GNLF president Ghising warns of political crisis in Darjeeling

Ghising laments the loss of a key opportunity for Gorkh rights, criticizes the GTA system and urges the central government to find a permanent political solution for Darjeeling before the 2026 elections

The President of Gorkha National Liberation Front (GNLF), central committee, Mann Ghising, today stated that the Gorkha community and the Darjeeling Hills are facing a severe political crisis.

In a press statement, Mr Ghising said: “The golden opportunity for the Gorkha community and the Darjeeling Hills to secure their rights and shape their destiny has been lost. The failure to implement the Sixth Schedule in our region remains a significant and grave mistake, resulting in increasingly complex issues that we face today.”

Mr Ghising further elab-



orated: “In this context, I filed a case challenging the legitimacy of the Gorkhaland Territorial Administration (GTA) system in the Calcutta High Court. I had also appealed to all political parties in Darjeeling to boycott the GTA elections, warning that ignoring this appeal would

lead to serious difficulties for our community in the future. Unfortunately, the crucial opportunity to boycott the GTA elections was lost, as various political parties in the Darjeeling Hills chose to participate. This has resulted in the chaotic and unstable situation we see in the hills

today.”

He emphasised that the community’s final hope now lies in securing a long-term and permanent political solution from the central government. “For the past 15 years, we have supported the BJP (Bharatiya Janata Party) in both Lok Sabha and Assembly elections. As our party’s foundation day approaches on 5 April, we urge the Centre to immediately resume dialogue and take decisive steps toward determining a long-term political solution for the Gorkha community and the Darjeeling Hills. We sincerely hope that a comprehensive political solution will be realised before the 2026 Assembly elections. It is our heartfelt appeal that the government listens to us and

takes the initiative to deliver a just and rightful solution,” he added.

Mr Ghising also expressed concern over the state government’s current tea land policy. “The issue of 30 per cent of tea garden land being allocated for other commercial purposes has created fear and uncertainty among the people. Additionally, the condition of the Cinchona plantations is deteriorating. Tea workers are compelled to struggle for their rightful Puja bonuses and face continuous oppression from both the government and management to secure their rights. All these problems have emerged as a consequence of neglecting the implementation of the Sixth Schedule,” he claimed.

Unrest in North Bengal medical college over watching cricket match

The North Bengal Medical College and Hospital (NBMC&H) witnessed chaos today after authorities issued a show cause notice to intern Sunny Manna for allegedly using the college’s Lecture Theatre to watch the Champions Trophy final between India and New Zealand.

The situation escalated into a full-blown confrontation, with students staging protests and demanding answers from the administration.

The controversy began when an “unidentified group” reportedly attacked Sunny Manna, leaving him injured. This incident sparked outrage among students, who claimed that Manna was innocent and had not unlocked the Lecture Theatre himself. A large group of agitated medical students confined the dean of NBMC&H for several hours, demanding an explanation for the show cause notice and questioning the motives behind it.

Tensions flared further as clashes broke out between two groups of students within the college premises this afternoon. The atmosphere turned volatile, with heated altercations adding to the

unrest. Protesting students argued that the notice was unjustified and that Manna was being unfairly targeted.

“Sunny Manna is innocent. He did not unlock the Lecture Theatre, and there is no evidence to support these allegations. This is a conspiracy to harass him,” said one of the protesting students. The students also demanded action against the unidentified attackers, who injured Manna.

As the situation remains tense, authorities are under pressure to resolve the issue swiftly and ensure the safety of all students. The incident has also raised questions about the handling of disciplinary actions and the need for clearer communication between the administration and the student body.

West Bengal Governor visits India-Nepal border

post under the 41st Battalion of the SSB. Upon arrival, he was briefed by inspector general Sudhir Kumar of the Siliguri Frontier about the security situation along the India-Nepal border. The Gov-

ernor visited the Border Interaction Team (BIT) checkpoint and interacted with SSB personnel, praising their dedication and commitment to protecting the nation under challenging conditions.

Police seek space for outpost within JU campus

Calcutta High Court's JusticeTirthankar Ghosh rules students must cooperate with Kolkata Police's Jadavpur University investigation

Amid the continuing crisis and tension in Jadavpur University over the ruckus within the university campus on 1 March, the Kolkata Police, on Wednesday, sent a communique to the university authorities seeking space within the campus to set up a police outpost there.

The university authorities have confirmed the receipt of the communique from the city police and also claimed that any decision following allowing the setting up of a police outpost within the campus has not been reached as yet.

However, admitted JU insiders, implementing the proposal for setting up a police outpost within the campus will not be an easy task since the responsibility of maintaining order within any campus rests with the



educational institution authority concerned.

"That is why the education institution authorities generally avoid the entry of cops within the campus to the best possible extent. In such a situation any decision to set up police outposts within the university is bound to

face resistance not just from the students but also from a section of the teaching staff here," said a faculty member of Jadavpur University, who requested anonymity.

Already the Students' Federation of India (SFI), the CPI-M student wing, has

objected to the proposal from the city police.

Meanwhile, a single-judge Bench of the Calcutta High Court, on Wednesday, lifted the earlier ban on any political rally in the locality in the vicinity of the Jadavpur University (JU) campus till 13 March without prior per-



mission of the court, which the same Bench had earlier imposed last week amid the prevailing and continuing tension in the area then over the ruckus within the university premises on 1 March.

Lifting the ban on Wednesday, the single Bench of Justice Tirthankar Ghosh

observed that the earlier order by his Bench on 8 March had been enforced partially and the court is not keen to retain the responsibility in the matter further.

Justice Ghosh also observed that henceforth the organisations or parties desiring to

conduct the rallies in the area will have to approach the administrative authorities concerned for the permission and the latter would decide on the matter.

In a related development, the Calcutta High Court, on Wednesday, directed a student of Jadavpur University to coop-

erate in the ongoing investigation by Kolkata Police in the case of ruckus within the university campus on 1 March.

On 10 March, a student of Jadavpur University approached the Calcutta High Court accusing the Kolkata Police of excesses against the students of the university, including him, in the name of investigation.

The matter came up for hearing at the single Bench of Justice Tirthankar Ghosh on Wednesday. At the end of the hearing, Justice Ghosh said the court would not interfere in the matter, and the student concerned would have to cooperate with the investigating officials.

Justice Ghosh also said that if the court gives relief to the petitioner in the matter from investigation just because the latter is a student, it would set a bad precedent. The next hearing is on 4 April. Justice Ghosh directed all parties in the case to file their respective affidavits by that date.

Police recover bag with body stuffed inside, 2 nabbed

Kolkata police uncovered a murder plot in which a businessman was killed, his body stuffed into a trolley bag, and an attempt made to dispose of it on Kalyani Expressway, near Khardah in North 24 Parganas.

The victim, identified as Bhagarama Debasi, a textile trader from Rajasthan who lived in the Girish Park area, was allegedly murdered over an unpaid loan of Rs 8 lakh. The police recovered the trolley bag late on Tuesday night from the trunk of an app cab on Kalyani Expressway. Inside, they found a body wrapped in a sack and sealed with cellophane tape. The victim's mouth was taped, and there were injury marks on his neck, indicating strangulation.

The investigation led to the arrest of Karan Singh, one of the two accused, while the second suspect, Krishpal Singh, initially escaped but was later caught near Muktaram Babu Street, close to Thanthania Kalibari in north Kolkata. According to police sources, Bhagarama Debasi had borrowed Rs 8 lakh from the accused but was delaying repayment. On Tuesday,



Krishpal and Karan met him at Girish Park, where they allegedly laced his coffee with poison. Once he lost consciousness, they strangled him and slit his throat to ensure he was dead.

They then stuffed his body into a blue trolley bag and first took it to Dum Dum's Nagerbazar area. Around 9 p.m., they hired an app cab to transport the bag towards Nadia, intending to dump it in a deserted spot near Kalyani Expressway. The accused's plan was foiled due to the cab driver's suspicions. Rahul Adhikari, the driver, became curious when the passengers asked him to stop suddenly in the middle of the road. When he questioned them, they became nervous and tried to bribe him to stay silent. Meanwhile, a patrolling police van arrived at the scene. Sensing trouble,

Krishpal fled, but Karan was apprehended on the spot. Upon searching the trolley, police found the body, Rs 65,000 in cash, and a blood-stained weapon. After interrogating Karan and tracking mobile tower locations, police traced and arrested Krishpal.

Investigators believe the murder was premeditated, with the accused having already planned where to dispose of the body. The two suspects are currently being interrogated for more details. The case has drawn attention due to its similarity to a recent incident in Kumartuli, where a woman's body was found stuffed inside a trolley bag. The app cab driver, aware of that case, had questioned the passengers about their suspicious luggage, ultimately leading to the discovery of the crime.

Farm, construction workers prone to kidney diseases: Doctors

Bengal is yet to wake up to the dangers of chronic kidney disease (CKD), which has deteriorated further due to desperate compromises in lifestyle and some hazardous work environments, claimed nephrologists ahead of World Kidney Day.

"Rising temperatures in recent years and people's long-term exposure to sunlight have also contributed to the increasing cases of persistent dehydration leading to CKD," said Dr Sheikh Mohammed Yunus, chief medical officer, West Burdwan, today. He added: "Environmental pollution is another key factor, especially for labourers working close to chimneys, who are more susceptible to kidney ailments." CKD prevalence has increased from 11.2 per cent (2011-2017) to 16.38 per cent (2018-2023) in adults in the country, according to a systematic review by the National Library of Medicine revealed in 2021.

TMC MLA hits back at Suwendu for communal comment

A fierce political face-off erupted after the Leader of Opposition, Suwendu Adhikari, issued a direct warning to Trinamul Congress' (TMC) Muslim MLAs. Speaking outside the Assembly on Tuesday, Adhikari had declared that once the BJP comes to power, these legislators would be "thrown onto the streets." His remarks sparked outrage, with TMC leaders strongly condemning the statement.

On Wednesday, TMC MLA Humayun Kabir hit back, stating: "We will also not serve him sweets." Responding to Adhikari's threat, Kabir asserted, "If he comes to attack us, should we offer him rosogollas? If he insults Muslim MLAs and threatens to throw them on the streets, we will respond accordingly. If he talks about throwing us, I will strike back." Kabir further warned Adhikari to withdraw his remarks within 72 hours and apologise to Muslim MLAs, or else he would face consequences.

