First-time BJP MLA Rekha Gupta to be new Delhi CM, oath today

and SANJAY KAW NEW DELHI, FEB. 19

Delhi's long wait for its new chief minister ended on Wednesday evening, with the BJP naming first-time legislator Rekha Gupta for the top post. She, along with her six Cabinet colleagues, will take the oath of office on Thursday at the historic Ramlila Ground.

Ms Gupta will succeed Aam Aadmi Party's Atishi as the BJP swerved to power in Delhi after a hiatus of over 26 years by sweeping the February 5
Assembly polls. The
Asian Age was the first
newspaper to report that
Delhi will get a woman chief minister.

Ms Gupta, who will be the lone woman chief minister among the 14 states currently ruled by the BJP, had won the recent Delhi polls from the Shalimar Bagh Assembly constituency.

The choice of the chief ministerial candidate is a clear indicator that the BJP aims to hold sway over this crucial votebank in the national capital. This is also in line with the extraordinary voter turnout of women in the Delhi polls, which was higher than men since the first Assembly elections

To woo the women voters, the BJP had pitched a monthly financial assistance of ₹2,500 against AAP's ₹2,100 in the run-up to the recent Assembly

The name of Ms Gupta as the leader of the BJP's legislative party was proposed by Parvesh Verma, Vijender Gupta and Satish Uphadyay and was seconded by nine other newly elected MLAs. Interestingly, the names of Mr Verma, Mr Gupta and Mr Uphadyay were also doing the rounds for the top post.

After much anticipation, the BJP finally ended the suspense by announcing Rekha Gupta as Delhi's new chief minister. Ms Gupta will be the fourth woman chief minister of Delhi after BJP's Sushma Swaraj, Congress' Sheila Dikshit and AAP's Atishi. Her appointment also signals the BJP's strategic move towards empowering women in leadership roles, aligning with the

party's broader vision.
Born on July 19, 1974, in
Haryana's Julana, Ms
Gupta has had a 32-year association with the RSS and has worked extensively for women's welfare. Her political journey began in 1992 when she became involved with the Bharatiya

Vidyarthi Parishad at Daulat Ram College, Delhi University. In 1995-96, she was the secretary of the Delhi University Students' Union and was its president in 1996-97. Ms Gupta also earned a

law degree from Chaudhary Charan Singh University, Meerut and practiced as an advocate. In 2002, Ms Gupta joined the BJP and has served as the national secretary of the party's youth wing. She has also served as the BJP's women's wing incharge in Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Uttar Pradesh. She was later elected as a councillor from North Pitampura in



Trump calls Zelenskyy a 'dictator without elections', tensions rise **THE UKRAINIAN PREZ**

Miami, Feb. 19: US President Donald Trump Wednesday called Volodymyr Zelenskyy a "dictator without elections", lashing out after the Ukrainian President the Ukrainian President said Mr Trump was being influenced by "Russian disinformation" as he moves to end the Kremlin's war against Ukraine on terms that Kyiv says are too favorable to Moscow.

"Think of it, a modestly comedian, Zelenskyy, successful Volodymyr talked the United States of America into spending \$350 billion to go into a war that couldn't be won, that never had to start, but a war that he, without the US and TRUMP, will never be able to settle,"

accused Donald Trump earlier of living in a Russian-made 'disinformation space' as he moves to end the Kremlin's war against Ukraine on terms that Kyiv says are too favorable to Moscow

Mr Trump said of Mr Zelenskyy, who was popular television star in Ukraine before running for office.

for office.

Mr Trump added in his social media post that Mr Zelenskyy is "A Dictator without Elections"!

Because of Russia's invasion in February

2022, Ukraine has delayed elections that were scheduled for April 2024.

Mr Zelenskyy accused Trump Wednesday of living in a Russian-made "disinfor-mation space". Mr Trump used his post to accuse Mr Zelenskyy of misusing American aid to Ukraine for the war effort and taking advantage of the Biden administration.

The sharp back-and-forth came after senior US and Russian officials met in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, on Tuesday and agreed to negotiate a settlement to an end to the war. Ukrainian and European officials were not included despite Mr Zelenskyy's insistence that they should be part of any such discussions.

