Modi to visit Kumbh Mela today, take holy dip at Sangam

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit the Maha Kumbh Mela in Prayagraj on Wednesday and take a holy dip at the Sangam around 11 am, his office said. Maha Kumbh 2025, which commenced on "Paush Purnima" (January 13), is the world's largest spiritual and cultural gathering, attracting devotees from across the globe. It will continue until Mahashivratri on February 26, a statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office said on Tuesday. Mr Modi will visit the Maha Kumbh Mela 2025 on February 5 and take a dip at the Sangam and offer prayers to Maa Ganga around 11 am, it said. In line with his commitment to promote and preserve India's spiritual and cultural heritage, Mr Modi has consistently taken proactive steps to enhance infrastructure and facilities at pilgrimage sites, the statement



Delhi holds polls today: BJP may have an edge

BHASKAR HARI SHARMA NEW DELHI, FEB. 4

As Delhi goes to the polls on Wednesday, the BJP appears to have an edge and the Congress. AAP heavyweights ranging from party supremo Arvind Kejriwal, chief minister Atishi and former deputy CM Manish Sisodia are reportedly facing stiff competition in their constituencies. A total of 699 candidates are in the fray for 70 Assembly seats.

As the polls approached, both key contesting outfits got into the game of luring voters with freebies and sops. The incumbent AAP was the first to announce ₹1,000 for every woman, which they claimed would be raised to ₹2,100 after the polls. To counter the AAP, the BJP and the Congress too came up with each offering ₹2,500. It's another story that these welfare measures would burden

the exchequer immensely. For ₹1,000 allowance for women, the burden on the exchequer will be about ₹4,560 crores. For ₹2,100, the outgo will be about ₹9,500 crores and for **Turn to Page 4**

New Delhi: A PIL has been moved before the Delhi high court seeking a CBI probe against the Drone Federation India for alleged manipulation of documents relating to regulatory approvals. The plea filed by Right to Information activist Tej Pratap Singh contended that the Drone Federation India. formerly known as Drone Federation of India, forged the NOC to bypass legal obstacles and change the name of the company. The petition said the alleged fraudulent document, submitted to the ministry of corporate affairs, was aimed at rebranding the organisation as "Drone Federation of India," potentially misleading the public into believing it was government-affiliated. The DFI is also accused of using lobbying tactics to unfairly influence tenders to certain select member companies, thereby suppressing competition in the UAV

New Delhi: The Delhi police has busted a cross-border cyber fraud network and arrested three people operating from Uttar Pradesh and Haryana, officials said on Tuesday. The accused were involved in large-scale digital arrest and investment frauds in collaboration with cyber criminals based in Cambodia, Thailand, Canada, and other countries, the police said. As part of the crackdown, the police also dismantled session initiation protocol (SIP) numbers and terminals used to route fraudulent calls, officials added, DCP Nidhin Valsan said the breakthrough came after a complaint was filed on the national cyber crime reporting portal (NCRP) regarding a financial fraud of ₹94,000. The SIP acts like a bridge between the phone system and the internet, allowing someone to make calls through a computer.

MOST OF OCT, NOV POLLUTION IN CITY LOCAL: STUDY

New Delhi: Delhi-NCR's pollution during October-November is largely of local origin, with stubble burning in Puniab and Harvana contributing 14 per cent to the overall PM2.5 levels in 2022,

a study has suggested. Researchers, led by those at Japan's Research Institute for Humanity and Nature under the 'Aakash Project', said that changes in the national capital's air quality could be related more with the stepping up or down of the 'GRAP' anti-pollution measures. The study, published in the journal 'npj Climate and Atmospheric Science', analysed fine par-

ticulate matter (PM2.5) data, recorded during the September-November months of 2022 and 2023 For the study, 30 sensors were installed across Punjab, Haryana and Delhi-NCR. Stubble burning, a common practice for clearing land following rice har-

vest, is often blamed for the sharp and sustained rise in PM2.5 levels, seen in the national capital region during the October-November months. However, the analysis showed that emissions over Punjab from burning stubbles "contributed only a meagre (nearly) 14 per cent to the overall PM2.5 over Delhi-NCR during October-November 2022".

