Youth murders Army vet father, mother and sister

New Delhi: A 20-year-old Delhi University student, Arjun Tanwar, was arrested for murdering his father, a retired Armyman, mother and his sister at their residence in south Delhi's Neb Sarai. Tanwar allegedly committed the murders early on Wednesday, the couple's wedding anniversary. In a bid to mislead cops, he went for his usual early morning run, and on returning raised an alarm that his family had been murdered.

According to police, the accused, Arjun, believed that his father, Rajesh Kumar (51), intended to transfer ownership of his property to his sister, Kavita (23). This, coupled with his father's

No Sci-Fi, It's Real: Dec Anomalies A Concern

Mosquito Proliferation, Delayed Tree Defoliation, Key Species Missing Not Good News

New Delhi: It's the first week of Dec and the city is aflutter with butterflies. But that is not good news. Their presence and activity show the weather this month is comparable to that of Aug or Sept. The anomalies don't stop at the butterflies. House geckos are still crawling on the walls, semal and palash leaves are still green and mosquitoes are breeding and biting.

The absence of the typical cool weather in Oct, Nov, and now potentially Dec, has given the city some reasons for worry. The mosquito proliferation, delayed tree defoliation and the absence of migrant species in the region signal significant ecological disruptions.

According to wildlife biologist Faiyaz Khudsar, who is the scientist in charge of DDA's biodiversity parks programme, cool winters are crucial to the health of nature and forests. "In winter, the earth's surface temperature is regulated. Snow covers the earth, and then when it melts, it creates rivulets and reservoirs that assist life. Species like bears and snakes hibernate; it's part of the life cycle and energy balance," said Khudsar. "This year so far, the weather has been

warm. Not a single plant in the Yamuna Biodiversity Park has started shedding."

He said it is important for plants to 'sleep' in winter in order to minimise activity, store energy for regeneration, flowering and fruiting, and again sprout in spring. "In the absence of a proper

winter, this overall phenology is affected," said Khudsar, who also said this weather trends foretold larger impacts like 'range shifts', when the habitats of certain shrubs and animals gained altitude to cope with the heat. Environmentalist Pradip Krishen added that some trees like the

jacaranda that like cool winters might suffer this year.

The scientist also pointed out that winter offers a brief relief from vector-borne diseases. This year, however, that's not the case. "As the temperature is optimum, mosquitoes and other pests and pathogens may last longer and create pro-

blems," he warned.

According to field biologist Sumit Dookia, house lizards should have gone into hibernation by now. "But these reptiles are still seen on walls. Generally, they go into hibernation around Diwali, but the temperature is conducive for their presence," said Dookia, who also remarked the native semal, palash and Ficus trees have yet to shed their leaves as usual. "The leaves of these species haven't even turned yellow. They are set to bud and flower in Feb but haven't even started shedding. This can impact the life-cycle of the plants," he said.

Warm winter will affect not only specific species, but also have a cascading effect, cautioned wildlife biologist Sohail Madan. "The coming seasons will be impacted. And in Delhi, which has dry deciduous forests, plants are supposed to go into dormancy in winter, but if they don't shed now, they might not be healthier in the coming seasons," said Madan. "The volume of migratory waterfowl is very low. And most peculiarly, butterflies are still active when their number usually drops by the time Dec begins. They are as active as in Aug and this can impact their lifecycle."

Warm Dec may give wings to viral infections

New Delhi: The meteorological prediction of unusually high temperatures in Dec has alarmed healthcare professionals, who expect a surge in health problems in vulnerable groups such as respiratory ailments and viral infections. The unexpected warmth could also cause dehydration and heat-related discomfort, especially among susceptible groups.

Dr Suranjit Chatterjee, senior consultant, internal medicine, Indraprastha Apollo Hospitals, explained that elevated temperatures could worsen existing health conditions and trigger new health issues. It is particularly true of susceptible groups, including senior citizens, young children and individuals with underlying medical conditions.

"The unusually warm weather during a traditionally cool month can result in heat-related illnesses and fluid loss, particularly when people have not adjusted to higher temperatures," said Chatterjee. "The unexpected weather variations can also affect mental wellbeing, potentially causing heightened stress and anxiety among people. The extended warm period also provides favourable conditions for mosquitoes to breed, raising concerns about increased instances of diseases like malaria and dengue fever. So, healthcare sys-

tems might experience additional strain from increased patient numbers, requiring enhanced disease monitoring and medical preparedness."

An additional concern due to the warm and humid weather is a flare-up in skin fungal infections and eczema, said Dr Rommel Tickoo, director, internal medicine, Max Super Speciality Hospital, Saket.

Air pollution's influence on climate change is notably

affecting weather patterns and, according to Dr Avi Kumar, senior pulmonology consultant, Fortis Escorts, Okhla, winter temperatures are becoming less severe while summers are getting warmer. To date, Dec has shown milder cold with warmer air, accompanied by significant temperature variations. These environmental changes are resulting in increased allergic reactions affecting the

skin and upper respiratory tract, leading to symptoms including nasal blockage, rhinorrhoea, and irritation in eyes and throat.

"The temperature fluctuations are also causing an increase in lower respiratory tract conditions, particularly bronchial asthma, with respiratory patients showing heightened vulnerability to infections. These environmental changes are problematic

for individuals with existing respiratory conditions, including asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and interstitial lung disease," said Kumar.

Expressing similar views, Dr Arvind Aggarwal, senior consultant, internal medicine, Sri Balaji Action Medical Institute, said that after Nov's air pollution, the higher temperatures this month could worsen respiratory problems like asthma, bronchitis and COPD.

Emphasising the importance of regular health screenings during this period, particularly for individuals with ongoing respiratory or cardiac conditions, Dr Ashish Kumar Prakash, associate director, respiratory & sleep medicine, Medanta, Gurgaon, said that a nutritious diet rich in vitamins played a vital role in strengthening the immune system. Preventive steps such as wearing masks and avoiding drastic temperature variations could minimise health concerns.

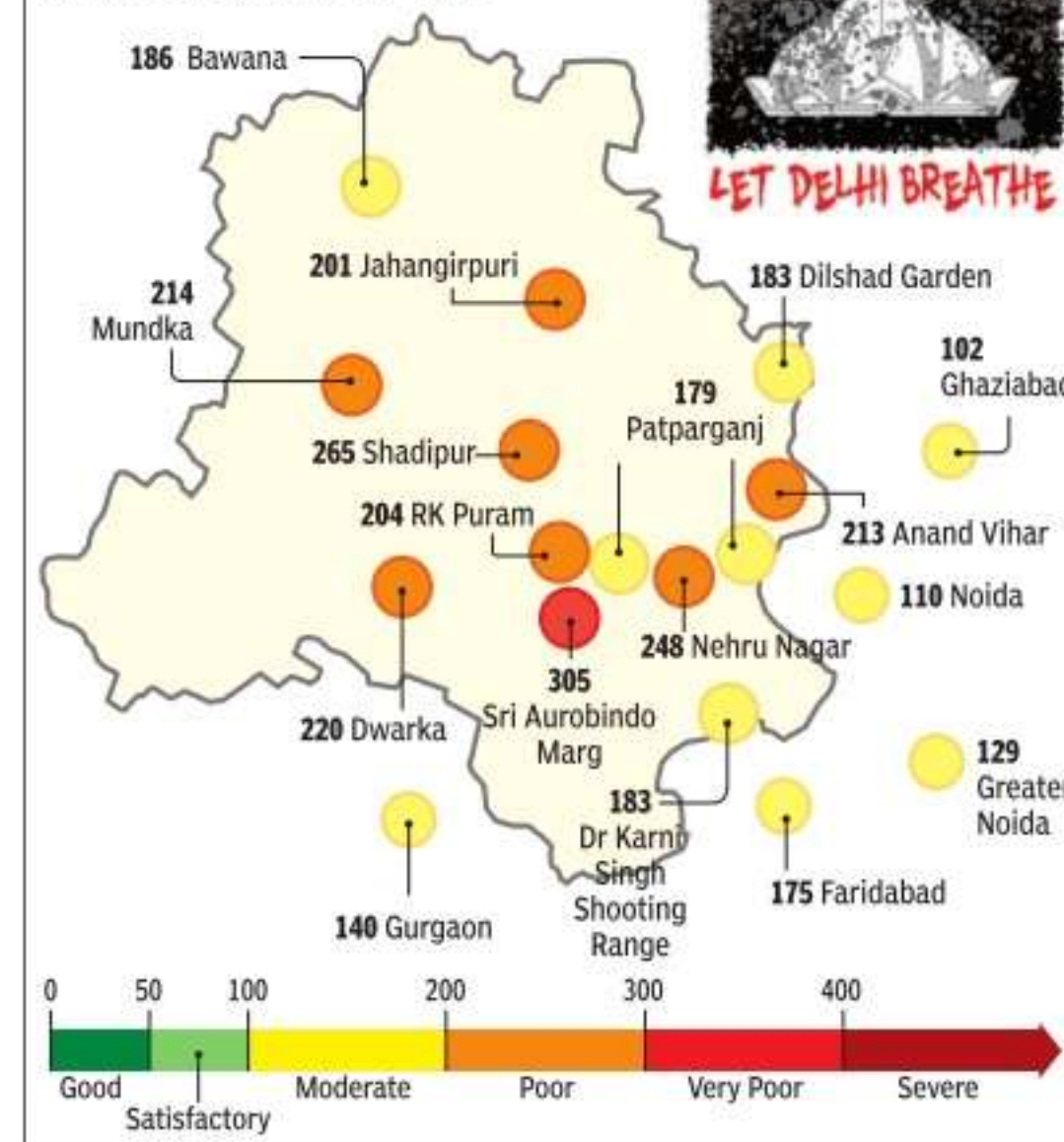
"To ward off infections, ensure proper hydration, use masks for protection against pollution and maintain proper hygiene practices," advised Prakash. "Keep track of air quality levels and limit outdoor activities when smog is at its peak. Ensure proper airflow in your residence to prevent the accumulation of indoor pollutants."

CM inaugurates 25 EV charging stns in E Delhi

New Delhi: Chief minister Atishi and senior Aam Aadmi Party functionary Manish Sisodia inaugurated 25 low-cost EV charging stations in Mayapuri Phase-1 on Wednesday.

The move is part of Delhi govt's broader strategy on combatting pollution, promoting the use of electric vehicles, and reinforcing the city's status as India's EV capital, an official statement said.

At the event, Atishi emphasised on Delhi govt's commitment to fostering a sustainable future. "Delhi now boasts of more than 2,400 EV charging points, offering the lowest rates in the country. It is the reason why 12% of all new vehicles registered in Delhi are electric," Atishi said, adding that the city is also home to the second-largest fleet of electric buses globally.

The new charging stations, managed by Delhi Transco Limited, took the total number of govt-operated charging points to 78, the statement said.

Praising the initiative as a step towards making the capital a hub for green mobility, Sisodia said, "These charging stations are the power banks of a modern Delhi. Despite challenges, we achieved 12% EV adoption among new vehicles, laying the foundation for a cleaner, healthier future. When we created the EV policy, we set a target that by 2025, 25% of new vehicles would be electric." TNN

ED busts ₹640cr cyber fraud racket run by CAs and CSs...

New Delhi: Given the big money, highly educated people are joining cybercrime. The Enforcement Directorate has unearthed a syndicate in Delhi-NCR where a few chartered accountants, company secretaries and crypto traders got together, scripted a cyber fraud racket and collected more than Rs 640 crore.

During a search operation between Nov 28 and Nov 30, two CAs — Ajay and Vipin Yadav — and a crypto trader, Jitendra Kaswan, were arrested. Further investigation unearthed a large-scale money laundering racket operated with the assistance of handlers sitting abroad and through closely held chat groups on instant messaging apps.

When ED officials raided the premises of a CA, Ashok Kumar Sharma, in Bijwasan in Delhi last week, associates of the accused attacked the agency's team, injuring an official. The others were saved by CRPF and Delhi Police personnel. The syndicate was engaged in online betting, gambling, part-time jobs, and phishing scams across several states.

The money was collected and siphoned off by layering through more than 5,000 mule bank accounts in India, and subsequently, uploaded on "PY-

YPL", a UAE-based payment platform. Part of the fraud money was withdrawn in cash in Dubai through Master/Visa Indian Bank ATM cards.

ED conducted searches at 13 premises across Delhi, Gurgaon, Jodhpur, Jhunjhunu, Hyderabad, Pune and Kolkata, and recovered hundreds of debit cards, cheque books, ATM cards, PAN cards, digital signatures, trust wallet secret phrases and seized unaccounted cash of Rs 47 lakh and cryptocurrency (USDT) worth Rs 1.36 crore from a private wallet. Several bank accounts have been frozen.

"Instructions regarding opening of mule accounts, cash circulation and purchase of

crypto were provided on a group messaging account by the handlers. More than 2,000 documents detailing debit/credit transactions in hundreds of bank accounts and purchase of cryptocurrency have been recovered and are being analysed," ED said on Wednesday.

The Delhi Police has registered an FIR on the attack on the ED team and arrested Radhe Shyam Sharma, brother of CA Ashok Kumar Sharma who is absconding.

ED initiated investigation on the basis of two FIRs registered by the CBI and the Economic Offences Wing of the Delhi Police with respect to cyber fraud money to the tune of Rs 640 crore.



YOUR HARD-EARNED MONEY UNDER ATTACK

...CBI unearths ₹117cr cyber scam after raids at over 10 locations

New Delhi: Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has cracked down on a massive cyber fraud scheme, uncovering a staggering Rs 117 crore scam. The investigation, which involved searches at 10 locations in Delhi and surrounding areas, has shed light on a complex web of financial scams orchestrated by organised cybercriminals and suspected foreign actors.

CBI has registered the case under various sections of Indian Penal Code and the Information Technology Act, 2000, following a complaint from the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C), ministry of home affairs. The complaint alleged that these cybercriminals were engaged in systematic financial fraud across India, targeting victims through digital platforms such as websites, WhatsApp and Telegram.

The scammers employed various tactics to lure people, including part-time job scams, task-based frauds, and promises of high returns on initial investments. Once the victims deposited funds, they were quickly transferred through a network of "mule accounts" designed to obscure their origins. The funds were eventually withdrawn overseas via ATMs or used for wallet top-ups on fintech platforms.

An analysis of 3,903 complaints registered on the National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP) revealed that the fraudsters siphoned off approximately Rs 117 crore, primarily withdrawn in Dubai and other UAE locations. Investigations identified 3,295 Indian bank accounts involved in these fraudulent transactions.

During the searches, the CBI seized incriminating evidence, including electronic devices and financial records, from the premises of 10 people suspected of involvement in the fraud. The investigation is ongoing to identify additional members of the syndicate and trace the complete flow of illicit funds.

In light of this development, the CBI has urged citizens to exercise caution while engaging with offers on digital platforms, particularly those promising quick earnings or lucrative investments. TNN

54 children freed from factories, 181 in 30 days

New Delhi: At least 181 children have been rescued from factories in the city in the past 30 days. Of these, 54 were rescued on Wednesday alone in central Delhi's Anand Parbat. Six factories were also sealed during the operation led by SDMs of Patel Nagar and Civil Lines, labour department, Delhi Police and NGO Sahyog Care for You.

The rescued children are all aged between eight and 17 and hail mainly from Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. Rescue workers found them working in factories producing plastic toys, fans, doorbells and other items. The children said they earned Rs 100 per day while working 12-hour shifts without breaks.

"The rescue operation revealed a horrific scene. We found children working in plastic factories, living and sleeping in the same dingy spaces where they worked. They were forced to seek respite on makeshift cardboard beds, positioned dangerously close to the machinery itself in almost all these cases," said Harish Kumar, a rescue worker.

"These children who work in plastic moulding are constantly exposed to toxic fumes from burnt plastic. Their health is severely compromised, affecting both their quality of life and life expectancy," he added.

"We consistently find such children in a state of severe undernourishment, their bodies visibly weakened. Most were trafficked from impoverished families in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar villages to work in Delhi-NCR," Kumar told TOI.

5 minor girls rescued from bonded labour

Five minor girls were rescued from different areas in Delhi in a joint operation conducted by the crime branch of Delhi Police, the Jharkhand police, and an NGO. The rescued girls, some as young as 12, were working as domestic workers without pay for up to four years. The authorities are working to reunite the girls with their families in Jharkhand. The operation was launched following the arrest of a human trafficker, Poonam Marandi, last month from a rented accommodation in Shakarpur. Marandi, who was involved in trafficking young girls from Jharkhand to Delhi-NCR, allegedly exploited these girls for years. An officer said that in one of the cases, a girl was brought to Delhi in 2021 on the pretext of a job opportunity. While the father managed to stay in touch with her for the first three months, all communication ceased thereafter. TNN

"Delhi High Court has mandated quick trials for such cases and back wages to be paid within three months of rescue. We request the district magistrate to help these children with rehabilitation and compensation as early as possible," said Shekhar Mahajan, general secretary of Sahyog Care for You.

27th Wedding Anniv Their Last

Neighbours Say Family Was Peaceful With No Known Enemies

New Delhi: The morning of what was supposed to be a joyous occasion for the Tanwar family on Wednesday turned out to be a shocker for the neighbourhood. Rajesh Tanwar and Komal Tanwar were all set to celebrate their 27th wedding anniversary, but fate had a cruel twist in store for them. They were allegedly attacked by their son, Arjun, and lost their lives and that of their daughter, Kavita.

As news of the tragedy spread, a silence descended on the neighbourhood in Neb Sarai in south Delhi. Relatives, friends and neighbours flocked to the crime scene, their faces showing a range of emotions from disbelief to sorrow. Saurav, a neighbour who knew the family for years, said Rajesh, the family's sole income earner, worked as a personal security officer for a south Delhi businessman. "I was asleep when I received the horrifying news. The entire neighbourhood was shocked. I had tutored Rajesh's children. Kavita was an ambitious young woman who aspired to crack the competitive exams," said Saurav.

The Tanwars were deeply respected within the community. Neighbours described them as kind, punctual and always ready to lend a helping hand. "I never once witnessed them engaging in arguments or disputes. They were a peaceable family," a neighbour disclosed.

Deepak, a close relative, recalled his last interaction with his uncle and his cousin, Arjun. He said he messaged his uncle the night before to wish them on their anniversary. Around 4.30am on Wednesday, Deepak said, Arjun sent a reply thanking him. Another relative remembered the couple were planning a small celebration to celebrate their anniversary.

At the scene, police were seen taking Arjun, 20, while a police dog followed them to different parts of the house. Later, the cops took the youth to the police station.

Rajesh, according to relatives, was a black belt in karate, while Arjun, also called Bunty by family members, was a boxer and was preparing for the national championships. "The daughter, Kavita, too had learned taekwondo. The father spent a lot on his children's education and their sports," the relative said. Another kin added that the couple were planning to shift back to Mahendragarh in Haryana after both their children settled down.

