SC STAYS RANVEER ALLAHBADIA'S ARREST, BARS HIM FROM DOING SHOWS FOR NOW



The Supreme Court on Tuesday stayed the arrest of YouTuber **Ranveer Allahbadia**, aka BeerBiceps, in the FIRs registered against him in Maharashtra, Assam and Rajasthan, for his inappropriate remarks made during an episode of the reality show *India's Got Latent*. The court called him out for his comments, saying, "The words you have used will make daughters, sisters, parents and even the society feel ashamed. It shows a perverted mind." While the SC allowed him interim protection, they restrained the YouTuber from doing any other show for the time being. 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The Doha billionaireess and her jewelled legacy

While the Emir of Qatar, Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, is making headlines in India while on his two-day visit, another member of the Qatari royal family is also being talked about for her recent public appearances – the Emir's mother Sheikha Moza bint Nasser. The fashion icon and philanthropist is known for her impeccable style and stunning collection of jewellery. Here's a look:

Global glitterati is enamoured by Sheikha Moza bint Nasser, the style icon, entrepreneur and power lady of Qatar. And there is enough reason to be so. One of the consorts of Sheikh Hamad bin Khalifa Al Thani, the former Emir of Qatar, and mother of the current Emir, Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, Sheikha Moza's public appearances have kept fashion critics and publications busy analysing her stellar sartorial choices. She has often been compared with Elizabeth Taylor and Maharani Gayatri Devi for her exquisite sartorial statements. In particular, her collection of statement jewellery pieces that would be comparable (or even eclipse) some of the most jaw-dropping jewels on public view last year on various occasions.

Sheikha Moza's public appearances – and she lives an active life between her philanthropy and entrepreneurial work – have fuelled many conversations among the glitterati in India as well. In fact, the recent launch of Sabyasachi's collection in Doha was said to be inspired by her elegant aesthetic while she was also listed as one of the people shaping the Global Fashion Industry (BOF, 2024).

One of the most talked-about pieces in her treasury is Cartier's Eternity snake diamond necklace, which is believed to have been modified for her. Created in 1998, the necklace originally featured two of the largest emeralds in the world, weighing 205 and 206 carats, along with 26 baroque pear emeralds, 3957 diamonds, and fine pearls (inset). The version worn by Sheikha Moza was reportedly altered to replace the emeralds with two large white diamonds, with the smaller emeralds and pearls removed for a more streamlined look. She paired it with a grey J Mendel dress at a 2010 event in London



Sheikha Moza's fascinating jewellery collection prominently features an array of statement pearl necklaces – ranging from single strands to elaborate layers, with pieces from esteemed jewellers such as Robert Wan and Mikimoto. POV Student of the year

As congratulatory posts pour in from political big-wigs and industrialists, Samarth Mahangade has already cleared an impossible challenge with flying colours. The college student, who paraglided from Panchgani to his exam centre in Pasarni minutes before the deadline to avoid congested roads, has been in the news for everything – from his "problem-solving" abilities to his resolve and determination. It is true grit. Absolutely.

But behind the feel-good story is also a grim reminder of how a staggering number of students battle the odds every day – not for social media clout, not for viral fame, but simply to get to class on time. Something that should be a given, what with the seriousness with which young students pursue their dreams of a better life, their academic and career ambitions. It's easy to cheer for a story like Samarth's, but let's also talk about the ones that don't make headlines.

There is perhaps a tendency to glorify the perseverance of the students who wade through flooded city streets during the monsoon, or travel miles on foot, sometimes negotiating a river in spate, by overcrowded buses, or hanging off the edge of trains just to reach school or an exam centre. But what we may not remember is that all it takes is a broken bridge or a delayed train to destroy an entire academic year. Or as in the tragic incident in Delhi, where JEE aspirants drowned in a flooded basement of a coaching centre, the irreplaceable loss of lives.

