Last year just under half of our electricity supply was powered by foreign energy imports, down from 65% in 2014, the Energy and Climate Intelligence Unit said.

Simon Cran-McGreehin, at the ECIU, said: 'UK electricity is becoming more British and this is the net zero emissions target in action."

SHADES OF GREY

ON the summit of Britain's second highest mountain, a terrifying beast is said to roam. The Big Grey Man of Ben Macdui, in the Cairngorms, is described as an enormous Sasquatch-like animal covered in short grey hair.

When he appears to unsuspecting hikers, he's said to trigger a sense of irrational panic and dread. In October 1943, soldier Alexander Tewnion described running away from the creature after desperately firing his gun at it.

Some boffins ave blamed have the apparitions on the Brocken spectre - a rare atmospheric effect caused by the projection of your shadow on to mist and cloud.



ON the coastal flats of East Anglia, a terrifying hellhound is said to have appeared since medieval times. Black Shuck is a huge dog with saucer-sized glowing red eyes, believed to be a harbinger of doom and death.

He often shows up during electrical storms, like the one that struck the churches of Bungay and Blythburgh in Suffolk at the exact same moment in August 1577. Scorched claw marks were left on Blythburgh's church door and at least two people died.

A similar beast called Cù-sìth, with dark green fur, is said to stalk the Scottish Highlands. And the Black Dog of Bunting Nook apparently prevs on car passengers in southern Sheffield.

STALKING CAT-ASTROPHES

THE Beast of Bodmin Moor is a large, cat-like mammal said to live on Bodmin Moor in Cornwall. More than 60 sightings have been reported since 1978, with witness-

es saying it looks like a panther with sharp teeth and yellow eyes.

Some theories suggest it could be an escaped zoo animal. But in 1995, a government-led investigation found there was no evidence either for or against its existence.

OWL OR NOTHING

THE Owlman of Mawnan Smith is another apparition said to roam

the Cornish countryside. Half-man and half-owl, with glowing red eyes, silver feathers and crab-like claws, he has terrified tourists since the 70s.

In April 1976, two young girls claimed to have seen him flying above the

Century parish church in the village of Mawnan Smith. Then in 1995, an American student described seeing him in a letter to a local newspaper.

I just screamed then turned and ran for my life," she added.

DARK HORSE

FOUND in the waters of Orkney, Scotland, the Nuckelavee has to be Britain's most terrifying legendary beast. He's a skinless horse with the head of a man only far larger - emerging from a mass of rotting sinews and exposed veins running with yellow

When he comes onto land, he makes livestock sick and wilts crops with his stinking breath. The only way to escape from his demonic presence is to leap across a freshwater river or stream.





The welfare of pooches should determine who looks after them when couples split, not who may have bought them, lawyers claim.

Campaigners change in the law to ensure prioritise animal welfare during divorces.

Experts say the move would stop pets being "weaponised" by warring

Currently, pets are owned by the spouse who bought them and can prove they paid for their upkeep - even if they are not the primary carer. As a result,

a partner who paid for a dog may keep it even if it was their ex who walked and fed it and took it to the vet.

Sarah Lucy Cooper, co-founder of Pets In Divorce - supported by Conservative peer Baroness Berridge - said: "We are lagging behind compared with a lot of jurisdictions in how we treat pets in divorce.

"At the moment a pet has the same legal status as a pot, or any other inanimate object. So the starting point for a judge is, 'Who paid for it?

"That may not be the end point but that's the concept. It's property law."







ETs brainier on warmer planets

BOFFINS are searching for uber-aliens as evolution could recently said they found alien algae on be three times faster on planets warmer than Earth.

Experts are scouring 6,000 exoplanets - outside the Solar System for atmospheres warmer than ours.

They claim ETs found there could be more advanced than humans.

Boffins are getting ever-closer to finding living beings on other planets Cambridge University scientists

recently said they found alien algae on K2-18b, 124 light years from Earth. Dr Emily Mitchell, an evolutionary

zoologist at Cambridge, said it was only a matter of time before they track down intelligent ETs.

Dr Mitchell said: "Finding life in the universe is an incredibly exciting prospect. But that is not necessarily life that you can say hello to.

"They're two very different things."

In a paper published by the Royal Astronomical Society she calculated an exoplanet 10C warmer than Earth could double or even triple the speed of evolution.