Sube Singh, another relative, said, "Rajesh retired from the army in 2007 as a naib subedar, a junior commission rank. During his army tenure, he also received training as an NSG commando." He revealed that the Tanwars, originally from Mahendragarh in Haryana, had been living in Delhi for more than a decade now. Singh recalled the last time he saw them — at a relative's wedding in Haryana on Nov 22. "They were the life of the party, radiating joy and warmth as they mingled with other relatives," he recalled.

The murders sent shockwaves through the community. For the residents of Neb Sarai, it was something horrific that had never before occurred in their peaceful locality.

Rajesh's body was found on the first floor, while his 46-year-old wife Komal's and daughter Kavita's bodies were discovered on the ground floor, each on separate beds. Neighbours who witnessed the scene reported that clothing was placed around the victims' necks to stem the flow of blood.

A team under the supervision of DCP (South) Ankit Chauhan scanned multiple CCTV footages and found no signs of forced entry or burglary. Everything inside the house appeared to be in its original place. "When we questioned Arjun, he started giving different answers, and there were multiple contradictions," joint CP (south) Sanjay Kumar Jain said, adding that Arjun subsequently confessed to the crime.

The team that cracked the case was formed under ACP Abhinendra Jain and led by inspector (AATS) Umesh Kumar. During interrogation, Arjun revealed that he devised

the plot to eliminate his family members a week ago. He chose Wednesday, which was his parents' wedding anniversary, believing that no one would suspect him.

To create a web of deception, he went out of the house at 5.30am for his daily morning run. "When he returned, as per his plan, he rushed to a gym where he works out and informed the gym owner that his parents had been murdered," police said. He then alerted the neighbours and relatives.

He further told police that he first killed his sister and then his father. His mother went to the bathroom, and as soon as she returned, he killed her. The sister and mother showed resistance, which was evident from the nature of their injuries, while he killed his father in his sleep. He used his father's Army knife for the murders.

"He told us that he opted for slitting their throats as he knew it would prevent them from screaming. He was so enraged with his father that he stabbed him in the head,"

police said.

Arjun said his father regularly scolded him over his daily routine and studies. He was also angry that his parents supported his sister, who was pursuing a master's degree and doing well in her studies. The accused was also pursuing a BA in political science from a college affiliated with Delhi University. He is a trained boxer and represented Delhi in boxing and won a silver medal. He studied at Army Public School in Dhaula Kuan.

"Arjun harboured a deep grudge against his father and family members, feeling that no one supported him. He felt neglected and isolated. He also suspected that his father was planning to give their property to his sister," police said.

Rajesh reportedly reprimanded and physically assaulted him in front of others outside their home. According to sources, on Dec 1, during his sister's birthday celebration, his father had physically assaulted him.

Police are also scanning Arjun's digital devices to check if he watched any videos to plan his crime.

Thousands of people, including some who had invested close to 15 years ago, are awaiting delivery of their flats. According to forensic audit report, Rs14,270 crore was deposited by 29,800 homebuyers and Unitech borrowed Rs1,806 crore from six financial institutions for 74 projects. After examining the account books of Unitech Group and its subsidiaries, the auditor said Rs5,063 crore or 40% of collections from homebuyers were not used for the housing projects while outflows of Rs 2,389 crore were not ascertained. The report said 40% of the money raised from financial institutions, amounting to Rs 763 crore, had not been utilised for construction.

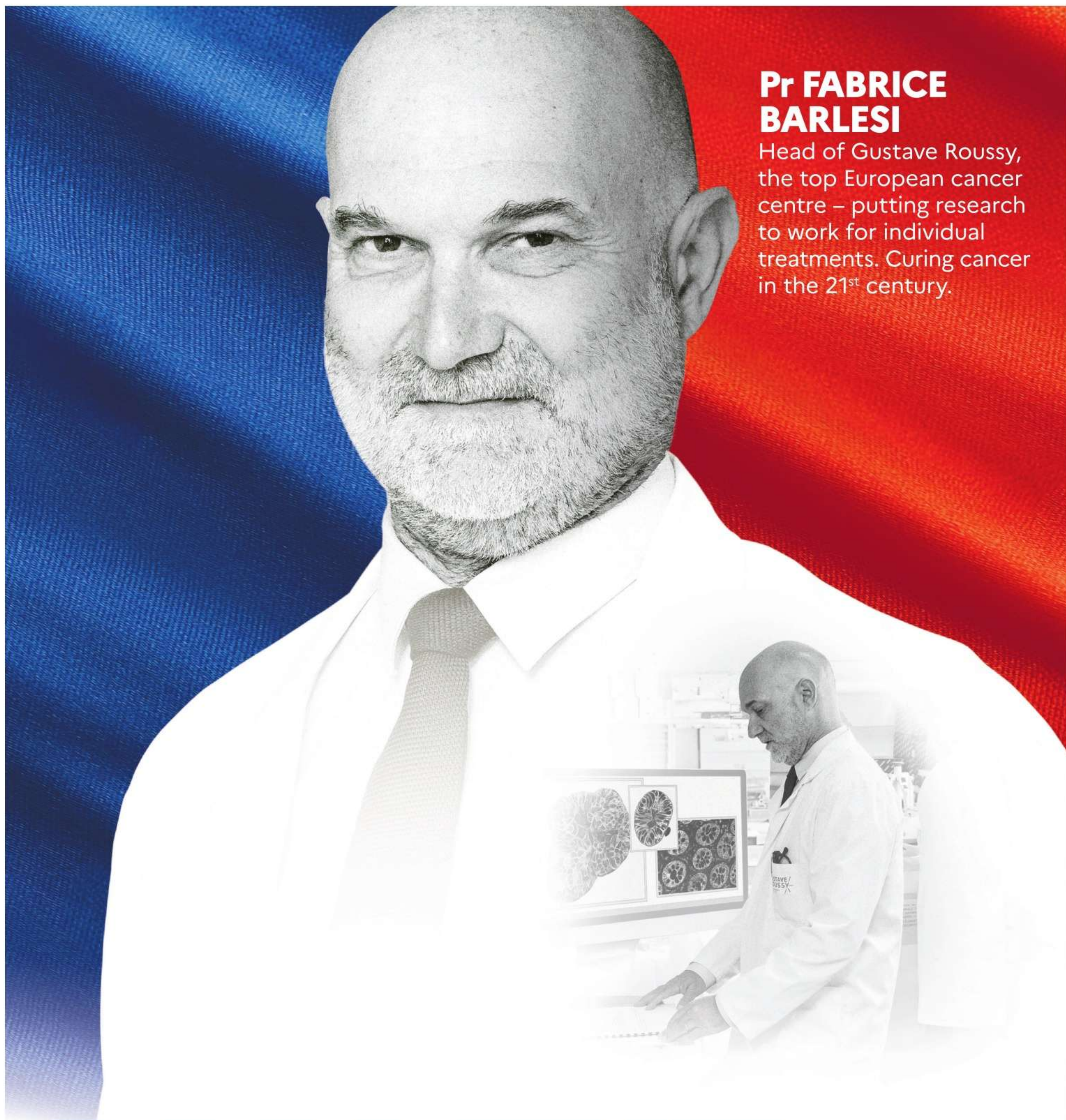

Govt Allocates Additional ₹2.5k Cr For Capital Work

REVISED BUDGET: Cash-Strapped DJB To Also Get ₹1,900cr

New Delhi: With assembly polls around the corner, Delhi govt made an additional allocation of over Rs 2,500 crore for capital works, apart from earmarking Rs 1,900 crore for the cash-strapped Delhi Jal Board to meet its routine revenue expenditure, in the revised budget estimates for FY 2024-25.

Additional provision has

been made for ongoing Delhi Metro works under Phase IV expansion plan, construction of bus depots, strengthening of roads, installation of CCTV cameras and remodeling of existing hospitals.

Govt also set aside Rs 400 crore under MLA Local Area Development Fund to meet its commitment of increasing the yearly amount for each assembly constituency

from Rs 10 crore to Rs 15 crore.

CM Atishi, who holds charge of the finance department, presented the Delhi Appropriation Bill in the assembly Wednesday, seeking a supplementary grant to meet expenses as per revised estimates, which was approved by the House with a voice vote. Officials said Delhi assembly passed supplementary demands for grants of Rs 4,575

crore for FY 2024-25.

Expecting increased revenue receipts through better tax collection, GST compensation and other sources, govt increased the total outlay from Rs 76,000 crore in budgetary estimates to Rs 77,700 crore in revised estimates.

The bill was passed on the last day of the winter session, which most likely was the last sitting of the House in the seventh Delhi assembly, whose term will end in Feb.

While Delhi Metro sought Rs 7,200 crore under various heads, Delhi govt set aside an additional amount of Rs 1,648.7 crore in the revised estimates for Phase IV expansion. Govt also provisioned Rs 951 crore for repayment of the Japan International Cooperation Agency loan, taken by Delhi Metro for constructing corridors in Phases I, II and III.

Govt made an additional allocation of Rs 100 crore in revised estimates to the transport department for Rapid Rail Transit System's two proposed corridors - Delhi-SNB and Delhi-Panipat. Construction of the Delhi-Meerut corridor is on in full swing, and govt is already paying its share as per schedule.

The transport department has been provided with Rs 140 crore for the EV policy and Rs 2,985 crore for DTC salary and other expenses, apart from other funds.

Govt increased the power department's allocation by Rs 350 crore to provide subsidies to domestic consumers using up to 400 units of electricity.

SC next: Longest serving HC judge bids tearful adieu

New Delhi: The longest serving judge in Delhi High Court's history bid a tearful adieu Wednesday after his elevation to the Supreme Court.

On Tuesday, the law ministry notified Delhi HC Chief Justice Manmohan's appointment as an SC judge with effect from the date he assumes office. He is set to take oath on Thursday.

Justice Manmohan was appointed as acting CJ of Delhi HC on Nov 9, 2023 and confirmed as Chief Justice on Sept 29, 2024. During his tenure, he broke several records in legal history. Apart from being the sole judge to have had an uninterrupted tenure of 6,142 days in HC, he is only the

second person in 37 years to have been appointed as Delhi Chief Justice despite it being his parent HC, a rarity.

Often described as a "quintessential Delhi product", Justice Manmohan had an eventful tenure, where he identified two issues plaguing the city. Friction between Delhi's ministers and their department officers, along with a "culture of freebies", were repeatedly flagged as worrisome by his bench, be it ordering revamp of govt hospitals, stormwater drains, removal of encroachments near Nizamuddin Dargah, mutation of "urban villages", or tackling stray dogs and the monkey bite menace.

In a case where the absence of the MCD standing committee delayed the supply of textbooks and uniforms for students, Justice Manmohan's bench authorised the MCD commissioner to sanction Rs 5 crore funds without waiting for clearance. In another PIL, his bench stressed the "mind-set" of Delhi's administrators

needs to change, particularly the perception that everything can be provided for free, as it resulted in a lack of funds to improve public facilities.

In a rare outburst over the state of affairs in Delhi's health department, Justice Manmohan told the city's health minister and health secretary the court would "send you to jail" for feuding over enactment of a law to regulate clinical establishments. He told them they were "servants of govt" and couldn't have "large egos".

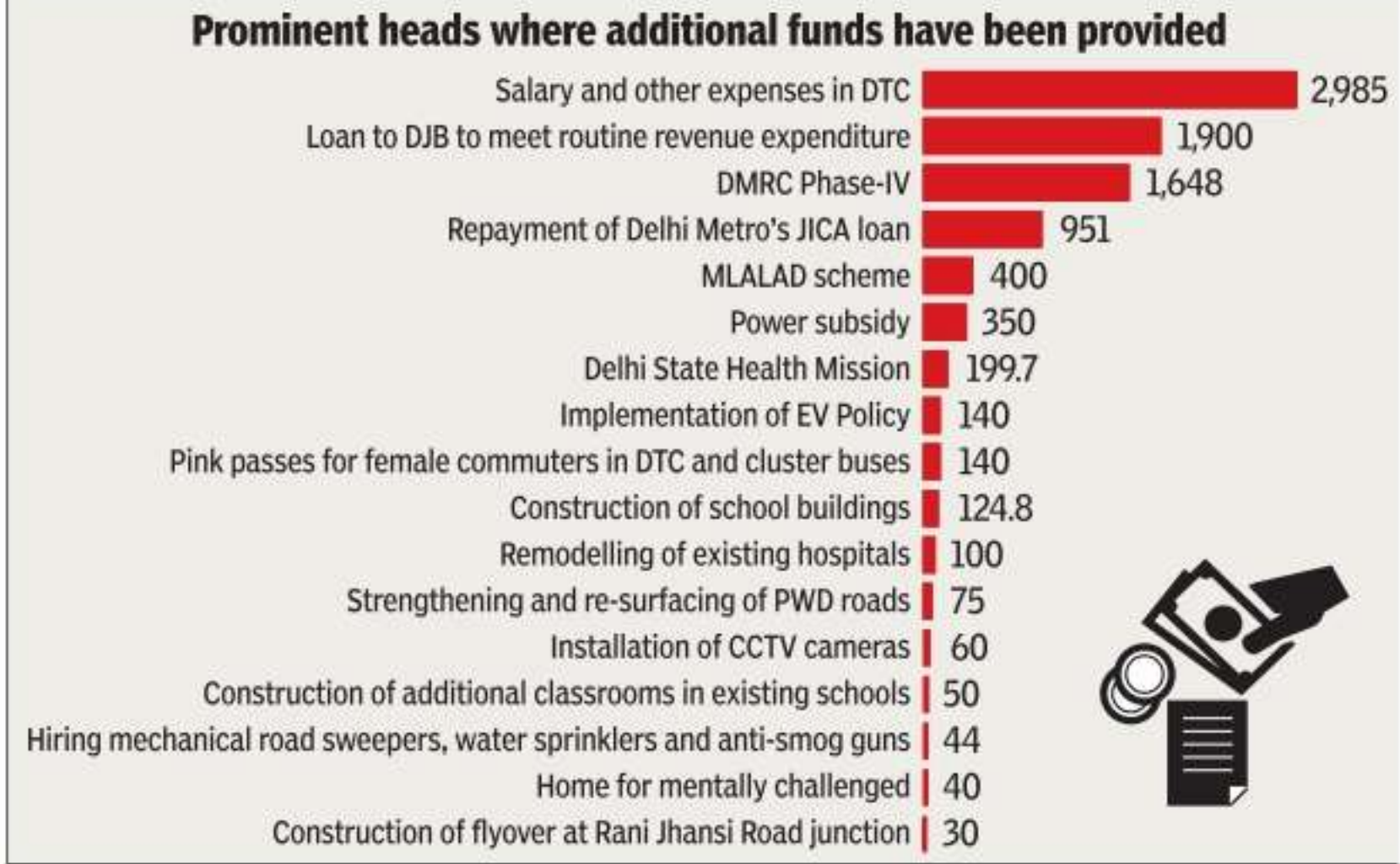
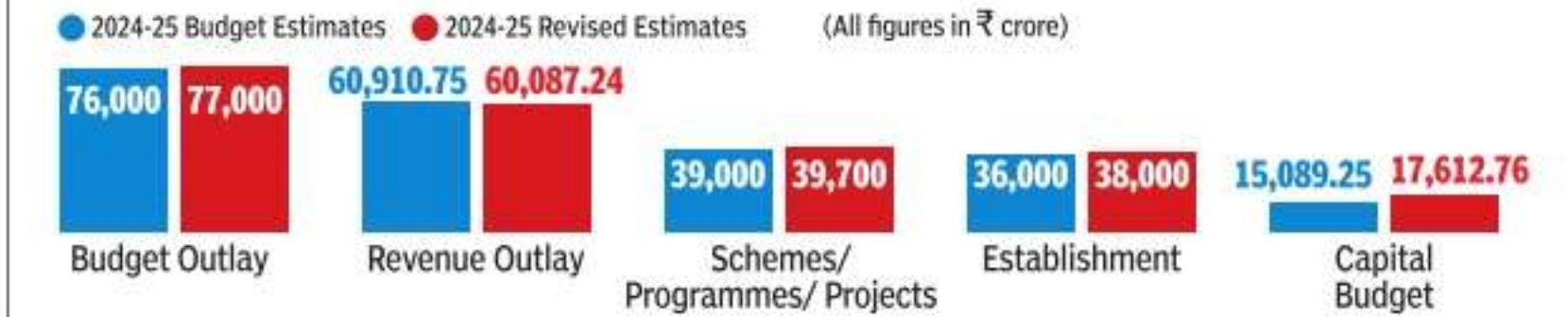
Dealing with this year's unprecedented flooding, Justice Manmohan criticised attempts to politicise efforts to protect the Yamuna floodplain by removing encroachments so floodwater can flow to the river. It was HC's intervention that led to one agency being answerable for everything related to the flow of water and stormwater drains. While dealing with the deaths of UPSC aspirants in a coaching centre's basement due to waterlogging, he also set up a high-powered committee to overhaul Delhi's infrastructure, such as outdated drains.

His bench also highlighted the deadly menace posed by stray dogs and monkeys. Striking a balance between animal lovers and the right of children to play in parks or people to walk freely, Justice Manmohan observed "stray dogs and monkeys cannot be allowed to take over the city", voicing concern over the menace in big hospitals and public parks. He identified "misplaced public sympathy and a notion of love for these animals", terming it a genuine problem.

During his tenure, the Delhi judiciary saw significant upgrades in virtual and physical infrastructure. So on, 255 courtrooms at Karkardooma, Rohini and Rouse Avenue will be ready as funds have been sanctioned by govt. With his appointment, SC will have 33 judges, one short of the sanctioned strength of 34 judges, including the CJ.

Son of former J&K governor Jagmohan, Justice Manmohan was elevated as Delhi HC had only one representation in SC — CJI Sanjiv Khanna.

Van catches fire in e-way crash, driver charred

New Delhi: A 36-year-old man burned to death after the van he was driving collided with a car and caught fire on Dwarka Expressway in the early hours of Wednesday. According to police, the car was being driven in the wrong direction and its driver fled after treatment in hospital.

The deceased driver was identified as Arvind Kumar, a resident of Gopal Colony in Samalkha.

An officer said Dwarka Sector 23 police station received information at 12.15am Wednesday about two vehicles catching fire due to collision on Dwarka Expressway. "When the police personnel reached the spot, they found a car and a CNG van in an accident and burning.

The driver of the van had burned to death," a senior police officer said.

A Delhi Fire Services official said fire brigades were sent to the spot and the blaze was extinguished. The burnt body of the driver was recovered from the van and transported to a govt hospital for post-mortem.

"The police team is analysing the footage of nearby CCTV cameras to ascertain the proper sequence and movement of both the vehicles. However, prima facie, our investigation revealed that the car was coming from the wrong direction and rammed the van," a senior police officer said.

The driver of the car was also injured in the accident. After receiving medical treatment, he allegedly fled to his village in Haryana. "He has been identified and efforts are underway to track him. Several police teams have been sent to Haryana to nab him," the officer added.

A case has been registered under sections 281 (rash driving) and 106 (causing death by negligence) of BNS at Dwarka Sector 23 police station.

Arrested farmers released after Gr Noida protest

Noida: Around 5,000 farmers protested near the entry point of Yamuna Expressway on Wednesday, compelling police to release 123 leaders who were arrested from a sit-in demonstration close to the Delhi-Noida border a day before.