"He will have to deal with 42 minority MLAs. If he does



not apologise within the given time, we will handle him in the Assembly itself. Moreover, he will not be allowed to enter Murshidabad. If he tries to, he will see our strength," Kabir asserted. Recalling a past political episode, Kabir reminded the Media that back in 2016, despite being TMC's district observer, Adhikari was not allowed to enter Murshidabad. "He had to flee like a thief. From Krishnanagar Circuit House, he called Didi (Mamata Banerjee) and urged her not to give me a ticket. Eventually, I wasn't given one, but the election results later proved everything," Kabir remarked. Meanwhile, BJP MLAs

staged a massive protest inside the Assembly over Adhikari's suspension. They tore papers and sat in protest outside the building, further intensifying the political tension in the state. With the war of words escalating between the ruling and opposition parties, the political atmosphere in Bengal remains highly charged up as both sides brace for a fierce electoral battle ahead.

Pradesh Congress committee senior leader Soumya Aich Roy said it is the game plan of BJP and TMC to divide the vote bank of Bengal. "People must avoid these parties, who are trying to divide the state in the name of religion," he said.

Dr Ballal reacted: "OMG! This is alarming. They work sincerely throughout our life. We can't let this happen. In my 50 years of career I haven't heard anything like this." He added: "They are our loyal soldiers and keep us getting rid of waste products and toxins from our body."

After going through the charter of demands placed by the kidneys and a video clip forwarded by the kidney leaders, Dr Ballal said: "The

demand list they served entirely talks about our healthy life and better protection of our kidneys, which we need to accept for our benefit only."

The demand list includes: Improve lifestyle; Reduce processed food; Avoid unnecessary popping of painkillers; Give up on tobacco; Drink enough water; Control blood sugar & blood pressure; Get an annual kidney check-up.

Dr Ballal also emphasised: "Kidney disease is largely preventable with simple lifestyle changes. Awareness is the first step towards better kidney health and people need to stay hydrated, eat right, pursue regular exercise, and get regular check-ups before it's too late."

IMA teaches students ways to make organic colours

The IMA, Serampore, urged using organic colours for Holi instead of toxic chemical ones, warning of health risks. Students were taught to make safe colours from flowers and vegetables to promote safety and environmental awareness.

The Indian Medical Association (IMA), Serampore unit in an awareness programme on safety measures during Holi, has completely prohibited the use of chemical toxic colours and encouraged the use of organic colours.

The Paschim Banga Vigan Manch district unit has come forward to teach school students the method of preparation of organic colours from flowers and vegetables.

The Serampore IMA branch president, Dr Pradeep Das, while speaking in a public awareness programme, warned against the use of chemical colours available in the market. He said most of the colours available in the open market are prepared with highly toxic chemicals such as Copper Sulphate, Lead, and Mercurous iodide, which are very harmful for the skin and eyes, causing skin allergies, loss of sight,

and in some cases, blindness. The toxic colours can even have harmful effects on the liver, stomach, brain, and kidneys. Hence, the use of organic colours, prepared from flowers and vegetables are much safer.

At the awareness programme school and college students are being taught preparing organic colours from marigold, palash flowers, beetroot, and spinach leaves. Spokesperson of the vigan manch Chandan Debnath said some of the common vegetables and flowers used to prepare dry Holi colours are quite safe and have no side effects.

Some of the social welfare organisations have decided to use white abir (dry Holi colour) to send out the message of safety and peace.

City, districts to have heat wave from Sunday: Met

South Bengal to face heat wave from 16 March, with temperatures expected to hit 40°C in four districts

Come Sunday and the state is to get its first spell of heat wave of the year. Four districts of south Bengal are set to sizzle for a few days with the weather office sounding a heat wave alert for them.

Kolkata is also headed for hot and humid weather conditions this weekend brought by soaring day temperature and increased humidity.

According to the Regional Meteorological Centre, Kolkata, districts of West Burdwan, Birbhum, Bankura and West Midnapore are to witness 'heat wave conditions' from 16 March. The weather scientists have tipped around five degrees rise in the day temperatures with the mercury hitting 40 degrees Celsius mark in those districts. Even the other districts of south Bengal are to see hotter day temperatures when the mercury would remain three to four degrees Celsius above normal. Like the tempera-



tures, the relative humidity is also anticipated to be high from that day. According to the forecast by the weather office in the city, the maximum relative humidity over coastal districts is likely to be 80-90 per cent and about 70-80 per cent over interior districts. The minimum relative humidity is likely to be 30-40 per cent during the heat wave period.

The heat wave, as explained by the scientists at the weather department, is brought mainly dry westerly to north westerly winds that

are likely to prevail over the region and consequently heat wave condition over the four districts of south Bengal from 16 March. The scientists have suggested to avoid prolonged heat exposure and outside work from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. during the heatwave. They have also recommended to drink sufficient water, even if not thirsty, to avoid dehydration and recognise the signs of heat rash or heat cramps such as weakness, dizziness, headache, nausea, sweating and seizures.

Forest department bans Holi celebrations in Sonajhuri

The forest department has banned playing of Holi within Sonajhuri Haat area in Santiniketan, this year. The Visva-Bharati University (VBU) has already announced that this year it will not organise Vasanta Utsav officially.

Though tourists will be allowed to enter and move around in the Sonajhuri Haat and Khowai areas, Dol Utsav will not be allowed. The forest department said that a large number of vehicles are also parked during the Holi festival, but this year, both playing of Holi and parking of vehicles have been banned in the core

area. The Bolpur forest department said that due to tourists and locals playing colours many trees and plants are damaged as both dry and water colours are littered around. To save the environment in Sonajhuri Haat no Holi festival will be allowed. Sonajhuri Haat is the most popular site in Santiniketan and hundreds of people visit throughout the year to purchase local handicrafts. Since 2020, the Visva-Bharati University has not organised Vasant. Instead, it organises the Dol Jatra festival internally. Due to the global outbreak of Covid-19 Vasanta Utsav was organised in 2021 and 2022.

Karnataka Congress will consult its high command in Delhi before deciding on participating in the Lok Sabha delimitation meeting convened by Tamil Nadu Chief Minister and DMK supremo MK Stalin. A DMK delegation comprising Tamil Nadu Forest Minister Ponnunmudi and Rajya Sabha member MM Abdullah called on Chief Minister S Siddaramaiah and Deputy Chief Minister DK Shiv-



akumar at Vidhan Soudha on Tuesday, briefing them about the meeting and inviting them to attend it. The delimitation meeting convened by Stalin will discuss and formulate strategies to oppose

fight the central government's initiative, which is feared to reduce the political strength of South India, where all states have excelled in population control and could lose seats in Parliament, or see proportional decrease in the number of seats as compared to North Indian states like Bihar, UP, Madhya Pradesh, and Rajasthan, which have witnessed increase in population.

Speaking to media persons after the TN delegation called on them with the invite, Shivakumar said, "Tamil Nadu CM Stalin has taken the lead in mobilising a protest against the Centre's Lok Sabha constituency delimitation exercise, which will reduce the number of seats for Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh, and Telangana. Stalin's representatives met me and CM Siddaramaiah and extended the invitation."

He said: "The ruling party of Tamil Nadu is our alliance partner, and we

are in agreement with their stance on the delimitation exercise. As we are a national party, we need to discuss this with our party high command. We will decide on the next steps after seeking their advice and have informed our counterparts from Tamil Nadu about the same. The delegation from Tamil Nadu also discussed various aspects with us, including language. It is time we work together to uphold our self-respect," the Deputy Chief Minister said.

Stalin has taken on the central government over the three-language formula, which the state has opposed for the past many decades. He is rallying opposition-ruled states against delimitation and is now engaged in an intense battle with the Centre over the language issue, as the latter pushes the state to accept the National Education Policy.

down when it comes crashing down."

BJP shares photo of Ranya Rao with K'taka CM, raises questions

BENGALURU, 12 MARCH

The BJP's Karnataka unit on Wednesday shared a picture claiming it to be of actor Ranya Rao's wedding day photo in which Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and state Home Minister G. Parameshwara can be seen.

The photo was shared by the BJP Karnataka on its X handle.

Ranya Rao was arrested by the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) on March 3 after she arrived from Dubai with gold bars worth Rs 14.56 crore.

In its caption, the BJP questioned the Congress party, demanding that it reveal the names of two Ministers who are allegedly connected to Ranya Rao.

Leader of Opposition R. Ashoka, commenting on the development, stated, "I don't have details about this right now. Every day, the media discusses the alleged nexus between Ministers and the accused. This scam is not recent; it has been happening for the past five years. It is not just about the 14 kilograms of gold seized from the actress -- after the investigation, it could turn out to be 140 kilograms."

However, Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar maintained that there was no scam. "But the people of Karnataka believe it is a major scam," Ashoka said.

"On the other hand, Shivakumar is giving a clean chit. This case should be investigated by the CBI and central agencies -- they will reveal the real culprit and determine the extent of hawala transactions. Shivakumar does not represent any investigating agency," Ashoka added.

"As Deputy Chief Minister, giving a clean chit in an ongoing investigation is a mistake," Ashoka pointed out.

When asked about the controversy, Congress MLA Rizwan Arshad said, "There will be photos of Ranya Rao and many others at various social functions with BJP leaders as well. If the seriousness of a case is decided based on a single photograph from a social gathering, then this case is politically motivated."

"Secondly, I want to ask the BJP that within 40 days of alleged gold smuggler Ranya Rao applying for 12 acres of land with the Karnataka Industrial Areas Development Board (KIADB), her application was approved, and she was allotted the land by the BJP government at the very end of their tenure," Arshad said.

"I want to ask BJP leaders -- was there a special service for smugglers under your government? A common businessman would never have been allotted land worth crores within 50 days during the BJP's tenure. Now, they are preaching us and pointing fingers at us?" Arshad added.

"The CBI should investigate all BJP leaders involved in allotting 12 acres of land within 40 days to her. The BJP should clarify whether she is an industrialist or a smuggler," he demanded.

Minister for Medical Education Sharan Prakash Patil stated, "Everyone knows how the Central government functions. They are using the CBI, ED, and IT departments as extensions of their party. No Congress Minister is involved in this. Maybe, BJP leaders are, but I am not aware."

BJP MLC C.T. Ravi said that big names were being discussed in connection with the Ranya Rao case.

"The role of two Ministers is also under scrutiny. Who are these Ministers? What was their involvement, and what did they receive in return? This should be investigated," he said.