Police recovers 305

phones worth ₹3cr

New Delhi: The crime branch of the Delhi police has recovered 305 high-end stolen mobile phones worth approximately ₹3 crore under their Operation Track Back, an official said on Wednesday. Among the 305 phones, 216 have been returned to their rightful owners after verification, a senior police officer said. During the operation, launched to curb mobile theft and protect citizens from digital fraud, arrests were made disrupting international mobile smuggling rings, the officer said. On January 10, the police teams arrested Manish Yadav from Wazirabad, recovering 195 stolen phones worth ₹2 crore. Later, on January 30, two members of an international theft syndicate - Rahul and Waheed — were arrested with 58 stolen phones, he added. On February 10, another arrest was made when Asif was nabbed with 52 stolen devices, including 40 iPhones. - PTI

Man gets 14-year Ri for raping minor girl

New Delhi: A Delhi court has sentenced a man to 14 years rigorous imprisonment for raping and impregnating a 14-year-old girl in 2018 and rejected his plea of poverty and no previous criminal record. Additional sessions judge Rajesh Kumar heard the arguments on sentencing against the 40-year-old man who was convicted under IPC and POCSO Act. Specia public prosecutor Nimmi Sisodia sought the maximum sentence for the convict say

ing the survivor gave birth owing to the heinous offence. The forensic report, she said, established the convict to be the child's biological father. The court handed out the 14-year sentence for rape and two years' of jail for criminally intimidating

After 27 long years, Delhi is all set to be draped in saffron on Thursday. Expecting a mammoth gathering, the Delhi police has already issued a traffic advisory for the oath ceremony of the new chief minister at Ramlila ground.

Among the prominent guests expected to attend the grand event are Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union home minister Amit Shah along with his colleagues besides NDA chief ministers and deputy CMs from different states.

The BJP is said to have extended invitations to gig workers, cab and auto drivers, farmers, as well as slum dwellers.

Women beneficiaries of the BJP-led Central government's welfare schemes are also being invited to the event.

Ahead of the grand ceremony, BJP national general secretary Tarun Chugh reviewed the ongoing final preparations for the oath He mocked the AAP for

defeat in the Assembly elections and said that the people of Delhi had punished a "tyrannical ruler for his

The people of Delhi have punished a tyrannical ruler for his lies, deceit,

The oath ceremony

holds venue immense political significance as Kejriwal had used the same place to take oath as the Delhi chief minister in 2013 and subsequent terms after decimating the Congress, which ruled the city for 15 consecutive

years.
The venue is also a pointer to the rise and fall of the Aam Aadmi Party, which was born out of the Anna Hazare-led anti-corruption movement channelised from the same historic ground. Ahead of the oath-taking

ceremony, the Delhi police tightened the security around the venue.

More than 25,000 security personnel are being deployed in the central, north, and New Delhi areas of the city for the event.

Lieutenant-governor V.K. Saxena will administer the oath of office to the CM-designate and the Cabinet at about 12.30 pm

Special commissioner of police (law and order) Ravindra Yadav said that the Delhi police has been preparing for the event for the last two days.

He said managing traffic and parking around the venue would be challenging due to the high number of vehicles expected to reach there.

"Delhi commissioner of police Sanjay Arora visit-ed the venue this morning. He personally reviewed the preparations. We are sure that we will manage the event smoothly," Mr Yadav said.

Another senior officer said the Delhi police is in touch with other security

"Only authorised people will be allowed near the venue. We have also chalked out a traffic plan," he said.

The police said along with other emergency response teams, there will be multiple layers of barricades to ensure the safety and security of the dig-

According to the police, commandos, quick reac-tion teams, PCR vans, antisabotage checks, and SWAT teams will be deployed at strategic locations while snipers will be positioned at high-rise buildings nearby.

Gurgaon: Girl, 13, raped, beaten up by her neighbour

Gurgaon, Feb. 19: A 13year-old girl was brutally raped and beaten up by her neighbour in Sector 29 area here, the police said on Wednesday. The girl's mother, in her complaint, alleged that at around 3 pm on Tuesday her daughter left home to meet her maternal grandmother. After sometime, she gets to know that her daughter did not reached there and they searching for her.

"After two hours, I found my daughter in bad condition in the gallery near my rented room. She told me that their neighbouring, Aryan, took her to his room and raped her," she alleged

After raping the girl, he badly thrashed her and also threatened to kill her if she told anyone about the incident, the mother alleged, adding, "Soon after, the health of my daughter started deteriorating and she was rushed to hospital where she is undergoing treatment.

