candidates have the same aggregate marks and same date of birth. The candidates having higher marks in CET Phase -I written examination shall be considered.

15. Likely causes of rejection of application/candidature

1. More than one application form for a particular post.

2. Application is incomplete and not online.

3. No qualification of Hindi/Sanskrit as prescribed in advertisement.

4. Applicant does not possess the requisite academic qualification on cutoff date.

5. Candidate is underage/overage on the cutoff date/closing date.

7. Lack of essential qualification as prescribed in advertisement.

16. Commission's Decision Final

The decision of the Commission in all matters relating to eligibility, acceptance or rejection of the applications, penalty for false information, mode of selection, short-listing for examination(s), conduct of examination(s), allotment of examination centres and preparation of merit list and allocation, debarment for indulging in malpractices will be final and binding on the candidates and no enquiry/correspondence will be entertained in this regard. 18. Important Instructions:

NCERT drops Preamble from Classes 3, 6 books

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 5 The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) has dropped the Preamble to the Constitution from several Classes III and VI textbooks.

Earlier, the Preamble was published in the first few pages of the books of both grades. While Preamble has been omitted from all Class III textbooks, for Class VI, it has been published only in the science book 'Curiosity', and the Hindi book 'Malhar'.

This year, the NCERT has published just one book on environmental studies in place of three for Class VI. The social science textbook of Class VI does not have the Preamble, however, it does mention fundamental rights and fundamental duties.

While the new English textbook for Class VI, 'Poorvi', has the national anthem and the Sanskrit textbook, 'Deepakam', has both the national anthem and the national song, but the Preamble is absent in both. The NCERT has not official-

ASSAULT TO DESTROY CONSTITUTION

ly released any statement on the dropping of Preamble from the books. The move has invited sharp reactions from Congress. Congress spokesperson Dr Shama Mohammad wrote on X: "The Preamble to the Constitution has been dropped from several Class III and Class VI textbooks issued by the NCERT this year. The BJP govt has launched a full-scale assault to destroy India's Constitution. All parents must come together and object to this blatant attempt to erase our history!"

The NCERT had earlier removed all mentions of Babri Masjid demolition, replacing it as the "three-domed structure [that] was built at the site of Shri Ram's birthplace" in the Class 12 political science book. Meanwhile, Professor Ranjana Arora, Head of the Department of Curriculum Studies and Development at

NCERT, said the allegations regarding the removal of the Preamble from the NCERT textbooks did not have a sound basis. "For the first time, the NCERT is giving great importance to various facets of the Indian Constitution- Preamble, fundamental duties, fundamental rights and the national anthem. All these are being placed in various textbooks of various stages," she said. "The understanding that only the Preamble reflects the Constitution and constitutional values is flawed and narrow. Why should children not acquire constitutional values from fundamental duties, fundamental rights and national anthem along with Preamble? We give equal importance to all of these for the holistic development of children following the vision of NEP-2020," Ranjana added.

SC extends stay on eatery order by U'khand, UP

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 5 The Supreme Court on Monday extended the interim stay on the orders of Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand governments to display names of their owners and employees.

A Bench of Justices Hrishikesh Roy and R Mahadevan extended the July 22 interim order as it could not take up the matter due to paucity of time.

The yatra is undertaken by lakhs of devotees of Lord Shiva during the Shravan month of Hindu calendar every year. This year, it began on July 22 and will end on August 19.

When a lawyer requested the Bench for an early hearing, it didn't specify any date and simply said a date would be given.

The Uttar Pradesh Government defended its directive requiring eateries along the yatra route to display the names of their owners and staff, saying that the idea was to bring in transparency, avoid "potential confusion" and ensure a peaceful yatra.

CBI, ED oppose Sisodia's bail pleas before apex court

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 5 The CBI and the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Monday opposed senior AAP leader Manish Sisodia's bail pleas before the Supreme Court in corruption and money-laundering cases linked to the excise policy scam, saying that documents showed his neck-deep involvement in the scam.

"Sisodia is not an innocent person picked up for political reasons... He is neck-deep in the scam," Additional Solicitor General (ASG) SV Raju told a Bench led by Justice BR Gavi.

Raju said Sisodia's petition for revival of his bail pleas was "not maintainable" and that

he should go to the trial court for bail.

On behalf of the former Delhi Deputy CM, senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi said there were 493 witnesses and 69,000 pages of documents in the corruption and money-laundering case and it would take a long time to conclude the trial. "Why should I (Sisodia) be in jail after 17 months is the larger liberty question... What's the purpose of keeping me behind bars?" Singhvi wondered. "Where do you draw the line between policy and criminality?" asked the Bench, which deferred the matter to next week as arguments remained inconclusive.