J-K leaders question Centre's ban on Mirwaiz's Awami Action Committee

Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Wednesday expressed his reservations on the ban imposed by the Centre on the Awami Action Committee (AAC) of Hurriyat leader Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, even as the other Valley-based political leaders described it a step towards intimidation and disempowerment of Kashmiris.

He said the Centre has not shared any intelligence with his government that could have warranted the ban on Mirwaiz Umar Farooq's Awami Action Committee (AAC), and asserted he was not in favour of such decisions.

The Centre had on Tuesday banned the AAC, headed by Kashmir's chief cleric Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, and Shia leader Masroor Abbas Ansari-led Itihaadul Muslimen (IM) for five years for their alleged

anti-national activities, supporting terrorism and fuelling secessionist activities.

"I do not know the basis of the ban. This is not under the purview of the elected government in J&K and the intelligence on the basis of which it has taken place has not been shared with us," Omar told reporters at Gilmarg after the culmination of the fifth edition of the Khelo India Winter Games.

However, Omar said: "On principle, we have never been in favour of such decisions".

"Since the Mirwaiz was released from house arrest, I have not seen any objectionable statements from him, but we do not have any information about the reasons behind the ban. (But), we will see what to do about it in the future," he added.

In a post on X, Mirwaiz Umar Farooq wrote: "Strongly condemn the ban on Awami Action Committee and declaring it an 'Unlawful Association'".

Iran Gamble

The latest outreach to Iran marks yet another dramatic shift in the US approach toward the Islamic Republic. While it is not unprecedented for an American President to seek direct communication with Iran’s leadership, the context of this attempt makes it particularly intriguing. The move comes from a leader who previously dismantled the nuclear agreement, re-imposed crippling sanctions, and applied a “maximum pressure” campaign that left Tehran increasingly isolated. Yet now, there is talk of negotiation, diplomacy, and even the possibility of a peace deal. There are two possible readings of this overture. The first is that it reflects a calculated attempt to push Iran into a position where it has no choice but to negotiate. The logic here is that the combination of economic hardship, regional setbacks, and diplomatic isolation could make Iran more willing to engage in talks. Some American policymakers may believe that Iran’s allies in the region, weakened by external pressures, are unable to provide the same level of strategic depth as before. If this is indeed the calculation, then the letter to Iran’s leadership is not an act of diplomacy in good faith but an effort to capitalise on perceived vulnerabilities. The second reading is that this is a political manoeuvre aimed at demonstrating a willingness to seek peace while keeping the military option on the table. By framing the situation as a choice between diplomacy and military action, the message is clear: Iran can either agree to talks or face the possibility of conflict. However, such an approach risks escalating tensions rather than resolving them. If Iran perceives the outreach as a trap rather than a genuine offer, it may respond with defiance, accelerating its nuclear programme rather than slowing it down. The Iranian leadership’s initial dismissal of the letter suggests that Tehran views this as another instance of strategic posturing. Iran has historically been wary of overtures from Washington, particularly when they come with ultimatums. The ultimate decision-maker in Iran, the Supreme Leader, has often signaled reluctance to engage in talks under pressure. Any negotiation that appears to be conducted from a position of weakness could be politically damaging within Iran itself.

Meanwhile, the involvement of external actors like Russia adds another layer of complexity. By offering to mediate, Russia positions itself as a key player in the diplomatic process, potentially using the crisis as leverage in its broader geopolitical manoeuvring. The response from other regional players, particularly those with deep-seated concerns about Iran’s nuclear ambitions, will also shape the outcome. In the end, whether this outreach results in meaningful diplomacy or further escalation depends on how both sides interpret each other’s intentions. If the goal is genuine dialogue, it must be accompanied by trust-building measures. Otherwise, this effort may simply be another chapter in the long history of failed US-Iran engagement ~ one that only deepens mistrust and pushes the region closer to instability.

Early summer

The early onset of summer across India this year is more than just a shift in seasons ~ it is a signal of a deeper, systemic problem that threatens livelihoods, economic stability, and the foundations of India’s agrarian society. While rising temperatures have become an almost routine headline, the consequences are now unfolding in ways that should alarm both policymakers and ordinary citizens. One of the most immediate casualties of India’s changing climate is its small and medium enterprises, which form the backbone of the economy. In cities like Ludhiana, traditionally known for its robust winter garment industry, decades-old business models are collapsing. Winter clothing manufacturers, who had fine-tuned their production cycles to meet seasonal demand, are witnessing a shrinking market. As winters grow shorter and milder, retailers are shying away from confirmed orders, shifting to “sale or return” models that place the entire risk on producers. Some businesses have already been forced to shut down, unable to navigate these abrupt changes. Agriculture, the livelihood of nearly half of India’s population, is even more vulnerable. Heatwaves have slashed yields of staple crops like wheat, chickpeas, and rapeseed, and prized horticultural produce such as the Alphonso mango has suffered devastating losses. Reports of farmers reducing their workforce because there is no work to offer are becoming increasingly common. The ripple effects are clear: lower yields lead to higher food prices, worsening inflation, and potentially trigger further restrictions on exports in an effort to protect domestic supply.

The situation is exacerbated by declining water availability. Reservoir levels in parts of northern India have dropped alarmingly, threatening irrigation for the next crop cycles. Reduced water availability will not only hurt crop production but also impact the dairy sector, where reports of declining milk output are already surfacing. These climate-induced economic shocks have the potential to derail India’s growth trajectory. Rural consumption, which had shown signs of recovery after a prolonged slowdown, is at risk once more. Urban consumption remains tepid, and private investment has yet to regain momentum. If agricultural incomes decline and food prices spike, the Reserve Bank of India’s delicate balancing act of supporting growth while keeping inflation under control could become even harder. India stands at a crossroads. The climate crisis is no longer a distant threat ~ it is a reality staring the country in the face. Urgent adaptation measures are needed. These include better weather forecasting systems, accessible agricultural insurance, and the adoption of climate-resilient cropping patterns. Without such interventions, India risks enduring cycles of economic distress, widening inequality, and social unrest. The early arrival of summer is a warning. Ignoring it could cost India not only in terms of lost economic output but also in lost lives and livelihoods. It is time to act decisively, before seasonal changes become irreversible damage.

India and China

China and India should build on their historical fraternity and shared challenges. Joint initiatives — gender equity programmes to combat son preference, health collaborations to address health issues overlooked by the West and I.T. partnerships to employ youth — could yield mutual benefits. The elephant and dragon, once partners in peace along the Silk Road under legends like Kanishka, must dance again



“Making the dragon and elephant dance is the only right choice,” says China’s Foreign Minister Wang Yi as he extends a friendly hand to India to bolster the democratisation of global relations while strengthening the Global South. Wang’s words echo former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee’s famous quote, “Friends can be changed, but not neighbours”.

India and China share a border of over 3,000 kilometres, a cultural and spiritual history of over 2,000 years, and urgent common challenges ~ making their partnership not just strategic but essential.

One of the most profound links is Buddhism, which originated in India in the 5th century BC and spread to China by 67 BC. Indian scholars such as Kumarajiva and Bodhidharma played significant roles in shaping Chinese Buddhist traditions, while Chinese travellers like Xuanzang and Faxian visited India, documenting their experiences and facilitating deeper understanding between the two nations.

The Southern Silk Road, which connected Pataliputra (modern Patna) to Xi’an by the 2nd century BC, facilitated flows of goods, ideas and diplomacy, thus creating prosperity.

Kanishka, the Kushan emperor (127–150 AD), significantly influenced China through Silk Road exchanges. A key patron of Buddhism, his Fourth Buddhist Council promoted Mahayana teachings, which spread to China via missionaries and translated texts. Trade networks under his rule connected China to Central Asia.

Following their respective independence in the mid-20th century ~ India in 1947 and China in 1949 ~ both countries embarked on paths of nation-

building and economic reforms. Today, China and India face similar concerns, amplified by their status as the world’s most populous nations ~ India at 1.44 billion and China at 1.41 billion (2023 estimates).

These challenges demand collaboration over competition. Managing such vast demographics strains resources, infrastructure and governance. Creating Employment is a big challenge that needs innovative policies. Joint ventures in manufacturing, technology and green energy could generate jobs.

Both nations struggle with gender imbalances rooted in deep-seated cultural preferences for sons. India’s sex ratio at birth is 933 girls per 1,000 boys (2024), while China’s is 923 females per 1,000 boys (2023). In India, dowry pressures and inheritance norms drive families to favour sons, often leading to sex-selective abortions ~ despite the law banning such practices.

China’s former one-child policy (1979–2015) inadvertently intensified son preference, as families prioritised male heirs. This resulted in millions of “missing” girls in both countries, despite campaigns like India’s Beti Bachao Beti Padhao and China’s Care for Girls. Both nations need to work together on this challenge to achieve gender equality.

India’s urban population is 35 per cent (rising to 50 per cent by 2050), while China’s is 64 per cent (World Bank, 2023), straining housing, sanitation, and transport. Joint urban planning initiatives, such as smart city tech exchanges, could ease the-

se growing pains. Both countries face severe air pollution (e.g., Delhi’s AQI often exceeds 300; Beijing’s PM2.5 levels hit 137 in 2023) and water scarcity. Collaborative renewable energy projects could provide a solution.

China has experienced significant viral disease outbreaks like SARS and the recent pandemic, with its dense cities amplifying transmission risks. On the other hand, India battles a rising tide of non-communicable diseases (NCDs), specifically cardiovascular diseases and diabetes, which account for over 30 per cent of all deaths.

Genetic factors may also play a role in these health challenges ~ viral susceptibility in China and NCD prevalence in India ~ potentially linked to both nations’ practices of marrying within caste or clan groups. A combined effort in genetic and medical research could offer innovative solutions.

A proposed Sino-Indian Genomic Initiative could merge China’s biobanks (China Kadoorie Biobank) with India’s Genome Project to map disease pathways. The combined dataset would dwarf others like UK Biobank in scale and diversity, addressing health disparities ignored by Western-centric research.

Imagine identifying a gene variant in Indian populations that increases diabetes risk. By cross-referencing China’s data, researchers might find that the same variant behaves differently in East Asians due to lifestyle or environmental factors. This could lead to tailored prevention strategies for both nations.