We all love a good underdog story – who doesn't? Films like *Super 30* and *12th Fail* have well captured the sheer tenacity of our students, showcasing the immense struggles they overcome in their pursuit of education. These films resonate deeply because they reflect a reality that is all too familiar – brilliant, hardworking students navigating a system that often seems indifferent to their hardships.

Samarth's story is impressive, no doubt. But you know what would be even more impressive? A system where students don't have to paraglide, wade or struggle just to reach their classrooms. Now, that would be something worth normalising.

HOW TO PLAY

HOW TO PLAY

1. A number may appear just once in each row or column. Eliminate repeat numbers by darkening cells. (see example)
2. Darkened cells must never be adjacent in a row or column.
3. Unmarked cells must create a single continuous area, undivided by darkened cells.
4. Every time you darken a cell, you can automatically circle its vertical and horizontal neighbours, which means they cannot be eliminated.
5. Any cell "sandwiched" between neighbours of the same value can be circled. (e.g. 6 4 6)
6. A "triple" is a special case of sandwich. Circle the centre cell, and darken the ends. (e.g. 6 6 6)

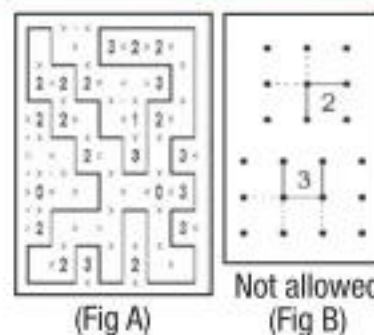

LOOP THE LOOP

RULES

- Connect adjacent dots with vertical or horizontal lines, creating a single loop (Fig A).
- Crossovers or branches are not allowed (As shown by dotted lines in Fig B).
- Numbers in the puzzle indicate the number of lines that should surround it, while empty cells may be surrounded by any number of lines.
- You can't draw lines around zeroes.
- Each puzzle has just one unique solution.

HOW TO BEGIN:

Example (Fig A) - Begin with the zero next to 3. Since no lines can be drawn around zero, mark crosses around it, as shown. Now there is a cross in one space around 3. So we know the three lines of 3 can only be drawn in the remaining three spaces. Next, these lines can only be extended in one direction each. Continue, using the same logic.

Hints: Keep eliminating possibilities by marking crosses in spaces between dots where a line isn't possible, i.e., if you have already completed required lines or where a line extension may create a branch or cause a deadend (Fig B).

