DISPUR COLLEGE: THE GENESIS AND EVOLUTION OF A LEGACY

The establishment of Dispur College in 1978 was a direct response to the surge in demand for higher education following the shift of Assam's capital from Shillong to Dispur. Founded under the leadership of Sri Ghana Kanta Chetia Phukan, the college began its journey with the Arts Stream, holding evening classes at Gopal Boro Govt. Higher Secondary School. A significant turning point occurred in 1987 during the tenure of Principal Dr. Reba Kanta Hazarika, when the college moved to its current location at the foothill of Narakasur Hill near Ganeshguri Chariali. This move signalled a new era: the evening shifts were transposed to vibrant day shifts, and the college became the heartbeat of Guwahati's educational map. Over the following decades, the institution solidified its academic standing, with the Arts Stream being provincialized on April 1, 1992, and the college receiving recognition from the UGC under sections 2F and 12B in the 1995-96 session.

The college has consistently expanded its academic horizons to meet the evolving needs of students. The Commerce Stream was introduced at the Higher Secondary level in 1991-92, followed by the introduction of the B. Com undergraduate course in 1994-95, eventually leading to the stream's provincialization on January 1, 2013. Recognizing the growing demand for professional education, the college introduced Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) programmes in the 2007-08 session, both of which received formal approval from the AICTE in 2024. Furthermore, Dispur College serves as a vital hub for distance learning through the K.K. Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) and the Centre for Distance & Open Education at Gauhati University.

In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the college introduced the four-year undergraduate programme (FYUGP) under Gauhati University in 2023-24. It received final recognition from the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) to launch the Four-Year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) on December 16, 2025. Moreover, to ensure students remain competitive in a digital economy, the college has partnered with the Assam Electronic Dev Corporation Limited to offer specialized employment-linked IT courses under its ICT College Programme. Looking ahead, the college has also resolved to introduce post-graduate courses in Political Science, Philosophy, Accountancy, Human Resource Management (HRM), Marketing Management, and a Masters of Business Administration (MBA) starting in the 2026-27 session, thereby significantly expanding the opportunities available for advanced study in the Northeast region.

Dispur College, now a premier institution accredited with an 'A' grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), is marching toward its Golden Jubilee in 2027-28. The ceremonial start of these celebrations was marked by the organization of a 'Bhaona Sabah'—a grand confluence of diverse programmes such as Bhagawat Path, 'Borgeet,' Dihanaam, 'Bhortal Nritya,' 'Satriya Nritya,' and 'Thiyo Naam,' along with the orchestration of two bhaonas, 'Dakshya Jagya' and 'Ram Parajay Sita Patal Gaman'—on November 14th and 15th, 2025 at the Gopal Boro Playground adjacent to the college. By featuring student-led performances rooted in the Satriya Vaishnavite culture of Sreemanta Sankar Dev and Shree Shree Madhav Dev, the college reinforced its commitment to experiential learning and Indian Knowledge Systems. This 'Bhaona Sabah' remains a reminder of the proud institutional legacy of Dispur College and its commitment to a future dedicated to holistic, modern, and culturally grounded education.

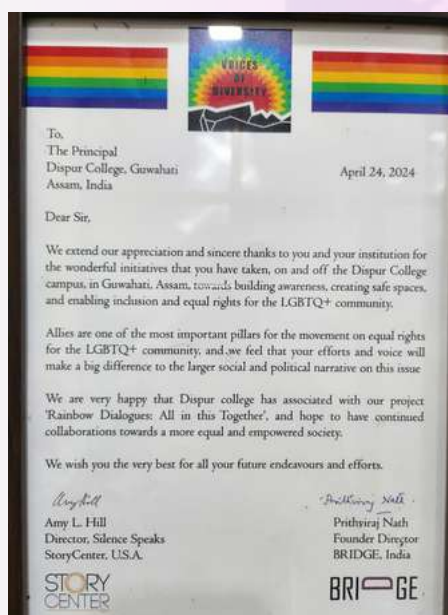

KEY INSTITUTIONAL MILESTONES

Accreditation with Grade “A” by National Assessment Accreditation Council (NAAC)

The College completed its third cycle of assessment by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in the month of November, 2024 and was awarded the prestigious 'A' Grade. The grading by NAAC testifies to the commitment of Dispur College towards achieving all round excellence. It has further boosted the morale of the college to continue contributing to the needs of its students and to the educational, social and economic development of the local community, of its adopted villages and schools as well as needy individuals through various extension activities. The excellent grading has enhanced the sense of civic and social responsibility of the college and propelled it to achieve newer heights and achievements.

