Nobel laureate to lead interim govt | Ex-PM Khaleda freed from house arrest

Bangladesh President Mohammed Shahabuddin dissolved Parliament on Tuesday, paving the way for an interim government and fresh elections even as former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina may be in India for a few more days following the UK's hesitation to provide her refuge.

The President also freed from house arrest Bangladesh Nationalist Party chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia, a former Prime Minister and Hasina's arch-rival. Khaleda (79) is the wife of Lt Gen Ziaur Rehman, the army chief of Bangladesh when Hasina's father Sheikh Mujibur Rehman was assassinated in 1975.

As the army took charge on Monday and the death toll in the violence in which temples were also attacked rose to 440, the Anti-Discrimination Student Movement (ADSM), an outfit that spearheaded the massive protests, said 84-year-old Nobel laureate Mohammad Yunus was appointed the head of the interim government. Student protesters had threatened more demonstrations if Parliament was not dissolved.

LEADER'S HOTEL TORCHED; 24 DEAD

Dhaka: At least 24 persons were burnt alive by a mob at a star hotel owned by a leader of Awami League party after PM Sheikh Hasina's ouster, sources said on Tuesday. The victims, mostly boarders, were burnt alive as the mob set afire Zabir International Hotel owned by district Awami League general secretary Shahin Chakraborty in Jashor district. PTI

A number of Hindu temples, households and businesses were vandalised, women assaulted and at least two Hindu leaders affiliated with the Hasina-headed Awami League were killed in the violence after she fled the country.

News agency PTI said the decision to dissolve Parliament was taken following the President's discussions with the three armed forces chiefs, leaders of different

political parties, representatives of civil society and leaders of the ADSM.

In a video posted on social media early Tuesday, ADSM's key coordinator Nahid Islam proposed the

Nobel laureate as the head of the interim government. He said they had already spoken with Yunus, and that he had agreed to take the responsibility. "No government other than the one proposed by the students will be accepted. As we have said, no military government or one backed by the military or a government of fascists will be accepted," said Nahid, flanked by two other coordinators.

Currently abroad, Yunus welcomed Hasina's ouster, describing the development as the "second liberation" of the country. He won the Nobel Peace Prize in 2006 for his anti-poverty campaign through the Grameen Bank, a mode replicated across continents.

The death toll in the anti-government protests climbed to 440 today, with 100 more deaths reported after Hasina's departure. The former PM's plan to travel to London hit a roadblock over some "uncertainties" and she is likely to stay in India for the next couple of days.

Hasina, who landed at the Hindon airbase on Monday in a C-130J military transport aircraft hours after resigning as the Prime Minister, has been shifted to an unspecified

'Watching closely', says Centre on Rahul's 'foreign hand' query

India made its first formal remarks on the Bangladesh crisis today as External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said the situation in the neighbouring nation was still evolving and there was concern regarding the safety and security of minorities and their religious places.

The government also convened an all-party meeting and briefed political outfits about the evolving situation in Bangladesh. It said a close watch was being kept on the extremely fluid situation.

Jaishankar, in a suo motu statement in both houses of Parliament, said former PM Sheikh Hasina requested for approval at very short notice to come to India "for the moment". "Our understanding is that after a meeting with leaders of the security establishment, PM Hasina apparently decided to resign. At very short notice, she requested approval to come, for the moment, to India," he said.

Hasina had resigned yesterday and was evacuated on a military plane to India. She flew into the Hindon airbase near Delhi.

The minister said it was "particularly worrying that minorities, their businesses and temples had come under attack at multiple locations". He said the Indian border-guarding forces had been instructed to be "exceptionally alert in view of the complex situation". and Sylhet were provided the required security protection.

At the all-party meeting, Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi asked Jaishankar if there was a foreign hand, principally Pakistan, involved in Bangladesh. The government did not rule out a foreign hand, but sufficed to say that the situation was too fluid and the Indian Government had been keeping a very close watch. 'Will gainfully employ all former Agniveers'

Underlining the BJP's commitment to the state's youth, Haryana CM Nayab Singh Saini on Tuesday vowed to gainfully employ every single Agniveer on the completion of the stipulated four-year service in the armed forces.

In an interview to *The Tribune*, the CM admitted that the Agniveer scheme adversely impacted the party in the Lok Sabha elections. Saini said the BJP lost five of the 10 seats in Haryana because of

Becomes 1st Indian woman wrestler to enter Oly final, secures medal

VINESH Phogat, given up as a lost cause by Indian wrestling officials not long back, will fight Sarah Hildebrandt of the US for gold on Wednesday. Vinesh beat Cuba's Yusneylis Guzman Lopez in the 50kg freestyle semifinals with ease to enter the final, becoming the first Indian woman to make it to the final round.

Vinesh, her singlet drenched in sweat, her arms akimbo, her breath short, walks by, looking as far from being a superwoman as is possible—but rest assured, she's a superwoman. Vinesh, with two Olympics nightmares in her memory bank, kept the dream of a gold alive when she entered the final, having beaten Ukraine's Oksana Livach in the semis. Consider this: Over the last couple of years, Vinesh has led the movement against former MP Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh over sexual molestation charges; she's dropped down from 53kg to 50kg in the Olympics after being deposed

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HC not subordinate to top court, says Justice Sehrawat

The Punjab and Haryana High Court has emphasised that it is not subordinate to the Supreme Court and there is no scope for the Supreme Court to issue sundry directions to a high court regarding specific proceedings pending before it. Highlighting its independent status.

Justice Rajbir Sehrawat made it clear that the relationship between a high court and the Supreme Court was not akin to that between a high court and a Civil Judge (Junior Division) within its jurisdiction.

The assertion came in a case where the apex court had stayed contempt proceedings before the high court. "Probably more caution on the part of the Supreme Court would have been more appropriate," he declared. The judge added that such an order from a psychological perspective appeared to be driven by two primary factors: first, a reluctance to take responsibility for the likely consequences under the guise that a stay on contempt proceedings did adversely affect anybody; and second, "a tendency to presume the Supreme Court to be more 'supreme' than it actually is and to presume a high court to be lesser 'high' than it constitutionally is".

lem of constitutional conformity vis-à-vis the court compliance, besides increasing the pendency before the high court by one more case. "One never knows how many more cases in execution and contempt petition may have been kept pending throughout the country because of such orders," he asserted.

Referring to the legal provisions, he said the high court's power under Article 215 was articulated in the same language as Article 129, which granted the Supreme Court authority to punish for contempt of its own orders. The power to initiate and continue proceedings for alleged contempt with regard to an order passed by it was exclusively

with the high court in terms of Article 215 of the Constitution and Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, he said.

The SC had no role in this aspect, except in an appeal against an HC Division Bench order convicting a contemner. According to the provisions of the Act, an appeal against an order passed by a Single Bench did not go directly to the SC. Instead, it was heard by the high court Division Bench. Its powers were defined, both in terms of the appeal's stage and the type of order it could issue. "It is highly doubtful if the Supreme Court has any such power to stay operation of Article 215 of the Constitution of India and the Contempt of Courts Act, per se," he added.

After losing Lok Sabha poll, Ranjit eyes BJP ticket from Rania

Energy Minister Ranjit Singh today said he would seek reelection from Rania Assembly constituency in Sirsa district.

Rania is a tehsil which witnessed agitation on the demand for upgrade to subdivision status recently. Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini had assured the delegation of protesters on Saturday to upgrade Rania to subdivision in the next rally in Rania.

Ranjit Singh had won the previous Assembly election as an Independent. He was among the first MLAs to extend support to the BJP, which fell short of the majority mark in the 2019 Assembly elections. However, he had joined the BJP just before the Lok Sabha elections and was nominated by the party as candidate from Hisar Lok Sabha seat. However, he lost the election to Congress's Jai Prakash.

Ranjit Singh, son of former Deputy Prime Minister Devi Lal, has been serving as Energy and Jails Minister in Haryana's BJP government since 2019. Though he resigned from the Assembly, he continues to serve as the Cabinet Minister in the Haryana Government led by Nayab Saini.

He was close to former Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar and was also retained in the Saini government on change of guard in Haryana just ahead of the Lok Sabha polls. "I expect the BJP will nominate me from the Rania Assembly constituency. And I hope I qualify the conditions for the nomination," he said.

'Bhupinder Hooda anti-Dalit, can't see beyond son'

Lashing out at the Congress over its "dynastic politics", Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini has said Leader of Opposition Bhupinder Singh Hooda is overlooking claims of senior party leaders to project his son, Rohtak MP Deepender Hooda, as the CM face in Haryana.

In a freewheeling interview to The Tribune on the show #DecodeHaryana, Saini dared the Congress to name an OBC leader as the CM face. "Hooda is anti-Dalit and he can't see beyond his son. What he did to Ashok Tanwar (a Dalit leader of the Congress who sought refuge in the BJP), he will repeat with Sirsa MP Kumari Selja. There are no posters of the two leaders together and they haven't shared the stage. Selja won on her own account. Hooda did not once campaign for her in the Lok Sabha elections," the CM said.

Taking a dig at the senior Congress leader for failing to see any leader beyond his son, Saini said Bhupinder Hooda was solely focused on projecting his son as the only leader in the party. "Things have come to such a pass that Hooda had to visit a Congress leader's house to dissuade him from quitting the Congress. The Congress is a divided house where politics goes from father to son to grandson," Saini said.

Between redressing the grievances of the public which starts to arrive at his residence since early morning and holding meetings with delegations calling on him, Saini believes in being available to the public he serves. "Our alliance is with the people of Haryana. We need and have the support of the public. The people are our Gods. I have repeatedly stated that if the officers fail to listen to the public, their CM is always available for them," he maintained.

Listing out Jat leaders in his party, the CM said Jat leader Birender Singh, who had quit the BJP to return to the Congress, was not even able to get ticket for his son, a former MP with the BJP.

