

# Dispur College hosts career guidance talk on police service

**GUWAHATI, April 9:** The Career Counselling and Placement Cell of Dispur College (CCPC-DC), in collaboration with the 48 Assam Naval Unit NCC (48 ANU NCC-DC), organized a career guidance talk titled "Indian Police Service: EkSeva – How & Why to Join" under the Udyam-II Series of its Domain-Oriented Career Guidance Programme.