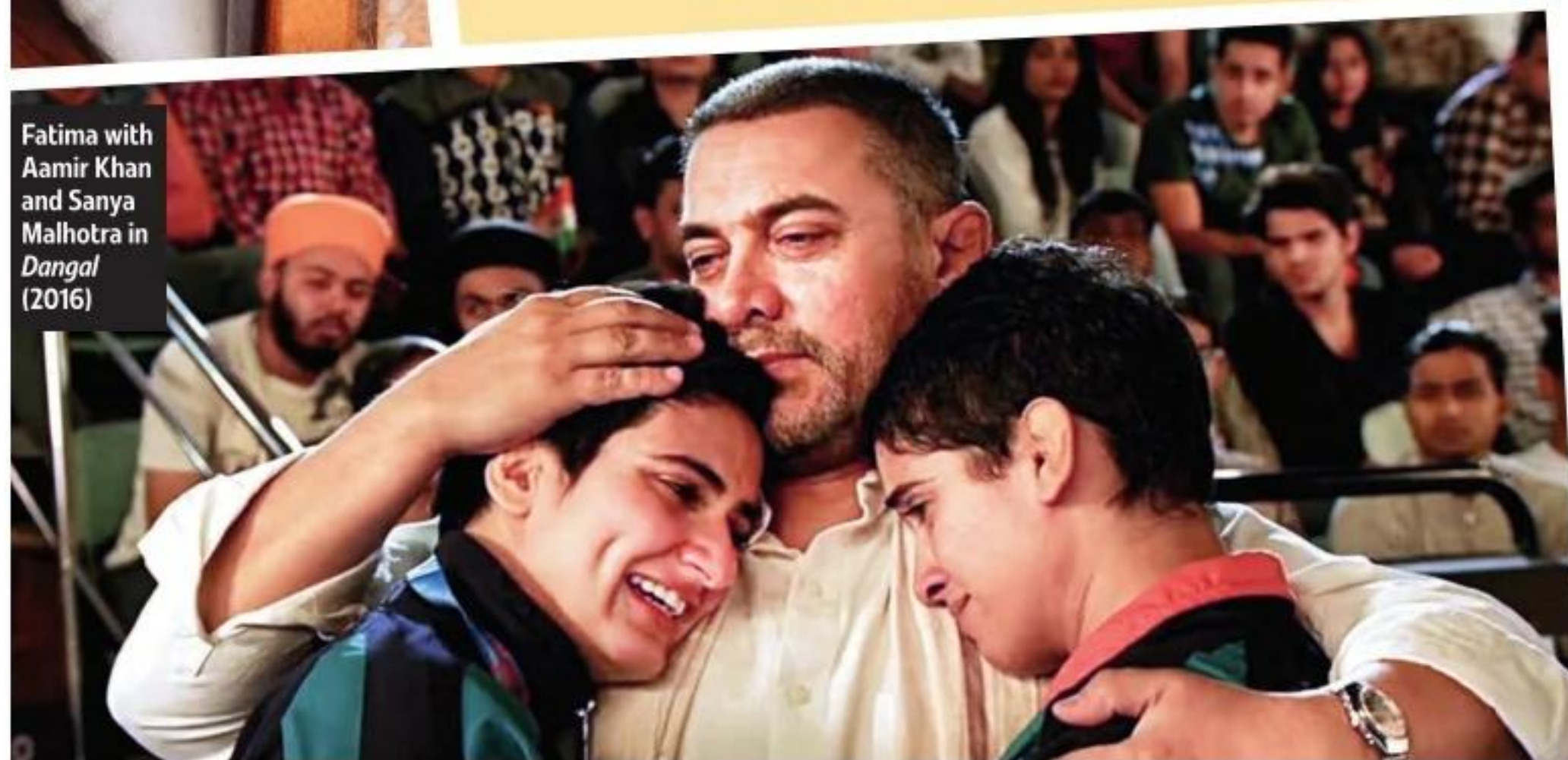
I'm realistic about myself and my talent: Fatima

Talking about the kind of work that inspires her, Fatima says, "With the kind of work I am doing now, I want to see if there's a shift or a change in the way I'm positioned. I have bigger dreams for myself, but it's not about stardom. I want to do films that transcend borders and leave a deep impact, not just emotionally, but also in a way that a film like *Andaz Apna Apna* had on people." Apart from *Metro... In Dino*, she will also be seen in the romantic comedy *Aap Jaisa Koi* with R Madhavan, among other projects.

'I TRY TO COLLABORATE WITH PEOPLE, BUT THE MARKET IS TOUGH RIGHT NOW'

Fatima doesn't hesitate to approach producers if the project excites her. "I'm trying to collaborate with people, but the market is tough right now. There are a lot of projects out there, but they're not the ones that attract me. I'm realistic about myself, my talent and my positioning. I know what I can offer to a producer. I can't expect them to invest ₹100 crore on me. I sometimes chase projects I'm passionate about."