Most farmers dispersed after the arrested protesters were released around 4.30pm.

Among those released from jails were BKU-Tikait's West UP president Pawan Khatana, Bhartiya Kisan Parishad chief Sukhvinder Khaliya and All India Kisan Sabha's district president Rupesh Verma.

Farmer outfits said they will hold a meeting on Thursday to determine their course of action. Farmer outfits from west UP revived their protest this week to demand higher compensation and 10% abadi (developed residential) plots in return for land acquired by authorities in Gautam Budh Nagar over the years.

They had planned a march to Delhi from the Noida-Greater Noida Expressway on Monday, but layers of security apparatus blocked them from entering the capital, also throwing traffic out of whack in the NCR city for around five hours.

Farmers called off the expressway protest by the evening after being assured by officials that their concerns will be addressed. But a group continued a sit-in demonstration at the Dalit Purna Sthal, a few hundred metres from the Delhi-Noida border near Chilla.

Noida police on Tuesday arrested those protesting at the Sthal, in a move that farmers said was unexpected as they were holding a peaceful demonstration, which did not block the expressway route.

On Wednesday, farmers from Noida, Greater Noida, Hapur, Meerut, Bulandshahr and Muzaffarnagar joined the protest organised under the loop of the Yamuna Expressway, called the zero point, so traffic remained unaffected on the speedway. BKU (Tikait) spokesperson Sunil Pradhan said the primary demand for Wednesday's demonstration was the release of arrested protesters.

‘Failure To Provide Cab On Time Deficiency In Service’

Aggregator Told To Pay ₹54k To Man Who Missed His Flight

New Delhi: Delhi State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission has upheld a district commission ruling that deemed Uber India Systems Pvt Ltd's failure to provide a cab on time and non-resolution of the issue as a "deficiency in service".

The district commission had asked Uber to pay Rs 24,100 as compensation, plus Rs 30,000 for mental distress and legal costs.

A bench of Justices Pinki and Sangeeta Dhirgala Sehgal noted that Uber provided neither evidence nor adequate justification for the taxi's non-arrival. "As a service provider facilitating the transportation process, the appellant (Uber)

The incident dates back to Nov 19, 2022. The complainant, Upendra Singh, had booked Uber at 3.15am to go to IGI Airport. The driver never arrived and there was no response from the firm despite numerous calls. Singh cancelled Uber and took a local taxi, reaching the airport at 5.15am. The delay caused him and his wife to miss their Delhi-Indore flight. They could spend less than 12 hours with their family in Indore, as return tickets to Delhi were pre-booked.

Singh tried to take up the issue with Uber but there was no response to a legal notice dated Nov 23, 2021. So, he filed a consumer complaint with Delhi District Commission.

In Oct 2023, the district commission ordered Uber to

pay Rs 24,100 for the replacement tickets and Rs 30,000 for mental distress and legal costs. Challenging the decision at Delhi State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Uber India claimed "insufficient opportunity" to present its case and denied any "deficiency in service". It maintained its role as a cab aggregator, arguing against liability for drivers' defaults. It pointed out Singh's decision to use a local taxi, instead of requesting another ride through the app.

However, the bench said since Uber India functions as a facilitator, it should have provided a viable alternative. Failure of grievance redressal highlighted the lack of responsibility in ensuring a seamless customer experience, it added.

Budget presentation likely to be delayed due to absence of MCD's standing panel

New Delhi: The Municipal Corporation of Delhi is likely to deviate from the previous practice of presenting the budget proposals for the coming financial year before Dec 10. Under the Delhi Municipal Corporation Act, the municipal commissioner must present the budget in a special meeting of the standing committee on or before Dec 10.

Officials are attributing the likely delay to the absence of a properly constituted standing committee.

The compilation of proposals received from various departments hasn't been completed yet. Once done, it will take some more days to print the budget booklets. "The statutory norms require presenting the budget proposals before mid-Dec, but the proposals are placed before the standing committee first and then sent to the

zonal ward committees and the other statutory committees, such as education, horticulture and public health for discussion and the addition of their points," said an official. "After that, the budget is finally taken to the House by the leader of opposition and concluded by the leader of the House. But in the absence of a standing committee and other statutory committees (except for 12 zonal ward committees), this process stands disrupted."

In similar circumstances last year, then-commissioner Gyanesh Bharti presented the budget directly at a House sitting, getting it approved later by leader of the House Mukesh Goyal at a House meeting. This time, it is likely that the administration will send the proposed budget to the municipal secretary's office for presentation to the standing committee. But since the committee has still not been constituted, it is unlikely to see further

progress. The final outcome may depend on the verdict in the standing committee case pending before the Supreme Court.

Though the poll for the 18 members of the standing committee was completed on Sept 27, then mayor Shelly Oberoi questioned the election of the 18th member. Officials have ruled out the possibility of holding the election for the last member again, stating that everything happened in accordance with the DMC Act. Oberoi filed a petition in the Supreme Court on Oct 4. The apex court has stayed the election result until it disposes of Oberoi's petition. This has further delayed the process for the constitution of the standing committee, pending for at least 21 months. The next hearing on this matter is scheduled for this month.

The non-installation of the standing committee has held up the implementation of crucial projects for many months.

Ph IV: DMRC completes work on longest underground tunnel on Golden Line

New Delhi: Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) on Wednesday completed the longest underground tunnelling between Tughlaqabad Airforce Launching Shaft and Maa Anandmayee Marg on the Tughlaqabad-Aerocity corridor of Phase IV. This is the longest underground tunnel of Phase IV.

A tunnel boring machine broke through at Maa Anandmayee Marg Station after creating a nearly 2.7-kilometre-long tunnel. This tunnel breakthrough was achieved using a mammoth 105-metre-long machine. Two parallel circular tunnels for up and down movement are being constructed on this stretch as part of the Aerocity-Tughlaqabad corridor, which is the new Golden Line. However, the breakthrough on the other parallel tunnel is expected to be achieved in Jan 2025.

A DMRC official said this new tunnel was constructed at an average depth of

16 metres. A total of 1,894 rings have been installed in the tunnel, with an inner diameter of 5.8 metres.

"The tunnelling work posed significant technical challenges, including the

relocation of a sewer line, navigation through hard rock strata, etc. The tunnel was built using the proven technology of earth pressure balancing method with a concrete lining made of precast tunnel rings. These tunnel rings were cast at a fully mechanised casting yard set up at Mundka. The concrete segments were cured with a steam curing system to achieve early strength," said Anuj Dayal, principal executive director, corporate communications, DMRC.

Dayal added that necessary safety precautions were taken during the construction of the tunnel. Ground movements were monitored with highly sensitive instruments fixed on nearby structures, ensuring that there was no settlement anywhere.

As part of the Phase IV work approved so far, 40.1 kilometres of underground lines are being constructed. The corridor has underground sections totalling 19.3 kilometres.

Kidneys with stones donated after nod

Noida: A 58-year-old brain-dead man's organs — liver and kidneys, which were both found to have stones — gave three critically ill patients a new lease of life.

Such kidneys are rarely accepted for transplantation as the possibility of a recipient developing stones exists. But doctors at Max Super Speciality Hospital in Vaishali deemed them suitable for donation as the stones — 4.5 cm in the right one and 2.1 cm in the other — could be removed before the transplant.

The Sahibabad resident and COO of a travel company was admitted to the private hospital two weeks ago with severe headache and dizziness. Diagnosed with brain haemorrhage, he underwent emergency surgery but was declared brain dead on Nov 28.

His liver and kidneys were retrieved after Vaishali's Max after his family consented to donate his organs. One of the kidneys was transported via a green corridor to Max's Saket centre and transplanted into a 50-year-old man. The other kidney was transplanted to a 52-year-old woman battling chronic kidney disease (CKD) for six years at the Vaishali centre. The liver was transplanted into a 60-year-old woman suffering from chronic liver disease.

According to doctors, a person who has previously undergone kidney stone removal surgery can also donate if doctors deem the organ's function good.

Dispose of 350MT of UCC waste or face contempt: HC to MP

Bhopal/Jabalpur: In a hard hitting order, Madhya Pradesh HC on Wednesday asked the authorities if they were "waiting for another tragedy", 40 years after the Bhopal gas disaster, before they are "shaken from their inertia" and do something for disposal of toxic waste at the Union Carbide site.

The court warned of contempt proceedings against principal secretary of the department concerned if any hurdle is created in complying with its order to dispose of 350 metric tonne packaged toxic waste kept in Dhar district (220km from Bhopal) within four weeks.

If the waste isn't disposed of in the time assigned, the state chief secretary and principal secretary of gas relief & rehabilitation department will have to be present at the next hearing on Jan 6, 2025, to explain the non-compliance, the bench of Chief Justice Suresh Kumar Kait and Justice Vivek Jain said.

The bench is hearing a petition filed by activist late Alok Pratap Singh, seeking disposal of toxic waste at the factory site. "We have perus-

ed orders passed by this court on March 30, May 13, and June 23, 2005, and recently, on Sept 11, 2024. Though some steps have been taken, they are minimal and cannot be appreciated because the petition dates to 2004 and almost 20 years have elapsed but the respondents are at the first stage of initiating the disposal process," the bench said.

"This is a really sorry state of affairs because the removal of toxic waste from the plant site, decommissioning the MIC and Sevin plants, and removal of contaminants that have spread in the surrounding soil and groundwater are of paramount requirement for the safety of Bhopal residents. Incidentally, the gas disaster took place on this very date, exactly 40 years ago," the judges said.

On face of it, you are corrupt, SC tells TMC former minister

'Do Not Seek Parity With Other Accused In Teachers Job Scam'Dhananjay Mahapatra

New Delhi: SC on Wednesday lashed out at former West Bengal education minister Partha Chatterjee, seeking bail in a money laundering case related to the teachers recruitment scam, for arguing that while bail has been granted to all other co-accused, he has been behind bars for more than two years.

"Do not seek parity with other accused. They are not ministers. You were the minister of the department where this alleged recruitment scam took place. Look at the recovery of huge sums of money from firms, virtually owned by you and your associate Arpita Mukherjee," a bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan said.

Chatterjee's counsel, senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, said the accused is a first time offender and he must get the benefit of bail having served one-third of the maximum sentence that could be imposed if he gets convicted. Enforcement Directorate's counsel, additional solicitor gener-

al S V Raju, said the beneficial provision of the Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita did not apply as many cases are pending against Chatterjee.

When Rohatgi said this reflects the sadistic attitudes of ED and CBI to get him embroiled in case after case so that he does not get out of jail on bail, the Justice Kant-led bench said, "When the minister is the kingpin in a scam, and SC grants him bail, what message it sends to society? That a powerful and influential person can get bail? On the face of it you are corrupt."

However, the bench was quick to clarify that since the investigation is going on and there is no likelihood of trial getting completed in the near future, the court has to balance the rights of the accused with suitable conditions to ensure there is a fair investigation without any impediments.

Rohatgi offered that Chatterjee would stay out of the territory of Bengal for a period of six months if that helped ED to complete investigations without apprehending any obstruction from the accused. "Chatterjee has been removed

from TMC," he said, indicating that he does not wield any influence through state govt.

Raju opposed the bail, saying Chatterjee was the mastermind of the scam in recruitment of teachers and group C&D employees for schools, and instrumental in depriving nearly 50,000 genuine candidates of their jobs by giving these to undeserving candidates in consideration of bribes. SC reserved verdict on Chatterjee's bail plea.

Rohatgi said identical were the charges against TN minister Senthil Balaji, but SC had granted him bail. The bench said there is no parity between a TN minister and a WB minister. "After all there is no association of ministers in this country," it said.

CBI will probe case against BJP neta: SC

New Delhi: SC Wednesday transferred the probe against BJP leader Kabir Bose in an assault case from Bengal cops to CBI, observing that the "politically charged atmosphere" in the state may not be conducive to a fair investigation.

A bench of Justices B V Nagarathna and Pankaj Mishra said the possibility that the petitioner may not get a fair probe or that the police may not behave cordially with him could not be brushed aside outright.

Bose alleged being targeted by the state administration and also by his ex-father-in-law Kalyan Banerjee, who is a TMC MP, and said the probe by the state police against him would not be fair. He alleged that his house and car were surrounded by 200 TMC members on Dec 6, 2020, but an assault case was instead lodged against him.

Noting Bose's plea, SC said, "We do not feel any prejudice would be caused to either party if the probe is conducted by an independent agency other than state police." TNN



Stampede at Pushpa 2 premiere, 1 dead

A 32-year-old woman died and a boy was injured in a stampede outside Hyderabad's Sandhya Theatre when police tried to disperse an unruly crowd that had gathered for a glimpse of actor Allu Arjun during the premiere show of his new film Pushpa 2: The Rule. The woman, who was with her husband and two children, might have "got trapped in the crowd" during the commotion that led to the stampede in the RTC X Roads neighbourhood, an official said.

The woman was given CPR and taken to a hospital at Vidya Nagar, where she succumbed to her injuries. The boy was unconscious before cops at the site revived him through CPR. He was moved to a hospital in Begumpet, where his condition is stable. Roads leading to the theatre were swarming with a few thousand fans till midnight, resulting in traffic snarls. Allu Arjun was inside the theatre watching the film when the stampede occurred. TNN

38 years after his act of bravery, SC orders reward for UP cop

New Delhi: Travelling in a night bus in the dacoit-infested Banda district of Uttar Pradesh nearly four decades ago, a station officer of UP police single-handedly fought a gang of armed dacoits which had waylaid the vehicle.

When the dacoits fired at him, Ram Yadav whipped out his service revolver and fired at the gang, killing their ring-leader. Unnerved by this, the dacoits fled.

While the incident happened on March 10, 1986, the Banda SP on Aug 3, 1989, recommended Yadav's name for the President's gallantry medal. Yadav eagerly waited the recognition, but it never came. With passage of time, govt appeared to have forgotten about it but Yadav kept writing to his seniors.

Decades later, on inquiring with the department concerned, Yadav learnt that the file containing the SP's 1989 recommendation had been lost. He then filed a writ petition before Allahabad HC, but the court dismissed it saying it was barred by limitation as almost four decades had

passed. He then moved SC. A bench of Justices Surya Kant, Dipankar Datta and Ujjal Bhuyan subsequently sought response from UP govt and also appointed senior advocate Rana Mukherjee as amicus curiae for a dignified resolution.

On Wednesday, UP govt counsel Ruchira Goel informed the bench that the DGP after due verification of Yadav's documents had agreed to grant a commendation certificate to him.

The bench said Yadav was honest enough to inform SC that he just wanted recognition of his bravery and not money. But the bench felt Yadav should be rewarded for his bravery that went unrecognized for 38 years, and using its discretionary powers, SC directed the state govt to give Yadav an honorarium of Rs 5 lakh.

Foreign secy may visit Bangladesh next week amid bilateral tensions

Dhaka: Indian foreign secretary Vikram Misri is likely to visit Bangladesh next week for a foreign secretary-level meeting, amid tensions between the two countries after the interim govt headed by Muhammad Yunus came to power.

Foreign adviser Md Touhid Hossain said the scheduled Foreign Secretary-level Foreign Office Consultation (FOC) between Bangladesh and India will take place in Dhaka on Dec 9 or 10, state-run BSS news agency reported.

It will be the first high-level visit by an Indian govt official to Bangladesh since the interim govt came to power on Aug 8 after the ouster of Sheikh Hasina as PM. "It is very clear that we want a good relationship (with India)," Hossain said.

However, he emphasised that relations between Bangladesh and India must be built on a reciprocal basis. Hossain said while the FOC is scheduled for Dec 10, it might be held a day earlier, on Dec 9.

During the high-level consultation, foreign secretary Md Jashim Uddin and Indian foreign secretary Misri will lead their respective delegations, the news agency said. The discussions are expected to cover a range of bilateral issues, including the potential extradition of Hasina and visa-related matters, it said.

The tension between the two neighbours, simmering since Aug 5 when Hasina fled to India, aggravated further with the arrest of the Hindu monk Chinmoy Krishna Das last week.

7-month-old abducted, raped in Kolkata; admitted to ICU

Kolkata: A seven-month-old girl sleeping beside her parents on a pavement was allegedly kidnapped and raped last week in Kolkata's Burtolla area. Police registered a case under PoCSO Act and launched an investigation. No arrests have been made so far, despite having questioned at least a dozen suspects, report Dwaipayan Ghosh & Sumati Yengkhom.

The infant remains hospitalised at the Paediatric ICU of R G Kar Medical College and Hospital. Police said her condition was now stable. "The bleeding has stopped and she has started to eat. We have set up a team of four doctors. Her condition should improve further in the next few days," said a hospital official.

Around 1.45pm on Nov 30, a Burtolla resident noticed the infant howling on the pavement in front of his home with no one around, police said. The person immediately informed cops. The child's parents had approached police after a futile search for her. A probe into the two reports soon reunited the girl with her parents. She was rushed to R G Kar MCH, where doctors found multiple injuries on her private parts and scratches all over her body. She was believed to have been sexually assaulted, police said.

House sale to Muslim sparks Moradabad protest

Bareilly: A late-night protest broke out in Moradabad's posh TDI City housing society on Tuesday after a house in the Hindu-majority colony was sold to a Muslim doctor by her fellow Hindu doctor. Women and other residents from the society, which houses around 450 Hindu families, demanded cancellation of the registration, saying they "feared the sale could lead to demographic changes and spark a trend of Hindu families leaving their apartments".

The house, located in the upscale colony on Kanth Road, was sold by Dr Ashok Bajaj to Dr Ikra Chaudhary. Protesters alleged that Bajaj had not informed anyone about the sale and that the transaction "violated the social harmony" of the gated society, which allegedly "had no

Muslim families before".

One of the protesters, Payal Rasgoti, said, "Bajaj sold his house to a non-Hindu without giving any information to us. We live here peacefully

and there was never any issue before. Now we just want Bajaj to get the registry cancelled. We have already lodged a complaint with the district administration and local police."

Another resident, Pallavi, added, "We have no enmity with any community. We just don't want the system to change. This has been our home for over 15 years, and we feel it's important that the house is registered in the name of a Hindu again. Otherwise, Hindus might start leaving, and everything will change."

Women participating in the protest highlighted "fears that similar incidents in other areas had led to Hindus moving away". One of them said, "If one house is sold, others might follow, and soon the area could lose its character." Moradabad district magistrate Anuj Kumar Singh said, "We are aware of the situation and are working to resolve the matter peacefully. The administration and police are in talks with both parties to ensure communal harmony is maintained."

From parched earth to green pastures

By Rejuvenating Waterbodies, This Foundation Has Infused Life Into Arid MP, Maha Farmlands

In the dust bowl of Khaman Kheda in Madhya Pradesh, Dev Yadav, a local farmer, marvels at his wheat fields.

Ever since fresh life was infused into the once-dry local lake in 2022, his crops need three times less water and yields have doubled, which Yadav believes is nothing short of remarkable.

"I can now plant two crops of wheat and lentils, even in the drier months," he says.

Just a few kilometres away, in Serwai village, summer used to mean dry waterbodies and plummeting groundwater levels, making livestock rearing nearly impossible.