Rational view of China would benefit Canada

THE governing Liberal Party elected former central banker Mark Carney its leader on Sunday. Carney will thus succeed Justin Trudeau as prime minister after he is sworn in in the coming days, at a critical juncture as Canada addresses the challenge of US President Donald Trump’s trade war. Despite having little political experience ~ he has never been elected as a member of parliament ~ Carney’s long track record as governor of the Bank of Canada during the global financial crisis and governor of the Bank of England during the Brexit negotiations is believed to be the main reason for his election victory.

But the test awaiting the future Canadian leader this time is very different from that of the difficult times he once led the central banks through, as it does not originate from the imbalance of financial or economic laws, but the rise of unilateralism, protectionism and hegemony based on a surge of populism in the US. So to pass the test entails the former central banker demonstrating not only financial acumen but more importantly political wisdom, vision and courage.

Unlike his predecessor, who has appeared “weak” in front of the US’ assertiveness, Carney, as predicted, talked tough on the US when addressing a crowd of Liberal supporters after the result of the leadership contest was announced on Sunday evening. “We didn’t ask for this fight, but Canadians are always ready when someone else

drops the gloves,” he said. But although he promised to face down Trump’s threats to impose tariffs and annex Canada, saying, “America is not Canada, and Canada never, ever will be part of America in any way”, how Carney will translate his strong language on the stage in Ottawa into practical solutions to those twin challenges is far less clear.

That Trudeau’s 50-minute telephone call with Trump on Wednesday was reported as being “profanity-laden” clearly indicates that the US leader is determined to press ahead with the pressure he is putting on Canada. Further evidence of that is the new tariffs Trump threatened to impose on Friday on Canadian lumber and dairy products, one day after offering Canada a one-month reprieve on punishing, virtually across-the-board 25 percent tariffs. As well as Trump’s trade pressure, Carney has a host of domestic political, economic and social problems to tackle. The fast rising living costs and ballooning national debt over the past nine years under the Liberal Party have undermined public confidence in his party’s leadership and he will have to deal with the challenge from the opposition parties led by the Conservative Party under the stewardship of the populist leader Pierre Poilievre in parliament. The opposition parties will be alert to how Carney will deal with the US trade blows, further squeezing the space for his maneuvers as the US leader heightens his threats. As such, the future Canadian leader has no reason not to overhaul the Trudeau government’s China policy to mend the ties with the world’s second-largest economy and Canada’s major trading partner. The retaliatory tariffs Beijing vowed on the weekend to impose on some Canadian imports later this month to counter the punitive duties Trudeau slapped on some Chinese imports in October under pressure from the US should be taken as a reminder to Carney of a move he can take that has the potential to save the whole situation on his gameboard.



Musk comes visiting

I am very proud of my daughter Leena (her name, school and workplace information have been changed to protect her privacy). She is very smart and has all three proverbial graces of Greek Mythology. She attended an Ivy League school for undergraduate education, went to Harvard medical school, married an Indian classmate and got a job at the National Institute of Health (NIH) in Washington DC; a federal job implied life-long job security. She has two wonderful children and lives in a nice house in the upscale town of Silver Springs, Maryland. I often joke that she could not help it because she got her DNA from me.

However, I knew that my joke lacked complete validity. Unlike me, Leena has a very compassionate side from her teenage years. Instead of going into traditional STEM subjects, she wanted to do something good for mankind. It was this mindset that propelled her towards a medical profession. I wanted her to study physics like me. Frankly, I wondered if the long path of becoming a doctor and the stress associated with hard work at all hours of night and day were really worth it. She was determined.

Even as a student, she participated in activities like organizing AIDS walks and attending “alternate spring breaks” which involved working with handicapped communities in some way instead of frolicking on Florida beaches and drinking alcohol.

Happily, my concerns turned out to be unfounded. The fact that her husband is also a doctor certainly helped in easing out stress and maintaining a peaceful domestic life. Her job at NIH is both prestigious and secure.

My relationship with Leena took a turn for the worse in 2016 with the election of Donald Trump. I have no hesitation or embarrassment in declaring that I am a staunch support-

er of Trump. Leena passionately hated Trump and was devastated by Hillary Clinton’s loss in the election. We had a number of vigorous and often loud debates on the merits of the two leaders. The debates never seemed to have an end as both of us stood firm.

While Leena believed that we should always help the less fortunate, be it the illegal immigrants or poor people of colour, I believe that God has given each one of us the ability to take care of ourselves and the only challenge is to get the right opportunities. I am not an advocate of relying on charity and government handouts. It is like teaching someone how to fish versus feeding him fish every day. I believed that Trump could offer just that; Hillary seemed to favour “pay for play” schemes. Eventually, Leena and I came to a truce: we agreed not to discuss politics in our conversations.

The Corona pandemic gave Leena some spotlight within NIH and she felt happy in her job. To make it even better, the government allowed the NIH employees to work from home. This gave Leena more time to spend with her kids. This included taking the kids to school every morning and picking them after school. One advantage of “working from home” is that the employee can almost be anywhere as long as he/she is close to a cell phone. Leena could carry out an important business meeting while driving her kids to school. Surprisingly, the Biden government allowed most Federal employees to continue working from home long after the pandemic was over.

That plan of apolitical family interactions worked out well. Things improved considerably when Trump lost the election in 2020 and faced numerous lawsuits, not to mention the 6 January 2021 riot at the Capitol building, and I did not offer any defense. I even resisted the temptation of mocking Joe Biden for his various failed policies, especially allowing mil-

lions of illegal immigrants into the country across the southern border.

No one, except for MAGA enthusiasts like me, expected Trump to come back from all the adversities, not to mention assassination attempts, and win the 2024 election. In addition, his popularity dragged the house and the senate to the Republican side of the aisle.

What made me especially happy was the observation that Trump seemed more mature and focused during the present term and the entire GOP was in sync with him as evidenced by votes to confirm Trump’s nominees: in almost all cases, the Republican senators were united behind Trump. Moreover, each cabinet member hit the ground running with policies consistent with Trump’s vision.

One new aspect of Trump’s cabinet was his creation of the “Department of Government Efficiency” (DOGE). Surprisingly, Trump put the tech billionaire, Elon Musk, touted as the richest man on earth in charge of DOGE, even though he never held any elected position. Musk did not waste any time and embarked on a wide-scale assault on every government activity with the goal of reducing waste, abuse and corruption. He also announced an end to working from home policy and ordered everyone to go back to their offices for in-person engagement.

This hit Leena on multiple fronts. The immediate issue was how to take and pick up the kids from school. Then there is the bigger concern about what the Trump/Musk team might do with NIH. Considering Leena’s credentials and achievements, I am not worried about her getting fired, but a relocation, which would severely disrupt her domestic life, is certainly a possibility.

Leena’s “Trump Derangement Syndrome” reached a new high. It seems that she not only hates Trump, but even developed an intense dislike for my opinions because I voted for Trump. In her view, people like me



could have stopped him from becoming president again.

I will not be unhappy no matter what happens. Coming from the private sector, I have always been envious of government employees enjoying lifelong job security. I heard stories of employees coming to work every day but doing nothing except playing solitaire or watching porn on their computer screen; knowing fully well that they could not be fired. In my professional life, a feeling of insecurity was part of the job.

If Leena is no longer working at NIH for one reason or another, that might be a blessing in disguise. I always felt that she has been wasting her talents and experience base in a government job and can do significantly

better in terms of both job satisfaction and financial compensation. I have told her as much: “what is the point of working in a Trump-hating echo-chamber where you guys just gather every day and badmouth Trump and his policies? The negativity spills over in your other activities”. She responded by saying that many qualified employees from NIH have already resigned and probably filled all the vacancies for good jobs.

I now know first-hand some of the anxieties and frustrations that Musk’s DOGE activities are creating. However, I believe these are only temporary sacrifices.

Trade could boost S Asian economies

Chaudhry Bashir Arain, a trader from Khairpur in Pakistan, exports over 99 per cent of his dried dates to India via Dubai. Delivery takes up to 40 days. The long-winded route for Pakistani chhhuars to India via Dubai started in February 2019 after the Pulwama attack, following which India suspended trade with Pakistan, revoking its Most Favoured Nation (MFN) status and imposing a 200 per cent duty.

That year, two events halted the small trade that had been ongoing. India stopped trade across the Line of Control (LoC) — active since 2008 — citing concerns over the alleged smuggling of drugs, arms and fake currency by groups from Pakistan, while Pakistan suspended it in response to India’s revocation of Article 370 and Kashmir’s special status.

Arain, president of the Khajoor-Anaj Market, said goods sent via Wagah-Attari reached India in eight days, while the long sea journey damaged the produce. His frustration highlights the volatile relationship between the two neighbouring South Asian nations.

Yet Nikita Singla, an expert in international trade, logistics, and inclusion, emphasises that it is commercial ties that are the key pathway to reconciliation. And there is a trade history too. According to her, in 1948-49, approximately 56 per cent of Pakistan’s exports were directed to India, while 32 per cent of its imports originated from there.

In 2019, after trade was suspended, Singla conducted a field survey in Amritsar and in towns along the LoC

on the Indian side. “Nearly 50,000 people in Amritsar — including traders, custom house agents, gas station attendants, mechanics, dhaba owners, truck drivers and porters — were adversely affected by the suspension of trade via the Wagah-Attari crossing. Similarly, in the districts of Uri and Poonch along the LoC, nearly 25,000 people depended on this trade for their livelihoods,” she said, adding that cross-LoC trade was particularly unique as it was more of a “confidence-building measure” with trade based on a barter system.

“Between 2008 and 2019, this was valued at \$1.2 billion, generating more than 170,000 job days, and an exchange of more than 110,000 trucks with a freight revenue of about \$9 million for transporters in Jammu and Kashmir,” said Singla. “It would be interesting to find out how Pakistan fares,” she added.

In a paper published last month for the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, Singla argues in favour of a more “interconnected, secure, and efficient trading environment” between the two countries. “It could actually drive the region’s overall prosperity,” she said.

For years, Cecile Fruman, director of Regional Integration, South Asia, at the World Bank, has been stressing on the need for regional trade. She notes that while the potential of intraregional trade between South Asian countries is valued at over \$67bn, the current value of trade remains a dismal \$23bn. Trade costs within South Asia are 20 per cent higher than in Asean. “For example, it is 15 to 20 per cent cheaper for a company in India to trade with Brazil



than with one in a South Asian country,” she points out.