All India Survey of Higher Education (AISHE) under MoE

In alignment with the Ministry of Education's (MoE) initiative to document the national landscape of higher education, Dispur College consistently participates in the annual web-based All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE). Since the survey's inception in 2010-11, the institution has maintained a record of continuous compliance and reporting. Facilitated by the College Nodal Officer, Dr. Ajoy Mitra, the college has successfully updated its institutional data through the 2024-25 session, contributing to the MoE's comprehensive database for policy planning and educational research. Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (PM-USHA) under MoE

PM-USHA (formerly known as RUSA) aims to build a self-sustaining momentum that will push for greater accountability and autonomy of state institutions and impress upon them the need to improve the quality of education and infrastructure. The College is maintaining all the formalities regarding institutional development under PM-USHA. Works of three storied RCC Building for Library and Toilet Block under RUSA was completed in 2020-21.

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) under MoE

(Rechristened as Ministry of Education) on 29th September, 2015. This framework outlines a methodology to rank institutions across the country. The parameters broadly cover “Teaching, Learning and Resources,” “Research and Professional Practices,” “Graduation Outcomes,” “Outreach and Inclusivity,” and “Perception”. Dispur College participated in ‘India Ranking 2018 and 2019 through the College Nodal Officer Dr. Ajoy Mitra and ranked under Rank-Band 150-200. Gender Neutral, Safe Space

The College takes pride in providing safe, gender-neutral spaces to all students, employees and the common public in general. Appreciating the initiatives adopted by the college to create an inclusive campus that truly adheres to the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEIs) goals of NEP, 2020, Silence Speaks Story Center, USA and BRIDGE, India recently awarded the college with a certificate of recognition. Additionally, the college also received a certificate of recognition from the Directorate of Health Services, Assam for regularly organizing counselling sessions aimed at providing students and any other needy people a sense of emotional security and well-being.

Digitization

The Digital India programme is a flagship programme of the Government of India with a vision to transform India into a digitally empowered society and knowledge economy. Dispur College has also adopted the same, and introduced Cashless Transaction, Leave Management System (LMS), Management Information System (MIS), Student Feedback System, Student Attendance, Office-Automation, Library-Automation (Web Opac, E-resource Centre, Government E- Market Place (GeM), PFMS, E-Admissions through Darpan and SAMARTH E-govt. portal.

State Infrastructure Grant (Govt. of Assam) and E-Tendering

The state government sanctioned Rs one crore to the college for infrastructure development. With this fund, the College undertook the construction of a three storied RCC Building with Multi-Gym, Canteen, Students' Union Room, Commerce Department, Boys Common Room, NCC, NSS Rooms and a rooftop Auditorium. The work was completed in the financial year 2019-20.

SWAYAM (Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds)

SWAYAM is a programme initiated by the Government of India and designed to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy viz., access, equity, and quality. The objective of this effort is to take the best teaching learning resources to all, including the most disadvantaged. UGC has taken the initiative and instructed colleges to popularize MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) through the platform of SWAYAM. Dr. Mousumi Devi, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Management has been appointed as the SAWAYAM Convenor.

IIC (Institution's Innovative Council)

In compliance with the Ministry of Education (Govt. of India) norms, Dispur College established its Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) during the 2021-22 academic session. Led by President Dr. Himangshu Kalita, Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics, the IIC is dedicated to fostering a culture of innovation, entrepreneurship, and start-up development within the college. By providing mentorship and networking opportunities, the council helps students transform creative ideas into tangible prototypes. Key initiatives currently supervised by the IIC include a Tailoring-cum-Sewing Facility—run in partnership with the Lions Club of Gauhati to promote financial independence—and professional makeup skill training conducted in collaboration with the Ministry of MSME and the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE).

ISO Certification

Dispur College has been assessed and certified ISO 9001:2015 for Quality Management System and ISO 21001:2018 for Educational Organization Management System (EOMS).

SDG Accord

Dispur College is a proud signatory of the SDG Accord, a prestigious international initiative that represents the higher education sector's commitment to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs). By adhering to this accord, the college pledges to adopt a "whole-institution approach," systematically embedding the 17 Sustainable Development Goals into its core pillars: education, research, leadership, operations, and community engagement.