"But so much more is possible now," says Santosh Patel. "Every family had only about two cows to supply milk for their home consumption. Now that the 'talaab' (pond) stays full longer, we can rear more livestock and earn from milk sales," he added.

These stories of prosperity rippling across villages are the humane side of a waterbodies rejuvenation project by ATE Chandra Foundation that manages philanthropic initiatives of the ATE Group, an engineering firm founded in 1939 as part of India's freedom movement.

Trigger For The Project

The foundation, driven by the personal efforts of Archana and Amit Chandra, is focused on improving income and sustainability of small and marginal farmers in India since 2015.

While they've been partnering with ministries and charities to achieve these and helped conserve 1,500 acres of forests, their standout project has been tackling rural water problems by rejuvenating old waterbodies across

allowed them to expand across Maharashtra and initiate pilot projects in other states, including Rajasthan, Jharkhand and Madhya Pradesh, starting in 2022.

While the govt bears 30% of the cost to hire necessary machinery, the rest of the cost to rejuvenate a waterbody is covered by local farmers and communities that help remove silt, which, they believe, "creates a strong sense of ownership to maintain the waterbodies in the long run".

With the foundation and the govt joining hands under the "Gaal-muk-t Dharan, Gaalyukt Shivar" (silt free water res-

holding capacity of our dam and we all will get water for cash crops," he reasoned.

Rejuvenating waterbodies is a multi-step process that the foundation has refined over time. Lobo breaks it down into clear steps. First, dry waterbodies are identified.

Timing Is Crucial

"We use an app to determine which ones have the potential for groundwater percolation. Next, a local NGO engages with the community to educate farmers about the benefits of silt application and generate demand for the silt.

On a predetermined date, machinery such as a backhoe loader or excavator is hired. Farmers line up with their tractors to collect the silt, apply it to their fields, and return for more," says Lobo, adding that timing is crucial since the work needs to be completed between mid-April and mid-June, when the waterbody is dry.

Tapping into local wisdom has been the key, given that many communities have their age-old ways of managing water.

"The NGO we select for a district identifies village elders who weigh in, especially on silt quality and application techniques," Lobo adds. So, how do they prevent future silting?

"Our experience shows these waterbodies stay healthy for eight to ten years," she says, adding that this ensures a higher return on investment. "For a very small cost per litre of water storage, you get a functioning waterbody with all its benefits for almost a decade."

India. Since 2016, the foundation has breathed new life into 5,000 lakes, ponds and tanks, spanning 7,000 villages across seven states.

The trigger for the project was the epidemic of farmer suicides in Maharashtra.

Gayatri Nair Lobo, the foundation's CEO, recalls how small and marginal farmers, burdened with loans to buy seeds and fertilisers,

were pushed to the brink every time monsoons failed.

"While loan waivers by the govt only offered temporary relief, we realised we needed a sustainable solution to allow farmers live with dignity, and not on dole-outs," she says.

The foundation knew they had to tackle the problem at its root—dependence on rain. "We explored a few existing

solutions and identified one that focused on rejuvenating existing but no longer usable waterbodies," explains Lobo.

Their pilot project, the foundation said, took root at the Akoladev Dam in Maharashtra's Jalna district, driven by enthused farmers and a demand for nutrient-rich silt that would reduce their need for costly fertilisers.

New Delhi: It was the ubiquitous 'Sikh moderates vs radicals' tug-of-war on display as history-sheeter and highly-radicalised pro-Khalistan terrorist Narain Singh Chaura aimed his weapon at former Punjab deputy CM Sukhbir Singh Badal, scion of the 'moderate' Badal family.

According to an ex-IPS officer from Punjab, the sensational assassination attempt by a terrorist who has been involved in serious offences like murder, attempt to murder, possession of arms and explosives and militancy in the past, and was in constant touch with the leadership of Sikh terrorists outfits based in Pakistan, was the manifestation of the discontent and religious extremism simmering in Punjab for almost two decades.

Particularly between 2007 and 2017, when the 'moderate' Badals were in office, the 'radical fringe' voices in the Sikh diaspora grew shriller, using social media as a vehicle to influence and indoctrinate new generation that has no living memory of how their families had suffered at the height of Sikh terror and who only seem to have seen the romanticised, pro-Khalistan propaganda fed to them online.

"The 'radical extremism' sentiment seems to have only gained momentum in the wake of the farmers' protests/unrest, dominated by agriculturists from Punjab," added another officer.

Pakistan not only sheltered the leadership of prominent pro-Khalistan outfits like Babbar Khalsa Interna-

Chaura was wearing a jacket and drew the pistol from his pocket as he advanced towards Sukhbir. After the shot went wide, Chaura was overpowered and taken to an undisclosed location. Sukhbir continued to carry out his duties as a sewadar, despite the scare. He later washed used utensils and listened to kirtans.

SC agrees to hear if Coalgate accused can appeal in Delhi HC

New Delhi: A decade after SC barred coal scam case accused from approaching Delhi HC on the apprehension that attempts would be made to stall trials in 44 cases, a bench led by CJI Sanjiv Khanna on Wednesday agreed to consider pleas for relaxation of the injunction.

Appearing for CBI and ED, special public prosecutors R S Cheema and Maninder Singh, informed the bench the trial in 25 of 44 cases relating to coal scam, that hit UPA govt soon after it was wracked by 2G spectrum scam, have been completed and that the July 25, 2014 order restraining the accused from moving HC could be reconsidered by apex court. SC in July 2017 had refused to relax its 2014 restraint order.

CJI Khanna said since the trial in more than half of the cases are completed, if appeals are directly filed in SC, then SC would not have the benefit of the opinion of HC that could re-appreciate the evidence considered by the trial court against the accused persons. Arguing for some accused persons, senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi said ten years have elapsed since the order restraining the accused from approaching HC was passed. "SC should reconsider whether a precious right of the accused to approach HC be curtailed," he said.

Advocate Prashant Bhushan, on behalf of NGO Common Cause, said SC had barred the accused from obtaining stay of the trial proceedings on any ground from HC to ensure

The bench said this warrants cancellation of the acquisition of the parcel of land. However, it said segregating a small plot from among huge tracts of land would not be either in the interest of development of basic amenities or the landowners.

SC directed special land acquisition officer to determine land's market value as of June 1, 2019 and deposit the same with reference court within four weeks of determination. It asked the land owners to give possession of the land, free from encumbrances, to authorities after receiving compensation amount. It also barred land owners from challenging acquisition after payment of compensation.

Advocate Nuli said, "In spite of issuing the final notification and the award, respondents kept the petitioners in the dark and neither took possession of the land, nor deposited or paid the compensation amount. The land continues to be in possession of petitioners even till date and they have been paying taxes, electricity bills etc. in respect of the said properties."

Installation of new CM will be a smooth affair, says Shinde

NCP's Ajit Pawar Set To Be Deputy CM For Record Sixth Time

Mumbai: Seeking to project unity in Mahayuti, BJP's legislative party leader Devendra Fadnavis said, "The chief minister's post is just a technical agreement between us."

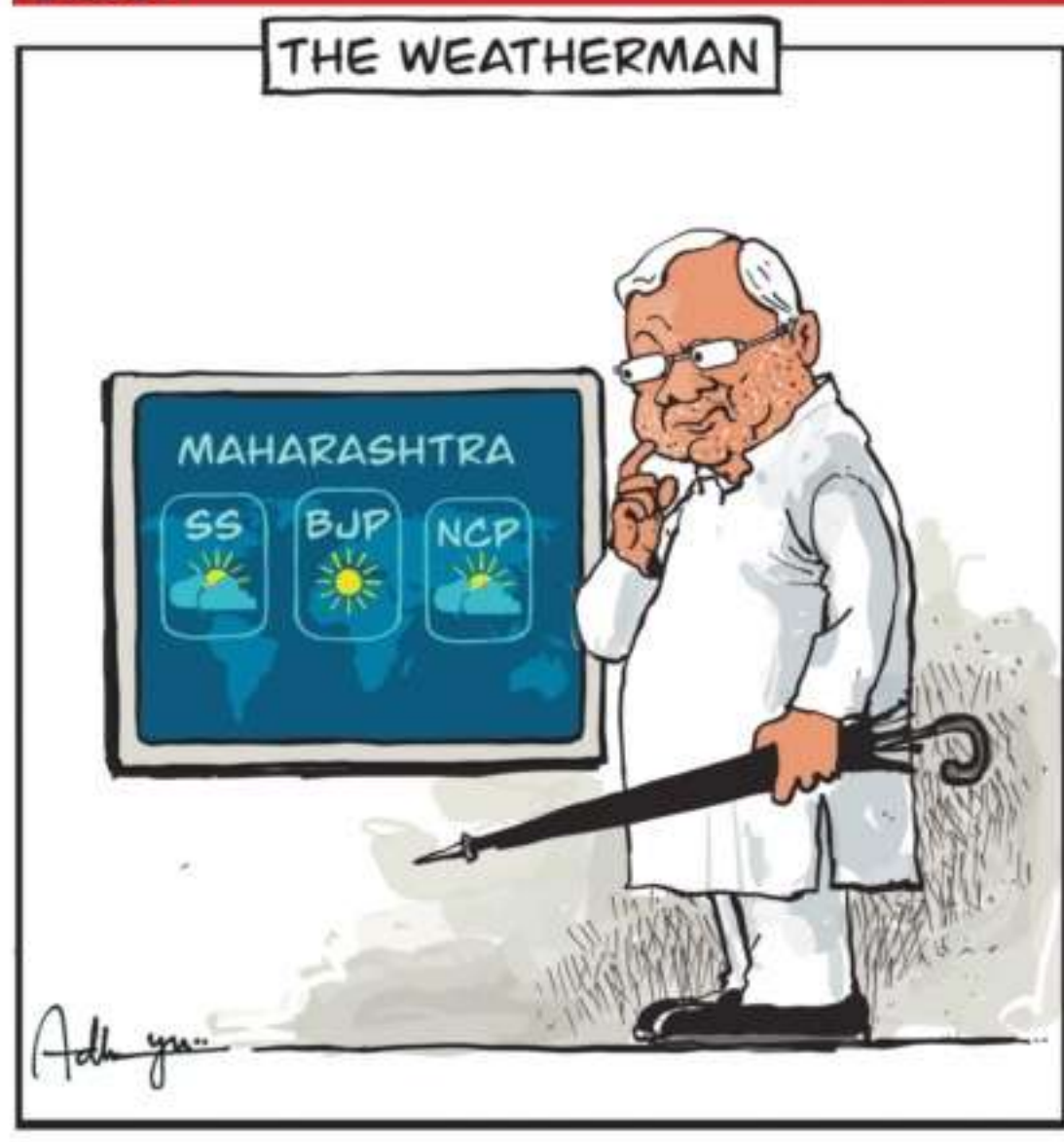
At a presser with Fadnavis and NCP's Ajit Pawar, outgoing CM Eknath Shinde evaded a reply when asked if he would join the govt. "Wait till evening," he said, only for Ajit to interject, "He may decide by evening, but I am going to take oath (as dy CM)." While Ajit's comment drew laughter, Shinde said, "Ajit dada has experience. He can take oath in evening as well as in the morning," referring to the NCP chief's early-morning oath-taking as Fadnavis's deputy when BJP and an NCP faction led by him formed a short-lived govt in 2019. Ajit remarked that this time, it won't be for a short span but for five years.

Ajit Pawar will be deputy CM for a record sixth time. Wilfred De Souza (Goa) had four terms as deputy, while Sushil Modi (Bihar), Mukul Sangma (Meghalaya) and Sukhbir Badal (Punjab) have been dy CMs three times each.

According to reports, Mahayuti has submitted to the governor a list of 237 legislators (out of a total of 288) in

support of the govt. "We submitted a letter from political parties supporting us. After the governor was convinced we have enough support, he invited us to form the govt," Fadnavis said. Before heading to Raj Bhavan, Fadnavis was elected leader of BJP legislative party. Members of the BJP state core committee met at Vidhan Bhavan before

the legislative party meeting. The core committee meeting was held in the presence of central observers—Union FM Nirmala Sitharaman and former Gujarat CM Vijay Rupani. Party national general secretary Vinod Tawade was also present. At the meeting, Fadnavis's name was proposed and approved for the legislative party leader's post. It was

decided that Chandrakant Patil would propose his name at the legislative party meeting and Sudhir Mungantiwar would second the motion.

Shinde said at the presser that he had made it clear to PM Modi, home minister Amit Shah and BJP president J P Nadda that he would support BJP's decision on the new CM. "It is my commitment to both Modi and Shah. They stood by me like a rock and supported our decisions. Installation of new CM will be a smooth affair and there will be no hindrance from our side," Shinde said.

Shinde said the victory of Mahayuti candidates in the assembly elections was "unprecedented" in recent political history. "People of Maharashtra voted for the developmental work of Modi and Shah. We took all developmental projects stalled by the MVA govt to the logical end," he said.

He said the election of Fadnavis as CM will benefit the state in view of his experience as CM from 2014 to 2019 and again as deputy CM. "Our team, comprising myself, Fadnavis and Ajit worked relentlessly for the cause of the state and I am sure the new team too will work with the same vigour and enthusiasm. Now we have greater responsibility," Shinde added.

'Ek hain toh safe hain': Fadnavis vows inclusive governance

Mumbai: "An analysis of the results has made it clear — 'Ek hain toh safe hain'," said Devendra Fadnavis. In his address to BJP legislators at Vidhan Bhavan central hall Wednesday after being elected legislative party leader, Fadnavis said after the LS polls setback, the series of electoral victories resumed with Haryana results and the historic win in Maharashtra, reports Clara Lewis.

"I assure all communities that this govt will work 24x7 to fulfil the aspirations of the people," Fadnavis said, adding that the responsibilities had gone up with the stupendous mandate towards "our Ladki Bahin, Shetkari, youth, Dalits, underprivileged and Adivasis. Our prime duty is to ensure fulfilment of promises and to take the state forward and to make it number one, for which we will have to be constantly working".

Fadnavis said PM Modi made him CM thrice, including when he was CM for 72 hours, but "technically I was the CM". "In 2019, we got the people's mandate, but it was snatched away, and a kind of treachery was done. The first 2.5 years of MVA govt we were harassed, yet not a single MLA left us, and in 2022 we formed the govt and this time we've got a tremendous majority," said Fadnavis.

Cautioning the legislators against expectations, he said the govt has to fulfil the expectations of the people and "since it is a Mahayuti govt, we will have to take our friends along".

Sena keen on home, NCP wants finance, co-op & agri

Mumbai: CM-designate Devendra Fadnavis visited Varsha—the chief minister's official residence, on Wednesday evening to once again persuade caretaker CM Eknath Shinde to join govt as deputy chief minister and finalise the power-sharing formula.

Sources said that Shinde agreed to take oath as deputy CM with Fadnavis's assurance that the portfolio allocation would be fair and could be finalised after the formation of the government.

Sources said Shiv Sena is still keen on getting the important home portfolio.

NCP, which is keen on the finance portfolio for deputy CM Ajit Pawar, is likely to get around 8-10 ministerial berths. Among the likely portfolios are cooperation, agriculture, food and civil supplies, ports, relief and rehabilitation, irrigation, social justice, and women and child development. These are portfolios that have a public interface and are linked to rural voters, the party's main base.

Wednesday was the second consecutive day that Fadnavis called on Shinde at Varsha, first to convince him to join the Mahayuti govt as deputy CM and then to finalise a possible power-sharing formula. The meeting lasted for over 30 minutes.

A Shiv Sena functionary said that only the chief minister and two deputy CMs are

likely to take oath on Thursday evening, and the wider cabinet will be finalised after the govt formation. The two are also said to have discussed other portfolios and the wider power-sharing formula in the Mahayuti govt.

Shiv Sena wants to retain all its nine existing ministries. These include the all-important industries and the urban development portfolios

Shiv Sena spokesperson Kiran Pawaskar did not respond to calls and texts by TOI on Wednesday evening.

Shiv Sena is seeking the deputy CM's post, the home portfolio, and wants to retain all its nine existing ministries. These include the all-important industries and ur-

ban development portfolio.

Shiv Sena is also keen on energy, revenue, irrigation and PWD. Shiv Sena functionaries said that when Shinde was CM, BJP bagged all these ministries, so when BJP bags the CM's post, Sena should get the plum departments in the same ratio.

"We are willing to concede some of the ministries as certain other things have been brought to the table. So we are still asking for the home portfolio and other key portfolios. Shinde is joining govt, but portfolio allocation will happen after that. It is not the case that we have given up the home portfolio," a Sena functionary said.

"There are a lot of issues to be discussed, such as number of ministers and portfolio allocation. They may also speak to the BJP brass. We want Eknath Shinde to join govt," said Sena MLA Sanjay Shirsat.

Five tough years end with a big reward for the Parivar veteran

As the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh gets ready to enter its 100th year, it has got the kind of gift it could only have dreamed of: in the state of its birth, a dyed-in-the-shakha saffron swayamsevak as chief minister, with smackingly high numbers in the legislature to back him up. Devendra Fadnavis is a man with deep ideological moorings in the Sangh and serious political upbringing in the BJP, and as he gears up for his new innings as CM, he brings with him, in addition, the vastly educative experience of a real rollercoaster ride he's had over the past five years.

That has seen him go through many moods, moments, experiences: one of exhilaration when the BJP-Shiv Sena combine won 161 seats in the 2019 assembly polls fought under his leadership; one of downright dejection when Uddhav Thackeray walked out of the alliance and Fadnavis suddenly realised the limitations of BJP's reduced tally of 105 (from the 122 it had in 2014), which had actually enabled Uddhav to jump ship; one of having to endure mocking references to his pre-2019 polls pronouncement of 'Mee Punha Yein (I'll be back)', which the opposition—and even detractors within BJP—used to beat him with. Also of having to play second fiddle to Eknath Shinde despite BJP having greater numbers in mid-2022. And of being at the receiving end of personal attacks—over his weight (by Uddhav Thackeray), allusions to his caste background (by a rival), and direct, denunciatory talk by Maratha quota activist Manoj Jarange.

Through it all, Fadnavis kept his head down. For some time literally so, because, as leader of opposition, Shinde said he'd sneak out quietly in the dead of night to meet him

as they plotted Operation Topples MVA together. For one and a half years, Fadnavis, along with Shinde, worked on Shiv Sena legislators to get them to switch over and 'restore' the popular mandate. In the non-nocturnal hours, he carried out his job effectively, mounting blistering attacks and pressure on the floor of the House as the Anil Deshmukh-Param Bir Singh and Sachin Waze-Antilia bomb scare controversies blew up. At the end of it and given his experience as CM between 2014 and 2019, his lawyerly skills and his talent for sifting through govt papers and analysing budget numbers, hope obviously would have risen of taking up the top job again. But not only did he not get it, he could also

not stay out of govt, though he publicly stated he would, as he was given the role of Shinde's deputy. And just when things stabilised for the Mahayuti with Ajit Pawar too coming in and the govt getting much-needed legal breathers, there emerged the Maratha quota campaign, with Fadnavis as one of its top targets, which cast a shadow over the 2024 Lok Sabha polls. The June 4 LS polls results came as a shock, and Fadnavis, accepting responsibility, offered to resign in order to concentrate on rebuilding efforts ahead of the crucial assembly polls. Instead, he was asked by the BJP's central leadership to take charge of poll preparations while staying in govt.