An FIR was registered at the Sector 29 police station on Tuesday and the accused was arrested today, a senior police officer said.

2 rape woman after making her friend on Insta

Gurgaon, Feb. 19: woman was allegedly raped by two men here after they befriended her on Instagram, the police said on Wednesday. An FIR has been registered at the Sector 29 police station based on a complaint lodged by the woman, officials said.

The woman, a resident of Delhi, in her complaint alleged that she befriended Gajendra and Vikas around 25 days ago on Instagram, the police said.

During the conversa-tion, the two behaved politely and gained her trust, they added. The woman's husband

died due to Covid-19 and after befriending the accused she used to share her problems with them, the police said citing the complaint.

Delhi pollution body presents action plan to PMO for Yamuna

New Delhi, Feb. 19: With the change in government in the national capital, an action plan to rejuvenate the Yamuna river has been submitted to the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), focusing on boosting sewage treatment capacity and other critical measures, officials said on Wednesday. The Delhi pollution control committee (DPCC) under the department of environment presented a document to the PMO last week regarding the cleaning and rejuvenation of the Yamuna.

The plan also outlines key measures, including tapping of major drains, setting up new sewage treatment plants (STPs), connecting drainage sys-JJ clusters, trap ping all drains, upgrading common effluent treatment plants (CETPs), removing encroachments from floodplains and beautifying the riverfront.

Cleaning of the Yamuna was at the centre of politics in the run-up to the Delhi Assembly polls with the BJP slamming the then ruling AAP for failing to rejuvenate the river during its 10-year

The BJP, which has come to power winning 48 out of the 70 Assembly seats in the recent polls, has said cleaning of the Yamuna will be among the top priorities of its government in Delhi.

According to the document sent to PMO last week, the DPCC has highlighted that the 48-km stretch of the Yamuna from Palla to Asgarpur village in the city has been classified as a "Priority-1" (top priority) polluted stretch.

A key concern raised in the document is the high biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) levels, wnich remain iar abov the desired standard of 3 mg/l. To improve water quality, the document has emphasised the need for a minimum environmental flow (E-flow) of 23 cumecs (437 MGD). However, due to existing

water shortages, the current flow into Delhi is nearly nil.

Babus ready draft schemes for BJP's women's scheme

New Delhi, Feb. 19: With the BJP all set to form gov-ernment in Delhi, bureaucrats working in the city government have been instructed to prepare drafts of schemes centred around women, which the party would launch in its manifesto for the elections.

The Delhi women and child development department has been instructed to prepare drafts by Thursday for schemes on providing ₹2,500 monthly to all women, financial aid to pregnant women. and assistance to poor families for their daughters' marriages, an official said.

The BJP returned to power in Delhi, defeating the Aam Aadmi Party comfortably in the elections held earlier this month.

The Delhi government official told a news agency that the Mahila Samman rojana would be renamed Mahila Samriddhi Yojana and beneficiaries will now receive ₹2,500 per month, up from ₹1,100 given by the previous government under the AAP.

In its poll manifesto, the BJP also promised to launch the Mukhya Mantri Kanyadan Yojana (MMKY) which will provide finan-

Need to be kind for adolescent love: HC

The Delhi high court has advocated for a compassionate approach prioritising "understanding" over "punishment" in criminal cases involving adolescent love, saying the law should evolve to acknowledge such relationships that are consensual and free from coercion.

Affirming that consensual and respectful adolescent love is a natural part of human development, justice Jasmeet Singh said adolescents should be allowed to express their feelings and engage in relationships without fear of criminalisation. The high court said the

focus of the law should be on preventing exploitation and abuse rather than punishing love. It therefore upheld a trial court judgement acquitting a man for the alleged offence of pene-

trative sexual assault

under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (Pocso) Act. In December 2014, complaint was lodged with the police by the girl's father that his minor daughter had not returned home from tuition. An apprehension was raised against the

man since he was also

missing from his house. Investigation was conducted and the girl, who was around 16 years of age at the time of the incident, was brought back home while a case was lodged against the man for allegedly sexually assaulting the minor.