Through this framework, the institution ensures that its administrative strategies, academic and extension activities—such as fostering a gender neutral campus, environmental conservation near Deepor Beel and rural development in adopted villages—are aligned with global standards for sustainability, social equity, and economic resilience. This commitment serves as a guiding principle for the college as it strives to foster a more sustainable and inclusive future for its students and the wider community.

Cooperative Society

Dispur College has a registered Cooperative Society under the name of Dispur College Multi-Purpose Cooperative Societies Limited, formed with the objective of boosting the Community as a whole. Multi-Purpose Cooperative Society also provides the platform for online student support services like admission, form fill-up, Xerox, printout etc. & college uniform is also provided at concessional rate.

Plastic Free Zone

In keeping with its environmental conservation and preservation efforts, Dispur College has declared itself a Plastic-Free Zone from the year 2022, imposing ban on the use of single use plastic bottles, bags, glasses, plates and other such items. In recognition of this initiative GMC officially recognized the campus as Plastic-Free Zone in the year 2024.

Tobacco Free Zone

The College has been consistently working to spread awareness on the adverse effects of tobacco on health and the environment. Recognizing the initiatives of the college, the District Tobacco Control Cell, Directorate of Health Services (Family Welfare), Kamrup (M), Assam awarded the status of 'Tobacco-free Zone' to the college on 31st May, 2022, the World No Tobacco Day.

Reduce, Reuse & Recycle (RRR)

As part of its commitment towards environment and sustainability, Dispur College strictly adheres to the policy of Reduce, Reuse and Recycle (RRR). It has a stringent waste management mechanism which facilitates the smooth reuse and recycling of waste products generated inside the college premises to the best possible extent.

Rainwater Harvesting System

Dispur College demonstrates its commitment to environmental sustainability through an advanced rainwater harvesting system designed to optimize resource conservation. This eco-friendly infrastructure efficiently captures and stores runoff, significantly reducing water waste across the campus. By merging technical conservation with sustainable horticultural practices, the institution fosters a "green" campus culture and serves as a model for environmental stewardship.

Food-waste Monitoring System

As a way of educating the young learners of the college on reducing food-wastage, a food-waste monitoring system was started in the college canteen from 13th July, 2022. Under the system, the waste food generated in the canteen at the end of each day is weighed and displayed on a board placed outside it the next day. A rough estimate of how many needy people such wasted food could have fed is also displayed so as to spread awareness against recklessly throwing away food.

E-Waste Management System

Electronic wastes generated in the college include discarded electrical or electronic devices such as used electronic parts, burned electric bulbs, wires, damaged computer units and peripherals. Understanding the serious health hazards posed by an inefficient or improper e-waste disposal system and conversant with the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change, Government of India's E-Waste (Management) Rules, 2022, the college has come up with an effective management plan for the electronic wastes generated within its premises. The waste materials are examined by a competent authority appointed by the administration and then segregated based on whether they can be effectively repaired and reused in an eco-friendly manner or not. Reusable items such as refillable printer cartridges are refilled and used as far as possible. Damaged products are handed over to a third-party organization for effective management. The college has an agreement with Lions' Club and Axom Refurbisher—an e-waste processing unit in Guwahati—whereby they have undertaken the responsibility of recycling or properly disposing the e-waste generated in the college.

Day Care Room

To facilitate a better work environment for working parents in the college, a baby day care room has been constructed with basic facilities for feeding and nurturing babies.

Divyangjan Friendly Campus

Committed to inclusivity, the college has systematically upgraded its facilities to cater to the needs of Divyangjan students. The campus is equipped with lifts, ramps, and wheelchairs for easy access to classrooms and offices, complemented by Braille resources and scribe assistance for the visually impaired. Furthermore, the institution extends holistic support by providing need-based financial aid for travel, refreshments, and academic supplies including books and uniforms to deserving students under this category, thereby ensuring that its campus stays inclusive in the true sense of the term.

Adoption of Villages

Dispur College, through its NSS wing, actively engaged in community service by adopting Pamohi village up to the 2020–21 academic sessions. The initiative focused on improving the overall well-being of the villagers through health, hygiene, and environmental awareness programmes. Regular health camps were organized to provide basic medical check-ups and promote nutritional awareness.