The morale of the party

cadre was down, and the opposition MVA was riding a high, hoping to replicate its success in the assembly polls. At this point, Fadnavis made an early intervention that turned out to be critical. He spent a lot of time telling BJP workers—publicly at meetings, in private and via media interactions—that the gap in vote share between MVA and Mahayuti was marginal, at less than 1%. MVA had got barely two lakh votes more than Mahayuti, he emphasised, so if Mahayuti could get 2 lakh more of its voters out during assembly polls, the results could well be reversed. He repeatedly highlighted what he termed the "fake narrative" of the 'Constitution in danger' that had worked so well for MVA in the LS polls. He reached out to the RSS to seek its help in countering MVA's narrative on caste and community and in bringing about Hindu consolidation by highlighting the 'Malegaon model' which had robbed Mahayuti of so many Lok Sabha seats by mobilising Muslim voters. After carefully selecting candidates for the assembly polls, he burned the phone lines asking BJP's rebels across the state to withdraw, assuring them he'd take care of their interests and asking them to reach out to him whenever they wanted to. And while not saying a word in response to Jarange's fulminations against him, he came out with his own fulminations against 'vote jihad' and in favour of what he termed as 'dharmauddha', the term he used to describe the assembly polls in a bid to counter the minority mobilisation play used by the opposition just months earlier.

For the most part, though, he was a silent performer. He took things on the chin and demonstrated resilience. That resilience has brought him the desired reward. And for the RSS, that 'one from the family (Parivar)' feeling again.

Shinde's challenge is to keep MLAs happy as portfolio lobbying begins

Mumbai: With Devendra Fadnavis of the BJP set to take oath as chief minister on Thursday and the Shiv Sena having settled for the Dy CM's post and about a dozen ministerial berths, hectic lobbying has begun among Eknath Shinde's MLAs and MLAs for govt portfolios.

While the Shiv Sena camp was enthusiastic, several MLAs said it would have been better for the party if Shinde had continued as CM for at least some more time as it would have boosted party morale and performance in the local body elections.

Almost all outgoing cabinet ministers are keen on retaining their berths. Shiv Sena functionaries said the party was likely to give a chance to new faces, and cabinet selection would be a balancing

act of regional and caste factors, while keeping in mind upcoming local body polls.

The Shiv Sena had 40 MLAs when the Mahayuti govt was formed in 2022. Now, after the assembly election, the Shiv Sena has 57. Four independents have also extended support to the Shiv Sena.

"Those MLAs who are not

made ministers will have to be adjusted in state-run corporations. There are many MLAs like Bharat Gogawale and Sanjay Shirsat who have been jostling for a cabinet berth since 2022. So they will have to be either accommodated or pacified. If the Sena gets only 11-13 berths, it will be a very tough balancing act and will not be

easy to keep all MLAs happy. Some senior MLCs are also looking for a promotion as ministers," an observer said.

Shiv Sena MLA Sanjay Shirsat said the party had now accepted the decision to hand over the top job to the BJP. "We expressed our opinion. But then Eknath Shinde announced his stance that we will not create any speed breakers for govt formation, we made it clear that whatever decision you (BJP) take, we will accept it. BJP has 132 MLAs. Our only wish was for more time (for Shinde as CM), as we would have been able to fight the municipal corporation and zilla parishad elections with strength," he said.

Shiv Sena is seeking Dy CM's post, the home portfolio, and wants to retain all its nine existing ministries. These include the important departments of industries and urban development.

Case against YSRCP netas for 'forcibly acquiring' cos' shares

Vijayawada: Andhra Pradesh CID filed a case against YSRCP Rajya Sabha MP V Vijaysai Reddy, his son-in-law P Sharath Chandra Reddy and Y Vikranth Reddy, son of YSRCP MP YV Subba Reddy on Tuesday on charges of forcibly transferring shares of Kakinada Port in their names.

Cases were also registered against PKF Sridhar & Santhanam LLP, and Aurobindo Realty and Infrastructure Pvt Ltd, its directors and others.

The complaint, filed by Kallapati Venkateswara Rao, alleged that he was forced and coerced to part with his shares in Kakinada Seaports Ltd and Kakinada Special Economic Zone for a pittance. He claimed the "forcible takeover" of his shares was part of a plan by former CM YS Jagan Mohan Reddy.

Rao stated that soon after the YSRCP tenure began in 2019, the govt appointed PKF & Santhanam for a special audit. It also appointed another

Mumbai auditing company for a forensic audit. PKF informed him that they had unearthed irregularities worth Rs 1,000 crore, and the report was submitted to the govt.

He stated in the complaint that Vijaysai asked him to talk to Vikranth, who in turn brought the proposal of taking over his shares in KSPL. When he protested, Vikranth warned that criminal cases would be filed against him and his family members. The share transfer was done in a hurried manner without due diligence, Rao alleged, adding that Vikranth told him he was following instructions of Jagan.

He further alleged that his 41.1% stake in KSPL and 48.74% stake in KSEZ were taken over for just Rs 494 crore and Rs 12 crore, respectively. According to him, even by conservative estimates, value of KSPL would be over Rs 2,500 crore, as it already had a share purchase agreement of Rs 400 crore with GMR Group, which is a majority stakeholder in KSEZ.



Inter-district bus services back in Manipur after 19 months

Guwahati: Manipur govt resumed Wednesday inter-district public bus services on four key routes from Imphal valley to the hill districts — 19 months after suspending operations due to the ethnic clashes that erupted on May 3 last year. The buses will run under "adequate security" to ensure safe travel, officials said.

However, the initial response was muted. Buses traveling from Imphal to Churachandpur and Kangpokpi in the hills saw no passengers, while a handful of people waited for buses heading from Imphal to Bishnupur.

Chief secretary Vineet Joshi said: "Govt has reviewed the law and order situation in the state with the availability of security forces, response system, and feasibility inputs from different agencies and has decided to resume traffic of public vehicles with adequate security deployment."

State-run Manipur State Transport buses will now operate on the Imphal-Kangpokpi-Senapati, Senapati-Kangpokpi-Imphal, Imphal-Bishnupur-Churachandpur, and Churachandpur-Bishnupur-Imphal routes. **TNN**

VP rejects calls for debate on farm issue, Cong walks out of RS

New Delhi: Even as Congress and other parties latched on to Vice-President and Rajya Sabha chairman Jagdeep

Dhankhar's statement on Tuesday that farmers were in distress, Dhankhar turned down the opposition's adjournment notices on the farmers' issue in Rajya Sabha on Wednesday and accused them of doing "drama" by pointing out that not a single adjournment notice submitted to him in the past five days was on farmers.

Stating that he had carefully gone through each and every notice sent to him under Rule 267, Dhankhar said not a single one was on farmers. "You are raising it (the farmers' issue) only now," he told opposition MPs even as they stood in the aisle demanding that they be allowed to speak on farmers' issues, including their demand for minimum support price.

As the RS chairman de-

clined, there was sloganeering by Congress functionaries including Ran-deep Surjewala, who was flanked by Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge, Jairam Ramesh and others.

Aam Aadmi Party and Shiv Sena (UBT) MPs too joined the protests, even as Trinamool and SP stayed in their seats.

Allowed by Dhankhar to speak, Congress MP Pramod Tiwari said "the 'annadata' farmer was braving batons". "Grant their MSP demand. Now even constitutional authorities are endorsing this demand," he said in an apparent reference to Dhankhar's comments on Tuesday.

As Dhankhar cut short Tiwari, Ramesh turned to the chair and said, "We are only supporting you." When the chairman did not allow further discussion on the farmers' issue, Congress and some other opposition MPs staged a walkout. They were, however, not joined by Trinamool, SP and AAP members.



IIT-M campus school in row for test on kids sans parents' nod

Chennai: A product test conducted on students of Vana Vani Matriculation Higher Secondary School run by IIT Madras on its campus sparked controversy with parents alleging that their consent was not obtained before the test. After an inquiry, IIT-M removed school principal M Sathishkumar from his post.

Some parents complained that their wards were made to wear a 'smart insole' inside their shoes and a smartwatch, and asked to cover a distance by jumping on Aug 19. The test was conducted by IIT-M faculty and students. "We suspect they took endurance test to develop a sports-related product. They should have obtained consent as per ICMR's ethical guidelines to perform any test on humans," said a parent. "The initial preliminary study was conducted to understand the feasibility of a cost-effective smart insole assembled using commercially viable items. Neither clinical trials nor any medical-related device trials were conducted," IIT-M said Wednesday.

Modi could visit Saudi this month

India and Saudi Arabia are in talks to schedule a visit by PM Narendra Modi to Riyadh later this month. If it happens, the visit will be Modi's last major diplomatic engagement for the year. Both sides are looking to finalise a date for what will be Modi's first visit to Saudi Arabia in more than five years. The scheduled visit will come in the middle of global concerns over the situation in West Asia, a region where India sees the Kingdom as a factor of stability.

Soren exempted from court appearance

In a relief to CM Hemant Soren, Jharkhand HC Wednesday exempted him from appearing in person before the MP-MLA court in Ranchi in connection with a matter related to ignoring the summons issued by ED. Justice Anil Kumar Chaudhary stayed the judicial magistrate court's order on his personal appearance until the next date of hearing, and posted the matter for hearing on Dec 16.

New panel to look into faulty hip implants

Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation has formed a new committee to examine issues related to faulty 'ASR' hip implants manufactured by DePuy

International Ltd, UK (now Johnson & Johnson Pvt Ltd) that were used in over 4,700 patients in India between 2004 and 2010, before it was recalled globally over higher than expected failure rate. The implant was apparently causing damage to the local bone and many patients were requiring revision surgery. The govt in 2018 formed a panel to examine such cases, but many members of the panel retired, hence the new committee had been constituted, say sources.

HC tells media to exercise restraint in Idlgah case

Allahabad HC has directed the media to observe due restraint while reporting on the Krishna Janmabhoomi-Shahi Idlgah case and said misrepresentation of proceedings could undermine the sanctity of judicial processes. It warned that inaccurate or irresponsible reporting may invite contempt proceedings. During the hearing of the dispute, counsels had raised concerns about misreporting in the media and urged HC to set guidelines for responsible reporting. The matter has been listed for further hearing on Dec 4.



As the convoy reached the border around 10.30am and was told it cannot proceed, Congress functionaries raised anti-govt slogans while the Gandhi siblings were seen arguing with cops to let them go through.

A senior officer of Ghaziabad police said they "handed over a notice to **Rahul Gandhi**" that said prohibitory orders under BNSS Section 163 were in place in Sambhal and the Congress team would not be allowed to proceed. Emerging from their car, the Gandhi said UP Police's action was "un-constitutional".

Rahul said it was his right as LoP to go to the west UP district where five people were killed in violence during a court-ordered survey of a Mughal-era mosque in Nov. "As LoP, it is my constitutional right to be able to visit Sambhal. I am ready to go alone. I am ready to go with the police but they did not accept that either. They (police) are saying they will let us go if we come back in a few days," Rahul, the MP from Rae Bareilly, said.

Holding a copy of the Constitution in one hand, Rahul said, "This is new India. This is the India where



2 Moradabad district jail officers suspended for facilitating 15 SP netas' meeting with accused

The jailor and deputy jailor of Moradabad district jail have been suspended for facilitating a meeting between 15 Samajwadi Party functionaries, including Thakurdwara MLA Nawab Jan Khan and former MP ST Hasan, with some of the accused booked over their alleged involvement in the recent Sambhal violence, **Kanwardeep Singh**. The meeting, which took place on Monday, was allegedly conducted without adherence to the jail manual. Officials said that senior superintendent of Moradabad jail may also face disciplinary action. A report on the matter has been sent to director general of jails. DIG (jail) Kuntal Kishore said, "This action was taken by headquarters. DG Jail has suspended jailor Vikram Singh Yadav and deputy Jailer Praveen Singh. Additionally, a departmental inquiry has been recommended against jail superintendent PP Singh."

attempts are being made to abolish Ambedkarji's Constitution. But we will keep fighting."

Priyanka also hit out at UP govt. "Maybe the situation in UP is such that they (police and authorities) cannot handle even this much. Then why do they say so arrogantly that they have taken care of law and order?" she asked.

Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinat, who was accompanying the Gandhis, later asked if govt had something to hide. "Why did they not let us pass," she said, alleging that Wednesday's incident proved how "this govt is muzzling the voice of the opposition".

Later in the day, Rahul posted on X: "Why is BJP scared — why is it using the police to hide its failures?"

Why is it suppressing the message of truth and brotherhood?"

UP's deputy CM Keshav Prasad Maurya said opposition leaders were doing "drama" to get minorities' votes. Brajesh Pathak, also deputy CM, said the clashes are being investigated and opposition should support govt in maintaining peace there. "They (opposition) should go there (Sambhal) after peace is restored," he said.

Before the Congress MPs' planned visit, Sambhal district magistrate Rajendra Pensia wrote a letter to Gautam Budh Nagar and Ghaziabad police commissioners, and Amroha and Bulandshahr SPs, urging them to stop the Gandhis at the borders of their districts due to "communal sensitivity".

ED's PFI case is like putting cart before horse: HC

The funds so collected are not proceeds of crime and can be proceeds of crime only when they were generated because of a scheduled offence. The case set up by ED is putting the cart before the horse," Justice Jasmeet Singh observed. Ordering their release on bail, the court added "Prima facie, I am of the view the offence of money laundering is not made out against the petitioners" as it noted that "in the present case, collection of funds precedes the crime, i.e., Delhi riots."

ED registered the case in Sept 2022 following an FIR by NIA under provisions of IPC and Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act against PFI and its members. While accused Ahmed was President of Delhi state unit of PFI from 2018 to 2020, Ilyas was general secretary since Nov 2018, and Muqet was office secretary since 2017. All the petitioners were arrested on Sept. 22, 2022 in the case.

ED alleged the petitioners were actively involved and instrumental in raising funds for PFI as part of a "larger criminal conspiracy" and to use it for nefarious activities in India. It was claimed PFI conducted anti-CAA protests across India and there was a flow of cash from suspicious sources in the form of proceeds of crime to disturb communal harmony and incite violence through riots.

It is strange so many voters have the same father. How can this happen?" said JD(U) candidate Abhishek Jha. "I am worried my voters could be stopped from casting their votes. Spelling mistakes and voters shuffled out of their blocks like misplaced luggage have added to the drama," he said.

Independent candidate Vanshidhar Brijwasi is equally flustered. "I flagged this to divisional commissioner, but nothing happened. Imagine, 138 voters are panicking because the list says they are all children of Munna Kumar. They're scared they won't be allowed to vote," he said.

Tirhut divisional commissioner Saravanan M is doing his best to calm the storm. "We can't fix the list now," he admitted, "but polling officials have instructions to allow genuine voters with proper documents to vote." As for those responsible for the mix-up? "Heads will roll, but first, we vote," he said. The bypolls were called after JD(U) MLC Devesh Chandra Thakur vacated the Tirhut seat for a Lok Sabha win in Sitamarhi. The votes will be counted on Dec 9.

As for Munna Kumar, the man of the hour? His identity remains a mystery. But rest assured, his "children" will ensure their voices are heard. After all, nothing unites like a shared surname... even one bestowed by a technical glitch.



Nepal, China ink deal on BRI plan, paving way for projects' progress

Kathmandu: Nepal has signed a framework agreement with China on the Belt and Road Initiative, after an initial pact was signed 7 years ago but no progress made since, paving the way for cooperation on projects, its foreign ministry said on Wednesday.

PM KP Sharma Oli has been in Beijing since Monday on a four-day visit, his first to a foreign country since his July swearing-in, breaking tradition by not making New Delhi, with which Kathmandu has centuries-old ties, his first foreign port of call.

Nepal and China signed an initial deal in 2017 for President Xi Jinping's Belt and Road Initiative, which aims to build China's infrastructure and trade links with the world. However, no projects have been planned or begun in the past seven years, as a framework for cooperation had not been set and as Nepal struggled to get consensus from its political parties. The signing of the deal implies that both countries will now move ahead with details of projects, which may include road upgrades and transportation corridors, and how to finance them.

Debt concerns have, meanwhile, spurred debate within Oli's coalition govt, with the Nepali Congress party, a key supporter of Oli, opposing any project funded by loans. China has loaned Nepal \$216 million to build an international airport in Pokhara, the second-largest city about 125km west of Kathmandu, which began operating last year. But the Chinese-built airport, claimed by Beijing as a symbol of Belt and Road success, has grappled with problems such as lack of international flights, due to India's refusal to let planes use its airspace. Iran Nobel peace winner released from prison for med treatment

Dubai: Iranian Nobel peace prize winner **Narges Mohammadi** was released from Evin prison after the suspension of her jail term to undergo medical treatment, her



husband Taqi Rahmani said on Wednesday. Mohammadi is serving multiple sentences in Tehran's notorious Evin prison on charges including spreading propaganda against the Islamic Republic.

"Based on the opinion of the forensic doctor, the office of Tehran's prosecutor suspended the jail sentence of Narges Mohammadi for three weeks and she was released from prison," her lawyer Mostafa Nili said on X on Wednesday. "The reason for this is her physical condition after the removal of a tumour and a bone grafting operation that was performed 21 days ago. Her tumour was fortunately benign but she must be examined every three months." Mohammadi was awarded the Nobel peace prize in 2023, following her three-decade campaign for women's rights and the abolition of the death penalty in Iran. REUTERS

S Korean oppn parties move to impeach prez

After Yoon's Sudden Declaration Of Martial Law On Tue, MPs Scaled Walls To Re-Enter Nation Assembly To Vote To Lift It

Seoul: South Korea's opposition parties moved Wednesday to impeach the president over the shocking and short-lived declaration of martial law that drew heavily armed troops to encircle parliament before lawmakers climbed walls to re-enter the building and unanimously voted to lift his order.

Vote on impeachment today

Impeaching Yoon Suk Yeol would require the support of two-thirds of parliament, and at least six justices of the nine-member Constitutional Court would have to endorse it to remove him. The motion to impeach, submitted jointly by the main liberal opposition Democratic Party and five smaller opposition parties, could be put to a vote as early as Friday.

Defence min offers to quit

Yoon's senior policy advisers and defence minister Kim Yong Hyun offered to resign as the nation struggled to make sense of what appeared to be a poorly conceived stunt. The Democratic Party submitted a separate motion to impeach Kim, who allegedly recommended the martial law declaration to Yoon.

Martial law lasted 6 hours

In his speech announcing the abrupt order Tuesday night, Yoon vowed to eliminate "anti-state" forces and continued to criticise the Democratic Party's attempts to impeach key govt officials. But martial law lasted only about six hours, ending after the National Assembly voted to overrule Yoon

and his cabinet formally lifted it before daybreak Wednesday.