Citing a 2021 World Bank report, Fruman says that full transport integration between Bangladesh and India could boost national income by 17 per cent in Bangladesh and 8 per cent in India. While trade between Bangladesh, Bhutan, India and Nepal grew six-fold from 2005 to 2019, significant untapped potential remains, with growth estimates of 93 per cent for Bangladesh, 50 per cent for India, and 76 per cent for Nepal, she said.

But for trade to flourish between India and Pakistan, it is imperative to “rebuild trust between the two and shield bilateral trade from political fluctuations”, says Singla.

One possibility, she suggests, whereby trade could restart is if both countries recommit to the South Asian Free Trade Area, a 2004 agreement that created a free-trade area for the region. Dr Huma Baqai, rector of the Millennium Institute of Technology and Entrepreneurship, Karachi, finds Safta, and even MFN to have had an insignificant effect on Pakistan’s bilateral trade with India. Like Singla, she points to the elephant in the room — “political will” — and

says both countries need well-defined and enforceable institutional frameworks as currently implementation and enforcement are zero. “And it’s not just India, Pakistan is also a high tariff country.”

Singla suggests that if trade resumes, this time round it should be made more collaborative and transparent, and supported by a joint trade portal for technical exchange and product-specific collaborations between business groups and chambers.

“For example, surgical instrument manufacturers in Sialkot could connect with their counterparts in Jalandhar, share technical expertise, explore new markets, and strengthen industry-level people-to-people ties,” she suggests. At the LoC, she said, a stricter and more advanced regulatory regime could be put in place, including truck scanners, X-ray machines, CCTVs and digitisation of records.

Across South Asia, there are examples of collaborations, even when relations are not always cordial. The recent successful trilateral power transaction of 40 MW in 2024, from Nepal to Bangladesh from June 15 to November 15, through the Indian grid, was a success in energy trade. In fact,

interim Bangladeshi leader Mohamad Yunus has even suggested the creation of a South Asian grid with hydroelectricity from Nepal and Bhutan to cut reliance on fossil fuels.

“China and India, despite their disputes, are engaged in a robust trading partnership of over \$100bn worth of exchange of goods and services,” points out former State Bank governor, Dr Ishrat Husain.

While Pakistan is the least economically integrated country in South Asia, due in large measure to its tense relationship with India, there have been small but promising steps it has taken recently. The restoration of trade with Bangladesh after 15 years, signals progress. Following the thaw between the two countries after the ouster of Sheikh Hasina, it surpassed \$1bn.

It’s time for India and Pakistan to set aside their pride. The advice from Bangladesh’s Yunus to foster better Bangladesh-Pakistan relations by “settling matters” and “moving forward” can similarly be applied to ease tensions and build a path towards reconciliation between India and Pakistan.

BURMA BROADCASTING

AMALGAMATION OF CLUB PROPOSED

RANGOON, MAR. 11

SEVERAL months ago the Burma Radio Club applied to the Government of India for a license to broadcast from Rangoon, and the replay was that as the Burma Wireless Club had also applied it would prove impracticable to license two radio clubs in Rangoon.

This led the Burma Radio Club to approach the Burma Wireless dub with a view to amalgamating the two, and thus to enable the public to enjoy the benefits of broadcasting. Certain proposals have been advanced which are expected to result in the formation of a broadcast committee from the two clubs which will be responsible for broadcasting in the Province.

MR. GANDHI & VAIKOM

FRUITLESS INTERVIEW WITH CASTE HINDUS

COCHIN, MAR. 11.

Mr. Gandhi met by invitation the local caste Hindu oppositionists. He was accompanied by Messrs. Rajagopalachari, Krishnaswami Iyer and others. The discussion lasted for over three hours and Mr. Gandhi made certain proposals to bring the struggle to a speedy conclusion, namely arbitration, referendum and examination by select pundits of Sankara Smritis. The oppositionists declined to accept any of these.

In the evening Mr. Gandhi addressed a large public meeting on the situation. He was presented with an address by the Ezhavas of Ambalapuzha. In replying Mr. Gandhi assured them that untouchability and unapproachability as practised were not supported by the Shastras.

Referring to his interview with the caste Hindu oppositionists, Mr. Gandhi said he had appealed to their reason, humanity and Hinduism but could not produce in them the impressions he wanted. He did not despair and hoped there would be a response.

Mr. Gandhi leaves Vaikom this afternoon for Alleppey en route to Quilon.

BRITAIN AND TREATIES

LABOUR PROPOSAL REJECTED

LONDON, MAR. 11.

IN the House of Commons to-day a resolution, which Mr. Ronald McNeill, Under-Secretary for Foreign Affairs, declared would mischievously hamper an efficient foreign policy, was moved by Mr. Charles Trevelyan (Lab. Newcastle), requiring that no international treaty or understanding be concluded without the consent of Parliament.

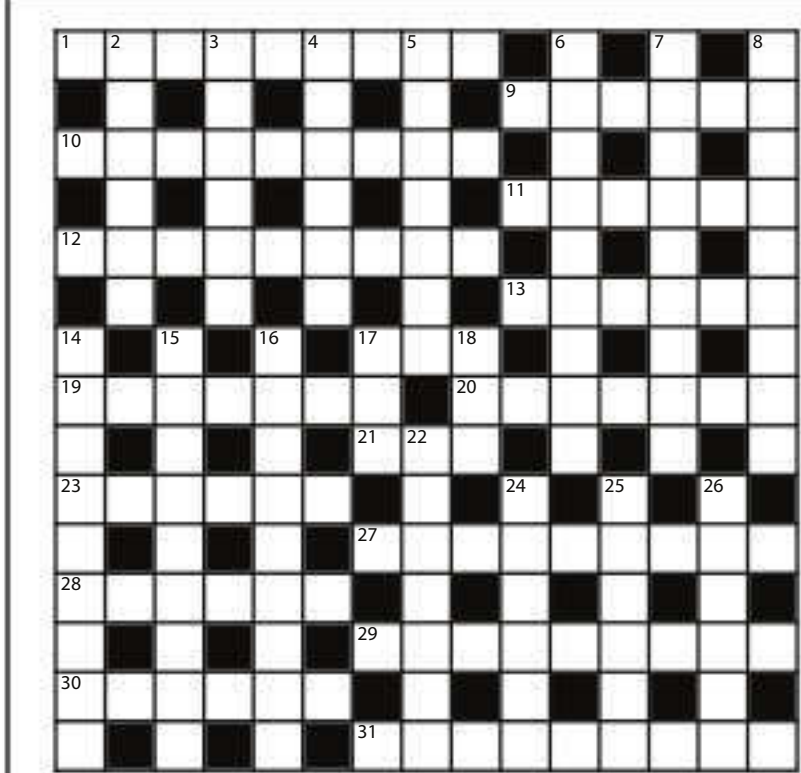
Mr. Trevelyan suggested that we were reverting to the old conditions of secret diplomacy, and that unless the Government followed the policy of the Labour Party they would have to transfer the Royal prerogative in connexion with treaties to Parliament.

Mr. McNeill confessed that he was not moved by the modification of the Royal prerogative in this matter, but he said that Mr. Trevelyan was setting about the matter in the wrong way. He declared that there were no secret treaties, as Mr. MacDonald knew, but the motion would delay extremely beneficial international arrangements which would have to be placed on the table in Parliament for twenty-one days. He pointed out that now-a-days we must obtain the consent of the Dominions before entering International engagements, and hence minor matters would have to be three weeks on the tables of every Parliament of the Empire.

The House subsequently adopted an amendment stating that the present procedure adequately secures Parliamentary control over foreign affairs.

Duterte to face crimes against humanity charges at The Hague

Duterte, once one of Asia's most feared leaders, is the first ex-leader from the region arrested by the global court

MANILA, 12 MARCH

Philippine police arrested former President Rodrigo Duterte in Manila on Tuesday and sent him by plane to the Netherlands to face charges of crimes against humanity at the International Criminal Court, President Ferdinand Marcos said.

The global court in The Hague had ordered Duterte's arrest through Interpol after accusing him of crimes against humanity over deadly anti-drug crackdowns he oversaw while in office, Marcos said in late-night news conference. Duterte had been arrested at the Manila international airport Tuesday morning when he arrived with his family from Hong Kong.

Walking slowly with a cane, the 79-year-old former president turned briefly to a small



group of aides and supporters, who wept and bid him goodbye, before an escort helped him into the plane.

His daughter, Vice President Sara Duterte, said she sought entry to the airbase where her father was held but was refused. She criticised the Marcos administration for surrendering her father to a foreign court which currently has no jurisdiction to the Philippines.

Marcos said Duterte's arrest

was "proper and correct" and not an act of political persecution, since the Philippines is a member of Interpol.

Among the most feared leaders in Asia while in power, Duterte became the first ex-leader from the region to be arrested by the global court.

Clad in a dark jacket, an irate Duterte protested his arrest after arrival in Manila and asked authorities the legal basis of his detention. His lawyers immediately asked

the Supreme Court to block any attempt to transport him out of the Philippines.

"Show to me now the legal basis for my being here," Duterte asked authorities in remarks captured on video by his daughter, Veronica Duterte, who posted the footage on social media. "You have to answer now for the deprivation of liberty."

The surprise arrest sparked a commotion at the airport, where Duterte's lawyers and aides protested that they, along with a doctor, were prevented from coming close to him after he was taken into police custody. "This is a violation of his constitutional right," Senator Bong Go, a close Duterte ally, told reporters.

The ICC has been investigating mass killings in crackdowns overseen by Duterte when he served as mayor of the southern Philippine city

of Davao and later as president. Estimates of the death toll of the crackdown during Duterte's presidential term vary, from the more than 6,000 that the national police have reported up to 30,000 claimed by human rights groups.

The ICC arrest warrant, seen by agencies, said: "there are reasonable grounds to believe that" the attack on victims "was both widespread and systematic: the attack took place over a period of several years and thousands of people appear to have been killed."

Duterte's arrest was necessary "to ensure his appearance before the court," the 7 March warrant said. "Mindful of the resultant risk of interference with the investigations and the security of witnesses and victims, the chamber is satisfied that the arrest of Mr. Duterte is necessary."

Taiwan to conduct 'immediate response' military drills to counter China

Taiwan is set to conduct a new round of "immediate response" military drills that will begin on 17 March and last five days, local media reported on Wednesday.

These drills by the Taiwanese defence forces will involve all military branches of Taiwan in response to China's grey zone warfare, the state-run *Central News Agency* reported, quoting military sources.