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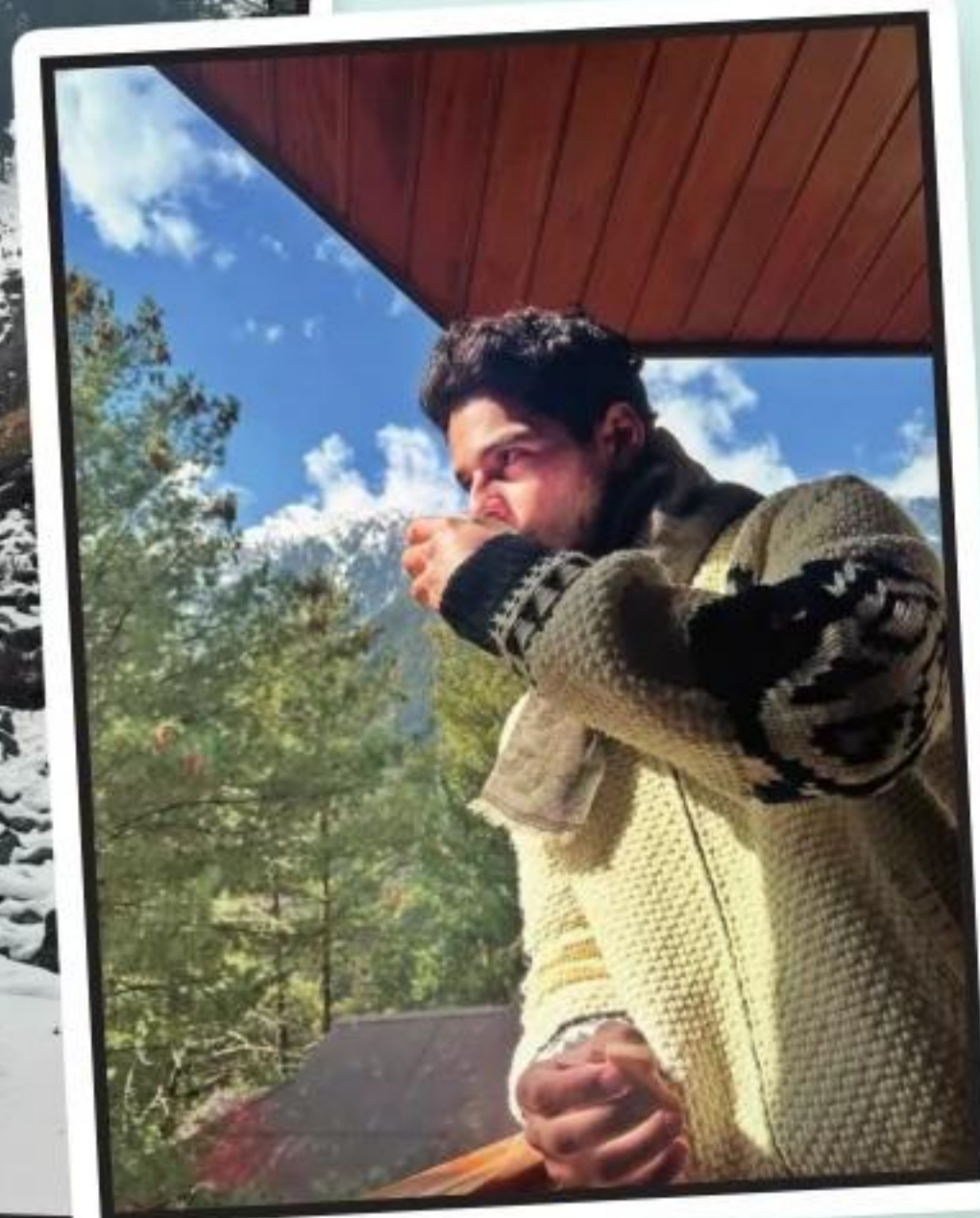
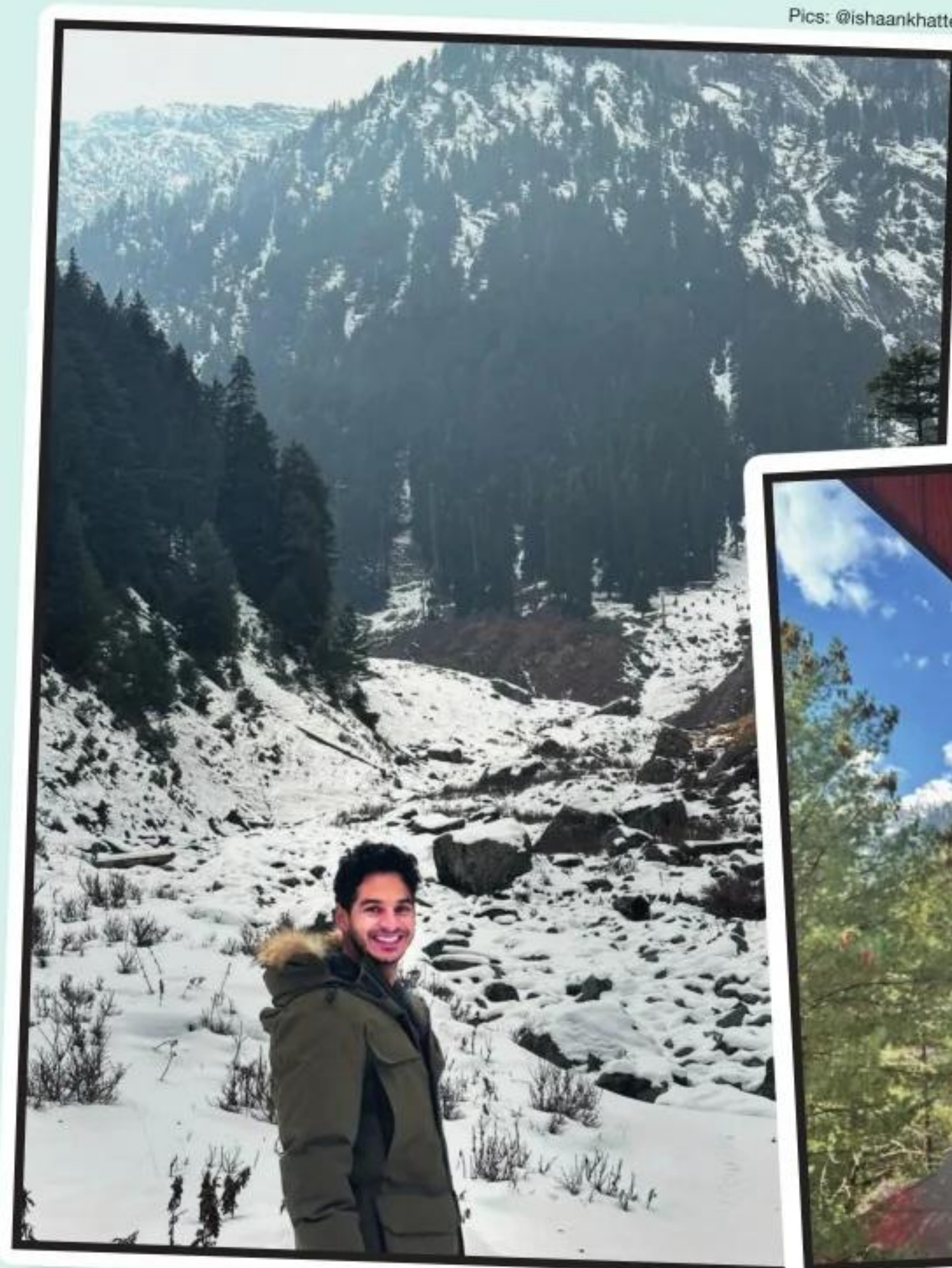

Donal Bisht is currently shooting her first international film in China and her family back home is worried about the HMPV outbreak there. When we reached out to Donal, she said, "I am shooting for a project in Foshan with director Andrew Lau, who has made films like *Internal Affairs* and *Women from Mars*. When I was finalised for the role, there were no reports of the virus, but by the time I travelled to China in January, HMPV had started spreading."

The actress, who has been part of TV serials and web shows, added, "My parents and friends back home are worried about me. This was a work commitment, so I couldn't postpone it. People here are taking a lot of precautions. I'm wearing a mask all the time. Luckily, the location where we are currently shooting is far away from where most of the cases have been found. As soon as my schedule is over in a few days, I will return to India."