"Hooda wants to finish off the entire Congress leadership in the state. In the BJP, Birender Singh was made a union minister, his son was an MP from Hisar while his wife was an MLA. What more can the party give to him? He still quit the party. Recently Congress leader Kiran Choudhry joined the BJP because of the trouble Hooda was creating for her," the CM remarked.

In Haryana's caste-centric politics, Saini admitted that the elevation of OBCs will be a key instrument of the BJP's political strategy in the coming Assembly elections, likely in October. Singing peans of praise for Modi, Saini said he gave this honour to OBCs,

while the Congress has only exploited them. He asked, "Why shouldn't the OBCs rally behind the BJP?"

While the Haryana CM untiringly spoke of the many IITs and ITIs, medical colleges and development projects that the BJP rule had ushered into Haryana and often brought up the visionary policies of PM Modi, Saini did not blink an eye as he talked about the "guru-shishya" relationship between himself and his predecessor, Manohar Lal Khattar, now a minister in the Modi government in Delhi.

"Union Minister Manohar Lal Khattar hand-held me right through my political career. He will forever be everything to me. He is my Guru and the Opposition, essentially the Congress, is right about that. We in BJP are not a father-son team. Our leaders come from the workers," the CM explained.

Terming "honour killings" as an "individual issue", Saini said the state did not come into this family picture. "If we are not punishing the guilty after a crime is committed, the government is responsible. If that is not the case and an accused is arrested and put behind bars, it is unfair to lay the blame at my doorstep," he said, adding that Haryana encouraged registration of cases for all crimes. "We have made Haryana a zero FIR state," he added.

₹651 cr grant okayed, but PRIs want curbs on spending to go

Even as the State Finance Commission (SFC) has released a grant of Rs 651 crore for the state Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs), sarpanches and zila parishad members have alleged they are unable to utilise the funds due to curbs on spending imposed by the state government.

The SFC has issued installments for the first and second quarters for 2024-25 to all PRIs, including panchayats, panchayat samitis and zila parishads. As per the SFC, 6,226 gram panchayats will get a total of Rs 488.88 crore, panchayat samitis Rs 97.77 crore and zila parishads Rs 65.18 crore. The rural bodies are empowered to utilise these grants as per the PRI Act.

However, sarpanches and members of panchayat samitis and zila parishads have expressed resentment over not having enough powers to utilise the development grants.

Ranbir Singh Samain, president, Haryana Sarpanches Association, said the government had not fully implemented the provisions of the Panchayati Raj Act, which had hampered development works. He alleged though Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini had announced a hike in the spending limit of gram panchayats from Rs 5 lakh to Rs 21 lakh, but the issue remained unresolved.

"There are many works which the panchayats want to undertake. But the division of works as per the work table has tied their hands. We have been demanding amendments to the work table, but the government is not paying any heed," he said, adding their struggle would continue till the Panchayati Raj Act was implemented



PANCHAYATS CAN SPEND UP TO ₹5 LAKH

in letter and spirit.

"We have been demanding ease of restrictions like work table and lengthy procedures which are hampering the functioning of the Panchayati Raj Institutions," he said.

An official, however, claimed Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini had accepted the demand of the panchayats to increase their power to spend up to Rs 21 lakh without e-tendering. "The issue stands resolved now," he claimed.

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Karnal farmers to supply 1 LMT crop residue to ethanol plant in Panipat

Farmers from Karnal district will supply one lakh metric tonnes (MT) of stubble to Indian Oil Corporation Limited's (IOCL) second generation (2G) ethanol plant in Panipat. This initiative is a part of the district administration's efforts to manage crop residue and prevent stubble burning, which contributes to several environmental and health challenges. To collect the supply, the IOCL has expanded its collection yards from five to six. These yards will temporarily store the crop residue before it is transported to the Panipat plant, where it will be converted into ethanol.

Last year, farmers in the region supplied nearly 90,000 MT of stubble from these centres in the district, of which Bhamberheri depot supplied 13,608 MT, Agarda 13,844 MT, Amnupur 19,602 MT, Jamalpur 16,680 MT and Bandrala in Assandh 16,190 MT, said Dr Wazir Singh, Deputy Director Agriculture.

"Deputy Commissioner Uttam Singh has conducted a meeting in this regard of all stakeholders, focusing on farmer awareness, information, and communication activities. Subsidies on agricultural machinery were also discussed," said the Deputy Director. Monitoring and enforcement measures,


Calls meeting on August 20 to chalk out further course of action

The HSKM leader claimed they had already submitted a charter of 32 demands to the government, including regressive amendments to the Land Acquisition Act, 2013 by diluting the pro-farmer clauses with an intention to facilitate the corporates but surprisingly, instead of fulfilling them, the government was making such announcements which seemed to be impractical at a time when the Assembly polls are just two months away, he pointed out.

Meanwhile, BJP state spokesman and former minister Krishan Murti Hooda said there can be no greater step for the welfare of farmers than the procurement of all their crops at the MSP and the BJP government had done it. "The CM has won the heart of farmers by taking this historical step. It is also a befitting reply to the Congress, which makes tall claims about the farmers' welfare but does nothing on coming to power. We will reach out to farmers to apprise them of this announcement, which will prove instrumental not only in raising their income but also in promoting farming," said Murti.

Absence of legal guarantee on MSP worries farmers

Even as the Haryana Government has decided to procure all crops at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) in the state, the farmer unions said the absence of legal guarantee on the MSP continues to be a major concern for the farmers. Welcoming the move of the government, Bhartiya Kisan Union (Charuni) spokesman Rakesh Bains, who had filed a case in the Punjab and Haryana High Court in 2014 seeking MSP on all crops, said, "The government has finally accepted that the crops must be procured on the MSP and we welcome the government's decision. But the absence of legal guarantee continues to be a matter of concern. The demand of legal guarantee on the MSP is a major reason behind the farmers' agitation and the government should provide a legal guarantee to make sure the crops are not sold below the MSP even during the procurement by private players."

Bhartiya Kisan Union Charuni chief Gurnam Singh said, "The decision taken by the government is a big victory for the farmers as we have been struggling for years to get the MSP on all crops. We request the government to include rabi maize in the list of crops to be procured on the MSP in Haryana and also push for a law on legal guarantee on the MSP so that even the future governments can procure the crops on the MSP."

Highway projects likely to miss deadline due to scarcity of soil

The non-availability of soil in the vicinity for its various ongoing projects in the region has become a matter of concern for the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI).

According to information, a number of projects, including the Ambala Ring Road, Karnal Ring Road, Shamli Ambala NH 344-GM, Jagadhri-Tajewalla Highway, Ismailabad-Ambala NH 152, and Ambala-Chandigarh highway are under progress and the issue of soil may affect the projects.

Sources said, "The issue of soil has been affecting the speed of NHAI projects.

GOVT ASSURES POSITIVE STEPS

"The NHAI has raised the issue with the Haryana Government and it has assured that soon some positive steps will be taken to ensure that the NHAI gets soil for the infrastructural projects in the state. - NHAI official

The contractors have been arranging soil from far away locations but there is a scarcity of soil. It will not only increase the cost of the project, but the projects may also miss their deadline too and cause inconvenience to the commuters. Most of the projects have their deadlines next year."

The projects are running two to three months behind their schedule due to various reasons, including rains and

shortage of soil in the vicinity. The NHAI has suggested to ensure that the soil is arranged in the vicinity for the ongoing projects so that the work could be completed in time," the sources said. An official in the NHAI said, "Most of these projects are green field highways and they require a huge quantum of soil. A ring road is being constructed to ease the traffic congestion of Ambala. The

total length of the ring road project is about 55 km long of which 15 km four-lane stretch is already constructed from Balana village to Sadopur, while the work on the remaining 40 km is under progress. The Ambala ring road is an ambitious project and similarly the other projects will help ease the traffic congestion on highways and make commuting safer."

"The NHAI has raised the issue with the Haryana Government and it has assured that soon some positive steps will be taken to ensure that the NHAI gets soil for the infrastructural projects in the state. All efforts are being made to complete the projects in time," he added.

3,000 AI-enabled cameras to be installed at border: CM

PHILLAUR/HOSHARPUR, AUG 6 Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Tuesday said that around 3,000 AI-enabled cameras would be installed at the borders for keeping a check on smuggling of drugs, weapons and other items.

Mann said this at a function held to distribute appointment letters to 443 officers in police, Law and Justice and Home Affairs Departments at the Punjab Police Academy in Phillaur. He said the focus was on modernising the police force and Rs 45 crore had already been sanctioned for introducing AI in policing.

The CM said the state government would soon recruit 10,000 more cops for which a notification had already been issued. He said 44,250 government jobs had already been given to the youth so far. "Till now, 19 toll plazas have been closed in the state, including the two that were shut yesterday night," he said. The commuters would save around Rs 63 lakh daily due to the closing of these toll plazas, he added.

The CM said that for the

first time, 410 hi-tech vehicles had been given to the SHOs. He said the Sadak Surakhya Force had got a fleet of 144 vehicles in the first phase. Over 1,000 lives had been saved by the force since its launch in February, he added.

Addressing a state-level function to mark Van Mahotsav at Hoshiarpur, the CM launched a Rs 45-crore carbon credit scheme. He said the project had been launched with the help of TERI. As a pilot project, 3,686 farmers from across the state would be given the amount in four instalments. Mann also distributed cheques

worth Rs 1.75 crore to 818 farmers of Hoshiarpur district as the first instalment under the scheme. The CM said these funds would be transferred to the farmers through the direct benefit scheme.

The CM said when he assumed the charge of office only 21 per cent canal water was being used for irrigation which had now increased to 72 per cent. Mann said the 150-km-long New Kandi Canal was being constructed at a cost of Rs 2,300 crore. It would help irrigate 11,000 acres. A 206-MW dam would also be established at Dhar Kalan.