The Delhi police on Tuesday registered an FIR against chief minister Atishi, also the AAP candidate from Kalkaji, for allegedly violating the model code of conduct (MCC) and obstructing public servants on duty. The police said Ms Atishi was with AAP supporters who allegedly obstructed an officer from doing his duty at Fateh Singh Marg. AAP members allegedly assaulted a police constable, they said.

This was preceded by a police case against two BJP leaders — Manish Bidhuri, a relative of BJP's Kalkaji candidate Ramesh Bidhuri, and Ravi Dayama.

"We have registered an FIR against the Kalkaji AAP candidate at the Govindpuri police station under various sections and further investigation is under process,' police official said.

Ms Atishi, however, took to X to slam the Election Commission (EC) for the police case against her and claimed that Ramesh Bidhuri, her BJP rival from Kalkaji, and members of his family were openly resorting to "hooliganism" but no action has been taken, instead they some people associated

'24 picks with criminal cases fielded without justification'

ADR flags non-compliance; serious charges against 71

Of the 118 candidates with criminal records contesting the Delhi Assembly polls slated for Wednesday, 24 candidates (20 per cent) did not have their records disclosed or justified by their respec-tive parties. A total of 699 candidates are in the fray for the polls in Delhi.

Poll rights body Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) released a detailed analysis of the Delhi Assembly elections 2025. The report, based on Format C7 data, revealed that many political parties failed to disclose reasons for selecting candidates with pending criminal cases as directed by the Supreme Court.

Among the candidates with the highest number of criminal cases are Amanatullah Khan (AAP), with 19 cases, Arvind Kejriwal (AAP) with 15 cases, and Mohd. Tahir Hussain (AIMIM) with 11 cases, including 38 serious charges. Out of 699 candidates

contesting the elections, 118 have declared criminal cases against themselves and among them, 71 candidates face serious criminal charges, including corruption, rioting and violent offences.

While 94 candidates' criminal records were published as mandated, 24 candidates (20%) did not have their records disclosed or justified by their respective parties. The Supreme Court had mandated that political parties provide valid reasons for fielding such candidates beyond just their 'winnability" at the polls. their beyond However, most parties continue to offer vague or repetitive justifications. The analysis covered 22 political parties that fielded candidates with crimi-

The major parties such as the AAP, Congress and the BJP published Format C7 for most of their candidates. However, the smaller parties, including the Peoples Party of India

(Democratic) and the Bhartiya Rashtrawadi Party, failed to comply. Some parties engaged in

questionable practices such as providing identical justifications for multiple candidates or claiming cases were "politically mot ivated" without substantial evidence. The AIMIM and the National Loktantrik Party also copied responses across different candidates, the ADR said.

The political parties justified their selection by citing their political experience, popularity and claims that cases against them were filed due to political vendetta. However, these explanations often lacked substantive reasoning on why cleaner candidates were not considered, the ADR said.

Lamba, made offensive comments about women. including party Bansuri Swaraj. MP

She played a video in which Mr Khurana is allegedly heard using abusive language against women, including a claim that one could get a ticket from the BJP by "supplying girls". In the same video, Mr Khurana also confessed to being promised ₹2.5 crore by the party for distributing funds in the slum areas

but claimed to have only

received ₹70 lakhs. The Mahila Congress president then turned her attention to the AAP, showing a separate video that featured a vehicle from Punjab, carrying liquor, money, and AAP publicity material.