200 lawmakers needed to approve impeachment vote

Democratic Party lawmakers, who hold a majority in the 300-seat parliament, called on Yoon to quit immediately or they would take steps to impeach him. Yoon's martial law declaration "was a clear violation of the constitution...", a party statement said. The order "...was a grave act of rebellion and provides perfect grounds for his impeachment."

Impeaching him would require support from 200 National Assembly members. The Democratic Party and other opposition parties together have 192 seats. But they could seek additional votes from Yoon's ruling conservative People Power Party. The 190-0 vote that rejected martial law included the votes of 18 lawmakers from the PPP, according to National Assembly officials.

PM takes over if prez ousted

If Yoon is impeached, he

will be stripped of his constitutional powers until the Constitutional Court rules. PM Han Duck-soo, who holds the No. 2 position in the govt, would take over presidential responsibilities. The Constitutional Court has only six incumbent justices following three retirements. That means all six must approve the impeachment motion for it to succeed.

Oppn leader and speaker were seen climbing walls

After Yoon's declaration, troops carrying full battle gear, including assault rifles, tried to keep protesters away from the National Assembly as military helicopters landed nearby. One soldier pointed his assault rifle at a woman who was among protesters outside the building demanding that the martial law be lifted. It wasn't clear how 190 lawmakers were able to enter a parliamentary hall to vote down Yoon's martial law decree. Opposition leader Lee Jae-myung and National Assembly Speaker Woo Won Shik were seen climbing over walls. AP

UnitedHealthcare CEO killed in 'targeted shooting' in NYC

New York: UnitedHealthcare CEO Brian Thompson was killed Wednesday in what investigators suspect was a targeted shooting outside a Manhattan hotel where the company was holding an investor conference.

The 50-year-old was shot around 6.45am as he walked alone to the New York Hilton Midtown from a nearby hotel, police said. The gunman appeared to be "lying in wait for several minutes" before approaching Thompson from behind and opening fire, New York City police commissioner Jessi-

ca Tisch said. Police did not establish a motive.

The suspect, dressed in a hooded sweatshirt and carrying a distinct gray backpack, then fled on foot down an alleyway before pedalling an e-bike into Central Park a few blocks away. The shooter was at large, sparking a search that included police drones, helicopters and dogs.

Thompson was struck at least once in the back and once in the calf, Tisch said. He was taken to a hospital, where he

was pronounced dead.

New York City mayor Eric Adams said it did not appear to be a random attack. Adams said

police were reviewing evidence from the scene, including video. "It seems to be clearly targeted by an individual and we will apprehend the individual," he said.

Thompson's wife Paulette told NBC News the executive told her "there were some people that had been threatening him." She said she didn't have details, but suggested they may have involved issues with insurance coverage.

Yunus perpetrating 'genocide', failing to protect minorities, accuses Hasina

Says Was Forced To Leave, Didn't Even Get Time To Resign

In her first public address after fleeing Bangladesh four months back, ousted PM Sheikh Hasina has mounted a stinging attack on the country's interim leader Muhammad Yunus, accusing him of perpetrating "genocide" and failing to protect minorities including Hindus.

In remarks delivered virtually to her supporters at an event in New York, Hasina, presently in India, claimed there were plans to kill her and her sister just like their father Sheikh Mujibur Rahman was assassinated in 1975.

Describing Yunus as "power-hungry", Hasina alleged places of worship in Bangladesh are under attack and the current dispensation has failed to deal with the situation.

Hasina was speaking to supporters of her Awami League party at the event Sunday to mark 'Victory Day' that falls on Dec 16. Though Hasina has made many statements in the last few months, it was her first public address after taking shelter, said an expert tracking the developments.

"Armed protesters were directed towards Ganabhaban (PM's residence). If the security guards opened fire, many lives would have been lost. It was a matter of 25-30 minutes, and I was forced to leave. I told them not to fire no matter what happened," she said. "Today, I am being accused of genocide. In reality Yunus has been involved in genocide in a meticulously designed manner. The masterminds — student coordinators and Yunus — are behind this genocide."

UK MP tables bill in House classing Sikhs and Jews as ethnic groups

London: Labour Sikh MP Preet Kaur Gill on Wednesday in the House of Commons successfully introduced a new bill for Sikh and Jewish people in Britain to be classed as ethnic categories when public bodies collect data for the purpose of delivering public services.

In her speech introducing the Public Body Ethnicity Data (Inclusion of Jewish and Sikh Categories) Bill, Gill said Jews and Sikhs are considered to be both ethnic and religious groups under the Equality Act, 2010. Referring to the 1983 Mandla vs Dowell Lee case, which found Sikhs to be an ethnic group, she said the bill would address a fundamental absurdity that the UK does not collect ethnic data on Jews and Sikhs. Gill said the only data collected on Jews and Sikhs is religious data. But this is "poor, patchy and incomplete", and is never used by bodies to make decisions for the purposes of delivering public services.

Using rare data, she said the pandemic revealed that both Sikh and Jewish people were dying at a significantly greater rate than others. "In 2018, 5.3% of homeless deaths in London were Sikh vs 1.3% of the general population; 27% of Sikhs in the UK report that someone in their family has an alcohol addiction... Local councils don't count us in the data they use to deliver services," she said.

The bill passed and the second reading is on March 7, 2025. It could get voted down or amended as it winds its way through parliament.

Peru is rocked by president's nose job scandal

A nose job by the Peruvian President, **Dina Boluarte**, sparked controversy Tuesday, with some lawmakers calling for her to be removed from

office for not delegating her responsibilities during the procedure. The procedure that Boluarte, 62, underwent in the summer of 2023 has been discussed at length on social media and in the press, but was only officially confirmed on Tuesday, when Boluarte's former PM Alberto Otrola revealed it to a congressional commission. "Otarola said that during her recovery period, Boluarte carried out her duties virtually. "There was no absence of power at that time, because the surgical procedure had no major complications," added Otrola, who was dismissed by Boluarte in March. Lawmakers and legal experts now charge that Boluarte's behaviour constitutes a constitutional violation and are calling for her removal. V-P of Congress Patricia Juarez sought to quell the row, calling it "a storm in

a glass of water." Boluarte, who has been embroiled in controversy for months, has a disapproval rating of 95%.

Cathay pulls in-flight Family Guy episode mentioning Tiananmen

Hong Kong carrier Cathay Pacific said Wednesday it removed an in-flight entertainment programme following a complaint about an episode from American TV show Family Guy that mentioned China's Tiananmen Square crackdown. The airline said in a statement that it was aware of the incident and apologised to affected customers. Cathay said its in-flight entertainment content was managed by a third-party provider, without naming the company.

Most significant takeaway from Seoul's drama is the importance of intraparty dissent in democracies

Quick reversal by South Korea's National Assembly of President Yoon Suk Yeol's shock announcement of martial law highlights the essentiality of intraparty dissent in maintaining democratic practice. That South Korea's constitution states the president must follow legislature's decision on imposition of martial law is a robust check inbuilt by design. Yoon's decision to radically switch to military rule was defeated by parliament in a unanimous vote—all 190 present voted, including 18 of Yoon's party. It wasn't opposition legislators alone who raced to block the measure. Yoon's own People's Power Party dissented—its leader called the act “the wrong move”. It speaks to the intrinsic value of dissent within parties.

Seoul's may be an extreme case, but in intraparty dissent lies potential to expand upon a party's ideascapes. Political parties settle into policy approaches party brass are loath to budge on. But clinging to what brought success in a set of circumstances has little to do with



stability or ideology. It has more to do with lack of imagination and failure to recognise a fundamental. That parties need to stay up to speed with economic, tech, societal shifts on the home-front and globally. For survival, responsiveness to people's needs—real, created, perceived—is key. It is dissenters who fire up their party with different, even radical, takes. It's dissent that prevents development of echo chambers and rigid groupthink.

Different perspectives lead to robust policy development. Take UK Labour Party's internal debates between traditional socialists and 'New Labour' factions in the 1990s. After three consecutive electoral defeats, internal disagreements are what reshaped Labour's political platform, moving the party away from orthodox to market economics and a resounding poll victory. There's Trump—outsider, disruptor, unpopular—yet a dissenter whose tariff-tax tease has won Republicans two terms, defying every punditry. There's Germany's Greens, who through fights and factions have evolved into a centrist party, a fair distance from their radical climate agenda at foundation.

Certainly, dissenters can impede party unity, but control of factional fallout is what intraparty democracy is expected to deliver. Allowing free flow of ideas, being a platform to air new approaches, reduce party members' probability of defection. Party leaders who welcome rebellious behaviour; for instance on policy votes, fare better in cementing party loyalty. Seoul may look chaotic in the midterm, but his party's dissent helped thwart Yoon's folly. Days ahead will show how his beleaguered party responds to the call for impeachment.

Eat, Pay, Respect

Midday meals really help India. Govts should stop exploiting the women who make them

When wages for a given work stay unchanged for 15 years, it signals that the work and worker have a beggarly low standing in the value chain. The 'honorarium' for cooks-cum-helpers (CCHs) in India's midday meal programme was fixed at ₹1,000 per month in 2009. And it hasn't moved an inch since. Honorarium expenditure is shared 60:40 between Centre and states. When states choose not to enhance the pay-out, Centre pays just ₹600 towards each CCH. The crazy thing is that these 15 years have also provided prodigious evidence of how much the midday meal scheme delivers on both the health and education fronts. How do we square the sterling work with the squalid treatment of the worker?



Hiding behind the semantics of CCHs being 'honorary' workers is untenable. Just like Anganwadi and AASHA workers, the women themselves have always been clear that they would rather be properly paid. And yes, an overwhelming majority of all these workers are women. If they weren't, no govt would write the bad fiction that 'they have come forward for rendering social services', before paying them a pittance. As it is, women's workforce participation in India is dominated by all the unpaid care work they do. For govts to be exploiting this perverse social scale instead of trying to reform it, is a comment on not only women's equality, but also India's future.

Intergenerational data has established that mothers with full mid-day meal exposure have much healthier children. One study associates this programme with 13-32% of the improvement in height-for-age z-scores from 2006 to 2016. This is also why courts regularly tick off pandemic-to-pollution controls for interrupting midday meals. Instead of treating the scheme anchors as if they are mystically immune to inflation, govts should start giving them their fair dues.

Another friend, another never-imagined end, another eerie reminder

Last week I wrote about finding a note from my dear Delhi friend Sabina exactly 16 years after she was killed in the 2008 Taj attack; worse, it bore the same date as that of my son's wedding reception which had brought her to Mumbai—and brutal death. In 1998, the haunting voice of another unputdownable woman had returned from a death as terrifying as Sabina's. Protima Bedi was the original Brat. In 1974, she'd 'streaked' across Juhu beach to the shock and awe of notoriously *bindaas* Bombay. Equally gobs-smacking was her career-switch, celeb model to celeb disciple of Odissi revivalist Guru Kelucharan Mohapatra.

We became good friends in mid-1990s Bangalore where I was TOI consulting editor and she, reborn as Protima Gauri/'Gaurima' had set up Nrityagram, her dance village nearby. Now shaven-headed like ex-saas Freda Bedi—first female Western Tibetan Buddhist monk—the sassy neo-sannyasin would come striding out of her 'hut' in earth-hued kaftan. Alongside loped a *khichdi* canine on whom she'd bestowed local pedigree: 'my Hessaraghatta hound'.

Then in 1998 she renounced it all, leaving her impassioned creation in the able hands of its devoted dancer-administrator; Lynne Fernandez. Crushed by the suicide of her brilliant, schizophrenic son, Siddharth, and like his venerable namesake, the smudged writing on it eerily unmistakable. My blood ran cold as I confronted the ghost letter. Protima had written, 'I feel I've already reached heaven, I am finally at peace.' Suddenly, I was suffused by warmth. Not by those turbulent means, but surely that ethereal mountain was a *sannyasin's* chosen end.

To-Do List For CM Fadnavis

- Play nice with allies ● Don't promise more freebies ● Create start-up hubs, good jobs
- Keep social peace ● Don't run other Maharashtra cities from Mumbai

Maharashtra is India's top state by GDP contribution—13.3%. With a Fadnavis-led Mahayuti govt set to take office, one hopes continued political wrangling will not distract from giving the state the governance, economic growth, jobs and improved social outcomes that it really needs. How Maharashtra fares will determine how quickly India becomes the world's third largest economy.

Here are five must-dos for Fadnavis govt.

● First, political stability does not depend only on having a legislative majority. Insecure partners and a wounded opposition will test govt's political nerves at every opportunity. It is thus advisable for Fadnavis to run the state through a consultative triumvirate. This means both junior partners, Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena and NCP led by Ajit Pawar, should be part of key decision-making on the policy front. If this triumvirate mostly works through a consensus, it will augur well for political and policy stability.

● Second, given the huge amount of giveaways announced and implemented even before the assembly elections, the first govt priority should be to deliver on promises in a targeted manner, with minimum leakages, so as to stabilise the fiscal ship.

Mahayuti rashly promised to raise payments under the Ladki Bahin scheme for eligible women from ₹1,500 to ₹2,100 per month, which could constrict the availability of funds for infra development. State debt has ballooned to ₹7.82L cr. Without large revenue increases, some experts say paying salaries to staff may also become difficult in the coming months. As the country's prime growth engine, it would be a tragedy if Maharashtra were to become the poster boy of fiscal irresponsibility rather than prudence.

● Third, the state houses the two biggest stock exchanges in the country, and is also the financial capital of India. This should have made it an automatic choice for start-ups. Instead, Bengaluru (despite bad infra) and Delhi (despite poor air quality) are doing better. Hyderabad and Chennai are pushing hard to challenge Maharashtra's third rank from below. The state should aim to be India's No. 1 start-up state, and for this it has to deregulate and simplify rules for small companies, which are the main job creation engines. It should lead

the race for making India the best place to do business in.

● Fourth, if the key to prosperity is good quality jobs, as the country's manufacturing and financial services capital, Maharashtra has to take the lead in legislating labour reforms and encouraging labour-intensive businesses. One wonders why Apple or other electronics manufacturers find Delhi or Tamil Nadu more attractive for setting up their global supply chains. This needs to be fixed. For Maharashtra's perch

But what should Fadnavis govt be wary of?

● One, since all development depends on social stability, Mahayuti govt should not let caste and religious conflicts get out of hand. This is not a secularism vs communalism battle, but about reducing mistrust between communities by encouraging dialogue. Govt should start with the assumption that community relations are not good enough to ensure social peace. It must work district by district to encourage local-level dialogue between antagonistic castes or religious communities.

Very often the law and order machinery is not good enough to keep the peace. It's the religious communities themselves that must be encouraged to work out viable compromises to live in harmony. Same logic is applicable for caste-based rivalries and conflicts. Govt could attempt to create multi-caste conflict resolution panels that can serve as exemplars for other caste-conflict ridden states. Law and order can work only if there is underlying community trust.

● Two, having already promised the voter the moon in terms of freebies, Mahayuti must ensure that the next five years do not involve more of the same. Elections can be won with freebies, but good governance cannot happen if one inherits the winner's curse of a bankrupt state. Two years of fiscal rectitude could help the state invest in development for the benefit of everybody in the remainder of the term.

● Three, every CM wants to keep the urban development portfolio just because of its large amount of funds and the illicit money to be made from real estate deals. Fadnavis govt should seek to make this portfolio less attractive by devolving more power to urban local bodies, including municipalities and metropolitan cities.

Maharashtra can set the pace in urban development by giving cities real freedom to manage themselves with adequate resources for infra. In India, we tend to debate the power asymmetry between the Centre and states, but not the even

US-China trade war offers opportunities for India: Niti

‘Boost Domestic Mfg, Especially In High-Tech, To Face Challenges’

New Delhi: The US-China trade war presents both challenges and opportunities for India, a report by govt think tank Niti Aayog said on Wednesday, calling for enhancing domestic manufacturing capabilities particularly in high tech industries. It, however, said India has seen limited success so far in capturing the China plus one strategy as countries, such as Vietnam, Thailand, Cambodia and Malaysia, have emerged as bigger beneficiaries of the shift.

The US has imposed tighter export controls and tariffs on Chinese goods to limit China's growth and spending for technological progress and this has led to fragmentation of global supply chains. This has also prompted multinational companies to look alternatives to Chinese manu-

The report said the domestic iron and steel industry, representing 23.5% of its EU ex-

ports, faces highest exposure under the proposed carbon tax or CBAM (carbon border adjustment agreement).

The report said that Indian steel companies may incur tariffs of 20-35%, leading to higher costs, reduced competitiveness, and lower demand in the EU market. Compliance costs will rise due to the need for detailed emissions reporting, according to the report which offers a snapshot of the country's trade position, combining global demand-supply perspectives, sectoral performance, and insights into emerging trade opportunities.

“With geopolitical shifts and a growing emphasis on sustainability, India must implement policy measures to ensure coherence between trade and environmental goals, aligning its long-term trade objectives with global trends,” said the report.

Voda to sell 3% stake in Indus Towers for ₹2,841cr

New Delhi: British telecom company Vodafone will sell 3% stake in Indus Towers to clear its debt of \$101 million or about Rs 856 crore and use the residual amount to pay outstanding dues of its Indian venture Vodafone Idea.

The transaction is valued at around Rs 2,841 crore as per the Wednesday's closing price of Indus Towers stock at nearly Rs 358.8 apiece on the BSE. “Vodafone Group announces that it has launched a placing of its remaining 79.2 million shares in Indus Towers representing 3% of Indus' outstanding share capital through an accelerated book build offering,” Vodafone said in a regulatory filing.

Post this, Vodafone's stake in Indus Towers will fall below 1%. Before this transaction Vodafone had 82.5 million shares or 3.1% stake in Indus Towers. In June, Vodafone had sold an 18% stake in Indus Towers for about Rs 15,300 crore. “The proceeds from the Placing will be used firstly to repay Vodafone's outstanding borrowings of \$101 million to Vodafone's existing lenders, secured against Vodafone's Indian assets,” the British telecom firm said.

Under the terms of the security arrangements between Vodafone and Indus, Indus has a security over the residual proceeds from a placing to guarantee obligations from Vodafone Idea to Indus under the Master Services Agreements.

“...Vodafone intends to contribute the residual proceeds from the placing (after repayment of Vodafone's outstanding borrowings) towards an issue of new equity shares by Vi once the terms of such a capital raise have been evaluated and decided on by the Board of Directors of Vi,” the filing said. Climate risks have hit financial system: RBI

Deputy Guv Says Tapping Into Global Pool Of Pvt Funds Is A Challenge For India Due To Data Gaps

Mumbai: Climate risks have started to impact the financial system and could pose systemic problems in future, according to RBI.

Besides damage to assets, risks include business disruption, increase in loan losses, and transition risks arising from the shift to a low-carbon economy, which create uncertainty for firms and investors.

Speaking at a conference organised by the National University of Singapore in New Delhi, RBI deputy governor Rajeshwar Rao said there are two main types of climate-related risks — physical risks from climate events and transition risks associated with shifting to a low-carbon economy. He highlighted data challenges in assessing climate risks, including a lack of uniform

methodologies, fragmented accessibility, and absence of historical loan loss data. “We are yet to comprehensively assess climate risks due to data issues. These include fragmented accessibility, differing metrics, and a lack of historical loan loss data and hazard forecasts.”