Given Pamohi's proximity to the ecologically sensitive Deepor Beel, the college placed strong emphasis on environmental conservation. Cleanliness drives were conducted under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, along with awareness programmes on waste management and sustainable practices. These activities not only benefited the local community but also helped students gain practical exposure to rural development and social responsibility.



Adoption of Schools

As part of its extended community outreach, Dispur College actively supports local primary education by adopting institutions such as Maghuapara Lower Primary School, Guru Nanak Lower Primary School, and Pragjyotish Lower Primary School. The college facilitates holistic student development through a blend of academic support, health awareness, and environmental initiatives. College students regularly assist younger learners in strengthening their literacy skills in both Assamese and English, while also leading tree plantation drives and hygiene awareness campaigns.

To foster a vibrant educational environment, the college conducts “Joyful Learning” sessions that utilize storytelling and art to make education more engaging. Furthermore, the institution consistently contributes to infrastructure and resource development by providing benches, drinking water facilities, and teaching aids. To support students from economically marginalized backgrounds, the college also provides essential items, including uniforms, stationery, and umbrellas, ensuring that financial barriers do not hinder their education.

PART A: ACTION TAKEN REPORT (2020–2025):

Between 2020 and 2025, Dispur College successfully modernized its academic and physical infrastructure to align with NEP 2020. The college established seven smart classrooms and high-performance computer, language, and electronics laboratories to foster ICT-enabled pedagogy and digital literacy. To bridge the employability gap, the institution launched 31 interdisciplinary certificate courses—ranging from Data Analysis and Cyber Ethics to Tea Tasting and Fashion—complemented by a Startup Incubation Centre and a dedicated Career Development Cell that facilitates placements with global firms like Wipro and Cognizant. Student well-being was prioritized through the inauguration of a modern multi-gym, yoga sessions, self-defense training, and regular psychological counseling.

Concurrently, the college emerged as a hub for research and cultural preservation, hosting numerous international seminars and its flagship "South East Asian Cultural Confluence" to support the Act East Policy. Community outreach remained a cornerstone of this phase, evidenced by the adoption of local schools/villages, the enforcement of a plastic-free campus under the SDG Accord, and the promotion of indigenous Vaishnavite traditions through major theatrical productions. Higher Secondary (HS) 1st Year Admission Guidelines 2026-2027

Dispur College invites applications for admission to the Higher Secondary (H.S.) 1st Year for the academic session 2026-2027. Candidates are requested to adhere to the following guidelines:

1. General Admission Process & Monitoring

- **Regulatory Schedule:** The college follows the admission timeline prescribed by the Assam State School Education Board, Division-II (ASSEB, Div-II).
- **Information Portals:** Applicants must regularly monitor the "DARPAN" Admission Portal (<https://darpan.ahseconline.in/>) and the official college website (www.dispurcollege.ac.in) for all official notices, updates, and merit lists.
- **Merit-Based Selection:** Admissions are strictly conducted on a merit basis. The college reserves the right to rectify or update the merit lists as necessary.

2. Reservations and Statutory Compliance

- **Reservation Policy:** Seat reservation for various categories will be implemented in accordance with the rules and guidelines issued by the Government of Assam.
- **OBC Category:** Candidates applying under the OBC category must produce an original Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) certificate at the time of admission.

- **EWS Quota:** Candidates seeking admission under the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) must provide a valid Income Certificate in the prescribed format, signed by the authorized official. The certificate must be valid for the current academic session (2026-27).
- **Extra-Curricular (EC) Quota:** Applicants under the EC quota must submit original copies of their proficiency certificates during the admission process.

3. Counselling and Document Verification

- **Physical Presence:** Selected candidates must report to the college premises on the specific date and time mentioned in the admission schedule.
- **Required Documentation:** Candidates must carry a hard copy of the application form submitted via the DARPAN portal, along with all relevant original documents for verification.
- **Forfeiture of Seat:** Attendance at the counseling session in order of merit is mandatory. Candidates who fail to appear at their designated time will automatically forfeit their claim to a seat.

Academic Offerings

Dispur College offers specialized degrees across the Arts, Commerce, and Professional Studies faculties, adhering strictly to the norms, statutes, and curriculum prescribed by Gauhati University.

A. Bachelor's Degree in a Stream (Honours/Major): Students may pursue specialized Honours in the following subjects:

- **Faculty of Arts:** Assamese, English, Education, Economics, Political Science, Philosophy, and History.
- **Faculty of Commerce:** Accountancy, Finance, Human Resource Management, and Marketing Management.