Sukhbir's apology means nothing; SAD, SGPC stand exposed: Experts

Termining the apology by SAD president Sukhbir Badal to Akal Takht as "vague", a cross-section of politicians and experts in religious studies say that the SAD and the SGPC have exposed themselves by using Takht politics for personal benefits.

Giani Kewal Singh, former jathedar of Takht Sri Damdama Sahib, says that before taking any decision, the five high priests should engage a retired judge and a panel of Sikh intellectuals to scrutinise the "unanswered" questions hovering in the mind and soul of the Sikh community in regard to the incidents of 2015.

While Prof Paramvir Singh, Department of Sikhism, Punjabi University, Patiala, asserts: "Everyone stands exposed," Dr Kehar Singh, formerly from the Department of Political Science of the university, declares: "We are standing on the cusp of change."

Prof Harpal Singh, formerly with the Sikh National College, says: "The SAD is sinking in clutched at the straw of forgiveness to revive its image. A straw cannot save a sinking party."

NOTHING SHORT OF MOCKERY
Sikhism has a tradition of seeking 'maafi' from Akal Takht, but the manner in which Sukhbir sought it lacked sanctity and is nothing short of mockery. Dr Amarjit Singh, HEAD OF THE CENTRE ON GURU GRANTH SAHIB STUDIES, GNDU

Anything the party says needs to be backed with credibility, which it has lost, he alleges. "It lost its base when it introduced caste politics and went all out to impress Jatt Sikhs with free electricity. Non-Jatts were among the top party leadership in the early years," he adds.

"The SAD has got nothing to do with Sikhism," clarifies leading Sikh scholar Gurdarshan Dhillon. "It is only associated with revival, and not reforms in Sikhism."

"Going to Akal Takht with an apology is meaningless as the Akalis have political interests. Akal Takht belongs to Sikhs, not to any party. It was Mahatma Gandhi who supported the Akalis because he wanted them to join the Congress," he adds.

"The response submitted by Sukhbir was vague. Accepting his mistake means nothing without resigning immediately and seeking penance. As per 'maryada', he was

bound to spell out the mistakes for which he had sought atonement. He was liable to answer who arranged the controversial 'poshak' (attire) for the Dera Sirsa cult in 2007? Why was the FIR against him withdrawn? Under what circumstances and pressure was he exonerated? The SAD and the SGPC put the community's faith and Akal Takht's 'maryada' at stake for political gains," Kewal Singh states.

Now in the rebel camp, former SGPC president Bibi Jagir Kaur feels it is good that Sukhbir confessed to the 'mistakes', but says remedy is not possible until he and his coterie are replaced. "We sought apology for being a moot spectator in 2015 was orchestrated to gain votes. We hope that Akal Takht will take a neutral stand," she says.

Claiming that he had opposed the pardon granted to Dera Sirsa head, SAD spokesperson Virsa Singh Valtaha says: "However, there was no political mileage to gain as elections were not due in 2015. The pardon to the Dera head was a blunder by the then Akal Takht jathedar. He had apologised to the Panth — though indirectly — before quitting in October 2018. Since the matter is sub judice with Akal Takht, it is not right to comment on it further."

Sikh intellectual Ashok Singh Bagaria from the Institute of Sikh Studies, Chandigarh, remarks: "The fact that the existing SAD leadership has been discarded was proved by the fact that the party lost its deposits in most Lok Sabha seats it contested. The SGPC, too, wavered from the path and became a mere tool for the SAD."

"Sikhism has a tradition of seeking 'maafi' from Akal Takht," comments Dr Amarjit Singh, head of the Centre on Guru Granth Sahib Studies, GNDU, "but the manner in which Sukhbir sought it lacked sanctity and is nothing short of a mockery." mTalking about the complainants, Dr Kehar Singh says they cannot be exonerated.

US lawmakers paid tributes to the members of the Sikh community who were killed in a massacre at a Mihwaakee gurdwara 12 years ago, underscoring the need to

reject bigotry and recommit to fighting hate and racism, as well as ending the gun violence epidemic in America.

US Ambassador to the UN Linda Thomas-Greenfield visited the Oak Creek Sikh Temple

in the Wisconsin city on the 12th anniversary of the "deadliest massacre of Sikhs on US soil" when a white supremacist claimed the lives of seven members of the community. "The Ambassador joined the victims'

families, community members, and temple leaders to honour those lives lost and lead a conversation on their ongoing efforts to combat hate against marginalised communities," the statement said. —PTI

HC notice to state on 24-hr free power to select agri consumers

CHANDIGARH, AUGUST 6

The Punjab and Haryana High Court today issued a notice of motion to the State of Punjab and others on a petition filed in public interest for quashing its action of providing 24-hour free and unmetered electricity to selected agricultural tube-wells on the ground of it being arbitrary and environmentally unsustainable.

The Division Bench of Chief Justice Sheel Nagu and Justice Anil Kshetrapal fixed September 30 as the next date of hearing on the petition filed by Balraj Singh Sandhu of Patti tehsil in Tarn Taran district.

Petitioner's counsel Gunoor S Sandhu submitted that the provision of free electricity had been implemented without any formal policy, leading to overexploitation of groundwater resources. A

response to an RTI plea revealed that 300 agricultural connections in Patti were receiving 24-hour unmetered electricity. Punjab State Power Corporation Limited (PSPCL), however, cited opposition from consumers and farmers for its inability to disconnect these connections.

The petition also highlighted the severe environmental repercussions of the practice. A government notification issued on January 27, 2023, under the Punjab Water Resources (Management and Regulation) Act, 2020, categorised the Patti area as having a groundwater extraction rate of 236 per cent, placing it in the "overexploited (200 per cent and above)" category. The Central Ground Water Board's report for 2023 also marked 117 out of 153 assessment units in Punjab as overexploited. — TNS

Preamble row

Omission from textbooks an affront to Constitution

THE National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) is no stranger to controversy. From time to time, it is in the spotlight for what is perceived to be a pick-and-choose policy when it comes to including, excluding or pruning references to contemporary events — such as the Babri Masjid demolition and the Gujarat riots — and historical personalities such as the Mughal rulers. The latest row — certainly an avoidable one — is about the reported omission of the Preamble to the Constitution from several Class III and Class VI textbooks.

The very thought of making short shrift of the Preamble, whose significance and sanctity cannot be overemphasised, is revolting. Veritably the Constitution in a nutshell, it articulates the solemn resolve of the people to secure to all Indian citizens justice, liberty, equality and fraternity. The Preamble is in no way less important than fundamental duties and rights, the national anthem and the national song. All these elements have an identity and essence of their own and none can take one another's place.

Both the NCERT as well as Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan have claimed that the allegations about the omission are baseless. However, instead of giving an evidence-based explanation, the minister has chosen to tear into the Congress, saying that the Opposition party's 'politics of lies' has laid bare its 'disgusting mentality'. The constitutional values enshrined in the Preamble are not the preserve of any political party. Nor should any party or government delude itself into believing that it can afford to sideline this sacred document. It is a no-brainer that the Preamble must be given pride of place in various textbooks for languages, science and social and environmental studies. Failure to do course correction would be a great disservice not only to our Constitution — which will complete 75 years of adoption by the Constituent Assembly later this year — but also to Indian democracy.

Far-right extremism

UK must protect vulnerable communities

THE wave of far-right violence in the UK, marked by attacks on immigrants and Muslims, is a disturbing pointer to the persistent undercurrents of xenophobia and misinformation in society. The stabbing of three girls has been exploited by far-right agitators to fuel hatred and incite chaos. The violence has extended beyond mere protests, with shops looted, cars set on fire and mosques and Asian-owned businesses targeted. This alarming trend underscores a deeper malaise. The far-right's hostility towards immigrants is not merely a reaction to isolated events but a symptom of broader social anxieties and political failures. Misguided beliefs about immigration and cultural integration have been stoked by influencers like Tommy Robinson and politicians like Nigel Farage. They spread dangerous misinformation, such as the false claim that the attacker was a Muslim immigrant, to rally support for their divisive agendas.

Prime Minister Keir Starmer's condemnation of the riots as "organised illegal thuggery" is a necessary step, but more must be done. Even as nearly 400 people have been arrested in a week of violence, including clashes between rioters and the police, concerted efforts must be made to combat the spread of misinformation online, which has proven to be a powerful tool for radicalising individuals and inciting violence. The government must also address the underlying socio-economic issues that far-right groups exploit, such as unemployment and inadequate social services, which often breed resentment towards immigrants.

In this climate of fear, it is crucial to uphold the values of tolerance and unity. The UK needs to ensure the safety and inclusiveness of all its residents, regardless of their background, to prevent such violence from taking root again. The media and political leaders must act responsibly, avoiding inflammatory rhetoric that can incite hatred.

Debate in Punjab House

THE debate which took place in the Punjab Legislative Council on Monday last over the resolution of Rana Ferz-ud-Din, urging the immediate and unconditional release of Maulana Zafar Ali, was chiefly notable only as affording a striking instance of official obduracy. The proposition before the House was a simple one. The Maulana had served four out of five years of his sentence, and in normal course would be released within a few months. It was asserted during the debate on the authority of the Superintendent of his jail himself that he would probably be released in November. All that the resolution amounted to in effect was that the Government be asked to reduce the sentence of five years passed upon the Maulana at a time when, as one of the speakers pointed out, it had become almost customary for courts in Punjab to sentence persons for sedition to long terms of imprisonment, by three or four months. A more modest proposal than this it would be almost difficult to think of. If one were, indeed, so minded, one could justly find fault with the Council not for bringing forward his proposal at the present time when the Maulana's sentence is about to expire, but for not having brought it forward earlier. And yet this is the resolution which was opposed from the official benches with a strength and vigour which seemed to show that in the opinion of the speakers and those for whom they spoke, it would be a grave calamity for the Government and the Province if the resolution were carried. Sir John Maynard described the Maulana as a criminal of a dangerous and insidious character, said he found no assurance that Mr Ali could abstain from repeating what he had done.