While upholding the man's acquittal and dismissing the state's plea against the trial court's decision, the high court said the acquittal order was well-reasoned and did not require any inter-

ference. The judge relied on a previous judgement of the high court dealing with the proposition that when a girl over 16 years

made a statement that she had consented to the relationship and it could be accepted, the court was within its power in quashing the proceedings under Sections 363 and 376 of the IPC.

The court observed that it would be harsh and unjust to convict an individual under the Pocso Act without definitive proof of the age of the prosecutrix, especially when the age gap for the minor survivor to attain majority was only one or two years.

It said the legal system must safeguard the rights of young individuals to love while ensuring their safety and well-being

Six jump from 2nd floor to escape house fire in Nangloi



Bihar FICN seizure

New Delhi: The National Investigation Agency on Wednesday raided multiple locations in three states in connection with a 2024 case of seizure of high-quality Fake Indian Currency Notes (FICNs) in Bihar. Extensive searches were conducted at five locations in Bihar and one each in J&K and Telangana as part of the NIA investigations into a fake currency racket operated by accu-sed and suspects from Nepal by using crypto currency. "NIA teams conducted searches at the premises of accused and suspects in Patna, Bhagalpur,

Bhojpur and Motihari districts of Bihar, Anantnag district of J&K, and in Hyderabad in Telang-ana and cash amounting to ₹1,49,400, along with digital devices including pen drives, mobile phones, SIM cards was seized during the searches. HC grants divorce over husband's alcoholism

A division bench comprising Justice Rajani Dubey and Justice Narendra Kumar Vyas, while granting divorce to woman, observed, "The man indulged in excessive drinking and had illicit relationships with other women. He is not doing any work to support his family. Such irresponsible and promiscu-ous conduct of the respon-

dent (the husband) is causing social infamy to the whole family." The HC overturned the family court's verdict by granting

divorce to the woman. The family court did not consider these factors while holding that no mental or physical cruelty was committed by the husband against the woman, the division bench said.

The couple married in 1991 and have three children — two daughters and one son.

The woman, a government teacher, filed for divorce against her husband saying that she had been living separately in another room of their house since 2018 and they had no conjugal relations since then.

Along the way he has also made it appear as if he can make a couple of wars go away though his motives are suspect in why he wants Ukraine to agree to a peace deal because his eye may be on that nation's natural resources in rare metals.

In a flurry of executive orders that came at the speed of light, Trump rained distortion on global trade, showed utter disdain for expert opinions, appointed his favourites to carry out tasks in dealing with groups of people like federal workers, illegal immigrants and transgenders, and demonstrated hatred for a clutch of ideas like diversity, equity and inclusivity while not hiding his dislike for countries he thinks has been putting one over the US

But, in his autocratic style, he has shown a willingness to overturn conventional wisdom on economics and politics to present his and his team's own version of an alternate reality. If the present appears to be a dangerous moment for the world, so be it.

A new order of things may have already been developing in a bipolar world in which China aspires to compete with the US, but what the US President is trying to impose is a Trump world order. This is reflected in his atavistic throwback to imperialism in his bluster for territory like Greenland and Canada and his zeal to take back

control of the Panama Canal while eyeing the waterfront of the Gaza Strip like the real estate mogul from which avatar he metamorphosed into the leader of

In his engagements with the world, Trump has made it clear that the US would no longer fulfil treaties and commitments, including those that can be said to be in American interest, if he does not get the deals he is looking for, regardless of how deferential or dependent the other nation may have been in

its dealings with the US.

At home, Trump is allowing wealthy private interests to influence, even run government policy, tearing asunder many institutions on the grounds of saving the government needless expenditure. America's checks and balances and its set of rights and individual freedoms and promise of equal justice are clearly under threat. While that is a problem for the US, what a previously favoured trading nation like India must do is to find ways to get around this transactional president's tactical moves in reciprocal trade matters.

A month under Trump 2.0 has seemed more like a year of cataclysmic events as he has turned Washington upside down and tries to redo the existing world order while inflicting pain on many old allies and strategic partners. Learning to live with Trump is going to be the biggest challenge, no matter that he is regarded as a maverick or an "America First" leader. And interesting times

Move carefully on Qatar FTA

he decision of India and Qatar to deepen economic ties between them will be mutually beneficial and augurs well for regional security in both West Asia and South Asia. While closer ties with Qatar, the largest supplier of liquified natural gas (LNG) and liquified petroleum gas (LPG), offer energy security to India, unrestricted access to the Indian market will allow Qatar to benefit from the economic rise of the world's fifth largest economy.