The matter relates to alleged corruption and money laun-

dering in the formulation and execution of the Delhi Government's excise policy for 2021-22, which now stands scrapped.

Sisodia was arrested by the CBI on February 26, 2023, for his alleged role in the "scam" and he resigned from the Delhi Cabinet two days later. The ED arrested him in a money-laundering case related to the scam on March 9, 2023, after questioning him in Tihar Jail.

The former Delhi Deputy CM - who has been denied bail by the top court in the past - has sought to revive his petitions in the cases. He has sought bail contending that he has been in custody for 16 months and the trial against him has not made any progress since October 2023.

Next week, SC to take up pleas on criminalising marital rape

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 5 The Supreme Court will hear next week petitions seeking to criminalise marital rape.

Currently, a man enjoys immunity from prosecution for rape, if he forces his wife, who is not a minor, to have sex. A Bench led by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud on Monday assured senior advocate Karuna Nandy that the matter would be taken up next week after she urged the CJI to list it for hearing as it would deal with petitions on taxation laws this week.

Nine NDA-ruled states and the UT of Jammu and Kashmir have moved the Supreme Court seeking to be heard on the contentious issue.

Injured Nisha loses in quarters

PARIS, AUGUST 5
Indian grappler Nisha Dahiya was left sobbing in acute pain after she lost her quarterfinal bout against North Korea's Pak Sol Gum 8-10 in the women's 68 kg freestyle category at the Paris Olympics. Leading 8-1 at one point in time with just over 90 seconds left, Nisha sustained a serious injury on her right hand, which left her in agonising pain as she wept inconsolably.

Following a medical break, Nisha didn't have any strength left in her right hand and it became a cake-walk for the North Korean, who showed her ruthless streak to get a leg-hold and nine straight points.


In fact, with 10 seconds left, the scoreline was 8-8 but the writing was on the wall as the Haryana woman surrendered in the dying moments without a fight.

Nisha might have a shot at repechage if her North Korean opponent reaches final, but whether she will be in a position to even take the mat is a bigger question as she wept inconsolably after the bout.

Earlier, Nisha had won her opening bout against Ukraine's Sova Rizhko 6-4 as the wrestling competition got underway at the Games.

India's only entry in the heavyweight category, Nisha is an Asian Championships silver medalist and got the better of her opponent from Ukraine without much trouble.

Meanwhile, most of the Indian women wrestlers, who have checked in at the Games Village, are spending significant amount of time in co-ordination of daily passes for their personal coaches and physios when their sole focus should have been on training. — PTI

Lakshya loses bronze playoff to Lee, India's badminton campaign over

LEADING 21-13 8-3, LAKSHYA SEN BECAME SHAKY AND VULNERABLE AS MALAYSIA'S JIA LEE ZIA FOUND HIS RANGE, HIS STYLE AND HIS AGGRESSION. PTI

ROHIT MAHAJAN IN PARIS

FOR the second time in two days, lightning struck Lakshya Sen at badminton Court 1, La Chapelle Arena.

There was blood on the floor, heartbreak in the air. Sen, dreaming of gold yesterday, let his mind wander at 20-17 in the first game against Viktor Axelsen. Today, his mind on the bronze, and it wandered, his game went to pieces. Like Axelsen yesterday, Jia Lee Zia grabbed his chance and broke Sen's heart yet again, winning the bronze playoff 13-21 21-16 21-11.

Minutes after the loss, Sen seemed to be sleepwalking, his mind numb. "At the moment I am not able to..." he said before his voice trailed off. "Midway in the sets, the blood was on the floor. They had to wipe it, and I lost some of my momentum."

Blood oozed out of Sen's right elbow, from an injury he suffered while diving to pick up a Lee smash.

Sen had beaten Lee four times in their five previous encounters, and his nightmare had a dream start today. Lee, man with a power game but also inconsistent, eschewed his usual attacking style and tried to engage Sen in a game that Sen enjoys — delicate touches at the net, half-smashes, crosscourt flicks and drops; moreover, Lee made far too many errors for comfort — there has been a draught in the hall, and the Malaysian struggled to put just the right amount of power in his overhead strokes.

Lee sent the shuttle long and wide far too often; Sen, expecting more such free points, also made errors of judgement on the backline, leaving the shuttle only to see it fall at the line at least four times. Yet, moving swiftly across the court, picking up the smashes, he kept his nose ahead. He won points at the net, and with powerful body smashes — Sen led 15-10, 17-11 and needed only one

Lee started smashing it hard, and won the first of his nine points in a row with three smashes — Sen, diving right, picked up two, but could not return the third. 8-4 for Sen. The Indian then hit long, and Lee smashed into Sen's body — 6-8. Sen was looking edgy and desperate, perhaps troubled by the memories of yesterday — overeager; he smashed into the net, dropped into the net, and sent it wide, and sent it high for Lee to smash it down. In a trice, Sen was down 8-10.