Prof Peter Vickers, from Durham University, said: "If it does turn out that K2-18b has life then it is virtually guaranteed that there are millions more exoplanets harbouring extrater-restrial life."

Jet lag a beast in the east

JET lag is worse for travellers going from west to east than those going east to west, say sleep boffs.

And young adults take a bigger hit to their kip after long flights compared to travellers in their sixties.

Travel-related sleep disruption takes "significantly longer" to get over than previously thought, the study also found.

Researchers at the Centre for Sleep and Cognition in Singapore analysed the sleep patterns of passengers during 60,000 trips of more than 600 miles.

Dr Adrian Willoughby, of the centre, said: "Jet lag is a challenge."



BOFFINS have discovered a new colour – but it can only be seen by folk
who have lasers fired into their eyes.
So far only five people have had the chance

to look at "olo" for themselves.

The lucky quintet at the University of California in Berkeley, US, said the colour looked like a kind of "blue-green" or similar to turquoise.

But they added that description did not capture the full richness of the experience.

Ren Ng, an electrical engineer at the university, said it was "jaw-dropping".

Members of the team were blasted with laser pulses enabling them to become the first people in history to view the colour. The boffs later shared an image of a

The boffs later shared an image of a turquoise square they said best matched the colour, but insisted it could only be experienced in real life through the laser method.

enced in real life through the laser method.
Ren added: "We predicted from the beginning that it would look like an unprecedented colour signal but we didn't know what the brain would do with it," he said.

"We're not going to see olo on any smartphone displays or any TVs any time soon."

Austin Roorda, a vision scientist on the research team said: "There is no way to convey that colour in an article or on a monitor.

"The colour we see is a version of it but it absolutely pales by comparison with the experience of olo."





ROSS Kemp has got no time for snobbery.

The TV legend often meets people in the industry who look down their noses at certain types of shows and he thinks they're idiots.

In fact, he reckons being open-minded is vital to have staying power in showbiz. Ross says: "I'm open to everything, so

long as it's something I can see myself doing well

"There is so much snobbery attached to different varieties of television, but that's never bothered me.

'I will always do things that I think are good. If I think it'll work well, I'll try to take it on and do it to the best of my ability.

The 60-year-old knows first-hand how wise it is to try different things.

His attitude has helped him be a regular on primetime telly for four decades.

To this day, he's one of the

busiest stars on the box. "I'm very lucky," he says. "I've had 40 years in the business and I've had a real cocktail of things

throughout my career. ľm still mixing it up.

"What I always say is, 'Never say never to anything.' That makes things interesting.

"That's why we're here on this Earth... to enjoy things and have as many experiences as we can.

That's what I'm doing and I'm succeeding."
Ross started working in TV in the mid-80s, but it was his debut as Grant Mitchell on EastEnders in 1990 that turned him into a household name.

While many actors and critics sneer at soaps. he is very proud of his time on one.

He says: "A lot of people leave soaps and they don't want to talk about them after that, but I

"I'm incredibly proud that I was on it for as long as I was. I have always believed that

EastEnders does what the BBC is there to do – inform, educate and entertain. It's important."

After becoming a big name on EastEnders, Ross branched out into documentaries.

Very quickly he became known for fronting hard-hitting programmes from the frontline in war zones.

It earned him praise from critics and even a

Bafta gong for Best Factual Series. Since then his career has taken another surprise turn into the world of game shows.

Ross signed up to front Bridge Of Lies for the BBC - even though many big-name stars would think they're above that sort of

format. "A game show is the last thing I thought I would ever do," shares Ross.

Bored

"But when I got sent details about it, I could visualise it. I could see myself doing it.

"When I talked it through with the execs, I could see it working.

Doing a variety of formats means Ross is never bored. One day can be very different to the next.

He says: "While I was in the middle of filming the new series of Bridge Of Lies, I went to do a documentary with the Colombian Special Forces about blowing up cocaine labs.

"The two shows could not be more opposite!"

Ross also gets very different treatment depending on what he is working on.
He says: "When I'm filming Bridge Of Lies, I'll have someone there who will get me a Berocca and honey to drink.

"But when I'm doing a documentary there are only three or four of us and I'll be the one fetching whatever we're drinking for the night.

They are two very different situations.

Because he's made so many shows over the years, Ross regularly gets recognised by fans

when he's out and about. But these days, it's not always for EastEnders.