'Mumbai Eye': BMC plans Ferris wheel on the lines of London Eye

Mumbai may soon have a major tourist attraction "Mumbai Eye", a giant Ferris wheel, modelled on the lines of the famous London Eye. The project, which has been envisaged in the 2025-26 budget of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), will be developed under the public-private partnership (PPP) model at a suitable location in

According to BMC officials, the Mumbai Eye will be modelled after the London Eye, which is also known as the Millennium Wheel, a 135-metre Ferris wheel located on the banks of the Thames river. The

THE BMC is the richest municipal corporation in the country and its annual budget is higher than even small states like Kerala, Goa and Northeastern states

Mumbai Eye will feature air-conditioned, sealed passenger capsules, each capable of holding 25 people.
While the BMC has pro-

posed the construction of the 'Mumbai Eye' project as a part of its budget, several similar attempts have failed to bear fruits earlier. The project has been in the pipeline for several years but has faced multiple hurdles. The concept of the Mumbai Eye was first introduced in 2008 by Shiv

Sena leader Ravindra Waikar Later, it was envisioned by the Maharashtra State Road Development Corporation back in 2011. However, the project never materialised. In 2023, the Mumbai

Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) revived the idea, proposing a loca-tion at the Bandra Reclamation promenade. In May 2023, the agency even invited bids for a management project consultant and began preparations for a technical feasibility report and the tendering process. However, the proposal faced strong opposition from Bandra Reclamation residents, citing concerns over traffic congestion.

A bench of Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna and Justices Sanjay Kumar and K.V. Viswanathan informed that the state government through its November 15, 2024 circular stopped the direct recruitment process by amending the Karna-taka Judicial Service (Recruitment) (Amendment) Rules

In its order, the bench said, "Issue notice, and as an interim measure we direct that the process of direct recruitment of 158 civil judges in Karnataka shall continue notwithstanding circular dated the circular dated 15.11.24 issued by the state government. This order is subject to the final outcome/decision on the application."

The CJI said the total sanctioned strength of judges in subordinate judiciary had risen from 21,000 to 29,000 in the country and the states, where the numbers rose significantly, would have to bear more expenses and increase the spending to demand. meet

After a long hiatus, the BJP. which claims to have seen a light at the end of the tunnel, launched an aggressive campaign to blend development, corruption and religion. To make inroads, the BJP launched an aggressive foray into the AAP's core vote bank — the JJ clusters comprising 10 per cent of total votes. The BJP is also expecting to benefit from the slew of tax reliefs for the middle class prescribed in the Union Budget.

The BJP has also dangled the carrot of "Jaha jhuggi wahi makan" promise to lure voters in slum clusters. The BJP has promised to give ownership rights to residents of 1,700 unauthorised colonies. The move could have an impact in at least 41 constituencies.

Budget allocations have little for southern states

t is not uncommon for the state governments, especially run by Opposition parties, to cry for more after the Union finance minister presented the Budget in the Lok Sabha. But the statements of four chief ministers from the south, obviously from the INDIA bloc parties, were shriller this time around. While Tamil Nadu chief minister M.K. Stalin rued that his state's name was never mentioned in the budget, Telangana chief minister A. Revanth Reddy commented that the Budget betrayed his state. Kerala chief minister Pinarayi Vijayan objected to his state "being penalised for the progress it has made" and Karnataka chief minister Siddaramaiah regretted that all his state got in the Budget was an empty vessel. Similar statements came from chief ministers of other non-BJP ruled states, too.

What triggered the elected chief ministers' ire was not just that their states got precious nothing in terms of funding despite presenting to the Union government specific need-based demands, but the discriminatory treatment of the BJP-led government towards them vis-\vec{x}-vis others. And their grief merits a hearing

India is diverse not only in terms of its history and culture but also when it comes to its geography, demography, wealth of resources and state of economic progress. Though India that is Bharat is a union of states, the Union government has come to wield disproportionate financial power compared to the states, somewhat by constitutional design and otherwise by precedent

To weaponise the financial resources and use them against states ruled by political opponents would be to undermine not just the federal principles of the Constitution but fairness itself

and encroachment. It was originally envisaged that there will be a central pool of taxes which the Union government would share with the states according to a formula. Instead of vesting the responsibility of devising the formula with the Union government, which is the custodian of the Consolidated Fund of India, the Constitution framers formed a body called the Finance

As per Article 280 of the Constitution, it shall be the duty of the Finance Commission to make recommendations to the President as to, inter alia, the distribution between the Union and the states of the net pro-ceeds of taxes which are to be, or may be, divided

between them, the allocation between the states of the respective shares of such proceeds, and the principles which should govern the grants-in-aid of the revenues of the states out of the Consolidated Fund of India. The Finance Commission's formula would factor in the ability of the states to raise their resources to meet their development needs, which vary from state to state. In short, we have a constitutional mechanism to help weaker states catch up with the rest.