1. Admission Eligibility & Guidelines

Admission to the Undergraduate Programme is conducted with transparency and is subject to the following criteria:

Academic Qualification: Candidates must have successfully completed the 12th Standard (Higher Secondary) or an equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized Board or Council.

Selection Criteria: Admission is primarily based on the student's preference for a Major. Candidates not opting for a Major will be considered based on their preferred Subject Combinations.

Capacity & Prerequisites: Enrollment in any Programme or Major is subject to the intake capacity of the respective department and strict adherence to the prerequisites mandated by Gauhati University.

2. Progression and Exits

The progression and exits during the whole course structure shall be as per the policies adopted by the Affiliating Universities from time to time.

3. ABC (Academic Bank of Credits)

All academic activities pertaining to a student (including enrolment, subject selection & mapping, registration for exams, assessment & evaluation, ID generation, etc.) are conducted via SAMARTH-e-Gov Suite and linked to ABC via the APAAR ID. The GU-FYUGP is directly connected to the ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earn at the end of an examination in GU-FYUGP, will be deposited in the ABC by the university. As such it is mandatory that a student under GU-FYUGP register for the ABC and generate an APAAR ID as notified by the regulatory agencies.

Aadhaar Card is mandatory for all the admitted students as it will be required for all purposes like creation of ABC, Registration with University, etc. Those who do not have Aadhaar Card, they must avail it within two/three weeks from date of admission.

4. Evaluation and Assessment:

The examination modalities of GU-FYUGP will be as per GU's Examination Ordinance in consonance with the UGC/AICTE/Other regulators.

Major Subject and Seat Capacity

For FYUGP, Arts (BA) and Commerce (BCom) at Dispur College, Students can choose any one from the following as Major Subject as per the allotted total number of seats. Students who fail to secure a seat in the B.Com 1st year day shift in order of merit will automatically be eligible for the afternoon shift. Once admitted in the afternoon shift, a student cannot be reverted to the day shift under any circumstances.

Overview of the Admission Process

For the academic session 2026–27, all undergraduate admissions will be centralized through the Assam State Higher Education Admission Portal (Samarth): <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/>. In compliance with the directives of the Department of Higher Education, Assam, Dispur College will conduct its entire admission process via the Samarth platform. Candidates must strictly adhere to the schedule and regulations prescribed by the State Government.

Application & Selection Strategy

- **Mode of Application:** Applications are accepted exclusively online through the Samarth portal.
- **Merit-Based Selection:** Admissions are granted based on merit lists published by the College following a thorough review of online registrations and academic credentials.

- **Continuous Monitoring:** Candidates are responsible for frequently checking both the Samarth portal and the official College website (www.dispurcollege.ac.in) for real-time updates and notifications.

Eligibility Criteria

- **General UG:** Applicants must have successfully completed the 10+2 (Higher Secondary) examination from a recognized State or Central Board.
- **B.C.A. Specialization:** While students from all streams (Arts, Science, and Commerce) are eligible, preference will be given to those who have studied Mathematics or Computer Science at the 10+2 level.

Counselling and Document Verification

- **Mandatory Presence:** Selected candidates will be called for Counselling on specific dates. Physical attendance is compulsory; failure to appear at the designated time will result in the immediate forfeiture of the seat.
- **Verification of Credentials:** Candidates must present a hard copy of their Samarth application along with all original documents (academic and category-based). The College reserves the right to rectify the merit list at any stage if discrepancies are found.

Reservations and Quotas

- **Statutory Reservations:** Seats for SC, ST(H), ST(P), OBC/MOBC, and PwD categories are reserved as per the Government of Assam norms.
- **OBC Applicants:** A valid Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) certificate in original must be produced at the time of admission.
- **EWS Category:** Candidates must provide an Income Certificate issued by a competent authority, valid specifically for the 2026–27 financial year.
- **Extra-Curricular (EC) Quota:** Original certificates representing achievements in sports, culture, or other extracurricular activities must be submitted during the admission session.

Code of Conduct and Disciplinary Regulations

Dispur College maintains a comprehensive Code of Conduct designed to uphold academic integrity and institutional decorum. The complete set of regulations is available on the official college website; it is incumbent upon all students to review these policies and ensure strict adherence.

