

What does it mean to be one of the most well-known cultural ambassadors in a country as diverse as India?


I don't think being India's cultural ambassador to the world is an entitlement. For the past 32 years India has always been in my heart, in my head, wherever I go.


MUMBAI GEARS UP FOR RAKSHABANDHAN

Mumbai is abuzz with shops selling colourful *rakhis* ahead of Raksha-bandhan (August 19). This year, Mumbaikars are spoilt for choice with American diamond *rakhis*, evil eye *rakhis*, bracelet *rakhis*, exquisite *lumbas* and superhero-themed *rakhis*. These are priced anywhere between ₹6 to ₹1,000 depending on the style, quality and materials used. We spoke to stall owners and shopkeepers about the latest trends...



'We have exquisite lumbas this year'

While this traditional *rakhi* has been there for years, this season there are some never-seen-before styles of *lumbas*. Afzal, a *rakhi* seller, says, "We have exquisite *lumbas* this year. They are bejewelled, stone studded, some have American diamonds and are designed in such a way that they can be worn as bracelets later. They are priced between ₹250 - ₹800." These *rakhis* are meant for the brother's wife. It is connected to the bangle of the sister-in-law and is said to protect and bring harmony.

Roli chawal

The simplest one priced at ₹20 is just a pair of sachets, there are also tiny printed cards with two mini packets inside. "This year we have a unique *roli chawal* bouquet made of burlap, decorated with *kundan* flowers and tiny mirrors, which is priced around ₹150 - ₹250," says Chintan, a *rakhi* seller.

HOW TO: Care for your velvet clothes during the monsoon

AVOID MOISTURE EXPOSURE

Ensure that velvet items are stored in a dry place. You can also use silica gel packets in your wardrobe to reduce moisture levels.

PROPER STORAGE

Hang velvet clothes on padded hangers to maintain their shape and avoid creases.

HANDLING STAINS

If the velvet gets wet or stained, blot the area with a dry, absorbent cloth. Do not rub, as this can damage the fabric. For small stains, use a damp cloth with a mild detergent.



PROTECT AGAINST MOULD
Occasionally expose velvet items to indirect sunlight to prevent mildew, but avoid long exposure.

HORTON HEARS A WHO! (2008)

DUMBO & MRS JUMBO

DUMBO (1941)
It's the enormous pair of ears that doomed Dumbo, a young circus elephant, to a lifetime of ridicule until he realised that those ears were actually an asset that allowed him to fly. As Dumbo's mother, Mrs Jumbo too won hearts with her protectiveness and compassion.

MEENA | SING (2016)

An elephant with a mellifluous voice, but who suffers from severe stage fright, eventually overcomes her fears and participates wholeheartedly in a singing competition to help rebuild and reopen a struggling theatre company. The inspiring character was voiced by singer-songwriter Tori Kelly.




COLONEL HATHI

THE JUNGLE BOOK (1967) Colonel Hathi, who appears in the 1967 animated adaptation of Rudyard Kipling's *The Jungle Book*, is a comically pompous elephant, who styles himself after a British Army colonel, leading his family like a patrol troop around the jungle. The iconic character was voiced by actor singer Pat O'Malley.

LUMPY

POOH'S HEFFALUMP MOVIE (2005)
The elephant's name is Heffridge Trumpler Brompet Heffalump IV but the character is nicknamed Lumpy. He was best known defying stereotypes and encouraging others in the film to overcome misconceptions.



TANTOR | TARZAN (1999)

Tantor is much-adored as an extremely phobic (of germs and all things unknown) African forest elephant and the childhood best friend of Tarzan and Terk. Originally, Woody Allen was cast as Tantor, but after he opted out of the film, he role was taken over by Wayne Knight.





Even as celebrations erupted over India's bronze medal in hockey at the Paris Olympics, there was one clear hero of the team. Goalkeeper PR Sreejesh, popularly known as the Wall of India, has been hailed for thwarting Spain's attempts at an equaliser, particularly during the last minutes of the match.

Sreejesh's father PV Raveendran, a farmer in north Ernakulam, says that the family, like the player, are delighted that he's retiring with an Olympic medal. "It was a nail-biting game and we were on the edge of our seats. We spoke to him briefly, because he's been busy. He had said that he would be retiring after the Paris Olympics. So he, and we, too, hoped that he would retire with a medal and we are thrilled that he is able to. Now, he will have no regrets. It is thanks to God's grace."

Raveendran adds that while Sreejesh, who was expected to return on August 10, has informed the family that he wasn't sure

Nina Dobrev is recovering well following a dirt bike accident that left her with severe knee injuries in May. The *Vampire Diaries* star is just over three months into a projected nine-to-12 month recovery, but has already graduated to walking

with a brace. During a recent interview, she said, "I think I'm doing pretty well. My doctors were pretty surprised by my swift progress. I'm a little ahead of schedule in terms of healing, but it is still a very long process."

The accident occurred while Dobrev was riding an electric dirt bike for the first time, she explained last month in an Instagram video chronicling her recovery. "After losing control and crashing the bike — and a not-so-quick hospital visit — I found out that my ACL had completely torn off, my meniscus was torn through, and I had a fracture in my tibial plateau," she said.

Rod Stewart cancels concerts after being diagnosed with COVID



His team shared a health update via a statement on his official Instagram account on Saturday. "We regret to announce that Rod Stewart concert in Stateline, NV and his show in Lincoln, CA have been postponed, as the singer

recovers from a summer strain of COVID-19."

The shows have already been rescheduled, his team announced in the same update. Stewart's illness follows the *You're In My Heart* singer missing the 200th show of his long-running Las Vegas residency at Caesars Palace on Wednesday when he cited strep throat as the reason for his absence.