Sen's judgement began to fail him — he let the shuttle drop well inside the baseline, and nearly did it a second time. He was shaky on return of serve, and at 15-17, he sent up a return that sat up over the net for Lee to smash it down volleyball-style.

The Indians in the stands waved the flag, urged him to "fight", shouted "jeetaga bhai jeetega, India jeetega". But no amount of pleadings by the crowd, no amount of counsel from coaches

Prakash Padukone and Vimal Kumar could put Sen's game together again.

The third game, it was one way traffic once again and Sen's game went horribly awry. The injury on his right elbow — for which play had to be halted, for him to get his arm bandaged — would have hurt, but it's in the mind that Sen lost the match and bronze.

"I just tried to switch the strategy, tried to overturn the lead," said Lee, explaining his sudden turn to aggression in the second game. "I was trying not to give up. I tried to turn the game more attacking, smashing."

Axelson, who won his second consecutive Olympics gold, offered some words of consolation to Sen: "He's such a strong opponent. He's fast, very tough opponent. He gets so many shots back!"

Praise from the world's greatest player, however, would be scant consolation for a man nursing a heart broken twice in two days.

Lyles takes victory by finest margin

Then the mist lifted, the two men were separated by advanced machinery that measures time at these events — Lyles' timing was expanded to 9.784, Thompson's to 9.789. Victory to the American by five-thousandths of a second — by perhaps the width of a fingernail, the dust on Lyles' shoes.

Fred Kerley won bronze in 9.81, and every man on the track easily finished under 10 seconds in the final late on Sunday night.

Lyles was the last man on the track after 30 metres; after 60 metres, he trailed both Kerley and Thompson.

Then, over the last 40 metres, Lyles ate up ground with his massive strides, and at the finish line, it was too close to call — it's cruel that Thompson's work over the years in his quest for gold had to come down to the final metre, for he had won the first 99 metres.

"It just goes to show races aren't won with starts," Lyles said later.

When they were introduced by the announcer before the race, Lyles ran

down the halfway, roaring, Thompson shouted and Kerley put his fingers to his lips.

Then, unexpectedly, a strange wait lasting a few minutes — the floodlights had been switched off for the build-up, and they took time to return to full brightness.

Lyle, beaten to second in the semifinals by Jamaica's Oblique Seville, grew calmer and confident.

Lyles did the 100m in 44 strides, one fewer than Thompson's 45; at 60 metres, Thompson may have hit peak speed, but Lyles was still accelerating.

Lyles did the final 40 metres in 3.35 seconds, Thompson in 3.38. That made all the difference.

In a flash, it was all over, and began the few moments of

anxiousness for the sprinters.

"It's the one I wanted, it's the hard battle, it's the amazing opponents," said Lyles after becoming the first American man to win the 100m gold since Justin Gatlin in 2004.

Lyles thought Thompson had won. "I did not think I won, I didn't think I dipped at the right time, too early," the 27-year-old said. "I even went up to Kishane while we were waiting and said 'I think you got that one.' But then my name popped up and I thought 'oh my gosh, I'm amazing'."

Lyles' 100m victory takes him halfway to the 100-200m double, which he wants to achieve to emulate fellow Americans Carl Lewis and Jesse Owens.

Ukrainian athletes spread joy in time of war

Yaroslava Mahuchikh, 22, eyes lined with golden mascara, smiles and smiles — and then speaks words that reveal a breaking heart.

"In my country, Russia killed people. Almost 500 sportsmen have died in this war," she said. "They'll never live again. They will never compete again. They'll never celebrate. They'll never feel this atmosphere."

"I'm happy with this gold medal, it's really for all of them," said Yaroslava from Ukraine, minutes after winning the women's high jump gold at Stade de France.

In the face of the horrors and tragedies of war, it's impossible to believe that sport is important — yet Yaroslava said sport is very, very important. If she says so, we must defer, because she's a two-time Olympic medalist, a world record holder, and a refugee from war.

Yaroslava's home in Dnipro is only around 100km from the war frontline. Soon after the war started, she hastily left the town, putting into her car whatever lay to hand, fleeing the sounds and sights of gunfire and battle.

The bronze was shared by another Ukrainian, Iryna Gerashchenko, another refugee from war. She talked about how she trains in fear all the time, for battle often comes to her hometown, Kyiv, where the beings she loves

Kokhan, a jovial man of 22 who once competed in javelin, also believes that sport in the time of war is not a frivolous activity. "For us, for people from Ukraine, I hope they would be a bit happier today, and we can share our happiness with them," said the towering young man. "This medal is for our people. Equity benchmark indices BSE Sensex and the NSE Nifty fell sharply on Monday to end in the red, in tandem with losses among global peers.