- Adherence to Institutional Charters:** All students are mandated to comply with the "Students' Charter" and the "Code of Conduct" as delineated on the institutional website and prominently displayed across the campus.
- Use of Mobile Devices:** The use of mobile cellular devices within the college premises is strictly restricted to academic and pedagogical purposes.
- Campus Entry and Uniform Policy:** The wearing of the prescribed college uniform and the possession of a valid institutional Identity Card are mandatory prerequisites for entry into the campus. No student will be permitted entry without full compliance with the uniform regulations.
- Attendance Requirements:** Students must maintain a minimum attendance of 75% in each subject. Failure to satisfy this requirement will result in debarment from sessional examinations. Students are responsible for monitoring their attendance records and institutional notifications through the dedicated online student portal.
- Consequences of Attendance Default:** In instances where attendance thresholds are not met, internal assessment marks will not be forwarded to Gauhati University for semester-end examinations. Consequently, the student will be recorded as "Fail (Back)" for that specific semester.
- Campus Boundaries and Conduct:** Students are prohibited from exiting the campus during active college hours. Engaging in unauthorized activities, such as roaming nearby markets or public spaces, creating a nuisance, or participating in anti-social behavior, is strictly forbidden. Violations will result in stringent disciplinary action, which may include expulsion, rustication, or the initiation of legal proceedings. Furthermore, loitering in corridors or in front of classrooms is prohibited.
- Library Regulations:** Students must carry their non-transferable Library Card at all times.
- Library Liability:** Students enrolled in Major courses are entitled to one additional library card. All borrowers assume full financial responsibility for the loss or damage of any borrowed materials and will be required to remit the full replacement cost.
- Mandatory Assessments:** Participation in all internal tests, sessional examinations, and home assignments conducted by the respective departments is strictly compulsory.
- Official Notifications:** For their own benefit, students are required to regularly consult the official Notice Boards for critical updates and instructions.

11. **Administrative Applications:** Applications for certificates, railway concessions, scholarships, or other official documents must be submitted well in advance to ensure timely processing by the administrative office.
12. **Financial Transactions and Scholarships:** Scholarship disbursements are made directly to the beneficiary's bank account via online mode. It is mandatory to obtain an official payment receipt for all financial transactions conducted at the college office.

Lakshyadhar Choudhury Knowledge Resource Centre(Library)

Established in the year 1978, the Library is one of the pioneer centre to provide knowledge not only to its stakeholders, but also to its society. The college library is a learning resource centre for the users (students, teachers, staff and other social stakeholders). Users can access the wide range of resources comprising of textbooks, reference books, periodicals etc. of Indian and international authors. As one of the pioneer institution of the Greater Guwahati, the Library is catering to the needs of its users providing every possible services to its users with its resources.

The Library building has been renovated in 2021 with RUSA 1.0 Grant. The Library has a sitting capacity of 57, both in new and old building. The Library has textbook section and reading rooms, both in old and new building and also has the sections like Property Counter, different reference books, Teacher's Reading Room, Librarian's Chamber, Library Assistant's Room, Journal and Magazine section, new arrivals section, newspaper section, Xerox section and e-resource centre (with 12 computers).

In the initial stage, Library collection was very less (2000 approx.). Gradually, the collection increased over the time along with the newspapers, journals, magazines etc. Presently, the Library has a collection of 22,026 (text and reference books), covering different subjects. The library also has a collection of 10(ten) Journals, 5(five) Magazines and 10(ten) Newspapers. The Library has N-LIST (National Library and Information Service Infrastructure of Scholarly Content), to access e-resources (e-journals and e-books) by the users.