"When I'm at the supermarket, no one mentions EastEnders or documentaries these days,"

"It's Bridge Of Lies. The people at the checkout will talk to me about it.

do get some people mentioning Grant Mitchell, but not as much as they used to.

Ross wants to keep enjoying plenty of variety. He will turn 61 this summer, but he's got no olans to slow down or retire any time soon.

The Barking-born talent is keen to keep making Bridge Of Lies for years to come along with its celebrity version, which is back for a new series on BBC One next month.

He said: "Everyone who works on the show

gets on well and the show works.

We are winning our slot over ITV, so we must be doing something right.
"And it gets me out of the house!"

Snooker legend Williams has noticed his eyes significantly deteriorate in recent months and is amazingly still winning despite seeing multiple balls due to severely blurred vision.

But the all-time great ditched his experiment with contact lenses before his Crucible opener on the advice of his coach.

He is due to have lens replacement surgery in early June.

The procedure, which costs around £4,000 an eye, replaces the natural lens in the eye with an artificial one.

And sixth seed Williams, who booked a 22nd last-16 appearance, said: "Hopefully, if it all goes well, it can prolong my career for another four or five years.

'I've noticed them get a lot worse in the last six months. I'm seeing

about three or four balls at a time. I knew the day was coming where I'd have to do something about it.

"If I keep going without doing anything, the only way is down. I'd be seeing five balls, then what would I go for?

"I tried playing with contacts but that was really difficult. It was really uncomfortable in the eyes.

"With the contacts it's brilliant – I only see the one ball I'm going for, it's clear. But then the cueball's really

blurry and I couldn't work out where to hit the cueball and that was driving me nuts.

"It would be funny if I did really well here. If I cancel, would I get my deposit back?"

Williams withstood the secondbest scoring streak in Crucible history - 466 unanswered points to lead 5-4 overnight.

And it was nip and tuck all the way to 8-8 before the Welshman produced two vintage breaks to progress. He added: "I have finished

really strongly there, so that can only be good for my confidence.

"I don't like to say it because I've beaten him. He's an unbelievable potter and has the potential to win this tournament one day."

OSCAR PIASTRI didn't just take the championship lead from Lando Norris, he also taught his teammate á lesson.

On the streets of Jeddah, he showed the Brit exactly how you deal with Max Verstappen when you come up against him on track.

Several times last year Norris was too meek in his approach to battling with the Dutchman, who will push to the limit, and sometimes beyond, to keep you behind.

But this race was won at turn one when Piastri got the better launch off the line and was not willing to give an inch more than he needed to.

Verstappen cut the first-corner chicane and came back onto the track still ahead, but the stewards were having none of it and he was given a five-second penalty.

That was the moment which decided the race. Once both had stopped and Verstappen emerged from the pit lane behind the Aussie, there would be no getting the lead back.

"Once I got on the inside, I wasn't coming out of turn one in second place," said McLaren ace Piastri, reflecting on that incident.

Obviously the stewards had to get involved, but I thought I was plenty far enough up and in that end that was what won me the race."

Piastri kept him at arm's length for the rest of the Grand Prix to win back-to-back races for the first time in his Formula One career. It was his

third win of 2025 already after just five rounds and he is the first Aussie to lead the championship since his manage Mark Webber in 2010 when he raced for Red Bull.

Verstappen was none too pleased with the way this one was taken away from him. If his pole position in qualifying was a surprise, then it was truly shocking to see his Red Bull, which was just plain slow in Bahrain a week earlier, show pace at least equal to that of the McLarens.

He was less than three seconds behind Piastri by the time he took the chequered flag and bit his tongue as he reflected on the race.

"I'm going to keep it quite short," he warned interviewer David Coulthard, before thank-ing the fans and walking off.

A much happier man was Charles Leclerc,

who held off a late charge from Norris to record Ferrari's first podium of the year.

Norris did well to recover to fourth on a track where overtaking is difficult but the damage was done on Saturday by his qualifying crash.

"I'm pleased on the whole," the Brit said. "I make life tough for myself, especially at a race like that. It would have been much easier, a lot more chilled, if I was driving at the front. I need to make things easier with better Saturdays."

Also in need of stronger qualifying is Lewis Hamilton, who started and finished seventh after again struggling for pace in his Ferrari.