Rao said that tapping into the global pool of private funds for climate finance was a challenge for India because of data gaps, technical limitations and institutional constraints in setting projects that help cope with the impact of

climate change. “While transitioning is crucial, we cannot overlook the immediate impact of climate events. We also need to look at adaptation measures, which currently appear to be a missing link in climate strategies,” Rao said.

Unlike mitigation projects — which focus on reducing greenhouse gas emissions to slow climate change — adaptation projects aim to minimise the risks and damages caused by climate-related events such as extreme weather, rising sea levels, and changing rainfall patterns. Rao added that there was an urgent need for the financial system to address climate risks and play a catalytic role in overcoming related challenges. He stressed on taking collective action to mitigate increasing climate risks, highlighting their significant impact on the economy, society, and financial stability.

Some ATMs to retract cash: RBI

Mumbai: RBI has partially reversed an earlier directive to disable cash retraction facility in ATMs. The facility was originally disabled in Jan 2012 due to concerns over fraud.

The cash retraction facility refers to the built-in feature in ATMs where the machine pulls back currency notes if the customer does not collect them from the dispenser in time. Previously, when the machine retracted cash, server logs recorded that the dispen-

sed cash was retracted. However, fraudsters exploited this feature by picking up some of the cash, causing the machine logs to record a cash retraction. Disabling this feature put an end to such frauds.

However, in the past year, a different fraud has emerged. The fake shutter overlay fraud involves criminals attaching a fake cover over the ATM's cash dispensing slot, which traps the dispensed cash. Fraudsters then retrieve the cash after the customer leaves thinking the transaction has failed. By re-enabling

cash retraction, customers have a better chance of retrieving their cash if the machine is targeted by fraudsters.

NPCI, in a letter to all members of the National Financial Switch, which manages India's ATM network, stated that after discussing solutions to the fake shutter overlay fraud, industry members, banks and ATM companies, submitted their recommendations, which were passed on to RBI.

Bankers said that the retraction facility will be introduced only in those ATMs that are susceptible to fraud.

Fairfax India to buy 10% more in BIAL

Bengaluru: Canadian billionaire Prem Watsa's Fairfax India is acquiring an additional 10% stake in Bangalore International Airport from Siemens Project Ventures.

The transaction, valued at \$255 million, will increase Fairfax's ownership to 74% in the airport venture. Following the transaction, Fairfax India's wholly-owned subsidiary will own 30.4%, and the remaining 43.6% will be held by its subsidiary Anchorage Infrastructure Investments Holdings.

“This additional investment in BIAL is a testament to our belief in the continued growth opportunities presented by BIAL and a phenomenal track record demonstrated by Hari Marar and his management team in capitalising on those opportunities,” Watsa said.

The transaction is expected to close in the first quarter of next year. The agreed purchase price will be disbursed in three separate payments, with the first payment scheduled upon deal completion in the first quarter of next year. The subsequent payments

are scheduled for Aug 2025 and July 2026, respectively.

The transaction is subject to approval by Fairfax India's shareholders at a special meeting of shareholders expected to be held in Jan next year. The stakes held by Airports Authority of India and Karnataka State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation in BIAL continue to be maintained at 13% each. Last year, Fairfax acquired a 7% stake for \$175 million, increasing its stake to 64%.

BIAL, a private company based in Bengaluru, under a

concession agreement with govt until 2068, has the exclusive rights to carry out the development, design, financing, construction, commissioning, maintenance, operation, and management of the Kempegowda International Airport Bengaluru through a public-private partnership. BIAL clocked \$305 million in revenue last year.

In June 2019, Fairfax India floated Anchorage Infrastructure Investments Holdings — its flagship investment vehicle for airports and other infrastructure investments in the country.

ICAI intensifies disciplinary action against errant CAs

At 366 In 2023-24, Hearings Nearly Treble Over 2022-23

New Delhi: Facing criticism over poor disciplining track record, the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) has stepped up action against errant members. While 2,652 chartered accountants have been found "prima facie guilty" of misconduct since the current mechanism was put in place in 2007, in recent years, more action has been taken, thanks to more proceedings. Between April and Aug, over 200 hearings have been completed in 71 sittings of the panel with some of the CAs seeing their membership cancelled for one month to five years, sources in ICAI said. Last financial year saw a record number of sittings at 366, which was almost three times the number in 2022-23. This year's number of punishments awarded is the highest in three years but

that's because several of the cases have been closed due to a Supreme Court order. "Out of the 2,652 cases referred for enquiry, hearing has been concluded in 2,284 cases after giving due opportunity of being heard to the parties to the case by the Board of Discipline and disciplinary committee, as the case may be," a source said.

Of the cases where hearings are over, in 1,080 of them CAs were held guilty of professional or other misconduct. Within this, 486 cases were referred to ICAI by govt, where hearing has been completed in 387 cases and 165 members were held guilty. Over the years, ICAI, which regulates the profession, has faced criticism for its poor disciplinary record, prompting govt to take away some of its powers and set up the National Financial Reporting Authority (NFRA). The new agency has been tasked with looking into cases involving auditors and audit firms for listed and large companies, drawing considerable protest from the CA community. A senior ICAI functionary, however, defended the disciplinary track record arguing that earlier the institute did not publicise action against its members, resulting in a perception being created.

Hospitals garner 50% share in healthcare FDI Account For \$1.5Bn Investment In 2023-24

New Delhi: Deal-making in India's healthcare sector has surged in recent years, with hospitals now commanding the largest share of foreign direct investment (FDI) within the sector. In FY24, hospitals accounted for 50% of the FDI in total healthcare, translating to \$1.5 billion. This marks a significant increase, as the share of hospitals in healthcare FDI has more than doubled from 24% in FY21, and has been rising from 43% in FY20, underscoring their growing prominence. The trend also reflects a strengthening investor preference for hospitals, alongside the traditionally favoured pharmaceuticals sector. Historically, the pharmaceuticals sector, including APIs (active pharmaceutical ingredients), has been the investor favourite, attracting multi-billion-dollar deals. However, post-Covid, the hospital and diagnostics sector has come into the spotlight, drawing a wave of investors and culminating in top-dollar buyouts of major chains such as Manipal and Max. Last week, Aster DM Healthcare announced its decision to merge with Quality Care India. "Hospitals have been at the centre of PE interest over the last few months. The size of the Indian market, relatively underserved mar-

kets outside the urban areas, high incidence of disease burden and growth in insurance (both public and private), will continue to fuel growth. Given the demand, there is still a long road for growth. Hence the optimism," Sujay Shetty, global

'Don't hurt eco to meet revenue goal'

Addressing the 67th foundation day of the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, Malhotra also said it is vital for the department to upgrade skills and manpower to adapt to technological changes. He urged the officers to focus energy on big fish and masterminds and bust syndicates in smuggling operations. However, Malhotra added that the officers have to be "very careful" while taking action against traders or businesses involved in potential commercial fraud cases. During 2023-24, duty evasion through misclassification and misdeclaration of goods worth Rs 10,000 crore was detected. **AGENCIES**

Offline UPI cap hiked to ₹1,000

Mumbai: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Wednesday announced an increase in the transaction limit for offline digital payments made through UPI Lite. The changes, with an immediate effect, raise the per-transaction limit from Rs 500 to Rs 1,000 and the overall limit from Rs 2,000 to Rs 5,000. UPI Lite is a streamlined version of the Unified Payments Interface designed for small-value transactions. It functions as an on-device wallet within the users' existing UPI app—like Google Pay, PhonePe, or BHIM. Users can add funds to the UPI Lite account from their linked bank accounts and use the ba-

lance to make quick and easy small payments without having to enter the UPI Pin for every transaction.

UPI Lite is an on-device wallet where users can add funds to their account and use the balance to make quick payments

By processing these transactions offline, UPI Lite reduces the dependence on real-time bank systems. This leads to quicker payments and fewer failures, especially in areas with spotty internet connectivity. It also reduces clutter on the users' bank statement.

Survey: Services activity holds steady, jobs rise

New Delhi: Activity in the country's services sector remained steady, with job creation reaching its highest level but price pressures remaining stubborn, a survey showed on Wednesday. At 58.4 in Nov—down marginally from 58.5 in Oct—the HSBC India Services Business Activity Index indicated a sharp rate of expansion that remained well above its trend. Survey participants attributed the upturn to demand strength and new business gains. The 50-point mark separates expansion from contraction in the survey. Firms noted gains from clients in Asia, Europe, Latin America and the US. "During Nov, services sector employment notably grew at the fastest pace ever recorded since this survey began in 2005," said Pranjal Bhandari, chief India economist at HSBC.

'Duty on steel to hit exports'

New Delhi: Engineering exporters have cautioned against imposition of safeguard duty on steel, arguing that it will increase prices in the domestic market and make exports uncompetitive. Steel makers are lobbying hard for protection from imports, arguing that cheap imports from Asean nations, which have a free trade agreement, are hurting the domestic players. Arguing aga-

inst the proposal, EEPIC India chairman Pankaj Chadha said the duty, which can be imposed in emergency situations, was unjustified as it will push up prices by 20-25% as domestic prices are always linked to the landed price. He said that due to freight and port handling charges, imports from Asean countries are suffering a 12.5% price disadvantage, which goes up to 20% in case of Chinese steel as they also face import duty. He said that bulk of the imports

are from Japan, which is seen as a high cost producers. "Our players (steel companies) say that they are the cheapest. Their balance sheets are also strong. The proposal has been made without consulting the user industry, which will be hard," Chadha said, adding that if action has to be taken it must be on specific products. He said that govt programmes will be among the worst hit as it is the largest buyer of steel for its ambitious infrastructure programme.

India's Eternal Floater Doesn't Worry About His Batting Position Anymore. Make Him Open Or Slot Him In The Middle, Rahul's Ready To Roll. Australia Is Where It All Began For Him, All He Needs Now Is A Chance To Contribute...



Adelaide: As Rohit Sharma and Yashasvi Jaiswal sweated it out under the blazing South Australian sun, batting as a pair in the pace nets, a composed KL Rahul took fresh guard against the sidearm throwers alongside. Minutes earlier, Rahul had been reminiscing about Australia being the place where it all began for him as a Test opener. Back on the 2014-15 tour — made famous by Virat Kohli's twin Adelaide tons and MS Dhoni's shock retirement from the format — the then-22-year-old Rahul's Test debut in Melbourne had been a forgettable one.

He was slotted in at No. 6 first up and managed three off eight balls, falling to a streaky attempt at slog sweeping Nathan Lyon and managing only a top edge. In his second dig he was pushed up to No. 3 and fell in equally horrifying fashion, another top edge to a short one from Mitchell Johnson costing him his wicket. Luckily, by the next Test in Sydney, his nerves had started to settle.

Pushed up to open, Rahul came up with a composed 262-ball 110, keeping the demons at bay with discipline and verve to announce his arrival. And this has been his roller-coaster story ever since, with crests following troughs and long absences in-between some stellar performances, especially away from home in challenging conditions.

Even a decade on, he remains the eternal floater in India's batting order, with even the disciplined and match-winning contribution in Perth in the first Test of this series offering no guarantee of a settled spot.

"Luckily for me, I've batted in different positions. Early on, it was a bit of a challenge mentally, how to play those first 20-25 balls. Not so much technique, but what shots to play, how early I can attack, how cautious I need to be.

Those were a bit tricky early on. But now that I've played in ODIs, Tests and all over the place, it's given me a little bit of an idea how I need to manage my innings. It's the start that's important, whether I'm batting at the top or middle. The first 30-40 balls. If I can manage that, everything else starts to seem like regular batting.

"Ten years ago, it was my first Test series. It was a bit surreal. There was a lot going on in my head. I've learnt a lot. I'm looking forward to the next 10 years and Australia is where it all started for me," Rahul said.

In India's remarkable Perth win a few days ago, Rahul — opening for the first time since Feb 2023 — chewed up 74 balls as India collapsed for 150 in 298 balls in their first innings. He then stayed put for 176 balls in a 201-run opening stand as Jaiswal scored 161.

"I was told quite early (to open). I missed out in the New Zealand series, so I was told to be ready. I

had enough time to prepare. I've batted enough at the top of the order and know what processes I need to follow," Rahul said.

However, with captain Rohit back and No. 3 Shubman Gill having recovered from his finger injury, could Rahul be shoved down the order again? If yes, it's only to be expected, since Rohit has ruled the opening slot since 2019. If not, it may well be the start of a fresh chapter again in Australia.

"This is my first pink-ball Test, so I'll try and face up to whatever

comes my way," he said. "I just want to go out there, bat and play for the team. I just want to be in the playing XI. Fit me in wherever."

The person holding the key is captain Rohit, who batted at No. 4 in the practice game in Canberra, keeping Jaiswal and Rahul's opening slots intact. So maybe Rahul has been told where he'll bat? The answer was equivocal. "I've been told, but I've also been told not to share it. You'll have to wait for Day One or maybe when the captain comes here tomorrow."

Pink venom: Can D/N Test break trend of early finishes?

Adelaide: Damian Hough offers a sheepish smile when asked about the drop-in pitch debacle in New York during the T20 World Cup earlier this year.

The Adelaide Oval curator, whose team was in charge of preparing those fresh surfaces, now has an even more important task at hand — he must ensure the second Test between India and Australia doesn't end in a heap of quick wickets and lead to similar accusations of farce.

"Both the drop-in pitches are challenging, we'll leave it at that," he offered. "New York was a great opportunity to get over there and learn. Anything you do in such a short time keeps you awake at night. But there's nothing bigger than India and Australia in a Test match."

The brief sample size of pink-ball Tests, played only since Nov 2015, makes

it difficult for the experienced curator to offer an educated guess on the expected duration of the game. One thing, though, is clear: these games, cooked up to draw in the evening crowd to the longer format, tend to finish quicker.

The general perception that pink-ball affairs are a nightmare for batters is spot on, since of the 22 pink-ball Tests played, only six have lasted the full distance of five days. Seven have ended within four days, seven within three days and two games within two days, in Ahmedabad (2021) and Port Elizabeth (2017).

Maybe it's because the seam, or the ball itself, can be difficult for batters to spot, or perhaps because it jags around in the in-between twilight hours with the lights on, or even because of the early swing. Also, the jury is still out on the lacquer on the ball.

It's also clear truncated pink-ball Tests are not limited to the hard and

bouncy surfaces of Australia, or Adelaide in particular. In fact, Adelaide isn't particularly notorious — out of seven games, two have lasted the duration. There have also been two three-day finishes and three four-day affairs.

Of the last seven pink-ball Tests played across the world, only the 2021 Adelaide game between Australia and England has been played across five days. But it was also here that Australia rolled India over for 36 in Dec 2020, with fast bowler Josh Hazlewood, who is sitting this game out, taking 5/8 in India's second innings.

Sold-out seats, and 6 mm grass

"Back in the day, Adelaide was known for bat-a-thons and draws," Hough said. "Do you want a five-day draw out of it? Obviously not. But do you want a two-and-a-half-day game? No, you don't. Wickets falling can be excit-

ing, but 10 wickets and 300 runs would be ideal. You've got to get that balance right. The fans come (tickets are sold out at the 53,500-seat stadium). We play our role, but the players play the game at the end of the day."

Nearly 6 mm of grass has been left on the pitch, the same as in the '36 all out Test. A recent Shield game between South Australia and Western Australia saw the quicks call the shots. "The preparation is the same," Hough said. Pacers have picked up 106 of the 134 wickets to fall in the day-night Tests here, with spinners picking up 28.

Spin factor and other tricks, and thunderstorms too!

In fact, spin could even come into play later on, according to Hough, because of the 30% clay content, which tends to break up. "Also, if you don't get a new ball under lights and you have set

David & Agarkar pull off a heist (2003)

In Test cricket, it has happened only a handful of times that a team has lost a Test after scoring more than 550 runs in the first innings.

Powered by Ricky Ponting's magnificent 242, Australia amassed 556. Virender Sehwag (47 off 41 balls) and Aakash Chopra gave India a 66-run start. However, after

Sachin Tendulkar (1) and skipper Sourav Ganguly (2) were dismissed early, India slipped to 83 for four. Two batting greats, Rahul Dravid and VVS Laxman came together then, and in a rerun of their famous, epic partnership which shaped India's famous triumph at the Eden Gardens in 2001, they put on a 303-run stand. Dravid's 233 and Laxman's 148 helped India score 523. Then, wiry paceman Ajit Agarkar, India's current chief selector, took six for 41 in a deadly 16.2 over spell to bowl Australia out for 196. With Dravid (72 not out) standing tall, India successfully chased down 230 in the fourth innings to record a four-wicket win.

Sehwag & Sachin stand tall (Jan 2008)

It was the fourth and final Test of an acrimonious series, marred by Monkeygate. India went into the match 1-2 down in the series. Making a comeback, Virender Sehwag scored 63, but it was a masterly 153 by Sachin Tendulkar, the

legend enjoying a second wind of his epic career, which helped India put up 526. Australia replied with 563. In danger of losing the Test after losing wickets regularly and Dravid (11) having retired hurt, India needed someone to stand in the middle. Shedding his natural attacking style, Sehwag hit 151 off 236 balls, perhaps one of his finest hundreds, which helped India earn a hard-fought draw.

The Virat specials (2011, 2014)

Coming off scores of 44 & 75 in the third Test at Perth, Virat Kohli had done



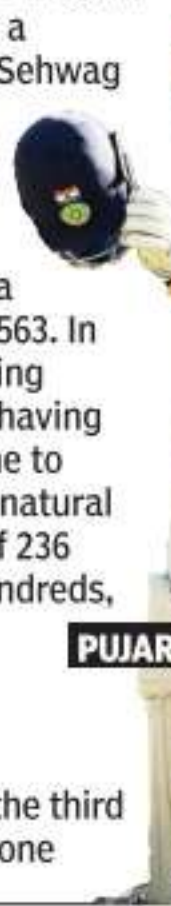

enough to justify his place in the XI. Come January 2012 in Adelaide, he announced his arrival as India's main batsman for the next decade, slamming his maiden Test hundred, a gallant 116 in the first innings. India lost that Test by 298 runs and were whitewashed 4-0 but were happy they had unearthed a batsman for the ages.

Kohli the captain was born at the same venue in Dec 2014. With MS Dhoni unavailable for the first Test, Kohli was pitchforked to India's Test captaincy. Responding superbly, Kohli hit centuries in both the innings — 115 & 141 — joining the likes of Vijay Hazare and Sunil Gavaskar in achieving the rare feat in Australia. Forging an exciting partnership with head coach Ravi Shastri, Kohli made India an exciting unit, one that didn't hesitate while chasing 364 in the final innings. India folded up at 315 and lost that Test by 48 runs, but Kohli had managed to make a statement about how India would play Test cricket under him.