The Library has an active website which is- <https://library.dispurcollege.ac.in/>, where every information about the library is being updated. Library has been automated through KOHA Software, therefore all the housekeeping workings of the library is done through this software. The Central Library has an E-Resource Centre for the users to access the internet, strictly only for the academic purpose. It also has the facility of digital library (using Dspace Software), where users can browse the digital collections of the library(<http://dispurcollege.digitallibrary.co.in/>). WEB-OPAC is facilitated to the users to see the collections of the library from anywhere and anytime(<http://dispurcollege-opac.kohacloud.org>). 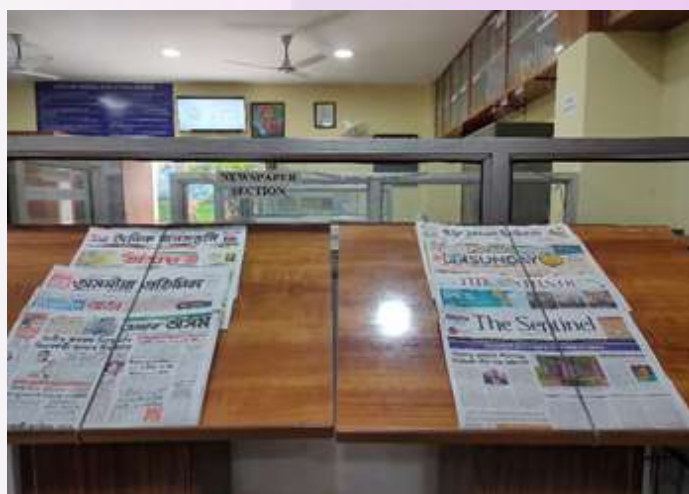
The library has some general Rules and Regulations, which the users have to be abide by. They are:

1. No students are allowed to enter the Library without uniform.
2. Students cannot use the mobile phone within the Library. They have to take the permission of the Librarian to use the mobile phone strictly for the academic purpose only.
3. Students should maintain silence within the Library and should try to keep it clean.
4. Students cannot chew chewing gum/gutkha within the Library.
5. Students cannot borrow the books using other student's Reader's Ticket as it is not transferable.
6. For loss of Reader's Ticket, a fine of Rs.50/- will be charged.
7. Students have to return the books within due date, after which a fine of Rs.1/- will be charged per day.
8. Degree Students are given 3(three) books, H.S Students 2(two) books, Faculties 4(four) books and Office Staffs 2(two) books at a time for borrowing.
9. Students can borrow the books for 15 days, Teachers for 1 month and Office Staffs for 15 days.
10. Only textbooks can be issued. Reference books, journals, magazines, dictionaries, encyclopedias etc. will have to be read in the Library only as they cannot be issued.
11. Borrowed books mutilated, damaged or lost, will have to be replaced or the borrower have to pay the double price of the book.
12. Desktops and fans have to be switched off after use.
13. Users must sign the attendance register given for the e-resource centre usage.
14. Teachers/Students must bring their own pen drive to save their documents.
15. Teachers/Students are not allowed to print their documents within the Library.
16. Teachers/Students are not allowed to use WhatsApp and E mail in desktops of e-resource centre.
17. Students are not allowed to play or download games in the desktops of the e-resource centre.
18. Public visitors can use the resources of the Library within the Library only. They cannot issue the books.
19. Every user must give their attendance(online/offline), put their belongings at the Property Counter, before entering the Library.
20. Any kind of query related to the Library should be discussed with the Librarian or Library Staffs only.

As a proud part of the National Cadet Corps (NCC), it plays a vital role in shaping young minds through a structured blend of discipline, leadership, and character-building activities. The NCC offers a holistic environment for personality development, instilling values such as discipline, teamwork, time management, and patriotism. Cadets experience a structured lifestyle that builds confidence, responsibility, and resilience which are essential for both civil and defense careers.

Cadets participate in prestigious national and international camps, including the Republic Day Camp and Overseas Deployment Camps in countries like Seychelles, Mauritius, and the Maldives. These opportunities foster cultural exchange, exposure, and national pride. Additionally, cadets can avail scholarships such as those offered by the Cadet Welfare Society (CWS) and earn honours like the Bir Chilarai Award, encouraging excellence.

The NCC curriculum ensures progressive growth: first-year cadets learn basics like discipline and drill; second-year cadets can appear for the 'B' Certificate; and third-year cadets qualify for the 'C' Certificate—the highest level. Camp participation is mandatory, typically requiring at least one Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC) for the 'B' Certificate and two camps (including an advanced camp) for the 'C' Certificate. Holding a 'C' Certificate provides a significant advantage for entry into the Indian Armed Forces through special schemes, bypassing the written exam conducted by the Union Public Service Commission. It also enhances opportunities in paramilitary forces and other sectors.

Beyond career benefits, cadets actively engage in community service, including Swachh Bharat drives, blood donation camps, disaster management training, environmental campaigns, and adventure activities like trekking, sailing, and boat pulling. The unit also contributes meaningfully to the local community.

The college recognizes excellence by awarding Best SD (Senior Division) and Best SW (Senior Wing) Cadet titles annually. Importantly, NCC enrollment is free, ensuring accessibility for all students.