What led to Hasina's fall & flight

Awami League govt exacerbated the crisis by mishandling the student protest movement

REGIONAL stability in South Asia saw a marked improvement after Sheikh Hasina assumed power in Bangladesh in January 2009. Her cooperation with New Delhi in addressing insurgent and terrorist threats in India's northeastern states and the decisive action she took against Islamists in Bangladesh significantly enhanced the security situation in the region. Hasina's uninterrupted 15-year rule was largely marked by peace and tranquillity, which, in turn, spurred economic development in Bangladesh and bolstered regional cooperation.

Several long-standing issues between India and Bangladesh were amicably resolved during her tenure, facilitating increased sub-regional collaboration, particularly as the regional organisation SAARC (South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation) remained largely ineffective. However, the dramatic collapse of law and order on August 4, which led to Hasina's ouster, can undermine these achievements and set back the progress made in both national and regional contexts.

The trigger for the deterioration in the security situation was the resurfacing of student protests, resulting in around 100 deaths and injuries to hundreds. The police used tear gas and rubber bullets on protesters demanding Hasina's resignation. The government imposed an indefinite nationwide curfew and banned access to the Internet to quell the protests.

These demonstrations began in June, with student activists at Dhaka University agitating

against a controversial quota system in government jobs that reserved 30 per cent of the positions for the family members of war veterans who had participated in the 1971 Liberation War. The protesters argued that the system was discriminatory and favoured Hasina's Awami League party; they demanded a merit-based system instead. The quota system, established in 1972, was briefly abolished in 2018 but later reinstated. It was abolished once again after nearly 200 students were killed by the security forces in July. The protests paused for a while after the Supreme Court scrapped/slash quotas but resumed over the demand for justice for those killed.

The stir evolved from being focused on the quota issue to a broader anti-government movement that witnessed the participation of people from diverse sections of society, including celebrities and garment manufacturers. Support for the protests also grew among former military figures, including ex-army chief Gen Iqbal Karim Bhuiyan, who turned his Facebook profile picture red as a gesture of solidarity.

The Bangladeshi army is unlikely to remain at the helm for long, as it is a major beneficiary of UN peacekeeping operations.

This was significant as a large number of former army officers in Bangladesh have backgrounds in the Pakistani army. There were also allegations that the protesters were being used by the Opposition Bangladesh Nationalist Party and Jamaat-e-Islami for their own political goals. Amid the unrest, the army intervened to restore order. Army chief Gen Waker-Uz-Zaman had first directed officers to ensure peace. However, as the situation threatened to spiral out of control, the army took an ambiguous stance.

On August 3, the army chief had addressed officers at the military

headquarters in Dhaka, emphasising that "the Bangladesh army is the symbol of trust of the people." He assured them that the army would stand by the people and the state in times of need, but he did not clarify if the army supported the protests.

Though the peace and tranquillity during Hasina's rule brought economic prosperity to Bangladesh, she was accused of entrenching power by using state institutions and suppressing dissent. It was alleged that the Awami League, supposedly the people's party, had lost touch with the populace. These clashes were among the deadliest in the country's history of civil unrest. The Awami League attempted to use its student wing, the Bangladesh Chhatra League, against the protesters, forgetting that the student wing was not an auxiliary police force and should not attack fellow students. It was actually the forces aligned with the ruling party that initially caused the protests to degenerate into civil disorder.

The worsening situation in Bangladesh drew the attention of the United Nations (UN), which called for a cessation of violence, the release of detainees, the

restoration of access to the Internet and a meaningful dialogue. India, concerned about the situation but limited in its ability to intervene as it is an internal matter of Bangladesh, has advised its nationals to avoid travel within that country. New Delhi is also worried about the spillover of the unrest in Bangladesh, particularly in the states bordering the neighbouring country.

The crisis has brought to the forefront the cumulative grievances of the citizens: rising prices of daily necessities, the pernicious influence of syndicates and unchecked corruption permeating almost every branch of the government. The people were also frustrated with the government's determination to suppress political opposition.

The Bangladeshi economy has faced significant challenges of late, particularly a crisis of foreign currency. While the economy was performing well, citizens paid less attention to the democratic political space available to them. However, as the economic situation began to deteriorate, concerns over jobs, employment and political freedom became increasingly important. The Hasina government exacerbated the crisis by mishandling the student protest movement, treating the agitators as political adversaries. The army chief announced that an interim government would take charge, promising that the military would stand down and investigate the deadly crackdown on protesters.

The Bangladeshi army is unlikely to remain at the helm for long, as it is a major beneficiary of the UN peacekeeping operations, and the UN does not encourage such an arrangement. As seen during the time of the caretaker government in 2007, the army prefers backseat driving, similar to the situation in Pakistan. However, for India, the bilateral relations will now depend on the new regime that emerges once the dust raised by the protests settles.

All on 'account' of cash in rural bank branch

A job in a rural branch of a bank offered a variety of interesting experiences. It was a privilege for me to reside in a village amidst simple, earnest and affectionate people during the early 1980s. Joining straight after college, a couple of months before the completion of my post-graduation degree, I felt secure and comfortable. Some of the situations that I encountered were quite amusing and they taught me a lot about human nature.

I was the lone clerical staff member in that branch; the branch manager was the sole supervisory officer. The presence of both of us was necessary to run the branch. The manager used to send me, along with the subordinate staff, for remitting excess cash or receiving the required cash from a bigger branch after finishing the day's work in the afternoon.

Once, when the cash box was being taken out of the branch, a local customer got suspicious and felt disturbed. He went on to question the manager as to how the hard-earned money deposited by the public was being 'irresponsibly' shifted elsewhere. The manager had to take pains to convince him that the public sector bank truly owed back the liability and would not default on payment to any customer.

On another occasion, an unscheduled payment of Rs 25,000 was to be made to a customer around 11 am. Unfortunately, our opening cash balance was much below that, and more deposits were unlikely to be made in our branch that day. I suggested that the manager himself go to secure cash from the branch situated about 9 km away. He thought of a short cut. He called up a current account holder, a wealthy textile merchant, and asked him if he could spare Rs 25,000 for the bank's urgent need. His idea was to make him deposit the amount in his account and the cash received thereby could be used to clear the payment pending at my counter.

The customer was kind enough to agree, and his son turned up within five minutes in front of me, not with the cash, but with a cheque signed by his father! I asked him why he had brought the cheque. Pat came the reply from the young son of the valued customer: 'My father has told me that the bank can take the required amount from his account.' The shocked manager thanked him with folded hands, and he left.

We realised that the innocent customer had misunderstood our communication. After having a hearty laugh, the manager hurriedly left along with the subordinate staff to get the cash from the nearby branch. And our requirement had now gone up due to the cheque that was staring us in the face.

Centre's overbearing presence bodes ill for J&K

UNLIKE the more constitutionally defined role of a Governor, the responsibilities and powers of the Lieutenant Governor (L-G) are relatively ambiguous, situational and dependent on the Centre.

There are union territories (UTs) of various shades when it comes to defining an L-G's role. There are 'half states' like Puducherry, which has a CM and a Cabinet, and Delhi with its unique national capital dynamics. There are strategic 'outposts' like the Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep. Relatively smaller UTs like Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu warrant a simpler bureaucratic 'administrator'. Then there is Chandigarh, a two-state capital with both Punjab and Haryana making competing claims over it. And five years ago, the state of Jammu and Kashmir was split into two UTs — Ladakh and J&K — with the abrogation of Article 370.

The topical lay of the land and the perceived urgency

in the UT concerned would define the tenor and preference for the office of the L-G. It is functionally wired to the Union Home Ministry, making it susceptible to the priorities of the Centre, not just administratively but also politically.

My experience as an Army officer was helpful, given the overarching security considerations (and relief and rehabilitation efforts following the 2005 tsunami) for the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, anchored at the mouth of the Chinese 'chokepoint' in the Strait of Malacca. My tenure in Puducherry entailed the more traditional role of constitutional oversight and propriety in a federal democratic structure. At least then, the office of the L-G in these two different types of UTs had no partisan requirements (though turf wars between the L-G and the CM in Delhi were common at the time).

It would be incorrect and naive to say that the trend of using one Raj Bhawan/Niwās or the other for partisan reasons began only after 2014. Even earlier, there were many incumbents who conducted themselves in a partisan fashion — rather than having an apolitical stance, which is mandated — especially in politically significant states like Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Karnataka. But it is true that many honourable exceptions had refused to

kowtow to the Centre. Some Presidents and gubernatorial incumbents bravely took on the Central Government to uphold the independence and dignity of their constitutional offices. But sadly, the last decade has not seen virtually any constitutional office refuse the Centre's political or partisan insistence.

Now, with the elections imminent in J&K, sudden steps pertaining to the strengthening of powers of the L-G's office are telling. The Transaction of Business of the Government of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir (Second Amendment) Rules, 2024, empower the L-G to control

the police, public order, bureaucracy transfers and postings. They mandate the J&K L-G's approval in those realms and give him the final say on any proposal for the grant of prosecutive sanction. This empowerment automatically results in the direct disempowerment of the writ of the future CM. The possibility of an intense turf war, like the one between the L-G and CM of Delhi, looms large in J&K. Expectedly, national and regional Opposition parties have slammed the seemingly preemptive move by the Centre as anti-democratic, small-spirited and manipulative. Some local leaders

have likened the future Assembly to a 'glorified municipality' where the ostensible House would have no powers to legislate.