The Union government's transfer of resources to the states comes in the form of Central schemes and special grants, too. The Planning Commission was an institution which acted as a resource centre to advise the Union government on such schemes and programmes.

One of the first actions of the first edition of the NDA government was to dismantle the Planning Commission and replace it with a Niti Aayog with no mandate of such advisory powers. The net result is that Union government can act completely arbitrarily when it comes to the allocation of funds to the states' pro-

No chief minister would have an argument that weaker states should not be given a larger share of the revenue pie so that India progresses as a nation and takes everyone along. But to weaponise the financial resources and use them against states ruled by political opponents, as the present Central dispensation is being accused of doing, would be to undermine not just the federal principles of the Constitution but fairness itself. It is best avoided.

Intriguing 3-way fight for Delhi n intriguing three-way contest for the Delhi Vidhan Sabha will be decided on

Wednesday by those among the capital's 1.56 crore voters who are willing to exercise their franchise. They voted for the aam admi champion Arvind Kejriwal twice in the last decade, giving his AAP 67 of 70 seats in an overwhelming vote when he first dislodged the Congress in 2015 and 62 of 70 seats in 2020.

Occupying the post of chief minister in the Delhi state setup where the lieutenant governor also wields power may seem like a mixed blessing, but Mr Kejriwal appears even more determined this time. A rare hat-trick against the background of his having carried the albatross of corruption charges in a liquor licensing scandal as he faces his foes in the BJP as well as friends in the INDIA alliance in the

shape of the Congress would make triumph even sweeter.

The BJP senses an opportunity to dethrone a regional chieftain who has been a esky opponent in the cut and thrust of politics done in Indiar trappings of drama thrown in. The Congress may have faced criticism from among allies for being in the fray at all. But it has always been a contestant for the prestige of ruling in the capital though its vote share was whittled down to as little as 4.26 per cent in 2020 as compared to BJP's 38.51 per cent and AAP's impressive 53.5 per

No one was spared in an abrasive campaign, not even the substitute CM Atishi who stood in for Mr Kejriwal after he had invited opprobrium for trying to run the government by proxy from Tihar Jail. With Prime Minister Narendra Modi BJP's star campaigner in all polls, and former CM Kejriwal and the Gandhi siblings spending major time at the hustings, the stakes appeared to hit a higher plane though the passage of time alone might have contributed to this in India's shrill and shriller electoral politics.

The bookmakers may have plumped for Mr Keiriwal's AAP as the favourite to win a simple majority while exit polls might have different tales to tell. As they say in sport, it is still Mr Kejriwal's match to lose and the spotlight is clearly on Delhi even if there are two Assembly bypolls in Tamil Nadu and UP, the second in Milkipur slated to be an interesting contest between the BJP and the SP after mixed results had popped up in the Lok Sabha polls last year.



The ministry said the two former captains "drank alcohol in excess of the limit, although they were aware of the rules' that limit the amount of alcohol consumed 12 hours before a scheduled flight.

The men both "gave false explanations to the company after arrival and attempted to cover up the excessive drinking", the ministry said.

RWANDA-BACKED REBELS DECLARE UNILATERAL TRUCE

Goma, Feb. 4: The Rwandabacked rebels who seized eastern Congo's key city of Goma announced on Monday a unilateral ceasefire in the region for humanitarian reasons, following calls for a safe corridor for aid and hundreds of thousands of displaced people.

The M23 rebels said the ceasefire would start on Tuesday.

The announcement came shortly after the UN health agency said at least 900 people were killed in last week's fighting in Goma between the rebels and Congolese forces. Government officials had previously cited a toll of 776.