The drill will be "comprehensive," with troops dispatched to their assigned defensive positions accordingly, the source said, without elaborating.

The armed forces would be put on high alert through the five-day drills, and the comprehensive exercise was planned as a warm-up for this



year's annual Han Kuang exercises, reports the leading Taiwanese newspaper, *Taipei Times*.

The military drills, scheduled for next week, are also to prevent China from sabotaging the nation's submarine cables, a defence official said on Tuesday.

Last month, a Chinese cargo ship flying the flag of another nation was detained on suspicion of severing a cable

between Taiwan proper and Penghu County.

Last week, Taiwanese Defence Minister Wellington Koo, told reporters that Beijing might use military exercises to disguise a military buildup before an invasion attempt.

In response to ceaseless "grey zone" harassment and to counter any threat posed by Chinese vessels, armed forces would hold "immediate combat readiness exercises."

Japanese media say police have arrested several men for alleged sexual assault of their daughters

The Kyodo News agency, NHK television and other outlets say police in the Aichi prefecture, a region in central Japan, took into custody several men, who are in their 30s, 40s and 50s.

Japanese media reported this week that police have arrested several men accused of sexual assault of their underaged daughters and sharing their abuse videos online.

Police have so far refused to confirm the reports.

The *Kyodo News* agency,

NHK television and other outlets say police in the Aichi prefecture, a region in central Japan, took into custody several men, who are in their 30s, 40s and 50s.

They are accused of repeatedly raping their daughters or stepdaughters, aged 6-14, filming the scenes of the assaults and sharing the videos on social media. They are also accused of child prostitution and child pornography, the reports said.

They allegedly exchanged messages and footage of their attacks in a group chat. The group was uncovered after one of the men was arrested in November on accusations of raping a child. Police investigated the data on his mobile phone, which led to the arrest of the other men, reports said.

Congo faces setback in mpox response after Rwanda-backed rebels advance in the east

Hospitals across eastern Congo that were once at the forefront of the country's response to the mpox outbreak are facing a setback in detecting the disease and offering treatment following the advance of Rwanda-backed rebels in the region.

The mpox global health emergency is worsening as the fighting between the M23 rebel group and Congolese troops escalates in eastern Congo, which has been the epicenter of the health crisis. Many patients have fled and can't be found. Recently



arrived vaccines are running short as supplies can't reach combat zones. Hospitals have been under attack.

The Associated Press visited one of the mpox hot spots,

which is now under control of M23 rebels backed by neighbouring Rwanda. Health workers and remaining patients described a growing disaster. "The situation has been

very difficult. Insecurity has disrupted everything," said Dr. Serge Munyahu Cikuru, medical officer in charge of the Miti Murhesa health zone in South Kivu province's Kabare territory.

The country, meanwhile, continues to battle other diseases in the east, including cholera and measles, in addition to mysterious outbreaks that recently started in the northwestern region.

Congo saw a 31 per cent weekly increase in mpox cases last week, bringing the total to 16,255, according to the Africa Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

However, that is only one

side of the story: Only seven out of the 26 provinces reported cases last week, the public health agency said at its last briefing, partly blaming the security crisis.

Although Congo has seen a surge in the current vaccination phase as compared to the previous one, much of that success is in other regions while eastern Congo remains cut off.

The Miti Murhesa treatment centre is fast running out of supplies.

Mubake Buroko Patrick, an mpox patient at the facility, said it was difficult to get drugs in the weeks following the fighting.

Violence, displacements overwhelm healthcare system in Sudan's El-Fasher: UN

Violence and waves of displacements have overwhelmed the fragile healthcare system in El-Fasher, the capital of Sudan's North Darfur state, UN humanitarianists said. "More than 200 health facilities in El Fasher are not functioning, and there are severe shortages of medical staff, essential medicines and life-saving supplies," said the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA).

Humanitarian partners have been trying to provide medical supplies, but their efforts to deliver continue to be impeded by insecurity and access constraints, the office said. The World Health Organisation (WHO) reported that more than 70 per cent of hospitals and health facilities across areas impacted by the hostilities in Sudan are no longer operational, leaving millions without healthcare.

"Sudan's health system has also come under relentless attack," WHO said. "As of mid-February, WHO recorded nearly 150 attacks on health



care in Sudan since the war there began, but the real figure could be far higher."

OCHA appealed to the parties involved in the conflict to ensure safe, sustained, and timely humanitarian access to reach people needing life-saving support. Civilians must be protected, and the essential needs for their survival must be met, Xinhua news agency reported.

As the civil war enters its second year, Sudan's two warring factions remain locked in a deadly power struggle. Since the conflict began on 15 April 2023, almost 15,000 people have been killed, and more than 8.2 million have been displaced, giving rise to the worst displacement crisis in the world.

Nearly 2 million displaced Sudanese have fled to unstable areas in Chad, Ethiopia, and South Sudan, overrunning refugee camps and prompting concerns that Sudanese refugees could soon attempt to enter Europe.

The UN continues to plead for more support as more than 25 million need humanitarian assistance, and deteriorating food security risks are triggering the "world's largest hunger crisis."

Meanwhile, mediation efforts have failed to produce results as the leaders of the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and Rapid Support Forces (RSF) refuse to halt their violence, and regional and international actors have taken sides in the war.

Yemen's Houthi rebels say 'any Israeli vessel' in nearby waterways again a target

The statement from the Houthis' Humanitarian Operations Coordination Center follows a four-day deadline set by the rebels for Israel to resume aid shipments.

DUBAI, 12 MARCH

Yemen's Houthi rebels warned shippers early Wednesday that "any Israeli vessel" traveling through nearby Mideast waters is now a target as Israel continues to block aid to the Gaza Strip.

The warning from the Houthis again throws into

chaos a crucial maritime waterway between Asia and Europe, threatens revenue from Egypt's Suez Canal and possibly will halt aid shipments to war zones. The rebels in the past have also had a loose definition of what constitutes an Israeli ship, meaning other vessels could be targeted as well.

The statement from the Houthis' Humanitarian Operations Coordination Center follows a four-day deadline set by the rebels for Israel to resume aid shipments.

"We hope it is understood that the actions taken by the (Houthi military) ... stem from a deep sense of religious, humanitarian and moral

responsibility toward the oppressed Palestinian people and aim to pressure the Israeli usurper entity to reopen the crossings to the Gaza Strip and allow the entry of aid, including food and medical supplies," the statement said.

It described the warning as taking hold in the Red Sea, the Gulf of Aden, the Bab el-Mandeb Strait and the Arabian Sea.

The statement added: "Any Israeli vessel attempting to violate this ban will be subject to military targeting in the declared operational area."

There was no immediate sign of an attack on ships. Israel's military did not respond to a request for comment.

Pleasant retail inflation keeps RBI rate cut possibility in April solid, says experts: The pleasant headline consumer price index (CPI) inflation implies that the fourth quarter of FY25 inflation may undershoot the RBI's forecast by more than 40 bps, and could keep the rate cut possibility in April solid, industry experts said on Wednesday. The year-on-year inflation rate eased to an 7-month low of 3.61 per cent in February this year, which is 0.65 per cent lower than the corresponding figure for January, as food prices came down further during the month. "Broad-based moderation in food inflation, led by perishables and some protein goods, largely led to better-than-expected headline February CPI print," according to Emkay Global Financial Services' Chief Economist Madhavi Arora. At the policy level, both the RBI and the government have implemented measures to revive growth, such as policy interest rate cuts and reduction in income tax to increase disposable income with households. "To further stimulate growth, the RBI is likely to implement another repo rate cut in the next MPC meeting in April. While this move may be inflationary, it is necessary to support growth, particularly in segments like housing where credit support is essential," Knight Frank India's National Director, Research, Vivek Rath, said.

Market falls on IT selloff; mid, small-caps underperform

Sensex and Nifty ended lower as IT losses outweighed banking and auto gains amid US recession fears and volatility

Benchmark indices ended marginally lower on Wednesday in a highly volatile session as gains in banking and automobile shares were offset by losses in the IT sector.

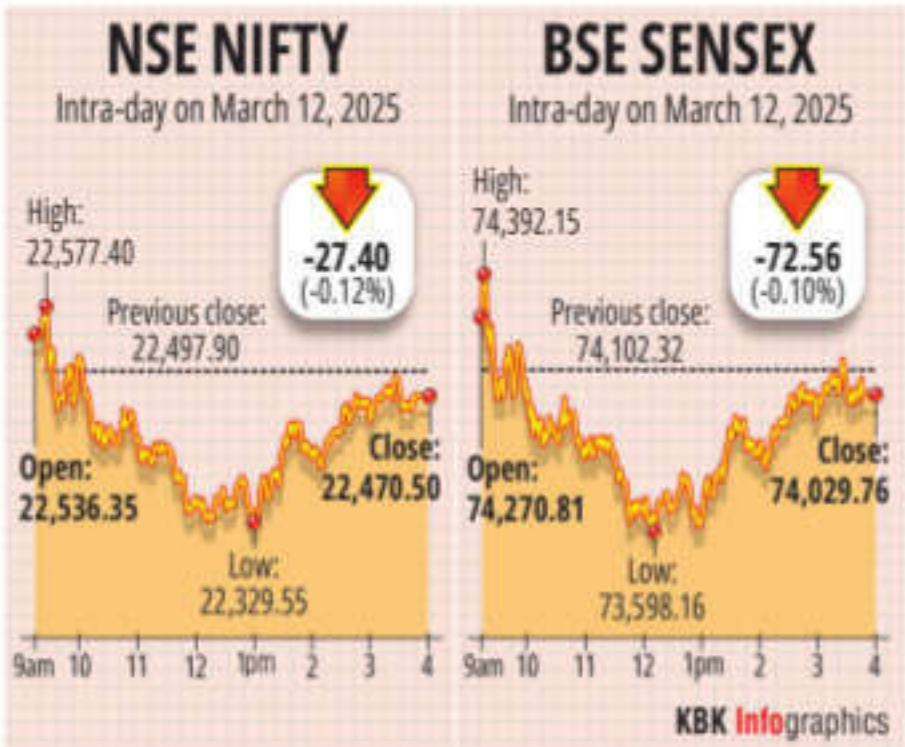
At close, the Sensex declined 0.1 per cent, or 72.56 points, to settle at 74,029.76, while the Nifty slipped 0.12 per cent, or 27.4 points, to 22,470.5.