The background to this J&K narrative is pertinent. The last elected government was dissolved in 2018, when the BJP walked out of an alliance with Mehbooba Mufti's People's Democratic Party, much political water has flown since then. Incidentally, the BJP had been in an alliance with Farooq Abdullah's National Conference much earlier. However, for the past more than six years, the state/UT has been under the Union Government's rule via the Centre-appointed Governor/L-G, and it has been largely denied popular participation and democratic imperatives. But ironically, this denial of democracy has counterintuitively emerged as one of the most successful claims of decisive and muscular governance by the ruling dispensation. Many premature claims of a return to normalcy (despite continuing encounters and terror attacks) and the end to stone-pelting were attributed to the Centre's 'successful' handling of the situation. The 'rest of India' was sought to be galvanised by the J&K storyline.

However, while the powers that be are aware of the unprecedented polarisation and societal disaffection, this regrettable detachment is wrongly postured as normalcy.

Therefore, the three Lok Sabha seats of Kashmir (Srinagar, Baramulla and Anantnag-Rajouri) were not contested by the ruling party (and by its coalition partners) even as it pursued the '400 paar' agenda in the General Election. Clearly, the party sensed the mood in the region, and the decision not to contest the elections afforded it the plausible claim of remaining 'undefeated', as the contest was reduced to one between the 'others'.

However, with the Assembly elections on the cards, staying out of the fray is no longer possible. The undeniable ground reality of perceived diminishment by the Centre is apparent. The history of insurgencies is instructive (Punjab, Mizoram, etc) — partisan considerations must always take a back seat to win over the disenfranchised populace. This does not mean lowering the guard in the Valley but only to remain genuinely inclusive and open to an occasional partisan 'defeat' in order to strengthen democracy, integrity and nationalism (which is not the exclusive preserve of any party). The move to further strengthen the Centre's imprint through the L-G does not suggest confidence, commitment or largeness of spirit necessary to handle societal disaffection. The 'idea of India' needs to win, not necessarily one party or the other.

Trump, Harris poles apart on Indian govt's human rights policies

THE Indian foreign policy establishment is keenly following the twists and turns of the US presidential campaign. Despite the rise of China and, with it, the growing global importance of its top leader, it is the US President who holds, by far, the most important political office on the planet. The US President and his administration's decisions impact almost every country and issues of international significance, such as climate change.

President Joe Biden had been his party's obvious candidate for this year's presidential election. There was no hint that this would change till Biden performed disastrously in the debate with his predecessor Donald Trump on June 27. Thereafter, a growing number of Democrats demanded Biden's replacement with another candidate because it became increasingly clear that he would lose the election. Yet, it took Biden more than three weeks to decide on giving up

the candidacy. Finally, on July 21, he announced that he would not contest the election and endorsed Vice-President Kamala Harris as the party's candidate. The Democrats, in disarray, quickly rallied around her and the race is now between Trump and Harris. Opinion polls indicate that both are almost tied in the swing states, where this election will really be decided.

Trump was generally leading Biden by substantial margins in the swing states by early summer. It was also becoming increasingly clear that the infirmities of age were telling on Biden. Hence, despite Trump's conviction in the Stormy Daniels hush money case in May, his candidature continued to remain strong. Would it then be wrong to assume that some influential voices in the Indian system, especially those with intimate professional knowledge and experience of US politics, had reached the conclusion by mid-June that it was more than likely that Trump would trump Biden in the polls.

While the Ministry of External Affairs announced Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Russia on July 4, it is believed that the dates for the visit were finalised around June 21. With Biden's debacle in the debate and his disinclination to give up his candidature, the impression that Trump would be the next US President would have been

only strengthened before Modi's Russia visit.

India has continuously exercised its strategic autonomy and displayed this from the beginning of Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. This has been evident through its increasing purchase of Russian oil. However, it is one matter to do this and quite another for Modi to visit Moscow. There would have obviously been comfort in doing so if the assessment was that Trump would be back in the White House in January next year. And, this was because it is known that his views on the Ukraine issue are, at least, till now, at great variance

with Biden's.

The race for the Oval Office has entirely changed with Harris as the Democratic Party's candidate. It can no longer be assumed that Trump will win the election. Hence, is Modi's proposed visit to Ukraine later this month a hedging exercise? Harris is likely to remain strong on Russia. This question also arises because of Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's intemperate comments on Modi meeting Putin in Moscow. It is understood that Modi will also visit Poland along with Ukraine.

Modi has been correctly insisting on the path of peace and diplomacy for a resolu-

tion of the Ukraine issue. But the conflict is hardly ready for a resolution. Though Modi's international reputation is strong, does India have the heft to play a role in matters of European security and bringing warring parties together? This cruel question has to be faced squarely.

At a basic level, India can successfully deal with Trump or Harris as the next incumbent of the White House. There is bipartisan support in the US system for comprehensively and strongly developing India-US relations. This naturally includes the security sector. In no small measure, China is a factor in India, and the US fostering closer strategic ties. This is going to remain so. Hence, both countries would want the Indo-Pacific region to be organised in a manner that does not permit China to become its dominant power. Quad will be strengthened to play a role in this quest. Strategic issues to the west of India may not witness a complete coincidence of views between India and the US, but the gap is narrowing in how the two countries are considering West Asia. Israel's continuing approach to Gaza is posing a problem, and it may worsen if Harris wins the election.

On trade and economic issues, both Trump and Harris would want closer ties,


but his immigration policies and MAGA (Make America Great Again) programme will pose problems which a Harris administration may not. The real difference between a Trump and a Harris presidency for the Modi government would be in their differing approaches on the Indian government's human rights policies.

The Trump administration was not really interested in the Modi government's human rights policies. The prime manifestation of its attitude was witnessed in Trump refraining from commenting on the 2020 Delhi riots which occurred when he was in the Capital. It can be expected that Trump 2.0 will be no different on this issue. On the other hand, Harris will come out strongly on these matters. She is aligned with left-of-centre members of the Democratic Party who have been critical of the Citizenship Amendment Act and how the Modi government has dealt with India's minorities. Congresswomen Pramila Jayapal, a vocal critic of the Modi government, has joined the Harris campaign. Harris is unlikely to hesitate in talking straight on these questions. This may be embarrassing for Modi.

In the light of all factors, it is a moot point whether the Modi government would want to see Harris as the US President despite her India connection.

Kangana demands probe into ₹1,800 cr Central aid 'bungling'

Mandi MP Kangana Ranaut today demanded a special inquiry into the alleged misuse of the Rs 1,800 crore assistance that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had given to the state last year. Kangana alleged there was corruption in the distribution of relief and people would not tolerate the bungling of funds provided by the Central Government. She criticised Sukhu Singh Sukhu-led Congress regime for its alleged failure to provide Rs 7 lakh to the families of flashflood victims like last year, as provided by the Central Government. She met with cloudburst victims in Samej village near Rampur in Shimla district and assured them of all help from the Central Government. She assured the cloudburst-affected villagers that the Prime Minister would announce a special package for Himachal like he did last year by providing Rs 1,800 crore. Kangana alleged, "The state government is totally unconcerned about the suf-

ferings of the flood victims, who have been forced to undertake the construction of a bridge in their village on their own." She added that no other state had received this kind of Central help and Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman had announced a package for Himachal but some other states objected to it. She said that the Central Government would provide all possible help to the flood-affected people and roll out schemes in consultation with locals. She added that the Central Government was providing funds to Himachal but the state government, which executes and implements schemes, failed to deliver. On the issue of providing land to the affected villagers, she said that this was a decision for the state government to take. She admitted that locals want to continue residing in their native Samej village and not to relocate elsewhere.

₹327 cr for HRTC to buy e-buses: CM

The Himachal Road Transport Corporation (HRTC) will be transformed into a 'green transportation system' as more electric buses are being introduced in its existing fleet of 110 e-buses and 50 e-taxis, said Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu here today. Sukhu, who presided over a meeting of the HRTC, said that Rs 327 crore had been provided for purchasing electric buses and the process was underway to procure 2,000 additional type-II e-buses. The entire fleet of diesel buses would be replaced by e-buses in a phased manner, he added. He said, "In the first phase, the HRTC is plying six buses to Ayodhya to facilitate pilgrims with a plan to add more buses, if necessary. Besides, it is also providing bus services to other religious places." Sukhu said that the state government would provide all possible assistance to the corporation to revive itself from financial losses and become a profitable organisation. "The HRTC, which is the lifeline of the hill

Monsoon to intensify, orange alert for today

SHIMLA, AUGUST 6
The weather department has sounded an orange alert for yet another spell of heavy to very heavy rain at isolated places in the state until August 10. Spells of heavy to very heavy rainfall are likely to occur in the districts of Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Chamba, Kullu, Kangra, Mandi, Solan, Shimla and Sirmaur over the next 24 hours. For tomorrow and August 10, the department has issued an orange alert. For August 8-9, an yellow

alert has also been issued. As per the department, the monsoon activity is likely to increase in intensity and distribution from today evening evening/night for the next four-five days. At most places, a fairly widespread precipitation of light to moderate intensity, associated with occasional development of thunderstorm/lightning, will occur over the next four-five days, with peak intensity on August 7 and 10. The department has warned of the possibility of landslides and flashfloods at the vulnerable areas of

the districts of Lahaul-Spiti, Kullu, Solan, Sirmaur, Shimla and Kinnaur during this spell of precipitation. There is a possibility of disruption of traffic due to waterlogging. The department has advised people to avoid going to areas that witness waterlogging and avoid staying in vulnerable structures. On Tuesday, 53 roads were closed for traffic, most of them in Kullu (18), followed by Mandi (16). Besides, 17 power distribution transformers and 63 water supply schemes too have been disrupted. Meanwhile, the overall rainfall this monsoon is still lower than normal. As against the normal rainfall of 415.3 mm, the state has received 287.3 mm rain, a deviation of -31 per cent. The month of July recorded a deviation of -29 per cent. The precipitation received in July is the lowest in the state since 2011.