At the end of session, Sensex was at 78,759.40, down as much as 2,222.5 points or 2.74 per cent. The index plunged nearly 3 per cent to hit the day's low of 78,295.86 on Monday. Similarly, the Nifty50 also tumbled 662.10 points or 2.68 per cent to settle at 24,055.60. After posting a gap-down opening, the index tumbled 3.33 per cent to hit Monday's low of 23,893.70.

Vishnu Kant Upadhyay, AVP, Research and Advisory, at Master Capital Services Ltd, said the Indian indices experienced a continued decline for the second consecutive session, with the Nifty50 plummeting nearly 3.5% and the Sensex dropping more than 4% from their all-time highs recorded last week. "This significant sell-off in domestic equities has been primarily driven by weak global senti-

PAK-CHINA HAND?

Former High Commissioner to Bangladesh Veena Sikri on Monday said instability in Bangladesh was "worrying for India" and the government was maintaining the highest level of vigil along the nearly 4,000-km-long border with the violence-hit nation.

She flagged the growing prominence in Bangladesh of banned Jamaat-e-Islami, known for proximity to Pakistan's ISI, as a sign of concern for India. Noting that students' movement for abolition of quotas had morphed into a political protest with Jamaat-e-Islami's student wing known to having become involved, Sikri said a foreign hand in the developments on India's border could not be ruled out. The only woman to serve as the High Commissioner to Bangladesh (2003-06), Sikri said the first indications of a possible foreign hand surfaced when the top Chinese leadership cold-shouldered Sheikh Hasina during her recent visit to the country. "The most recent indicator of this (a foreign hand) was

when Sheikh Hasina's visit to China went very badly. China did not accord her a proper welcome. Xi Jinping did not give her a separate meeting. This was uncharacteristic of China. One could not fathom why China did this. But now, one can see. The Pakistan-China nexus is very strong," said Sikri. She said Sheikh Hasina had been on the same page as protesting students on the quota issue and those who vandalised the statue of Bangladesh liberation hero and Sheikh Hasina's father Sheikh Mujibur Rahman today are not students but protesters. Sikri was referring to Jamaat-e-Islami's student wing Islami Chatra Shibir and others who infiltrated the students' anti-quota agitation in Bangladesh.

Students, she said, were at the forefront of the war for Bangladesh liberation and are "very patriotic." Referring to Bangladesh army chief's invitation to Jamaat-e-Islami for talks and his assertion that Sheikh Hasina's Awami League would not be engaged, Sikri said the growing role of Jamaat-e-Islami in Bangladesh to be close to Pakistan, is a worrying sign for India. "Jamaat-e-Islami's role seems to be a very large one. It forces us to think whether there is a Pakistan-China hand behind the developments in Bangladesh," she said, adding that India is very worried about this instability and wants the situation to calm down. Sikri warned that instability in Bangladesh could have a spill-over effect in India and the BSF which guards our borders with Bangladesh would be in a state of high alert.

On Hasina's future, the former diplomat said it was not known if India would be her interim stop or if she has sought refuge here. "There is a lot of talk that she may go to London or Belarus. Sheikh Hasina spent many years in India after her father's brutal assassination," the former diplomat added.

Lt Col, Major face court martial for manhandling 3 subordinates

Two Army doctors, a Lieutenant Colonel and a Major, are facing trial by general court martial (GCM) for allegedly manhandling and misbehaving with three subordinates during a social function at an Army training centre.

Five charges have been levelled against the officers under Sections 45 and 47 of the Army Act for behaving in a manner unbecoming of an officer, and using criminal force to a person subordinate in rank, sources said. The GCM, convened recently by General Officer Commanding, Purva Uttar Pradesh and Mad-

hya Pradesh Sub Area, Maj Gen RR Bhat is in progress. The incident had taken place at the Dogra Regimental Centre when the station's quick reaction team (QRT), headed by a non-commissioned officer (NCO) was summoned over a disturbance during the function. The officers have been accused of forcibly pulling the NCO's service rifle, pushing and slapping him and pulling his uniform belt. Sources said the NCO had been in an inebriated state when on duty and was also later tried by a summary court martial. The Major has also been charged with snatching the mobile of a junior commis-

sioned officer (JCO), pushing him by the neck and forcibly holding the arm of another JCO and slapping him. The Lieutenant Colonel has also been charged with attempting to influence the fair medical diagnosis of the NCO and a JCO involved in the matter by telling the duty medical officer that they were consuming alcohol chronically. Another Major from the Regimental Centre is also facing five charges of inappropriate behaviour that include hitting a civilian disc jockey at the aforementioned function and disobeying lawful command by not meeting his superior officer when directed to do so.

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
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