During the trading session, the Nifty reached a high of 22,577.4 and a low of 22,329.55 while the Sensex fluctuate within a range of 74,392.15 and 73,598.16.

The mid and small-cap segments underperformed the benchmarks with the BSE Midcap slipped 0.57 per cent, while the Smallcap index ended 0.48 per cent lower.

The overall market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms dropped below 393 lakh crore from over 394 lakh crore in the previous session.

On Nifty50, the top gainers were IndusInd Bank (4.38 per cent), Tata Motors (3.12 per cent), Kotak Mahindra



Bank (2.45 per cent), Bajaj Finance (1.73 per cent), and ITC (1.53 per cent).

While on the losing side were Infosys (4.26 per cent), Wipro (3.31 per cent), Tech Mahindra (2.77 per cent), Nestle India (2.48 per cent), and Tata Consultancy Services (1.93 per cent).

The Bank Nifty concluded at 47,853.95, with an intraday high of 48,222.15 and a low of 47,844.95.

After a 27 per cent crash in the previous session, IndusInd Bank saw a 6 per cent rebound as investors assessed the fallout from the bank's derivatives portfolio

discrepancies.

Among the sectors, Nifty IT index suffered a solid loss of 2.91 per cent, with all stocks in the red. IT stocks have been under pressure amid growing concerns of a recession in the US market.

Infosys and Wipro led the sell-off amid growing fears that a slowdown in US client spending could impact revenue growth for Indian IT firms.

Nifty Realty, Media and PSU Bank lost 1.65 per cent, 1.53 per cent and 1.08 per cent, respectively.

Shares of Tata Motors surged over 3 per cent on 12

IndusInd Bank rebounded 6 per cent after a previous 27 per cent crash; Tata Motors gained 3 per cent; PB Fintech fell 5 per cent after announcing a ₹696 crore investment.

March, emerging as one of the top Sensex gainers and providing a strong boost to the BSE Auto index.

Ola Electric shares rose 2 per cent after the company announced the successful completion of its company-wide cost-reduction initiative.

PB Fintech, the parent company of Policybazaar, saw its stock tumble over 5 per cent after announcing a Rs 696 crore investment in its subsidiary PB Healthcare Services.

On the global landscape, Asian markets mostly declined, as investors remained cautious over US President Trump's trade policies and the risk of a US recession.

Global markets have been volatile with the US President putting pressure on trade partners with tariff barriers.

Indian space economy to reach USD 44 bn by 2033: FICCI-EY report

Indian space economy is aiming to reach USD 44 billion by 2033 from USD 8.4 billion in 2022, said a FICCI-EY report on 'Unlocking India's Space Economy - Pathways to Growth, Innovation and Global Leadership', released today at Bharat Space Conclave 2025', organised by FICCI.

According to the report, the global space economy is projected to exceed USD 1.8 trillion by 2035, with commercial satellite services, deep-space exploration, and space-based infrastructure driving expansion.

The report further states that India has set an ambitious target to grow its space economy from USD 8.4 billion in 2022 to USD 44 billion by 2033, aiming to capture 8 per cent of the global market.

This growth is being fuelled by policy reforms, private sector participation, and increased international collaboration, supported by the Indian Space Policy 2023 and institutions such as IN-SPACe and NSIL.

The FICCI-EY report notes that a significant shift is underway, with India's space sector evolving from a government-led model to a commercially driven, innovation-led ecosystem. Satellite communication (SATCOM), projected to reach

USD 14.8 billion by 2033, will play a critical role in expanding digital connectivity, particularly in rural and underserved regions.

By leveraging LEO and MEO satellite constellations, India can accelerate broadband penetration, enhance financial inclusion, and strengthen digital infrastructure, supporting flagship initiatives such as Digital India and BharatNet.

The increasing use of Earth Observation (EO) and remote sensing, estimated to contribute \$8 billion by 2033, is already transforming agriculture, disaster management, and climate resilience, highlights FICCI-EY Report.

Addressing the 'FICCI Bharat Space Conclave 2025', Dr Pawan Goenka, Chairman, IN-SPACe said that for the Indian space sector to grow we need capacity, capability, skilling, infrastructure, international partnership, funding and demand. "We will have to work for it and this will happen. These will not become a constraint for us to reach the \$44 billion target by 2033," he emphasised.

Earth Observation Preparatory Program (EOPP), Dr Goenka said that we have already shortlisted 6 companies and by mid-April the final name will be announced. "The EOPP project is going to be orbit changing project

for the Indian private space sector. It will bring in a dozen of private satellites which will provide data which is not available in the country today from Indian sources. We are not replicating what ISRO is doing but we are depending on outside data to get the data," he added.

Dr Goenka while highlighting the potential in satellite communications (SATCOM), said that the private sector is not present at all in this segment in terms of having their own satellites and we depend completely on NSIL (New Space India Limited), ISRO and outside sources.

"Now we have the first company who has been given the authorisation to use a frequency that ISRO has unused to set up launch SATCOM. This is just the first of many that will happen, and we will keep working on finding more of you (industry) frequencies and make it available to private sector," he added.

Dr AS Kiran Kumar, Member, Space Commission and Former Chairman, ISRO said that space is the frontier today which can provide significant advantages from uses to strategic applications including space tourism, adventure space, space habitation. "Soon we will see the launch of NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar satellite," he added.

After Bharti Airtel, Reliance Jio inks deal with SpaceX to provide Starlink internet services

Mukesh Ambani-owned Jio Platforms Limited officially announced on Wednesday that it has signed a deal with the Elon Musk-owned SpaceX to bring Starlink's internet services to India, only a day after its competitor Bharti Airtel announced a similar deal on Tuesday.

"This agreement, which is subject to SpaceX receiving its own authorisations to sell Starlink in India, enables Jio and SpaceX to explore how Starlink can extend Jio's offerings and how Jio can complement SpaceX's direct offerings to consumers and businesses," the company said in an official statement.

Jio Platforms Limited plans to offer Starlink solutions through its retail stores and online platforms. Under this partnership, Jio's extensive presence as the world's largest mobile operator by data traffic and Starlink's leadership in low earth orbit satellite technology will be utilised to

provide reliable broadband connectivity across India, including its most remote and rural areas.

"Jio will not only offer Starlink equipment in its retail outlets but will establish a mechanism to support customer service installation and activation. The agreement with SpaceX is part of Jio's commitment to ensuring that reliable internet is fully accessible to all enterprises, small and medium businesses, and communities across India," the company said.

Reliance Jio Group CEO Mathew Oomen said: "Our collaboration with SpaceX to bring Starlink to India strengthens our commitment and marks a transformative step toward seamless broadband connectivity for all. By integrating Starlink into Jio's broadband ecosystem, we are expanding our reach and enhancing the reliability and accessibility of high-speed broadband in this AI-driven era, empowering communities and businesses across the country".

Deepinder Goyal invests \$20M in LAT Aerospace

Deepinder Goyal, Chief Executive Officer at Zomato has invested \$20 million in LAT Aerospace, a new startup working on developing low-cost short takeoff and landing (STOL) aircraft with up to 24 seats. These aircraft will focus on improving regional air connectivity.

As per a recent media report, the startup is co-founded by Surobhi Das, former Chief Operating Officer (COO) at Zomato, along with Goyal. Das will be leading the operations of the company while Goyal will be serving in a non-executive role.

Goyal's involvement will be one of making investments and mentoring the startup in a non-executive role, it said.

The company is currently in talks to raise \$50 million in seed funding. It is also looking to hire engineers in fields such as aerodynamics, material sciences, and hybrid propulsion systems. Notably, Surobhi Das had left Zomato in November 2023, and at the end of her tenure, she worked at Blinkit, Zomato's quick commerce platform, focusing on expanding markets and adding new categories. For the third quarter of financial year 2024-25 (FY25), Zomato reported a 57 per cent drop in consolidated net profit to Rs 59 crore.

India's IT services industry to witness revenue growth of 4-6 per cent in FY26: ICRA

Individual housing loans outstanding grows 14 per cent at ₹33.53 lakh crore as of 30 Sept

The individual housing loans outstanding as of 30 September, 2024, stood at Rs 33.53 lakh crore, marking a 14 per cent growth compared to the same period in the previous year, said the National Housing Bank (NHB) on Wednesday.

According to the report launched by the NHB, on Trends and Progress of Housing in India, 2024, Individual housing loan disbursements were recorded at Rs 4.10 lakh crore during the half-year that ended September 2024, while for the full financial year 2023-24, disbursements reached Rs 9.07 lakh crore.

Further it is said that upto



the said period, EWS & LIG accounted for 39 per cent, MIG accounted for 44 per cent and HIG accounted for 17 per cent of outstanding individual housing loans.

For the quarter ended September 2024, the Housing Price Index (NHB-RESIDEX) recorded a y-o-y increase of

6.8 per cent as compared to 4.9 per cent during previous year.

It said that the major initiatives of GoI, such as PMAY-G, PMAY-U, impact assessment of PMAY-U, Urban Infrastructure Development Fund (UIDF), Affordable Rental Housing Complexes (ARHC) scheme, etc. have been covered in the report.

The report identifies regional disparities in credit flow and vulnerability to climate related risks, as some of the key challenges to be addressed by the sector.

It also identifies technological advancements in construction, digitization of land records etc. as some of the factors which will facilitate growth opportunities for the sector.

Moody's projects India's growth to exceed 6.5 per cent next fiscal, up from 6.3 per cent this year

India's economic growth will exceed 6.5 per cent in the next fiscal, up from 6.3 per cent this year, said Moody's Ratings on Wednesday. It cited the higher government capex and consumption boost from tax cuts and interest rate reduction for this growth.

Moody's said that following a temporary slowdown in mid-2024, India's economic growth is expected to reaccelerate and record one of the fastest rates among large economies globally.

"Government capital expenditure, tax cuts for middle-class income groups to boost consumption and monetary easing will help India's

real GDP growth exceed 6.5 per cent for fiscal 2025-26 from 6.3 per cent in fiscal 2024-25," Moody's Ratings said.

Moody's also projected a stable outlook for the banking sector, and said although the operating environment of Indian banks will remain favourable in the next fiscal.

Their asset quality will deteriorate moderately after substantial improvements in recent years, with some stress in unsecured retail loans, microfinance loans and small business loans, it added.