One more body found in Mandi's Rajban village

One more body was recovered from the affected area of Rajban village in Padhar subdivision of Mandi district today. This is the ninth body to be recovered from the area that was battered by a devastating cloudburst on July 31 night hours. The latest victim, Khuddi Devi (46), was a resident of Rajban village in Mandi. Her body was found during the ongoing search and rescue operation conducted under

the jurisdiction of the Tikkan police post in Padhar subdivision. Mandi SP Sakshi Verma visited the spot to review the search operation. On July 31, a cloudburst had caused extensive damage and flooding in the region, leading to significant loss of lives and property. The SP said the rescue teams had been working tirelessly in challenging conditions to locate missing persons. As of now, nine bodies had been recovered. —TNS



HC orders personal appearance of CS, 3 IAS officers in contempt case

Taking a strong exception about the 'sorry state of affairs' that court said exists in J&K with regard to "judicial proceedings and judicial orders", the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh has ordered personal appearance of UT's chief secretary Atal Dulloo and three top IAS officers on August 8 regarding a contempt case.

This is the second time in recent days when the high court has sought personnel appearance of IAS officers for ignoring the court orders.

While hearing a case related to pay scales engineers, in which the court had issued directions in September 2023, the division Bench of Justice Atul Sreedharan and Justice Javed Iqbal Wani also slammed the J&K administration for the number of contempt petitions pending before the High Court.

"All the four contemnors herein are directed to remain present in person

before this Court on the next date... If any of them does not comply with the direction for personal appearance, this Court shall resort to coercive measures to secure their presence," the court said on Tuesday, while ordering the personal appearance of the Chief Secretary, Finance Secretary, Secretary, General Administration Department (GAD), and Secretary of the Public Works Department (PWD).

On Monday, during the contempt hearing, the court had directed the Chief Secretary and other three senior officers to join the proceedings through video conferencing to answer the charge of contempt.

While two IAS officers joined the video conferencing, and one was on leave, the court was informed that Chief Secretary "is unable to appear through video conferencing as he is busy in a meeting."

During the hearing, the counsel for the "contemnors" informed the court that a special leave petition (SLP) has been filed in the

Supreme Court in June 2024 against the principal order. The Bench then questioned the delay in filing the SLP.

Stating that "the manner in which the Union Territory government has conducted itself, it is clear that there is an absolute lack of sincerity of purpose on its part to comply with the order passed by this Court," the court then lashed out the at the administration for the higher number of contempt petitions pending before the High Court, which it said "is a little over 6000."

"A few of these contempt matters are pending between ten to fifteen years and the cases pending between one to five years are the ones that run into thousands and has reduced the justice dispensation system in the UT to a cruel joke," the court said in the order.

The case has now been listed on Thursday.

Recently, the High court summoned Ganderbal Deputy Commissioner Shyambir, who has been accused of harassing a judge over a land acquisition case.

EC to meet political parties tomorrow, seek feedback

The Election Commission will meet political parties in Jammu and Kashmir on Thursday to get feedback on conducting Assembly poll in the Union Territory.

The office of the Chief Electoral Officer, J&K, today issued letters to various political parties, inviting them for a meeting with the Election Commission (EC). The political parties have been given time slots for the meeting with the Election Commission.

The EC, led by Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar, is scheduled to visit Jammu and Kashmir from August 8-10 to review preparedness for the Assembly poll, weeks before the Supreme Court's September 30 deadline for holding elections in the UT.

Kumar will be accompanied by Election Commissioners Gyanesh Kumar and SSS Sandhu.

In March, Kumar, who was then sole member of the three-member commission to visit the Union Territory, had assured political parties and the people that the poll panel would soon hold elections in J&K.

At that time, the two posts of election commissioners were vacant. They were filled days before the Lok Sabha polls were announced on March 16.

Besides meeting the political parties, the commission will also review the situation with the chief electoral officer and the central forces coordinator.

The commission will also review the preparations with election officers and police superintendents of all districts as well as the chief secretary and the Director General of Police.

On August 10, the commission will visit Jammu for a review meeting with enforcement agencies. It will also hold a press conference in Jammu to brief the media on the review process.

Whenever Assembly elections are held in Jammu and Kashmir, they will be the first since provisions of Article 370 of the Constitution were abrogated and the erstwhile state divided into two Union Territories in 2019. The electoral exercise in Jammu and Kashmir is usually spread over a month. — PTI

Amid 'uncertainty', parties, admn gear up for Assembly poll

Hold meetings, door-to-door campaigning; special revision of electoral roll underway

In June, the Prime Minister had stated that the elections will be held soon," said party spokesperson Altaf Thakur.

They said while pre-special summary roll exercise had been completed, a special summary roll revision was underway, which would complete on August 9.

Cong, NC begin talks for alliance, PDP out of sight

With the possibility that the Assembly elections will be held here in the coming months, the Congress and the National Conference (NC) have started talks to form a pre-poll alliance. However, the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) has so far not shown any interest in the alliance in the wake of a rift between NC vice-president Omar Abdullah and PDP chief Mehbooba Mufti ahead of the Lok Sabha elections a few months ago.

Abdullah and Mufti had criticised each other in separate press conferences after the former did not let PDP, a part of INDIA alliance, to contest from the Anantnag seat under the alliance. Mehbooba contested from the seat, but was defeated by NC candidate Mian Altaf.

A senior leader of the J&K Congress told *The Tribune* that talks for an alliance have begun between NC and Congress, but these were in initial stage. "At present, we are dis-

cussing the number of seats to be shared between the two parties. The NC is asking for 12-15 seats in Jammu region which is quite a lot, given the performance of the Congress in LS poll where the winning margin of two BJP candidates decreased considerably," the Congress leader said. He said if the talks failed to mature, the "Congress will not shy away from contesting alone".

It has also been learnt that the PDP is likely to contest the Assembly poll on its own without entering into any alliance. A party leader based in Poonch said as Mehbooba Mufti was not allowed to contest the Lok Sabha poll under the INDIA alliance from Anantnag, there was little scope that there would be an alliance.

The NC, which is a Valley-based party, has influence in pockets of Jammu region. The NC and Congress have been into an alliance in earlier governments in J&K. There are a total of 90 Assembly segments in J&K. Of this, 43 are located in Jammu division.

Over 5 lakh pay obeisance at Lord Shiva cave shrine so far

SRINAGAR, AUGUST 6

The number of pilgrims, who paid obeisance to Lord Shiva at Amarnath cave shrine in South Kashmir in this year's yatra, has crossed the five-lakh mark as more than 2,800 pilgrims visited the naturally formed ice 'lingam' on Tuesday. The 52-day pilgrimage, which started on June 29, will conclude on August 19.

According to officials, 2,813 pilgrims paid obeisance at the 3,880-metre high cave shrine on Tuesday. This has taken the number of pilgrims this year to 5,00,105.

The officials said 1,500 male pilgrims, 618 female pilgrims,

65 sadhus and two sadhvis were among those who paid obeisance at the cave shrine.

Over 570 security forces and 57 children also performed the pilgrimage. According to the officials, there have been two deaths - a sevadar from Haryana and a pilgrim from Jharkhand - in this year's yatra. They suffered cardiac arrest along the Baltal route in June.

One anecdote Hasina recalled with particular warmth in her memoirs was about a personal meeting with Indira Gandhi during that time.

"Once we requested a meeting with Mrs Gandhi upon our return from Ajmer Sharif and she granted us permission. But our vehicle went out of

order and by the time we returned, there was little time left for the appointment. So after a quick change of clothes, we started for the PM's residence. When she saw us, she asked, 'Didn't you take anything?' I could not lie to her. She quickly ordered omelettes and toasts for us and served us tea herself," Hasina says in her article in "India's Indira."

As for Mukherjee, they were always a family to her. "For Sheikh Hasina, Pranab Mukherjee was always 'Dada' and Suvera Mukherjee 'Bahudi' (Bengali for bhabhi)," a former private secretary to the late Mukherjee says, remembering how Hasina would ring him daily when the late Congress veteran was ill in August 2020.

Hasina's ties with Mukherjee date back to her days of asylum in India when she stayed at their Greater Kailash family home before moving to an apartment on the Pandara Road. Hasina lived in India from 1975 to 1981 before returning home to wage struggles that culminated in prime ministership in 1996.

"Their families are still connected, Pranab Mukherjee's daughter Sharmishtha, Sheikh Hasina's son Sajeeb Wazed Joy, daughter Saima, aunt Rehana's daughter Tulip Siddiq, who is a sitting Labour MP in the UK, all of them," another former aide of late Mukherjee says, adding not only Hasina, even the Indian and Bangladeshi establishments would be missing the

late President, who had ties across all segments of Bangladeshi society, from the political spectrum and armed forces to industry. As for Hasina, she would always stay at Rashtrapati Bhavan during Mukherjee's tenure as the President. A former private secretary to Mukherjee mentions how as PM, Hasina in 2018 hosted Mukherjee as a state guest in Dhaka even when the latter was no longer the President of India.

"Their deep bond never changed. Few know that Mukherjee's in-laws hailed from Narail village in Bangladesh's Barisal and Sheikh Hasina always accorded the late President the welcome fitting of a 'jamai raja'," the former aide adds.

Hasina, accompanied by her sister Sheikh Rehana, planned to leave for London from India to take temporary refuge but the option is not being pursued now. Hasina is now known to be considering several options, including the United Arab Emirates, Belarus, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and Finland, said a source.

Under the UK's immigration rules, it is not possible to apply for asylum from outside the UK and each asylum claim is carefully considered on its individual merits on a case-by-case basis. The movement that toppled Hasina rose out of demonstrations against public sector job quotas for families of veterans of Bangladesh's 1971 independence war, seen by critics as a means to reserve jobs for allies of the ruling Awami League.

Publish apology from own funds: SC to IMA chief in Patanjali case

The Supreme Court on Tuesday asked Indian Medical Association (IMA) president RV Asokan whether his unconditional apology to the apex court over his 'damaging' statements in an interview was published in all those newspapers that carried his interview.