KENYA GOLD MINE COLLAPSES, **TRAPPING 12**

Nairobi, Feb. 4: A dozen people were trapped after a gold mine in western Kenya partially collapsed, police said on Tuesday. Kenya has a small mining sector compared to its neighbours. However despite rapid growth in recent years, much of it is unregulated with miners having to deal with poor safety measures and organised crime

groups.
"The information we have is that there were around 20 miners at the time it collapsed but eight have been rescued," said Daniel Makumbu, a county police commander, said.

China imposes limited tariffs for US levies

China starts anti-monopoly investigation into Google; Trump pauses tariff on Canada for one month

Washington, Beijing, Feb. 4: China on Tuesday imposed targeted tariffson American imports and put several US companies, including Google, on notice for possible sanctions, in a measured response to the sweeping duties on Chinese imports imposed by President Donald Trump.

Beijing's limited counter to Trump's imposition of a 10% tariff on all Chinese imports underscored the attempt by Chinese policy-makers to engage Trump in talks that could avert an outright trade war betw-een the world's two largest economies

Capital Economics, a UKbased research firm, estimated that China's additional tariffs would apply to about \$20 billion of annual imports, compared with the \$450 billion worth of Chinese goods subject to the Trump tariff that took effect at 12:01 a.m. ET on Tuesday (0501 GMT).

"The measures are fairly modest, at least relative to US moves, and have been calibrated to send a message to the US," Julian Evans-Pritchard, the firm's head of China Economics said in a note.

Trump on Monday suspended his threat of 25% tariffs on Mexico and Canada at the last minute, agreeing to a 30-day pause in return for concessions on border and crime enforcement. Trump plans to speak to Chinese President Xi Jinping later in the week, a White House spokesperson said.

China's new measures, announced as the Trump tariff took effect, include a 15% levy on US coal and LNG and 10% for crude oil, farm equipment and a small number of trucks as well as big-engine sedans shipped to China from the

United States.
China said it was starting an anti-monopoly investigation into Alphabet Inc's Google. It put both PVH Corp the holding company for brands including Calvin Klein, and US biotechnology company Illumina on a list for potential sanctions.

Separately, China said it was imposing export controls on some metals, including tungsten, that are critical for electronics, military equipment and

Tesla had no immediate comment. Suit as Musk takes reins

of US treasury payments Washington, Feb. 4: Elon Musk and his aides have taken control of the US treasury department's pavments system, triggering a lawsuit charging he is illegally getting access to private data of millions of Americans.

Musk, the world's richest person, is leading President Donald Trump's federal cost-cutting efforts under the so-called department of government effi-ciency (DOGE).

The suit calls on a federal judge to declare it illegal for Musk or others from DOGE to get personal ers and to block the treasury department from letting that happen.

"People who must share information with the federal government should not be forced to share information with Elon Musk or his 'DOGE'," read a lawsuit filed in Washington by labour unions and a grassroots advocacy group.

"And federal law says they do not have to." HUNDREDS OF U.S. GOVT SITES GO OFFLINE

Washington, Feb. 4: Hundreds of US government websites were offline on Monday, an *AFP* review showed, including that of the humanitarian agency USAID which President Donald Trump's administration is shufting down.

From a list of nearly 1.400 federal sites provided by the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), more than 350 were unavailable on Monday afternoon.

These included sites linked to the departments of defence, commerce, labour as well the Central Intelligence Agency and the Supreme Court, the review showed.

The exact time when the sites became unavailable was not clear. Nor was it known whether the sites were temporarily offline or taken down at the instruction of Trump's administration.

U.S. ENDS TEMPORARY DEPORTATION PROTECTION FOR 3.5L VENEZUELANS Washington, Feb. 4: US who have the protection.

CONSCRIPTS IN MYANMAR CAN'T GO ABROAD

Yangon, Feb. 4: Myanmar's embattled junta has banned anyone eligible for military conscri-ption from leaving the country without permission, as it seeks to shore up its forces fighting rebel groups opposed to its rule.