Pujara shapes India's win (Dec 2018)

Cheteshwar Pujara had endured a lean time on India's previous tour (in the 2014-15 season). However, in Adelaide in Dec 2018, Pujara proved he was a complete batsman, stroking a fine century (123) in India's first innings. Batting first, India collapsed to 127 for six, but Pujara stood firm, taking the score to 250 with his monumental 246-ball, 376-minute effort. In the second innings, the Saurashtra man became more of an 'immovable object', wearing the Aussie bowlers down with his 204-ball 71. After laying the foundation of India's exciting 16-run victory, Pujara was justifiably named the 'Player of the Match.'

"There was another fans' day in Sydney which stands cancelled as players were very disturbed by the rude and insensitive comments that were passed," he added.

NOT FOCUSING JUST ON BUMRAH OR KOHLI: LYON

Adelaide: India is a team of superstars, and Australia is not focused on countering just 'extraordinary' players like Jasprit Bumrah and Virat Kohli, but the entire group as everyone is incredibly talented, Australia spinner Nathan Lyon said.

"I look at the Indian squad and see a group of superstars. Cricket, however, is a team game, winning requires the entire side to perform well. India boasts extraordinary players like Bumrah and others, but it's not just about the superstars," Lyon said. "The rest of the Indian squad is also incredibly talented. They're an incredible cricket team. We're not focusing solely on any one player, that's for sure."

"We have nothing but respect for every Indian cricketer. That doesn't mean we're not going to compete. We respect them, but we're determined to play our brand of cricket," added Australia's premier off-spinner. **PTI**

BCCI's hunt for Shah's successor hits roadblock

New Delhi: As Jay Shah gets ready to chair the first meeting as ICC's independent chairman on Thursday the Indian cricket board (BCCI) is grappling with uncertainty over his successor as the secretary of the board.

According to the BCCI constitution, the board must call for a special general meeting (SGM) once Shah has officially stepped down from the post. BCCI sources told **TOI** that there is no consensus over Shah's replacement yet and that administrators are reluctant to use up one year from their total six years of holding office in BCCI before going in to the mandatory three-year cooling off period.

TOI understands that the board will also be waiting for the Maharashtra government to form its cabinet since incumbent BCCI treasurer Ashish Shelar could be in running for a ministerial post.

"The big issue is that the board isn't finding a strong

candidate for the secretary's post who is willing to use up a year from his entitled tenure. The BCCI will anyway have an election next year. So, if someone takes up a post in BCCI, he will be on an unsure footing going into the subsequent term after next year's election. There may be a chance that someone could be elevated to an interim post," a BCCI source told **TOI**.

"These decisions have been taken unanimously after the Supreme Court-appointed committee of administrators left in 2019. An idea of an election for the post has also been floated," the source said.

It's learnt multiple queries have been raised by state associations to know how the board is operating. The associations have not even been communicated about Shah's resignation. There are a few names doing the rounds. Gujarat Cricket Association secretary Anil Patel and Delhi and District Cricket Association president Rohan Jaitley were thought to be in contention.

After another ailing Kambli video emerges, 1983 team offers to bear medical expenses

But There's A Condition... Ex-India Star Has To Check Into Rehab First

Mumbai: For the second time in months, a disturbing video emerged of former India batter Vinod Kambli. In August, cricket fans were stunned to see Kambli struggling to walk properly, when someone captured it on camera. On Tuesday, another video immediately went viral, where the 52-year-old was seen clutching his childhood friend, legendary cricketer Sachin Tendulkar's hand, trying to continue making conversation with him when they met on stage in a rare public meeting between the two. They had congregated at Shivaji Park during a memorial ceremony for their childhood coach Ramakant Achrekar. Also gone viral is his muddled and incoherent speech in the tribute Kambli attempted for his beloved coach.

Marcus Couto, childhood cricketing friend, clarified Kambli's reaction on Tuesday. "He wasn't drunk or something. He hasn't touched a drop of alcohol for the past one year," Couto told **TOI** on Wednesday. "It's just that

he became very emotional during his brief meeting with Sachin, who greeted him nicely on the stage. He was very enthusiastic about meeting Sachin and attending the function."

It was a poignant moment. "I met him after many years. He got up and hugged me and called out: 'Samyaa!'" said former India and Mumbai wicketkeeper Sameer Digue, "I couldn't see him in his present condition. I felt so bad. I had tears in my eyes."

"We've played together for 14 years (for Mumbai). I pray to God to give him good health," added Digue.

"He has severe, multiple health issues," Couto, a former first-class umpire, revealed. "There's no point in him going for rehab - Kambli has already gone to rehab 14 times! Thrice

we took him to a rehab in Vasai."

After the first video emerged in August, revealing that Kambli has serious ailments, Couto and his brother Ricky visited Kambli at his Jewel Cooperative Society residence in Bandra.

While many of his cricketing colleagues have long given up on Kambli due to his issues with alcohol addiction, Tuesday's viral video has moved members of India's 1983 World Cup winning team to help the left-hander. But there is a condition. Kambli's World Cup winning seniors want the man to be willing to help himself first.

"Kapil (Dey, captain of the 1983 team) has told me clearly that if he wants to go to rehab, then we are willing to help him financially. However, he has to check into rehab himself first," former India seamer Balwinder Singh Sandhu told **TOI** on Wednesday. "Only if he does that, we are ready to foot the bill, irrespective of how long the treatment lasts," added Sandhu.

The 1983 team had also come together to help former India opener and coach Anshuman Gaekwad for his cancer treatment.

LIV International coming to India, DeChambeau to play

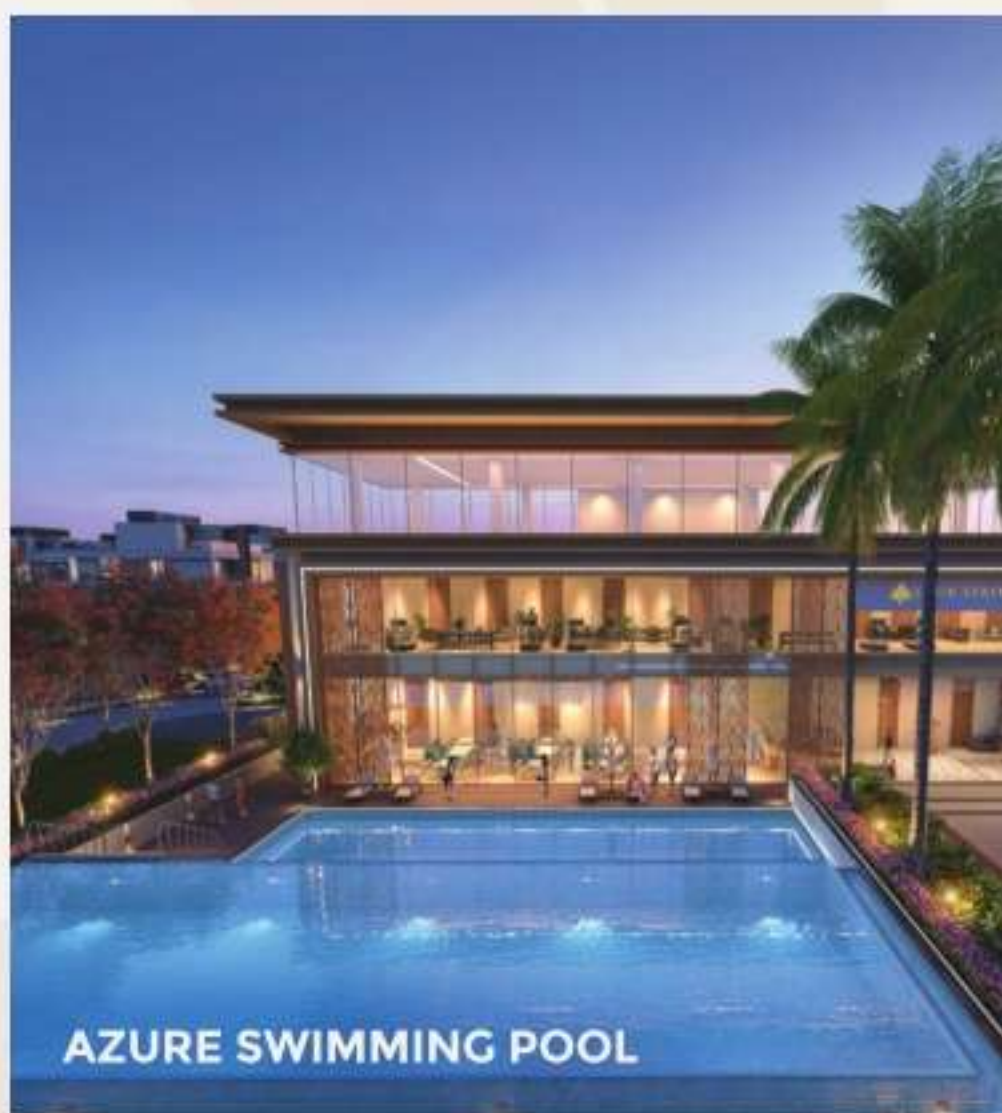

Shinde Agrees To Be Dy CM On Eve Of Swearing-In

Mumbai: Right through the 2019 assembly election campaign, Devendra Fadnavis had kept saying 'Mee Punha Yein' (I'll be back). With the MVA forming its govt, however, the remark was thrown at him repeatedly as a taunt by his rivals. They also rubbed it in when he became Eknath Shinde's deputy 2.5 years ago. But he has finally proved his words right: he's back at the helm with a resounding mandate of 132 seats for BJP and of 230 for Mahayuti and is poised to take oath as chief minister of Maharashtra once again at 5 pm this evening at Azad Maidan.

It was caretaker CM Shinde who proposed his name on

Wednesday, hours after Fadnavis was unanimously chosen legislative party leader of BJP. Shinde said, "Fadnavis had recommended my name as CM, & this time, we are recommending his."

After the BJP legislators' meet, the CM-designate met Governor CP Radhakrishnan with Shinde and Ajit Pawar — who is slated to be deputy CM for the sixth time, a record in India — and staked claim to form govt. Shinde has agreed to be deputy CM following a closed-door mee-

ting that Fadnavis had with him on Wednesday evening.

The CM and deputy CM will be sworn in on Thursday while the rest of the cabinet is likely to take oath once the power-sharing formula, which is still in the works, is finalised. Fadnavis extended special thanks to Shinde after the latter proposed his name. He said that he had, on Tuesday, requested Shinde to join the cabinet, and he believed he would be able to persuade him.

First in 2 yrs, city gets a moderate air day in Dec

New Delhi: Strong winds swept the air clean on Wednesday as Delhiites basked in crisp sunshine and azure skies, and an AQI that had dramatically improved to 'moderate' — the lowest in 50 days. This was also the city's best air day in Dec since 2022.

By Jove! Capturing all of Jupiter in one night

A Group Of Passionate NCR Astrophotographers Hopes To Achieve This Rare First As The Earth, Sun And Jupiter Are Perfectly Aligned This Saturday

Would you like to serenade a planet all night long? This Saturday (Dec 7), a bunch of professionals from diverse fields will come together to do just that. And more. They hope to become the first group in India, perhaps the world, to image the entire surface of a planet in high resolution during the course of a single night and produce results of the observations within 48 hours.

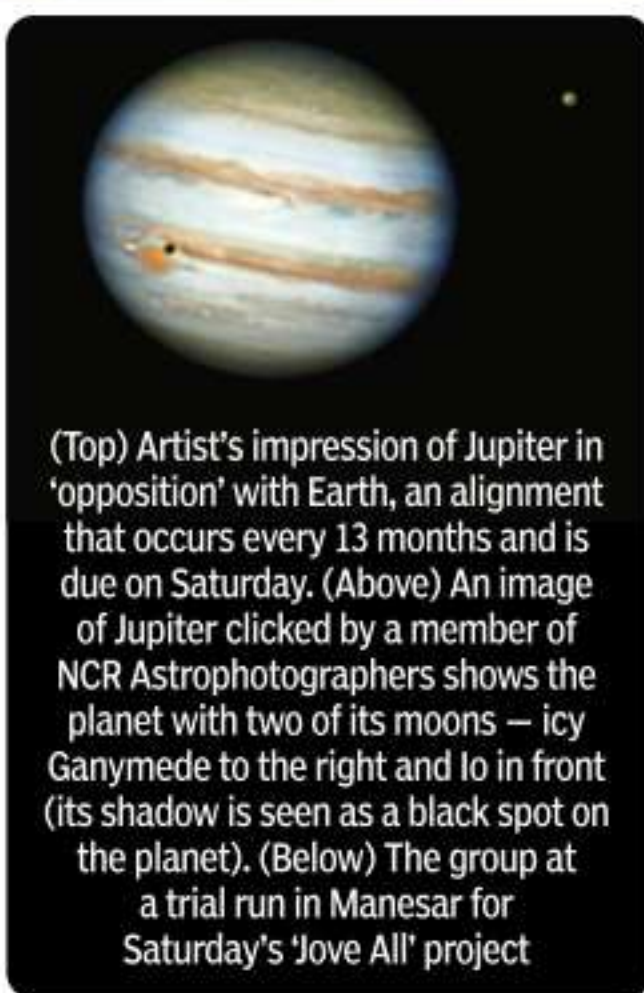
The planet in question is the 'god of the skies', Jupiter. And Saturday evening is the perfect time to pull off this feat because that's when Jupiter reaches 'opposition', as Earth comes between the Sun and the gas giant so that the three bodies form a straight line.

"This alignment occurs once every 13 months. It's also when the planet comes closest to Earth, making it ideal for viewing. Since Jupiter will be directly opposite the Sun with respect to Earth, it will rise just as the Sun sets, traverse the entire sky during the night and set at sunrise. Jupiter completes one rotation around its axis in less than 10 hours, so we will be able to capture the entire surface of the planet in a single night," says Ajay Talwar, a veteran astrophotographer who runs a company that manufactures astronomical instruments.

FINDING ESCAPE IN NIGHT SKIES

Talwar is *paterfamilias* of sorts to a collective that calls itself 'NCR Astrophotographers'. It's a group of seven-eight professionals — including a cosmologist, a doctor, techies, entrepreneurs, and an educationist — most of whom have stressful day occupations and find escape in the night skies. Quite remarkably, they have developed tools and techniques to capture stunning images of planets and deep-sky objects through the polluted skies of NCR.

The group will be bringing all their expertise, along with tonnes of equipment, to Saturday's project, which they have named 'Jove All'. They will travel to Nainital for the all-nighter,

having decided against capturing the event from NCR owing to the recent smog episodes. "We are collaborating with Nainital's Aryabhata Research Institute of Observational Sciences (ARIES) Observatory and the entire project would be completed on their campus located atop Manora Peak," says Talwar.

NCR Astrophotographers hopes to complete a movie of the entire rotation of Jupiter in one night, another on the movement of its Galilean moons in that period, produce a rectangular map of the planet's surface and a 10-15-minute movie on the 'Making of Jove All' — all within 48 hours. "To the best of our knowledge, such a project has never been taken up anywhere in the world," says Talwar, who began astrophotography way back in the 1980s. The "astro-nuts", as Talwar likes to call the bunch, will be crunching an enormous amount of data — upwards of 12TB — besides setting up and testing diverse equipment, including their showpiece Rs 15-lakh, 14-

inch Schmidt-Cassegrain telescope, for the big night. "All systems have to work perfectly, and of course, the night has to be clear; for 'Jove All' to succeed," he says.

PASSION PROJECT

It's a project of passion for the members who stumbled into astrophotography in their own ways. For Sona Shahani Shukla, an entrepreneur based in south Delhi's Kalkaji, the trigger was a business coaching workshop she attended a few years ago. "My coach asked me, 'What makes your soul happy? Don't answer right now, take seven days to think about it.' I was lying in bed that night and happened to look out the window. I could see the star Vega twinkling at me and it brought a lot of pleasant memories. I called up my coach and said, 'You know, looking up makes me happy'."

Today, Shukla specialises in imaging planets and one of her works recently won the Aperture Indian Astrophotographer of the Year award.

Dr Udbhav, an eye surgeon who lives in Noida, has had a passion for photography in general. "I graduated to astrophotography around two years ago and have been hooked ever since," he says. Likewise, Sameer Dhar, an IT professional "with a stressful sales job" found refuge in the skies around three years ago. "I got myself one of the smaller telescopes and started imaging deep-sky objects. It's extremely addictive. Once you capture a nebula or a galaxy, you are gone for good," says Dhar.

While achieving 'Jove All's' objectives will be challenging enough, the group hopes to capture an unexpected event or two. Says Kartikey Gupta, who runs a school for underprivileged kids near Jaipur, "Jupiter is the most dynamic planet in our solar system, with outbreaks, eddies and cyclones forming all the time. Who knows what new features we will witness?" For the group, any such discovery will be a cherry on the cake, by Jove!

Cheetahs Agni & Vaayu Freed Into The Wild

Bhopal: Two male cheetahs — Agni and Vaayu — were released into the wild at Kuno National Park in MP's Sheopur district on Wednesday, International Cheetah Day.

The release took place in Parond forest area, across the Kuno river. This is part of the Ahera tourism zone, where visitors may now get an opportunity to spot the cheetahs during safari tours.

Both Agni and Vaayu are in good health and ready to explore their new home. They will be monitored 24x7 to ensure their well-being and prevent escapades like Pawan's, who loved going far and beyond Kuno's boundaries. Officials say it's a major milestone in India's cheetah reintroduction project.

"This initiative, following PM Modi's directives, aims to restore cheetah population, which has been extinct in the country for nearly 70 years, and enhance the region's biodiversity. MP, once known for tigers, is now

known for cheetahs," said CM Mohan Yadav. There are 22 more cheetahs, including 12 cubs, in Kuno's enclosures.

In coming months, more cheetahs will be released in phases, and officials will monitor them to ensure suc-

cessful adaptation to the wild. Kuno National Park is prepared to support the cheetahs in their new habitat, with enhanced security measures to protect them from potential threats, said an official. To celebrate International Cheetah Day, rallies by 'cheetah-mitras' were organised across Sheopur district. To mark the occasion, Kuno released its 2025 calendar, featuring stunning images of cheetahs in India.

Teacher 'kills' student to go on leave, lands in trouble

Bhopal: A teacher in MP's Mauganj declared a Class III student 'dead' in the office register and went off on leave, ostensibly to attend the kid's 'funeral', reports Amarjeet Singh. The child is alive and his father, far from amused.

The teacher, Heeralal Patel, was suspended Tuesday. When TOI contacted him, he said, "I made a mistake, I was not well, I am a patient of diabetes." The incident took place at Chikir Ka Tota govt primary school in Chakrahan Tola village, 600 km from Bhopal.

On Nov 7, Heeralal told students that their schoolmate Jitendra Kori, son of Ram Saroj Kori, had died and he was going to attend his funeral. He wrote in the official register that Jitendra was a "regular student of his class". Someone clicked a picture of this diary entry and circulated it on village social media groups, sarpanch of Chakrahan Tola, Rajesh Pratap Singh, told TOI. Jitendra's father got to know of it on Nov 28 and headed straight for the police station.

"It was Hariyansh Kori, grandfather of student Jitendra, who died on Nov 7. But the teacher wrote Jitendra's name in school records as 'deceased' and left the school, saying he was going to attend his funeral," added the sarpanch.