During an interview, where he had answered queries about Patanjali Ayurved Limited's 'misleading advertisements' case, Asokan had said that it was "unfortunate" that the Supreme Court criticised the association and also some of the practices of private doctors.

The court observed that the apology needs to be published in the newspapers by Asokan personally and not from the funds of the IMA.

The Bench has posted the matter for further hearing on August 27.

Asokan's was responding to a query about the

Supreme Court's observations during a hearing on April 23, when it had said that while it was pointing one finger at Patanjali, the remaining four fingers were pointed towards IMA.

During the hearing on May 14, the Bench had posed some tough questions against the court in the interview and said, "You cannot sit on a couch giving an interview to the press and lampooning the court."

The court had then made it clear that it will not accept his affidavit tendering apology at that stage. — PTI



'NHM funds denied over colour guidelines'

UK for UN-led probe into B'desh crisis, mum on asylum for Hasina

LONDON, AUGUST 6 The British Government has called for a United Nations-led investigation into the violent incidents of the past few weeks in Bangladesh, which led to ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina fleeing to India "for the moment", before reportedly seeking asylum in the UK. Foreign Secretary David Lammy issued a statement on Monday to condemn the "unprecedented levels of violence and tragic loss of life" over the last two weeks in Bangladesh and said the UK wanted to see action towards a democratic future for the country.

Same Islamists forced Hasina to leave country: Exiled Taslima

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 6 The same Islamists who threw her out had forced Sheikh Hasina to leave Bangladesh, said author Taslima Nasreen, exiled from the country in the 1990s following protests over her book "Lajja". Nasreen wrote on X: "In order to please Islamists, Hasina threw me out of my country in 1999 after I entered Bangladesh to see my mother in her deathbed and never allowed me to enter the country again. The same Islamists have been in the student movement who forced Hasina to leave the country today."

DILEMMA FOR BRITISH GOVT

Hasina's desire to relocate to UK puts the government in a dilemma. If a UN-led probe is held, it will likely hold her accountable and would look bad for British government if she were then in the UK. Strategic experts believe the situation was a complicated one for the UK, which had previously offered Hasina's late father, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, refuge on his release from a Pakistani jail in January 1972.

Lebanon's Hezbollah launches drone attacks on Israel

BEIRUT, AUGUST 6 Lebanon's armed group Hezbollah launched a series of drone and rocket attacks into northern Israel on Tuesday but warned that its much-anticipated retaliation for Israel's killing of a top commander last week was yet to come. Hezbollah said it launched a swarm of attack drones at two military sites near Acre in northern Israel.

Tim Walz is Kamala's V-P pick

WASHINGTON, AUGUST 6 Democratic presidential candidate Kamala Harris selected Minnesota Governor Tim Walz to be her running mate on Tuesday, choosing a progressive policy champion and a plain speaker from America's heartland to help win over the rural, white voters. Harris announced the selection in a text message to supporters. "I'm pleased to share that I've made my decision: Minnesota Governor Tim Walz will join our campaign as my running mate," she said.

Walz, a 60-year-old US Army National Guard veteran and former teacher, said he was honoured to join Harris on the ticket. "I'm all in," Walz wrote on X, adding: "Vice-President Harris is showing us the politics of what's possible. It reminds me a bit of the first day of school." Harris was expected to appear with Walz at an event in Philadelphia on Tuesday evening.

B'desh unrest not likely to impact India's overall trade balance: S&P

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 6 India is a well-diversified exporter and a blip in its exports to Bangladesh is unlikely to have any meaningful impact on India's overall trade position for the full year, S&P Global Ratings said on Tuesday. Bangladesh is facing its worst political crisis since independence in 1971, with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina resigning amid massive anti-government protests.

'SIGNIFICANT CONCERNS' FOR TEXTILE INDUSTRY

Bangladesh crisis poses "significant concerns" for India's textile and apparel sector, particularly for companies operating in the neighbouring country, Confederation of Indian Textile Industry said. The domestic textile industry body believes that any supply disruption in Bangladesh will have an immediate impact on the supply chain, affecting production schedules of Indian firms.

India's exports to Bangladesh dipped to USD 11 billion in 2023-24 from USD 12.21 billion in 2022-23. Imports too declined to USD 1.84 billion in the last fiscal, from USD 2 billion in 2022-23. India's main exports include vegetables, coffee, tea, spices, sugar, confectionery, refined petroleum oil, chemicals, cotton, iron and steel, and vehicles. The main import items are fish, plastic, leather, and apparel, among others.

Vedanta Ltd files demerger scheme

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 6 Mining conglomerate Vedanta Ltd said in a statement that the proposed demerger of its businesses was on track and it had already filed the demerger scheme with the NCLT after getting a nod from secured creditors. Vedanta earlier announced to split into six independent listed companies, including oil and gas and aluminium. Vedanta Ltd Executive Director Arun Misra said that the company had delivered a strong start to the year, with exceptional EBITDA improvement of 47 per cent and PAT improvement by 54 per cent year-over-year on the back of improved margins, and robust cost reduction across all operations.

Sensex falls by 0.21%, Nifty ends below 24K

CHANDIGARH, AUGUST 6 Equity benchmark indices BSE Sensex and NSE Nifty50 surrendered early gains and settled lower in volatile trade on Tuesday, with Sensex losing 166.33 points and Nifty ending below the 24,000 level. BSE Sensex ended at 78,593.07, down 0.21 per cent. The index had jumped 1.38 per cent to hit the day's high of 79,852.08 during the intraday trade. NSE Nifty50, on the other hand, ended 63.05 points or 0.26 per cent down at 23,992.55. It had climbed 1.35 per cent to the day's high of 24,382.6 during intraday trade.

Retail inflation for industrial workers eases to 3.67%

NEW DELHI, AUGUST 6 Retail inflation for industrial workers slipped to 3.67 per cent in June from 3.86 per cent in the previous month this year, mainly due to lower prices of certain food items. "Year-on-year inflation for the month of June 2024 moderated to 3.67 per cent as compared to 5.57 per cent in June 2023," the Labour Ministry said. The All-India Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers (CPI-IW) for June 2024 was at 141.4 points against 139.9 points in May 2024. Food and Beverages Group under the CPI-IW was at 148.7 points in June 2024 against 145.2 points in May this year.



"Down goes Susaki! Down goes the world champion!" The wrestling world was struck by a tremor of massive proportion a little before noon today, shaken by the fall of a giant of the sport, Champ de Mars, close to the Eiffel Tower here, being the epicentre. Then, Vinesh Phogat calmly walked by the media, hands folded in thanksgiving and apology. She doesn't wish to talk after having handed Yui Susaki — multiple world champion, the defending champion in women's 50kg wrestling, unbeaten for 94 international bouts in a row! — a shock defeat in the first round. Vinesh's muscles ache, and she must rest and recover before her next bout, the pre-quarterfinal against Ukraine's Oksana Livach, to begin a little over an hour later. But her heart is full, too, for the process of adulthood has made her angry and bitter — from a chirpy, ever-smiling teenager of a decade ago, she's become distant, distrustful, cynical. What she's lost, innocence, has been replaced by something more useful on the mat — guile, nous, artfulness. Vinesh beat Susaki with guile; by playing the docile sheep for most of the bout, she lulled the great Susaki into a false sense of

security. Vinesh so completely lacked initiative and energy for the most part, she conceded a point in each round for passivity and was down 0-2 with 63 seconds left in the bout. Everyone thought Vinesh was content to lose the bout — Susaki would reach the final, and that would hand Vinesh the chance to fight for bronze through the repechage round tomorrow, everyone thought. It's very likely Susaki thought so, too; but Vinesh had different ideas. With 17 seconds left on the clock, she made her first attacking move — with coach Woller Akos hollering at her to go for it, she tried to grab Susaki's right leg, but the Japanese legend escaped. Vinesh again went after her, trying to get a grip on her neck, and Susaki suddenly looked vulnerable. She was backing away, but keeping low in defence — a fatal mistake! Vinesh, all over Susaki, bore down upon her, and down went Susaki on the mat, on her chest — two points for the Indian, with five seconds to go! Vinesh tried to flip Susaki over for two more points, but then the hooter went — 2-2 the score, and victory for Vinesh for winning the final points. Japan challenged the final takedown, but it was rejected, making it a 3-2 win for Vinesh.

The great Susaki, her coach said, was crying and crying, but OK. She was also hoping that Vinesh would reach the final, for that would let Susaki fight for bronze tomorrow through repechage: 15 seconds of magic by Vinesh, and the shoe was on the other foot, with Japan praying for Vinesh's progress. Vinesh was a changed woman in the quarterfinal against Livach — she made her first attack within 15 seconds, and though the Ukrainian fought like a tigress in the end, Vinesh was a clear winner at 7-5. A victory in the semifinal against Cuba's Yusneylis Guzman Lopez would send Vinesh into the gold medal match tomorrow. Unless something goes horribly wrong, Vinesh is certain to receive a call from the prime minister, and likely to be congratulated for her bravery and passion. That, indeed, would be very different from what she went through in Delhi last year — dragged on the streets of the capital for standing up for the right of women to not be molested by officials, belittled and vilified for months. Last December, she left her Khel Ratna and Arjuna Award medals on a pavement in Delhi — after being denied permission to meet the prime minister. How times change!

Duplantis breaks pole vault world record

PARIS, AUGUST 6 The pole vaulter they call "Mondo" really can put on a show. With the rest of the action at the Olympics track wrapped up for the evening and the crowd of 80,000 at the Stade de France still on their feet, Armand Duplantis rested the pole on his right shoulder and took a deep breath. Then, he lifted up that long piece of carbon fiber and took off down the runway and into the night sky. Another Olympics gold medal already was his. When he came crashing down into the padding on the other side of that sky-high, pink-tinted bar, so was another world record. Duplantis, the Louisiana-born 24-year-old who competes for his mother's native Sweden, cleared 6.25 metres to break the world record for the ninth time — but the first time on his sport's grandest stage. His next move was a sprint

to the stands to hug his girlfriend and celebrate his record and second Olympic gold with all those friends and family wearing yellow and blue. The country's king and queen were on hand, as well, to witness Sweden's latest history-making leap into the pole vault pit.