The junta has lost control of swathes of the country to ethnic minority armed groups and other opposition forces in the civil war triggered by its coup d'etat four years ago. A long-dormant conscription law was enforced last year as the Army reeled from a string of battlefield defeats to ethnic armed groups and civilian "People's Defence Forces" seeking to oust it from power.

A bylaw imposes new restrictions on those eligible to be called up men aged 18-35 and

women aged 18-27. The person who receives the order shall not be allowed to leave for foreign countries without obtaining the permission of the Central Body." The rule applies to those who have been called up and also those waiting for the outcome of appeals for exemption, reduction, or postponement of military — Reuters

Russian missile kills 5, wounds over 50

Izium, Kyiv, Feb. 4: A Russian strike killed five civilians and wounded 55 on Tuesday in the town of Izium in Ukraine's northeastern Kharkiv region, partially destroying the city council building, officials said as Ukraine brought home 12 children who were forcefully taken by Russia, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's chief of staff said.

Santorini, Greece, Feb. 4: Thousands of people were leaving the Greek island of Santorini by sea and air for a third day on Tuesday, as an unprecedented series of earthquakes shook the top travel desti-

nation. Some 6,000 people have already left the island, known for its spectacular cliffside views and a dormant volcano, which has been hit by hundreds of tremors since last week,

A quake with a magnitude of 4.9 hit early on Tues-

day morning amid other ector at the national obsersmaller tremors.

No injuries or damage were reported on Santorini and the neighbouring islands of Anafi, Ios and Amorgos, which have also been affected by the seismic activity.

Experts say the region has not experienced seismic activity on this scale in recent history. The experts added they do not know how long it will last. "This is the first time this is happening, we have not seen it before," Athanassios Ganas, research dir-

vatory's institute of geodynamics, said. He noted that the area

had been hit with over 40 earthquakes with a magnitude of over 4.0 in the past 72 hours. Santorini lies atop a vol-

cano which last erupted in 1950 -- but an experts' committee on Monday said the current phenomenon was "not linked to volcanic activity." According to the Greek coastguard, over 4,600 people have left the island by ferry since Sunday alone.

SWEDEN: FIVE SHOT AT ADULT EDU. CENTRE

Stockholm, Feb. 4: Five people were shot on Tuesday in an attack at a school for adults in Sweden, police said, but they declined to comment on local media reports that several people had been killed. The perpetrator is believed to be among those injured and a search is continuing at the school for more possible victims, a police spokes-person told a news conference. The perpetrator's motive was not immediately known.

'This is currently seen

as attempted murder, arson and aggravated weapons offence," police said in a statement, adding that the extent of the injuries of the five people who had been shot remained unclear. The Aftonbladet daily and broadcasters SVT and TV4, citing anonymous sources, said "several people" had been killed. The shooting took place in Orebro, some 200 km (125 miles) west of Stockholm, at the Risbergska school for adults who did not complete their formal education or failed to get the grades to continue to higher education. It is located on a campus that also houses schools for children.



New Delhi, Feb. 4: The GST Council will soon take a decision on having fewer and lower rates as the review work is almost complete, finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman said on Tuesday.

Currently, goods and services Tax (GST) is a four-tier tax structure with slabs at 5, 12, 18 and 28 per cent. Luxury and demerit goods are taxed at highest bracket of 28 per cent, while packed food and essential items are in the lowest 5 per cent slab.

The Council, chaired by Sitharaman and comprising her state counterparts, has set up a group of ministers (GoM) to suggest changes in GST rates as well as reduce slabs.

"To be fair to the GST and the ministers who are all in the council, the work on rationalising and simplifying GST rates has already commenced. In fact, it had commenced nearly three years ago,' she said at a post Budget round table.

Sitharaman said later the scope was widened and now the work is almost complete.

India to assess US exit from global tax deal, says official

Revenue secretary Tuhin Kanta Pandey on Tuesday said that India would assess the implications of the United States' decision to withdraw from the global tax deal. The comment from the government comes after US President Donald Trump's statement in the Presidential memorandum on January 20.