Banks' profitability will remain adequate as declines in net interest margins (NIMs) are likely to be marginal amid modest rate cuts, it said.

BSF seized contraband worth a record ₹461 crore in 2024

This unprecedented seizure marks the highest confiscation recorded in the past decade

The Border Security Force (BSF) seized contraband worth Rs. 461.07 crore in 2024 during anti-smuggling operations along the India-Bangladesh border.

This unprecedented seizure marks the highest confiscation recorded in the past decade, as reported in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday. Minister of State for Home Affairs Nityanand Rai, responding to a parliamentary query, emphasized the BSF's multi-pronged strategy to combat smuggling.

This includes round-the-clock surveillance, intensified patrolling, and the estab-



lishment of observation posts, effectively curbing illicit activities along one of India's most porous and vulnerable borders.

The Indo-Bangladesh border, spanning approximately 4,096 kilometers, is among the most densely populated and vulnerable international

borders in the region.

The terrain varies from dense forests and hilly regions to riverine stretches, making it a prime target for cross-border smuggling of narcotics, cattle, gold, and other contraband.

According to official data presented in Parliament,

BSF seizures since 2015 have amounted to Rs. 2,806.17 crore. The record-breaking figure of Rs. 461.07 crore seized in 2024 alone underscores the growing challenges and the enhanced efficiency of border security measures.

Minister Rai outlined a series of measures adopted to strengthen border security, including the deployment of additional personnel and the construction of border fencing, particularly in vulnerable stretches. Flood-lighting and the establishment of Border Out Posts (BOPs) have significantly bolstered security, especially in riverine and densely forested areas.

Advanced technology also plays a pivotal role in the BSF's anti-smuggling oper-

ations. State-of-the-art equipment such as Hand-Held Thermal Imagers (HHTI), Night Vision Devices (NVD), Twin Telescopes, and Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) have been deployed to ensure round-the-clock monitoring and rapid response. Intelligence gathering capabilities have been significantly upgraded, and coordination with state governments and central intelligence agencies has been enhanced.

The surge in contraband seizures reflects both the growing scale of smuggling attempts.

The porous borders and socio-economic challenges in border areas continue to fuel smuggling activities.

Ahead of Holi, the festival of colours, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath distributed Rs1,890 crore subsidy for gas cylinder refills to 1.86 crore eligible families in Uttar Pradesh under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana.

He said, "Since then, the initiative has been implemented annually to help people celebrate their festivals easily. With Holi and Ramzan falling together this year, the scheme will bring joy to even more households."

The Allahabad High Court on Wednesday approved white washing and painting in outer walls of Sambhal's Jama Masjid.

The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) has been given a week's time to complete the work. The High Court has ordered the ASI to paint the mosque and put up lights.

The court said: "The Masjid Committee can do white wash-



ing and painting on the outer walls of the mosque. During Ramadan, the mosque could be decorated with lighting, but during this time, there

should be no harm or any kind of damage to the structure."

The single bench of Justice Rohit Ranjan Aggarwal pronounced the order on

Wednesday.

On February 25, the lawyer of the Jama Masjid Committee, Zahuh Asghar, filed a petition in the High Court for white washing of the mosque. The petition said that the mosque gets white washed and painted before Ramadan every year. But this time the authorities are not giving permission for this.

However, the Hindu side opposed white washing and painting of the mosque. They said that the evidence of the

temple can be erased by white washing and painting and therefore permission should not be given.

Earlier in compliance with the court order, the ASI filed an inquiry report. In the report, the Archaeological Survey of India said there is no need for white washing and painting of the mosque. During the investigation, dirt and bushes have been found to grow in the mosque. Its photographs were also filed by ASI in the court.

PSG stun Liverpool to reach QF; Barcelona, Bayern, Inter also win

French giants edge out English outfit on penalties while trio of former European champions also progress into last eight

LIVERPOOL, 12 MARCH

Paris won 1-0 at Anfield before more Gianluigi Donnarumma shoot-out heroics helped them to overcome Liverpool on penalties and reach the UEFA Champions League quarterfinals.

Paris keeper Donnarumma saved twice in the shoot-out as Paris overcame a 1-0 first-leg deficit to reach the quarterfinals.

Ousmane Dembele completed a slick move by slotting in his seventh goal of the campaign in the 12th minute, drawing Paris level in the tie in doing so, but Liverpool dominated after the break and Luis Enrique's side needed Donnarumma to brilliantly paw Luis Diaz's header away and maintain overall parity in the tie.

The visitors went closest during extra time before Donnarumma denied Darwin Nunez and Curtis Jones made the spot, allowing 19-year-old substitute Desire Doue to convert the decisive penalty.

Earlier, Barcelona become the first team into the last eight, turning on the style in an emphatic second-leg win against Benfica in the early kick-off. Raphinha and Lamine Yamal starred as Barcelona roared into the quarterfinals. The pair combined for the 11th-minute opener, the Spanish youngster providing a fine cross for the Brazilian international to coolly volley in. Nicolas Otamendi replied almost instantly for Benfica with a header.

Yamal netted the pick of the goals with a sublime curl-



ing strike on 27 minutes, and Raphinha then fired in his 11th of the campaign to become the overall top scorer this season and end the contest before half-time.

Bayern Munich also cruise through against Bundesliga rivals Leverkusen. Harry Kane's tap-in and Alphonso Davies' first-time finish sealed a convincing victory for Bayern. Kane, twice denied by

Lukas Hradecky in the opening stages, extended the lead across the tie early in the second half with a straight-forward strike after Patrik Schick's clearance rebounded into the path of the Bayern No9. The England captain then turned provider when spotting the run of Davies into the area, with the Canadian international full-back sweeping in impressively.

The visitors pressed for further goals in the closing stages, with Jamal Musiala denied by the woodwork on two occasions. Bayern will meet Inter in the quarterfinals after the Nerazzurri completed their assignment against Feyenoord.

Inter are through to the quarter-finals for just the second time since 2010/11 after wrapping up a com-

fortable aggregate triumph over Feyenoord. Marcus Thuram put the Serie A side ahead in style eight minutes in, receiving the ball midway inside the Feyenoord half and weaving his way into the penalty area before unleashing a sensational long-range strike.

Jakub Moder reduced the deficit for Feyenoord from the penalty spot just before

half-time but Inter replied with a spot kick of their own shortly after the interval, converted by Hakan Calhanoglu for his second goal in the Champions League knockout rounds – the first coming in February 2015.

Barcelona, Bayern, Inter and PSG are the first four teams through to the quarterfinals of the Champions League.

Barca, Madrid greats raring for 'Legends Faceoff' in Mumbai

"I've played in some of the most electric stadiums in the world, and now it's time to experience India's football madness. See you soon, Mumbai!"

Quaresma, known for his flair and creativity, was a key part of Portugal's UEFA Euro 2016-winning squad. The former FC Barcelona and FC Porto winger also won league titles in Portugal and Turkey, along with the UEFA Europa League with Porto (2011), cementing his reputation as one of the game's most skilful wingers. "I've heard incredible things about football fans in India. Excited to finally experience it in Mumbai!" stated Quaresma.

This is not the first time Barca Legends are heading back to India. They last played in Calcutta on September 29, 2018 against a team of veterans from Mohun Bagan, comfortably winning 6-0.

Indian Wells: Rune beats Tsitsipas, enters 9th Masters 1000 QF

Holger Rune overcame Stefanos Tsitsipas in the Indian Wells fourth round to snap the Greek's seven-match winning streak.

Rune flashed his entire repertoire in a 6-4, 6-4 win over Tsitsipas that upped his record against the Greek Grand Slam finalist to 4-0. He pulled off perhaps one of the shots of the year in the second set, a tweener lob.

Rune is into his ninth Masters 1000 quarter-final, with his best result at this level a title run in Paris in 2022 when he was just 19. Having reached the same stage in Indian Wells last year, the 12th seed is the first Scandinavian since Stefan Edberg in 1994-95 to advance to consecutive quarter-finals in the California desert, ATP reports

Rune had an inconsistent start to the year. The World No. 13 reached the fourth round at the Australian Open



but struggled in February, failing to record consecutive wins at tour-level events in Rotterdam, Buenos Aires and Acapulco.

After earning his 16th Top 10 win and first on an outdoor hard court, Rune will aim to continue his run when he meets Tallon Griekspoor in the last eight.

"It was an extremely good match from my side from start to finish. I stayed very committed to my game plan. "Mentally I was very, very

good. I think that's what made the difference. How composed I could stay," Rune, who had to retire at his last tournament in Acapulco due to food poisoning, said in a TV interview.

Earlier, Griekspoor overcame Japanese qualifier Yosuke Watanuki and the rain to reach his first ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final.

In a rain-disrupted clash, Griekspoor earned a 7-6(4), 6-1 win to become the first Dutchman to advance to the

last eight at a Masters 1000 since Robin Haase in Toronto in 2018.

Griekspoor captured the biggest win of his career in the second round when he upset No. 2 in the ATP Rankings Alexander Zverev. Griekspoor has been in red-hot form in recent weeks, having also advanced to the semi-finals in Dubai.

In the women's section, No. 23 seed Elina Svitolina of Ukraine withstood rain and battled into the Indian Wells Open quarterfinals with a 5-7, 6-1, 6-2 upset of No. 4 seed American Jessica Pegula.

The former Indian Wells semifinalist shook off her early misfortunes and flipped the match on its ear as she claimed 12 of the final 15 games to earn a trip to her 21st WTA 1000 quarterfinal, and first since 2021.

On a misty day in the California desert, Svitolina and Pegula had to brave a lengthy rain delay after the first game of the third set. It was Svitolina who came back from the

interlude with fire in her eyes. She put Pegula on the back foot and raced away with the win.

Pegula entered Indian Wells having just won the Austin title earlier this month, but Svitolina came out on top, earning just her third win over Pegula in their eight career meetings.

Svitolina, who is into the quarterfinals at Tennis Paradise for the first time since 2019, will face either Mirra Andreeva, who ousted Elena Rybakina for the second time in three weeks to advance to the quarterfinals with a commanding 6-1, 6-2 win.

The 17-year-old Russian Andreeva's run in the desert comes fresh off the heels of her capturing a maiden WTA 1000 title at the Dubai Championships, which propelled her to become the youngest player to reach the Top 10 since 2007.

Earlier, Iga Swiatek thumped 15th-seeded Karolina Muchova with 6-1, 6-1 victory to march into the quarterfinals.