"It's hard to understand, honestly," he said. "If I don't beat this moment in my career, then I'm pretty OK with that. I don't think you can get much better than what just happened." It felt only right that the Duplantis drama came with Noah Lyles in the building.

A night after the American sprint star electrified track with a .005-second victory in the men's 100m, Lyles was on hand to receive his gold medal and watch Duplantis electrify field to the tune of 6.25 metres — about the height of a typical two-story building. — AP

Padukone tears into Sen, others

Prakash Padukone, the 69-year-old badminton legend from Bengaluru, generally keeps it cool, but after watching Lakshya Sen lose from winning positions twice on two days, he could not restrain himself. "Maybe the players are not working hard enough. Maybe it is not enough to get a medal at the Olympics. So you (players) need to work also," he said. Padukone, who saw Sen's two meltdowns — in the semifinals and then the bronze medal playoff, from the coach's chair at the end of the court — said he was left "not happy" with the performance. "Viktor Axelsen might say he (Sen) is the next best. But that's not good enough," Padukone said. "Of course he's still young. He must realise it himself and not give it as an excuse. In terms of facilities, nobody can do anything more." Padukone agreed that the younger players may be pampered a bit too much. "Maybe, to some extent. That (pampering) is also required. I hope the players also realise when you ask for certain things, they also need to deliver," the former All England champion, who runs a coaching academy in Bengaluru, said. "If they don't deliver, then I think you need to be a little firm. Maybe the federation or the government can be. Let's be frank."

Nisha's pain

Nisha Dahiya's Olympics ended in pain, body and soul, when she lost her women's 68kg quarterfinal bout from a winning position. The 25-year-old from Adiyar village, Panipat, led 8-1 before losing 8-10 to 18-year-old Pak Sol Gum of North Korea. Nisha, who was sent back to India today, started very strongly but was forced to take medical timeouts due to injuries in her hand and shoulder. India coach Virender Dahiya today said that it needed Vinesh Phogat's performance today to lift the spirits in the Indian camp. "We were very sad yesterday and the wrestlers and coaches could not sleep properly," he said. "Nisha was in pain. Today, Vinesh managed to bring cheer to our camp." Coach Dahiya added that Pak deliberately caused the injury to Nisha. "It was deliberate, Pak hurt her intentionally. There was an instruction from the Korean corner for it. She attacked Nisha's arm, shoulder joint." Nisha, incidentally, was in the news in November 2021 when another wrestler named Nisha was killed by her coach. "It was like any other competition day when all of a sudden the news of my murder began spreading like wildfire," Nisha said then. Nisha lives on in hope, wishing to fight on. — Rohit Mahajan



Hosts SL seek first series win over India in 27 years

INDIA-SL CRICKET SERIES the result in all of them. er, but the left-hander could not even pick a regulation leg-break by Vandersay in the second one-dayer, getting trapped in front of the wicket. Shreyas Iyer and KL Rahul too have larded over spinners in the past, but here their feet and wrists have been unresponsive against the Lankan slow bowlers. They seemed to be going through a temporary memory loss as to how to rotate strike, the most effective weapon to keep spinners in check on tracks such as the ones at the Premadasa. They just need to watch the batting of Rohit to find a remedy — not so much in his approach but more in the confidence and planning behind his knocks. — PTI

List steps taken for political stability in South Asia: Tewari to govt

Murmu, who is on a two-day visit to Fiji, described the honour as "a reflection of the deep ties of friendship" between India and Fiji. This is the first visit by an Indian head of state to the archipelago nation. President Murmu also addressed the Fijian Parliament.

"As India emerges strongly on the global stage, we stand ready to partner with Fiji, according to your priorities, to build a stronger, more resilient, and more prosperous nation. Let us come together to unlock

the full potential in our partnership for the mutual benefit of people of both our beloved countries," she said while addressing the Parliament.

"These include, 'our democ-

racy, the diversity of our societies, our creed that all human beings are equal, and our commitment to the liberty, dignity and rights of every individual." These shared values are eternal, and shall continue to guide us ahead," she said.

She said she was confident that the newly announced projects, including the Super Specialty Cardiology Hospital to be established in Suva, would help to meet the priority needs of the people of Fiji. — PTI

Armed forces not dumping ground for unfit, says tribunal

Holding that the services have the prerogative to discharge personnel placed in low medical category even if they have not completed their term of engagement to ensure operational efficiency, the Armed Forces Tribunal (AFT) has ruled that the services cannot be a dumping ground for unfit persons.

"It is for the respondents to assess who is fit and who is unfit for serving in the Air Force keeping in view the opinion of the medical board. Members of the armed forces must be physically and mentally fit to meet the challenges which the Air Force is likely to face during the course of discharge of duty," the AFT Bench comprising Justice Anil Kumar and Lt Gen Anil Puri said while dismissing a petition of an airman seeking reinstatement of service.

70% PENDING CASES RELATED TO DISCHARGE

There are over 15,000 cases pending before various Benches of the tribunal

"It is for the respondents to assess who is fit and who is unfit for serving in the Air Force keeping in view the opinion of the medical board. According to sources, about 70 per cent of the pending cases are related to discharge on medical grounds and denial of disability benefits

"Any infirmity on any ground may be fatal to the collective discharge of duties by the armed forces. The Air Force cannot be a dumping ground of low medical category personnel to keep on working in spite of physical and mental ailment," the Bench added.

There are over 15,000 cases pending before various Benches of the tribunal. According to sources, about 70 per cent of these are related to discharge on medical grounds and denial of disability

benefits. He averred that he was forced to undergo psychiatric treatment in military hospital and not allowed to meet his family or given leave.

The Air Force contended that he was hospitalised in 2012 for argumentativeness, irritability, aggression and for fighting with neighbours. He had a history of multiple relapses in past and spent considerable time in hospital. Since he had completed pensionable service, he was invalidated out as per the rules.

Ruling that there was the opinion of the medical board did not suffer from any illegality and arbitrariness and there was no illegality in denying extension in service, the Bench observed that in order to maintain the operational capabilities and effectiveness of a military unit, a substantive number of medically fit personnel are required and that physical fitness is necessary to enable a person to discharge his duty.

SC reserves order on Sisodia's bail petitions

The Supreme Court on Tuesday reserved its order on senior AAP leader Manish Sisodia's petitions seeking bail in corruption and money laundering cases linked to the Delhi excise policy 'scam' even as it wondered how long it will take to complete the trial in the case.

"Where is the light at the end of the tunnel and how long will it take?" a Bench of Justice BR Gavai and Justice KV Viswanathan asked Additional Solicitor General (ASG) SV Raju who accused Sisodia of delaying the trial by filing multiple applications seeking supply of documents.

The Bench pointed out that none of his applications had been rejected for being vexatious and that the probe agencies supplied documents only after Sisodia moved applications. On behalf of the former Delhi Deputy Chief Minister, senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi contended that Sisodia has already undergone half of the minimum sentence and there was no evidence against him. "There is no statement about Manish Sisodia or WhatsApp chat with him. No evidence about hawala operators with him, no evidence of WhatsApp chat with Sisodia at all,"

Asks CBI, ED about 'end of tunnel'

Singhvi submitted.

The CBI and ED had on Monday opposed Sisodia's bail pleas before the SC in corruption and money laundering cases linked to the excise policy scam, saying, documents showed his neck-deep involvement in the scam.

"Sisodia is not an innocent person picked up for political reasons... He is neck deep in the scam," the ASG had said on behalf of the probe agencies. Sisodia's petition for revival of his bail pleas was "not maintainable" and that he should go to the trial court for bail, he had said.

On Tuesday, Raju said Sisodia could tamper with evidence and influence important witnesses, if released on bail. The matter relates to alleged corruption and money laundering in the formulation and execution of the Delhi Government's excise policy for 2021-22 which now stands scrapped. Sisodia was arrested by the CBI on February 26, 2023 for his alleged role in the 'scam' and he resigned from the Delhi cabinet two days later. The ED arrested him in a money-laundering case related to the scam on March 9, 2023 after questioning him in Tihar Jail.

Can child marriage Act override Muslim Personal Law? SC agrees to decide

Can a minor Muslim girl marry a man of her choice on attaining puberty at 15? The Supreme Court on Tuesday agreed to examine the contentious issue after Solicitor General Tushar Mehta urged a Bench led by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud to do so at the earliest in view of divergent views of various high courts that have delivered contrary judgments.

"There are different views taken by different high courts. Whether child marriage is permitted or not in one religion or another religion. We are arguing on constitutional principles. If that can be listed on priority on any Wednesday or Thurs-

day... because new judgments are coming and we are multiplying appeals," Mehta told the Bench after it could not take up the matter today. "We have to settle the matter at once," the CJI assured the Solicitor General and agreed to list the matter at any early date. Mehta represented the National Commission for Protection of

Child Rights (NCPCR), which has challenged a Punjab and Haryana High Court order that said under the Muslim Law a minor Muslim girl was permitted to marry a man of her choice on attaining puberty at 15.

Acting on a petition filed by the NCPCR challenging the Punjab and Haryana High Court's order, the top court had on January 13 last year issued notices to the Haryana Government and others and appointed senior advocate Rajshankar Rao as amicus curiae to assist it in the matter. The HC verdict can't be treated as a precedent, it had noted.

In its 2022 verdict, the Punjab and Haryana High Court had ruled that a Muslim girl who has attained puberty can enter into a lawful marriage, irrespective of the fact that she has not attained the age of majority i.e. 18 years. However, the Kerala High Court held that provisions of the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, will prevail over personal laws.