Qatar is expected to invest \$10 billion in India, after it remained a low participant in the country's economic success as it had invested a partly sum of \$1.5 billion in the last 24 years. Bilateral trade has also declined to \$14 billion in 2023-24 from \$18.77 billion in 2022-23 and the countries aim to double the trade to \$28 billion.

between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, both countries have agreed on signing an agreement to avoid double taxation. STAYS ON AT NITI AAYOG The appointments committee of Cabinet (ACC) has decided to stick with experience, extending B.V.R. Subrahmanyam's tenure as CEO of Niti Aayog for another year beyond February 2025. A veteran bureaucrat with a track record spanning governance, trade, and strategic policymaking, Mr Subrahmanyam's extension signals continuity at India's top policy think tank. But is continuity always a good thing?

On the one hand, his leadership ensures stability. Having handled complex policy challenges, from Jammu & Kashmir's administration to India's commerce strategy, he brings deep institutional knowledge. His supporters argue that in a rapidly evolving economic landscape, a steady hand at Niti Aayog is essential.

On the other hand, some question whether this move stifles fresh thinking. India's policy ecosystem thrives on innovation, and a shake-up at the top sometimes brings in new energy. Critics argue that a more dynamic approach — perhaps someone from outside the bureaucratic machinery

could push Niti Aayog into new territory. Ultimately, the extension suggests the government is prioritising experience over experimenta-tion. Whether that's a masterstroke or a missed opportunity will unfold over the next year. The real test? Whether Niti Aayog can continue shaping policies that keep pace with India's aspirations — or simply maintain the status quo.

THE AC OFFICE SYNDROME

Telangana CM A. Revanth Reddy stirred the pot recently with his candid remarks about the state of the administration. Addressing a gathering at the IAS Officers' Institute in Begumpet, he lamented that some district collectors today seem reluctant to step out of their air-conditioned offices and engage with the people they serve. It's an unfortunate reality and one that raises serious concerns about the evolving role of civil servants.

Gone are the days, Mr Reddy pointed out, when IAS officers would thoroughly brief political leaders on the pros and cons of policy decisions. Instead, he suggested, many bureaucrats now pri-

oritise pleasing their political bosses, sometimes even encouraging them down misguided paths. That's not governance — it's groupthink with a

dangerous ripple effect. This shift begs the question: Have we institutionalised a culture where career progression trumps public service? Bureaucrats of an earlier era, like retired officer M. Gopalakrishna (in whose honour the book launch was held), were known for their hands-on approach. They spent time in the field, understood ground realities, and served as the bridge between the government and the governed. Today, many officers seem more at home with PowerPoint presentations than public grievances.

Of course, not all babus fit this mould. There are still those who walk the extra mile, defying the "file-pushing" stereotype. But Mr Reddy's remarks are meant to serve as a wake-up call. Governance isn't about paperwork alone, it's about people. And if the system rewards deference over diligence, then we have a bigger problem on our hands than just a few officers preferring their AC cabins over the summer heat.

MISLEADING OPTIMISM

A new study report shed light on the realities of employment generation in India. Niti Aayog defines gig workers as those who labour outside of the traditional employer-employee structure, and their number has surpassed one crore. This figure is expected to reach two crores and 35 lakhs by 2030. Now 97.6 per cent of such workers earn less than five lakh rupees per year. In fact, 77.6 per cent make less than ₹2.5 lakh. There are barely 2.6 per cent earning between ₹5 lakhs and ₹7.5 lakhs annually and they are employed in gig-based software development. At least 21 per cent work over 12 hours every day. None of them are eligible for any form of social security.

Musk is enforcer-in-chief, says Trump

Hails tech billionaire's zeal in implementing executive orders he has issued since returning to office

Washington, Feb. 19: US President Donald Trump painted Elon Musk as his enforcer-in-chief on Tuesday, hailing the tech billionaire's zeal in implementing the blizzard of executive orders the president has issued since returning to office

In a joint interview broadcast on Fox News, the two men spent substantial time singing the other's praises and dismissing concerns that Trump is overstepping his executive powers. Trump has signed scores of executive directives in the past three weeks, many of which have been challenged in the courts as potentially unconstitutional.