As per the Trump's statement, the 'global tax deal' has no force or effect within the United States, thus nullifying the progress made so far by the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) to bring 140 countries on the same platform to levy a minimum 15 per cent tax on profits of multinational



corporates. Pandey, who was inter-

acting with in a post-Budget session of industry body Assocham, said that the tax deal is a multilateral approach where the US is much integrally "The US exit has added a lot of uncertainty and if the United States is not joining it then such a pact doesn't work out," the top official of the finance ministry said.

In 2021, nearly 140 countries signed the OECD's global tax deal. "We have not enacted any legislatries have already done it. If the US withdraws from this process, then I think we will have to evaluate what benefit it will have," Pandey said here.

Concerned over growth of the economy, Pandey, meanwhile, said that the government has taken measures to lower fiscal deficit and delivered a non-inflationary Budget, and the Monetary Policy Committee of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has to now decide on interest rate cut to boost growth.

'The fiscal policy and the monetary policy need to work in tandem, not at cross purposes. Because a lot more benefit will come also with monetary easing, if we are able to maintain inflation control," Pandey said.

Both Praggnanandhaa and Gukesh finished with 8.5 points after losing

their 13th-round games, Praggnanandhaa showed remarkable mental resilience to triumph 2-1 in the tie-breaker during the 87th edition of the prestigious event in Wijk Aan Zee.

Praggnanandhaa became the first Indian after Viswanathan Anand to win the Tata Steel Chess

Anand, a three-time winner (2003, 2004, and 2006) when the event was known as the Corus Chess Tournament, had also shared the honours twice (1989 and 1998) during its earlier form as the Hoogovens Tournament.

Praggnanandhaa described the final day as "crazy and long" after he battled exhaustion and nerves to outwit Gukesh in a thrilling tie-breaker. As a draw seemed immi-

nent in sudden death, Gukesh lost control, and Praggnanandhaa capitalised on the mistake to clinch his maiden title.

The 'Old Lady' has new charm

It's like a big party in a sleepy coastal town of picturesque Elizabeth, recently re-christened Gqeberha, Gqeberha, where all traffic is heading to the St George's Park Stadium, which is hosting the first Qualifier of the SA20 League between MI Cape Town and Paarl Royals. It is the home of the Port Elizabeth Cricket Club (one of the oldest clubs in South Africa), the Eastern Province Club and Sunrisers Eastern Cape but the SA20 League had brought a major lift to the 'Old Lady', which was established in early

"The league has brought a huge difference to the stadium. Cricket is no longer the game that it was 10 years ago and SA20 has made a huge impact in upgrading the stadiums and St George's Park has been very much part of that process. We have a larger crowd coming here for the SA20 matches and witness renewed enthusiasm," said Mark William, CEO of Eastern Province Cricket.

St George's Park staged the first Test to be played England Australia in 1888-89 and in 1969-70 hosted the final Test before South Africa's 21-year isolation. It also staged South Africa's first international, against England, in 1891. It also hosted the first

ODI between India and South Africa in 1992.

"This is an old lady. She has been here for a long time and so we called her our 'Old Lady'. It used to be a rugby field but we no longer host rugby matches. Now we are just focusing on organising cricket tournaments. We have had a full house every single time this season during SA20. Hoping there will be more cricket tournaments coming future," he added.

'BROKEN GLASS WILL BE FIXED SOON'

Mark also informed Rinku Singh's six that smashed the media box glass panel of the stadium in 2023 will be fixed as soon as the season ends.

"We are waiting to get this season over then we will change the glass. It's a big glass and will need big tools to change it and when you allow big and special equipment like big cranes entering the stadium... there are chances it will damage the ground. Once the season finishes we will start prepping up for the next one. We have a fourmonth window, then we will upgrade, change and fix the stuff," Mark said.

The stadium also has the pavilion named after Africa legend Graeme Pollock — uncle of former Proteas star Shaun Pollock, Graeme is widely regarded as one of South Africa's greatest ever cricketers and one of the greatest batters in the history of the game.