Billionaire Musk, who was Trump's top donor during his 2024 presidential campaign, was tasked with leading the newlycreated department of government efficiency (DOGE), with the declared goal of rooting out "waste, fraud and abuse" in feder-

al spending.
"One of the biggest functions of the DOGE team is just making sure that the presidential executive orders are actually carried out," Musk told Fox News.

In the interview, Trump insisted his policies - including a wholesale onslaught on federal institutions — should be implemented without delay and said Musk was instrumental in pushing them forward.

'You write an executive order and you think it's done, you send it out, it doesn't get done. It doesn't get implemented," Trump said. He added that Musk and DOGE team have now become an enforcement mechanism within the federal bureaucracy to enact his administration's agenda without anyone standing in their way. -AFP

300 deportees from US detained in Panama hotel

Panama City, Feb. 19: Panama is detaining in a hotel nearly 300 people ported under US President Donald Trump, not allowing them to leave while waiting for international authorities to organise a return to their countries.

More than 40 per cent of the migrants, authorities say, won't voluntarily return to their homeland. Migrants in the hotel rooms held messages to the windows reading "Help" and "We are not save (sic) in

our country. The migrants hail from 10 Asian countries, including Iran, India, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Afghanistan, China and others. The US has difficulty deporting directly to some of those countries so Panama is being used as a stopover. Costa Rica was expected to receive a similar flight of

a surge in retail sum assured by 41 per cent year-on-year (YoY) from April to December 2025, compared to 30 per cent during same period in FY24. This growth outpaced the retail new business premium growth of 17 per cent (7 per cent in FY2024).

The retail sum assured per policy for private insurers rose to ₹24 lakh in FY2024 from ₹13 lakh in FY2018. However, for LIC, the retail sum assured per policy has remained stable at ₹3 lakh.

The group sum assured also saw significant growth, driven by the expansion of credit life insurance, which has been bolstered by robust credit growth in the retail segment (a compound annual growth rate of 18 per cent from FY2021 to FY2024), particularly in unsecured loans (CAGR of 21 per cent), where credit life penetration remains higher. India's GDP to grow at 6.3% in FY25: SBI

SBI Research in a report has estimated India's GDP growth to come in at 6.3 per cent in 2024-2025 assuming that the National Statistical Office (NSO) does not make major revisions to the erstwhile first and second quarter estimates.

The SBI's estimate is 10 basis points (bps) lower than the NSO's forecast of 6.4 per cent growth for the current fiscal year.

The report said that leveraging 36 high-frequency indicators, the estimated gross domestic product (GDP) growth for the third quarter of the current financial year should be between 6.2 per cent and 6.3 per cent.

"Despite upheavals in global geo-politics, and trade/supply chains being susceptible to winds of re-

globalization, the Indian economy has been leaning against the winds," said Soumya Kanti Ghosh, group chief economic adviser, SBI.





Karachi, Feb. 19: Will Young and Tom Latham struck fine hundreds as New Zealand maintained their recent dominance over hosts Pakistan with an emphatic 60-run win in the Champions Trophy

opener here on Wednesday. Young com-piled an important innings of 107 off 113 balls, while Latham remained unbeaten on 118 off 104 balls to steer the Black Caps to 320 for five after Pakistan put them in to bat.

Glenn Phillips' 39-ball 61 also went a Îong way in the Kiwis getting past the 300-run mark as New Zealand overcame a shaky start.

The Pakistan top-order comprising Babar Azam (64 off 90), Mohammed Rizwan (3 off 14) and Saud Shakeel (6 off 19) were a tad too conserva tive in their approach. That ultimately cost the home team as it ended with 260 all out in 47.2 overs.

Fakhar Zaman (24 off 41) batted at number four after being off the field for a major part of the New Zealand innings due to an injury scare.

It was New Zealand's third win over Pakistan in less than two weeks, the Kiwis having beaten the Rizwan-led side twice in the preceding triseries. The sole positive for

defending champions Pakistan ahead of their clash against India was the performance of the lower-order Khushdil Shah smashing 69 off 49 balls. Salman Agha also showed plenty of intent in his 42 off 28 balls but that urgency was missing in the approach of the top-order.
